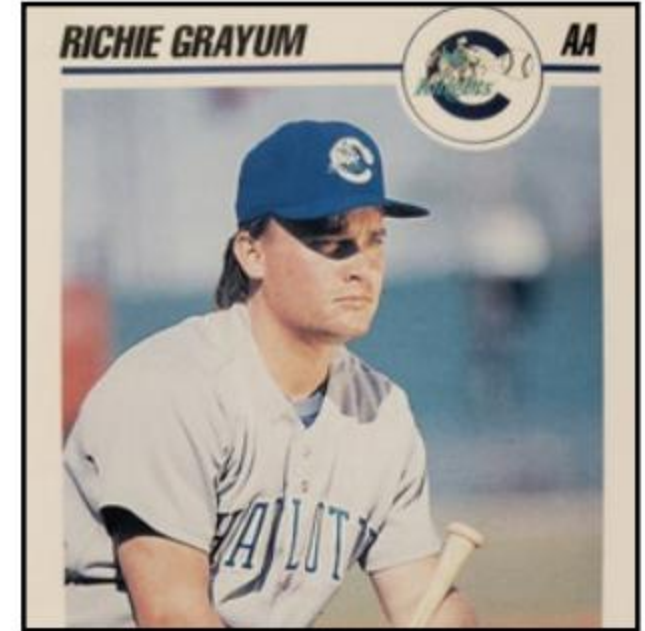

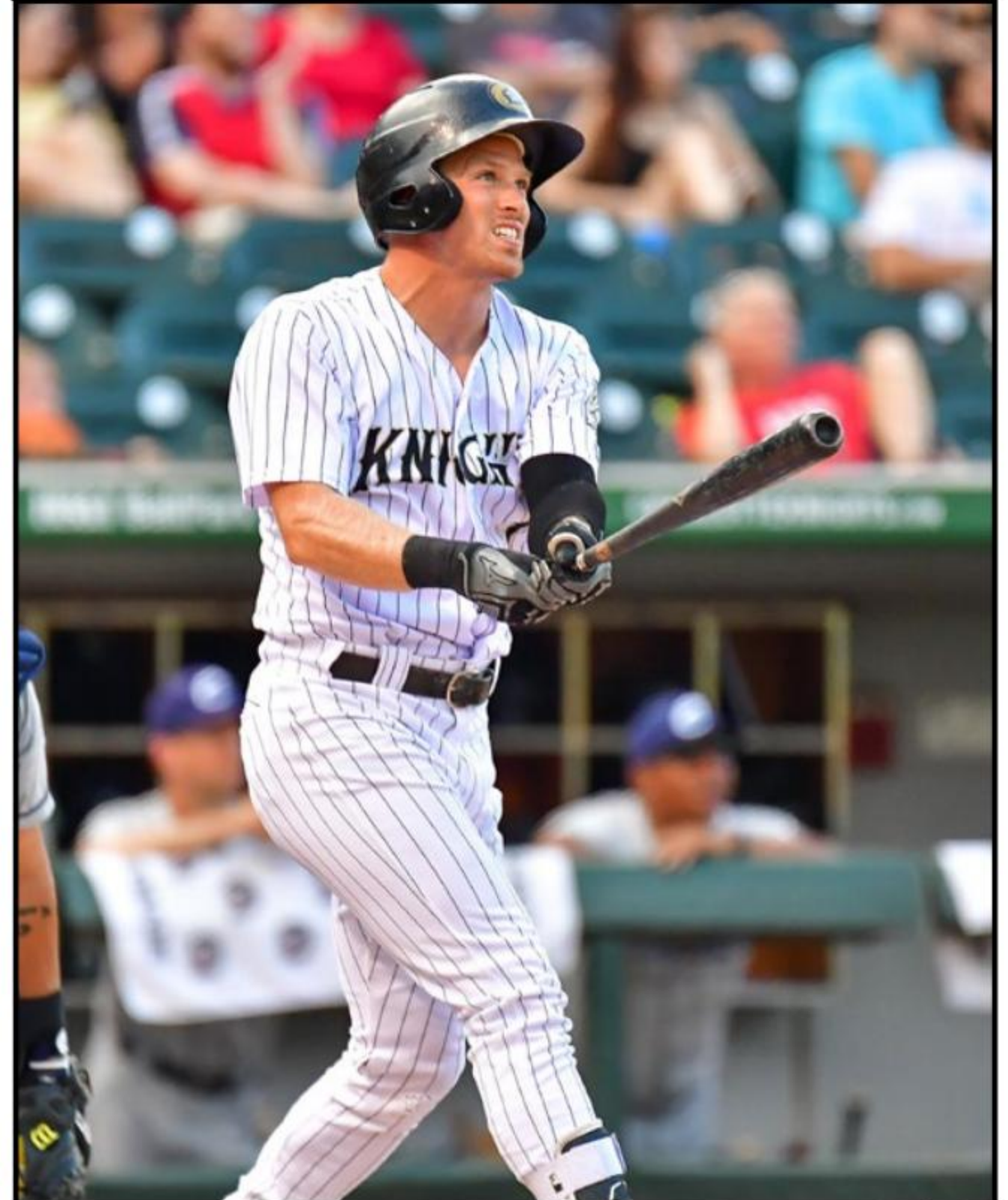

KNIGHT LIGHTS: The Charlotte Knights finished the 2019 season with a 75-64 record, their best record in their six seasons playing in Uptown Charlotte (2014-present). The team's 2019 regular season came to an abrupt end on the final day of the 2019 regular season with a heartbreaking loss to the Norfolk Tides from Harbor Park in Norfolk, Va by a score of 7-6 in 10 innings on Monday, September 2. The Knights needed a loss by the Durham Bulls and a win to earn their first playoff spot since 2012. The Bulls lost their game, but the Knights fell just short in extra innings. A Knights win that day would have given the team an International League Wild Card berth.

FROM THE SOUTH TO THE SOUTH SIDE: In all, 24 players were promoted from the Knights to Chicago White Sox in 2019. Those players, in order of their promotion(s) to Chicago: RHP Carson Fulmer (April 8, April 18, May 28, June 19, & July 30), LHP Josh Osich (April 12), OF Ryan Cordell (April 18, August 1, & August 30), OF Nicky Delmonico (April 22), LHP Aaron Bummer (April 28), RHP Thyago Vieira (April 28, May 1, May 22, & June 9), RHP Dylan Covey (April 30, August 3, & September 3), RHP Evan Marshall (May 1), RHP Juan Minaya (May 5), LHP Caleb Frare (May 5), OF Charlie Tilson (May 6), RHP José Ruiz (May 17, May 28, August 13, August 23, & September 4), C Seby Zavala (May 25 & August 2), RHP Odrisamer Despaigne (June 10), C Zack Collins (June 17 & September 3), OF Daniel Palka (June 28 & September 3), LHP Ross Detwiler (June 28), RHP Dylan Cease (July 3), INF Ryan Goins (July 17), OF Adam Engel (July 19), RHP Jimmy Cordero (July 20), 1B Matt Skole (August 2), LHP Héctor Santiago (August 6), and INF Danny Mendick (September 3).

200 MANAGERIAL WINS: Mark Grudzielanek notched his 200th win as a Knights manager on Saturday, August 31, joining an exclusive club in franchise history. Grudzielanek, who managed the Knights for the third-straight season (2017-2019), became one of just three managers in franchise history with 200 wins behind Joel Skinner (285) and Nick Leyva (202).

ROBERT RAKES: OF Luis Robert was promoted to Charlotte from Double-A Birmingham on Tuesday, July 9. He made his Triple-A debut on Thursday, July 11 and hit two home runs, including his first career Triple-A hit – a grand slam. In 47 games with the Knights, Robert hit .297 (60-for-202) with 44 runs scored, 10 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs, 39 RBIs, and seven stolen bases. He had one four-hit game (8/13 vs. SWB) and 18 multi-hit games. He had three multi-homer games and 10 multi-RBI games. Robert, 22, hit .328 (165-for-503) with 108 runs scored, 31 doubles, 11 triples, 32 home runs, 92 RBIs, and 36 stolen bases combined over 122 games with Winston-Salem (High-A), Birmingham (Double-A), and Charlotte (Triple-A). Robert finished the season as a member of the exclusive 30-30 club, swatting 32 home runs and stealing 36 bases.

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE AWARDS: The Knights had three players earn a weekly award from the International League. OF Daniel Palka was the first player to be named IL Batter of the Week May 13-20. INF Ramón Torres was the second (August 5-11), while C/1B Zack Collins was the third and final Knights player to earn the award (August 12-18).

MEN AT WORK: INF Danny Mendick had a solid first Triple-A season and was rewarded for his hard work with a promotion at the end of Charlotte's season. Mendick hit .279 (133-for-477) with 75 runs scored, 26 doubles, 17 home runs, 64 RBIs, and 19 stolen bases with the Knights in 133 games. He led the Knights in games played, hits, stolen bases, and total bases. He also finished second in the IL in games played, sixth in hits, fifth in walks, and tied for ninth in stolen bases.

CORDELL CYCLE: OF Ryan Cordell hit-for-the-cycle on April 10 in a 10-9 walk-off win over the Norfolk. Cordell went a perfect 5-for-5 at the plate to earn the impressive feat. His cycle was the first in Minor League Baseball in 2019 and was the first by a Knights player since Alex Gonzalez in 1998.

HOME RUN KNIGHTS: The Knights finished third in the International League in home runs with 208, five behind the IL leaders, the Columbus Clippers (213). On Saturday, August 24, OF Luis Robert connected on Charlotte's 200th team home run of the season, the first time in franchise history the club has swatted 200 home runs in a season. INF Yoán Moncada's fourth-inning home run in game two of the August 17th twin bill broke the Charlotte Knights' franchise record for home runs in a season (185) with the 186th home run of the season. The 186 home runs were the team's all-time single-season franchise mark, which were set back in 1993 during Charlotte's first campaign as a Triple-A franchise. Charlotte's 208 home runs this season were 105 more than they hit all of last year (103). This year, 28 different players hit a home run, which is a franchise record. The Knights had three players go over the 20-homer mark in 2019 – Daniel Palka (27), Matt Skole (21), and Seby Zavala (20).

MAGIC MAN: INF Nick Madrigal, who was selected in the first round (fourth overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft by the White Sox, was promoted to the Knights on July 31 from Double-A Birmingham. He went 1-for-4 with a run scored and an RBI in his Triple-A debut with the Knights on August 1. In 29 games with the Knights, Madrigal hit .331 (39-for-118) with 26 runs scored, six doubles, one triple, one home run, 12 RBIs, and four stolen bases. He began the 2019 season with High-A Winston-Salem and hit .272 (52-for-191) with 20 runs scored, 10 doubles, two triples, two home runs, 27 RBIs, and 17 stolen bases. He was promoted to Double-A Birmingham on June 6, 2019 and hit .341 (56-for-164) with 30 runs scored, 11 doubles, two triples, one home run, 16 RBIs, and 14 stolen bases.

2020 KNIGHTS KNOTES



2020 SEASON CANCELLED: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the entire 2020 Minor League Baseball season was cancelled. The official word came down on June 30. On that day, the Knights released a statement: "This afternoon, the cancellation of the 2020 Minor League season was announced. We are extremely disappointed in this result for all of the fans, partners, and community stakeholders with the Charlotte Knights. The effects of the pandemic have been felt by all who play a part in producing the memorable experiences of Knights baseball games. From the players, coaches, and support staff who perform on the field to those that work in the concourses, concession stands, and front office, it takes several hundred people per game to help provide the enjoyable escape during the spring and summer. We ask that our community keep them in mind in the absence of this season. To assist the game day, front office, and non-profit partners of the Knights affected by COVID-19, please consider a contribution to our Knights Care 4 CLT effort."

KNIGHTS CARE 4 CLT LAUNCHED: The Charlotte Knights and Charlotte Knights Charities announced the formation of "Knights Care 4 CLT", an effort to assist those affected by COVID-19. The announcement came one day before the team would have played host to the Durham Bulls at BB&T Ballpark for Opening Night of the 2020 season.

KNIGHTS CARE 4 CLT RAISED OVER \$125,000: On July 30, the Charlotte Knights announced that the team's "Knights Care 4 CLT" initiative raised over \$125,000 and that the team would begin to disperse the funds to those affected by COVID-19. With help from a \$75,000 donation from naming rights partner, Truist, and additional contributions from Charlotte Knights Charities, sponsors and fans, the team donated those funds to healthcare workers, seven local-area charities, and Knights' employees (part-time, game-day, and full-time).

"As this pandemic continues to affect so many in our community, we are very pleased to begin dispersing these much-needed funds to those who need some help," stated Dan Rajkowski, Charlotte Knights Chief Operating Officer. "We are so thankful to Truist, as well as our generous partners and fans who helped us raise these funds for those in need. Baseball has a way of bringing communities together and we hope that we are able to help those in the community who have been affected by this difficult time in our nation's history."

In addition to the funds dispersed to Knights' displaced employees due to COVID-19 from the cancellation of the 2020 season, the team is also contributing \$15,000 from the "Knights Care 4 CLT" fund to Atrium Health, one of the team's founding partners.

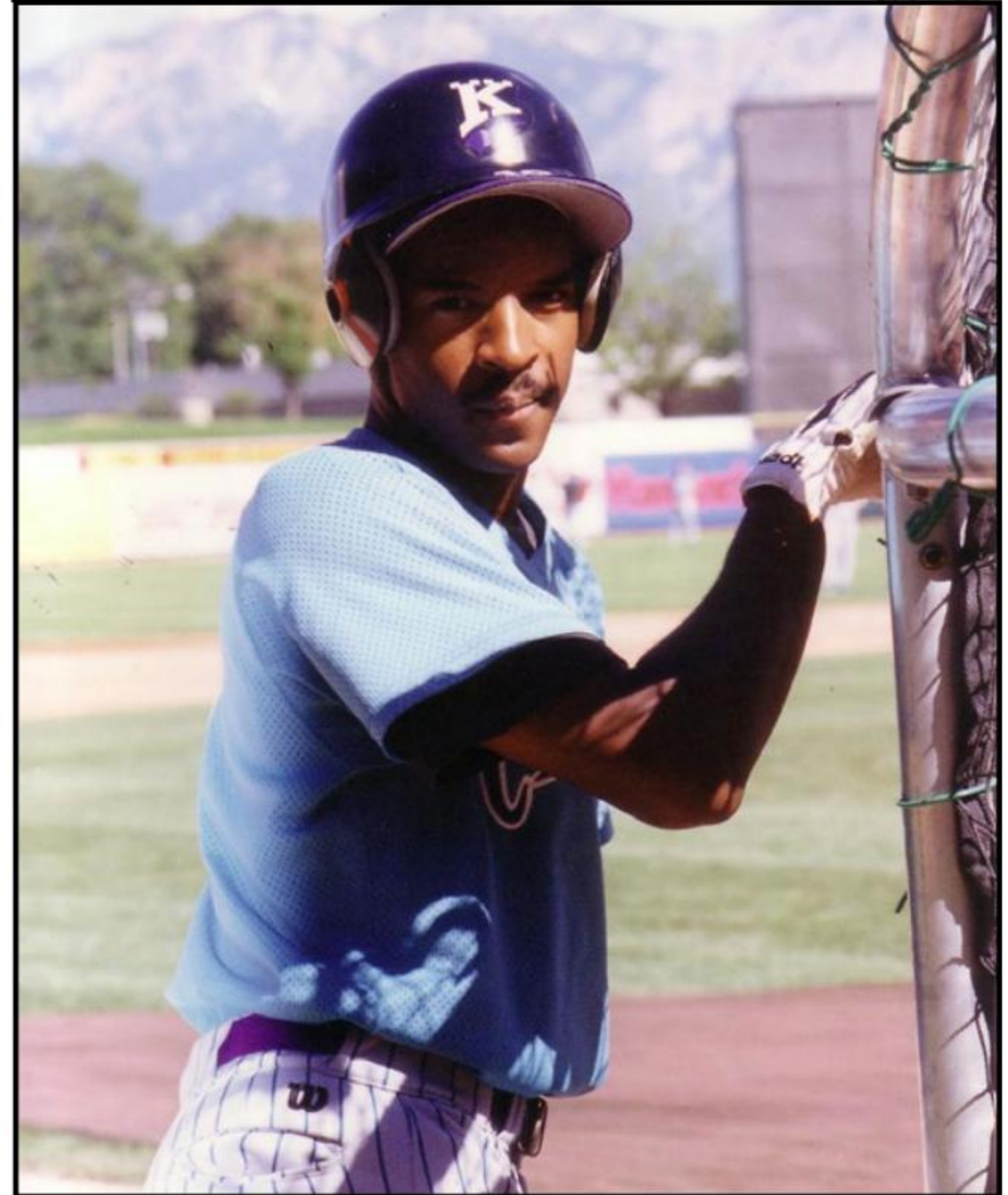

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE HISTORY



HISTORY OF THE IL



Professional baseball was still in its early stages when the International League was founded in 1884. The International League was created from the mergers of member teams from three precursor leagues: the Eastern League, which was itself a re-organization of the Interstate Association of 1883; the New York State League, formed in 1885; and the Ontario League, also organized in 1885. The New York State and Ontario leagues merged in 1886 to form the International League, and in 1887 the Eastern League was absorbed to create a ten-club league. With the recent reorganization of Minor League Baseball by Major League Baseball in 2021, the International League ceased operations and Triple-A teams now play in the Triple-A East and Triple-A West (most of these teams formerly made up the Pacific Coast League, which also ceased operations ahead of the 2021 season)..

CHARLOTTE KNIGHTS IL HISTORY

The Charlotte Knights joined the International League in 1993 and won two Governors' Cup Championships (1993, 1999) during their 27-year history of playing in the league. Charlotte's first season resulted in a Governors' Cup Championship as manager Charlie Manuel led the team to an impressive 86-win season. The Knights first Triple-A season saw them affiliated with the Cleveland Indians (93-94). The Knights and Marlins then entered into a Player Development Contract from 1995-98. In 1999, the Knights welcomed the Chicago White Sox and have been affiliated ever since. Much like their first season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians in 1993, the Knights won the Governors' Cup Championship in 1999 during their first season with the White Sox. Manager Tom Spencer led the team to 82 wins. The Knights reached the postseason two more times over the course of their storied affiliation with the White Sox. The Knights were playoff bound in 2006 and again in 2012. The 2012 team was led by manager Joel Skinner, who guided the team to the IL Finals.

On February 12, 2021, Major League Baseball announced the new league structure for all 120 Minor League Baseball teams under the Professional Development License (PDL). The Knights, members of the International League since 1993, became members of the Southeast Division of the Triple-A East League. In all, there will be 20 of the 30 Triple-A teams in the Triple-A East League, while the other 10 Triple-A clubs will be in the Triple-A West League.

The Knights will continue to have the Durham Bulls (Triple-A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays), Gwinnett Stripers (Triple-A affiliate of the Atlanta Braves), and Norfolk Tides (Triple-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles) as division rivals. In addition, Charlotte will now be in the same division as the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (Triple-A affiliate of the Miami Marlins), Nashville Sounds (Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers), and the Memphis Redbirds (Triple-A affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals). The only team in the Southeast Division the Knights won't see in 2021 is Memphis, who is not on Charlotte's schedule this season. Jacksonville is new to Triple-A Baseball for the 2021 season as they moved up from Double-A.

Although they will only play five teams this season, the Knights will eventually see three new foes in the Midwest Division of the Triple-A East League -- the Iowa Cubs (Triple-A affiliate of the Chicago Cubs), Omaha Storm Chasers (Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals), and the St. Paul Saints (Triple-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins). The 2021 season marks the first for the Saints as the Triple-A affiliate of the Twins. Those teams join four other teams from the old International League West -- Columbus Clippers (Triple-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians), Indianapolis Indians (Triple-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates), Louisville Bats (Triple-A affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) and the Toledo Mud Hens (Triple-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers).

In the Northeast Division, the Worcester Red Sox replace the Pawtucket Red Sox. The Buffalo Bisons are slated to play their home games in Trenton, NJ during the 2021 season due to the Toronto Blue Jays using Sahlen Field in Buffalo as their home ballpark.

The Triple-A West is made up of nine teams previously in the Pacific Coast League and one newcomer -- the Sugar Land Skeeters, who were members of the Independent Atlantic League from 2012-2019. The 2021 season marks their first as the Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros.

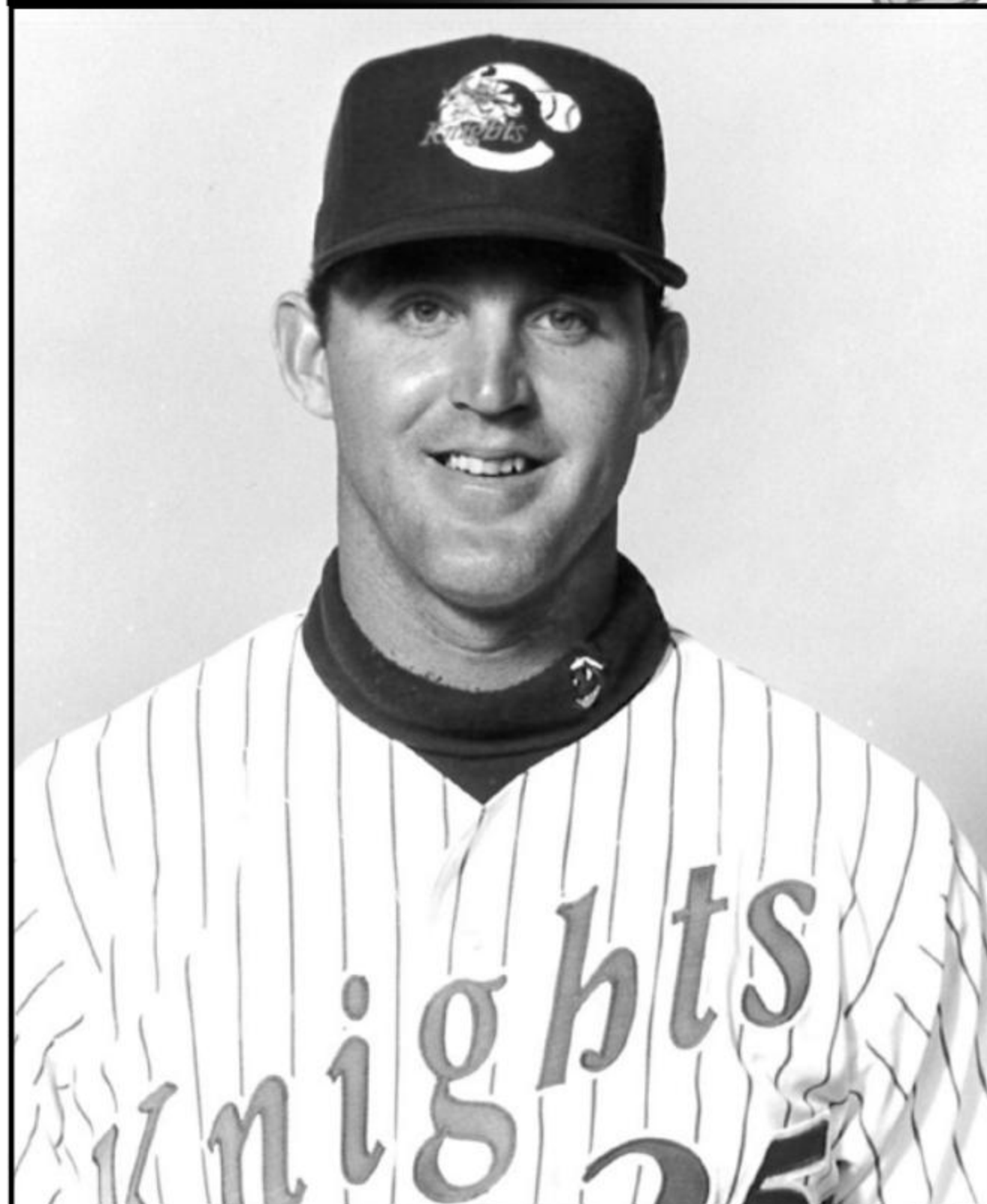

CHARLOTTE ALL-CENTURY TEAM

HARMON KILLEBREW

Like Thome, Killebrew was a source of power, launching 573 home runs during his run. A member of the 1956 knights, His best MLB season came during the 1969 campaign, where he was named A.L. MVP after hitting 49 homers.

MANNY RAMIREZ

A member of the 1993 Knights for just 40 games, Ramirez spent the majority of his major league career with the Indians and later the Red Sox. A fan favorite in Beantown, he would go on to bring Boston their first two championships since 1918.

TONY OLIVA

A Crockett Park legend in 1962, Oliva would go on to capture three batting titles while with the Minnesota Twins. He would also be elected to the All-Star Game in eight consecutive seasons from 1964 to 1971.

CAL RIPKEN JR.

One of the most widely known and respected baseball players of all-time, Ripken Jr. spent time in Charlotte during the 1979 and 1980 seasons. He is best remembered for breaking Lou Gehrig's consecutive games record of 2,130.

EARLY WYNN

Wynn pitched 23 years for the Washington Senators after spending the 1939 and '40 seasons in Charlotte. He went on to win 300 games, record 2,334 strikeouts and was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1972.

JIM THOME

Thome was key in helping the Knights capture the 1993 championship by hitting .332 with 25 home runs. His power continued into his major league career, where he has totaled 612 round-trippers, which ranks seventh on the all-time list.

EDDIE MURRAY

Murray started at first base during the 1976 season in Charlotte, quickly earning himself a trip to Baltimore a year later, where he was named Rookie of the Year. He finished his career with 3,255 hits and 504 home runs.

CURT SCHILLING

Schilling spent a portion of the 1988 season in Charlotte before finally landing in Philadelphia to begin his MLB career. He was later sent to Arizona and Boston, where he won a combined three championships in 2001, 2004, and 2007.

BRIAN DAUBACH

Daubach, who ranks among the Knights leaders in nearly every offensive category, would spend eight years in the minors before getting his crack in the big leagues. He went on to play eight years in the Majors, five with the Boston Red Sox.

RICK DEMPSEY

A 24-year major league veteran, Dempsey made his appearance in Charlotte during the 1971 season. His long career reached its high point in 1983, when he was named World Series MVP for the Baltimore Orioles.

CALVIN GRIFFITH

Griffith managed the Charlotte teams from 1938-41, including the 1938 Piedmont League Championship. He proceeded to become the owner of the Washington Senators, which he moved to become the Minnesota Twins.





NATIONAL BASEBALL HALL-OF-FAMERS



Early Wynn

Early Wynn won exactly 300 games over his 23-year Major League career. An eight-time All-Star and winner of the 1959 American League Cy Young Award, Wynn finished his career with a 300-244 record and a 3.54 ERA. While he spent 10 years with Cleveland, eight with Washington, and five with Chicago (AL), the 6'0, 190-pound right-hander spent three seasons in Charlotte with the Hornets. During his time with Charlotte's Minor League team, Wynn won 34 games (34-32) and finished with an ERA of 4.45 in 94 games. The Alabama native compiled a 15-14 record with a 3.96 ERA in 34 games for the 1939 Charlotte Hornets.

Harmon Killebrew – one of baseball's most prolific sluggers – spent 22 seasons in the Majors and hit an astounding 573 career home runs. Before his success in the Majors, Killebrew played in Charlotte with the Hornets. In 1956, he appeared in 70 games for the Hornets and hit .325 with 15 homers. The rest was history for the 11-time American League All-Star & American League MVP in 1969. When he finished his career after the 1975 season, he ranked fifth all-time on the home run list. Nicknamed "Killer", the Idaho native was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1984.

Eddie Murray excelled at the plate for the 1976 Charlotte O's, hitting .298 with 12 home runs and 46 RBIs over 88 games. He earned a promotion to Triple-A Rochester later that year and continued to hit. He batted .274 with 11 home runs and 40 RBIs. "Steady Eddie" began his Hall of Fame career a year later with the Baltimore Orioles – making his Major League debut on April 7, 1977 at the age of 21. He hit .283 with 27 home runs and 88 RBIs in his first season and won the American League's Rookie of the Year. A native of Los Angeles, CA, Murray went on to play 21 seasons in the Majors – 13 of those with Baltimore. He was a 1983 World Series winner, with Baltimore, an eight-time All-Star, three-time Gold Glove Award winner, and a three-time Silver Slugger Award winner. Murray finished his career with a .287 batting average, 3,255 hits, 504 home runs, and 1,917 RBIs. He was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003.

Cal Ripken Jr. was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 2nd round of the 1978 draft and made his professional debut later that year in Bluefield (Single-A). A season later, the 18-year-old Maryland native made his leap through Baltimore's Minor League system. He hit .303 in Miami (Single-A) over 105 games and later made the jump to Double-A Charlotte where he would become an important player for a very talented team. After appearing in just 17 games for the Charlotte O's in 1979, Ripken was back in 1980 and this time he set career highs in the offensive department. In 144 games for Charlotte, Ripken hit .276 with 25 home runs, 78 RBIs and 144 hits. Ripken's solid play, along with Drungo Hazewood, who hit a team-high 28 home runs, led the O's to a Southern League Championship in 1980. Ripken spent one more season in the Minors with Triple-A Rochester in 1981 before making his Major League debut on August 10, 1981 as a 20-year-old. That was the start of a special career, which saw Ripken play in a Major League record 2,632 consecutive games. Ripken finished his career with 3,184 hits, 431 home runs, and 1,695 RBIs. Among some of his accomplishments, he won the 1982 American League Rookie of the Year, a 1983 World Series Champion with the Orioles, an eight-time Silver Slugger Award winner, a 19-time American League All-Star, and a two-time Gold Glove Award winner. He was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1997 – his first year on the ballot.

JIM THOME
Charlotte Knights 1993

Jim Thome, who shined with the Charlotte Knights in 1993, was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame on Wednesday, January 24, 2018. Thome becomes the first player in Charlotte Knights franchise history to earn entrance into the Hall.

Thome made his mark on the Charlotte area in 1993 – his one and only season with the Charlotte Knights. At the age of 22, he hit .332 and clubbed 25 home runs while driving in 102 RBIs in 1993 with the Knights.

He earned the International League's Most Valuable Player Award and a trip to the majors with the Cleveland Indians later that year. Thome helped lead the Knights and manager Charlie Manuel to the 1993 Governors' Cup Championship in their first season as a Triple-A franchise.

For his career, Thome mashed 612 career home runs at the major league level over 22 seasons -- four of those with Manuel at the helm.

A five-time All-Star, he led the National League in home runs in 2003 with an impressive 47 while playing for the Philadelphia Phillies, one of six teams he played for in his major league career (Indians, Phillies, White Sox, Dodgers, Twins and Orioles). He finished his illustrious big league career with 2,328 career hits and 1,699 RBIs.

Since 2013, he has worked with the Chicago White Sox as a special assistant to senior vice president/general manager, Rick Hahn, working with minor league players in the organization -- including the Charlotte Knights.

On April 11, 2014, Thome helped usher in a new era of professional baseball in Charlotte as he threw out a ceremonial first pitch at the opening of BB&T Ballpark in Uptown Charlotte.

Two seasons later, Thome and Manuel were inducted into the Charlotte Baseball Round Table of Honor at the 2016 Triple-A Baseball All-Star Game Luncheon on the morning of July 13th at the Charlotte Convention Center. The iconic duo each threw out a ceremonial first pitch later that evening at the 2016 Sonic Automotive Triple-A Baseball All-Star Game.

Hoyt Wilhelm - RHP

Though he never donned a Hornets uniform, Hall of Famer Hoyt Wilhelm became a member of the Charlotte Baseball Hall of Fame's inaugural class. Born in Huntersville, North Carolina, the player known as "Old Sarge" appeared in over 1,000 games across his 21-year major league career. His first professional appearances came as a 19-year-old with the Mooresville Moors in 1942. He was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1985 having won 124 games as a reliever and 143 contests overall during his illustrious career.

Minnie Mendoza - INF

Infielder Minnie Mendoza spent a total of 10 seasons playing baseball in Charlotte, appearing for the Hornets during both the Class A and Class AA eras. The Cuban infielder was a career .288 hitter at the AA level, and appeared in 16 games for the Minnesota Twins.

1965 Post 9 Team

The lone group enshrined to the Charlotte Baseball Hall of Fame, the 1965 Post 9 Team made their way into the history books by capturing an American Legion National Championship in 1965. Notables such as Dave Lemonds highlighted the amateur team, eventually making their way from the Queen City to the major leagues.

Calvin Griffith

Calvin Griffith managed the 1938 Hornets to a Piedmont League title, and further made his mark on baseball by moving the Washington Senators to Minnesota before the 1961 season. Griffith Park, which was built in 1940, was named after him.

Tony Oliva - OF

Born in Pinar del Rio, Cuba, outfielder Tony Oliva hit .350 in his lone season with the Charlotte Hornets en route to a trio of major league batting titles as a member of the Minnesota Twins.

Roberto Estalella - OF

Roberto Estalella appeared for the Charlotte Hornets at both ends of his professional journey; playing during the 1937 and 1938 seasons, and closing his career with the 1951 Hornets. In between, the Cuban Estalella appeared in nearly 700 major league games across nine seasons. He was named an All-Star during the 1945 season.

Jim Crockett Jr.

Jim Crockett Jr. ushered in the modern era of baseball in Charlotte, purchasing the Asheville Orioles after the 1975 season and moving the team southeast. Griffith Park was renamed to Crockett Park and housed the team until 1985.

Grady Little

A product of Garinger High School in Charlotte, Grady Little was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the 15th round of the 1968 MLB Draft. Following a six-year playing career, Little began his career as a manager. He managed the Hornets in 1983-84, eventually making his way to the major leagues prior to the 2000 season.



CHARLOTTE BASEBALL ROUND TABLE OF HONOR

The 2016 season marked the return of the Charlotte Baseball Round Table of Honor, also known as the Charlotte Baseball Hall of Fame. From 1982-87, five Hall of Fame classes featuring 29 players and the entire 1965 Post 9 Team emerged from nearly a century of baseball in the Queen City toward a permanent spot at the Round Table of Honor.

Following nearly a three decade hiatus, the 2016 Round Table of Honor class was named. Featuring legendary slugger Jim Thome, World Series winning manager Charlie Manuel, and the "First Lady of Charlotte Baseball" Frances Crockett, the 2016 class took their place in history on July 13, 2016 during the All-Star Luncheon at the Charlotte Convention Center.

Former Knights slugger Billy McMillon was announced as the 2020 inductee before the cancellation of the season and will be inducted at some point at Truist Field in the future. More details about the 2021 class to come at a later time.

JIM THOME 1993 CHARLOTTE KNIGHTS

A prolific slugger who made his mark on the Charlotte area in 1993 -- his one and only season with the Charlotte Knights. That year the mammoth home run hitter put together an MVP season. The Illinois native hit .332 and clubbed 25 home runs while driving in 102 RBIs on his way to earning the International League's Most Valuable Player Award and a trip to the majors with the Cleveland Indians.

His solid season helped lead the Knights and manager Charlie Manuel to the 1993 Governors' Cup Championship in their first season as a Triple-A franchise. He went on to slug 612 career home runs at the major league level in 22 seasons -- four of those with Manuel at the helm. A five-time All-Star, he led the National League in home runs in 2003 with an impressive 47 while playing for the Philadelphia Phillies, one of six teams he played for in his major league career (Indians, Phillies, White Sox, Dodgers, Twins and Orioles). He finished his illustrious big league career with 2,328 career hits and 1,699 RBIs.

CHARLIE MANUEL 1968 CHARLOTTE HORNETS, 1993 CHARLOTTE KNIGHTS

With a larger-than-life persona as a player, scout, coach, manager, and executive, Charlie Manuel has devoted a lifetime to the game of baseball. Early on -- as a 24-year-old -- the hard-hitting outfielder brought his talents to Charlotte where he slugged 13 home runs and drove in 79 runs for the Charlotte Hornets in 1968. He finished third in the Southern League that season in RBIs and batted a respectable .283. A year later, the Northfork, WV native made his major league debut with the Minnesota Twins. Overall, this legendary baseball mind spent parts of six seasons in the majors before taking his home run hitting talents to Japan where he mashed 189 long balls over six seasons. Years later, Manuel returned to the Queen City area as a manager and led the Charlotte Knights to their first Governors' Cup title in 1993 after 86 regular-season wins and a dominating playoff run. He later took his managerial talents to the majors and went on to win 1,055 games as a major league manager over 12 seasons. In 2008, his hard-work came full circle as he guided his Philadelphia Phillies to a World Series win -- the organization's first since 1980.

FRANCES CROCKETT 1976-1987 CHARLOTTE O's

The first female General Manager in professional baseball, Frances Crockett guided her Charlotte O's to success on the field and at the gates. Following the departure of the Charlotte Hornets in 1972, professional baseball in Charlotte, NC was dormant for three years until the Crockett family brought America's Pastime back to the city. From 1976 to 1987, the Charlotte O's were the Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles and played their home games at Crockett Park. Led by the hard work of Frances, the O's were a family business and their family friendly environment was a great place to watch baseball each year.

On the field, her O's brought home two Southern League Championships (1980 & 1984). In 1980, she was honored by The Sporting News with the Class AA Executive of the Year Award -- becoming the first woman to win The Sporting News Award at any level. In 1982, she was profiled in Sports Illustrated for her leadership and tireless efforts to Charlotte baseball. As the team's leader, the two-time Rawlings Woman Executive of the Year (1980 & 1985) guided many future Major League Baseball stars -- including National Baseball Hall of Famers Eddie Murray and Cal Ripken Jr., as well as countless others. She remains a valuable member of the Charlotte community and a great ambassador to Charlotte professional baseball.

CHARLOTTE BASEBALL HISTORY



DON BEAVER, OWNER 1998–Present CHARLOTTE KNIGHTS

With a passion for the game of baseball that began early in life, Don Beaver has devoted countless hours to America's Favorite Pastime. As an owner of Minor League Baseball teams since 1992, Don's commitment to the game is unparalleled.

As a young player, he excelled in youth leagues including American Legion and Little League Baseball. In 1952, As a 12-year-old, Don shined as he pitched and won for his team -- the Mooresville All-Stars -- into the Little League World Series.

As the years went on, Don's leadership in the sport led him to a minority interest in the Pittsburgh Pirates as well as a majority ownership in Minor League teams across the country -- including in his hometown of Hickory, NC. His vision to move the Knights from Fort Mill, SC to Uptown Charlotte after years of hurdles came to fruition when the team broke ground for BB&T Ballpark on Sept. 14, 2012.

That vision helped propel the Knights to record-setting attendance while being a major catalyst for business development in the Queen City. He is a member of the Little League Baseball Hall of Excellence, the South Atlantic League Hall of Fame, as well as a respected businessman and community leader.

DRUNGO LaRUE HAZEWOOD 1979–1982 CHARLOTTE O's

A larger-than-life figure, he was a man whose smile and baseball ability left a lasting impression on all who knew him. An athletically gifted two-sport star in high school, he was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the first round (19th overall) of the 1977 draft out of Sacramento High School in Sacramento, CA. From there, his physical gifts, which included lightning speed on the base paths, a cannon for an arm in the outfield, and a power bat at the plate, led him to set records during his time in the Queen City.

He excelled on the baseball diamond for four seasons with the Charlotte O's from 1979 to 1982. In 1980, the prolific slugger launched 28 home runs, added 80 runs batted in, and stole 29 bases.

A true five-tool player, he was one of the all-time legendary players in Charlotte O's franchise history. The 6'3" right-handed hitter finished his career as the club's all-time leader in games played, at-bats, runs scored, and walks, while he finished second all-time in hits, home runs, runs batted in, and stolen bases.

An important field general, he helped the Charlotte O's capture a Southern League Championship in 1980 -- the club's first in franchise history.

BRIAN DAUBACH 1997–1998 CHARLOTTE KNIGHTS

Originally selected by the New York Mets in the 17th round of the 1990 MLB June Amateur Draft, Brian Daubach spent parts of eight seasons in the majors and 14 in the minors over the course of his illustrious career. He hit a total of 93 home runs at the major league level, including 20-plus home runs in four consecutive seasons with the Boston Red Sox from 1999 to 2002. He also swatted a remarkable 160 home runs and 805 RBIs in the minors.

Daubach appeared in two seasons with the Knights (1997-1998) when the team was the Triple-A affiliate of the Florida Marlins. Over that two-year span, he combined to record 85 doubles, 56 home runs, and 217 RBIs with the franchise. In 1997, he compiled a .278 batting average with 40 doubles, 21 home runs, and 93 RBIs in 136 games. One year later, Daubach returned to the Knights and hit .316 with 157 hits, 102 runs scored, 45 doubles, four triples, 35 home runs, and 124 RBIs. He led the International League in home runs and RBIs that season before making his major league debut with the Marlins on September 10, 1998.

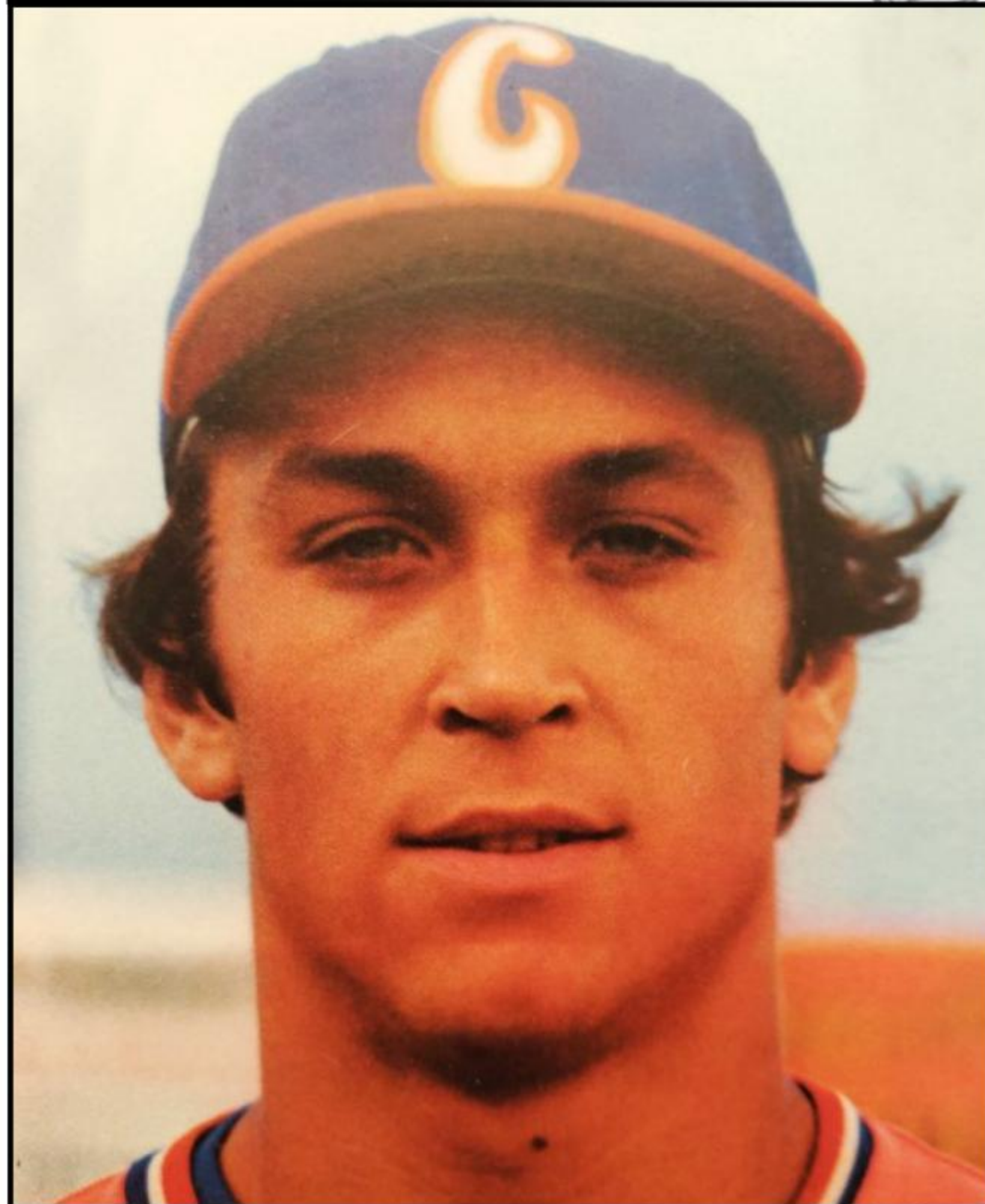
JOE BORCHARD 2002–2005 CHARLOTTE KNIGHTS

A two-sport standout at Stanford University (football and baseball), Joe Borchard was originally selected by the Chicago White Sox in the 1st round of the 2000 MLB June Amateur Draft. As a 23-year-old in 2002, he made his debut with the Knights and went on to hit .272 with 35 doubles, 20 home runs and 59 RBIs that year. Later that season, he made his major league debut on September 2, 2002 in Toronto with the White Sox and homered in his first big league game.

A year later, he returned to the Knights and appeared in 114 games with the club. He compiled 110 hits that season with 13 home runs and 53 RBIs. Over the course of his next two seasons with the Knights, he swatted 16 home runs in 2004 and a career-best 29 in 2005. During the course of his four years with the Knights, he ranked as one of the best offensive players in franchise history. He finished as the all-time franchise leader in nearly all offensive categories, including games played, at-bats, home runs, doubles, RBIs, runs scored, and walks.

For his professional career, Borchard racked up a total of 1,067 hits and 182 home runs combined over parts of 10 seasons in the minors and six in the majors. The 6'4" slugger appeared in the majors with the White Sox (2002-05), the Seattle Mariners (2007), and the Florida Marlins (2006-07). He retired from professional baseball after the 2011 season.

CHARLOTTE O's HISTORY



From 1976 to 1987, the Charlotte O's epitomized Charlotte. The players, the coaches, the front office staff, and of course, the Crockett Family were synonymous with baseball in the Queen City. If you were a baseball fan in the Charlotte area from the mid-to-late 1970's to the mid-to-late 1980's, you attended games at Crockett Park on Magnolia Avenue in Charlotte. You witnessed history in 1980 and 1984 when the Knights brought home a Southern League Championship. For 12 memorable seasons, it was the place to be all summer long.

The Charlotte O's were the Double-A, Southern League affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. During the course of their 12-year affiliation, the O's featured many bright stars including National Baseball Hall-of-Famers Eddie Murray and Cal Ripken Jr. The franchise also boasted talented players that would become Charlotte icons. Players such as Drungo LaRue Hazewood, John "T-Bone" Shelby, "Cat" Whitfield, and others, were household names in and around the Charlotte area. Managers Grady Little, John Hart, Jimmy Williams, and Mark Wiley were also legendary figures in the Queen City.

Just before the O's came into existence, the city of Charlotte was without baseball for three consecutive seasons. After the Charlotte Hornets (baseball) left the Queen City at the conclusion of the 1972 season, Charlotte was without professional baseball from 1973-1975. Enter the Crockett family.

Jim Crockett Jr. -- son of legendary wrestling promoter Jim Crockett Sr. -- along with his family -- purchased the Asheville O's in 1975 and moved the club to Clark Griffith Park in Charlotte. Griffith Park was the same ballpark that housed the Charlotte Hornets from 1940 to 1972 and it was once home to Harmon Killebrew, Early Wynn, Tony Oliva, and many other Hornets greats. The historic wooden ballpark was renamed Jim Crockett, Sr., Memorial Park and it was the place where new memories were made.



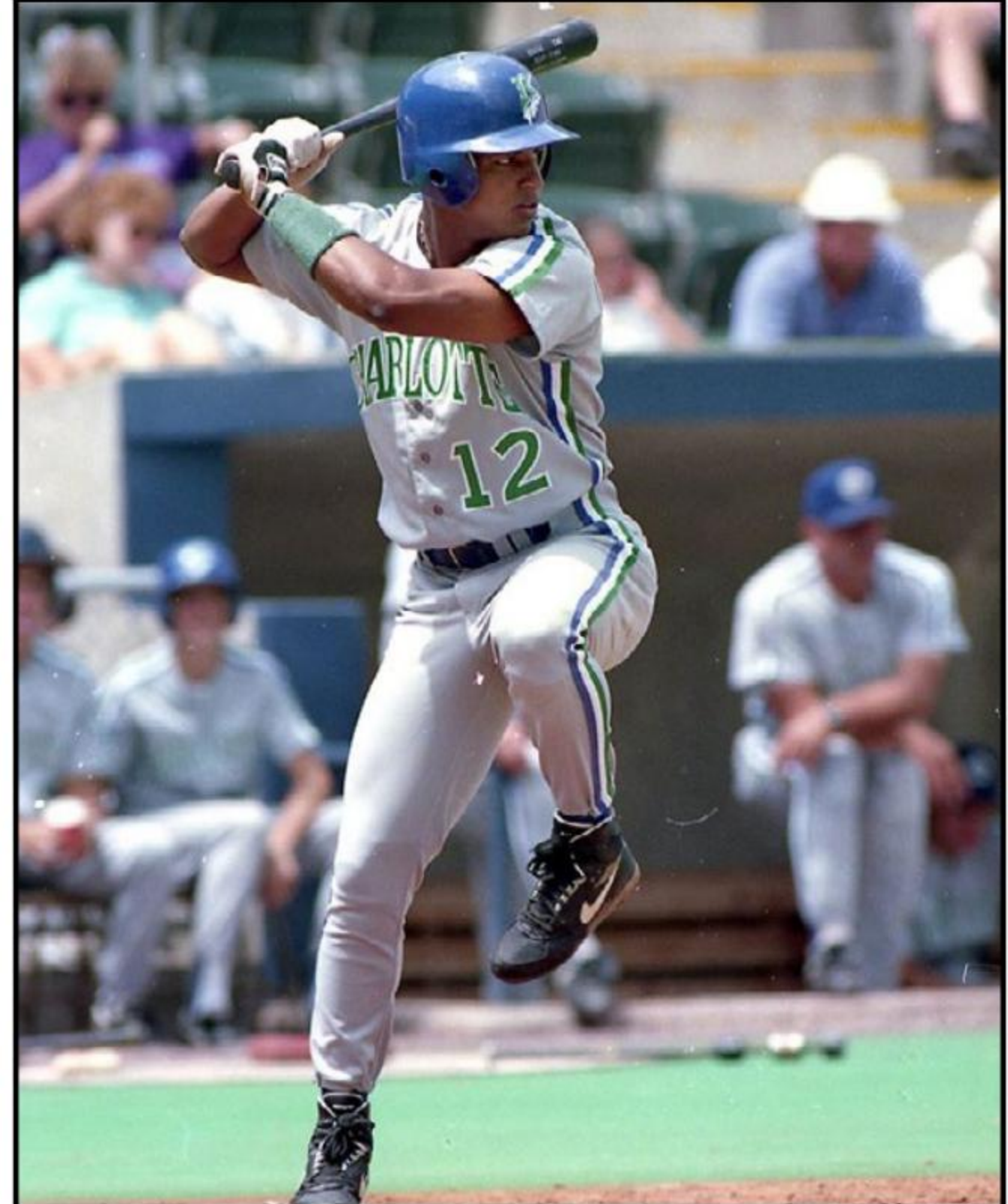
Serving as the club's President and General Manager was Frances Crockett, who was just 35 years old at the time when she first took over control in 1976. Her organization was a true family affair too. Her five children all had roles in the team's operation. Debbie popped the popcorn and supervised vendors in the stands. Lisa was a Pepper Girl. Jimmy worked on the grounds crew. Betsy ran the souvenir stand, while Ron -- her youngest -- was a ball boy. Sports Illustrated wrote a story about their success in 1982. The team's success was felt at the gates and on-the-field -- but not at first. Although the inaugural O's team (1976) compiled a 76-64 record and featured future legend Eddie Murray, who hit .298 with 12 home runs and 46 RBIs over 88 games -- it wasn't until 1980 that the team brought home a championship.

In 1979, a young Cal Ripken Jr. made his O's debut. At the age of 18, the future "Iron Man" played in 17 games for the O's that season -- giving fans a small glimpse of what they could expect in 1980. When the 1980 season came around, Ripken, Hazewood and the O's combined to win 72 games and the club earned a chance to bring home a Southern League Championship to the city of Charlotte for the first time in nine years (1971 Hornets). Under manager Jimmy Williams, the O's beat the Memphis Chicks 3-1 in the playoffs to capture their first of two championships in franchise history. The 1980 team also welcomed 198,528 fans through the gates -- a Charlotte baseball record at the time.



Four years later, the O's brought home another championship. After winning the second-half of the season, the O's beat Greenville in the first round (3-1) and then defeated Knoxville in the finals (3-0) to win their second Southern League title. It was another great day for the O's and the city of Charlotte. Sadly, in 1985, there was a fire at Crockett Park and the Crocketts and the city of Charlotte lost a lot. Still, the Crocketts did everything they could to play the season on time. With help from many people, they did just that. The team played baseball in 1985, 1986, and again in 1987. After that, however, the Crockett family sold the team to George Shinn, who renamed the team the Knights and the ballpark Knights Park for the 1988 season. Eventually, Shinn left Charlotte for Fort Mill (1989) and the Knights spent 25 seasons in Fort Mill, SC before returning home to Charlotte on April 11, 2014.

Fast Facts

- The Knights moved from Charlotte, NC to Fort Mill, SC in 1989. A year later, the team opened up Knights Castle (1990). The 1989 season was spent in a temporary facility.
- The largest crowd to watch a game in the 24-year history of Knights Stadium was 15,591 on July 4, 2008 vs. the Durham Bulls.
- The Knights played their final game at Knights Stadium on September 2, 2013 in a 4-0 victory over the Gwinnett Braves.

Knights Stadium Knotes

THE FINALE: 2013's finale marked the final game at Knights Stadium after more than 24 years. The Knights, however played 25 total seasons in Fort Mill, SC (1989 was spent in a temporary facility) – after one season as the Knights in Charlotte (1988). Knights Castle debuted in 1990 and the Knights were the Double-A affiliate of the Chicago Cubs (1989-92) before moving to Triple-A in 1993 to become an affiliate of the Cleveland Indians (93-94). Charlotte won their first Governors' Cup Championship in 1993 with manager Charlie Manuel at the helm. The Knights switched affiliates in 1995 -- this time becoming the Triple-A affiliate of the Florida Marlins from 1995-1998. The Chicago White Sox entered the picture in 1999 and have been the parent club ever since. They will continue their affiliation with the White Sox through the 2020 season after signing a six-year extension this past December.

KNIGHTS STADIUM NO-HITTERS: The Knights celebrated "Christmas in July" on Thursday, July 25 at Knights Stadium as Andre Rienzo tossed a seven-inning no-hitter in a 1-0 win over the Indianapolis Indians. For the Knights, it was the third no-hitter in franchise history and first since Carlos Torres threw a five-inning perfect game on June 18, 2009 in Pawtucket. Before that, the last Knights no-hitter was thrown by Tetsu Yofu on August 1, 2004 at Knights Stadium. Rienzo threw the no-no in game one of a doubleheader against the Indians. For Rienzo, it was his third win during the month of July (all in consecutive starts). He allowed just five baserunners on the evening en route to Charlotte's second-straight win over first-place Indianapolis. He walked four batters and had one batter reach on an error. In all, Rienzo threw 112 pitches - 69 for strikes. Charlotte's only run of the game came on an Andy Wilkins RBI single in the bottom of the second inning off Indians starter Stolmy Pimentel (2-3, 2.60). Rienzo was promoted to the White Sox on July 30 - just five days after his no-hitter. At the time of his promotion, the Brazilian native was leading the International League in strikeouts (113), and also ranked tied for the league lead in complete games (three), and second in shutouts (1). He made his Major League debut later that night and became the first Brazilian-born pitcher in Major League Baseball history.



'93 CHAMPION KNIGHTS: 1993, the Charlotte Knights captured the International League crown in their first year of play at the Triple-A level. Knight's third baseman Jim Thome was named by *Baseball America* as Triple-A Player of the Year after leading the IL in average (.332), RBI (102), and on-base percentage (.441), while finishing second in home runs (25), fourth in runs (85) third in total bases (240), second in walks (76), and second in slugging percentage. DH Sam Horn also had an all-star season in which he paced all the minor leagues with 38 HR and led the IL with a .600 slugging percentage. Knights manager Charlie Manuel led the IL to victory during the annual Triple-A All-Star Game.



Knights Stadium Knotes

MORE FINALE NOTES: Over 1,700 games were played at Knights Stadium from 1990-2013, including the Double-A All-Star game in 1992. The Knights made the playoffs four times – 1993, 1999, 2006, 2012 – capturing championships in both 1993 and 1999, respectively. The title in 1999 was won at Knights Stadium on September 17, 1999 over the Durham Bulls (2-1 win). Over 500 players were promoted to the majors from Charlotte and over 6.5 million fans (including 2013) passed through the gates over the 24 years.

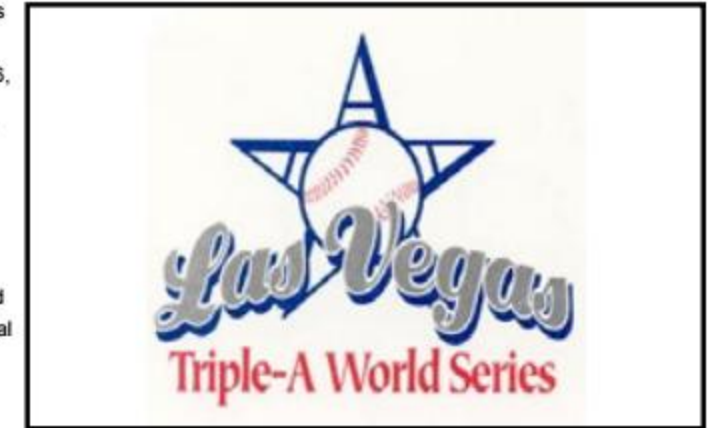
KNIGHTS GO NATIONAL: The 1999 Knights team finished second in the South Division and earned a wild card spot in the International League playoffs. After defeating Scranton/WB in round one they would go on to defeat Durham to capture the IL Governors' Cup. The Knights advanced to the second-ever Triple-A World Series in Las Vegas where they would receive national television coverage on ESPN 2. The Knights would fall to the Vancouver Canadians three games to two. Tom Spencer was named International League Manager of the Year, the first Charlotte manager to achieve that honor.

MANNY BEING MANNY: Knights OF Manny Ramirez was named International League Batter of the Week for August 22-28 in 1993. In 40 games at Charlotte, Ramirez belted 14 HR and 36 RBIs while batting .317 with a .690 slugging percentage.

TRIPLEHEADER: Thanks to Mother Nature snowing out eight of the Knights first nine games in 1996, the Charlotte Knights played 13 games from June 9 through June 16. During this span, the Knights had one tripleheader and three doubleheaders. The Knights won seven of the 13 games.

AWARD SEASON: The Knights had five players receive the International League Player of the Week in 2006, with three batters and two pitchers recognized by the league. Ryan Sweeney was the first Knights player to earn the honor, capturing the IL's Batter of the Week award for the week of April 24-30. Josh Fields was also named batter of the week for May 8-14. Heath Phillips became the first Knights pitcher to receive an award, getting recognition for the week of May 15-21. Phillips was followed by Sean Tracey, who received his award for June 19-25, and Bobby Smith, who received the IL's third Batter of the Week award for the team after the week of August 7-13. In addition to the five weekly honors, Heath Phillips was named the International League's Most Valuable Pitcher following the 2006 season.

KNIGHTS JOIN WHITE SOX ORGANIZATION: As the 1999 season began, the Knights again changed hats, as Charlotte ended their four-year affiliation with the Marlins and headed into a Player Development Contract with the Chicago White Sox. The Knights finished the season by winning the International League Governors' Cup Championship.

ALL-KNIGHTS STADIUM TEAM



Charlie Manuel - Manager

Before Manuel was guiding the Phillies to consecutive World Series appearances in the late 2000's, the Northfork, WV native led the Charlotte Knights to their first-ever Governors' Cup title back in 1993 - his only season at the helm of the Knights. Under Manuel, the Knights went 86-55 in the regular season - their first season in the International League - before beating Rochester in five games in the Governors' Cup finals. The 86 regular season wins are the most in the Knights Stadium era. .

Josh Phegley - C

Phegley made his Knights debut in 2011 and hit two home runs in 22 games for the team. His break-out campaign, however, came during the 2012 season. His solid first-half play earned him a spot on the International League All-Star Team. In all, Phegley hit .266 with six home runs and 48 RBIs for the Knights in 2012. At the end of the year he was rewarded for his stellar defense with the MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove Award. The white sox former first round pick was back in 2013 and once again named to the IL All-Star Team, but did not participate because he was called up.

Jason Bourgeois - 2B

Speedster Jason Bourgeois appeared in 211 games for the Knights over parts of two seasons (2007-2008). In 2007, he hit .311 with seven home runs, 34 RBIs and 23 stolen bases. The Texas native returned to the Knights a year later and hit .286 with nine home runs, five triples, 48 RBIs and 30 stolen bases.

Mark Lewis - SS

Lewis had a career-year in 1993 for the Knights. He batted .284 with 17 home runs and 67 RBIs for the champion-winning Knights. He led the team with 93 runs scored and finished second in the entire league in that category. He also had 144 hits, 30 doubles, and four triples that season for Charlie Manuel's squad. Lewis came back to Charlotte in 1994 and hit .259 with eight home runs and 34 RBIs - giving him 25 career Knights home runs and 101 RBIs.

Billy McMillon - OF

McMillon was an International League All-Star and the league's Rookie of the Year in 1996. In 97 games that season, McMillon hit a remarkable .352 with 17 home runs and 70 RBIs for the Knights -- his first year in Triple-A. A year later, the Clemson product hit .279 with eight home runs over 57 games.

Dayan Viciedo - UTILITY

Viciedo posted back-to-back 20 home run seasons for the Knights from 2010-2011. The Cuban native hit .274 with 20 long balls and 47 RBIs for the Knights over 86 games in 2010. The next year he compiled a .296 batting average with 20 home runs and 96 RBIs. His 40 home runs (over two seasons) rank seventh all-time in franchise history. Over his two years, he played third base, first base, DH, and right field for the Knights.

Chad Ogea - SP

The ace of the Charlotte Knights championship team in 1993 was Chad Ogea. At just 22 years old, Ogea posted a 13-8 mark with a 3.81 ERA in 29 starts. The Louisiana native tossed a team-high two complete games that season and tied for the league lead in wins (13) and games started (29). A year later, he was back in Charlotte and this time went 9-10 with a 3.85 ERA in 24 games (23 starts). Ogea also completed a league-high six games that season. His 22 combined wins are fourth-best in Knights franchise history.

Charlie Leesman - SP

Leesman went 12-10 with a 2.47 ERA for the Knights in 26 starts in 2012. The Ohio native finished second in the IL in ERA and was tied for third in wins with three other pitchers. His 12 wins helped lead the Knights to their first playoff appearance since 2006. He was named as an International League All-Star in 2012 as well. The lefty was back in 2013, pitching in 16 games for the Knights. With 223.1 innings pitched he qualifies for the Knights career ERA record. Leesman's franchise ERA of 3.02 ranks him fourth in club history.

Ross Gload - 1B

An IL All-Star in 2003, Gload finished third in the International League with a .315 batting average that season. Also that season, the powerful first baseman launched 18 home runs with 70 RBIs. He led the IL with 266 total bases and tied for second in doubles with 40. In 2005, Gload hit .366 with 15 home runs and 45 RBIs in just 59 games for the Knights. He is the Knights franchise leader in batting average with a stunning .332 mark.

Jim Thome - 3B

Thome, a future Hall-of-Famer, spent one season in Charlotte and it was a memorable one. At the young age of 22, Thome hit a league-best .332 with 25 home runs and 102 RBIs for the Knights, who went on to win their first International League championship in what was their first year in the league. Thome was a big part of the team and a year later, he became a staple in Cleveland's lineup.

Jordan Danks - OF

Danks spent parts of four seasons with the Knights and along with his exceptional defense, he was a force with the bat as well. He is in Knights franchise leader in triples with 12. He has 36 home runs and 165 RBIs in his Knights career and was the winner of a MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove Award in 2011. He ranks first in club history in walks, second in runs scored, second in at-bats, second in hits, third in doubles, and second in games played.

Joe Borchard - OF

Borchard is the Knights career leader in nearly every offensive category. For four-straight seasons (2002-05), Borchard was a staple in Charlotte's lineup. He hit 78 home runs over the four-year span and had 227 RBIs. His 439 hits are nearly 200 more than the next best player in Knights history. Borchard was a first round selection (12th overall pick) of the White Sox in the 2000 draft.

Sam Horn - DH

A 1993 All-Star, Horn led the power-packed Knights with 38 home runs - the most by a Knights player in a single-season! In all, the 6'5" slugger mashed .269 and drove home 96 RBIs. His home run total led the International League and helped lead the Knights to the International League Championship in their first year in the IL. Horn finished with 226 home runs over his 15-year Minor League career. He hit 62 Major League home runs as well.

Edwin Almonte - RP

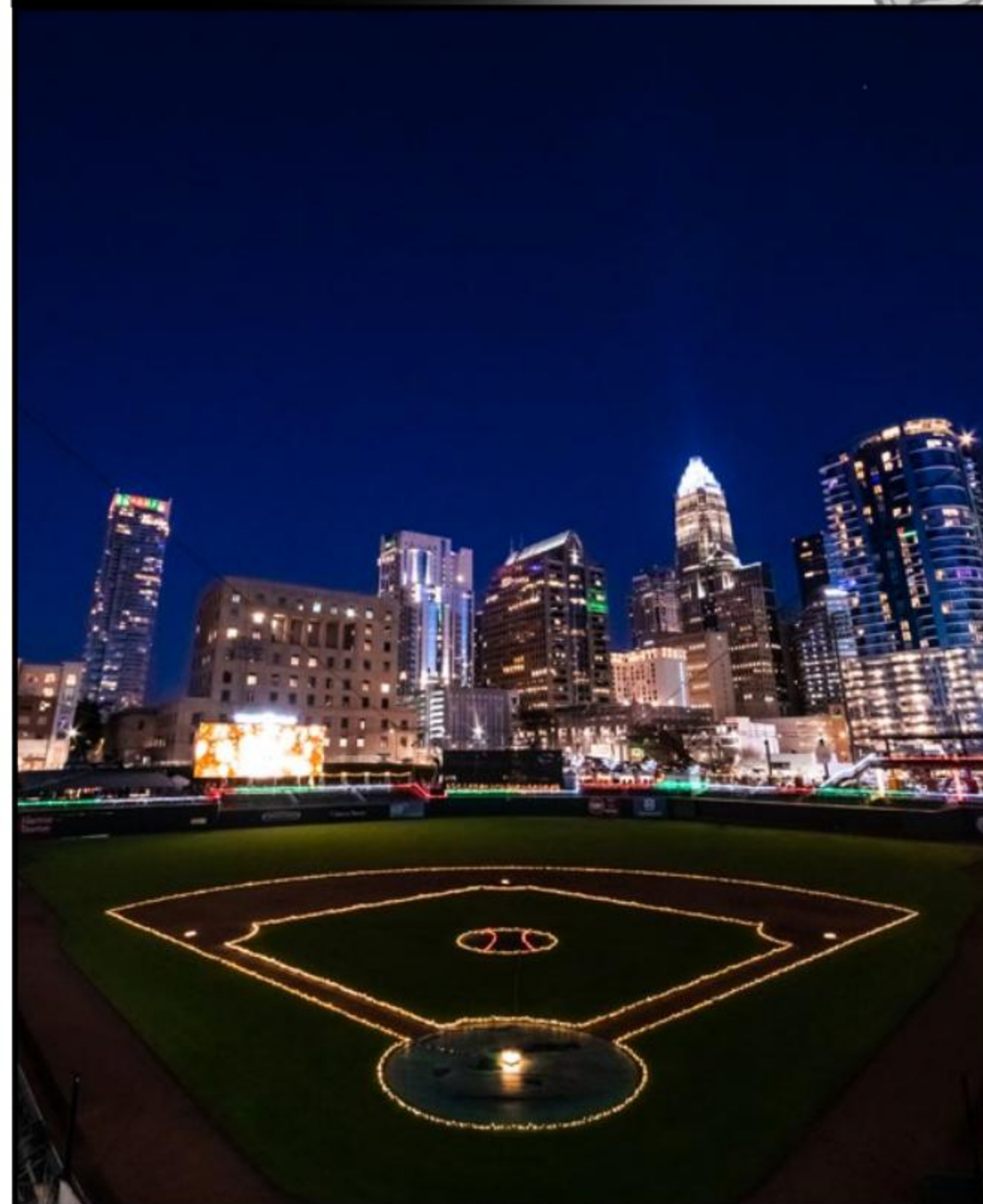
Almonte is the Knights franchise leader in saves for a season and a career. In 2002, Almonte saved 26 games, which still ranks as the all-time high in a season for a Knights reliever. The following season, he saved 14 games adding to his total. In all, Almonte's 40-career saves as a Knights reliever is the one more than Donn Pall's 39. Almonte could have had more saves too, but on July 1, 2003, he was traded to the New York Mets, along with Andrew Salvo and Royce Ring for Hall-of-Famer Roberto Alomar.

Donn Pall - RP

Pall spent three seasons playing at Knights Stadium and was a solid reliever for the club from 1996-98. Pall appeared in 28 games for the Knights in 1996 and saved a team-high 17 games. In all, Pall accumulated 39 saves over the three-year span and ranks second in Knights franchise history in that category. He's appeared in 126 games for the Knights, which also ranks second in Knights franchise history.

WHITE SOX EXHIBITION GAMES



EXHIBITION GAME RECAPS



2015: In the first major league exhibition game played within the city limits of Charlotte since 1984, the Charlotte Knights topped their parent club Chicago White Sox 10-2 in front of 10,556 fans at BB&T Ballpark - the second largest crowd in BB&T Ballpark history. The Knights used a trio of two-run home runs and scored in six of eight possible innings in the offensive display.

Jared Mitchell and Neftali Soto led the Knights offensive attack with three RBI apiece. Trayce Thompson joined Mitchell and Leury Garcia as the three Knights with a multi-hit effort, tallying three singles in his four at-bats. An error led to two unearned runs in the seventh inning, extending the Charlotte lead to 10-1. The Sox added a run in the ninth when George Kottaras doubled and scored on a Jason Coats single, cutting the lead to 10-2. The Knights pitching staff of Shawn Haviland, Junior Guerra, Jarrett Casey and Daniel Webb kept the major league hitters at bay, scattering eight hits over nine innings.



2018: Powered by a four-run second inning, the Chicago White Sox beat the Charlotte Knights 9-5 Monday in an exhibition game held at BB&T Ballpark for the first time since 2015. Reynaldo Lopez pitched 2.2 shutout innings and Avisail Garcia hit a two-run home run in the top of the second leading the way for the White Sox in their last tune-up before Opening Day.

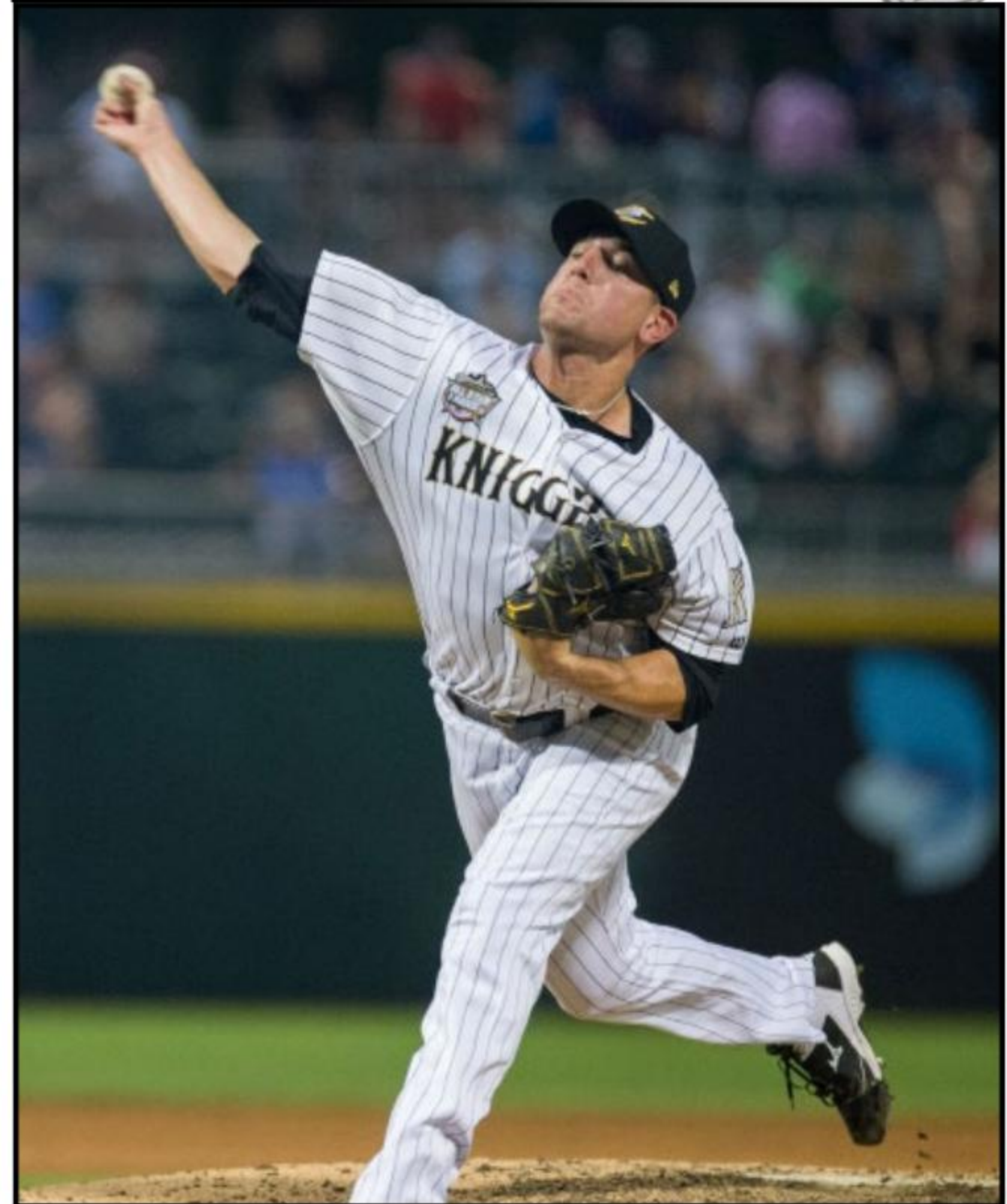
Donn Roach (0-1) got the starting nod for the Knights pitching four innings, surrendering seven hits and five runs to the White Sox. Charlotte's bullpen settled down as the game went on with its last three pitchers -- Thyago Vieira, Brad Goldberg, and Jorge Rondon--allowing just one run and no hits over the final three innings.

Matt Davidson got things going for the White Sox as he grounded into a fielder's choice to score former Knights second baseman Yoan Moncada to give the White Sox an early 1-0 lead in the first. Moncada put together a nice day at the plate for the White Sox going 2-for-2 with one RBI and one run scored. Other notable former Knights appearing in the game for the White Sox included Yolmer Sanchez, Juan Minaya, Danny Farquhar, Tyler Saladino, and Adam Engel.

The Knights broke through in the seventh inning as Patrick Leonard scored on a wild pitch followed by a two-run home run by Juan Perez to cut the deficit to 8-3. Casey Gillaspie added a home run of his own in the ninth inning, a solo shot off of Drew Hasler. The Knights managed eight hits on the day off a veteran White Sox pitching staff.



2016 TRIPLE-A ALL-STAR GAME

CHARLOTTE—After being in lock step through the first two rounds with Pawtucket (Red Sox)’s Chris Marrero, Reno’s Kyle Jensen knew he had to put up a big number in the final round if he wanted to win.

“If you go first, you have to set the bar high,” said Jensen, playing in the Diamondbacks organization at 28 years old. “That’s what I did, but the other guy just went on a freaking tear. It was fun to watch.”

After Jensen hit 17 in his round, Marrero—the 15th overall pick in 2006 by the Nationals—seemingly homered on every swing he took, hitting 18 to win the 2016 Triple-A Home Run Derby Tuesday night in Charlotte. And, thanks to a stretch of seven straight swings with a home run, Marrero did it with a full minute to spare.

“I knew I needed a lot of home runs, but the adrenaline just kept going,” Marrero said. “I kept going with the fans and swinging, and my guy throwing was throwing perfect.”



Marrero got in a groove with Mike Moore, a coach at the Carolina Baseball Center and a former catcher at Tennessee. The two linked up for a practice round in the batting cage, and both Marrero and Moore say they clicked.

“That was unbelievable. That was a display,” Moore said. “I just tried to put it where he wanted it. It was fun to watch him do it.”

Marrero hit 10 home runs in the first round and 16 in the second round, and the 18 home runs in three minutes of the final round gave him 44 bombs in just 11 minutes at the plate.

Jensen finished the first two rounds with the same numbers as Marrero, but took a much different route to get there. He went homerless in the first two minutes of the first round but exploded in the last two, hitting all 10 first round homers in the last two minutes.

“I was trying to get comfortable, trying to get relaxed,” Jensen said. “Once you get in that groove, you just have to go with it.”

Both Jensen and Marrero peppered the left field stands with balls, pulling balls off the scoreboard and onto a grassy knoll to the side of it. Each batter earned standing ovations from the crowd after multiple streaks of three-or-more straight swings with a homer, with Marrero’s streak of seven straight sending the crowd into pandemonium.

“Anytime you can go out and show the people what you can do, it’s a good time,” Jensen said. “But what he did? That’s impressive right there.”

Marrero said he didn’t think he’s hit homers on seven straight swings like tonight, but he’s thankful that he did after Jensen’s 17-homer round to start the finals.

“I thought, ‘Wow, this guy is unstoppable,’” Marrero said. “But I knew, if I got into a little groove, I had a chance. And it was fun. This is one of the best parks ever.”

Oklahoma City’s (Dodgers) Rob Segedin was the last batter in the first two rounds, leading all sluggers with 12 homers in the first round and putting up 13 in the second round. But he fell one homer short of a three-way tie with 25 home runs. Jesus Montero (Blue Jays) of Buffalo advanced with seven homers in the first round, but only hit five in the second round for a two-round total of 12.

Two batters—Toledo’s (Tigers) Chad Huffman and Riley Zayicek of Lake Norman High, Mooresville, N.C., one of the two high school participants—fell one homer short of the second round with six. Travis Taijeron of Las Vegas (Mets) hit five, and Trent Alley of Charlotte (N.C.) Country Day School hit two. In total, the fans in Charlotte witnessed 143 home runs on the night, with Marrero’s 44 earning him the championship belt. He said it is the coolest trophy he’s ever won.

“It’s a memory I’m going to remember for the rest of my life,” Marrero said.

2016 TRIPLE-A ALL-STAR GAME RECAP

CHARLOTTE, N.C. -- It's been a magical three-day run for Pawtucket's Chris Marrero.

The veteran outfielder/first baseman slugged a solo homer off the bench to earn MVP honors and put the finishing touch on the International League's 4-2 victory over the Pacific Coast League at the Triple-A All-Star Game on Wednesday night at BB&T Ballpark.

Two days after winning the Triple-A Home Run Derby, Marrero crushed a solo blast to center field in the eighth inning.

"Just came out here and had fun," said Marrero, who had two at-bats in a reserve role.

"[Iowa's Armando Rivero] gave me a good pitch to hit."

The 28-year-old, who spent 39 games with Charlotte last season, also was named IL Player of the Week on Monday. It was an All-Star Game defined by pitching, aside from a few home runs.

Indians No. 11 prospect Erik Gonzalez of the Columbus Clippers got the IL on the board with a solo shot in the bottom of the second. Lehigh Valley's Andrew Knapp, the Phillies' ninth-ranked prospect, tied the game with a solo homer off Reno's Braden Shipley in the fourth, clearing the wall in left for an opposite-field blast.

The IL scored the go-ahead run in the fifth on an RBI groundout by Lehigh Valley's Cam Perkins. Travis Tajeron of the Las Vegas 51s made his return trip to the Triple-A All-Star Game worth it. Playing the entire game at designated hitter, he opened the scoring with a two-run homer in the second and was named the PCL's Top Star.

"You'd love to move up and all that," Tajeron said. "[Las Vegas manager] Wally [Backman] preaches to give it 110 percent every game." Tajeron said he learned from last year's Midsummer Classic -- where he played as a reserve -- and made the most of his repeat appearance. "New town, new experience," he said. "Definitely having four at-bats, you get locked in. Definitely a full night."

Backman, who managed the PCL squad, said Tajeron has remained committed to improving and could fit in at the next level as a corner outfielder.

"I think Travis is motivated," Backman said. "He has been overlooked for a long time. ... I think someone is going to give a guy like that a chance."

Tajeron, 27, has been in the Mets organization since he was drafted out of Cal Poly Pomona in 2011. He has 13 homers for Las Vegas after smashing 25 last year. His All-Star blast came on a 1-2 pitch after he'd fallen into an 0-2 hole.

"Middle away, down, just where I like it," he said of the delivery from Rochester left-hander Jason Wheeler. "I knew I got it well."

For the IL, Gonzalez also had a moment in the field at shortstop to go with his home run. He began a ninth-inning double play with a quick flip in one of the game's dazzling defensive plays. "I did it [to] have fun with the game," Gonzalez said. "When I do that, it's really fun for me."

Durham Bulls right-hander Austin Pruitt got the win. A starter during the regular season, he threw a scoreless fifth inning on 16 pitches.

"I had no idea," he said of picking up the victory. "I was thinking about trying to get people out. I got through the inning with no runs [and one walk]."

IL pitchers combined on a three-hitter with nine strikeouts.

Clippers right-hander Shawn Armstrong came through in a clutch moment, entering with a runner on second base and one out in the seventh. He struck out D-backs No. 12 prospect Jack Reinheimer and Padres No. 15 prospect Carlos Asuaje to quell the threat.

The only player in the game with more than one hit was Rochester Red Wings second baseman Jorge Polanco, who had an infield single and a double for the IL.

Charlotte Knights baseball once again returns to the airwaves in 2021 as all 120 games can be heard on 730 The Game ESPN Charlotte. Back for his 23rd season with the Knights and 30th in professional baseball behind the microphone will be the "Voice of the Charlotte Knights" Matt Swierad. Long-time broadcaster Mike Pacheco returns for his 16th season to join Swierad in the "Matt Swierad Home Radio Booth" for all home broadcasts. Fans can also listen to the broadcast online at espnclt.com or charlotteknights.com.



TELEVISION INFORMATION

The Charlotte Knights will once again broadcast select games on TV for the 2021 season. The Knights and WMYT will partner to broadcast all Saturday and Sunday home games this season on My12. A total of 20 games (10 Saturday and 10 Sunday games) will be broadcast live. The "Voice of the Charlotte Knights" Matt Swierad will be joined in the booth by long-time team broadcaster Mike Pacheco.

BROADCASTERS

MATT SWIERAD - "VOICE OF THE KNIGHTS"

Since 1998, Swierad has been the "Voice of the Charlotte Knights". Most recently -- in 2017 -- the Knights named their home radio broadcast booth, "The Matt Swierad Home Radio Booth".

Swierad will embark on his 23rd campaign with the Knights in 2021 (24th year). He is the longest running broadcaster in team history and has called over 3,000 Knights games and over 3,300 in a professional career. Overall, the 2021 season will mark his 30th season as a broadcaster (31st year).

Prior to joining the Knights for the 1998 season, Swierad spent seven years in the Class-A South Atlantic League with the Hickory Crawdads (1994-97), Hagerstown Suns (1993) and Gastonia Rangers (1991-92). In addition to his work with the Knights, Swierad serves as the radio play-by-play Voice of Charlotte 49ers Basketball and Football. He also hosts the school's Basketball and Football Radio Coaches Shows. Over the course of his career, he has also handled television play-by-play duties for the Charlotte 49ers, UT Chattanooga, Jacksonville University, University of South Florida, the Southern Conference, the Sun Belt Conference, C-USA, the Big South Conference, SportsChannel Florida, Fox Sports Net and ESPN Regional Television.

During the 2005 season Swierad reached the big leagues for the first time, being selected from over 150 applicants to broadcast for the San Diego Padres. He sat-in for the legendary Friars broadcaster Jerry Coleman the last weekend in July while Coleman was inducted into the broadcasting wing of the Baseball Hall of Fame.

MIKE PACHECO - BROADCASTER & PRE-GAME SHOW HOST

Mike Pacheco enters his 16th season as analyst/play by play broadcast with the Charlotte Knights. Alongside the "Voice of the Knights" Matt Swierad, Pacheco can be heard on both radio and TV with the Knights. With over 28-years of broadcast experience, Pacheco is an experienced radio/TV play by play announcer, talk show host, reporter, studio host, sports anchor, consultant, event emcee and writer. Pacheco also hosts "The Knights Pregame Show" broadcast on the video board and throughout the stadium on the in-house channel at Truist Field.

Following baseball season, Pacheco is co-host and producer for both the CPI Security Postgame Show and the Panthers Wrap Show on the Carolina Panthers Radio Network and WBT Radio in Charlotte, NC. Pacheco, a 1991 graduate of Merrimack College (MA), joined the Winthrop Eagles broadcast staff in 2006, and is currently the Winthrop Basketball Voice alongside Dave Friedman. Pacheco is a former producer of the Boston Red Sox, Boston Celtic, Boston Bruins and Boston College football and basketball games while working in Boston for radio station, WEEI.



ITEMS OF INTEREST



Batting Average: Divide the number of hits by the number of at-bats.

Consecutive Game Hitting Streaks: A consecutive game hitting streak keeps going as long as a player keeps hitting. If he makes it through an entire game without a hit, there's still one chance to keep the streak alive: If he does not get an official at-bat. Simply put, if all the at-bats in a game result in a walk, getting hit by a pitch, reaching on defensive interference or laying down a sacrifice bunt, the streak is alive. There is a hitch: Sacrifice Flies do not count.

Consecutive Games Played Streak: A playing streak shall be extended if the player plays one half inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch running appearance shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game before he can comply with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

Earned Run Average (ERA): Multiply the number of earned runs by nine and divide that total by the number of innings pitched.

Fielding Percentage: Divide the total of putouts and assists by the total of putouts, assists and errors.

Holds: If a reliever comes into a game to protect a lead, gets at least one out and leaves without giving up that lead, he is credited with a hold. You cannot get a save and a hold in the same game.

Magic Number: Add one to the number of games left in the season, then subtract the number of games ahead in the loss column of the closest team.

On-Base Percentage Add hits, walks, hit by pitches, then divide by at-bats plus walks, hit by pitches and sacrifice flies.

Player Limit The Knights roster will feature 28 active players for the 2021 season.

Quality Start: Is a start when a pitcher lasts six or more innings and gives up three or less earned runs.

Saves: A pitcher earns a save by meeting all three of the following criteria: 1) he is the last pitcher in a game won by his club; 2) he is not the winning pitcher; 3) he qualifies under one of the following conditions: a) he enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches at least one inning, or b) he enters the game with the potential tying run either on base, at-bat or on deck, or c) he pitches effectively for at least three innings.

Slugging Percentage: Divide the total bases of all hits by the total times at-bat (at-bats do not include walks, sacrifices, hit by pitches or times awarded first base on interference or obstruction).
