

Ken Young - President



Ken Young has been the President of the Norfolk Tides since 1993, the year the team moved into Harbor Park. The previous year, Young put together an investor group to purchase the Tides from the New York Mets. Since taking over day-to-day control of the Tides, the club has experienced unprecedented success, averaging approximately 470,000 fans per year.

Young has been in the recreational food business for more than 30 years since graduating from Penn State University in 1972. Young has been involved in numerous Major League stadiums, arenas, and international events, and has worked in such exciting events as the Super Bowl, the World Series and the Olympics.

In the fall of 2006 Young headed an ownership group which purchased the Bowie Baysox and Delmarva Shorebirds, both of which were Maryland-based Orioles affiliates. Young also led an investment group in 2003 which purchased the Calgary Cannons. That club moved into a new stadium in 2003 in Albuquerque, New Mexico where it has averaged 600,000 fans per year.

Young and Tides Baseball, LP also purchased the Norfolk Admirals in 2004. The Admirals have been members of the ECHL and AHL and play their home games in downtown Norfolk.

Young is also on the Board of Trustees of Minor League Baseball, and heads up the licensing operations for college football's Outback Bowl in Tampa, FL. After the 2009 season, he was named as *Baseball America's* Minor League Executive of the Year.

Joe Gregory - General Manager

Joe Gregory was named the General Manager of the Tides on October 4, 2011. He has also served as the Vice President of the Norfolk Admirals Hockey Club since the 2008-2009 season.



Gregory came to Norfolk after serving as the General Manager of the Youngstown SteelHounds of the Central Hockey League from 2006-2008. In that capacity, Gregory ran the day-to-day operations of the SteelHounds. During Gregory's tenure in Youngstown, the season ticket base increased by 70 percent and he negotiated the team's first NHL affiliation.

Gregory graduated from Youngstown State University in 2001 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration. Upon graduation, Gregory worked as both the Coordinator of Tournament Operations and the Coordinator of Sales and Marketing at the Giant Eagle LPGA Classic in Vienna, Ohio. He had been working at the tournament as an operations assistant prior to that since high school. After his time with the LPGA, Gregory became the Director of Business Development for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers, a Short-Season Class-A baseball team affiliated with the Cleveland Indians. There, he oversaw all sponsorship and advertising sales and cultivated community relationships.

Dave Rosenfield - Executive VP and Sr. Advisor to the President



Dave Rosenfield first came to the Tides in 1962 and served as the General Manager of the club from 1963 - 2011. He was named the Executive Vice President and Senior Advisor to the President following the 2011 season.

Rosenfield has had a varied presence in the Norfolk area's pro sports scene. He has served as the GM of the Norfolk Neptunes (Continental Football League), was the interim GM of the Virginia Squires (American Basketball Association), and served as the GM of the Tidewater Sharks hockey club. He was a member of the inaugural class of the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame, which opened in 2008.

Rosenfield was named the "King of Baseball" at the Baseball Winter Meetings in Anaheim, CA in December of 2004. The "King of Baseball" is a long-standing tradition in which Minor League Baseball salutes a veteran from the world of professional baseball for long-time dedication and service to the game.

He is a four-time International League Executive of the Year and won the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues' top honor, the John H. Johnson President's Trophy, in 1993. He also accepted the Baseball America Triple-A Bob Freitas Award on behalf of the Tides in 1994, and 2013 will be his 37th-consecutive year as vice president of the International League.

He was inducted into the International League Hall of Fame in 2008, joining former manager Frank Verdi as the first members of the Tides organization to ever receive the honor.

Rosenfield has also broadcast Tides games throughout his tenure with the Tides. He joined the radio crew full time in 2013, serving as a broadcaster for all Norfolk home games.

PETE MICHAUD

The 2015 season is Pete Michaud's 9th as a broadcaster for the Tides on ESPN Radio 94.1. Previously, he's had stints as the play-by-play voice of the Springfield Cardinals of the Midwest League (1992-93), the Vero Beach Dodgers of the Florida State League (1995-96) and the Iowa Cubs of the Pacific Coast League (1998).



Michaud is well known as the longtime voice of the Norfolk Admirals hockey team, having spent over 21 years with the organization - including all 15 of their seasons in the American Hockey League. Additionally, Pete's resume includes five seasons of play-by-play work as the broadcaster for the Old Dominion University Monarchs men's and women's basketball programs - including NCAA and NIT tournament games - and 10 years of area high school football play-by-play. He has previously worked in local radio at WFOS, WLTY, WNIS and WTAR, while also serving as a weekend sports anchor for WAVY-TV 10 and WVEC-TV 13.

Michaud has been honored twice by the Chesapeake Athletic Club as Hampton Roads' Most Outstanding Sports Broadcaster, taking home the honor in 2009 and 2012. In 2009, he was selected by the Norfolk Sports Club for the prestigious Abe Goldblatt Award for Outstanding Local Sports Coverage. In 2012, he was the recipient of the James H. Ellery Memorial Award, an honor presented annually by the American Hockey League in recognition of outstanding media coverage.

When not on the air, Pete is an avid golfer and has worked for many years as a local baseball umpire with the Eastern Officials Association. Michaud is an honor graduate of Indian River High School in Chesapeake and Old Dominion University in Norfolk. He resides in Chesapeake. MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS: To obtain press credentials, call (757) 622-2222 Ext. 125 or email ilocke@norfolktides.com. All requests should be made at least 24 hours prior to game time to assure compliance. Credentials can be picked up at the Harbor Park offices or at the Will Call area located at the home plate entrance of the park. All additional requests should be made through the Media Relations Office.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers may work out of the camera pits located on the outfield ends of both dugouts. Other areas are available, but must be approved by the Tides prior to the game. At no time will photographers be allowed to obstruct a fan's view of the game, interfere with play on the field, or interfere with players in the dugout. Photographers MUST stay in the designated areas during play.

CLUBHOUSES: The Tides clubhouse is open to accredited media up to an hour prior to game time. There will be no admittance during games, during rain delays, or between games of a doubleheader unless approved by the field manager. Players and coaches will be made available 15 minutes after the conclusion of a game. Times are subject to change and will be communicated as soon as possible. The Training Room is off limits at all times. Any requests for interviews with visiting clubs should be set up in advance with the Tides Media Relations Department. Visitors in the clubhouse, including accredited media members, should conduct themselves in a professional manner. Autograph seeking, touching equipment or personal items in lockers, and sampling player food spreads are all prohibited. Clubhouse business should be conducted as expeditiously as possible with a minimum of disruption of regular game routines.

FIELD AND DUGOUTS: A general code is to be observed by the media so uniformed personnel may do their pre-game work unimpeded. The playing field and dugouts must be clear of all media 60 minutes prior to game time and remain so until after the game ends - with the exception of photographers as noted above. Photographers and credentialed media must stay on the warning track or in the dugouts at all times.

PRESS BOX: The press box is located on the fourth level of Harbor Park behind home plate. Each workspace is equipped with an electrical outlet, phone line, and wireless internet access. The press box is open to working media ONLY. Credentials are required for admittance and media must notify the Tides PR department if they intend to use the press box during games. The press box is a working environment.

GAME NOTES: Game notes, lineups and statistics are available in the press box approximately three hours prior to game time. Anyone needing information earlier should contact the media relations office.

INTERVIEWS: Interviews can be conducted with the coaching staff and players on the field or in the dugout prior to or after batting practice as long as the interview does not interrupt pre-game and practice routines. All pre-game interviews must be completed at least an hour prior to the scheduled game time. The coaching staff and players will be available in the clubhouse 15 minutes after the conclusion of a game.



2015 COACHING STAFF



Ron Johnson led the Tides to back-to-back winning seasons in 2012 & 2013, the first Tides manager to do so since Steve Swisher skippered the Tidewater Tides to winning records in 1990 (79-67) and 1991 (77-65).

Ron Johnson is the 26th Triple-A manager of the Norfolk Tides, and 2015 is his fourth year in the Orioles organization. Johnson led the Tides to a 65-79 record in 2014, and he's posted a 216-216 record over his first three seasons as Norfolk's manager. He enters the 2015 campaign just 68 wins shy of matching Gary Allenson's 284 victories for the most in Tides franchise history.

In 21 seasons as a minor league manager, Johnson has compiled a career record of 1,477-1,478. Prior to joining the O's system, Johnson served as the first base coach for the Boston Red Sox in 2010 and 2011. He managed in the Red Sox system from 2000-09, a stint that included a playoff berth for Triple-A Pawtucket in 2008 after an 85-58 campaign.

Johnson was a coach in the Kansas City Royals system from 1986-91 before taking his first managerial job in 1992. He posted six winning seasons in eight years managing in the Royals organization, and he guided three clubs to the postseason: Baseball City (1992), Wichita (1995) and Omaha (1999). He was named the 1995 Texas League Manager of the Year after guiding Double-A Wichita to the playoffs.

While in high school, Johnson turned down football scholarships to UCLA and Fresno State, choosing instead to play baseball at Fresno State. He was a First Team All-American in 1978 before being selected in the 24th round of the 1978 draft. He collected his first big league hit on September 25, 1982, a double off of Oakland's Tom Underwood. Johnson played in 22 Major League games over parts of three seasons with the Royals (1982-83) and Expos (1984), batting .261.

Randy Mobley
President
International League

Randy Mobley is in his 25th season as President of the International League after being conveyed the title at the Winter Meetings in December of 1990.

He started work in baseball as a part-time intern with the Columbus Clippers in 1980 in exchange for graduate school credit. After completing his schoolwork, Mobley moved into a full-time intern position with the Clippers before being hired as an Administrative Assistant in September, 1981.

Mobley moved on to become the Assistant Director of Advertising and Stadium Operations in November of that same year and remained in that position until November of 1982. He held two other positions with the Clippers (Director of Public Relations and Director of Group Sales) before leaving the club in November, 1985.

On November 1, 1985, Mobley was hired to fill the newly created position of Administrator of the International Baseball League and stayed at that post until being elected President of the American Association and Commissioner of the Triple-A Alliance.

A year later, he was elected as President of the International League. He retained his duties with the American Association and the Triple-A Alliance.

After the Triple-A Alliance dissolved in November, 1991, Mobley continued in his role as President of the International League of Professional Baseball Clubs.

During his post as President, Mobley has taken on many other duties including Chairman of Minor League Baseball Council of League Presidents (since 1992), Co-Chairman of the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues/Major League Baseball Rules and Policy Review Committee. He is the first person to be given the Warren Giles Award (presented annually to a league president by Minor League Baseball). He was also the 2002 recipient of the *Baseball America* Minor League Executive of the Year Award.

Mobley is a graduate of Otterbein College in Westerville, OH with a B.A. in Physical Education. He also holds a M.A. in Physical Education with a concentration in Sports Administration from The Ohio State University.

Mobley and his wife, Judy, have two sons - Taylor and Reid - and reside in the Columbus, OH area.

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE HALL OF FAME

Created by the International League Baseball Writers' Association, the International League Hall of Fame originated on June 12, 1947 when nine former players, managers and League officials were formally inducted into the Hall's first class. The induction included the unveiling of the International League Hall of Fame plaque at the League's New York City offices located in the Ruppert Building at 535 Fifth Avenue.

From 1948 until 1960, a class of three individuals was inducted into the HOF every year. In 1961, '62 and '63, a class of one was inducted annually. For unknown reasons, no inductions were made between 1964 and 2006, and the roster of inductees remained at 51. Speculation is that with the demise of the League's Writers' Association, the selection process went dormant.

With the passing of the only three-time International League Most Valuable Player (1953, '55, '58), two-time Triple Crown Winner (1955, '58) and IL Hall of Famer Glenn "Rocky" Nelson (class of '60) in October, 2006, no living Hall of Fame members remained.

In July, 2007, League Directors unanimously passed legislation during the League's All-Star Game meeting in Albuquerque, NM, to re-establish the Hall of Fame. Former League Presidents Harold Cooper and George Sisler, Jr. were inducted in 2007, while 27 additional inductees were chosen by the Anniversary Committee and enshrined in January, 2008.

A total of 14 inductees were enshrined in 2009, while seven inductees were announced in 2010. Beginning in 2011, up to three inductees will be nominated by fans, media and executives. Those nominated will then be elected by eligible voters.

2014 SEASON RECAP

Norfolk finished 65-79, placing them third in the International League South division.

- There were 55 different players that appeared in a game for the Tides, with 19 of those players also appearing on the active roster of the Baltimore Orioles at some point during the 2014 season.
 - The 19 players who played for both the Tides and Orioles included pitchers Brad Brach, Kevin Gausman, Miguel Gonzalez, Preston Guilmet, Ubaldo Jimenez (MLB Rehab), T.J. McFarland, Evan Meek, Troy Patton (MLB Rehab), Ramon Ramirez, Joe Saunders, Josh Stinson and Ryan Webb, infielders Steve Lombardozzi, Jimmy Paredes, Cord Phelps and Jemile Weeks, outfielder Quintin Berry and catchers Caleb Joseph and Steve Clevenger.
 - Norfolk led the International League with 1,322 hits, five more than Scranton/Wilkes-Barre's 1,317 hits. The 1,322 hits were the second-most in franchise history, trailing the 1,331 hits registered by the 1987 Tidewater Tides.
 - Despite leading the league in hits, Norfolk ranked last in the IL in extra-base hits with 336 (227 doubles, 30 triples, 79 home runs).
 - Norfolk led the International League by hitting into 145 double plays in 144 games. That total was 18 more than any other club.
 - The Tides led the league with 10 wins when trailing after seven innings and were tied with Scranton/WB for the league lead with five wins when trailing after eight innings. Norfolk went 47-1 when taking a lead into the ninth inning, second-best in the IL behind the 65-0 mark registered by Columbus.
 - The Tides finished third in the IL with a .269 team average and ranked 12th in the league with a 4.42 team ERA.
 - Norfolk set a franchise record with 23 hits in a win at Indianapolis on May 9.
 - Norfolk's pitching staff set a franchise record with 20 strikeouts in a win at Indianapolis on May 10.
 - The Tides set a Harbor Park record by scoring 11 runs in the 5th inning of a win vs. Louisville on May 13. Norfolk trailed that contest 8-0 before winning 14-8.
 - The Tides finished with an IL-best record of 20-8 during the month of July.
 - Norfolk led the IL with a 3.01 team ERA in August.
 - Norfolk had three players named as International League Players of the Week: Francisco Peguero (5/19-5/25), Steve Clevenger (6/2-6/8) and Mike Wright (8/18-8/24).

Christian Walker

- In 139 games between Double-A Bowie and Norfolk, Walker hit .288 with 26 home runs and 96 RBI. He opened the season with Bowie and joined the Tides after the All-Star break.
 - Named an Eastern League midseason and postseason All-Star.
 - At the time of his promotion to Norfolk (July 17), he ranked among Eastern League leaders in total bases (1st, 189), RBI (1st, 77) and home runs (2nd, 20).
 - Named to Baseball America's 2nd-Team Minor League All-Star Team.
 - Led Orioles minor leaguers in home runs (26) and RBI (96).
 - His 26 home runs tied for the 22nd-most among all minor leaguers, while his 96 RBI tied for the 15th-most in the minors.
 - Hit first Triple-A home run on July 27 at Columbus, a solo shot off of Mark Lowe.
 - With Bowie, hit safely in 22 straight road games from April 11 to May 24, over which he hit .398 (37-93) with six home runs and 20 RBI. The 22-game streak was the longest in the Eastern League in 2014.

Dariel Alvarez

- In 135 games between Bowie and Norfolk, he hit .306 with 15 home runs, 37 doubles and 87 RBI. He opened the season with the Baysox before joining the Tides after the All-Star break (July 17).
 - At the time of his promotion to Norfolk, he ranked among Eastern League leaders in hits (1st, 111), RBI (3rd, 68) and average (8th, .309).
 - Named to the Eastern League midseason and postseason All-Star Teams.
 - Represented the Orioles in the MLB Futures Game, going 0-for-2 in the contest for the World Team during the All-Star festivities in Minnesota.
 - Opened the year by hitting safely in each of Bowie's first 15 games, over which he

hit .328 (20-61) with one home run, seven doubles and 13 RBI.

- Put together a career-high 17-game hitting streak with Norfolk from August 11-28, a stretch that was tied for the fourth-longest in the International League in 2014. Over that span, he hit .369 (24-65) with one home run, eight doubles and nine RBI.
- Ranked among Orioles minor leaguers in home runs (T-2nd, 15), RBI (2nd, 87) and batting average (5th, .306).
- Hit safely in 37 of 44 games with Norfolk after his promotion.
- Hit first Triple-A home run on August 21 at Durham, a three-run homer off of Durham's Nathan Karns.

Tyler Wilson

- In 28 starts between Bowie and Norfolk, he went 14-8 with a 3.67 ERA. He opened the year with Bowie before making his first start with the Tides on July 3.
- Led Orioles minor leaguers with 14 wins and 157 strikeouts.
- Ranked 7th among O's farmhands with a 3.67 ERA.
- His 14 wins tied for the third-most among all minor league pitchers, trailing the 17 wins registered by Red Sox farmhand Henry Owens and the 15 wins by Rockies minor leaguer Antonio Senzatela.
- Finished 4-0 with a 1.57 ERA (8 ER, 46.0 IP) in seven starts at Harbor Park.
- Registered 17 Quality Starts between Bowie and Norfolk. Despite not joining the Tides until July 3, he ranked third on the club with six Quality Starts.

At the time of his promotion to Norfolk, he ranked among Eastern League leaders in wins (2nd, 10), strikeouts (2nd, 91), innings pitched (5th, 96.2) and strikeouts per 9.0 IP among starting pitchers (5th, 8.47).

- Named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on April 28 after going 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA and 18 strikeouts over a two-start stretch.
- Among Norfolk's starting pitchers who made more than two starts, threw the fewest average pitches per inning (15.33).
- Struck out a season-high 10 over 6.0 shutout innings vs. Charlotte on August 27.

Mike Wright

- In 26 starts during his first full season at Triple-A, he went 5-11 with a 4.61 ERA.
- Over his final seven starts, he went 4-2 with a 0.95 ERA (5 ER, 47.1 IP), 35 hits allowed, 37 strikeouts and eight walks. He held opposing batters to a .202 average over that span.
- Did not allow an earned run over his final three starts. Over that span, he allowed two unearned runs on eight hits and six walks while striking out 24 over 22.2 IP.
- Ended the season by not allowing an earned run over his final 24.2 innings (August 10 - August 29), a stretch that is just 2.0 innings shy of matching the franchise record of 26.2 innings, set by LHP Royce Ring in 2006.
- Took a no-hitter into the ninth inning on August 21 at Durham. The Bulls got their first hit of that contest on a two-out, two-strike double by Mikie Mahtook, one batter after shortstop Alexi Casilla made a throwing error.
- Took a no-hitter into the seventh inning in game one of a doubleheader vs. Durham on August 29 before Mikie Mahtook lined a one-out single to break up the no-hit bid.
- His 26 starts tied for the 5th-most in the International League. The 26 starts were also tied for the most by a Tides pitcher since Norfolk became an O's affiliate in 2007.
- Named the International League Pitcher of the Week on August 25 after striking out a career-high 11 while allowing one hit over 8.2 innings on August 21 at Durham.

Evan Meek

- In 39 games with Norfolk, went 2-0 with 16 saves and a 1.94 ERA.
- Did not allow a run over his final 13 appearances (July 25 through the end of the season). Over that span, he allowed seven hits and one walk while striking out 11 over 13.0 innings.
- Did not allow a run in 34 of 39 outings, including 31 of his final 36 appearances.
- Registered 37 walks while issuing just four walks over 41.2 innings.
- His 16 saves ranked second among Orioles minor leaguers.
- Posted a 0.52 ERA (1 ER, 17.1 IP) in 17 games after the All-Star break.





Tides History



Chris Tillman, who ranks among Tides franchise leaders in strikeouts and wins, went 13-6 with a 3.34 ERA for Baltimore in 2014. He also made a career-high 34 starts, a total that tied for the most among American League pitchers.

TEAM HISTORY

The city of Norfolk had been without pro baseball since the Tars of the Piedmont League folded on July 13, 1955. The Portsmouth Merrimacs finished that season, but the league folded after the season.

A South Atlantic League exhibition game was held in Portsmouth at Lawrence Stadium and was followed

by a study by Joe Ryan and Marshall Fox (who became the first General Manager of the Tides) to bring baseball back to the area. A Tidewater franchise in the South Atlantic League was granted in 1961 to businessman William McDonald of Miami, FL.

The name "Tides" was selected in a contest conducted by The Virginian-Pilot. Mariners was the name of choice, but editor Robert Mason liked the sound and alliteration of Tidewater Tides.

The team operated in the South Atlantic League for two years, the first as an independent, and the second with a Cardinal working agreement. Granny Hamner, the former Phillie Whiz Kid, became the first manager.

In 1963, the Sally League decided against continuing in Virginia because of travel requirements, and the prospect

of losing baseball again loomed. However, Dave Rosenfield, assistant general manager in 1962, led a local group to gain admittance to the Carolina League in tandem with a Peninsula franchise.

The Tides operated in the Carolina League for six years under Tidewater Professional Sports, Inc., which was led by the late Richard J. Davis, a former lieutenant governor of Virginia.

In 1969, the New York Mets moved their Triple-A International League franchise from Jacksonville, FL to Tidewater. T.P.S. Inc. continued to run the team, but it was owned by the Mets. That first year in Triple-A was played in Portsmouth's Lawrence Stadium and the Tides went on to win the pennant under manager Clyde McCullough. At the same time, the Mets helped the City of Norfolk finance the construction of 6,200 seat Met Park.

The Tides won Governors' Cup championships in 1972, '75, '82, '83 and '85. During that time, the Tides competed in the first and last Fall Classic of Minor League Champions, the last Junior World Series, and they won the first Triple-A World Series in 1983 - a fall classic that was not played again until 1998.

Mike Cubbage's 1987 team won the International League pennant by virtue of having the best record, and several individual team records were set before the Tides were upset in the playoffs.

The 1990 and 1991 teams were led by former big league catcher, Steve Swisher. He led the team to a pair of second-place finishes in the International League's West Division.

Former Tide Clint Hurdle managed the Tides in 1992, although the team struggled to one of the worst records in team history. Not only did the Tides lose a club record 86 games, but an entire homestand (eight games) was rained out in mid-August.

Ground was broken on a new state-of-the-art facility in downtown Norfolk in February, 1992. This facility would prove to be the model for all minor league stadiums to be built in the future, as the Tides would begin play at Harbor Park in 1993.

Also in 1992, the Mets agreed to sell the franchise to a group led by businessman Ken Young. This, coupled with the move to the new ballpark, brought about many changes for the Tides. The club dropped the Tidewater name in favor of Norfolk to give the team a national geographic presence. Also, the City of Norfolk was quite instrumental in keeping the team in the area by getting the new stadium financed and built.

The Tides set a franchise record for attendance in 1993 when 542,040 fans bought tickets to a game at Harbor Park. General Manager Dave Rosenfield won his 4th IL Executive of the Year Award and the team won its first John H. Johnson President's Trophy from the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues. This award is emblematic of the "complete" baseball franchise. It is based on the club's history and commitment to the community, as well as success financially and at the box office.

In 1994, the Tides won the Triple-A Bob Freitas Award from *Baseball America*, and the club once again set an attendance record with 557,586 fans.

The 1995 season was Harbor Park's first foray into postseason play as the Tides tied the franchise record with 86 wins, which was also accomplished in 1975. It was the Tides first taste of the playoffs since 1988. Yet another attendance record was set (3rd consecutive year) at 586,317. The Tides were selected by *Baseball America* as its "Team-of-the-Year," as more than a dozen players graduated to the Major League level during the year.

Bobby Valentine became the first manager to return for a second tour of duty in team history in 1996. For the second time in as many seasons, the Tides made the playoffs. This time, Columbus dispatched the Tides in the first round en route to the championship. The Tides had their manager called up to the Majors for the first time during a season. Valentine replaced Dallas Green at the helm of the Mets on August 26th and took long-time pitching coach Bob Apodaca with him.

The Tides drew in excess of 500,000 fans for the fifth consecutive season in 1997 and missed the playoffs by just 1.5 games under first-year manager Rick Dempsey.

The Tides hosted the 11th Annual Triple-A All-Star Classic in 1998 to rave reviews in front of a national television and radio audience. Manager Rick Dempsey and his team finished the season with a 70-72 record as they finished 2nd in the South Division of the expanded IL, behind newcomer Durham.

Another former player returned as manager in 1999 as John Gibbons led the Tides to a winning record with a mark of 77-63. It was not enough to overcome Durham, however, as the Bulls won 83 games. The biggest news of 1999 was the installation of TidesVision, the first television replay board in Hampton Roads.

MET PARK

Gibbons returned for the 2000 season to lead the Tides to a 65-79 record, placing them in 3rd in the International League's Southern Division.

Gibbons led the 2001 team to a South Division Regular Season Championship, as the team clinched the championship with two weeks left to play in the regular season. After some September 1st call-ups, the Tides roster was depleted, and Norfolk fell to Louisville in the opening round of the postseason.

The 2002 season, Norfolk's 10th at Harbor Park, was one of mediocrity on the field. New manager Bobby Floyd led the Tides to a 70-73 record, good for 3rd place in the South Division. Marco Scutaro was named an All-Star Shortstop and seven different Tides made their Major League debuts.

The Tides finished the 2003 season 67-76, 3rd in the IL South Division. The season started with the Mets top prospect Jose Reyes at shortstop, and the youngster stole 26 bases before his promotion in June. The season was also highlighted by a rehab appearance by catcher Mike Piazza. The Tides set top 10 attendance and homestand records as area fans flocked to the ballpark to get a glimpse of the All-Star.

The 2004 Tides finished the season at 72-72, placing them third in the IL South Division. The season was highlighted by the promotion of Chesapeake native David Wright to the Tides in mid-June. Wright hit .298 with 8 home runs and 17 RBI in 31 games with Norfolk before being promoted to New York in July.

The Tides returned to the playoffs in 2005, as manager Ken Oberkfell helped the Tides win the South Division by a record 14.0 games. Pitcher Jason Scobie earned the starting nod at the Triple-A All-Star game and eventually tied a Tides franchise record with 15 wins, while Brian Daubach powered Norfolk's offense throughout the season. The Tides fell to eventual league champion Toledo in five games in the semifinals of the playoffs.

Norfolk struggled to a 57-84 mark in 2006, using a season-ending five-game winning streak to avoid posting the worst record in franchise history. 26 different Tides appeared in the major leagues, including John Maine and Oliver Perez, who both pitched tremendously for the parent New York Mets during the postseason. 2006 turned out to be the 38th and final year for the Tides as the Mets Triple-A affiliate, as Norfolk partnered with the Baltimore Orioles after the season concluded.

The 2007 season got off to a great start, as the Baltimore Orioles defeated the Washington Nationals in a Major League spring training game in front of a sellout crowd at Harbor Park. Mike Cervenak became the first Tides player to lead the league in hits in 11 years, while local product Jason Dubois was one of five Norfolk players to reach double figures in home runs. Norfolk finished the season 69-74.

The Tides struggled at the outset of the 2008 season, as they opened up the month of July a season-low 23 games under .500 and 15.0 games out of first place. However, over the final two months of the season the Tides crept to within 5.5 games of first place during the final two weeks of the season. The late charge was not enough, as Norfolk finished the year 64-78, placing them second in the division.


The 2009 Tides found themselves with the top record in all of minor league baseball (34-15) when play began on June 1, but that success was limited once the club lost several players to Baltimore, including Nolan Reimold, Matt Wieters, Brad Bergesen, and David Hernandez. Strong pitching performances by youngsters Chris Tillman and Jake Arrieta helped Norfolk end the year at 71-71.

The 2010 season saw a midseason managerial change, as Bobby Dickerson replaced Gary Allenson on June 4 after Allenson was promoted to the Baltimore Orioles coaching staff. The season was highlighted by a nine-inning no-hitter from 22-year-old Chris Tillman, who tossed the gem on April 28 at Gwinnett. Norfolk ended the season 67-77, placing them third in the IL South Division.

The Tides endured a slow start to their 2011 campaign, as an opening 1-8 road trip set the tone for a 56-87 record, Norfolk's worst-ever mark in the International League. Seven different Tides sluggers reached double digits in home runs, led by the 19 homers belted by infielder Josh Bell.

Norfolk returned to its winning ways in 2012, as new manager Ron Johnson navigated a staggering amount of roster moves to guide the Tides to a 74-70 record - Norfolk's first winning season as an Orioles affiliate. The Tides set an IL record by using 75 different players, and Norfolk tied the league record by using 25 different starting pitchers. Norfolk finished in 2nd place in the IL South, and 5.0 games back of the IL Wild Card. More importantly, there were 26 players to appear for both the Tides and Orioles, as Baltimore advanced to the postseason for the first time since 1997.

The 2013 Tides nearly returned to the postseason, as Norfolk took a one-game lead in the Wild Card standings into the final day of the season, only to see Rochester pull even with the Tides. Norfolk and Rochester each finished with 77-67 records, but the Red Wings advanced to the postseason due to winning the season series between the two clubs. Norfolk closer Jairo Asencio led the league with 28 saves and was named to the postseason All-Star team.

In Ron Johnson's third year at the helm of the Tides, Norfolk finished in third place with a 65-79 mark. The Tides led the league in hits despite only two players reaching double digits in home runs. Twenty one different players played for both the Tides and Orioles, as Baltimore won the American League East Division for the first time since the 1997 campaign. The O's defeated the Detroit Tigers in the Division Series before falling to the Kansas City Royals in the American League Championship Series.



HARBOR PARK



Harbor Park, with its outstanding view and sound design, was opened in 1993. The ballpark is located in downtown Norfolk on the Elizabeth River, and the Tides christened their new home on 4/14/93 with a 2-0 victory against the Ottawa Lynx.

Talks of a new stadium for the Tides began during the 1990 season. Several sites were discussed, and the area known as "Bessie's Place" in downtown Norfolk was selected due to the nationwide success of downtown ballparks. Ground was broken in February of 1992 and work began shortly after.

HOK Sports Facilities Group of Kansas City, Mo. (currently known as Populous) was chosen to design the crown jewel on the Norfolk waterfront. HOK Sports Facilities Group has also designed some of the finest major league parks, including Oriole Park at Camden Yards in Baltimore, PNC Park in Pittsburgh, Comerica Park in Detroit, PETCO Park in San Diego, Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia, Citi Field in New York and the new Yankee Stadium.

The design team, led by Earl Santee, elected to create a nautical image with shipyard crane-like light towers and arrays of colorful flags. However, it also had to fit into the downtown business scene, and the brick exterior of the stadium was selected for just that purpose.

Harbor Park features nearly 9,000 lower-deck seats, 2,800 upper-deck seats, and 400 seats in 24 luxury skyboxes. The park also features a 225-seat restaurant known as "Hits at the Park," a climate-controlled facility that offers a complete view of the playing field. Two LED video boards were installed in the right field scoreboard prior to the 2006 season, while three LED ribbon boards were installed prior to the 2013 season. A 3,000-person, tiered picnic area overlooks left field, which increases Harbor Park's total capacity to 11,856. An additional party deck was built in right field prior to the 2009 season which moved the right field fence in 20 feet. The playing surface was completely renovated prior to the 2014 season, with the center field fences moved in 10 feet. The Harbor Park field dimensions are 333 ft in LF, 400 ft in CF, and 318 ft in RF.

The facility is owned by the City of Norfolk. Its construction was financed by rent paid by the Tides and other revenue from non-baseball events held in the facility. The total cost of construction for the stadium exceeded \$16 million.

Harbor Park was selected by *Baseball America* as the finest minor league facility in the United States in 1995.




