

## 2019 CORPUS CHRISTI HOOKS FINAL REPORT

66-73 | $4^{\text {th }}$ in TL South Division, 7.0 GB $\mid 6^{\text {th }}$ Overall in Texas League

2019 in Review: The Corpus Christi Hooks posted their second losing record since 2015, going 66-73 (.475) overall to finish last in the four-team Texas League South Division. The Hooks were sixth in the eight-team Texas League, ahead of Springfield (60-80) and Northwest Arkansas (57-81).

- First Half: At 33-36, the Hooks finished $3^{\text {rd }}$ in the South Division first half race, which ended on Monday, June 17 vs. Arkansas. Corpus Christi finished 1.5 games behind first-half champion Amarillo and 0.5 games behind Midland as the Hooks went 3-7 over their final 10 games to conclude the half.
- Second Half, Same Story: Corpus Christi suffered a similar fate in the second half, finishing fourth in the division at 33-37. The Hooks ended the season 2-8 over their final 10 games and were eliminated from playoff contention on August 29 in a loss to Arkansas

1,000 Wins for CC: With their 7-6 victory vs. Northwest Arkansas on Wednesday, April 24 at Whataburger Field, the Corpus Christi Hooks earned their $1,000^{\text {th }}$ win in franchise history in all-time game No. 1,975. As of 2019, Corpus Christi owns a record of $1,056-1,038$ (.504) since the club's inception in the Texas League in 2005.
Six Million at Whataburger Field: The Hooks welcomed their six millionth fan to Whataburger Field on Sunday, July 21 vs. Springfield. Through 2019, Corpus Christi ranks second behind Frisco in Texas League total attendance with 6,093,212 fans through the gates.
Homer Happy: The Hooks smashed a club-record 163 home runs in 2019, eclipsing the previous franchise high of 158 set by the 2013 squad. Infielder Jonathan Arauz clubbed the record-breaker on August 30 vs. Tulsa right-

The 163 homers ranked third among MiLB teams below the Triple-A level behind Double-A Tulsa (169) and Advanced-A Rancho Cucamonga (165), both Dodgers affiliates. Ronnie Dawson (17), Abraham Toro (16), Seth Beer (16), Granden Goetzman (15), Colton Shaver (15), Osvaldo Duarte (12) and Lorenzo Quintana (11) all reached double digits in long balls. Hooks hitters also set a franchise record for triples with 39, topping the 2006 Texas League Championship team that hit 37. Duarte and Stephen Wrenn led the way with eight triples each, which tied them for third in the Texas League.

Punchout Prowess: Hooks pitchers set a Texas League record with 1,453 strikeouts, shattering the previous mark of 1,319 set in 2018 by Corpus Christi. Among all MiLB clubs, the Hooks ranked fourth overall and tops among Double-A and Triple-A teams, behind only Advanced-A Rancho Cucamonga $(1,497)$, Modesto $(1,479)$ and Fayetteville $(1,476)$. Hooks hurlers also held opposing hitters to a minuscule . 221 average, ranking fifth among all full-season MiLB teams and smashing the previous club mark of .235 set in 2018.

Toro on Top: Astros infielder Abraham Toro had a sparkling breakout season in 2019, the majority of which he spent with Corpus Christi. The 22-year-old combined to bat . 324 ( 143 -for- 442,31 2B, 4 3B, 17 HR, 82 R, 80 RBI, 58 BB, 4 SB, .411 OBP, .938 OPS) in 114 games between CC and Triple-A Round Rock. In 98 games with the Hooks, he hit . 306 (115-for- 376 , 16 HR, 65 R, 70 RBI, 48 BB, 4 SB, .393 OBP, .906 OPS), leading the Texas League in OBP and OPS. The Greenfield Park, Quebec native made his MLB debut with Houston on $8 / 22$ vs. Detroit and hit his first MLB home run on $8 / 29$ vs. Tampa Bay. He earned Houston's Minor League Player of the Year Award and Corpus Christi Player of the Year in addition to being named a Texas League Midseason and Postseason All-Star.

Javier's Flair: Right-hander Cristian Javier dominated across three levels in 2019, combining to go 8-3 with a 1.74 ERA ( 22 ER in $113.2 \mathrm{IP}, 51 \mathrm{H}, 7 \mathrm{HR}, 59 \mathrm{BB}, 170 \mathrm{SO}, 4 \mathrm{SV}, .130 \mathrm{BAA}, 0.97$ WHIP) in 26 games (18 starts). After earning his promotion from Advanced-A Fayetteville on $5 / 15$, he went $6-3$ with a sparkling 2.07 ERA ( 17 ER in 74.0 IP ) with 114 strikeouts, a 124 opponents' average, a 0.95 WHIP and was 3 -for- 3 in save chances in 17 games ( 11 starts) with the Hooks. He never allowed more than four hits in any of his appearances. The 22-year-old was promoted to Triple-A Round Rock on 8/23. He was named Houston's Minor League Pitcher of the Year Award, Corpus Christi Pitcher of the Year and made MLB Pipeline's All-Prospect Second Team of the Year.

Colton's Clouts: Half of infielder/catcher Colton Shaver's hits (21-of-42) in his Double-A debut season went for extra bases, including 15 long balls in just 55 games with the Hooks. Promoted from Advanced-A Fayetteville on 6/16, the 2017 39 th -round pick of the Astros led the Texas League in home runs after the 6/23 All-Star Break with 13. He hit clouts in back-to-back games on five occasions (6/236/27, 7/4-7/6, 7/28-7/29, 7/29-7/30, 8/28-8/29), including three in two games spanning the All-Star Break from 6/23-6/27. The 24-year-old combined to hit . 248 (99-for-399) with 28 doubles, one triple, 21 homers and 72 RBIs between the two levels and was assigned to the Arizona Fall League to continue his season.

Grand Central: The Hooks' six grand slams in 2019 led the Texas League and matched the franchise high-water mark, joining the 2012, '15 and ' 16 squads. Four different players swatted slams: Granden Goetzman (4/27 vs. TUL, off LHP Michael Boyle), Abraham Toro (5/31 at FRI, off RHP Blake Bass), Colton Shaver (7/6 vs. Midland, off RHP Charles Hall) and Lorenzo Quintana with a club-record of three, all coming within a 12-day span (7/3 at FRI, off RHP Emmanuel Clase; 7/7 vs. Midland walkoff, off RHP John Gorman; 7/14 at Midland, off RHP Daulton Jeffries).

Prospect Watch: Thirteen members of MLB.com's preseason Houston Astros Top 30 Prospects list played for the Hooks in 2019 (preseason ranks in parentheses): Forrest Whitley (No. 1), J.B. Bukauskas (No. 6), Bryan Abreu (No. 8), Seth Beer (No. 10), Ronnie Dawson (No. 13), Brandon Bielak (No. 15), Tyler Ivey (No. 17), Dean Deetz (No. 20), Luis Santana (No. 21),
J.J. Matijevic (No. 22), Abraham Toro (No. 23), Jonathan Arauz (No. 25) and Enoli Paredes (No. 28).
Hooks to H-Town: Including MLB rehabs, 10 players saw action with both the Hooks and Houston Astros this season: RHP Bryan Abreu, IF Aledmys Diaz, RHP Collin McHugh, RHP Brad Peacock, RHP Ryan Pressly, RHP Joe Smith, OF George Springer, C Max Stassi, INF Abraham Toro and RHP Jose Urquidy. Three made their MLB debuts: Urquidy ( $7 / 2$ at COL), Abreu ( $7 / 31$ at CLE) and Toro (8/22 vs. DET). Additionally, INF Josh Rojas, who began 2019 with Corpus Christi, made his MLB debut with Arizona (8/12 at COL) following a midseason trade.
Playoff Pitch: Right-handers Jose Urquidy and Bryan Abreu each made their MLB postseason debuts with the Astros in 2019. Urquidy, who was Corpus Christi's Opening Night starter, was included on the roster throughout, going 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA ( 1 ER in 10.0 IP, $2 \mathrm{BB}, 12 \mathrm{SO}$ ) in four games ( 1 start). Abreu, who began the year with Advanced-A Fayetteville, made the ALCS staff, allowing two runs on two hits and two walks in 0.2 innings in Game 1.
A Roster a Day: Corpus Christi used 68 different players via 108 roster moves in 2019, compared to 58 players used in 2018. Sixteen Hooks players earned firsttime promotions to Triple-A Round Rock: P Brandon Bielak, P Ronel Blanco, OF Ronnie Dawson, P Justin Ferrell, P Cristian Javier, P Carson LaRue, OF Chas McCormick, P Colin McKee, C Lorenzo Quintana, IF Josh Rojas, P Kit Scheetz, IF Anibal Sierra, IF Abraham Toro, P Jose Urquidy, P Gabriel Valdez and OF Stephen Wrenn.

About Lopez: 2018 Texas League Manager of the Year Omar Lopez is 148129 (.534) in 277 games as Corpus Christi's skipper since the start of 2018. Lopez, the seventh skipper in CC's 16-year history, has a career record of 645-643 (.501) in $\mathbf{1 , 2 8 8}$ games through 12 seasons as a MiLB manager in the Astros' organization with Buies Creek (2017), Quad Cities (2013-14, '16), Lancaster (2015), Greeneville (2011-12), the GCL Astros (2009-10) and the VZL Astros (2008). The former MiLB infielder has spent 21 years in the Houston organization.

Freshman Staff: Lopez's field staff included all first-year Hooks coaches. Pitching coach Graham Johnson joined the team from Class-A Quad Cities and performance coach Ryan Engels came from the AZL Mariners, while hitting coach Tim LaMonte and strength coach Terrence Kennell held their first roles in professional baseball.

Red-Hot Rojas: Infielder Josh Rojas began 2019 as an unrated Astros prospect by most major publications but proved to be one of the top players in Minor League Baseball by season's end. Rojas torched Texas League pitchers to the tune of .322 ( 55 -for-171, 13 2B, 2 3B, 8 HR, 29 R, 30 RBI, 13 SB, .967 OPS) in 44 games. Seven of his eight home runs came during a seven-game tear from 5/21-5/28; each were solo blasts, including two on back-to-back days at Amarillo on $5 / 21-5 / 22$. He earned Texas League Player of the Week on $5 / 26$, hitting .516 (16-31, $32 \mathrm{~B}, 6 \mathrm{HR}, 11 \mathrm{R}, 7 \mathrm{RBI}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 1.194 \mathrm{OPS}$ ) in seven games leading to his promotion to Triple-A Round Rock on $5 / 29$. Rojas was included in the trade to Arizona that netted Zack Greinke to Houston. Rojas made his MLB debut with the D-backs on $8 / 12$ at Colorado.

Cold Brewed: First baseman/outfielder Seth Beer had a prolific 2019, the majority of which he spent with the Hooks. After starting the year in Advanced-A Fayetteville, Houston's 2018 first-round pick quickly ascended to Double-A and hit hit 299 ( 70 -for-234, 9 2B, 16 HR, 52 RBI, .950 OPS) in 63 games. After a June slump (. 241 AVG, 5 HR, 17 RBI, . 313 OBP), Beer batted 337 ( 32 -for- 95 , 9 HR, 24 RBI, . 462 OBP) to earn Texas League Player of the Month for July. In that time, he rose from Houston's No. 10 prospect to No. 3 in the system and No. 100 in baseball according to MLB.com. Beer was included in the July 31 trade with Arizona in exchange for Zack Greinke. He finished his year with Double-A Jackson, hitting just 205 ( 18 -for- 88 , HR, 17 RBI, . 615 OPS) in 24 games.
