## ASTROS WALK OFF WITH MILLS CUP TITLE

It hasn't always been convenient for Buies Creek to play in its temporary home, but there was a reward at the end.

"I'm glad we could bring a championship to 'The Creek,'" Astros catcher Chuckie Robinson said after scoring the winning run on Jonathan Arauz's 11th-inning sacrifice fly to cap the Carolina League season.

Buies Creek outlasted Potomac, 2-1, in 11 innings on Tuesday at Jim Perry Stadium in the only game of the restructured Mills Cup Final as Hurricane Florence bore down on the region.

Astros manager Morgan Ensberg found about the one-game setup just a couple of hours before Tuesday's first pitch.

"I really debated whether to tell the players. Obviously, they were amped up," he said. "I'm just thankful that the players will be able to get out safely."

Tuesday's championship brought an end to a two-year arrangement for the Astros to play on the campus of Campbell University. Next year, the team will bear a different name and move into a new ballpark some 35 miles away in Fayetteville, North Carolina. Ensberg praised Campbell baseball coach Justin Haire and the school's staff for the accommodations. In turn, the Astros brought a title.

"You're happy to do this for the fans who come out," Astros first baseman Jake Adams said. "Fifteen, 30 people, whatever it is. ... We found a way to get it done."

Buies Creek loaded the bases in the 11th with one out. Robinson opened the inning with an infield single and took second on Adams' base hit, then easily beat center fielder Nick Banks' throw to the plate on Arauz's fly ball. A few dozen spectators were on hand for Tuesday night's game, which was delayed about a half-hour by a pregame shower.

"There's a hurricane coming, that's all everyone was talking about," Robinson said. "Once we knew we were going to play only one [game], I think everyone was really pumped up."

Astros starter Bryan Abreu yielded one hit and one walk with five strikeouts over four scoreless innings. Buies Creek rounded out an undefeated postseason after sweeping the best-of-3 semifinal series from Winston-Salem.

"To get a chance to win a championship is so fun. It's the best," Ensberg said. "We're 100 percent development in the season. The byproduct of that is there is winning."

Adams clobbered Jeremy McKinney's first pitch in the eighth inning over the left field fence with two outs to tie the game at 1-1.

"We're a team that always puts up runs late," Adams said. "It just took a home run to give us a spark." The Nationals scored in the fifth on Banks' double that just squeezed past Adams down the right field line, scoring Andruw Monasterio from first base. Potomac failed to cash in after loading the bases in the ninth. Potomac starter Joan Baez yielded three hits and three walks with six strikeouts over 4 2/3 scoreless frames.

Carolina League president Geoff Lassiter, who consulted with farm directors of both teams, said the decision was a matter of player safety after the series concluded amid potential travel concerns.

"Would we even finish the series and would we get our players home?" Lassiter said, adding it was good to determine a champion.

The league has had co-champions only twice since 1945, including last year, when threatening weather from Hurricane Irma forced Down East and Lynchburg to share the Mills Cup title.

Founded during World War II, the Carolina League's inaugural 1945 season featured two South-side Virginia cities. But throughout the 1940s and '50s it was known as a predominately North Carolina League. In those days it wasn't unusual for talented players to make a career out of Minor League Baseball. Some of the league's colorful greats from that era (many still hold league records) included Muscle Shoals, Willie Duke, Woody Fair, Harvey Haddix and Crash Davis, whose name was immortalized in the movie Bull Durham.

Later in the '50s Willie McCovey, Carl Yastrzemski and Earl Weaver, who all eventually entered the Hall of Fame, were quite the rage throughout the league. During the 60s, the Minors became more closely affiliated with the Major Leagues, as the league crept up into the central Virginia cities of Lynchburg and Salem. During this period, CL stars such as Rod Carew, Curt Flood, Joe Morgan and Johnny Bench found themselves on the fast track to Major League stardom.

Though CL playing talent remained strong with such stars as Wade Boggs, Dave Parker, Cecil Cooper and Dwight Evans, the '70s were a difficult time financially throughout Minor League Baseball. A number of cities found they could not support teams, and CL membership dwindled to four clubs. Winston-Salem hung in, never missing a season. Lynchburg and Salem have not missed a season since entering the league in the '60s.

In a pair of bold moves in the late '70s and early '80s, the CL went as far north as Maryland (first Hagerstown, now Frederick) and re-established the Durham Bulls (now Myrtle Beach) with two expansions in three years. Also coming in during that period were Kinston (now the Carolina Mudcats) and Alexandria (now Potomac).

The gamble paid off at the gate. In 1989, the league went over the 1 million mark for the first time since 1947. New all-time records were set for the next six straight years. Part of this fueled by a new stadium in Wilmington, Del., which opened in 1993 with a club relocated from the Virginia Peninsula. Durham followed suit with its new park two years later.

On the field, the fast track never slowed. In fact, it got faster. The '80s and '90s were the era of Dwight Gooden, Lenny Dykstra, Barry Bonds, Bernie Williams, Moises Alou and Andruw Jones, just to name a few.

After the Triple-A International League moved into Durham, the CL took on its present footprint by going into South Carolina for the first time at Myrtle Beach in 1999. While attendance pulled back a bit, it remained stable through the first decade of the millennium as names like Juan Pierre, Jayson Werth, Brian McCann, Jason Heyward and Albert Pujols were honing their skills in ever-improving Carolina League parks.



## 2018 SEASON

Defending their first World Championship in 2017, the Houston Astros followed a 101-61 season by going 103-59 in 2018 to win the West division for the second straight year.

Led by the infield duo of Bregman and Altuve, who combined to drive in over 160 runs on the year, the Astros landed in the top five of the power heavy American League in overall offense. Combine the offense with a quality bullpen, and two of the most renowned starters in baseball from Justin Verlander and Gerrit Cole, Houston allowed only 534 runs on the season for the best mark in the AL, over 100 runs fewer than the second best team.

Taking their momentum into the postseason, the Astros decimated the Cleveland Indians, outscoring them 21-6 over the three-game sweep and advancing to the ALCS.

Taking the first game of the Championship Series against the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park, the top offense in baseball was able to bounce back, and took the next four games from Houston and win the series, and eventually the World Series

## 2018 SEASON

In their final season as the top affiliate for Houston, the Fresno Grizzlies came just two games shy of winning their second PCL Title in only four years, dropping the five game championship series to the eventual Triple-A Champion Memphis Redbirds.

Led offensively by first baseman AJ Reed, who slugged 28 home runs and drove in 109 runs, for the second-best and best mark in the league, respectively, the Grizzlies clawed at the rest of the PCL by averaging nearly six runs per game, good for second in the league.

Following the season, the Astros announced a new affiliation with Round Rock, returning to a franchise they were affiliated with from its inception in 2000 until 2010, while Fresno would become the Triple-A affiliate for the Washington Nationals.

## 2018 SEASON

For the fifth time in seven years, the Hooks finished with the best record in the Texas League and went on to be eliminated from the Texas League Playoffs in the first round.

In his first season at the helm, Omar Lopez guided Corpus Christi to an 82-56 record, and picked up Manager of the Year honors in the process.

The Hooks were a threat on all fronts in 2018, leading the League in AVG (.268), SB (181), and ERA (3.44)

Individually, the offense was quite evenly spread, with Randy Cesar being the only qualified batter to crack a .290 AVG, but Stephen Wren and Myles Straw were instrumental in the offensive production, swiping 44 and 35 bags respectively, the best in the league.

On the mound, Corpus Christi had plenty of standouts, including lefty Ryan Hartman, who led the league with 11 wins, 143 strikeouts, and a 2.69 ERA in 120.2 innings.

Top prospect Forest Whitley spent the middle months of the year at Whataburger field, accumulating a 0.99 WHIP and 34 Ks in only 26.1 innings of work across eight starts.

# ABOUT FAYETTEVILLE AND FORT BRAGG

Few places in America have played such a formative role in our country's most defining moments as Fayetteville. From its original settlement in 1739 by Scottish immigrants through the deployment of troops to Afghanistan and Iraq today, it is here the very seeds of American freedom, democracy and patriotism were planted and continue to grow. Out of the dozens of U.S. cities and counties named after the Revolutionary War hero Marquis de Lafayette, Fayetteville, NC was the first, and it is told, the only one he actually visited. Forty-two years after its founding in 1783, Lafayette traveled to Fayetteville in a horse-drawn carriage and was welcomed by residents. (The very same carriage in which he arrived is on display at the Fayetteville Independent Light Infantry Armory & Museum.) Fayetteville's original settlers were from the highlands of Scotland and arrived in 1739 via the Cape Fear River. The area grew as a center of government and commerce because of its location as an inland port and the hub of the early "Plank Roads" system, key to over-land travel from the 1840s to 1850s.

The Fayetteville area has played key roles during defining moments in America's history. The Liberty Point Resolve of 1775 pledged local support for the Revolutionary War cause for independence from England while Scottish heroine Flora MacDonald rallied for the loyalist cause. After the Revolution, with no permanent state capital, the North Carolina legislature periodically met here. In 1789, at a meeting in Fayetteville, the legislature ratified the U.S. Constitution and chartered the University of North Carolina, America's oldest state university.

Fayetteville citizens joined together to rebuild their city after two separate calamities. The first was the Great Fire of 1831 that destroyed over 600 buildings. However, the ensuing reconstruction resulted in many of the landmark structures that we appreciate today. The second occurred during the Civil War when the city found itself in the path of General Sherman's Union troops. They wreaked destruction upon the town and burned the N.C. Arsenal, a manufacturing facility for weapons and ammunitions for the Confederacy. Once again, Fayetteville rose to the challenge to repair the damages to their city and spirit.

On Saturday, March 7, 1914, George Herman Ruth, then a rookie with the Orioles organization, stood in the batter's box at the Cape Fear Fair Grounds in Fayetteville and hit his first home run as a professional baseball player. It was on this road trip to Fayetteville that the nickname "Babe" was coined as Ruth had been legally adopted by the Orioles Manager, Jack Dunn (Dunn's Babe).

During World War I, the U.S. Chief of Field Artillery, General William J. Snow, was seeking an area having suitable terrain, adequate water, rail facilities, and a climate suitable for year-round training, and he decided that the area in Fayetteville met all of the desired criteria. On September 4th, 1918, Fort Bragg was established as an artillery training ground. Today, the military community (including active servicemen, retired veterans and military families) surrounding Fort Bragg exceeds 270,000 people. Many argue that without Fort Bragg, Fayetteville might have grown only to be a small town of ten thousand.

Thanks to insight gleaned in town hall meetings, online surveys and one-on-one conversations with residents, the Woodpeckers brand celebrates the core characteristics of the city, its natural beauty and proud community.

As the home to the second-largest population of endangered redcockaded woodpeckers in the world, the sights and sounds of Fort Bragg are intrinsically linked to the woodpecker. The bird is small in size but vital to the Long Leaf Pine ecosystem, fighting extinction and embodying the resilient nature that the Fayetteville Woodpeckers will show with their play on the field. The same can also be said of the City of Fayetteville – though small, Fayetteville is tough, proud, and vital to this country's protection.

### DIRECTIONS

#### FROM I-95

**Going North:** Take exit 46A to merge onto NC-87 N toward Fayetteville. After seven miles and combining with US-401, take exit 104B to Hay Street toward Downtown. Turn right onto Hay Street, and Segra Stadium will be one half-mile down the street, on the left.

**Going South:** Take exit 52A to merge onto NC-24 W toward Fayetteville. After five miles, turn left onto Ray Avenue just before Festival Park. At the roundabout, keep straight to stay on Ray Avenue. Take the next right onto Hay Street. Segra Stadium will be one quarter-mile away, on the right.

#### FROM US-421

**Going South:** At exit 153, keep left, away from US-421 S Business Route. After 10 miles, keep left at exit 143A and merge onto NC-87 Bypass. Staying on the Bypass will eventually become South Bragg Boulevard. After passing South Main Street, keep left toward Honeycutt Road. # MEDIA GUIDELINES

**Contact Information:** You may contact the Woodpeckers communications department at (314) 477-4765 or via email at MSabados@Astros.com or VHuggins@astros.com

**Media Credentials:** Fayetteville Woodpeckers media credentials will be issued only to accredited members of the media ONLY. Season-long credentials will only be made available to select media members of well-established news gathering organizations with the intention of continuous coverage of the team throughout the season. All media members seeking daily credentials may contact MSabados@Astros.com or VHuggins@astros.com with at least **24-hours notice** to request credentials for a daily pass (3 p.m. Thursday for a weekend game) Under no circumstance may media credentials be transferred to other persons without written approval from the Woodpeckers communications department. Violation of this policy may result in forfeiture of credentials for the remainder of the season.

**Press Box:** The Woodpeckers press box is located on the club level of the park, and opens four hours prior to game time. It is a working press box for **working members of the media only**. Media members will have access to WiFi provided by Segra, with connection information available on arrival.

**Clubhouse Access:** The home and visitors clubhouse may only be accessed by properly credentialed members of the media, and members are permitted only to speak with players in the locker room. In accordance with the regulations designated by Major League Baseball, the clubhouse is opened to members of the media **3-1/2 hours prior to first pitch and closed one hour prior to first pitch**. The clubhouses will remain closed until approximately 15-30 minutes following the end of the game, and will be closed during any delays and between doubleheader games.

**Field Access:** Properly credentialed media may access the field and dugout areas until one hour prior to first pitch. Media members are not permitted to enter fair ground, and must remain in foul ground, especially during batting practice.

**Game Notes & Statistics:** Daily game notes and stat packets will be made available to media members and staff in the press box prior to each game. If you would like to receive daily game notes to your inbox, email MSabados@Astros.com

**Interview Policy:** Uniformed players and coaches are only available for interviews prior to their on-field stretch time. After this time, interviews may only be conducted with prior approval from the Woodpeckers communications department. Media members wishing to do an off-site interview must contact the Woodpeckers no later than 72 hours to the scheduled interview. The media is asked to be respectful of a players' pregame schedule when requesting an interview. **No one will be permitted to interview a starting pitcher on the day of their start.**

**Autographs:** Under no circumstances are credentialed media to seek autographs at any point of the day, anywhere in the park. Violators will be escorted from the park and have their credentials confiscated.

### Matt Sabados (1st Season)

Matt Sabados joined the Astros organization in February of 2019 as the Communications and Broadcasting Coordinator. As the inaugural "Voice of the Woodpeckers" Matt will be on the air for all 140 Woodpeckers games in the 2019 season. A native of Saint Louis, Matt makes his way to Fayetteville after spending the 2018 season with the broadcast team for the Lehigh Valley IronPigs, the Triple-A affiliate of the Phillies, where he hosted pre and postgame shows, and called games for the best team in Triple-A baseball at the end of the regular season No stranger to the area, Matt spent the 2017-2018 academic year just 45 minutes south of Fayetteville as the play-by-play voice for the University of North Carolina at Pembroke. Earning his bachelor's degree from Lindenwood University in Saint Louis, Matt took his first step into professional baseball as the broadcast assistant for the independent Gateway Grizzlies in 2016. While earning his degree, Matt spent a year with KMOX 1120, the heralded flagship for the St. Louis Cardinals and St. Louis Blues, working with the sports department to produce and coordinate full games and shows. Matt graduated in 2017 after serving as the voice of the football team along with men's and women's basketball at the Division 2 Lindenwood for two years.



### Maura Sheridan (1st Season)

Maura Sheridan joined the Astros organization in March of 2019 as the Gameday Broadcasting Assistant. Maura can be heard calling Woodpeckers home games as well as contributing to the pre and post game shows on air. Born and raised in Vermont, Maura is coming off a season as the voice of University of Vermont Women's Basketball, where she called every game for the Catamounts. Maura got her first taste of play-by-play with the Brewster Whitecaps in the Cape Cod League, serving as one of three broadcasters during the Whitecaps title run. While earning her degree Maura spent four years at Syracuse University's WAER, broadcasting 'Cuse football, basketball, and lacrosse games. She also has TV experience working as a sideline reporter, color analyst, and play-by-play voice for ACC Network Extra. Earning her bachelor's degree from Syracuse University in 2018, Maura is excited to travel south and join the Woodpeckers team!

## DEFINITIONS

**Consecutive-Game Hitting Streaks:** A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if a player's plate appearance(s) result in a base on balls, hit bats-man, defensive interference, or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if a player has a sacrifice fly or no hit. Consecutive-game hit streaks do not carry over from season to season.

**Consecutive-Game Playing Streak:** a consecutive-game playing streak shall be extended if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes an at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running experience only shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from the game by an umpire before they can fulfill any of the requirements, the streak shall continue.

**Day/Night Games:** Any game schedules to start after 5:00 p.m. will be considered a night game. If a game is scheduled to start at or before 5:00 p.m. and is later delayed by rain or other occurrence, it will still be considered a day game. Both games of a two-night doubleheader will be considered night games. When an afternoon and night game is scheduled and separate admission is charged, they will be counted as one day game and one night game, and not be considered a doubleheader.

**Qualifications for a Batting Championship:** The highest batting average based on a minimum of 434 plate appearances, including official times at bat, bases on balls, hit by pitch, sacrifice hits, sacrifice flies, and times awarded first base due to interference or obstruction.

**Qualifications for a Pitching Championship:** Lowest Earned Run Average with a minimum of 100 innings pitched.

**Qualifications for a Fielding Championship:** Highest fielding average and (a) catchers must have played in at least 70 games; (b) infielders or outfielders must have played in 94 games; and (c) pitchers must have at least 100 innings pitched.

**Quality Start:** Defined as a start when a pitcher lasts 6 or more innings and gives up 3 or fewer earned runs.

**Hold Rule:** The hold is not an official statistic, but it was created as a way to credit middle relief pitchers for a successful outing. If a reliever comes in to a game to protect a lead, gets at least one out, and leaves the game without giving up the lead, he is credited with a hold, even if the losing run is later earned to that pitcher after he departs. You cannot get a save and a hold in the same appearance.

**Save Rule:** Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

1. He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club.
2. He is not the winning pitcher.
3. He satisfies at least one of the following conditions:
  - He enters with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches at least one inning
  - He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either on base, at bat, or on deck. (To say, the potential tying run is either already on base, or is one of the first two batters a pitcher faces.)
  - He pitches effectively for at least three innings.

**Minor-League Roster Guidelines:** In the minors, the rosters are managed differently than the standard 25-man roster in the majors. Minor League teams keep two separate lists of players. The first is the active list which denotes what players are eligible for the current game, and the second is the reserve list, which is a team's entire roster. At both Single-A levels, the active list may contain 25 players, while the reserve list may contain 35 players. The Minor Leagues have a 7-day disabled list that works the same as MLB's 15-day disabled list.

**Rule 5 Draft:** Once a player is signed by an organization either through the draft or as a free agent, the clock begins on the club's exclusive rights to the player.

After three complete minor league seasons (or four seasons, if the player was younger than 19 on the preceding June 5th of their signing), the team has to decide if it wants to sign the player to a major-league contract (adding the player to the 40-man roster). If the team does not add the player to the 40-man roster, the player becomes available to other teams in the Rule 5 Draft held annually in December.

A player can be drafted by another team for a sum of \$50,000 (payable to the player's original team). The catch, however, is that if the player is ever removed from his new team's 25-man roster during the following season, he has to be offered back to his original club for only \$25,000.

To prevent abuse of the system, the draftee must also be active for at least 90 days. This keeps teams from drafting a player and keeping them on the disabled list for a majority of the season.

Any player selected in the Rule 5 Draft may be traded to any other team, but the limitations of the 25-man roster still apply, and the player must be offered back to his original club if the player does not fulfill his requirements with the new team.

Organizations may also draft players from Double-A or lower to play on their Triple-A affiliate for \$12,000, and may draft players from Single-A or lower to play for their Double-A affiliate for \$4,000.

**Pace-of-Play:** The Pace-of-Play initiatives vary between levels of MiLB, the following guidelines apply to the Advanced Single-A Level specifically:

#### Mound Visits

At both Full Season Single-A levels, teams are permitted 9 mound visits per game, and an additional mound visit per extra inning played. In the event of crossed signs between pitcher and catcher with all mound visits exhausted, the plate umpire has discretion to grant a visit from the catcher to correct the issue

#### Extra Innings

Starting in 2018 for all MiLB games, every half inning past the scheduled regulation number will begin with a runner at second base. The runner will be scored as if reaching on an error, but no error will be given to a player or team (to say, the potential run is scored as unearned no matter the situation.) The player who precedes the leadoff batter of the inning in the lineup will serve as the runner at second base, and that runner can be removed and substituted as normal.
