

NEGRO LEAGUE CELEBRATION



Welcome back to Segra Park, home of the Columbia Fireflies!

From Opening Night and through Opening Week, we welcomed droves of Fireflies fans back to the ballpark for the first game in 621 days. Through the first six games, we: led the league in attendance (#1 of 12), led the classification in attendance (#1 of 30) and led all of Low-A and High-A in attendance (#1 of 60).

In fact, we finished #25 of ALL Minor League teams, outshining many Double-A and Triple-A in the process.

Now we're back to our core business of bringing people together for fun, family and Fireflies Baseball, you'll notice that things are still going to look a bit different. BUT... things are changing daily.

Masks: As of our first Thirsty Thursday on May 13, the Major League Baseball mask mandate and the City of Columbia Mask ordinance expired, meaning that although we do encourage mask-wearing, masks are no longer required. Our full-time and gameday staff will continue to wear masks for the time being.

Players: Because of continuing Covid restrictions, please understand that players are not permitted to sign autographs at this time. We hope that this restriction will be lifted later in the season.

Seating: You'll notice that we are providing our fans with a choice of seating options: socially distant seating or traditional seating. As you purchase your tickets, please be sure to pick the section in which you are most comfortable. Based on demand, we have evened out the socially distant and traditional seating sections with six of each now featured at Segra Park. Sections will continue to adjust with demand, but we pledge to keep some amount of socially distant seating available throughout the season.

Cashless venue: To assure the safety of our fans and our staff, Segra Park is now a cashless venue, accepting debit and credit cards only at all points of sale – including parking. For fans that don't have bank cards, don't worry. You can stop by Guest Services and exchange cash for gift cards that can be used anywhere in the park. Gift Cards are available in \$5 increments and will have no expiration date so you can use it on any visit to the park in the future.

Mobile Food Ordering: To help reduce lines and expedite service, the Fireflies are now offering mobile ordering from the comfort of your seats. Please visit https://mobile.appetizeapp.com/fireflies to place your order and you'll get a text notification when it is ready for pick-up.

As always, our staff is always here to help answer your questions, help resolve issues and to make your experience at Segra Park memorable. Please let us know if there's anything we can do to make your visit even more special.



This is the place where players adjust to full-season baseball. Where someone finds out if they can handle the grind of playing six-or-seven times a week from spring all the way until summer begins to fade away. This is where many Royals farmhands will receive their first taste of professional ball after college and where some polished high schoolers will begin their journey to the Majors. While players are in Columbia, they can head to the Congaree National Park to see the Fireflies there blink synchronously—a feat that can only be seen at Congaree National Park, Allegheny National Forest and the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

QUAD CITIES RIVER BANDITS • ADVANCED-A • HIGH-A CENTRAL



If you find yourself in Quad Cities, you're on your way as a player. Typically, only very polished draft picks selected out of college will start at this level. Most other players will have spent time in a rookie league or extended spring training prior to making the jump. The game gets faster here and the defense cleaner. This is where pitchers will add a better secondary pitch and hitters will have to learn to be more selective at the plate if they want to advance. While players are in Quad Cities, they can take a river boat trip along the mighty Mississippi River that'll give great views of the surrounding cities in the tight-knit area. They can also visit Antique Archeology, or the original store for The History Channel's The American Pickers show.

NORTHWEST ARKANSAS NATURALS • AA • DOUBLE-A CENTRAL



Players will find themselves in Northwest Arkansas when they are nearly ready to make their Major League debut. A lot of top prospects will skip AAA and move directly from AA to the show. A lot of players will workshop a specific part of their game while in Northwest Arkansas so they can prepare themselves for the show. While in Northwest Arkansas, players can visit a handful of local wineries or breweries, including Sassafras Springs Vineyard or take a day trip along the historic Arkansas & Missouri Railroad. The A&M will allow you to spend three hours in historic Van Buren where you can peruse local cafes and shops and check out the historic downtown area.

OMAHA STORM CHASERS • AAA • TRIPLE-A EAST



Players who are tuning up for the Majors or who have been up in the bigs and need to work on a skill and take a break from Major League competition will compete in Omaha. Fans and players who visit Warner Park also have the opportunity to visit some great attractions such as the Durham Museum, which is a history exhibit that runs through a 1931 train station. You can also visit the Henry Doorly Zoo, which has the world's largest indoor desert and the largest indoor rain forest in North America

CHURCH LEAGUE GREW UP WITH, HONORS NEGRO LEAGUES

The Community All-Star Baseball League (CASBL) held a game in their championship series in 2020 at Segra Park. The league currently has a handful of teams from various counties in South Carolina, but the league has come a long way from where it began.

Starting in 1940 as a church and textile league, the CASBL was meant to be a church and textile league that would emulate professional players of the Negro

Leagues. Although the league was never recognized as an official Negro League, they grew up parallel and offered underserved and overlooked players an opportunity that they weren't afforded elsewhere. Although the CASBL was not ever considered an official Negro League, it grew up parallel to the Negro Leagues, under the same harsh circumstances of racism and bigotry that were fostered in the South in the early parts of the 20th century.

"There was a desire to play baseball. Baseball was always a part of the African American community." CASBL Commissioner Derrick Mobley said. "It was a church league that only played on Sundays. People would leave church and go straight to the ballpark."

After Jim Crow Laws were repealed and the civil rights movements of the 1960's allowed more Black Americans to play the game, the Negro Leagues began to wane in popularity. The American Negro League folded in 1960, and clubs began to dwindle after that until the Indianapolis Clowns, the last surviving traveling Negro League team, ceased operations in 1989. While the Negro Leagues were scuttling, the CASBL grew to the height of its popularity. At one point in the late 1970's there were 24 teams in the league. The level of play continues at a high level today. Carl Edwards Jr., the seven-year Major League veteran, played for the Newberry Pirates, a perennial powerhouse in the CASBL, in 2007, as a 15-year-old. Mobley remembers when he first laid eyes on the phenom, "He was this long, lanky young man. He was super thin when he came to play in our league, and he came in as a 15-year old throwing in the mid-to-high 80's pitching against guys from anywhere from 14-to-60-years-old and he was striking people out left-to-right."

The story goes that a scout found him playing in the rural fields of Newberry, attending one of the Pirates games, and eventually Edwards Jr. was selected in the 48th round of the draft, as a 6'3", 150-pound kid out of high school. The righty climbed the rungs to get where he is today Toronto Blue Jays, something that wouldn't be possible without the contributions of the Negro Leagues or even the Community All-Star Baseball League, where the one-in-amillion shot was discovered.

If you attend a CASBL game or find yourselves around a diamond near Sumter, there's a better-than-not chance that you'll run into an 82-year-old man who possesses an arm just like Carl Edwards Jr. Russell "Crazy Legs" Patterson earned his nickname from his moves on the dance floor, but for a while, he made his living with

that he brought with him from his left arm. The southpaw could whip a ball in at 90 MPH and he had a plus 12-6 curveball that he attacked hitters with. The grizzled man still shows his jovial nature where ever he goes, bouncing on the balls of his feet as he walks and echoing the passion for the game in his voice as he speaks.

Mr. Patterson is a treasure. He's one of 190 surviving players of the Negro Leagues. Crazy Legs' playing career spanned three decades, but he still finds himself around the game, coaching

youth and high school athletics and he carries around a State Championship Ring from when he coached a high school ballclub a few years back.

It wasn't always as easy for Russell to be around the game as it is now. When he was young, he would get invited to a lot of baseball camps for players who were trying out to play professionally, and he ran into a lot of trouble.

"They would call Russell Patterson, then I would raise my hand and they would say, 'Oh, you're not Russell Patterson.' I would look at them and say, 'Well, you must be looking for a white fella, but I'm


not one," Patterson recalls. "It was very racist back then, and that's why we had the Negro Leagues."

Patterson's career began in Savannah, Georgia, where he played for the Bears when he was around 15 in 1954. He moved around a lot during his career. After spending five years with the Bears, he spent a pair of years playing with the Indianapolis Clowns, one year where he played with Hank Aaron. He played for the Patterson Invaders in 1962 before he was drafted into the US Army, where he served for two years before going back to Patterson from 1965-1978 to pitch for the Black Sox.

He earned the nickname "Crazy Legs" during his tour with the Indianapolis Clowns. The Clowns were one of the top teams in the Negro Leagues and operated much like the Harlem Globetrotters. They played baseball at a high level, but they also were showmen who took pride in entertaining those who purchased tickets to the games. Patterson was known for his dancing, both on the diamond and in the night clubs after games. His time in Indianapolis wasn't always easy though. "It was rough. Our pay was \$150/month. We couldn't eat in restaurants or use their restrooms. When we were travelling we weren't welcomed to hotels or towns the way teams are now," Patterson narrates. "We did have a nice bus though. It didn't have air conditioning, but it was a nice bus that didn't give us trouble." The bus is in the past. The Negro Leagues have been defunct for nearly 40 years after their founding in 1920, but that doesn't mean we can't tip our cap to the past and honor those who played.

Crazy Legs considers himself a historian. Not just a historian of the game of baseball or of Black History or American History, of which he has contributed a lot to, but also of World History. He has always found himself reading and trying to learn more about the past. That's important. Because, yes, the Negro Leagues are part of the past now. Black players can play in the Majors in front of fans in Atlanta, like Hammerin' Hank Aaron once did or in New York, like Darryl Strawberry or anywhere where the 30 Major League teams are located, but we can't forget about the strife and missed opportunities of the men who toiled in the Negro Leagues on busses without air conditioning and who weren't allowed to eat at restaurants in certain cities while they were travelling. They too are a part of our history.

That's why the CASBL is an important part of baseball in South Carolina. While it isn't a Negro League, it's a window into the past of our nation and our game. Attending a game is a way that people can learn more about baseball and the Negro Leagues.






THE NEWARK EAGLES



*Information courtesy of MLB.com The Newark Eagles debuted in the Negro National League in 1936 after the Brooklyn Eagles and Newark Dodgers were consolidated into a single team by co-owners Abe and Effa Manley. Operating out of Ruppert Stadium in Newark, N.J., the Eagles were a consistently competitive team, finishing above .500 all but three times in their 14-year history.

After years of pushing for a championship, the Eagles achieved the ultimate success in 1946, winning the Negro World Series over the Kansas City Monarchs, who had dominated the Negro American League that year with a record of 43-14.

The Eagles finally winning the World Series was not the only big change in 1946, however. Earlier that year, integration had begun in organized baseball, and MLB teams soon began sending scouts to survey the talent in the Negro Leagues. It was only a year later that the Eagles were directly affected by this seismic shift in the status quo, losing Doby to the Cleveland Indians as he became the first African-American player in the American League.



THE CHATTANOOGA CHOO-CHOOS

The Chattanooga Choo-Choos were a minor league Negro league baseball team based in Chattanooga, Tennessee. The team was a member of the Negro Southern League, which was considered a minor league for the duration of the Choo-Choos' affiliation, and fielded a team from 1940 until 1946.

The Choo-Choos played their home games at Engel Stadium. The team is noted as the first professional baseball organization for which Hall of Famer Willie Mays played.

WILLIE MAYS FACTS

Willie Howard Mays Jr. nicknamed "The Say Hey Kid", is an American former professional baseball center fielder. He spent almost all of his 22-season Major League Baseball career playing for the New York/San Francisco Giants (1951-1952, 1954-1972) before finishing his career with the New York Mets (1972-1973). Regarded as one of the greatest baseball players of all time, he was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1979. As of his birthday in 2021, he is the oldest living Baseball Hall of Famer.
