Bruce Schumacher

Chairman of the Board & Chief Executive Officer

Bruce Schumacher was named the Indianapolis Indians' chairman of the board and chief executive officer in November 2016 to signal a new era of leadership for the Tribe. Now in his 36th year with the organization, he enters his sixth on the Indians Board of Directors after his election in February 2012.

Schumacher joined the organization as ticket manager in January 1983 and served in that role until 1986 when he was promoted to director of special projects.

Under Schumacher's leadership as director of special projects, which spanned 25 years, the Indians made the move from Bush Stadium to Victory Field in 1996, hosted the 2001 Triple-A All-Star game, and established themselves as one of the premier franchises in Minor League Baseball.




In 2012, Schumacher transitioned to the position of vice president of corporate affairs in addition to being elected to the Indians Board of Directors. Since 2012, the Indians have drawn nearly two million fans, including leading all of Minor League Baseball in attendance in 2013 and establishing a new Victory Field record of 660,289 fans in 2014. During the 2016 and 2017 seasons, Victory Field led all of Minor League Baseball in attendance and ushered in its 13 millionth fan last summer.

From 1987 to 2009, Schumacher also served as the in-park "Voice of the Tribe" public address announcer.

Schumacher is active in the community, having volunteered at IPS as part of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce Winning Team program and the Washington Township School system, while also serving on the board of the Delaware Trails Neighborhood Association and as a member of Indianapolis' Abandoned Housing Task Force.

He currently serves on the Metropolitan Development Commission, the Indianapolis Neighborhood Housing Partnership, the Mapleton Fall Creek Community Development Corporation Housing Committee and is a member of the Stadium Village Business Association.

Born in Indianapolis, Schumacher attended North Central High School and graduated from Indiana University with a degree in Business Management and Administration in 1982. He and his wife, the former Jo Kussmaul, have three daughters, Rachel and twins Grace and Sara.



Max Schumacher

Chairman Emeritus

Indianapolis Indians baseball and the name of Schumacher are forever linked.

After 60 seasons with the club, Max Schumacher transitioned to chairman emeritus in November 2016. He relinquished his responsibilities as chairman of the board to his son, Bruce, and his title of president to Randy Lewandowski, Indians general manager.

In his altered role, Schumacher maintains his position on the finance committee, hosts his suite on game days, and provides mentorship for Indians leadership.

Under Schumacher's more than half century of leadership, the Indians have enjoyed recognition for their ongoing commitment to excellence. The team has been recognized with awards such as the Triple-A Bob Freitas Award in 1996 and 2014, *Baseball America's* Triple-A Team of the Decade for the 1990s, and, in 2005, At The Yard Magazine's Minor League Team of the Year. The Indians led all of Minor League Baseball in attendance during the 2016 (636,888) and 2017 seasons (641,141), two of many records set in the 21-year-old Victory Field.

Following his service in the United States Army, Schumacher began his Indians career as ticket manager in 1957, before also assuming the duties of publicity director in 1959. Schumacher then took over as general manager just two years later in 1961, serving under then-president Owen J. Bush, who would continue in that capacity for eight more years. Following Bush's retirement in 1969, Schumacher was named president.

During his tenure as the Indians' general manager, Schumacher was named the American Association's Executive of the Year for 1996, and just one year later was voted Minor League Baseball's "King of Baseball" for his long-term dedication and service to the game.

Schumacher played four years of varsity baseball while also serving as editor of The Collegian publication at Butler from 1950-54. Schumacher has been honored by his alma mater with the Robert Todd Duncan Alumni Achievement Award in 2003 and induction into Butler's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

Along with his professional success, Schumacher has also been recognized for his impact in the Indianapolis area after formerly serving as President of the Indianapolis Downtown Kiwanis Club, the American Business Club and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Indianapolis. Schumacher was honored for his numerous contributions with the Thomas W. Moses Good Scout Award in April of 2006 for his dedication to community service, social responsibility and having a true "scout spirit."

Randy Lewandowski

President & General Manager

Randy Lewandowski enters his 25th year with the Indianapolis Indians and fourth as the club's general manager in 2018. He is just the team's fourth general manager since the organization was incorporated in 1955. In addition to his duties as GM, he was named president by the Indians Board of Directors in November 2016.

Lewandowski was named the International League's 2016 Executive of the Year, marking the third Executive of the Year award for the Indians' front office staff since joining the International League in 1998.

After joining the Tribe as a ticket office intern in 1994, Lewandowski was hired full-time as assistant ticket manager the following year. He served in that capacity for two seasons, contributing to the Indians' transition from Bush Stadium to Victory Field in 1996.

Lewandowski took over as director of operations in 1998, helping Victory Field host the 2001 Triple-A All-Star Game. He transitioned to assistant general manager in 2002, serving as one of the team's two assistant GMs before becoming the sole assistant GM in 2005. In this role, his primary responsibilities were overseeing the marketing, operations and ticket departments.

Over the final five seasons of Lewandowski's tenure as assistant GM, the team recorded five straight seasons of increased attendance, leading all of Minor League Baseball in 2013 and setting a Victory Field record the year after.

That success would continue following Lewandowski's ascension to general manager in October 2014 as the team eclipsed its top season attendance mark for the second consecutive year. The 2016 and 2017 campaigns saw the Indians lead all of Minor League Baseball in attendance, while also welcoming Victory Field's 13 millionth fan through the gates last summer.

Lewandowski has been active in the Indiana chapter of the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society as past president and board member, and past chair of the LLS Light the Night Walk. For a seven-year period, he was active in the youth sports coaching and mentoring ministry at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church and School. Lewandowski spearheaded a partnership between the Indians and Play Ball Indiana in 2015 and now serves on the organization's board of directors.

A native of Fort Wayne, Ind., Lewandowski graduated with a degree in business management from Anderson University in 1993. He was also a four-year starter on the Ravens' baseball team, where he earned academic All-America honors as a first baseman and pitcher. Lewandowski resides in Carmel, Ind. with his wife, Christina, and their two children, Alyssa and Sam.



Cal Burleson

Senior Vice President - Community Affairs

Cal Burleson enters his 44th year with the organization and has served as senior vice president of community affairs since November 2016. In this role, he has expanded his efforts of relating Indians baseball to community leaders and civic groups.

Under Burleson's leadership, recent years have been among the most successful in Indianapolis Indians history. The organization received back-to-back nods as one of the Best Places to Work in Indiana by the Indiana Chamber of Commerce and drew record attendance figures in 2014 (660,289) and 2015 (662,536). The Indians topped all of Minor League Baseball in attendance during 2016 (636,888) and 2017 (641,141).

Burleson was also honored for his outstanding management efforts when the Indians were named the 2013 Triple-A recipients of the Bob Freitas Award, presented to the organization with the best overall operations at each level of Minor League Baseball.

Burleson was hired as ticket manager and began with the team on New Year's Day, 1975. He served in that capacity for two years before taking over duties as business manager from 1977-80, publicity director from 1981-86 and assistant general manager from 1987-97.

Burleson then served as the organization's third general manager in its history from 1998-2014 and was twice voted the International League's Executive of the Year. In his previous role as vice president of baseball and administrative affairs, he functioned as the team's representative with the Pirates and International League offices.

In addition to his work with the team, Burleson has assumed a leadership role in the local community as a past chairman of the board for the American Red Cross of Greater Indianapolis, as well as a board member of the Indianapolis and Indiana Chambers of Commerce, the Indianapolis Urban League, and serves on the advisory board of the Military Family Research Institute. He is also currently a board member for Jump IN for Healthy Kids, an initiative aimed at combating childhood obesity in Central Indiana.

His passion for promoting healthy lifestyles for children was a key factor in the development and launch of RightFit – an after-school program that creates an opportunity for elementary school students to build positive relationships with public safety personnel and fight childhood obesity through nutrition-oriented education and physical activity.

Burleson received a bachelor's degree in business administration from Ohio University in 1973 and a master's degree in sports administration from OU in 1974 prior to joining the Indians staff.

Joel Zawacki

Assistant General Manager - Corporate Sales and Marketing

Joel Zawacki is assistant general manager – corporate sales & marketing for the Indianapolis Indians. Each year he is tasked with the implementation of an annual strategic marketing and communications plan to exceed an attendance goal of more than 660,000 and a revenue goal of more than \$14 million.

His primary duties and responsibilities include leading a staff of more than 20 employees in advertising, broadcasting, communications, community relations, corporate sales, game presentation, marketing, media relations, merchandising and promotions.

Zawacki also collaborates with outside advertising and media agencies to develop and implement annual campaigns including messaging, creative execution, promotional partnership, and allocation of an annual budget in excess of \$1.5 million.

Zawacki joined the organization in 2007 as sponsorship sales coordinator. He was promoted to director of corporate partnerships in 2008, and added marketing to his duties and responsibilities in 2012. He was elevated to assistant general manager in 2016.

Zawacki graduated magna cum laude from the University of Indianapolis in 2006 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Sports Administration. He was a pitcher on the Greyhounds' baseball team and earned Great Lakes Valley Conference All-Academic Team honors.

After college and prior to joining the Indians, Zawacki worked as a sponsorship sales intern with Pacers Sports and Entertainment, and also interned with the Brevard County Manatees of Melbourne, Fla., the High-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers.

Zawacki resides in downtown Indianapolis with his wife Ellen and son Jack.



Matt Guay

Assistant General Manager - Tickets & Operations

After 19 seasons with the Indians, Matt Guay has revolutionized goal-setting for the team's ticket department with no signs of slowing down.

Guay began with the Indians in 1999 as a ticket intern and has since climbed the ranks. In 2003, Guay was named director of ticket sales and immediately led his team in a 20 percent group sales increase when presented the challenge of boosting ticket sales.

In 2004, Guay was promoted to director of ticket operations and oversaw all ticket service representatives. After serving as the director of tickets for five years (2006-2011), Guay now holds the title of assistant general manager - tickets and operations, where he is responsible for ticket sales and ticket service, along with all stadium operations, business operations and facility operations.



Throughout his career with the Indians, Guay has implemented daily sales goals, along with overall attendance and revenue goals, which have allowed the sales team to focus their attention on a tangible outcome. Under his leadership, the Indians have surpassed 630,000 fans through the gate five consecutive years (2013-17).

In addition to overseeing the ticket department, Guay is the chair of the organization's diversity and wellness committees.

Guay is also an avid member of his community and has been volunteering in the Fall Creek Place area since 2007. He is the current president of the Fall Creek Place Foundation, where his efforts in fundraising helped build a park in the neighborhood.

Guay is a Pittsburgh, Pa., native and graduated from the University of Dayton in 1998 with a degree in sport management. He lives in Indianapolis' Fall Creek Place neighborhood with his wife, Emily, and daughter, Audrey.

2017 COMMUNITY RELATIONS HIGHLIGHTS

ORGANIZATIONAL COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

In 2017, the Indianapolis Indians continued their long-standing tradition of providing support and dedication to Indianapolis and the central Indiana area. Community outreach programs, player and mascot appearances, charitable fundraisers and non-profit awareness nights all contributed to the organization's mission of providing memorable family fun to central Indiana.

The Indians supported the community through various ticketing initiatives such as the Pinch Hitter program, Tickets for Troops and charitable fundraisers. The organization contributed more than \$495,000 in fundraising and donations, and the Indians' staff volunteered 942 community service hours towards various initiatives around central Indiana.

In collaboration with other Pittsburgh Pirates affiliates, the Indians participate in the Pirates Community Commitment Program, which requires every player in the organization to complete ten hours of community service over the course of the season. Indians players visited local children's hospitals and animal shelters, packed meals for area food pantries and participated in numerous other activities. The 2017 Indians served nearly 200 hours in the program.

The 2017 season also marked the fifth year of the Indians' Triple Play Youth Baseball Program. With a budget of \$40,000, the program included 17 leagues and sponsored 107 youth baseball and softball teams. Participating leagues were also given the opportunity to raise funds by selling Knot Hole Kids Club memberships and hosting a League Night at Victory Field. This growing program allows the Indians to positively impact the future of baseball while teaching kids to "Play Hard. Play Smart. Play Fair."

Looking ahead, the Indians franchise will continue to be strategic with its community partnerships. In 2017, for the first time, the organization created a community relations mission statement refining its approach to community outreach. The Indians will continue to be proactive in positively impacting the Indianapolis community, while also working diligently with nonprofit partners to determine the best way to affect change for the organizations and their noteworthy causes.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND PROMOTIONS



100 Men in 50 Days Campaign: For the second consecutive season, the Indians collaborated with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Indiana as the presenting partner of BBBSCI's 100 Men in 50 Days campaign, which sought to recruit male volunteers for the program and raise awareness for the importance of mentoring. The Indians provided perks to current and prospective Bigs and Littles, including a behind-the-scenes tour of Victory Field and a free Knot Hole membership given to each match. In 2017, Big Brothers Big Sisters recruited 95 new Bigs throughout the campaign.

Bark in the Park: For the fourth year, the Indians partnered with the Indianapolis Humane Society to host two Bark in the Park games. Fans were able to purchase a special ticket package that allowed them to enjoy the game with their furry friend in the outfield lawn of Victory Field. A total of 424 dogs filled the outfield and enjoyed the game on these two nights.

Baseball Buddies: Local youth softball and baseball teams had the opportunity to serve as the Indians' Baseball Buddies during the 2017 season. Participating teams had a front row seat for all pregame ceremonies and activities, and then got to take the field with the Indians players during the National Anthem. A total of 54 teams participated in the Baseball Buddies program.

Baseball in Education: The Indians partnered with Indiana University-Purdue University at Indianapolis and Citizen's Energy Group to transform Victory Field into the biggest classroom in central Indiana for four games in 2017. Each student was provided an in-game education workbook to fill out throughout the game. Answers to the workbook were found around the ballpark and on the video board between innings. The Indians offered discounted ticket prices for participating schools, as well as curriculum guides for grades K-12 that encouraged learning through baseball in the classroom. A total of 17,778 students and teachers participated in Baseball in Education days in 2017.





Celebrity Softball: On June 15, the Indians partnered with the Indiana Children's Wish Fund to host the 9th annual Caroline Symmes Celebrity Softball Challenge. More than 6,600 fans came to Victory Field to watch their favorite Indiana-based celebrities compete in the game. 2017's attendees included former Indiana Pacers All-Star Paul George and Indianapolis Colts legend Robert Mathis. A total of \$19,931 was raised through the event and proceeds helped the Indiana Children's Wish Fund grant wishes to Indiana children who suffer from life-threatening illnesses.

Charitable Fundraising: The Indians offer local organizations the opportunity to raise funds by selling tickets to a select Indians game and receiving \$5 back from each \$10 ticket sold. In 2017, 53 organizations participated in the program, raising a total of \$8,185.

Donations: The Indians frequently donate tickets and merchandise items to local organizations to be used for silent auctions, raffles and door prizes. In 2017, the organization made 1,613 donations, totaling more than \$256,811 in value.

Great Clips Charity Cuts: The Indians once again partnered with Great Clips on three game days this season. Great Clips set up shop on the Victory Field concourse and cut fans' hair for donations throughout the game. All proceeds were given to Answers for Autism, and the total contribution for 2017 was \$472.

Hero of the Game: The Indians recognized a retired or active member of the military every Saturday night during the 2017 season, plus Independence Day. Each Hero of the Game received four tickets to the game and was recognized on field between innings.

Indians Speakers Bureau: The Indians Speakers Bureau offered keynote presenters to churches, civic organizations, schools and other community organizations free of charge. They made 20 appearances in 2017.



Indy Do Day: In conjunction with the city of Indianapolis, the Indians' front office staff spent the day of September 29 rehabbing the senior diamond at Forest Manor Park. The entire staff re-graded the infield, planted new grass seed, realigned the foul lines and trimmed the hedges overtaking the field.

Jersey Auctions: In collaboration with Community Health Foundation, Indiana National Guard Relief Fund, Ronald McDonald House, Make-a-Wish Foundation, Riley Children's Foundation and Shepherd Community Center, the Indians raised nearly \$49,000 for their respective charities by auctioning player-worn jerseys. Fans were able to bid on their favorite player's jersey while also supporting a local cause.

Knot Hole Kids Club: In 2017, 9,142 kids ages 14 and under signed up to be a part of the Indians' Knot Hole Kids Club. For just \$17, club members received a Lawn or Reserved seat ticket to all 71 home games, an exclusive t-shirt and a chance to be introduced on-field pregame as the Play Ball Kid. In addition, all Knot Hole Kids Club members were invited to run the bases after each Sunday home game.

Mascot Appearances: Rowdie made many appearances throughout the year at various community events. In addition to helping fans cheer on the Indians at all 71 home games, he participated in over 130 events in the Indianapolis area, including the Indianapolis Humane Society's Community Day, Best Buddies Friendship Walk, the IndyStar Sports Awards, Wheeler Mission Drumstick Dash, 500 Festival Kids' Day and Downtown Indy's Indy Do Day Kickoff.

Mike Schneider Golf Outing: In memory of one of their own, the Indians hosted the 13th annual golf outing to honor the late Mike Schneider. The Indians donated \$13,000 to Teachers' Treasures, the designated beneficiary of the 2017 outing.

Mother's Day at Victory Field: In collaboration with Susan G. Komen Central Indiana, the Indians offered moms a day at the ballpark on Sunday, May 14. Mothers could stop by PNC Plaza for massages and pedicures, and 10 percent of the proceeds from all women's merchandise sold in the Hot Corner Gift Shop went to Komen. The promotion raised more than \$700 for the cause.

Pinch Hitter: Through the generosity of partners Kleenit and Regions Bank, the Indians donated more than 1,400 tickets throughout central Indiana. These organizations used the tickets for staff outings, volunteer appreciation or a fun day at the ballpark for the charity's beneficiaries.

Play Ball Indiana: The Indians once again partnered with Play Ball Indiana, the Indianapolis-based chapter of Major League Baseball's Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities (RBII) program. Highlights included sponsoring 10 teams in various Play Ball Indiana leagues and hosting a Pitch, Hit & Run regional competition at Victory Field. The Indians front office staff also dedicated a day of community service at Forest Manor Park, renovating the senior diamond in one day in preparation for a tournament the following day.

Regions Financial Literacy Initiative: For the fourth consecutive year, the Indians partnered with Regions Bank to educate over 120 inner-city youth on financial literacy and provide a VIP ballpark experience. Participants rotated through three sessions: a financial literacy workshop, behind-the-scenes tour of Victory Field, and batting tutorial conducted by Indians players. Participants also had a Q&A session with a player. At the end of the event, lunch was provided to all participants.



RightFit: The Indians worked with Indianapolis Public Schools and the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, plus city government officials and corporate partners, to create a new 501 C-3 not-for-profit called RightFit. The initiative provided homework help, nutrition education, physical fitness, dinner and a ride home to students at four Indianapolis elementary schools. RightFit groups met after school three days a week for 18 weeks. The program served 500 students and 27,000 after-school meals, and provided an opportunity for inner city students to develop positive relationships with emergency and safety personnel.

Rowdie Claus: In December, Rowdie dressed up and played the part of Santa Claus for children and families in the Indianapolis area. With a little help from some friendly elves, the Indians provided art projects and crafts along with hot chocolate, cupcakes and cookies. Admission to the event was a non-perishable food item, which the Indians donated to Wheeler Mission, a local homeless and recovery shelter.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND PROMOTIONS (cont.)

Scout Night Sleepover: On two Friday nights throughout the season, the Indians hosted a postgame sleepover for scouts. In 2017, there was one Boy Scout sleepover and one Girl Scout sleepover. Following the game, scouts were given popcorn and allowed to set up their tents in the outfield as they watched a movie on the video board. The Indians provided breakfast for all attendees as they left the next morning. A total of 1,540 scouts participated in the sleepovers in 2017.



Thursday Craft Beer Night: In 2017, the Indians partnered with Sun King Brewery for Thursday Craft Beer Night. During each Thursday game, Sun King brought two different local breweries for sampling in PNC Plaza. Each Craft Beer Night benefitted a local non-profit organization, including ALS Association, American Red Cross, Indy Parks Foundation, Nine13sports, Teachers' Treasures, Outreach, Inc. and Little Red Door. The organizations had a promotional table next to the tasting area, threw a ceremonial pitch, addressed the crowd during pregame ceremonies and took part in a radio interview with the Indians broadcast team. Groups received a portion of tickets sold for that evening's game. In total, nearly \$5,900 was donated back to the seven non-profit organizations in 2017.

Tickets for Troops: Through the generosity of season ticket holders and Eli Lilly & Co., the Indians provided 6,245 tickets to locally stationed troops, current reserves and veterans. Eli Lilly matched every unused season ticket donated to the Indians in order to support our military personnel and veterans.

Triple Play Little League Program: Every year since its inception in 2013, the Indians' Triple Play program has seen exceptional growth and increasingly positive results. Last year was no exception, as the organization spent \$40,000 sponsoring 17 local youth baseball and softball leagues. In total, 107 youth teams in central Indiana wore Indians jerseys and hats. As part of the program, the Indians sponsored two Challenger Leagues, which are leagues for children with learning or physical disabilities.

Valentine's Day Deliveries: The Tribe's mascot, Rowdie, surprised 52 local lovebirds in February 2017. The special delivery included an Indians t-shirt or stuffed Rowdie doll, four box seat ticket vouchers and four Gigi's cupcakes.

Wishes for Indiana Children's Wish Fund: Fans wishing to have their birthday or anniversary messages displayed on the Victory Field message board were encouraged to make a donation to the Indiana Children's Wish Fund. Through this opportunity, the Indians raised \$573 in 2017.

Youth Baseball Clinic: On May 31, the Indians hosted a free pregame clinic for any child with a game ticket. More than 500 children attended this year's clinic, which included hands-on instruction from Indians players on hitting, pitching and fielding fundamentals. During this time, Indians manager Andy Barkett held a Q&A session with parents.



2017 COMMUNITY RELATIONS HIGHLIGHTS

PIRATES COMMUNITY COMMITMENT PROGRAM

Pirates Community Commitment Program: Like all Pittsburgh Pirates affiliates, Indians players participated in community service throughout the baseball season. Players earned hours by visiting local children's hospitals, non-profit organizations, youth leagues and other community events. Collectively, Indians players made 44 appearances and served 193 hours to the community during the 2017 season.

PCCP HIGHLIGHTS

Call an Indian: Five players took time to record themselves reading a children's story related to baseball. By calling the Marion County Public Library, fans were able to hear any of the stories read to them for free.

Indianapolis Humane Society: As part of the Indians' ongoing partnership with IndyHumane, Indians players visited the local humane society for its Community Day. They worked with staff and other volunteers caring for the animals and walking them around the event, showcasing the dogs to prospective families.

Indy Thunder Beep Baseball for the Blind: The Indians joined the 2017 Beep Baseball World Series champion Indy Thunder for a demonstration and practice. Indians players participated in the game and attempted hitting and fielding with a blindfold.



Riley Hospital for Children: Throughout the season, several Indians players spent time with children undergoing treatment for cancer and other serious health issues at Riley Hospital for Children. They played video games, competed in air hockey and foosball and enjoyed other activities with children in Riley's Child Life Zone.

Wheeler Mission: Players spent time at Wheeler Mission, an Indianapolis non-profit that provides meals and assistance to those in need. The players met with residents of the neighborhood Wheeler Mission serves and played a few games of Wiffle Ball.

2017 NOTES & HIGHLIGHTS

IL WEST CHAMPS, AGAIN: The Indianapolis Indians (79-63) secured their fourth International League West Division title in the last six seasons as they held off Columbus (71-71) down the stretch to win the division by a comfortable eight-game margin. Indy started its run in the IL West in 2012 when they won the division by 14 games, and they followed that up with a 2013 division crown in which they beat second-place Columbus by nine games. Indy and Columbus tied for first in 2015. The 2017 squad started off 8-16 and was at the bottom of the IL before a 21-8 May turned the season around. The Indians pulled into a tie for first place on May 18 and only slipped into second for a single day following a 10-1 loss at Columbus on Aug. 3. The Tribe then reeled off nine wins in 10 games en route to a 20-11 finish and Governors' Cup Semifinal with Durham.

BARKETT'S FIRST CAMPAIGN: Tribe first-year manager Andy Barkett had a very successful campaign in 2017. Barkett became the ninth skipper to lead the Indians since Victory Field opened in 1996, and his 79 regular-season wins were good for second most among those nine managers in the VF era in their first year at the helm. Barkett's squad fell just short of Steve Smith's 81 victories from the 2000 season, the last Governors' Cup Championship season for the Tribe.

BOUNCED BY THE BULLS: The Indians and Durham Bulls met in the Governors' Cup Semifinals for a third time since Indy rejoined the IL in 1998. The Tribe knocked out the Bulls in 2000, winning the series 3-2 before defeating Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in the Championship, 3-2. The two didn't meet in the semis again until 2013 when Durham swept Indy, 3-0. In 2017, Durham protected its home field by winning Game 1 by a convincing 10-3 margin. The Bulls then defeated Tyler Glasnow and the Indians 2-0 in Game 2. With their backs against the wall, the Indians staved off elimination momentarily with a 5-0 shutout in Game 3, but Durham rallied for a 4-3 win in Game 4 to take the series. Durham then beat Scranton/W-B in the Governors' Cup Championship Series, 3-1, before besting Memphis in the winner-take-all Triple-A National Championship.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Indians posted a 44-27 home record during the 2017 regular season, tied for the second-most home wins in the IL. The 44 wins for the Tribe represented the fourth-highest win total at home since Victory Field opened in 1996, falling shy of the 1998 (45-26), 2012 (48-24) and 1997 (49-23) home records.

THE SEATS ARE FULL: For a second consecutive season and third time in five years, the Indians led Minor League Baseball in overall attendance. In 2017 Victory Field welcomed 641,141 patrons through its gates (70 openings), good for an MiLB-best average attendance of 9,159 fans per game.

STAFF STRIKEOUTS: Indians pitchers piled up 1,142 strikeouts in 142 regular-season contests, the fourth-highest total in the IL. The 1,142 whiffs fell just short of the franchise record 1,153 strikeouts from 2013, a year in which Indy played 144 games. The total was still good for second-most in franchise history, easily surpassing the 1,123 punchouts from the 2012 campaign.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: Indianapolis was well-represented on the team offensive leaderboards. Among IL squads, the Tribe ranked first in doubles (279) and second in average (.268), runs scored (647), hits (1,283), RBI (607) and OBP (T-2nd, .333). Indy was third in total bases (1,928) and fourth in both slugging percentage (.402) and stolen bases (101). Indy's .268 average and 1,283 hits were the best numbers in those categories by a Tribe team since the 2005 squad (.275 average, 1,342 hits).

SHOW BOUND: Over the course of the 2017 season, a total of 17 players were either recalled or had their contract selected by Pittsburgh, eight of whom went on to make their major league debut. First baseman/outfielder Jose Osuna was the first to be recalled in April and was the first of the eight to make his MLB debut. Right-hander Edgar Santana, Dovydas Neverauskas and Angel Sanchez, infielder Gift Ngoepe and outfielders Danny Ortiz, Jordan Luplow and Christopher Bostick all made their debuts as well.

BRAULT'S BREAKOUT SEASON: Left-hander Steven Brault began the season 0-3 through five starts, but he flipped the script when the calendar turned from April to May. The 25-year-old established himself as Indy's ace and one of the IL's most electrifying pitchers over his final 16 games (15 starts), going 10-2 with a 1.43 ERA (15 ER/94.2 IP). He earned his first midseason All-Star election as a pitcher for the IL and tossed a scoreless inning in the Triple-A Midsummer Classic in Tacoma, Wash. He finished with a 10-5 record and a league-best 1.94 ERA (26 ER/120.1 IP), becoming the third pitcher in franchise history (1902-present) and first since 1945 to lead his respective league with a sub-2.00 ERA. Additionally, he was the 22nd Tribe pitcher in franchise history to lead his league in ERA. Brault's .199 average against was second-lowest in the IL and his 1.07 WHIP was the third-best mark. The California native also registered a 5-3 record and remarkable 0.84 ERA (6 ER/64.0 IP) in 11 games (10 starts) at Victory Field. Further, he held left-handed batters to a .155 average (20-for-129). He was named Indy's Pitcher of the Year, the IL's Most Valuable Pitcher, Pittsburgh's Minor League Pitcher of the Year and was one of *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Stars. Brault also earned his first major league win on Sept. 11 at Milwaukee.

FEEL THE BREEZE: Following a mid-June demotion to Indianapolis, right-hander Tyler Glasnow dominated IL opponents by going 9-2 with a 1.93 ERA (20 ER/93.1 IP) and 140 strikeouts in 15 regular season starts. Despite missing the first two months of the minor league season due to pitching for Pittsburgh, Glasnow still managed to pace Tribe pitchers in whiffs while finishing third overall in the IL. Seven of his 15 starts featured 10-plus strikeouts, including a pair of dozen-punchout performances on June 26 vs. Durham and July 30 vs. Pawtucket. He also fanned nine batters over six innings of one-run ball in Game 2 of the Governors' Cup Semifinals against the Bulls. Glasnow's 140 strikeouts were the most by a Tribe pitcher since Mark Gardner struck out 175 batters in 1989. He also became the 13th pitcher in franchise history (1902-present) to lead Indy's staff in strikeouts in consecutive seasons. Glasnow's 273 strikeouts over the last two seasons for the Tribe is the third-highest total in a two-year span in the last six decades, trailing only Franklin Kreutzer (278, 1962-63) and Dave DeBusschere (302, 1964-65).

LITHUANIAN LIGHTNING: Tribe reliever Dovydas Neverauskas recorded a 2.86 ERA (16 ER/50.1 IP) and team-high 13 saves in 40 games this year. He finished third in the IL in saves and posted a 1.75 ERA (5 ER/25.2 IP) for the Tribe from the beginning of June-Sept. 4. He was ultimately honored as Indy's Reliever of the Year. Neverauskas became the first born-and-raised Lithuanian to appear in the big leagues on April 24 vs. Chicago (NL). He went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA (11 ER/25.1 IP) in 24 appearances with Pittsburgh.

DOUBLE THE FUN: The Indians led the IL in doubles for a third time in franchise history, collecting 279 two-baggers in 142 contests. Both Durham and Scranton/W-B finished with 272 doubles apiece. The Indians also led the league with 278 doubles in 2013 and 299 in 1998. Christopher Bostick led the team with 33 doubles, the most by a Tribe player since Matt Hague's 37 in 2013.

BOSTICK'S BIG YEAR: Christopher Bostick's 2017 season was an eventful one. He made his MLB debut at Dodger Stadium, was named to the IL midseason All-Star Team as an outfielder and played from start to finish in the Triple-A Midsummer Classic, was tabbed as Indy's Silver Slugger and Team MVP, and represented as the Tribe's 2017 recipient of the Pirates Community Commitment Award winner. Bostick led the Indians in average (.294), doubles (33), runs scored (75), multi-hit games (44) and two-out RBI (25). He finished among IL leaders in hits (2nd, 143), doubles (3rd), runs scored (T-3rd) and average (4th). He became the first Tribe player since Matt Hague in 2011 to have 30+ doubles, 70+ runs scored and 50+ RBI in a single season and is just the 10th Tribe player since 1995 to reach those numbers in a season. He recorded his first big league hit on Sept. 7 vs. Chicago (NL), a double in the ninth off right-hander Felix Pena.

NGOPE MAKES HISTORY: Gift Ngoepe became the first MLB player from the continent of Africa when he debuted on April 26 vs. Chicago (NL). In his first big league at-bat, Ngoepe singled off Cubs left-hander Jon Lester. Ngoepe went on to bat .222 (12-for-54) in 28 games for Pittsburgh before returning to Indy. He batted .220 (58-for-264) in 77 games for the Tribe, with his minor league season highlighted by a twisting, acrobatic catch at shortstop that appeared as the No. 2 play on SportsCenter's Top 10.

REWRITE THE RECORD BOOKS: The Indians put together a historical offensive performance on July 6 at Columbus, matching or setting five different records in a 21-1 rout over the Clippers. The 21 runs scored and 21 RBI by the Tribe broke the previous high of 19 runs and 18 RBI set on May 6, 2004 vs. Charlotte. Indy's 22 hits marked the third time the club has reached that number in the Victory Field era, most recently on May 31, 2005 vs. Louisville. Seven of the Tribe's 22 knocks sailed over the fence, just the second time since 1996 that the Indians hit seven home runs in a single game (also: July 3, 1997 at Nashville). The Indians also drew 13 walks, tying the VF era record set on July 6, 1998 at Louisville. Four players recorded three-plus hits, and Jordan Luplow became the first Tribe player to score four runs in a game since Steve Pearce did so on May 29, 2009 vs. Pawtucket.



MAKE ROOM ON THE MANTEL







Napoleon Lajoie (1918) - Suite 301

MLB TEAMS PLAYED FOR

Philadelphia Phillies (1896-1900), Philadelphia Athletics (1901-02, 1915-16)
Cleveland Bronchos (1902), Cleveland Naps (1903-14)

On the heels of a 21-year major league career, Nap Lajoie (LAJ-way) came to Indianapolis and served as player-manager for the club in 1918. He hit .282 and led the Tribe to a 41-34 record, but the season was shortened by the United States' involvement in World War I. Lajoie won the American League Triple Crown in 1901, led the AL in batting average five times (1901-04, 1910) and joined Cap Anson and Honus Wagner as the only MLB players with 3,000 career hits on Sept. 27, 1914. His popularity in Cleveland led to the organization changing its name from the Bronchos to the Naps. He is among MLB's all-time hits leaders and was elected into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1937.



Vern Rapp (1969-75) - Suite 302

MLB TEAMS MANAGED

St. Louis Cardinals (1977-78), Cincinnati Reds (1984)

After spending all or parts of 16 minor league seasons as a catcher in the Cardinals, Yankees, Giants, Tigers and Expos organizations, Vern Rapp became a minor league manager for 15 years, seven of them with Indianapolis. He skippered the Tribe to American Association East Division titles in 1971 and 1974. His 1971 club led the AA in ERA (3.01), fewest hits allowed (1,084) and fielding percentage (.976) over 140 contests. His second division-winning squad repeated what made the 1971 team successful, again leading the league in ERA (3.81), fewest hits allowed (1,024) and fielding percentage (.971). He ranks second on Indy's all-time managerial wins list with 513 career victories, and his .532 winning percentage is second to only Dean Treanor's .545 clip among Tribe managers with 400-plus wins. Rapp managed his hometown Cardinals to an 83-79 record in 1977 ahead of an early-season dismissal in 1978. He returned to the big leagues as manager of the Reds in 1984 and accumulated 140 total wins at the game's highest level.



Randy Johnson (1988-89) - Suite 303

MLB TEAMS PLAYED FOR

Montreal Expos (1988-89), Seattle Mariners (1989-98), Houston Astros (1998)

Arizona Diamondbacks (1999-2004, 2007-08), New York Yankees (2005-06), San Francisco Giants (2009)

Nicknamed "The Big Unit" due to his imposing 6-foot-10 presence on the mound, Randy Johnson's career is undoubtedly the most illustrious among former Tribe players. The left-handed fireballer reached triple digits with his fastball early in his career, going a combined 9-8 with a 3.08 ERA in 23 games during Indianapolis' 1988 and 1989 American Association Championship seasons. With Seattle, Johnson was a 1990 American League All-Star and took off in 1992 by striking out an AL-high 241 batters. A year later Johnson fanned a league-best 308 batters, the first of a record six 300-plus strikeout campaigns. He earned four more AL All-Star selections (1993-95, 1997) with Seattle and his first Cy Young Award in 1995 after leading the AL in ERA (2.48) and strikeouts (294). In 1997 with the Mariners, he recorded his first of three career 20-win campaigns while helping guide Seattle to the postseason for a second time. Johnson was then traded to Houston at the July deadline in 1998 and went 10-1 down the stretch to lift the Astros into the playoffs. The superstar talent later earned a spot in the desert with the Arizona Diamondbacks, where he won four straight National League Cy Young Awards (1999-2002) and was elected to five NL All-Star teams (1999-2002, 2004). He led the NL in ERA three times (1999, 2001-02) and strikeouts five times (1999-2002, 2004), including a career-high 372 during Arizona's run to the 2001 World Series Championship, of which he was named MVP. Earlier that season, he tossed the fourth 20-strikeout game by an individual in baseball history. He won the NL Triple Crown (24 wins, 2.32 ERA, 334 strikeouts) in 2002 and finished second in the 2004 NL Cy Young race, a season where he tossed the 17th perfect game in baseball history to become the oldest ever to accomplish the feat, doing so at age 40 and breaking a century-old record set by Cy Young himself in 1904. Johnson's last of 22 seasons was highlighted by his 300th career win, making him the 24th member of the 300-win club. He ended his career with 303 total victories, a lifetime 3.29 ERA and 4,875 strikeouts, a total that trails only Nolan Ryan. He was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2012, and three years later, his No. 51 jersey was retired by the D-backs just months after he became a First Ballot Hall of Famer.



Norman A. Perry Sr. (1929-41) - Suite 304

The mastermind behind the construction of Perry Stadium (later known as Victory Field from 1942-67 and Bush Stadium from 1967-96), Norman Perry Sr. has multiple ties to the rich history of Indianapolis. The Perry family owned and operated the Indianapolis Light & Heat Company, today known as the Indianapolis Power & Light Company. The light towers at Washington Park (located in place of the Indianapolis Zoo) were provided by the Perry family, which were eventually moved to the Tribe's new stadium in 1931. Perry Sr. named the ballpark Perry Stadium in honor of his late brother James, who bought the Indians in 1927 but was killed in a plane crash two years later. Following the tragic death, Perry Sr. took the reins as owner of the team up until selling the franchise to Owen "Donie" Bush and Frank E. McKinney in 1941.



Orestes "Minnie" Minoso (1964) - Suite 305

MLB TEAMS PLAYED FOR

Cleveland Indians (1949, 1951, 1958-59), Chicago White Sox (1951-57, 1960-61, 1964, 1976, 1980)

St. Louis Cardinals (1962), Washington Senators (1963)

On the heels of 14 successful major league seasons, 38-year-old Minnie Minoso hit .264 in 52 games for an 89-win Indianapolis squad. His baseball career began in 1946 with the New York Cubans in the Negro leagues, and he eventually signed with Cleveland in 1948 after baseball's color barrier began to fade. Minoso consistently ranked among American League leaders, topping the AL in stolen bases (1951-53) and triples three times (1951, 1954, 1956) each and doubles (1957) and hits (1960) once apiece. The seven-time All-Star (1951-54, 1957, 1959-60) and three-time Gold Glove Award winner (1957, 1959-60) finished fourth in AL MVP voting four times (1951, 1953-54, 1960) and led the AL in times hit by pitch a record 10 seasons. He was the first black Cuban in major league history and first black player in White Sox history. He rejoined the South Siders as a coach in the early '70s and made highly publicized game appearances in 1976 and 1980 at ages 50 and 54. Minoso became the third player in baseball history over the age of 50 to notch a hit at the big league level and the second ever to play in the majors across five different decades. The White Sox retired his No. 9 jersey in 1983 and unveiled a statue of him at U.S. Cellular Field in 2004. He was also inducted into the Mexican Baseball Hall of Fame in 1996.



Andrew McCutchen (2007-09) - Suite 306

MLB TEAMS PLAYED FOR

Pittsburgh Pirates (2009-17), San Francisco Giants (2018)

Selected by the Pirates 11th overall in the 2005 MLB June Amateur Draft, Andrew McCutchen lived up to the hype on his way through Circle City. Following a brief 17-game showing in 2007, McCutchen paced the 2008 Indians in batting average (.283), hits (145), doubles (26) and OPS (.770) while finishing second in stolen bases (34). He played for Indy again in 2009 and led the club with eight triples, despite only appearing in 49 games. McCutchen broke into the majors with Pittsburgh in 2009 and became a five-time National League All-Star (2011-15), four-time Silver Slugger (2012-15), Gold Glove Award winner (2012) and MVP (2013). He led the NL with 194 hits in 2012 and batted .317 with 21 home runs, 84 RBIs and 27 stolen bases during his MVP campaign. McCutchen posted 20-plus home runs and 79 or more RBIs in each of his final seven years with the Pirates. He was presented with the Roberto Clemente Award in 2015, given annually to an MLB player who "best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field."



Roger Maris (1956) - Suite 307

MLB TEAMS PLAYED FOR

Cleveland Indians (1957-58), Kansas City Athletics (1958-59), New York Yankees (1960-66), St. Louis Cardinals (1967-68)

Before churning out 12 seasons in the major leagues, Roger Maris helped lead Indianapolis to the American Association Pennant, Championship and Junior World Series title in 1956. Just 21 years old, Maris batted .293 with 17 home runs, 75 RBI and a team-high 20 doubles in 131 games for the Tribe. In Game 2 of Indy's 4-0 sweep of Rochester in the Junior World Series, Maris belted two home runs as part of a record seven-RBI performance. He made his big league debut with Cleveland in 1957 and earned four American League All-Star nods from 1959-62. After being traded from the Kansas City Athletics to the New York Yankees following the 1959 season, Maris won back-to-back AL MVP Awards in 1960 and '61. He led the AL in RBI both years and set the single-season home run record with 61 blasts in 1961, breaking Babe Ruth's record of 60 set in 1927. Maris' record lasted 37 years, until both Mark McGwire and Sammy Sosa surpassed the feat in 1998. The left-handed-hitting right fielder appeared in seven World Series, five with the Yankees (1960-64) and two with the Cardinals (1967-68), winning rings in 1961, '62 and '67. Maris' No. 9 was retired by the Yankees on July 21, 1984. A little over a year later, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma took his life in December 1985.



Ken Griffey (1973-74) - Suite 308

MLB TEAMS PLAYED FOR

Cincinnati Reds (1973-81, 1988-90), New York Yankees (1982-86), Atlanta Braves (1986-88), Seattle Mariners (1990-91)

Well before making history with his son Ken Griffey Jr., Ken Griffey Sr. had a successful 19-year major league career of his own. He was the Tribe's Team MVP and American Association Rookie of the Year in 1973 after hitting .327 with 10 home runs, 58 RBI and 43 stolen bases. Griffey Sr. then hit .333 in 43 contests with Indy the following year and later won two Series rings in 1975 and 1976 with Cincinnati as part of The Big Red Machine. Griffey Sr. was a three-time National League All-Star (1976-77, 1980) and won the game's MVP Award in 1980. A decade later, he closed out his career in Seattle playing alongside his son. On Aug. 31, 1990, they became the first father-son teammates in MLB history. Griffey Sr. hit second, followed by his son Griffey Jr. and both singled in their first at-bats of the game. Two weeks later, the duo further etched themselves in baseball history by becoming the first father-son combination – and only to this date – to hit back-to-back home runs. Griffey Sr. was inducted into the Reds Hall of Fame in 2004 and is the only player in Reds history to play for three Reds World Champion teams.

Don Zimmer spent 66 of his 83 years either playing, coaching or managing professional baseball. One of those 66 years came as skipper of the 1968 Indianapolis Indians, a team that was led by eventual Kansas City Royals All-Star Hal McRae. Zimmer played a combined 12 seasons for six major league organizations, winning two World Series rings with the Dodgers (1955, 1959) before earning a National League All-Star bid with the Chicago Cubs in 1961. His first taste of managing came in 1967 before coming through Indy the following year. He broke into the majors as a manager in 1972 and won 90-plus games with the Boston Red Sox three straight seasons (1977-79). His lone managerial playoff appearance came in 1989 when he guided the Cubs to a 93-69 record and NLCS appearance, eventually receiving the NL Manager of the Year Award. Zimmer was a bench coach for the New York Yankees for four of their World Series titles (1996, 1998-2000) and was later inducted into the Red Sox Hall of Fame in 2010. Every year, Zimmer increased his jersey number one digit to match his years spent in professional baseball. After working 11 seasons with the Tampa Bay Rays from 2004 to 2014, his last jersey – No. 66 – was officially retired by the Rays in 2015.



Michael A. Carroll - Suite 314

On Sept. 11, 1992, four Indianapolis business and civic leaders were killed when two small planes collided. The leaders were en route to Columbus, Ohio, for a flower show with hopes of learning how to beautify White River State Park. Michael A. Carroll, Vice President of Community Affairs for Lilly Endowment Inc. and a former Deputy Mayor and special assistant to Senator Richard Lugar and Dan Quayle when he served in the Senate, was among the four leaders who died. Frank E. McKinney Jr., a former Indiana University swimming champion, Olympic gold medalist and retired CEO of Bank One Indiana, also died in the crash, along with former Indiana lottery director John Welever and White River State Park Commission Executive Director Bob Welch. Among Carroll's greatest achievements was helping bring the Pan American Games to Indianapolis in 1987, held at the venue named in honor of him. In addition to the 1987 Pan Am Games and 1988 Olympic Team Trials, the Michael A. Carroll Track & Soccer Stadium has hosted IUPUI athletics, the 2006 and 2007 USA Track and Field Championships, the IHSAA Lacrosse and Soccer State Championships and Indy Eleven soccer.



Joe Sparks (1986-88) - Suite 315

A minor league manager for all or parts of 20 seasons, Joe Sparks delivered nothing but championships during his three-year stretch as Indianapolis' skipper. In his first season at the helm the Indians went 80-62 and defeated Denver in a best-of-seven series, 4-3, to claim the first of four straight American Association titles for the club. His squad finished third in the eight-team division the following year but bounced Louisville 3-2 in the opening round of the playoffs before again trouncing Denver for the AA Championship, 4-1. Sparks' 1988 campaign featured 89 wins, another AA Pennant and Championship, and Triple-A Classic title over Rochester. He was named AA Manager of the Year in each of his three seasons with Indy, in addition to 1988 Minor League Manager of the Year honors. Sparks never reached the majors in his 13 seasons as a player, but he did have four separate one-year MLB coaching stints with the Chicago White Sox (1979), Cincinnati Reds (1984), Montreal Expos (1989) and New York Yankees (1990). He closed out his career in baseball as an advance scout for the St. Louis Cardinals (1996-2003) and Oakland Athletics (2005-08).



Rocky Colavito (1954-55) - Suite 316

An eventual Cleveland Indians and Detroit Tigers slugger, Rocky Colavito first showcased his raw power with the Tribe in 1954 and '55. At age 20, he set the Indianapolis single-season home run record with 38 long balls. His power lifted the Indians to an American Association Pennant and Championship appearance. The young corner outfielder followed that campaign with a 30-homer output in 1955. His 68 career homers for the Tribe place him in a tie for third among Indy's all-time home run leaders. Colavito would later crush 374 career home runs over 14 big league seasons, eight spent in Northeast Ohio. He finished second in the 1956 American League Rookie of the Year voting and was third in votes for AL MVP two years later. In 1959, Colavito smacked 42 home runs and finished atop the AL home run chart with another former Indianapolis Indian, Harmon Killebrew of the Washington Senators. A trade to the Tigers just days before Opening Day in 1960 caused an uproar amongst Indians fans, who voiced their displeasure by starting a "Don't Knock the Rock" campaign. Colavito earned a total of six AL All-Star bids (1959, 1961-62, 1964-66) before his playing days ended following the 1968 season. Colavito, alongside former Indy Indians player-manager Al Lopez and pitcher Herb Score, was inducted into the Cleveland Indians Hall of Fame in 2006.

Aaron Boone (1997-99) - Suite 317

An up-and-coming prospect in the Reds organization, Aaron Boone first joined Indy in 1997 and hit .290 with 22 home runs, 30 doubles and 75 RBI on his way to team MVP honors and an American Association playoff berth. Boone played in another 98 games for the Tribe spanning the 1998 and 1999 seasons before fully catching on as a regular in Cincinnati. He launched a career-high 26 home runs and played in all 162 games in 2002, earning Reds Team MVP. The following October, he etched his name in Yankees lore with an extra-inning, walk-off home run in Game 7 of the 2003 American League Championship Series to defeat the rival Red Sox. His playing career ended after the 2009 season, but Boone remained involved in the game by contributing to ESPN's *Sunday Night Baseball* coverage as a game analyst and color commentator from 2010-17. He was a regular on *Baseball Tonight* and part of ESPN Radio's broadcast team for the World Series until accepting an offer to become the 33rd manager in Yankees history ahead of the 2018 season.



Moises Alou (1990) - Suite 323

Thirteen years before his name became synonymous with Steve Bartman, Moises Alou played a 15-game stint with Indianapolis in 1990, just five years after his father Felipe Alou managed the club. He earned his first career National League All-Star bid in a strike-shortened 1994 season, a year in which he finished third in the MVP race while winning a Silver Slugger Award. Three years later, Alou was again elected an NL All-Star and won his first and only championship ring, doing so with the Florida Marlins after he hit .321 with three home runs and nine RBI in the World Series. He earned four additional NL All-Star selections (1998, 2001, 2004-05) and another Silver Slugger Award (1998), sandwiching those accolades around the infamous Bartman fiasco. Playing for the Chicago Cubs in Game 6 of the 2003 NLCS and just five outs away from a World Series berth, Alou tracked a fly ball into foul territory down the left field line at Wrigley Field. The ball sliced into the first row, where Cubs fan Steve Bartman deflected the ball away from a leaping Alou. The Cubs - leading 3-1 at the time - imploded as the Marlins plated seven more runs in the inning to win Game 6, eventually win Game 7 and ultimately become World Series Champions. Alou finished his 17-year career in 2008 with a lifetime average of .303 and 2,134 hits.



Johnny Vander Meer (1940) - Suite 324

The left-handed throwing Johnny Vander Meer won a total of 119 games over his 13-year big league career, 11 of those seasons spent with the Cincinnati Reds. In 1938, Vander Meer became the first pitcher to record consecutive no-hitters, doing so against the Boston Braves and Brooklyn Dodgers. That record still stands to this day. On the flipside, command issues plagued the southpaw for much of his career, ultimately leading him to be optioned to Indianapolis during the 1940 season. He went 6-4 with a 2.40 ERA in 14 starts for the Tribe before returning to Cincinnati and helping the Reds win their second World Series Championship. Vander Meer was a four-time National League All-Star (1938-39, 1942-43) and led the NL in strikeouts three straight seasons (1941-43). The New Jersey native also put his major league career on hold for two seasons when he joined the United States Navy in March 1944.



Hal McRae (1968-69) - Suite 340

Hal McRae's first of two campaigns with the Tribe saw him become the third player in franchise history to lead the team in batting average, hits, doubles, triples, home runs and RBI. Those results led him to the majors, where he would churn out 19 seasons - 15 spent with the Kansas City Royals. McRae was selected to three American League All-Star Teams (1975-76, 1982) and finished fourth in the AL MVP race two times (1976, 1982). The Florida native was a double machine for most of his career, compiling league-best marks with 54 and 46 in 1977 and 1982, respectively. He also led the AL with 133 RBI in 1982. McRae played in nine different postseasons, including four World Series (1970, 1972, 1980, 1985). He has two World Series rings to his credit - one as part of Kansas City's first World Series Championship in 1985 and later as hitting coach of the 2006 St. Louis Cardinals. McRae also managed the Royals and Tampa Bay Devil Rays for a combined six seasons.



Champ Summers (1978) - Suite 341

In the summer of 1978, Champ Summers' one season with Indianapolis proved to be one of the most dominant seasons by an individual player in team history. Summers joined the Tribe during his three-year run with Cincinnati and accumulated team highs in batting average (.368), hits (170), home runs (34) and RBI (124), setting league highs with the latter three marks. He was named Team MVP and American Association MVP after leading the Tribe to a 78-57 record and AA East Division title. Since that '78 campaign, no Tribe player has topped Summers' average, hits, home runs or RBI totals in a single season. His 34 long balls that year trail only Rocky Colavito's 38 from 1954, and his .368 average is the fourth-highest single-season mark in club history. Summers' best major league season came in 1979 between Cincinnati and Detroit when he notched career highs in homers (21), RBI (62) and stolen bases (7) while batting .291. His lone MLB postseason appearance came in 1984 as the Padres defeated the Cubs in the National League Championship Series before falling to Detroit in the World Series, 4-1.



Bob Uecker (1960) - Suite 342

While Milwaukee native Bob Uecker only appeared in eight games for the Tribe in 1960 and was a lifetime .200 hitter over six major league seasons, he did play for his hometown team, won a World Series with the Cardinals in 1964 and hit three of his 14 career home runs off future Hall of Famers Sandy Koufax, Gaylord Perry and Fergie Jenkins. Uecker caught his break when he became a regular guest on Johnny Carson's *Tonight Show*, on which the famous TV host branded Uecker the nickname "Mr. Baseball." Uecker became radio broadcaster of the Milwaukee Brewers in 1971 and was part of ABC and NBC Major League Baseball broadcasts in the 1970s and 1990s. In 1989, Uecker's part-time acting career landed him a prominent role as Cleveland broadcaster Harry Doyle in the *Major League* film trilogy. Uecker was on the call for Robin Yount's 3,000th career hit on Sept. 9, 1992, one of many iconic broadcasting moments in his legendary career. In 2003, he was honored with the Ford C. Frick Award in recognition of his broadcasting career, and his catchphrase home run call "Get up! Get up! Get outta here! Gone!" resonates with Brewers and baseball fans across the country.



Owen J. "Donie" Bush (1908, 1924-26, 1941-52, 1955-69) - Suite 345

One of the original 16 members inducted into the Indiana Baseball Hall of Fame in 1979, Indianapolis native Donie Bush contributed significantly to Tribe baseball, both on and off the field. Prior to being honored as the "King of Baseball" at Major League Baseball's 1963 Winter Meetings, Bush was a player, manager, president and owner of the Indians at various points of his career. He first suited up for the Tribe in 1908 and helped lead the team to a 92-61 record and American Association pennant. Bush made his MLB debut that year in Detroit, where he led the American League in walks five times (1909-12, 1914) and finished third in the 1914 AL MVP race. Bush was a nightmare on the baselines as well, swiping 30-plus bags eight times in his career (1909-15, 1917). At age 35 in 1923, he served as a player-manager for the Washington Senators before returning to Indy in 1924. He managed the Tribe to three straight 90-plus win seasons in the American Association and even took the field briefly in both 1924 and 1926. Bush's managerial success earned him the same gig with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1927, and he didn't disappoint in leading the Buccos to a 94-60 record and World Series berth. He skippered another five years in the big leagues before an opportunity arose with his hometown club. In 1941, Bush and Frank E. McKinney bought the Indianapolis Indians from Norman Perry Sr., and Bush became co-owner and president as a result. For the entire 1943 season and part of 1944, Bush maintained his front office roles while returning to the dugout as field manager. In total, he piloted 497 wins in the major leagues and 365 victories for Indy. After Bush stepped down as Indianapolis president and sold his remaining club ownership rights to the Cleveland Indians, he became a scout for the Boston Red Sox from 1953-55. Bush made a fourth and final return to the Tribe in Nov. 1955, becoming president through January 1969. In 1967, old Victory Field was renamed Bush Stadium in honor of Indianapolis' "Mr. Baseball." Bush's baseball career continued as a scout for the Chicago White Sox until he passed at age 84 in March 1972.

Ted Beard (1947-51, 1956-63) - Suite 346

The longest-tenured position player in franchise history, Ted Beard unsurprisingly ranks among all-time Tribe leaders in numerous offensive categories. His defense was superb as well, following a two-game stint in 1947, Indianapolis fans nicknamed him "The Arm" after he recorded 31 outfield assists in his first full season. He quickly became a favorite among his teammates and fans with his hustle. At just 5-foot-8 and 165 pounds, Beard led the 1948 American Association in triples (17), walks (128) and runs scored (131), helping guide Indy to the pennant and the franchise's lone 100-win season. One year later, he drew a single-season record 132 walks while propelling the team to its third American Association Championship and first Junior World Series title. The scrappy talent spent parts of seven seasons in the big leagues, and one of his six career major league homers is still remembered to this day. What Beard would later describe as "a mistake" because he rarely hit home runs at all, the left-handed hitter became the second of 10 players ever to hit a home run over the 86-foot-high right field roof at Forbes Field in 1950. Fifteen years prior, Babe Ruth was the first to accomplish the feat, doing so on his last of 714 career home runs. Beard is Indy's all-time leader in career walks (707) and ranks in the top five in triples (2nd), runs scored (2nd), doubles (4th), games played (4th) and hits (6th). He also managed the club for half of the 1960 season and admirably served as an Army medic in the Pacific theatre of World War II.

George Foster (1973) - Suite 351

George Foster was a feared right-handed slugger from the mid-1970s to the mid-80s. At age 23, Foster appeared for the Reds in Games 1 and 5 of the 1972 World Series against Oakland but did not receive an at-bat. He returned to the minors the following year and hit .262 with 15 home runs, 26 doubles and 60 RBI for Indianapolis. Foster finally hit his stride in 1976 with his first of four straight National League All-Star selections, even winning MVP of the All-Star Game. The California native hit 29 home runs and drove in an NL-high 121 RBI that year, helping The Big Red Machine to its second consecutive World Series Championship while finishing second in the NL MVP race behind Reds teammate Joe Morgan. In 1977 Foster exploded with major league bests in home runs (52), RBI (149), total bases (388) and slugging percentage (.631) to win NL MVP, and his 1978 season saw him again lead the NL in RBI (120). In his last season with the Reds, Foster earned his fifth and final All-Star bid, won a Silver Slugger Award and finished third in the MVP race. He split his last of 18 big league seasons between the Mets and White Sox, with New York awarding him a World Series ring following their 1986 Championship. Overall, Foster had 10 seasons with 20-plus home runs and seven with 90 or more RBI. He was inducted into the Reds Hall of Fame in 2003.

Mordecai "Three Finger" Brown (1919) - Suite 352

During his youth, Mordecai Brown got the nickname "Three Finger" when he lost parts of two fingers on his right hand in a farming accident. Raised 60 miles west of Indianapolis in Nyesville, Ind., Brown used his accident as an advantage when playing baseball. The movement of his pitches was second to none in the early 1900s, including a curveball that Detroit Tigers legend Ty Cobb dubbed as "the most deceiving and most devastating pitch he ever faced." Brown led the majors with a 1.04 ERA in 1906 before leading the Chicago Cubs to back-to-back World Series titles in 1907 and 1908. During his 29-win 1908 campaign, he became the first pitcher in MLB history to toss four consecutive shutouts. Brown pitched for Indianapolis in 1919 at age 42 and was elected into the National Baseball Hall of Fame by the Veterans Committee in 1949.

Larry Walker (1989) - Suite 353

Larry Walker was a key contributor to Indianapolis' run at a fourth straight American Association Championship and second consecutive Triple-A Classic title in 1989. He batted .270 with 12 home runs, 59 RBI and a team-best 36 stolen bases for the 89-57 squad. The 22-year-old Canadian broke into the majors that season with the Montreal Expos. His 1992 campaign featured a National League All-Star bid, Gold Glove and Silver Slugger Award. Another Gold Glove Award in 1993 preceded an NL-high 44 doubles in 1994 before his career took off in Colorado. He became the first Canadian to win an MVP, doing so in 1997 behind a league-best and career-high 49 homers. Walker added four more All-Star selections (1997-99, 2001), five Gold Glove Awards (1997-99, 2001-02) and two Silver Slugger Awards (1997, 1999) with the Rockies. He was also a three-time MLB batting champion while in Colorado (1998-99, 2001) and peaked with a .379 average to close out the 20th century. He finished his playing career with the Cardinals, appearing in the final two of his three career postseasons. Walker carried St. Louis to the 2004 World Series against Boston and set the franchise record for most home runs by a left-handed hitter in postseason play with six. In the series opener, his four-hit performance made him the seventh Cardinals player and first since Lou Brock in 1969 to record four knocks in a World Series game. Following retirement, Walker served as hitting coach of the Canadian national team in multiple World Baseball Classics.

Razor Shines (1984-89, 1991-93) - Suite 355

A name synonymous with Indianapolis Indians baseball, Razor Shines played in over 800 games for the Tribe across nine seasons. While he only saw brief major league action in parts of four seasons, Shines played a huge role in guiding Indianapolis to American Association dominance throughout the 1980s. His best season with Indy came in 1984 when he had 26 doubles, 18 home runs and 80 RBI, but the Tribe fell short in their AA Championship Series against Louisville. Following the loss, Shines led the Indians to three AA Pennants (1986, 1988-89) and four straight AA Championships (1986-89). Overall, Shines' longevity and success placed him among Indy's all-time leaders in home runs (1st-3rd), RBI (4th) and doubles (5th). He was a player-hitting coach for Indy in 1993 and attended the final game played at Bush Stadium on July 3, 1996. Shines coached and managed for various minor league teams up through 2015 and accepted big league opportunities in 2007 as third base coach of the White Sox and first base coach for the Mets from 2009-10.



Dave Concepcion (1969) - Suite 356

Originally drafted by Cincinnati as a pitcher, Dave Concepción became one of the Reds' and National League's greatest all-time shortstops. Before spending each of his 19 major league seasons in Cincy, Concepción played in 42 games and batted .341 for the Tribe in 1969. He made his MLB debut the following year at age 22 and earned his first NL All-Star bid in 1973. Despite missing the All-Star cut in 1974, he did manage to steal a career-high 41 bases while winning his first Gold Glove Award. Concepción then reeled off eight consecutive All-Star selections from 1975-82, also winning four additional Gold Glove Awards (1975-77, 1979) and two Silver Slugger Awards (1981-82). He played in five postseasons – four of which the Reds advanced to the World Series (1970, 1972, 1975-76) – winning the last two. He was part of The Big Red Machine's intimidating "Great 8" lineup that featured Pete Rose, Johnny Bench, Joe Morgan and former Indy Indians Ken Griffey Sr. and George Foster. In his last of nine All-Star Games, Concepción was named MVP after hitting a home run for the victorious NL side. The Reds honored the Venezuelan by inducting him into their Hall of Fame in 2000 and later retired his No. 13 jersey on Aug. 25, 2007.



Herb Score (1952, 1954, 1962-63) - Suite 357

On his 19th birthday in 1952, Herb Score signed a contract with the Cleveland Indians and was assigned to Indianapolis where he made 12 appearances (10 starts) with the Tribe. Two years later, Score returned to Indy and delivered the most dominant season in franchise history, pacing the American Association with 22 wins, a 2.62 ERA and a league- and franchise-record 330 strikeouts. Score reached the majors the following year and was named an American League All-Star and Rookie of the Year after going 16-10 with an MLB-high 245 strikeouts. His strikeout total set a rookie record and lasted until 1984, and it made him one of eight rookie pitchers in the 20th century to tally 200 or more strikeouts in their debut season. He again earned an AL All-Star nod and led all major league pitchers in strikeouts with 263 recorded in 1956. Unfortunate injuries derailed Score's playing career in the late '50s, but he joined Cleveland's broadcast team in 1964 and continued in that role through the 1997 season. He was inducted into the Cleveland Indians Hall of Fame in 2006 alongside former Indy Indians player-manager Al Lopez and slugger Rocky Colavito.



Eric Davis (1983) - Suite 358

Baltimore Orioles (1997-98), St. Louis Cardinals (1999-2000), San Francisco Giants (2001)

Eric Davis was a rare five-tool player from the mid-1980s into the late '90s. He played in 19 games for the Tribe in 1983, batting .299 with four doubles, seven home runs and 19 RBI. Davis later made his MLB debut as a 21-year-old in May 1984 and quickly became one of baseball's most entertaining players. In 1986, Davis joined Rickey Henderson as the only players in baseball history to hit 20-plus homers and swipe 80 or more bases in the same season. Those numbers teed up National League All-Star bids in 1987 and 1989, in addition to three consecutive Gold Glove Awards (1987-89). He became the first member of the 30/50 club, hitting 37 home runs to go along with 50 stolen bases in 1987. Barry Bonds would later join the 30/50 club in 1990, but Davis' Reds got the best of Bonds' Pirates in the NLCS. Davis went on to contribute a Game 1 home run and five total RBI in Cincinnati's 4-0 World Series sweep of Oakland. Davis was the first former Indianapolis Indian to win the Home Run Derby (1989) and was a recipient of the Roberto Clemente Award after beating a May 1997 colon cancer diagnosis. He was inducted into the Reds Hall of Fame in 2005.



Al Lopez (1948-50) - Skyline 1

Cleveland Indians (1951-56), Chicago White Sox (1957-65, 1968-69)

Al Lopez was a dependable backstop for four organizations over 19 seasons, earning a pair of National League All-Star selections along the way (1934, 1941). He then took the reins as player-manager for Indianapolis in 1948, and in his three-year tenure with the Tribe, logged the only 100-win season (1948, 100-54) and third of 10 American Association Championships in franchise history (1949). Lopez's minor league managerial success eventually earned him big league opportunities to manage the Cleveland Indians and Chicago White Sox. He averaged 95 wins per season with Cleveland, including an American League record 111 wins and AL Pennant in 1954. Lopez later joined the White Sox and delivered the South Siders their fifth AL Pennant in 1959. Over a 16-year span (1949-64), the only teams other than the New York Yankees to represent the AL in the World Series were Lopez's 1954 Indians and 1959 White Sox. He was elected into the National Baseball Hall of Fame by the Veterans Committee in 1977. Lopez lived to the age of 97 and passed just four days after watching the White Sox win the 2005 World Series, their first since 1917.

Viewed as one of the best catchers in baseball history, Charles "Gabby" Hartnett rocked Indianapolis headlines when he was named Tribe manager for the 1942 season. At age 41, Hartnett even took the field for Indy in 72 contests, clubbing four home runs while the team finished 76-78 overall. Hartnett first broke into the majors in 1922 and racked up six National League All-Star bids (1933-38) and the 1935 NL MVP. He finished second in the 1937 NL MVP race after posting a .354 batting average for the Cubs, the highest mark recorded by a catcher for the next 60 years. From 1938-40, Hartnett served as both a player and manager for the Cubs. Hartnett became the third Indianapolis Indian elected into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1955.

In his seventh minor league season, Andres Galarraga led all Indianapolis players in home runs (25), triples (8) and RBI (82) en route to Team MVP and American Association Rookie of the Year honors. His prolific power translated to the big leagues, where he recorded three consecutive seasons of 40-plus home runs (1996-98). He was a five-time National League All-Star (1988, 1993, 1997-98, 2000) and garnered two Gold Glove (1989-90) and Silver Slugger Awards (1988, 1996). He was the first Colorado Rockies player to be elected to the All-Star Game and first Venezuelan to win a batting title when he hit a league-best .370 in 1993. His .370 clip was the highest mark by a right-handed batter in the majors since the Joe DiMaggio hit .381 in 1939. He then became an RBI-machine with 150 and 140 RBI back-to-back years (1996-97), both NL highs. Galarraga missed the entire 1999 season when he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a form of lymphatic cancer, but he returned to the Braves in 2000 and hit .302 with 28 home runs and 100 RBI. As a result, he was awarded his second career Sporting News National League Comeback Player of the Year Award.

On June 23, 1954, 17-year-old Harmon Killebrew made his major league debut with the Washington Senators. Four years later, Killebrew hit two home runs in 38 games for Indianapolis. It wasn't until Killebrew's age-23 season in 1959 that his prodigious power would earn him the nicknames "Hammerin' Harmon" and "Killer." He smashed an American League-leading 42 home runs for the Senators that year, the first of eight career 40-plus homer seasons. Baltimore Orioles manager Paul Richards marveled at Killebrew's titanic blasts, once telling media "Killebrew can knock the ball out of any park, including Yellowstone." Following the 1960 season, the Senators moved to Minnesota and became the Minnesota Twins. Killebrew's lone World Series appearance came in 1965 under the tutelage of manager and former Indianapolis Indian Sam Mele. The 11-time AL All-Star (1959, 1961, 1963-71) and 1969 AL MVP spent his last of 22 major league seasons with the Kansas City Royals. On May 4, 1975, Killebrew returned to Metropolitan Stadium in Minneapolis, where the Twins retired his No. 3 in a pregame ceremony. With the crowd on its feet during his first at-bat in an opposing uniform, Killebrew fittingly cranked the first pitch he saw into the left-field bleachers for a home run. The Idahoan retired with 573 career homers under his belt and was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1984.



Luke "Old Aches and Pains" Appling managed the Tribe during the 1962 season, leading them to the American Association Pennant with an 89-58 record. Five years later, Appling's only big league managing experience came during a 40-game stint with the Kansas City Athletics. Appling's entire playing career was spent with the Chicago White Sox, where he primarily played shortstop and often led the team offensively. Appling paced the American League with a .388 batting average in 1936 and a .328 clip in 1943, two of 14 full seasons where the lifetime .310 hitter batted north of .300. World War II interrupted his 1944 season and most of 1945, but the two-time AL MVP runner-up (1936, 1943) and seven-time AL All-Star (1936, 1939-41, 1943, 1946-47) didn't miss a beat. Only 587 of his 2,749 career hits went for extra bases, but he added 1,302 walks and a .399 on-base percentage to his résumé. In 1964, Appling won a winner-take-all runoff election to gain entry into the National Baseball Hall of Fame. In the initial election, he garnered 70.6 percent of the vote as the top vote-getter but still fell nine votes short of the necessary 75 percent needed for induction. The subsequent runoff election saw him earn 94 percent of the vote — five votes ahead of 273-game winner and former Red Sox and Yankees hurler, Red Ruffing.





VICTORY FIELD GROUND RULES

Rule 1: A pitched or thrown ball sticking in the padding is a dead ball; runners advance one base.

Rule 2: A ball thrown into the dugout is a dead ball; runners advance one base.

Rule 3: Balls thrown into dugout screens and staying out of the dugouts and stands are live and in play.

Rule 4: Fielders can make a legal catch from the top of the steps to the dugout even with the playing field. Players leaning in from the top of the steps, catching the ball and then going into the dugout results in a legal catch. Players may not step into the dugout and then make a catch.

Rule 5: A fairly batted ball sticking in the wall padding is a dead ball and a ground-rule double.

Rule 6: A batted ball that comes to rest under a bullpen bench is dead and a ground-rule double. A thrown ball that comes to rest under a bullpen bench is a dead ball and runners advance one base. A ball that lodges in the bullpen bench area is a dead ball — a ground-rule double if a batted ball, or runners advance one base if a thrown ball.

Rule 7: A batted or thrown ball that goes under a bullpen bench and bounces out is a live ball.

Rule 8: A batted ball that hits a player in the bullpen area is live and in play. If such touching is intentional, interference will be called.

Rule 9: All outfield screens are considered part of the wall. A fairly batted ball hitting an outfield screen and going over the fence on the fly is a home run.

Rule 10: A batted ball hitting the top or any portion of the left field scoreboard and then going over the outfield screen and yellow pad on the fly is a double. A batted ball hitting the left field scoreboard that caroms off the outfield screen or yellow pad back into the field of play, the ball is live. A batted ball that comes to rest on top of the left field scoreboard is a double.

Rule 11: A batted ball landing on the small roof area in the left field corner on top of the power room is a home run.

MiLB PACE OF PLAY REGULATIONS

General Timing

NOTED FOR 2018

- Batter in box; pitch when he's alert to pitcher changed from 20-5 sec. to 20-7 sec.
- Pitcher allowed 15 sec. to throw each pitch with no runners on base and 20 sec. with runners on base (except first pitch of an at-bat).
- Teams are limited to six non-pitching change mound visits by coaches, managers and players per regulation; one additional mound visit for every extra inning.
- Extra innings will begin with a runner on second base.

1. TIME OF BREAK

The timer will count down from 2:25, as follows:

35 seconds	Last warm-up pitch shall be thrown
25 seconds	PA and music end; PA announces batter
20 seconds	On-field entertainment off the field
20-7 sec.	Batter in box; pitch when he's alert to pitcher
20-0 sec.	Deadline for pitcher to begin motion

*It is considered a violation if:

- Batter is not in box and alert to pitcher by 7 seconds
- Pitcher begins pitch motion after timer reaches "0"

2. WARM-UP PITCHES

Pitchers not guaranteed 8 warm-up pitches. No pitch limit before inning, but final warm-up must be delivered **at least 35 seconds** prior to end of inning break or a pitch change.

*Umpire stops warm-up pitch at that time, unless:

- Deems valid exception (injury, delay in activities, etc.)
- Pitcher/catcher finishes an inning **on base or at bat**

3. START OF GENERAL TIMERS (not pitch timers)

- Pregame countdown begins 60 minutes before scheduled first pitch (IL supplement)
- Timer starts on **last out** of an inning for inning break
- Pitching-change timer starts as soon as relief pitcher **crosses the warning track** (or foul line)

4. DELIVERY OF PITCH

Pitcher satisfies rule if, prior to clock reaching "0",

- Begins windup, or
- Begins motion to come set

Pitch Timer Between Pitches and Between Batter Timer (:30)

1. BATTER'S BOX RULE

During each at bat, the batter shall comply with **Official Rule 5.04(b)**. (listed at end of section)

*If no exception & batter intentionally leaves box, umpire:

- Issues batter warning for 1st violation of Rule in game
- Calls a "Strike" without a pitch on second violation

2. START OF 20-SECOND TIMER

- A pitcher shall be allowed (:15) seconds to throw each pitch with no runners on base and (:20) seconds with runners on base. (except for the first pitch of an at-bat)

3. START OF 30-SECOND TIMER

- A pitcher shall be allowed (:30) seconds to throw the first pitch of an at-bat (except for the first batter after an inning break or pitching change)

4. STOP OF TIMER

- When pitcher begins motion of windup or coming set
- Pitcher makes a pickoff attempt at any base
- Pitcher feints pickoff or steps off rubber with runners on
- Catcher leaves box to give signals/visit mound
- Umpire calls for a "time out"

*On pickoff/feint, timer resets & begins again immediately

i. OFFICIAL BASEBALL RULE 5.04(B)

The batter shall keep at least one foot in the batter's box throughout the batter's time at bat, unless one of the following exceptions applies, in which case he may leave the batter's box but not the dirt area surrounding home plate:

- Batter swings at pitch	- Batter feints a bunt
- Batter forced out by pitch	- Wild pitch/passed ball
- Team granted "time"	- Pitcher leaves dirt area with the ball
- Defensive play on runner	- Catcher leaves box to give signals

Mound Visits (:30)

1. START TIMER

Thirty second timer shall operate during mound visits **initiated by a manager or coach** beginning when the manager or coach **crosses the foul line** unless accompanied by a doctor or trainer.

*Additional time may be permitted by the umpire for:

- Trip to mound slowed by **bona fide medical ailment**
- **Special circumstances** are required (i.e. translator)

2. STOP OF TIMER

- When manager or coach **leaves dirt circle** of mound
- If a **Pitching change** is signaled, begin respective timer for pitching changes immediately
- **Home plate umpire will proceed to the mound** when timer reaches (:10) seconds

3. MOUND VISIT LIMIT (6)

- When a manager, coach or player meets the pitcher, **regardless of where the visit occurs or the length**; shall constitute as a mound visit
- Home plate umpire may, upon request from catcher, grant a brief mound visit for a "cross-up" situation

Enforcement

1. BATTERS

Make every reasonable effort to enter box with 20 seconds remaining, and should not delay to gain undue advantage.

*Automatic "strike" if batter not in box with 7+ seconds.

2. PITCHERS

Are expected to begin the motion to deliver the pitch as soon as the batter enters the box and becomes alert to the pitcher.

*Automatic "ball" if not beginning windup/set prior to "0".

3. MOUND VISIT LIMITS

Once a team has exhausted its six mound visits in a game, an umpire **will attempt to stop a player** on that team from visiting the mound by reminding the player that his team has exhausted its mound visit limit, unless the umpire determines that an exception to the rule applies. If the **player promptly returns to his position when directed** by the umpire, the player shall not be penalized. If a **player does not return to his position when directed by the umpire and proceeds with the mound visit**, the player shall be subject to ejection from the game. A manager must remove his pitcher from the game after six mound visits, and is subject to ejection if he violates the rule with no pitcher warming in the bullpen.

INDIANS ON THE AIR

Howard Kellman

Kellman is in his 43rd season as Voice of the Indians. He has watched more than a million pitches and seen more than 300,000 outs recorded during Indians broadcasts. On June 30, 2017, Kellman broadcasted his 6,000th game for the Tribe. In honor of the feat, Indianapolis Mayor Joe Hogsett made July 1 "Howard Kellman Day" in Indianapolis.

Kellman joined the Tribe in 1974 and has been the club's lead play-by-play announcer each year during that time frame except for the 1975 and 1980 seasons.

Honored as Indiana's Sportscaster of the Year in 2002, Kellman has called IHSAA football and basketball games on WHMB-TV 40 since 1990. In 2009, he was inducted to the Indiana Sports Writers & Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame. Kellman was inducted into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame in 2015 and the Indiana High School Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame this past January.

Since joining the Indians, Kellman has also been named to the radio broadcast team for three Triple-A All-Star Games, including the 1989 Midsummer Classic in Columbus, Ohio, the 2001 contest at Victory Field, and most recently, the 2013 showcase in Reno, Nev. In addition, he led the

broadcast team for ESPN's coverage of the Triple-A World Series from 2006-08.

Along with covering the Tribe, Kellman has worked behind the microphone for the Chicago White Sox (1984) and Cleveland Cavaliers (1988-90), called both IHSAA football and basketball games on WHMB-TV

40 (since 1990-91) and served as a sideline reporter for Yale football on the YES Television Network (2012). He also filled in as a replacement on New York Mets broadcasts in 2014.

Kellman currently manages his own professional speaking service which features life lessons drawn from sports-related stories, and published his book *61 Humorous & Inspiring Lessons I Learned From Baseball* in 2010.

A graduate of Brooklyn College, Kellman began his early broadcasting days as an announcer for St. John's University basketball.

Howard and his wife, Robin, reside in Carmel, Ind.

Andrew Kappes

Kappes enters his fourth season alongside Howard Kellman as part of the Indians' broadcast team. He is just the sixth broadcaster to join Kellman on the Tribe's call since 1996.

In addition to his on-air duties, Kappes also helps facilitate road coverage for the team by composing game recaps and assisting with the club's social media channels.

Prior to joining the Indians, Kappes served as the broadcast and media relations manager for the Single-A Bowling Green Hot Rods in 2014. His first International League assignment came as a media relations and broadcasting assistant with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in 2013, providing play-by-play commentary for the RailRiders.

Broadcaster

Kappes also worked as a television broadcaster for Northern Kentucky University from 2011-16, and has contributed to various collegiate broadcasts ranging from Horizon League basketball and soccer to the women's field hockey National Championship during the baseball offseason. In March 2017, Kappes was on the call for the NKU Norse's first bid to the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament.



Kappes, 27, graduated from NKU in 2012, where he studied broadcast journalism.





MEDIA POLICIES

Press Box: The press box is located on Suite Level (third floor) directly behind home plate. The press box phone number is **317-269-3542 ext. 288**.

Credentials: Full-season and single-game credential requests should be emailed to the Indians Communications Department no less than 24 hours prior to first pitch. Credentials will be left at the guest relations desk in the suite lobby, which you can find through the administration doors on the ballpark's west side. Photo ID will be required at time of pick up.

Parking: A limited number of spaces are available for members of the working media. Single-game parking passes are granted on an as-available basis.

Television: Trucks may connect to TV lines in the right field corner of Victory Field (outside the ballpark). The stadium is wired for cameras to plug in on the north end of the third base dugout. For more information, email telecast and production assistant Alex Leachman at aleachman@indyindians.com.

Photographers: Photography wells are located in each dugout. Space is available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Access the wells at the bottom of the stairs at Sections 107/108 or 116/117. Photographers who shoot from the stands will be asked to move by an usher if a fan's view is obstructed.

Clubhouses: The Indians clubhouse is located on service level behind home plate. The visitors clubhouse is located on service level down the right field line. Clubhouses will close to the media 60 minutes prior to first pitch, as well as between contests of a doubleheader. The Indians communications staff will re-open the clubhouses no earlier than 10 minutes following the final out. Members of the media are not allowed in the training rooms, weight rooms or kitchens. Still photography is not permitted in the clubhouses without prior approval. Live video, including live social media interviews, are not permitted inside the Indians or visiting team clubhouses at any time.
