SCOREKEEPERS, SCOREKEEPING, AND THE SACRIFICE By Bill McPoil

Sportswriter Henry Chadwick is generally credited as the "inventor of baseball scorekeeping" for his system used around 1870. Both Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball hire professional scorekeepers to record every game; their record produces the box score you see in the newspaper the day after the game and the way they record a play can have a significant outcome on the statistics of a team and an individual player. But many fans keep score as well for their own enjoyment and to "stay in the game". Such is the case with several River Cats fans. One such fan is a young woman who sits in the front row behind home plate. For every game she enters the lineup for the teams before the game starts and keeps every statistic of the game you can imagine.

One night we ended up in the Western Health Advantage Legacy Club at the same time because it was too cold to stay in our seats. She was still keeping score watching the game on the television. We landed on an obscure scorekeeping rule involving the sacrifice fly and the sacrifice



bunt. When a batter hits a fly ball that is caught *and* a runner scores (sac fly) or when a batter bunts the ball and advances the runner (sac bunt), the batter gets credit for the sacrifice and he is not charged with making an out. Why?

It's a way to acknowledge the batter for helping his team without penalizing him by lowering his batting average. According to rule 9.08, in both cases, the batter is charged with a plate appearance but not an at bat, an important distinction. The sacrifice fly rule was introduced as an official statistic in 1908, but the rule was repealed or revised several times until it was finally implemented for good in 1954. The sacrifice bunt came into being around 1895.

With his first full season under his belt, outfielder Heliot Ramos is poised for a breakout 2019 season in the California League. The Puerto Rican first-rounder racked up 535 plate appearances in the power-suppressing South Atlantic League in 2018. And while being the youngest player in the league, he still managed to post a .151 isolated slugging percentage – good enough to be in the top 34% of hitters with at least 200 plate appearances.

There's still good hype surrounding Ramos, who was the highest drafted player to come from his home country since shortstop Carlos Correa in 2012. His family of athletes includes his older brother Henry, who the Giants signed to a minor-league deal in the offseason, as well has his nationally-ranked, soccer-playing brother, Hector.

Ramos' athleticism is evident in nearly all aspects of the game. His arm strength lends to impressive raw power at the plate, as well as a cannon in the outfield to gun down runners. He's a 55-grade runner with quickness to track down balls. Though he displayed well-above average speed at the Excellence Games with a 6.42 60-yard dash time, that hasn't translated to eye-catching base-stealing numbers as he's totaled just 18 swipes in 159 games since turning pro.

With the San Jose Giants in 2019, the organization will look for Ramos to continue improving his strikeout rate, which he was able to drop by seven percentage points from 2017 to 2018. They'll also expect someone of his caliber to produce big slugging numbers in a league that tends to inflate power.

SHAUN ANDERSON PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 2/14/95

Was a third-round pick by the Boston Red Sox in 2016 and pitched in their minor-league system until he was traded to the Giants on July 26, 2017 as part of the Eduardo Nunez deal. He broke camp in 2018 with the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels, posting a 3.45 ERA with 93 strikeouts in 94 innings before being called up to make his Triple-A debut in Sacramento. After a non-roster invite to major-league spring training this season, he'll begin the year as the Giants' fifth-ranked prospect according to MLB Pipeline.

TYLER BEEDE PITCHER Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 5/23/93

Beede, drafted in 2014's first round out of Vanderbilt University, made more starts than any other River Cats pitcher during his Triple-A debut season in 2017 and is the No. 24-ranked prospect in the system according to MLB Pipeline. He pitched six or more innings in 11 of his 19 starts, posting a 3.47 ERA in those outings. He struggled during the 2018 season with the River Cats and was sent to the bullpen for the remainder of the year, but made some mechanical adjustments in the offseason and will be back in the rotation for 2019.

TY BLACH PITCHER Bat: R | Throw: L | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 10/20/90

Blach is back in a River Cats uniform after spending all of 2017 and 2018 with the San Francisco Giants. There, he pitched the third most innings on the club in 2017 and followed that up with 118.2 a year later. He owns a 4.36 ERA in nearly 300 major-league innings pitched while making almost half of his 85 appearances as a starter. Blach was a three-year starter at Creighton University in Omaha, Neb. and was selected by the Giants in the fifth round of the 2012 draft.



After playing collegiately at the University of Pittsburgh, he was drafted by the Giants in the 7th round of 2011, though he missed the 2012 and 2013 seasons after undergoing shoulder surgery to repair a torn labrum. In 2014 while pitching for the San Jose Giants, he struck out nearly 45% of the batters he faced in 25 innings. In May of 2017 he had arthroscopic surgery on his throwing elbow, but returned healthy and made his major-league debut on July 8, 2018.

SAM COONROD



Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 9/22/92

Drafted in the fifth round in 2014, Coonrod hails from Carrollton, Ill. and played collegiately for Southern Illinois University. Following Tommy John surgery at the conclusion of 2017, Coonrod finished up his rehab in July of 2018 and returned to action pitching for the AZL Giants and the San Jose Giants, where during his brief time in San Jose he struck out 46.4% of the batters he faced in 6.1 innings. Prior to moving into the pen, Coonrod racked up more than 100 innings in three straight seasons from 2015 to 2017.

ENDERSON FRANCOPITCHERBat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 12/29/92

Originally a Houston Astros product out of Venezuela, Anderson found himself in the Giants system this offseason when he was signed to a minor-league deal on November 20, 2018. He was designated for assignment by Houston at the end of the 2015 season and was claimed by Atlanta, which is where Franco spent the last three seasons, pitching the majority of the time for the Double-A Missisippi Braves. He began the 2019 season as the No. 5 starter in the River Cats rotation.

WILLIAMS JEREZ PITCHER Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 5/16/92

Jerez was acquired by the Giants late in March in a deal that sent starting pitcher and long-time River Cats pitcher Chris Stratton to the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. The left-handed reliever is a native of the Dominican Republic but went to high school in Brooklyn, N.Y. and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the second round of the 2011 draft. He found himself in the Angels organization when he was traded in the deal that helped the Red Sox acquire lan Kinsler. Jerez made his major-league debut with the Angels on August 7, 2018.



Drafted by the Giants in the third round of the 2013 draft, Johnson was the closer for the Cal Poly - San Luis Obispo in college after growing up in northern San Diego County. Johnson was converted into a starting pitcher during his first few years in the Giants organization but beginning in 2016 he returned to pitching as a reliever. He required Tommy John surgery in 2017 and fully recovered in May of 2018. He pitched six games for the River Cats in 2017 before injuring his throwing elbow.



Navas signed a minor-league deal with San Francisco on December 17, 2018 and joined the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels out of spring training. Though before even playing a game in the Eastern League, Navas was called up to Triple-A. He was originally a product of the Oakland Athletics, signed in 2010 out of his home country of Venezuela. He pitched in the A's organization until the 2018 when he signed with the Cincinnati Reds in the offseason.

PITCHER


Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 7/9/91

A product of the University of Oklahoma, Okert was a fourth round pick by the Giants in 2012. He was designated for assignment on March 23 but cleared waivers and returned to Sacramento to begin the 2019 season. Okert has 48.1 career innings pitched in the major leagues spread from 2016 to 2018, and is third all-time in River Cats history for pitcher appearances.









TYLER ROGERS PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 180 | DOB: 12/17/90

With 55 appearances, Rogers finished tied with San Jose Giants right-hander Dylan Rheault for most games by a pitcher in the Giants' system in 2017, then followed that up by leading the system with 51 in 2018. The right-handed submariner totalled 143.2 innings over that span, entirely with the Sacramento River Cats, while holding opposing hitters to a .236 average, just two home runs, and a 2.37 ERA in 2017. His 61.0% ground ball rate was one of the highest on the Giants' farm over these last two seasons.

ANDREW SUAREZ PITCHER Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 195 | DOB: 9/11/92

Suarez entered 2018 ranked the 10th best prospect on the Giants after posting a career-high 155.2 innings in 2017, 10.1 more innings than any other Giants' minor leaguer. After being the opening-day starter for the River Cats, Suarez was called up to San Francisco where he made his major-league debut on April 11. The University of Miami product was sent back down for a brief stint but was eventually called up for good, making 29 starts totaling 160.1 innings with a 4.49 ERA.



One of the most unique baseball players in the game, Venditte is a switch-pitcher. He throws with either arm and carries a special glove that allows him to switch hands while on the mound. He's a 33-year veteran who made his major-league debut for the Oakland A's in 2015, though it was the New York Yankees who signed him in the 20th round of the 2008 draft. Venditte spent 2018 in the Los Angeles Dodgers' system where he tossed 14 big-league innings while pitching most of his games with the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers.



Drafted in the 2nd round of the 2014 draft out of Florida International University, Garcia was the top catching prospect in the Giants' farm system until they selected Georgia Tech's Joey Bart in 2018. Garcia, though, is certainly the closest to consistent major-league time as he's currently one of three backstops on San Francisco's 40-man roster. Garcia has been known mostly for his offensive prowess, but his skills behind the dish have improved from year to year, especially during the 2018 season in Double-A Richmond.

STEPHEN VOGT

Bat: L | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 11/1/83

Vogt is back with the River Cats for the third time, but first as a member of the Giants' organization. The catcher drafted out of Azusa Pacific University slashed .324/.398/.547 in 75 games for the River Cats back in 2013 and went on to become an American League All-Star with the A's from 2015 to 2016. He was designated for assignment by the A's in 2017 but was quickly picked up by Milwaukee, though he hit the injured list in August after a hard collision at the plate. He then spent most of 2018 rehabbing from a shoulder surgery that stemmed from the incident.

ABIATAL AVELINO INFIELDER Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 2/14/95

After signing out of the Dominican Republic at age 16 with the New York Yankees, Avelino was a ranked prospect in the Pinstripes' farm system for seven seasons. In 2015, he stole the fifth most bases in all of the minor leagues (54) while splitting time between Advanced-A and Double-A ball. On August 31, 2018, he was included in the trade that sent then Giants outfielder Andrew McCutchen to the Yankees. He enters the 2019 season on the Giants' 40-man roster and is ranked the No. 19 prospect in the organization by MLB Pipeline.

ZACH GREENINFIELDERBat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 3/7/94

Drafted out of Sacramento's Jesuit High School in 2012, Green played in the Philadelphia Phillies' farm system before electing free agency at the conclusion of the 2018 season. He had Tommy John surgery in August of 2016 and missed the rest of that season plus half of 2017. In 2018, he OPS'd nearly 1.000 with 17 home runs and 23 doubles in Double-A before being promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley where he completed the season. He signed with the Giants over the offseason and will get to play roughly ten miles from where he grew up in Carmichael.



Originally a St. Louis Cardinals prospect who signed at age 17 out of Venezuela in 2005, Solano is now with his fifth different franchise. Solano, who signed a minor-league contract with the Giants in the offseason, spent 2018 in the Dodgers organization where he played in 81 games for the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers. Though he hasn't played in a major-league game since 2016, Solano has 360 big-league games under his belt since making his debut back in 2012 with the Miami Marlins.



Acquired by the Giants from the Orioles during the offseason after spending time with three teams in 2018. He began the spring in St. Louis Cardinals camp but was designated for assignment at the end of March. The Venezuelan was sent to the Dodgers a few days later and began the season in Triple-A with the Oklahoma City Dodgers. He was called up to Los Angeles a handful of times, appearing in 20 games. Valera was sent to Baltimore as part of the Manny Machado deal on July 18. Valera can play a variety of positions, including second base, shortstop, third base, and corner outfield.

He was placed on waivers in December and claimed on the 10th by San Francisco. He was the Tigers' Minor League Player of the Year in 2015 after hitting .292 with 31 doubles, 10 triples, and 13 home runs playing for Class-A West Michigan.

HENRY RAMOS OUTFIELDER Bat: S | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 4/15/92

Brother of highly-ranked Giants prospect Heliot Ramos, Henry joins the River Cats after playing in the Dodgers' farm system for the last two seasons. Originally a draft pick of the Boston Red Sox in 2010, Ramos is a switch-hitting outfielder who can play all three positions. He clubbed 10 home runs and 22 doubles while slugging .465 in 102 games for the Oklahoma City Dodgers last year. He received a non-roster invite to spring training this season where he was able to roam the outfield during a game with his younger brother Heliot.

MICHAEL REEDOUTFIELDERBat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 11/18/92

Reed was acquired in the offseason in an exchange of outfielders with the Minnesota Twins, who received John Andreoli in the deal. He's originally a fifthround pick in 2011 by the Milwaukee Brewers out of Leander H.S. just outside Austin, TX. Reed began the 2019 season on the San Francisco Giants 25-man roster but was designated for assignment after just eight plate appearances. After clearing waivers, Reed signed a minor-league deal back with the Giants and joined the River Cats a few games into the season.



Slater began 2017 playing his first 46 games in Sacramento slashing .322/.381/.460 with 12 doubles and four home runs. He received a call-up to San Francisco to make his major-league debut on June 2, going 1-for-5 with a single at Philadelphia. Before injuring his hip, the former Stanford Cardinal played in 29 games with the Giants batting .290. Similarly in 2018, Slater got off to a hot start in Triple-A and was eventually recalled to San Francisco where he played in 74 games batting .250.

APRIL 19 IN MLB HISTORY



April 19, 1963: Willie Mays becomes the all-time National League right-handed home run leader when he connects for his 371st career round-tripper, a fourthinning solo shot off Chicago's Larry Jackson in the Giants' 5-1 victory at Candlestick Park. AUTOGRAPHS

Guests may seek autographs from players and coaches from the time the gates open until 15 minutes prior to game time. The autograph areas are located on the outer sides of both the home and visiting dugouts. Guests will not be allowed to seek autographs at the dugout corners closest to home plate. Please be courteous and respectful to the players and coaches as well as guests possessing tickets in autograph areas. If you are seeking autographs in a seating section other than your own, you may be asked to proceed to your designated seating section.

ATMs

There are two Golden 1 Credit Union ATMs at Raley Field, located on the concourse at sections 113 and 110.

BATTING PRACTICE

Gates open one hour before game time allowing guests to view infield practice for the visiting team. Please note: on dates with large crowds expected, Raley Field may open 2 hours prior to game time to accommodate all of our fans. Be sure to arrive as soon as the gates open and catch all the pregame action. River Cats batting practice generally occurs before gates are open, and both teams' BP is subject to cancellation.

BEVERAGES, BOTTLES AND CANS

Guests are not allowed to bring any outside beverages, cans, or bottles into Raley Field. The following items are permitted: unopened, soft-sided containers of drinks such as water, small milk cartons, juice boxes or pouches, baby formula, bottles, and baby food for children and medication or other special needs. Sports drinks or other flavored waters are not allowed. Permission to enter the stadium with any beverage is at the discretion of security or front office personnel.

BIRTHDAY AND ANNIVERSARY MESSAGES ON SCOREBOARD

Get your birthday, anniversary, or special message displayed on the matrix board (in left field) at a River Cats game this season. There is a \$25 charge benefiting the River Cats Foundation. All requests must be submitted at least 48 hours before the day of the game you wish to have your announcement displayed.

CHILDREN

Children 23 months and younger do not need a ticket for entry into Raley Field; however, they must sit on the lap of an accompanying adult and will not be reserved a seat. Children two years of age and older must have a ticket. Booster seats are available, free of charge, at the Guest Services Office.

CUSTOMER SERVICE INITIATIVE

Make sure you stop by guest services to acknowledge any exceptional service by our gameday staff.

DISABLED PARKING

A limited number of on-site disabled parking is available on a first-come, firstserved basis in the VIP Green Lot. Additional disabled parking is available in the Orange Lot, which is just south of the stadium. Guests parking in all lots can catch a shuttle back to the drop-off zone in front of the stadium. A wheelchairaccessible van is also available which can transport guests in wheelchairs back to the drop-off zone. The cost to park in any disabled spot is \$10 (4+ carpool is free with Lasher Subaru Parking Pass.

DISABLED SEATING

Wheelchair and companion seating is offered on every level and in all price categories of the stadium. Every seating section is wheelchairaccessible and electric outlets are provided at many of the wheelchair seating areas for use in charging power wheelchairs and electronic communication devices.

EXIT AND RE-ENTRY

Guests may leave Raley Field at any time through any of the exit gates. Guests may reenter the stadium only after obtaining a reentry stamp from an attendant at any of the exit gates. Reentry for non-baseball events is subject to change.

FIELD ACCESS

In accordance with Pacific Coast League rules, only authorized personnel with proper credentials will be permitted on the field before, during, or after a game or event. Any unauthorized person who travels onto the field will be removed from Raley Field and subject to arrest and prosecution.

FIRST AID

The First Aid Station is located on the concourse at Section 112. If first aid assistance is needed, please go to the First Aid Station or contact the nearest Guest Services representative.

FOOD

Pacific Coast League rules state that guests are not allowed to bring any outside food items into Raley Field.

FOUL BALLS AND HOME RUN BALLS

Guests may keep any balls hit into the stands. Batted balls can be dangerous, so we ask that guests stay alert at all times, even when out of your seat. When attempting to catch a foul or home run ball please do not interfere with the game in progress, and be respectful of other guests. At no time should a foul or home run ball be thrown back on the field. Guests who fail to adhere to these rules face immediate ejection from Raley Field and will be subject to arrest and prosecution.

GUEST SERVICES OFFICE

The Guest Services Office is located on the Concourse Level at Section 112 and will be open when gates open to the event and closes approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after the event's conclusion. Guests will find a number of services including lost and found, child booster seats, taxi service, guest assistance, and reporting lost children.

ICE CHESTS AND COOLERS

Guests are not permitted to bring hard-sided ice chests or coolers into Raley, Field. Soft-sided cooler bags to keep unopened bottled water, baby items, or other special needs cool during the event are permitted. Admission with these items are subject to the discardent or may be returned to one's vehicle.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found in or around Raley Field during events should be turned in to the Guest Services Office located on the concourse at Section 112. All lost and found items will be stored for 30 days. After 30 days, Raley Field and the River Cats reserve the right to remit to charity or otherwise disposed of. Lost and found items can be picked up at the Administrative Office during the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. All calls and questions regarding the lost and found should be forwarded to the Guest Services Department at [916] 376-4700.

MERCHANDISE - ON DECK SHOP

The On Deck Shop is located at the Home Plate Entrance of the stadium and is open year-tound. Current hours are Monday through friday, 10:00 am - 5:00 pm. On game days, the On Deck Shop closes to the public 90 minutes prior to gate time and reopens as soon as the main gates open for ticketed guests only. Hours are subject to change.
