PILLARS OF ART

You're making your way through the concourse, hungry for a hot dog. Or you've just entered the main gate on a hot August night and are on the lookout for the Merlino's Freeze stand. Chances are, you've seen the colorful concrete pillars evenly staggered around the top of the lower bowl.

Nearly twenty years ago,
Sacramento-area school children
put their stamp on Raley Field's
grand opening with displays of
creativity as part of the Pillars of Art
program. Sacramento River Cats
majority owner Susan Savage, who
serves on the board of the Crocker
Art Museum, KVIE Public Television,
and the River Cats Foundation,
found a unique way to integrate art
and community into the ballpark's
charm.



Not often do you see Dominican ballplayers sign after they've turned 20. For flamethrower Melvin Adon, it took until he was of legal U.S. drinking age to be inked to a contract – one of just \$50,000, mind you.

His advanced age meant he needed just one season in the Dominican Summer League before Giants' brass determined he was ready to play state-side. And though he's started nearly 90% of the 69 games he's played in entering the 2019 season, Adon appears destined for the bullpen.

After falling just two outs shy of 100 innings in 2017 with the Class-A Augusta GreenJackets, Adon took his 102-mph fastball to San Jose, Calif. where he was the highlight of the Baby Giants' starting rotation. He missed some time due to injury, totaling just 77.2 innings but made up for the lost time after being assigned to the Arizona Fall League (AFL). It was there that Adon made what could be a permanent transition to the bullpen, and he did so with dominating results.

Facing some of the league's top offensive talent, as it goes with an AFL assignment, Adon struck out 42.9% of the 49 batters

he faced over 12.1 innings while allowing just seven hits and three walks.

Adon's upper-90s four-seam fastball has some run and works well with a mid-to-upper 80s slider. In Scottsdale, he worked on adding a two-seamer to his arsenal, creating a mid-90s sinker. He does occasionally mix in a changeup, but it's still a work in progress.

Like teammate Logan Webb, Adon was added to the 40-man roster in the offseason and spent his first spring in big-league camp. Two key questions remain for Adon: can he continue simplifying his complicated delivery, and when exactly will the Giants commit to a bullpen role?

2019 RIVER CATS ROSTER



FERNANDO ABAD

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 220 | DOB: 12/17/85

Abad is an eight-year major-league veteran signed to a minor-league deal in the offseason. After breaking camp in Richmond, and proceeding to allow just four baserunners and zero runs in six innings, Abad was promoted to Sacramento to bolster the bullpen. Abad, who has pitched more than 300 innings combined for five different MLB teams, began the 2018 season in the New York Mets system but was suspended for 80 games after testing positive for the banned substance Stanozolol.



SHAUN ANDERSON

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 2/14/95

Was a third-round pick by the Boston Red Sox in 2016 and pitched in their minor-league system until he was traded to the Giants on July 26, 2017 as part of the Eduardo Nunez deal. He broke camp in 2018 with the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels, posting a 3.45 ERA with 93 strikeouts in 94 innings before being called up to make his Triple-A debut in Sacramento. After a non-roster invite to major-league spring training this season, he'll begin the year as the Giants' fifth-ranked prospect according to MLB Pipeline.



TYLER BEEDE

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 5/23/93

Beede, drafted in 2014's first round out of Vanderbilt University, made more starts than any other River Cats pitcher during his Triple-A debut season in 2017 and is the No. 24-ranked prospect in the system according to MLB Pipeline. He pitched six or more innings in 11 of his 19 starts, posting a 3.47 ERA in those outings. He struggled during the 2018 season with the River Cats and was sent to the bullpen for the remainder of the year, but made some mechanical adjustments in the offseason and will be back in the rotation for 2019.



TY BLACH

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: L | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 10/20/90

Blach is back in a River Cats uniform after spending all of 2017 and 2018 with the San Francisco Giants. There, he pitched the third most innings on the club in 2017 and followed that up with 118.2 a year later. He owns a 4.36 ERA in nearly 300 major-league innings pitched while making almost half of his 85 appearances as a starter. Blach was a three-year starter at Creighton University in Omaha, Neb. and was selected by the Giants in the fifth round of the 2012 draft.

RAY BLACK

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 230 | DOB: 6/26/90

After playing collegiately at the University of Pittsburgh, he was drafted by the Giants in the 7th round of 2011, though he missed the 2012 and 2013 seasons after undergoing shoulder surgery to repair a torn labrum. In 2014 while pitching for the San Jose Giants, he struck out nearly 45% of the batters he faced in 25 innings. In May of 2017 he had arthroscopic surgery on his throwing elbow, but returned healthy and made his major-league debut on July 8, 2018.



SAM COONROD

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 9/22/92

Drafted in the fifth round in 2014, Coonrod hails from Carrollton, Ill. and played collegiately for Southern Illinois University. Following Tommy John surgery at the conclusion of 2017, Coonrod finished up his rehab in July of 2018 and returned to action pitching for the AZL Giants and the San Jose Giants, where during his brief time in San Jose he struck out 46.4% of the batters he faced in 6.1 innings. Prior to moving into the pen, Coonrod racked up more than 100 innings in three straight seasons from 2015 to 2017.



ENDERSON FRANCO

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 12/29/92

Originally a Houston Astros product out of Venezuela, Anderson found himself in the Giants system this offseason when he was signed to a minor-league deal on November 20, 2018. He was designated for assignment by Houston at the end of the 2015 season and was claimed by Atlanta, which is where Franco spent the last three seasons, pitching the majority of the time for the Double-A Mississippi Braves. He began the 2019 season as the No. 5 starter in the River Cats rotation.



WILLIAMS JEREZ

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 5/16/92

Jerez was acquired by the Giants late in March in a deal that sent starting pitcher and long-time River Cats pitcher Chris Stratton to the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. The left-handed reliever is a native of the Dominican Republic but went to high school in Brooklyn, N.Y. and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the second round of the 2011 draft. He found himself in the Angels organization when he was traded in the deal that helped the Red Sox acquire lan Kinsler. Jerez made his major-league debut with the Angels on August 7, 2018.



CARLOS NAVAS

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 170 | DOB: 8/13/92

Navas signed a minor-league deal with San Francisco on December 17, 2018 and joined the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels out of spring training. Though before even playing a game in the Eastern League, Navas was called up to Triple-A. He was originally a product of the Oakland Athletics, signed in 2010 out of his home country of Venezuela. He pitched in the A's organization until the 2018 when he signed with the Cincinnati Reds in the offseason.

STEVEN OKERT

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 7/9/91

A product of the University of Oklahoma, Okert was a fourth round pick by the Giants in 2012. He was designated for assignment on March 23 but cleared waivers and returned to Sacramento to begin the 2019 season. Okert has 48.1 career innings pitched in the major leagues spread from 2016 to 2018, and is third all-time in River Cats history for pitcher appearances.



TYLER ROGERS

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 180 | DOB: 12/17/90

With 55 appearances, Rogers finished tied with San Jose Giants right-hander Dylan Rheault for most games by a pitcher in the Giants' system in 2017, then followed that up by leading the system with 51 in 2018. The right-handed submariner totalled 143.2 innings over that span, entirely with the Sacramento River Cats, while holding opposing hitters to a .236 average, just two home runs, and a 2.37 ERA in 2017. His 61.0% ground ball rate was one of the highest on the Giants' farm over these last two seasons.



SAM SELMAN

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: L | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 190 | DOB: 11/14/90

A former second-round pick of the Kansas City Royals, Selman joins the River Cats after dominating in his seven innings pitching for the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels. He pitched collegiately for Vanderbilt University, where he was teammates with current River Cats Tyler Beede and Mike Yastrzemski. Pitching between Double and Triple-A during the 2017 season, Selman struck out 97 batters in just 67.2 innings while sporting a 2.66 ERA.



ANDREW SUAREZ

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 195 | DOB: 9/11/92

Suarez entered 2018 ranked the 10th best prospect on the Giants after posting a career-high 155.2 innings in 2017, 10.1 more innings than any other Giants' minor leaguer. After being the opening-day starter for the River Cats, Suarez was called up to San Francisco where he made his major-league debut on April 11. The University of Miami product was sent back down for a brief stint but was eventually called up for good, making 29 starts totaling 160.1 innings with a 4.49 ERA.



PAT VENDITTE

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: S | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 185 | DOB: 6/30/85

One of the most unique baseball players in the game, Venditte is a switch-pitcher. He throws with either arm and carries a special glove that allows him to switch hands while on the mound. He's a 33-year veteran who made his major-league debut for the Oakland A's in 2015, though it was the New York Yankees who signed him in the 20th round of the 2008 draft. Venditte spent 2018 in the Los Angeles Dodgers' system where he tossed 14 big-league innings while pitching most of his games with the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers.



ARAMIS GARCIA

CATCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 1/12/93

Drafted in the 2nd round of the 2014 draft out of Florida International University, Garcia was the top catching prospect in the Giants' farm system until they selected Georgia Tech's Joey Bart in 2018. Garcia, though, is certainly the closest to consistent major-league time as he's currently one of three backstops on San Francisco's 40-man roster. Garcia has been known mostly for his offensive prowess, but his skills behind the dish have improved from year to year, especially during the 2018 season in Double-A Richmond.



STEPHEN VOGT

CATCHER

Bat: L | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 11/1/83

Vogt is back with the River Cats for the third time, but first as a member of the Giants' organization. The catcher drafted out of Azusa Pacific University slashed .324/.398/.547 in 75 games for the River Cats back in 2013 and went on to become an American League All-Star with the A's from 2015 to 2016. He was designated for assignment by the A's in 2017 but was quickly picked up by Milwaukee, though he hit the injured list in August after a hard collision at the plate. He then spent most of 2018 rehabbing from a shoulder surgery that stemmed from the incident.



ABIATAL AVELINO

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 2/14/95

After signing out of the Dominican Republic at age 16 with the New York Yankees, Avelino was a ranked prospect in the Pinstripes' farm system for seven seasons. In 2015, he stole the fifth most bases in all of the minor leagues (54) while splitting time between Advanced-A and Double-A ball. On August 31, 2018, he was included in the trade that sent then Giants outfielder Andrew McCutchen to the Yankees. He enters the 2019 season on the Giants' 40-man roster and is ranked the No. 19 prospect in the organization by MLB Pipeline.



ZACH GREEN

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 225 | DOB: 3/7/94

Drafted out of Sacramento's Jesuit High School in 2012, Green played in the Philadelphia Phillies' farm system before electing free agency at the conclusion of the 2018 season. He had Tommy John surgery in August of 2016 and missed the rest of that season plus half of 2017. In 2018, he OPS'd nearly 1.000 with 17 home runs and 23 doubles in Double-A before being promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley where he completed the season. He signed with the Giants over the offseason and will get to play roughly ten miles from where he grew up in Carmichael.




DONOVAN SOLANO

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 5'7" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 12/17/87

Originally a St. Louis Cardinals prospect who signed at age 17 out of Venezuela in 2005, Solano is now with his fifth different franchise. Solano, who signed a minor-league contract with the Giants in the offseason, spent 2018 in the Dodgers organization where he played in 81 games for the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers. Though he hasn't played in a major-league game since 2016, Solano has 360 big-league games under his belt since making his debut back in 2012 with the Miami Marlins.

AUSTIN SLATER

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 12/13/92

Slater began 2017 playing his first 46 games in Sacramento slashing .322/.381/.460 with 12 doubles and four home runs. He received a call-up to San Francisco to make his major-league debut on June 2, going 1-for-5 with a single at Philadelphia. Before injuring his hip, the former Stanford Cardinal played in 29 games with the Giants batting .290. Similarly in 2018, Slater got off to a hot start in Triple-A and was eventually recalled to San Francisco where he played in 74 games batting .250.



BREYVIC VALERA

INFIELDER

Bat: S | Throw: R | Height: 5'8" | Weight: 185 | DOB: 1/8/92

He began the spring in St. Louis Cardinals camp but was designated for assignment at the end of March. The Venezuelan was sent to the Dodgers a few days later and began the season in Triple-A with the Oklahoma City Dodgers. He was called up to Los Angeles a handful of times, appearing in 20 games. Valera was sent to Baltimore as part of the Manny Machado deal on July 18. Valera can play a variety of positions, including second base, shortstop, third base, and corner outfield.

He was placed on waivers in December and claimed on the 10th by San Francisco. He was the Tigers' Minor League Player of the Year in 2015 after hitting .292 with 31 doubles, 10 triples, and 13 home runs playing for Class-A West Michigan.

He clubbed 10 home runs and 22 doubles while slugging .465 in 102 games for the Oklahoma City Dodgers last year. He received a non-roster invite to spring training this season where he was able to roam the outfield during a game with his younger brother Heliot.


MIKE YASTRZEMSKI

DAVE BRUNDAGE Manager

Brundage will take the field as the River Cats' manager for the third consecutive season. Having nearly two decades of managerial experience, the veteran manager spent four previous seasons with the International League's Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Philadelphia Phillies Triple-A), compiling a 286-289 record (.497), before heading west to Sacramento. In 2016, he led the IronPigs to an 85-58 record, the second best mark in all of Triple-A baseball.

Kline rejoins the River Cats for his second season as pitching coach in Sacramento after three seasons with the Giants' Double-A affiliate Richmond Flying Squirrels. Yesterday's Game: The Sacramento River Cats (15-14) were just nine minutes short of their longest nine-inning game ever, coming up just short against the Reno Aces (12-17) in a 7-6 loss in front of a fantastic Saturday night crowd. The River Cats took a 6-1 lead early in the game against the Arizona Diamondbacks number two prospect, Jon Duplantier. Catcher Aramis Garcia's two-run triple got Sacramento going in the first, and Anthony Garcia added a two-run double in the fourth to push the lead to 6-1. It was a bullpen game for Sacramento, with righty Carlos Navas making a spot start and putting up three strong innings. Left-hander Sam Moll was excellent in his two innings, retiring six batters in order and striking out two. Right-hander Sam Coonrod took the loss in this one, however, after serving up a three-run homer to Wyatt Mathisen in the eighth inning.

Today's Starter: LHP Ty Blach (1-0, 4.34) returns to the River Cats after making his season debut with the Giants on April 30 against the Los Angeles Dodgers. Blach did not fair well, giving up seven runs before getting chased from the game in the fourth. Blach was uncharacteristically wild with the big club, giving up three walks in 3.1 innings. In 18.2 innings with the River Cats this season Blach has walked just two batters while striking out 14. Blach will look to repeat his last performance with the River Cats in which he tossed six innings and allowed just two hits and a run.

Lefty Success: Sacramento batters have experienced great success over left handed pitching this year. On the year the River Cats hold a team batting average of .267 against right handed pitching, against left handed pitching the River Cats batting average jumps to a .305 average. The River Cats OPS also jumps from .825 vs right handers to .916 vs left handers. **OF Mac Williamson and INF Donovan Solano** have been tearing left handed pitching apart this season. Williamson in 21 plate appearances is hitting .524 with an OPS of 1.219. Solano in 23 plate appearances is batting .522 with an OPS of 1.316.

Slow Pace: The Sacramento River Cats continued to play baseball at a slow pace again Saturday night. The game was a standard nine inning affair, but lasted four hours and thirteen minutes coming up nimutes shy of their longest nine inning game ever. On May 16, 2005 at New Orleans the River Cats played a game which lasted four hours and twenty-two minutes. Sacramento leads the PCL in average game time at three hours and sixteen minutes, the next closest is El Paso at three hours and six minutes.

Swipping Bags: The River Cats have not stole many bases this season, but when they do they steal them in bunches. Sacramento stole three bases last night for the second time in a game this season. **INF** Abitatal Avelino nabbed his third and fourth bases on the year, while **INF** Austin Slater nabbed his fifth. The River Cats now have 16 stolen bases on the year, Slater and Avelino account for nine of those.

This Day in River Cats History: May 5, 2011: The Sacramento River Cats knocked off the Salt Lake City Bees 7-1 to win the crucial fourth game of their series, giving the edge to Sacramento 3-1. Right fielder Matt Carson was the hero for Sacramento, driving in three runs while adding a runs scored. Two of his RBI came off his fourth home run of the year, a moon shot that was estimated at 440 feet. Starting pitcher Graham Godfrey picked up his fourth win on the night, going six innings giving up only one earned run, two hits, two walks and struck out seven.

MAY 5 IN MLB HISTORY

May 5, 1904: Cy Young tosses the first perfect game in American League history, defeating Rube Waddell and the Philadelphia A's, 3-0. The Red Sox right-hander's gem is the first perfect game thrown in the majors since the distance between the mound and plate was changed from 45 feet to 60 feet, six inches in 1893.

May 5, 1978: At Riverfront Stadium, Pete Rose became the 13th player in major league history to collect his 3000th hit, a single to left field off Montreal right-hander Steve Rogers. The Reds' legend reaches the milestone in his 16th major league season, quicker than any of the other dozen players who have accomplished the feat.



Q&A with Mike Yastrzemski, outfielder for the River Cats, and Johnny Doskow, the radio broadcaster of the Sacramento River Cats.



Johnny: We have Mike Yastrzemski with us and I was always wondering, do guys call you Yaz? Do you go by Yaz when your teammates do?

Mike: Yeah, most of the time I do. I'll definitely respond to it. I got a new one lately, Brundy called me "Ski" for the first time

in Spring Training. He [Brundage] goes Ski you got center field, and I kind of looked around and was like who's this "Ski" guy? He [Brundage] goes you got it and I was like oh okay it's me so I've never heard that before but it's good.

Johnny: You talk



about growing up in the Northeast, and it is such a beautiful part of the country. You were drafted out of high school by the [Boston] Red Sox, it must have been awfully tempting to sign, but you end up going to Vanderbilt. How hard was that decision?

Mike: Well the way the Corbs [Tim Corbin] runs his program down there, not hard at all. You know definitely tough to turn down a home town team having some lineage there, just being able to stay home essentially, but I really wanted to go to college and see what that had to offer. I really got to grow as a person when I went there and it prepared me for pro ball for sure.

Johnny: Your dad was a heck of a ballplayer, your dad got to Triple-A, great lineage. I know your dad passed away at a tough time in your life when you were 13, you were my

daughter's age, 13-14 years old, you're still not a boy but not quite a man, take us through that a little bit

Mike: Yeah, you know you always run through the hardships, everybody gets them at some point in their life, and I think it was honestly a blessing to happen at that point in my life because I had so much family around me and then being able to go out and make my own decision to decisions to grow into the baseball world that I wanted to. I'm not saying I wouldn't have been able to, but you got to make some tough decisions for yourself at that time in your life and to do that really matured me earlier than most people do. That made that fulfilling, especially being able to go back and graduate and get my degree, that felt so good to check that off the list and not have that weighing on my shoulders or anything like that, that's where it came into play mostly.

Johnny: That's phenomenal. I know people don't realize it is hard having a last name like yours. You know the way you handle it now is so much different than when you handled it when you were younger. When you were 18-19 you feel the pressure, the weight on your shoulders, but I think now with you growing up, you're more mature, now your 28 years old it's different now right?

Mike: Yeah it is for sure. I actually have a grasp of what he did looking back on it now; when you're 18 you're like yeah I want to do that too, I want to play in the big leagues for 23 years. If I were to say that now I would laugh at myself, you know those things just don't happen anymore. It just shows how remarkable that was, so when people think "that must be tough to live up to that," it never is because that was SO great, almost unattainable, that you don't have to try and do something like that. That

was just special.


Johnny: You know your journey is special. I mean you were with the Orioles and now you're one step from the big leagues, you're a solid hitter, you play a solid defensive game; you're knocking on the door. What's it like for you? It's kind of a crowded outfield right now but you're still getting some good swings out there.

Mike: Yeah, you know you just have to take every advantage you get and taking the opportunity to get your at-bats, you actually start to take them way more seriously and actually have a ton more intent and focus. You know when you're a young guy coming up they are just feeding you your at-bats, giving you your development, you tend to take some for granted because you know you are going to get four the next day. Here right now, you have no idea whether you are going to get one off the bench the next day,

whether you're not going to get any or whether you're going to get four in the game, it brings your focus to tunnel vision.

Johnny: Also nice to get a new start with an organization, right?

Mike: Yeah, forgot about that too. That's huge, after being with the Orioles for so long it is nice to have some new faces and new eyes on you, it's refreshing for sure.



AUTOGRAPHS

Guests may seek autographs from players and coaches from the time the gates open until 15 minutes prior to game time. The autograph areas are located on the outer sides of both the home and visiting dugauts. Guests will not be allowed to seek autographs at the dugaut corners closest to home plate. Please be courteous and respectful to the players and coaches as well as guests possessing tickets in autograph areas. If you are seeking autographs in a seating section other than your own, you may be asked to proceed to your designated seating section.

ATMs

There are two Golden 1 Credit Union ATMs at Raley Field, located on the concourse at sections 113 and 110.

BATTING PRACTICE

Gates open one hour before game time allowing guests to view infield practice for the visiting team. Please note: on dates with large crowds expected, Raley Field may open 2 hours prior to game time to accommodate all of our fans. Be sure to arrive as soon as the gates open and catch all the pregame action. River Cats batting practice generally occurs before gates are open, and both teams' BP is subject to cancellation.

BEVERAGES, BOTTLES AND CANS

Guests are not allowed to bring any outside beverages, cans, or bottles into Roley Field. The following items are permitted: unopened, soft-sided containers of drinks such as water, small milk cartons, juice boxes or pouches, baby formula, bottles, and baby food for children and medication or other special needs. Sports drinks or other flavored waters are not allowed. Permission to enter the stadium with any beverage is at the discretion of security or front office personnel.

BIRTHDAY AND ANNIVERSARY MESSAGES ON SCOREBOARD

Get your birthday, anniversary, or special message displayed on the matrix board (in left field) at a River Cats game this season. There is a \$25 charge benefiting the River Cats Foundation. All requests must be submitted at least 48 hours before the day of the game you wish to have your announcement displayed.

CHILDREN

Children 23 months and younger do not need a ticket for entry into Raley Field; however, they must sit on the lap of an accompanying adult and will not be reserved a seat. Children two years of age and older must have a ticket. Booster seats are available, free of charge, at the Guest Services Office.

CUSTOMER SERVICE INITIATIVE

Make sure you stop by guest services to acknowledge any exceptional service by our gameday staff.

DISABLED PARKING

A limited number of on-site disabled parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis in the VIP Green Lot. Additional disabled parking is available in the Orange Lot, which is just south of the stadium. Guests parking in all lots can catch a shuttle back to the drop-off zone in front of the stadium. A wheelchair-accessible van is also available which can transport guests in wheelchairs back to the drop-off zone. The cast to park in any disabled spot is \$10 (4+ carpool is free with Lasher Subaru Parking Pass.

DISABLED SEATING

Wheelchair and companion seating is offered on every level and in all price categories of the stadium. Every seating section is wheelchair-accessible and electric outlets are provided at many of the wheelchair seating areas for use in charging power wheelchairs and electronic communication devices.

EXIT AND RE-ENTRY

Guests may leave Raley Field at any time through any of the exit gates. Guests may reenter the stadium only after obtaining a reentry stamp from an attendant at any of the exit gates. Reentry for non-baseball events is subject to change.

FIELD ACCESS

In accordance with Pacific Coast League rules, only authorized personnel with proper credentials will be permitted on the field before, during, or after a game or event. Any unauthorized person who travels onto the field will be removed from Raley Field and subject to arrest and prosecution.

FIRST AID

The First Aid Station is located on the concourse at Section 112. If first aid assistance is needed, please go to the First Aid Station or contact the nearest Guest Services representative.

FOOD

Pacific Coast League rules state that guests are not allowed to bring any outside food items into Raley Field.

FOUL BALLS AND HOME RUN BALLS

Guests may keep any balls hit into the stands. Batted balls can be dangerous, so we ask that guests stay alert at all times, even when out of your seat. When attempting to catch a foul or home run ball please do not interfere with the game in progress, and be respectful of other guests. At no time should a foul or home run ball be thrown back on the field. Guests who fail to adhere to these rules face immediate ejection from Raley Field and will be subject to arrest and prosecution.

GUEST SERVICES OFFICE

The Guest Services Office is located on the Concourse Level at Section 112 and will be open when gates open to the event and closes approximately ½ hour after the event's conclusion. Guests will find a number of services including lost and found, child booster seats, taxi service, guest assistance, and reporting last children

ICE CHESTS AND COOLERS

Guests are not permitted to bring hard-sided ice chests or coolers into Raley Field. Softsided cooler bags to keep unopened bottled water, baby items, or other special needs cool during the event are permitted. Admission with these items are subject to the discretion of security or front office personnel. All prohibited items should be discarded or may be returned to one's vehicle.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found in or around Raley Field during events should be turned in to the Guest Services Office located on the concourse at Section 112. All lost and found items will be stored for 30 days. After 30 days, Raley Field and the River Cats reserve the right to remit to charity or otherwise disposed of, Lost and found items can be picked up at the Administrative Office during the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. All calls and questions regarding the lost and found should be forwarded to the Guest Services Department at [916] 376-4700.

MERCHANDISE - ON DECK SHOP

The On Deck Shop is located at the Home Plate Entrance of the stadium and is pen year-round. Current hours are Monday through Friday, 10:00 am - 5:00 pm. On game days, the On Deck Shop closes to the public 90 minutes prior to gate time and reopens as soon as the main gates open for ticketed guests only. Hours are subject to change.
