INFIELD FLY RULE

The ball is popped up, the runners on first and second are tagging up and before the ball is caught, one of the umpires throws his hand in the air and calls out "infield fly." Well, we can all see that so why is he telling us? What he's doing is invoking rule 5.09 (a)(5). That rule mandates that when there are runners on first and second, or first, second, and third, and there are one or no outs, any fly ball that can be caught with ordinary effort by an infielder is hit, the batter is automatically out. It's a judgement call by the umpire.

The rule doesn't get used very often (there are no statistics on its use since it is not part of the data kept by baseball statisticians), but when it is used it can be controversial. In the 2008 World Series, Phillies' third baseman Pedro Feliz hit a pop-up with runners on first and second. The game was being played in the rain with strong winds and the umpires did not invoke the rule. The umpire crew chief Tim Tschida explained that because of the weather conditions, the player "could not make the play with ordinary effort."

Then, in 2012, in the eighth inning of the one-game wild card playoff between the St. Louis Cardinals and the Atlanta Braves, Braves shortstop Andrelton Simmons hit a 225 foot pop up to shallow left field. Cardinals' shortstop Pete Kozma, who was playing in normal position, ran out to

left field to catch the ball while left fielder Matt Holliday ran into catch it as well. Kozma, thinking Holiday was going to make the catch, backed off and the ball was not caught by either of them. In a very controversial call, left field umpire Sam Holbrook called the infield fly rule just before the ball hit the ground. The result meant the Braves now had runners at second and third with two outs, instead of bases loaded with one out. The Braves did not score in the inning, and the Cardinals went on to win the game, 6-3, eliminating the Braves from the postseason.

So why have the rule? What if, with runners on first and second and no outs, the batter pops up to the third baseman. Because the ball was hit in the air, neither runner on base attempts to advance, instead returning to their base. The batter, thinking it is an easy out, casually starts jogging to first. If that third baseman let the ball drop, he could quickly grab it and step on third before throwing to second. The second baseman then fires to third and the team has turned a triple play. The rule is in place to prevent the defense from abusing the tag rule to turn a double play or triple play by intentionally not catching a ball.

Arizona native Jake Wong stayed close to home when he chose to attend Grand Canyon University after graduating from Hamilton H.S. in the Phoenix suburb of Chandler. His strong performance as a junior in 2018 helped surge the newly-admitted NCAA program and ultimately led to the school's highest draft selection since Tim Salmon went 69th overall in 1989.

Wong's profile features a mid to sometimes upper-90s fastball to go along with a curveball and a changeup. When Wong is sitting in the lower half of the zone, the fastball takes on sinker-like characteristics. This pitch helps him thrive as a weak contact pitcher as opposed to a strikeout guy, which could help him become an effective innings eater if he reaches his ceiling.

And as you would imagine, in 40.2 innings with the Augusta GreenJackets to begin this season, Wong didn't put up gaudy strikeout totals (22.1%) but

instead pitched to soft contact for an opposing batting average of .186, opposing OPS of .521, and a ground-ball rate of nearly 50%.

It all came together for a 1.99 ERA in those eight starts, prompting a mid-season promotion (alongside fellow rotation-mate Sean Hjelle) to the Advanced-A San Jose Giants. This puts the right-hander on track for another mid-season call-up to Double-A next season, as long as everything goes well in the hitter-friendly California League.

FERNANDO ABAD

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 220 | DOB: 12/17/85

Abad is an eight-year major-league veteran signed to a minor-league deal in the offseason. After breaking camp in Richmond, and proceeding to allow just four baserunners and zero runs in six innings, Abad was promoted to Sacramento to bolster the bullpen. Abad, who has pitched more than 300 innings combined for five different MLB teams, began the 2018 season in the New York Mets system but was suspended for 80 games after testing positive for the banned substance Stanozolol.



TYLER BEEDE

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 5/23/93

Beede, drafted in 2014's first round out of Vanderbilt University, made more starts than any other River Cats pitcher during his Triple-A debut season in 2017 and is the No. 24-ranked prospect in the system according to MLB Pipeline. He pitched six or more innings in 11 of his 19 starts, posting a 3.47 ERA in those outings. He struggled during the 2018 season with the River Cats and was sent to the bullpen for the remainder of the year, but made some mechanical adjustments in the offseason and will be back in the rotation for 2019.



TY BLACH

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: L | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 10/20/90

Blach is back in a River Cats uniform after spending all of 2017 and 2018 with the San Francisco Giants. There, he pitched the third most innings on the club in 2017 and followed that up with 118.2 a year later. He owns a 4.36 ERA in nearly 300 major-league innings pitched while making almost half of his 85 appearances as a starter. Blach was a three-year starter at Creighton University in Omaha, Neb. and was selected by the Giants in the fifth round of the 2012 draft.



RAY BLACK

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 230 | DOB: 6/26/90

After playing collegiately at the University of Pittsburgh, he was drafted by the Giants in the 7th round of 2011, though he missed the 2012 and 2013 seasons after undergoing shoulder surgery to repair a torn labrum. In 2014 while pitching for the San Jose Giants, he struck out nearly 45% of the batters he faced in 25 innings. In May of 2017 he had arthroscopic surgery on his throwing elbow, but returned healthy and made his major-league debut on July 8, 2018.

SAM COONROD

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 9/22/92

Drafted in the fifth round in 2014, Coonrod hails from Carrollton, Ill. and played collegiately for Southern Illinois University. Following Tommy John surgery at the conclusion of 2017, Coonrod finished up his rehab in July of 2018 and returned to action pitching for the AZL Giants and the San Jose Giants, where during his brief time in San Jose he struck out 46.4% of the batters he faced in 6.1 innings. Prior to moving into the pen, Coonrod racked up more than 100 innings in three straight seasons from 2015 to 2017.



JANDEL GUSTAVE

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 10/12/92

Signed by the Houston Astros as a non-drafted free agent on 5/25/10. Played the first 9 years of his career with the Astros organization, and made his Major League debut on 8/11/16 against Minnesota. He has made 20 big league appearances and has a 3.98 ERA in 20.1 career innings. After the 2018 season, Gustave signed with the San Francisco Giants with an invitation to Major League spring training. He appeared in three games with the Advanced-A San Jose squad before being promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on May 10, 2019.



WILLIAMS JEREZ

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 5/16/92

Jerez was acquired by the Giants late in March in a deal that sent starting pitcher and long-time River Cats pitcher Chris Stratton to the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. The left-handed reliever is a native of the Dominican Republic but went to high school in Brooklyn, N.Y. and was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the second round of the 2011 draft. He found himself in the Angels organization when he was traded in the deal that helped the Red Sox acquire lan Kinsler. Jerez made his major-league debut with the Angels on August 7, 2018.



DILLON MCNAMARA

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'5" | Weight: 230 | DOB: 10/6/91

The tall right-hander was traded to the Giants in exchange for cash on July 23, 2017 and has bounced between Double-A and Triple-A during his almost-two seasons in the organization. McNamara made his Triple-A debut last year, appearing in six games for the River Cats but spent most of his time in Richmond where he owned a 1.20 ERA in 33 games. He began the 2019 season in Extended Spring Training while rehabbing an injury, but was added to the River Cats roster on May 10.



STEVEN OKERT

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: L | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 7/9/91

A product of the University of Oklahoma, Okert was a fourth round pick by the Giants in 2012. He was designated for assignment on March 23 but cleared waivers and returned to Sacramento to begin the 2019 season. Okert has 48.1 career innings pitched in the major leagues spread from 2016 to 2018, and is third all-time in River Cats history for pitcher appearances.

YOANYS QUIALA

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 235 | DOB: 1/15/94

A native of Mayari, Cuba, Quiala originally signed with the Houston Astros as a minor league free agent in 2015. The right-hander was released by the Astros following the 2018 season and signed with the San Francisco Giants before spring training in 2019. His best professional season was 2017, when he went 9-5 with a 2.57 ERA with Advanced-A Buies Creek and Double-A Corpus Christi. Quiala began 2019 with Double-A Richmond before being promoted to Sacramento on April 26.



DERECK RODRIGUEZ

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 215 | DOB: 6/5/92

Selected by the Minnesota Twins in the sixth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Pace High School in Miami Gardens, Fla. He made the transition from outfielder to pitcher following the 2013 season. His father, Ivan, spent 21 years in the Major Leagues, won 13 Gold Gloves and was a 14-time All-Star. Rodriguez was signed by the San Francisco Giants as a minor league free agent before the 2018 season and began the year with the River Cats. He was called up to make his Major League debut on May 29, 2018.



TYLER ROGERS

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'4" | Weight: 180 | DOB: 12/17/90

With 55 appearances, Rogers finished tied with San Jose Giants right-hander Dylan Rheault for most games by a pitcher in the Giants' system in 2017, then followed that up by leading the system with 51 in 2018. The right-handed submariner totalled 143.2 innings over that span, entirely with the Sacramento River Cats, while holding opposing hitters to a .236 average, just two home runs, and a 2.37 ERA in 2017. His 61.0% ground ball rate was one of the highest on the Giants' form over these last two seasons.



SAM SELMAN

PITCHER

Bat: R | Throw: L | Height: 6'3" | Weight: 190 | DOB: 11/14/90

A former second-round pick of the Kansas City Royals, Selman joins the River Cats after dominating in his seven innings pitching for the Double-A Richmond Flying Squirrels. He pitched collegiately for Vanderbilt University, where he was teammates with current River Cats Tyler Beede and Mike Yastrzemski. Pitching between Double and Triple-A during the 2017 season, Selman struck out 97 batters in just 67.2 innings while sporting a 2.66 ERA.



PAT VENDITTE

PITCHER

Bat: L | Throw: S | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 185 | DOB: 6/30/85

One of the most unique baseball players in the game, Venditte is a switch-pitcher. He throws with either arm and carries a special glove that allows him to switch hands while on the mound. He's a 33-year veteran who made his major-league debut for the Oakland A's in 2015, though it was the New York Yankees who signed him in the 20th round of the 2008 draft. Venditte spent 2018 in the Los Angeles Dodgers' system where he tossed 14 big-league innings while pitching most of his games with the Triple-A Oklahoma City Dodgers.

RONNIE FREEMAN

CATCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 190 | DOB: 1/8/91

Originally drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2012 out of Kennesaw State University, Freeman had his best season offensively in 2014 with Advanced-A Visalia, slashing .278/.340/.392 with three home runs and 24 doubles. He was traded to the Giants from the Arizona on March 24, 2018 and played in 12 games for Double-A Richmond before being called up to the River Cats. He would eventually play 61 games for Sacramento, batting .264 with seven doubles and three home runs.



ARAMIS GARCIA

CATCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'1" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 1/12/93

Drafted in the 2nd round of the 2014 draft out of Florida International University, Garcia was the top catching prospect in the Giants' farm system until they selected Georgia Tech's Joey Bart in 2018. Garcia, though, is certainly the closest to consistent major-league time as he's currently one of three backstops on San Francisco's 40-man roster. Garcia has been known mostly for his offensive prowess, but his skills behind the dish have improved from year to year, especially during the 2018 season in Double-A Richmond.



FRANCISCO PENA

CATCHER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 230 | DOB: 10/12/89

Brother of major-league infielder Tony Peña, Francisco has 86 big-league games with three different teams under his belt since debuting in 2014 with the Kansas City Royals. Peña was signed by the New York Mets out of the Dominican Republic back in 2009, but became a member of the Giants' organization on May 2, 2019 when he was traded by the St. Louis Cardinals to San Francisco in exchange for cash. Peña began the 2019 season with the Triple-A Memphis Redbirds after playing 58 games in the majors for the Cards in 2018.



ABIATAL AVELINO

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 210 | DOB: 2/14/95

After signing out of the Dominican Republic at age 16 with the New York Yankees, Avelino was a ranked prospect in the Pinstripes' farm system for seven seasons. In 2015, he stole the fifth most bases in all of the minor leagues [54] while splitting time between Advanced-A and Double-A ball. On August 31, 2018, he was included in the trade that sent then Giants outfielder Andrew McCutchen to the Yankees. He enters the 2019 season on the Giants' 40-man roster and is ranked the No. 19 prospect in the organization by MLB Pipeline.




RYAN HOWARD

INFIELDER


Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 195 | DOB: 7/25/94

Howard was selected by the San Francisco Giants in the fifth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Missouri. In his first full season as a professional in 2017, Howard hit .306 in 127 games with Advanced-A San Jose and was promoted to Double-A Richmond to begin the 2018 season. Howard began the 2019 season by being assigned to Double-A Richmond, but was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on May 9, 2019 where he has played second, third, and shortstop.

LEVI MICHAEL

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 5'8" | Weight: 175 | DOB: 2/9/91

Selected by the Minnesota Twins in the first round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of North Carolina. He hit .297 with 5 homers, 3 triples, 14 doubles and 48 RBIs in 60 games for the Tar Heels in 2011. He was rated as the No. 1 prospect in North Carolina by Impact Baseball. After the 2018 season he signed with the Giants with an invitation to Major League spring training. Has a .258 batting average in eight minor league seasons since becoming a professional.



AUSTIN SLATER

INFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'2" | Weight: 205 | DOB: 12/13/92

Slater began 2017 playing his first 46 games in Sacramento slashing .322/.381/.460 with 12 doubles and four home runs. He received a call-up to San Francisco to make his major-league debut on June 2, going 1-for-5 with a single at Philadelphia. Before injuring his hip, the former Stanford Cardinal played in 29 games with the Giants batting .290. Similarly in 2018, Slater got off to a hot start in Triple-A and was eventually recalled to San Francisco where he played in 74 games batting .250.



ANTHONY GARCIA OUTFIELDER

Bat: R | Throw: R | Height: 6'0" | Weight: 180 | DOB: 1/4/92

Led the Nashville Sounds, at the time a Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland A's, in plate appearances (566), doubles (31), and home runs (25) during the 2018 season, but did not receive a September call-up from the A's. He elected free agency at the end of the year and signed a minor-league deal with the Giants on January 24, 2019. A product of Puerto Rico, Garcia was originally drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in 2009 and remained in their system until signing with Oakland after the 2017 season



MIKE GERBER

OUTFIELDER






MIKE YASTRZEMSKI OUTFIELDER

Brundage will take the field as the River Cats' manager for the third consecutive season. Yesterday's Game: The River Cats failed to hit a home run for the third consecutive game in an 8-4 loss to the Las Vegas Aviators. LHP Andrew Suarez gave up 11 hits and eight runs in five innings of work, both of which mark the most a River Cats pitcher has allowed this season. The heart of the order for the Aviators did the bulk of the damage as Jorge Mateo, Seth Brown, Sheldon Neuse, and Dustin Fowler combined to record nine of the team's 11 hits and drive in seven of the team's eight runs. On the offensive side for the River Cats, it was a nice night at the plate for both INF Abiatal Avelino and OF Mike Gerber as third baseman raked two singles and drove in a run while the center fielder clubbed his 18th double of the year and drew two walks.

Tonight's Starter: RHP Enderson Franco (2-1, 6.89) will make his team-high tenth start of the season for the River Cats. Franco is coming off a season-best outing in strikeouts in which he struck out inie Isotopes batters and picked up his second win of the season as Sacramento beat Albuquerque 10-6. Franco's Achilles heel this season has been giving up home runs as he's allowed 13 on the season -- six more than the next River Cats pitcher (RHP Carlos Navas - 7). Sacramento has supplied Franco with plenty of run support this season, though. When he starts the River Cats have outscored opponents 79-51, winning seven of nine.

Owned by the "Triple" A's: Thursday night's loss to the Aviators marked the 14th consecutive time in which the River Cats have lost to a Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics. This streak dates back to 2017 when the A's housed their AAA club in Nashville. The final two contests between the clubs that year, followed by a four-game series sweep in Nashville in 2018, and then these eight games in 2019 as the A's have now aligned with Las Vegas for Triple-A affiliation. Going back even further, the A's farm club has taken 22 of the last 24 games. In terms of the Las Vegas ballclub without respect to affiliation, they have defeated Sacramento 10 straight times dating back to the end of last season when the 51s closed out their time at Cashman Field with two wins over the River Cats.

Struggling Suarez: The young left-hander from the University of Miami has not been pitching his best during his time with the River Cats in 2019, especially during his most recent two outings. Though he pitched five innings in both contests, the opposition has combined to tally 13 runs on 20 hits to skyrocket his ERA to 7.59 through 32 innings.

Bullpen: Despite a rough outing from Suarez, the bullpen did their best to keep the River Cats in the game by pitching four scoreless innings allowing just two baserunners. One came on a hit batsman from RHP Jandel Gustave and another came on a walk, also from Gustave. **LHP Fernando Abad** faced three batters and struck out all of them while fellow lefty **Steven Okert** also struck out three, but did so in two perfect innings.

This Day in River Cats History: May 31, 2008: The River Cats cranked out 13 runs on 18 hits in Colorado Springs against the Sky Sox, winning 13-5 to take their fourth victory in a row. INF Jeff Baisley reached base three times, finishing the day 2-for-5 with two doubles, while OF Danny Putnam and INF Wes Bankston each collected three hits. RHP Chris Gissell pitched five innings allowing three runs while striking out eight, which would stand as his season-high that year.

MAY 31 IN MLB HISTORY

May 31, 1869: The first rain out involving a professional baseball team occurs when heavy rain postpones the Red Stockings' tune up game against the Antioch Nine, a Yellow Springs, Ohio college team. Aaron B. Champion, Cincinnati's owner, had been a student at the school in the 1850s.

May 31, 1980: Ken Landreaux's 31-game hitting streak comes to an end when he goes hitless in four at-bats in Minnesota's 11-1 loss to Baltimore at Metropolitan Stadium. The 33 year-old outfielder's accomplishment, the longest span in the American League since Dom DiMaggio's 34 for the Red Sox in 1949, establishes the record for the most consecutive games with a hit in Twins history.


May 31, 2012: At Coors Field, Carlos Gonzalez sets a franchise record and becomes the 22nd major league to hit a home run in his fourth straight at-bat. 





Q&A with Sam Selman, pitcher for the River Cats, and Johnny Doskow, the radio broadcaster of the Sacramento River Cats.

Johnny: Left-hander Sam Selman with us, and Sam you are kind-of settling in to the Sacramento area. This is not your first rodeo in Triple-A, but how are you enjoying Sacramento so far?

Sam: I'm really enjoying it out here. I actually came here last year when I was

with the Omaha Storm Chasers, my previous team, and really enjoyed the area. I'm staying down here in a good apartment nearby with a bunch of the guys. I'm loving being able to explore the town, taking the Jump Bikes around to the different restaurants and things, but yeah, it's been a great time so far.

SILIMAN SILIMA

Johnny: You went to pitching-rich Vanderbilt – incredible tradition there. You actually went to Vandy and got humbled a bit. You dominated in high school and then went to Vanderbilt and you didn't pitch the first two years, you just soaked it all in and learned. Can you take us through those first two years, was it frustrating or were you able to embrace the situation?

Sam: So yeah, I came from a small high school in

Austin, Texas and we had 18 guys on our baseball team. From my school when I was a 14th round draft pick I was no doubt the first person ever to be drafted, and probably the first to play collegiate baseball. So, then I went to Vanderbilt where everyone is the same, they are all good. I only pitched a few innings during my first two years, but finally after my sophomore year, we had 14 guys either graduate or get drafted so there was an opportunity for me to pitch 80 innings in 2012 for my Junior year.

Johnny: What is it about Vandy that makes it a baseball player factory, with all the players that have come out of there to have success in the minor league and in the big leagues? It's pretty special.

Sam: Yeah, it's the best recruiting tool you can possibly have. You get to play in Nashville, and go to a top school in the country, and by the way we've had 120-plus guys drafted and have 14 players currently in the Major Leagues. And all those guys come back and contribute to the program. There are resources for alumni to come back and work on their games after they graduate. Yaz (teammate and Vanderbilt alum Mike Yastrzemski) goes back every offseason, and I go back whenever I can. It's just a fun atmosphere that everyone wants to remain a part of.

Johnny: No doubt. Could

you take us through a bit about growing up in Austin, Texas?

Sam: You know, people ask me all the time when they go to visit there, like "what should I go do?" or "what should I see?". But it's a very different town than it was when I grew up there. So, my parents are from there, my grandparents are from there, so it was slowly on the rise when I was growing up, similar to Nashville when I was in college. Now they are both just booming great towns that everyone wants to go to. But your hometown is your hometown. I'm not sure of the best bars and hip new sushi places, but I can tell you where my brother and I golfed every Sunday or where my favorite Mexican food place its.

Johnny: You are going to be someone who really appreciates when you finally get the call to the big leagues. You've been through so much in this

game, can you imagine what that feeling is going to be like?

Sam: You know what, you think about it all the time. You think about but at the same time you don't think about it because you have to keep grinding on through. It's one of those things where you don't want to always be looking up to see how well you've done, because that's the moment when you trip and fall and things start going

south. So, I obviously thought about it and dream about that experience. I've been on this ride for so long, but so have my parents and friends who have supported me along the way, so they're a huge part of it as well.



AUTOGRAPHS

Guests may seek autographs from players and coaches from the time the gates open until 15 minutes prior to game time. The autograph areas are located on the outer sides of both the home and visiting dugouts. Guests will not be allowed to seek autographs at the dugout corners closest to home plate. Please be courteous and respectful to the players and coaches as well as guests possessing lickets in autograph areas. If you are seeking autographs in a seating section other than your own, you may be asked to proceed to your designated seating section.

ATM.

There are two Golden 1 Credit Union ATMs at Raley Field, located on the concourse at sections 113 and 110.

BATTING PRACTICE

Gates open one hour before game time allowing guests to view infield practice for the visiting team. Please note: on dates with large crowds expected, Raley Field may open 2 hours prior to game time to accommodate all of our fans. Be sure to arrive as soon as the gates open and catch all the pregame action. River Cats batting practice generally occurs before gates are open, and both teams' BP is subject to cancellation.

BEVERAGES, BOTTLES AND CANS

Guests are not allowed to bring any outside beverages, cans, or bottles into Roley Field. The following items are permitted: unopened, soft-sided containers of drinks such as water, small milk cartons, juice boxes or pouches, baby formula, bottles, and baby food for children and medication or other special needs. Sports drinks or other flavored waters are not allowed. Permission to enter the stadium with any beverage is at the discretion of security or front office personnel.

BIRTHDAY AND ANNIVERSARY MESSAGES ON SCOREBOARD

Get your birthday, anniversary, or special message displayed on the matrix board (in left field) at a River Cats game this season. There is a \$25 drage benefiting the River Cats Foundation. All requests must be submitted at least 48 hours before the day of the game you wish to have your announcement displayed.

CHILDREN

Children 23 months and younger do not need a ticket for entry into Raley Field; however, they must sit on the lap of an accompanying adult and will not be reserved a seat. Children two years of age and older must have a ticket. Booster seats are available, free of charge, at the Guest Services Office.

CUSTOMER SERVICE INITIATIVE

Make sure you stop by guest services to acknowledge any exceptional service by our gameday staff.

DISABLED PARKING

A limited number of on-site disabled parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis in the VIP Green Lot. Additional disabled parking is available in the Orange Lot, which is just south of the stadium. Guests parking in all lots can catch a shuttle back to the dropoff zone in front of the stadium. A wheelchair-accessible van is also available which can transport guests in wheelchairs back to the dropoff zone. The cost to park in any disabled spot is \$10 (4+ carpool is free with Lasher Subaru Parking Pass.

DISABLED SEATING

Wheelchair and companion seating is offered on every level and in all price categories of the stadium. Every seating section is wheelchair-accessible and electric outlets are provided at many of the wheelchair seating areas for use in charging power wheelchairs and electronic communication devices.

EXIT AND RE-ENTRY

Guests may leave Raley Field at any time through any of the exit gates. Guests may reenter the stadium only after obtaining a reentry stamp from an attendant at any of the exit gates. Reentry for non-baseball events is subject to change.

FIELD ACCESS

In accordance with Pacific Coast League rules, only authorized personnel with proper credentials will be permitted on the field before, during, or after a game or event. Any unauthorized person who travels onto the field will be removed from Raley Field and subject to arrest and prosecution.

FIRST AID

The First Aid Station is located on the concourse at Section 112. If first aid assistance is needed, please go to the First Aid Station or contact the nearest Guest Services representative.

FOOD

Pacific Coast League rules state that guests are not allowed to bring any outside food items into Raley Field.

FOUL BALLS AND HOME RUN BALLS

Guests may keep any balls hit into the stands. Batted balls can be dangerous, so we ask that guests stay alert at all times, even when out of your seat. When attempting to catch a foul or home run ball please do not interfere with the game in progress, and be respectful of other guests. At no time should a foul or home run ball be thrown back on the field. Guests who fail to adhere to these rules face immediate ejection from Raley Field and will be subject to arrest and prosecution.

GUEST SERVICES OFFICE

The Guest Services Office is located on the Concourse Level at Section 112 and will be open when gates open to the event and closes approximately ½ hour after the event's conclusion. Guests will find a number of services including lost and found, child booster seats, taxi service, guest assistance, and reporting lost children.

ICE CHESTS AND COOLERS

Guests are not permitted to bring hard-sided ice chests or coolers into Raley Field. Soft-sided cooler bags to keep unopened bottled water, baby items, or other special needs cool during the event are permitted. Admission with these items are subject to the discretion of security or front office personnel, prohibited items should be discorded or may be returned to one's vehicle.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found in or around Raley Field during events should be turned in to the Guest Services Office located on the concourse at Section 112. All lost and found items will be stored for 30 days. After 30 days, Raley Field and the River Cats reserve the right to remit to charity or otherwise disposed of. Lost and found items can be picked up at the Administrative Office during the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. All calls and questions regarding the lost and found should be forwarded to the Guest Services Department at 1916 376-4700.


