## GREEN BAY (7-1) AT L.A. CHARGERS (3-5)

Sunday, Nov. 3 • ROKiT Field at Dignity Health Sports Park • 3:25 p.m. CST

### PACKERS TRAVEL WEST TO TAKE ON THE CHARGERS

The Green Bay Packers travel to California for a matchup with the Los Angeles Chargers.

- ▶ While it's the first time the Packers will play the Chargers since they moved to Los Angeles, it is the seventh away game against the Chargers, and Green Bay has won the previous six.
- ▶ It is one of six games the Packers have this season against 2018 playoff teams (Chicago twice, Philadelphia, Dallas, Kansas City), with four of those contests taking place on the road. So far, the Packers are 3-1 against 2018 playoff teams.
- ▶ The Packers are 10-1 all-time vs. the Chargers, a .909 winning percentage that is tops by Green Bay versus any team.
- ▶ Dating back to 1990, the Packers are 11-3 during the regular season in the state of California (vs. Chargers, 49ers, Raiders, Rams).
- ▶ It is the final game of a stretch of three straight games against AFC West teams, the first time the Packers have had three straight games against AFC teams since playing the AFC West in 2003 in Weeks 15-17.
- ▶ Green Bay is 16-3 against AFC West teams since 2002, an .842 winning percentage that ranks No. 1 in the NFL over that span.
- ▶ With the victory in Week 7 over Oakland, the Packers improved to 8-0 against the Raiders, dating back to 1990. Green Bay won four of those eight games by 28-plus points (10, 30, 31, 34, 4, 28, 13, 18). The eight-game streak is Green Bay's longest active winning streak vs. an opponent, with the second longest being a seven-game win streak against the San Diego/L.A. Chargers, who the Packers face this week.



### GOOD START

- ▶ Packers Head Coach **Matt LaFleur** is the first head coach in franchise history to win seven of his first eight NFL games. He is also the 19th NFL head coach and the first since Jim Harbaugh in 2011 to win at least seven of his first eight games (Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ LaFleur is the first coach in Packers history to win his first three road NFL games.
- ▶ With a win, LaFleur would tie Mike McCarthy (8-8) and Ray Rhodes (8-8) for the third-most NFL wins by a Packer head coach in their first season (9-7: Mike Holmgren and Mike Sherman).
- ▶ Green Bay has started the season with at least seven wins in its first eight games for the first time since starting 8-0 in 2011 and the fifth time since 1970 (7-1 in 2007, 2002 and 1996).
- ▶ The Packers (3-0) are one of six teams to be undefeated on the road this season. Green Bay won its first three road games for the first time since starting 7-0 on the road in 2011.
- ▶ The Packers have a plus-24 point differential on the road this season, No. 1 among teams who have played three road games or less this season and No. 7 overall.
- ▶ Green Bay joins the New England Patriots (8-0), San Francisco 49ers (7-0) and the New Orleans Saints (7-1) as the only NFL teams with at least seven wins this season.
- ▶ The Packers have started 3-0 in the NFC North for the first time since 2012 and for just the fourth time (2011 and 2002) since the division was formed in 2002.

- ▶ Out of the 26 teams that have played multiple division games this season, Green Bay joins New England (4-0) and Dallas (3-0) as the only teams to have three division wins, and is one of eight teams with multiple wins against division opponents.

### WITH THE CALL

- ▶ CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with play-by-play man **Jim Nantz** and analyst **Tony Romo** handling the call from the broadcast booth and **Tracy Wolfson** reporting from the sidelines.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro **John Kuhn** (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ Sports USA Radio will air the game on radio across the country with **Larry Kahn** (play-by-play) and **Hank Bauer** (analyst) calling the action and **Troy West** reporting from the sideline.
- ▶ The game can also be seen on DirecTV channel No. 714 with NFL Sunday Ticket.

## PACKERS AT CHARGERS - WEEK 9

### VERSATILE BACKS

The Packers' backfield trio of RBs **Aaron Jones** and **Jamaal Williams** and FB **Danny Vitale** combines skill sets in the run and pass game.

- ▶ Green Bay has rushed for over 115 yards in three of the last four games, **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** since Week 5.
- ▶ The Packers' RBs/FBs rank near the top of the league in a few categories this season:

- ▶ Jones (three) and Williams (four, **No. 2 in the NFL** among running backs) are the only RB tandem in the NFL to both have three-plus receiving TDs this season. The last time the Packers had two RBs/FBs with three-plus TD receptions in a season was 2003 when Ahman Green had five and William Henderson had three.
- ▶ In Week 8, Jones had two receiving TDs and Williams had one, marking the first time the Packers have had three TD receptions in a game by RBs since Nov. 12, 1995, vs. Chicago (Edgar Bennett with two, Dorsey Levens with one).
- ▶ Among fullbacks/running backs with five-plus receptions (six), Vitale ranks **No. 3 in the league** in yards per catch (15.7 avg.).
- ▶ Vitale has three receptions for 20-plus yards, **tied for No. 7 in the NFL** among RBs/FBs.
- ▶ The Packers rushed for 120-plus yards in Weeks 5-6 on fewer than 30 attempts. It is only the **fourth time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger** that the Packers have posted back-to-back games with 120-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts and the first time since 2006.
- ▶ Week 6 marked the fifth time since 2017 that the Packers posted 150-plus rushing yards on fewer than 30 attempts, which is **tied for the most in the league over that span** (Kansas City, San Francisco). Green Bay is also the **only team in the league** to have at least one of those games in each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ▶ Jones tied a franchise record with four rushing TDs in Week 5. It was the Packers' first game with four rushing TDs since Dec. 23, 2012, vs. Tennessee.
- ▶ The Packers rushed for a season-high 170 yards on 29 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 6. They were led by Williams, who posted 104 rushing yards on just 14 attempts (7.4 avg.), the fewest carries needed by a Packer in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015. Williams recorded a career-long 45-yard run, the longest by a Packer this season.
- ▶ Jones (107 yards in Week 5) and Williams (104 yards in Week 6) going back-to-back with 100-plus yard rushing games marked the first time Green Bay has had different RBs post a 100-yard game in back-to-back weeks since Weeks 2-3 in 2013 (Starks in Week 2, Johnathan Franklin in Week 3).

### JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

- ▶ RB **Aaron Jones** ranks in the top five in the NFL in rushing TDs this season:

- ▶ Jones' league-leading 11 total TDs are **tied for the most** through the first eight games of the season by a Packer since 1950 (Ahman Green, 11 in 2003).
- ▶ In Week 8, Jones posted a career-high 159 receiving yards and two TDs on seven receptions (22.7 avg.), the **second-most receiving yards in a game by a RB in franchise history** behind only Andy Uram (174 yards, vs. Chicago Cardinals on Nov. 1, 1942).
- ▶ Jones added 67 rushing yards on 13 carries (5.2 avg.), giving him a career-best 226 yards from scrimmage, the **fourth-best single-game total in team annals** and the best mark since RB Ahman Green's 227-yard game vs. Denver on Dec. 28, 2003.
- ▶ Jones' average of 11.3 yards per touch set a single-game franchise mark among RBs with 200-plus yards from scrimmage (Elias Sports Bureau):

- ▶ Jones joined Rams RB Todd Gurley (at Tennessee on Dec. 24, 2017) as the **only NFL players since 1950** to have 65-plus rushing yards, 150-plus receiving yards, seven-plus receptions and two receiving TDs in a single game.
- ▶ Jones had two receptions of 50-plus yards in Week 8, the first Green Bay RB to do so since Paul Hornung at Baltimore on Dec. 12, 1965.
- ▶ Jones totaled 182 scrimmage yards (107 on 19 carries, 5.6 avg. and 75 yards on seven receptions, 10.7 avg.) and a **franchise-record-tying** four rushing touchdowns in a Week 5 win at Dallas. He was the first Packer to record four rushing TDs in a game since Dorsey Levens tallied four in a win over the Arizona Cardinals on Jan. 2, 2000.
- ▶ Jones recorded a rushing TD in four consecutive games (Weeks 2-5) this season, the second longest streak of his career (five games in 2018, Weeks 10-14).
- ▶ Jones was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Dallas, becoming the first Packer RB to earn the honor since Eddie Lacy in 2014 (Week 12).
- ▶ Jones has two multi-rushing TD performances this season (Weeks 3 and 5) to **tie for the most in the NFL**.
- ▶ Dating back to 1950, Jones' two multi-rushing-TD performances this season (Week 3 and 5) are **tied for the ninth most** by a Packer in a single season. In 1962, Jim Taylor recorded the most in one season (five) by a Packer, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Jones had nine plays from scrimmage of 10-plus yards in Week 5 at Dallas (six runs, three catches), the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker on Dec. 19, 2004.
- ▶ Jones posted a rushing TD in six straight home games (2018-19) to surpass Taylor (1964) and Green (2003) for the **longest streak in franchise history**.
- ▶ In Week 2, Jones set a career high with 23 carries for 116 yards (5.0 avg.) and a TD.
- ▶ Since entering the NFL in 2017, Jones ranks in the top five in yards per carry (min. 200 att.) among running backs:

## PACKERS AT CHARGERS - WEEK 9

### OWNING OCTOBER

- ▶ Green Bay began October with a 34-24 win over the Dallas Cowboys, marking the second time in the last three years that it started October with a win at Dallas. The Packers finished 4-0 in the month with victories over the Detroit Lions (23-22), Oakland Raiders (42-24) and Kansas City Chiefs (31-24).
- ▶ The Packers were one of five teams to win four games this season in the month of October.
- ▶ Green Bay had a plus-36 point differential in October 2019, ranking **No. 5 in the NFL**.
- ▶ Dating back to 2008, the Packers (31-12, .721) hold the **second-best record in the NFC** and the **third-best mark in the league** in the month of October:

- ▶ Green Bay recorded at least a .500 record in the month of October for the 10th time in the last 12 seasons (2008-19).

- ▶ Green Bay has an .818 winning percentage (18-4) at home in October since 2008, **No. 2 in the NFC and No. 3 in the NFL**.
- ▶ The Packers have a .636 winning percentage (14-8) on the road in October since 2008, **No. 1 in the NFC and No. 3 in the NFL**. Green Bay is one of five teams to have a winning road record in the month of October since 2008.
- ▶ The Packers ranked No. 2 in the NFL in October in points per game this season:

- ▶ The Packers also ranked **No. 4** in yards per play (6.47) and **No. 6** in yards per game (409.3) during October 2019.

- ▶ Dating back to 2008, QB **Aaron Rodgers** leads the NFL (min. 500 pass attempts) in passer rating (108.9) and passing touchdowns (97) in the month of October, while ranking No. 4 in passing yards (12,222).
- ▶ In October 2019, Rodgers completed 94 of 137 passes (68.6 percent) for 1,255 yards (313.8 per game) with 10 TDs and one INT for a 118.7 passer rating, the fourth-highest passer rating in an October of his career (129.4 in 2011, 123.9 in 2009 and 121.5 in 2012).
- ▶ Rodgers ranked in the top five in the NFL in passer rating this October (min. 50 pass att.):

- ▶ For the month of October, Rodgers was **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** in TD passes (10) and ranked **No. 2** in yards/attempt (9.2) and **No. 3** in passing yards (1,255).
- ▶ Rodgers **led the NFL** in October 2019 with 21 completions of 20-plus yards and was **tied for No. 1** with five completions of 40-plus yards.
- ▶ RB **Aaron Jones** ranked No. 2 in the league with 551 yards from scrimmage this October:

- ▶ Jones was the **only player in the league** in October 2019 with 250-plus rushing yards and 250-plus receiving yards, and he became the **first Packer** to have 250-plus rushing yards and 250-plus receiving yards in a calendar month since the 1970 merger.
- ▶ Jones led all NFL running backs in receiving yards in the month of October:

- ▶ Jones and **Jamaal Williams tied for the league lead among RBs** with three receiving TDs each.
- ▶ Jones led the league with seven total TDs in October:

- ▶ It was the most TDs by a Packer in the month of October since RB Terrell Middleton (eight in 1978) and the most in a calendar month since RB Ahman Green had seven in Dec. 2000.
- ▶ Jones averaged 7.2 yards per touch in the month of October, **No. 1 among running backs** with 35-plus touches.



## PACKERS AT CHARGERS - WEEK 9

### TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

- ▶ In Week 7, Rodgers set a single-game franchise record with a perfect 158.3 passer rating after connecting on 25 of 31 passes for 429 yards and five TDs with no INTs. It eclipsed the previous single-game team record of 155.4 by Rodgers at Cleveland on Oct. 25, 2009.
- ▶ Rodgers also posted a rushing TD in Week 7, making him just the second QB in NFL history (Redskins QB Mark Rypien; Nov. 10, 1991) to throw for 400-plus yards with five-plus passing TDs, a rushing TD and no INTs.
- ▶ Dating back to 1950, Rodgers is just the **sixth NFL QB** to register 400-plus passing yards and a perfect passer rating in a game, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Rodgers' average of 13.84 yards per attempt in Week 7 was a single-game career high (min. 15 att.) and was the best by a Green Bay QB since Brett Favre registered a 14.52-yard average (363 yards on 25 att.) at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997. Rodgers' 13.84-yard average was the best in team history in a game with 30-plus attempts.
- ▶ Weeks 7-8 marked the sixth time in his career that Rodgers has had two or more consecutive games with 300-plus passing yards, three-plus passing TDs and no INTs. No other QB in team history has done it once.
- ▶ A look at where Rodgers ranks among active NFL quarterbacks **since he took over as the starter in 2008** (min. 1,500 attempts):

- ▶ Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the **first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games**, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- ▶ Rodgers tied Manning for the **fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards**, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ Rodgers threw for 400-plus yards in Week 7 to extend his **franchise record** to nine 400-plus-yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- ▶ In Week 4, Rodgers passed Hall of Fame QB Fran Tarkenton (342) to rank **No. 9 in NFL history** in touchdown passes. He (353) trails Giants QB Eli Manning (362) for the No. 8 spot and Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger (363) for No. 7 in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3 of 2018. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt
- ▶ Rodgers finished the 2018 season with 372 completions, **tied for the second most** in a season in team history behind his **franchise mark** of 401 (2016).
- ▶ Rodgers finished 2018 with 4,442 passing yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just two interceptions, marking his sixth season with 4,000-plus passing yards, 25-plus passing TDs and 10 or fewer interceptions, the most by an NFL player since 1920, according to pro-football-reference.com:

### RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career and that has continued this season.

- ▶ Rodgers is **one of two QBs** with 16-plus passing TDs (16) and two or fewer interceptions (two) this season (Russell Wilson, 17 and 1).
- ▶ Rodgers is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** in TD passes this season:

- ▶ With his fourth TD pass in Week 7, Rodgers became the ninth player in NFL history to throw 350 career TD passes. He reached 350 TD passes in his 172nd game, surpassing Saints QB Drew Brees (180 games) as the **fastest to 350 TD passes in league history**.
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown four-plus touchdowns in a game a **franchise-record** 22 times. That is **the fifth most in the NFL since 1950** and ranks **No. 3 among active quarterbacks** (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- ▶ In Week 7, Rodgers completed TD passes to two different running backs (Aaron Jones and Jamaal Williams) in a game for the first time in his career. It was the first time the Packers had two different RBs/FBs catch a TD pass in the same game since Nov. 14, 2004, vs. Minnesota (RB Tony Fisher and FB William Henderson). Rodgers, Jones and Williams duplicated the effort in Week 8.
- ▶ Last season was the first time in his career that Rodgers registered 25-plus touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions in a season (25/2). Dating back to 1920, he was the **third player in the NFL** with 25-plus TDs and two or fewer INTs in a single season (Tom Brady, 28/2 in 2016 and Nick Foles, 27/2 in 2013), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ▶ Rodgers has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), the **most in team history**.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

- Green Bay had six different players register a reception of 20-plus yards in Week 7, the first time the Packers did so since Dec. 12, 1983, at Tampa Bay (also six players).
- The Packers had nine passing plays of 20-plus yards in Week 7, the most by the Packers in a game since Dec. 22, 2003, at Oakland (nine).
- Green Bay ranks **No. 4 in the NFL** this season in 20-plus-yard completions (34), according to Sportradar.



## PACKERS AT CHARGERS - WEEK 9

### NEW LEADER

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- ▶ He is the first head coach in franchise history to win seven of his first eight NFL games and the first to win his first three road NFL contests.
- ▶ He is the 19th NFL head coach and the first since Jim Harbaugh in 2011 to win at least seven of his first eight games (Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- ▶ It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- ▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ▶ With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- ▶ LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ▶ LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ▶ During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- ▶ The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level, having also worked at Central Michigan (2004-05), Northern Michigan (2006), Ashland University (2007) and Notre Dame (2014).

### THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- ▶ Offensive coordinator **Nathaniel Hackett** brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- ▶ Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- ▶ Special teams coordinator **Shawn Mennenga** (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- ▶ **Chris Gizzi**, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of **Mark Lovat**, **Thadeus Jackson** and **Grant Thorne**.
- ▶ Quarterbacks coach **Luke Getsy** returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for

Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.

- ▶ Defensive line coach **Jerry Montgomery** is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks in 2017-18, the most among Packers defensive linemen.
- ▶ Inside linebackers coach **Kirk Olivadotti** (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ▶ Tight ends coach **Justin Outten** (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- ▶ Defensive backs coach **Jason Simmons** is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- ▶ Running backs coach **Ben Sirmans** is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best single-season mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- ▶ Outside linebackers coach **Mike Smith** joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- ▶ Offensive line coach **Adam Stenavich** (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05. Following his collegiate career, Stenavich spent time with a few NFL teams, including a stint on the Packers' practice squad in 2006.
- ▶ Wide receivers coach **Alvis Whitted** (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- ▶ Assistant offensive line coach **Luke Butkus** comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- ▶ Assistant defensive backs coach **Ryan Downard** begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.
- ▶ Assistant special teams coach **Maurice Drayton** was retained and is entering his fourth season coaching in the NFL. He worked as the assistant special teams coach for each of the past three seasons (Green Bay in 2018 and the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17).
- ▶ Offensive assistant **Jason Vrable** enters his seventh season as an assistant coach in the NFL, previously working for the New York Jets (2017-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-16).

- MATT LaFLEUR**...In his first season as the Packers' 15th head coach.
- ▶ In his 11th season in the NFL, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16), and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
  - ▶ Guided the Titans' offense in 2018 to a No. 7 league ranking in rushing (126.4 ypg) as Tennessee registered 11 games with 100-plus rushing yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.
  - ▶ Helped the Rams lead the league in scoring with an average of 29.9 points per game in 2017, more than doubling their average from 2016 (14.0 ppg).
  - ▶ Tutored QB Matt Ryan, who led the league in passer rating (117.1) in 2016 on his way to being named NFL Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press*.
  - ▶ Coached rookie QB Robert Griffin III with the Redskins in 2012, who became the first QB in team history to win AP Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- ANTHONY LYNN**...In his third season as the Chargers' 16th head coach.
- ▶ Led the Chargers to their first playoff appearance since moving to Los Angeles by recording a 12-4 record in 2018. With seven selections, the Chargers led the league in sending players to the Pro Bowl.
  - ▶ As offensive coordinator and later interim head coach for Buffalo in 2016, the Bills led the league in rushing yards (2,630), rushing touchdowns (29) and rushing yards per attempt (5.3).
  - ▶ Spent the 2014 season as both running backs and assistant head coach with the N.Y. Jets; where the team recorded 100-plus rushing yards in 13 games, including three games with over 200 yards on the ground.
  - ▶ Served as running backs coach for six seasons with Jacksonville (2003-04), Dallas (05-06) and Cleveland (07-08) before his six seasons with the Jets (09-14).
  - ▶ Signed as an undrafted free agent with the N.Y. Giants in 1992 and later played for Denver (1994, 97-99) and San Francisco (1996-97). He won back-to-back Super Bowls with Denver in 1997 and 1998.

## THE PACKERS-CHARGERS SERIES

- ▶ The two teams have met 11 times in the regular season in a series that dates back to 1970, the year of the AFL-NFL merger.
- ▶ The Packers have won seven straight and 10 of the 11 meetings, including a 6-0 mark while the team was located in San Diego. Sunday's matchup will mark the first time Green Bay has played the Chargers in Los Angeles.
- ▶ The Chargers were the hosts for the Packers' first-ever appearance on *Monday Night Football*, on Oct. 12, 1970. The Packers won, 22-20, on a 14-yard Dale Livingston field goal with 3:39 remaining.
- ▶ Their second meeting, at Lambeau Field in 1974, was won by the Packers, 34-0, and became Dan Devine's final victory in his four-year tenure as Green Bay head coach.
- ▶ One of the more bizarre contests in Packers history was played in San Diego on Sept. 14, 1978. With a temperature of 102 degrees at kickoff (tied for the highest in Packers history), the teams combined for 18 sacks, including 10 by the Chargers. The Packers also created 11 turnovers - five interceptions (four by Willie Buchanon to tie a league record) and six fumble recoveries - in a 24-3 Green Bay victory.

## NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- In Week 7, Valdes-Scantling also tied a career franchise record with his third 100-yard receiving game on three or fewer catches.
- Valdes-Scantling's 74-yard TD reception in the fourth quarter of Week 7 was Green Bay's longest play from scrimmage this season and the longest catch of his career. It was his fifth reception of 40-plus yards this season, giving him nine career catches of 40-plus yards.
- In Week 7, Valdes-Scantling (74, 59) became the first Packer with a pair of 50-plus-yard receptions in a game since WR Greg Jennings at St. Louis on Sept. 27, 2009.

### BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 26 offensive players, 24 defensive players and three specialists.

- Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 28 of them (52.8 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- Green Bay has 14 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents.
- Over a third of the players (20 of 53, 37.7 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- Of the 53 players on the roster, 47 of them (88.7 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Nov. 3) and 22 players (41.5 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

### OFFSEASON ADDITIONS ENHANCE DEFENSE

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff made numerous moves to strengthen the roster this offseason and those moves have impacted the defense's strong start to the season:

- ▶ **S Adrian Amos** (A-miss), who joined the Packers after four seasons with the Chicago Bears, picked off QB Mitchell Trubisky in the end zone in Week 1 on the Bears' second-to-last drive of the game to protect a 10-3 lead. He became the first player to record an interception in their first game with the Packers since Bryant Westbrook on October 13, 2002, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ Dating back to Week 9 of the 2018 season (including postseason), Amos is **tied for No. 6 in the NFL** among S/DB with four interceptions.
- ▶ **LB Preston Smith** came to Green Bay after playing for the Washington Redskins for the past four years. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1. He followed it up by picking off QB Kirk Cousins in Week 2.
- ▶ Smith is the **only player in the NFL** with 25-plus sacks (31.5), five-plus INTs (five) and five-plus forced fumbles (five) since 2015.
- ▶ He matched his career high set on Dec. 26, 2015, at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- ▶ **LB Za'Darius** (zuh-DARE-ee-us) **Smith** played in 58 regular-season games with 16 starts in four seasons for the Baltimore Ravens and ranked No. 2 among NFL linebackers in 2018 in QB hits (25) and **tied for No. 6 in total pressures** (sacks + hurries + knockdowns) with 35.
- ▶ For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is **one of six NFL players** to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ▶ Z. Smith's eight sacks in the first eight games are the most by a Packer since LB Clay Matthews had nine in 2012.

► Crosby hit five field goals of 50-plus yards in 2018, which tied his career high (2013) and **tied for No. 3 in the NFL** in 2018 (Baltimore Ravens K Justin Tucker) behind the six made by New York Jets K Jason Myers and Dallas Cowboys K Brett Maher. It was the **second most in a season in team history** behind only K Chris Jacke, who made six in 1993.

► Adams recorded 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games (Weeks 5-6, 8), joining WR James Lofton (1984) as the **only players in franchise history** to do so, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► In 2017-18 (Weeks 14-15, Weeks 1-6 and 8-9 in 2018), Adams recorded five-plus receptions in 10 consecutive games to rank **No. 3 in team history**, trailing Sharpe, who recorded 18 consecutive games in 1993-94 and 13 straight games in 1992-93, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► Adams became the **first player in franchise history** to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season (2018).

► Adams was the first Packer since WR Greg Jennings (2010) with three straight games with 100-plus receiving yards (Weeks 5-6, 8 in 2018). Adams finished one short of the franchise record held by Lofton (four in 1982-83) and Hutson (four in 1945).

► Adams had a career-best three 10-plus-reception games last season (**tied for No. 4 in the NFL**) and added the eighth of his career in Week 4 this season to **rank No. 1 in team history**:

► In Week 5 of 2018, Adams extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his 10th straight road game, and **tied the longest streak in NFL history** (Eagles WR Tommy McDonald, 10, 1959-61).

► Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in each of the first three contests, which extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to the 2017 season. He had six TD catches during the streak. It was the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It was also the longest streak by a Packer player since WR **Randall Cobb's** streak of six games in 2014.



## PACKERS AT CHARGERS - WEEK 9

### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- Dating back to 2000, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- Since 2000, Green Bay is one of only six NFL teams to have a regular-season road record above .500.

### 347 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Oakland Raiders in Week 7 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 347 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

### THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 2019 NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) on the original schedule for the sixth straight year (2014-19) – was released April 17 by the National Football League.

- ▶ The Packers will face 2018 playoff teams in six games this season (Chicago, Philadelphia, Dallas, Kansas City, L.A. Chargers), with four of those contests taking place on the road.
- ▶ The Packers opened the season at the Chicago Bears in the NFL's Thursday night regular-season opener. It marked the fourth time in team history that Green Bay opened at Chicago (1979, 1981, 2015).
- ▶ The Packers opened their home slate in Week 2 against the Minnesota Vikings, marking just the fourth time (2003, 2008, 2018) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ▶ Green Bay stayed at home both of the next two weeks, the first time the Packers have played three straight at home in September since 1990 (Weeks 1-3). They hosted the Denver Broncos in Week 3 and the Philadelphia Eagles in a Thursday night matchup in Week 4.
- ▶ The Packers traveled to take on the Dallas Cowboys in Week 5. It was the seventh matchup between the two teams (including postseason) since 2013, and Green Bay improved to 6-1 with a win.
- ▶ For the second time in three seasons, the Packers hosted the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football*, this time in Week 6. It was the fourth matchup on *Monday Night Football* between the two clubs (1971, 1972, 2017).
- ▶ A home game against the Oakland Raiders in Week 7 was the Packers' fifth at Lambeau in 2019, marking the most home contests for Green Bay in the first seven games of a season since 1978 when it also played five at home (not including the 1987 strike year).
- ▶ In Week 8, Green Bay was at Kansas City for a Sunday night matchup.
- ▶ In Week 9, Green Bay travels to Los Angeles to take on the Chargers. While it's the first time the Packers will play the Chargers since they moved to Los Angeles, it is the seventh away game against the Chargers, and Green Bay has won the previous six.
- ▶ In Week 10, the Packers host the Carolina Panthers in the fourth contest between the two teams in the last six years (2014, 2015, 2017).
- ▶ Green Bay will have its bye the following week, marking the first Week 11 bye for the Packers and the latest for the team since the bye was reintroduced in 1990.
- ▶ Over the next two weeks, Green Bay will crisscross the country, playing at the San Francisco 49ers in Week 12 and at the New York Giants in Week 13.
- ▶ In Week 14, the Packers take on the Washington Redskins in the third matchup between the two in the last five years (including the postseason), but the first in Green Bay since 2013.
- ▶ Week 15 has the Bears coming to Green Bay. The Packers are 10-2 all-time at home against the Bears in December/January games.
- ▶ The Packers close out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago.
- ▶ In Week 16, Green Bay is at the Vikings and on *MONF* for the second time on the season. The Packers last played two Monday games in the same regular season in 2009.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

**CHICAGO (AP)** — The Green Bay Packers beat the Chicago Bears by on Thursday night, 10-3. And while it was ugly on offense, likely in great part due to the lack of action so many regulars on that side of the ball got in the preseason, it was a thing of beauty for the defenders in green, gold and white. On this night, the Packers were the Monsters of the Midway.

There was plenty of noise heading into Soldier Field about Chicago's D, which was dominant in 2018 as the Bears won the NFC North. And it played quite well against Aaron Rodgers and the pack, sacking Rodgers five times and yielding only 213 yards.

But the Packers were stingier.

The Packers defense totaled five sacks on a clearly befuddled Mitchell Trubisky. The only turnover of the game was a fourth-quarter pick in the end zone by former Bears safety Adrian Amos.

Green Bay went into the end zone on an 8-yard jump-ball reception by tight end Jimmy Graham — a former college basketball player who dived out to perfection on the play. That was the difference, thanks to the stringy Packers D.

The game also was marked by sloppy offense and penalties. But the Packers made the fewest mistakes and now lead the league's longest series 99-95-6. Green Bay has won 16 of the last 19 regular-season meetings, and Rodgers is 17-5.

Chicago's defense hardly stacked, getting five sacks — tying the most it has had against Rodgers. But it could do little with the ball and Trubisky never found his stride. He even was sacked on Chicago's final offensive play.

Mason Crosby made a 39-yard field goal in the final period of the game, while Chicago got a 38-yarder from Eddy Pineiro. Bears fans rejoiced in relief on the first score of the season: Pineiro's first-quarter field goal. The last such kick on Soldier Field was Cody Parkey's double-dunk off the goalpost and crossbar that sent Chicago home from the wild-card round.

Each team had 10 penalties, there was a total of 467 yards or only offense, and several drops. At one point, Chicago had three straight penalties to put it in a first-and-40. No, the Bears didn't convert.

It was a rough start in the opening series for Green Bay. A run and a pass netted zero yards, then Rodgers was sacked heavily by Roy Robertson-Harris for a 10-yard loss. Rodgers was sacked again on the next three-and-out and Chicago took over at the Packers' 36 after a punt. Chicago had forced 17 yards in losses on those series, and the Packers had minus-12 yards through one period.

Rodgers got it going at the start of the second quarter, launching a 47-yard completion to Marquez Valdes-Scantling. Two more completions got the pack to the 8, and Graham then scored.

By halftime, Green Bay had outgained Chicago 119 yards to 98.

**GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)** — All that mattered to Aaron Rodgers on Sunday was that the Packers won. Rodgers threw two early touchdowns and Green Bay held on for a 21-16 victory over the Minnesota Vikings. On a day when the Packers honored late Hall of Fame Bart Starr at halftime, Rodgers put on quite a show — particularly early. Rodgers completed nine of his first 10 passes for 134 yards and two touchdowns and had a perfect 158.3 rating through the first quarter. He finished 22 of 34 for 209 yards. Rodgers and new coach Matt LaFleur experimented with Rodgers wearing a playcall wristband in the hope that it would speed up the play-calling process and get the offense out of the huddle quicker.

After scoring on each of its first three possessions, Green Bay's offense failed to muster another point. But the hot start was enough to win. The Packers remained unbeaten under LaFleur after opening the NFL's 100th season with a victory at rival Chicago. They also beat the Vikings (1-1) for the fifth time in the past seven games at Lambeau Field.

Minnesota's Dalvin Cook had a career-high 154 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. It was the third-year pro's second consecutive game with over 100 yards rushing. Cook also had 37 yards receiving in the loss.

After throwing the ball just 10 times in the opener against Atlanta, Kirk Cousins finished 14 of 32 with 230 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. Cousins was picked off by Kevin King in the end zone late in the fourth quarter.

The Vikings are 5-2-1 in last their eight meetings against Green Bay. Rodgers and Davante Adams connected on a 39-yard completion on the Packers' first offensive play. Rodgers found running back Jamaal Williams for a 15-yard touchdown to cap a four-play, 75-yard drive.

Adams finished with 106 yards on seven catches.

After a missed field goal by Minnesota, receiver Gerónimo Allison, who did not see a single pass against the Bears, gave the Packers a two-score advantage on a 12-yard strike from Rodgers.

Green Bay took over at the Vikings' 33 after defensive lineman Kenny Clark sacked Cousins, forcing a fumble. Dean Lowmy recovered the loose ball. The Packers took a commanding 21-0 lead two minutes into the second quarter on a 23-yard run by Aaron Jones.

After rushing for 11 yards and two touchdowns in a win last week against the Falcons, Cook broke out for a 75-yard score following a missed tackle by rookie safety Daniel Savage.

Stefon Diggs scored the Vikings' other touchdown with a 45-yard grab with 9:12 to play in the third.

Minnesota had eight penalties for 100 yards.

**GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)** — The short-handed Philadelphia Eagles promoted Craig James, the second-year undrafted cornerback to the active roster two days before the crucial game in Green Bay, Wis. James responded by making the game-winning play in the 4:27 when he intercepted Packers QB Matt Flynn on the 25-yard line and sealed the victory for the Eagles. James' interception was the first of three interceptions he had in the game. Jordan Howard rushed Green Bay for his second career three-touchdown game and the Eagles (2-2) ended a two-game losing streak. Howard finished with 87 yards on 15 carries and two touchdowns, rushing and one receiving. Aaron Rodgers went 16 for 27 for 150 yards, three scores and no turnovers, and the Eagles rebounded after losing consecutive games by a combined seven points. Rodgers started 10 for 10 and finished 34 for 53 for 422 yards on 10 catches for Green Bay, but he wasn't in the field for the Packers' 3-1 on the last drive because of a toe injury. Adams was hurt after making a catch in the fourth quarter that gave the Packers first-and-goal at the 8. Aaron Rodgers was called for pass interference on the next play while teammate Andrew Sendejo collided with him. Maddox was carted off the field on a stretcher late in the fourth quarter, which forced coach Doug Pederson to turn to James. Rodgers had first-and-goal from the 1, after the delay and threw four straight incompletions. After punting on his first two drives and falling behind 10-0, Philadelphia scored on four straight possessions against a defense that had only given up 35 points through the first three games. Sacked six times in the previous two games, Wentz managed to stay upright. Zach Ertz had a team-high seven catches for 65 yards, and Alshon Jeffery, who missed all but six snaps over the past two weeks with a calf injury, finished with 38 yards and a touchdown on three catches. Rodgers and Adams connected on a 58-yard completion on the opening drive. It was the longest play of the season for Green Bay, which scored a touchdown on its opening drive for the third consecutive game. Aaron Jones scored from 3 yards out two plays later to give the Packers the early lead. Mason Crosby added a field goal in the beginning of the second quarter to make it 10-0. The Eagles finally got a little momentum on a 67-yard return by Miles Sanders on the ensuing kickoff. The return set up a 6-yard drive by Jeffery. Green Bay added another field goal to take a 13-7 lead. Wentz found tight end Dallas Goedert for a 3-yard touchdown strike to give the Eagles a 14-13 lead just before the two-minute warning. Rodgers fumbled on the following drive after a strip-sack by Derek Barnett. The Eagles capitalized with 1-yard score by Howard. Howard's touchdown made it 21-13 with 59 seconds to go. Rodgers needed just 50 seconds to lead the Packers 70 yards. The two-time MVP found Jeronimo Allison for a 19-yard touchdown to make it 21-20 at the half. The Eagles opened the second half with a 20-yard score from Wentz to Howard. After a failed two-point conversion, Philadelphia led 27-20. Jimmy Graham got his first catch and score since Week 1. Graham had six catches for 61 yards and a 14-yard touchdown that tied the game at 27-27 with 3:16 to go in the third.

**GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)** — It took Mason Crosby 13 seasons to perform his first Lambeau Leap. The 35-year-old kicker nailed a 23-yard field goal as time expired and jumped into the crowd with a boost from long snapper Hunter Bradley after he finished off a rally for the Green Bay Packers, who benefited from some questionable officiating to edge the Detroit Lions, 23-22, on Monday night.

Aaron Rodgers, in his second straight game without top target Davante Adams, completed 24 of 39 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns, including a beautiful 35-yard throw to Allen Lazard for the first-year pro's first career score.

Rodgers linked up with Jamaal Williams for the first-year pro's first career score. Rodgers finished with 104 yards on 14 carries and four catches for 32 yards for Green Bay (5-1) which captured its first win in five tries against its NFC North rival.

The Packers, who are off to their first 3-0 start in the NFC North since 2012, might not have pulled it off if not for two fourth-quarter penalties for illegal hands to the face against Detroit's Trey Flowers, both of them on third down. The first set up Lazard's touchdown, and the second allowed Green Bay to run the clock down to two seconds before Crosby's game-winner. In both cases, replays showed Flowers' hands on the neck or shoulder — not the face — of a Packers lineman.

Referee Clete Blakeman said each of the calls was made by umpire Jeff Rice, and he discussed the last one with him. Matt Prater was good from 26, 22, 41, 51 and 54 yards for the Lions (2-2-1), who fell to 0-2 under Matt Patricia on Monday night. Detroit lost its last Monday night game to the Jets, 48-17, last year.

Matthew Stafford finished 18 of 32 for 265 yards and was sacked three times. Kerryon Johnson scored the lone touchdown for the Lions from 1 yard out in the first quarter.

Preston Smith and Za'Darius Smith each had a sack for Green Bay. Preston Smith and Tyler Fackrell combined for the other. Rodgers was sacked once by Damon Harrison Sr. and threw an interception that bounced off the facemask of an open Darrius Shepherd near the goal line. James Coleman snagged the ball and returned it 55 yards, setting up Prater's last field goal that made it 22-13.

**GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)** — The Green Bay Packers gave the rest of the NFL its first true glimpse of what Matt LaFleur's offense can look like with Aaron Rodgers at the helm. And it was scary.

Rodgers had his best game by far under the new Packers coach, throwing for 429 yards and five touchdowns and running for another as Green Bay beat the Oakland Raiders, 42-24, on Sunday.

Rodgers completed 25 of 31 passes to eight different targets and finished with the first perfect passer rating of his career, leading LaFleur's offense to a season high in points.

Even with top target Davante Adams sidelined for the third straight game with turf toe, Rodgers threw for his most touchdowns in a game since Sept. 28, 2015, against the Chiefs.

Derek Carr finished 22-for-28 for 293 yards, two touchdowns and two costly turnovers for the Raiders (3-3), who lost their eighth straight against Green Bay, dating back to 1990. The Packers (6-1) have scored 30-plus points in each of their last five games against the Raiders.

Green Bay took the lead for good on a 2-yard touchdown from Rodgers to Jamaal Williams with 3:27 to go in the first half. The score capped an 11-play, 82-yard drive that took up 8:06 — the Packers' longest drive of the season — and made it 14-10.

Carr put the Raiders in position to retake the lead with a 48-yard completion down the middle to Darren Waller, giving Oakland first and goal at the 3. On second down, as Carr scrambled for the pylon, Blake Martinez forced a fumble and the ball went through the end zone for a touchdown. Rodgers made Oakland pay, finding Jake Kumerow for a 37-yard touchdown to make it 21-10 at halftime.

The Raiders had seven penalties for 87 yards in the first half. They finished with eight penalties for 97 yards.

Rodgers opened the second half with a 59-yard completion to Marquez Valdes-Scantling. Four plays later, Rodgers crossed the goal line on a 3-yard run.

Carr and Waller connected on a 7-yard score to cut the Green Bay lead to 28-17.

Jimmy Graham got into the action, scoring his third touchdown of the season on a 3-yard pass from Rodgers before the end of the third. Kevin King picked off Carr in the end zone with 8:09 to play. That led to Rodgers' sixth score of the day, a 74-yard pass to Valdes-Scantling, who finished with the two catches for 133 yards. Valdes-Scantling was a game-time decision after suffering knee and ankle injuries on Monday night against the Lions. Gerominio Allison, who was also listed as questionable, had four catches for 33 yards.

Mike Glennon relieved Carr late in the fourth and found Waller for a 17-yard score for the Raiders.

**KANSAS CITY** — It was supposed to be a prime-time showdown between the Green Bay Packers and Kansas City Chiefs, division leaders each led by two of the most talented and exciting quarterbacks in the NFL.

Aaron Rodgers and the Packers tied up to the hilt. Patrick Mahomes never got the chance.

Rodgers threw for 305 yards and three touchdowns, five of them to Aaron Jones on a big night for the Green Bay running back, and the Packers held off Bill Belichick's Matt Moore and the rest of the banged-up Chiefs for a 31-24 victory Sunday night.

Jones had seven catches for 159 yards and added 67 on the ground — a big chunk of them in the closing minutes, when the Packers (7-1) sealed their first win at Arrowhead Stadium since Nov. 4, 2007.

The Chiefs (5-3) hoped Mahomes could make a miraculous recovery 10 days after dislocating his kneecap in Denver in time to play. But after the league MVP was limited all week in practice, coach Andy Reid named Friday's franchise quarterback to lead the team.

Moore took the reins of the high-powered offense and varied play, throwing for 267 yards with two touchdowns and no picks in the ex-high school coach's first start in more than two years.

It wasn't the Rodgers-Mahomes matchup everyone wanted, but Moore and Co. made sure there was still an entertaining game between teams with Super Bowl aspirations.

But after a shaky start by Moore, the offensive quarterback found a groove. He led the Chiefs on an 88-yard drive that ended with a make-or-burn 29-yard touchdown pass to Travis Kelce, then found Mahomes on a 30-yard drive-and-catch to end the game.

The Chiefs held 17-14 at halftime, raising some eyebrows across the league. Rodgers and Co. began to move the ball once more. They used a 15-play drive that sealed them but left the third quarter to get a big yard gain, then got the ball back when Lesan McCoy fumbled on the very next play.

Five plays later, Rodgers completed a run on first down.

With Mahomes on the field, he dropped back and was flushed from the pocket. He rolled to his right and threw a blind pass to the back corner of the end zone, where Jamaal Williams somehow took the ball away from Chiefs manager Ben McQuinn while spinning down feet inbounds.

Rodgers was going full on his back, starting at the sky, as the official signaled touchdown.

The Chiefs assumed with another team date, and when it appeared they had nearly been stopped, the Packers' Tramon Williams was flagged for illegal use of hands. That one Kansas City ball inside the 5 and Damien Williams scored on the next play to tie it again.

It took the Packers all of 56 seconds to score the eventual winning touchdown.

Rodgers again found Jones out of the backfield, and this time he found a lane through the entire Kansas City secondary. It was a foot race from there, and the speedy Rodgers back-hop-skip-ped over the goal line to finish off the 67-yard touchdown reception.

The Chiefs were forced to punt on the ensuing possession and never got the ball back.

## **17 Davante Adams, WR, 6th Year, Fresno State**

- Led the team with a career-high 111 receptions in 2018, the second most in team history behind only WR Sterling Sharpe's 112 in 1993, for a career-best 1,386 yards (12.5 avg.) and a career-high 13 TDs on his way to earning Pro Bowl honors for the second straight year, his first as an original selection.
- Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.
- Has 35 receiving TDs since 2016, No. 2 in the league (WR Antonio Brown, 37) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 28 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Is the lone player in the league to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.
- Leads the league with 26 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016.
- Has posted eight games in his career with 10-plus catches, the most in franchise history (Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all four games he has appeared in and ranks No. 2 on the team with 25 receptions for 378 yards (15.1 avg.)...Has picked up a first down on 80 percent of his receptions (20 of 25), good for No. 5 in the league among players with 25-plus catches...Has been inactive (toe) for four contests.

► **At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Started and appeared on 62 of 64 snaps, tying for the team lead with four receptions for 36 yards (9.0 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs.

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15):** Started and played 71 of 74 snaps, pacing the team with 106 yards receiving on seven catches (15.1 avg.)...Posted 81 receiving yards in the first quarter, the second most in his career in a first quarter behind only the 90 yards he registered vs. New England in 2014...On the first play from scrimmage, found an opening near midfield to make the catch and take it down the sideline for a 39-yard gain to the Minnesota 36...On Green Bay's second series, came out of the slot to free himself from S Jayron Kearse for a 21-yard pickup to the Minnesota 19...With just under two minutes remaining in the game and the Packers holding a 21-16 lead, made a 7-yard catch over the middle on a second-and-6 to move the chains.

► **Vs. Denver (Sept. 22):** Started and played 52 of 57 snaps, finishing with four receptions for 56 yards (14.0 avg.)...Early in the second quarter, made a back-shoulder catch near the sideline for 22 yards to the Denver 28 against CB Chris Harris.

► **Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26):** Started and played 57 of 81 snaps, posting a career-high 180 receiving yards on 10 receptions (18.0 avg.)...It marked his eighth career game with 10-plus receptions as he moved past WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver (seven each) to set a new team record...Joined Don Hutson as the only players in team history to post two games with 10-plus catches and 165-plus receiving yards...Racked up 107 receiving yards on six catches (17.8 avg.) in the first quarter, the most receiving yards in a first quarter by a Packer since WR Javon Walker registered 121 yards at Indianapolis in the first quarter on Sept. 26, 2004...Finished the first half with 158 receiving yards, the most by a Packer in a first half since WR Antonio Freeman had 169 yards vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998...Posted two receptions of 40-plus yards for just the third time in his career (Weeks 8 and 11, 2018)...On the Packers' third play from scrimmage, beat CB Sidney Jones down the sideline for a 58-yard gain to the Philadelphia 7 to set up RB Aaron Jones' 3-yard TD run two plays later...Made a 40-yard catch on a third-and-10 in the second quarter, spinning away from CB Avante Maddox to take it down the sideline to the Philadelphia 36...Made a 13-yard catch on a third-and-6 with a little more than 10 minutes remaining in the game, but sustained a toe injury on the play and did not return.

- After a foot injury sidelined him for most of training camp and the first two regular-season games, saw action in seven games as a rookie in 2017, recording five tackles (one solo) and a QB hit.

- Appeared in 13 games with 11 starts as a rookie and ranked No. 2 on the team with 76 tackles (61 solo) while adding a half-sack, three tackles for a loss, an interception and a QB pressure.
- In Week 8 at the Los Angeles Rams, finished with five passes defended, the most by a Green Bay defender during the 2018 season.
- Earned second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016 after posting a team-high five interceptions (tied for No. 11 in the country) along with a career-best 39 tackles (31 solo) and 14 passes defended.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all eight games and has registered 32 tackles (21 solo), an interception, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a team-high 14 passes defended.

• Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (2010-11), topping K Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.

• Holds the NFL postseason record for most consecutive FGs made with 23 straight from 2010-16.

• Registered 1,310 receiving yards with the New Orleans Saints in 2011, the second most in NFL history by a TE to that point behind only Gronkowski (1,327 in 2011), and posted 16 TD catches in 2013, No. 2 in a season among TEs behind only Gronkowski (17 in 2011).

Minnesota (Sept. 15):** Paced the team with 116 rushing yards on a career-high 23 carries (5.0 avg.)...Had a 15-yard run around the right end to the Minnesota 15 on Green Bay's opening drive to set up RB Jamaal Williams' 15-yard TD catch on a screen on the next play...On Green Bay's third drive, scored on a 2-yard run to give the Packers a 21-0 lead...Picked up six first downs on the ground and added four receptions for 34 yards (8.5 avg.), giving him 150 yards from scrimmage, the second-highest single-game total of his career to that point (172 vs. Miami, Nov. 11, 2018).

► **At Dallas (Oct. 6):** Posted a career-high 182 yards from scrimmage (107 rushing, 75 receiving) and tied a single-game franchise record with four rushing TDs (18, 3, 5, 1), becoming the first Packer to do so since Dorsey Levens (Jan. 2, 2000, vs. Arizona)...Became just the fourth NFL player since 1950 to post 100-plus rushing yards, 75-plus receiving yards and four rushing TDs in a game as he joined Gale Sayers, Dub Jones and Shaun Alexander as the only players to accomplish that feat...Became the first NFL player to register four rushing TDs in a game against the Dallas Cowboys...Led the team with a career-high seven receptions for a career-best 75 yards receiving (10.7 avg.)...His 182 yards from scrimmage were the most by a Packer since RB Eddie Lacy recorded the same total at New Orleans on Oct. 26, 2014...Matched his career highs with six carries of 10-plus yards (vs. Miami, Nov. 11, 2018) and three receptions of 10-plus yards (at Seattle, Nov. 15, 2018), setting a career high with nine plays from scrimmage of 10-plus yards, the most by a Packer since WR Javon Walker posted nine vs. Jacksonville on Dec. 19, 2004...Earned NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance, his first time winning the award, as he became the first Green Bay RB to earn the honor since Lacy in 2014 (Week 12 at Minnesota).

► **Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14):** Rushed for 47 yards on 11 carries (4.3 avg.) and caught four passes for 13 yards (3.3 avg.).

► **Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20):** Led the team with 50 yards rushing on 12 carries (4.2 avg.) and was tied for the team lead with four receptions for 33 yards (8.3 avg.), highlighted by his 21-yard TD catch in the first quarter...On Green Bay's opening drive, came out of the backfield to make the TD catch in the end zone with LB Nicholas Morrow in coverage, making an adjustment at the last second before hauling in the reception...Had a key block on S Karl Joseph near midfield to help spring WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling on his 74-yard TD catch in the fourth quarter.

► **At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Posted a career-high 159 receiving yards and two TDs on seven receptions (22.7 avg.), the second-most receiving

yards in a game by a RB in franchise history behind only Andy Uram (174 yards, vs. Chicago Cardinals on Nov. 1, 1942)...Added 67 rushing yards on 13 carries (5.2 avg.), giving him a career-best 226 yards from scrimmage, the fourth-best single-game total in team annals and the best mark since Green's 227-yard game vs. Denver on Dec. 28, 2003...His average of 11.3 yards per touch set a single-game franchise mark among RBs with 200-plus yards from scrimmage...Joined Rams RB Todd Gurley (at Tennessee on Dec. 24, 2017) as the only NFL players since 1950 to have 65-plus rushing yards, 150-plus receiving yards, seven-plus receptions and two receiving TDs in a single game...Had two receptions of 50-plus yards, the first Green Bay RB to do so in a game since Paul Hornung at Baltimore on Dec. 12, 1965 (TD receptions of 65 and 50 yards)...Posted five receiving first downs, the most by a Green Bay RB since Green had five vs. Minnesota on Sept. 7, 2003...On the Packers' opening drive, came in motion and caught a quick flip from Rodgers before taking it in for a 4-yard TD catch...Later in the first quarter, was split out wide to the left and beat LB Anthony Hitchens down the sideline for a 50-yard catch to the Kansas City 10, setting up RB Jamaal Williams 1-yard TD run two plays later.

### **96 Kingsley Keke, DL, Rookie, Texas A&M**

- Played in all 52 games with 35 starts in his four seasons with the Aggies, recording 150 tackles (57 solo), 21 tackles for a loss, 12 sacks, seven passes defended, three fumble recoveries and a forced fumble.
- Started all 13 games as a senior in 2018 and led the team with a career-high seven sacks. Ranked No. 2 on the team with a career-best 11 tackles for a loss.
- Helped the A&M defense finish No. 3 in the country in run defense in 2018 with an average of 95.2 yards allowed per game, the best mark posted by the Aggies since 1994 (92.4 ypg).

- Entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent with the Jacksonville Jaguars in May 2018.

- Appeared in 48 games at Iowa State, finishing as the school's career leader in receptions (241), receiving yards (3,360) and 100-yard receiving games (12). Earned first-team All-Big 12 honors in 2016 and 2017.

- Finished his career with the Jaguars ranked No. 3 in team history in receiving yards (4,502) and receptions (375) and No. 2 in receiving TDs (33), tops among tight ends in all three categories.

- Was named to the Pro Bowl in 2010, the first tight end in team history to be honored, after posting career highs in receptions (58), receiving yards (700) and receiving TDs (10).

- Helped block for the top four single-season rushing-yardage totals in franchise history (2006-07, 2010, 2017). In 2017, helped the Jaguars lead the league in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in franchise history.

### **63 Corey Linsley, C, 6th Year, Ohio State**

- Has started at center in all 78 contests he played in since entering the league in 2014.
- Was the only player on offense to play every snap for the Packers in 2018, the third time in his career that he played 100 percent of the offensive snaps in a season (2014, 2017).
- Helped the offense average 4.51 yards per carry from 2014-18, which ranked No. 4 in the league over that span.
- Started all 16 games in 2018 and was named a Pro Bowl alternate for the first time in his career as he helped the Packers rank No. 2 in the NFL in yards per carry (5.01) and giveaways (15) and No. 1 in rushing first-down percentage (29.4).
- Started every game in 2014, becoming the first rookie center to open every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978. Was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all eight games at C...Part of a line that has given up two or fewer sacks in six games this season, tied for No. 3 in the NFL...Has helped the offense average 26.9 points per game this season, good for No. 7 in the NFL, and post 26 total TDs, tied for No. 2 in the league...Has helped the offense rank No. 1 in yards per game (425.6), No. 2 in points per game (31.4) and No. 3 in first downs (120) since Week 4.

- ▶**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Started at C and played all 64 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 18 of 30 passes for 203 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 91.4 rating.

### **94 Dean Lowry, DL, 4th Year, Northwestern**

- Has only missed one game in his career, appearing in 55 regular-season contests with 27 starts since entering the league in 2016.
- Saw action in all 16 games and made eight starts in 2018, setting career highs in tackles (57), solo tackles (39), sacks (three) and passes defended (four) while also registering the first forced fumble of his career.
- Played in all 16 games with 11 starts in 2017 and registered 34 tackles (22 solo), two sacks, seven tackles for a loss, a fumble recovery for a touchdown, two passes defended, eight QB hits and six QB pressures.
- Earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors vs. Tampa Bay (Week 13, 2017) after recording four tackles (all solo), a sack, a QB pressure, a QB hit and a fumble recovery he returned 62 yards for a touchdown. Became just the seventh Green Bay player (since 1982) to register a sack and a defensive TD in the same game.

• Started all 47 games he appeared in for Washington State at right tackle, tied for the second-most starts in school history.

• Was a three-time All-Pacific-12 selection, earning second-team honors as a senior in 2017 and honorable mention as a junior and as a sophomore.

• Helped the Cougars rank in the top five in the country in passing offense in all four of his seasons, the lone FBS team to accomplish that feat from 2014-17, including No. 1 rankings in 2014-15.

**2019 SEASON:** Has been inactive (healthy scratch) for all eight games.

### **50 Blake Martinez, LB, 4th Year, Stanford**

• Led the team in tackles both of the past two seasons (158 in 2017 and 147 in 2018), the first Packer to do so in back-to-back years since LB A.J. Hawk (2012-13).

• Has started all 36 games since 2017 and 45 of 49 games he has played in since entering the NFL in 2016.

• Finished No. 3 on the team with career-best five sacks in 2018, and was No. 3 on the team with 10 tackles for a loss.

• Played in 13 games with nine starts at ILB and ranked No. 5 on the team with 62 tackles (46 solo) as a rookie in 2016. Became the first Green Bay rookie to start on defense in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all eight games and leads the team with 108 tackles (69 solo), including four tackles for a loss, and two QB pressures... Has added a forced fumble and two QB pressures...Is one of two defensive players to appear on every snap (S Adrian Amos) this season.

• Originally signed with the Packers as an undrafted free agent in May 2017 and spent 16 weeks on Green Bay's active roster, appearing in one game.

**2019 SEASON:** Has been inactive (healthy scratch) for six contests (Weeks 3-8)...Was signed by Green Bay to the 53-man roster from the Tennessee Titans' practice squad on Sept. 21.

### **62 Lucas Patrick, G, 3rd Year, Duke**

• Appeared in a career-high 14 contests with a career-best four starts in 2018, opening two games at left guard and two at right guard.

• Played in 12 games with two starts in 2017, opening at LG in Week 4 vs. Chicago and at RG in Week 17 at Detroit.

• Spent the entire 2016 season on Green Bay's practice squad. Was originally signed by the Packers as an undrafted free agent on June 1, 2016, after participating in Green Bay's rookie camp that May on a tryout basis.

**2019 SEASON:** Has played in seven games and was inactive (healthy scratch) for one contest.

►**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Appeared on two plays on special teams.

►**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15):** Inactive (healthy scratch).

• Spent time on the Kansas City Chiefs' practice squad in 2017.

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.3), interception percentage (1.42) and TD/INT ratio (4.32, 354/82).

- Set an NFL single-season record in 2018 with his interception percentage of 0.34 (two INTs on 597 attempts), besting the previous mark held by Chiefs QB Damon Huard (0.41 in 2006). Also set a league record last season for consecutive passing attempts without an INT (402).

- Has posted seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (four), Redskins QB Alex Smith (two), Falcons QB Matt Ryan (two) and nine QBs (one).

- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.

- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in seven of the last 10 seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018).

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons.

- Is one of only three QBs in NFL history with 40,000-plus passing yards and 3,000-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).

- In 166 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 59 games with 300-plus passing yards (tied for No. 4 in the NFL over that span), 101 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 89 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and five of the top seven for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016, 2018).

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all eight games and has completed 185 of 283 passes (65.4 pct.) for 2,324 yards and 16 TDs with two INTs for a 106.7 rating...Ranks No. 2 in the league in passing yards, tied for No. 2 in passing TDs, No. 4 in passer rating and No. 6 in passing yards/attempt (8.08)...Has completed nine passes of 40-plus yards on the season, which ranks No. 2 in the NFL, and 34 passes of 20-plus yards, which is tied for No. 2 in the league...Has thrown multiple TD passes in five games this season, tied for No. 2 in the NFL...Has rushed for 97 yards and a TD on 25 carries (3.9 avg.).

Philadelphia (Sept. 26):** Threw for a season-high 422 yards and two TDs with one INT on 34-of-53 passing (64.2 pct.) for a 93.4 rating...It marked his eighth career 400-yard game, further extending his franchise mark...Moved past QB Fran Tarkenton (342) for No. 9 in NFL history for the most career TD passes on his TD throw to WR Geronimo Allison in the second quarter...Connected with Allison on a 19-yard TD over the middle with nine seconds remaining in the first half...Finished the first half with 241 passing yards and a TD on 16-of-22 passing (123.5 rating), his most passing yards in a first half since Dec. 24, 2016, vs. Minnesota (268)... Led the Packers with 46 rushing yards on five carries (9.2 avg.), picking up first downs on three of the carries.

►**At Dallas (Oct. 6):** Connected on 22 of 34 passes (64.7 pct.) for 238 yards and an 85.2 rating...Completed passes to nine different players, a season high...Posted four completions of 20-plus yards for the third straight game, with each one going to a different player (23-yarder to Graham, 23-yarder to TE Robert Tonyan, 22-yarder to RB Aaron Jones, 22-yarder to Allison).

►**Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14):** Threw for 283 yards and two TDs with one INT on 24-of-39 passing (61.5 pct.) for a 90.0 rating...Threw a 5-yard TD pass to RB Jamaal Williams in the second quarter and a 35-yarder to WR Allen Lazard in the fourth quarter...Led the Packers on two scoring drives in the fourth quarter, the first a seven-play, 79-yard drive that was capped off with the TD pass to Lazard and the second a 14-play, 77-yard game-winning drive that ran out the final 6:46 and was capped off with K Mason Crosby's 23-yard FG as time expired...Posted a 12-yard run on that final drive as he went over 3,000 rushing yards for his career, becoming the 13th player in team history to eclipse the 3,000-yard mark.

Oakland (Oct. 20):** Set a single-game franchise record (min. 15 att.) with a perfect 158.3 passer rating after connecting on 25 of 31 passes (80.6 pct.) for 429 yards and five TDs with no INTs, eclipsing the previous franchise mark of 155.4 by him at Cleveland in 2009...Also posted a rushing TD (3-yarder in the third quarter), making him just the second QB in NFL history (Redskins QB Mark Rypien; Nov. 10, 1991) to throw for 400-plus yards with five-plus passing TDs, a rushing TD and no INTs...Posted the third-most passing yards in a game with a perfect passer rating (since 1950)...His fourth TD pass of the day (3-yarder to TE Jimmy Graham in the third quarter) was the 350th of his career as he reached the mark in his 172nd career game, the fastest to 350 TD passes in NFL history (Saints QB Drew Brees, 180 games)...His average of 13.84 yards per attempt was a single-game career high (min. 15 att.) and was the best by a Green Bay QB since Brett Favre registered a 14.52-yard average (363 yards on 25 att.) at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997...His 13.84-yard average was the best in team history in a game with 30-plus attempts...Posted his 22nd career game with four-plus TD passes, moving into the No. 5 spot in NFL history as he moved past Dolphins QB Dan Marino (21)...Threw TD passes to two different RBs (21-yarder to Jones in the first quarter, 2-yarder to Williams in the second quarter) for the first time in his career...Threw a 20-plus-yard completion to six different players on the afternoon, the most in a game by the Packers since Dec. 12, 1983, at Tampa Bay (also six players)...Completed a career-high nine passes of 20-plus yards, the most by a Green Bay QB since Favre had nine at Oakland on Dec. 22, 2003...Threw a 74-yard TD pass to Valdes-Scantling in the fourth quarter, his 18th TD pass of 70-plus yards since 2008, the most in the league over that span... Led the Packers on six TD drives on the eight series that he played... Earned NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance, his franchise-record 17th time winning the award.

►**At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Threw for 305 yards and three TDs with no INTs on 23-of-33 passing (69.7 pct.) for a 129.0 rating, giving him back-to-back games with 300-plus passing yards, three-plus passing TDs and no INTs for the sixth time in his career (no other QB in team history has done it once)...All three of his TD passes went to RBs (two to Jones, one to Williams), the first time the Packers had three TD passes to RBs in a single game since Favre threw two to RB Edgar Bennett and one to RB Dorsey

Levens vs. Chicago on Nov. 12, 1995...It gave him TD passes to two different RBs for the second straight game after never doing it in his first 171 career starts...Added 29 rushing yards on six carries (4.8 avg.), including scrambles of 15 and 9 yards over a three-play span on the Packers' TD drive that was capped off with his 3-yard TD pass to Williams that gave Green Bay a 24-17 lead early in the fourth quarter...On the third-and-1 play from the 3, threw the ball off his back foot as he was under heavy pressure from DE Emmanuel Ogbah and DT Derrick Nnadi, finding Williams in the back right corner of the end zone for the score...After the Chiefs tied the game at 24 with just over nine minutes remaining, connected with a split-out Jones on a screen that he took 67 yards for what proved to be the game-winning TD, giving Rodgers a TD pass of 65-plus yards in the fourth quarter of back-to-back games as he became the first Packers QB to do so since Arnie Herber in 1935.

### **26 Darnell Savage, S, Rookie, Maryland**

- Earned All-Big Ten honors from media and coaches in each of his final two years, being named honorable mention in 2017 and second team in 2018. Started all 36 games over his final three seasons at Maryland.

- In 2018, ranked No. 2 in the Big Ten, trailing only teammate LB Tre Watson (five), and No. 13 in the country with four interceptions.

- Led the team with a career-high 11 passes defensed and tied for the team lead with three interceptions as a junior in 2017.

- Set career highs with 59 tackles and 45 solo tackles as a sophomore in 2016 and as a junior in 2017.

**2019 SEASON:** Has started all six games he has appeared in and has recorded 29 tackles (22 solo), an interception, a forced fumble, four passes defensed, a QB hit and two QB pressures...Was inactive (ankle) for two contests (Weeks 6-7).

► **At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Started and played all 73 snaps, becoming the first rookie safety to start for the Packers in Week 1 since Morgan Burnett in 2010...Registered three tackles (all solo), a pass defensed, a QB pressure and a QB hit...Late in the first half, broke up a QB Mitchell Trubisky pass over the middle intended for WR Allen Robinson on third down to force a Chicago punt.

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15):** Started and played all 65 snaps, leading the secondary with seven tackles (six solo) along with a forced fumble and two passes defensed...Posted his first forced fumble as a pro when he punched the ball out from QB Kirk Cousins at the end of his 11-yard scramble late in the first quarter, a fumble that the Vikings recovered...Late in the first half, got a hand in to break up Cousins' pass over the middle intended for WR Stefon Diggs, deflecting the ball into the arms of LB Preston Smith for the interception to the Minnesota 47.

► **Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20):** Inactive (ankle).

► **At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Started and played all 59 snaps in his first game back from an ankle injury...Registered five tackles (all solo).

### **6 JK Scott, P, 2nd Year, Alabama**

- Averaged 44.7 yards per punt as a rookie in 2018, the third-best single-season mark (min. 35 punts) in team history behind only Tim Masthay (45.6 in 2011) and Craig Hentrich (45.0 in 1997).

- Became the first punter in team history to register a punt of 58-plus yards in each of his first three NFL games and was the first NFL punter to do so since Redskins P Tress Way in 2014.

- Holds University of Alabama records for career punting yards (11,074),

attempts (243) and average yards per punt (45.6).

- Selected to an All-America team in three of his four seasons at Alabama, earning first-team honors in 2014 and second-team honors in '16 and '17.

**2019 SEASON:** Has appeared in all eight games and has posted a 48.1-yard gross average and a 43.2-yard net average on 38 punts with 15 inside the 20...Ranks No. 3 in the league in gross punting average and No. 5 in net average...Is tied for No. 7 in the NFL for punts inside the 20.

• Ranked No. 6 among NFL rookies in receiving yards and had four recep-

tions of 40-plus yards, tied for the most among league rookies (Falcons WR Calvin Ridley, Bills WR Robert Foster).

• Registered two 100-yard receiving games last season, tied for No. 2 in franchise history among rookies behind only Billy Howton (six in 1952).

**2019 SEASON:** Has played in all eight games with seven starts and ranks No. 3 on the team with 22 receptions for 420 yards (19.1 avg.) and two TDs...Among players with 20-plus receptions this season, ranks No. 2 in the NFL in yards per catch...Ranks No. 2 in the NFL with five receptions of 40-plus yards (Buccaneers WR Mike Evans, six)...Has posted nine 40-yard catches since Week 6 last season, No. 2 in the NFL over that span behind only Evans (10)...His nine catches of 40-plus yards since 2018 are the most by a Packer in his first two NFL seasons since WR Greg Jennings recorded nine in 2006-07...Has registered 9 rushing yards on two carries (4.5 avg.).

►**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Started and played 42 snaps, pacing the team with 52 yards receiving on four catches (13.0 avg.)...On Green Bay's first offensive play of the second quarter, caught a deep pass down the middle of the field for a 47-yard gain to the Chicago 27 with CB Prince Amukamara in coverage, helping to set up QB Aaron Rodgers' 8-yard TD pass to TE Jimmy Graham three plays later that would turn out to be the game-winning TD.

►**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15):** Started and played 65 of 74 snaps, posting three receptions for 19 yards (6.3 avg.)...Had a 14-yard catch over the middle on third down on Green Bay's second series with CB Trae Waynes in coverage.

►**Vs. Denver (Sept. 22):** Started and appeared on 50 of 57 plays, pacing the offense with six receptions for 99 yards (16.5 avg.) and a TD...Scored on a 40-yard TD pass in the first quarter, matching the longest TD reception of his career...With the Broncos jumping offside and giving the Packers a free play, beat S Kareem Jackson down the middle of the field to make the catch in the end zone for the score...On the next series, made a 27-yard catch near the sideline, tapping both feet in bounds at the Denver 40 to convert a third-and-15.

►**Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26):** Started and played 70 of 81 snaps, finishing with three receptions for 47 yards (15.7 avg.)...Late in the third quarter, beat CB Avante Maddox to make a catch over the middle for a 26-yard gain to the Philadelphia 29 on third-and-7...Beat Maddox on a slant late in the fourth quarter for a 17-yard pickup to the Philadelphia 18.

►**At Dallas (Oct. 6):** Started and appeared on 70 of 74 snaps, recording an 18-yard reception on Green Bay's second drive...Got both feet in bounds near the sideline with CB Byron Jones in tight coverage for the 18-yard pickup to the Dallas 29.

►**Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14):** Started and played 57 snaps, posting two receptions for 48 yards (24.0 avg.), highlighted by his 46-yard grab on the first play of the fourth quarter...Made the catch down the right sideline with CB Rashaan Melvin draped all over him, hauling in the pass at the Detroit 15...Added a 9-yard carry late in the third quarter...Left the game late in the first half due to injury, but did return.

Rodgers' 3-yard TD run four plays later...With just under 6:30 remaining in the game, caught a pass from Rodgers on an out route at the Green Bay 31, making CB Gareon Conley miss on his tackle attempt right after the catch before taking it down the sideline for a 74-yard TD, the longest reception of his career.

►**At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Appeared on 14 plays on offense and 15 on special teams...Led the team with a season-high three tackles on special teams.

#### **22 Dexter Williams, RB, Rookie, Notre Dame**

- Led Notre Dame in rushing as a senior in 2018 with a career-high 995 yards on 158 carries (6.3 avg.), an average of 110.6 rushing yards per game.

- Also paced the Fighting Irish in rushing touchdowns with 12 in just nine games, the most by a Notre Dame RB since Jonas Gray posted the same number in 11 games in 2011. Registered a 97-yard TD run at Virginia Tech last season, the second-longest run in school history.

- Posted four games with 140-plus rushing yards in '18, highlighted by his career-high 202-yard output vs. Florida State.

- Was one of only eight FBS players in 2018 to average at least 6.3 yards per attempt (min. 150 carries) with 12-plus rushing TDs.

- Posted 95 rushing yards and 61 receiving yards at the N.Y. Jets last season in Week 16, becoming just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota; RB Dorsey Levens, Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis).

- Rushed for a team-high 556 yards in 2017, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four touchdowns on 153 carries (3.6 avg.). Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie RB since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.

- After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11 as a rookie, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.

**2019 SEASON:** Has played in seven games with one start and has rushed for 218 yards on 50 carries (4.4 avg.)...Has posted 19 receptions for 127 yards (6.7 avg.) and a career-high four TDs (leads the team)...Ranks No. 2 in the league among RBs in receiving TDs behind only Chargers RB Austin Ekeler (five)...Has added two tackles on special teams...Was inactive for one contest (concussion).

►**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Played 26 snaps on offense and carried the ball five times for 0 yards (0.0 avg.)...Added a pair of receptions for 15 yards (7.5 avg.).

►**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 15):** Appeared on 35 plays on offense and rushed for 28 yards on nine attempts (3.1 avg.)...Added three catches for 13 yards (4.3 avg.) and a TD...Capped off Green Bay's opening drive with a 15-yard TD reception on a screen pass from QB Aaron Rodgers.

►**Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14):** Returned to action and paced the team with 104 rushing yards on just 14 carries (7.4 avg.), the fewest attempts by a Green Bay player in a 100-yard rushing game since RB James Starks (10-112) vs. San Diego on Oct. 18, 2015...Posted a career-long 45-yard run in the second quarter, Green Bay's longest carry of the season, as he took it up the middle and made a cut to make S Tavon Wilson miss on his way to the Detroit 10 to help set up a 37-yard Mason Crosby FG just before halftime...Added four receptions for 32 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 5 yards out as he came in motion and took the pass from QB Aaron Rodgers out of the shotgun midway through the second quarter...His 136 yards from scrimmage was the second-highest single-game output of his career behind only his 156-yard effort at the N.Y. Jets in Week 16 last season.

►**Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20):** Was tied for the team lead with four receptions for 26 yards (6.5 avg.) and a TD, scoring from 2 yards out on a pass in the flat from Rodgers late in the first half for his career-high third TD catch of the season...Became the first Green Bay RB to register a TD reception in back-to-back games since James Starks in 2016 (Weeks 10-11)...Rushed three times for 5 yards (1.7 avg.).

►**At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Rushed for 22 yards and a TD on seven carries (3.1 avg.) and added three catches for 14 yards (4.7 avg.) and a score, his third career game with a rushing TD/receiving TD (two in 2017)...Late in the first quarter, took the shotgun handoff from Rodgers for a 1-yard TD run up the middle...Early in the fourth quarter on third-and-1 from the Kansas City 3, initially came across the middle before circling to

the back corner of the end zone to make a diving TD catch with LB Ben Niemann in coverage.

#### **47 Tim Williams, LB, 3rd Year, Alabama**

- Played in 19 games for the Baltimore Ravens from 2017-19, recording 16 tackles (12 solo), two sacks and two tackles on special teams.
- Was drafted by Baltimore in the third round (No. 78 overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft. Posted 19½ sacks and 28½ tackles for a loss in 30 games over his final two seasons at Alabama.

**2019 SEASON:** Has appeared in one game and has been inactive for three contests...Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore on Oct. 2...Played in the first four games of the season for the Ravens and registered two tackles (both solo) on defense.

► **At Dallas (Oct. 6):** Inactive (healthy scratch).

► **Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14):** Saw his first action in a Green Bay uniform, appearing on two plays on special teams.

► **Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20):** Inactive (healthy scratch).

► **At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Inactive (healthy scratch).

#### **38 Tramon Williams, CB, 13th Year, Louisiana Tech**

- Has appeared in 151 regular-season games for the Packers (2007-14, 2018), the fourth most among defensive backs in franchise history behind only LeRoy Butler (181), Willie Wood (166) and Mark Lee (157).
- Has 36 career interceptions (including playoffs), the second most among active NFL players (49ers CB Richard Sherman, 37).
- Returned to the Packers and started all 16 games in 2018 after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017).
- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.
- Was one of only two NFL players (CB Terence Newman) to register at least one interception each season from 2007-17.

**2019 SEASON:** Has played in all eight games with two starts and has posted 16 tackles (seven solo), a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and five passes defended.

► **Vs. Detroit (Oct. 14):** Appeared on 33 snaps and posted two tackles (one solo), a QB hit and a pass defended...With the Packers trailing, 22-20, made a diving breakup of QB Matthew Stafford's pass over the middle intended for TE T.J. Hockenson.

► **Vs. Oakland (Oct. 20):** Appeared on 37 plays on defense.

► **At Kansas City (Oct. 27):** Started as the third CB and played 53 of 59 snaps, posting two tackles (one solo).
