YEAR IN REVIEW

The Green Bay Packers finished the 2018 campaign with a 6-9-1 record, just the fourth losing season in Green Bay in the last 26 seasons.

- Six of the Packers' nine losses this season were by eight points or less, including three by three or fewer points.
- ► Green Bay began the season by coming back from 20 points down to beat the Chicago Bears, 24-23, in Week 1. It was the second-largest comeback win in team history at Lambeau Field (21 vs. New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989) and just the fifth time in franchise history that Green Bay posted a comeback win of 20-plus points.
- ▶ In Week 2, the Packers and Minnesota Vikings tied, 29-29, marking Green Bay's first tie game since Nov. 24, 2013, which was also against Minnesota at Lambeau Field (26-26). It marked just the third tie game between the two teams in the 58-year history of the series (1961-2018).
- ➤ After a loss at Washington in Week 3, the Packers beat the Buffalo Bills by registering their first shutout (22-0) since Oct. 31, 2010, at the N.Y. Jets (9-0) and the first shutout posted by the Packers at Lambeau Field since a 26-0 victory over Detroit on Oct. 18, 2009.
- An eight-point loss on the road against the Lions in Week 5 was followed by a 33-30 win over the San Francisco 49ers on *Monday Night Football*. K **Mason Crosby** made all four of his field goals (29, 39, 51, 27) and all three extra points, including a 27-yard FG as time expired that gave him a game-winning FG in each of the last three seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati).
- ►The Packers faced a stretch of four road games in five weeks after the Week 8 bye.
- A two-point loss at the Los Angeles Rams was followed by a primetime loss at the New England Patriots. In Green Bay's first home game in nearly four weeks, the Packers recorded a season-high 195 yards on 25 carries (7.8 avg.) and tied a season-high with six sacks to power them to a 31-12 victory over the Miami Dolphins.
- ► Green Bay lost at the Seattle Seahawks by three points in a Thursday night game that marked the Packers' third game in 12 days. Week 12 at Minnesota brought Green Bay a seven-point loss.
- After a three-point loss to the Arizona Cardinals at Lambeau Field, the Packers parted ways with Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** and offensive coordinator **Joe Philbin** was named interim head coach.
- ► Green Bay posted a season-high 34 points in Philbin's first game, beating the Atlanta Falcons by 14 points at home.
- ► Rodgers' streak of consecutive attempts without an INT ended at 402 in a Week 15 loss at Chicago. He had surpassed Patriots QB Tom Brady (358 in 2010-11) for the longest streak in NFL history.
- Green Bay rebounded in Week 16 as Rodgers completed 37 of 55 pass attempts (67.3 percent) for 442 yards with two touchdowns and zero interceptions for a 103.8 passer rating and had two rushing TDs in the Packers' 44-38 overtime win at the New York Jets. Rodgers is the **only player in NFL history** with at least 400 passing yards, two passing touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns in a game. He also previously accomplished the feat on October 2, 2011, vs. Denver (408 passing yards, four touchdown passes and two rushing touchdowns).

2018 SEASON REVIEW

- ▶In Week 16, Green Bay came back from 15 points down in the fourth quarter to defeat the Jets. It marked the first time in team history that the Packers had come from 15-plus points down in the fourth quarter in two games in a season (Week 1 vs. Chicago), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ►Green Bay totaled 35 first downs in Week 16, the **second most in a** game in franchise history behind only the 37 at Philadelphia on Nov. 11, 1962.
- ►The Packers would lose the season finale against the Lions and finish 2-2 under Philbin.
- ► The Packers finished **No. 2 in the league in 2018** with 15 giveaways (Seattle, 11), marking the third fewest in a season in team history (13 in 2014 and 14 in 2011).
- ▶Green Bay has four passes intercepted in 2018, a franchise record and the second fewest in NFL history behind the 2016 New England Patriots (two).

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- ►WR Davante Adams played in 15 games during the 2018 season, but registered 111 receptions, the second-highest single-season total in franchise history, trailing WR Sterling Sharpe (112 in 1993).
- ►Adams recorded 1,386 receiving yards in 2018, the sixth most in a season in franchise history and 133 yards shy of the franchise record of 1,519 yards that was set by WR Jordy Nelson in 2014.

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field and it continued during the 2018 season with a 5-2-1 record.

- ► Green Bay has 226 victories at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ► With the win over the Chicago Bears in Week 1, Green Bay has won six straight home openers (2013-18).
- ► Since 2007, Green Bay is 71-23-2 at home during the regular season. The Packers' .750 winning percentage ranks in the top five in the NFL over that span:

- ▶The Packers 26.0 sacks at home were the most by the team in a single season since recording 31.0 sacks at home in 2002.
- ▶ QB Aaron Rodgers has started 78 home games during the regular season for Green Bay, with the Packers holding a 61-16-1 record in those contests. He has completed 1,750 of 2,641 passes (66.3 pct.) for 21,104 yards (270.6 per game), 181 touchdowns, 33 interceptions and a passer rating of 108.2.
- ► Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** since 1970 in passer rating at home (min. 500 pass att.) as a starter (Sportradar):

ADAMS' ADMIRABLE SEASON

WR **Davante Adams** reached 100 receptions (111) and 1,000 yards (1,386) for the first time in his career in 2018 and earned a trip to his second consecutive Pro Bowl.

- ►Adams recorded 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games (Weeks 5-6, 8), joining WR James Lofton (1984) as the **only players** in **franchise history** to do so, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ Dating back to 2017 (Weeks 14-15, Weeks 1-6 and 8-9 in 2018), Adams recorded five-plus receptions in 10 consecutive games to rank **No. 3** in team history, trailing Sharpe, who recorded 18 consecutive games in 1993-94 and 13 straight games in 1992-93, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ►Adams became the **first player in franchise history** to record fiveplus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season (2018).
- Adams was the first Packer since WR Greg Jennings (2010) with three straight games with 100-plus receiving yards (Weeks 5-6, 8). Adams finished one short of the franchise record held by Lofton (four in 1982-83) and Hutson (four in 1945).
- ►Adams had a career-best three 10-plus-reception games this season (tied for No. 4 in the NFL) and now has seven career games with 10-plus catches, tied for No. 1 in team history:

- ►In Week 5, Adams extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his 10th straight road game, and tied the longest streak in NFL history (Eagles WR Tommy McDonald, 10, 1959-61).
- ▶ Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in each of the first three contests, which extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to the 2017 season. He had six TD catches during the streak. It was the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It was also the longest streak by a Packer player since WR Randall Cobb's streak of six games in 2014.



ASCENDING ADAMS

WR **Davante Adams** has continued to get better as his career has gone on. He is the **only player in the NFL** to record 70-plus receptions, 850-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in a each of the past three seasons (2016-18), earning Pro Bowl honors in each of the last two seasons.

- With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each season since 2016 (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 13 in 2018), Adams joined Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.
- ► Adams joined Steelers WR Antonio Brown as the only players in the league to record two seasons with 12-plus receiving TDs since 2016.
- ►Adams is the **only player in the NFL** to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).

▶The Packers finished the 2018 season with 1,667 rushing yards on 333 attempts, an average of 5.01 yards per carry that ranked No. 2 for a single season in franchise history and in the NFL for the 2018 season:

- ▶ From 2016-18, the Packers **led the NFL** in rushing average (4.66).
- ► Green Bay **tied for No. 7 in the NFL** in 2018 in games with 95-plus rushing yards (11). It was the most by the Packers since 2014 (11) and only the ninth time in the last 30 seasons (1989-2018) that Green Bay recorded 11-plus games with 95-plus rushing yards in a season.
- ► Green Bay had seven 100-yard rushing games during the 2018 season as a team on 25 or fewer attempts, the most in a season in team history. It is also tied for the most by an NFL team in a season since the merger (2018 Miami Dolphins and the 1995 Detroit Lions).
- ▶The Packers recorded four straight 100-yard rushing games as a team on 25 or fewer carries (Week 6, Weeks 8-10), the **longest streak in franchise history** and in the league this season (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ► The Packers ranked **No. 2 in the NFL** in percentage of rushing plays that gained 10-plus yards during the 2018 season (Sportradar):

- ▶ Dating back to 1991, it was the highest percentage of rushing plays that gained 10-plus yards in a single-season by the Packers (Sportradar).
- ▶In Week 16, RB **Jamaal Williams** rushed for 95 yards on 15 carries (6.3 avg.) with a TD and caught six passes for 61 yards (10.2 avg.), becoming the first Packer since RB Dorsey Levens (Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis) to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game and only the third Packer since the merger (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota).
- ► Green Bay posted a season-high 195 rushing yards on 25 carries (7.8 avg.) in Week 10, just the third time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers recorded 195-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer carries (at St. Louis Cardinals, Sept. 29, 1985; at Chicago, Dec. 18, 2016).
- ►The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3 at Washington, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).

JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

▶RB Aaron Jones put together an impressive 2018 season before an injury landed him on injured reserve after Week 15. He finished No. 1 in the NFL in rushing average (min. 100 att.) for the 2018 season, becoming the first Packer to lead the league in the category since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978:

- ▶ Dating back to 1991, Jones recorded the highest percentage of rushing plays that gained 10-plus yards in a single-season by a Packer (min. 50 carries, Sportradar).
- ▶Jones posted at least one rushing TD in five straight games for the first time in his career in 2018 (Weeks 10-14). It was the longest streak by a Packer since RB Ahman Green's five-game streak in 2003-04 and was tied for the longest streak in the league in 2018 (Browns RB Nick Chubb).
- ▶In Weeks 8-10, Jones became the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote in 1951 to have 75-plus rushing yards on 15 or fewer attempts in three straight games.
- ▶Jones rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries (9.7 avg.) with a career-best two rushing TDs in Week 10 to become just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards in a game on 15 or fewer carries and the first to accomplish the feat since Green had 15 carries for 163 yards vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.
- ►In Week 10, Jones rushed for 96 yards on four carries (24.0 avg.) in the first quarter, the most rushing yards by a Packer in a first quarter since Green had 122 rushing yards vs. Detroit in the opening quarter on Sept. 9, 2001. Jones had 101 rushing yards in the first half, the most by a Packer since RB Ty Montgomery posted 123 yards on the ground in the first half at Chicago on Dec. 18, 2016.
- ► Jones had a career-high six runs of 10-plus yards in Week 10, the most by a Packer since Green had six at Minnesota on Nov. 2, 2003.



GOING DEEP

- ▶In Weeks 8 and 11 of the 2018 season, QB **Aaron Rodgers** tied his single-game career high by completing three passes of 40-plus yards. His 16 completions of 40-plus yards in 2018 were tied (2008) for the second most he has thrown in a single-season (17 in 2009).

- ► Green Bay's rookie class accounted for 50 starts this season, the most by the Packers since 2006 (66 starts).
- ▶The Packers had three rookies start 10-plus games during the 2018 season (CB Jaire Alexander, 11; WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, 10; CB Josh Jackson, 10). Green Bay was one of only five teams in the league to have at least three rookies start 10-plus games in 2018 (Oakland Raiders had four; Cleveland Browns, Indianapolis Colts and the New York Giants had three).
- ► For the first time since 2006 (five), the Packers had four or more rookies start six-plus games in 2018 (Alexander, 11; Valdes-Scantling, 10; Jackson, 10 and WR **Equanimeous St. Brown**, seven) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ► Valdes-Scantling averaged 15.3 yards per catch in 2018, the top mark posted by a Green Bay rookie (min. 25 rec.) since WR James Lofton's 17.8-vard average in 1978.
- ► Valdes-Scantling registered four receptions of 40-plus yards in 2018, tied for the most among NFL rookies (Falcons WR Calvin Ridley, Bills WR Robert Foster).

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers finished the 2018 season with just two INTs on 597 attempts, a 0.34 interception percentage that set an NFL single-season record among passing qualifiers (Chiefs QB Damon Huard, 0.41 in 2006, 244-1).
- ▶Rodgers' two INTs during the 2018 season were the **fewest in a** season in league history by a QB with 500-plus attempts, eclipsing the previous low of five held by Rodgers (2014), Vikings QB Sam Bradford (2016) and Chiefs QB Alex Smith (2017).
- ▶Rodgers also set the franchise record for the fewest INTs in a season (min. 200 att.), besting QB Bart Starr's mark of three INTs on 251 attempts in 1966.
- ► Rodgers' streak of consecutive attempts without an INT ended at 402 in Week 15 of 2018. He had surpassed Patriots QB Tom Brady (358 in 2010-11) for the longest streak in league history.
- ► Rodgers recorded nine straight zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) during the 2018 season (Weeks 5-6, 8-14) to tie for the second-longest streak in NFL history behind only Brady (11 games in 2010).
- ►In 2018, Rodgers did not throw an INT in 13 games, tied for the most (2014) in a season in team annals (min. 15 att.).
- ► Rodgers ranked **No. 1 in the NFL** in zero-INT games in 2018 (min. 15 att.):

- ► Four times Rodgers has had 10-plus zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) in a season (13 in 2018, 11 in 2016, 13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Bart Starr (10) in 1964.
- ► Week 13 was Rodgers' fourth game since 2015 with 50-plus pass attempts and zero INTs, the most in the NFL over that span. His four games of 50-plus pass attempts and no INTs are the only ones in team history.

- ► Green Bay has a 4-0-1 mark in its last five overtime games, the **most** overtime wins in the NFL from 2017-18 (six teams have two wins).
- ►The Packers played in two overtime games in 2018, tied for the second most in the NFL behind the Cleveland Browns' four contests.
- ►According to Sportradar, QB Aaron Rodgers recorded a 118.8 passer rating in overtime in 2018, tied with Oakland QB Derek Carr for the second-highest passer rating in the NFL (Dallas QB Dak Prescott, 151.6).
- ►In Week 16, Green Bay came back from 15 points down in the fourth quarter to defeat the Jets in overtime.
- ► The Week 2 game between the Packers and Vikings ended in a 29-29 tie, Green Bay's first tie game since Nov. 24, 2013, which was also against Minnesota at Lambeau Field (26-26).
- ►It marked just the third tie game between the two teams in the 58-year history of the series (1961-2018).
- ▶ At least one NFL game went to overtime in each of the first five weeks of the 2018 season, marking the first time that a season has featured at least one overtime game in each of its first five weeks.
- ▶ Green Bay won three games in overtime (Weeks 3, 13 and 14) during the 2017 season, the most by the Packers in a single season in franchise history. Green Bay's three overtime wins last season were tied for the second most in a season since the NFL added an OT period in 1974, trailing only the 2011 Arizona Cardinals (four wins).
- ►In 2017, the Packers registered overtime wins in back-to-back games (Weeks 13-14) for the first time in team history.
- ▶The Packers are 5-4-2 in regular-season OT games since 2007.

- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** ranked **No. 1 in the NFL** in second-half passing yards in 2018 (2,511).
- ► Green Bay finished 2018 ranked **No. 1 in the NFL** in rushing average (3.73) in the red zone (Sportradar).
- ► The Packers ranked **No. 3 in the NFL** in 2018 in rushing average on first down (5.14), according to Sportradar.
- ▶CB Bashaud Breeland posted his second career interception return for a TD in Week 14. He became the first Packer with an INT touchdown since CB Damarious Randall (21 yards) at Dallas on Oct. 8, 2017. Breeland also added a fumble recovery to become just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record an INT return for a TD and a fumble recovery in the same game (S Marques Anderson, at Detroit, Sept. 22, 2002; CB Charles Woodson, at Detroit, Nov. 26, 2009).
- ► Breeland posted a career-long 38-yard kickoff return in Week 17, the longest kickoff return by the Packers in 2018.
- ► The Packers did not allow a TD in Week 4 and Week 10 of 2018. The last time Green Bay had two-plus games in a season with no TDs allowed was 2010 (three games).
- ► Rodgers ranked in the top 10 of the NFL during the 2018 season in a few fourth-quarter passing categories (min. 50 pass att.):

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers finished the 2018 seasons with a 53-man roster that was composed of 28 offensive players, 22 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 25 of them (47.2 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay had six players that were drafted in the first round, including four that were selected by the Packers.
- ► Green Bay had 34 players on the roster that were draft picks (64.2 percent), including 16 players that were selected in the first three rounds (30.2 percent).
- ▶ Over 45 percent of the players (25 of 53, 47.2 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 42 of them (79.2 percent) were 28 years old or younger (as of Dec. 30) and 30 players (56.6 percent) were 24 years old or younger.
- The Packers had eight players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with five of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Randall Cobb, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 34 began their pro careers with the Packers (64.2 percent).
- ► Over half the roster consisted of players with experience ranging from rookie to three years (38 of 53, 71.7 percent)

- ►In 2018, Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs. Rodgers added 442 yards against the Jets in Week 16 to become the first QB in NFL history to have three games with 425-plus passing yards in a season.
- ►It was the seventh 400-yard passing game for Rodgers, a franchise record. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- ▶Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- ► Rodgers tied Manning for the **fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards**, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued in 2018. It was the first time in his career that he registered 25-plus touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions in a season (25/2). Dating back to 1920, he was the **third player in the NFL** with 25-plus TDs and two or fewer INTs in a single season (Tom Brady, 28/2 in 2016 and Nick Foles, 27/2 in 2013), according to pro-football-reference.com.

- ▶In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ► Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► Rodgers has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), the most in team history.
- ▶In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).
- ► Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history:

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started 25 games since the start of the 2017 season.

- ► Despite being placed on injured reserve following Week 16, Clark ranked No. 3 on the team in QB hits (seven) in 2018.
- ►After recording 4.5 sacks in 2017, Clark was second on the team with a career-high six sacks in 2018.
- ► Clark was **tied for No. 7 in the NFL** with two opponent fumble recoveries during the 2018 season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth guarter.
- ►In Week 8, Clark tied his career high with two sacks against the Rams. Dating back to 2016, he is **tied for No. 2 on the Packers** in multisack games (Perry, three), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ►In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ▶ The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- ► According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the **most** by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December in a single season (since 1982).

- ▶Green Bay ranked No. 7 in the NFL in sack yards (322) in 2018, which was the most by the Packers since 333 yards in 2010 (according to profootball-reference.com).
- ►The Packers were one of two teams (Minnesota Vikings) in the league to register two games during the 2018 season with 50-plus sack yards (64 vs. Buffalo in Week 4 / 50 vs. Miami in Week 10). It tied for the second most in a season in team history (three games in 1978) and it was the first time Green Bay had two games since 1998.

- ► Crosby has played in 192 straight games for the Packers, the **second** most all-time behind only QB Brett Favre (255).
- ▶ Crosby has been named NFC Special teams Player of the Week a teamrecord seven times in his career, including in 2018 after hitting a gamewinning field goal in Week 6.
- ▶ Crosby finished **No. 10 in the NFL** in scoring in 2018 with 124 points.
- ► Crosby hit five field goals of 50-plus yards in 2018, tied for No. 3 in the NFL (Baltimore Ravens K Justin Tucker) behind the six made by New York Jets K Jason Myers and and Dallas Cowoboys K Brett Maher.
- ► Crosby has recorded a game-winning field goal in each of the last three seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati, 2018 vs. San Francisco).
- ▶In Week 4 of 2018, Crosby hit two 52-yard field goals, joining Ryan Longwell (at Atlanta, Nov. 13, 2005) as the only Packers to make two 50-plus-yard field goals in a regular-season game. It was the first time two field goals of 50-plus yards had been made by a kicker at Lambeau Field. Crosby had previously connected on two 50-plus field goals (56, 51) in the 2016 NFC Divisional Playoff win at Dallas.
- ► Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 of the 2018 season (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- ► Crosby passed Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶ Dating back to 2006, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, Green Bay is one of only seven NFL teams to have a regularseason road record above .500.

342 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Detroit Lions in Week 17 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 342 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field hosted its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

► Has played in 76 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but three of his 47 starts (LT in Week 4-5 of 2017, RG in Week 13 of 2015) taking place at LG.

► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David

► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C Corey Linsley, 5th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

► Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was the only Packers offensive lineman to start every game during the 2017 and 2018 season.

► Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games of the 2016 season.

► Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.

► Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

▶Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Lucas Patrick, 2nd Year, Duke, FA-16

▶ Played in 14 games with four starts in 2018 (LG in Weeks 14, 17 and RG in Weeks 15-16).

►After spending the entire 2016 season on Green Bay's practice sqaud, appeared in 12 games with two starts in 2017 (LG in Week 4 and RG in Week 17)

▶ Originally signed by the Packers as an undrafted free agent out of Duke in 2016 after participating in Green Bay's rookie orientation camp on a tryout basis.

▶ Appeared in 44 career games with 26 starts at Duke, closing out his career with 21 consecutive starts at left guard.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

► Has played in 99 career regular-season games with 95 starts at right tackle.

Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season.

►Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury

vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.

▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.

Named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.

Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18

Among NFL tight ends (min. 40 rec.), ranked No. 7 in yards per reception (11.6) in 2018, according to Sportradar. His 636 receiving yards were the most by a Packer TE since Jermichael Finley in 2012 (667).
 ► His 71 career touchdowns rank No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends.
 ► Last season, led NFL tight ends with 10 receiving TDs, which marked his fourth season, with 10 plus toughdown reportions to the Antonio Catalogue.

fourth season with 10-plus touchdown receptions to tie Antonio Gates for the second most 10-touchdown-catch seasons among tight ends (Rob Gronkowski, five). ► Has been selected to the Pro Bowl five times in his career (2011, 2013,

2014, 2016, 2017) and was named first-team All-Pro by The Associated

Press in 2013.

▶ Is the only tight end in NFL history to have two seasons with 1,200-plus

receiving yards and 10-plus receiving TDs (2011, 2013).

From 2015-17, he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a third-round pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

▶ Earned a trip to his second straight Pro Bowl in 2018 after recording the second-most receptions (111) in franchise history behind WR Sterling Sharpe (112 in 1993)

▶Is the only player in the NFL to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).

With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (12 in 2016 and 2018, and 10 in 2017), he joined Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.

► Registered the third-most receptions (314) and tied for the third-most receiving touchdowns (36) by a Green Bay player in their first five seasons (2014-18) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74

receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).

WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, Rookie, South Florida, D5c-18

► Averaged 15.3 yards per catch in 2018, the top mark posted by a Green Bay rookie (min. 25 rec.) since WR James Lofton's 17.8-yard average in 1978.

▶ In Week 8 at New England, totaled 101 yards on three receptions (33.7 avg.), becoming the first Packer since Max McGee (1959) to have two 100-yard receiving games in a season on three or fewer receptions

▶ Posted an average of 17.3 yards per catch on his 75 receptions at USF, the top mark in school history (min. 70 receptions)

▶ Played first two seasons at North Carolina State (2013-14), posting 44 receptions for 538 yards (12.2 avg.) and a TD before transfering to USF, where he played two seasons (2016-17).

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

► His career passer rating of 103.1 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.

In 158 regular-season starts (100-57-1 record), has posted 56 games with 300-plus passing yards, 98 without an interception and 87 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).

► Earned his seventh selection to the Pro Bowl in 2018, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38)

▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the

third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.

▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from The Associated Préss.

RB Jamaal Williams, 2nd Year, Brigham Young, D4b-17

▶ Recorded a career-high 156 scrimmage yards on 21 touches (7.4 avg.) with a touchdown in Week 16 at the New York Jets.

▶Played in 16 games with eight starts and ranked No. 2 on the team with 464 rushing yards in 2018.

►After playing as a reserve in the first nine games of the 2017 season, started the last seven and finished the season with a team-high 556 yards rushing and six total touchdowns (four rushing, two receiving).

► Finished No. 6 among rookie running backs in rushing yards in 2017.

► Became the first Green Bay rookie to have three consecutive games with 115-plus yards from scrimmage (Weeks 12-14) since Billy Howton in

DE Dean Lowry, 3rd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16

- Started eight games in 2018, including each of the last six.
- ► Was tied for No. 3 on the team with 14 QB pressures in 2018.
- ► Made first career start in the 2017 season-opening win over Seattle and went on to start at total of 11 games while playing in all 16 last season.
- ► Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.
- ► Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13 vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.
- ▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern.
- ► Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.

NT Tyler Lancaster, Rookie, Northwestern, FA-18

- ► Played in 12 games with five starts in 2018, each coming in the last six weeks of the season.
- ▶ Recorded a team-best 10 tackles (six solo) in Week 15 at Chicago.
- Spent the first four weeks of the season on the Packers' practice squad before being promoted to the active roster on Oct. 6.
- ► Signed as an undrafted free agent by Green Bay on May 4, 2018.
- ►Was a team captain as a senior, earning honorable mention All-Big Ten for a defense that ranked No. 9 in the NCAA in rushing defense.
- ▶Played in 40 games with 39 starts over four seasons for Northwestern, racking up 101 tackles (46 solo), 18.5 tackles for a loss, 3.5 sacks and two forced fumbles.

DE Montravius Adams, 2nd Year, Auburn, D3-17

- ▶Played in all 16 games in 2018 and made his first career start in Week 16 at the New York Jets.
- ►After a foot injury sidelined him for most of training camp and the first two regular season games as a rookie (2017), he saw action in seven games, recording five tackles (one solo) and a quarterback hit.
- ▶ Played in 52 career games for Auburn, starting 26 consecutive contests to end his career.
- ► Earned first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors from *The Associated Press* and second-team All-America honors from *AP*, the American Football Coaches Association and CBS Sports as a senior in 2016.

OLB Clay Matthews, 10th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ► Led the team in QB pressures (19) and QB hits (nine) in 2018.
- ► With 83.5 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history. Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2017 despite missing two games.
- ▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- ► For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).
- ► Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ► With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ► Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Blake Martinez, 3rd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

- ► Led the Packers in total tackles (147) and solo tackles (103) in 2018 for the second straight season.
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 on the Packers with 158 total tackles (107 solo) during the 2017 season. Dating back to 1975, it was the 14th time and first time since A.J. Hawk (153) in 2013 that a Green Bay player reached 150 tackles in a season.
- ► Registered 10-plus tackles in seven games in 2017 (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit, 17 at Pittsburgh, 10 vs. Tampa bay).
- ► Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ► Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

ILB Antonio Morrison, 3rd Year, Florida, FA-18

- ▶ Played in all 16 games with eight starts in 2018.
- ► Acquired by the Packers in a trade with the Indianapolis Colts on Aug. 26, 2018, in exchange for CB Lenzy Pipkins.
- Originally selected by the Colts in the fourth round (No. 125 overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft out of the University of Florida.
- ▶ In two seasons with Indianapolis, played in 31 games with 19 starts and registered 154 tackles (91 solo), six tackles for a loss and a pass defensed. Started all 15 games he played in at inside linebacker last season and led the team with a career-high 108 tackles (64 solo).

OLB Kyler Fackrell, 3rd Year, Utah State, D3-16

- ► After tying for No. 2 on the team with 20 QB pressures in 2017, led the Packers with 10.5 sacks in 2018.
- According to Sportradar, ranked No. 6 among NFL linebackers in sacks in 2018.
- ►Is tied for the fifth-most three-sack games (two) in franchise history (since 1982), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Became one of just 15 players in school history to earn first-team or second-team all-conference recognition three times during his career (2012-13, 2015).
- ▶ Entered college as a walk-on in 2011 before a scholarship opened up in the fall.

CB Jaire Alexander, Rookie, Louisville, D1-18

- ▶ Played in 14 games with 11 starts in 2018, ranking No. 1 on the team with 15 passes defensed.
- ▶ Registered five passes defensed against the Los Angeles Rams in Week 8, the most by a Green Bay defender this season.
- Was just the third Louisville defensive back in school history to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.
- ▶Played in 31 games with 19 starts during his three seasons with the Cardinals, earning second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016.

CB Josh Jackson, Rookie, Iowa, D2-18

- ► In 2018, played in all 16 games with 10 starts.
- Finished No. 2 on the team with 13 passes defensed in 2018.
- ► Set career highs as a junior at lowa in games started (13), passes defensed (26, No. 1 in the nation) and interceptions (eight, No. 1 in the nation and tied a school record).
- Named a permanent team captain on the lowa defense in 2017 and was a consensus first-team All-American as well as first-team All-Big Ten by the league's coaches and media.

S Tramon Williams, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-18

- ▶ After starting the first seven games of the 2018 season at CB, started at S in each of the final nine games.
- ► Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- ► Is the only active player in the NFL with at least one INT in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).
- ▶ Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.
- ► Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

S Josh Jones, 2nd Year, North Carolina State, D2b-17

- ► Started five of the last seven games in the 2018 season and finished No. 6 on the team with 60 tackles.
- ►Led the team with a career-high 12 tackles (eight solo) in Week 16.
- ► Was one of three Green Bay rookies to play in all 16 games in 2017 (RB Jamaal Williams and P Justin Vogel).
- ► Started seven contests as a rookie and posted 71 tackles (64 solo), five tackles for a loss, two sacks, three QB pressures, two QB hits, an interception and seven passes defensed in 2017.
- ►Tied for No. 2 on the team with six special teams tackles as a rookie.
- Started 32 of 38 games played in three seasons at North Carolina State, finishing each season in the top five on the team in tackles (No. 5 in 2014, No. 3 in 2015 and No. 1 in 2016).

GREEN BAY. Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers heard the applause after walking out of the stadium tunnel and back on to the field.

The team doctor had checked out his left knee after the Green Bay Packers quarterback was carted off the field in the second quarter. Rodgers, it seemed, had avoided a major injury, He was good to go. The adrenafine kicked in.

The hobbling two-time NEL MyP threw three touchdown passes in the second half after returning from injury, and the Green Bay Packers overcame a 20-point deficit for a thrilling 24-23 win over the Chicago Bears on Sunday night.

Rodgers connected with receiver Randali Cobb for a catch-and-run through the secondary for a 75-yard touchdown and the go-ahead score with 2:13 left in the game.

Nick Perry sacked the Bears' Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 58 seconds to complete the comeback.

Against the archival Bears. To start the Packers' 100th season.

Sunday marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

The Packers posted the second-largest comeback in franchise history at Lambeau Field, behind only a rally from 21 points down to beat New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989.

For Rodgers, this was special. And especially because how awful the Packers played in the first half.

A Chicago defense featuring newly acquired star linebacker Khalil Mack dominated until the third quarter. Mack had a 27-yard interception return or a touchdown against backup quarterback beShone Kizer in the second quarter.

A gimpy Rodgers returned in the second half and finally figured out the Bears. He also found Davante Adams and Geronimo Allison for touchdown passes. He finished 20 of 30 for 286 yards, including 17 of 23 for 273 yards in the second half.

It was Rodgers' first regular-season home game since Sept. 28 against the Bears. He was limited to seven games in 2017 because of a collarbone

injury.

Mack nearly stole the show. He also stripped the ball for a turnover in the red zone off Kizer in the second quarter. Mack made an immediate impact in his first game since the Bears acquired the premier pass rusher in a blockbuster deal with the Oakland Raiders.

The Bears led 20-0 at one point and their defense dominated until the second half. Then Rodgers returned, and the Packers' defense held the

Bears in check.

Trubisky was 23 of 35 for 171 yards. He also ran for 32 yards on seven carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

SEATTLE (AP) Rodgers and the Seahawks y beginning, Russell Wilson got hot in the fourth quarter, Bobby Wagner and Seattle's defense stymied stayed in the middle of the NFC playoff race.

Wilson three for 225 yards, and his 15-yard to uchdown pass to Ed Dickson with 5:08 left was the difference in the Seahawks' 27-24 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Thursday night.

In a key matchup in the battle for the two NFC wild-card spots, Seattle (5-5) snapped a two-game losing streak by overcoming an early 14-3 deficit. Wilson was inconsistent at times early, but was outstanding in the fourth quarter, capping the winning drive by recognizing a biltiz and hitting Dickson quickly for his second TD pass of the night.

Seattle still has not lost three straight games since the middle of the 2011 season, and the Seahawks finally closed out a one-score victory after consecutive close losses to the Chargers and Rams. Seattle was 1-8 in its previous nine games decided by one score. Rodgers had a huge first half and threw for 332 yards, but the Packers (4-5-1) had just one scoring drive in the second half, helped by a 57-yard strike from Rodgers to Davante Adams. Rodgers threw a pair of touchdown passes in the first half, but never got the ball back after Green Bay punted with 420 left. Seattle got first-down runs from Wilson and Mike Davis and finished the game kneeling three times. Chris Carson rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown, overcoming the mistake of fumbling on the first play of the game and setting up green Bay's opening score. Tyler Lockett had two key receptions late in the fourth quarter and Doug Baldwin had his first 1D catch of the season for Seattle.

season for Seattle.

Rodgers was 21-of-30 passing with 10 of those going to Adams for 166 yards receiving. Backup tight end Robert Tonyan had the first catch of his career go for a 54-yard touchdown to give Green Bay an early 14-3 lead. The Packers led 21-17 at halftime after Aaron Jones caught a 24-yard TD pass from Rodgers in the final minute of the half, but Green Bay's offense was stymied in the second half.

Jones finished with 40 yards rushing after going for a career-high 14-5 a week ago. Rodgers was sacked five times, four of those in the second half. The Packers gained just 14-14 yards in the second half. half coming on the one throw from Rodgers to Adams. That pass set up Mason Crosby's 36-yard field goal with 8:23 left to give Green Bay a 24-20 lead.

Wilson had one more answer. Wilson hit Lockett on consecutive plays for 18 yards — to convert a third-down — and 34 yards to the Green Bay 16. Two plays later, facing another third-and-long, Wilson recognized the biltz and hit Dickson quickly over the middle to put Seattle in front.

That proved to be enough. On Green Bay's next drive, Rodgers short-hopped a pass on third-and-2. Rather than going for it on fourth down, Green Bay punted and never got the ball back.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — A tough week for the Green Bay Packers ended with a sorely needed win that relied on a familiar formula. They beat a warm-weather team on a chilly afternoon at Lambeau Field by building a hig lead and winning the turnover margin.

Aaron Rodgars threw two touchdown passes and set an NLT record for interception-free football, and the Packers beat the Atlanta Falcons, 34-20, on Sunday to win their first game under interim head coach doe Philbin.

Aaron Jones ran for a 29-yard score in the third quarter. The defense forced two turnovers — their first takeaways in three games — and limited quarterback Matt Ryan after a game-opening touchdown drive to hand Atlanta its rifth straight loss and guarantee the Falcons at losing record for the first time since 2014.

The Packers (5-7-1) regained some swagger with Philbin taking over for the fired Mike McCarthy. They've still got work to do to avoid a losing record, but at least Grene Bay snapped a three-game losing strack, in return, the team gave the game ball to Philbin.

Randall Cobb caught a 24-yard touchdown pass with 1244 left in the third quarter to make it 27-7. That pass also turned out to be momentous for other reasons for Rodgers, giving him 359 consecutive attempts without an interception to break the league record previously held by whew England's Tom Bradgers finished 21 of 32 for 196 yards and two scores. Linebacker Deion Jones had a couple chances to snap Rodgers' interception streak, but couldn't have not either time.

Atlanta drove to the 8 when the shotgun snap from center Alex Mack hit Mohaned Sanu's leg while the receiver was in motion. Bashaud Breeland recovered. Ryan finished 28 of 42 for 262 yards and three scores, connecting with Justin Hardy for a 19-yard touchdown with 14 seconds left. Ryan also tossed a 22-yard interception returned for a score by Breeland in the second quarter.

Ryan was outplayed by Rodgers, who also hurt Atlanta on the ground with trademark scrambles. A scrum broke out in the second quarter after cornerback Bran Poole hit Rodgers as the quarterback sit (mear the end of a 21-yard run to the Atlanta 27.

Pushing and showing ensued, with Delon Jones and Packers center Corey Linsley each whistled for offsetting personal fouls. After a sack, the Packers still got 48-yard field goal as time expired to take a 13-point halftime lead.

Rodgers was sacked four firmes, but all four hits came in the first half. Overall, it turned into a good day for the line, even with left guard Lane Taylor (foot), right guard Byron Bell (knee) and right tackle Bryan Bulaga (knee/Illness) out with injuries.

The Chicago Bears clinched the NFC North and helped knock Aaron Rodgers and the Green Bay Packers out of

playoff contention.

That forced the Bears to settle for a field goal by Cody Parkey, making it 24-14 with 6:43 remaining.

The Packers then drove to the 9, but on third down, Jackson picked off Rodgers, ending his streak at 402 passes. The throw over the middle was intended for Jimmy Graham near the goal line, but the ball got tipped to Jackson, an interim basis.

Mason Crosby kicked a field goal in the closing seconds to make it a seven-point game. But Chicago recovered the onside kick. The Packers are 1-1 since offensive coordinator Joe Philbin replaced fired coach Mike McCarthy on an interim basis.

Khalil Mack had 2½ sacks and Leonard Floyd added two. Trubisky was 20 of 28 for 235 yards with a 120.4 rating. Cohen caught a touchdown pass. Jordan Howard ran for a TD, and the Bears improved to 7-1 at home for the first time since 2005.

Rodgers said his groin tightened on him at the end of the first half. He finished 25 of 42 for 274 yards with his second interception of the season and failed to throw a touchdown for the first time this year.

Davante Adams had elight receptions for 119 yards.

- Has 35 receiving touchdowns since 2016, No. 2 in the league (Steelers WR Antonio Brown, 36) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 28 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Is the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.
- Is the lone player in the NFL to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons. Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.
- Leads the league with 26 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016, seven more than any other player.
- Has posted seven games in his career with 10-plus catches, tied with Sharpe and WR Donald Driver for the most in team history.
- Has posted 348 catches since entering the league in 2014, the second most in franchise history by a player in his first five NFL seasons behind only Sharpe (389). His 39 career receiving TDs are the third most in team annals by a player in his first five seasons in the league behind only WRs Antonio Freeman (42) and Greg Jennings (40).

- Is the all-time franchise leader in field goals (307), 50-yard field goals (34) and extra points (548).

- Has not missed a game in his career, playing in 192 straight contests in the regular season, the second-longest streak in franchise history (QB Brett Favre, 255).
- Registered a franchise-record 10 straight 100-point seasons (2007-16), one of only three players in NFL history to register 100-plus points in 10-plus consecutive seasons (Jason Elam, 16, 1993-2008; Adam Vinatieri, 13, 1996-2008). Has registered a team-record 11 seasons with 100-plus points.
- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (2010-11), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.

2018 SEASON: Played in all 16 games and connected on 30 of 37 field goals (81.1 percent) and 34 of 36 extra points, ranking No. 10 in the league in scoring with 124 points...Posted 41 touchbacks on 80 kickoffs (51.3 pct.) and a tackle on special teams.

- In 2017, started all 14 games he appeared in and registered a career-high 72 tackles (42 solo), 11 tackles for a loss (tied for No. 2 on the team), five sacks (No. 3 on the team), a forced fumble, 14 QB hits (No. 3 on the team) and seven QB pressures.

- Ranks No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends with 71 career TD catches and ranks No. 4 in the league in TD receptions among all players since entering the NFL in 2010.
- Has been selected to five career Pro Bowls (2011, 2013-14, 2016-17) and earned first-team All-Pro honors from The Associated Press in 2013.
- Has posted four seasons with 10-plus TD catches, tied for No. 2 in league annals among TEs behind only Patriots TE Rob Gronkowski (five).
- Is one of only four tight ends in the league (Chiefs TE Travis Kelce, Eagles TE Zach Ertz, Vikings TE Kyle Rudolph) to have 55-plus receptions each of the last three seasons (2016-18).
- **2018 SEASON:** Played in all 16 games with 12 starts and ranked No. 2 on the team with 55 receptions for 636 yards (11.6 avg.) and two TDs... Was tied for No. 2 on the team in receptions of 20-plus yards with seven... Among TEs, ranked No. 9 in the league in receiving yards and receptions and No. 10 in yards per catch...His 636 receiving yards were the most by a Green Bay TE since Jermichael Finley's 667 yards in 2012.

- His seven career postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind LB Clay Matthews (11) and DE Reggie White (eight). Since entering the league in 2012, ranks No. 1 in the NFL with seven sacks in the playoffs over that span.

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 14th Year, California

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.1), interception percentage (1.46) and TD/INT ratio (4.20, 338/80).
- Has posted seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (four), Redskins QB Alex Smith (two), Falcons QB Matt Ryan (two) and nine QBs (one).
- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.

- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), the second most in league history behind only Saints QB Drew Brees (eight).
- Is one of only three QBs in NFL annals with 40,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).
- In 158 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 56 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 5 in the NFL over that span), 95 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 86 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in seven of the last 10 seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16, 2018).
- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and five of the top seven for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016, 2018).

2018 SEASON: Started all 16 games and completed 372 of 597 passes (62.3 percent) for 4,442 yards and 25 TDs with two INTs for a 97.6 passer rating...Was selected to his seventh career Pro Bowl...Set an NFL singleseason record with his interception percentage of 0.34, eclipsing the previous mark held by Chiefs QB Damon Huard (0.41 in 2006)...His two INTs on the season were the fewest in league history among QBs with 500-plus attempts, besting the mark of five by him (2014), Vikings QB Sam Bradford (2016) and Smith (2017)...Also set the franchise mark for fewest INTs in a season (min. 200 att.) as he topped QB Bart Starr's record of three INTs on 251 attempts in 1966...Became just the third QB in NFL history with 25-plus passing TDs and two or fewer INTs in a season (Eagles QB Nick Foles, 27/2 in 2013; Brady, 28/2 in 2016)...His 372 completions tied him for the second-best mark (QB Brett Favre, 2005) in team history behind only his own mark of 401 completions in 2016...Led the NFL with 13 zero-INT games (min. 15 att.), tied for the most in a season in franchise history with his mark in 2014...Ranked No. 6 in the league in passing yards...His passing-vardage total ranks No. 3 in team history behind only his 4,643 yards in 2011 and QB Lynn Dickey's 4,458 yards in 1983...Led the league with nine completions of 50-plus vards and was tied for the league lead with 16 completions of 40-plus yards...Completed a pass of 50-plus yards to seven different players on the season, a franchise record...Became the first QB in NFL history to post three games with 425-plus passing yards in a season...Ranked No. 2 in the league with 1,249 yards passing on third down...Added 269 rushing yards on 43 carries (6.3 avg.)...Rushed for 20 first downs on his 43 carries, a 46.5 percentage that ranked No. 2 in the NFL among players with 40-plus attempts...Posted 10 runs of 10-plus yards, good for No. 3 on the team.

▶Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Completed 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating as he led the Packers to the second-largest comeback win in Lambeau Field history after Green Bay trailed 20-0 late in the third quarter... It marked the first time in team annals that the Packers won a game after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter...It marked his sixth regular-season game since 2008 with a 125-plus rating against the Bears, the most in the league over that span, with no other QB posting more than one 125-plus game against Chicago...With just over nine minutes remaining in the second quarter, sustained a knee injury when he was sacked by DE Roy Robertson-Harris at the Green Bay 27...Was sidelined for the final three drives of the first half, but returned to action for the second half...Completed 17 of 23 passes for 273 yards and three TDs in the second half (152.7 rating), with all three of his TD passes coming in the fourth quarter, a career high...Early in the fourth quarter, connected with WR Geronimo Allison on a 39-yard TD pass, lofting the ball to Allison in the right corner of the end zone over CB Kyle Fuller...On the next drive, found WR Davante Adams for a 51-yard completion to the Chicago 24 and then connected with him again three plays later for a 12-yard TD pass...Led the offense to a third straight TD drive, with all three drives taking less than three minutes, threading the ball to WR Randall Cobb on a short pass over the middle as Cobb took it down the middle of the field for a game-winning 75-yard TD with 2:13 remaining...It marked his 10th TD pass of 75-plus yards since 2008.

▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Playing with a brace on his injured left knee, completed 30 of 42 passes (71.4 percent) for 281 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 97.4 rating...Also rushed three times for 8 yards (2.7 avg.), including a 7-yard run late in the first quarter on a third-and-7... Completed passes to eight different receivers, with three players recording 60-plus receiving yards for the second straight game (TE Jimmy Graham, 6-95; Adams, 8-64; Allison, 6-64).

▶At Washington (Sept. 23): Completed 27 of 44 passes (61.4 percent) for 265 yards and two TDs with no INTs for a 93.5 rating...Eclipsed 5,000 career passing attempts in the game, with his 319 career TD passes at the time of his 5,000th attempt setting an NFL mark (Johnny Unitas, 284) and his 78 INTs also setting a league record (Donovan McNabb, 107)...Connected with a wide-open Allison on a 64-yard TD pass down the middle of the field late in the first half, his 29th TD pass of 60-plus yards since 2008, the most in the NFL over that span...Found Adams on a slant for a 2-yard TD on the opening drive of the second half...Added two carries for 13 yards (6.5 avg.), including a 10-yard scramble to convert a third-and-3 on Green Bay's opening drive of the second half.

▶Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30): Connected on 22 of 40 passes (55.0 percent) for 298 yards and a TD with one INT...Was picked off for the first time on the season, snapping a streak of 150 consecutive attempts without an INT...Helped the offense convert on 11 of 19 third downs (57.9 pct.), with the 11 conversions the most by Green Bay since Oct. 27, 2013 (13 at Minnesota)...Rushed for 31 yards on five carries (6.2 avg.), highlighted by a 15-yard scramble late in the first half to convert a third-and-10 and help set up K Mason Crosby's 52-yard FG as time expired.

▶At Detroit (Oct. 7): Threw for 442 yards and three TDs on 32-of-52 passing for a 108.0 rating...It marked his fifth career 400-vard passing game, further extending his franchise record, and marked the second-best yardage output of his career behind only his 480-yard performance vs. Washington in 2013...Threw for 301 yards in the second half, the most in his career in a second half and the third most in either half in his career (335 yards vs. Washington in the first half in 2013, 315 vs. Chicago in the first half in 2014)...His 32 completions were a season high and his most since posting 33 at Atlanta last season in Week 2...Had six completions of 20-plus yards, the most he had posted since recording the same number vs. Minnesota (Week 16) in 2016...Went over the 40,000-yard passing mark for his career, making him the fastest QB to 40,000 passing yards/300 passing TDs in NFL history by doing it in his 154th career game (Peyton Manning and Dan Marino, 157 games)...Is tied for No. 4 in league history for games needed to reach 40,000 passing yards behind QBs Matt Ryan (151), Brees (152) and Dan Marino (153).

▶Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Became the first QB in team history to post back-to-back 400-yard passing games as he connected on 25 of 46 attempts for 425 yards and two TDs with no INTs for a 100.4 rating... Became the first QB in NFL history to register back-to-back 400-vard passing games with no interceptions...It marked his sixth career 400-vard game, with no other QB in team annals posting more than one 400-yard effort...Part of an offense that featured three 100-yard receivers (Adams, 132; Graham, 104; WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, 103) for just the second time in franchise history (Oct. 12, 1980, at Tampa Bay)...Completed two passes of 50-plus vards (60-varder to Valdes-Scantling and 54-varder to Graham), matching his career high...With the Packers trailing, 30-23, with three minutes remaining, led the offense on a four-play, 58-yard drive that took just 1:05 and was capped off with his 16-yard TD pass to Adams...After a CB Kevin King interception gave the offense the ball back with 1:07, led the offense on a 10-play, 81-yard drive that was capped off with Crosby's 27-yard game-winning FG as time expired...The final drive included a 21-yard scramble up the middle by Rodgers and back-to-back 19-yard completions to WR Equanimeous St. Brown and Adams down to the San Francisco 9 to set up Crosby's FG...lt marked his fifth straight game with 40-plus passing attempts, topping Don Majkowski (four-game streak in 1989) for the longest streak in team history.

▶At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Threw for 286 yards and a TD on 18-of-30 passing (60.0 pct.) with no INTs (102.9 rating), his third straight game with zero INTs...Matched his career best (six previous times) with three completions of 40-plus yards, including a 40-yard TD pass to Valdes-Scantling midway through the fourth quarter that gave the Packers a 27-26 lead...The pass to Valdes-Scantling capped Green Bay's second straight five-play, 75-yard TD drive, with both drives taking less than three minutes each.

▶At New England (Nov. 4): Connected on 24 of 43 passes (55.8 percent) for 259 yards and two TDs with no INTs for a 89.2 rating...With just under five minutes remaining in the first half, scrambled to his left on third-and-2 to buy time before finding Adams in the end zone for the TD... ▶ At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Completed 17 of 28 passes for 198 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 94.0 rating...Did not throw an INT for the seventh straight game (min. 15 att.), matching his streak of seven games in 2016 for the top mark in franchise history...Brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT to a career-high 286, the second-longest streak in franchise history (QB Bart Starr, 294 in 1964-65)...Brought his streak of consecutive TD passes without an INT against NFC North foes to 27, the second-longest streak of his career behind his streak of 28 TDs without an INT from 2013-15.

Arizona (Dec. 2): Connected on 31 of 50 attempts (62.0 percent) for 233 yards and a TD with no INTs for a 79.8 rating, his franchise-record eighth straight zero-INT game (min. 15 att.) as he surpassed his previous record of seven straight games in 2016...Brought his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT to 336, surpassing Starr's mark of 294 in 1964-65 for the top streak in franchise annals...Also moved into No. 2 in NFL history behind only Brady (358 in 2010-11)...Posted his fourth game since 2015 with 50-plus passing attempts and no INTs, the most in the league over that span...His four career games with 50-plus attempts/zero INTs are the only ones in franchise history.

▶Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Completed 21 of 32 passes (65.6 percent) for 196 yards and two TDs with no INTs, bringing his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT to an NFL-record 368 as he surpassed Brady's mark of 358 in 2010-11...Set the record on his 24-yard TD pass to Cobb in the third quarter...It marked his ninth consecutive zero-INT game (min. 15 att.), tied for the second-longest streak in NFL history behind only Brady (11 games in 2010)...Posted a season-high 154.9 passer rating on third down, completing 5 of 6 passes for 70 yards and a TD...Added 44 rushing yards on just three carries, an average of 14.7 yards per carry that was the best in his career (min. three att.)...Scrambled for gains of 16 and 21 yards on a drive late in the first half to help set up a 48-yard field goal from

Crosby as time expired...His rushing-yardage total was his most since his regular-season career-high 60-yard effort at Atlanta on Oct. 30, 2016.

▶At Chicago (Dec. 16): Completed 25 of 42 passes (59.5 percent) for 274 yards with an interception, snapping his NFL-record streak of 402 consecutive attempts without an INT...Was picked off on a pass over the middle on third-and-goal from the 9 late in the fourth quarter, with S Eddie Jackson intercepting the deflected ball in the end zone...The pick snapped his streak of 225 consecutive attempts without an INT in the red zone... Added 25 rushing yards on three carries (8.3 avg.).

Buffalo (Sept. 30): Made his first career start, opening as the third WR with Randall Cobb (hamstring) sidelined...Played 54 snaps and posted a 38-yard reception...With just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, beat CB Ryan Lewis down the right sideline to catch a deep pass from Rodgers to the Buffalo 28, helping to set up a 52-yard Mason Crosby field goal.

►At Detroit (Oct. 7): Started for the second straight week with Cobb (hamstring) and WR Geronimo Allison (concussion/hamstring) sidelined, appearing on 77 of 81 plays and posting a career-high seven receptions for 68 yards (9.7 avg.) and a TD...Early in the third quarter, posted his first TD catch as a pro, hauling in a 3-yard TD pass as he found himself wide open in the end zone with two defenders going to cover Adams.

▶Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Started his third straight game and appeared on 66 of 71 snaps...Posted a career-high 103 receiving yards on just three catches (34.3 avg.), becoming just the sixth Green Bay rookie since 1950 to register 100-plus receiving yards in a game on three or fewer catches (Howton, Max McGee, Lofton, Greg Jennings, James Jones)...On the Packers' first play from scrimmage, found himself wide open down the left sideline, hauling in a pass from Rodgers near midfield and taking it down the sideline to the San Francisco 17...Early in the third quarter, made an out-and-up move and then came back on the ball to make a leaping 30-yard catch near the sideline with S Jaquiski Tartt covering him.

▶At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Started his fourth consecutive game and played 31 snaps, catching two passes for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) and a TD... With the Packers trailing, 26-20, midway through the fourth quarter, got inside on CB Troy Hill and caught a deep pass from Rodgers for a 40-yard TD, outrunning S Lamarcus Joyner after making the catch on his way to the end zone.

▶ At New England (Nov. 4): Made his fifth straight start, appearing on 60 of 74 snaps and leading the team with 101 yards receiving on three catches (33.7 avg.), with all three grabs coming in the second half ...Became the first Packer since McGee in 1959 to register two 100-yard receiving games on three or fewer catches in a season and is only the third NFL player to accomplish that feat since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Rams WR Drew Hill, 1980; Patriots WR Stanley Morgan, 1978, 1980, 1984)...All three of his receptions were for 20-plus yards, bringing his streak to four straight catches of 20-plus yards...On the third play of the second half, beat CB Jason McCourty on a post for a 51-yard gain to the New England 21 on third-and-6...Late in the third quarter, made an out-and-up move before making a leaping 24-yard reception down the right sideline on third down over CB J.C. Jackson...On the next play, came across the field to beat Jones for a 26-yard grab to the New England 34.

▶Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Started for the sixth straight game and led the

team with six receptions for 44 yards (7.3 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs...Made a pair of 11-yard receptions on back-to-back plays late in the first half.

► At Seattle (Nov. 15): Started and played 48 snaps, posting an 8-yard reception.

► At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Started and played 44 snaps, recording one catch for 3 yards.

- Was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the sixth round (No. 197 overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft.
- Spent time on the Buccaneers' practice squad in 2016 before being signed by the Cleveland Browns. Played in 24 games with nine starts for the Browns in 2016-17, recording seven receptions for 46 yards (6.6 avg.) and 13 tackles on special teams.

2018 SEASON: Appeared in five games, seeing time on offense and special teams...Registered a 2-yard reception and posted two tackles on special teams...Was signed to Green Bay's practice squad on Oct. 22 and then was signed to the 53-man roster on Dec. 1.

►Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Played three snaps on offense and nine on special teams in his Green Bay debut.

►Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Played 16 snaps on special teams and two on offense...Registered a tackle on special teams.

►At Chicago (Dec. 16): Appeared on four plays on offense and 17 on special teams.

▶At N.Y. Jets (Dec. 23): Played eight snaps on offense and posted his first reception in a Green Bay uniform, a 2-yard grab from QB Aaron Rodgers late in the first half to convert a third-and-1...Also appeared on 24 plays on special teams.

►Vs. Detroit (Dec. 30): Appeared on 17 plays on special teams and recorded a tackle...Also played two snaps on offense.

96 Muhammad Wilkerson, DL, 8th Year, Temple

- The former Pro Bowler (2015) and second-team All-Pro member (*The Associated Press* in 2013 and 2015) joined the Packers after spending the first seven seasons of his career with the N.Y. Jets, who selected him in the first round (No. 30 overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft.
- Registered three-plus sacks and at least one forced fumble in six different seasons, tied for the most among defensive linemen since 2011.
- From 2011-17, was part of a defense that ranked No. 4 in the league over that span in opponent rushing average (3.84). Helped the Jets rank No. 6 in the league (103.7 ypg) in run defense from 2011-17.
- Has registered 50-plus tackles in each of his seven seasons, including 90-plus tackles twice (90 in 2012 and 91 in 2013).

2018 SEASON: Started the first three games and posted six tackles (four solo), a tackle for a loss and two QB hits...Was placed on injured reserve (ankle) on Sept. 29.

►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played 43 snaps in his Green Bay debut, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss and a QB hit.

▶Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and played 49 snaps, posting a solo tackle and a QB hit...Part of a line that helped limit the Vikings to just

68 yards on 18 carries (3.8 avg.).

► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started and played 23 snaps, recording an assisted tackle, but was carted off the field after sustaining an ankle injury with just over two minutes remaining in the first half.

30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 2nd Year, Brigham Young

- Rushed for a team-high 556 yards last season, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four TDs on 153 carries (3.6 avg.).
- Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie running back since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.
- Became the first rookie in team history to register a rushing TD/receiving TD in two games (Week 12 at Pittsburgh, Week 14 at Cleveland).
- After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.
- **2018 SEASON:** Played in all 16 games with eight starts and ranked No. 2 on the team with 464 rushing yards and three TDs on 121 carries (3.8 avg.)...Also had 27 receptions for 210 yards (7.8 avg.) and four kickoff returns for 95 yards (23.8 avg.).
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and led the team with 47 rushing yards on 15 carries (3.1 avg.)...Had a key blitz pickup on QB Aaron Rodgers' 51-yard completion to WR Davante Adams in the fourth quarter, stuffing LB Danny Trevathan as he came up the middle to give Rodgers a clean look on the big gain.

late in the first quarter on a swing pass from Rodgers.

- ▶ At N.Y. Jets (Dec. 23): Started and led the team with 95 rushing yards and a TD on 15 carries (6.3 avg.), with his yards-per-carry average a career high (min. 10 att.)...Added six receptions for 61 yards (10.2 avg.) to give him a career-best 156 yards from scrimmage on the afternoon... Became just the third Packer since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to have 95-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game (RB John Brockington, Nov. 17, 1974, at Minnesota; RB Dorsey Levens, Nov. 16, 1997, at Indianapolis)...Matched his career high with six rushing first downs...Late in the first half, took a toss from Rodgers around the left end, keeping his feet in bounds as he extended his body toward the pylon for the 7-yard score...Late in the fourth quarter, posted a season-long 26-yard reception, taking a screen pass from Rodgers down to the New York 24 with a host of blockers leading the way.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Dec. 30): Started and had 4 rushing yards on eight carries (0.5 avg.) with three receptions for 16 yards (5.3 avg.).

38 Tramon Williams, CB/S, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech

- Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- Returned to the Packers after spending three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.
- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.
- Was the only undrafted free agent in the NFL to post four-plus INTs each season from 2008-11. Was tied for No. 4 in the NFL with 19 INTs over that span.
- **2018 SEASON:** Started all 16 games (nine at S, Weeks 9-17; seven at CB, Weeks 1-6, 8) and posted 64 tackles (47 solo), a fumble recovery and four passes defensed...Returned 12 punts for 83 yards (6.9 avg.) with 10 fair catches.
- ►Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9): Started and played all 70 snaps, one of five Green Bay defenders to do so...Finished third on the team with seven tackles (five solo).
- ►Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16): Started and was one of four Green Bay defensive players to appear on all 73 snaps...Finished with six tackles (five solo).
- ► At Washington (Sept. 23): Started and played 59 of 61 snaps, posting two tackles (one solo).

- ►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Started and played all 57 snaps, finishing with four tackles (three solo)...Also had one punt return for 6 yards.
- ►At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Started and played all 78 snaps, posting four tackles (one solo)...Returned one punt on the afternoon for 13 yards.
- ►At New England (Nov. 4): Made the third start of his career at safety (two starts with Cleveland in 2016) and was one of two defensive players to play all 71 snaps for Green Bay...Registered six tackles (five solo).
- ►Vs. Miami (Nov. 11): Started at safety for the second straight game and posted a solo tackle...Added a 19-yard punt return.
- ▶At Seattle (Nov. 15): Started at safety for the third straight game, appearing on 69 of 70 snaps and posting seven tackles (five solo) and a fumble recovery...On Seattle's first play from scrimmage, recovered a RB Chris Carson fumble that was forced by LB Clay Matthews, diving on the ball at the Seattle 29 to help set up a Green Bay TD.
- ►At Minnesota (Nov. 25): Started at safety for the fourth straight

game, appearing on all 70 plays as he saw time at both S and CB... Registered five tackles (three solo) and returned two punts for 23 yards (11.5 avg.), including a season-long 23-yarder in the third quarter.

- ▶Vs. Arizona (Dec. 2): Started at S and played all 62 snaps, one of three Green Bay defenders to do so, and registered five tackles (three solo) and a team-high two passes defensed...Broke up a pass from QB Josh Rosen intended for TE Ricky Seals-Jones in the first quarter.
- ►Vs. Atlanta (Dec. 9): Started at S and played all 71 snaps, recording a solo tackle.
- ► At Chicago (Dec. 16): Started at S and appeared on all 60 snaps, finishing with five tackles (four solo).
- ▶ At N.Y. Jets (Dec. 23): Started at S and played all 60 snaps, posting a solo tackle and a pass defensed...Late in the first quarter, made a diving breakup of a pass from QB Sam Darnold to RB Trenton Cannon on first-and-goal from the 4.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Dec. 30): Started at S and played 72 of 73 snaps, recording three tackles (two solo).
