PACKERS AND 49ERS WILL MEET IN PRIMETIME

The Green Bay Packers will host the San Francisco 49ers at Lambeau Field on *Monday Night Football*.

- ▶ It is the 26th consecutive season (1993-2018) that Green Bay is appearing on *MNF*.
- ▶ It is the fifth time in the last six seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on *MNF*.
- ▶ It will be the fourth time, and first since 1999, that Green Bay and San Francisco will face off on *MNF*, with the Packers winning two of the three matchups.
- ▶ Green Bay has won three of its last four games on *MNF*.
- ▶ The Packers lead the all-time series with the 49ers, 35-30-1, including a 4-3 record in the postseason.
- ▶ Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay is 4-2 against San Francisco during the regular season.
- ▶ The Packers have won 10 of the last 12 regular-season matchups with the 49ers, including six of seven contests at home.
- ▶ Green Bay has scored 20-plus points in each of the last eight regular-season home games it has played against San Francisco.
- ▶ After the second Week 7 bye for Green Bay in the last four seasons (2015), the Packers will play four of five games on the road, including three games against teams that won their division last season (at Los Angeles Rams, at New England Patriots, at Minnesota Vikings).
- ▶ The Packers are 7-5 (.583) under McCarthy in the game heading into the open date on their schedule, including wins in two of the last three contests.



AGAINST THE NFC WEST

- ▶ Under McCarthy, Green Bay is 17-7 versus NFC West teams during the regular season. The Packers' .708 winning percentage is **tied for No. 4 in the NFL** against the NFC West and Green Bay's 17 wins are **tied for No. 1** (Atlanta, Minnesota) among teams outside the NFC West (pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started 19 regular-season games against teams from the NFC West with the Packers winning 14 of those. Rodgers has thrown 37 touchdowns and nine interceptions in the 19 games and his 105.1 passer rating ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** against the NFC West since 2008 (min. 100 pass att.).
- ▶ Dating back to 2002, the Packers are 22-9 against the NFC West in the regular season. Green Bay's .710 winning percentage against the NFC West is **No. 1 in the NFC** and **No. 3 in the NFL**.
- ▶ The Packers' 22 wins against the NFC West since 2002 are **tied for the most in the NFL** for a team outside the division.
- ▶ Green Bay has a plus-259 point differential against the NFC West since 2002, **No. 2 in the NFL** behind the Seattle Seahawks (plus-619).

WITH THE CALL

- ESPN is in its 13th season as host of the most successful series in sports television history, *Monday Night Football*. Play-by-play man **Joe Tessitore** is joined by analysts **Jason Witten** and **Booger McFarland** for the 49th season of *MNF* broadcasts, with **Lisa Salters** reporting from the sidelines.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
 - ▶ Westwood One Sports will air the game on radio across the country. **Kevin Harlan** (play-by-play) and **Kurt Warner** (analyst) will call the action, with **Olivia Dekker** reporting from the sidelines and **Jim Gray** hosting the pregame and halftime shows.
 - ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

PACKERS VS. 49ERS - WEEK 6

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field and it has continued this season with a 2-0-1 record.

- ▶ Green Bay has 223 victories at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ▶ With the win over the Chicago Bears in Week 1, Green Bay has won six straight home openers (2013-18).
- ▶ Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay is 71-26-2 at home during the regular season. The Packers' .727 winning percentage ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** over that span:

- ▶ Since the start of 2014, Green Bay is **No. 6 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home during the regular season:

- ▶ Green Bay started 3-0 at home in 2017, marking the fifth time since 2011 that the Packers began the season 3-0 or better at home.
- ▶ The Packers rank **No. 7 in the league** with a plus-23 point differential at home this season. Green Bay ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** in point differential at home since the start of the 2014 season (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- ▶ The Packers are 17-6 (.739, **No. 6 in the NFL**) at home in the month of October since 2006 with a plus-217 point differential that ranks **No. 4 in the NFL** over that span.
- ▶ Green Bay has won 12 of its past 14 home games in the month of October.
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started 73 home games during the regular season for Green Bay with the Packers holding a 58-14 record in those contests. He has completed 1,651 of 2,480 passes (66.6 pct.) for 20,025 yards (274.3 per game), 174 touchdowns, 33 interceptions and a passer rating of 109.0.
- ▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** since 1970 in passer rating at home as a starter (Sportradar), min. 500 pass attempts:

- ▶ Rodgers has led Green Bay to an 8-0-1 record in his last nine starts at home, recording a passer rating of 100-plus in six of those games.

► In Week 4, Green Bay blanked the Buffalo Bills, 22-0, marking Green Bay's first shutout since Oct. 31, 2010, at the N.Y. Jets (9-0) and the first shutout posted by the Packers at Lambeau Field since a 26-0 victory over Detroit on Oct. 18, 2009.

► The Packers joined the Los Angeles Rams (34-0 vs. Arizona, Week 2) as the only NFL teams with a shutout this season.

► In Week 4, the Packers allowed just 145 yards of total offense, the fewest given up by Green Bay since Dec. 21, 2014 (109 yards at Tampa Bay).

► Green Bay registered a season-high seven sacks versus the Bills, the most by the Packers since recording seven vs. Tampa Bay on Dec. 3, 2017. The 64 sack yards in Week 4 were the most by the Packers since vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 24, 1991 (67 yards).

► The Packers forced the Bills into seven three-and-outs in Week 4. The last time a Packers' opponent had at least seven drives without producing a first down in a game was November 8, 2015, against Carolina (eight), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► LB **Kyler Fackrell** became the third Packer since 1991 to register three-plus sacks in the fourth quarter of a game (according to Sportradar):

► Fackrell is the first player in the NFL with three sacks in a single fourth quarter this season.

► S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** registered an interception in three consecutive games (Weeks 2-4), the longest streak of his career. He is the only player in the NFL with a three-game streak this season.

► Clinton-Dix is tied for **No. 1 in the NFL** in interceptions this season:

VERSATILE RUNNING BACKS

Green Bay has used numerous running backs this season as part of a rushing attack that has improved each week. The Packers have posted for 95-plus rushing yards in each of the last four games.

► Green Bay is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** this season in games with 95-plus rushing yards (four).

► The Packers are one of four teams (New England, Philadelphia, Seattle) to have three running backs with 85-plus rushing yards this season (**Jamaal Williams**, 195 / **Aaron Jones**, 147 / **Ty Montgomery**, 87).

► Green Bay ranks **No. 8 in the NFL** with an average of 4.56 yards per rush this season.

► According to Sportradar, Jones ranks **No. 3 among NFL running backs** (min. 15 carries) in yards per carry (6.13).

► In Week 4, Green Bay posted a season-high 141 rushing yards on 32 carries (4.4 avg.).

► The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).

► Among running backs with 10-plus receptions this season, Montgomery ranks **No. 3 in yards per reception** (Sportradar):

Mike McCarthy: 133-80-2, .623 (incl. 10-8 postseason); 13th NFL season

MIKE MCCARTHY...Is in his 13th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led Green Bay to its eighth consecutive playoff appearance in 2016, tied for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history. Has led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 11 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ▶ Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ▶ Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that span; Packers led the league in scoring in 2014.
- ▶ Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

KYLE SHANAHAN...Is in his second year as the 49ers' 20th head coach.

- ▶ In his first season as head coach in 2017, led the team to a 6-10 record, a four-game improvement from the previous year for the 49ers.
- ▶ Possesses 14 seasons of coaching experience at the NFL level, including nine as an offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2015-16), Cleveland Browns (2014), Washington Redskins (2010-13) and Houston Texans (2008-09).
- ▶ In six of nine seasons as an offensive coordinator (2008-09, 2012-13 and 2015-16), directed an offense that ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in yards gained.
- ▶ In 2016, helped the Falcons reach Super Bowl LI and guided the Atlanta offense to franchise records in yards per game (415.8), points scored (540), net passing yards per game (295.3) and average yards per play (6.7).

THE PACKERS-49ERS SERIES

Originally dating back to 1950, the series featured two games per season from 1953-66 with the teams trading dominant stretches.

- ▶ San Francisco won 13 times in a span of 15 games between 1950-58, while the Packers won 10 of 11 games between 1959-64.
- ▶ In more recent times, the series has been noted for its postseason clashes, including several defining moments in Packers history. Green Bay's 27-17 triumph in the 1995 NFC Divisional playoff was considered the breakthrough victory that established the Packers as an elite team for the next several years. The Packers also won the next two postseason meetings, a 35-14 home victory in the 1996 NFC Divisional playoff en route to the Super Bowl XXXI title, and a 23-10 win at San Francisco in the 1997 NFC Championship game.
- ▶ The two teams met in the playoffs for a fourth straight season in 1998, with the 49ers winning, 30-27, on QB Steve Young's last-second TD pass to WR Terrell Owens.
- ▶ The clubs faced off in the playoffs in back-to-back seasons (2012-13), with San Francisco coming away with wins in both.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers head coach Mike McCarthy was San Francisco's offensive coordinator in 2005...Green Bay S Jermaine Whitehead signed with the 49ers as an undrafted free agent in 2015 and spent that season on the San Francisco practice squad...Packers offense - pass game coordinator Jim Hostler served as the 49ers' quarterbacks coach from 2005-06 and as the offensive coordinator in 2007...Green Bay quarterbacks coach Frank Cignetti worked in the same role for San Francisco in 2007...49ers run game specialist/outside linebackers coach Johnny Holland played linebacker for the Packers from 1987-93, and worked as a Green Bay assistant coach from 1995-99...San Francisco assistant offensive line coach Adam Stenavich spent time on the Green Bay practice squad in 2006 and is from Marshfield, Wis. ...Green Bay chief operating officer and general counsel Ed Policy's father, Carmen, worked in San Francisco's front office in the 1980s and 1990s...Packers QB Aaron Rodgers is from Chico, Calif., and played collegiately at Butte College in Oroville, Calif., and the University of California...Other Packers with connections to northern California include: WR Davante Adams (Palo Alto), T David Bakhtiari (San Mateo), offensive line coach James Campen (Sacramento), CB Kevin King (Oakland), LB Blake Martinez (Stanford) and RB Ty Montgomery (Stanford)...49ers defensive quality control coach Bobby Slowik is a native of Green Bay, Wis. ...Packers LB Clay Matthews' grandfather, Clay Sr., played for San Francisco for four seasons (1950, 1953-55)...Packers TE Jimmy Graham played in Seattle with 49ers CB Richard Sherman (2015-17), DL Cassius Marsh (2015-16) and OL Garry Gilliam (2015-16)...Green Bay T/G Byron Bell played in Dallas with San Francisco RB Alfred Morris in 2017...Packers TE Mercedes Lewis teamed with 49ers DL Sheldon Day in Jacksonville in 2016 and for part of 2017...49ers assistant head coach/tight ends coach Jon Embree was Lewis' position coach at UCLA from 2004-05...Green Bay TE Lance Kendricks was teammates with San Francisco OL Mike Person in St. Louis in 2014...Person also played with Packers LB Antonio Morrison in Indianapolis in 2017...Green Bay CB Tramon Williams played with 49ers CB K'Waun Williams (2015), RB Raheem Mostert (2015) and T Shon Coleman (2016) while with the Browns...Green Bay defensive coordinator Mike Pettine was the Browns' head coach from 2014-15. A number of Packers and 49ers coaches served on Pettine's coaching staff in Cleveland: Green Bay tight ends coach Brian Angelichio, defensive quality control coach Ryan Downard, 49ers head coach Kyle Shanahan, special teams coordinator Richard Hightower, defensive backs coach Jeff Hafley, wide receivers coach/passing game coordinator Mike LaFleur, offensive assistant T.C. McCartney and run game coordinator Mike McDaniel...Packers secondary coach Jason Simmons played for Houston (2002-07) while a number of 49ers coaches served on the Texans' staff: Shanahan, defensive coordinator Robert Saleh, Hightower, offensive line coach John Benton, Holland and McDaniel...San Francisco defensive line coach Jeff Zgonina was also teammates with Simmons in Houston in 2007...Benton worked as the offensive line coach in Miami while Green Bay offensive coordinator Joe Philbin coached the Dolphins...Mostert (2015) and San Francisco NT Earl Mitchell (2014-15) also played for the Dolphins during Philbin's tenure as head coach in Miami...Angelichio and Hafley coached together in Tampa Bay in 2012...Angelichio, Cignetti and Hafley also coached together at Rutgers in 2011 and at the University of Pittsburgh from 2009-10...49ers CB K'Waun Williams played for the Panthers in 2010...Zgonina was an assistant to Packers defense - run game coordinator/inside linebackers coach Patrick Graham when Graham coached the New York Giants' defensive line in 2016...Cignetti was also on the Giants' coaching staff in 2016...Stenavich coached with Packers defensive line coach Jerry Montgomery at Michigan for two seasons 2011-12...Embree was the Colorado head coach during Bakhtiari's final two seasons (2011-12) playing for the Buffaloes...McCartney also served as a graduate assistant at Colorado in 2012...San Francisco pass rush specialist Chris Kiffin worked as an assistant at Southern California in 2010 while Green Bay LB Nick Perry played for the Trojans...Former college teammates include: Packers P JK Scott and 49ers LB Reuben Foster (Alabama), Packers DL Montravius Adams, S Jermaine Whitehead and Coleman (Auburn), Packers RB Jamaal Williams and 49ers LB Fred Warner (BYU), Packers CB Bashaud Breeland and 49ers P Bradley Pinion (Clemson), Packers G Lucas Patrick and 49ers OL Laken Tomlinson (Duke), Packers CB Josh Jackson, 49ers QB C.J. AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 12 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

► McCarthy's 121 regular-season wins in his first 12 years as a head coach (2006-17) are **No. 4 in NFL history** (according to the Elias Sports Bureau):

► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his first 12 seasons, he won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.

► With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

► The 133 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 169).

► In Week 6 of the 2017 season, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason). Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the **sixth-most wins by a head coach** through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.

► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).

► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.

► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.

► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (17) and Andy Reid (12) have more 10-plus-win seasons.

► McCarthy is the **only coach in franchise history** to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).

► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowl-winning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.

► Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 133-80-2 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .623 winning percentage that ranks **No. 3 among current NFL head coaches** (minimum 100 games):

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season. It is the second time in his career that he has registered 10-plus touchdowns and one or fewer interceptions in the first five games of the season (2018: 10/1; 2014: 12/1).

- ▶ In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ▶ With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ▶ Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history:

STAT OF THE WEEK

► WR **Davante Adams** extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his 10th straight road game, and **tied the longest streak in NFL history** (Eagles WR Tommy McDonald, 10, 1959-61).

ASCENDING ADAMS

Despite playing in just 14 games in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** led the Packers in all three major receiving categories with 74 receptions (one shy of career-best 75 from 2016) for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 touchdowns (**tied for No. 2 in the NFL**), resulting in his first appearance in the Pro Bowl.

- Adams is **tied for No. 6 in the NFL** in receiving TDs (four) and **tied for No. 7 in the league** in receptions (37) this season.
- Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in each of the first three contests, which extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to last season. He had six TD catches during the streak. It was the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It was also the longest streak by a Packer player since WR **Randall Cobb's** streak of six games in 2014.
- Adams was one of four players in the league with a receiving TD in the first three games of this season.
- Adams was the third Packer in the last four seasons (James Jones, 2015; Jordy Nelson, 2016) to catch a TD pass in each of the first three games of the season.

THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF COBB

Packers WR **Randall Cobb** has been a versatile weapon for the team over his career. While he has contributed as a kick and punt returner and out of the backfield, most of his production has come as a wide receiver.

- In Week 1, he led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- On third down in Week 1, Cobb finished with a career-high 110 yards on four receptions (27.5 avg.), the most by a Packer since WR Antonio Freeman posted 124 yards on five third-down receptions (24.8 avg.) vs. Tampa Bay on Oct. 10, 1999.
- Cobb's receiving-yardage total in Week 1 was the most by a Packer in a season opener since WR James Lofton recorded 154 yards receiving at Houston on Sept. 4, 1983.
- Since 2014, Cobb ranks **No. 2 among NFL wide receivers** (min. 150 receptions) in average yards after the catch (according to Sportradar):

- Cobb ranks No. 6 in franchise history in receptions (449), No. 12 in receiving yards (5,335) and is tied for No. 11 in touchdown catches (40).
- Cobb was one of just six wide receivers to register four-plus touchdowns in each season from 2012-17 (Brown, Green, IND T.Y. Hilton, Tate, Thomas).

GERONIMO STEPPING UP

- ▶ In Week 5 the Packers did not punt, marking the first time since Oct. 26, 2014 at New Orleans that Green Bay did not punt once in a game. Dating back to 2006, the Packers have had four games without a punt, tied for the **most in the NFL** (Jacksonville Jaguars) over that span (pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ According to Sportradar, Green Bay has had nine drives of five-plus minutes this season, **tied for the fifth most in the NFL**. The Packers have scored on all seven drives to **tie for the fourth-most** scores on drives of five-plus minutes in the league this season:

- ▶ TE **Jimmy Graham** ranks **No. 8 in the NFL among tight ends** in both receptions (22) and receiving yards (245).
- ▶ P **JK Scott** currently ranks **No. 10 in the NFL** in gross punting average with 47.4 yards per punt and **No. 11 in the league** with a net average of 41.6 yards per punt.
- ▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Scott is the first punter in Packers history with a 58-plus yard punt in each of his first three NFL games. The last NFL player to do it was Washington P Tress Way in 2014.

- ▶ According to Sportradar, the Packers have finished in the top 10 of the NFL in two-minute offense (points scored on drives started in the last two minutes of the second quarter or fourth quarter) in four of the previous seven seasons (No. 2 in 2016, t-10 in 2013 and 2012, No. 1 in 2011). In 2018, Green Bay is **tied for No. 4 in the NFL** in two-minute offense:

According to Sportradar, it marked the 18th time in his career that he recorded a passer rating of 150-plus in the fourth quarter.

- ▶ Rodgers has registered a passer rating of 100-plus in three of five fourth quarters this season (156.3 in Week 1, 102.7 in Week 4 and 123.4 in Week 5).

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

IN THE CONFERENCE

Over the years the Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NFC.

- ▶ Green Bay has 201 wins against the NFC since 1992, the most in the league over that time span (Dallas, 178).
- ▶ Green Bay's 30 regular-season wins against NFC opponents since 2014 are **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** (Seattle, 32 / Minnesota, Carolina, Detroit, 31).

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 30 of them (56.6 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has eight players that were drafted in the first round, including seven that were selected by the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 37 players on the roster that were draft picks (69.8 percent), including 21 players that were selected in the first three rounds (41.5 percent).
- ▶ Over a third of the players (19 of 53, 35.8 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 42 of them (79.2 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 15) and 28 players (52.8 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- ▶ The Packers have 10 players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with seven of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Randall Cobb, Mike Daniels, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 40 began their pro careers with the Packers (75.5 percent).
- ▶ Over half the roster consists of players with experience ranging from rookie to three years (33 of 53, 62.3 percent).

CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL

LB **Clay Matthews** continues to make an impact on opposing offenses. He leads the team with 10 QB pressures this season.

- ▶ In 2017, Matthews recorded a sack in three consecutive games that he appeared in (Weeks 11, 13-14), marking the eighth time he has recorded a sack in at least three straight games that he has played in during the same regular season.
- ▶ For the seventh time in his career, Matthews registered at least six sacks (team-high 7.5) and forced a fumble in 2017, which **tied for the second-most seasons** with six-plus sacks and one or more forced fumbles since 2009 (Julius Peppers, nine).
- ▶ In Week 4 of 2017, Matthews registered a sack/forced fumble of Bears QB Mike Glennon to move past DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila to set the team record:

Packers LB **Nick Perry** is a big part of a pass rush that has recorded a sack in 19 of the last 21 games.

- ▶ He sealed the Week 1 victory over the Bears with a sack/forced fumble of QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 1:06 on the clock and the ball at the Chicago 46-yard line. The fumble was recovered by DL **Kenny Clark**.
- ▶ Perry has registered at least one sack in each of the last three season openers, totalling 3.5 sacks in those games.
- ▶ Perry leads the Packers in sacks and games with at least one sack since 2016:

ON THE RISE

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl and second-team All-Pro recognition from *The Associated Press* in 2016.

- ▶ After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ▶ Clinton-Dix has three interceptions this season (**tied for No. 1 in the NFL**), was **tied for No. 2 on the team** with three INTs in 2017 and ranks **No. 1 among safeties** since 2016 during the regular season:

- ▶ His career-best five interceptions were **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** in 2016 and **tied for No. 2 among safeties**. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ▶ In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 15, becoming the first Packer to have multiple two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶ In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark started all 20 games he has played in since the start of the 2017 season.

- ▶ Clark is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** with two defensive fumble recoveries this season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ▶ Against Minnesota in Week 2, he sacked QB Kirk Cousins. He has 5.5 sacks since Week 13 of 2017, the most on the Packers over that span, according to Sportradar.
- ▶ The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- ▶ According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the **most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December** in a single season (since 1982).
- ▶ With two sacks vs. Minnesota in Week 16 (2017), Clark became the first Packers defensive tackle to register two sacks in a single regular-season game since **Mike Daniels** recorded two Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (according to STATS).

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DL **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- ▶ After being selected as an alternate each of the past three seasons (2015-17), he was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ▶ He finished **No. 4 on the team** with five sacks in 2017, the third-most sacks of his career (6.5 in 2013, 5.5 in 2014), and recorded a career best 72 tackles.
- ▶ Daniels has recorded at least four sacks in each season since 2013, which is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles** (according to pro-football-reference.com):

RACKING UP POINTS

K **Mason Crosby** is moving his way up the record books.

- ▶ In Week 4, Crosby hit two 52-yard field goals, joining Ryan Longwell (at Atlanta, Nov. 13, 2005) as the only Packers to make two 50-plus yard field goals in a regular-season game. It was the first time two field goals of 50-plus yards had been made by a kicker at Lambeau Field. Crosby had previously connected on two 50-plus field goals (56, 51) in the 2016 NFC Divisional Playoff win at Dallas.
- ▶ Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- ▶ Crosby has played in 181 straight games for the Packers, the **third most all-time** behind only QB Brett Favre (255) and T Forrest Gregg (187).
- ▶ Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶ The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ▶ Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only eight of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records at or above .500.

337 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Buffalo Bills in Week 4 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 337 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶ The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ▶ Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ▶ Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 71-26-2 (.727) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 3 in the NFL**.
- ▶ Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 98th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 19 by the National Football League.

- ▶ For the second consecutive season, the Packers opened the season at home and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 1, Green Bay hosted Chicago on Sunday night, marking the 13th consecutive regular season that the Packers and Bears have squared off in primetime.
- ▶ It was the first time Green Bay opened the season at home against the Bears since playing them on Sunday night in Week 1 of the 2009 season, a 21-15 win for the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay hosted Minnesota in Week 2, marking the first time since 2012 that the Packers played two home games to open the season. It also marked just the third time (2003, 2008) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ▶ The Packers' first road contest was at the Redskins, marking Green Bay's first September visit to Washington.
- ▶ The Packers returned home to take on the Buffalo Bills in Week 4. It was the second-coldest September game (49 degrees at kickoff) at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Washington Redskins on Sept. 24, 2001 (46 degrees).
- ▶ In Week 5 they traveled to Detroit to play the Lions.
- ▶ In Week 6, Green Bay hosts the San Francisco 49ers on *Monday Night Football*, marking the fourth time the two teams have met on MNF and the first since 1999. It is the fifth time in the last six seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on MNF.
- ▶ After the second Week 7 bye for Green Bay in the last four seasons (2015), the Packers will play four of five games on the road.
- ▶ Green Bay makes its first trip to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 1978 to play the Rams.
- ▶ In Week 9, the Packers travel to the other side of the country to play the Patriots on Sunday night.
- ▶ It is the second consecutive time the Packers and Patriots will face off on a Sunday night in New England (2010).
- ▶ Green Bay returns home to take on the Miami Dolphins before a quick turnaround to play the Seahawks, marking the Packers' second Thursday night game at Seattle (Week 1 in 2014). Including the postseason, it will be the seventh time Green Bay and Seattle have played since 2012.
- ▶ November finishes with a trip to play the Vikings on Sunday night, marking the sixth straight season that the teams have met in a prime-time game.
- ▶ Green Bay opens the final month of the regular season against Arizona, only the second time the Cardinals have played at Lambeau Field in December (Dec. 21, 1969).
- ▶ The Packers will play back-to-back home games for only the second time in 2018 when they host the Atlanta Falcons in Week 14. It will be the fourth matchup (including postseason) between Green Bay and Atlanta in the last three seasons.
- ▶ The Packers end the season with two road games in the final three weeks for the seventh straight year.
- ▶ In Week 15, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place it has won in the regular season each of the last seven years. The Packers have scored 30-plus points at Chicago in four of the last five matchups (33, 38, 31, 30, 23).
- ▶ The Packers' road slate will finish up with a game at the New York Jets, the third December game at the Jets in team history (1981, 2002). Three of the last four games at New York have been decided by single digits, including one game that went to overtime.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the third straight year and the fourth time in the last five seasons. Green Bay has an 18-6 overall mark (.750) and a 10-2 home record (.833) against Detroit under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE

WR Randall Cobb, 7th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ In Week 1, led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards (13th 100-yard receiving game of his career) on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- ▶ Despite missing a game, was No. 2 on the team with 66 receptions in 2017. It was the fourth consecutive season he registered 60-plus receptions.
- ▶ Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- ▶ Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ▶ Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team history.
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

LT David Bakhtiari, 6th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ▶ Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2016 and 2017, joining Forrest Gregg (1959-60, 1962-67) as the only Green Bay tackles to be named to an AP All-Pro team in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- ▶ Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ▶ Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ▶ Has played in 67 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but three of his 38 starts (LT in Week 4-5 of 2017, RG in Week 13 of 2015) taking place at LG.
- ▶ Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ▶ A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C Corey Linsley, 5th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ▶ Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was the only Packers offensive lineman to start every game during the 2017 season.
- ▶ Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games of the 2016 season.
- ▶ Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.
- ▶ Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Justin McCray, 2nd Year, Central Florida, FA-17

- ▶ Signed by Green Bay as a free agent during the 2017 offseason and has seen action in 17 games with 11 starts (five at RT, two at LG, four at RG).
- ▶ Played for the Orlando Predators of the Arena Football League in 2016.
- ▶ Spent the 2015 season out of football.
- ▶ Entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the Tennessee Titans in 2014 and spent that season on Tennessee's practice squad.
- ▶ Appeared in 45 games with 32 starts in four seasons at Central Florida (2010-13), with 23 of the starts coming at RG.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ▶ Has played in 90 career regular-season games with 86 starts at right tackle, the most games played and started among starting offensive linemen on Green Bay's current roster.
- ▶ Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season.
- ▶ Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ▶ Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18

- ▶ His 70 career touchdowns rank No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends.
- ▶ Last season, led NFL tight ends with 10 receiving TDs, which marked his fourth season with 10-plus touchdown receptions to tie Antonio Gates for the second most 10-touchdown catch seasons among tight ends (Rob Gronkowski, five).
- ▶ Has been selected to the Pro Bowl five times in his career (2011, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017) and was named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2013.
- ▶ Is the only tight end in NFL history to have two seasons with 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving TDs (2011, 2013).
- ▶ From 2015-17, he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a third-round pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- ▶ Leads the Packers in receptions (37), receiving yards (425) and receiving TDs (four) this season.
- ▶ Recorded the fourth-most receptions (237) and receiving touchdowns (26) by a Green Bay player in their first four seasons (2014-17) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).
- ▶ With 12 receiving touchdowns in 2016, joined Jordy Nelson (2014, 2016), Antonio Freeman (1997-98), Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Set franchise postseason single-game records for the most catches and receiving yards by a rookie when he posted seven grabs for 117 yards (16.7 avg.) and a TD in the 2014 NFC Divisional playoff victory over Dallas.

WR Geronimo Allison, 3rd Year, Illinois, FA-16

- ▶ Ranks No. 2 on the team with 289 receiving yards this season.
- ▶ Recorded a TD reception of 39 yards in the fourth quarter of Week 1, blocked a punt that was recovered in the end zone by CB Josh Jackson for a TD in Week 2 and registered the longest TD catch of his career (64 yards) in Week 3.
- ▶ Of his 35 receptions in 2016-17, 21 picked up first downs, a 60.0 percentage that ranked No. 3 among Packers with 35-plus catches over that span.
- ▶ Recorded career highs with 122 receiving yards and six receptions (20.3 avg.) in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati last season, highlighted by a career-long 72-yard reception in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's game-winning 27-yard field goal.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- ▶ His career passer rating of 103.7 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ In 147 regular-season starts (96-50-1 record), has posted 53 games with 300-plus passing yards, 88 without an interception and 81 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Jamaal Williams, Rookie, Brigham Young, D4b-17

- ▶ Leads the Packers with 195 rushing yards this season.
- ▶ After playing as a reserve in the first nine games of the 2017 season, started the last seven and finished the season with a team-high 556 yards rushing and six total touchdowns (four rushing, two receiving).
- ▶ Finished No. 6 among rookie running backs in rushing yards in 2017.
- ▶ Became the first Green Bay rookie to have three consecutive games with 115-plus yards from scrimmage (Weeks 12-14) since Billy Howton in 1952.



PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

DE Dean Lowry, 3rd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16

- ▶ Tied with LB Reggie Gilbert for No. 2 on the team with eight QB pressures this season (Clay Matthews, 10).
- ▶ Made first career start in the 2017 season-opening win over Seattle and went on to start at total of 11 games while playing in all 16 last season.
- ▶ Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.
- ▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13 vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.
- ▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern.
- ▶ Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defended.

NT Kenny Clark, 3rd Year, UCLA, D1-16

- ▶ Has 5.5 sacks since Week 13 of 2017, the most on the Packers over that span (according to Sportradar).
- ▶ Despite missing Week 12 due to injury, set career highs in tackles (78, No. 4 on the team) and sacks (4.5, No. 4 on the team) in 2017.
- ▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).
- ▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ▶ Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

DE Mike Daniels, 7th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ▶ Leads Packers defensive linemen with 26.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ After being selected as an alternate each of the previous three seasons (2015-17), was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ▶ Ranked No. 4 on the team with five sacks in 2017 and set a career high with 72 tackles.
- ▶ Has recorded at least four sacks in each season since 2013, which is tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.
- ▶ Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

OLB Clay Matthews, 10th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ▶ With 80.5 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history. Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2017 despite missing two games.
- ▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- ▶ For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).
- ▶ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Blake Martinez, 3rd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

- ▶ Leads the Packers in total tackles (39) and solo tackles (28) this season.
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 on the Packers with 158 total tackles (107 solo) during the 2017 season. Dating back to 1975, it was the 14th time and first time since A.J. Hawk (153) in 2013 that a Green Bay player reached 150 tackles in a season.
- ▶ Registered 10-plus tackles in seven games in 2017 (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit, 17 at Pittsburgh, 10 vs. Tampa Bay).
- ▶ Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ▶ Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

ILB Oren Burks, Rookie, Vanderbilt, D3-18

- ▶ Named to the Butkus Award watch list in 2017 and went on to post career highs in tackles (82), solo tackles (45) and tackles for a loss (seven) in his first season at inside linebacker.
- ▶ Appeared in all 13 games with 10 starts as a junior in 2016 at a linebacker/safety hybrid position, finishing with 59 tackles (40 solo), 6.5 tackles for a loss and a career-best 3.5 sacks.

- ▶ Was a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award in 2017, a finalist for the Wooden Citizenship Cup in 2017 and a member of the Allstate-AFCA Good Works Team in 2016, which honored 12 Division I-A football players from across the country for their commitment to community service. Also served as president of the Vanderbilt Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in 2016-17.

OLB Nick Perry, 7th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- ▶ Sealed the Week 1 victory over the Bears with a sack/forced fumble of QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 1:06 on the clock and the ball at the Chicago 46-yard line. The fumble was recovered by DL Kenny Clark.
- ▶ Finished second on the team with seven sacks in 2017. Registered a career-high three sacks against the Chicago Bears in Week 10. It was the first time a Packers player had three-plus sacks in a game since LB A.J. Hawk (three) on Oct. 13, 2013, at Baltimore.
- ▶ Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.
- ▶ Registered multiple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ▶ Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, ranking No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

CB Tramon Williams, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-18

- ▶ Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- ▶ Is the only active player in the NFL with at least one INT in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).
- ▶ Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.
- ▶ Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

CB Kevin King, 2nd Year, Washington, D1-17

- ▶ Appeared in nine games with five starts as a rookie in 2017, registering 31 tackles (23 solo), a tackle for a loss and eight passes defended before being placed on injured reserve (shoulder) on Dec. 6.
- ▶ Despite being limited to nine games due to injury, his five starts were the third most among Packers rookies in 2017 (S Josh Jones and RB Jamaal Williams both had seven).
- ▶ Played in all 48 games with 35 starts in his four seasons at Washington and registered 165 tackles (107 solo), 8½ tackles for a loss, six interceptions, 28 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Earned honorable mention All-Pacific-12 recognition as a junior and senior.
- ▶ Was named first-team All-East Bay by the *Contra Costa Times* as a senior at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif., where he was coached by former NFL linebacker Hardy Nickerson.

S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 5th Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ▶ Is tied for No. 1 in the NFL with three INTs this season.
- ▶ Ranked No. 3 on the team with 86 tackles and No. 2 with three INTs in 2017.
- ▶ Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ▶ In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶ Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ▶ Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

S Kentrell Brice, 3rd Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-16

- ▶ Recorded his first career sack in Week 1 as part of a 12-tackle (nine solo) performance.
- ▶ Started a career-best three games in 2017 and set career highs in tackles (24), solo tackles (21), interceptions (one) and passes defended (four) despite only playing in six contests before being placed on injured reserve with an ankle injury on Nov. 3.
- ▶ Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's Week 1 roster and joined S Marwin Evans as the only rookie free agents to play in all 16 regular-season games and three postseason contests for the Packers in 2016.

GREEN BAY WRs (AP) — Aaron Rodgers heard the applause after walking out of the stadium tunnel and back on to the field. The team doctor had checked out his left knee after the Green Bay Packers quarterback was carried off the field in the second quarter. Rodgers, it seemed, had avoided a major injury. He was good to go. The adrenaline kicked in.

The hobbling wide-time NFL MVP threw three touchdown passes in the second half after returning from injury, and the Green Bay Packers overcame a 20-point deficit for a thrilling 24-23 win over the Chicago Bears on Sunday night.

Rodgers connected with receiver Randall Cobb for a catch-and-run through the secondary for a 75-yard touchdown and the go-ahead score with 2:13 left in the game.

Nick Perry saved the Bears' Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 58 seconds to complete the comeback.

Sunday marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

The Packers posted the second-largest comeback in franchise history at Lambeau Field, behind only a rally from 21 points down to beat New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989.

For Rodgers, this was special. And especially because how awful the Packers played in the first half.

A Chicago defense featuring newly acquired star linebacker Khalil Mack dominated until the third quarter. Mack had a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown against backup quarterback Desmond Haizer in the second quarter.

A gimpy Rodgers returned in the second half and finally figured out the Bears. He also found Davante Adams and Jeronimo Allison for touchdowns passes. He finished 20 of 30 for 286 yards, including 17 of 23 for 273 yards in the second half.

It was Rodgers' first regular-season home game since Sept. 28 against the Bears. He was limited to seven games in 2017 because of a collarbone injury.

Mack nearly stole the show. He also stripped the ball for a turnover in the red zone off Kizer in the second quarter. Mack made an immediate impact in his first game since the Bears acquired the premier pass rusher in a blockbuster deal with the Oakland Raiders.

The Bears led 20-0 at one point and their defense dominated until the second half. Then Rodgers returned, and the Packers' defense held the Bears in check.

Trubisky was 23 of 35 for 171 yards. He also ran for 32 yards on seven carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — Things have not gone all that well for Aaron Rodgers and Co. so far, and as the Packers (1-1-1) fail to the Redskins (2-1) on a rainy afternoon.
That was certainly the case in a 31-17 loss at the Washington Redskins on Sunday, when Green Bay fell behind 14-0 and trailed 28-10 at halftime after giving up TD drives of 74, 75, 79 and 98 yards.
Among McCarthy's ailments were his team's 11 penalties for 115 yards - including three for pass interference on one drive - and the most-discussed among those flags was linebacker Clay Matthews' for roughing the passer after he sacked Alex Smith late in the third quarter.

A week after gaining 20 yards on 11 attempts, Adrian Peterson went for 120 yards on 19 runs with a pair of 2-yard TDs.
Smith went 12 for 20 for 220 yards. He also had his streak of 156 consecutive passes without an interception, the longest active run in the league, and in the second quarter, Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix made the pick when Jordan Reed went one way and Smith threw another. Rodgers, who was 27 for 44 for 265 yards passing with two touchdowns - of 64 yards to Germaine Allison and 2 yards to Davante Adams - said he expects to start against Buffalo after again dealing with an injured left knee, which he hurt in Week 1. He wore a bulky brace on his left knee against Washington, and he came up hobbling a bit after some plays, while he moved around in the pocket or scrambled for a gain.
Green Bay's receivers had problems with drops, plus Randall Cobb was stripped of the ball by Fabian Moreau - Josh Norman recovered the fumble - after a completion with about 5½ minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.
The Packers' ground game was limited to 15 carries for 87 yards by running backs.

DETROIT 31 GREEN BAY 23

DETROIT (AP) — The Detroit Lions took advantage of some mistakes they forced Green Bay to make and were fortunate some breaks simply went their way.

Matthew Stafford, who was 14 of 26 for 183 yards, threw two touchdown passes and LeGarrette Blount ran for two scores, lifting the Lions to a 31-23 win over the Packers on Sunday.

DETROIT (2-3) earned a win it desperately needed under first-year coach Matt Patricia, going into its bye week.

Green Bay (2-2-1) had a rough day because veteran Mason Crosby had the worst game of his life and two-time NFL MVP Aaron Rodgers lost two fumbles for just the third time in his 14-year career.

Crosby missed a career-high four field goals in one game and failed to make an extra point to boot. He connected on a field goal with two seconds left, but that wasn't of much consolation after his poor performance.

Detroit recovered an onside kick to seal the win, preventing Rodgers from getting another chance at a Hail Mary in Detroit like the one he threw in 2015.

The Lions built a big lead in the first half: Blount had a pair of 1-yard TD runs in the first quarter and Stafford's 8-yard pass to Marvin Jones late in the second quarter put Detroit up, 24-0.

Rodgers, missing injured receivers Randall Cobb and Geronimo Allison, threw short TDs to rookie Marquez Valdes-Scantling and Lance Kendricks in the third to pull the Packers within 10 points.

Stafford answered with a 5-yard TD pass to Kenny Golladay early in the fourth quarter to give Detroit a 31-14 lead.

Rodgers connected with Davante Adams on a 12-yard throw for a third TD pass, but Crosby hit the left upright on the extra point to let the Lions keep an 11-point lead midway through the fourth quarter.

Rodgers was 32 of 52 for 442 yards — the second-highest total of his career — with three TD passes.

17 Davante Adams, WR, 5th Year, Fresno State

- Has 26 receiving touchdowns since 2016, tied for No. 1 in the league (Steelers WR Antonio Brown) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 21 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in both of the last two seasons (2016-17).
- Ranks No. 2 in the league with 18 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016.
- Posted 237 catches from 2014-17, the fourth most in franchise history by a player in his first four NFL seasons behind WRs Sterling Sharpe (281), Greg Jennings (246) and James Lofton (242).
