GREEN BAY (4-7-1) VS. ATLANTA (4-8)

Sunday, Dec. 9 • Lambeau Field • 12 p.m. CST

PACKERS HOST THE FALCONS ON SUNDAY

The Green Bay Packers will take on the Atlanta Falcons this Sunday at Lambeau Field.

- ▶ Green Bay is 10-4 at home against Atlanta during the regular season.
- ▶ The Packers have won three of the last five regular-season meetings against the Falcons.
- ▶ Nine of the last 11 regular-season matchups between the two have been decided by eight points or less, including six by three or fewer points.
- ▶ Including the postseason, it is the sixth time the Packers and Falcons have played in six years, with Atlanta winning three of the five previous matchups and each team winning their home games.
- ▶ It is the third straight time the Falcons' visit to Lambeau Field has been in Week 14.
- ▶ Dating back to 2002, Green Bay is 11-5 against NFC South teams at home during the regular season, including wins in seven of the last eight contests (pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ The Packers' .688 winning percentage at home against NFC South teams since 2002 is **No. 1 in the NFC** and **No. 5 in the NFL** over that span.
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started seven home games against NFC South teams, throwing 22 touchdowns and four interceptions with a passer rating of 119.5. Rodgers has recorded a passer rating of plus-109.0 in six of the seven contests, including each of the last five (Sportradar).
- ▶ The Packers have won each of the past five home games against NFC South teams with Rodgers as the starter.
- ▶ It is the first time since Weeks 1-2 that the Packers will play back-to-back games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 15, Green Bay goes back on the road to face division foe Chicago. The Packers won the first meeting this season, 24-23, in Week 1. Five of the last six games between the two at Soldier Field have been decided by single digits.



THE FINAL STRETCH

- ▶ Since 2006, the Packers are 39-18 in the regular season in December/January, a .684 winning percentage that ranks **No. 1 in the NFC** and **No. 3 in the NFL** over that span (Sportradar).
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, Green Bay is 24-6 at home in regular-season games in December/January, ranking **No. 2 in the NFL** with a winning percentage of .800, according to Sportradar.
- ▶ With Rodgers as the starter, the Packers are 24-11 in the month of December, including 16-2 at home (according to Sportradar). Rodgers had a streak of 16 straight wins at home in December (2008-16), the second longest in the Super Bowl era behind only Patriots QB Tom Brady (19 games from 2002-12).
- ▶ As a starter, Rodgers has thrown 72 touchdowns and just 19 interceptions with a passer rating of 101.3 in the month of December. His 101.3 rating is **No. 2 in the NFL** among active players (min. 300 pass att.), trailing only Seattle QB Russell Wilson (103.3), according to Sportradar.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 25th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



- ▶ Play-by-play man **Kevin Burkhardt** joins analyst **Charles Davis** and sideline reporter **Pam Oliver**.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ Sports USA Radio will air the game on radio across the country. **Wayne Randazzo** (play-by-play) and **Hank Bauer** (analyst) will call the action.
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 711.

PACKERS VS. FALCONS - WEEK 14

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field and it has continued this season with a 4-1-1 record.

- ▶ Green Bay has 225 victories at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ▶ With the win over the Chicago Bears in Week 1, Green Bay has won six straight home openers (2013-18).
- ▶ Since 2006, Green Bay is 70-22-2 at home during the regular season. The Packers' .755 winning percentage ranks in the top five in the NFL over that span:

- ▶ The Packers are 35-10-1 (.772, **No. 2 in the NFL**) at home in the second half of the season since 2007 with a plus-583 point differential that ranks **No. 2 in the NFL** over that span (pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Green Bay has won five of its past eight home games played in the second half of the regular season (Games 9-16).
- ▶ The Packers' defense has 23 sacks at home this season, **No. 2 in the NFL**:

- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started 76 home games during the regular season for Green Bay, with the Packers holding a 60-15-1 record in those contests. He has completed 1,726 of 2,604 passes (66.3 pct.) for 20,882 yards (274.8 per game), 179 touchdowns, 33 interceptions and a passer rating of 108.4.
- ▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** since 1970 in passer rating at home (min. 500 pass att.) as a starter (Sportradar):

- ▶ Rodgers has led Green Bay to an 10-1-1 record in his last 12 starts at home, recording a passer rating of 100-plus in eight of those games.

- ▶ In six home games this season, Adams has registered 43 receptions (**No. 1 in the NFL**) for 515 yards (12.0 avg.), and his seven touchdowns are **tied for No. 1 in the league** this season:

ASCENDING ADAMS

After earning his first Pro Bowl appearance in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** has recorded his first 1,000-yard receiving season in 2018.

► Adams ranks in the top 10 of the NFL in receiving TDs, receptions and receiving yards this season:

► With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 11 in 2018), Adams joined Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the **only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.**

► Adams is the **only player in the NFL** to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).

► Adams registered the **third-most** receiving touchdowns (37) and **tied for the third-most** receptions (Greg Jennings, 322) by a Green Bay player in their first five seasons (2014-18) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

► Adams' 11 TD receptions this season are tied for the third most through 12 games by a Packer (since 1950) behind only WR Billy Howton (13 in 1952 and 12 in 1956), according to pro-football-reference.com.

► Adams is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** (Julio Jones) with four games with 130-plus receiving yards this season, tied for the **second most in franchise history** (Hutson, five in 1942) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► Adams recorded 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games (Weeks 5-6, 8), joining WR James Lofton (1984) as the **only players in franchise history** to do so, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► Dating back to 2017 (Weeks 14-15, Weeks 1-6 and 8-9 in 2018), Adams recorded five-plus receptions in 10 consecutive games to rank **No. 3 in team history**, trailing Sharpe, who recorded 18 consecutive games in 1993-94 and 13 straight games in 1992-93, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► Adams became the **first player in franchise history** to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season (2018).

► Adams was the first Packer since Jennings (2010) with three straight games with 100-plus receiving yards. Adams finished one short of the franchise record held by Lofton (four in 1982-83) and Hutson (four in 1945).

► Adams' average of 26.6 yards per catch in Week 8 was a career high (min. four receptions).

► Adams finished with 10 receptions for 166 yards (16.6 avg.) in Week 11, his sixth career game with 10-plus catches, **No. 3 in team history:**

► In Week 5, Adams extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his 10th straight road game, and **tied the longest streak in NFL history** (Eagles WR Tommy McDonald, 10, 1959-61).

► Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in each of the first three contests, which extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to last season. He had six TD catches during the streak. It was the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It was also the longest streak by a Packer player since Cobb's streak of six games in 2014.

EFFECTIVE RUNNING GAME

▶ Green Bay is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** this season in games with 95-plus rushing yards (nine).
 ▶ The Packers recorded four straight 100-yard rushing games as a team on 25 or fewer carries (Week 6, Weeks 8-10), the **longest streak in franchise history** and in the league this season (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

▶ Green Bay ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** in average yards per rush this season:

▶ The Packers rank **No. 5 in the NFL** in percentage of rushing plays that gain 10-plus yards (14.8) this season (Sportradar).

▶ Green Bay posted a season-high 195 rushing yards on 25 carries (7.8 avg.) in Week 10, just the third time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers recorded 195-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer carries (at St. Louis Cardinals, Sept. 29, 1985; at Chicago, Dec. 18, 2016).

▶ The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3 at Washington, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).

JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

▶ RB **Aaron Jones** ranks **No. 2 in the NFL** in rushing average (min. 55 att.) this season:

▶ Among running backs with 150-plus career attempts, Jones ranks **No. 4 in NFL history** with an average of 5.65 yards per carry.

▶ Jones ranks **No. 4 among the NFL running backs** in percentage of rushing attempts that gain 10-plus yards (min. 50 carries), according to Sportradar:

▶ Jones has posted at least one rushing TD in four straight games for the first time in his career. He is the first Packer to have a rushing TD in four straight games since RB Eddie Lacy in 2013.

▶ In Weeks 8-10, Jones became the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote in 1951 to have 75-plus rushing yards on 15 or fewer attempts in three straight games.

▶ Jones rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries (9.7 avg.) with a career-best two rushing TDs in Week 10 to become just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards in a game on 15 or fewer carries and the first to accomplish the feat since RB Ahman Green had 15 carries for 163 yards vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.

▶ Jones' 67-yard run late in the first quarter in Week 10 was the longest of his career and the longest by a Packer since WR Randall Cobb's 67-yarder vs. Detroit on Oct. 6, 2013.

▶ In Week 10, Jones rushed for 96 yards on four carries (24.0 avg.) in the first quarter, the most rushing yards by a Packer in a first quarter since Green had 122 rushing yards vs. Detroit in the opening quarter on Sept. 9, 2001. Jones had 101 rushing yards in the first half, the most by a Packer since RB Ty Montgomery posted 123 yards on the ground in the first half at Chicago on Dec. 18, 2016.

▶ Jones had a career-high six runs of 10-plus yards in Week 10, the most by a Packer since Green had six at Minnesota on Nov. 2, 2003.

Joe Philbin: 24-28, .462; 5th NFL season

JOE PHILBIN...Is the Packers' interim head coach.

- ▶ Is in his second stint with the Packers, having coached on Green Bay's staff from 2003-11, including five seasons (2007-11) as offensive coordinator.
- ▶ Helped the Packers offense rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards and total points each year from 2007-11.
- ▶ In 2011, led a Green Bay offense that set single-season franchise records for total points (560), touchdowns (70), total yards (6,482) and net passing yards (4,924).
- ▶ As head coach of the Miami Dolphins from 2012-15, helped Miami increase its win total in 2012 and 2013, one of only four teams in the NFL to improve its record in both of those seasons.
- ▶ Prior to joining the NFL ranks, coached on the collegiate level for 19 seasons.

DAN QUINN...Is in his fourth year as the Falcons' 16th head coach.

- ▶ Guided the Falcons to a 10-6 record in 2017, marking the third time that the club has posted back-to-back seasons of 10-plus wins.
- ▶ Led Atlanta to the franchise's second NFC Championship in 2016 en route to an appearance in Super Bowl LI.
- ▶ Coached a high-powered offense in 2016 with the Falcons, finishing second in the NFL in passing touchdowns and total yards per game.
- ▶ Coached Atlanta to a 5-0 start in 2015, the best start for a head coach in franchise history.
- ▶ Coordinated a Seattle defense that led the league in yards allowed per game, passing yards allowed per game and points allowed per game for two consecutive seasons (2013-14).

THE PACKERS-FALCONS SERIES

- ▶ Green Bay averaged 34.4 points while winning the first five games of the series, with the first coming in 1966 en route to becoming the first Super Bowl champions.
- ▶ In 1992, Atlanta won the first game of the series after trading QB Brett Favre to Green Bay in February.
- ▶ Favre and the Packers won the next two games against the Falcons, including a 37-20 win in the 1995 NFC Wild Card, where Green Bay held Atlanta to only 21 rushing yards.
- ▶ The Falcons won both contests in 2016 and the matchup in 2017 after losing four consecutive games to the Packers from 2011-14.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers LB Clay Matthews is the elder cousin of Falcons T Jake Matthews... TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

▶ Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the **first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs.**

▶ It was the sixth 400-yard passing game for Rodgers, a **franchise record.** No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).

▶ Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the **first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games,** the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.

▶ Rodgers tied Manning for the **fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards,** trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Dan Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

▶ Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt.

▶ Rodgers passed his own franchise record (seven in 2016) with eight straight games (min. 15 att.) without an interception.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season. It is the first time in his career that he has registered 15-plus touchdowns and one or fewer interceptions in the first 12 games of the season (21/1). Dating back to 1950, he is the **only player in the NFL** with 20-plus TDs and one or fewer INTs in his team's first 12 games of the season, according to pro-football-reference.com.

- ▶ In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ▶ With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ▶ Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

- ▶ Over 40 percent of the players (23 of 53, 43.4 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 41 of them (77.4 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Dec. 9) and 30 players (56.6 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- ▶ The Packers have eight players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with five of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Randall Cobb, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 37 began their pro careers with the Packers (69.8 percent).

CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL

LB **Clay Matthews** continues to make an impact on opposing offenses. He leads the team in QB pressures (16) and is tied for No. 2 on the team in QB hits (seven) this season.

- In 2017, Matthews recorded a sack in three consecutive games that he appeared in (Weeks 11, 13-14), marking the eighth time he has recorded a sack in at least three straight games that he has played in during the same regular season.
- For the seventh time in his career, Matthews registered at least six sacks (team-high 7.5) and forced a fumble in 2017, which **tied for the third-most seasons** with six-plus sacks and one or more forced fumbles since 2009 (Ryan Kerrigan, eight and Julius Peppers, nine).
- In Week 4 of 2017, Matthews registered a sack/forced fumble of Bears QB Mike Glennon to move past DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila to set the team record:

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started all 25 games he has played in since the start of the 2017 season.

- ▶ Clark is **tied for No. 11** among players listed as defensive tackles and defensive lineman with a career-best six sacks this season (Sportradar).
- ▶ He is tied for No. 2 on the team in QB hits (seven) this season.
- ▶ Clark is **tied for No. 4 in the NFL** with two defensive fumble recoveries this season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ In Week 8, Clark tied his career high with two sacks against the Rams. Dating back to 2016, he is **tied for No. 2 on the Packers** in multi-sack games (Perry, three), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ▶ The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- ▶ According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the **most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December** in a single season (since 1982).

- ▶ Green Bay has had 16 different players record at least a half-sack this season, the second most in team history (since 1982), trailing only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that featured 17 different players for the Packers posting at least a half-sack.
- ▶ Green Bay ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** in sack yards (274) this season, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ The Packers are the only team in the league to register two games this season with 50-plus sack yards (64 vs. Buffalo in Week 4 / 50 vs. Miami in Week 10). It is tied for the second most in a season in team history (three games in 1978) and it is the first time Green Bay has had two games since 1998.
- ▶ The Packers have recorded 24.0 sacks in the second half this season, **the most in the NFL**, according to Sportradar:

- ▶ Green Bay has 38 sacks on the season, **tied for the sixth most** by the Packers in the team's first 12 games dating back to 1963.
- ▶ The Packers recorded six sacks against the Dolphins in Week 10, with six different players recording a sack. It marked Green Bay's second game this season with six-plus sacks (seven vs. Buffalo in Week 4), **tied for No. 2 in the NFL**.

RACKING UP POINTS

- ▶ **K Mason Crosby** is moving his way up the record books.
- ▶ Crosby has played in 188 straight games for the Packers, passing T Forrest Gregg for the **second most all-time** behind only QB Brett Favre (255).
- ▶ Crosby has been named NFC Special teams Player of the Week a team-record seven times in his career, including this season after hitting a game-winning field goal in Week 6.
- ▶ Crosby ranks **No. 11 in the NFL** in scoring this season with 93 points.
- ▶ Crosby has recorded a game-winning field goal in each of the last three seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati, 2018 vs. San Francisco).
- ▶ In Week 4, Crosby hit two 52-yard field goals, joining Ryan Longwell (at Atlanta, Nov. 13, 2005) as the only Packers to make two 50-plus-yard field goals in a regular-season game. It was the first time two field goals of 50-plus yards had been made by a kicker at Lambeau Field. Crosby had previously connected on two 50-plus field goals (56, 51) in the 2016 NFC Divisional Playoff win at Dallas.
- ▶ Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- ▶ Crosby passed Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- Dating back to 2006, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- Since 2006, only eight of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records at or above .500.

340 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Arizona Cardinals in Week 13 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 340 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Green Bay is 4-1-1 at home this season with a .750 winning percentage that ranks **No. 11 in the NFL**.
- Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 98th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 19 by the National Football League.

- ▶ For the second consecutive season, the Packers opened the season at home and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 1, Green Bay hosted Chicago on Sunday night, marking the 13th consecutive regular season that the Packers and Bears have squared off in primetime.
- ▶ It was the first time Green Bay opened the season at home against the Bears since playing them on Sunday night in Week 1 of the 2009 season, a 21-15 win for the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay hosted Minnesota in Week 2, marking the first time since 2012 that the Packers played two home games to open the season. It also marked just the third time (2003, 2008) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ▶ The Packers' first road contest was at the Redskins, marking Green Bay's first September visit to Washington.
- ▶ The Packers returned home to take on the Buffalo Bills in Week 4. It was the second-coldest September game (49 degrees at kickoff) at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Washington Redskins on Sept. 24, 2001 (46 degrees).
- ▶ In Week 5, they traveled to Detroit to play the Lions.
- ▶ In Week 6, Green Bay hosted the San Francisco 49ers on *Monday Night Football*. It was the fifth time in the last six seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on *MNF*. The temperature at kickoff was 37 degrees, the second-coldest October game at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Minnesota Vikings on Oct. 26, 1980 (36 degrees).
- ▶ After the second Week 7 bye for Green Bay in the last four seasons (2015), the Packers will play four of five games on the road.
- ▶ Green Bay made its first trip to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 1990 to play the Rams.
- ▶ In Week 9, the Packers traveled to the other side of the country to play the Patriots on Sunday night.
- ▶ It was the second consecutive time the Packers and Patriots faced off on a Sunday night in New England (2010).
- ▶ Green Bay returned home to take on the Miami Dolphins before a quick turnaround to play the Seahawks, marking the Packers' second Thursday night game at Seattle (Week 1 in 2014). Including the postseason, it was the seventh time Green Bay and Seattle have played since 2012.
- ▶ November finished with a trip to play the Vikings on Sunday night, marking the sixth straight season that the teams met in a prime-time game.
- ▶ Green Bay opened the final month of the regular season against Arizona, only the second time the Cardinals played at Lambeau Field in December (Dec. 21, 1969).
- ▶ The Packers will play back-to-back home games for only the second time in 2018 when they host the Atlanta Falcons in Week 14. It will be the fourth matchup (including postseason) between Green Bay and Atlanta in the last three seasons.
- ▶ The Packers end the season with two road games in the final three weeks for the seventh straight year.
- ▶ In Week 15, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place it has won in the regular season each of the last seven years. The Packers have scored 30-plus points at Chicago in four of the last five matchups (33, 38, 31, 30, 23).
- ▶ The Packers' road slate will finish up with a game at the New York Jets, the third December game at the Jets in team history (1981, 2002). Three of the last four games at New York have been decided by single digits, including one game that went to overtime.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the third straight year and the fourth time in the last five seasons.

PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE

WR Randall Cobb, 7th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ In Week 1, led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards (13th 100-yard receiving game of his career) on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- ▶ Despite missing a game, was No. 2 on the team with 66 receptions in 2017. It was the fourth consecutive season he registered 60-plus receptions.
- ▶ Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- ▶ Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ▶ Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team history.
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

LT David Bakhtiari, 6th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ▶ Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2016 and 2017, joining Forrest Gregg (1959-60, 1962-67) as the only Green Bay tackles to be named to an AP All-Pro team in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- ▶ Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ▶ Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ▶ Has played in 74 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but three of his 45 starts (LT in Week 4-5 of 2017, RG in Week 13 of 2015) taking place at LG.
- ▶ Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ▶ A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C Corey Linsley, 5th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ▶ Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was the only Packers offensive lineman to start every game during the 2017 season.
- ▶ Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games of the 2016 season.
- ▶ Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.
- ▶ Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Byron Bell, 8th Year, New Mexico, FA-18

- ▶ Signed by Green Bay as a free agent during the 2018 offseason and has seen action in all 12 games with nine starts, all coming at right guard.
- ▶ Originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of New Mexico by the Carolina Panthers in 2011. After four seasons (2011-14) with the Panthers, spent two years with the Tennessee Titans (2015-16) and a season with the Dallas Cowboys (2017).
- ▶ Played in 90 games with 74 starts from 2011-17, and started all three postseason contests he appeared in.
- ▶ Played in 37 games with 36 starts at New Mexico, starting 24 games at LT over his final two seasons after making 12 starts at RT as a sophomore.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ▶ Has played in 97 career regular-season games with 93 starts at right tackle.
- ▶ Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season.
- ▶ Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ▶ Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18

- ▶ Among tight ends (min. 30 rec.), ranks No. 6 in yards per reception (12.2), No. 8 in receiving yards (536) and is tied for No. 9 in receptions (44) this season, according to Sportradar.
- ▶ His 71 career touchdowns rank No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends.
- ▶ Last season, led NFL tight ends with 10 receiving TDs, which marked his fourth season with 10-plus touchdown receptions to tie Antonio Gates for the second most 10-touchdown-catch seasons among tight ends (Rob Gronkowski, five).
- ▶ Has been selected to the Pro Bowl five times in his career (2011, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017) and was named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2013.
- ▶ Is the only tight end in NFL history to have two seasons with 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving TDs (2011, 2013).
- ▶ From 2015-17, he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a third-round pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- ▶ Is the only player in the NFL to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (2016-18).
- ▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season.
- ▶ With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the last three seasons (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 2018), he joined Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.
- ▶ Registered the third-most receptions (314) and tied for the third most receiving touchdowns (36) by a Green Bay player in their first five seasons (2014-18) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).

WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, Rookie, South Florida, D5c-18

- ▶ Leads the team with 16.0 yards per reception (min. 15 receptions).
- ▶ In Week 8 at New England, totaled 101 yards on three receptions (33.7 avg.), becoming the first Packer since Max McGee (1959) to have two 100-yard receiving games in a season on three or fewer receptions.
- ▶ Posted an average of 17.3 yards per catch on his 75 receptions at USF, the top mark in school history (min. 70 receptions).
- ▶ Played first two seasons at North Carolina State (2013-14), posting 44 receptions for 538 yards (12.2 avg.) and a TD before transferring to USF, where he played two seasons (2016-17).

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- ▶ His career passer rating of 103.4 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ In 154 regular-season starts (98-55-1 record), has posted 55 games with 300-plus passing yards, 95 without an interception and 85 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Aaron Jones, 2nd Year, Texas-El Paso, D5b-17

- ▶ Leads the Packers with 642 rushing yards and ranks No. 2 in the NFL with an average of 5.7 yards per carry (min. 55 att.) this season.
- ▶ Is the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote (1951) with three straight games with 75-plus rushing yards and 15 or fewer carries (Weeks 8-10).
- ▶ Recorded 448 rushing yards and four TDs as a rookie and his 5.53-yard rushing average ranked No. 6 in franchise single-season history (min. 75 att.)
- ▶ Registered two 125-yard rushing games in 2017, tied for the most in franchise history by a Green Bay rookie.
- ▶ Finished career at UTEP ranked No. 1 in school history in rushing yards (4,114).



PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

DE Dean Lowry, 3rd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16

- ▶ Has a sack in three of the last four games.
- ▶ Tied for No. 3 on the team with 13 QB pressures this season.
- ▶ Made first career start in the 2017 season-opening win over Seattle and went on to start at total of 11 games while playing in all 16 last season.
- ▶ Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.
- ▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13 vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.
- ▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern.
- ▶ Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defended.

NT Tyler Lancaster, Rookie, Northwestern, FA-18

- ▶ Has played in seven games with two starts this season.
- ▶ Spent the first four weeks of the season on the Packers' practice squad before being promoted to the active roster on Oct. 6.
- ▶ Signed as an undrafted free agent by Green Bay on May 4, 2018.
- ▶ Was a team captain as a senior, earning honorable mention All-Big Ten for a defense that ranked No. 9 in the NCAA in rushing defense.
- ▶ Played in 40 games with 39 starts over four seasons for Northwestern, racking up 101 tackles (46 solo), 18.5 tackles for a loss, 3.5 sacks and two forced fumbles.

DE Kenny Clark, 3rd Year, UCLA, D1-16

- ▶ Ranks No. 2 on the team with a career-best six sacks this season.
- ▶ Is tied for No. 2 on the team in QB hits (seven) this season.
- ▶ Despite missing Week 12 due to injury, set career highs in tackles (78, No. 4 on the team) and sacks (4.5, No. 4 on the team) in 2017.
- ▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).
- ▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ▶ Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

OLB Clay Matthews, 10th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ▶ Leads the team in QB pressures (16) and is tied for No. 2 on the team in QB hits (seven) this season.
- ▶ With 82.5 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history. Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2017 despite missing two games.
- ▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- ▶ For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).
- ▶ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Blake Martinez, 3rd Year, Stanford, D4a-16

- ▶ Leads the Packers in total tackles (108) and solo tackles (72) this season.
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 on the Packers with 158 total tackles (107 solo) during the 2017 season. Dating back to 1975, it was the 14th time and first time since A.J. Hawk (153) in 2013 that a Green Bay player reached 150 tackles in a season.
- ▶ Registered 10-plus tackles in seven games in 2017 (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit, 17 at Pittsburgh, 10 vs. Tampa Bay).
- ▶ Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ▶ Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

ILB Antonio Morrison, 3rd Year, Florida, FA-18

- ▶ Has played in all 12 games with six starts this season.
- ▶ Acquired by the Packers in a trade with the Indianapolis Colts on Aug. 26, 2018, in exchange for CB Lenzy Pipkins.

- ▶ Originally selected by the Colts in the fourth round (No. 125 overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft out of the University of Florida.
- ▶ In two seasons with Indianapolis, played in 31 games with 19 starts and registered 154 tackles (91 solo), six tackles for a loss and a pass defended. Started all 15 games he played in at inside linebacker last season and led the team with a career-high 108 tackles (64 solo).

OLB Kyler Fackrell, 3rd Year, Utah State, D3-16

- ▶ After tying for No. 2 on the team with 20 QB pressures in 2017, he leads the Packers with 8.0 sacks this season.
- ▶ According to Sportradar, is tied for No. 5 among NFL linebackers in sacks this season.
- ▶ Is tied for the fifth-most three-sack games (two) in franchise history (since 1982), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Became one of just 15 players in school history to earn first-team or second-team all-conference recognition three times during his career (2012-13, 2015).
- ▶ Entered college as a walk-on in 2011 before a scholarship opened up in the fall.

CB Jaire Alexander, Rookie, Louisville, D1-18

- ▶ Has played in 11 games with eight starts this season, ranking No. 1 on the team with 13 passes defended.
- ▶ Registered five passes defended against the Los Angeles Rams in Week 8, the most by a Green Bay defender this season.
- ▶ Was just the third Louisville defensive back in school history to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.
- ▶ Played in 31 games with 19 starts during his three seasons with the Cardinals, earning second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016.

CB Kevin King, 2nd Year, Washington, D1-17

- ▶ Appeared in nine games with five starts as a rookie in 2017, registering 31 tackles (23 solo), a tackle for a loss and eight passes defended before being placed on injured reserve (shoulder) on Dec. 6.
- ▶ Despite being limited to nine games due to injury, his five starts were the third most among Packers rookies in 2017 (S Josh Jones and RB Jamaal Williams both had seven).
- ▶ Played in all 48 games with 35 starts in his four seasons at Washington and registered 165 tackles (107 solo), 8½ tackles for a loss, six interceptions, 28 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Earned honorable mention All-Pacific-12 recognition as a junior and senior.
- ▶ Was named first-team All-East Bay by the *Contra Costa Times* as a senior at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif., where he was coached by former NFL linebacker Hardy Nickerson.

S Tramon Williams, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-18

- ▶ After starting the first seven games of the season at CB, started at S in each of the past five games.
- ▶ Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- ▶ Is the only active player in the NFL with at least one INT in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).
- ▶ Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.
- ▶ Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

S Kentrell Brice, 3rd Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-16

- ▶ Recorded his first career sack in Week 1 as part of a 12-tackle (nine solo) performance.
- ▶ Started a career-best three games in 2017 and set career highs in tackles (24), solo tackles (21), interceptions (one) and passes defended (four) despite only playing in six contests before being placed on injured reserve with an ankle injury on Nov. 3.
- ▶ Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's Week 1 roster and joined S Marwin Evans as the only rookie free agents to play in all 16 regular-season games and three postseason contests for the Packers in 2016.

GREEN BAY WRs (AP) — Aaron Rodgers heard the applause after walking out of the stadium tunnel and back on to the field. The team doctor had checked out his left knee after the Green Bay Packers quarterback was carried off the field in the second quarter. Rodgers, it seemed, had avoided a major injury. He was good to go. The adrenaline kicked in.

The hobbling wide-time NFL MVP threw three touchdown passes in the second half after returning from injury, and the Green Bay Packers overcame a 20-point deficit for a thrilling 24-23 win over the Chicago Bears on Sunday night.

Rodgers connected with receiver Randall Cobb for a catch-and-run through the secondary for a 75-yard touchdown and the go-ahead score with 2:13 left in the game.

Nick Perry saved the Bears' Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 58 seconds to complete the comeback.

Sunday marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

The Packers posted the second-largest comeback in franchise history at Lambeau Field, behind only a rally from 21 points down to beat New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989.

For Rodgers, this was special. And especially because how awful the Packers played in the first half.

A Chicago defense featuring newly acquired star linebacker Khalil Mack dominated until the third quarter. Mack had a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown against backup quarterback Desmond Haizer in the second quarter.

A gimpy Rodgers returned in the second half and finally figured out the Bears. He also found Davante Adams and Jeronimo Allison for touchdowns passes. He finished 20 of 30 for 286 yards, including 17 of 23 for 273 yards in the second half.

It was Rodgers' first regular-season home game since Sept. 28 against the Bears. He was limited to seven games in 2017 because of a collarbone injury.

Mack nearly stole the show. He also stripped the ball for a turnover in the red zone off Kizer in the second quarter. Mack made an immediate impact in his first game since the Bears acquired the premier pass rusher in a blockbuster deal with the Oakland Raiders.

The Bears led 20-0 at one point and their defense dominated until the second half. Then Rodgers returned, and the Packers' defense held the Bears in check.

Trubisky was 23 of 35 for 171 yards. He also ran for 32 yards on seven carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Vikings kicker Daniel Carlson missed two field goals in overtime, including one from 35 yards as time expired, and Minnesota had to settle for a 29-29 tie with the Green Bay Packers after rallying from a late 13-point deficit on Sunday.
The rookie's final attempt went to the right of the uprights. Just like his kick from 49 earlier in overtime, Carlson also missed from 48 in the second quarter.
Packers kicker Mason Crosby matched a career high with five field goals, but his potential game-winner from 52 went wide left as time expired in regulation.
The result at Lambeau Field overshadowed memorable performances from both quarterbacks.
Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers played with a brace on his injured left knee and threw for 281 yards and a 9-yard touchdown pass to Devante Adams. But a mishandled handoff with 5:17 left in overtime cost the Packers a chance at another long field-goal attempt. Rodgers recovered the fumble on second-and-1 at the 37, and he was sacked on third down to push Green Bay back to the 47.
Minnesota's Kirk Cousins threw for 425 yards and four touchdowns, including three in the fourth quarter. He also threw an interception to Ha Ha Clinton-Dix after the ball bounced off the hands of Aaron Treadwell with 2:13 left.
Everything seemed to go the Vikings' way in the fourth, when they rallied from a 20-7 deficit. Until that point, the Packers had put together the kind of complete performance needed to support Rodgers, who got hurt in Green Bay's opening victory against Chicago.
Facing double coverage, Adams Thielen still caught a 22-yard touchdown pass from Cousins with 31 seconds left on a drive that included a roughing-the-passer penalty on Clay Matthews. Stefan Diggs caught a 2-point conversion pass to tie it at 29.
The penalty negated an interception by Jair Alexander with 1:45 left that would have allowed the Packers to run out the clock. Referee Tony Corrae said the call was not related to the new helmet-to-helmet rule.
Rodgers, who finished 30 of 42, didn't have his typical mobility that allows him to buy time for receivers. But he was able to move around enough to scramble out of trouble on occasion, operating out of shotgun or pistol formations also brought Rodgers more time.
The Packers (1-0-1), though, could have used more touchdowns from the offense. They did get one on special teams after Geromimo Allison blocked a punt that was recovered by Josh Jackson in the end zone for a touchdown.
Thielen had 12 catches for 131 yards for Minnesota (1-0-1), while Diggs had nine catches for 128 yards and two scores.

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — Things have not gone all that well for Aaron Rodgers and Co. so far, and as the Packers (1-1-1) fail to the Redskins (2-1) on a rainy afternoon.

That was certainly the case in a 31-17 loss at the Washington Redskins on Sunday, when Green Bay fell behind 14-0 and trailed 28-10 at halftime after giving up TD drives of 74, 75, 79 and 98 yards.

Among McCarthy's ailments were his team's 11 penalties for 115 yards - including three for pass interference on one drive - and the most-discussed among those flags was linebacker Clay Matthews' for roughing the passer after he sacked Alex Smith late in the third quarter.

A week after gaining 20 yards on 11 attempts, Adrian Peterson went for 120 yards on 19 runs with a pair of 2-yard TDs.

Smith went 12 for 20 for 220 yards. He also had his streak of 156 consecutive passes without an interception, the longest active run in the league, and in the second quarter, Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix made the pick when Jordan Reed went one way and Smith threw another. Rodgers, who was 27 for 44 for 265 yards passing with two touchdowns - of 64 yards to Germaine Allison and 2 yards to Davante Adams - said he expects to start against Buffalo after again dealing with an injured left knee, which he hurt in Week 1. He wore a bulky brace on his left knee against Washington, and he came up hobbling a bit after some plays where he moved around in the pocket or scrambled for a gain.

Green Bay's receivers had problems with drops, plus Randall Cobb was stripped of the ball by Fabian Moreau - Josh Norman recovered the fumble - after a completion with about 5½ minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

The Packers' ground game was limited to 15 carries for 87 yards by running backs.

DETROIT 31 GREEN BAY 23

DETROIT (AP) — The Detroit Lions took advantage of some mistakes they forced Green Bay to make and were fortunate some breaks simply went their way.

Matthew Stafford, who was 14 of 26 for 183 yards, threw two touchdown passes and LeGarrette Blount ran for two scores, lifting the Lions to a 31-23 win over the Packers on Sunday.

Detroit (2-3) earned a win it desperately needed under first-year coach Matt Patricia, going into its bye week.

Green Bay (2-2-1) had a rough day because veteran Mason Crosby had the worst game of his life and two-time NFL MVP Aaron Rodgers lost two fumbles for just the third time in his 14-year career.

Crosby missed a career-high four field goals in one game and failed to make an extra point to boot. He connected on a field goal with two seconds left, but that wasn't of much consolation after his poor performance.

Detroit recovered an onside kick to seal the win, preventing Rodgers from getting another chance at a Hail Mary in Detroit like the one he threw in 2015.

The Lions built a big lead in the first half: Blount had a pair of 1-yard TD runs in the first quarter and Stafford's 8-yard pass to Marvin Jones late in the second quarter put Detroit up, 24-0.

Rodgers, missing injured receivers Randall Cobb and Aaroniso Allison, threw short TDs to rookie Marquez Valdes-Scantling and Lance Kendricks in the third to pull the Packers within 10 points.

Stafford answered with a 5-yard TD pass to Kenny Golladay early in the fourth quarter to give Detroit a 31-14 lead.

Rodgers connected with Davante Adams on a 12-yard throw for a third TD pass, but Crosby hit the left upright on the extra point to let the Lions keep an 11-point lead midway through the fourth quarter.

Rodgers was 32 of 52 for 442 yards — the second-highest total of his career — with three TD passes.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Aaron Rodgers can't lead a game-winning drive if he never gets the ball. That was the whole idea when Los Angeles Rams kicker Matt Scott blocked a punt by Green Bay Packers punter Matt LaCosmo on the sideline in the unbeaten Rams' eighth victory.

Greg Zuerlein hit a 34-yard field goal with 2:05 left before Wilson forced and recovered Montgomery's fumble on the ensuing kickoff, and Goff's prudent decision to go down wrapped up the Rams' 29-27 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Sunday.

Jared Goff passed for 295 yards and three touchdowns while the Rams (8-0) were sternly tested by the Packers (3-3-1).

Both teams rallied from 10-point deficits to take a lead in front of a rollicking, bipartisan Coliseum crowd, but the Rams extended their best start since 1969 by capitalizing on two crushing special-teams mistakes by Green Bay.

Rodgers threw for 286 yards, but he didn't get a snap in the final 5:20.

Marquez Valdes-Scantling caught a 40-yard touchdown pass from Rodgers with 8:50 left to put the Packers ahead 27-26, but Goff and Gundry drove the Rams into range for Zuerlein's second field goal of the fourth quarter after a 25-yard punt by JK Scott.

Montgomery then coughed up his return, and Wilson pounced on the ball. Packers coach Mike McCarthy said the return man was supposed to take a touchback.

In the final minute, Gundry ran 17 yards for a key first down and stopped before reaching the end zone, allowing the Rams to run out the clock.

Just Reynolds caught two touchdown passes for Los Angeles. Gundry had 114 yards rushing and 81 yards receiving, and he scored a touchdown in his franchise-record-tying 11th consecutive game on a 30-yard pass in the third quarter.

The Rams faced their largest deficit of the remarkable season when they trailed 10-0 early in the second quarter, but they calmly turned it into a 23-13 lead late in the third.

Rodgers answered with two touchdown drives to grab a one-point lead for Green Bay in the fourth quarter, but Goff countered his falloff Cal product and childhood hero after Aaron Donald sacked Rodgers on third down to stop the Packers' next drive.

Both teams had loud contingents of fans at the Coliseum, where Green Bay won the first Super Bowl in 1967. The Packers were greeted by a raucous bunch of California Greshams in Green Bay's first trip to Los Angeles since the NFL returned in 2016.

After Reynolds scored on a 19-yard grab late in the third, the Packers responded with Aaron Jones' 33-yard TD draw run up the middle with 13 seconds left.

SEATTLE (AP) — After a shaky beginning, Russell Wilson got hot in the fourth quarter. Bobby Wagner and Seattle's defense stymied Aaron Rodgers and the Seahawks stayed in the middle of the NFC playoff race.

Wilson threw for 225 yards, and his 15-yard touchdown pass to Ed Dickson with 5:08 left was the difference in the Seahawks' 27-24 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Thursday night.

In a key matchup in the battle for the two NFC wild-card spots, Seattle (5-5) snapped a two-game losing streak by overcoming an early 14-3 deficit. Wilson was inconsistent at times early, but was outstanding in the fourth quarter, capping the winning drive by recognizing a blitz and hitting Dickson quickly for his second TD pass of the night.

Seattle still has not lost three straight games since the middle of the 2011 season, and the Seahawks finally closed out a one-score victory after consecutive close losses to the Chargers and Rams. Seattle was 1-8 in its previous nine games decided by one score.

Rodgers had a huge first half and threw for 332 yards, but the Packers (4-5-1) had just one scoring drive in the second half, helped by a 57-yard strike from Rodgers to Davante Adams. Rodgers threw a pair of touchdown passes in the first half, but never got the ball back after Green Bay punted with 4:20 left. Seattle got first-down runs from Wilson and Mike Davis and finished the game kneeling three times. Chris Carson rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown, overcoming the mistake of fumbling on the first play of the game and setting up Green Bay's opening score. Tyler Lockett had two key receptions late in the fourth quarter and Doug Baldwin had his first TD catch of the season for Seattle.

Rodgers was 21-of-30 passing with 10 of those going to Adams for 166 yards receiving. Backup tight end Robert Tomyan had the first catch of his career on for a 54-yard touchdown to give Green Bay an early 14-3 lead. The Packers led 21-17 at halftime after Aaron Jones caught a 24-yard TD pass from Rodgers in the final minute of the half, but Green Bay's offense was stymied in the second half.

Jones finished with 40 yards rushing after going for a career-high 149 a week ago. Rodgers was sacked five times, four of those in the second half. The Packers gained just 114 yards in the second half, half coming on the one throw from Rodgers to Adams. That pass set up Mason Crosby's 36-yard field goal with 8:23 left to give Green Bay a 24-20 lead.

Wilson had one more answer. Wilson hit Lockett on consecutive plays for 18 yards — to convert a third-down — and 34 yards to the Green Bay 16. Two plays later, facing another third-and-long, Wilson recognized the blitz and hit Dickson quickly over the middle to put Seattle in front.

That proved to be enough. On Green Bay's next drive, Rodgers short-hopped a pass on third-and-2.

Rather than going for it on fourth down, Green Bay punted and never got the ball back.

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Once Kirk Cousins and the Minnesota Vikings took the lead on Green Bay, they played with a fierce refusal to let it go.

They held onto the ball with the same determination. Cousins bounced back from his worst game of the season with 342 passing yards and three touchdowns without a fumble or an interception, and the Vikings overcame some early gaffes to outlast the depleted Packers for a 24-17 victory on Sunday night. Completing 29 of his 38 attempts, Cousins found Dalvin Cook, Stefon Diggs and Adam Thielen for scores. Diggs and Thielen had eight receptions apiece.

Sheldon Richardson had two sacks to lead the defense's game-long stifling of Aaron Rodgers, and the Vikings (6-4-1) pushed the Packers (4-6-1) further back in the NFC wild card race.

Rodgers threw a touchdown pass to Davante Adams and Aaron Jones scored on a short run for a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter, but the Packers fell to 0-6 on the road this season and 1-5-1 against the Vikings in their last seven meetings. Their final seven possessions produced only one field goal, with five punts and one turnover on downs.

With Randall Cobb out (hamstring) for a sixth game this season and rookies Equanimeous St. Brown (elbow) and Trevor Davis (hamstring) forced out in the second half, Rodgers didn't have much to work with down the field. Left guard Lane Taylor (quadriceps) departed in the third quarter and left tackle David Bakhtiari (knee) was sidelined briefly in the second half, leaving the protection shaky at best. Rodgers finished 17 for 28 for 198 yards, without a turnover.

The Packers failed to move the chains on eight of 10 third downs. Jones was stuffed on fourth-and-inches by Harrison Smith, Danielle Hunter and Eric Kendricks midway through the third quarter, giving the Vikings the ball at the Green Bay 44. That set up a 37-yard field goal by Dan Bailey for Minnesota's first lead of the game.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — The Arizona Cardinals pulled off an upset at Lambeau Field that was so much a stunner that the Green Bay Packers fired coach Mike McCarthy after the game.
Zane Gonzalez kicked a 44-yard field goal with 1:41 left. Green Bay's Mason Crosby missed a 49-yard attempt as time expired and the Cardinals braved windy conditions to hold on for a 20-17 victory on Sunday.
The Packers (4-7-1) announced McCarthy's dismissal amid the postgame availabilities with the media. Team president Mark Murphy made the move after Green Bay took another debilitating hit to its fading playoff hopes.
For McCarthy, a tenure highlighted by a Super Bowl win in the 2010 season ends with a loss to Arizona (9-9).
Cardinals rookie Josh Rosen struggled for much of the afternoon, but hit Larry Fitzgerald for a sliding 32-yard completion on third-and-23 to help set up Gonzalez's winning kick.
Crosby pushed his kick wide right, with the flags stop Lambeau blowing in toward the field at the time of the play. Green Bay's playoff hopes took another significant blow.
Gonzalez just joined the team this week after Phil Dawson was placed on injured reserve. The Cardinals had a patchwork offensive line, which didn't hold well for what had been the league's worst offense coming into the day.
Aaron Rodgers was 37 of 50 for 233 yards and a touchdown. A complete throws looked off especially in the first half, and receivers had a few drops.
The offense regained some swagger after Rodgers orchestrated a 95-yard drive that led to Aaron Jones' 8-yard touchdown run with 5:26 left, tying it at 17. Davante Adams tipped the sideline for a 19-yard catch to extend that drive.
But too many missed opportunities and drops caught up with the Packers in the end. They struggled on third down, going 3 for 14 in the continuation of a season-long theme.
Rookie Chase Edmunds ran for two touchdowns for Arizona. Rosen was 11 of 26 for 149 yards, making just enough plays in front of a makeshift offensive line.
Rosen's 32-yard completion to Fitzgerald sapped momentum from the Packers after Arizona was pushed back to its own 12. Dean Lowry sacked Rosen on first down, and Rosen threw an incomplete on second-and-18 following a botched snap.
A 16-yard completion to Adams with 13:42 left in the second quarter gave Rodgers the team record for attempts without an interception. Hall of Fame Bart Starr set the previous mark of 294 from 1964-65.

17 Davante Adams, WR, 5th Year, Fresno State

- Has 33 receiving touchdowns since 2016, tied for No. 1 in the league over that span with Steelers WR Antonio Brown. Has caught at least one TD pass in 26 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Is the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.
- Is the lone player in the NFL to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons. Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.
- Leads the league with 24 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016, five more than any other player.
- Has posted 322 catches since entering the league in 2014, tied with WR Greg Jennings for the second most in franchise history by a player in his first five NFL seasons behind only Sharpe (389). His 37 career receiving TDs are the third most in team annals by a player in his first five seasons behind only WR Antonio Freeman (42) and Jennings (40).
- Led the team with 74 catches for a team-high 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 TDs in 2017. Was tied for No. 2 in the NFL in TD receptions and was named to his first career Pro Bowl (injury replacement for Falcons WR Julio Jones).

2018 SEASON: Has started all 12 games and leads the team with a career-high 85 receptions for a career-best 1,115 yards (13.1 avg.) and a team-high 11 TDs...Is tied for No. 2 in the NFL in receiving TDs, ranks No. 5 in receptions and tied for No. 6 in receiving yards...Leads the league with 10 TD catches in the red zone...Has posted a TD catch in nine games this season (tied for No. 2 in the NFL), which matches his career high set in 2016...His 85 receptions are the second most in team history through the first 12 games of the season behind only Sharpe's 86 in 1993...Registered five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games this season, the first player in franchise history to accomplish that feat...Has a team-high 13 receptions of 20-plus yards...Leads the league with 394 receiving yards on third down and is tied for No. 5 with 20 receptions on third down...Is tied for No. 1 in the NFL (Falcons WR Julio Jones) with four 130-yard receiving games this season, tied for the second most in a season in franchise history (Hutson, five in 1942)...Has averaged 103.8 receiving yards per game since Week 5, No. 1 in the league over that span.

► **Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started and played 59 of 60 snaps, hauling in five passes for 88 yards (17.6 avg.) and a TD...It marked his fourth straight game with a receiving TD against the Bears, giving him five TDs over that span...Early in the fourth quarter, created separation on a double move, beating CB Prince Amukamara as he hauled in QB Aaron Rodgers' pass near the Green Bay 40 before taking it down the middle of the field to the Chicago 24 for a 51-yard gain...Three plays later, caught a short pass from Rodgers just inside the 10 before beating Amukamara down the sideline as he got to the pylon for the 12-yard TD.

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Started and played 75 of 77 snaps, leading the team with eight receptions for 64 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD...It marked his third straight game with a TD catch against the Vikings and his career-high fourth consecutive regular-season game overall with a TD reception...Early in the second quarter, caught a quick-out from Rodgers near the 2-yard line, eluding LB Anthony Barr and CB Xavier Rhodes on his way to the end zone for the score.

► **At Washington (Sept. 23):** Started and played 68 of 69 snaps, pacing the team with seven receptions for 52 yards (7.4 avg.) and a TD...Scored on a slant on Green Bay's opening drive of the second half, hauling in the pass from Rodgers and fighting through a tackle attempt by CB Quinton Dunbar for the 2-yard score...Extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his ninth straight road game, tied for the second-longest streak in NFL history (Eagles WR Mike Quick, nine, 1983-84) behind only Eagles WR Tommy McDonald's streak of 10 straight games in 1959-61...Also extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games

with a TD catch to a career-high five straight, the longest by a Packer since WR Randall Cobb's streak of six games in 2014...Became the third Packer in the last four seasons (James Jones, 2015; Jordy Nelson, 2016) to catch a TD pass in each of the first three games of the season.

► **Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30):** Started and played all 76 snaps, pacing the team with eight receptions for 81 yards (10.1 avg.)...In the second quarter, made a move to elude CB Tre'Davious White and then caught a pass over the middle from Rodgers for a 25-yard pickup.

► **At Detroit (Oct. 7):** Started and played 71 of 81 snaps despite dealing with a calf injury that limited him during the week...Led the team with nine receptions for 140 yards (15.6 avg.) and a TD, the second-best receiving-yardage output in his career behind only his 156 yards at Tennessee in 2016...Early in the fourth quarter, made an inside move to create separation from CB Darius Slay on the 12-yard TD catch...The score gave him a TD catch in 10 consecutive road games, which tied McDonald for the longest streak in NFL history...Matched his career high with three receptions of 20-plus yards on the afternoon (at Tennessee in 2016, at Philadelphia in 2016), including two on a second-quarter drive, the first a 22-yard pickup on a pass over the middle and the second a 30-yard gain out of the slot as he got past Slay to make the catch down the sideline to the Detroit 9.

► **Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15):** Started and played 63 of 71 snaps, leading the team with a season-high 10 receptions for 132 yards (13.2 avg.) and two TDs, the third time in his career that he posted 10-plus catches and two-plus receiving TDs in a game as he matches WR Don Hutson (three) for the most in team annals...Is the only player in the league to record 10-plus catches and two-plus receiving TDs in a game each of the past three seasons (2016-18)...Late in the first quarter, found an opening in the middle of the end zone in front of DB Adrian Colbert to haul in a 9-yard TD pass from Rodgers...With the Packers trailing, 30-23, with three minutes to go in the game, got behind LB Reuben Foster to make a 38-yard catch over the middle down to the San Francisco 20...Three plays later, made a leaping catch behind DB Greg Mabin for the 16-yard TD as the Packers tied the game with 1:55 remaining...On the Packers' game-winning drive, helped set up K Mason Crosby's 29-yard FG by beating Mabin off the line and then hauling in a 19-yard pass from Rodgers down the sideline to the San Francisco 9...Posted four catches for 81 yards (20.2 avg.) in the final three minutes of the game.

► **At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28):** Led the team with 133 receiving yards on five receptions (26.6 avg.)...Joined WR James Lofton (1984) as the only players in team history to record 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games, and became the first Packer since WR Greg Jennings in 2010 to register three straight 100-yard receiving outings...Is the first NFL player with a streak of three straight games with 130-plus receiving yards since Giants WR Odell Beckham Jr. in 2015 (Nov. 29-Dec. 14)...Set a career high (min. four receptions) with his average of 26.6 yards per catch, highlighted by a pair of 40-plus-yard receptions, the first time in his career that he posted two catches of 40-plus yards in a game...In the first quarter, beat CB Marcus Peters down the left sideline on a stutter-and-go route for 48 yards to the Rams' 22...Late in the third quarter, made a leaping grab of a deep pass down the middle from Rodgers with Peters in coverage for a 41-yard pickup to the Los Angeles 33...On the Packers' go-ahead drive in the fourth quarter, had catches of 15 and 20 yards.

► **At New England (Nov. 4):** Led the team with six receptions for 40 yards (6.7 avg.) and a TD, his 10th straight game with five-plus catches, the third-longest streak in team history behind only Sharpe (18 games in 1993-94, 13 games in 1992-93)...With just under five minutes remaining in the first half, got in front of CB Jonathan Jones in the end zone on third-and-goal from the 2 to make the TD catch.

► **Vs. Miami (Nov. 11):** Matched his career high (six previous times) with two TD catches as part of a four-catch, 57-yard (14.3 avg.) effort...On Green Bay's opening drive, beat CB Bobby McCain on a slant for a 7-yard TD...In the second quarter on a third-and-9, freed himself from CB Xavier Howard to make a 19-yard catch near the sideline...Midway through the

third quarter, found an opening to make a catch near the Miami 5 before easily taking it in for a 25-yard TD.

►**At Seattle (Nov. 15):** Led the team with a career-high 166 yards receiving on 10 receptions (16.6 avg.), his sixth career game with 10-plus catches, the third most in team history behind only Sharpe and Donald Driver (seven each)...Became the seventh Packer since 1950 to have 10-plus receptions for 165-plus receiving yards in a game...Posted two catches of 40-plus yards for just the second time in his career (Week 8 at L.A. Rams)...On Green Bay's second drive, beat CB Tre Flowers down the left sideline for a 41-yard catch to the Seattle 36...Early in the fourth quarter, beat CB Shaquill Griffin for a 57-yard catch to the Seattle 17, hauling in the pass with his right hand as Griffin held his left arm.

►**At Minnesota (Nov. 25):** Started and played all 53 snaps, leading the team with five receptions for 69 yards (13.8 avg.) and a TD as he went over the 1,000-yard receiving mark on the season for the first time in his career...On Green Bay's second series, beat CB Xavier Rhodes to make a back-shoulder catch at the Minnesota 5 before taking it in for the 15-yard TD...Late in the fourth quarter, beat Rhodes down the right sideline for a 36-yard reception to the Minnesota 29.

►**Vs. • Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* both of the last two seasons, becoming only the second offensive tackle in team history (Forrest Gregg; 1959-60, 1962-67) to earn AP All-Pro recognition in consecutive seasons.

• Has started all 86 regular-season games he has appeared in at LT since entering the league in 2013.

• Started all 12 games he played in at LT in 2017, helping Green Bay rank No. 3 in the NFL in red-zone scoring (61.9 percent) and No. 5 in rushing yards per carry (4.47 avg.).

• Was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016, having initially been named a first alternate before being selected as an injury replacement for Eagles T Jason Peters.

2018 SEASON: Has started all 12 games at LT...Has helped the Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in yards per carry (4.95), No. 1 in rushing first-down percentage (29.7), No. 8 in total offense (380.6 ypg) and No. 6 in net passing yards (274.9 ypg).

► **Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started at LT and played all 60 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating...Part of a line that did not allow a sack in the second half.

► **At Detroit (Oct. 7):** Started at LT and played all 81 snaps, helping the offense rack up 521 yards of offense, the most by the Packers since Sept. 15, 2013, vs. Washington (580 yards)...Protected Rodgers as he threw for 442 yards, the third most in a game in franchise history, and three TDs on 32-of-52 passing.

- Has 11 sacks in 15 career playoff games, the most in franchise postseason history (since 1982) and tied for No. 5 in NFL playoff history.

- Joined Carolina Panthers DE Julius Peppers (84 and seven) as the only players in the NFL with 80-plus sacks (80) and five-plus interceptions (six) from 2009-17.

• Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), tied with Saints QB Drew Brees for the most in NFL history.

►**Vs. Miami (Nov. 11):** Started for the sixth straight game and led the team with six receptions for 44 yards (7.3 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs...Made a pair of 11-yard receptions on back-to-back plays late in the first half.

►**At Seattle (Nov. 15):** Started and played 48 snaps, posting an 8-yard reception.

►**At Minnesota (Nov. 25):** Started and played 44 snaps, recording one catch for 3 yards.

• The former Pro Bowler (2015) and second-team All-Pro member (*The Associated Press* in 2013 and 2015) joins the Packers after spending the first seven seasons of his career with the N.Y. Jets, who selected him in the first round (No. 30 overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

• Registered three-plus sacks and at least one forced fumble in six different seasons, tied for the most among defensive linemen since 2011.

• From 2011-17, was part of a defense that ranked No. 4 in the league over that span in opponent rushing average (3.84). Helped the Jets rank No. 6 in the league (103.7 ypg) in run defense from 2011-17.

• Has registered 50-plus tackles in each of his seven seasons, including 90-plus tackles twice (90 in 2012 and 91 in 2013).

2018 SEASON: Started the first three games and posted six tackles (four solo), a tackle for a loss and two QB hits...Was placed on injured reserve (ankle) on Sept. 29.

►**Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started and played 43 snaps in his Green Bay debut, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss and a QB hit.

►**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Started and played 49 snaps, posting a solo tackle and a QB hit...Part of a line that helped limit the Vikings to just 68 yards on 18 carries (3.8 avg.).

• After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.

- Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.

- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

- Was the only undrafted free agent in the NFL to post four-plus INTs each season from 2008-11. Was tied for No. 4 in the NFL with 19 INTs over that span.

2018 SEASON: Has started all 12 games (seven at CB, five at S) and has posted 54 tackles (39 solo), a fumble recovery and three passes defended...Has returned 11 punts for 83 yards (7.5 avg.).
