PACKERS TRAVEL TO DALLAS TO FACE THE COWBOYS

The Green Bay Packers go on the road for the first time since Week 1 to take on the Dallas Cowboys on Sunday.

- ▶ Both teams enter Week 5 with 3-1 marks, tied for the second-best records in the NFC behind the 3-0 San Francisco 49ers.
- ▶ Green Bay leads the regular-season series with Dallas, 15-13, while the two teams have each won four games against each other in the postseason. The Packers have won seven of the last eight contests (including playoffs).
- ▶ Out of the last 15 regular-season meetings between the two, 13 have been decided by 10-plus points. The two contests decided by single digits were a 35-31 win by the Packers in 2017, the last time Green played at Dallas, and a 37-36 Green Bay victory at Dallas in 2013.
- ▶ It is the seventh matchup between the two teams (including playoffs) since 2013, with Green Bay holding a 5-1 record in those contests.
- ▶ The Packers are playing at Dallas in Week 5 for the second time in three seasons.
- ▶ Including the playoffs, Green Bay is 3-0 against Dallas at AT&T Stadium.
- ▶ The Packers are 3-1 this season, marking the fourth time in the last five years and the ninth time since 2000 that they have won at least three of their first four games.
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started eight times against the Cowboys (including playoffs), with the Packers winning six of the contests. In those eight games, Rodgers has completed 198 of 293 passes (67.6 pct.) for 2,172 yards, 15 touchdowns, two interceptions and a passer rating of 103.5.
- ▶ Rodgers has registered a passer rating of 120 or more (125.4 and 131.5) in three games against Dallas, including a rating of 122.9 after completing 19 of 29 passes (65.5 pct.) for 221 yards and three TDs the last time the Packers played the Cowboys in 2017.



ON TO OCTOBER

- ▶ Dating back to 2008, the Packers (28-12, .700) hold the second-best record in the NFC and the fourth-best mark in the league in the month of October.
- ▶ Green Bay has recorded at least a .500 record in the month of October in nine of the past 11 seasons.
- ▶ Green Bay has a .600 winning percentage (12-8) on the road in October since 2008, leading the NFC and ranking No. 3 in the NFL.
- ▶ The Packers are one of five NFL teams to have an above-.500 winning percentage on the road in the month of October since 2008.
- ▶ Dating back to 2008, Rodgers leads the NFL (min. 300 pass attempts) in passer rating (107.8) and passing touchdowns (87) in the month of October, while ranking No. 2 in touchdown percentage (6.6) and No. 4 in passing yards (10,967).

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 26th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.

- ▶ Play-by-play man **Joe Buck** joins analyst **Troy Aikman** and sideline reporter **Erin Andrews**.
- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play), two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) and three-time Packers Pro Bowler and two-time All-Pro **John Kuhn** (sideline) will call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 25th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 21st season of broadcasts together. They surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers with 313 at the 2018 season opener against Chicago.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 716.

GETTING TO THE QB

► In 2018, the Packers finished in the top 10 in the NFL in fourth-quarter sacks (t-No. 4), third-down sacks (t-No. 6), sacks per pass attempt (No. 7) and total sacks (t-No. 8). The Green Bay defense has picked the pressure back up this season, ranking in the top 10 in numerous categories:

- According to Next Gen Stats, Green Bay **leads the NFL** with a QB Pressured rate of 35.9%.
- The Packers registered a season-high six sacks in Week 3, their most since posting six vs. Miami on Nov. 11, 2018.
- Dating back to 1982, the five sacks Green Bay registered at Chicago marked only the **fourth time** the Packers recorded five-plus sacks in the season opener (six in 2010, seven in 2001 and five in 1995).
- Green Bay is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** this season in games with five-plus sacks (pro-football-reference.com):

- Dating back to 1963, the Packers' two games with five-plus sacks are tied for the most by Green Bay in the first four games, trailing only the three five-plus sack games the Packers had in the first four games of the 2001 season.
- Green Bay (**Preston Smith**, 4.5 / **Za'Darius Smith**, 3.0) joins the Arizona Cardinals (Terrell Suggs, 3.5 / Chandler Jones, 3.0) as the **only teams in the NFL this season** to have two linebackers register three-plus sacks (Sportradar).

DEFENSE STARTS STRONG

After showing improvement in the first season under defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine**, the Green Bay defense has had a strong start to Year 2.

- Green Bay ranks **No. 7 in the NFL** in points per game allowed this season:

- Dating back to 1970, the 69 points allowed by Green Bay through the first four games of a season are the fewest since allowing 66 points in the first four games of the 2007 season (pro-football-reference.com).
- Green Bay is **tied for No. 6 in the NFL** this season in opponent three-and-out drives (11) and **ranks No. 10** in opponent three-and-out percentage (22.4).
- The Packers' eight takeaways this season are their most through four games since 2011 (11). Eight different players have accounted for a takeaway for the Packers this season.
- Green Bay posted three takeaways (two fumble recoveries, one interception) in Week 3, giving them back-to-back games with three-plus takeaways for the first time since Weeks 4-5 in 2017.

► In Week 4, Green Bay scored a TD on its opening drive for the third consecutive game, the Packers' longest since a four-game streak in 2017 (Weeks 2-5).

► The Packers have only allowed three points scored in the first quarter, the fewest allowed by Green Bay through four games since 2010 and tied with Chicago for the second fewest allowed in the NFL this season (New England, 0).

ODDS AND ENDS

► Green Bay posted season highs for total net yards (491), net passing yards (422) and first downs (31) in Week 4.

► The Packers did not allow a sack in Week 3 vs. Denver, their first zero-sack game since Nov. 28, 2016, at Philadelphia. It marked the first time Green Bay registered six-plus sacks on defense while not allowing a sack since Jan. 2, 2005, at Chicago.

► The Packers allowed just one sack in Week 4, giving them back-to-back games with one/zero sacks allowed for the first time in a single season since a three-game streak in 2016 (Weeks 12-14).

► CB **Jaire Alexander** posted his first forced fumble and fumble recovery as a pro when he took the ball away from Broncos TE Noah Fant on his third-quarter reception in Week 3.

► S **Darnell Savage** registered the first forced fumble of his career in the Week 2 win over Minnesota and his first career interception in the Week 3 victory against Denver.

► CB **Tony Brown** blocked a Dan Bailey extra point in Week 2, marking the Packers' first blocked extra point since DL **Kenny Clark** registered one vs. New Orleans on Oct. 22, 2017.

► CB **Tramon Williams** forced and recovered a fumble on the final play of the game in Week 2 vs. Minnesota, marking the first time he posted both in a game since Nov. 10, 2013, vs. Philadelphia.

OFFSEASON ADDITIONS ENHANCE DEFENSE

Packers General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** and his staff made numerous moves to strengthen the roster this offseason and those moves have impacted the defenses strong start to the season:

- ▶ **S Adrian Amos** (A-miss), who joined the Packers after four seasons with the Chicago Bears, picked off QB Mitchell Trubisky in the end zone in Week 1 on the Bears' second-to-last drive of the game to protect a 10-3 lead. He became the first player to record an interception in their first game with the Packers since Bryant Westbrook on October 13, 2002, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ Dating back to Week 9 of the 2018 season (including postseason), Amos is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** with four interceptions.
- ▶ **LB Preston Smith** came to Green Bay after playing for the Washington Redskins for the past four years. Smith registered 1.5 sacks in Week 1, including taking down Trubisky on fourth down to seal the victory. It was the third time in his career that Smith recorded at least one sack in Week 1.
- ▶ In Week 2, Smith picked off QB Kirk Cousins, joining Jamie Collins and C.J. Mosley as the **only NFL linebackers to record an interception in each of the last four seasons** (2016-19) according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Preston matched his career high set on Dec. 26, 2015 at Philadelphia with three sacks in Week 3 vs. Denver.
- ▶ **LB Za'Darius** (zuh-DARE-ee-us) **Smith** played in 58 regular-season games with 16 starts in four seasons for the Baltimore Ravens and ranked No. 2 among NFL linebackers in 2018 in QB hits (25) and **tied for No. 6 in total pressures** (sacks + hurries + knockdowns) with 35.
- ▶ For the third year in a row, Z. Smith registered a sack in the season opener. He is **one of six NFL players** to record a sack in Week 1 each of the last three seasons (2017-19).
- ▶ Za'Darius recorded two sacks in Week 3 against Denver, marking his fourth career game with two-plus sacks.
- ▶ Dating back to 2017, Z. Smith has 48 QB hits and P. Smith has 44 QB Hits (according to Sportradar), **both ranking in the top five NFL linebackers** over that span:

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started 29 games since the start of the 2017 season.

- ▶ After recording 4.5 sacks in 2017, Clark was second on the team with a career-high six sacks in 2018. He has started 2019 with 1.5 sacks.
- ▶ Among players listed as DL, DT or NT on Sportradar, Clark is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** with one forced fumble this season.
- ▶ Dating back to 2016, Clark has four forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries.
- ▶ Despite being placed on injured reserve following Week 16, Clark ranked No. 3 on the team in QB hits (seven) in 2018.
- ▶ Clark was **tied for No. 7 in the NFL** with two opponent fumble recoveries during the 2018 season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ Dating back to 2016, he is **tied for the team lead** (2) in multi-sack games (LB **Kyler Fackrell**), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- ▶ According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the **most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December** in a single season (since 1982).

NEW LEADER

The Green Bay Packers named **Matt LaFleur** (la-flew-er) the 15th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2019.

- ▶ He joined Vince Lombardi (3-0) as the only head coaches in franchise history to win their first three NFL games.
- ▶ It was the first time since 2015 and just the third time (2011) in the last 12 seasons that Green Bay has started 3-0.
- ▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, LaFleur joined John Harbaugh (2008) and Don Coryell (1973) as the only head coaches since the merger (1970) to win each of their first two games, both against divisional opponents.
- ▶ With a win at Chicago in Week 1, LaFleur became the sixth head coach in franchise history to win his first game, joining Curly Lambeau, Vince Lombardi, Phil Bengston, Forrest Gregg and Ray Rhodes. He joins Lombardi as the only Packers head coaches to beat the Bears in their first game.
- ▶ LaFleur became only the second coach to make his head-coaching debut in the NFL's primetime kickoff game (since 2002), joining Jim Zorn who made his debut with Washington in a losing effort against the New York Giants (16-7) in 2008.
- ▶ LaFleur is in his 11th season in the NFL in 2019, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16) and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ▶ During his first 10 seasons in the NFL, LaFleur was a part of offensive staffs that helped their teams rank in the top 10 in the league in total yards seven times (2008-09, 2012-13, 2015-17). In three of his last six seasons in the NFL, he was on a staff that helped its offense finish in the top five in the league in scoring, highlighted by No. 1 rankings in 2016 with the Falcons and in 2017 with the Rams.
- ▶ The former quarterback began his coaching career in 2003 at his alma mater, Saginaw Valley State. LaFleur has six seasons of coaching experience at the collegiate level, having also worked at Central Michigan (2004-05), Northern Michigan (2006), Ashland University (2007) and Notre Dame (2014).

THE NEW STAFF

LaFleur explored various avenues to compile his coaching staff, bringing in new coaches and retaining some from the 2018 staff.

- ▶ Offensive coordinator **Nathaniel Hackett** brings 10 years of NFL experience to Green Bay, including five as an offensive coordinator (Buffalo, 2013-14; Jacksonville, 2016-18). In 2017, he guided the Jaguars to a No. 1 league ranking in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in team history on their way to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game.
- ▶ Defensive coordinator **Mike Pettine** was retained after a 2018 season that featured 16 different players with at least a half-sack, the second most in team history (since 1982) behind only the 1987 campaign (strike season) that saw 17 players register a half-sack or more. The defense finished 2018 tied for No. 8 in the league in sacks (44), the most by Green Bay since 2013, and No. 12 in the NFL in pass defense (234.5 ypg) after finishing No. 23 in the category in 2017.
- ▶ Special teams coordinator **Shawn Mennenga** (MEN-in-guh) begins his eighth season in the NFL and returns to the league after leading the special teams at Vanderbilt last season. From 2011-17, he served as the special teams assistant for the Cleveland Browns, assisting Chris Tabor as the team ranked No. 7 in the league over that span in both punt return average (9.9) and opponent kickoff return average (21.8).
- ▶ **Chris Gizzi**, who served as a strength and conditioning assistant from 2014-18, was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator. As a player, he appeared in 23 games for the Packers as a linebacker in 2000-01, ranking No. 5 on the team with eight tackles on special teams in 2000. Gizzi will lead a staff that consists of **Mark Lovat**, **Thadeus Jackson** and **Grant Thorne**.
- ▶ Quarterbacks coach **Luke Getsy** returns to the Packers after spending last season as the offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach for Mississippi State. Over his last two seasons in Green Bay (2016-17), Getsy worked as the wide receivers coach after originally joining the Packers in 2014 as the offensive quality control coach.

- ▶ Defensive line coach **Jerry Montgomery** is entering his fifth season with the Packers and second as defensive line coach. He worked as the defensive front assistant for Green Bay from 2015-17. Montgomery has helped with the development of DL Kenny Clark, who recorded 10.5 sacks over the past two seasons, the most among Packers defensive linemen and second most on the team over that span.
- ▶ Inside linebackers coach **Kirk Olivadotti** (ah-luh-vuh-DOT-ee) joins the Packers after coaching for the Washington Redskins for 16 seasons. He is one of 11 members of the Redskins' assistant coach honor roll, which recognizes coaches with at least 10 seasons of service as an assistant in Washington. During his time with the Redskins, Washington ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in overall defense eight times.
- ▶ Tight ends coach **Justin Outten** (OW-ten) was the offensive assistant for the Atlanta Falcons the past two seasons (2017-18). He began with the Falcons as an offensive intern in 2016. Over the last three seasons, Atlanta averaged 27.2 points per game (No. 4 in the NFL over that span) and 389.9 yards per game (No. 3 in the league over that span).
- ▶ Defensive backs coach **Jason Simmons** is entering his ninth season with the Packers having worked in various roles (secondary in 2018, assistant special teams coach from 2015-17, defensive/special teams assistant in 2014 and a coaching administrator from 2011-13). Before coaching, he played for 10 years in the NFL as a defensive back and was a standout on special teams during his career.
- ▶ Running backs coach **Ben Sirmans** is entering his fourth season in that position for the Packers. From 2016-18, Green Bay led the NFL with an average of 4.66 yards per carry, including an average of 5.01 yards per carry in 2018 (No. 2 in the NFL) that was the second-best single-season mark in team history. He joined the Packers after spending the previous four seasons (2012-15) as the running backs coach for the St. Louis Rams.
- ▶ Outside linebackers coach **Mike Smith** joins the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Kansas City Chiefs, first as the assistant defensive line coach in 2016-17 and then coaching outside linebackers last season. In 2018, Smith coached Dee Ford, who was selected to his first Pro Bowl after tying for the NFL lead with seven forced fumbles and tying for No. 2 among NFL linebackers with a career-high 13 sacks.
- ▶ Offensive line coach **Adam Stenavich** (STEN-uh-vitch) comes to the Packers after serving as the assistant offensive line coach for the San Francisco 49ers the last two seasons. He helped coach a line that cleared the way for RB Matt Breida to average 4.96 yards per carry in 2016-17, ranking No. 5 in the NFL over that span (min. 200 att.). The Marshfield, Wis., native played left tackle at Michigan (2002-05) and was named first-team All-Big Ten in 2004-05. Following his collegiate career, Stenavich spent time with a few NFL teams, including a stint on the Packers' practice squad in 2006.
- ▶ Wide receivers coach **Alvis Whitted** (WHITT-id), who played wide receiver for nine seasons in the NFL, worked for the last seven years as the wide receivers coach at Colorado State. During his tenure at CSU, Whitted mentored three All-America wide receivers, including two consensus first-team All-Americans who also were finalists for the Biletnikoff Award (Michael Gallup in 2017 and Rashard Higgins in 2014).
- ▶ Assistant offensive line coach **Luke Butkus** comes to Green Bay after serving as the offensive line coach for the University of Illinois for the past three seasons (2016-18), a position he also held for the Fighting Illini in 2012. Between the two stints at his alma mater, he was the assistant offensive line coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars (2013-15).
- ▶ Assistant defensive backs coach **Ryan Downard** begins his second season in Green Bay after serving as the defensive quality control coach last year. He came to Green Bay after working at Bowling Green for two seasons, serving as the safeties coach in 2017 and the director of football operations in 2016.
- ▶ Assistant special teams coach **Maurice Drayton** was retained and is entering his fourth season coaching in the NFL. He worked as the assistant special teams coach for each of the past three seasons (Green Bay in 2018 and the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17).
- ▶ Offensive assistant **Jason Vrable** enters his seventh season as an assistant coach in the NFL, previously working for the New York Jets (2017-18) and Buffalo Bills (2013-16).
- ▶ The staff also consists of four quality control coaches: **Wendel Davis** (defense), **Kevin Koger** (offense), **Christian Parker** (defense) and **Rayna Stewart** (special teams).

MATT LaFLEUR...In his first season as the Packers' 15th head coach.

- ▶ In his 11th season in the NFL, having served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons (Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018), a quarterbacks coach for six seasons (Washington Redskins, 2010-13; Atlanta Falcons, 2015-16), and an offensive assistant for two seasons (Houston Texans, 2008-09).
- ▶ Guided the Titans' offense in 2018 to a No. 7 league ranking in rushing (126.4 ypg) as Tennessee registered 11 games with 100-plus rushing yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.
- ▶ Helped the Rams lead the league in scoring with an average of 29.9 points per game in 2017, more than doubling their average from 2016 (14.0 ppg).
- ▶ Tutored QB Matt Ryan, who led the league in passer rating (117.1) in 2016 on his way to being named NFL Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press*.
- ▶ Coached rookie QB Robert Griffin III with the Redskins in 2012, who became the first QB in team history to win AP Offensive Rookie of the Year.

JASON GARRETT...Is in his ninth full season as the Cowboys' eighth head coach. Was the interim head coach for the final eight games in 2010.

- ▶ Has led Dallas to NFC East titles in two of the past three seasons, including helping QB Dak Prescott earn NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors in 2016 and Ezekiel Elliott win the rushing title in 2018.
- ▶ Has helped guide the Cowboys to a top-10 offensive ranking six times (2007, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016) in his tenure as offensive coordinator and then head coach.
- ▶ In 2014, coached Dallas to a 12-4 record, its first winning season and playoff appearance since 2009.
- ▶ Won Super Bowls XXVII, XXVIII and XXX as a quarterback for the Cowboys.

THE PACKERS-COWBOYS SERIES

- ▶ These clubs squared off in one of the most famous games in league history, the 1967 NFL Championship, dubbed the 'Ice Bowl.' Kickoff temperature was recorded as minus-13 with a minus-46 wind chill, the coldest game in league annals. Bart Starr's game-winning TD, a 1-yard dive with 13 seconds left, sealed Green Bay's third straight NFL championship en route to its second consecutive Super Bowl title.
- ▶ Green Bay won 10 of the first 15 in the series, in which Tom Landry and Vince Lombardi - former assistants on the same N.Y. Giants staff in the 1950s - turned it into one of the NFL's preeminent rivalries.
- ▶ The teams met in the 2014 and 2016 NFC Divisional playoffs, with Green Bay coming out on top both times. In the 2016 playoff matchup, on third-and-20 with 12 seconds remaining, Aaron Rodgers threw a 36-yard pass to a toe-dragging Jared Cook on the sideline, to set up Mason Crosby's game-winning, 51-yard field goal as time expired.

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

► Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

► Rodgers threw for 422 yards in Week 4 this season, extending his **franchise record** to eight 400-plus yard games. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard-passing game (four QBs with one).

► Since 2018, Rodgers is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** (Ryan Fitzpatrick) with four 400-yard passing games.

► In 2018, Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the **first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs**. Rodgers added 442 yards against the Jets in Week 16 to become the **first QB in NFL history** to have three games with 425-plus passing yards in a season.

► Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit, 2018). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the **first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games**, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.

► Rodgers tied Manning for the **fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards**, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that continued this season as he is one of 10 NFL QBs to register at least one passing TD in each of the first four weeks of the season.

- ▶ Rodgers is one of seven QBs with six-plus passing TDs and one or fewer interceptions this season.
- ▶ Last season was the first time in his career that Rodgers registered 25-plus touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions in a season (25/2). Dating back to 1920, he was the **third player in the NFL** with 25-plus TDs and two or fewer INTs in a single season (Tom Brady, 28/2 in 2016 and Nick Foles, 27/2 in 2013), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ▶ With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ▶ Rodgers has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), the most in team history.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history:

STATS OF THE WEEK

- ▶ Despite missing the final 10 minutes of the game in Week 4 due to injury, WR **Davante Adams** posted a career-high 180 receiving yards on 10 catches, eclipsing his previous career best of 166 yards receiving at Seattle on Nov. 15, 2018.
- ▶ Adams joins Don Hutson as the only players in franchise history to have two games with 10-plus receptions and 165-plus receiving yards.
- ▶ Adams is the only player in the league to have a 10-catch, 165-yard game in both of the last two seasons.
- ▶ Adams posted 10-plus catches for the eighth time in his career, setting a franchise record (WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).

ASCENDING ADAMS

WR **Davante Adams** has continued to get better as his career has gone on. He is the **only player in the NFL** to record 70-plus receptions, 850-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the past three seasons (2016-18), earning Pro Bowl honors in each of the last two seasons.

- ▶ Adams' 107 receiving yards in the first quarter of Week 4 were the most by a Packer in a first quarter since WR Javon Walker registered 121 receiving yards at Indianapolis on Sept. 26, 2004. Adams' 158 receiving yards in the first half were the most by a Packer in a first half since WR Antonio Freeman posted 169 yards vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998.
- ▶ With 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each season from 2016-18 (12 in 2016, 10 in 2017 and 13 in 2018), Adams joined Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the **only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in three straight seasons.**
- ▶ Adams joined Steelers WR Antonio Brown as the **only players in the league** to record two seasons with 12-plus receiving TDs from 2016-18.
- ▶ Adams was the **only player in the NFL** to register 70-plus receptions and 10-plus receiving touchdowns in each of the past three seasons (2016-18).

- Green Bay ranked **No. 2 in the NFL** in 2018 with 15 giveaways (Seattle, 11). It marked the sixth time in the last eight seasons that the Packers had 17 or fewer giveaways. That is tied for the most over that span with New England (six seasons). Since Rodgers took over as the starter in 2008, the Packers have ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in the category in nine of 11 seasons.
- Rodgers finished the 2018 season with just two INTs on 597 attempts, a 0.34 interception percentage that set an **NFL single-season record among passing qualifiers** (Chiefs QB Damon Huard, 0.41 in 2006, 244-1). It was the third time in his career he led the league in lowest interception percentage, tying Bart Starr for the most in team history. Rodgers is tied for **No. 3 in NFL history** with Starr and four others behind only Sammy Baugh (five times) and Tom Brady (four).
- Rodgers' two INTs during the 2018 season were the **fewest in a season in league history by a QB with 500-plus attempts**, eclipsing the previous low of five held by Rodgers (2014), Vikings QB Sam Bradford (2016) and Chiefs QB Alex Smith (2017).
- Rodgers also set the **franchise record** for the fewest INTs in a season (min. 200 att.), besting Starr's mark of three INTs on 251 attempts in 1966.
- Rodgers' streak of consecutive attempts without an INT ended at 402 in Week 15 of 2018. He had surpassed Patriots QB Tom Brady (358 in 2010-11) for the **longest streak in league history**.
- Rodgers recorded nine straight zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) during the 2018 season (Weeks 5-6, 8-14) to tie for the second-longest streak in NFL history behind only Brady (11 games in 2010).
- In 2018, Rodgers did not throw an INT in 13 games, tied for the most (2014) in a season in team annals (min. 15 att.).
- Four times Rodgers has had 10-plus zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) in a season (13 in 2018, 11 in 2016, 13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Starr (10) in 1964.

- Week 13 of 2018 was Rodgers' fourth game since 2015 with 50-plus pass attempts and zero INTs, **the most in the NFL over that span**. His four games of 50-plus pass attempts and no INTs are the only ones in team history.

ALL-PRO TACKLE

- T **David Bakhtiari** was named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2018. It was the first time he was named to the first team but the third year in a row he was named All-Pro by the AP.
- Bakhtiari was the first Packers offensive tackle to earn first-team honors since Forrest Gregg in 1967
- Bakhtiari was also named to the All-NFL team by the Pro Football Writers of America.

- **K Mason Crosby** continues moving his way up the record books.
- In Week 14 of 2018, Crosby connected on the 300th regular-season field goal of his career, becoming the 32nd player in league history with 300-plus career field goals (310).
- Crosby has played in 196 straight games for the Packers, the **second most all-time** behind only QB Brett Favre (255).
- Crosby has been named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week a team-record seven times in his career, including in 2018 after hitting a game-winning field goal in Week 6.
- Crosby finished **No. 10 in the NFL** in scoring in 2018 with 124 points.
- Crosby hit five field goals of 50-plus yards in 2018, which tied his career high (2013) and **tied for No. 3 in the NFL** in 2018 (Baltimore Ravens K Justin Tucker) behind the six made by New York Jets K Jason Myers and Dallas Cowboys K Brett Maher. It was the **second most in a season in team history** behind only K Chris Jacke, who made six in 1993.
- Crosby recorded a game-winning field goal in each of the last three seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati, 2018 vs. San Francisco).
- In Week 4 of 2018, Crosby hit two 52-yard field goals, joining Ryan Longwell (at Atlanta, Nov. 13, 2005) as the only Packers to make two 50-plus-yard field goals in a regular-season game. It was the first time two field goals of 50-plus yards had been made by a kicker at Lambeau Field. Crosby had previously connected on two 50-plus field goals (56, 51) in the 2016 NFC Divisional Playoff win at Dallas.
- Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 of the 2018 season (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.

► In Weeks 8 and 11 of the 2018 season, QB **Aaron Rodgers** tied his single-game career high by completing three passes of 40-plus yards. His 16 completions of 40-plus yards in 2018 were tied (2008) for the second most he has thrown in a single-season (17 in 2009).

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 28 of them (52.8 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- Green Bay has 15 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents.
- Over a third of the players (22 of 53, 41.5 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.

► Of the 53 players on the roster, 47 of them (88.7 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Oct. 6) and 24 players (45.3 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- Dating back to 2000, the Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- Since 2000, Green Bay is one of only six NFL teams to have a regular-season road record above .500.

345 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Philadelphia Eagles in Week 4 of 2019 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 345 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field hosts its 63rd season of football in 2019. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Green Bay was 5-2-1 (.786) at home in 2018, marking the eighth time in the last 10 seasons that the Packers won five-plus games at home.
- Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 2019 NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) on the original schedule for the sixth straight year (2014-19) – was released April 17 by the National Football League.

- ▶ The Packers will face 2018 playoff teams in six games this season (Chicago, Philadelphia, Dallas, Kansas City, L.A. Chargers), with four of those contests taking place on the road.
- ▶ The Packers opened the season at the Chicago Bears in the NFL's Thursday night regular-season opener. It marked the fourth time in team history that Green Bay opened at Chicago (1979, 1981, 2015).
- ▶ The Packers opened their home slate in Week 2 against the Minnesota Vikings, marking just the fourth time (2003, 2008, 2018) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ▶ Green Bay stayed at home both of the next two weeks, the first time the Packers have played three straight at home in September since 1990 (Weeks 1-3). They hosted the Denver Broncos in Week 3 and the Philadelphia Eagles in a Thursday night matchup in Week 4.
- ▶ The Packers travel to take on the Dallas Cowboys in Week 5. It is the seventh matchup between the two teams (including postseason) since 2013, with Green Bay holding a 5-1 record in those contests.
- ▶ For the second time in three seasons, the Packers will host the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football*, this time in Week 6. It is the fifth Monday night matchup between the two clubs (1964, 1971, 1972, 2017).
- ▶ A home game against the Oakland Raiders in Week 7 will be the Packers' fifth at Lambeau in 2019, marking the most home contests for Green Bay in the first seven games of a season since 1978 when it also played five at home (not including the 1987 strike year).
- ▶ In Week 8, Green Bay is at Kansas City in a Sunday night matchup.
- ▶ The following week, Green Bay travels to Los Angeles to take on the Chargers. While it's the first time the Packers will play the Chargers since they moved to Los Angeles, it is the seventh away game against the Chargers, and Green Bay has won the previous six.
- ▶ In Week 10, the Packers host the Carolina Panthers in the fourth contest between the two teams in the last six years (2014, 2015, 2017).
- ▶ Green Bay will have its bye the following week, marking the first Week 11 bye for the Packers and the latest for the team since the bye was reintroduced in 1990.
- ▶ Over the next two weeks, Green Bay will crisscross the country, playing at the San Francisco 49ers in Week 12 and at the New York Giants in Week 13.
- ▶ In Week 14, the Packers take on the Washington Redskins in the third matchup between the two in the last five years (including the postseason), but the first in Green Bay since 2013.
- ▶ Week 15 has the Bears coming to Green Bay. The Packers are 10-2 all-time at home against the Bears in December/January games.
- ▶ The Packers close out the regular season with two road games for the first time since 2004 when they played at Minnesota and Chicago.
- ▶ In Week 16, Green Bay is at the Vikings and on *MON* for the second time on the season. The Packers last played two Monday games in the same regular season in 2009.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

CHICAGO (AP) — The Green Bay Packers beat the Chicago Bears by on Thursday night, 10-3. And while it was ugly on offense, likely in great part due to the lack of action so many regulars on that side of the ball got in the preseason, it was a thing of beauty for the defenders in green, gold and white. On this night, the Packers were the Monsters of the Midway.

There was plenty of noise heading into Soldier Field about Chicago's D, which was dominant in 2018 as the Bears won the NFC North. And it played quite well against Aaron Rodgers and the pack, sacking Rodgers five times and yielding only 213 yards.

But the Packers were stingier.

The Packers defense totaled five sacks on a clearly befuddled Mitchell Trubisky. The only turnover of the game was a fourth-quarter pick in the end zone by former Bears safety Adrian Amos.

Green Bay went into the end zone on an 8-yard jump-ball reception by tight end Jimmy Graham — a former college basketball player who dived out to perfection on the play. That was the difference, thanks to the stringy Packers D.

The game also was marked by sloppy offense and penalties. But the Packers made the fewest mistakes and now lead the league's longest series 99-95-6. Green Bay has won 16 of the last 19 regular-season meetings, and Rodgers is 17-5.

Chicago's defense hardly stacked, getting five sacks — tying the most it has had against Rodgers. But it could do little with the ball and Trubisky never found his stride. He even was sacked on Chicago's final offensive play.

Mason Crosby made a 39-yard field goal in the final period of the game, while Chicago got a 38-yarder from Eddy Pineiro. Bears fans rejoiced in relief on the first score of the season: Pineiro's first-quarter field goal. The last such kick on Soldier Field was Cody Parkey's double-dunk off the goalpost and crossbar that sent Chicago home from the wild-card round.

Each team had 10 penalties, there was a total of 467 yards or only offense, and several drops. At one point, Chicago had three straight penalties to put it in a first-and-40. No, the Bears didn't convert.

It was a rough start in the opening series for Green Bay. A run and a pass netted zero yards, then Rodgers was sacked heavily by Roy Robertson-Harris for a 10-yard loss. Rodgers was sacked again on the next three-and-out and Chicago took over at the Packers' 36 after a punt. Chicago had forced 17 yards in losses on those series, and the Packers had minus-12 yards through one period.

Rodgers got it going at the start of the second quarter, launching a 47-yard completion to Marquez Valdes-Scantling. Two more completions got the pack to the 8, and Graham then scored.

By halftime, Green Bay had outgained Chicago 119 yards to 98.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — All that mattered to Aaron Rodgers on Sunday was that the Packers won. Rodgers threw two early touchdowns and Green Bay held on for a 21-16 victory over the Minnesota Vikings. On a day when the Packers honored late Hall of Fame Bart Starr at halftime, Rodgers put on quite a show — particularly early. Rodgers completed nine of his first 10 passes for 134 yards and two touchdowns and had a perfect 158.3 rating through the first quarter. He finished 22 of 34 for 209 yards. Rodgers and new coach Matt LaFleur experimented with Rodgers wearing a playcall wristband in the hope that it would speed up the play-calling process and get the offense out of the huddle quicker.

After scoring on each of its first three possessions, Green Bay's offense failed to muster another point. But the hot start was enough to win. The Packers remained unbeaten under LaFleur after opening the NFL's 100th season with a victory at rival Chicago. They also beat the Vikings (1-1) for the fifth time in the past seven games at Lambeau Field.

Minnesota's Dalvin Cook had a career-high 154 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. It was the third-year pro's second consecutive game with over 100 yards rushing. Cook also had 37 yards receiving in the loss.

After throwing the ball just 10 times in the opener against Atlanta, Kirk Cousins finished 14 of 32 with 230 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions. Cousins was picked off by Kevin King in the end zone late in the fourth quarter.

The Vikings are 5-2-1 in last their eight meetings against Green Bay. Rodgers and Davante Adams connected on a 39-yard completion on the Packers' first offensive play. Rodgers found running back Jamaal Williams for a 15-yard touchdown to cap a four-play, 75-yard drive.

Adams finished with 106 yards on seven catches.

After a missed field goal by Minnesota, receiver Gerominio Allison, who did not see a single pass against the Bears, gave the Packers a two-score advantage on a 12-yard strike from Rodgers.

Green Bay took over at the Vikings' 33 after defensive lineman Kenny Clark sacked Cousins, forcing a fumble. Dean Lowmy recovered the loose ball. The Packers took a commanding 21-0 lead two minutes into the second quarter on a 23-yard run by Aaron Jones.

After rushing for 11 yards and two touchdowns in a win last week against the Falcons, Cook broke out for a 75-yard score following a missed tackle by rookie safety Daniel Savage.

Stefon Diggs scored the Vikings' other touchdown with a 45-yard grab with 9:12 to play in the third.

Minnesota had eight penalties for 100 yards.

17 Davante Adams, WR, 6th Year, Fresno State

- Led the team with a career-high 111 receptions in 2018, the second most in team history behind only WR Sterling Sharpe's 112 in 1993, for a career-best 1,386 yards (12.5 avg.) and a career-high 13 TDs on his way to earning Pro Bowl honors for the second straight year, his first as an original selection.
- Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in each of the last three seasons (2016-18). Joins Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.
- Has 35 receiving TDs since 2016, No. 2 in the league (WR Antonio Brown, 37) over that span. Has caught at least one TD pass in 28 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Is the lone player in the league to have 10-plus receiving TDs each of the past three seasons (2016-18). Joins WR Don Hutson (1941-43) and Sharpe (1992-94) as the only players in team history to do so in three straight seasons.
- Leads the league with 26 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016, six more than any other player in the NFL.
- Has posted eight games in his career with 10-plus catches, the most in franchise history (WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver, seven each).

2019 SEASON: Has started all four games and leads the team with 25 receptions for 378 yards (15.1 avg.)...Ranks No. 4 in the NFL in receiving yards and tied for No. 10 in receptions...Has picked up a first down on 80 percent of his receptions (20 of 25), good for No. 7 in the league among players with 15-plus catches, with his 20 receiving first downs ranking No. 3 in the league.

►**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Started and appeared on 62 of 64 snaps, tying for the team lead with four receptions for 36 yards (9.0 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs.

►**Vs. ►**Vs. Denver (Sept. 22):** Started and played 52 of 57 snaps, finishing with four receptions for 56 yards (14.0 avg.)...Early in the second quarter, made a back-shoulder catch near the sideline for 22 yards to the Denver 28 against CB Chris Harris.

►**Vs. Philadelphia (Sept. 26):** Started and played 57 of 81 snaps, posting a career-high 180 receiving yards on 10 receptions (18.0 avg.)...It marked his eighth career game with 10-plus receptions as he moved past WRs Sterling Sharpe and Donald Driver (seven each) to set a new team record...Joined Don Hutson as the only players in team history to post two games with 10-plus catches and 165-plus receiving yards...Racked up 107 receiving yards on six catches (17.8 avg.) in the first quarter, the most receiving yards in a first quarter by a Packer since WR Javon Walker registered 121 yards at Indianapolis in the first quarter on Sept. 26, 2004...Finished the first half with 158 receiving yards, the most by a Packer in a first half since WR Antonio Freeman had 169 yards vs. Tennessee on Dec. 20, 1998...Posted two receptions of 40-plus yards for just the third time in his career (Weeks 8 and 11, 2018)...On the Packers' third play from scrimmage, beat CB Sidney Jones down the sideline for a 58-yard gain to the Philadelphia 7 to set up RB Aaron Jones' 3-yard TD run two plays later...Made a 40-yard catch on a third-and-10 in the second quarter, spinning away from CB Avante Maddox to take it down the sideline to the Philadelphia 36...Made a 13-yard catch on a third-and-6 with a little more

than 10 minutes remaining in the game, but sustained a toe injury on the play and did not return.

90 Montravius Adams, DL, 3rd Year, Auburn

- Played in all 16 games with one start in 2018, seeing action on defense and special teams. Posted 26 tackles (17 solo), 1½ sacks, six tackles for a loss, a forced fumble and three quarterback pressures.
- After a foot injury sidelined him for most of training camp and the first two regular-season games, saw action in seven games as a rookie in 2017, recording five tackles (one solo) and a QB hit.

23 Jaire Alexander, CB, 2nd Year, Louisville

- Was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team after leading the team with 15 passes defended. Became just the second Packers CB to be honored since 1974 (CB Casey Hayward, 2012).
- Appeared in 13 games with 11 starts as a rookie and ranked No. 2 on the team with 76 tackles (61 solo) while adding a half-sack, three tackles for a loss, an interception and a QB pressure.
- In Week 8 at the Los Angeles Rams, finished with five passes defended, the most by a Green Bay defender during the 2018 season.
- Earned second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016 after posting a team-high five interceptions (tied for No. 11 in the country) along with a career-best 39 tackles (31 solo) and 14 passes defended.

2019 SEASON: Has started all four games and has registered 19 tackles (12 solo), a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a team-high eight passes defended.

►**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Started and played all 73 snaps, finishing with six tackles (two solo) and two passes defended...Late in the first quarter, got his right hand in to break up a pass from QB Mitchell Trubisky intended for WR Taylor Gabriel...Late in the fourth quarter with the Packers holding a 10-3 lead and the Bears driving, broke up a pass from Trubisky intended for TE Adam Shaheen near the sideline at the Green Bay 10.

- In his eight career starts, has posted 30 receptions for 470 yards (15.7 avg.) and three TDs.
- Despite being limited to just five games due to injury in 2018, registered a career-best 303 yards receiving and matched his career high with two receiving TDs on 20 receptions (15.2 avg.)
- Led the team with a career-high 122 receiving yards on a career-best six catches (20.3 avg.) in Week 3 vs. Cincinnati in 2017, highlighted by his career-long 72-yard grab in overtime that set up K Mason Crosby's game-winning 27-yard field goal.

2019 SEASON: Has appeared in all four games and has posted eight receptions for 76 yards (9.5 avg.) and two TDs (tied for team lead) along with one carry for 7 yards...Has registered one tackle on special teams.

►**At Chicago (Sept. 5):** Appeared on 32 plays on offense.

31 Adrian Amos, S, 5th Year, Penn State

- Played in 60 games with 56 starts for the Chicago Bears over four seasons (2015-18), recording 305 tackles (244 solo), 17 passes defensed, three interceptions, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 13 tackles for a loss, two sacks and seven tackles on special teams.
- Was one of four NFL safeties (Malcolm Jenkins, Eddie Jackson, Mike Adams) to register at least three INTs, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries from 2016-18, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Started all 16 games on a defense that finished No. 1 in the NFL in 2018 in points allowed per game (17.7), yards per play (4.78), takeaways (36) and interceptions (27), and set career highs in passes defensed (eight) and interceptions (two).
- Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team in 2015 after he became the first Bears rookie to lead the team in tackles (based on coaches review) since LB Brian Urlacher in 2000.
