

A LOOK BACK ON THE 2020-21 SEASON

TEAM NOTES

Season recap: The Senators concluded the 2020-21 regular season with a record of 23-28-5 and 51 points to rank sixth in the Scotia North Division and 23rd overall in the NHL.

Home on the range The Senators posted a record of 14-10-4 at home this season ... Connor Brown, Josh Norris and Brady Tkachuk were the Senators' leaders with 10 goals each at home while Thomas Chabot maintained the club lead with 14 assists at Canadian Tire Centre ... In 28 home games, Tkachuk led the team with 21 points on home ice ... The Senators earned a record of 18-13-6 through 37 home contests in 2019-20.

Road scholars: The Senators posted a record of 9-18-1 on the road this season ... Connor Brown and Tim Stützle were the team leaders with 11 goals each on the road while Thomas Chabot ranked first with 11 assists while the Senators served as visitors ... Stützle (11 goals, nine assists) led the club with 20 points over the team's 28 road games ... The Senators registered a 7-21-6 record over 34 road contests in 2019-20.

Franchise record: Ottawa has posted an all-time record of 971-940-115-169 over 2,195 games ... The Senators are 533-413-60-93 through 1,099 all-time home games and 438-527-55-76 through 1,096 all-time road games.

Back-to-back games: Ottawa played back-to-back games on 10 occasions in 2020-21 and concluded its final set when the team opposed the Flames at Calgary's Scotiabank Saddledome on May 9 (6-1 loss) ... The Senators posted a record of 6-4-0 in the first half of contests on consecutive nights after registering a mark of 3-6-4 over 13 such games in 2019-20. The team's record in the second half of games in back-to-back sets was 0-8-2 on the heels of a mark of 4-6-3 during the previous campaign.

On the power play: The Senators were 27-for-174 (15.5%) on the power play in 2020-21 ... Josh Norris was the team leader with six power-play goals while Drake Batherson (five goals, 10 assists) maintained the Senators lead with 15 points on the power play ... Ottawa tallied multiple power-play goals in an individual contest on five occasions in 2020-21 after having done so six times in 2019-20.

On the penalty kill: Ottawa overcame 135 of the 171 occasions it was shorthanded in 2020-21 to maintain an efficiency rating of 79.0% through its 56 regular-season games ... The team registered seven (Connor Brown x 5, Alex Formenton, Nick Paul) shorthanded markers after also recording 15 such goals in 2019-20.

New sweater: The Senators debuted a new primary logo this season which saw the organization return to its roots with the implementation of the modified original "2D" logo. The team has earned a 22-25-4 all-time record while wearing its current sweater. The Senators also unveiled their Reverse Retro sweater and wore it on five occasions in 2020-21 (1-3-1 this season). The Senators hold an all-time record of 112-75-7-25 when wearing an alternate; 26-17-2-4 when wearing a red alternate, 84-55-5-19 when wearing a black alternate and 1-1-0-1 when wearing a cream alternate.

Overtime and shootouts: The Senators earned a record of five wins, four losses and one shootout loss over 10 games which were decided beyond regulation time in 2020-21 ... Ottawa posted a mark of 4-3 over seven contests which were decided in overtime and a record of 2-1 in three shootout games. Matt Murray (2-0) and Filip Gustavsson (0-1) were the goaltenders of record in the team's three shootout contests – a 5-4 victory vs Montreal at Canadian Tire Centre on Feb. 23, a 4-3 win at Calgary's Scotiabank Saddledome on March 7 and a 3-2 setback vs Vancouver on March 17.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Coach Smith: D.J. Smith was introduced as the Senators' 14th head coach in franchise history on 5/23/19. A native of Windsor, Ont., Smith spent the four previous NHL seasons as an assistant coach with the Toronto Maple Leafs. Prior to joining the Maple Leafs (which was also the team for which he made his NHL playing debut in 1996-97), Smith guided the Ontario Hockey League's Oshawa Generals to a record of 135-53-3-13 over three campaigns which included his having been recognized as the OHL's Coach of the Year in 2013-14. One year later, he helped the team capture the Mastercard Memorial Cup. His 48 head coaching victories with Ottawa see him rank seventh in franchise history.

Four-plus alternates for now: In conjunction with the start of the team's 2020-21 training camp, the Senators announced that the team would deploy four full-time alternate captains during the campaign in Thomas Chabot, Erik Gudbranson, Derek Stepan and Brady Tkachuk. For Stepan, the Senators marked the third club for which he sported the 'A' following his time with the New York Rangers and Arizona Coyotes. For Gudbranson, the Orleans, Ont. native and third overall selection in the 2010 NHL Draft, the Senators represented the first NHL club for which he had worn an 'A'. Chabot and Tkachuk, who were selected by the club (in 2015 and 2018) served as fulltime alternates for the first time in their respective careers. Both players concluded the 2019-20 season as alternates following the 2/24/20 trade of Jean-Gabriel Pageau and the mid-February injury of Mark Borowiecki. Following Gudbranson's mid-April trade, Nick Paul served as an alternate while Connor Brown and Nikita Zaitsev also both served as alternates following the injury of Thomas Chabot on May 3.

Iron men: For the first time since the 2012-13 season, the Senators saw at least five players appear in each of the team's regular-season contests ... Drake Batherson, Connor Brown, Josh Norris, Nick Paul and Brady Tkachuk each skated in all of Ottawa's 56 regular-season games while Evgenii Dadonov, Chris Tierney and Nikita Zaitsev appeared in 55 of the team's 56 games. The 2021-22 season will see forward Brady Tkachuk enter the campaign as the team's current Iron Man by way of having skated in 194 consecutive contests for the club dating to his return from a torn left leg ligament on 11/8/18 vs Vegas (5-3 loss). Should he appear in the Senators' first eight games in 2021-22, he would move into a tie (with Chris Neil at 202) for 8th place among all-time Senators Iron men. Additionally, forward Connor Brown has yet to miss a regular-season NHL game since becoming a regular skater during the 2016-17 season with Toronto. He has appeared in 127 consecutive games since being acquired by Ottawa ahead of the 2019-20 season and has skated in 373 consecutive games with both Toronto and Ottawa to sit fifth overall in consecutive games played by active league skaters and 28th among all-time Senators Iron men.

Can't shut them down: With a goal by Nikita Zaitsev at the 18:52 mark of the first period, the Senators guaranteed themselves at least one goal in each of the team's 56 regular-season games this season, thus becoming the lone NHL club to not be shutout during the 2020-21 season. It marked the first time since the 2014-15 campaign that the club managed to register at least one goal in each of the team's regular-season contests. Ottawa registered a single goal in 13 of their 56 games including four times during their first nine games in the month of January while a power-play goal from Connor Brown at 18:13 of the third period on April 1 vs Montreal (4-1 loss) marked the closest the team came to not registering a marker. With two shutouts on the season (both by Matt Murray), the Senators were +2 in shutouts for to shutouts against, their greatest total since the 2016-17 season (10 shutouts for to four shutouts against). The club was last shut out on 2/22/20 when they suffered a 3-0 setback to Montreal at Canadian Tire Centre.

Tkachuk earns impressive mark: Senators forward Brady Tkachuk became the first skater since the 2005-06 season (when hits became an officially tracked league statistic) to sit in the top five league-wide in both hits and shots-on-goal. He concluded the season with 220 shots on goal, two shy of Toronto's Auston Matthews for the league lead and with 248 hits, two shy of Florida's Radko Gudas for tops in the NHL. His second overall ranking marked the highest an Ottawa skater has finished in the league in shots-on-goal since Erik Karlsson ranked fourth overall with 292 shots-on-goal during the 2014-15 season. Tkachuk has now finished second in hits among all NHL skaters for two consecutive seasons, after previously recording 303 in 2019-20 to sit one spot below Vegas' Ryan Reaves. A Senator has finished in the top five in league-wide hits three times in the last five seasons after defenceman Mark Borowiecki led the league in 2016-17 with 364.

All-time leaders: Chris Phillips is the Senators' all-time leader in games played (1,179) ... Daniel Alfredsson leads in goals (426), assists (682) and points (1,108) ... Following Phillips is Alfredsson (1,178), Chris Neil (1,026), Wade Redden (838), Radek Bonk (689), Jason Spezza (686) and Mike Fisher (675) ... Neil leads in penalty minutes (2,522) while Patrick Lalime holds the lead in shutouts (30) and ranks second (283) to Craig Anderson (435) in games played among goaltenders. Anderson leads in wins (202).

ROSTER NOTES

Building from within: Of the 42 Senators who played for Ottawa in 2020-21, 13 were drafted by the team ... The list includes: Drake Batherson, Jacob Bernard-Docker, Logan Brown, Thomas Chabot, Filip Chlapik, Joey Daccord, Alex Formenton, Marcus Hogberg, Shane Pinto, Tim Stützle, Brady Tkachuk, Colin White and Christian Wolanin while Parker Kelly was signed as an undrafted free agent. Originally drafted by the Senators in the 2011 NHL Draft, Ryan Dzingel returned to the club following a mid-season trade from Carolina.

Fourteen (14) rookie Sens: Fourteen (14) different rookies played regular-season games for the Senators this season ... The list includes: Vitaly Abramov, Olle Alsing, Bernard-Docker, Clark Bishop, Brown, Daccord, Formenton, Filip Gustavsson, Hogberg, Kelly, Josh Norris, Pinto, Stützle and Artem Zub ... Of those players, Alsing, Bernard-Docker, Kelly, Pinto, Stützle and Zub made their respective NHL debuts. Additionally, Kelly, Norris, Pinto, Stützle and Zub scored their first NHL goals while Gustavsson made his first start and also earned his first win as a member of the Senators.
