

The Senators media information line is available at 613-599-0275. The media information line is updated by the Senators communications department. The service provides media with the latest Senators information, including practice schedules, roster moves, injury updates, ticket information, broadcast information, team announcements and visiting team information.

The account is updated frequently and aims to provide detailed information pertaining to team news, organizational events, OttawaSenators.com content, Sens TV videos, behind-the-scenes photos and more.

The account is primarily updated on game days with a goal of providing up-to-the-minute information pertaining to statistical accomplishments and real-time team-related information (injury status, scoring changes, etc.) while also aiming to inform media about upcoming availabilities and opportunities in addition to providing practice times and locations.

Media access to Canadian Tire Centre

The Canadian Tire Centre media entrance throughout the playoffs will be Gate 3 on the south side of the venue. Club dressing rooms are located at ice (arena) level at lower Gate 3. **ACCREDITATION MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.**

Parking

Parking for game-day and non-game-day practices is available in Lot 3 (which is the lot immediately adjacent to the Gate 3 entrance). However, media parking for games will be in Lot 4. Parking in Lot 4 is limited. Free parking and a parking spot are not guaranteed even if you have a pass. Parking throughout the duration of the playoffs will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Media work room

The Canadian Tire Centre media work room located at lower Gate 3 will be available from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. on non-game days and 9:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. on game-days. The media workspace available in the Senators Media Centre will only be available to photographers and out-of-town media.

News conferences and post-practice access

News conferences during the playoffs for the head coaches following off-day practices, morning-of-game practices and post-game will be held in the Senators Media Centre, located at the Gate 3 entrance of Canadian Tire Centre. All post-practice interviews will take place at Canadian Tire Centre in the event the Senators use another facility for practice.

Accreditation

All members of the media accredited for the entire Senators 2016-17 regular season can use their pass for the first three rounds of the playoffs. Visiting team media will receive 'series' accreditation, which will provide access for every Senators home game. Single-game accreditation passes will be available by contacting the Senators communications department, **by 3 p.m. on the day before the game.** Requests must be made by e-mail by the respective media outlet's assignment/news editor. Local Ottawa media should contact the Senators communications department for accreditation for away games.

Press box seating

As per each playoff year, seating in the press box will be very limited. Please be sure to check the seating plan prior to each game.

Technical lines

Media wishing to have a phone line or hardwire internet line reserved for them must make arrangements with the Senators communications department. Wireless internet is available for each practice and game in the Senators press box and in other working areas throughout Canadian Tire Centre.

Media availability on the road

Senators' players and members of the coaching staff will be available to the media after non-game day practices, morning of game practices and after games. All media availability will take place at the arena unless the team does not practice that day. A LOOK BACK ON THE 2016-17 SEASON

TEAM NOTES

Season recap: The Senators concluded the 2016-17 regular season with a record of 44-28-10 and 98 points to rank second in the Atlantic Division and sixth in the Eastern Conference. The club's 98 points were its eighth most in franchise history and accounted for its highest regular season total since the team earned 99 points during the 2014-15 campaign ... In 2015-16, Ottawa concluded the season with a record of 38-35-9 (85 points), and did not qualify for NHL post-season play.

Attendance report: The Senators averaged 16,745 patrons through their 41 home games while attracting eight sellout crowds ... The club also averaged 15,682 fans over two 2016-17 pre-season contests ... With additional modifications to Canadian Tire Centre following the launch of the Molson Canadian Fan Deck in the arena's 200 level this season, venue capacity is now 18,572.

Home on the range: Ottawa earned a record of 22-11-8 at home this season ... Mike Hoffman led the team with 14 goals at home while Erik Karlsson led the team with 26 assists at Canadian Tire Centre ... Karlsson (six goals, 26 assists) also concluded the season maintaining the team lead in home scoring with 32 points in Ottawa ... The Senators earned a record of 21-14-6 through 41 home contests in 2015-16.

Road scholars: The Senators posted a record of 22-17-2 on the road this season ... Kyle Turris was the club leader with 15 goals on the road while Karlsson concluded the season by maintaining the team lead with 28 assists while playing away from Ottawa ... Karlsson (11 goals, 28 assists) also owned the team lead with 39 points on the road this season ... The Senators registered a 17-21-3 record over 41 road contests in 2015-16.

Franchise record: Ottawa has posted an all-time record of 866-788-115-135 over 1,904 games ... The Senators are 467-351-60-74 through 952 all-time home games and 399-437-55-61 through 952 all-time road games.

Back-to-back games: Ottawa played back-to-back games on 13 occasions in 2016-17 and concluded its final set when the team opposed the New York Islanders at Brooklyn's Barclays Center on April 9 (4-2 loss) ... The Senators posted a record of 7-4-2 in the first half of contests on consecutive nights after registering a mark of 8-6-2 over 13 such games in 2015-16. The team's record in the second half of games in back-to-back sets was 7-5-1 on the heels of a mark of 4-10-0 during the previous campaign.

On the power play: The Senators were 43-for-253 which saw the team finish in a tie for 23rd among NHL clubs with an efficiency rating of 17.0% on the power play in 2016-17 ... Hoffman was the team leader with 13 power-play goals while Karlsson (four goals, 23 assists) maintained the club lead with 27 points while the team enjoyed a man advantage ... Ottawa tallied multiple power-play goals in six games this season after having done so seven times in 2015-16.

On the penalty kill: Ottawa overcame 196 of 246 (79.7%) shorthanded situations in 2016-17 which ranked 22nd in league efficiency and recorded seven shorthanded markers (Zack Smith led the team with four while Ryan Dzingel, Chris Kelly and Dion Phaneuf each had one) which tied for 11th among NHL clubs ... The team concluded the 2015-16 campaign ranked 29th in the NHL with an efficiency rating of 75.8% but tallied a league-high 17 shorthanded markers.

Heritage jersey: The Senators wore the heritage jersey on 11 occasions in 2016-17 and did so for the final time on March 23 against Pittsburgh ... Ottawa earned a record of 7-2-2 while wearing its alternate threads after registering a mark of 6-4-1 over 11 such contests in 2015-16 ... The Senators hold an all-time record of 99-62-7-21 when wearing an alternate jersey; 14-6-2-1 when wearing a red alternate, 84-55-5-19 when wearing a black alternate and 1-1-0-1 when wearing a cream alternate.

Overtime and shootouts: The Senators earned a record of 10 wins, six losses and four shootout losses over 20 games which were decided beyond regulation time in 2016-17 ... Ottawa posted a mark of 4-6 over 10 contests which were decided in overtime and a record of 6-4 in 10 shootout games ... Craig Anderson earned a record of 3-3 over six shootout results while Mike Condon registered a mark of 3-1 over four such games.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Coach Boucher: A native of Notre-Dame-du-Lac, Que., Guy Boucher made his NHL head coaching debut in a 5-3 Tampa Bay home win over Atlanta on 10/9/10. He ultimately served two-plus seasons at the Lightning helm, guiding Tampa Bay to within one victory of the Stanley Cup Final in his first season. Hired as the 12th head coach in Senators franchise history by general manager Pierre Dorion on May 8, Boucher has 141 NHL head coaching victories to his credit and ranks sixth among all-time Ottawa head coaches with 44 victories with the team.

Third season with the 'C' for Captain K: Erik Karlsson was appointed the ninth captain in Senators franchise history on 10/2/14. A native of Landsbro, Sweden, Karlsson succeeded Jason Spezza who served in the role in 2013-14. A two-time Norris Trophy recipient and a three-time First Team NHL All Star, Karlsson was assisted by alternates Chris Neil, Dion Phaneuf and Kyle Turris and leads franchise defencemen while ranking fourth among all-time Senators with 456 points for his NHL career.

Iron men: Chris Kelly, Jean-Gabriel Pageau and Tom Pyatt were the only three Senators to appear in each of the team's 82 regular season games in 2016-17 ... Erik Karlsson surpassed Chris Phillips for the franchise lead in skating in a 312th consecutive game for the club on March 4 vs Columbus (3-2 win) but ultimately saw his Ironman streak, which dated to his return from the Achilles injury he sustained in mid-February, 2013, on 4/25/13 in Washington, end at 324 consecutive contests when a lower body injury forced him to miss the team's game on March 30 at Minnesota (5-1 loss) ... Pageau will enter the 2017-18 season having appeared in 191 consecutive games for the club after competing in a full regular season NHL schedule for the second straight season. His 191 consecutive contests for the club see him rank ninth among all-time Senators Iron men.

All-time leaders: Chris Phillips is the Senators' all-time leader in games played (1,179) ... Daniel Alfredsson leads in goals (426), assists (682) and points (1,108) ... Following Phillips in games played are Alfredsson (1,178), Neil (1,026), Wade Redden (838), Radek Bonk (689), Spezza (686) and Mike Fisher (675) ... Neil leads in penalty minutes (2,522) while Patrick Lalime holds the lead in shutouts (30) and ranks second (283) to Craig Anderson (293) in games played among goaltenders. Anderson leads in wins (151).

ROSTER NOTES

Building from within: Of the 39 Senators who played for Ottawa this season, 20 were drafted by the team ... The list includes: Mark Borowiecki, Cody Ceci, Thomas Chabot, Fredrik Claesson, Chris Driedger, Ryan Dzingel, Andreas Englund, Ben Harpur, Mike Hoffman, Erik Karlsson, Chris Kelly, Curtis Lazar, Max McCormick, Chris Neil, Jean-Gabriel Pageau, Matt Puempel, Zack Smith, Mark Stone, Colin White, Chris Wideman.

Nine rookie Sens: Nine different rookies played regular-season games for the Senators this season ... The list includes: Casey Bailey, Chabot, Claesson, Driedger, Englund, Harpur, McCormick, Buddy Robinson and White ... Of those players, Chabot, Englund and White made their respective NHL debuts. While not considered a rookie by NHL standards, forward Chris DiDomenico also made his NHL debut after signing with the team on Feb. 28 following a five-season professional career in Europe. Additionally, Claesson was the lone member of this season's team to score his first NHL goal as member of the Senators.
