## SCOTT MALKIN

OWNER & GOVERNOR

Scott Malkin is founder and Chairman of S D Malkin Properties, a specialist property investment and development company concentrating on innovative mixed-use, retail anchored projects including the award winning 2 Rodeo Drive in Beverly Hills, California.

He is also founder and Chairman of Value Retail PLC, as well as co-founder and Chairman of Value Retail China. Value Retail develops and operates upmarket outlet shopping villages serving the capital cities of Western Europe and the tier one cities in China.

These open air, pedestrianised villages serve the fashion and luxury retail brands and attract primarily long haul tourists. They generate the highest sales per square foot of any portfolio of shopping centres in the world.

Scott is a graduate of Harvard College, Harvard Business School and Harvard Law School and serves on various committees at Harvard University including the Dean's Board of Advisors at Harvard Business School and the University's Global Advisory Committee.

He is also a member of the Advisory Boards for the Harvard Stem Cell Institute, the Harvard Medical School Advisory Council on Global Health, Oxford University's business school, the Tobin Project, Conservacion Patagonica and the Columbia University Global Centres/Europe, and is a member of the President's Council of Massachusetts General Hospital.

Scott is currently Chair of the Advisory Board of the Urban Land Institute, Europe. In addition, he is a Trustee of the New York Public Library, of Partners In Health, of The Carnegie Endowment for International Peace and of the US Olympic and Paralympic Foundation.

Scott and his family have lived in London since 1991.



## JON LEDECKY

### CO-OWNER & ALTERNATE GOVERNOR

Jon Ledecky is a private equity investor who has been the co-founder or initial investor in companies that have raised over \$20 billion in financing. Jon founded U.S. Office Products in 1994 and by 1997 the Company had become the fastest entrant ever in the history of the Fortune 500 with annualized sales of nearly \$4 billion. U.S. Office Products owned Mail Boxes, Etc. (now the UPS Store) and several other brands that eventually became independent public and private companies.

Jon Ledecky's initial foray into professional sports ownership occurred in 1999 when, with partner Ted Leonsis, he bought the Washington Capitals of the National Hockey League and an interest in the Washington Wizards of the National Basketball Association. Jon later sold his partnership interest and started a foundation that dedicated itself to the education of inner-city children in Boston, New York and Washington. The foundation distributed millions of dollars to the building and upgrading of educational facilities for children in these inner cities.


Jon Ledecky is an honors graduate of Harvard College and also graduated from Harvard Business School. He was elected the Chief Marshal at Harvard in 2004, a singular honor bestowed on the 25th Reunion graduate by his classmates for accomplishing the "most for Harvard and society while

achieving outstanding professional success." Mr. Ledecky received the prestigious National Capitol Boy Scouts Citizen of The Year Award in 1998, the youngest recipient to receive an honor bestowed previously on President Ronald Reagan and Colin Powell. He has also been honored as the Anti-Defamation League Man of the Year and was the International Franchise Association's "Free Enterprise Award" winner.

Mr. Ledecky was selected to serve as a Commissioner on the National Commission on Entrepreneurship. He has been a Board member of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and served as a Trustee of George Washington University. Jon is a Trustee of the U.S. Olympic Committee Foundation.

His niece, Katie Ledecky, won gold medals at the 2016 Summer Olympic games in Rio in the 200-meter freestyle, the 400-meter freestyle, the 800-meter freestyle and the 4X200 freestyle relay. In 2012 in the London Olympic Games, she won the 800-meter freestyle gold medal at the age of 15. She owns the current world records in the 400, 800, and 1500-meter freestyle swimming events.

Jon is a native of New York City and has lived in Brooklyn, Queens and Manhattan.



## DEWEY K. SHAY


### CO-OWNER

Dewey K. Shay is co-founder and CEO of Unison Site Management, a U.S. buyer and manager of wireless cell site properties. Unison originated and managed portfolios of wireless assets sold to Goldman Sachs Infrastructure Fund I, American Tower and Melody Capital Partners for impressive returns.

Prior thereto, Dewey co-founded OneMain.com, an internet service provider which raised \$215 million in an IPO in March 1999 and was sold for \$300 million of cash and stock to EarthLink in September 2000.

Dewey was an investment banker with Morgan Stanley for ten years in corporate finance and mergers and acquisitions. He currently serves on the Management Advisory Board for TowerBrook Capital Partners L.P. as a Board member of Validity Finance, LLC, and as board member on the Cornell Rowing Association.

He is an investor in the New York Islanders hockey team and the New York Mets baseball team. Dewey has a BA from Cornell University and an MBA from the Wharton School.



# LOU LAMORIELLO

## PRESIDENT OF HOCKEY OPERATIONS AND GENERAL MANAGER

Lou Lamoriello was named the Islanders President of Hockey Operations on May 22, 2018. He assumed the role of General Manager on June 5, 2018. Lamoriello is in his third season as Islanders President of Hockey Operations and General Manager. In the past three seasons, he has led the Islanders to a combined regular season record of 115-67-24 and a combined playoff record of 17-13.

In the 2020-21 season, Lamoriello moved into second place on the league's all-time list for most wins as an NHL general manager (1,326-921-179-166, 2,592 GP) and became one of just three NHL general managers in league history to win 1,300 or more games. Lamoriello earned his 100th win with the Islanders on March 11, 2021 against New Jersey to become the fourth general manager in league history to reach 100 or more wins with three different franchises.

The Islanders have qualified for the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of his first three seasons at the helm. The Islanders went 13-9 in the 2020 playoffs and advanced to the Eastern Conference Final for the first time in 27 years. With a Second-Round series win over the Philadelphia Flyers on September 5, 2020, Lamoriello moved into second in league history in playoff series wins (29). He was named the winner of the 2020 Jim Gregory General Manager of the Year Award.

A three-time Stanley Cup Champion as a General Manager and Hockey Hall Of Fame inductee, Lamoriello joined the Islanders after three seasons as General Manager of the Toronto Maple Leafs. Toronto posted 100-point seasons and qualified for the playoffs in each of Lamoriello's final two seasons with the club. The Maple Leafs compiled an overall regular-season record of 118-95-33 and a 5-8 playoff record during Lamoriello's tenure.

Lamoriello joined the New Jersey Devils as President and General Manager in 1987. Throughout his tenure in New Jersey, the Devils went to the Stanley Cup Playoffs 21 times, posted 13, 100-point seasons, won nine division titles, went to the Stanley Cup Final five times and won the Stanley Cup in 1995, 2000 and 2003. The Devils also earned 13 consecutive post-season berths from 1997-2010.

Over the course of Lamoriello's tenure in New Jersey, the Devils posted a regular season record of 1,093-759-179-109 and a playoff record of 136-116. In 1995, New Jersey's American Hockey League affiliate, the Albany Devils, won the Calder Cup, marking the

third time an NHL organization and their AHL franchise won both championships in the same season.

Through 25 postseason appearances, Lamoriello has compiled a lifetime Stanley Cup Playoffs record of 158-137 (295 GP).

Lamoriello served as the Devils' Head Coach for 50 regular season games in 2005-06 (32-14-4) and the final three regular season games in 2006-07. The Devils qualified for the playoffs and reached the Eastern Conference Final in both seasons.

In 2009, Lamoriello received the highest honor there is in the sport of hockey as he was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame.

In addition to his responsibilities with the Devils, Lamoriello was named vice-chairman and CEO of the National Basketball Association's New Jersey Nets after the hockey team was purchased by YankeeNets. Following back-to-back appearances in the NBA Finals in 2002 and 2003, Lamoriello relinquished his posts with the Nets when YankeeNets sold the basketball franchise to an independent owner in 2004.

Internationally, Lamoriello served as the General Manager for Team USA at the World Cup of Hockey in 1996. Team USA won the inaugural tournament championship, defeating Team Canada in a best-of-three final. He also served as General Manager for Team USA at the 1998 Winter Olympics in Nagano, Japan. The Johnston, RI native was inducted into the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2012 and received the Lester Patrick Trophy in 1992 in recognition of his service to hockey in the United States.

Prior to his time in the NHL, Lamoriello spent two decades at Providence College, including 15 seasons as Head Coach. During his time behind the bench, the Friars posted a 248-179-13 record, qualified for 12 consecutive post-season tournament berths and had more players drafted into the NHL after entering college than any other college team during Lamoriello's last five years. He also served as the College's Athletic Director. Lamoriello was one of five founders of Hockey East Association and served as commissioner of the league from 1983-87. Since 1989, the winner of the Hockey East tournament has been awarded the Lamoriello Trophy. Lamoriello was inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.



## CHRIS LAMORIELLO

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

GENERAL MANAGER, BRIDGEPORT SOUND TIGERS

Chris Lamoriello joined the Islanders in August, 2016 as the Director of Player Personnel. He was promoted to Assistant General Manager prior to the 2017-18 season.

Prior to joining the Islanders, the Providence, RI, native served as the Senior Vice President of Hockey Operations for the New Jersey Devils and the General Manager of the Albany Devils (AHL) from 2001-2015. Lamoriello was a part of the Devils scouting staff since the start of the 1995-96 season, covering all levels of hockey throughout the United States, Canada and Europe.

During Lamoriello's tenure with New Jersey, the Devils posted 12 100-point seasons, made the playoffs 14 times, reached the Stanley Cup Final four times and won two Stanley Cups (2000, 2003).

Lamoriello attended Providence College in 1994, where he earned his bachelor's degree in history. He played both hockey and baseball at Providence. Chris is the son of current President and General Manager Lou Lamoriello.



## STEPHEN PELLEGRINI

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Stephen Pellegrini was named Assistant General Manager of the New York Islanders on June 12, 2018.

Pellegrini joined the Islanders after working for the New Jersey Devils as the Vice President of Hockey Operations from 2006-2018. During Pellegrini's tenure in New Jersey, the Devils posted four 100-point seasons, made the playoffs six times and reached the Stanley Cup Final in 2012.

Prior to joining the Devils, Pellegrini spent eight seasons as Group Vice President of the NHL's Central Registry Department (1998-2006). There, he served on the league's CBA negotiating committee and assisted on CBA rules and regulation enforcement.

Pellegrini served as the Director of Hockey Administration from 1995 through 1998 for the Edmonton Oilers.

Pellegrini earned his graduate degree in sports administration from Montreal's Concordia University in 1991. He received his undergraduate degree in history from King's College at The University of Western Ontario.

# NEW YORK ISLANDERS COACHING STAFF



## BARRY TROTZ

### HEAD COACH

Barry Trotz was named Head Coach of the New York Islanders on June 21, 2018. Through his first three seasons, Trotz has led the franchise to a combined regular season record of 115-67-24 and a combined playoff record of 17-13.

In the 2020-21 regular season, the Islanders went 32-17-7 and earned 71 points through 56 games. The team went 21-4-3 on home ice, earning their most home points through 28 games since the 1980-81 season. The Islanders allowed the fewest goals (128) through 56 games in club history and set a franchise-best shutout streak (212:35).

Trotz earned his 850th win on Feb. 8, 2021, passing Ken Hitchcock for third on the NHL's all-time list. He ranks second among active head coaches in both wins (877) and games coached (1730).

The Islanders earned 80 points and went 30-23-10 in 2019-20 before the season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The team set a franchise record 17-game point streak (15-0-2) from October 12 through November 28, 2019.

The Islanders have qualified for the Stanley Cup Playoffs in all of Trotz's first three seasons with the club. Trotz led the Islanders to a 13-9 postseason record in 2020, the most postseason wins by an Islanders team since 1982-83. The team advanced to the Eastern Conference Final for the first time since 1993.

In his first year with the club, the Islanders earned 103 points, their highest total since the 1983-84 season (104 points). Trotz's club gave up the fewest goals of any team in 2018-19. The Islanders' fourth-place Eastern Conference ranking in 2019 was their best finish since the conference was created (1993). The Islanders finished fifth overall in the NHL standings, marking their first top-5 finish since 1985-86 (5th overall). They advanced to the second round

of the Stanley Cup Playoffs. For the second time in his career, Trotz was awarded the Jack Adams Trophy (2018-19), given annually to the coach voted best in the league.

Trotz spent the previous four seasons as the Head Coach of the Washington Capitals. During his tenure in Washington, Trotz led the Capitals to two consecutive Presidents' Trophies (2015-16 and 2016-17) and won the franchise's first Stanley Cup (2017-18). He was awarded the Jack Adams Trophy (2015-16).

In 2017, the Winnipeg, Manitoba native became the sixth coach in NHL history to earn 700 wins. Trotz has compiled a lifetime regular-season record of 845-618-60-151 (1,674 GP) (WL-T-OT) and a lifetime Stanley Cup Playoffs record of 76-75 (151 GP).

Prior to joining the Capitals, Trotz spent the previous 15 seasons as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators. He ranks third all-time in NHL history in both games coached (1,196) and wins (557) with a single franchise.

Prior to joining the Predators, Trotz spent five seasons (1992-97) coaching the Baltimore Skipjacks, the Capitals' American Hockey League affiliate. The franchise relocated to Portland, Maine in 1993 and he led the Portland Pirates to two Calder Cup Finals appearances over the next four seasons. In 1994-95, Trotz coached Portland to a Calder Cup Championship and a league-best record of 43-27-10. He was named the AHL Coach of the Year that same season.

On the international stage, Trotz has served as an Assistant Coach for Team Canada at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and at the IIHF World Championships on four occasions, most recently at the 2013 tournament in Stockholm, Sweden, and Helsinki, Finland. In 2003, he helped Team Canada win gold in Finland, and in 2009, he helped guide Canada to a silver medal in Switzerland.

# NEW YORK ISLANDERS COACHING STAFF



## LANE LAMBERT ASSOCIATE COACH

Lane Lambert was named Associate Coach of the New York Islanders on July 5, 2018.

Lambert spent the previous four seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Washington Capitals, working alongside current Islanders Head Coach Barry Trotz. Lambert was on Washington's staff that helped guide the Capitals to two consecutive Presidents' Trophies (2015-16 and 2016-17) and the franchise's first Stanley Cup Championship (2017-18).

Prior to joining the Capitals, Lambert spent three seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Nashville Predators. In his first season with the Predators in 2011-12, Nashville recorded the NHL's fifth-best record and advanced to the second round of the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Lambert served as Head Coach of the Milwaukee Admirals of the American Hockey League (AHL) from 2007-11. In addition to four straight Calder Cup playoff berths, Lambert helped the Admirals capture a pair of West Division titles and post the Western Conference's highest point total in 2010-11 (102

pts, 44-22-14 record).

Prior to joining the Admirals as an Assistant Coach in 2006-07, the Melfort, Saskatchewan, native spent one season as an Assistant Coach for the Bridgeport Sound Tigers, the Islanders' AHL affiliate. Lambert started his coaching career in the Western Hockey League, spending two seasons as Head Coach of the Prince George Cougars (2003-05) and two seasons as an Assistant Coach for the Moose Jaw Warriors (2002-04).

Lambert was drafted by the Detroit Red Wings in the second round, 25th overall, of the 1983 NHL Entry Draft. He scored 125 points (58 goals, 67 assists) and accumulated 521 penalty minutes in 283 career NHL games from 1983-1988 with Detroit, the New York Rangers and Quebec Nordiques. Lambert enjoyed his most successful NHL campaign with the Nordiques in 1987-88, recording career-highs in points (41) and assists (28) in 61 contests. Lambert won an AHL Calder Cup title with the Adirondack Red Wings in 1986 and helped the Houston Aeros claim the IHL's Turner Cup Championship in 1999.



## JOHN GRUDEN ASSISTANT COACH

John Gruden was named Assistant Coach of the New York Islanders on July 18, 2018.

Gruden spent the previous two seasons as the Head Coach for the Hamilton Bulldogs of the Ontario Hockey League. In 2017-18, Hamilton finished with the best record in the OHL's Eastern Conference (43-18-4-3) and won the J. Ross Robertson Cup as OHL Champions.

Prior to coaching the Bulldogs, Gruden served as Head Coach for the Flint Firebirds (OHL) during the 2015-16 season.

Internationally, Gruden has extensive background with USA Hockey, where he was an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2016 U18 World Championships in Grand Forks, ND. He spent four seasons (2011-15) as an Assistant Coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. Gruden helped lead Team USA to gold-medal finishes at both the 2012 and 2014 U18 Men's World

Championships.

Gruden, a native of Virginia, Minn. played 92 games over the course of six seasons in the National Hockey League with the Boston Bruins, Ottawa Senators and Washington Capitals. He also played professionally in the American Hockey League, International Hockey League and in Europe. Gruden played for Team USA at the 2003 World Championships in Helsinki, Tampere and Turku, Finland.

Gruden attended Ferris State University, where he played in 155 games and registered 104 points (40 goals, 64 assists). He became the first NCAA Division I All-American in Ferris State Athletics history in 1993-94. He also was the first player in school history to achieve Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) First-Team honors and finished as the runner-up for the CCHA's Player of the Year Award that same season.



## JIM HILLER ASSISTANT COACH


Jim Hiller was named Assistant Coach of the New York Islanders on June 19, 2019.

Hiller spent the previous four seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Toronto Maple Leafs. Prior to his time with the Maple Leafs, Hiller served as an Assistant Coach with the Detroit Red Wings during the 2014-15 season.

The Port Alberni, BC native coached for 10 years in the Western Hockey League. Hiller was the Head Coach of the WHL's Tri-City Americans from 2009-14. In 360 regular-season games with Tri-City, Hiller compiled a 210-124-11-15 record, leading the team to four playoff berths, two U.S. Division titles and an appearance in the WHL Finals in 2010. In 2011-12, Hiller was named the WHL's Coach of the Year, and also received the Brian Kilrea Coach of the Year Award as the top coach in the Canadian Hockey League after leading the

Americans to a 50-18-2-2 record. Hiller also spent two years as an Assistant Coach in Tri-City (2002-04) before taking his first head coaching job in the BCHL with the Alberni Valley Bulldogs in 2005-06. Hiller compiled a 43-12-2 record in his lone season with Alberni Valley before spending the following three seasons with the WHL's Chilliwack Bruins.

As a player, Hiller was drafted in the 10th round (207th overall) of the 1989 NHL Entry Draft by the Los Angeles Kings. He appeared in 63 career NHL games with the Red Wings, Kings and New York Rangers from 1992-94. He scored 20 points (eight goals, 12 assists). Hiller also played in the IHL with the Phoenix Roadrunners and Atlanta Knights, as well as in the AHL with the Binghamton Rangers before finishing his playing career in Europe. Prior to turning pro, he played three seasons with the Northern Michigan Wildcats, scoring 205 points (76 goals, 129 assists) in 123 collegiate games from 1989-92.

Dina Passaro joined the Islanders as Executive Assistant to President and General Manager Lou Lamoriello before the 2018-19 season.


