

JACK McILHARGEY

1952 - 2020



Jack McIlhargey, a longtime member of the Flyers organization, passed away in British Columbia on July 18 at the age of 68 after a battle with cancer. Jack began his NHL career with the Flyers and contributed to the organization's success over the years as a player, an assistant coach, and most recently as a scout until his passing. He helped the Flyers to three Conference Championships, including two as a player.

Jack will be deeply missed, but his legacy with the Flyers will be felt for years to come. He was a large part of drafting the players on today's team and the ones currently in the system who will make up a new generation of Flyers. The Flyers organization sends its condolences to Jack's wife Karyne, and his three daughters, Erin, Georgia and Anna.



DAVID A. SCOTT

CHAIRMAN / CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF COMCAST SPECTACOR AND GOVERNOR, PHILADELPHIA FLYERS



Dave Scott is Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Comcast Spectacor, and serves as Governor of the Philadelphia Flyers for the National Hockey League. As CEO, Scott is responsible for the growth of Comcast Spectacor's core businesses: The Wells Fargo Center arena and complex, as well as a portfolio of professional sports teams that includes the National Hockey League's Philadelphia Flyers, the Overwatch League's Philadelphia Fusion, the National Lacrosse League's Philadelphia Wings and the Maine Mariners of the ECHL.

Scott oversees Comcast Spectacor's investments in partner companies and serves as CEO of Spectra, a hospitality firm specializing in Venue Management, Food Services & Hospitality, and Partnerships. Under Scott's direction, the Wells Fargo Center continues to serve as the company's flagship arena and is consistently ranked a top-five "must play" venue in the United States. The Wells Fargo Center continues to capture the national spotlight by hosting prestigious events such as the 2016 NCAA Men's Basketball East Regional matchups, the 2016 Democratic National Convention as well as the 2019 Overwatch League Grand Finals.

Throughout his tenure, Scott has diversified and expanded Comcast Spectacor's professional sports and esports portfolios. In 2017, the company re-established the Philadelphia Wings of the National Lacrosse League and launched the Philadelphia Fusion, the city's first professional esports franchise who competes in the global Overwatch League. In that same year, Comcast Spectacor proudly brought professional ice hockey back to Portland after it acquired the Maine Mariners of the ECHL.

In 2019, the company expanded its footprint within the esports industry and did so in a global way. Under Scott's leadership, Comcast Spectacor formed an esports joint venture with South Korean wireless telecommunication giant SK Telecom and launched T1 Entertainment and Sports, which includes the ultra-successful T1 League of Legends (LoL) team. The organization also operates teams in competitive gaming segments that include Fortnite, Dota 2, PUBG, Super Smash Bros., Hearthstone and Apex Legends.

Scott joined Comcast Spectacor as President in December 2013 following a 20-year tenure at Comcast Cable. Scott served as Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of Comcast Cable from 2005-2013.

Scott joined Comcast in 1993, and was President of Comcast's Central Division from 1996 to 2005.

Scott earned a BBA from Cleveland State University and CPA Certification from the state of Ohio. Scott currently serves on the executive committee and the Board of Directors of the Ed Snider Youth Hockey Foundation. Scott is also a board member of the Comcast Spectacor Foundation.

Scott is married with five children.

CHUCK FLETCHER

PRESIDENT, HOCKEY OPERATIONS & GENERAL MANAGER/ALTERNATE GOVERNOR



Chuck Fletcher was named the ninth general manager in Flyers history on December 3, 2018, and added the title of President of Hockey Operations on July 11, 2019. Over the course of a 26-year career as an NHL executive, Fletcher has advanced to the Stanley Cup Final four times with three different franchises, and won the Stanley Cup with Pittsburgh in 2009.

Fletcher joined the Flyers after serving as a senior advisor with the New Jersey Devils for the first part of the 2018-19 season. Prior to that appointment, Fletcher was the Executive Vice President & General Manager of the Minnesota Wild for nine seasons (2009-2018), compiling a record of 399-298-89. The Wild made the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of Fletcher's final six seasons and reached the Second Round in 2014 and 2015. During his tenure in Minnesota, Fletcher added

several players that have become leaders in the franchise's history, including Zach Parise, Ryan Suter, Eric Staal, Matt Dumba, Mikael Granlund, Jared Spurgeon, Charlie Coyle, Nino Niederreiter, Jason Zucker, Jason Pominville, and Devan Dubnyk.

Fletcher's NHL career began in 1993 when he joined the expansion Florida Panthers as an assistant general manager to Bob Clarke, who served as the franchise's first GM. Fletcher assisted in the assembly of the Panthers' first roster and was part of the organization's run to the Stanley Cup Final in just its third season of operation in 1996. He spent nine seasons with the franchise, serving as Interim General Manager in 2001-02.

In 2002, Fletcher joined the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim as Director of Hockey Operations and spent four seasons with the club, later holding the titles of Assistant General Manager, Hockey Operations and Vice President of Amateur Scouting and Player Development. The Ducks made the Stanley Cup Final in the 2002-03 season, losing just two games in the first three rounds before taking New Jersey to a seventh game in the Final. While with Anaheim, Fletcher was involved in drafts that brought Ryan Getzlaf, Corey Perry, Ladislav Smid, Joffrey Lupul and Bobby Ryan to the franchise.

Fletcher moved to the Pittsburgh Penguins in 2006 as an assistant general manager to Ray Shero, where his duties also included overseeing the team's American Hockey League affiliate in Wilkes-Barre/Scranton. In addition to Pittsburgh's 2009 Stanley Cup championship, the Penguins also reached the Stanley Cup Final in 2008. On the AHL side, Wilkes-Barre/Scranton reached the Division Finals in 2006-07 and 2008-09 and the Calder Cup Final in 2007-08. He departed the Penguins for Minnesota following the 2009 championship season.

Fletcher began following the NHL game at a young age alongside his father Cliff Fletcher, a Hockey Hall of Fame inductee who was the general manager of the Atlanta/Calgary Flames from 1972-91 and the Toronto Maple Leafs from 1991-97. While pursuing his degree at Harvard University, Fletcher worked with the Canadian Olympic Team at the 1988 Winter Olympics in Calgary. After graduating from Harvard in 1990, Fletcher spent two years as a player representative for Newport Sports Management before joining Florida.

Fletcher was born on April 29, 1967 in Montreal. He and his wife, Rhonda, have two children, daughter Kaitlin, and son Keith.

VALERIE CAMILLO

PRESIDENT, BUSINESS OPERATIONS/ALTERNATE GOVERNOR



Valerie Camillo is President of Business Operations for the Philadelphia Flyers and Wells Fargo Center. In this role, she directs all business activities for the NHL franchise and one of the country's busiest arenas. Valerie sets the strategic direction for the team and arena, leading all revenue, marketing, operations, and administration (Finance, HR, Communications, etc.) functions. Valerie is the first woman hired as President of a NHL franchise and is a member of the NHL's Board of Governors. She is also Governor and President of the Philadelphia Wings of the National Lacrosse League, and President of the Maine Mariners of the ECHL.

Valerie is leading the \$300M transformation of the Wells Fargo Center—a multi-year redesign of the arena focused on delivering innovative technologies and guest experiences.

She manages Comcast's relationships with several key stakeholders including broadcast partners, key arena tenants, most notably the Philadelphia 76ers, concert promoters (such as Live Nation and AEG), and development partners such as the Cordish Companies. Currently, Comcast and Cordish are partnering to develop the Philadelphia sports complex into a world class entertainment district with bars, restaurants, retail, office buildings, hotels, and the east coast's first esports arena.

Camillo joined the Flyers from the Washington Nationals, where she was Chief Revenue and Marketing Officer from 2014-2018. During her tenure, she led the development and implementation of strategies to maximize commercial opportunities—leading to record growth for the franchise. She was responsible for all revenue generating functions of the team including corporate partnerships, licensing, ticket and suite sales, broadcasting, marketing, brand management, retail, food and beverage, and non-baseball events at Nationals Park.

From 2010-2014, Camillo was a Senior Vice President in the NBA's Team Marketing and Business Operations (TMBO) group. In this role, she provided strategic advisory services to multiple NBA teams with regards to revenue generation, marketing, analytics, technology and property development.

Camillo began her career in management consulting, working for 15 years as a business strategy, data analytics, and process improvement advisor. During her consulting career, Valerie worked for PriceWaterhouseCoopers (PWC), IBM, and Booz Allen Hamilton leading a variety of commercial and Government projects.

Camillo received a B.S. in Commerce from the University of Virginia, and her M.B.A. from the Darden School of Business at the University of Virginia.

She is on the Board of Directors for Herschend Family Entertainment, one of the largest privately-held amusement park, event, and attraction companies in the United States.

She is active in the Greater Philadelphia community. Valerie is on the Board of the Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Philadelphia Chapter of the Young Presidents Organization (YPO), and sits on the Corporate Counsel of the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP).

Valerie resides in Philadelphia with her husband, Lawrence.

PHIL WEINBERG

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT, ADMINISTRATION AND GENERAL COUNSEL/ALTERNATE GOVERNOR



Phil Weinberg is Executive Vice President and General Counsel for Comcast Spectacor. In this role, Weinberg provides direct oversight of all legal affairs surrounding Comcast Spectacor which includes the Wells Fargo Center arena and complex, as well as a portfolio of professional sports teams that includes the National Hockey League's Philadelphia Flyers, the Overwatch League's Philadelphia Fusion, the National Lacrosse League's Philadelphia Wings and the Maine Mariners of the ECHL. Weinberg's responsibilities cover all aspects of litigation, employment and labor laws, financing, business acquisition and development, as well as player-related matters. In addition, Weinberg oversees Comcast Spectacor's Corporate Communications and Human Resources functions, and serves as a key advisor to Chairman and CEO Dave Scott.

Since becoming EVP/General Counsel in 1996, Weinberg has supported a number of company-defining transactions, such as the construction and permanent financing of the Wells Fargo Center, the merger between Comcast and Spectacor, the acquisitions of Global Spectrum, Ovations Food Services, New Era Tickets and Paciolan, Inc., as well as the sale of the Philadelphia 76ers.

From 2008 through 2012, as Comcast completed its acquisition of NBCUniversal, Weinberg also worked with Comcast's Regional Sports Network group as its Executive Vice President of Legal and Business Affairs. In 2015, Weinberg provided leadership throughout the rebranding of Comcast Spectacor's Venue Management, Food Services, Partnerships and Ticketing business units into one cohesive company: Spectra. Most recently, Weinberg oversaw the sale of Spectra's Ticketing & Fan Engagement division to Learfield in June 2017 and the sale of Spectra to Atairos in April 2018.

Weinberg joined Comcast Spectacor in 1990 following seven years of private practice law with the litigation firm of Sprague and Sprague in Philadelphia. Between 1977 and 1980, Weinberg also served as an assistant to the Commissioner of the New York City Department of Environmental Protection.

Weinberg earned a B.A. in Political Science from Hamilton College in 1977 and his law degree from Boston University in 1983. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Ed Snider Youth Hockey Foundation, Flyers Charities, Philadelphia Futures and Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Southeastern Pennsylvania. He also serves as an Alternate Governor of the National Hockey League.

Weinberg resides in Philadelphia and is married with two children.

MIKE SHANE

CHIEF BUSINESS OFFICER



Michael Shane joined Comcast Spectacor in April 2019 as the Chief Business Officer for the Philadelphia Flyers, Wells Fargo Center, Wings and Mariners. In this role, Shane manages all ticketing, sales, marketing, business strategy and analytics for the arena and Comcast Spectacor's professional sports entities.

Prior to joining Comcast Spectacor, Shane was with the Washington Nationals for 12 years and held a myriad of roles in sales, marketing, analytics, and business strategy. He was most recently Senior Vice President of Consumer Revenue and oversaw all revenue and marketing functions for the Club.

Prior to his time in Washington, Shane began his career with Major League Baseball in their Special Events Department before transitioning to the Charlotte Bobcats' (now Hornets) sales division.

Shane received a B.S. in Business Administration and Management from Mary Washington College before going on to earn an MBA from Georgetown University.

ALAIN VIGNEAULT

HEAD COACH



Alain Vigneault was named the 21st head coach in Flyers history on April 15, 2019.

Vigneault, 58, brings 1,216 games of experience as an NHL head coach to Philadelphia over parts of 16 seasons. He served as the head coach of the New York Rangers for five seasons (2013-18), the Vancouver Canucks for seven seasons (2006-13) and the Montreal Canadiens for parts of four seasons (1997-2000). He also served as the head coach for Team Canada at the 2019 IIHF World Championships in Slovakia, guiding the squad to a silver medal.

In Vigneault's 15 full seasons as a head coach, eight of his teams have finished with 100 points or better. A ninth team, Vancouver in 2012-13, achieved 59 points during the lockout-shortened campaign for a points percentage of .610, equivalent to a 100-point season. His teams have won seven division championships and have made the playoffs 11 times, advancing past the first round on eight of those occasions, and reaching the Stanley Cup Final with Vancouver in 2010-11 and the Rangers in 2013-14. Three of Vigneault's teams have earned the Presidents' Trophy – Vancouver on two occasions, 2010-11 and 2011-12, and the Rangers in 2014-15. Individually, Vigneault won the Jack Adams Award as the NHL Coach of the Year in 2006-07 and was a finalist for the award on three other occasions:

1997-98, 2010-11 and 2014-15.

Vigneault earned 539 wins over his 12 seasons in Vancouver and New York from 2006-18, which was the most of any NHL coach in that timeframe – five more than Joel Quenneville and nine ahead of Barry Trotz. He is also one of only two head coaches, along with Scotty Bowman, who have captured the Presidents' Trophy at least three times since the award was first presented in 1985-86.

Vigneault was one of the most successful head coaches in the 91 seasons the New York Rangers franchise had played through the end of the 2017-18 campaign, joining Lester Patrick and Emile Francis in a group that sits atop the 35 men that have coached the team. He was just the fourth head coach to start five consecutive seasons with the Rangers, and he finished ranked third in the franchise's history in regular season wins with 226, third in playoff wins with 31, and fourth in regular season games coached with 410. The 226 wins in his five years with the club is the highest number of wins over any five-year span in Rangers history.

Vigneault guided the Blueshirts to the playoffs in each of his first four seasons with the team, joining Patrick and Francis as the only three head coaches in Rangers history to reach the playoffs in at least four consecutive seasons. Those four teams all turned in seasons of 96 points or better, starting with the 2013-14 squad that bested the Flyers in a seven-game first-round series en route to the 2014 Stanley Cup Final. The Rangers followed that season up by winning the Presidents' Trophy in 2014-15 with 53 wins and 113 points, both franchise records, and took the Tampa Bay Lightning to a seventh game in the Eastern Conference Final. Playoff appearances also followed seasons of 101 points in 2015-16 and 102 points in 2016-17.

Vigneault's tenure in Vancouver was the most successful period in the franchise's history. He is the team's all-time leader in nearly all major coaching categories, including regular season games coached (540), wins (313), points (683) and points percentage (.632), as well as playoff games coached (68) and wins (33).

In Vigneault's debut season with Vancouver in 2006-07, the team went 49-26-7 for 105 points to win the Pacific Division after finishing fourth with 92 points a year prior, a turnaround that earned Vigneault the Jack Adams Award on his second career nomination. After missing out on a playoff spot by three points in 2008-09, Vigneault and the Canucks reeled off five consecutive division championships, all of which came with seasons of 100 points or equivalent.

The peak of that run came in 2010-11, when Vancouver went 54-19-9 for 117 points to win its first of two consecutive Presidents' Trophies. The Canucks defeated the defending champion Blackhawks in a seven-game first round series, and after defeating Nashville in the second round and San Jose in the Conference Final, came within one win of the Stanley Cup before falling to Boston in a seven-game Final series. A 51-win season followed in 2011-12, but the Canucks saw their run cut short by the eventual Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in the first round.

Vigneault's first NHL head coaching position came in Montreal, where he became the second-youngest head coach in the franchise's long history at the age of 36. Vigneault guided the Canadiens to the Eastern Conference Semifinals in 1997-98 and earned his first Jack Adams nomination in 1999-2000 after Montreal came within two points of a playoff spot despite an injury-riddled season in which 36 different skaters appeared in at least one game; only seven of those 36 players played 70 or more games that year.

Over the course of a three-year playing career as a defenseman, Vigneault appeared in 42 NHL games with St. Louis from 1981-1983 after being selected by the Blues in the eighth round (167th overall) of the 1981 NHL Entry Draft. He began his coaching career in 1986 in the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League, spending one season with the Trois-Rivières Drapeaux and five with the Hull Olympiques. In 1992-93, Vigneault joined the expansion Ottawa Senators as an assistant coach, where he spent 3 ½ seasons before returning to the QMJHL, where he coached the Beauport Harfangs through the end of the 1996-97 season. He was named the head coach of the Canadiens the following season. After departing Montreal 20 games into the 2000-01 season, Vigneault spent two seasons back in the QMJHL as the head coach of the Prince Edward Island Rocket from 2003-05 and then one season as the head coach of the Manitoba Moose, the AHL affiliate of the Canucks, before his return to the NHL with Vancouver.

MICHEL THERRIEN

ASSISTANT COACH



Michel Therrien joined the Flyers as an assistant coach on May 5, 2019.

Therrien, 55 (11/4/1963), comes to the Flyers after most recently serving what was his second term as the head coach of the Montreal Canadiens, a position he held from June 5, 2012 until February 14, 2017. The Canadiens made the playoffs in each of Therrien's first three seasons, including division titles in 2012-13 and 2014-15 and a trip to the Conference Finals in 2013-14. Therrien had previously coached Montreal for parts of three seasons (2000-01 to 2002-03). His 542 games at the helm of the Canadiens ranks fourth in the franchise's history, as does his 271 wins with the team.

In between stops in Montreal, Therrien spent seven seasons in the Pittsburgh Penguins organization. He was hired as the head coach of the team's American Hockey League affiliate, the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins, in 2003 and led the team to Calder Cup Playoff berths in 2004 and 2005.

Wilkes-Barre/Scranton was 21-1-2-1 through the first 25 games of the 2005-06 season when Therrien was promoted to the head coaching position in Pittsburgh on December 15, 2005. After missing the playoffs that season, Therrien guided the Penguins back to the postseason in 2006-07 with a 47-24-11 record and was named a finalist for the Jack Adams Award. Therrien remained with the Penguins until February 15, 2009, a run that included a trip to the 2008 Stanley Cup Final.

In 814 games as an NHL head coach, Therrien has a record of 406-303-23-82.

MIKE YEO

ASSISTANT COACH



Mike Yeo joined the Flyers as an assistant coach on May 6, 2019.

Yeo, 45 (7-31-1973), was most recently with the St. Louis Blues, where he served as associate coach from June 13, 2016 to February 1, 2017 and as head coach from that date until November 19, 2018. He led the Blues to a 22-8-2 record over the final 32 games of the 2016-17 regular season, finishing third in the Central Division. The Blues defeated the Minnesota Wild in five games in the first round of the 2017 Stanley Cup Playoffs before exiting in a six-game second-round series at the hands of the eventual conference champion Nashville Predators.

Yeo earned his first head coaching job when he was hired to guide the Houston Aeros, the AHL affiliate of the Minnesota Wild, on June 16, 2010. The Aeros reached the AHL's Calder Cup Finals in Yeo's one season behind the bench, after which he was named the head coach of the Wild on June

17, 2011. Yeo became the youngest head coach in the NHL at the time, at the age of 38. Yeo held the position until February 13, 2016; his teams made the playoffs in three of his four full seasons behind the Wild bench, including 98- and 100-point seasons, respectively, in 2013-14 and 2014-15. In 482 games as an NHL head coach, Yeo has a record of 246-181-55.

Yeo began his coaching career as an assistant coach with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, the AHL affiliate of the Pittsburgh Penguins, in 1999 and continued in that position after Michel Therrien was hired as the head coach in 2003. Yeo was promoted to Pittsburgh along with Therrien on December 15, 2005 and the pair worked together until Therrien's departure in February 2009. Yeo remained in his role through the end of the 2009-10 season, winning the Stanley Cup in 2009.

An Ontario native, Yeo was born in Scarborough and grew up in North Bay. He and his wife Tanya have two children, daughter Braeden and son Kyler.

IAN LAPERRIERE

ASSISTANT COACH



Ian Laperriere is in his seventh season as a Flyers assistant coach. He was named to the post on October 7, 2013 after spending just over a year as the Flyers' director of player development, a position he officially took on June 29, 2012 following his retirement as a player.

Laperriere spent two seasons assisting the Flyers in a player development role while trying to return from the aftereffects of an injury suffered in the first round of the 2010 Stanley Cup Playoffs. He also remained active within the organization as a television analyst on Comcast SportsNet. Following the 2010-11 season, Laperriere won the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy for his perseverance, sportsmanship, and dedication to hockey. He signed with the Flyers as a free agent prior to the 2009-10 season and appeared in all 82 games that year, as well as 13 playoff games as the club went to the Stanley Cup Final.

Over his 16 year NHL career, Laperriere played 1,083 games with the Flyers, St. Louis, NY Rangers, Los Angeles, and Colorado, finishing his career with 1,956 PIM – the career leader among active NHL players at the time of his retirement. He was originally selected by St. Louis in the seventh round (156th overall) of the 1992 NHL Entry Draft.

In August 2013, Laperriere competed in the Ironman North American Championship at Mont-Tremblant, Quebec. He completed the 2.4-mile swim, 112-mile bike ride and 26.2-mile run in 12:11:55.

Laperriere and his wife Magali reside in Haddonfield, NJ with their sons Tristan and Zachary. Laperriere was born on January 19, 1974.

KIM DILLABAUGH

GOALTENDING COACH



Kim Dillabaugh was named the Flyers goaltending coach on July 3, 2015.

Dillabaugh came to the Flyers from the Los Angeles Kings, where he spent eight seasons working in a goaltender development role for the club. In his time with the Kings, Dillabaugh contributed to the development of Jonathan Quick, Jonathan Bernier, and Martin Jones, while also working with goaltenders at the club's American Hockey League affiliate, the Manchester Monarchs, and prospects playing elsewhere in professional and amateur hockey. During Dillabaugh's time with the Kings organization, Los Angeles won two Stanley Cups and made the Conference Finals one other time, while Manchester won one Calder Cup and reached the Eastern Conference Finals two other times.


Dillabaugh played three seasons in the Western Hockey League (WHL) with the Kelowna Rockets and the Calgary Hitmen from 1994-97. 2020 STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS



On May 26, the NHL and the NHL Players' Association reached an agreement on a Return To Play plan for the 2019-20 season, highlighted by a modified competitive format in which 24 teams will return to play and vie for the Stanley Cup at two "hub" cities.

COMPETITIVE FORMAT

In each Conference, teams have been seeded by points percentage at the pause of the regular season on March 11.

Round Robin: The top 4 teams play for First Round seeding (regular-season overtime rules in effect)

Qualifying Round: The remaining 8 teams play best-of-5 series to advance to the First Round (playoff overtime rules in effect)

After the Qualifying Round, the remaining 16 teams will proceed through the previously utilized four-round playoff format.

Ties in the Round Robin – featuring the top four teams from each conference – will be broken by regular season points percentage. The seeding order for these teams then will remain the same throughout the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

SERIES LENGTHS

The Qualifying Round will be composed of best-of-five series. All other rounds (First Round, Second Round, Conference Finals, Stanley Cup Final) will be best-of-seven series.

"SEEDING" FORMAT

In each succeeding round of the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs, the highest remaining seed in each conference will face the lowest remaining seed, the second-highest remaining seed in each conference will face the second-lowest remaining seed, etc.

"HOME" ICE

In the Qualifying Round, the higher-seeded team will be designated as the home team in Games 1, 2 and 5. The lower-seeded team will be designated as the home team in Games 3 and 4.

In the First Round, Second Round and Conference Finals, the higher-seeded team will be designated as the home team in Games 1, 2, 5 and 7. The lower-seeded team will be designated as the home team in Games 3, 4 and 6.

In the Stanley Cup Final, the team with the higher regular season points percentage will be designated as the home team in Games 1, 2, 5 and 7. The team with the lower regular season points percentage will be designated as the home team in Games 3, 4 and 6.






