# Media Policies

## CREDENTIALS & MEDIA SERVICES

### Media Credentials

The Washington Capitals will honor 2008-09 season media credentials that feature a Stanley Cup playoff logo sticker for the team's home games at Verizon Center during the first three rounds of the Stanley Cup playoffs. As in the regular season, anyone with a season credential who requires a press box seat must alert a member of the media relations staff that they are planning to attend by 4 p.m. the day prior to a game.

Media who do not have a season credential may apply for single-game credentials. These requests must be made in writing to a member of the Capitals media relations staff and be received no later than noon the day prior to a game.

As always, credentials and seat assignments are subject to availability.

While each club handles credentials for the first three rounds of the playoffs, the National Hockey League's public relations office manages the credential process for the Stanley Cup final. An application for Stanley Cup final credentials is available on NHLMedia.com and must be submitted by Friday, May 15.

Non-North American media outlets are required to request media credentials through the National Hockey League by contacting Lindsay Morris at [lmorris@nhl.com](mailto:lmorris@nhl.com).

Capitals media credentials are issued to print, television, radio and online media outlets that adhere to professional standards, regularly produce quality content and have a demonstrated audience. Space limitations may impact the decision to grant credentials. The final decision on all applications for media credentials rests with the Capitals media relations staff; we reserve the right to revoke media credentials at any time.

### News Releases

Accredited members of the media who would like to receive Capitals news releases via e-mail should contact a member of the media relations staff with an e-mail address. Each morning the Capitals send out "Caps Today," which includes an updated practice schedule and the top storyline of the day. We offer additional updates, including late practice time changes, at [twitter.com/capsmedia](http://twitter.com/capsmedia)

The NHL's password-protected media site includes statistics, press releases, game notes, credential applications, player headshots and pdf files of every team's media guide. To access the site, visit <http://media.nhl.com>.

## MEDIA FACILITIES – VERIZON CENTER

### Media Entrance

The media entrance to Verizon Center is located on 6th Street. Credentials to Capitals games may be picked up at the media entrance, which is open from two and a half hours prior to game time until the midway point of the first period. All media must show a photo ID and are subject to a security search.

### Press Work Area and Press Lounge

The press work area and press lounge are located on the Event Level (ice level). The press lounge is located directly adjacent to the media work area. Meals are served buffet style two hours prior to game time. All food must be consumed in the press lounge and may not be taken to the press box. The press work area is located at the rear of the press lounge. There are reserved seats for beat media and additional work spaces with telephones and wireless Internet access.

### Press Box

The press box is on the sixth floor of Verizon Center, on the penalty box side of the ice. Seats are on an assigned basis only. Please check the seating charts in the press room or press box, or check with the press box attendant for your seat assignment. The press box features wireless Internet access.

In order to ensure seating in the press box, it is necessary for all media to notify the Capitals' media relations staff of their attendance by 4 p.m. the day prior to the game. If you do not have an assigned seat, please check with a member of the media relations staff.

### Overflow Media Area

Media without an assigned seat in the press box may watch the game on television monitors in the Press Lounge on the Event Level.

## **Media Parking**

Media parking at Verizon Center is extremely limited and assigned prior to the season. There are numerous lots within walking distance of Verizon Center, and Verizon Center is adjacent to the Gallery Place/Chinatown Metro Station. Gallery Place can be reached on the Red, Yellow and Green lines. It is also one stop away from Metro Center, which provides service to the Blue and Orange lines.

## **Photography**

Verizon Center has a limited number of photo positions. All photo positions will be assigned prior to the game by team photographer Mitchell Layton at a photo meeting one hour before each game in the photo lab, adjacent to the press room. Daily print and wire services receive priority. Freelance photographers will not receive credentials; all photographers must be on assignment. Still photographers must receive permission in advance from a member of the media relations staff for postgame admission to the Capitals locker room.

## **MEDIA FACILITIES – KETTLER CAPITALS ICEPLEX**

### **Work Room**

Kettler Capitals Iceplex features a media work room adjacent to the ice, near the entrance of the Capitals' locker room. The work room features high-speed and wireless Internet access. During the playoffs, overflow work space is provided in the party room overlooking the Capitals' practice rink or in the Capitals' offices.

## **MEDIA ACCESS AND INTERVIEWS**

### **Practice Sessions**

The media has access to all team practices at all practice facilities, including game-day skates, in accordance with the NHL Media Regulations. The media is allowed to enter the team locker room five minutes after the first regular player who has participated in the entire practice leaves the ice. In the event of a team meeting, the media will be allowed access immediately following the conclusion of the meeting. The locker room is closed to the media prior to and during practice.

Per NHL Media Regulations, media access at Kettler Capitals Iceplex is limited to the team's main locker room and the entrance to the locker room. All other areas of the training center are off limits to media. Capitals game-day skates are typically held at 10 a.m. at Kettler.

### **Pregame**

The Capitals locker room is closed prior to game time, although requested players will be made available during a 30-minute window beginning two hours prior to faceoff, with priority given to broadcast rightsholders. Television networks, including rightsholders, requesting pregame interviews with a player are asked to request these times prior to or during the morning skate. Head coach Bruce Boudreau is available to the media outside the Capitals' locker room two hours prior to faceoff.

### **Postgame**

The Capitals' locker room will be open to working media five minutes after the conclusion of the game. Both teams' coaches and select players will attend a press conference held at the Verizon Center's basketball practice court. The visiting team coach will go first, followed by Bruce Boudreau.

If the media wishes to interview a player who is not present in the locker room, contact a Capitals' media relations representative who will locate the player and make him available.

### **Video**

All outlets are prohibited by the NHL from shooting game footage of any Capitals game being played at Verizon Center. Television and online outlets are welcome to shoot Capitals practices, but are restricted to broadcasting five minutes of on-ice video content from any one practice. There is no limit to the length of interviews that outlets may broadcast.

### **Players' Personal Telephone Numbers**

At no time will a player's home or mobile phone number be released to either the media or the public unless the player specifically authorizes such release. Members of the media attempting to reach players must do so through the Capitals media relations staff.

### **Autographs**

Media attending Capitals' practices or games are strictly forbidden from requesting autographs. Any person with a media pass observed asking players for autographs will be asked to leave and may not be granted credentials in the future.

# 2009 Stanley Cup Playoff Format & Conference Semifinal Schedule

The National Hockey League's 30 clubs are aligned into two conferences, each consisting of three divisions (Eastern Conference: Atlantic, Northeast, Southeast; Western Conference: Central, Northwest, Pacific). Sixteen teams qualify for the 2009 Stanley Cup Playoffs. First-round playoff berths were awarded to the first-place team in each division, as well as to the next five best teams (based on regular-season point totals) in each conference. The three division winners in each conference were seeded first through third (in order of points) and the next five teams were seeded fourth through eighth. In each conference, the team seeded #1 will play the team seeded #8; #2 vs. #7; #3 vs. #6 and #4 vs. #5 in the Conference Quarterfinal round. Home-ice in the Conference Quarterfinals is granted to those teams seeded first through fourth in each conference.

In the Conference Semifinals and Conference Finals, teams will be reseeded according to the same criteria as the Conference Quarterfinals (division leaders will be seeded first and granted home-ice advantage while the remaining teams will be seeded in order of regular-season points). Home-ice advantage in the Stanley Cup Final will be determined by points. All series remain best-of-seven.

## Conference Quarterfinals (Series A – H)

The six regular-season division champions will be ranked in the first three positions in their respective conferences, the clubs with the greatest number of points being ranked first in their respective conferences. The remaining five playoff clubs in each conference will be ranked based on regular-season points. Following are the matchups based on the rankings.

## Conference Semifinals (Series I – L)

*If one division winner is eliminated in the Conference Quarterfinals:* The remaining division winners would be seeded first and second, followed by the two remaining clubs in order of regular-season points. The #1 seed would face the club with the fewest regular-season points, while the other two clubs would meet.

*If two division winners are eliminated in the Conference Quarterfinals:* The remaining division winner would be seeded first, followed by the three remaining clubs in order of regular-season points. The #1 seed would face the club with the fewest regular-season points, while the other two clubs would meet.

*If all three division winners are eliminated in the Conference Quarterfinals:* The remaining clubs would be ranked in order of regular-season points. The remaining team with the most regular-season points would be seeded first, followed by the three remaining teams. The #1 seed would face the #4 seed, while the #2 and #3 seeds would meet.

*If a division winner meets a non-division winner that compiled more regular-season points:* The division winner would receive home-ice advantage.

## Conference Finals (Series M and N)

The same criteria used in the selection of order for the Conference Quarterfinals (Advancing division winners, followed by remaining clubs based on regular-season points) again will be in effect. *If a division winner meets a non-division winner that compiled more regular-season points:* The division winner would receive home-ice advantage.

*If Conference Semifinal series end early:* Start dates for the Conference Finals may be moved up depending on a number of factors, including building availability and travel schedules.

## Stanley Cup Final (Series O)

The Eastern Conference and Western Conference champions will meet in the Stanley Cup Final series. Home ice will be determined by the greater number of regular-season points, subject to the tie-breaking procedures outlined previously. Games will be played on a 2-2-1-1-1 basis.

## Lincoln Holdings LLC

In the spring of 1999 Lincoln Holdings LLC purchased 100% of the Washington Capitals (held in the name of Lincoln Hockey LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of Lincoln Holdings) and, together with a subsequent purchase, approximately 44% of Washington Sports and Entertainment Limited Partnership (WSELP). WSELP owns 100% of the NBA Washington Wizards, Verizon Center and the Baltimore-Washington Ticketmaster franchise. In 2005 Lincoln Holdings purchased the WNBA's Washington Mystics from WSELP. Lincoln Holdings has a right of first refusal on the sale of any of the individual teams or other assets, as well as an option to purchase Abe Pollin's majority interest in WSELP.

All of the current partners of Lincoln Holdings are extremely active in the Washington-area business community.

Chairman and majority owner **Ted Leonsis** (see page 8) and president **Dick Patrick** (see page 9) were among the founding members of Lincoln Holdings LLC in 1999.

**Jack Davies** was the founder and president of AOL International and now serves on the board of directors of Scholastic, the global children's publishing and media company. Prior to joining AOL in 1993, Davies was managing director of Citicorp's London-based consumer mortgage business after serving as vice president, Europe, for RCA Records. He began his career at General Electric where he held numerous senior consumer marketing positions. Davies earned an MBA in Marketing (1973) and a BA in Political Science (1972) from the University of Rochester.

Active in philanthropy in the D.C. area, Davies serves on a number of boards including the Board and Executive Committee of Venture Philanthropy Partners. In addition he is on the board of HeadsUp, See Forever Foundation, CharityWorks and The Washington Scholarship Fund.

**Richard D. Fairbank** is founder, chairman and chief executive officer of

Capital One also was named to *Fortune Magazine's* list of "Top Companies for Leaders," ranking second in North America and fifth globally. Under Fairbank's leadership, Capital One has demonstrated a strong commitment to philanthropy and volunteerism, supporting a number of area programs focused on community redevelopment and youth education, including DC Cares, the DC College Access Program and Junior Achievement. Fairbank has been recognized for his community and industry leadership, including his 2008 appointment to the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation. He also was honored as a 2008 *Washington Business Hall of Fame Laureate* and was named "2006 Banker of the Year" by the American Banker. Fairbank holds an MBA from the Stanford Graduate School of

Business and a bachelor's degree in economics from Stanford University.

**Raul Fernandez** is the chairman of ObjectVideo, a leading video analytics company specializing in security surveillance. He is also a special advisor to General Atlantic Partners, a growth equity firm with over \$17 billion under management. Fernandez founded Proxicom, an e-business solutions company, in 1991, took it public in 1999 and sold it in 2001. Fernandez also serves on the board of Liz Claiborne, an international apparel company; TROW, a Toronto-based engineering and consulting firm; ValueOptions, the nation's largest independent behavioral healthcare company; Network Solutions, the leader in web-based domain name and related services and Capital Acquisition, a special purpose acquisition company.

Fernandez, a native Washingtonian, is involved with many D.C.-based philanthropic organizations, including serving as a founding member of Venture Philanthropy Partners serving on the board of directors for D.C. College Access Program, D.C. Children's First and the National Symphony Orchestra. He holds a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Maryland.

**Michelle DiFebo Freeman** is the owner and an active board member of the Carl M. Freeman Companies, with offices in Olney, Md., and Fenwick Island, Del. The Freeman Companies has over 60 years in a variety of real estate ventures, currently with special expertise in land acquisition, land planning, development and redevelopment for award-winning, amenity-rich residential communities and neighborhood shopping centers. Notable real estate developments and redevelopments by the Freeman Companies include Sea Colony, the Village at Bear Trap, Bayside (including a Jack Nicklaus Signature Golf Course) at the Delmarva Shore, The Tidewater Inn in Easton, Md., and Olney Village Center and Cabin John Center and Mall in Montgomery County, Md.

Michelle is also the founding president and chairman of the board of the Joshua M. Freeman Foundation. The Joshua M. Freeman Foundation was created in 2007 to conceptualize, construct and operate sustainable facilities that support the arts, the environment and athletic achievement. Michelle has also served as the president and chairman of the board of the Carl M. Freeman Foundation since 2007. The Carl M. Freeman Foundation has been proudly giving grants and guidance since 1960 to hundreds of nonprofit organizations in Maryland, Virginia, Washington, D.C., Delaware and West Virginia. Michelle is a founding member of Venture Philanthropy Partners and is currently serving on the boards of The Washington National Opera, CharityWorks and YouthAIDS. She has three children ranging in ages from 5 to 18.

**Sheila C. Johnson**, a successful entrepreneur and impassioned philanthropist, is CEO of Salamander Hospitality, LLC, overseeing a growing portfolio of luxury properties including The Woodlands Resort & Inn in Summerville, S.C., Innisbrook Resort & Golf Club in Innisbrook, Fla., and Salamander Resort & Spa in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains in Middleburg, Va., which is poised to become one of the most unique retreats in the world when it opens in early 2011. Johnson is president and managing partner of the WNBA's Washington Mystics. She has long been a powerful influence in the entertainment industry as a founding partner of Black Entertainment Television (BET) and most recently as a film producer. Her film *A Powerful Noise* premiered at the 2008 Tribeca Film Festival in New York. On March 5, 2009 *A Powerful Noise* premiered in more than 450 theatres throughout the country to celebrate International Women's Day.

In 2006 Johnson was named global ambassador for CARE, a leading humanitarian organization fighting global poverty by empowering women because they have the unique power to help entire communities escape poverty. "Sheila's I Am Powerful Challenge" was instrumental in helping

raise funds for CARE's important work. Johnson is also a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. An avid supporter of the arts and an accomplished violinist, Johnson dedicates her time to organizations that create opportunities for children to express and explore their creativity. She serves as chair of the Board of Governors of Parsons The New School for Design in New York and sits on the boards of VH1's Save the Music Foundation, Americans for the Arts, the Jackie Robinson Foundation, and the University of Illinois Foundation.

**Richard Kay** is currently chairman of SENTRILLION Inc., a "TS" (Top Secret) border security, cyber-security, information assurance and healthcare managed services company. He is the former founder, chairman and CEO of OTG Software, a data storage software company that he founded in 1992. OTG became the leader in online data storage solutions. OTG was acquired by Legato Systems in 2002 and Kay remained on the board of directors until the acquisition of Legato Systems by EMC in 2003.

Kay currently serves on the board of directors of the University of Maryland School of Engineering. He is a special partner with ABS Capital, a multibillion dollar equity investment firm focused on healthcare, IT and media companies. Kay is also an honorary member of the board of directors of Venture Philanthropy Partners. He and his family work closely with various charities.

**Jeong H. Kim** is the 11th president of Bell Labs, the communication industry's most heralded research organization. His background ranges from being a CEO of a high technology start-up to senior executive of a Fortune 500 corporation. Kim's early career encompassed computer design, satellite systems design and data communications and included seven years as a nuclear submarine officer in the U.S. Navy.

Kim holds a Ph.D. in Reliability Engineering from the University of Maryland, a Master's degree in Technical Management and Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science from Johns Hopkins

University. Kim currently serves on the boards of, the Johns Hopkins University, Stanford University's Freeman Spogli Institute of International Studies, and Global Internet Ventures. He is a member of the National Academy of Engineering and the NASDAQ Listing and Hearing Review Council, and was named one of the 10 most influential Asian Americans in business for 2005 by the U.S. Pan Asian American Chamber.

**Mark D. Lerner**, representing members of the Theodore N. Lerner family, is a principal owner of the Washington Nationals Baseball Club and a principal of Lerner Enterprises, a Rockville, Md., based real estate development, management and investment company founded in 1952 by his father, Ted Lerner. Lerner Enterprises development activity is mainly concentrated in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area. A 1973 graduate of The Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, Stamas graduated in 1976 from the University of Maryland

Law School and began his career as a special counsel in the Securities & Exchange Commission. He has been listed in Best Lawyers in America for many years and was previously named as one of the leading 45 lawyers in America under the age of 45 by *The American Lawyer*. Stamas is also a founding board member of FTI consulting (NYSE) and of NexCen Brands (NASDAQ).

Stamas is active in numerous local and national civic affairs, and is on the board of The Shakespeare Theatre Company, Leadership 100, Caves Valley Golf Club and the Baltimore Orioles and is an Archon of the Order of St. Andrew.

## **Ted Leonsis, Chairman and Majority Owner**

Ted Leonsis is known as one of the country's premier businessmen and a pioneer in the Internet industry, holding numerous leadership positions at AOL in his 15-year tenure, including vice chairman and president. He is a professional sports team owner; founder and chairman of Web 2.0 start-up SnagFilms; chairman and investor in Clearspring Technologies and Revolution Money; a film producer; a private-angel investor; an active board member; and a committed philanthropist.

Leonsis recently retired as AOL's vice chairman emeritus. He recently founded and launched SnagFilms, a Web 2.0 company that brings the best nonfiction films to a global web audience. He is also the chairman of Clearspring Technologies, the leading provider of cross-platform widget services; as well as Revolution Money, an innovative new Web 2.0 payment platform and credit-card service. Revolution Money is a subsidiary of Revolution LLC, the investment company created by Steve Case.

Leonsis is the founder, chairman and majority owner of Lincoln Holdings LLC, a sports and entertainment company that holds ownership rights in several Washington, D.C., entities, including 100% of the Washington Capitals and the WNBA's Washington Mystics. Lincoln Holdings also owns approximately 44% of Washington Sports and Entertainment Limited Partnership (WSELP), which owns the NBA's Washington Wizards, D.C.'s Verizon

Center and the Baltimore-Washington Ticketmaster franchise.

In addition to Lincoln Holdings, Leonsis has investments and/or sits on the board of directors for several companies: Algentis LLC; Beacon Capital Strategies LLC; Bridgevine Inc.; Capitol Acquisition Corp; GridPoint; LaunchBox Digital; Mahalo.com; MediaBank; Mevio; MobilePosse; ObjectVideo; SB Nation; TidalTV; and Zedge. Leonsis is also on the board of directors of Georgetown University, his alma mater.

Leonsis is a film producer having conceptualized and produced *Nanking*, a documentary film that tells the story of the Japanese invasion of Nanking, China, in the early days of World War II. *Nanking* made its world premiere at the 2007 Sundance Film Festival, where it was awarded the Documentary Editing Award, and was released by THINKFilm in December 2007. The film aired on HBO and is available on DVD.

While at the 2007 Sundance Film Festival, Leonsis coined the phrase "filmanthropy" to describe a new category of filmmaking that sheds light on important issues around the world and activates discussion as well as new volunteers and new funds to benefit a social cause. Leonsis is also the producer of *Kicking It*, another example of filmanthropy, which debuted at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival. *Kicking It* aired on ESPN and Netflix.

Leonsis is a committed philanthropist and is very involved with numerous charities, including Best Buddies, Hoop Dreams, See Forever Foundation, Venture Philanthropy Partners, YouthAIDS and others through the work of the Leonsis Foundation.

Early in his career Leonsis was the founder of several new media companies, including Redgate Communications Corporation, a pioneering new media company that in 1993 was the first company acquired by AOL. He was also the founder of six personal computer magazines, authored four books and worked on the introduction of the IBM PC and the Apple Macintosh. He co-invented a very successful board game called "Only in New York" and served as a marketing executive with Harris Corp and Wang Laboratories.

He once served as mayor of Orchid, Fla. Among his many honors, Leonsis has been named Washington's Businessman of the Year, a Washingtonian of the Year, one of the 20 most influential people in sports, one of America's most creative executives and a top 10 entrepreneur of the year. Leonsis blogs daily at TedsTake.com. Originally from Brooklyn, N.Y., and later, Lowell, Mass., he now lives in McLean, Va., and Vero Beach, Fla., with his wife and two children.

## Dick Patrick, President

Dick Patrick, along with Ted Leonsis, is one of the original partners in Lincoln Holdings LLC, which was formed in the spring of 1999. A mainstay for the Washington Capitals' franchise for more than two decades, the owner, president and governor continues to lead the club with his tireless effort and intense desire to continue a family tradition – engraving the Patrick name onto the Stanley Cup.

For three generations the family name of Patrick has been synonymous with the sport of hockey and the National Hockey League. Patrick's grandfather, Lester Patrick, was the longtime coach and general manager of the New York Rangers. In his honor the Lester Patrick Trophy is awarded annually for "outstanding service to hockey in the United States." It was Lester who instilled in his family the desire to remain active in the advancement of the sport of hockey and the National Hockey League. Patrick's father, Muzz, and uncle, Lynn, both played on the 1940 New York Rangers team that captured the Stanley Cup.

Patrick's cousin, Craig Patrick, played for the Capitals from 1977-79. He won two Stanley Cups as general manager of the Pittsburgh Penguins and was

enshrined in the Hockey Hall of Fame in November 2001 in the "builder" category.

Patrick, who joined the Capitals prior to the 1982-83 season, guides the team on a daily basis and also serves as the team's representative to the NHL's Board of Governors. The former chairman of the NHL Finance Committee, Patrick has been instrumental in the Capitals' long-term success as a franchise both on and off the ice. Patrick was a leader in the conception and development of the Kettler Capitals Iceplex, the team's state-of-the-art training center and office building that opened in 2006 in Arlington, Va.

Before Patrick's arrival the Capitals never had advanced to postseason play. In his 26 seasons with the club, Washington has qualified for the playoffs 19 times – including the team's magical run to the Stanley Cup finals in 1998 with a team led by a blend of veterans and eager youngsters. The 2007-08 Southeast Division championship was the fourth division title Washington has won under Patrick's watch, and the following year the Capitals added No. 5. The 2008-09 team set a club record for points and

finished the regular season in second place in the Eastern Conference.

In addition to his commitment to the Capitals, Patrick previously served as co-chairman of the Washington, D.C., Division of the Fighting Blindness League. FBL, a charity event sponsored by the National Hockey League, benefits the Foundation Fighting Blindness in the fight against retinal degenerative diseases. Held in nine NHL cities on the eve of the Stanley Cup playoffs, FBL gives participants the chance to "own" an imaginary NHL franchise and participate in a rotisserie-style fantasy draft of NHL players.

Born in 1946 in Victoria, B.C., Patrick grew up in the United States. He earned his undergraduate degree from Dartmouth College and a law degree from the Washington College of Law at American University. He has developed commercial real estate in the Washington, D.C., area for more than 20 years and, while raising children who have skated within local youth hockey programs, he has been instrumental in increasing the Capitals' involvement in youth programs throughout the area.

## George McPhee, Vice President and General Manager

In 12 years as vice president and general manager of the Washington Capitals, George McPhee has overseen the club's development with an emphasis on scouting, drafting, coaching and building from within. McPhee has provided solid direction for the Capitals franchise by instituting a team-first philosophy that has extended from his hockey operations staff to the players on the ice. McPhee has led a Capitals organization that has grown from a lottery team to Southeast Division champions in each of the last two seasons.

Named the fifth general manager in team history June 9, 1997, McPhee found immediate success with the Capitals while engineering the club's first trip to the Stanley Cup Finals in his first season (1997-98). Under his leadership the team has claimed four Southeast Division championships (1999-00, 2000-01, 2007-08 and 2008-09), five 40-or-more win seasons (1997-98, 1999-00, 2000-01, 2007-08 and 2008-09) and a club-record 108-point season (2008-09).

In efforts to further cultivate the Capitals as a competitive and progressive franchise, McPhee has

stressed the growth of the Washington organization through scouting, coaching, amateur drafts, free agency, trades and minor-league development. These focus points have resulted in 17 first-round draft picks during the last eight years, the most of any NHL team, including the No. 1 overall pick in 2004, Alex Ovechkin, the first player in league history to win both the Calder Trophy and the Hart Trophy in a three-year span. Capitals prospects have enjoyed tremendous success as well, leading the Hershey Bears of the American Hockey League to the 2006 Calder Cup championship and the AHL's best record in 2006-07.

Prior to joining the Capitals, McPhee spent five seasons as the vice president and director of hockey operations as well as alternate governor for the Vancouver Canucks, assisting then general manager Pat Quinn with all hockey-related matters. In his time with the Canucks, the team enjoyed four trips to the playoffs, a division championship and a trip to the 1994 Stanley Cup Finals.

McPhee began his playing career in his hometown of Guelph, Ont., with the Ontario Junior Hockey League's Guelph

Platers, leading them to the 1978 Centennial Cup, Canada's Tier II championship. Following his stint with the Platers, McPhee attended Bowling Green State University of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, where he became one of college hockey's most decorated players. A four-year letterwinner from 1978-82, he was the recipient of the 1982 Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given to the top player in college hockey. His other accolades included a first-team All-CCHA selection in 1982, second-team All-CCHA honors in 1979 and 1981 and his selection as the CCHA's Rookie of the Year in 1979. Earning a degree in business, he became the first player to be named to the CCHA All-Academic Team in three consecutive seasons.

Upon the completion of his college career, McPhee signed as a free agent with the New York Rangers and started his NHL career during the 1982 Stanley Cup playoffs. Following his seven-year playing career with the Rangers and New Jersey Devils, McPhee earned his law degree from Rutgers University in 1992.

## Bruce Boudreau, Head Coach

Bruce Boudreau, the 2007-08 Jack Adams Award winner as the NHL's coach of the year and a member of the AHL Hall of Fame, is in his second season as Washington Capitals head coach and has two Southeast Division titles to his credit. He enters the second round of the 2009 Stanley Cup playoffs having taken each of his last 11 teams to the postseason.

Boudreau, 54, became the 14th head coach in Washington Capitals history when he was named to the position on an interim basis, Nov. 22, 2007, and had the interim tag removed Dec. 26, 2007. He has an 87-41-15 record with Washington.

Boudreau led the Capitals on a remarkable comeback from 30th in the NHL when he took over on Thanksgiving Day to the Southeast Division championship in 2007-08, his first season. His record of 37-17-7 would have been good for a 109-point pace in the course of a full season. Boudreau was the first coach in NHL history to lead his team from 14th place at midseason to a playoff berth.

Boudreau became the second Capitals head coach to win the Jack Adams Award (Bryan Murray, 1984).

In 2008-09, Boudreau guided his team to the best record in franchise history, a successful defense of the Southeast Division title and the team's first playoff win since 1998. His team ranked second in the NHL on the power play (25.2%) and third in goals per game (3.27).

and he coached two leading candidates for the Hart Trophy (Alex Ovechkin) and the Norris Trophy (Mike Green).

Boudreau has coached championship teams in the American Hockey League (AHL) and the ECHL and was in his third year as the head coach of the Hershey Bears, Washington's AHL affiliate, when he was promoted to D.C. He led the Bears to the Eastern Conference championship and the Calder Cup finals in each of his two full seasons in Hershey, winning the Calder Cup in 2006. Boudreau compiled a 103-45-11-16 record with the Bears (a .666 winning percentage), including an AHL-best 51-17-6-6 record (.713) in 2006-07.

Boudreau spent nine seasons as an AHL head coach, having compiled a 340-216-56-43 career record. He spent four years with the Manchester Monarchs and two years with the Lowell Lock Monsters before joining the Bears. Before ascending to the AHL, he was the head coach and director of hockey operations for the Mississippi Sea Wolves (ECHL), where he won the 1999 Kelly Cup championship.

After making his head-coaching debut in the Colonial Hockey League with the Muskegon Fury in 1992-93, Boudreau

took over the Fort Wayne Komets of the International Hockey League (IHL) in 1993-94. The Komets advanced to the Turner Cup finals his first season at the controls, and Boudreau was named the 1993-94 IHL coach of the year.

A native of Toronto, Boudreau played parts of eight seasons with the Toronto Maple Leafs and Chicago Blackhawks, recording 70 points in 141 NHL games. A third-round pick of the Leafs in the 1975 NHL draft, Boudreau enjoyed one of the best seasons ever by a Canadian junior player during 1974-75. He picked up 165 points for the Toronto Marlboros, a Canadian Hockey League record until Wayne Gretzky surpassed the mark during the 1977-78 season.

An outstanding AHL player, Boudreau ranks 11th all-time in scoring in league history with 316 goals and 799 points. No AHL player in the 1980s notched more points than Boudreau, as he played for the New Brunswick Hawks, Baltimore Skipjacks, Nova Scotia Oilers, Springfield Indians and Newmarket Saints during that time. He won the 1987-88 John B. Sollenberger Trophy for leading the league in scoring, and was also a member of the 1992 Calder Cup champion Adirondack Red Wings.

### Playoff History

This is the eighth Stanley Cup playoff meeting between Washington and the Pittsburgh Penguins, with Pittsburgh holding a 6-1 series lead. The Penguins are the most common opponent that the Caps have faced in the playoffs (NY Islanders are second with six meetings and 30 games to Pittsburgh's 42). Washington's lone series win was the 1994 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals when the Caps defeated the Penguins in six games. The last playoff meeting between the two clubs was in the 2001 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals, which Pittsburgh won in six games.

The clubs have played six playoff overtime games and the Capitals are 1-5 in those games. Sixteen of the 42 playoff games between the two teams have been decided by one goal. Washington is 4-12 in those games.

2001 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals: PIT wins, 4-2. Peter Bondra scored the only goal in Game 1, as Olie Kolzig shut out the Penguins, 1-0. Pittsburgh took Games 2 and 3 before Washington evened the series 2-2 with an overtime winner by Jeff Halpern in Game 4 in Pittsburgh. Pittsburgh topped the Caps 2-1 in Game 5 and then won the series in Game 6 with an overtime goal from Martin Straka. Five of the six games were decided by one goal as Pittsburgh outscored Washington 14-10.

2000 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals: PIT wins, 4-1. Ron Tugnutt backstopped the Penguins to a 7-0 shutout of the Capitals in Game 1. Games 2-5 were all decided by one goal. Pittsburgh won Game 2 in overtime with a Jaromir Jagr goal before taking Game 3 by a 4-3 decision. Washington bounced back with a 3-2 triumph in Game 4, but Jagr scored the winning goal in Game 5 and the Penguins ended the series in Washington.

1996 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals: PIT wins, 4-2. Washington raced to a 2-0 series lead (erasing a 4-1 deficit in Game 1 to win 6-4) with two wins in Pittsburgh before dropping the next four games. Ken Wregget replaced Tom Barrasso in goal in Game 3 for Pittsburgh and effectively put the clamps on the high-scoring Caps. Washington had tallied 11 goals in the first two games, but managed only six in the final four. The series turned in Game 4 when Pittsburgh's Petr Nedved scored a power-play goal in the fourth overtime (the longest game in Caps playoff history and fifth longest in NHL history) to even the series at two games apiece.

1995 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals: PIT wins, 4-3. Current Penguin Sergei Gonchar scored the game-winning goal for Washington as the Capitals won Game 1 in Pittsburgh. The Penguins took Game 2 before Washington built a 3-1 series lead with consecutive 6-2 wins in Games 3 and 4. The Penguins won Game 5 at home in overtime before routing Washington 7-1 in Game 6 in D.C. Pittsburgh completed the series comeback with a 3-0 shutout by Ken Wregget in Game 7.

1994 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals: WSH wins, 4-2. Pittsburgh had home ice, but Washington took Game 1 with a 5-3 decision. The Penguins leveled the series with a 2-1 win in Game 2, but Washington returned home and won Games 3 and 4 by

a combined score of 6-1. Goaltender Don Beaupre shut out the Penguins in Game 3 as he shared netminding duties with Byron Dafoe during the series. Dafoe took the two Washington losses (Games 2 and 5), while Beaupre earned all four wins.

**1992 Patrick Division Semifinals:** PIT wins, 4-3. Washington won the first two games in D.C. by a combined score of 9-3 before dropping Game 3 in Pittsburgh. The Caps claimed Game 4 to build a 3-1 series lead, but fell in the final three games to lose the series. Larry Murphy, Mario Lemieux and Jaromir Jagr had the game-winning goals for Pittsburgh in the final three games.

**1991 Patrick Division Final:** PIT wins, 4-1. Al Iafrate notched the game-winner for the Caps in Game 1, but Kevin Stevens scored three straight game-winning goals for Pittsburgh to give the Penguins a 3-1 series lead. Pittsburgh closed out the Caps at home in Game 5 with a 4-1 win. Penguin goaltender Tom Barrasso allowed only one goal each in the final three games of the series.

## This Year's Series

**Oct. 16 at Pittsburgh:** WSH 4, PIT 3. Washington scored the final four goals of the game, including three in a furious third-period rally that produced 21 shots on goal, to erase a 3-0 deficit. Tomas Fleischmann, Michael Nylander and Alexander Semin each had a goal and an assist, while Boyd Gordon scored the game-winner with just 4:17 left.

**Jan. 14 at Pittsburgh:** WSH 6, PIT 3. Despite playing at home the night before, Alex Ovechkin and the Washington stormed into Pittsburgh and dropped the Penguins for their third straight victory at Mellon Arena. Ovechkin had two goals and an assist in the third period and Washington lit the lamp four times in the final frame. Nicklas Backstrom had three assists, as the Caps erased 1-0 and 2-1 deficits. Washington scored on both of its third-period power-play opportunities and ended a three-game losing streak.

**Feb. 22 at Washington:** WSH 5, PIT 2. The Capitals scored two first-period power-play goals and held Pittsburgh to just one power-play goal in eight chances. Alexander Semin (1g-2a), Alex Ovechkin (1g-1a), Sergei Fedorov (1g-1a) and Nicklas Backstrom (2a) each had multiple-point games.

**March 8 at Washington:** PIT 4, WSH 3 SO. Alex Ovechkin and Brooks Laich each scored in the third period to force overtime. Pittsburgh picked up its first win against the Caps this season with a shootout win.

## Series Notes

- No current member of the Capitals has ever faced the Penguins in the playoffs.
- Washington was 3-0-1 against Pittsburgh this season and is 4-1-2 versus the Penguins with Bruce Boudreau behind the bench.
- The Capitals outscored the Penguins 9-1 in the third period this season and scored two or more goals in six of the 12 regulation periods in the series.
- The Caps did not have a regulation loss to Pittsburgh this year for only the second time in team history. Washington was 6-0-1 against the Penguins during the 1984-85 season.
- Washington is 3-0-1 in their last four games at Mellon Arena.
- Washington has won three straight at Mellon Arena, which is the longest winning streak in Pittsburgh since the team won four straight from Jan. 16, 1985 to Nov. 20, 1985.
- Washington's 2-0-0 record in Pittsburgh this season represents only the second season in team history that the Caps have won every game in Mellon Arena. The Caps won all four games in the 1983-84 season.
- Ten Capitals had a goal and 11 Caps tallied an assist against the Penguins this season.
- In four regular season games against Pittsburgh this year, the Caps recorded 48 points (18g-30a) and had a combined +40 rating.
- The Caps power play clicked at a 29.4% success rate (5 for 17) this season against Pittsburgh.
- Twenty-three Capitals suited up for a game against the Penguins this season and 16 of those players had a plus rating, while five more finished even.
- Only two players (Bryan Helmer and Karl Alzner) finished the regular season with a minus rating against Pittsburgh; both played only one game and both are currently in Hershey.
- Alexander Semin scored a goal in every game versus Pittsburgh this season and led Washington with seven points (4g-3a).
- Alex Ovechkin (4g-2a), Brooks Laich (2g-4a) and Nicklas Backstrom (6a) each had six points in four games against the Penguins this season.
- Nicklas Backstrom has 13 career assists against Pittsburgh in eight games, including nine assists in four games at Mellon Arena.
- Jeff Schultz's lone goal of the season was a shorthanded goal on Jan. 14 at Pittsburgh.
- Former Capitals Sergei Gonchar and Matt Cooke play for Pittsburgh. Cooke and Cristobal Huet are the only players to appear in all seven playoff games for Washington last year who aren't with the current team. Matt Bradley is the lone former Penguin on the Capitals roster.

## Capitals Playoff Notes

**Break on through** – Washington won its first playoff series since the 1998 Eastern Conference Finals. The Capitals have advanced to the second round for the first time in their last five trips to the playoffs.

**Seventh heaven** – The Capitals are now 2-5 in Game 7s in franchise history. Game 7 against the Rangers was the first for the franchise since the first round of the 1988 Stanley Cup playoffs.

**Don't stop believing** – Washington became the 21st team in 230 occasions (9.1%) to win a series after falling behind 3-1 and the 38th team in 292 instances (13.0%) to win a series after falling behind 2-0.

**Against the wall** – The Capitals are now 6-1 when facing elimination the last two seasons (including the final game of the 2007-08 regular season).

**Follow the leaders** – Capitals players led the NHL in the first round in goals (Alexander Semin, tied), assists (Nicklas Backstrom), shots (Alex Ovechkin) and shutouts (Simeon Varlamov, tied).

**On the right foot** – Washington's eight first-period goals were the most of any team in the first round.

**Shot stoppers** – Washington allowed just 23.7 shots per game, the fewest in the NHL in the first round.

**Spreading the wealth** – Six players accounted for the Capitals' six power-play goals in the first round (Tomas Fleischmann, Alexander Semin, Brooks Laich, Tom Poti, Mike Green, Alex Ovechkin).

**Tall hands** – Washington killed off 25-of-27 Ranger power plays (92.6%) and scored a shorthanded goal after allowing two power-play goals in Game 1.

**Meet the new boss** – Simeon Varlamov allowed just seven goals in six games in his playoff debut. He tied a Capitals record with two shutouts in a series and is one of only three Capitals goaltenders with more than one playoff shutout in his career (Olie Kolzig, 6, and Don Beaupre, 2). He turned 21 the day before Game 7 and is just the fourth NHL goaltender to post a shutout before he turned 21 (Harry Lumley, Patrick Roy and Carey Price).

**Welcome aboard** – Chris Clark, Brian Pothier, Jose Theodore and Simeon Varlamov were the only players to make their Capitals debut in these playoffs. Varlamov was the lone Capital to make his NHL playoff debut.

**O from the D** – Washington had three defensemen score in Game 6 at New York, the first time the team had three defensemen score goals (regular season or playoffs) since March 12, 1996.

**Stepping up** – Tom Poti had six points in seven games after averaging just 0.25 points per game in the regular season.

**Living legend** – Sergei Fedorov recorded the game-winning goal in Game 7, his fourth point of the series. He now has 172 career playoff points and is tied with Mario Lemieux for 15th in all-time playoff scoring (second among active players behind Joe Sakic). In his career Fedorov has six points (3g-3a) in eight Game 7s.

**Blueshirt boost** – The Capitals are now 3-2 in five playoff series with the Rangers. They last faced the Rangers in the 1994 Eastern Conference semifinals.

**SRO** – Verizon Center was sold out (18,277) for all four home games and has been sold out for all eight playoff games the last two seasons.

## 2008-09 Notes

**For the ages** – Washington enjoyed what could be considered the franchise's most successful regular season in history, having established a club record for points (108) and points on the road (47) and tied the club record for wins (50, with the 1985-86 team). The Capitals' 25.2% power play also set a club record.

**Power brokers** – The Capitals' power play enjoyed a 30.2% success rate (39-of-129) in the last 33 games of the season, including 42% in the first period (21-of-50). The Capitals' opponents in that time have received 24 more power-play opportunities but have scored 14 fewer goals (25-for-155, 83.9% penalty killing).

**History on D** – Mike Green's 31-goal, 73-point season has produced numbers not seen in years by an NHL defenseman. Green:

- set an NHL record for a defenseman with goals in eight straight games
- set a Capitals record for a defenseman with 18 power-play goals
- became just the seventh NHL defenseman with a 30-goal season and the first since the Caps' Kevin Hatcher in 1992-93
- became, at 23, the youngest defenseman with 30 goals since Paul Coffey in 1983-84
- was the first defenseman ever to score 30 goals in a season playing fewer than 70 games (he played 68)
- had the fourth-best point total all-time by a Caps defenseman (eight points shy of Larry Murphy's club record)
- had the most points by an NHL defenseman since 2005-06 (Nicklas Lidstrom, 80)
- averaged 1.07 points per game, most by a defenseman since 1994-95 (Paul Coffey, 1.29)
- had eight more goals and nine more points than any other defenseman despite missing 14 games due to injury

Washington returns home to face Chicago and raise the 2008 Southeast Division championship banner. Alex Ovechkin scores twice in a 4-2 win.

The Capitals set a club record by holding Vancouver to 10 shots on goal as Brent Johnson earns his 100th career victory in goal.

#### December 28, 2008

The Capitals retired Mike Gartner's No. 11 jersey in a pregame ceremony prior to the game against the Toronto Maple Leafs.

**Goal dust** – Alex Ovechkin led the league in goals for the second consecutive year, the first player to do so since Pavel Bure in 1998-99 and 1999-2000. Ovechkin's 56 goals were 10 more than any other player. He has 121 goals in the past two seasons, 26 more than anyone else in the league (Ilya Kovalchuk, 95, is second).

**Elite company** – Alex Ovechkin is just the third player in the NHL to record 200 goals and 200 assists in his first four years in the league. Wayne Gretzky and Mario Lemieux are the only other players to accomplish the feat.

**Century to remember** – Alex Ovechkin's 110 points give him his third 100-point season and the NHL lead in points per game (1.39). He is one of only five players in league history to post 100-plus points in three of his first four NHL seasons (Gretzky, Lemieux, Hawerchuk, Crosby). There had only been two 100-point seasons in Washington's 30-season history prior to his arrival.

**Shooting star** – Alex Ovechkin has led the league in shots on goal in each of his four seasons; he tied Phil Esposito's record of four straight years atop the league's shot chart. Ovechkin became the second player in NHL history to surpass 500 shots in a season (528) and owns three of the top six shots on goal seasons in league history.

**Passing fancy** – Nicklas Backstrom posted the third-best assist total in Capitals' history (66) and ranks tied for third in the league in that category. His 121 assists in his first two seasons in the league tied Peter Forsberg for seventh all-time, and three of the players ahead of him had WHA experience before joining the NHL. He finished tied for ninth in the NHL in points (88) and had the most points by a Capitals player other than Alex Ovechkin in 20 years (Mike Ridley, 89 points in 1988-89).

**Super Sasha** – Alexander Semin had at least a point in 50 of the 62 games he played and never went more than two games without a point.

**I Laich April** – Brooks Laich established career highs in goals (23) and power-play goals (9). Laich had 12 points (5g-7a) in his last eight games. Including last year's playoffs, Laich is averaging a point per game in the last two Aprils (6g-10a in 16 GP).

**Winning The-o-ry** – Jose Theodore posted his best winning percentage and second-best win total of his career in 2008-09 with a 32-17-5 record. He joins Jim Carey and Olie Kolzig as the only goaltenders to win 30 games in a season for the Capitals. Since Dec. 23, Theodore is 24-11-4 (2.70, .907). Theodore is over .500 for his career (215-214-44) for the first time since he was 5-4-2 on Feb. 17, 1997.

**Young guns firing** – In 49 of the Capitals' 50 wins this season at least one of the team's four leading scorers – the "Young Guns" group of Ovechkin, Semin, Backstrom and Green – has scored a goal. The one exception was a 2-1 win Dec. 6 in Toronto.

**Goal oriented** – Washington scored 32 goals in its last seven games, an average of 4.57 goals per game. The Capitals finished third in the league with 3.27 goals per game and their 268 goals scored were the franchise's most since potting 277 in 1993-94.

**Banner bites** – Washington's Southeast Division title is its second in a row and marks the fifth division title in franchise history. They have won back-to-back titles once before, in 1999-00 and 2000-01. Washington is the first Southeast team to repeat as division champs since Tampa Bay in 2002-03 and '03-04.

**That 70 show** – The last time the Caps had four players with 70-plus points was 1992-93.

**Powerful balance** – Washington, Detroit and San Jose are the only three teams that boast six players with at least seven power-play goals.

**Peaking** – Washington went 5-1-2 in its last eight games and 7-2-2 in its last 11. The Capitals were 10-3-2 in their last 15 games.

**Hershey help** – Washington had 41 players dress for games this season, including 16 call-ups from the Hershey Bears of the American Hockey League. That's a remarkable number for a first-place team; by comparison, in 2005-06 when the Capitals finished 27th in the NHL, they dressed 40 players over the course of the season. Fourteen defensemen suited up for Washington this year, including Sergei Fedorov on occasion. That's five more than Washington used all of last year.

**Divide and conquer** – Washington went a combined 26-6-8 vs. the Northeast (12-4-3) and Atlantic (14-2-4) divisions.

**Home run** – Washington started the season with an 18-1-1 mark in its first 20 home games and finished with 29 wins at Verizon Center, its second-best home win total in club history (29-9-3).

**SRO** – Washington had a club-record 29 sellouts at Verizon Center. A few notes on the crowds at Caps home games this year:

- 25 of the last 27 games were sold out
- Washington's 29 sellouts were more than triple the total from 2007-08 (8)
- The Caps didn't have their second sellout last year until Feb. 24; since then 36 of the Capitals' 52 regular-season home games were sold out
- The average attendance of 18,097 (99% capacity) was up 17% from 2007-08 (15,473) and up 30% from Alex Ovechkin's rookie season
- Washington has sold 4,000 new full season tickets for 2009-10, plus 2009 playoff tickets

**At home away from home** – The Capitals went 16-6-3 in their last 25 games on the road and 10-3-3 on the road after the All-Star break.

**Alexes for 50, Alex** – The Capitals organization boasted the only 50-goal scorers in both the NHL (Alex Ovechkin) and the AHL (Alexandre Giroux). Ovechkin boasts the ninth 50-goal season in Capitals' history while Giroux has produced just the fifth 60-goal season in AHL history.

**Goals all over** – Alex Ovechkin and Mike Green led the league in goals from their respective positions for the second year in a row. Last season Ovechkin and Green became the first teammates to lead the league in goals and goals by a defenseman since Pittsburgh's Mario Lemieux and Paul Coffey in 1988-89.

**First things first** – The Capitals were 30-3-3 when leading after the first period, 34-8-3 when scoring first, 47-8-5 in games that they led at any time and 32-15-4 when outshooting an opponent.

**Kill joy** – Washington ranked just 17th in the NHL on the penalty kill (80.6%), but had an 88.9% success rate in the last 11 games of the season.

**A real winner** – Washington has gone 41-5-4 in the last 50 games when Alex Ovechkin has scored a goal (31-5-4 this season). Washington is 22-0-1 in his last 23 multiple-goal games.

**D powers, activate** – Washington defensemen contributed significantly to the team's offense in 2008-09. On the year, a blueliner has either scored or assisted on more than half of the Capitals' 268 goals (140; 46g-108a).

**Starting something** – Eight Capitals made their NHL debut this season: Karl Alzner, Jay Beagle, Sean Collins, Andrew Gordon, Michal Neuvirth, Oskar Osala, Tyler Sloan and Simeon Varlamov. By comparison, Washington only had three players make their NHL debuts last season (Nicklas Backstrom, Chris Bourque and Sami Lepisto).

**Depth charge** – Washington and its two minor-league affiliates – Hershey in the AHL and South Carolina in the ECHL – posted a combined record of 139-67-12-10 and each stands first or second in their respective division.

**The big 5-0** – Alex Ovechkin reached the 50-goal milestone for the third time in his career March 19 with his first-period goal against the Lightning. By doing so he became:

- the first Capital to record three 50-goal seasons
- the second active player to record three 50-goal seasons (joining Teemu Selanne)
- the third player all-time to post three 50-goal seasons in his first four years in the NHL (joining Mike Bossy and Wayne Gretzky)
- the 20th player all-time with at least three 50-goal seasons

**Bicentennial celebration** – Feb. 7 against Los Angeles Alex Ovechkin joined Wayne Gretzky, Mike Bossy, Mario Lemieux and Brett Hull as the only NHL players in the modern era to score 200 goals in their first 300 games.

**Mr. Clutch** – Sergei Fedorov, who earlier this year became the all-time NHL leader in goals by a Russian, tied the league record with his 15th career overtime goal March 10 in Nashville. It was the 93rd game-winning goal of Fedorov's career.

**All good** – Washington laid claim to the best record through 60 games in franchise history (38-17-5) and the best first half in franchise history (.695). This year was the fastest team to 30 wins (47 games) and 40 wins (63 games) in franchise history.

**Year to remember** – The Capitals closed the book on a remarkable 2008 calendar year, a year that saw them post a 52-23-6 record (trailing only San Jose, 119 points, and Boston, 112, with 110 points). Among the team's other notable achievements in 2008:

- Reached the Stanley Cup playoffs for the first time since 2003
- Posted a 31-6-3 home record at Verizon Center with 14 sellouts
- Alex Ovechkin scored 60 goals in 2008 (10 more than any other player), posted 113 points (second only to Evgeni Malkin, 124)
- Bruce Boudreau was named NHL coach of the year and was selected for induction in the AHL Hall of Fame
- Nicklas Backstrom ranked eighth in the league in points (83) in the calendar year

**Something to behold** – Ovechkin's goal Feb. 18 vs. Montreal was the highlight of the night on ESPN's SportsCenter and TSN's SportsCentre, and "ovechkin goal" was the 17th most popular search term on Google.com Thursday morning. No fewer than 43 versions of the goal were posted on YouTube.com, the most popular of which got more than 250,000 views in 24 hours and was the No. 1 video on the site on Friday.

**Live Mike** – Mike Green set an NHL record for defenseman with goals in eight straight games from Jan. 27 to Feb. 14, breaking the mark previously held by Mike O'Connell (1983-84). It matched the longest streak in the NHL since 1997-98 (Teemu Selanne scored in 11 straight games that season). Green had 10-7-17 during his goal-scoring streak.

## 2008-09 Off-the-Ice Success

### Record-setting attendance

Washington had a club-record 29 sellouts at Verizon Center and twenty-five of the last 27 games were sold out. Washington's 29 sellouts were more than triple the total from 2007-08, when the Capitals had only eight sellouts. The average attendance of 18,097 (99% capacity) was up 17% from 2007-08 (15,473) and up 30% from Alex Ovechkin's rookie season. The Capitals are sold out for the playoffs and sold out of season tickets for next season, making Verizon Center the place to be. Not only is the home crowd coming out to see the Capitals but on the road the Capitals played in 21 sold out venues. With the fast-paced, high-energy product the Caps put out on the ice fans are coming out to watch in record numbers at home or on the road.

### TV ratings surging

The Capitals ended the regular season with a 1.13 TV rating for local broadcasts, which is up 60% from last year's 0.72 rating. Washington had a 1 or higher TV rating for every month except April; December's 1.25 rating was the highest of the season. The highest rated game was 1.9 on Feb. 22 against Pittsburgh on NBC. The Caps had five other games draw a 1.7 rating this season.

### Old merchandise becomes new

The Capitals at Verizon Center are now selling game-used equipment in their locker room area in the team store at Verizon Center. This has helped boost sales as net revenue increased 75.5% from last year. Jersey sales are always high for the Capitals as Alex Ovechkin's No. 8 is one of the top sellers in the NHL, but the addition of game-used equipment to the locker room section of the store has allowed fans to get even closer to the game they love. In January, Washington sold \$10,408 in game-used equipment, which was the highest grossing month of the season.

### WashingtonCaps.com – the source for everything Capitals

WashingtonCaps.com is up 95% in monthly visits from last year. March saw the largest audience on WashingtonCaps.com, with Alex Ovechkin's 50th goal video getting more than 2 million views. Average time on the site is 9:01, which is up 57% from last season, a product of the increased emphasis on streaming video and other exclusive content on the site.

### Rocking the Red

The Capitals have been recognized for producing one of the best in-game experiences in the NHL. The team's game entertainment group earned awards for its rock concert-themed game open and a feature on players' tattoos. The same group led the development of *Caps Red Line Monday*, Washington's new half-hour television show that aired on Comcast SportsNet.

### In the news

The Capitals were the cover story on *ESPN the Magazine*'s NHL preview issue, and the national media attention didn't stop there. Capitals stories have also graced the cover of *USA Today*, three covers of *The Hockey News*, two lengthy features in *Sports Illustrated* and many more publications. On the airwaves, NPR has followed the Capitals for special features throughout the year and an Alex Ovechkin feature will appear on ESPN's *E:60* on April 21.

### Giving back to D.C.

Washington Capitals Charities had an amazing year. The 2008 Caps Care Classic raised more than \$180,000 through sponsorship, donations and an online auction, and has now raised more than \$1 million in the last five years. The \$180,000 was \$10,000 more than the event raised last season. Another successful event was the Amazing Auction held by the Capitals players' wives and girlfriends, which raised \$110,825. The highest bid of the evening (\$11,000) was dinner with Bruce and Crystal Boudreau and Dean and Sherry Eason at the Boudreau residence. Several of the Capitals players have generously donated their time or money, including Alex Ovechkin through his Crazy 8s program and Mike Green, who this year started hosting children in Green's Gang at Verizon Center and donating money through a new program called "So Kids Can."
