

# SEASON NOTES

## 2019-20 COLORADO AVALANCHE TEAM NOTES

### AVS PLAYOFF BOUND FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR; POST THIRD-HIGHEST POINTS PERCENTAGE SINCE MOVING TO DENVER

The Avalanche finished second in the Central Division and the Western Conference with 92 points in 70 games...The Avs ended two points behind St. Louis (94) but played one fewer game than the Blues when the regular season was paused on March 12 and eventually concluded...Colorado's 37 regulation wins—the first tiebreaker—were four more than the next closest Western Conference team (St. Louis 33)...The Avs' 92 points tied Tampa Bay for third in the NHL behind only the Blues and Boston Bruins (100)...The Avalanche clinched a playoff berth for the third straight year, which ranks as the third-longest run in franchise history...The Nordiques/Avalanche made 11 straight trips to the postseason from 1994-95 to 2005-06 and Quebec made seven straight from 1980-87...Colorado's .657 points percentage this season was its third highest since relocating to Denver, trailing only the 2000-01 team (.720) and the 2013-14 squad (.683).

### ROAD WARRIORS

Colorado led all teams in road wins (24) and road points (50) this season...The 24 victories equaled the second-most away wins in franchise history, two shy of the record set in 2013-14...This year's Avalanche team played four fewer road contests than that 2013-14 squad...The Avs, who had three road trips of five or more games for just the second time in franchise history (also 1999-00), went a combined 11-4-1 on those three trips.

### GETTING OFFENSIVE

Colorado finished the season tied for third among all teams in goals scored (236) and ranked fourth in goals-per-game (3.37)...The Avs shared the league lead in 5-on-5 tallies (162)...Colorado led all teams in both first period (73) and second period (95) goals...The Avalanche's +46 goal differential was the best in the Western Conference and third in the NHL.

### THE PUCK STOPS HERE

Colorado's goaltenders ranked sixth in the league in team goals-against average (2.69), finishing among the NHL's top 10 in this category for the first time since 2002-03...The Avs ranked fourth in team save percentage (.913)...Pavel Francouz ended the season tied for fifth in the NHL in save percentage (.923) and ranked seventh in goals-against average (2.41)...He was the first Avalanche netminder to finish among the league's top 10 in BOTH categories since David Aebischer in 2003-04.

### FINISH WHAT YOU STARTED

The Avs finished the season 17-5-2 in their last 24 games, 14-4-2 in their last 20 and 9-2-1 in their last 12...Colorado had the NHL's second-best record since Jan. 16 and Feb. 4.

### CROWDED HOUSE

The Avalanche sold out 29 of its 33 home dates (that includes the outdoor game at Air Force)...The 29 sellouts marked the club's most since selling out all 41 home games in 2005-06...The Avs sold out each of their final 20 home contests, including their final 19 at Pepsi Center.

### FIRST AND FOREMOST

Colorado scored the first goal of the game 43 times this year, most in the NHL...The Avalanche's 30 wins when scoring first (30-6-7) tied Tampa Bay for the league lead...The Avs led all teams with 73 first-period goals.

## 2019-20 COLORADO AVALANCHE TEAM NOTES

### IN WITH THE NEW

Offseason additions Andre Burakovsky (20), Nazem Kadri (19), Joonas Donskoi (16) and Valeri Nichushkin (13) all finished among the Avalanche's top-seven goal scorers, accounting for 68 (almost 30%) of the club's 236 goals...If you also include offseason signing Pierre-Edouard Bellemare (nine), these five additions had 77 of the 236 goals (33%).

### CARRYING THE LOAD

Nathan MacKinnon led the Avalanche and finished fifth in league scoring with 93 points (35g/58a) in 69 games...He finished 43 points ahead of Colorado's second-leading scorer, Cale Makar (50), the largest gap of any team since the 2007-08 Washington Capitals (Alex Ovechkin 112, Nicklas Backstrom 69)...The 43-point difference was the largest gap between the top-two scorers in Avalanche history and the second largest in franchise history...In 1990-91, Joe Sakic (109) finished 50 points ahead of Mats Sundin (59) with Quebec.

### MA(C)KING HIS MARK

Nathan MacKinnon paced the club with 93 points, becoming the first player in franchise history to lead the team in scoring for four straight seasons... He was the first Avalanche player to post three consecutive seasons of 90 or more points since the team relocated to Denver, joined Joe Sakic as the only Colorado players to post three straight 30-goal campaigns and also joined Sakic and Peter Forsberg as the only Colorado skaters to record three straight 50-assist seasons...MacKinnon set a career high with 29 multi-point games, the most by an Avalanche player since Forsberg had 29 in 2002-03...Nathan ranked fifth in the league in points-per-game (1.35), the highest average by a Colorado skater (min. 50 points) since Forsberg in 2003-04 (1.41).

### TAKING IT ONE MONTH AT A TIME

Colorado finished 8-2-2 in October, 8-6-0 in November, 7-5-2 in December, 5-2-2 in January, 11-3-1 in February and 3-2-1 in March...It marked the first time Colorado posted a winning record in each of its first six months of a season since 2000-01.

### NEXT MAN UP

The Avs posted the NHL's third-best record despite having lost 223 man games due to injury...That list included lengthy injuries to key players such as Mikko Rantanen (28 games missed), Cale Makar (13), Nazem Kadri (19), Gabriel Landeskog (16), Philipp Grubauer (20), Andre Burakovsky (12), Erik Johnson (11) and Matt Calvert (19).

### HIGH FIVE

This year marked the first time that Colorado has ever used five different goalies in a single season...Prior to relocating, Quebec used seven goalies in 1989-90 and five in 1990-91...The 2019-20 Avalanche and the 1989-90 Nordiques are the only teams in franchise history to feature five different goalies with a victory...Colorado and Carolina were the only NHL clubs to get wins from five different netminders this year.

### EAST SIDE STORY

Colorado was 21-6-4 (.742) against Eastern Conference opponents, the best record of any team against the East...The Avalanche's 21 wins matched the 2013-14 club for the most victories by an Avs team against the Eastern conference (despite playing one fewer interleague game)...Colorado's 46 points were its most-ever against the other conference.

### SEEING STARS

An Avalanche player was named one of the NHL Stars of the Week on seven occasions this season, tied with Edmonton for the most of any team... It was the most weekly honors in one season for Colorado since the Three Stars began in 2006-07... Pavel Francouz in late February became the first Avalanche player to ever earn one of the Three Stars in back-to-back weeks.

### DAYDREAM BELIEVER

The Avs finished 4-0-0 in afternoon games this year, outscoring the opposition 22-9... The Avalanche won 6-1 in Las Vegas on Oct. 25, 5-2 in Chicago on Nov. 29, 5-3 against the Blues at home on Jan. 18 and 6-3 against Detroit at Pepsi Center on Jan. 20... Colorado is 11-3-1 in home afternoon games since the start of 2017-18.

### ALL HAIL CALE

Cale Makar finished second among NHL rookies in scoring with 50 points (12g/38a) in 57 games... Makar's 0.88 points-per-game average led all rookies and tied for the third-highest single-season total by a rookie defenseman in NHL history (min. 50 GP)... Only Brian Leetch (1.04 in 1988-89) and Larry Murphy (0.95 in 1980-81) averaged more... Makar paced all rookie blueliners with 12 goals and tied for first among all rookies with four game-winning tallies... His 0.21 goals-per-game average was the highest by a first-year defenseman since 2015-16 (Shayne Gostisbehere, 0.27)... Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes, who led all rookies with 53 points in 68 games, became the first defensemen to rank 1-2 in rookie scoring in the NHL's modern era (since 1943-44)... Overall, only 17 rookie defensemen in NHL history have reached the 50-point mark in a season, with Makar and Hughes the first since Vladimir Malakhov (52) in 1992-93 with the NY Islanders.

### THAT'S A PLUS

Ryan Graves led the NHL with a +40 plus/minus rating, becoming the first Avalanche player to lead the league in that category since Milan Hejduk and Peter Forsberg (+52) in 2002-03... Graves' +40 mark was the highest ever by a Colorado defenseman and tied for the second-highest rating by a blueliner in franchise history (Quebec's Mario Marois was +49 in 1983-84)... Graves was the first NHL defenseman to finish +40 or better in 10 years, since Jeff Schultz was +50 with Washington in 2009-10... Graves was a "plus player" in 35 of his 69 games and posted a "minus" rating only 11 times.

### IRON G

Samuel Girard was one of two Avalanche players to appear in all 70 contests this season (also Matt Nieto)...Girard has dressed in 220 consecutive regular-season games, the third-longest ironman streak ever by an Avs defenseman.

### YOU HAD TO BE A BIG SHOT

Nathan MacKinnon led the NHL in shots for the second straight year with 318...He has recorded a shot in 220 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in franchise history (227, Joe Sakic, 1995-99)...MacKinnon's streak is the second-longest active run behind Dougie Hamilton (294 straight)...MacKinnon tied a single-game franchise record with 12 shots on Nov. 1 vs. Dallas.

### BACK-TO-BACK

The Avs played 12 back-to-back games this season, finishing 9-3-0 in the first contest and 6-5-1 in the second...The Avalanche swept half (six) of its 12 back-to-backs, matching a franchise record for the most back-to-back sweeps (1985-86 and 2000-01)...Colorado swept three consecutive back-to-backs in February, tying a franchise record for consecutive sweeps (fifth time, last: October 2009)...The Avalanche's victories in Anaheim/Los Angeles (Feb. 21-22) marked the first time Colorado had ever swept a back-to-back in Southern California.

### ROAD, SWEET ROAD

The Avs won a franchise-record nine straight road games from Feb. 4 to March 2, topping the previous mark of seven straight away wins set in 1998-99...Colorado's nine-game streak tied for the longest in the NHL this season.

### HITTING THE "BENCH" MARKS

Jared Bednar this season led Colorado to its third-highest points percentage (.657) since relocating to Denver in 1995...He became just the third Avalanche coach since the franchise relocated to lead the club to three straight playoff berths, joining Bob Hartley (four, 1998-02) and Marc Crawford (three, 1995-98)...Bednar owns a 145-136-35 (.514) record in four seasons behind the bench, which includes a 123-80-31 (.592) mark over the past three years...Only Bob Hartley (193) has more wins in Colorado Avalanche history...Bednar's 145 wins rank fourth in franchise annals behind Michel Bergeron (265), Hartley (193) and Marc Crawford (165 including one season with Quebec).

### NOT BAD FOR STARTERS

Colorado was the last NHL's last undefeated team (5-0-0) and the last team without a regulation loss (7-0-1)...The Avalanche's 7-0-1 start was its best through eight games in franchise history, and the eight-game point streak was its second-longest to start a season (9-0-2 in 2000-01)...It was the longest by any team to open a campaign since the Montreal Canadiens began 2016-17 with a 9-0-1 run...The NHL's last unbeaten team, the Avalanche started a season 5-0-0 for just the second time since relocating to Denver and only the fourth time in franchise history.

### **A VIEW TO A KILL**

The Avalanche's penalty-kill unit went 11 consecutive games without allowing a power-play goal from Feb. 15 to March 6, equaling the longest such streak in franchise history... Colorado killed 27 straight penalties during that stretch.

### **ALL STAR CAPTAIN**

Nathan MacKinnon captained the Central Division for the 2020 NHL All-Star Game on Jan. 25 in St. Louis, the second straight year he's been voted captain... MacKinnon was the first Avalanche player to be named All-Star captain twice (Joe Sakic wore the 'C' once) and the first Avalanche player to be selected to four consecutive All-Star Games since Peter Forsberg was chosen for six straight from 1996-2001.

### **CLOSE ENCOUNTERS**

The Avs won six straight games by one goal from Feb. 21–March 2, the first time Colorado/Quebec had ever done that... In fact, that six-game run equaled the NHL record for consecutive wins all by a one-goal margin.

### **SHOTS FIRED**

The Avalanche fired over 40 shots-on-net in a franchise record four straight games, Dec. 27–Jan. 2... They eclipsed the previous mark of three straight games with 40+ shots from Jan. 28–Feb. 2, 2006 and Jan. 31–Feb. 3, 1996.

### **FINE FEBRUARY**

The Avs finished 11-3-1 in February, equaling their most wins in a single month in franchise history... The 11 wins tied for first in the NHL, while their 23 points led all teams in February... The Avs allowed a league-low 29 goals in February (1.93 per game).

### **THREE'S COMPANY...SO IS FOUR**

Colorado scored three or more goals in each of its first five games this season, the first team in Avalanche history (since 1995-96) to open a season by scoring at least three goals in each of their first five contests...The Avs scored four or more goals in each of their first three games this year, which was also an Avalanche first.

### **MR. NOVEMBER**

Nathan MacKinnon was named the NHL's Second Star for the month of November...He finished second in the NHL with 25 points (10g/15a) in 14 games despite the team missing Mikko Rantanen and Gabriel Landeskog for almost the entire month...MacKinnon's 25 points were a career high for any month and set a franchise record for the month of November...It was the most points by an Avalanche player in a single calendar month since March 2000 (Joe Sakic 26)...This was the third straight November that MacKinnon had been named one of the league's three stars, as he was the NHL's Second Star of the Month last November (2018) and the First Star in November of 2017...He has combined for 68 points (24g/44a) in 40 November games since 2017, the most of any player.

### **NOT A BAD NOVEMBER HIMSELF**

Cale Makar was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November...He became the first Avalanche defenseman to ever be named NHL Rookie of the Month and the first Colorado player since Gabriel Landeskog in February 2012...Makar led all NHL rookies and all NHL defensemen in points (16) and goals (seven) in 14 games during the month...His 16 points were the third-most ever by an NHL rookie defenseman in November and the most by a rookie defenseman in ANY month since Alexei Zhitnik (19) in March of 1993 with the Los Angeles Kings...Makar's seven goals tied the franchise record for a defenseman in a single month and also equaled the third most ever by an NHL rookie blueliner in one month...He scored three game-winning goals in November, the most by any rookie defenseman within a single calendar month in NHL history.

The Avs scored a goal in each of their first nine periods to start the season, the first Colorado team to ever accomplish that feat...The previous record was goals in each of the first six periods set in 2018-19 and in 2013-14...Prior to relocating, the Nordiques scored in their first nine periods twice: 1982-83 (also nine) and 1992-93 (first 18 periods).

### **LEAGUE OF NATIONS**

Nine different countries were represented on the Avalanche's Opening Night roster: Canada, USA, Russia, Finland, Austria, Czech Republic, Germany, France and Sweden...Columbus (also nine) was the only other team to feature players from nine different countries.

### **LUCKY 13**

Nathan MacKinnon recorded points in each of his first 13 games, the longest scoring streak to start a season in Avalanche history and the fourth longest in franchise history...It was the longest by an NHL player to open a season since Henrik Zetterberg (17 straight) in 2007-08...MacKinnon, who opened the previous year with a nine-game scoring streak, was the fifth player in NHL history to record a season-opening point streak of nine or more games in consecutive seasons, joining Wayne Gretzky (four straight, 1982-86), Charlie Simmer (1979-81), Guy Lafleur (1975-77) and Rod Gilbert (1971-73).

### WERNER SHINES IN DEBUT

Adam Werner stopped all 40 shots after relieving Pavel Francouz 31 seconds into the first period to pick up the victory in his NHL debut on Nov. 12 at Winnipeg... He became the first goaltender in Avalanche/Nordiques history to win his NHL debut in relief... The Mariestad, Sweden, native was the fourth Colorado goalie to win his NHL debut and the first since Vitaly Kolesnik on Dec. 7, 2005 vs. Boston... Werner's 40 saves were the most ever by an Avalanche/Nordiques goaltender in his NHL debut, topping the previous high of 37 by Jeremy Smith on Feb. 14, 2017 at New Jersey... The 6-foot-5 netminder was just the third goaltender in the last 40 years (since 1979-80) to make 40 or more saves without allowing a goal in his first career NHL game, joining Troy Grosenick (45 with San Jose on Nov. 16, 2014 at Carolina) and Mike Fountain (40 with Vancouver on Nov. 14, 1996 at New Jersey)... At 22 years, 194 days, Werner was the second-youngest Avalanche netminder to win his debut behind only Marc Denis (21 years, 156 days) on Jan. 4, 1999 vs. Montreal.

### COMBINED EFFORT

Adam Werner's effort on Nov. 12 gave the Avs their second combined team shutout in franchise history... The other was March 30, 2018, when Semyon Varlamov (30 saves) and Jonathan Bernier (three) combined for a 5-0 victory over the Blackhawks at Pepsi Center.

### TAKE FIVE

Cale Makar was just the fifth defenseman in NHL history to open his career with a five-game point streak... In fact, Makar's five-game streak ended up tied for the second-longest by a blueliner to begin a career in NHL history... Furthermore, Makar also equaled the Avalanche record (since 1995-96) for the longest streak to start a career at any position, a mark Alex Tanguay set to begin his career in 1999-00... Makar, who joined the Avs during their first round series against Calgary last spring, was the first defenseman in league history to score a goal while making his NHL debut in the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

### NINE IS FINE

Trailing 3-2 early in the second period on Nov. 7 against the Predators, the Avalanche erupted for six goals in a span of 8:00 to roll to a 9-4 victory at Pepsi Center... Joonas Donskoi led the way with his first NHL hat trick, helping the Avs to their best offensive output in 12 years... A look at some notables from the victory:

- The Avalanche set a franchise record by scoring six goals in a span of 8:00 in the second period, eclipsing the previous mark of 8:06 set by the Quebec Nordiques on Feb. 22, 1981 (11-7 win at Washington)... Colorado became the third NHL team in the last 20 years to score six goals in a span of 8:00 or less in a game, joining the 2010-11 Maple Leafs (7:43, Jan. 7, 2011 at Atlanta) and the 1999-00 Rangers (8:00, Dec. 15, 1999 vs. LA Kings).
- The Avalanche's nine goals were its most in a game since Dec. 9, 2007 (9-5 win over St. Louis at Pepsi Center)... In fact, it marked only the fifth time that Colorado has scored nine or more times in a game since relocating from Quebec... It tied for the most goals by an NHL team this season and was the most ever allowed by the Predators.
- The Avs tied a franchise record with six goals in the second period... It was the 11th time the Avalanche/Nordiques have scored six goals in a period (last: Jan. 19, 2019 vs. Los Angeles - 2nd).
- Here is a rundown of Colorado's second-period scoring:
  - 2 goals in 0:20
  - 3 goals in 1:31
  - 4 goals in 2:21
  - 5 goals in 4:35
  - 6 goals in 8:00
- The five goals in 4:35 was not a franchise record but was an Avalanche record... The previous mark was five in 5:18 on Oct. 19, 1996 vs. Vancouver.
- This game marked only the second time that five different Avalanche players had three points in a single contest... On Dec. 5, 1995, six different Avs tallied three points in Colorado's 12-2 win over San Jose.

### ODDS & ENDS

- Colorado won its first four home games of a season for the first time since 2009-10 (6-0-0).
- The Avalanche's 4-0 season-opening homestand marked the first time they swept a homestand of at least four games since Dec. 17-23, 2011 (4-0-0).
- Colorado finished 3-0-2 on its five-game homestand from Jan. 10-20, collecting points in every contest of a five-plus game homestand for the first time since Oct. 25 to Nov. 8, 2005 (5-0-1).
- The Avs went 4-1-0 on a five-game road trip from Feb. 1-9, the first time Colorado won four or more games of a five-game trip since Oct. 10-17, 2011 (5-0).

### SUCCESS IN OPENERS

Colorado's 5-3 victory on Oct. 3 improved the franchise's all-time record on Opening Night to 23-10-7 (.663), the second-best mark in the NHL... Colorado has won four straight on Opening Night, tied with Philadelphia for the second-longest active win streak behind Tampa (six)... Colorado's four straight season-opening wins is the longest such streak in Avalanche history and the second-longest in franchise history (Quebec won eight in a row from 1981-82 to 1988-89)... The Avs improved to 4-0-0 in season openers under Jared Bednar, the longest streak of Opening Night wins ever by an Avalanche head coach (since 1995-96)... Bednar is one of three active coaches who are perfect in season openers (Todd Reirden and Ralph Krueger are both 2-0)... The NHL record for the longest such win streak from the start of a coaching career is eight by Tom Renney... The Oct. 3 victory improved the franchise's record to 28-8-4 (.750) all-time in home openers, second to only Minnesota (.833; 13-1-4)... Colorado is 16-5-3 (.729) in home openers since moving from Quebec, which includes a 14-4-2 (.750) mark at Pepsi Center.



# JARED BEDNAR

HEAD COACH

SEVENTH HEAD COACH IN AVALANCHE HISTORY | 15TH IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

Jared Bednar completed his fourth season as Colorado's head coach, leading the Avalanche to a second-place finish in the Central Division and the Western Conference with 92 points. The Avs were two points behind St. Louis (94) but played one fewer game than the Blues when the regular season was paused and eventually concluded. Colorado tied Tampa Bay for the third-most points in the NHL behind the Blues and Boston Bruins (100).

Bednar is just the third Avalanche coach since the franchise relocated to lead the club to three straight playoff berths, joining Bob Hartley (four, 1998-02) and Marc Crawford (three, 1995-98).

Named to his position on Aug. 25, 2016, Bednar is the seventh head coach in Avalanche history and the 15th in the history of the franchise. He signed a two-year contract extension through the 2021-22 season on July 9, 2019.

Bednar, 48, owns a 145-136-35 (.514) record in four seasons behind the bench, which includes a 123-80-31 (.592) mark over the past three years. Only Hartley (193) has more wins in Avalanche history. Bednar's 145 victories rank fourth in franchise annals behind Michel Bergeron (265), Hartley (193) and Crawford (165 including one season with Quebec).

Bednar during the 2019-20 season passed Joe Sacco and Patrick Roy (130) for fourth on the Avs win list on Jan. 20, passed Joel Quenneville (131) for third on Feb. 4 and passed Crawford (135) for second on Feb. 11.

A native of Yorkton, Saskatchewan, Bednar led Colorado to its second straight playoff berth in 2018-19—the first Avs team to make back-to-back postseason appearances in 13 years—and also guided the club to its first postseason series win since 2008. He was a finalist for the Jack Adams Award as the NHL's coach of the year during his second season behind the bench in 2017-18, leading the Avs to a playoff berth while equaling the fourth-highest year-to-year improvement in NHL history (from 48 points to 95).

The 2019-20 campaign marks his 18th season of coaching pro hockey, his 10th as a head coach. He posted a .603 win% as a minor league head coach (251-158-42), winning championships in the AHL and ECHL. Bednar was inducted into the ECHL Hall of Fame in 2020.

Bednar played nine seasons of professional hockey, a career that spanned parts of eight seasons in the ECHL and parts of three seasons in the AHL. The defenseman was a member of two Kelly Cup championship teams as a player, 1997 and 2001 with South Carolina.

## THIS SEASON

- Led the Avalanche and finished fifth in league scoring with 93 points (35g/58a) in 69 games.
- Became the first player in franchise history to lead the team in scoring for four straight seasons.
- Finished 43 points ahead of Colorado's second-leading scorer, Cale Makar (50), the largest gap of any team since the 2007-08 Washington Capitals (Alex Ovechkin 112, Nicklas Backstrom 69). The 43-point difference was the largest gap between the top-two scorers in Avalanche history and the second largest in franchise history. In 1990-91, Joe Sakic (109) finished 50 points ahead of Mats Sundin (59) with Quebec.
- Became the first Avalanche player to post three consecutive seasons of 90 or more points since the team relocated to Denver. He and Peter Forsberg (1997-99) were the only ones to do it in two straight campaigns.
- Set a career high with 29 multi-point games, the most by an Avalanche player since Forsberg had 29 in 2002-03. Nathan tied David Pastrnak for the second most multi-point games this season (Leon Draisaitl 33).
- MacKinnon's 58 assists ranked sixth in the league and tied his career high set both last season and the year before.
- Ranked ninth in the NHL with 35 goals, joining Sakic (2003-07) as the only Colorado players to post three straight 30-goal campaigns.
- Also joined Sakic and Forsberg as the only Colorado skaters to record three straight 50-assist seasons.
- Led the NHL in shots for the second straight year with 318.
- Has recorded a shot in 220 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in franchise history behind Sakic's run of 227 straight contests from 1995-99. MacKinnon's streak is the second-longest active run behind Dougie Hamilton (294 straight).
- Ranked fifth in the league in points-per-game (1.35), the highest average by an Avalanche player (min. 50 points) since Forsberg in 2003-04 (1.41).
- Finished fourth in the NHL in power-play points (31) and sixth in power-play goals (12-tied). His 12 PPG matched a career best.
- Ranked third in the league in even-strength scoring with 62 points (23g/39a).

- Captained the Central Division for the 2020 NHL All-Star Game on Jan. 25 in St. Louis, the second straight year he's been voted captain. MacKinnon was the first Avalanche player to be named All-Star captain twice (Sakic wore the 'C' once) and the first Avalanche player to be selected to four consecutive All-Star Games since Forsberg was chosen for six straight from 1996-2001.
- Was the NHL's First Star of the Week from Nov. 25-Dec. 1 and Dec. 30-Jan. 5 and Second Star from Nov. 11-17.
- Recorded points in each of his first 13 games, the longest scoring streak to start a season in Avalanche history and the fourth longest in franchise history. It was the longest by an NHL player to open a season since Henrik Zetterberg (17 straight) in 2007-08.
- MacKinnon, who opened the 2018-19 campaign with a nine-game point streak, became the fifth player in NHL history to record a season-opening point streak of nine or more games in consecutive seasons, joining Wayne Gretzky (four straight, 1982-83 to 1985-86), Charlie Simmer (1979-80 to 1980-81), Guy Lafleur (1975-76 to 1976-77) and Rod Gilbert (1971-72 to 1972-73).
- Collected points in his first eight home games, equaling the longest home scoring streak to start a season in Avalanche history (Alex Tanguay, 2005-06).
- Named the NHL's Second Star for the month of November after finishing second in the NHL with 25 points (10g/15a) in 14 games.
- MacKinnon's 25 points were a career high for any month and set a franchise record for a single November. It was the most points by an Avalanche player in a calendar month since March 2000 (Sakic 26).
- This was the third straight November that MacKinnon has been named one of the league's three stars, as he was the NHL's Second Star of the Month last November (2018) and the First Star in November of 2017. He has combined for 68 points (24g/44a) in 40 November games since 2017, the most of any player.
- Recorded a career-high 12 shots on Nov. 1 vs. Dallas, tying the single-game franchise record set by Gabriel Landeskog on Jan. 9, 2019 at Calgary.

## THIS SEASON (cont.)

- Ended up leading all players with 79 shots in November, which were the most ever by a Colorado player in a calendar month.
- Reached the 50-point mark in his 32nd contest of the season on Dec. 13, one fewer than when he hit the milestone in 2018-19. Nathan became the second player in Avalanche/Nordiques history to require 33 or fewer games to reach 50 points in consecutive seasons, joining Peter Stastny (1981-82 to 1983-84).
- Appeared in his 500th NHL game on Jan. 7 at NY Rangers.
- His 62 points through 41 games equaled the most by an Avalanche player at the team's halfway point of a season (Mikko Rantanen, 2018-19).
- Reached the 70-point mark in his 48th game for the second straight year. The only Avalanche player to do it faster was Rantanen (47th game) last season.
- Logged a career-high 29:04 of ice time on Feb. 22 at Los Angeles, the most minutes by an Avs forward since Sakic played 29:57 on Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Calgary.
- Picked up his 300th career assist on March 2 at Detroit.
- Missed his only game of the year on March 11 vs. NY Rangers (lower body), which turned out to be the season finale.

## STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS

### 2018-19

- Finished second on the Avalanche with 13 points (6g/7a) in 12 playoff contests.
- Tied Mikko Rantanen for the team lead in goals, the most by a Colorado skater in the postseason since Joe Sakic had seven in 2004.
- Led the NHL with three game-winning goals during the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- Ranked first on the club in shots (57).
- Had an eight-game point streak from April 13–May 2, the longest by an Avalanche player in the postseason since Peter Forsberg (eight) in 2002. In fact, MacKinnon's streak equaled the third longest in Avalanche postseason history behind only Sakic's 10-game run in 1996 and Claude Lemieux's nine-game streak in 1997.
- The eight-game streak also tied Vladimir Tarasenko for the longest during the 2019 postseason.
- MacKinnon had a five-game assist streak from April 15-28, matching David Krejci for the league high.
- Tallied his second career playoff overtime goal in Game 2 of the first-round series at Calgary on April 13.
- Scored two power-play goals and had an assist in the first period of Game 3 vs. Calgary (April 15), tying franchise playoff records for points and PPG in a single period.
- Was the 13th Colorado/Quebec player to have three points in a postseason period, the first since Forsberg on April 17, 2004, and just the third to score two PPG in a period, as Forsberg and Mike Ricci both did it during the 1996 postseason.
- Has 29 points (11g/18a) in 25 career playoff games, the highest points-per-game average (1.16) among active players and the eighth highest all-time (min 20 games).

### 2017-18

- Finished second on the team with six points (3g/3a) in six games during the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- Led the Avs in shots (28) and ranked second in goals.
- Collected his first career playoff multi-goal game on April 16 vs. Nashville (Game 3).

### 2013-14

- Shared the team scoring lead during the playoffs with 10 points (2g/8a) in seven contests.
- MacKinnon's 10 points were the third-most by an 18-year-old in one playoff year, behind only Jaromir Jagr (13, 1991) and Ed Olczyk (11, 1985).
- Despite playing just seven games, Nathan's eight postseason assists tied for the league lead among rookies.
- Collected three assists in his playoff debut on April 17 vs. Minnesota, becoming the first rookie to ever record three assists in his postseason debut.
- At 18 years, 228 days, was the second-youngest player in NHL history to record three points in his playoff debut (Pierre Turgeon was 18 years, 222 days on April 6, 1988 at Boston).
- Had a goal and three assists in Game 2 on April 19, becoming the third 18-year-old in NHL history to record a four-point game in the postseason (Pierre Turgeon, 1988; Trevor Linden, 1989).
- With that four-point effort, Nathan tied the NHL record for most points in the first two playoff games of a career with seven (Odie Cleghorn, Montreal 1918-19 and Barry Pederson, Boston 1981-82).

- Don Gallinger was 17 years, 339 days when he did it for Boston on March 21, 1943 against Montreal.

- Finished second among NHL rookies in scoring with 50 points (12g/38a) in 57 games.
- Makar's 0.88 points-per-game average led all rookies and tied for the third-highest single-season total by a rookie defenseman in NHL history (min. 50 GP). Only Brian Leetch (1.04, New York Rangers, 1988-89) and Larry Murphy (0.95, Los Angeles Kings, 1980-81) averaged more.
- Led all rookie blueliners with 12 goals and tied for first among all rookies with four game-winning tallies.
- His 0.21 goals-per-game average was the highest by a first-year defenseman since 2015-16 (Shayne Gostisbehere, 0.27).
- Makar's 38 assists ranked second among all rookies.
- Was first among rookie blueliners in even-strength goals (8) and points (31) as well as power-play goals (4).
- Finished second among all rookies in power-play points (19) and assists (15).
- Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes, who led all rookies with 53 points in 68 games, became the first defensemen to rank 1-2 in rookie scoring in the NHL's modern era (since 1943-44).
- Overall, only 17 rookie defensemen in NHL history have reached the 50-point mark in a season, with Makar and Hughes the first since Vladimir Malakhov (52) in 1992-93 with the NY Islanders.
- Led all Colorado defensemen in points, goals and assists, all franchise records for a rookie blueliner. His four game-winning tallies were also a franchise mark for a first-year defender.
- Made his regular-season debut in the season opener vs. Calgary on Oct.

3 and had an assist.

- Notched points in each of his first five games, Oct. 3-14, becoming the fifth defenseman in NHL history to open his career with points in each of his first five career games. In fact, Makar's five-game streak ended up tied for the second-longest by a blueliner to begin a career (Marek Zidlicky, six, 2003-04 with Nashville).
- Makar's five-game point streak to begin his career equaled the Avalanche record set by Alex Tanguay in 1999-00.
- Tied for first among rookies in points (10) and assists (nine) in October, with his nine assists an Avalanche record for a rookie defenseman in that month.
- Tallied his first regular-season goal Oct. 25 at Vegas.
- Named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November, the first Avalanche defenseman to ever be named NHL Rookie of the Month and the first Colorado player since Gabriel Landeskog in February 2012.
- Makar led all NHL rookies and all NHL defensemen in points (16) and goals (seven) in 14 November games. His 16 points were the third-most ever by a rookie defenseman in November and the most by a rookie defenseman in ANY month since Alexei Zhitnik (19) in March of 1993 with Los Angeles. Makar's seven goals tied the franchise record for a defenseman in a single month and also equaled the third-most ever by an NHL rookie blueliner in one month. He scored three game-winning goals in November, the most by any rookie defenseman within a single calendar month in NHL history.
- Selected as the NHL's Third Star of the week for Nov. 4-10.

## STANLEY CUP PLAYOFFS

### 2018-19

- Seventy two hours after winning the Hobey Baker Award and 48 hours after playing in the NCAA championship game, Makar scored his first NHL goal on his first shot in the opening period of Colorado's Game 3 victory against Calgary on April 15.
- He became the first defenseman in history to score his first career goal while making his NHL debut in the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- Overall, he was the seventh player in history to make his League debut in the playoffs and score, and the first Colorado/Quebec skater to do so.
- Despite playing just 10 games, Makar ended up leading all NHL rookie defensemen with six points (1g/5a) during the Stanley Cup Playoffs... His six points tied the franchise rookie record for a blueliner set by Quebec's Jeff Brown in 1987.
- Only two rookie skaters had more points during the 2019 postseason, Carolina left wing Warren Foegele (9) and Dallas left wing Roope Hintz (8).
- Finished the playoffs with a +3 plus/minus rating, tied for fifth on the team, and his six points ranked second among Avalanche rearguards.

## THIS SEASON (cont.)

- Was the first rookie defenseman in franchise history to score a goal in three straight games, Nov. 7-12. In fact, he was just the 11th rookie blueliner to have a three-game goal streak over the last 30 years (since 1989-80).
- Recorded three points on Nov. 7 vs. Nashville and followed that up with a pair of goals on Nov. 9 vs. Columbus. He was just the second rookie defenseman in Avalanche/Nordiques history to post consecutive multi-point outings, joining David Pichette (Dec. 7-10, 1980), and the first to score two goals in a game.
- Potted the game-winning goal in two straight contests, Nov. 9-12, the eighth rookie defenseman in NHL history to score the winning tally in consecutive games.
- Had four assists on Nov. 16 at Vancouver, setting a franchise rookie record for assists by a defenseman in a single game and matching the record in points (Quebec's Jeff Brown, Oct. 13, 1986 at Vancouver).
- Surpassed the 20-point mark in that Nov. 16 victory, becoming just the fourth defenseman in NHL history to record 20 or more points in his first 20 career games. He was only the second to do so in the modern era (since 1943-44) and the first since Larry Murphy nearly 40 years ago.
- Makar was the fourth defenseman to be the first rookie to surpass 20 points, joining Nicklas Lidstrom (22 GP with Detroit in 1991-92), Bobby Orr (33 GP with Boston in 1966-67) and Hap Day (18 GP with Toronto St. Pats in 1924-25). It was the most points by any Avalanche defender through the team's first 20 contests.
- Collected an assist on five consecutive Avalanche goals from Nov. 16-19, becoming the sixth rookie defenseman in NHL history to assist on five consecutive team goals.
- Logged a career-high 27:45 of ice time on Nov. 23 vs. Toronto, the most minutes by a Colorado rookie blueliner since April 26, 2013 (Tyson Barrie 28:48 at Phoenix).
- Suffered an upper-body injury on Dec. 7 at Boston, forcing him to miss eight games (Dec. 9-23).
- Placed on IR, Dec. 13 (retro to Dec. 7), and activated on Dec. 27.
- Makar's 29 points on Jan. 1 were the most by a rookie blueliner through New Years Day since Lidstrom (35) in 1991-92
- Surpassed the 30-point mark on Jan. 4 at New Jersey, becoming the eighth defenseman in history to record his first 30 career regular-season points in 33 games or fewer, and the first since Lidstrom in 1991-92.
- Scored his 11th goal of the year on Jan. 18 vs. St. Louis, breaking the single-season franchise record for a rookie defenseman (10) set by John-Michael Liles in 2003-04.
- With an assist on Feb. 4 in Buffalo, Makar broke the franchise record for the most points by a rookie defenseman in a single season with 38, topping the previous mark of 37 set by Bruce Bell for Quebec in 1984-85.
- Missed five games due to an upper-body injury, March 2-9.
- Returned to the lineup for what turned out to be the season finale on March 11 vs. NY Rangers and picked up three assists that night to surpass the 50-point mark.
