# MEDIA RELATIONS TEAM



## MEDIA RESOURCES

**WILD.COM/PRESSBOX:** The Minnesota Wild media website [www.wild.com/pressbox](http://www.wild.com/pressbox) provides media access to team press releases, game notes, multimedia and game-day statistics, along with team publications and other media information. Media must use the site to request credentials to Wild practices, morning skates and Stanley Cup Playoff games at Xcel Energy Center.

**TWITTER:** Follow @mnwildPR on Twitter to get the latest news and notes from the team, including practice times, player interviews and other valuable media information from the official Wild Public Relations Twitter account.

## MINNESOTA WILD WIRELESS INFORMATION:

Wireless access is available throughout Xcel Energy Center by connecting to the **WildMedia** network.

Please enter **WildMedia** for the password when instructed.

**ACCESS:** All media access to Players, Coaches and Executives during the 2021 NHL Stanley Cup Playoffs will be conducted virtually. There will be no event level or locker room access by any media during the 2021 NHL Stanley Cup Playoffs, and no in person interviews will be permitted at any time. The Minnesota Wild organization and Communications department strive to make its players, coaches, management and other personnel available in a timely and responsible fashion to all accredited members of the media.

**PRACTICE AND MORNING SKATE ACCESS:** Media interested in covering the Minnesota Wild daily practices and morning skates during the 2021 Stanley Cup Playoffs must register to attend by **4 p.m. the day before a practice or morning skate** by visiting [wild.com/pressbox](http://wild.com/pressbox) and clicking "Practice Sessions Credentials". Media must submit a separate request for every practice and morning skate they plan to attend this postseason.

**SINGLE-GAME CREDENTIALS:** Single-game credentials must be requested no later than **4 p.m. the day before a game**. Requests should be made by clicking on the "Game Day Credentials" link located at [wild.com/pressbox](http://wild.com/pressbox). Once approved, single-game credentials may be picked up beginning 1.5 hours prior to game time at the Xcel Energy Center Box Office inside the Gate 1 Lobby on Kellogg Boulevard. Limited credentials are also available for reporters that would like to do live shots inside Xcel Energy Center. Media credentials are not transferable and may be revoked for noncompliance or for violation of the NHL Media Access Policy or the 2020-21 NHL Season COVID-19 Protocol. The elevator to the press box is located in the southwest corner of the Xcel Energy Center near Section 107.

**AL SHAVER PRESS BOX:** Press seating at Wild home games at Xcel Energy Center for the 2021 Stanley Cup Playoffs is available to accredited media in the Al Shaver Press Box. The elevator to the press box is located in the southwest corner of Xcel Energy Center near Gate 2 and Section 107. To get to the press elevator, take a left once you enter the arena through the media entrance. Due to extremely limited press box seating during the Stanley Cup Playoffs, priority will be given to media that have covered the team consistently this season. Credentials provided to reporters doing live shots does not guarantee a seat in the press box.

**MEDIA HEALTH SCREENINGS:** Upon entering Xcel Energy Center, media will be required to fill out their TalentMS or [wild.com/healthscreen](http://wild.com/healthscreen) questionnaires and undergo a temperature test (anyone that registers a temperature over 100.4 or higher will not be allowed access) and attest that they are free of COVID-19 symptoms. Anyone that has a symptom, has had exposure to someone with symptoms of COVID-19, or has a temperature, will not be admitted entry and: (a) will need to follow up with their own physician for care, and (b) shall require a letter from their physician providing written media clearance before they may be admitted entry to the club facility. The medical clearance must detail the steps that were taken to effect such clearance, and must be satisfactory to the Club doctor and the Club's infectious diseases specialist.

- Media must social distance from one another (minimum 6 feet)
- Media must wear face coverings at all times inside TRIA Rink and Xcel Energy Center.
- Face coverings shall completely cover the mouth and nose, fit snugly against the sides of the face, and shall be secure under the chin.
- Gaiters and Bandanas are not permitted to function as face coverings.
- Use of a face shield does not eliminate the requirement to wear a face covering underneath.
- Face coverings with exhalation valves or vents are prohibited.
- Media will only have access to the main level and pressbox level at Xcel Energy Center. Media will not have access to the event level.
- The press dining room and media work room on the event level at Xcel

Energy Center are open to credentialed still photographers only.

**PRACTICE/MORNING SKATE INTERVIEWS:** All media access will be conducted virtually. Minnesota Wild Head Coach **Dean Evason** and select players will be available to media via Zoom following each practice session. Please contact **Aaron Sickman** or **Megan Kogut** if you have specific interview requests or questions.

**POST-GAME INTERVIEWS:** Approximately 10 minutes following the conclusion of each NHL game, the Wild will make a representative number of players and Head Coach Dean Evason available for virtual interviews. The media access period for both Clubs will run concurrently. The selected Players and Head Coaches of each Club will be positioned in a separate area of the venue for the interview access period. The virtual media access periods will be organized and moderated by each Club's communications staff. Please contact each team's communications personnel to request access to post-game interviews.

**MEDIA MEALS:** Very limited media meals and refreshments will be available in the Al Shaver Press Box prior to each game's puck drop. Media are encouraged to bring their own food and beverages.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Only those photographers on assignment will be allowed access to designated photography locations at rink level and concourse positions. Xcel Energy Center spaces are accessible to local dailies and wire service photographers. Two photography positions are reserved for Wild team photographers. Additional photography positions are determined on a first-come, first-served basis and positions will be assigned by team photographer, Bruce Kluckhohn. In all cases, photographers should check in with Bruce Kluckhohn before the start of warm-ups. It is not possible to accommodate freelance photographers.

**TELEVISION COVERAGE:** All television stations are prohibited by the National Hockey League from shooting and distributing game footage of any contest that is being broadcast from Xcel Energy Center by the Minnesota Wild, the visiting team or network television. Requests for special features and the like should be directed to the Wild Communications department. Television stations are prohibited from doing live shots with the Xcel Energy Center ice in the background from 30 minutes prior to puck drop until 30 minutes after the completion of a game due to the exclusive rights holder broadcast window.

**MEDIA PARKING AT XCEL ENERGY CENTER:** Media that covered a majority of home games during the 2020-21 regular season will continue to use their access code given by the Wild PR department to use when entering the RiverCentre Parking Ramp for practice, morning skates and games. A Wild media credential and/or company issued media identification **WILL NOT** allow you access to the parking ramp for games. The RiverCentre Park Ramp has two entrances: on Kellogg Boulevard and on Exchange Street, which can be accessed via Eagle Street (at the Kellogg and West Seventh intersection). To enter the arena, media should take the West elevator to Skyway Level and then take the Skyway hallway elevator on the right down to level one to the RiverCentre Lobby and enter Xcel Energy Center through the Gate 1 East doors. An alternate option is to cross Kellogg Blvd. and enter through the RiverCentre Lobby.

## AARON SICKMAN DIRECTOR OF MEDIA RELATIONS

Aaron Sickman is in his 22nd year with the Minnesota Wild. He started as an intern with the organization in June of 1998 and has held a number of positions in the club's communications and broadcasting department including Manager of Corporate Communications and Internet Services, Communications Manager, Manager of Media Relations and Team Services and Director of Media Relations.

His responsibilities include facilitating interview requests for players and hockey operations personnel, overseeing the distribution of all team information and working closely with the organization's digital content department and rights holders FOX Sports North and KFAN. Sickman is also responsible for coordinating logistics with the players featured on *Becoming Wild* presented by Toyota. During his tenure with the Wild, the team has been named the recipient of the Dick Dillman Award, given to the NHL's top Public Relations staff in each conference by the Professional Hockey Writers Association, in 2005-06, 2016-17 and 2019-20.

Born in the Twin Cities, he attended John Marshall High School in Rochester, Minn., and graduated from Gustavus Adolphus College with a double major in Organizational Management and Geography. Sickman also holds a Master of Science in Sport Management from the University of Massachusetts Amherst and served as the media relations intern for the NFL's Miami Dolphins in 1997.

He and his wife, Kari, have two sons, Evan and Tate. The family resides in Rosemount.

The four teams that advance to the Semifinal Round would be seeded by their regular season points total, with the No. 1 seed playing the No. 4 seed in one series and the No. 2 and No. 3 seeds meeting in the other.



# TEAM MANAGEMENT



## CRAIG LEIPOLD

### OWNER & GOVERNOR

Craig Leipold is the majority owner and principal investor in Minnesota Sports & Entertainment (MSE), a regional sports and entertainment leader that includes the National Hockey League's Minnesota Wild, the Iowa Wild of the American Hockey League, 317 on Rice Park and the facility management of Xcel Energy Center, TRIA Rink at Treasure Island Center, Saint Paul RiverCentre and the Legendary Roy Wilkins Auditorium. He oversees the day-to-day business operations of the organization and also serves as the team's Governor at NHL Board of Governors' meetings. The NHL's Board of Governors officially approved Leipold's purchase of MSE on April 10, 2008.

Leipold has advocated for the State of Hockey to host premiere NHL events, including the 2011 Entry Draft at Xcel Energy Center, 2016 Coors Light Stadium Series at TCF Bank Stadium and the Bridgestone Winter Classic at Target Field.

A resident of Racine, Wis., Leipold completed the sale of the Nashville Predators to a local ownership group on Dec. 7, 2007, a team he owned since the expansion franchise was awarded to Nashville in 1997.

During his time as an NHL owner, Leipold has been a tireless advocate for the professional hockey industry. Appointed by NHL Commissioner Gary Bettman, Leipold serves on both the League's Executive Committee and Audit Committee. He was a member of the League Negotiating Committees that negotiated the Collective Bargaining Agreements with the NHL Players' Association in 2005 and 2013. He is also a strong advocate for the new, more "fan-friendly" NHL, including the rule changes to promote a more entertaining competition and increased fan access to the product.

Craig and his wife Helen (Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Johnson Outdoors, Inc., and Chairman of Johnson Financial Bank Corp.) have five sons (Chris, Kyle, Connor, Curtis and Bradford) and own five dogs. Matt Majka (pronounced MAY-kuh) is in his fourth season as President and Alternate Governor for Minnesota Sports and Entertainment (MSE) and 24th year with the organization. He previously held the positions of Chief Operating Officer, Executive Vice President, Senior Vice President of Business Operations and Vice President of Marketing and Corporate Sponsorships.

MSE is a regional sports and entertainment leader that has grown into several different business operations including the Minnesota Wild, its minor league affiliate, the Iowa Wild, 317 on Rice Park and the facility management of Xcel Energy Center and Saint Paul RiverCentre.

# HOCKEY OPERATIONS



## BILL GUERIN GENERAL MANAGER

Bill Guerin is in his second season as General Manager of the Minnesota Wild after being named to the position on August 21, 2019. He oversees the Wild's hockey operations department including all matters relating to player personnel, coaching staff, scouting department and minor league operations.

Guerin spent the previous eight seasons with the Pittsburgh Penguins, including the last five seasons as Assistant General Manager. He served as the Penguins player development coach for three seasons (2011-14), helping develop the organization's minor league, junior and college prospects, many of whom were key contributors on Pittsburgh's 2016 and 2017 Stanley Cup teams. Guerin was promoted to Assistant General Manager by the organization on June 6, 2014, and served as General Manager of Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, overseeing the day-to-day operations of Pittsburgh's American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate, the last two seasons.

He recorded 856 points (429-427=856), a plus-51 rating and 1,660 penalty minutes (PIM) in 1,263 career NHL games during 18 seasons (1991-2010) with New Jersey, Edmonton, Boston, Dallas, St. Louis, San Jose and the New York Islanders. Guerin played in four NHL All-Star Games (2001, 2003, 2004 and 2007) and ranks fourth in shots on goal (3,693), sixth in goals, seventh in games played, 10th in PIM and 13th in scoring in NHL history amongst American-born players. He is one of eight U.S.-born players to record 400 career goals and 400 career assists in the NHL. Guerin also made 15 appearances in the Stanley Cup Playoffs and tallied 74 points (39-35=74) and 162 PIM in 140 career playoff contests, winning the Stanley Cup in 1995 with New Jersey and in 2009 with Pittsburgh. He was selected by New Jersey in the first round (fifth overall) of the 1989 NHL Entry Draft.

Guerin represented the United States at three Olympic Games (1988, 2002 and 2006) and two World Cups of Hockey (1996, 2004), helping Team USA win a gold medal at the 1996 World Cup of Hockey and a silver medal at the 2002 Olympics. He also played for Team USA at the 1989 and 1990 IIHF World Junior Championships and played in 46 games for the U.S. National Team during the 1991-92 Pre-Olympic Tour. Guerin tallied 70 points (40-30=70) in 77 games during two seasons at Boston College (1989-91). The native of Wilbraham, Mass., was inducted into United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2013.

He and his wife, Kara, have three daughters, Kayla, Grace and Lexi, and a son, Liam.



## TOM KURVERS ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Tom Kurvers is in his third season with the Minnesota Wild as Assistant General Manager after being named to the position on June 26, 2018. He reports to General Manager Bill Guerin and supports the day-to-day operations of the club. Kurvers also serves as General Manager of the Iowa Wild of the American Hockey League (AHL).

Kurvers joined the Wild after spending 10 seasons with the Tampa Bay Lightning where he served as senior advisor to the general manager the last seven seasons (2011-18). The native of Minneapolis, Minn., served as assistant general manager for three seasons (2008-11) and oversaw the Lightning's hockey operations department on an interim basis from April through May of 2010. During his tenure with Tampa Bay, he also served on USA Hockey's advisory board for the 2014 IIHF World Championship.

Prior to joining the Lightning, Kurvers spent 11 seasons with the Phoenix Coyotes (1997-2008). He served three seasons as director of player personnel for the Coyotes, overseeing all aspects of the team's amateur and professional scouting departments. Kurvers also spent seven seasons as a professional scout, one season as a radio analyst and served as interim assistant coach for the final two months of the 2003-04 season.

The defenseman collected 421 points (93-238=421) and 350 penalty minutes (PIM) in 659 career NHL games during 11 seasons (1984-95) with Montreal, Buffalo, New Jersey, Toronto, Vancouver, New York Islanders and Anaheim. Kurvers won the 1986 Stanley Cup with the Canadiens and was selected by Montreal in the seventh round (145th overall) of the 1981 NHL Entry Draft.

Kurvers played four seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (1980-84), setting school records for most career goals (43) and points (192) by a defenseman and won the 1984 Hobey Baker Award. Kurvers has been inducted into the University of Minnesota Duluth and Bloomington Jefferson High School Athletic Hall of Fames. He played in the 1980 Minnesota state high school hockey tournament with the Jaguars.

Kurvers received a Bachelor of Arts degree in communications from the University of Minnesota Duluth in 1984 and earned a Masters of Business Administration degree in sports management from the University of St. Thomas in 1997.

He has his wife, Heather, have two daughters, Madison and Rose, and two sons, Weston and Roman.

## RANDY SEXTON

### SENIOR ADVISOR TO THE GENERAL MANAGER

Randy Sexton is in his first season with the Minnesota Wild as the Senior Advisor to the General Manager after being named to the position on Jan. 1, 2020.

Sexton joins the Wild after spending the last three seasons as assistant general manager for the Buffalo Sabres where he oversaw amateur scouting and served as general manager of Buffalo's American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate, the Rochester Americans.

Prior to joining the Sabres, Sexton spent seven seasons with the Pittsburgh Penguins. He joined the Penguins as assistant director of amateur scouting in 2010-11 and was promoted to director of amateur scouting in 2015-16. As director of amateur scouting, Sexton oversaw Pittsburgh's scouting operations in North America and Europe.

## JACK FERREIRA

### SENIOR ADVISOR TO THE GENERAL MANAGER

Jack Ferreira is in his third season with the Minnesota Wild as the Senior Advisor to the General Manager after being named to the position on June 5, 2018. Ferreira brings 48 years of professional hockey experience to the Wild organization, including nine years as an NHL General Manager. He spent the previous 12 seasons as Senior Advisor for the Los Angeles Kings (2006-18). Prior to joining the Kings, Ferreira spent six seasons as the Director of Player Personnel for the Atlanta Thrashers (2000-06) and assisted General Manager Don Waddell in all player related decisions.

The native of Providence, R.I., was an original member of the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim, serving as the first Vice President and General Manager in team history (1993-98) as well as Vice President of Hockey Operations (1998-00). During his tenure with the Ducks, Ferreira was responsible for several prominent moves, including the drafting of Hall of Famer Paul Kariya in 1993 and the acquisition of Hall of Famer Teemu Selanne in 1996. He also served as the Assistant General Manager for Team USA when they captured the gold medal at the 1996 World Cup of Hockey and at the 1998 Olympics in Japan.

Ferreira won a Stanley Cup in 1993 serving as the Montreal Canadiens Director of Pro Scouting. He also served as the first-ever Vice President and General Manager of the San Jose Sharks (1990-92) following two seasons (1988-90) as the Vice President and General Manager of the Minnesota North Stars.

Ferreira has also served as Director of Player Development for the New York Rangers (1986-88), as a U.S. and College Scout for the Calgary Flames (1980-86) and worked for the NHL's Central Scouting Service as a New England Area Scout (1977-80). His professional career began with the New England Whalers of the World Hockey Association, where he held various roles including Head Scout, Assistant Coach and Assistant General Manager in five seasons (1972-77).

A former All-America goaltender at Boston University (1963-66) where he later earned induction into the Terriers Athletic Hall of Fame, Ferreira spent five seasons as an Assistant Coach at the collegiate level at Brown University (1970-72), Princeton (1969-70) and West Point (1967-69).

## DEAN EVASON

### HEAD COACH

Dean Evason is in his first season as Head Coach with the Minnesota Wild after being named to the position on July 13, 2020. He was named interim Head Coach on Feb. 14, 2020 and led the team to an 8-4-0 record (.667). Evason is in his third season with Minnesota after being named an Assistant Coach on June 6, 2018.

He joined the Wild after spending six seasons (2012-18) as head coach of the Milwaukee Admirals in the American Hockey League (AHL), leading the team to a record of 242-161-53 (.588). Prior to serving as the Admirals head coach, he spent seven seasons as an assistant coach with the Washington Capitals (2005-12). During Evason's tenure with Washington, the Capitals went 294-206-74 (.576) and claimed four straight Southeast Division titles, advanced to the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of his last five seasons (2008-12) and won the 2010 Presidents' Trophy. His responsibilities with the Capitals included faceoffs (Washington finished in the NHL's Top 10 in faceoff percentage in five of his seven seasons), the penalty kill (which finished as high as second in the League under his watch (2010-11) and being in charge of the team's forwards.

Prior to joining the Capitals, the Flin Flon, Man., native spent six seasons as a head coach in the Western Hockey League (WHL). He served as co-coach of the Calgary Hitmen in 2004-05, head coach of the Vancouver Giants for two seasons (2002-04) and head coach of the Kamloops Blazers for three seasons (1999-02).

Evason totaled 372 points (139-233=372) and 1,002 penalty minutes (PIM) in 803 career NHL games during 13 seasons (1983-96) as a center with the Capitals, Hartford Whalers, San Jose Sharks, Dallas Stars and Calgary Flames. He added 29 points (9-20=29) and 132 PIM in 55 Stanley Cup Playoff contests. He was originally selected by Washington in the fifth round (89th overall) of the 1982 NHL Entry Draft.

An honored member of the Manitoba Hockey Hall of Fame, Evason served as a player/coach for Team Canada during the 1996-97 season, captaining the team to a gold medal at the 1997 World Championship. He retired as a player following two seasons as a player/coach with Landshut in the German League (1997-99).

Evason has three children, Bryce, Brianne and Brooke, and is married to Geneviève.

## BOB WOODS

### ASSISTANT COACH



Bob Woods is in his fourth season as an Assistant Coach with the Minnesota Wild after being named to the position on June 24, 2017.

Prior to joining the Wild, he served as an assistant coach for the Buffalo Sabres during the 2016-17 season and spent two seasons (2014-16) as general manager and head coach of the Saskatoon Blades in the Western Hockey League (WHL).

Woods also served as an assistant coach with the Anaheim Ducks (2012-14) and Washington Capitals (2009-12) in the NHL, and with the Hershey Bears in the American Hockey League (AHL) from 2005-07. Woods became the Head Coach of the Bears 15 games into the 2007-08 season and helped Hershey win the AHL's Calder Cup championship in 2006 and 2009.

## BRETT MCLEAN

### ASSISTANT COACH



Brett McLean is in his first season as an Assistant Coach for the Minnesota Wild after being named to the position on August 26, 2020. He spent the last three seasons (2017-20) as an Assistant Coach for the Iowa Wild in the American Hockey League (AHL). During his tenure the Iowa Wild owned a record of 107-71-37 (.583).

McLean played 18 years of professional hockey including 385 games in the National Hockey League (NHL) with the Chicago Blackhawks, Colorado Avalanche and Florida Panthers. During his NHL tenure, he collected 162 career points (56-106=162) in six seasons (2002-09). The former center played in seven different leagues from 1999-2017, compiling 1,111 pro games between the NHL, AHL, IHL, ECHL, SEL, Swiss-A and the Austrian League. The Comox, BC native also represented Canada many times during his career including at the U-18 level, the World Juniors and for six Spengler Cups, winning the Spengler Cup in 2012. McLean also won the Swiss-A championship in 2010. He completed his pro career in 2016-17 in Austria with Linz EHC. ### DARBY HENDRICKSON

#### ASSISTANT COACH

Darby Hendrickson is in his 11th season as an Assistant Coach with the Minnesota Wild.

Hendrickson was an original member of the Wild and one of the most popular players in team history, playing four seasons (2000-04) and scoring the team's first goal at Xcel Energy Center on Oct. 11, 2000 vs. Philadelphia. The Richfield, Minn., native posted 60 points (29-31=60) in 182 regular season games with the Wild. He appeared in 17 playoff matches with Minnesota in 2003 and recorded five points (2-3=5) including the game-winning goal in Game 7 of the Western Conference Semifinal at Vancouver on May 8, 2003. Hendrickson also skated with Toronto, the New York Islanders, Vancouver and Colorado, posting 129 points (65-64=129) and 370 PIM in 518 games in parts of 10 NHL seasons.

He played for the University of Minnesota for two seasons (1991-93) after earning the 1991 Minnesota Mr. Hockey Award while playing for Richfield High School and was a member of the 1994 United States Olympic Team. Prior to joining the Wild, Hendrickson served as a studio analyst for FOX Sports North and an analyst for KSTC-TV, Channel 45's coverage of the state high school hockey tournament, as well as a National Hockey League Players' Association (NHLPA) Northwest Division Representative.

### FREDERIC CHABOT

#### GOALTENDING COACH

Frederic Chabot was named Goaltending Coach for the Minnesota Wild on August 26, 2020. He spent the previous five seasons (2015-20) as the Wild's Goaltending Development Coach working with goalie prospects throughout the organization, including goaltenders playing for the Iowa Wild in the American Hockey League (AHL), as well as Minnesota draft picks.

The former NHL netminder joined the Wild after serving as the Goaltending Coach for the Edmonton Oilers for five seasons (2009-14). Prior to working for the Oilers, he served as a Goaltending Consultant with Hockey Canada and its National Junior Team, helping Canada win a gold medal at the 2009 World Junior Championship. Chabot was also an instructor at Hockey Canada's Program of Excellence Goaltending Camp for three years (2007-09). The native of Hebertville-Station, Que., worked as a Goaltending Consultant with Berlin (DEL) in 2008-09, capturing the league championship with the Ice Bears. Chabot also worked with AIK Stockholm (SWE-2) from 2007-09, overseeing goaltending for the entire organization.

Chabot played 17 seasons of professional hockey (1989-2006) and appeared in a total of 32 NHL contests with the Montreal Canadiens, Los Angeles Kings and Philadelphia Flyers. He spent a majority of his career in the International Hockey League (IHL) and was named the IHL's Most Valuable Player and Top Goaltender in 1999-2000 after going 36-19-7 with a 2.13 GAA and a .920 SV% in 62 games with the Houston Aeros. Chabot was also named best goaltender in the AHL (Baz Bastien Award) in 1993-94, MVP of the IHL in 1996-97 and best goaltender in the German League in 2002-03. He also backstopped the Vienna Capitals to the regular season and playoff championship in the Austrian League in 2004-05. He was originally drafted by the New Jersey Devils in the 10th round (192nd overall) of the 1986 NHL Entry Draft.

# 2020-21 SEASON NOTES



## TOTAL TEAM EFFORT

- The Wild went 35-16-5 for 75 points this season – the second-most wins and team points through 56 games in franchise history. The team's .669 points percentage is the highest in team history (.646 in 2016-17).
- Minnesota began the 2020-21 season with a 6-5-0 record in its first 11 games before a 14-day pause due to COVID-19. The Wild went 29-11-5 in their return to action, ranking second in the NHL in points (63) and fifth in wins since Feb. 16.
- The Wild never had a losing streak (regulation and OT/SO) longer than two games for the first time in team history. Minnesota, Boston and Pittsburgh were the only teams to not have a losing streak of more than two games this season.
- Minnesota recorded a season-high seven-game win streak, April 14-24, and a season-high eight-game point streak (7-0-1), April 10-24.
- Per NHL Stats, the Wild recorded three win streaks of five-or-more games in a season for the third time in franchise history (2014-15, 2011-12).

## GOALS, GOALS, GOALS

- The Wild had eight different players with double digit goal totals, including two that reached the 20-plus goal total. Minnesota was one of eight NHL teams with eight double digit goal scorers.
- Minnesota was one of three NHL teams to have 12 players to record at least 20 points this season.
- The Wild ranked T-1st in the NHL in first period goals (60) and second in third period goals (67).
- Per NHL Stats, the Wild had overcome a multi-goal, third-period deficit to win a game four times, tying Boston for the highest such total in the NHL.
- The Wild ranked T-8th in the NHL in total goals scored (non-shootout goals) – the second time in team history Minnesota finished in the top 10 of the League (second in 2016-17).

## HOME SWEET HOME

- The Wild went 21-5-2 in 28 home games this season and recorded its highest home point percentage in team history (.786).
- Minnesota ranked second in the NHL in goals scored at home (101).
- Minnesota went 19-2-2 at home since Jan. 31 to rank T-1st in the NHL in home wins in that span.
- The Wild set a franchise record 11-game home win streak from Jan. 31-March 25.
- Minnesota defeated Colorado, 8-3, on April 7 to tie its franchise best for most goals in a game for the fifth time, third at Xcel Energy Center.

## ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- Minnesota began its 2020-21 season as the road team for the sixth straight season and for the 10th time in team history. The Wild began the season with a four-game road trip, the longest road trip to start a season in franchise history.
- The Wild posted a pair of five-game road point streaks, Feb. 28-March 1 and April 10-24.
- Minnesota scored four-plus goals in four of the last six games to rank T-6th in the NHL with a 3.67 goals/game road average since April 19.

## POWER PLAY

- Minnesota scored 19 power-play goals in its last 22 games, including a season-high four-game PPG streak April 1-7. The Wild led the NHL in PPG and ranked third in PPP (.31.7) since April 1.
- The Wild went 24-for-91 on the power play since March 10, ranking T-3rd in the NHL in PPG and fourth in PPP (.26.4).
- Minnesota netted 12 PPG in its last 12 games at Xcel Energy Center to rank T-1st in home PPG and rank third in PPP (.33.3) since April 5. The Wild had scored just one PPG in its first nine home games and collected 16 in its last 19 home games.
- The Wild netted seven PPG in the last 10 road games to rank third in the NHL in road PPP (.29.2) since April 1.
- Minnesota scored four PPG on April 7 – the 12th time in franchise history it has recorded four-plus PPG.

## LIGHTS OUT CAM

- Cam Talbot posted a seven-game road point streak (5-0-2) from March 29-April 23 with a 1.93 GAA and a .942 SV%. He ranked T-4th amongst NHL goalies in road wins since March 29.
- The backstop went 8-2-3 since April 7, ranking T-4th amongst NHL goalies in wins.
- He went 15-4-4 with a 2.53 GAA, a .918 SV% and two shutouts in his

last 23 starts. He ranked second amongst NHL goalies in saves (663) and shots against (722), T-3rd in wins and T-6th in shutouts since March 12. • He went 12-2-2 with a 2.50 GAA, a .912 SV% and two shutouts in 17 home starts this season and tied his career-best seven-game home win streak, Jan. 31-March 25.

• The 33-year-old made a career-high 50 saves on a career-high 55 shots faced March 18 at COL, tied for the most saves and shots faced by an NHL goaltender in a game this season.

## FINISH FLARE

- Kaapo Kahkonen won 16 games this season – the most wins by a Wild rookie goaltender in a season. He ranked T-3rd amongst NHL rookie goalies in wins and shutouts.
- Per NHL Stats, his nine-game win streak from Feb. 18-March 16 tied for the fifth-longest by an NHL rookie goalie.
- He made all 31 saves to earn his second career NHL shutout March 16 vs. ARI.
- The backstop stopped all 26 shots faced March 8 vs. VGK to earn his first career NHL shutout.
- He won five straight road wins Feb. 18-March 5. Per NHL Stats, the five-game road win streak is the longest win streak by a Wild rookie goalie.
- The Finnish native is the second Finland-born goaltender to backstop for Minnesota (Niklas Backstrom).

## KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov led the Wild in goals and points. Per NHL Stats, only three rookies since 1992-93 have led a team in points during the regular season, while helping them qualify for the playoffs: Auston Matthews (2016-17), Filip Forsberg (2014-15) and Trent Hunter (2003-04).
- He recorded a career-high, six-game point streak (5-5=10) from April 29-May 8. He also owned a four-game multi-point game streak, May 3-8, the longest by a Wild rookie in team history.

- Per NHL Stats, Kirill is the first Wild rookie to record three point streaks of five-or-more games in a single season. He is also the first NHL rookie to do so since Elias Pettersson (2018-19).
- He recorded 16 points (11-5=16) in his last 13 contests, ranking T-1st in the NHL in goals since April 17.
- He tallied 13 multi-point games this season – the most by a Wild rookie in a season.
- He became the eighth rookie in past 10 NHL seasons to tally his first 30 career regular-season points in 35 or fewer games.
- The 24-year-old set franchise rookie records for goals, PPG (8), EVG (19), assists (24), points and EVP (38).
- He led the Wild and NHL rookies in scoring this season. He also led NHL rookies in goals, EVG, PPG and shots on goal, ranked T-1st in OT goals, second in assists, EVP and PPP, T-3rd in plus/minus rating and T-4th in GWG (3).

- He netted his second OT winner May 7 vs. ANA – the most by a Wild rookie.
- Kaprizov recorded a Wild rookie franchise-best five-game goal streak, April 17-24.

- He registered three PPP (2-1=3) April 7 vs. COL to become the first Wild rookie to record three PPP in a game and the first to net two PPG in a game.
- The three-point night was the third of his career, the most by a Wild rookie in a season in team history (NHL Stats).
- The winger netted his first career NHL hat trick March 12 to become the second Wild rookie to do so (Justin Fontaine, 1/9/14). He also became the third Wild player to score all three goals in the same period: Parise, 3/24/16 (1st); Zucker, 11/9/17 (3rd).
- Tallied an assist on the OT goal at LA (1/16) to become the first player in NHL history to record OT points in first two games.
- Notched three points (1-2=3) including GWG in 4-3 OT win at LA (1/14) to become the third player in NHL history to score OT goal in debut. Three points are the most by a Wild player in debut.

## STRIKING FIRST

- Mats Zuccarello tallied six points (1-5=6) in his final six games.
- Seven of his 11 goals were the Wild's first goal of the game. He ranked T-2nd on the Wild with four first goals of the game this season.
- He tallied 13 points (5-8=13) in the last 15 games.
- The winger ranked T-2nd on the Wild in assists (24), third in scoring (35) and T-4th in goals.
- He recorded a pair of three-game goal streaks (April 14-17 and Feb. 20-

24) to tie his career best for the seventh time.

- Per NHL Stats, he became the sixth player in Wild history to score the team's opening goal in three consecutive games (2/20-2/24).
- He scored two PPG April 14 for his 17th career multi-goal game, first career contest with two PPG.
- He skated in his 600th career NHL game April 1 to become the 149th active skater since entering the League in 2010-11 to reach the milestone.
- His six-game assist streak from Feb. 18-27 was the longest by a Wild player and tied his career-best for the second time.
- He tied his career-high with four points (1-3=4) Feb. 20, last 10/7/17 (w/ NYR), to become the 10th player in Wild history to total four-or-more points in a game.

## FA-LA-FIALA

- Kevin Fiala tallied eight points (3-5=8) in his last six games, including a three-game multi-point streak April 29-May 3.
- He recorded six of his nine multi-point games in his last 15 contests.
- He reached 20-plus goals and 40-plus points in a season in back-to-back campaigns and for the third time in his career. He joins Timo Meier (3) and Nino Niederreiter (5) as the only Swiss natives to record 20-plus goals in three-or-more seasons in NHL history. He is the only Swiss-born to reach 40 points this season.
- The winger tallied 14 points (6-8=14) in his last 11 games and has 26 points (11-15=26) in the last 22 games.
- He recorded 11 power-play points (3-8=11) in his last 19 contests to rank T-5th in the NHL in PPP since April 1.
- He recorded a career-high four points (3-1=4), including his first career NHL hat trick and tied his career-best eight shots on April 7 vs. COL.
- His hat trick marked the 30th in franchise history, 15th at Xcel Energy Center. He became the second Swiss native to record a hat trick in a Wild sweater.
- The 24-year-old had a team-high seven-game point streak (5-6=11) from March 25-April 7, including a career-high four-game PPP streak (3-3=6).
- The winger led the Wild in GWG (5), PPP (14) and shots (162) and ranked second in goals, PPG (6) and scoring.

## OH MY JEE

- Joel Eriksson Ek collected two points May 7 (1-1=2) for his ninth career multi-point game, sixth this season. He tallied 10 points (6-4=10) in the last 14 games.
- He ranked third on the Wild and T-3rd amongst Swedish-born NHL skaters in goals this season. He also ranked third on the team in shots, fourth in plus/minus rating (+16) and fifth in points.
- He registered a career-high, seven-game point streak (4-3=7) from April 17-29, tying Fiala for longest point streak on the Wild this season.
- The 24-year-old scored two goals March 10 to set a career high in goals and earned his second career two-goal game.
- He tallied a career-high seven hits Feb. 16 at LA and ranked second on the Wild in hits (105).
- The Swedish native registered two points (1-1=2) Jan. 22 to record his second consecutive multi-point game. It marked the first time in his career he has posted back-to-back multi-point games.

## EASY PARISE

- Zach Parise is one goal shy of becoming the third player in franchise history to reach 200 goals (Gaborik, 219; Koivu, 205).
- His goal on April 17 vs. SJ marked his 400th career point with Minnesota to become the third player in franchise history to reach 400 points (Koivu, 709; Gaborik, 437).
- The winger tallied his 200th career assist in a Wild sweater April 7 vs. COL. He became the eighth player to reach the milestone in team history.
- He registered his 800th career NHL point Feb. 24 at COL to become the 21st active NHL skater (172nd overall), the 18th all-time U.S.-born skater and third Minnesota native to reach 800 career points.
- In his 16th NHL season, he is the active NHL leader in games played amongst Minnesota-born skaters (1,060).
- The Minneapolis native ranks third amongst active U.S.-born skaters in goals (393).

## BRODIN

- Jonas Brodin posted back-to-back multi-point games for the first time in his career and tied his career-best two-game goal streak for the second time, May 1-3.

• His goal on May 3 was his ninth of the season to surpass his previous career-high set in 79 games during the 2013-14 season. The goal was also his second GWG of the season to tie his career best for the third time (2016-17, 2018-19).

- The 27-year-old netted his first career OT goal Jan. 31 vs. COL to become the 14th defenseman in team history to record an OT goal.
- He led team defensemen in goals (T-7th among NHL defensemen) and ranked second in scoring and blocked shots (99) this season.
- Wild defensemen ranked T-1st in the NHL in GWG (6) by team blueliners this season.

## SURGING SPURGEON

- Jared Spurgeon recorded nine points (2-7=9) in his last 10 games played.
- The blueliner tallied 19 points (6-13=19) in his last 26 contests, including nine PPP (3-6=9). He led Minnesota defensemen in scoring and PPP this season.
- He tallied his 300th career point with an assist April 29 vs. STL to become the eighth player in team history to reach 300 points, second defenseman (Suter, 369).
- The Captain skated in his 700th career NHL game April 28 to become the third player in Wild history, second defenseman (Nick Schultz, 743) to reach the milestone. He became the 29th defenseman and 86th skater since entering the League in 2010 to reach 700 games.
- He collected a career-high three power-play assists April 7 vs. COL to become the fifth Wild defenseman in team history to record three PPP in a game.
- The third PPA marked his 100th career PPP to become the second defenseman in Wild history to reach the milestone (Suter, 138), seventh player all-time.
- He reached 200 career assists on Jan. 31 vs. COL to become the seventh player in team history, second defenseman, to reach the milestone.

## MOOSE TRACKINGS

- Marcus Foligno set career highs in points and plus/minus rating (+19) and tied his career best in goals this season.
- He led the Wild in hits (109), ranked T-2nd in PIM, third in plus/minus rating, T-4th in goals and fifth in EVG (10). He was one of two players to net a SHG.
- The Buffalo native recorded two season-high three-game point streaks, March 1-5 (3-3=6) and April 17-21 (1-2=3).
- He registered a season-high three points (2-1=3) March 1, all in the second period, to earn his fifth career three-point game, third with the Wild. The three points tied the franchise record for most points in a period.
- He netted the shorthanded GWG Feb. 24 at COL. The goal was his fifth career SHG, first in a Wild sweater. The goal was also his second career SH GWG, last, 1/25/14 (with Buffalo).
- The winger recorded his third career Gordie Howe Hat Trick, second with Minnesota on Feb. 22 at SJ.
- The 29-year-old posted back-to-back multi-point games for the second time in his career, Feb. 22-24. He collected six multi-point games this season, his most in a single season in his 10 NHL campaigns.

## NHL & WILD DEBUTS

- Kirill Kaprizov made his NHL debut at LA (1/14). He became the ninth rookie to record a goal in his NHL debut with the Wild.
- Calen Addison made his NHL debut at LA (2/16). He became the 88th player to make his NHL debut with the Wild, 30th defenseman.
- Nick Bjugstad (1/14), Nick Bonino (1/14), Ian Cole (1/20), Joseph Cramarossa (3/20), Marcus Johansson (1/14) and Dakota Mermis (2/16) each made their debuts with Minnesota this season.

# PLAYOFF NOTES

# COLORADO AVALANCHE



- The Minnesota Wild will make its 11th playoff appearance in team history, its eighth in the last nine seasons. The Wild is one of four NHL teams to have appeared in the postseason eight times in the last nine seasons: Pittsburgh, St. Louis, Washington.
- The Wild will look to become the first expansion franchise from either the NHL, NBA, NFL or MLB to play its inaugural season in the 2000s or later and win a championship.
- Minnesota made a franchise record six consecutive playoff appearances from 2013-18, joining Anaheim and Pittsburgh as the only teams to make the playoffs in each of those seasons.
- The Wild fell to Vancouver, 3-1, in the 2020 Qualifying Round, facing the Canucks for the second time in the Stanley Cup Playoffs – first since the 2003 Western Conference Semifinal. The series marked Minnesota's first-ever, best-of-five playoff series.
- Minnesota lost to Winnipeg 4-1 in the 2018 Western Conference Quarterfinal, facing the Jets for the first time in the Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- The Wild fell 4-1 against St. Louis in the 2017 Western Conference Quarterfinal, facing the Blues for the second time in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The series also marked the third time Minnesota began a playoff series at Xcel Energy Center, the first since the 2008 Western Conference Quarterfinal. The Wild topped St. Louis in the 2015 Western Conference Quarterfinal, clinching the series victory with a Game 6 win in Saint Paul – marking the first time in franchise history Minnesota earned a playoff series win on home ice or before a deciding seventh game.
- Minnesota faced the Dallas Stars in the 2016 Western Conference Quarterfinal. It marked the first time the Wild faced the Stars in the playoffs and the fourth straight postseason Minnesota played the Central Division champion in the opening round. The Wild fell 4-2 in the series.
- Minnesota advanced to the 2014 Western Conference Semifinal for the first time since 2003 after winning its quarterfinal series, 4-3, over Colorado. In its semifinal series, Minnesota fell to Chicago, 4-2.
- With a 5-4 overtime victory in Game 7 of the 2014 Western Conference Quarterfinal series at Colorado (4/30/14), Minnesota became the first team in NHL history to record four tying goals in a Game 7 (Elias Sports Bureau).
- The Wild advanced to the 2003 Western Conference Final in its first playoff appearance after winning its quarterfinal series, 4-3, over Colorado and its semifinal series, 4-3, over Vancouver – Minnesota was swept by Anaheim in four games in the Conference Final.
- Of the 22 players that finished the regular season on the Wild's main roster, eight have not appeared in a Stanley Cup Playoff Game with Minnesota: **Nick Bjugstad, Nick Bonino, Ian Cole, Marcus Johansson, Kaapo Kahkonen, Kirill Kaprizov, Victor Rask and Cam Talbot**. Three players have not appeared in a Stanley Cup Playoff Game: Kahkonen, Kaprizov and Rask.
- Nick Bonino** and **Ian Cole** are the only Wild players that have won the Stanley Cup – both with the Pittsburgh Penguins in 2016 and 2017. **Zach Parise** lost to Los Angeles in the 2012 Stanley Cup Final with the New Jersey Devils. **Marcus Johansson** fell in the 2019 Stanley Cup Final to the St. Louis Blues with the Boston Bruins and **Mats Zuccarello** lost to Los Angeles in the 2014 Stanley Cup Final with the New York Rangers.
- Nick Bonino** ranks second on the Wild in career playoff games and points. He ranks T-4th amongst active U.S.-born NHL skaters in playoff GWG, T-7th in playoff games, 12th in scoring, T-12th in goals and 13th in assists since entering the League in 2010. He collected a career-high 18 points (4-14=18) in 24 playoff games with Pittsburgh during the 2016 Stanley Cup Playoffs, leading the Penguins in assists, T-2nd in GWG and T-3rd in scoring.
- Jonas Brodin** ranks T-1st in playoff games, second in blocked shots, third in assists and scoring amongst team defensemen. He registered his first career Stanley Cup Playoff goal and multi-point game (1-1=2) in Game 6 vs. DAL (4/24/16, Lehtonen).
- Jordan Greenway** and **Nico Sturm** each recorded their first NHL goals in the playoffs. Greenway scored in Game 3 of the 2018 Western Conference Quarterfinal vs. WPG (4/15/18, Hellebuyck) to become the first player in franchise history to score his first NHL goal in the playoffs. Sturm scored in Game 4 of the 2020 Qualifying Round series vs. VAN (8/7/20, Markstrom) to become the second player in franchise history to do so.
- Zach Parise** leads Minnesota with 77 career playoff points (35-42=77) in 101 games, skating in the postseason in 12 of his 15 NHL seasons. He ranks first in franchise history in playoff goals, PPG, assists and scoring and ranks second in shots on goal. The winger also leads all active Minnesota-born players in playoff scoring, goals, PPG, assists and shots on goal, ranks T-2nd in GWG and fourth in games played. He set a playoff career high and Wild playoff single-game record with four points (2-2=4) in Game 6 vs. Colorado (4/28/14), also setting a franchise record for fastest goal to start a playoff game, scoring 49 seconds into the contest.
- Jared Spurgeon** is the franchise's all-time leader in goals, PPG, scoring and blocked shots, ranks T-1st in games played and second in assists amongst team defensemen in the playoffs. He registered a career-high three points in Game 1 of the 2020 Qualifying Round vs. VAN (8/8/20) and set a franchise record for most points in a playoff game by a Wild defenseman.
- Ryan Suter** had a career-best seven points (1-6=7) during the 2014 postseason and his six assists set a franchise record for most assists in a single postseason by a defenseman. Suter ranks first in franchise history and fourth amongst active NHL defensemen in TOI/game. He ranks first amongst team defensemen in assists, shots on goal and hits, second in scoring and third in blocked shots and games played in playoffs.
- Cam Talbot** holds an all-time record of 12-11 in the postseason. He ranked T-2nd in the NHL in shutouts during the 2020 playoffs. He made 57 saves in Game 4 of Western Conference Quarterfinal vs. DAL (8/16/20) – the second-most saves in a playoff game in Flames' franchise history.
- Mats Zuccarello** is making his ninth career Stanley Cup playoff appearance and ranks third on the Wild roster in career playoff points. He set a career-high 13 points (5-8=13) in 25 games during the 2014 Stanley Cup Playoffs with the New York Rangers.

#### SERIES NOTES

After an unprecedented season, the Minnesota Wild advanced to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for its 10th time in franchise history. The NHL split the 24 teams into two bubbles without fans – Edmonton (West) and Toronto (East). The Wild faced off against Vancouver in the Stanley Cup Qualifying Round to play in its first-ever, best-of-five playoff series. Minnesota took Game 1 with a 3-0 shutout victory. It marked the Wild's fifth postseason shutout victory in franchise history. Jared Stalock made his first career playoff start in a Wild sweater and earned his first career postseason win and shutout stopping all 28 shots faced. Jared Spurgeon tallied a postseason career-high three points (2-1=3) to set a franchise record for most points in a playoff game by a Wild defenseman. His two goal made him the franchise leader for most playoff goals by a Wild blueliner. Kevin Fiala netted the game-winning goal on the power-play in the first period. Minnesota fell in Game 2 of the series, 4-3. Kevin Fiala scored two goals in a span of 2:20 in the third period for his first career multi-goal playoff game. Luke Kunin netted his first career playoff goal shorthanded to become the seventh player in franchise history to record a postseason SHG and the 11th player to score his first career regular season and first playoff goal shorthanded. Zach Parise tallied two assists to surpass Mikko Koivu for first place in playoff assists in team history. Vancouver earned a 3-0 shutout win in Game 3 to take the series lead, 2-1. The Canucks were the first to break the 0-0 score as Brock Boeser potted the power-play, game-winning goal at 13:49 in the second period. Zach Parise skated in his 100th career Stanley Cup Playoff contest. Minnesota lost the series as Vancouver took Game 4 with a 5-4 overtime win. Kunin opened the game's scoring with his first career playoff power-play goal at 2:58 in the first period. The Wild held a 3-1 lead before the Canucks' Brandon Sutter and Quinn Hughes each netted goals in a span of 1:24 in the second period to tie the game. Nico Sturm made his playoff debut in Game 3 and scored his first career NHL goal in Game 4. He became the second player in Wild history to score his first NHL goal in the playoffs. Bo Horvat forced the overtime with his goal at 14:14 of the third period. Christopher Tanev netted the overtime winner just 11 seconds into the extra session. Eric Staal led the Wild with five points (1-4=5) in four games and Fiala (3-1=4) and Spurgeon (2-2=4) ranked tied for second with four points each. Stalock stopped 104-of-116 shots faced for a 3.03 GAA, a .897 SV% and one shutout. Hughes led the Canucks with six points (1-5=6). Horvat (2-2=4), Elias Pettersson (1-3=4) and Tanev (1-3=4) each tallied four points. Jacob Markstrom stopped 112-of-121 shots faced for a 2.27 GAA, a .926 SV% and one shutout in four starts.

#### SERIES NOTES

The Wild extended its franchise record streak by advancing to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the sixth consecutive season as Minnesota and Winnipeg met for the first time in the postseason. Minnesota was one of three NHL teams to make the playoffs in each of the last six seasons, joining Anaheim and Pittsburgh (2013-18). The Wild took a 2-1 lead early in the third period of Game 1 on goals from Matt Cullen and Zach Parise, but the Jets responded with third period goals from Patrik Laine and Joe Morrow to claim a 3-2 win. Winnipeg scored the first four goals in Game 2 to claim a 4-1 win. Parise scored for Minnesota in the third period and the teams combined for 76 PIM in the third period. Six different players scored for the Wild in Game 3 to lead the team to a 6-2 win at Xcel Energy Center. Blake Wheeler opened the scoring before Minnesota responded with three straight goals. Parise scored a goal for the third consecutive game, but suffered a fractured sternum in Game 3 and missed the remainder of the series. Mark Scheifele scored both goals in the Jets 2-0 victory in Game 4, tallying a PPG with 28 seconds remaining in the first period and an empty-net tally with 12 seconds remaining in the contest. The Jets scored four times in the first period of Game 5 and earned a 5-0 series-clinching win. Winnipeg outshot Minnesota, 169-126, in the series and both teams went 3-for-13 on the power play. Mikko Koivu led the Wild in scoring with four assists. Parise (3-0=0) and Mikael Granlund (1-2=3) recorded three points each. Devan Dubnyk stopped 138-of-152 shots faced for a 3.39 GAA and a .908 SV%. Scheifele (4-1=5) and Dustin Byfuglien (0-5=5) led the Jets in scoring with five points each. Laine (2-2=4), Paul Stastny (1-3=4) and Wheeler (1-3=4) added four points each. Connor Hellebuyck stopped 110-of-119 shots faced for a 1.94 GAA, a .924 SV% and two shutouts in the series.

## SERIES NOTES

The Wild advanced to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the fifth consecutive year. Minnesota and St. Louis met for the second time in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Wild defeated St. Louis in six games in the first round of the 2015 Stanley Cup Playoffs. The Wild began a series at Xcel Energy Center for the third time in franchise history, the first since the 2008 Western Conference Quarterfinal. Minnesota registered 52 shots on goal in Game 1 – the most shots on goal during any game in team history, regular-season or playoffs – but Joel Edmundson scored 17:48 into overtime to lift the Blues to a 2-1 OT victory in Saint Paul. Jaden Schwartz scored with 2:27 left in regulation to lead the Blues to a 2-1 victory in Game 2. The series shifted to St. Louis in Game 3, where Alexander Steen secured the 3-1 win with an empty-net goal for the Blues. Devan Dubnyk posted a 28-save shutout as the Wild claimed a 2-0 Game 4 victory. The series ended after Magnus Paajarvi scored 9:42 into overtime to lift the Blues to a 4-3 overtime win in Game 5 at Xcel Energy Center. The Wild outshot the Blues in the series, 182-134. Minnesota killed 14-of-15 power-play opportunities in the series, while scoring three goals on 18 power-play chances. Jake Allen allowed eight goals in five games, recording a 1.47 GAA and .956 SV%, while Devan Dubnyk registered a 1.86 GAA and a .925 SV%. Jaden Schwartz led the series with five points (2-3=5), while Alexander Steen posted four points (2-2=4). Zach Parise (2-1=3) and Ryan Suter (1-2=3) led the Wild in scoring, while Parise and Charlie Coyle led the team with two goals each.

#### SERIES NOTES

Minnesota faced the Dallas Stars for the first time in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. The meeting marked the fourth straight postseason Minnesota played the Central Division champion in the opening round. After posting a shutout win in Game 1 and extending its series lead to 2-0 after the first pair of games in Dallas, the Stars scored twice in the first 4:10 of Game 3 in Saint Paul before Minnesota earned a comeback victory. Dallas claimed a Game 4 win in Minnesota before Mikko Koivu scored an overtime goal to help Minnesota to a Game 5 victory in Dallas. The Stars opened Game 6 with four goals before Minnesota scored four times in the third period, but Alex Goligoski's marker served as the series-winner in Saint Paul. Jason Pominville led Minnesota in points and tied for the series lead in goals (4-3-7), including a three-point performance (2-1-3) in the Game 3 victory. Nino Niederreiter led the Wild in assists and ranked second on the club with six points (1-5-6) – all tallied in a four-game streak to end the series. Devan Dubnyk set the Wild franchise record for all-time playoff games and starts with his 12th contest in Game 2 before stopping a career-high 37 shots on a career-high 41 shots faced in Game 5 – becoming Minnesota's franchise record holder for most career playoff wins with his sixth victory. Jamie Benn led the series in points and assists (4-6-10) and tied for most goals alongside his teammate Jason Spezza, who ranked second in the series with nine points (4-5-9). Kari Lehtonen led Dallas with a 3-1 record in four games played, including the series-clinching Game 6 victory, while Antti Niemi posted a 1-1 record after starting Games 4 and 5.

## SERIES NOTES

For the first time in franchise history, Minnesota clinched a playoff series with a home-ice victory, defeating the St. Louis Blues in Game 6 of the first-round series at Xcel Energy Center. The win also marked the first time Minnesota won a playoff series in fewer than seven games, with its three previous series-clinching victories coming on the road in a Game 7. Zach Parise led the Wild with seven points (3-4-7) in the series, while his linemates Jason Pominville (2-3-5) and Mikael Granlund (1-4-5) ranked T-2nd with five points each. Nino Niederreiter scored three goals in the series to tie Parise for the team lead and ranked fourth on the Wild with four points during the series. Niederreiter scored the winner in Game 5 to become the Wild's all-time leader in playoff GWG (3). In his first NHL postseason, Devan Dubnyk recorded a 2.32 GAA and .913 SV% while going 4-2 in the series, including a 17-save shutout in Game 3. Over the six-game series, the Wild posted a 33.3 percent success rating on the power play (4-of-12) and added one shorthanded goal (Parise). St. Louis defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk led the series with eight points (0-8=8), while Vladimir Tarasenko totaled seven points (6-1-7), including a Game 2 hat trick. Jake Allen went 2-4 for the Blues, posting a 2.20 GAA and a .904 SV%. The Wild led the Blues in both hits (149 to 134) and blocked shots (102 to 79) in the series.

## SERIES NOTES

Corey Crawford went 4-0 in net, posting a 1.75 GAA and a .947 SV% during the series, including a 30-save shutout in Game 3. Minnesota outlasted Chicago, 122-90, while each team registered 54 blocked shots in the series.

#### SERIES NOTES

With a 5-4 overtime victory in Game 7, the Wild became the first team in NHL history to record four score-tying goals in a Game 7 (Elias Sports Bureau). Nino Niederreiter scored two goals, including the winner 5:02 into overtime, and added an assist in Game 7 – the fourth-youngest player to ever net a total three points in a Game 7. Zach Parise led the Wild with 10 points (3-7=10) against the Avalanche, a career high for points in a series. He set a playoff career high and a Wild playoff single-game record with four points (2-2=4) in Game 6. Parise also set a franchise record for fastest goal to start a playoff game, scoring 49 seconds into Game 6 and tallied the game winner. Before being held pointless in Game 7, he had a career-best six-game playoff point streak. Darcy Kuemper went 3-1 in five starts posting a 2.03 GAA and a .913 SV%. Ilya Bryzgalov went 1-2 in two starts with a 3.72 GAA and a 4.25 GAA. Bryzgalov earned the Game 7 win by stopping the only shot he faced (in overtime) in relief of Kuemper, who left the game with 8:13 left in regulation. Kuemper stopped all 22 shots in Game 3 to become the first Wild goalie to record a playoff shutout. Mikael Granlund earned his first career playoff point by scoring the overtime winner in Game 3, becoming only the fifth NHL player in the last 75 years to score his first career playoff goal in a 1-0 overtime game. Nathan MacKinnon (2-8=10) and Paul Stastny (5-5=10) led the Avalanche in scoring with 10 points each. Semyon Varlamov posted a 2.78 GAA and a .913 SV% in seven starts. The Wild outshot the Avalanche 233-174 and outhit Colorado 194-188 in the series.



Brian Rolston led the team in points (2-4-6) and assists. Mikko Koivu led the team in goals with four and tied a franchise record by scoring in four consecutive games to start the series (4/9-4/15). Niklas Backstrom started all six games for the Wild and went 2-4 with a 2.82 GAA and a .900 SV%. For Colorado, Jose Theodore stopped 188-of-200 shots faced (.940 SV%), a franchise record for saves by an opposing goaltender in a series besting Patrick Roy's mark in 2003 of 161 saves. Joe Sakic led the Avalanche with six points (2-4-6) against the Wild. Andrew Brunette's three goals led Colorado and Sakic and Peter Forsberg both notched four assists to lead the Avs. The first three games of the series went to overtime, continuing a streak from 2003 that saw the final two games of Western Conference Quarterfinal between these two teams go to overtime. All five games had 3-2 final scores. The Wild set playoff franchise records with 101 PIM, 25 penalties taken and 13 short-handed opportunities in a 5-1 loss in Game 4 at the Pepsi Center. The Wild lost Game 5 despite setting a franchise record for shots in a period with 17 in the first stanza and totaling 40 shots overall (which tied a franchise record). In Game 6, Aaron Voros tallied his first career playoff goal to tie the score in the second period but the Avs won 2-1 to take the series.

The Wild fell in five games to the Anaheim Ducks in the Western Conference Quarterfinal series. It was the second all-time postseason appearance for Minnesota. Wild goaltender Niklas Backstrom went 1-4 in his first Stanley Cup Playoffs, posting a 2.22 GAA and a .924 SV%. Marian Gaborik and Pavol Demitra each paced the Wild with four points apiece. #### SERIES NOTES

The Minnesota Wild, in its first-ever playoff series, made NHL history. The club became only the eighth team in NHL history to win the first playoff series it competed in. Minnesota also became only the eighth NHL team to come back from a 3-1 deficit and win Games 5 and 7 on the road. Andrew Brunette scored the series-clinching goal, beating Patrick Roy, at 3:25 of overtime in Game 7 at Pepsi Center. Manny Fernandez started and won the final three games of the series. Overall, the netminder was 3-0 and stopped 107 of 114 shots faced in four games played. Brunette (3-3=6), Marian Gaborik (4-2=6) and Sergei Zholtok (0-6=6) finished tied for the team lead in scoring with six points in seven games versus Colorado. The Wild earned a victory in the franchise's first-ever playoff game with a 4-2 win over Colorado in Game 1 at Pepsi Center. Filip Kuba scored the club's first playoff goal and Dwayne Roloson earned the first playoff win in net. The Avalanche rebounded to win the following three games, including two in Saint Paul, and took a commanding 3-1 series advantage. In the first playoff game at Xcel Energy Center, Minnesota fell to Colorado, 3-0. Roy posted his NHL playoff-record 23rd shutout in the win. Facing elimination on the road in Game 5, the Wild raced to a 3-0 second period lead and forced Game 6 back in Minnesota with a 3-2 victory. The Wild earned its first home playoff win and first overtime playoff victory, 3-2, in Game 6 at Xcel Energy Center. Richard Park scored the game-winning goal at 4:22 of the extra session. The tally was his second of the game, marking the franchise's first-ever two-goal playoff game and set the stage for Minnesota's historic Game 7 victory.

# PLAYOFF RECORD BOOK



## SERIES NOTES

For the second straight series, the Minnesota Wild overcame a 3-games-to-1 deficit, this time defeating the Vancouver Canucks in a Western Conference Semifinal series, 4-3. The Wild became the first team in NHL history to come back from a 3-1 deficit twice in the same postseason and also became only the second club ever to win two Game 7's on the road in the same playoff year. The win also raised the team's record to 6-0 in its first six "elimination games." Minnesota outscored the Canucks 16-5 over the final three games of the series. Marian Gaborik led all scorers with five goals and 11 points (5-6-11) in seven games. Wes Walz tied for the team lead in goals with five and finished the seven-game series with nine points (5-4-9). Dwayne Roloson won Games 5, 6 and 7 and finished the series with a 4-1 record and only seven goals allowed in 130 shots faced. Minnesota battled back from a 2-0 second period hole to earn a 4-2 win over Vancouver in Game 7 at GM Place, Darby Hendrickson scored the game-winning goal with just under six minutes to play as the Wild earned its first-ever trip to the Western Conference Final. The two teams split the first two games of the series at GM Place with the Canucks winning Game 1, 4-3 in overtime, and the Wild capturing Game 2, 3-2. Vancouver seized control of the series with two road wins at Xcel Energy Center, including a 3-2 overtime victory in Game 4. Minnesota staved off elimination thanks to five second-period goals and a 7-2 road win in Game 5. The Wild scored five more goals in a 5-1 Game 6 victory at Xcel Energy Center. Gaborik posted his third consecutive multi-point game (0-2=2) and Andrew Brunette scored a pair of goals to set up another historic Game 7 showdown.

## SERIES NOTES

The Wild fell in four games to the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim during the club's first-ever appearance in the Western Conference Final. Ducks goaltender J.S. Giguere posted a 4-0 mark in the series, turned aside 122-of-123 shots faced and recorded a 212:43 shutout streak. Minnesota's season came to an end with a 2-1 defeat in Game 4 at Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim. Andrew Brunette netted the Wild's lone goal of the series and staked the team to a 1-0 advantage in its seventh "elimination game" of the post season. The Ducks answered with a pair of goals from Adam Oates to clinch the Western Conference crown. The Wild lost its home-ice advantage in the series when it dropped Game 1 at Xcel Energy Center, 1-0, in double overtime. The game marked the franchise's first-ever, double-overtime Stanley Cup Playoff game. Minnesota was shutout in back-to-back games for the first time in its playoff history when it dropped Game 2 to Anaheim, 2-0, in Saint Paul. Both Mighty Ducks goals were shorthanded and Giguere ran his playoff scoreless streak to 148:06 with the win. The Wild fell behind 3-0 in the series when it lost Game 3 in Anaheim, 4-0.


