

BILL FOLEY Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and Governor

Bill Foley knew that bringing an NHL franchise to Las Vegas was not going to be an easy task, but his persistence paid off on June 22, 2016. While that day will go down in history as the first day a major professional team entered the market, it would not have happened without the hard work from Foley and the people he surrounded himself with.

In the years leading up to the Board of Governor's announcement of the NHL's 31st franchise, Foley, the Vegas Golden Knights Chairman and CEO, was busy engaging the fan base and aligning himself with prominent people in the community. In early 2014, he entered an agreement with the Maloof family to pursue an NHL franchise in Las Vegas. At the end of 2014, the NHL granted Foley permission to gauge fan interest in Las Vegas.

On February 15, 2015, Foley and the Maloofs launched the "Vegas Wants Hockey" season ticket drive with the goal of 10,000 season tickets sold. They received more than 5,000 ticket deposits on the first day and about a month later, they reached their goal. In June, the NHL officially announced they would accept applications for expansion. Less than a month later Foley had submitted his application. He would spend the next 11 months meeting with NHL

officials and governors on why Las Vegas was a good fit.

After expansion was announced, Foley went to work putting together his team. He named George McPhee the team's first General Manager on July 13, 2016 and the hockey operations staff started to take form. On October 3, 2016, Kerry Bubolz was named the team's first President and the business side of the team started to develop. The official team name, the Vegas Golden Knights, was announced on November 22, 2016, in front of thousands of fans in Toshiba Plaza in front of T-Mobile Arena.

Foley sat in on many meetings leading up to the Expansion Draft and on June 21, alongside McPhee, Foley announced picks at the NHL Awards Show in front of more than 10,000 fans at T-Mobile Arena.

In their inaugural season, the Golden Knights finished with a 51-24-7 overall record, won the Pacific Division and advanced to the Stanley Cup Final. Vegas became the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division.

Foley is the founder and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Fidelity National Financial Corporation (NYSE: FNF), a publicly traded Fortune 500 Company. A provider of title insurance, specialty insurance and claims management services, FNF was selected in 2004 by Forbes as one of the "26 Best Managed Companies in the U.S." and has repeatedly been named to Fortune's list of America's Most Admired Companies, Forbes' list of America's Best Big Companies and selected for Barron's list of Best Companies for Investors.

After receiving his B.S. degree in engineering from the United States Military Academy at West Point, Foley served in the U.S. Air Force, where he attained the rank of captain. He received an M.B.A. degree from Seattle University and earned his J.D. degree in 1974 from the University of Washington School of Law. From 1974 to 1984, Foley practiced law in Phoenix and focused primarily on corporate and real estate law. Following his legal tenure, Foley became affiliated with FNF. Through strategic acquisitions, Foley led FNF to become one of the largest title insurance companies in the nation, as well as to diversify into information services through the 2003 acquisition of ALLTEL Information Services, now Lender Processing Services (NYSE: LPS).

Foley devotes time to many educational and community organizations. In 1997, he was chosen as Orange County, California's Business Person of the Year, honored with the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation's Semper Fidelis award and inducted into the Florida Council of Economic Education's First Coast Business Hall of Fame in 2006.

Foley and his wife, Carol, are active philanthropists for many causes, especially those in support of children's education. Foley has served as a trustee on the boards of the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce and the Cummer Museum of Art & Gardens. He also serves on the board of the Folded Flag Foundation, and their mission is to provide educational scholarships and support grants to the spouses and children of the United States military and government personnel who died as a result of hostile action or in an accident related to U.S. combat operations. Foley's additional professional directorships include Winter Sports, Inc.; Ceridian Corporation; and Fidelity Newport Holdings, LLC.

In addition to his numerous professional and philanthropic commitments, Foley is an accomplished golfer, ranked in 2004 by Golf Digest as one of the top five executive golfers in the world. Foley enjoys his time as a vintner and is the founder and managing partner of Foley Family Wines, headquartered in Sonoma, Calif. Foley also formed and serves as Chairman of Glacier Restaurant Group, LLC, the largest restaurant business headquartered in Montana. He is the developer of Rock Creek Cattle Company, a 40,000-acre working Montana ranch, featuring a high-end golf community with diverse homesteads, a well-appointed lodge for recreation and dining and an exceptional golf course designed by Tom Doak.



TEAM MANAGEMENT



GEORGE McPHEE

President of Hockey Operations, Alternate Governor

On July 13, 2016, George McPhee became the first-ever President of Hockey Operations and General Manager of the Vegas Golden Knights. On September 1, 2019, McPhee retained the President of Hockey Operations when he promoted Kelly McCrimmon to the team's General Manager.

In his current role, McPhee oversees the team's day-to-day hockey operations including development, with an emphasis on scouting, drafting and overseeing the coaching staff. He has created a team-first culture in his short time with the franchise and has hired staff around him who share that philosophy.

The team's third season saw the Golden Knights post a 39-24-8 record (86points) and capture its second Pacific Division title in three years following a shortened regular season. The team advanced to the Western Conference Final, where Vegas fell to the Dallas Stars in five games.

During the team's second season, the Golden Knights posted a 43-32-7 record (93 points) and finished third in the Pacific Division. In the opening round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Vegas fell to the San Jose Sharks in seven games.

Under McPhee's guidance, the Golden Knights became the first expansion team to start their inaugural season 3-0. The Golden Knights continued their strong play in October, starting with an 8-1 record, despite losing multiple goaltenders to injury.

The Vegas Golden Knights finished their unprecedented inaugural season with a 51-24-7 record (109 points) and the Pacific Division title, becoming the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division.

For his efforts, McPhee was named the General Manager of the Year during the NHL Awards show on June 20, 2018. It was his first GM Award in his second appearance as a finalist, having finished as a runner-up in 2009-10 with the Washington Capitals.

Prior to the season, McPhee was tasked with putting together a competitive team in the short-term but also building for long-term success. Contributing to both of those goals was a successful Expansion Draft. The Expansion Draft was not the only place where McPhee and his staff were successful. Through the expansion process, the Golden Knights made agreements with other teams and benefited by having three first-round draft picks in the 2017 NHL Entry Draft and 13 overall picks in the draft. The team ended up making 12 selections, the most of any team in the 2017 draft.

McPhee joined the Golden Knights after most serving as a Special Advisor to New York Islanders General Manager Garth Snow in 2015.

Prior to his time with the Islanders, McPhee served as Vice President and General Manager of the Washington Capitals for 17 seasons. Under his guidance, the Capitals grew from a lottery team to a perennial contender with multiple Southeast Division championships and the team captured the Presidents' Trophy in 2009-10.

The Capitals reached the playoffs 10 times during McPhee's tenure in Washington, including six straight seasons from 2007-08 to 2012-13. Under his leadership, the team claimed seven Southeast Division titles and he oversaw the Capitals first trip to the Stanley Cup Final in 1997-98, McPhee's first season with the franchise.

McPhee also saw success through the draft while with Washington as the team held 15 first-round draft picks from 2004-13, the most of any NHL team. His most notable selection was the No. 1 overall pick in 2004, Alex Ovechkin, the league's only active three-time MVP. Prospects flourished under McPhee's direction as the Capitals affiliate of the American Hockey League, the Hershey Bears, were Calder Cup champions in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Prior to his time in Washington, McPhee spent five seasons as the Vice President and Director of Hockey Operations as well as alternate governor for the Vancouver Canucks, assisting then General Manager Pat Quinn with all hockey-related matters. In his time with the Canucks, the team enjoyed four trips to the playoffs, a division championship and a trip to the 1994 Stanley Cup Final.

McPhee began his playing career in his hometown of Guelph, Ont., with the Ontario Junior Hockey League's Guelph Platers, leading them to the 1978 Centennial Cup, Canada's Tier II championship. Following his stint with the Platers, McPhee attended Bowling Green State University of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, where he became one of college hockey's most decorated players. A four-year letterwinner from 1978-82, he was the recipient of the 1982 Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given to the top player in college hockey. His other accolades included a first-team All-CCHA selection in 1982, second-team All-CCHA honors in 1979 and 1981 and his selection as the CCHA's Rookie of the Year in 1979. Earning a degree in business, he became the first player to be named to the CCHA All-Academic Team in three consecutive seasons.

Upon the completion of his college career, McPhee signed as a free agent with the New York Rangers and started his NHL career during the 1982 Stanley Cup playoffs. Following his seven seasons with the Rangers and New Jersey Devils, McPhee earned his law degree from Rutgers University in 1992.

McPhee and his wife, Leah, have two daughters, Grayson and Adelaide, and one son, Graham, who was drafted by the Edmonton Oilers in the fifth round of the 2016 NHL Entry Draft.

KERRY BUBOLZ

President, Chief Operating Officer, Alternate Governor

On October 3, 2016, Vegas Golden Knights Chairman and owner Bill Foley announced Kerry Bubolz as the first President and Chief Operating Officer of the Golden Knights. In his role, Bubolz oversees all business aspects of the franchise.

Bubolz is in his third season with the Golden Knights after leading the organization to tremendously successful first two campaigns. The Golden Knights continued to exceed expectations in their second season, averaging 105.5% capacity at T-Mobile Arena while also achieving a top 5 ranking in the NHL in team allocated sponsorship revenue, ticket sales and merchandise sales.

Bubolz was also instrumental in negotiating the franchise's television deal with Root Sports (now AT&T Sportsnet), broadcasting VGK games not only locally in Las Vegas but extending throughout the Western Rockies region through Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Wyoming, Montana and parts of California and Arizona. In only their second year, the Golden Knights ranked 3rd in the NHL's U.S. markets with a 4.2 average household rating for the 18-19 regular season. For the

2019-2020 preseason, the Golden Knights made their television broadcasts even more accessible to fans through partnerships with KTNV, Nevada Sports Network, and KJZZ, allowing the games to be seen in Las Vegas, Reno, and Salt Lake City.

The organization also captured national attention with their best-in-class game presentation putting on a show for both Golden Knights fans, and NHL fans. Players across the league have taken notice of the incredible atmosphere at Golden Knights games, as T-Mobile Arena was voted "Best Atmosphere in the NHL" by the players in a recent NHL Players' Association Poll. Bubolz's steady leadership ultimately led to the organization winning the Sports Business Journal's prestigious Sports Team of the Year Award for the 2017-2018 season, as well as the National Hockey League's "Commissioner Award for Business Excellence" for the inaugural season. The Golden Knights continued to earn recognition in their second season by winning the NHL Business Awards Stanley for best in class social media content.

Bubolz has also instilled a commitment to community outreach and service in the franchise through the organization's various charitable initiatives. The Golden Knights Foundation serves as the primary charitable link between the team and the Las Vegas community focusing on five pillars including, fighting hunger and homelessness in Las Vegas, securing the future of Las Vegas military, first responders and their families, and fostering physical, social and emotional growth of Las Vegas youth. The Golden Knights Foundation has been supported by the 51/49 raffle, which has raised more than \$2,500,000 during the team's first two seasons. Bubolz's commitment to community and growing the sport of hockey in Southern Nevada is evidenced by the team's hockey development programs, including the "Golden Knights Hockey Academy" which reaches over 200,000 children in Clark County middle and elementary schools.

Prior to joining the Golden Knights, Bubolz spent 13 years with the National Basketball Association's Cleveland Cavaliers. In 2013, he was named President, Business Operations where he oversaw ticketing and suite sales, corporate sponsorship revenue, broadcast, marketing, communications and community engagement for the franchise. In Bubolz's time with the Cavaliers, the team won the Eastern Conference Championship three times and won the NBA championship in 2016. The Cavaliers were consistently recognized by the NBA during their annual Sales & Marketing awards ceremonies as a top performing team in all key business metrics.

In addition to overseeing Cavaliers business operations, Bubolz also served as President and Alternate Governor for all franchise property teams owned by the Cavaliers Operating Company, including the Lake Erie Monsters of the American Hockey League. In 2016, the Monsters won the Calder Cup and finished third in league average attendance with 8,596 fans per-game. He was also President and Chief Operating Officer of the Cleveland Lumberjacks of the International Hockey League from 1994 to 2000.

The Tulsa, Oklahoma native also brings an abundance of National Hockey League experience to Las Vegas. He served as vice president of sales for the Carolina Hurricanes and the Dallas Stars prior to joining the Cavaliers.

Bubolz graduated from Oklahoma State University with a Bachelors' Degree in marketing in 1989. He and his wife, Melissa, live in Summerlin and have two daughters, Madison and Emma.





KELLY McCRIMMON General Manager

On September 1, 2019, **Kelly McCrimmon** took over the General Manager duties for the Vegas Golden Knights. He originally came to Las Vegas as one of **George McPhee**'s first appointments and was instrumental in the development of the front office staff, roster and culture for the organization during the first three years with the team.

McCrimmon joined the organization after serving as Owner, Governor, General Manager and Head Coach of the Western Hockey League's Brandon Wheat Kings and has been with the organization since 1988-89. McCrimmon served as Head Coach from 2004-11, and 2013-16. He has helped the Wheat Kings to five Memorial Cup appearances, once as a player (1979), three times as General Manager (1995, 1996, 2016) and twice as Head Coach and General Manager (2010, 2016).

Under McCrimmon's guidance, the Wheat Kings have captured 10 Eastern Division pennants and six Eastern Conference Championships. He was named WHL Executive of the Year in 1994-95, 2009-10, 2014-15, and received the Canadian Hockey League Executive of the Year award in 2009-10.

Since the 1992-93 campaign, when the Wheat Kings established a CHL record that still stands for the biggest single-season improvement of 62 points, the club has won more games than any other team in the CHL and has made the playoffs 22 of the last 24 seasons.

McCrimmon is the Wheat Kings All-Time winningest coach, having won over 400 games behind Brandon's bench. He purchased one-third ownership of the Wheat Kings from partner Bob Cornell in 1992, and assumed sole ownership in 2000. A member of the WHL's Board of Governors, McCrimmon also served as Chairman of the league's Competition Committee.

The Plenty, Saskatchewan, native played two seasons in Brandon in the late seventies and was a member of the 1979 WHL Championship club before moving on to the University of Michigan from 1980-84, serving as team captain his senior year. He will continue to serve as Owner and Governor of the Wheat Kings.

ANDREW LUGERNER Director of Legal Affairs



Lugerner, a native of Potomac, Maryland, now resides in Las Vegas.






VAUGHN KARPAN Director, Player Personnel

Craig Cunningham is a professional scout with the Golden Knights. Before joining the Golden Knights, Cunningham served as a pro scout for the Arizona Coyotes and assisted in player development with the Coyotes prospects. He registered eight points (3G, 5A) in 63 career NHL games with the Coyotes and Boston Bruins. The Trail, BC native totaled 203 points (101G, 102A) in 319 career American Hockey League (AHL) games. Cunningham survived a medical emergency prior to the Tucson Roadrunners (AHL) game on November 19, 2016, which ended his playing career.



Kelly Kisio serves as a professional scout for the Golden Knights. Prior to joining the team, he spent 18 years with the WHL's Calgary Hitmen, holding multiple positions throughout his tenure. The Hitmen won the WHL championship in 1999 and 2010 under Kisio's leadership. Before becoming general manager of the Hitmen, he scouted for the Calgary Flames for three years. Kisio enjoyed a long, successful playing career as well. In his 13 NHL seasons, he played for four teams and served as captain of the Rangers for four seasons, and alternate captain of the Sharks for two seasons. Kisio represented the Sharks in the 1993 NHL All-Star Game, scoring a goal for the Campbell Conference.



Jim McKenzie is a professional scout with the Golden Knights. Before joining the Golden Knights, McKenzie spent three seasons as a professional scout for the Florida Panthers. Prior to that, he served as the head coach of the Muskegon Lumberjacks of the United States Hockey League for parts of two seasons. 

While with the Panthers, the team won two division titles (2011-12 and 2015-16). Prior to joining the Panthers, he was a scout for the Columbus Blue Jackets and the Colorado Avalanche. The Washington Capitals selected Ginnell in the fourth round of the 1986 draft. He also played in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League and the Western Hockey League. While playing Canadian college hockey, Ginnell won a championship with the Red Deer College Kings. He also played Canadian senior hockey, where he won two Allan Cups with the Powell River Regals.

Keith Hendrickson is an amateur scout for the Golden Knights. Hendrickson previously served in the same capacity for the Buffalo Sabres for six seasons from 2011-17. Prior to that he was a successful high school hockey coach in Minnesota, serving as the head coach of the Virginia-Mountain Iron-Buhl boys coach. He helped lead the Blue Devils to the state tournament in 2005, 2009 and 2010, the first appearances in program history. Hendrickson played collegiately for the Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs from 1975-80 and was an eighth round draft selection by the Montreal Canadiens during the 1977 NHL Entry Draft.



Brad McEwen is an Amateur Free Agent Scout for the Golden Knights. He joined the team after serving as Hockey Canada's Program of Excellence head scout. McEwen's hockey background includes scouting, coaching, and management roles for the better part of two decades with the Western Hockey League's Medicine Hat Tigers and Swift Current Broncos. He also served as an amateur scout for the Calgary Flames from 2014-17. Following the 2001-02 season, McEwen was awarded the Lloyd Saunders Memorial Trophy as the WHL executive of the year.



Raphael Pouliot is an amateur scout for the Golden Knights. Pouliot most recently served as the assistant general manager and head scout for the Rouyn-Noranda Huskies in the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL), helping lead them to the President's Cup during the 2015-16 season. Pouliot has also served as the director of player development and as an Atlantic and Quebec regional scout for Rouyn-Noranda. Pouliot played four seasons in the QMJHL. He also played a season at the University of Moncton.



Peter Ahola was hired on to the Golden Knights team as a European scout on August 30, 2016. Before joining the Golden Knights, Ahola served as a General Manager for four seasons in Finland's Liiga (Finnish Elite League) with the Espoo Blues. Ahola also previously served as a European scout for the Toronto Maple Leafs for two seasons. He also played in the NHL for three seasons, suiting up for the Los Angeles Kings, Pittsburgh Penguins, San Jose Sharks and the Calgary Flames.



Alex Godynyuk is a European scout for the Golden Knights. Previously Godynyuk served as the head coach of Sokol Krasnoyarsk of the Russian Supreme Hockey League. Before his time with Sokol Krasnoyarsk, he also spent time as the head coach of the Hockey Federation of Ukraine from 2014-2015 as well as their National Junior U-20 and U-18 teams from 2009-2015. Before his coaching career, Godynyuk played in 223 NHL games over a span of nine years for four teams. After his retirement in 2001, he coached the ECHL's Greensboro Generals for one season.



Serhii Hapshenko is a European scout for the Golden Knights. The Chemihiv, Ukraine native began his work hockey as a journalist in 2009 in Ukraine. From 2011-2013, he worked in a hockey analytic position for Sokol Kyiv of the Professional Hockey League, which was an elite Ukrainian hockey league, where he worked with Alex Godynyuk. From 2013-19 he worked in hockey analytics, was the head of the hockey section and served as Deputy Chief Editor for Sportarena.com. Hapshenko holds a Master of Psychology degree from National University of Chemihiv, Ukraine. He and his wife Olha reside in Ukraine.



Anders Johansson is a European scout for the Golden Knights. Previously Johansson worked with the Swedish national team, serving as an assistant coach on numerous teams from 2010-17. From 2003-10, he served as the head coach of Division 2 team Boro/Vetlanda. During the 2003-04 season, Johansson was the head coach of the Rögle BK J20 after serving as an assistant coach for two seasons with Rögle BK. The Vertlanda, Sweden native got his start in coaching serving as an assistant coach for the Great Falls (MT) Americans of the American West Hockey League.



COACHING STAFF



PETE DeBOER Head Coach

Pete DeBoer was named the second head coach of the Vegas Golden Knights on January 15, 2020 and led the Golden Knights to a Pacific Division championship once the season ended on March 12 due to COVID-19. During his first postseason run with Vegas, DeBoer helped lead the team to a Western Conference Final appearance, where the team faced the Dallas Stars.

During his first season with the Golden Knights, DeBoer led the team to a 4-2 victory at the Ottawa Senators in his first game behind the Vegas bench on January 16. He helped lead the team to a 15-5-2 record and 32 points, which ranked tied for fourth in the NHL after joining the team.

DeBoer owns a career NHL coaching record of 430-334-113 as well as 53 playoff victories following stints with Vegas, San Jose, New Jersey and Florida. He was named the eighth coach in San Jose Sharks franchise history on May 28, 2015. With San Jose, DeBoer guided the Sharks to a 198-129-34 record over five seasons, including a trip to the first Stanley Cup appearance in team history in 2016.

Prior to joining San Jose, DeBoer coached the New Jersey Devils for three and a half seasons, posting a 114-93-41 record and leading the Devils to the 2012 Stanley Cup Final. DeBoer finished his coaching tenure with the Devils as the second-winningest coach in New Jersey franchise history behind Jacques Lemaire (276).

DeBoer spent three seasons prior to his stint with the Devils as head coach of the Florida Panthers, compiling a 103-107-36 mark behind the Panthers' bench.

Before coaching in the NHL, DeBoer was one of the most distinguished coaches in the Ontario Hockey League's history. He spent 13 seasons coaching with Detroit, Plymouth and Kitchener in the OHL, including winning a Memorial Cup Championship in 2003 and the OHL Championship in 2003 and 2008 with Kitchener.

A two-time winner of the OHL Coach of the Year Award in 1999 and 2000 with Plymouth, he was also named the Canadian Hockey League's Coach of the Year in 2000. During his time in the OHL, he led his team to the league's best overall record four times (1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2007- 08) and is one of only eight coaches in OHL history to reach the 500+ win mark. He ranks eighth on the OHL all-time coaches win list (539) and 12th in games coached (878).

Internationally, DeBoer has frequently been selected to represent his native Canada, including serving as an assistant coach for the Canadian World Championship squad in 2015 (gold medal), 2014 and 2010. Additionally, he was a member of the coaching staff for Canada's World Junior Championship team in 2005 (gold medal) and 1998. He also served on the Team Canada coaching staff for the 2007 Canada-Russia Super Series.

A center in his playing career, DeBoer was selected by the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 12th round (237th overall) of the 1988 NHL Entry Draft and played professionally for two seasons with the International Hockey League's Milwaukee Admirals.

Born June 13, 1968 in Dunnville, Ontario, he holds a law degree from the University of Windsor and University of Detroit. He and his wife, Susan, have one daughter, Abigail, and two sons, Jack and Matthew.

COACHING STAFF



STEVE SPOTT Assistant Coach

Steve Spott joined the Golden Knights on January 28, 2020 after most recently serving under Peter DeBoer with the San Jose Sharks organization from 2015-19. In that time, Spott helped guide the Sharks to a record of 198-129-34 and an appearance in the 2016 Stanley Cup Final.

Prior to working with the Sharks, Spott spent the 2014-15 season as an assistant coach of the Toronto Maple Leafs. As a native of Toronto, he spent the previous two seasons with the Maple Leafs' American Hockey League (AHL) team, the Toronto Marlies. As head coach of the Marlies during the 2013-14 season, Spott led the team to a record of 45-25-2-4 and a Northern Division title.

Before his time in Toronto, Spott coached in the Ontario Hockey League (OHL) with both the Kitchener Rangers and the Plymouth Whalers. He spent four total seasons under DeBoer with the Whalers before they joined Kitchener in 2001. Spott spent his first seven seasons in Kitchener as an assistant under DeBoer.

Following DeBoer's departure to the NHL in 2008, Spott was hired as both Kitchener's head coach and general manager. In five seasons as head coach, Spott helped the Rangers to a record of 187-121-32, including two appearances in the Western Conference Final.

Internationally, Spott helped Team Canada win the gold medal as an assistant coach at the under-18 Ivan Hlinka Memorial tournament in the summer of 2008. He also won a silver medal as an assistant with Team Canada at the World Junior Hockey Championships in 2010. In 2011, he led Canada to a gold medal as head coach of the under-18 team at the Ivan Hlinka Memorial Tournament in the Czech Republic. Spott was also head coach of Team Canada during the 2013 World Junior Hockey Championships in Russia.

Spott played hockey at Colgate University in New York from 1986-90. During his time at Colgate, he recorded 75 goals and 73 assists, for 148 points total.

He and his wife, Lisa, have two children; Tyler and Emma.



RYAN McGILL Assistant Coach

Ryan McGill is in his fourth season with the Golden Knights and joined the team after most recently serving as the head coach of the Ontario Hockey League's Owen Sound Attack. He led the Attack to an overall record of 49-15-4 for a franchise-best 102 points during the 2016-17 season, which was good for the second-most points in the league. Over his two years with the club, McGill compiled a record of 81-42-10-5 and helped guide the team to its first conference final berth since the Attack won the J. Ross Robertson Cup in 2010-11 and was named both the OHL and Canadian Hockey League's Coach of the Year in 2016-17.

Prior to coaching the Attack, McGill spent time as the head coach of the Western Hockey League's Kootenay Ice. It was his second stint with the Ice, as he was team's head coach from 1998-2002 and led them to a Memorial Cup title in 2002. In 2009, McGill was named an assistant coach for the Calgary Flames after four years as the head coach of the Flames' American Hockey League primary affiliate team in Quad City and Omaha. He was also the head coach of the AHL's Hartford Wolf Pack from 2003-05.

The Sherwood Park, Alberta native played in 151 NHL games between 1991-95 before his career was cut short by injury. McGill scored four goals and recorded 15 assists for 19 points and 391 penalty minutes in those 151 games. He suited up for the Chicago Blackhawks (1991-92), Philadelphia Flyers (1992-95) and the Edmonton Oilers (1994-95).

He was selected by Chicago in the second round (29th overall) of the 1987 NHL Draft. McGill made his NHL debut for the Blackhawks during the 1991-92 season.

COACHING STAFF



RYAN CRAIG Assistant Coach

Ryan Craig is in his fourth year as an assistant coach for the Vegas Golden Knights. The Abbotsford, BC native joined the Golden Knights after most recently playing for the Cleveland Monsters of the American Hockey League, an affiliate of the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets. In the 2016-17 season Craig served as captain of the team and skated in 71 games, combining goals (11) and assists (11) for a total of 22 points. He also had a total of 25 penalty minutes this during the 2016-17 season. In the 2015-16 season Craig played for the Lake Erie Monsters, where he skated in 60 games, registering 20 points with 9 goals and 11 assists and totaling 38 penalty minutes. In addition, in the 2015-16 season the Monsters were the AHL Calder Cup champions.

Craig spent a total of 11 seasons in the AHL and was the captain of his team for nine of those years. He skated in 711 AHL games and tallied a total of 360 points on 172 goals and 188 assists and recorded 554 penalty minutes. From 2010-2012 Craig captained the AHL's Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins until signing a one-year AHL contract with the Springfield Falcons, where he was also named captain in his first season with the club.

The British Columbia native also spent time playing with various teams in the NHL. Craig was selected by the Tampa Bay Lightning in the 8th round (255th overall) in the 2002 NHL Entry Draft. Craig debuted in his first NHL game with Tampa Bay in the 2005-06 season. Craig played with Tampa Bay four more seasons, from 2006-2010, before signing with the Pittsburgh Penguins for the 2010-2011 season. In 2013-14 Craig signed with Columbus where he played in 2 regular season games. Over Craig's entire NHL, career he registered 63 total points, combining 32 goals with 31 assists as well as 148 penalty minutes in 198 games.

Craig has earned several awards throughout his years in professional hockey including: the CHL and WHL Humanitarian of the Year in 2002-03, the ECHL Player of the Week in 2003-04 and AHL Calder Cup champion in 2015-16.

He and his wife, Jaydee, have a son, Carson, and two daughters, Kylie and Camryn.



MIKE ROSATI Goaltending Coach

Mike Rosati is in his fourth season with the Vegas Golden Knights, and is in his second season serving as the Goaltending Coach for the team. He previously served as the Goaltending Development Coach/scout for the Golden Knights. Rosati joins the team after serving as the goaltending coach of the Barrie Colts in the Ontario Hockey League (OHL).

He was drafted by the New York Rangers in the 1988 NHL Entry Draft, won two Italian Hockey Championships with Bolzano HC, won three Deutsche Eishockey League (DEL) championships with the Mannheim Eagles and played on the Italian national team during the 1994 and 1998 Winter Olympics.

Rosati was the number-one goalie for most of Italy's greatest decade on the ice. He made his debut at the 1994 Olympics in Lillehammer and a few months later at the World Championship in Italy. In eight World Championships during this time, Rosati played in 32 of the team's 50 games and claimed 12 of the team's 16 victories during these years. He had two shutouts and posted a respectable 3.42 goals-against average playing every night against the best of the best. Rosati was named to the All-Time Italy Team in 2020 by the International Ice Hockey Federation.

He appeared in one NHL game and recorded 12 saves in a perfect outing for the Washington Capitals in 1998.



DAVE ROGOWSKI Video Coach

Dave Rogowski is in his first season as the video coach for the Vegas Golden Knights. He most recently served as the statistical analyst for the Chicago Wolves, who were at the time the American Hockey League affiliate for the Golden Knights. He managed all of the team's video needs and was part of the staff that helped lead the Wolves to a Calder Cup appearance and a Western Conference championship during the 2019 postseason.

Prior to his time in Chicago, Rogowski served as the Director of Hockey Operations for the United States Hockey League's Chicago Steel during the 2017-18 season. He managed all video needs for the team as well as coordinating all team travel logistics, player appearances and organized the hockey operation's budget and expenses.

From 2014-17, he served as a volunteer student assistant at the University of Denver and was part of the staff that captured the 2017 National Championship.

2020 PLAYOFF NOTES

RETURNING TO THE WESTERN CONFERENCE FINAL

After defeating the Vancouver Canucks in seven games, the Vegas Golden Knights punched their ticket to the Western Conference Final, which was the team's second appearance in three years. Vegas became the first team to reach the Conference Finals multiple times in its first three NHL seasons since the series was introduced in 1982.

AS A TEAM IN THE POSTSEASON

The Vegas Golden Knights have appeared in 47 playoff games since the franchise's first season and have a recorded 28 victories. Both numbers rank second in the league, behind Boston (49 games) and Tampa Bay (29 victories), respectfully. The Golden Knights' 139 playoff goals also rank second behind Boston (149 goals). Vegas leads the league with 1,889 hits, 826 blocked shots and 462 takeaways.

SHUTOUTS ON EITHER SIDE

After being shut out in Game 1 of the Western Conference Final, Vegas exacted its revenge by blanking Dallas in Game 2. It was the first time in the modern era (since 1943-44) that the Conference Finals/Semifinals have opened with each team earning a shutout within the first two contests.

ELITE LINEMATES

Vegas forwards Jonathan Marchessault & Reilly Smith have been linemates nearly since the inception of the franchise. Their chemistry in the playoffs since the first postseason has been apparent as the pair has collaborated on 22 postseason goals in three years (goals on which both players recorded point), which ranks tied for second in the NHL. Individually either Smith or Marchessault — who are first & second, respectively, on the Golden Knights' alltime playoff points list — have recorded a point on 41.0 percent of Vegas' all-time playoff goals (57 of 139).

PANDA EVEN BETTER IN ROUND 2

Robin Lehner posted three shutouts against the Vancouver Canucks, including a 3-0 win in the organization's first-ever Game 7 victory. He matched the NHL record for most shutouts in a playoff series and became the first goaltender since 2016 to record a shutout in his first career Game 7 appearance (last was San Jose's Martin Jones). Against the Canucks, Lehner finished with a 1.54 goals against-average and a .934 save percentage to go with a 3-3 record in six appearances.

GAME 7 VS. VANCOUVER

The Vegas Golden Knights captured their first victory in a Game 7, defeating the Vancouver Canucks, 3-0. Vegas Head Coach Pete DeBoer moved to 5-0 all-time in Game 7 situations and is the only coach in NHL history to win his first five Game 7 contests. Additionally, Vegas became the third franchise in NHL history to earn multiple series wins in two of its first three NHL seasons, in joining the Rangers (1928 and 1929) and Blues (1968, 1969 & 1970).

2020 PLAYOFF NOTES

TUCH CALLS GAME!

Alex Tuch posted three game-winning goals during the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs and leads the Golden Knights with five postseason game winners since the franchise's inception. He is one of six players who have recorded five game-winning goals since the 2018 playoffs.

PANDA IN ROUND 1

Robin Lehner (23 saves) earned the series-clinching win versus his former team, the Chicago Blackhawks. Lehner became the second goaltender in NHL history to earn a series-clinching win against a team that he played for earlier in the same season, joining Boston's Hal Winkler in Game 2 of the 1927 Semifinals against the Rangers (3-1 W). Against Chicago, he finished with a 2.20 goals-against average and a .905 save percentage to go with a 3-1 record in four appearances.

ROCKIN' ROUND ROBIN

The Vegas Golden Knights finished round robin play with a 3-0 record after defeating the Dallas Stars (5-3 on Aug. 3), the St. Louis Blues (6-4 on Aug. 6) and the Colorado Avalanche in overtime (4-3 on Aug. 8). After finishing with a perfect record, the Golden Knights earned the #1 seed in the Western Conference and will open the round of 16 against the #8 Chicago Blackhawks.

OVERCOMING MULTI-GOAL DEFICITS

The Vegas Golden Knights staged another comeback during the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs, defeating the Chicago Blackhawks, 4-3 (Aug. 18) after trailing by multiple goals in the contest. The Golden Knights now have 14 multi-goal comeback wins to their credit. Vegas also came back to win in two games earlier in the postseason, winning consecutive games (Aug. 3 & Aug. 6). The only other time they won consecutive games after trailing by multiple goals in each was in 2017-18, their inaugural season (Dec. 17 & Dec. 19). Against the Dallas Stars (Aug. 3), Vegas won after trailing by multiple goals in the third period for the first time (regular season or playoffs). The largest deficit the Golden Knights have overcome to win a game is three goals, on Jan. 4, 2020 against the Blues (5-4 OTW). The Golden Knights became the third different franchise in NHL history with three multi-goal comeback wins through their first eight games in a postseason, joining the Bruins in 1943 as well as the North Stars in 1968 & 1985.

MAKING THE POSTSEASON, AGAIN AND AGAIN

Vegas is the fourth team in NHL history to make the playoffs in each of its first three seasons, joining the Oilers as the only team to do it in the post-expansion era (i.e. excluding teams who joined the NHL in 1967-68 or earlier). The Oilers went on to extend their streak to 13 consecutive seasons, a run which saw them capture five Stanley Cups within their first 11 campaigns. Though playing under different rules and circumstances, these are the other franchises to make the playoffs in each of their first three NHL seasons, with their consecutive playoff appearances and inaugural season noted in parentheses: Oilers (13; 1979-80), Rangers (9; 1926-27) and Blues (6; 1967-68).



SERIES WINNERS (ESPECIALLY ON THE ROAD)

The Golden Knights have more series wins than two active franchises (5), posting three of their series-clinching victories as the road team. They are one of six NHL franchises to earn each of its first three such wins as visitors, following Calgary/Atlanta (6), Pittsburgh (4), NY Islanders (3), San Jose (3) and Minnesota (3).

PODIUMS IN THE PACIFIC DIVISION

Vegas has sat in a top three position in their division for 424 of 559 total days (76%) as an NHL franchise. Only one team to debut in the League's expansion era (since 1967-68) holds a higher percentage of time in a top three position in their division through their first three NHL campaigns: Nashville (81%, 460 of 571).

PLAYERS FROM INAUGURAL RUN

Thirteen Golden Knights players who helped the club reach the 2018 Final remain with the team: William Carrier, Derek Engelland, Marc-Andre Fleury, William Karlsson, Jonathan Marchessault, Brayden McNabb, Jon Merrill, Tomas Nosek, Ryan Reaves, Nate Schmidt, Reilly Smith, Shea Theodore and Alex Tuch.

SMITH PACES THE GROUP

Reilly Smith is the Golden Knights leading scorer in the playoffs with 42 points (11 G, 31 A) in 47 games, one of seven skaters to appear in every Golden Knights postseason game. Smith also has turned in 11 multi-point games including a three point game against Chicago (Aug. 11, 2020). His 31 postseason assists with Vegas are also a team-high.

CONSECUTIVE PLAYOFF RUNS

Vegas goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury has made 14 consecutive postseason appearance after getting the start against the St. Louis Blues Round Robin portion of the 2020 NHL Stanley Cup Playoffs. He is tied with Tony Esposito for the longest consecutive run by a goaltender making a playoff appearance. He also holds the longest active streak amongst any player in the four major leagues (MLB/NBA/NFL/NHL). The full list is below.

2020 PLAYOFF NOTES



Marc-Andre Fleury has 15 career postseason shutouts, tied with Clint Benedict and Chris Osgood for fourth place on the NHL's all-time playoff list. Fleury posted two of his four career series-clinching shutouts during the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

FLEURY CLIMBING ALL-TIME RANKINGS

With 81 career playoff victories, Marc-Andre Fleury broke a tie with Ken Dryden for sixth place on the NHL's all-time list. Fleury, who leads all active goaltenders in postseason games played (146), wins (81) and shutouts (15) now sits seven victories from tying Ed Belfour and Billy Smith (88) for fourth overall.

TOP VEGAS SCORERS FROM LAST YEAR RETURNING TO POSTSEASON

The Golden Knights return the majority of the group from a season ago, including some exceptional participants of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs: Mark Stone (6-6—12 in 7 GP), Max Pacioretty (5-6—11 in 7 GP) and Paul Stastny (2-6—8 in 7 GP).

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE

Combined, the Vegas Golden Knights came into the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs having appeared in 868 Stanley Cup playoff games. That number ranks as the most of any Pacific Division team involved in the 2020 tournament, the third most in the Western Conference & the seventh most in the league.



PACIFIC DIVISION CHAMPIONS

Once the season was deemed complete by the NHL, the Golden Knights became the first franchise in League history to capture a division title multiple times within their first three NHL seasons (among clubs to debut when the NHL featured divisions from 1926-27 to 1937-38 and in each campaign since 1967-68). Vegas finished with a 39-24-8 record (86 points) and were three points ahead of the Edmonton Oilers. The fewest seasons required by a franchise to win its second division title is four, achieved by the Oilers in 1982-83 (47-21-12, 106 points).

PODIUM POSITION IN THE PACIFIC

Vegas has sat in a top three position in their division for 424 of 559 total days (76%) as an NHL franchise. Only one team to debut in the League's expansion era (since 1967-68) holds a higher percentage of time in a top three position in their division through their first three NHL campaigns: Nashville (81%, 460 of 571).

PODIUM POSITION IN THE PACIFIC, PART DEUX

Since the introduction of divisions in 1926-27, only two NHL franchises have finished among the top three in their division in each of their first three seasons: the Rangers (American Division: 1st in 1926-27, 2nd in 1927-28, 2nd 1928-29) and Blues (West Division: 3rd in 1967-68, 1st in 1968-69, 1st in 1969-70).

GOING STREAKING!

The Vegas Golden Knights matched the longest win streak in franchise history after rattling off eight consecutive wins from February 13-28. Vegas became the first team in NHL history to post multiple such runs of at least eight games through their first three seasons of existence. The Sabres (8-0-0 in 1972-73) and 1917 Senators (9-0-0 in 1919-20) are the only other clubs to register at least one. The Golden Knights posted an eight-game run in the midst of its historic inaugural season, doing so from Dec. 14, 2017 – Jan. 2, 2018.

HOME COOKING AT THE FORTRESS

While the Golden Knights won't play any games at T-Mobile Arena during the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Vegas once again saw success on home ice. The team finished with 48 points (22-11-4), which was tied for the fifth most points in the league at their home arena.

LAYING THE LUMBER

The Vegas Golden Knights once again rank amongst the heaviest hitters in the NHL this season, averaging 26.51 hits per game. Vegas forward Ryan Reaves was the only player in the NHL to finish with more than 300 hits, recording a career-high 316. It is the first time in his career that Reaves has logged back-to-back seasons of 300 or more hits. His linemate William Carrier finisehd with 213 hits in 71 games.

X MARKS THE SPOT

For the third consecutive season, the Vegas Golden Knights clinched a spot in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. Vegas is the fourth team in NHL history to make the playoffs in each of its first three seasons, joining the Oilers as the only team to do it in the post-expansion era (i.e. excluding teams who joined the NHL in 1967-68 or earlier). Though playing under different rules and circumstances, these are the other franchises to make the playoffs in each of their first three NHL seasons, with their consecutive playoff appearances and inaugural season noted in parentheses: Oilers (13; 1979-80), Rangers (9; 1926-27) and Blues (6; 1967-68). The Golden Knights will open the 2020 playoffs playing in a round robin format against the Dallas Stars, St. Louis Blues and Colorado Avalanche in order to determine seeding for the first round.

FABULOUS FEBRUARY

The Vegas Golden Knights finished the month of February with a 10-2-1 record. The team's .808 points percentage led the NHL, while the 21 points & 10 victories the Golden Knights accrued tied for fourth in the league. It is the first time this season that Vegas finished a month with double digit-victories & second time this season that the team captured 20 points or more (December, 9-4-2 for 20 points). The 10 wins are also the second most the Golden Knights have captured in a single month in team history, behind the 11 the team won in December of the inaugural season (December 2017, 11-1-1 for 23 points). It was the fifth time in team history that Vegas finished a calendar month with 20 or more points. Below are the most productive months in team history in terms of points:

MEMORABLE DEBUTS

Ten players have scored a goal in their respective debuts with the Vegas Golden Knights & four of those players posted multi-point games in those contests. Nick Cousins (1G) was the latest to achieve the feat against the Edmonton Oilers (Feb. 26, 2020).

ELEVEN GOAL AFFAIRS

In February, the Golden Knights participated in three games where 11 total goals were scored. Vegas fell to Carolina on Feb. 8 (6-5, SOL) and edged the Blues in overtime on Feb. 13 (6-5, OTW) before defeating Anaheim in overtime on Feb. 23 (6-5, OTW). They joined the Predators (3x in Oct.) and Rangers (3x in Nov.) as the third team this season to compete in three games with 11 combined goals in a single month (including shootout-deciding goals).

SOME VGK TAKEAWAYS

The Vegas Golden Knights lead the NHL with 682 takeaways through 71 games this season. Last season, Vegas was the only team to record over 900 takeaways, finishing with 903, which were the most recorded by a team since the NY Islanders finished the 2009-10 season with 948 takeaways. Vegas is led by Mark Stone, who ranked third in the league with 78 takeaways, & Reilly Smith, who ranks tied for 11th in the NHL, with 58 takeaways. Shea Theodore (55 takeaways) & William Karlsson (54 takeaways) also ranks in the league's top-20, sitting tied for 17th and 19th, respectively.

REGULAR-SEASON VGK MILESTONES

The Golden Knights played their 200th all-time regular-season game against the Vancouver Canucks at T-Mobile Arena (Dec. 15). Vegas improved to 112-69-19 (243 points) with a 6-3 win over the Canucks and owns the second-best record in NHL history by a franchise through its first 200 games in terms of wins, points and point percentage. It was also the team's 100th all-time regular-season home game and the Golden Knights improved to 62-28-10 (134 points) at T-Mobile Arena. Vegas owns the fourth-best record in League history by a franchise through its first 100 home games, behind the original Ottawa Senators (78-19-3, 159 points), Montreal Canadiens (71-28-1, 143 points) and Toronto Arenas/St. Patricks (69-29-2, 140 points).

CENTURY MARK

The Golden Knights captured their 100th victory as a franchise with a 3-0 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins (Oct. 19), giving Vegas a cumulative record of 100-59-14. It took the organization 173 regular-season games to reach the century mark as they became the fourth franchise in NHL history to achieve the feat in less than 200 games. The only team to do it quicker than the Golden Knights was the original Ottawa Senators, who reached the mark in 165 games. The Montreal Canadiens (183 GP) & Toronto Maple Leafs (190 GP) also achieved the feat in less than 200 games.

2019-20 NOTES



FOUR PLAYERS WITH 20+ GOALS

The Golden Knights are one of eight teams, joining Florida, Philadelphia, Tampa Bay, Toronto, Vancouver, Washington and Winnipeg who have at least four players that have scored at least 20 goals this season. As a team, Vegas is tied for ninth with 224 goals this season. Max Pacioretty leads the team with 32 goals, Reilly Smith has scored 27 goals, Jonathan Marchessault has recorded 22 goals this season and Mark Stone has posted 21 goals.

STONE ERA

Vegas forward Mark Stone turned in back-to-back-to-back multi-point games to start the 2019-20 season (Oct. 2-8). It was the first time in his career that he recorded multiple points in three straight games to start a season. He recorded multiple points in four consecutive games (Dec. 13-19) for the first time in his career. He recorded his first two goal game of the season against Arizona (Dec. 28). Against Florida, Stone became the first player in Golden Knights history to post a five-point game (2G, 3A) during the regular season. He matched his career-high with four assists in a single game on two occasions in February, against St. Louis (Feb. 13) & at Anaheim (Feb. 23). He is just the second player this season to post multiple four assist games, joining Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl. This season, the Winnipeg, Manitoba native has recorded 63 points (21G, 42A) & posted his 200th career assist against Ottawa (Oct. 17).

MAD MAX!

Vegas forward Max Pacioretty was named the NHL "First Star" of the week (Dec. 16) after recording eight points (5G, 3A) and helping lead the Golden Knights to a 3-1-0 record during the week. He scored goals in four consecutive games from Dec. 10-15, the longest streak by a Vegas player this season, & recorded a point in six straight games (Dec. 10-19). He recorded points in five straight games (Feb. 17-26) & scored his 30th goal of the season against Edmonton (Feb. 26). It is the sixth time in his career, and the first time since the 2016-17 season, that he has reached the 30 goal plateau. This season, the New Canaan, CT native has recorded 66 points (32 G, 34 A) and represented the organization at the 2020 NHL All-Star Game in St. Louis, Missouri. In his first NHL All-Star Game appearance, Pacioretty helped lead the Pacific Division to victory. He becomes the third different Golden Knights player to lead the team in goals after William Karlsson (2017-18) and Jonathan Marchessault (2018-19) led the team during the last two season. Vegas is the fourth expansion team after 1979-80 to have a different leading goal scorer in its first three seasons.

FLOWER CONTINUES TO CLIMB THE ALL-TIME WINS LADDER

Marc-Andre Fleury has climbed from eighth to fifth place on the NHL's all-time regular-season wins list this season, surpassing Terry Sawchuk, Curtis Joseph and Henrik Lundqvist. He finished the regular season with 466 career victories, which is 18 wins behind Ed Belfour. The Sorel, Quebec native recorded his 450th career win against the Toronto Maple Leafs (4-2 on Nov. 19) and made arguably the "Save of the Year" denying Nic Petan with an full-extension glove save.



FINISHING TOP-FIVE IN VICTORIES

Marc-Andre Fleury finished with 27 wins this season, tied for fifth most in the NHL. It is the seventh season of his career ranking in the NHL's top five in wins, tied for the most by any goaltender since Fleury entered the league in 2003-04.

FLOWER CONTINUING TO SHUT THE DOOR

Marc-Andre Fleury turned aside all 29 shots as he blanked the Edmonton Oilers (Feb. 26) and posted his 61st career regular-season shutout, which matches Turk Broda for 17th place on the NHL's all-time list. Fleury recorded five of his 61 career shutouts in 2019-20, tied for the second most among all goaltenders this season with Columbus rookie Elvis Merzlikins and Boston's Tuukka Rask. Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck led the league with six shut outs.

GOALTENDER OF THE DECADE?

Marc-Andre Fleury led all goaltenders in regular-season wins over the past decade (321). He is one of four goaltenders with multiple Stanley Cup wins in the 2010s; only three netminders have more than his 47 playoff wins in that span.

SMITH POSTS CAREER-HIGH IN GOALS

Reilly Smith finished the season with 54 points (27-27) and appeared in every VGK game during the abbreviated season. His 27 goals were a career-high and he matched his career-high by posting four multi-goal games.

2019-20 NOTES



THE "SHEA HEY KID"

Vegas defenseman Shea Theodore tallied the game-winning goal in back-to-back nights, first scoring the go-ahead goal at the Calgary Flames (March 8) with 70 seconds left in regulation and then posted his third overtime goal of the season at the Edmonton Oilers (March 9). Theodore became the 11th defenseman over the last 21 years (since 1998-99) to score a game-winning goal in consecutive days and second to do so this season, joining Washington's John Carlsson. The Langley, British Columbia native has already turned in a career-year, posting highs in goals (13), assists (33) & points (46), all of which are the most ever by a VGK blueliner in a single season. Theodore's 46 points rank as the 10th most in the NHL this season & ranks tied for fifth in the league since January 1 with 23 points (8G, 15A).

FATHER & SON COMBOS

Paul Stastny's overtime goal against Nashville (Nov. 27) was the 700th point of his NHL career (241-459—700 in 901 GP). Paul joined his father Peter Stastny (450-789—1,239 in 977 GP) as just the third father-son duo in NHL history to each record at least 700 career regular-season points. The others: Gordie Howe (801-1,049—1,850 in 1,767 GP) & Mark Howe (197-545—742 in 929 GP), as well as Bobby Hull (610-560—1,170 in 1,063 GP) & Brett Hull (741-650—1,391 in 1,269 GP).

NEW FACES IN THE VGK LINEUP

This season the Golden Knights acquired four players who made immediate impacts for the team. Vegas acquired forward Chandler Stephenson from the Washington Capitals on Dec. 2 and he finished the 2019-20 season with a career-high 26 points (11-15), 22 of which (8-14) came with Vegas. On Feb. 19, the organization acquired Alec Martinez from the Los Angeles Kings and he posted eight points (2-6) in 10 games with the Golden Knights, matching his points total in 41 games with the Kings. On trade deadline day, Vegas acquired forward Nick Cousins from Montreal and goaltender Robin Lehner from Chicago. Cousins appeared in seven games for the Golden Knights and posted three points (1-2) while Lehner appeared in three games for Vegas, posting a 3-0-0 record to go with a 1.67 goals against average and a .940 save percentage. His first shut out as a Golden Knight came against New Jersey on March 3.

March 10, 2018 - With a 2-1 shootout victory over the Buffalo Sabres, the Golden Knights improve to 20-12-3 on the road and set the record for most road wins by a team in its inaugural season in league history, passing the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim (1993-94).

March 12, 2018 - Vegas Golden Knight's goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury becomes the 13th goalie in NHL history to capture 400th career victory as Vegas defeats the Philadelphia Flyers, 3-2.

March 18, 2018 - Vegas Golden Knight's goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury captures 401st career victory and 48th career shutout while forward William Karlsson records his second career hat trick and becomes the 11th player in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) to record multiple hat tricks while playing for a team in its inaugural season, and just the eighth with a natural hat trick, as Vegas defeats the Calgary Flames, 4-0.

March 22, 2018 - Vegas became the first team in NHL history to reach the 100-point mark in its inaugural season. The previous benchmark to reach the century mark took three seasons, set by the Oilers in 1981-82 and four campaigns for a team that did not merge from the WHA (a mark set by the Islanders in 1975-76).

March 26, 2018 - The Vegas Golden Knights defeated the Colorado Avalanche to become the third expansion team since 1968-69 – and first to start from scratch – to clinch a berth in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. In 1979-80, the Hartford Whalers and Edmonton Oilers each reached the postseason after joining the NHL from the World Hockey Association. In addition to the Golden Knights, Oilers and Whalers, only four other expansion clubs from any of the four North American professional sports leagues qualified for the playoffs. The four other expansion clubs to reach the playoffs – all from the NBA – are the 1966-67 Chicago Bulls, 1976-77 Denver Nuggets, 1976-77 San Antonio Spurs and 2002-03 New Orleans Hornets. The Nuggets and Spurs joined from the defunct American Basketball Association, while the newly-formed Bulls were part of an eight-team playoff bracket in a 10-team league. The Hornets, meanwhile, relocated from Charlotte but are considered an expansion franchise by the NBA.

March 31, 2018 - Vegas defeats San Jose and becomes the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division (excluding mergers and all-expansion divisions).

April 7, 2018 - The Golden Knights finish their inaugural regular season with a record of 51-24-7 and 109 points.

April 11, 2018 - The Golden Knights capture their first postseason victory in franchise history. Vegas became the first team in NHL history to win its playoff debut in its inaugural season when facing a non-first-year team. The Golden Knights joined the Rangers (1927), Blues (1968) and Kings (1968) as the only teams to post a playoff shutout in their inaugural NHL season. The Rangers and Blues also achieved the feat in their postseason debut.

April 13, 2018 - The Golden Knights take a 2-0 series lead over the Los Angeles Kings. They became the third team in NHL history to win a playoff game requiring multiple overtimes in its inaugural season. Vegas also became the fifth franchise in NHL history to win each of their first two playoff games and just the second to do so in its inaugural season.

April 17, 2018 - The Golden Knights become just the third team from the NHL, NBA and MLB to complete a four-game sweep to win their first-ever playoff series – and the first to do so in their inaugural season.

April 26, 2018 - The Golden Knights capture their fifth consecutive victory of the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs with a 7-0 win over the San Jose Sharks, becoming the first NHL team ever to win its first five postseason games.

May 6, 2018 - The Golden Knights become just the third franchise in NHL history to win multiple series in its inaugural season after defeating the San Jose Sharks 3-0 in Game 6 of the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs Second Round. Vegas holds an 8-2 record through its first 10 playoff games – the best record through a franchise's first 10 postseason contests in NHL history.



May 20, 2018 - The Golden Knights become the sixth team in NHL history to reach the Stanley Cup Final in its first playoff appearance – and the third to do so in its inaugural season after defeating the Winnipeg Jets in five games.

May 28, 2018 - The Golden Knights take a 1-0 series lead over the Washington Capitals in the Stanley Cup Final following 6-4 victory at T-Mobile Arena.

June 7, 2018 - The Golden Knights fall to the Washington Capitals in Game 5 of the Stanley Cup Final following a 4-3 loss at T-Mobile Arena.

June 13, 2018 - An estimated crowd of 7,500 stand under the canopy covering Fremont Street as the Golden Knights held a "Stick Salute to Vegas and Our Fans" event to thank fans for their support during the Golden Knights inaugural season.

June 20, 2018 - Four members of the Vegas Golden Knights – defenseman Deryk Engelland, center William Karlsson, head coach Gerard Gallant and general manager George McPhee – received awards in recognition of achieving the greatest season by an expansion team in major pro sports history, both on and off the ice.

June 26, 2018 - The team's second development camp, and first at City National Arena, begins with 42 players.

July 18, 2018 - Nate Schmidt, Ryan Reaves, Brayden McNabb and James Neal represent the Vegas Golden Knights as the team was up for "Best Moment" at the ESPYs.

Aug. 6-10, 2018 - Golden Knights staff and players embark on the second annual road trip through the team's television distribution area, making stops in Reno, Nevada; Boise, Idaho; Jackson, Wyoming; and Salt Lake City, Utah before returning to Las Vegas.

Aug. 16, 2018 - Pierre-Edouard Bellemare and William Karlsson partake in the NHL European Media Tour in Stockholm, Sweden.

Sept. 6, 2018 - Rookies report for Golden Knights Rookie Camp.

Sept. 8-11, 2018 - The Golden Knights host the 2018 Vegas Rookie Faceoff presented by NextGen at City National Arena. The Anaheim Ducks, Arizona Coyotes, Colorado Avalanche, Los Angeles Kings and San Jose Sharks all take part and Vegas was 2-1 in the three-day event, defeating the Avalanche, 7-6, on Sept.

8 and the Kings, 7-2, on Sept. 11. The team's only loss came on Sept. 9 against the Sharks, falling 5-4. Gage Quinney led the Golden Knights with seven points (3G, 4A) in three games.

Sept. 11, 2018 - The Vegas Golden Knights Inaugural Charity Golf Classic is played at Bear's Best Las Vegas.

Sept. 13, 2018 - Veterans report for the Golden Knights Training Camp.

Sept. 30, 2018 - The Golden Knights wrap up the preseason with a 5-2 win over the San Jose Sharks and finish the exhibition schedule with a 6-1-0 record.

Oct. 1, 2018 - The Golden Knights join the community in remembrance of the 1 October tragedy one year ago by visiting command and dispatch centers, Mandalay Bay and the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority.

Oct. 2, 2018 - The Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles and Golden Knights release a VGK branded "Vegas Born" license plate.

Oct. 4, 2018 - The Vegas Golden Knights drop their season opener at T-Mobile Arena, falling to the Philadelphia Flyers, 5-2.

Oct. 6, 2018 - Vegas captures its first victory of the season, a 2-1 shootout win at the Minnesota Wild.

Oct. 18, 2018 - The Golden Knights host their annual Season Ticket Member Appreciation Event at Mandalay Bay Resort & Casino.

Oct. 20, 2018 - Marc-Andre Fleury passes Glenn Hall for sole possession of 10th place on the NHL's all-time wins list with 408 career victories.

Oct. 28, 2018 - After starting the month with a 1-6-0 record, the Golden Knights win four of five games at T-Mobile Arena, including a 4-3 overtime victory against the Ottawa Senators. Jonathan Marchessault sealed the victory after scoring the 15th penalty-shot goal in overtime in league history, with Vegas becoming the 13th different franchise to have such a tally (NSH and ANA have two each).

Nov. 3, 2018 - Marc-Andre Fleury makes 34 saves en route to his 50th career shutout as Vegas defeats Carolina, 3-0.



Nov. 11, 2018 - The Golden Knights play their 100th game as a franchise, but fall at the Boston Bruins, 4-1.

Nov. 26, 2018 - Marc-Andre Fleury earns the NHL's Second Star of the Week after stopping 81 of the 83 shots he faced, going 3-0-0 with a 0.65 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and two shutouts to lift the Golden Knights (12-12-1, 25 points) into third place in the Pacific Division.

Nov. 27, 2018 - The Vegas Golden Knights post a franchise-best eight goals at the Chicago Blackhawks. Vegas spread out the goals, scoring three in the first and second periods, each, and finishing with two goals in the third.

Dec. 1, 2018 - Marc-Andre Fleury earns the NHL's Third Star of November after leading the NHL with nine wins and four shutouts in November (13 GP), compiling a record of 9-4-0 with a 2.32 goals-against average and .920 save percentage to backstop the Golden Knights (14-12-1, 29 points) to a 9-6-0 month.

Dec. 6, 2018 - William Karlsson collects an assist and becomes the first Golden Knights player to reach the 100-point mark (112 games).

Dec. 14, 2018 - Jonathan Marchessault records an assist to become the fastest player in Golden Knights history to record 100 points (111 games).

Dec. 20, 2018 - Marc-Andre Fleury passes Tony Esposito for sole possession of ninth place on the NHL's all-time wins list with 424 career victories.

Dec. 30, 2018 - The Golden Knights (23-15-4) defeat Arizona, 5-1, and become the first franchise in NHL history to accumulate 50 or more points before Jan. 1 in each of their first two seasons. Vegas posted a 26-9-2 (54 points) record by Dec. 31, 2017.

Jan. 6, 2019 - Max Pacioretty becomes the the 30th different player in 2018-19 to register consecutive game-winning goals. Only one other Golden Knights player has registered the game-winning goal in consecutive team games: James Neal, who did so in the first three games in franchise history from Oct. 6-10, 2017. Jan. 8, 2019 - The Golden Knights win their season-high seventh straight game and record a point in 10 straight games with a 4-2 win over the Rangers. Marc-Andre Fleury has collected a point in his last 12 starts (9-0-3), the third longest point streak of his career. Vegas also extends its home point streak to 12 games (12-0-2 since Nov. 23), which is tied for the longest in franchise history.

Jan. 12, 2019 - Alex Tuch extends his point streak to nine games (3G, 8A - 11P), the longest such stretch in franchise history.

Jan. 17, 2019 - The 2019 Knight To Remember Gala is held at World Market Center Pavilions.

Jan. 19, 2019 - Jonathan Marchessault scores the third hat trick in team history as Vegas defeats Pittsburgh, 7-3.

Jan. 25-26, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury makes fourth career allstar appearance, representing the Golden Knights at the 2019 NHL All-Star Weekend in San Jose, CA.

Feb. 26, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury records 30th win of the season, the ninth time in his career he has had a season with 30 victories.

Feb. 28 - *March 6, 2019* - Marc-Andre Fleury records a career-high shutout streak of 200:41.

March 4, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury is named the NHL's First Star of the Week after going 3-0-0 with a 0.33 goals-against average and a .987 save percentage.

March 9, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury makes 29 saves and moves into sole possession of eighth place all-time, passing Jacques Plante, after collecting his 438th regular-season victory.

March 17, 2019 - The Golden Knights earns their 40th win of the season with a 6-3 victory over Edmonton.

March 29, 2019 - Vegas clinches a spot in the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, becoming the seventh team in NHL history to make the playoffs in each of its first two seasons, joining Edmonton as the only team to do it in the post-expansion era.



March 30, 2019 - The Golden Knights fall in overtime at the San Jose Sharks, but collect their 200th point as a franchise, becoming the fastest team in league history to collect their 200th standings point.

April 4, 2019 - The Golden Knights fall to the Arizona Coyotes, 4-1, in the final home game of the 2018-19 season. Following the game the Golden Knights announce regular season award winners. For the second year in a row, Deryk Engelland receives the Vegas Strong Service Award for his outstanding work in the Las Vegas community. Ryan Reaves earns the Seventh Player Award presented by GEICO as the player who most exceeded expectations during the 2018-19 campaign after setting career-highs in goals, assists, points, game-winning goals and shots on net. Finally, Marc-Andre Fleury and Cody Eakin share the honor of the First Star Award for having the most three stars appearances on home ice this season.

April 6, 2019 - The Golden Knights finishes their second season with an overall record of 43-32-7 (93 points) following a 5-2 loss at Los Angeles.

August 7, 2019 - The Vegas Golden Knights renewed its affiliation agreement with the ECHL's Fort Wayne Komets.

Aug. 5-9, 2019 - Golden Knights staff and players embark on the third annual road trip through the team's television distribution area, making stops in Idaho Falls, Idaho; Billings, Montana; Casper, Wyoming; and St. George, Utah before returning to Las Vegas.

Aug. 15, 2019 - William Karlsson partakes in the NHL European Media Tour in Stockholm, Sweden.

Sept. 4, 2019 - The Vegas Golden Knights Foundation Inaugural Charity Golf Classic is played at TPC Summerlin.

Sept. 5, 2019 - Rookies report for Golden Knights Rookie Camp.

Sept. 7-10, 2019 - The Golden Knights participate in the 2019 Anaheim Rookie Faceoff at Great Park Ice and FivePoint Arena.

Sept. 12, 2019 - Veterans report for Golden Knights Training Camp.

Sept. 15, 2019 – The Golden Knights win in their first preseason game of the 2019-20 season, Max Pacioretty scores three goals against Coyotes in 6-2 victory.

Sept. 29, 2019 - The Golden Knights wrap up the preseason with a 5-1 win over the San Jose Sharks and finish the exhibition schedule with a 5-2-0 record. Max Pacioretty finished with a league-best 10 points (4G, 6A) during the preseason after appearing in four exhibition games for Vegas.

Oct. 1, 2019 - The Golden Knights join the community in remembrance of the 1 October tragedy two years ago by hosting private practice and lunch for invited guests who were affected by the events on October 1, 2017.

Oct. 2, 2019 - The Golden Knights win in their season opener, defeating the San Jose Sharks, 4-1, at T-Mobile Arena. Cody Glass, the first draft pick in franchise history, became the fifth player in franchise history to score in his Vegas debut. At 20 years, 184 days, he became the youngest player to score a goal for the club while also becoming the first player to appear in a regular-season contest with the franchise after being drafted by them.

Oct. 4, 2019 – Marc-Andre Fleury appears in his 800th NHL game. The Golden Knights play in their ninth consecutive regular season/playoff game against San Jose, defeating the Sharks 5-1. Only three other teams in NHL history have contested nine straight regular-season/playoff games against the same opponent: Colorado against Minnesota (7 in 2014 Playoffs, 2 in 2014-15), Ottawa against Toronto (7 in 2004 Playoffs, 2 in 2005-06) and Toronto against Detroit (3 in 1942-43, 6 in 1943 Playoffs).

Oct. 6, 2019 - The Golden Knights host their annual Season Ticket Member Appreciation Event at the High Roller.

Oct. 8, 2019 – Mark Stone records three consecutive multi-point games to start the 2019-20 season. First time in his career that he recorded multiple points in three straight games to start a season and only the fourth time in his career he has had at least two points in three consecutive games.

Oct. 19, 2019 – The Golden Knights captured their 100th victory as a franchise with a 3-0 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins, giving Vegas a cumulative record of 100-59-14. It took the organization 173 regular-season games to reach the century mark as they became the fourth franchise in NHL history to achieve the feat in less than 200 games. The only team to do it quicker than the Golden Knights was the original Ottawa Senators, who reached the mark in 165 games.



Oct. 22, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury makes 31 saves and moves into sole possession of seventh place all-time, passing Terry Sawchuk after collecting his 446th regular-season victory.

Oct. 27, 2019 – Nicolas Roy becomes the sixth player in franchise history to score in his Vegas debut, as the Golden Knights beat the Anaheim Ducks, 5-2.

Oct. 31, 2019 – Max Pacioretty records his 500th career point (250G, 250A), an assist, in loss to Montreal.

Nov. 19, 2019 – After making an incredible diving save that would be considered the save of the regular season by many pundits, Marc-Andre Fleury becomes the seventh goaltender in NHL history to earn 450 career victories after defeating the Toronto Maple Leafs, 4-2.

Nov. 20, 2019 – The Golden Knights and BT Supplies West Inc. announce long-term partnership agreement to name the new community arena in Henderson, Nevada: "Lifeguard Arena in Henderson".

Nov. 27, 2019 – Max Pacioretty scores the latest goal in team history with 0.3 seconds remaining in regulation to send the Golden Knights to overtime in Nashville. Paul Stastny scored the overtime winner, which was the 700th point of his NHL career. Paul joined his father Peter Stastny (450-789—1,239 in 977 GP) as just the third father-son duo in NHL history to each record at least 700 career regular-season points. The others: Gordie Howe (801-1,049—1,850 in 1,767 GP) and Mark Howe (197-545—742 in 929 GP), as well as Bobby Hull (610-560—1,170 in 1,063 GP) and Brett Hull (741-650—1,391 in 1,269 GP).

Dec. 3, 2019 – Jonathan Marchessault scores three goals in the final frame against the New Jersey Devils, recording his third career hat trick and second as a Golden Knight. It was also the second natural hat trick in his career (first in one period) and the second natural hat trick in team history (William Karlsson vs. CGY - March 18, 2018). Chandler Stephenson became the seventh player in franchise history to score in his Vegas debut, as the Golden Knights beat the Devils, 4-3.

Dec. 15, 2019 - The Golden Knights play their 200th all-time regular-season game against the Vancouver Canucks at T-Mobile Arena. Jonathan Marchessault scores his 100th career NHL goal.

Dec. 16, 2019 – Forward Max Pacioretty named NHL "First Star" of the week ending Dec. 15, after leading all skaters with eight points (5G, 3A) in four games.

Dec. 27, 2019 – Reilly Smith collects 200th NHL assist against the Anaheim Ducks.

Dec. 31, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury makes 26 saves and moves into sole possession of sixth place all-time, passing Curtis Joseph after collecting his 455th regular-season victory.

Jan. 3-4, 2020 – The Golden Knights host "Fortress Invitational" collegiate tournament at T-Mobile Arena featuring Cornell, Ohio St., Army and Providence.

Jan. 10, 2020 – Forward Max Pacioretty named to 2020 NHL All-Star Weekend in St. Louis, MO.

Jan. 15, 2020 – The Golden Knights make coaching changes, name Pete DeBoer the second head coach in franchise history.

Jan. 16, 2020 – Pete DeBoer wins in his first game as head coach of the Golden Knights, 4-2, over the Ottawa Senators.

Jan. 25, 2020 - Forward Max Pacioretty helps lead the Pacific Division to victory in the NHL All-Star game, recording one goal and two assists in his first All-Star selection.

Jan. 28, 2020 – The Golden Knights name Steve Spott as an assistant coach.

Feb. 6, 2020 – The Golden Knights purchase AHL franchise membership, apply for franchise relocation to Henderson/Las Vegas, Nevada. Marc-Andre Fleury makes 23 saves and moves into sole possession of fifth place all-time, passing Henrik Lundqvist after collecting his 460th regular-season victory.

Feb. 15, 2020 - Marc-Andre Fleury collects 60th career shutout, tied for 18th all-time.

Feb. 18, 2020 - The 2020 Knight To Remember Gala is held at XS Nightclub inside the Wynn Las Vegas.



Feb. 20, 2020 – Paul Stastny scores his 250th career NHL goal and Alec Martinez becomes the eighth player in franchise history to score in his Vegas debut, as the Golden Knights beat the Tampa Bay Lightning, 5-3.

Feb. 22, 2020 – Gage Quinney becomes the first Nevada-born player to appear in a regular season NHL game. The Golden Knights host the 40th anniversary celebration of the "Miracle On Ice" U.S. Olympic Ice Hockey Team that won gold during the 1980 Olympics.

Feb. 23, 2020 – William Karlsson records his third-career hat trick. Shea Theodore scores game-winning goal in overtime and collects his 42nd point of the season, passing Colin Miller's 41 points during the 2017-18 season as the most by a defenseman in franchise history. Patrick Brown becomes the ninth player in franchise history to score in his Vegas debut, as the Golden Knights beat the Anaheim Ducks, 6-5.

Feb. 26, 2020 – Marc-Andre Fleury collects 61st career shutout, tied for 17th all-time. Nick Cousins becomes the tenth player in franchise history to score in his Vegas debut, as the Golden Knights beat the Edmonton Oilers, 3-0.

Feb. 28, 2020 – AHL Board of Governors approves Vegas Golden Knights franchise membership purchase and relocation. The Golden Knights defeat the Buffalo Sabres 4-2, and extend their winning streak to eight games, tying a franchise record. Reilly Smith posts career-high 26th and 27th goals. Robin Lehner earns the win in his debut with the Golden Knights.

Feb. 29, 2020 – Over 4,000 fans showed for the third-annual "Fan Fest" held at the Downtown Las Vegas Events Center.

March 9, 2020 – Shea Theodore tallied the game-winning goal in back-to-back games, first scoring the go-ahead goal at the Calgary Flames (March 8) with 70 seconds left in regulation and then posted his third overtime goal of the season at the Edmonton Oilers. Theodore became the 11th defenseman over the last 21 years (since 1998-99) to score a game-winning goal in consecutive days.

March 12, 2020 – The NHL pauses its season from concerns over the coronavirus, having played 85 percent of the 2019-20 regular-season schedule

May 26, 2020 – The NHL announces its Return To Play plan, beginning with a 24-team playoff in August and officially concluding the regular-season. The Golden Knights finish the abridged 2019-20 season with a record of 39-24-8 and 86 points. The team captures its second division title in three years and finishes third in the Western Conference. Vegas will partake in a Round Robin to determine seeding for the first round of the Stanley Cup Playoffs in August.

May 28, 2020 - The Henderson Silver Knights are born. The Silver Knights' NHL parent club, the Vegas Golden Knights, shared the team name, logo and brand story during a one-hour live show on KSNV NBC Las Vegas that was also streamed across their social platforms on Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and Twitch. The announcement comes after Black Knight Sports and Entertainment, LLC, who also own and operate the Golden Knights, purchased an AHL membership in February 2020.

June 8, 2020 – The NHL announces the league's transition to Phase 2 of its Return To Play plan. Teams are permitted to reopen their training facilities and allow players to participate in individualized training activities in small groups on a voluntary basis.

July 10, 2020 – The NHL, NHLPA officially approve the Return To Play agreement and also extend the Collective Bargaining Agreement through at least 2025-26. The Stanley Cup Playoffs will begin with a qualifying round on August 1 in Toronto and Edmonton, which serve as the hub cities for the Eastern and Western Conferences, respectively. The Vegas Golden Knights will open the Round Robin against Dallas on August 3 at Rogers Place in Edmonton.

July 13, 2020 – Phase 3 of the NHL's Return To Play plan begins and 33 players report for the Golden Knights' playoff training camp.

July 26, 2020 - The team travels to Edmonton, Alberta for the 2020 Stanley Cup Qualifiers and 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

August 8, 2020 – Vegas defeats Colorado, 4-3, in overtime to lock down the No. 1 seed in the Western Conference for the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

August 12, 2020 - The Vegas Golden Knights renewed its affiliation agreement with the ECHL's Fort Wayne Komets.



August 13, 2020 - VGK and AT&T SportsNet host second annual Charity Knight telecast and raised over \$250,000 benefit the Vegas Golden Knights Foundation

August 18, 2020 – The Golden Knights knock off the Chicago Blackhawks, 4-3, in Game 5 of the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs First Round to advance to the second round for the second time in franchise history.

August 21, 2020 – The Henderson Silver Knights announce a radio partnership with Lotus Broadcasting and that all Silver Knights games will be broadcast live on 1230 The Game (KLAV).

August 31, 2020 – The Henderson Silver Knights announce hiring of Manny Viveiros, who will serve as the team's first head coach.

September 4, 2020 – The Golden Knights defeated the Vancouver Canucks, 3-0, in Game 7 of the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs Second Round to advance to the Western Conference Final for the second time in franchise history.

September 15, 2020 – The Golden Knights return to Las Vegas after falling to the Dallas Stars in the Western Conference Final, ending their stay in the Edmonton bubble.

October 1, 2020 - The Golden Knights join the community in remembrance of the 1 October tragedy two years ago by hosting a blood drive at T-Mobile Arena and select players visited multiple police precincts around Las Vegas. *October 2, 2020* - Vegas goes gold! The Golden Knights and adidas unveiled today an all-new gold jersey which will serve as the team's official third jersey and is added to the current rotation.

October 3, 2020 – Vegas signs goalie Robin Lehner to a five-year contract extension.

October 7, 2020 - Vegas drafts five more players in rounds 2-7 of the 2020 NHL Entry Draft.

October 12, 2020 – The Golden Knights sign prized free agent defenseman Alex Pietrangelo to a seven-year contract. Pietrangelo was the captain of the 2019 Stanley Cup Champion St. Louis Blues.

November 9, 2020 – The Henderson Silver Knights unveil inaugural jerseys during "Jersey Knight" which was a live-streamed special that was televised on KSNV-NBC in Las Vegas and across the HSK and Vegas Golden Knights content networks.



The credential is good only for the game printed on the tag and must be displayed to a T-Mobile Arena security personnel to gain entry to restricted areas. If you apply after the cut off time, you will not be issued a credential. We will respond to all requests as promptly as possible. Please wait for confirmation on your request.

This season, all print/digital/non-rightsholder television media will receive a GREEN credential per the NHL directives.

Media Parking

The Vegas Golden Knights can provide complimentary parking. Media parking at T-Mobile Arena is located on the fifth level of the Aria parking garage. Media members who have their parking confirmed will have their names on a list with a parking attendant. 

Press Box/Stella Artois Lounge

In compliance with the National Hockey League regulations, members of the media will only be allowed in designated zones at T-Mobile Arena. This includes the press box and other specific areas designated by the Vegas Golden Knights communications department. Members of the media cannot access any other part of T-Mobile Arena other than level five unless otherwise given permission by a member of the VGK communications staff. The Press Box is on level five of T-Mobile Arena on the side opposite the team benches. Media will access the designated press elevator by following signage and guidance once inside the building. Seats in the press box are on an assigned basis only and members of the media must sit in the seat assigned to them. Please check the seating charts in the press box or check with the Golden Knights communications staff member for your seat assignment. There will be limited seating in the Press Box for media members and additional seating will be provided, albeit with an obstructed view, in the Stella Artois Lounge. Each seat will be socially distant from neighboring seats. Please do not move your seats within six-feet of another individual. If you need to use the restroom, please use the restroom inside Hyde Lounge. The Press Box restrooms will not be accessible for media. 

DAVE GOUCHER

AT&T SportsNet Play-by-Play Announcer

Dave Goucher is in his fourth season as the play-by-play voice for Golden Knights games on AT&T SportsNet. He was previously the radio play-by-play announcer for the Boston Bruins 2000-17. He has been named New England's top radio play-by-play announcer by the Associated Press three times (2003, 2006 and 2007), was awarded the Associated Press "Best Sportscast" Award in 2006 and was named the Massachusetts Sportscaster of the Year in 2013 and 2014. Goucher also calls games during the season for NBCSN.

While with the Bruins he has called several historic and exciting matchups. He was the voice in the 2010 Winter Classic at Fenway Park featuring the Bruins and Flyers and could be heard throughout the Bruins 2011 Stanley Cup Championship run. This included calls of Game 5 and Game 7 of the Bruins vs. Canadiens matchup, both of which Bruins won in double overtime and overtime, respectively, Game 7 of the Eastern Conference Final, where the Bruins defeated the Lightning to advance to the Cup Final and Game 7 of the 2011 Stanley Cup Final, in which the Bruins defeated the Canucks to take the Cup.

In 2017, Goucher called the Western Conference Final nationally on Westwood One Radio. He also called the Boston Marathon. from 2005-07 and was also the voice of the Wheeling Thunderbirds (1993-95) and then the AHL's Providence Bruins (1995-2000). He was behind the mic when the P-Bruins won the Calder Cup in 1999.

In 2013, he called Game 7 of the Bruins-Leafs matchup, where the Bruins rallied from three goals down in the third period to win the game and series in overtime. Also in 2013, Goucher was the radio play-by-play broadcaster of the Bruins-Penguins series in which the Bruins swept the Penguins to return to the Stanley Cup Final and called all six games of the Stanley Cup Final between the Bruins and the Blackhawks that year. In 2016, he called his second Winter Classic as the Bruins hosted the Montreal Canadiens at Gillette Stadium. Goucher has been a regular contributor to Bruins coverage on Comcast Sportsnet New England, the NHL Network and WCVB-TV in Boston.

He began his broadcasting career at his alma mater, Boston University, calling Terrier hockey games, including the Hockey East Championships and 1993 Frozen Four, before becoming the radio and television play-by-play announcer for the ECHL's Wheeling Thunderbirds. In 2004, he covered the Boston Red Sox winning their first World Series in 86 years and Super Bowl XXXIX.



SHANE HNIDY AT&T SportsNet Color Analyst

Shane Hnidy is in his fourth season of providing color commentary on the Golden Knights television airwaves. He was previously part of the Winnipeg Jets broadcast team from 2011-17. He was the color commentator alongside Dennis Beyak on TSN Television, as well as a part of the broadcast team on TSN Radio 1290, and handled in-studio pre-game and game recaps for TSN. Hnidy also serves as an analyst on numerous NBCSN broadcasts.

The Neepawa, Manitoba native played in the NHL from 2000-2011, playing for the Ottawa Senators, Nashville Predators, Atlanta Thrashers, Anaheim Ducks, Boston Bruins and Minnesota Wild. He was drafted in the 7th round (173rd overall) in the 1994 NHL Entry Draft by the Buffalo Sabres. As a defenseman, he played in 550 NHL games during his career, registering 16 goals and 55 assists for a total of 71 points with 633 penalty minutes.

Hnidy was a member of Atlanta's and Nashville's inaugural playoff appearances. In addition, he was a member of the Bruins' 2011 Stanley Cup championship team. He officially retired on August 21, 2011.

He joined TSN 1290 in September of 2011 as a radio analyst for the Jets and went on to become the full-time Winnipeg Jets Television color analyst for TSN in 2014. While with TSN, he served as an analyst covering the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship and the Men's World Hockey Championships for the last four years.

DAREN MILLARD AT&T SportsNet Host

Dave Goucher is in his second season as the pregame, intermission and postgame host for Golden Knights games on AT&T SportsNet. Millard brings nearly three decades of experience to the Golden Knights broadcasting team. He began his broadcasting career in radio and worked different markets in the provinces of Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

The Brandon, Manitoba native was one of the first hires ever made by Rogers Media's Sportsnet in 1998 and he worked as an on-air host with Sportsnet for 20 years. In addition to his role as host, Millard covered events such as the 2010 Winter Olympics, multiple Stanley Cup Finals, as well as the 2017 NHL Expansion Draft at T-Mobile Arena.

In December of 2018 Millard started his own hockey podcast, "The Chirp", featuring interviews from prominent figures around the NHL.



MIKE McKENNA AT&T SportsNet Studio Analyst

Mike McKenna is in his second season of providing pregame, intermission and postgame analysis for the Golden Knights. McKenna, a native of St. Louis, was drafted by the Nashville Predators in the sixth round of the 2002 NHL Draft.

The recently retired goaltender had a career that spanned 14 years in professional hockey. After playing four years of college hockey at St. Lawrence University, McKenna made his pro debut with the ECHL's Las Vegas Wranglers during the 2005-06 season and spent two years in Las Vegas. During his career, he appeared on seven different NHL teams and 12 different AHL teams. He appeared in a total of 35 NHL games and sported a goals-against average of 3.60 to go with a .890 save percentage

Since February 2019, McKenna has hosted his own podcast, "6 Degrees with Mike McKenna."



STORMY BUONANTONY AT&T SportsNet Rinkside Reporter

Stormy Buonantony is in her second season at the rinkside reporter for the Golden Knights. She is returning to her hometown of Las Vegas to be the rinkside reporter for the Golden Knights after spending the 2017-19 seasons as the in-stadium emcee and broadcast reporter for the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

Her extensive portfolio includes time with ESPN, SEC Network, Raycom Sports and NBC News, in addition to three years spent as a reporter and host for the Mountain West in Colorado. She's received numerous awards for her work including the NATAS Heartland Emmy for Technical Achievement, the Cynopsis Sport Leaderboard Award for Excellence in Social Media, and a NATAS Pacific Southwest Emmy for Outstanding Production in Sports.

Bunantony graduated from San Diego State University in 2014 with a degree in journalism.

Dan D'Uva is in his fourth season of Golden Knights radio play-by-play on flagship Fox Sports 98.9 FM / 1340 AM. He previously was the radio and TV play-by-play voice of the AHL's Syracuse Crunch since 2012. He has called some of the team's most historic games, including runs to the 2013 and 2017 Calder Cup Finals and the Toyota Frozen Dome Classic in 2014. He also contributed to two AHL All-Star Classic broadcasts, on radio in 2015 and on television in 2016.

In addition to his role with the Crunch, he hosted a daily show, "In the Booth with Dan D'Uva" on ESPN Radio Syracuse, handled on-air assignments for Time Warner Sports/Spectrum Sports, and served as a media consultant for the Cape Cod Baseball League's Chatham Anglers. He has also been an adjunct professor at Syracuse University's S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications.

Prior to that, the Ridgewood, New Jersey native was the director of public relations and broadcasting for the ECHL's Trenton Devils. He studied at Syracuse University and Fordham University and participated in student media at each school. He received WFUV's Marty Glickman Award for excellence in play-by-play in 2009.

In this role, Lawless authors in-depth breaking news stories, columns, features, event recaps and player/staff profiles on vegasgoldenknights.com and serves as the team's lead on-camera reporter, filing daily video recaps from Golden Knights practices, games, events and press conferences for the team's social channels and website. He also serves as the analyst for all radio broadcasts and is prevalent on the AT&T SportsNet's television broadcasts during the season.

Lawless joined the Golden Knights after an 18-year run in Winnipeg, Manitoba where he held several prominent media positions. He began as a beat writer and columnist for the Winnipeg Free Press covering the Canadian Football League's Winnipeg Blue Bombers and the NHL's Winnipeg Jets. In 2006 he launched the "Hustler and Lawless" Radio Show on TSN 1290 AM, a daily, drive-time sports talk radio show covering a variety of topics throughout the world of sports. He had been the show's co-host since its inception in 2006. Lawless regularly appeared as an analyst on multiple television programs, including TSN That's Hockey, TSN Sportscentre and TSN's broadcasts of Winnipeg Jets home games. Lawless is a native of Peterborough, Ontario. He and his wife Jennifer have a daughter, Lauren.




GOLDEN KNIGHTS ON RADIO

In addition to broadcasting games in English, the Vegas Golden Knights have featured Spanish broadcasts on Deportes Las Vegas 1460. The Golden Knights are one of four teams to broadcast any games in Spanish during the 2018-19 season, being joined by the Chicago Blackhawks, Los Angeles Kings and San Jose Sharks, but Vegas is the only organization that has broadcast all home games in Spanish

For the third consecutive year, Jesus Lopez will again handle the play-by-play duties, while Herbert Castro will provide analysis of games this season. Vegas was one of only two teams to broadcast games in Spanish during the 2017-18 season, being joined by Chicago. In total, 20 regular season games and all of the home games during the Stanley Cup Playoffs were heard in Spanish during the Golden Knights inaugural season. During the 2018-19 season, the organization aired all 41 regular season home games in Spanish as well as every game during the opening round of the Stanley Cup playoffs against the San Jose Sharks.

Select Golden Knights games of the Spanish feed at T-Mobile Arena are available on television through the Second Audio Program (SAP) function during home games.





T-MOBILE ARENA



T-Mobile Arena, the home of the Vegas Golden Knights, is a 650,000-square-foot entertainment and sports venue sitting on 16 acres between New York-New New York Hotel & Casino and Park MGM Las Vegas. Construction for T-Mobile Arena started on May 1, 2014 and less than two years later the arena hosted its grand opening on April 6, 2016 with a sold-out concert headlined by local legends including The Killers, "Mr. Las Vegas" Wayne Newton and emerging pop artist Shamir.

To capture the excitement of The Strip, T-Mobile Arena's design includes an expansive glass façade with an LED overlay, sweeping, dramatic balconies on every level, an outdoor performance stage and a sleek exterior that is as bold as it is sophisticated.

The design creates a visually captivating and iconic focal point in Las Vegas' bustling entertainment market.

As guests enter T-Mobile Arena, they walk through Toshiba Plaza, an open-air public venue that connects The Strip, The Park and T-Mobile Arena. This two-acre flexible event space has the ability to host outdoor basketball and volleyball events, public concerts, media events and a variety of other activations including fan festivities prior to Golden Knights games.

Inside the arena, guests can experience unrivaled premium seating options featuring Event Level Suites, Luxury Suites, Opera Boxes and Terrace Tables, as well as Club and Event Level seating programs. There are eight Event Level "Bunker" suites, 44 Luxury Suites and two Party Suites inside T-Mobile Arena. There also are nine event spaces, including several VIP Lounges and two Tower Club spaces that cantilever over the upper bowl offering unique views of the arena.

In addition to being home to the Vegas Golden Knights, the venue hosts more than 100 events annually. Past and current events include the Billboard Music Awards, iHeartRadio Music Festival, Latin GRAMMYs, Academy of Country Music (ACM) Awards, Professional Bull Riders (PBR) World Finals, the NHL Awards & Expansion Draft, Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament, concerts by some of the top touring artists in the world and major boxing events including the Floyd Mayweather vs. Conor McGregor and Canelo Alvarez vs. Gennady Golovkin bouts, among many others. T-Mobile Arena also is the exclusive Las Vegas arena destination for Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC).

T-Mobile Arena has been named the No. 1 venue on Billboard Magazine's 2018 Arena Power List and the "Best New Major Concert Venue" by Pollstar Magazine in 2016, among other recognitions since its opening.

CITY NATIONAL ARENA





When the idea of an NHL franchise in Las Vegas became a reality, Chairman and CEO Bill Foley knew that the Vegas Golden Knights would need a state-of-the-art facility that served as a home for the hockey team and the business team.

Thus, the vision for City National Arena was born. Designed to house all the needs of a hockey team and staff, the building was tailored for a new franchise and its excited fanbase. Equipped with two sheets of ice, office space, top-tier training and medical equipment, and an expansive locker room, the rink effectively serves all the needs of the team and business as it laid its roots in Las Vegas.

The fan experience was an important aspect of the building's design as the organization wanted the people of Las Vegas to embrace the Golden Knights. City National Arena serves the needs of the community by housing youth and adult hockey programs as well as multitiered figure skating programs. Between the sheets lies Mackenzie River Pizza, a full-service grill and pub which serves as a common place for fans to gather and watch Golden Knights games on television. The Arsenal, located in the building lobby, is the home to unique team apparel as well as a fully functioning hockey pro shop.

After the inaugural season of Golden Knights hockey, the building transformed to reflect the team's brand identity that developed during that first year. A state-of-the-art video scoreboard was installed on the team's main practice rink and a castle structure was built around it. Black, gray and gold paint was laid upon the walls of the building to create a feel that matched the team's uniform.
