From launching football teams at urban high schools to urging students to be active for at least 60 minutes every day to fostering positive school environments, the New York

Jets invest in programs that make a difference in the lives of others. In addition to our focus on youth development, the Jets support the efforts of the Lupus Research Alliance and numerous established charitable organizations and causes sponsored by the NFL.

### **LUPUS RESEARCH ALLIANCE**

The New York Jets organization is deeply committed to supporting the Lupus Research Alliance, a national voluntary health organization cofounded by Robert Wood Johnson IV - a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson and owner of the New York Jets. The Lupus Research Alliance's mission is to find better treatments and ultimately prevent and cure systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE, or lupus), a debilitating autoimmune disease, by supporting the most promising and innovative lupus biomedical research. Collectively to date, the organization has committed over \$200 million to lupus research projects at the most prestigious universities, medical schools and hospitals throughout the world.

Born from the merger of three organizations with a common belief in the potential for science to overcome lupus, the Lupus



Research Alliance is at the forefront of driving innovative research that can make a difference for people living with the prototypical autoimmune disease. ### **JETS TACKLE BULLYING**



The Jets Tackle Bullying program is a collaboration with STOMP Out Bullying to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators and preventing bullying for kids and teens. The Jets have made available a team branded STOMP Out Bullying

Educator's Prevention Toolkit at no cost to schools in the tri-state area. This toolkit enables educators to create meaningful dialogue,

educate students through proven Social Emotional Learning methods, adopt character building in schools and involve both students and faculty in working together to change school climate. In addition, the Jets are funding a digital training tool reaching every school throughout the New York Change The Culture City Department of Education.



Schools that sign up for the toolkit or complete the digital training course are invited to our annual Educator's Symposium designed to provide teachers and administrators resources to improve the culture at their schools. Schools that attend the symposium are then given additional opportunities to engage with the Jets through our Upstander of the Week and School Recognition programs.

The Upstander of the Week Program highlights one student per week during the season across our social media platforms and on the video boards during home games. "When you see someone being bullied and/or cyberbullied and you help them, you stop being a bystander and become an Upstander!" Our School Recognition Program focuses on schools who demonstrate and can articulate how their school combats bullying. Selected schools receive a fun filled assembly featuring a Jets player.

### YOUTH FOOTBALL

The New York Jets are committed to growing the game of football through a comprehensive outreach program designed to provide opportunities for underserved communities to



play football. In addition, we fund training and equipment to ensure safety for all participants.

### **FLAG FOOTBALL**

The Jets fund and create thousands of flag football opportunities for children ages 5-18 to enjoy America's favorite sport. Players benefit by being physically active through non-contact, continuous action while learning the fundamentals of football, lessons in teamwork and sportsmanship.

In 2018, the New York Jets presented a combined donation of \$60,000 to New York City Police Athletic League (PAL) and New York City Parks and Recreation (Parks and Rec.) to operate an NFL FLAG Football program powered by USA Football. Through funding provided by the Jets Foundation, over 3,000 New York City youth have the opportunity to play flag football at no cost. All participants are given a free Jets NFL FLAG jersey and top teams from each program competed in a tournament hosted at the Jets practice facility. The winning team represented the Jets at the NFL FLAG Championships at the Pro Bowl in Orlando, Florida.

Each year the Jets provide \$50,000 to support the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) Girls Varsity Flag Football League. The league created in 2011 by the PSAL and Jets has nearly doubled from 31 to now almost 60 schools participating. USA Football was also instrumental in helping to get the league off the ground with flag belts and footballs for each program.



Since 2007, the Jets have provided annual funding for the expansion of CHAMPS Middle School Flag Football League to more than 3,700 students at 111 programs throughout the New York City public school system. The CHAMPS Middle School Sports and Fitness League is an initiative of the New York City Department of Education that promotes

student physical activity during the critical years of middle school. The name CHAMPS derives from the initials of the five characteristics that describe our participants: Cooperative, Healthy, Active, Motivated and Positive Students. For more information go to schools.nyc.gov.



### **SNY PLAY BALL: FOOTBALL WEEK**

The New York Jets have teamed up with our television partner, SNY, to offer support for youth football leagues in our community through SNY Play Ball: Football Week. SNY Play Ball offers leagues the opportunity to receive new footballs, tickets to a Jets preseason game, attend an exclusive youth football clinic and volunteer with league projects in our local community. In addition, one eligible organization will receive a \$5,000 grant to be put towards new equipment for the upcoming season. The program will culminate in "Play Ball Week," where SNY will honor and highlight individuals and selected organizations daily on the television network and website. ### **PUBLIC SCHOOLS ATHLETIC LEAGUE**



In 2001, the New York Jets artheric league formed a community partnership

with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. Through an annual matching grant from the NFL's Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets now donate \$100,000 to the PSAL's football programs. This grant has helped to create 15 new and developmental football teams. The funding also assisted in the reconditioning of every student-athletes' helmet and the cost for PSAL coaches to become USA Football Heads Up certified. Beyond these grants, the Jets support the PSAL in a variety of other ways including honoring the PSAL football champions at a home game during the NFL season.

### HIGH SCHOOL COACH OF THE WEEK



For 10 weeks during the football season. the Jets and Gatorade present the High

School Coach of the Week award to a coach in the tri-state area. This coach serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to



achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to his community, his school and his student-athletes. Gatorade and the Jets award each winner with a \$2,000 check for their high school's football program. In addition to the weekly award, a Coach of the Year is selected at the end of the high school season. The Coach of the Year winner is awarded \$4,000 and receives a Gatorade cooler cart from the Jets and Gatorade.

### **JETS 11-ON TOURNAMENT**



In 2019, the Jets hosted a 46-team high school football tournament. The program was held at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center over three days in June. The event was comprised of both a traditional 7on7 tournament, as well as a linemen challenge. High schools from the tri-state area competed in pool and

bracket play. The tournament was free of charge to all schools and participants received a complimentary pair of New York Jets shorts and 11-ON shirts, courtesy of the Jets and Nike. The 7on7 and linemen challenge champions will be invited to a future Jets home game and honored on-field prior to kickoff. ### PLAY 60

The New York Jets have taken a stance in the fight against childhood obesity through fitness and nutrition programs under the Jets PLAY 60 platform, which encourages children to get 60 minutes of activity every day.

### **PLAY 60 EAT RIGHT. MOVE MORE**

Launched in 2006, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Jets PLAY 60 Eat Right, Move More Program in partnership with the American Dairy Association Northeast (ADANE) encourages New Jersey school children to take advantage of healthy foods in their school cafeterias and become more active through grant incentives and Jets player visits.



The campaign encourages schools to challenge their students to get 60 NEW JERSEY minutes of physical activity every day and invites schools to submit their most creative cafeteria meal menus to determine which New Jersey schools

each year go above and beyond state and federal guidelines. Annually, the Jets and ADANE provide \$30,000 to schools, which can be used for cafeteria infrastructure improvements and physical education equipment. One grand champion school receives a \$20,000 grant as well as a Jets School Takeover Day. Two division champion schools receive a \$5,000 grant.

### **PLAY 60 FLAG FOOTBALL PROGRAM**

The Jets PLAY 60 Flag Football Program encompasses 6th Grade students from six Morris County Schools where the Jets provided flag belts, jerseys and footballs to operate a flag football unit. All six participating schools, Chatham Middle School, Harding Middle School, LC Johnson Middle School, Madison Jr. School, Ridgedale Middle School and St. Vincent The Martyr School encouraged students to participate in at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day while learning the game of football. As a culmination, each school will compete in a tournament at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center.

### **FUEL UP TO PLAY 60 HOMETOWN GRANTS**

Through the Fuel Up to PLAY 60 program, the New York Jets and American Dairy Association Northeast are \$5,000 Hometown Grants offering two to eligible schools in Nassau County and Suffolk County that best showcase how X their students stay active for 60 minutes o per day, as well as provide increased access



to school breakfast and ensure their students are fueled to learn. Grants will be awarded to one school in each county to help facilitate sustainable physical activity and eating improvements. Schools not already enrolled in the Fuel Up to PLAY 60 program can enroll at www.fueluptoplay60.com and email Kristina Deecher at kdeecher@ Milk4u.org for the online grant application. Fuel Up to Play 60 is an in-school nutrition and physical activity program launched by National Dairy Council and National Football League, with additional support from the US Department of Agriculture. The program encourages youth to consume nutrient-rich foods and achieve at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day. Proper nutrition and consistent physical activity are both necessities for maintaining a healthy child.

### **HOMETOWN HUDDLE**

The Jets and United Way's Hometown Huddle is an annual day of service that provides the Jets rookie class the opportunity to participate in a community service project together. Each year, the Jets Hometown Huddle consists of building a Jets PLAY 60 fitness zone in an underserved community. Since 2008, the New York Jets have donated \$525,000 to build PLAY 60 Fitness Zones throughout New Jersey.



### CHARITABLE PARTNERSHIPS



The New York Jets are committed to giving back to our community. That is why we partner with numerous charitable organizations throughout the tri-state PARTNERSHIPS area. We are proud to help further the mission of these critical programs which

truly make a difference in the lives of many people.

### ATLANTIC HEALTH JETS WOMEN'S ORGANIZATION

In 2008, the Jets Women's Organization and Atlantic Health partnered to form the Atlantic Health Jets Women's Organization (AHJWO). Through this partnership, the AHJWO can accomplish its mission of working together to build goodwill in the tri-state community through active volunteer participation. Comprised of significant others of players, coaches, and football staff, the Jets Community Relations Department oversees the organization. The AHJWO serves as a unique and positive outlet in the community on behalf of the New York Jets and seeks to team up with select charities to assist in maximizing the impact of their events. The work of the AHJWO would not be possible without the partnership with Atlantic Health.





### **UNITED WAY**

Since 1973, United Way, the NFL and the New York Jets have had the most visible and longest-running charitable collaboration of its kind. Every year, thanks to community service projects and public service announcements, millions of Americans learn about United Way's vital work and the volunteer spirit of the NFL.



Combining their rich histories of community involvement, United Way of New York City, United Way of Northern New Jersey, United Way of Essex and West Hudson and the New York Jets have teamed

up to drive home the importance of community involvement. Their community outreach efforts include the Hometown Huddle, an annual hands-on volunteer project with players, the Gridiron Gala, New York City's premier charity event, Character Playbook, an innovative digital learning experience that uses evidence-based strategies to educate students on how to cultivate and maintain healthy relationships during their critical middle school years and Tix for Kids, a charitable ticket turn-back program for season ticket holders.

The New York Jets implement Tix For Kids with the United Way of New York City. The charitable ticket distribution program was created in 2003 to give season ticket holders an opportunity to donate their tickets to underprivileged children. This program allows numerous children to experience the excitement of the NFL first-hand as many of them have never attended a professional football game.

United Way of New York City makes these donated tickets available to children and youth participating in their programs via communitybased organizations throughout New York City, including Children's Aid Society, East Side House, Good Shepherd Services, Partnership with Children, Sports & Arts in Schools Foundation and many others.

Log in to your My Jets Account at am.ticketmaster.com/nyjets. There is no charge for this service. Upon receipt of your ticket donation, United Way will issue a written letter of confirmation recognizing your charitable donation for tax purposes.

### **WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR**

Since 1970, the NFL has awarded the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award to recognize a player's off-thefield community service, as well as

his playing excellence. The Jets award MAN OF THE YEAR winner will receive \$50,000 to donate to the 501(c)(3) organization of his choice. The team's recipient is eligible to win the national Walter Payton Man of the Year Award and be recognized at a press conference during Super Bowl Week. The national winner will receive \$500,000 to donate to the 501(c)(3) organization of his choice. The Jets have had two national winners, Marty Lyons in 1984 and Boomer Esiason in 1995.

### MARTY LYONS COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

Named after 2013 Ring of Honor inductee, Marty Lyons, the Marty Lyons Award is presented each year to a New York Jets player that gives from the heart through charity and community involvement (as voted by Jets staff). Lyons played the entirety of his 12-year NFL career with the New York Jets as a member of the feared "Sack Exchange." In 1984, Lyons was named the National Football League's Man of the Year and in 1990 the New York Jets renamed their Outstanding Community Service Award because of Lyons' commitment to the community.

# **METLIFE STADIUM**



In 2010, New Meadowlands Stadium became the home of the New York Jets. The venue was renamed MetLife Stadium on August 23, 2011, when MetLife acquired the naming rights. MetLife Stadium is one of the highest-profile stadiums in the country, and was honored as the 2017 "Venue of the Year" by The StadiumBusiness Awards. In 2016, the Stadium had its busiest year since opening, drawing nearly 3 million fans to a record 61 major events and 210 smaller private events.

MetLife Stadium bleeds green on Jets game days. Fans have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game. They can catch the ESPN New York - 98.7FM pregame radio show broadcast live from the west plaza, head to the Kids Zone for familyfun activities and enjoy a vast array of food and beverages on the Stadium's multiple concourses. Fans can also find the latest gear at the team's 10,000 square-foot flagship plaza store. The intimate seating bowl, uncompromised sight lines, cutting-edge video boards, LED signage and state-of-the-art sound system all enhance the game-watching experience.

MetLife and the cornerstone partners – Bud Light, Dell EMC/SAP, Pepsi and Verizon – are also integrated into the game experience with ample space to engage and entertain fans.

One of the biggest upgrades in MetLife Stadium is the availability of club seats. There are four clubs - EY Coaches Club, MetLife 50 Club, Toyota Club and United Rentals Club – that offer access to VIP reserved parking, a private club entrance, as well as a host of other amenities and benefits.



### ATLANTIC HEALTH JETS TRAINING CENTER



The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, located at One Jets Drive in Florham Park, New Jersey has been the headquarters of the Jets since its official ribbon cutting on September 2, 2008. Designed by Skidmore Owings + Merrill, the 224,000 square-foot complex sits on nearly 100 acres of open space and provides players, coaches and staff with a best-in-class facility to learn, practice and work within 30 minutes of both MetLife Stadium and Newark Liberty International Airport.

### A UNITED ORGANIZATION

Prior to the opening of the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the team's operations were split between two locations. Located on the campus of Hofstra University, Weeb Ewbank Hall housed the players, coaches and football support staff, while the business operations were located in New York City.

In the creation of the new facility, Chairman & CEO Woody Johnson looked to unite all elements of the franchise under one roof. In the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the organization now has a building that seamlessly combines the operations of both the football and business departments. Equipped with open-concept workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment, the training center was a major contributing factor in the team being named one of Inc. Magazine's Top Small Company Workplaces in 2010. An outdoor terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, provides a business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners.



### **FOOTBALL FACILITIES**

Featuring state-of-the-art training and medical facilities that combine the latest advances in rehabilitation pools, high-performance equipment and nutrition, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center also has five full-size football fields: three natural grass, two Sportexe synthetic turf field, one outdoors, and another indoors in the Field House, each with a permanent scoreboard. Additionally, the goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be repositioned 90 degrees to help minimize some of the wear throughout the season. With a first floor that is all football, the facility houses a 5,500-square-foot locker room, an 11,000-square-foot weight room and a 10,000-square-foot cafeteria.

As a "graduate school for football" - an element that was important in the design of the building - the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center has more than 25,000 square feet of space dedicated to classrooms and instruction space, including 10 classrooms. The classroom also provides direct access to both the indoor and outdoor practice field, allowing for seamless transition between classroom and practice.

### TRAINING CAMP

For the fourth consecutive year, the New York Jets will host training camp at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, in addition to all team mini-camps and organized team activities. The facility has hosted a number of open practices, and welcomed over 30,000 Jets fans over the last three years.

During all open Training Camp practices, fans are able to take advantage of bleachers for enhanced viewing, a shuttle service to and from the parking lot, water and sunscreen stations close to the field, cooling zones, a food court and a fan zone fully equipped with family-friendly activities. Additionally, all fans can enjoy Training Camp staples including Jets Fest, Jets Experience and the Jets Shop tent, while members of the Gen Jets Kids Club, have access to a kids-only player autograph area.

This year, the AHJTC will feature four open practices as well as play host to a variety of youth camps and football teams.

# CHRISTOPHER JOHNSON





CHAIRMAN & CEO

CHRISTOPHER WOLD JOHNSON, an owner of the New York Jets since 2000, enters his third season as chairman & CEO. A fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, he has overseen pivotal changes within the organization, including key additions both on and off the field, as well as an update to the club's brand and uniform for the first time in 20 years.

This offseason, Johnson oversaw the hiring of Head Coach Adam Gase and General Manager Joe Douglas to establish a new foundation for the organization based on his vision of a winning culture throughout the franchise. In these key hires, he showed his commitment to building a strong, successful and united organization.

"Adam really stood out as the best fit for the New York Jets," Johnson said introducing Gase. "My expectations for this team under Adam are very high. In short, I chose him to win. To win for our players. To win for this organization. And most importantly, to win for our fans." In Douglas, Johnson saw someone who shared his vision for not just the team, but the entire organization. "A great general manager

must be more than an excellent talent evaluator, they must be able to build and sustain a winning culture," Johnson said. "Joe has a tremendous football pedigree, while also playing integral roles in building championship teams. I feel that we now have the right people in charge of our football operation."

In April of 2019, the organization unveiled three new uniforms, along with a refreshed logo, the first changes to both in over 20 years. "Our goal was to create a modern and innovative look for the future of our franchise," said Johnson. "We believe these uniforms will appeal to fans of all ages and the design is one that both fans and players would be extremely proud to wear. I am extremely excited to usher in the next generation of the New York Jets." In addition to the uniforms and logo, the team also added noticeable changes to the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center to reflect the re-brand and will modify fan elements at MetLife Stadium for the 2019 season.

In his two seasons as chairman & CEO, Johnson has developed a strong bond with his players and worked closely with them to advance social justice initiatives. In December of 2018, Johnson donated to five non-profit social justice organizations that aim to combat social inequality and reduce barriers to opportunity. Additionally,

he matched donations by Jets players and coaches for charities focused on education, community/police relations, criminal justice reform, as well as other initiatives, including reducing poverty, racial equality and workforce development.

In 2017, Johnson regularly met with the team's leadership council to discuss social justice matters and serve as a resource. Moreover, he accompanied players to the Bronx public defender's office to learn about challenges facing the criminal justice system. In February 2018, he joined the players in sending a letter to New York Governor Andrew Cuomo advocating for bail reform.

Engaged in all aspects of the organization, Johnson places an emphasis on the team's year-round commitment to the community, primarily through the New York Jets Foundation. The Foundation funds programs that look to positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area through the promotion of fitness, youth football support and the prevention of bullying, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the charities supported by the Foundation is the club's trail-blazing anti-bullying program, Jets Tackle Bullying. The program aims to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators and preventing bullying for kids and teens.

A dedicated proponent of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. The center, named for his mother, Betty, aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies. On a national level, Johnson donated \$1M on behalf of the Jets to the American Red Cross in the wake of the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey.

**NEIL GLAT** is in his eighth season with the Jets after being named President in April 2012. Glat reports directly to Jets Chairman and CEO, Christopher Johnson, and oversees all elements of team business operations.

Glat and his executive staff have focused on continuously improving the fan/consumer experience, deepening the team's connections with its passionate fans, and striving to be best-inclass in all areas of the sports business. Glat has elevated the organization's gameday and off-field activities through positive relationships with business partners and community leaders. These efforts have led to many new partnerships including most recently with Def Jam Recordings, Marvel, and WWE, innovative initiatives such as PilotVision (an in-stadium second screen experience) and the Jets Rewards program (including digital/ mobile ticketing and Jets Cash), and the team's investment and active involvement in Sapphire Sport (a sports technology venture capital firm).

Other key efforts have included spearheading a new uniform (the first change in 20 years) that was revealed with much fanfare in April 2019, fan-friendly stadium capital improvements (such as "The Hangar"), novel ticketing approaches (which resulted in the Jets being #1 in the NFL in group and individual ticket sales for the 2018 season), award-winning virtual reality offerings, a state-of-the-art mobile app, the Jets Fan Hall of Fame, new television shows on WCBS ("Jets Late Night"), SNY, and Facebook Watch ("One Jets Drive"), and the launch of Jets 360, an Emmy award-winning content platform that produces high quality videos across television, digital, and social platforms. The Jets recently were recognized as "The Most Innovative Sports Team" by SportTechie, a leading sports and technology digital publication, as well as one of the "Best Places to Work in New Jersey 2018" by NJ Biz.

During Glat's tenure, the team implemented a year-round fan engagement calendar that has resulted in increased fan and partner involvement at events like Jets House, Draft parties, Taste of the Jets, and Town Hall. The team advanced strategic partnerships with leading companies and entities such as Anheuser-Busch, Atlantic Health, CBS, Dell-EMC, ESPN, JetBlue, M&T Bank, MetLife, NYU, Pepsi, SAP, SNY, Ticketmaster, Toyota, United Rentals, Verizon, and Visa, among many others. In addition, the team was an early mover and innovator in the gaming space with its recent deal and activations with MGM. Glat also has advanced programs that strengthen the team's relationships with Jets alumni, including Legends Community Weekend, and business partners through the Jets Partner Alliance.

Glat has led community-based initiatives, including the heralded Jets Tackling Bullying program in partnership with STOMP Out Bullying. The team hosts educators at the annual Jets Tackling Bullying Symposium, highlighting best practices in anti-bullying education, and has funded digital training tools for educators in conjunction with the New York City Department of Education. Other initiatives include working with players in support of specific social justice non-profits and the #JetsLunch program where players go into schools and have lunch with students that need moral support.

Prior to joining the Jets, Glat was the National Football League's Senior Vice President of Corporate Development. Glat headed a department responsible for League strategic initiatives, Club business development, stadium development, and new business opportunities. Glat's Club business development activities entailed initiating and overseeing the League efforts to help generate business growth for all 32 NFL Clubs.

His stadium development activities included advancing numerous successful new stadium projects and the League's multi-billion dollar G-3 and G-4 stadium financing programs. Also, he negotiated numerous commercial transactions, including secondary ticketing deals with Ticketmaster which led to the creation of the NFL Ticket Exchange and video game deals with Electronic Arts relating to Madden NFL, and he conceptualized and secured approval for the launch of the NFL venture capital fund. Glat worked at the NFL from 1997-2012.



"My first steps and priorities here are simply to engage and connect with the entire organization," Douglas said during his press conference. "Adam Gase and I share a vision of building a team and I look forward to partnering with him and getting this program to a place where we are consistently competing for championships each and every year.

"To Jets nation, you are getting a general manager that is a relentless worker, someone that understands a winning culture, someone that is going to strive to put a product on the field each Sunday that competes for greatness and that I hope will make you proud."

Before joining the Jets, Douglas spent the previous three seasons as the vice president of player personnel with the Eagles. In Philadelphia, he was a key component in acquiring many of the players that helped win Super Bowl LII, including the game's MVP, quarterback Nick Foles.

Using every avenue to help improve the team, Douglas was part of a front office that acquired the players who scored all but two of the team's postseason touchdowns, including four of the five touchdowns in the Super Bowl. A trio of 2017 unrestricted free agent signings - LeGarrette Blount, Foles and Alshon Jeffery - as well as a pair of street free agents - Patrick Robinson and Torrey Smith - all contributed scores on the team's title run. The Eagles' leading receiver in the Super Bowl, running back Corey Clement, was signed as an undrafted free agent, while the team's leading rusher in the game, running back Jay Ajayi, joined the club as a midseason trade.

Prior to joining the Eagles, Douglas spent a season as the director of college scouting for Chicago (2015), first working with Gase, the then offensive coordinator for the Bears.

Entering the NFL as a player personnel assistant (2000) the year Baltimore won Super Bowl XXXV, Douglas ascended within the Ravens organization, holding various posts in the organization's scouting department, serving as a national scout (2012-15), Southeast area scout (2009-11), East Coast area scout (2008) and Northeast area scout (2003-07), helping add a number of prominent players via the draft, including the Super Bowl XLVII MVP, quarterback Joe Flacco, as well as a number of Pro Bowl players – Ben Grubbs, C.J. An All-Atlantic 10 selection, Douglas started 45 consecutive games at tackle for the University of Richmond. Following his collegiate playing career, he transitioned into a volunteer assistant coach role with the Spiders in 1999.

As an offensive and defensive lineman at Lee-Davis (VA) HS, Douglas was recognized as a two-time all-state honoree.

Chad Alexander is in his first season with the Jets as director, player personnel. Alexander will work closely with both General Manager Joe Douglas and Assistant General Manager Rex Hogan in a collaborative effort to oversee the Player Personnel department.

Before joining the Jets, Alexander was a Ravens executive for 20 seasons, the last nine of which he served as the assistant director of pro personnel. Phil Savage is in his first season with the Jets as a senior football advisor. In his role, he will evaluate college prospects and pro players, while providing valuable insight on the player personnel department's overall philosophy, grading system and annual approach to building the club's roster and practice squad.

Joining the team this offseason, Savage brings over 20 years of NFL front office experience, including four seasons as senior vice president and general manager with the Cleveland Browns (2005-08). Prior to joining the Jets, he worked as the Reese's Senior Bowl executive director (2012-18) and served as the general manager of the Arizona Hotshots in the Alliance of American Football (2018-19).

Savage entered the league as a defensive assistant coach with the Browns [1991], before transitioning to scouting in 1994. He has held several positions with Cleveland [1991-95, 2005-08], Baltimore [1996-04] and Philadelphia [2010-12]. During his nine seasons in Baltimore, the Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV and drafted ten Pro Bowl players, including Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees, Jonathan Ogden,

Ray Lewis and Ed Reed. His tenure with the Browns was highlighted by a 10-win season in 2007 and the selection of perennial Pro Bowl offensive tackle Joe Thomas.

Prior to the NFL, Savage worked at the University of Alabama as a graduate assistant (1987) and the tight ends coach (1988-89) before transitioning to a similar role at UCLA (1990).

From 2009-17, he was the color commentator for the Crimson Tide Sports Network, when the Alabama Football program won five National Championships (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017). He was also a front office insider for ESPN (2013-17) and provided analysis for SiriusXM on their NFL and college conference channels (2013-19). In 2017, St. Martin's Press published Savage's first book, 4th and Goal Every Day, Alabama's Relentless Pursuit of Perfection.

Savage received a degree in English from the University of the South in Sewanee, TN. He played both football and baseball and was a three-time all-conference shortstop in baseball. He went on to receive a master's degree in physical education from the University of Alabama in 1989.

### SENIOR DIRECTOR

### FOOTBALL ADMINISTRATION

David Socie is in his third year with the Jets after returning to the organization in 2018 as the senior director, football administration. His primary responsibilities include working closely with General Manager Joe Douglas and Jets staff in matters regarding player contracts, the team's salary cap, the NFL Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) and NFL Rules. He previously served in this role with the Jets during the 2006 season.

Before rejoining the Jets, Socie spent eight years working at the National Football League office. He served as Director of Labor Operations and Senior Director of Labor Operations in the NFL Management Council. In those roles, his responsibilities included advising club executives on player contracts, the salary cap, player-related areas of the CBA, and NFL Rules. He also oversaw the approval of all player contracts, monitored Clubs' compliance with the salary cap and participated in the CBA negotiation process.

### **COLLEGE SCOUTING**

Jon Carr is in his second season as the director, college scouting with the Jets after 11 seasons with the Texans, the last three as their director of college scouting. Prior to that he served as national and college scout with Houston.

In his current role, Carr manages the college scouting department and assigns responsibilities to the team's national and college scouts. He works directly with General Manager Joe Douglas on evaluating college prospects around the country and organizing the college free agency process. He also organizes and helps manage the personnel meetings leading up to the NFL Draft.

Prior to joining an NFL front office with the Texans, Carr worked as the wide receivers coach at the University of Toledo (2005-06) and as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Eastern Illinois (2003-04). He began his college coaching career at Tennessee State, first as an assistant coach (1997-99) and later as the offensive coordinator (2000-02).



## COACHING **STAFF**





### ADAM GASE

### EXPERIENCE 1

#### HEAD COACH

**ADAM GASE** was named the head coach of the New York Jets by Chairman & CEO Christopher Johnson on January 11, 2019. For Gase, he becomes the 17th full-time coach in franchise history.

Under Gase, starting quarterbacks have produced 38 games with a 100+ passer rating, a number that would tie him for 10th among all NFL franchises since 2013 – higher than the total of all three franchises he's worked with in that span. Additionally, every quarterback (Peyton Manning, Jay Cutler, Ryan Tannehill, Matt Moore and Brock Osweiler) who has started at least two games for him has produced a 100+ passer rating performance. Since 2013 (his first season calling plays), nine different running backs have produced 100-yard games under Gase, while in his three seasons as Miami's head coach, the Dolphins ground game averaged 4.36 yards per carry, the 10th best average in the league, and Miami running backs accounted for a 4.49 average, the third best in the league. Additionally, Dolphins running backs have 33 carries of 20+ yards in that span, tied for the fourth most in the league.

Beginning with his first season in Denver (2009), he has coached 16 different players to the Pro Bowl, including 12 offensive players — multiple players at offensive line, wide receiver and running back.

Prior to his appointment as Jets head coach, Gase spent 16 seasons as a coach in the NFL, the last six calling plays for three different franchises, including record-setting offensive output as the offensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos (2013), his first season calling plays in the NFL. In his last position, Gase spent three seasons (2016-18) as the head coach for the Miami Dolphins, where he compiled a 23-25 record and led the franchise to a postseason berth in his first season.

As the Dolphins head coach, he posted a 20-6 record in onescore games (+/- eight points), a .769 winning percentage, the best among any team in the league. Buoyed by the fact that his team registered the sixth most touchdowns in the fourth quarter of close games (+/- seven points), Gase also saw his quarterbacks post the 10th highest passer rating in those scenarios.

YPSILANTI, MI | 🦝 MICHIGAN STATE

In his first season under Gase's leadership (2016), Tannehill posted the most efficient season of his NFL career, completing 67.1% of his passes for a 7.7 yards per attempt average and a 93.5 passer rating, all career highs, while also leading the league with a red zone passer rating of 119.7 as the Dolphins broke an eight-year playoff drought.

Before his time in South Florida, Gase spent a season as the offensive coordinator with the Chicago Bears (2015), improving the team's rushing yardage ranking from No. 27 the season before to No. 11. Under his tutelage, Cutler finished the season with the highest passer rating (92.3) of his career, threw seven fewer interceptions than the previous season, and posted a single-season-best 2.3 percent interception rate.

Prior to Chicago, Gase served on the Broncos staff in a variety of roles, including offensive coordinator (2013-14), quarterbacks coach (2011-12) and wide receivers coach (2009-10) as Denver won four AFC West titles, three playoff games and an AFC Championship.

In two seasons as the offensive coordinator (2013-14), Gase oversaw a record-setting offense that produced over 430 yards per game, including 315.8 yards per game passing and 34 points per game, all the best in the league over that span. In 2013, they set NFL single-season records for most points scored (606) and most passing yards (5,444), while five different players (three wide receivers, a tight end and a running back) all scored 10+touchdowns.

Additionally, Manning established single-season NFL records in passing yards (5,477) and passing touchdowns (55), earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors for his efforts. In three seasons under Gase (2012-14), Manning posted a 131-to-35 touchdown to interception ratio, completing 67.7% of his passes for a passer rating of 107.8.

### **ADAM GASE**



In his first season as the team's quarterbacks coach (2011), Gase oversaw quarterbacks Kyle Orton and Tim Tebow, as the latter helped guide the team to a division title and a postseason berth. Under Gase, Tebow ran for 660 yards and six touchdowns, at the time, the ninth-highest rushing total by a quarterback since the merger.

He initially served on Denver's staff as the team's wide receivers coach (2009-10). In those years, he coached a pair of Pro Bowlers, first wide receiver Brandon Marshall (2009), who produced 101 receptions for 1,120 yards and 10 touchdowns, and then wide receiver Brandon Lloyd (2010), who led the league with 1,448 yards on 77 receptions (18.8 average).

Before joining the Broncos staff, Gase spent one season with San Francisco as an offensive assistant under Offensive Coordinator Mike Martz, assisting an offensive that saw running back Frank Gore produce over 1,000 yards rushing.

Gase entered the NFL ranks with the Detroit Lions in 2003, serving as scouting/coaching assistant for three seasons under Steve Mariucci before becoming an offensive quality control coach in 2006 and the quarterbacks coach in 2007 under Rod Marinelli. In his season as quarterbacks coach, Jon Kitna posted 4,068 passing yards, the second-highest total of his 14-year career, finishing sixth in the league in passing yards.

FRANK BUSH begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's assistant head coach defense/ linebackers on February 8, 2019. For Bush, he enters his 28th season coaching in the NFL, remaining with Gase after two seasons in Miami and reuniting with Defensive Coordinator Gregg Williams, whom he coached with for three seasons with the Rams.

Prior to joining the Jets, Bush served two seasons with the Dolphins, as the team's assistant head coach/linebackers coach. Last season, linebacker Kiko Alonso (125) finished tied for 10th in the league in total tackles after finishing 13th a season earlier (according to radar360). Another of his charges, linebacker Raekwon McMillan, in his first season on the field after missing all of his rookie season due to injury, also posted a 100-tackle season. Alonso and McMillan became one of just seven linebacker combos last season to each register 100+ tackles.

Bush spent four seasons as the Rams linebackers coach (2013-16), where he helped Alec Ogletree finish ninth among all NFL linebackers in total tackles (408) in just 52 games played in that span, while James Laurinaitis (335) finished 20th in just 48 games (2013-15). Ogletree's 11 forced fumbles were tied for the fourth most among all linebackers in that span, while his five interceptions ranked tied for eighth and his 33 passes defensed were tied for second-most (all stats according to radar360). Additionally, Bush helped Mark Barron, selected seventh overall in 2012 as a safety, switch to linebacker in the middle of the 2015 season. That season, Barron finished with 117 tackles, second on the team.

Returning to the Oilers/Titans organization in 2011, Bush spent two seasons in Tennessee (2011-12) and helping two rookies, 2012 secondround pick Akeem Ayers and 2011 fourth-round selection Colin McCarthy, earn starting roles.

Bush spent four seasons with the Texans (2007-10), the first two as a senior defensive assistant, working primarily with the defensive line, before serving as the team's defensive coordinator (2009-10). During his time in Houston, he saw the emergence of defensive end Mario Williams and linebackers DeMeco Ryans and Brian Cushing as Pro Bowl players, with Cushing earning Defensive Rookie of the Year honors in 2009.

Before joining the Texans, Bush spent three seasons (2004-06) with Arizona as the linebackers coach, adding the assistant head coach title in 2006. While he was with the Cardinals, Karlos Dansby, a second-round rookie in 2004, produced three-year totals of 222 tackles, 17.0 sacks, five forced fumbles and four interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns. In that span, he was one of only four players to produce at least 200 tackles, 15.0 sacks, five forced fumbles and four interceptions and the only one to score multiple touchdowns.

In his time with Denver (1995-2003), Bush earned two Super Bowl rings (XXXII and XXXIII), serving several different roles, including special teams coach (2001-03), secondary/nickel coach (2000) and linebackers coach (1995-99).

A three-year starter at North Carolina State, he was selected in the fifth round by the Oilers in the 1985 NFL Draft. A starter at linebacker as a rookie, Bush earned All-Rookie honors before an injury in his second season and subsequent diagnosis of a narrow spinal canal forced an early end to his playing career.

Following his on-field career with Houston, he joined the team as a college scout for five seasons (1987-91) before transitioning to the coaching staff, initially as the team's linebackers coach (1992) and then as the defensive quality control/linebackers coach (1993-94).

Born in Athens, GA, Bush is married to wife, Stephanie.

SHAWN JEFFERSON begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's assistant head coach offense/wide receivers on February 8, 2019. A wide receiver in the league for 13 seasons, this marks Jefferson's 15th season coaching in the NFL.

In Jefferson's three seasons in Miami, Dolphins wide receivers averaged 4.9 yards after catch, the fifth-best average in the league, and accounted for 52 touchdowns, tied for sixth most. Additionally, Miami wide receivers accounted for 70.8% of the team's receptions, the second-highest percentage in the league during that span.

In two seasons with Jefferson, wide receiver Jarvis Landry made two Pro Bowl appearances, pulling in 206 total receptions, the third-most of any player in the league, while wide receiver Kenny Stills posted 21 touchdowns in his three seasons under Jefferson, the ninth-most in the league.

Jefferson spent three seasons (2013-15) with the Titans as wide receiver Kendall Wright finished seventh in the league with 94 receptions in posting his first 1,000-yard season in just his second season (2013). Wide receivers Nate Washington (2013-14) and Justin Hunter (2013-14) each averaged at least 16.0 yards per catch during Jefferson's time in Tennessee.

Prior to Tennessee, Jefferson spent eight seasons on the Lions staff, beginning as a coaching assistant in 2005 and moving up to wide receivers

coach where he served from 2008-12. During his time in Detroit, he helped wide receiver Calvin Johnson set an NFL singleseason record with 1,964 yards receiving (2012). Johnson was selected for the Pro Bowl three times and led the NFL in receiving yardage twice, finishing with season averages of 88 receptions for 1,416 yards (16.1 average) and 10 touchdowns in five years with Jefferson as his position coach.

Jefferson began his coaching career shortly after a 13-season playing career during which the former Charger (1991-95), Patriot (1996-99), Falcon (2000-02) and Lion (2003) wide receiver caught 470 passes for 7,024 yards and 29 touchdowns after entering the league as a ninth-round selection in 1991.

Before entering the league, the Jacksonville, FL native played receiver for three years at Central Florida. He and his wife, Marla, have two daughters, Paige and Faith, and a son, Van.

**BRANT BOYER** returns for his fourth season as the New York Jets special teams coordinator. In his three seasons with the team, he has transformed a unit that in 2015 placed in the bottom 10 in special teams rankings according to FootballOutsiders.com (25th), which compiles the numbers in five key elements of special teams, and Rick Gosselin (31st), an annual compiler of special teams rankings for the last 39 years, to the number one unit in the league in 2018 according to both.

Change has been a constant for Boyer, as the Jets have had a different primary player at kick returner, punt returner and kicker as well as a different leading special teams tackler in each of his three seasons as coordinator. Despite the change, his unit has committed just 40 penalties, the third fewest of any team in the league, while also posting top 10 rankings in both kickoff return average (23.3) and field goal percentage (87.6%) since 2016.

Last season, in addition to their number one ranking from both FootballOutsiders.com and Rick Gosselin, Boyer's group finished in the top five league-wide in kickoff return average (third; 26.9), punt return average (first; 13.0) and field goal percentage (fourth; 91.7%). The unit

also blocked three kicks — a punt, a field goal and an extra point — one of just three teams with at least three blocked kicks and one of just two with a block of all three.

Among the many superlatives by the Jets special teams unit last season were kicker Jason Myers earning a Pro Bowl selection after tying Nick Folk's field goal percentage franchise record, connecting on 33-of-36 field goals (91.7%) and finishing with the second-most made field goals and tying for the second most points for a single season in franchise history. Additionally, Myers made all five of his attempts of 55+ yards last season, the most in a single year in NFL history, and now accounts for five of the 11 makes from 55+ yards in Jets history. Myers also became one of just eight players in league history with a seven-field-goal game after connecting on all seven attempts for 24 total points (second-most kicking points in a game in league history) vs. Indianapolis (10/14/18).

Wide receiver/return specialist Andre Roberts, who was named a first-team All Pro and selected to his first Pro Bowl in nine NFL seasons, led the league in punt return average (14.1) and finished second in kickoff return average (29.4) last season, one of just 12 qualifying players to finish in the top three in both in the same season since 1970. Additionally, Roberts registered 10 returns (three punt, seven kickoff) of 40+ yards last season, two of which accounted for touchdowns — a 78-yard punt return at Detroit (09/10/18) and a 99-yard kickoff return vs. Green Bay (12/23/18). For Roberts, the 10 returns of 40+ make him one of just five players to accomplish the feat since 2000.

Punter Lachlan Edwards, in his third season under Boyer, posted another franchise record in net punting average (40.8) last season. Long snapper Thomas Hennessy, an undrafted free agent acquired in 2017 just before the regular season, has snapped in every game for the Jets since joining the team, posting 16 tackles (11 in 2018) and a forced fumble on coverage while not allowing a blocked field goal, extra point or punt in his career. Running back Trenton Cannon, the 2018 sixth-round draft pick who was in competition with Roberts for the primary return job during preseason, remained a key special teams contributor, leading the team with 16 special teams tackles and finishing with the most special teams tackles in franchise history by a running back (since 2000; according to radar360).

In 2017, Boyer oversaw the first career year from Edwards, as the punter increased every statistic from his rookie season. Edwards, who established franchise records with 46.6 gross and 40.5 net punt averages, ranked third in the league with 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in Jets history. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro, a 2017 acquisition by the Jets, improved on his field goal percentage from 75% in 2016 to 83.3%, as well as connecting on 100% of his extra point attempts, the first time he had done so since his rookie season. Catanzaro also connected on a 57-yard field goal, the longest in team history, and set a franchise record with a 66.2% touchback rate.

### **BRANT BOYER**



Among Boyer's coverage units, the Jets allowed just 20.0 yards per kickoff return in 2017, the eighth lowest average in the league. Safety Rontez Miles led the NFL with 15 solo special teams tackles (according to radar360).

In his first season (2016), kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league that season and the fourth highest mark in team history. Additionally, Edwards matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Boyer joined the Jets after a four-year tenure in Indianapolis (2012-15), where he aided a Colts special teams unit that ranked in the top 10 league-wide during that span in net punting average (third), kickoff return average (fourth), kickoff touchbacks (fourth) and field goal percentage (seventh), despite using three different players as primary punt returners and four different kick returners in his four seasons.

During the 2015 season, the Indianapolis special teams unit established an NFL record with just 156 kickoff return yards allowed for the season, besting the previous mark of 254 set by Denver in 1992.

In 2014, both punter Pat McAfee and kicker Adam Vinatieri received Associated Press First-Team NFL All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors under Boyer as McAfee converted a career-high three onside kicks and set single-season franchise records for punts pinned inside the 20-yard line (30), net punting average (42.8) and kickoff touchbacks (70), while Vinatieri made 30 of 31 field goals and also converted 35 consecutive attempts, the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

In 2013, Boyer coached Matt Overton to his first career Pro Bowl selection, one year after discovering the long snapper at a specialists combine in Arizona and bringing him to Indianapolis for a workout prior to his signing in April 2012.

Prior to joining the Colts, Boyer was twice a training camp intern, first for the Cleveland Browns (2009) and later for the New York Giants (2010).

Before entering the coaching ranks, Boyer played linebacker and was a standout on special teams for the Miami Dolphins (1994), Jacksonville Jaguars (1995-2000) and Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He served as a special teams captain for both the Jaguars and Browns and led the Browns in tackles in 2002 and 2003. Boyer was a two-time member of USA Today's All-Joe Team, once as a linebacker and once as a special teams player. In 2002, his teammates selected him for the Cleveland Browns Unsung Hero Award.

Boyer played in 129 career games and totaled 250 tackles, 13.0 sacks, six interceptions, one forced fumble and 15 passes defensed. He originally entered the league as a sixth-round selection of the Miami Dolphins in the 1994 NFL Draft.

Before entering the NFL, Boyer was an inside linebacker and team captain at the University of Arizona as part of the school's "Desert Swarm" defense. He led the team in tackles during his senior season, helping the Wildcats to their first 10-win season in 90 years and a victory in the 1993 Fiesta Bowl, and earned a place in the school's Ring of Honor.

DOWELL LOGGAINS begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks coach on January 23, 2019. Loggains is in his 14th season coaching in the NFL and has served as either guarterbacks coach or offensive coordinator since 2010.

Before joining the Jets, Loggains oversaw a Miami offense that ranked ninth in the NFL by averaging 4.68 yards per rush. The Dolphins also ranked second in the league with 14 passing touchdowns of 20+ yards. Additionally, he helped running back Kenyan Drake become one of just nine players to register four touchdowns rushing and receiving and produce over 1,000 scrimmage yards.

In three seasons with Chicago, first as the quarterbacks coach in 2015, Loggains helped Jay Cutler to a career season as the then 10-year veteran posted then single-season bests in completion percentage, passer rating and yards per attempt, all while reducing his interception total by seven from the previous season.

The following season (2016) he was promoted to offensive coordinator and helped running back Jordan Howard finish sixth in the league with 1,313 yards rushing as a rookie. In 2017, he helped Mitchell Trubisky, the second overall selection in the draft, transition to NFL starter, as the quarterback finished second among rookie passers in yards and passer rating in 12 starts. He also oversaw another rookie, fourth-round pick

Tarik Cohen, as the running back became the first rookie since 1965 and first player since 1975 to record a rushing, passing, receiving and punt return touchdown in the same season. That season, both Howard and guard Josh Sitton earned Pro Bowl selections as Howard again produced 1,000+ yards rushing.

In one season with the Browns, Loggains helped quarterback Brian Hoyer to a career season as the then six-year veteran won seven games (in 13 starts) and threw for over 3,000 yards, while the offense produced 31 passes of 25+ yards, the 10th most of any team in the league.

Beginning his coaching career with the Titans in 2006, Loggains spent eight seasons in Tennessee in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the offensive coordinator for the final five games of 2012 and all of 2013. In his first full season as the offensive coordinator, he helped wide receiver Kendall Wright and running back Chris Johnson become just the organization's fifth 1,000yard receiving/rushing combo as Wright brought in 94 catches for 1,079 yards and Johnson gained 1,077 yards on the ground. He began his career with the Titans as a coaching administrative assistant (2006-07) and quality control coach (2008-09), before spending the next three seasons as the quarterbacks/passing game coordinator, helping quarterback Vince Young achieve a career-high passer rating in 2010, earning a Pro Bowl appearance.

Loggains gained his start in the NFL with Dallas, working as a scouting assistant where he helped with opponent film breakdown, self-scouting and statistical analysis to be used in game-plan preparation.

In college, Loggains walked on as a quarterback and holder at Arkansas before earning a scholarship and becoming a four-year letterman, appearing in 50 games. He and his wife, Beth, have two daughters, Reese and Aven, and one son, Ryne.

**GREGG WILLIAMS** begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's defensive coordinator on January 16, 2019. An NFL coach for 29 seasons, Williams has served as a head coach for three years and a defensive coordinator for 17.

Williams' defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. His defenses have twice made the Super Bowl, winning Super Bowl XLIV with the Saints after holding a Colts team that finished seventh in the league in scoring to just 17 points. He also oversaw a defense that held a Rams offense that led the league in scoring and was the third-highest scoring offense in league history at the time to 10 points less than their season average in Super Bowl XXXIV. Additionally, he has helped 15 different defensive players earn trips to the Pro Bowl, 11 of whom made their first trips under him, including Myles Garrett, Aaron Donald and Sean Taylor.

In his final season with Cleveland (2018), Williams took over as the interim head coach for the final eight games of the season, leading the team to a 5-3 record en route to a 7-8-1 season, the best winning percentage by the franchise since 2007. In his two seasons as the defensive coordinator, the Browns saw production from a number of young players as Garrett produced 20.5 sacks in his first two seasons, earning a Pro Bowl selection in his second year, and Denzel Ward was selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie. Additionally, in his first season with Cleveland (2017), Joe Schobert and Christian Kirksey both finished in the top five in total tackles and Schobert was also selected to his first Pro Bowl.

Prior to his time in Cleveland, Williams spent three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense. Additionally, he oversaw the development of Aaron Donald, who was voted the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl all three seasons under Williams.

Before the Rams, Williams returned to Tennessee, serving as senior assistant defensive coach (2013) and helping the team make significant improvements in nearly every defensive category. The Titans improved in points per game (16th from 32nd), total defense (14th from 27th), pass defense (11th from 26th) and third down

Over his three seasons as the defensive coordinator (2009-11), the Saints advanced to the postseason each year, capturing two division titles and winning Super Bowl XLIV. In 2010, the Saints allowed the fewest touchdown passes (13) in the league. In his first season, the defense recorded 35 takeaways, returning seven for touchdowns.

Williams spent one season (2008) with Jacksonville as defensive coordinator/assistant head coach following four seasons (2004-07) as assistant head coach/defense with Washington. The Redskins had one of the NFL's top defenses over that span, allowing just 19.4 points per game and ranking sixth overall in defense during the four-season stretch. In 2005, the defense was a key factor in the club making its first postseason appearance in six seasons.

From 2001-03, Williams served as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills, helping six different players, five of whom were offensive players including quarterback Drew Bledsoe, earn Pro Bowl recognition. The defense improved each season, moving from 21st in the NFL to 15th to second in his three seasons.

### **GREGG WILLIAMS**

Williams joined the NFL ranks in 1990 and spent 11 seasons with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans working his way up from defensive quality control coach (1990-92) to defensive coordinator (1997-2000). He also served as special teams coach (1993) and linebackers coach (1994-96). In 1999, he helped the Titans advance to Super Bowl XXXIV. In 2000, Tennessee led the NFL in total defense for the first time in franchise history and allowed 191 points, the third-fewest in league history since the adoption of the 16-game schedule in 1978. The Titans also set club records for sacks (55), fewest passing yards allowed (2,424) and fewest touchdowns allowed (17).

Prior to arriving in the NFL, Williams was a graduate assistant at the University of Houston from 1988-89. From 1984-87, Williams was the head coach at Belton (MO) HS after opening his coaching career at his alma mater, Excelsior Springs (MO) HS.

A graduate of Truman State University, Williams played quarterback and also played baseball. He later earned a master's degree from Central Missouri.

Since 2004, Williams has helped raise more than \$2 million for Excelsior Springs young people through the Gregg Williams Foundation. The money raised annually provides two scholarships for Excelsior Springs High School graduates and funds both school and local youth athletics. In January 2016, Williams was inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame. The induction celebrated his decorated NFL coaching career as well his unwavering commitment to his home state of Missouri and the mentorship of young men.

ANDRE CARTER is in his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's defensive line coach on February 8, 2019. Carter is in his third season coaching in the league after a 13year Pro Bowl career as a defensive end.

Before joining the Jets, Carter spent two seasons in Miami as the assistant defensive line coach. In his two seasons there, defensive end Cameron Wake produced 16.5 sacks and 44 quarterback hits, both top 10 totals among AFC defensive linemen, despite being 35 and 36 in those seasons.

Between 2017-18, Carter's group produced 140 quarterback hits, the seventh-best total in the NFL, including seasons of 10 or more by four different players. Additionally, Dolphin defensive linemen accounted for 86 tackles for loss, tied for the ninth-most in the league.

Prior to his time in Miami, Carter was a Bill Walsh NFL Diversity Coaching Fellowship participant with San Francisco in 2016. He began his coaching career in 2015 as a graduate student assistant at his alma mater, California.

The seventh overall selection in the 2001 NFL Draft, Carter totaled 184 games (147 starts) for San Francisco (2001-05), Washington (2006-10), New England (2011, 2013) and Oakland (2012). He recorded career totals of 517 tackles (388 solo), 80.5 sacks, 18 forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries. His 80.5 sacks were the 13th most in the NFL during his 13 seasons from 2001-13 and he was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2011 at age 32.

At Cal, Carter was a unanimous All-American selection as a senior in 2000 as well as earning first-team All-Pac-10 honors twice (1999-2000) and in 2000 winning the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-10's top defensive lineman.

Carter earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. His father, Rubin Carter, played at the University of Miami and had a 12-year NFL career as a defensive lineman with Denver (1975-86) before spending 28 seasons as a coach in high school, college and the NFL, including three seasons as a defensive line coach for the Jets (2001-03).

JIM BOB COOTER begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's running backs coach on February 8, 2019. Cooter joins the Jets after directing the Lions offense for the past three-and-a-half seasons.

After initially joining the Lions as a quarterbacks coach (2014), Cooter was promoted to offensive coordinator in Week Eight of the 2015 season. During his time in Detroit, quarterback Matthew Stafford ranked in the top 10 in completion percentage (64.9%), passing yards (21,069), touchdowns (128) and passing plays of 25+ yards (151). Prior to his promotion to offensive coordinator, the Lions offense under Stafford produced the third-most turnovers in the league. Following his appointment as offensive coordinator, the offense produced the fifth-fewest.

Additionally, running backs in Cooter's offense ranked in the top four league-wide in both receptions and receiving yards in his time as offensive coordinator, while Theo Riddick's 211 receptions under him were the second most in the league in that span. Three different backs produced 25-catch seasons under him, including four by Riddick from 2015-18.

Prior to his time in Detroit, Cooter first worked with Gase as the Broncos offensive assistant (2013). That season, the Denver offense ranked first in the NFL in multiple categories, including total yards per game (465.3), total touchdowns (76) and points per game (37.9), and set an NFL single-

season record with 606 points scored as the team earned its third-straight AFC West title.

In his lone season in Kansas City, Cooter was part of a Chiefs offensive staff that oversaw the fifth-ranked rushing offense in the league, producing 149.7 yards per game, as running back Jamaal Charles finished with 1,509 yards (fourth most in the league), earning Pro Bowl recognition.

Cooter entered the NFL coaching ranks with Indianapolis in 2009, serving the Colts staff in a variety of roles as the team won back-to-back AFC South titles in 2009 and 2010, earning a Super Bowl XLIV appearance.

A former quarterback at the University of Tennessee, Cooter got his coaching start at his alma mater as a graduate assistant from 2007-08. As a player, he appeared in six games for the Volunteers. He earned a bachelor's degree in sports management from Tennessee in 2006 and went on to receive a master's degree in sports psychology in 2008.

Last season, the Huskies offense under Dunn produced two 1,000-yard rushers, as the guarterback established a school rushing record for the position and the team saw a running back gain 1,000+ yards for the first time since 2011.

JEFF HAMMERSCHMIDT returns as the assistant special teams coach. He continues with Special Teams Coordinator Brant Boyer on Head Coach Adam Gase's staff for his fourth season with the New York Jets following a 24-year college coaching career.

In Hammerschmidt's three seasons with the Jets, the special teams unit has committed just 40 penalties, the third fewest of any team in the league, while also posting top 10 rankings in both kickoff return average (23.3) and field goal percentage (87.6%), despite new returners and kickers each season.

Last season, Hammerschmidt assisted a special teams unit that was widely regarded as the best in the league, receiving top honors from Rick Gosselin, an annual compiler of special teams rankings for the last 39 years, and FootballOutsiders.com, after finishing in the top five leaguewide in kickoff return average (third; 26.9), punt return average (first; 13.0) and field goal percentage (fourth; 91.7%). Additionally, both kicker Jason Myers, a waiver claim by the Jets shortly before the final preseason game, and wide receiver and return specialist Andre Roberts, a nine-year veteran offseason signing, both earned their first trips to the Pro Bowl with Roberts also earning first team All-Pro honors as a kick returner.

Among the many superlatives by the Jets special teams unit last season were Myers tying Nick Folk's field goal percentage franchise record after making 33-of-36 field goals (91.7%) and finishing with the second-most made field goals and tying for the second most points for a single season in franchise history. Additionally, Myers made all five of his attempts of 55+ yards last season, the most in a single year in NFL history, and now accounts for five of the 11 makes from 55+ yards in Jets history. Myers also became one of just eight players in league history with a sevenfield-goal game after connecting on all seven attempts for 24 total points (second-most kicking points in a game in league history) vs. Indianapolis (10/14/18).

Roberts led the league in punt return average (14.1) and finished second in kickoff return average (29.4) last season, one of just 12 qualifying players to finish in the top three in both in the same season since 1970.

Additionally, Roberts registered 10 returns (three punt, seven kickoff) of 40+ yards last season, two of which accounted for touchdowns — a 78-yard punt return at Detroit (09/10/18) and a 99-yard kickoff return vs. Green Bay (12/23/18). For Roberts, the 10 returns of 40+ make him one of just five players to accomplish the feat since 2000.

Punter Lachlan Edwards, in his third season under Boyer and Hammerschmidt, posted another franchise record in net punting average (40.8) last season. Long snapper Thomas Hennessy, an undrafted free agent acquired in 2017 just before the regular season, has snapped in every game for the Jets since joining the team, posting 16 tackles and a forced fumble on coverage while not allowing a blocked field goal, extra point or punt in his career. Running back Trenton Cannon, the 2018 sixth-round draft pick who was in competition with Roberts for the primary return job during preseason, remained a key special teams contributor, leading the team with 16 special teams tackles and finishing with the most special teams tackles in franchise history by a running back (since 2000; according to radar360).

In his second season with the Jets, Hammerschmidt helped coach a record-setting performance from Edwards, as the punter

set franchise records with a 46.6 gross punting average and 40.5 net punting average while also placing 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in franchise history and the third most in the NFL in 2017. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro connected on the longest field goal in franchise history when he hit a 57-yard field goal at CLV (10/08/17). Overall, Catanzaro improved from his 75% field goal rate in 2016 as he connected on 25 of 30 attempts (83.3%), and he became one of just five kickers in the conference with at least 14 makes of 40+ yards that season.

In Hammerschmidt's first season, Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for sixth best in the league that season and the fourth-highest mark in team history. Additionally, Edwards, then a seventh-round rookie, matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Prior to joining the Jets, Hammerschmidt served as a special teams coordinator for his alma mater Arizona (2008-11) before working in the same capacity at Colorado State (2012-15). In his time with the Rams, both the punter and kicker received honorable mention all-conference honors, while punter Hayden Hurst was also a Ray Guy Award finalist in 2015.

Throughout his career, Hammerschmidt has coached every

level of the defense (secondary, linebackers and defensive line) while also serving as a defensive coordinator for Southern Utah (1996-97), Saint Mary's (2000-02) and Montana (2003-04). He began his coaching career in 1992 as a graduate assistant at Arizona and has since worked with a handful of current and former NFL players, including Kris Dielman, Adewale Ogunleye, Antwaan Randle El and Brooks Reed.

A four-year letterman, three-year starting safety and first-team All-Pac-10 selection at Arizona, Hammerschmidt was a semifinalist for the 1989 Jim Thorpe Award after beginning his career as an option quarterback. Following his collegiate career, he signed as a free agent with the Los Angeles Rams (1991) and played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of the World League (1992). Hammerschmidt and his wife, Felicity, have two children, Bryn and Bode. He has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Arizona.

**BO HARDEGREE** begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's offensive assistant on February 8, 2019, his sixth-consecutive season working with Gase.

Before joining the Jets, Hardegree spent three seasons (2016-18) in Miami coaching the quarterbacks. In his time there, Ryan Tannehill completed 65.9 percent of his passes, the ninth best among qualified quarterbacks in that span, for a 93.2 passer rating. In their first season together (2016), Tannehill posted his most efficient season, setting career highs with a 93.5 passer rating, 7.7 yards per attempt and a 67.1 completion percentage before missing the final three games with an injury. Following Tannehill's injury, he helped backup quarterback Matt Moore win two of his three starts as the Dolphins earned a playoff berth. snapping an eight-year postseason drought.

Hardegree's first NFL position came as an offensive quality control coach in Denver (2014), where he first worked with Gase, then the Broncos offensive coordinator. He would follow Gase to Chicago the following year (2015), serving as a Bears offensive assistant.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Hardegree spent three seasons at Duke (2008-10) as a graduate assistant before three seasons at LSU,

where he worked on both sides of the ball, first as a defensive assistant (2011) and later an offensive assistant (2012-13).

A guarterback at Tennessee, Hardegree was also a tennis student-athlete and earned All-SEC Academic team honors from 2004-07 before graduating with a degree in exercise science. A native of Jackson, TN, he is married to wife, Lauren.

STEVE JACKSON returns for his second season with the New York

Jets as the team's assistant defensive backs coach, his 16th season as an NFL coach following a nine-year playing career.

Last season, Jackson helped second-year safety Jamal Adams to a Pro Bowl season as the former sixth-overall selection also earned the Curtis Martin Team Most Valuable Player honors from his teammates. Adams registered 115 tackles, the second most by a Jets safety since 2000, and finished in the top three among league safeties in tackles, tackles for loss, sacks, quarterback hits, passes defensed, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries. Additionally, starting cornerbacks Trumaine Johnson and Morris Claiborne combined for six interceptions, including touchdown returns by both players.

Prior to joining the Jets staff, Jackson spent two seasons with the Titans as the team's assistant secondary coach, assisting a pair of young players to standout years. Safety Kevin Byard, a former 2016 third-round selection, was named a first-team All-Pro last year as well as being selected for the Pro Bowl after tying for the league lead with eight interceptions, which

he returned for 130 yards (second most in the NFL). Additionally, cornerback Adoree' Jackson, the team's first-round selection in 2017, started since Week One and registered 17 passes defensed (according to Radar360), the third most of any rookie.

Before the Titans, Jackson spent time coaching with the Lions (2013) and Redskins (2004-11) after beginning his coaching career with the Bills (2001-03).

FRANK POLLACK begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's offensive line coach on February 8, 2019. After playing the position for eight years in the league, Pollack has been guiding NFL offensive lines for the last 13 seasons. helping to produce All-Pros at center, guard and tackle.

In his lone season in Cincinnati before joining the Jets, Pollack oversaw an offensive line that was transitioning to four new starters from the start of the previous season, including a first-time starter in second-year undrafted guard Alex Redmond and rookie center Billy Price. Despite the change, the line finished in the top third of the league in sacks allowed while producing 4.69 yards per carry, the eighth-best average in the league and helped pave the way for running back Joe Mixon's 1,168 rushing yards and eight touchdowns rushing.

Pollack spent five seasons (2013-17) with the Cowboys, developing an offensive line regarded as one of the league's best. Despite ranking 31st in rushing offense before his arrival, his unit paved the way for an offense that featured two league-leading rushers, DeMarco Murray (2014) and Ezekiel Elliot (2016), and averaged 4.73 yards per carry in those seasons, the best in the league. Additionally, the pass protection allowed the sixthfewest sacks in that span.

A trio of offensive lineman achieved All-Pro status for the Cowboys under Pollack as tackle Tyron Smith, quard Zack Martin and center Travis

Frederick each earned trips to four Pro Bowls under him. Additional offensive honors his line helped achieve were an Offensive Rookie of the Year award for Dak Prescott as well as Pro Bowl selections at every offensive position, including wide receiver Dez Bryant, running backs Elliott and Murray, tight end Jason Witten and quarterbacks Prescott and Tony Romo.

Prior to his time in Dallas. Pollack oversaw the offensive line in Oakland (2012), which, despite no first-round picks among the starters, protected Carson Palmer, allowing the quarterback to throw for over 4,000 yards while also allowing the fifth-fewest sacks that season.

Pollack began his NFL coaching career with the Texans, serving as the team's assistant offensive line coach for five seasons (2007-11). In his time with Houston, the offensive line only allowed 144 sacks, the seventh-fewest in the NFL over that span and ranked in the top 10 in rushing average in each of his final two seasons with the club (third in 2010, eight in 2011).

Beginning his coaching career at his alma mater, Northern Arizona, Pollack served as the assistant offensive line coach (2005) and then the offensive line coach (2006).

A sixth-round selection by San Francisco, Pollack played eight seasons in the league, appearing in 90 games at tackle and guard for the 49ers (1990-91, '94-98) and Broncos (1992), including Super Bowl XXIX with the 49ers.

An offensive lineman at Northern Arizona who graduated with a degree in advertising in 1990, he was an All-America and All-Big Sky selection in 1989 and was inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame in 2010. He and his wife, Wendy, have three sons, Frankie, Carter and Wilson.

**JOE VITT**, an NFL coaching veteran for almost 40 years, begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as the team's senior defensive assistant/outside linebackers coach on February 8, 2019. This is the ninth franchise Vitt has worked with in the league after beginning his career in 1979 with the Baltimore Colts.

Among Vitt's coaching stops in a five-decade career are New Orleans (2006-16), St. Louis Rams (2004-05), Kansas City (2000-03), Green Bay (1999), Philadelphia (1995-98), Los Angeles Rams (1992-94), Seattle (1982-91) and the Baltimore Colts (1979-81). In his time there, six different Saints linebackers produced 90-tackle seasons (according to Radar360), including Jonathan Vilma, who did so from 2008-10, while twice earning Pro Bowl recognition.

Before he began his coaching career, Vitt played linebacker at Towson State, where he was part of the school's 1974 undefeated team. In 1976, he helped Towson finish as the NCAA Division III runner-up in just the program's eighth year of existence. **BLAKE WILLIAMS** begins his first season with the New York Jets after joining Adam Gase's staff as a defensive assistant on February 8, 2019, his 10th season coaching in the league and 13th year coaching football.

Prior to joining the Jets, Williams served as the linebackers coach with the Browns for two seasons (2017-18), helping coach Joe Schobert to a Pro Bowl season in 2017 as the linebacker tied for the league-lead in total tackles (144). Cleveland increased its run defense ranking from 31st in 2016 to seventh in 2017, as Schobert and Christian Kirksey were two of just three players in the NFL to play every defensive snap.

During the 2016 season, Williams worked at the NFL league office following three seasons at the collegiate level, first as the defensive coordinator for William Jewell in Missouri for two years and then as the defensive coordinator for Southeastern Louisiana University for a year.

Initially joining the Rams staff as the team's linebackers coach in 2012, Williams also served as the team's defensive coordinator that season, overseeing a defense that tied for the NFL lead with 52 sacks while also intercepting 18 passes, four of which were returned for touchdowns.

In 2009, he joined the Saints staff as an offensive assistant, helping the team win Super Bowl XLIV, before serving as the team's assistant linebackers coach the next two seasons (2010-11).

Williams began his NFL coaching career as a coaching intern with the Redskins for two seasons (2006-07) before spending a year with the Jaquars as a linebackers/strength & conditioning coach (2008).

A graduate of Princeton University, Williams was a four-year letterman as a defensive back.

**DENNARD WILSON** returns for his third season with the Jets, adding the title of passing game coordinator after serving as the team's defensive backs coach the two previous seasons.

Last season, Wilson coached second-year safety Jamal Adams to a Pro Bowl season as the former sixth-overall selection also earned Curtis Martin Team Most Valuable Player honors from his teammates. Adams registered 115 tackles, the second most by a Jets safety since 2000, and finished in the top three among league safeties in tackles, tackles for loss, sacks, quarterback hits, passes defensed, forced fumbles and fumble recoveries. Additionally, cornerback Trumaine Johnson, who joined the team in the offseason as an unrestricted free agent, posted a 73.3 passer rating allowed since his return from injury in Week 10, the fifth best among NFL corners with at least 400 defensive snaps for the final eight weeks (according to radar360). Cornerback Morris Claiborne led the team with 14 passes defensed, a single-season best, while also registering a career-best two interceptions, one of which was returned for a touchdown.

In his first season with the team, Wilson helped integrate the Jets firstand second-round draft picks at safety, Adams and Marcus Maye. The

duo became the first pair of rookie safeties in league history to start all 16 games, leading all rookie defensive backs in tackles and finishing third and fourth respectively among all rookies (according to NFL.com statistics). Additionally, Claiborne led the defense with 11 passes defensed, while cornerback Buster Skrine posted multiple forced fumbles and fumble recoveries, one of just 10 cornerbacks to do so since 2011, while finishing second with 10 passes defensed. Additionally, Skrine finished as one of just three cornerbacks in the league that season with an interception, forced fumble, fumble recovery, and a sack.

With the Rams, Wilson held the defensive backs coach position for two seasons, overseeing a passing defense that improved from 23rd in 2015 to ninth overall in 2016. Since 2015, cornerback Trumaine Johnson has picked off eight passes, tied for the fifth most in the league and third most among corners. Before spending two seasons as the defensive backs coach, Wilson worked as the Rams defensive quality control coach after joining the team in 2012.

Wilson entered the NFL coaching ranks with the Rams after four years as a pro scout with the Chicago Bears, evaluating pro players and scouting opponents.

Before the NFL, Wilson coached at both of his former schools, first as a defensive backs coach/passing game coordinator for DeMatha (MD) HS (2004-06) and then as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland (2007-08).

A three-year starter at Maryland, Wilson played four years as a defensive back and was selected as captain for the 2002-04 seasons, earning All-Atlantic Coast Conference honorable mention in 2004. After Maryland, he signed with the Washington Redskins as an undrafted free agent, joining the team as a member of the practice squad before suffering a season-ending injury.

Wilson graduated from the University of Maryland in 2004 with a degree in communications. He is married to his wife, Taihitia, and the couple have a daughter, Riley, and a son, Reece.

**MY FAVORITE MARTIN:** "Growing up, my whole family were literally Pittsburgh Steeler fans, and I was the only one who grew up a Curtis Martin fan, loving the New York Jets," Bell said on a conference call after signing with the team this offseason.

"I remember growing up, a run Curtis Martin did," Bell told Jets 360 after signing. "And he had his hand on his lineman's back, I didn't know what he was doing at the time or what he was trying to execute, but over the course of time as I got older I realized he was being patient. Curtis Martin, he taught me patience and I don't think he knew he did."

For Martin, he called Bell to congratulate the new Jets running back after the deal and said that he took Bell's praise as "a huge compliment" in comments to ESPN.com, adding that Bell, "Has a lot of natural athletic attributes, but what I value most is the vision that he has. He can be patient and set up his blocks." Patience they appreciated in each other.



(since 2013 • including postseason)










#### Youngest Quarterbacks to pass for 300 Yards

#### OF NOTE

**MONTANA:** Despite a high school career that saw him named a first-team all-league selection at both defensive back and quarterback at Edison in his hometown of Stockton, CA, he never received a scholarship offer from any Pac-12 school despite attending camps at both USC and Cal...Rather than attend junior college, he enrolled at Montana, becoming a four-year starter, two-time All-American and three-time All-Big Sky Conference first-team selection, setting school records with 36 pass deflections and 15 interceptions.

"Everything happens for a reason. I took that and ran with it," Johnson told the Atlanta Journal-Constitution before the 2012 NFL Draft, where he was drafted by SL in the third round.

#### OFF THE FIELD

**MONOPOLY MAN:** Along with former college defensive back teammates Brandon Dodson, Mike McCord and Andrew Swink, they would play the board game Monopoly constantly, often making their own rules.

"You would think that we were in law school the way we negotiated," Swink told the Los Angeles Times in 2016, with McCord adding, "The board was turned over many times by all of us. It got pretty intense."

The group remains close, texting and getting together every few months, with each sharing a similar tattoo of their Monopoly games...The one on Johnson's left arm is topped by script that reads "The Crew."







Their mission is to assist with the development of fostered youth and raise awareness about the importance of fostering and support the protection and care of those who have suffered from human trafficking and to raise awareness about this issue so that we may find solutions to end this practice.

**FOSTERING CARE:** The only child of Lisa Montgomery, he was raised alongside 17 foster brothers in Dallas, TX.

"I grew up an only child, so I'm biologically hers and I always wanted siblings," Ty told fox6now.com in 2016. "I always wanted brothers. That's how she got into (foster parenting) -- and from there on, it just took off. One brother turning into 17."

Together with his mother, the two worked with the Wisconsinbased Coalition for Children, Youth & Families, that supports people who are changing lives through foster care and adoption by connecting them to information, training, and support they need to succeed. Its mission is to inspire, inform and support individuals and families caring for children touched by foster care and adoption.

**EYE HEART WORLD:** Served on the Board of Directors for Eye Heart World, whose mission is to fight and care for victims of human trafficking in the United States, something that he feels ties into another of his passions, foster care.

"Not a lot of people talk about human trafficking," Montgomery said in 2018. "The foster care system and people being neglected and sold into trafficking, I think that there is a connection there. A lot of the kids that are trafficked from the stories I've heard, and serving on the board at Eye Heart World, they are in that system in some way shape or form."



To be one of the positive role models, and to come back and still have that same support -- people are not trying to take advantage of you and things like that -- I can come back here with open arms, so that's a great feeling."
