



In 2010, New Meadowlands Stadium became the home of the New York Jets. The venue was renamed MetLife Stadium on August 23, 2011, when MetLife acquired the naming rights. MetLife Stadium is one of the highest-profile stadiums in the country, and was honored as the 2017 “Venue of the Year” by The StadiumBusiness Awards. In 2016, the Stadium had its busiest year since opening, drawing nearly 3 million fans to a record 61 major events and 210 smaller private events.

MetLife Stadium bleeds green on Jets game days. Fans have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game. They can catch the ESPN New York - 98.7FM pregame radio show broadcast live from the west plaza, head to the Kids Zone for family-fun activities and enjoy a vast array of food and beverages on the Stadium's multiple concourses. Fans can also find the latest gear at the team's 10,000 square-foot flagship plaza store. The intimate seating bowl, uncompromised sight lines, cutting-edge video boards, LED signage and state-of-the-art sound system all enhance the game-watching experience.

MetLife and the cornerstone partners – Bud Light, Dell EMC/SAP, Pepsi and Verizon – are also integrated into the game experience with ample space to engage and entertain fans.

One of the biggest upgrades in MetLife Stadium is the availability of club seats. There are four clubs –EY Coaches, Metlife 50, Toyota, and Touchdown – that offer access to VIP reserved parking, a private club entrance, as well as a host of other amenities and benefits.

ATLANTICHEALTHJETS TRAINING CENTER

The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, located at One Jets Drive in Florham Park, N.J. has been the headquarters of the Jets since its official ribbon cutting on September 2, 2008. Designed by Skidmore Owings + Merrill, the 224,000 square-foot complex sits on nearly 100 acres of open space and provides players, coaches and staff with a best-in-class facility to learn, practice and work. Located within 30 minutes of both MetLife Stadium and Newark Liberty International Airport, the facility is also just a short distance to a number of New Jersey towns, giving all Jets employees a number of options for suburban, urban or rural lifestyles.

A UNITED ORGANIZATION

Prior to the opening of the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the team's operations were split between two locations, first, located on the campus of Hofstra University, Weeb Ewbank Hall housed the players, coaches and football support staff, while the business operations were located in New York City.

In the creation of the new facility, Chairman & CEO Woody Johnson looked to unite all elements of the franchise under one roof. In the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the organization now has a building that seamlessly combines the operations of both the football and business departments. Equipped with open-concept workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment, the training center was a major contributing factor in the team being named one of Inc. Magazine's Top Small Company Workplaces in 2010. An outdoor terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, provides a business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners.



FOOTBALL FACILITIES

Featuring state-of-the-art training and medical facilities that combine the latest advances in rehabilitation pools, high-performance equipment and nutrition, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center also has five full-size football fields; three natural grass, one Sportexe synthetic turf field outdoors, and another in the Field House, each with a permanent scoreboard. Additionally, the goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be repositioned 90 degrees to help minimize some of the wear throughout the season. With a first floor that is all football, the facility houses a 5,500-square-foot locker room, an 11,000-square-foot weight room and a 10,000-square-foot cafeteria.

As a "graduate school for football" - an element that was important in the design of the building - the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center has more than 25,000 square feet of space dedicated to classrooms and instruction space, including 10 classrooms. The classroom also provides direct access to both the indoor and outdoor practice field, allowing for seamless transition between classroom and practice.

TRAINING CAMP

For the third consecutive year, the New York Jets will host training camp at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, in addition to all team mini-camps and organized team activities. Over the first two seasons, the facility hosted 13 open practices, and welcomed over 21,000 Jets fans.

During all open practices, fans were able to take advantage of bleachers for enhanced viewing, a shuttle service to and from the parking lot, water stations close to the field, cooling zones, a food court and a fan zone fully equipped with family-friendly activities. Additionally, all fans could enjoy Training Camp staples including Jets Fest, featuring skills challenges, music, inflatable rides, virtual reality and the Jets Shop tent, while members of the Gen Jets Kids Club, had a kids-only player autograph area.

This year, the AHJTC will feature six open practices as well as play host to a variety of youth camps and football teams.

YOUTH FOOTBALL

 The New York Jets are committed to growing the game of football through a comprehensive outreach program designed to provide opportunities for underserved communities to play football. In addition, we fund training and equipment to ensure safety for all participants.

FLAG FOOTBALL

The Jets fund and create thousands of Flag Football opportunities for children ages 5-18 to enjoy America's favorite sport. Players benefit by being physically active through non-contact, continuous action while learning the fundamentals of football, lessons in teamwork and sportsmanship.

In 2016, the New York Jets and USA Football announced a new NFL FLAG powered by USA Football league with the **New York City Police Athletic League (PAL)**. Through a \$40,000 donation from the Jets Foundation, 1,200 New York City youth have the opportunity to play flag football at no cost. All participants are given a free Jets NFL FLAG jersey and top teams in each division have their entry fees to the New York City area's Regional NFL Flag tournament covered by the Jets.

Each year the Jets provide \$50,000 to support the **Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) Girls Varsity Flag Football League**. Created in 2011 by the PSAL and Jets, the league has nearly doubled from 31 to now almost 60 schools participating. USA Football was also instrumental in helping to get the league off the ground with flag belts and footballs for each program.



Since 2007, the Jets have provided annual funding for the expansion of **CHAMPS Middle School Flag Football League** to more than 3,700 students at 111 programs throughout the New York City public school system. The CHAMPS Middle School Sports and Fitness League is an initiative of the New York City Department of Education that promotes student physical activity during the critical years of middle school. The name CHAMPS derives from the initials of the five characteristics that describe our participants: Cooperative, Healthy, Active, Motivated and Positive Students. SNY PLAY BALL: FOOTBALL WEEK

The New York Jets have teamed up with our television partner, SNY, to offer support for youth football leagues in our community through SNY Play Ball: Football Week. SNY Play Ball offers leagues the opportunity to receive new footballs, tickets to a Jets preseason game, attend an exclusive youth football clinic and volunteer with league projects in our local community. In addition, one eligible organization will receive a \$5,000 grant to be put towards new equipment for the upcoming season. PUBLIC SCHOOLS ATHLETIC LEAGUE

 In 2001, the New York Jets formed a community partnership with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. Through an annual matching grant from the NFL's Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets now donate \$100,000 to the PSAL's football programs. This grant has helped to create 15 new and developmental football teams. The funding also assisted in the reconditioning of every student-athletes' helmet and the cost for PSAL coaches to become USA Football Heads Up certified. Beyond these grants, the Jets support the PSAL in a variety of other ways including honoring the PSAL football champions at a home game during the NFL season.

HIGH SCHOOL COACH OF THE WEEK

For 10 weeks during the football season the Jets and Gatorade present the High School Coach of the Week award to a coach in the tri-state area who serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to his community, his school and his student-athletes. Gatorade and the Jets award each winner with a \$2,000 check for their high school's football program. In addition to the weekly award, a Coach of the Year is selected at the end of the high school season. The Coach of the Year winner is awarded \$4,000 and receives a Gatorade cooler cart from the Jets and Gatorade.

7on7 TOURNAMENT



In 2018, the Jets hosted a 32-team 7on7 Tournament. The program was held at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center over two days in June. High schools from the Tri-state area competed in pool and bracket play. The tournament was free of charge to all schools and participants received a complimentary pair of New York Jets shorts. The champion will be invited to a future Jets home game and honored on-field prior to kickoff. Information for the 2019 Tournament will be made available in the early spring. PLAY 60

 The New York Jets have taken a stance in the fight against childhood obesity through fitness and nutrition programs under the Jets PLAY 60 platform, which encourages children to get 60 minutes of activity every day.

PLAY 60 EAT RIGHT, MOVE MORE

Launched in 2006, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Jets PLAY 60 Eat Right, Move More Program in partnership with the American Dairy Association Northeast (ADANE) encourages New Jersey school children to take advantage of healthy foods in their school cafeterias and become more active through grant incentives and Jets player visits.

The campaign encourages schools to challenge their students to get 60 minutes of physical activity every day and invites schools to submit their most creative cafeteria meal menus to determine which New Jersey schools each year that go above and beyond state and federal guidelines. Annually, the Jets and ADANE provide \$30,000 to schools, which can be used for cafeteria infrastructure improvements and physical education equipment. One grand champion school receives a \$20,000 grant as well as a Jets School Takeover Day. Two division champion schools receive a \$5,000 grant.

FUEL UP TO PLAY 60 HOMETOWN GRANTS

The American Heart Association and the National Football League have teamed up to create the PLAY 60 Challenge, a program that inspires kids to get the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity a day. The PLAY 60 Challenge is an in-school curriculum created by the National Football League and the American Heart Association that has been implemented locally between the Jets and several schools in Morris County, New Jersey, the home of the Jets training facility. Childhood obesity rates are at an all-time high: today, nearly one in three kids and teens in the United States are obese or overweight. Physical activity produces overall physical, psychological and social benefits, while research suggests that inactive children are likely to become inactive adults. CHRISTOPHER JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN & CEO

JETS: 19th

Christopher Wold Johnson has been an owner of the New York Jets since 2000. A fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, Christopher assumed the role of Chairman & CEO following his brother Woody's appointment as the United States Ambassador to the United Kingdom prior to the 2017 season.

While winning cannot come quickly enough, Johnson's focus is sustained success.

"The idea is to win year-after-year, to be one of those great franchises that seem to go from year-to-year-to-year and they are there for a decade," Johnson said following his first season as Chairman & CEO. "We want to be in that conversation."

2017 was a season of transition for the organization. Through it all, Johnson saw unity, improvement and a plan. These factors inspired him to extend the contracts of General Manager Mike Maccagnan and Head Coach Todd Bowles.

"The players saw something special happening to this team within that locker room," said Johnson following the year. "I think most of us see it. I'm in that locker room with them. Something special is happening there - there's so much to look forward to on this team with this core we have. We have a chance to build on that."

The 2017 season also saw Johnson develop a strong bond with his players and he worked closely with them to constructively advance social justice initiatives. He regularly met with the team's leadership council to discuss these matters and serve as a resource. Moreover, he accompanied Josh McCown, Kelvin Beachum and Demario Davis in December 2017 to the Bronx public defender's office to learn about challenges facing the criminal justice system. In February 2018, he joined the players in sending a letter to New York Governor Andrew Cuomo advocating for bail reform.

Engaged in all aspects of the organization, Johnson places an emphasis on the team's year-round commitment to the community, primarily through the New York Jets Foundation which funds programs that look to positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area through the promotion of fitness, youth football support and the prevention of bullying, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the charities supported by the Foundation is the club's trail-blazing anti-bullying program, Jets Tackle Bullying. The program aims to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators and preventing bullying for kids and teens.

A dedicated proponent of autism research and awareness, Johnson works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. The center, named for his mother, Betty, aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research and education, as well as raise awareness on Autism Spectrum Disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

Johnson is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies. On a national level, Johnson donated \$1M on behalf of the Jets to the American Red Cross in the wake of the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey.

PRESIDENT

JETS: 7th

Neil Glat is in his seventh season with the Jets after being named President in April 2012. Glat reports directly to Jets Chairman and CEO, Christopher Johnson, and oversees all elements of team business operations.

Since joining the Jets, Glat and his senior staff have focused on improving the fan/consumer experience (especially at the stadium) and deepening the team's connections with its passionate fan base, while striving to be best-in-class in all areas of the sports business. To that end, Glat has looked to elevate the organization's gameday and off-field activities through positive relationships with business partners and community leaders. These efforts have led to many new and innovative initiatives, such as PilotVision (an in-stadium second screen experience) and the technology-driven Jets Rewards program (including digital ticketing and Jets Cash), which have resulted in an improved gameday experience at MetLife Stadium and enhanced fan benefits. Other initiatives have included award-winning virtual reality offerings, a state-of-the-art mobile app, novel ticketing approaches and products such as the Boarding Pass, the Jets Fan Hall of Fame, new television shows on WCBS ("Jets Late Night"), SNY ("Jets Pre-Game Live"), and Facebook Watch ("One Jets Drive"), and the launch of Jets 360. Jets 360 is a comprehensive content platform that gives fans greater access to the team through enhanced storytelling and video quality across all digital and social platforms as well as via the team's television partners. The Jets recently were recognized as "The Most Innovative Sports Team" by SportTechie, a leading sports and technology digital publication, as well as one of the "Best Places to Work in New Jersey 2018" by NJ Biz.

During Glat's tenure, the team implemented a year-round fan engagement calendar that has resulted in increased fan participation and partner involvement at events like Jets House, Draft parties, Taste of the Jets, Town Hall, and Movie Night. The team advanced strategic partnerships with leading companies and entities such as Anheuser-Busch, Atlantic Health, CBS, Dell-EMC, ESPN, JetBlue, M&T Bank, MetLife, New York University, Pepsi, Porsche, SAP, SNY, Ticketmaster, Toyota, Verizon, and Visa, among many others. Glat has fostered programs that strengthen the team's relationships with Jets alumni, including Legends Community Weekend and Homecoming, and business partners through the Jets Partner Alliance.


Glat has led community-based initiatives, including a heralded partnership with STOMP Out Bullying designed to raise awareness about the devastating impact of bullying in local schools. The team hosted educators for the past few years at the Jets Tackling Bullying Symposium, highlighting the latest trends and best practices in anti-bullying, and recently funded digital training tools for educators in conjunction with the New York City Department of Education.

Prior to joining the Jets, Glat was the National Football League's Senior Vice President of Corporate Development. Glat headed a department responsible for League strategic initiatives, Club business development, stadium development, and new business opportunities. Glat's Club business development activities entailed initiating and overseeing the League efforts to help generate business growth for all 32 NFL Clubs. Also, he negotiated numerous commercial transactions, including secondary ticketing deals with Ticketmaster which led to the creation of the NFL Ticket Exchange, and conceptualized and secured approval for the launch of the NFL venture capital fund. Prior to working at the NFL, Glat worked as a management consultant at McKinsey & Company and as an investment banker at Dillon, Read & Co.

Glat currently serves as a Board Member of the New York City Chapter of the National Football Foundation, is a Committee Member for the UJA-Federation's Sports for Youth initiative, and recently joined the newly formed Anti-Defamation League Sports Leadership Council. He has also been an active member of the Wharton Sports Business Initiative (WSBI) Alumni Advisory Board. In addition, Glat was a two-time selection for the Street & Smith's Sports Business Journal Forty Under 40 award.

MIKE MACCAGNAN

GENERAL MANAGER

Entering his fourth season as general manager, Mike Maccagnan continues to reshape a roster he inherited in 2015 with a keen emphasis on building through the draft, while focusing on the long-term objective of constructing a team that consistently contends for the playoffs.

"Our goal is to be a team that competes for the playoffs on a consistent basis," said Maccagnan. "Our plan is to build the nucleus of this team through the draft. This core group of young players will be our foundation and, ideally, we want to have a good group of veterans. Some of these veterans can be players that have been with us for their entire career. Some of these players will be veterans that we've added through free agency. We're all on the same page and success can't happen fast enough for any of us, but we also recognize that it will take time to do it right. Every decision we make will be based on what's best for the team in the short term and the long term."

In his four drafts with the Jets, Maccagnan has selected 28 players – at least one at every position group – including defensive lineman Leonard Williams, young starters in safeties Jamal Adams and Marcus Maye, linebackers Darron Lee and Jordan Jenkins, right tackle Brandon Shell and punter Lachlan Edwards. Undrafted free agent wide receiver Robby Anderson has also blossomed into a starter.

As the 2018 Draft approached, Maccagnan demonstrated the foresight to position the team more than a month before the draft and completed a trade with Indianapolis to secure the third overall pick that eventually was used to select quarterback Sam Darnold. Prior to the 2017 regular season, Maccagnan acquired a second-round choice in the 2018 NFL Draft and wide receiver Jermaine Kearse from Seattle in exchange for defensive lineman Sheldon Richardson. The second-round pick was one of three used to complete the trade with Indianapolis for the pick used for Darnold. Maccagnan has shown the ability to maneuver throughout the Draft, trading 12 times in his four drafts, executing transactions to move up and down, as well as in and out of rounds. During the 2017 Draft, he completed five trades, increasing the team's total draft choices from six entering the Draft to nine at its conclusion, while also adding a selection in the 2018 Draft.

In 2017, following the difficult decision to part ways with a number of veteran players, including Eric Decker, David Harris, Brandon Marshall, Nick Mangold and Darrelle Revis, Maccagnan's saw his first and second-round selections, safeties Adams and Maye, become the first pair of rookie teammates to start every game at safety since the NFL merger in 1970. The duo also ranked first and second respectively in tackles among all NFL rookie secondary players, according to press box stats. Additionally, Adams earned consensus all-rookie recognition for his efforts.

Adams' recognition continues a favorable trend for Maccagnan's first-round selections. Lee was named all-rookie by NFL.com in 2016, while Williams was a consensus all-rookie selection in 2015 and earned a trip to play in the 2016 Pro Bowl. Since entering the league in 2016, Edwards' 57 punts inside the 20-yard line rank 10th in the league. Additionally, Edwards set an NFL overtime record with a 70-yard punt versus Jacksonville in 2017. Despite going undrafted, Anderson's 1,528 receiving yards are the most in a player's first two years in Jets history since Keyshawn Johnson racked up 1,807 during the 1996-97 seasons. In 2016, Anderson topped all NFL rookies with 20 or more receptions in yards per catch and ranked sixth among all rookies in receptions and receiving yards.

In his first season as a General Manager (2015), Maccagnan was named NFL Executive of the Year by the Pro Football Writers Association after he acquired seven new starters, all of whom played roles in helping the team win 10 games – six more than the previous season. Two (Brandon Marshall & Darrell Revis) of the seven new starters earned Pro Bowl recognition in 2015. Marshall, who was acquired for a 2015 fifth-round draft pick, earned team MVP honors and established club records for receptions (109) and receiving yards (1,434) while he tied the Jets record for most receiving touchdowns (14). Revis, who signed as an unrestricted free agent, led the club with nine takeaways (five interceptions and four fumble recoveries), tied for second most in the NFL.

In 2016, the Jets used an NFL-record-tying 75 players (including 49 different starters) en route to a 5-11 finish.

Prior to his arrival in Florham Park, Maccagnan spent more than 20 years in scouting, including the last four as the director of college scouting for the Houston Texans, originally joining the team in 2000 shortly after the expansion franchise was awarded. One of Charley Casserly's original hires as Texans general manager, he spent his first 10 seasons with the club as the coordinator of college scouting before twice being promoted by current general manager Rick Smith, first to assistant director of college scouting in 2010 and then to director of college scouting the following season.

Prior to his departure, he had a hand in every draft in Texans franchise history, selecting or signing an undrafted rookie free agent Pro Bowler at every position group with the exception of quarterback and specialist. RB Arian Foster (undrafted rookie free agent), WRs Andre Johnson (first-round pick) and Jacoby Jones (third-round pick), TE Owen Daniels (fourth-round pick), LT Duane Brown (first-round pick), DE J.J. Watt (first-round pick), DE Mario Williams (first-round pick), DE Jason Babin (first-round pick), LBs Brian Cushing (first-round pick) and DeMeco Ryans (second-round pick), CB Tramon Williams (undrafted rookie free agent) and S Glover Quin (fourth-round pick) were added to the roster and each went on to make at least one Pro Bowl appearance in their careers.

Despite selecting just two offensive linemen before the third round since 2008, Maccagnan helped add talent to a position group that cracked the top 10 in fewest sacks allowed (eighth), rushing yards (eighth) and fewest turnovers (10th). In 2014, 65 percent of the Texans offensive line starters joined the team as a result of the draft or as undrafted rookie free agents.

Maccagnan began his career in the NFL as a training camp intern with the Washington Redskins (1990) and later re-joined the team in 1994 as a college scout before spending the next five seasons as a pro scout.

Prior to returning to Washington, Maccagnan served as a league scout for the World Football League at its office in Dallas, joining the London Monarchs the following year for the team's championship run. He also spent time in the Canadian Football League, first with the Ottawa Rough Riders and later with the Saskatchewan Roughriders.


Married to wife, Betty, Maccagnan is a native of Hightstown, NJ, and holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Trinity College.

In his current role, Heimerdinger oversees both the college and pro personnel departments while assisting with player contract negotiations. Heimerdinger joined the Jets after spending three seasons as a scout and player personnel analyst for the St. Louis Rams. During his time with the Rams, his responsibilities included evaluating NFL rosters and completing positional crosschecks of quarterbacks, tight ends and wide receivers for free agency. Returning for his fourth season as head coach of the New York Jets, Todd Bowles continues to emphasize the tenets of hard work, cohesiveness and perseverance at the franchise where he began his NFL coaching career in 2000.

In 2017, Bowles fostered a theme focused on teamwork and unity encapsulated by the mantra, One Team, One Goal. To reinforce the message, Bowles oversaw a redesign of the first floor of the team's practice facility, the primary area utilized by players, coaches and support staff. The theme resonated throughout the season as the team maintained a united front, earning a 5-11 record.

"The players clearly love Todd. I heard more than once, 'I'd run through a brick wall for him.' I think he is a great coach of these men, and the record at the end of the season didn't dissuade me on that," said Chairman & CEO Christopher Johnson after signing Bowles to a two-year extension in December. "He is a great leader of men. He got, I think, the most out of these guys. He got more than anybody imagined out of these guys. The predictions at the beginning of the season were pretty dire, and I think some young stars emerged and an extraordinary core emerged, and I attribute that to Todd and his staff who coached these guys up."

On the field, Bowles and his coaching staff played a crucial role in safeties Jamal Adams and Marcus Maye becoming the first pair of rookie teammates to start every game at safety since the NFL merger in 1970. During the 2017 season, the rookie safety duo ranked first and second respectively in tackles among all NFL rookie secondary players, according to press box stats. Additionally, Adams earned consensus all-rookie recognition for his efforts.

"I think I've grown every year. Letting the defense go to Kacy (Rodgers) is big for me and becoming more of a game day manager has been big for me. I think I'm calmer from the standpoint of understanding what my players are and who they are and what they like and what they don't like and when to teach and when to yell, as opposed to just going off the handle all the time. I think I've grown in that way and am continuing to grow in every aspect," said Bowles.

For Bowles, the key to having a successful team is tied to executing in four areas: running the ball, third down, red zone and turnovers. Since Bowles became head coach in 2015, the Jets have ranked near the top of the NFL in defending the run. From 2015-17, the defense ranks fourth in limiting opponents to 3.79 yards per carry, fifth in allowing 28 rushing touchdowns and seventh in yielding 100.1 rushing yards per game. Since 2015, the Jets have held opponents to 70 rushing yards or less in 16 contests, a figure that ties for the second-highest amount in the NFL. Additionally, during Bowles' tenure, the Jets have allowed opponents to convert on only 36.7% of third downs, the fifth-lowest percentage in the league, as well as tying for second in the league with 13 red-zone takeaways.

En route to earning a 5-11 record in 2016, the Jets tied an NFL record by using 75 players, including 49 different starters, 25 of whom were in their first or second seasons. Additionally, of the 29 players that appeared on the practice squad for the Jets in 2016, 13 were promoted to the active roster, including every player that spent at least seven weeks on the practice squad.

Bowles led the Jets to a 10-6 mark in 2015, beginning his head coaching tenure by winning four of his first five games before dropping four of five to even the season record at 5-5. With the season at a crossroads, Bowles guided the club to five straight wins. The six-game turnaround from the previous season matched the second-best win improvement in the first season by a new Jets head coach. The team also finished 10th in the league in total offense and fourth in total defense, one of just five teams in the league with a top 10 finish on both sides of the ball.

In 2015, the Jets ranked in the top third of the NFL in three of the four major offensive categories and in the top three in all four major defensive categories, improving the team's rank from 2014 in seven of the eight areas. The Jets also established a new franchise record for the fewest rushing yards allowed per game in a single season.

Prior to rejoining the Jets, Bowles served as the defensive coordinator for the Cardinals (2013-14), earning Assistant Coach of the Year recognition in 2014 from both the Pro Football Writers of America and The Associated Press, the first ever recipient of the AP award. During

his time with Arizona, the Cardinals defense ranked in the top five in the league in several statistical categories, including third in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed (14), fifth in points per game allowed (19.5) and fifth in rushing yards per game allowed (96.6). Also, Bowles' defenses demonstrated a knack for causing turnovers and returning them for scores. During his tenure, the Cardinals ranked first in defensive touchdowns (nine) and fifth in interceptions (38).

In 2014, despite key losses to injury, Arizona's defense remained among the league's best and helped the Cardinals tie their highest win total in franchise history with 11. The defense ranked fifth in the NFL in points per game allowed (18.7), tied for fifth in fewest touchdowns surrendered (32), tied for third in interceptions returned for touchdowns (three) and tied for fifth in turnover margin (+8).

During Bowles' first season as Arizona's defensive coordinator in 2013, his defense immediately developed into one of the most stout units in the NFL. The Cardinals finished the 2013 campaign with 10 wins, led by the league's sixth-ranked overall defense with 317.4 yards per game allowed. Arizona finished with the NFL's No. 1 rushing defense for the first time in franchise history, surrendering just 84.4 yards per game, improving from 28th in the league in 2012. Additionally, the Cardinals defense ranked seventh in points allowed per game (20.3), sixth with 30 takeaways and fifth with 20 interceptions. The team's 47.0 sacks in 2013 were good for the third highest in a season in team history.

Under Bowles' tutelage, three different Cardinals defensive players were named to the Pro Bowl. Most notably, cornerback Patrick Peterson made the Pro Bowl both seasons and was recognized as a first-team Associated Press All-Pro in 2013. Defensive end Calais Campbell was named to his first Pro Bowl in 2014 and earned second-team All-Pro honors. In 2013, linebacker Karlos Dansby earned second-team All-Pro honors and linebacker John Abraham was a Pro Bowler after accumulating a team-leading 11.5 sacks, the most by a linebacker in a single season in team history.

Prior to joining the Cardinals, Bowles coached in Philadelphia (2012), Miami (2008-11), Dallas (2005-07) and Cleveland (2001-04) after his start with the Jets (2000).

With the Eagles, he began the season coaching the team's defensive backs for the first six games before being appointed interim defensive coordinator for the final 10 contests. The Eagles finished ninth in the NFL in pass defense (216.9 ypg) that season.

Before his time with the Eagles, he spent four seasons with the Dolphins, serving as the team's assistant head coach/secondary. In 2011, Bowles was named interim head coach for the final three games, leading the club to a 2-1 record. In his time with the Dolphins, opposing quarterbacks completed just 58.1% of their passes, the seventh lowest total in the league, while safety Yeremiah Bell (2009) made his only Pro Bowl appearance in that span.

Prior to his time with Miami, he reunited with Head Coach Bill Parcells (who, as the director of football operations for the Jets in 2000, hired Bowles to his first coaching job in the NFL) as the secondary coach for the Cowboys from 2005-07. During that span, the Dallas defense totaled 52 interceptions, tied for third most in the NFC, and ranked fifth in the NFC by holding opposing offenses to 310.4 total yards per game. He coached three defensive backs to a total of five Pro Bowls in Dallas, including three appearances by safety Roy Williams and the first career trips for safety Ken Hamlin and cornerback Terence Newman.

From 2001-04, Bowles was a defensive assistant for Cleveland, serving as the secondary coach (2004) and defensive nickel package coach (2001-03). In 2004, the Browns ranked fifth in the NFL in passing yards allowed with 181.3 yards per game. His first year with Cleveland (2001), the Browns defense set a franchise record with 33 interceptions, including 28 picks by the secondary.

Bowles got his start in the NFL coaching ranks in 2000 as the Jets defensive backs coach and mentored a secondary that was ranked sixth in the NFL in pass defense, allowing 183.3 yards per game.

Before beginning his NFL coaching career, Bowles was recruited by his former Redskins teammate, quarterback Doug Williams, despite never having coached at any level, to serve as the defensive coordinator/secondary coach at Morehouse College in 1997 and then as the defensive coordinator/secondary coach at Grambling State from 1998-99.

After his retirement as a player, Bowles spent two seasons (1995-96) with the Green Bay Packers player personnel department under General Manager Ron Wolf, working alongside five current NFL general managers, John Dorsey, Scot McCloughan, Reggie McKenzie, John Schneider and Ted Thompson.

Despite going undrafted in the 1986 NFL Draft, Bowles, the four-year letterman and team captain out of Temple (1982-85), played in 117 regular-season games at cornerback and safety and registered 15 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries in his eight-year career playing for the Washington Redskins (1986-90, 1992-93) and the San Francisco 49ers (1991). Bowles was a starter on the 1987 Redskins championship team that defeated the Denver Broncos, 42-10, in Super Bowl XXII.

A New Jersey native, Bowles grew up 22 miles from the site of the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center. He and his wife, Taneka, have three sons, Todd Jr., Troy and Tyson.

In 2016, the city of Elizabeth, NJ renamed Waterfront Field to The Todd Bowles Waterfront Sports Complex.

MIKE CALDWELL

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH | INSIDE LINEBACKERS

Mike Caldwell returns for his fourth season as the team's assistant head coach/linebackers coach after joining Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff from the outset in 2015. Under his charge, every full-time starter at inside linebacker has recorded a 100+ tackle season.

Last season, the Jets inside linebackers both recorded career seasons. Second-year pro Darron Lee ranked second on the team with a career best 123 tackles, and also registered 3.0 sacks and two forced fumbles, both single-season highs. Opposite Lee, linebacker Demario Davis returned via trade in the offseason and registered a career best 172 tackles, the most by a Jet since 2005. Additionally, Davis ranked sixth in the league in tackles (according to Radar360), while also producing career numbers in sacks. Lee and Davis were third among LB tandems in total tackles (according to Radar360) while the pair also had 22 combined tackles for loss, tied for the most among the leading tackle duos.

In his second year with the Jets (2016), Caldwell guided a group that saw David Harris lead the team in total tackles (113) for the ninth time in 10 seasons. Additionally, Lee, the Jets' 2016 first-round draft choice, posted 40 of his 76 tackles as a starter over the season's final six games. Caldwell's charges were part of a defense that allowed just 3.69 yards per carry, the fourth lowest average in the league, as the Jets were one of just five teams to surrender 91 or fewer rushing yards in a game 10 times, despite facing six of the top 10 running backs in rushing yards.

Because of injuries, including one that snapped Harris' streak of 121 consecutive starts, Caldwell saw five different players — Harris, Lee, Erin Henderson, Julian Stanford and Bruce Carter — start at inside linebacker last season. Four of those players produced at least one double-digit tackle performance for the Jets in 2016.

In his first season with the Jets (2015), Caldwell's unit was part of a defense that helped to set a franchise record with just 83.4 rushing yards per game allowed, as two of his linebackers, Harris and Demario Davis, finished first and second on the team in total tackles with 128 and 118, respectively.

Prior to joining the Jets, Caldwell oversaw a Cardinals linebacker group that contributed to a defense (coordinated by Bowles) that ranked fifth in points allowed per game in 2015 (18.7) despite the key losses of inside linebackers Karlos Dansby (free agency) and Daryl Washington (injury).

In 2013, Arizona's defense finished as the NFL's sixth-ranked overall unit and featured the league's top-ranked run defense (84.4 yards per game), which allowed the fewest rushing yards in team history for a 16-game season (1,351). The Cardinals also had 47 sacks, the third highest total in franchise history, and 30 takeaways, including 20 interceptions, which tied for the fifth best total in the NFL.

After serving as a training camp coaching intern with the Eagles in 2007, Caldwell began his coaching career as a defensive quality control coach with Philadelphia in 2008. He was promoted to assistant linebackers coach in 2010 and elevated to linebackers coach in 2011. During his first season overseeing the linebackers, Caldwell helped develop several young players into key roles, including Jamar Chaney, who intercepted three passes to go along with a team-leading 104 tackles. He also integrated two rookies into the rotation – sixth-round pick Brian Rolle, who started 13 games, and fourth-rounder Casey Matthews. In 2012, Caldwell oversaw standout linebacker DeMeco Ryans, who led the team with 113 tackles, including 15 tackles for loss. During his 11-year playing career at linebacker, Caldwell was a special teams standout with Cleveland (1993-95), Baltimore (1996), Arizona (1997), Philadelphia (1998-2001), Chicago (2002) and Carolina (2003). He played in 159 career regular-season games, posting 14.5 sacks and eight INTs and receiving Special Teams MVP honors from his Eagles teammates in 1998.

Caldwell earned his degree from Middle Tennessee State in business administration. He and his wife, Sue, have two daughters, Sydnei and Saniyah, and a son, Simeon. His niece, Nikki, is the head women's basketball coach at LSU.

Jeremy Bates was promoted to offensive coordinator | quarterbacks coach on February 14, 2018, a season after joining Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff as the team's quarterbacks coach. This season will mark the third overall for Bates with the Jets after he initially joined the organization in 2005.

Last season, Bates coached 38-year-old quarterback Josh McCown to career season. McCown completed 67.3% of his passes for a passer rating of 94.5, finishing in the top four in franchise history in both, as he established his single-season marks in passing yards (2,926) and touchdown passes (18) in starting 13 games. Additionally, Jets passers cut their interception total from 25 in 2016 to just 12 a season ago, fewer than all but 10 teams.

Before rejoining the Jets, Bates spent a season working with the quarterbacks in Chicago, as Jay Cutler helped guide the team to a 10-6 record. Prior to his time in Chicago, Bates spent one season as the offensive coordinator for the Seahawks, overseeing a Seattle offense that averaged 31.5 points in the postseason.

Between NFL positions, Bates spent one season at the University of Southern California where he worked as the school's assistant head coach/quarterbacks coach.

Prior to USC, Bates spent three seasons with Denver, working with Jets offensive line | run game coordinator coach Rick Dennison, then the Broncos offensive coordinator. He initially served as an offensive assistant (2006), then as the wide receivers/quarterbacks coach (2007) and finally as the quarterbacks coach (2008). The Broncos finished top 10 in both total yards and passing yards in that span.

In his first stint with the Jets (2005), Bates worked with a quarterback position that saw five quarterbacks play and three start as injuries took their toll on the position.

In his first coaching position, Bates was an offensive quality control coach (2002-03) and later became the assistant quarterbacks coach (2004) with Tampa Bay as the Buccaneers won Super Bowl XXXVII after the 2002 season.

Bates, a college quarterback at both Rice (1996-99) and Tennessee (1995), received his degree from Rice in 1999. He is the son of Jim Bates, who spent 17 years coaching in the NFL as part of a coaching career that spanned five decades.

BRANT BOYER

SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR

Brant Boyer returns to head up the Jets special teams units, his third season with the club after initially joining Todd Bowles' staff in 2016. In his two seasons with the Jets, the team has committed just 22 penalties on special teams, the fewest of any team in the league.

Last season, Boyer oversaw a career year from punter Lachlan Edwards as the second-year Australian increased every statistic from his rookie season. Edwards, who established franchise records with 46.6 gross and 40.5 net punt averages, ranked third in the league with 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in Jets history. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro, a 2017 acquisition by the Jets, improved on his field goal percentage from 75% in 2016 to 83.3% last season, as well as connecting on 100% of his extra point attempts, the first time he had done so since his rookie season. Catanzaro also connected on a 57-yard field goal, the longest in team history, while also setting a franchise record with a 66.2% touchback rate.

Among Boyer's coverage units, the Jets allowed just 20.0 yards per kickoff return in 2017, the eighth lowest average in the league. Safety Rontez Miles led the NFL with 15 solo special teams tackles (according to Radar360), while both Miles and linebacker Josh Martin rank in the top 13 league-wide in total special teams tackles since Boyer's appointment in 2016.

In his first season (2016), kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league that season and the fourth highest mark in team history. Additionally, Edwards matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Boyer joined the Jets after a four-year tenure in Indianapolis (2012-15), where he aided a Colts special teams unit that ranked in the top 10 league-wide during that span in net punting average (third), kickoff return average (fourth), kickoff touchbacks (fourth) and field goal percentage (seventh), despite using three different players as primary punt returners and four different kick returners in his four seasons.

During the 2015 season, the Indianapolis special teams unit established an NFL record with just 156 kickoff return yards allowed for the season, besting the previous mark of 254 set by Denver in 1992.

In 2014, both punter Pat McAfee and kicker Adam Vinatieri received Associated Press First-Team NFL All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors under Boyer as McAfee converted a career-high three onside kicks and set single-season franchise records for punts pinned inside the 20-yard line (30), net punting average (42.8) and kickoff touchbacks (70), while Vinatieri made 30-of-31 field goals and also converted 35 consecutive attempts, the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

In 2013, Boyer coached Matt Overton to his first career Pro Bowl selection, one year after discovering the long snapper at a specialists combine in Arizona and bringing him to Indianapolis for a workout prior to his signing in April 2012.

Prior to joining the Colts, Boyer was twice a training camp intern, first for the Cleveland Browns (2009) and later for the New York Giants (2010).

Before entering the coaching ranks, Boyer played linebacker and was a standout on special teams for the Miami Dolphins (1994), Jacksonville Jaguars (1995-2000) and Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He served as a special teams captain for both the Jaguars and Browns and led the Browns in tackles in 2002 and 2003. Boyer was a two-time member of USA Today's All-Joe Team, once as a linebacker and once as a special teams player. In 2002, his teammates selected him for the Cleveland Browns Unsung Hero Award.

Boyer played in 129 career games and totaled 250 tackles, 13.0 sacks, six interceptions, one forced fumble and 15 passes defensed. He originally entered the league as a sixth-round selection of the Miami Dolphins in the 1994 NFL Draft.

Before entering the NFL, Boyer was an inside linebacker and team captain at the University of Arizona. He led the team in tackles during his senior season, helping the Wildcats to their first 10-win season in 90 years and a victory in the 1993 Fiesta Bowl, and earned a place in the school's Ring of Honor.

Kacy Rodgers returns for his fourth season as the Jets defensive coordinator after helming a defense that remains among the NFL's best since his appointment in 2015.

Since 2015, the Jets defense has surrendered just 350.5 scrimmage yards, the eighth lowest total in the league, while also surrendering the 10th fewest first downs. The Jets defense has excelled in key categories as well, surrendering the seventh fewest rushing yards per game (100.1), while dropping that number to just 87.6 (third best in the league) at home. On third down, they have allowed opponents to convert just 36.7% of their attempts, the fifth lowest percentage, and have forced 13 red zone takeaways (second most in the league) and registered 12 red zone sacks (eighth most).

Last season, the Jets saw improvement across the board in their passing defense, surrendering a lower opposing passer rating and completion percentage and fewer passing plays of 25+ yards, while also increasing their interceptions. Overall, the defense added five new starters, including three in the secondary.

In 2016, the passing defense improved over the final eight weeks from the league's last-ranked passing defense, allowing 302.1 yards per contest, to the league's second-ranked passing defense, allowing just 207.5 yards per game. Additionally, the rushing defense allowed just 3.69 yards per carry, the fourth lowest average in the league, continuing the group's success against the run. Over his two seasons as defensive coordinator, Rodgers' group has held opposing runners to just 91.1 yards per game, the third best average in the league during that span. Opposing ball carriers have gained just 3.64 yards per carry, second best in the league.

In his first season as defensive coordinator (2015), Rodgers' unit registered 30 takeaways, increasing the team's total by 17 from the previous season, tying for the third most in the league and the most since the team recorded 31 in 2011. As a whole, the defense ranked in the top 10 in five major defensive categories, including points (No. 9), total defense (No. 4), rushing defense (No. 2), third downs (No. 3) and red zone (No. 1).

Prior to joining the Jets, Rodgers spent seven seasons coaching the defensive line in Miami. During his tenure, the Dolphins defense totaled 287 sacks, third most in the league during that span, and ranked in the top 10 in opponents' rushing average (4.02 yards per carry) and rushing touchdowns allowed (80). In 2014, Miami's defensive line produced 30.5 of the team's 39 sacks, the third consecutive season that it accounted for over 70% of the team's total.

Under Rodgers' direction, defensive tackle Paul Soliai (2012), defensive tackle Randy Starks (2010, '12) and defensive end Cameron Wake (2011, '13-15) all made their first Pro Bowl appearances. Additionally, 2012 third-round selection defensive end Olivier Vernon paired with Wake to produce 38.0 sacks from 2013-14, the third highest total by a pair of defensive linemen, behind only Mario Williams and Kyle Williams (BUF), and Robert Quinn and Chris Long (SL).

During his time with the Cowboys, Rodgers coached both the defensive tackles (2003-04) and the defensive line (2005-07). Over his tenure, the defense finished in the NFL's top 10 against the rush all but one year. In 2007 it finished sixth against the rush, allowing just 94.6 yards per game.

Prior to his career in the NFL, Rodgers spent time coaching at several colleges, including Tennessee-Martin (1994-97), Louisiana-Monroe (1998), Middle Tennessee State (1999-01) and Arkansas (2002). He spent his time coaching the defensive lines at every stop, before becoming the assistant head coach at Tennessee-Martin and Middle Tennessee State.

Rodgers signed as an undrafted free agent with the Steelers in 1992, spending training camp with the team, and signed with the Shreveport Pirates (CFL) in 1994 before retiring.

He attended the University of Tennessee (1988-91) and lettered four times while contributing to a pair of SEC Championships (1990-91).

Rodgers' son, Kacy II, a former defensive back at the University of Miami, was signed by the Jets this offseason after two seasons in the CFL with the Saskatchewan Roughriders.

RICK DENNISON

Rick Dennison begins his first season with the Jets as the team's offensive line | run game coordinator coach after being hired on February 14, 2018. This season marks his 24th as an NFL coach, with 16 of the last 17 coming as either an offensive coordinator or offensive line coach.

Dennison has coached 18 different Pro Bowl players, across seven different positions, including six offensive linemen. Of those six, five made their first Pro Bowl appearance under him, while three made all their trips with him as their coach. His rushing offenses have averaged 2,064 yards a season (129.0 yards per game) and 4.4 yards per carry while producing 14.5 touchdowns a season.

Prior to joining the Jets, Dennison served on the staffs at Buffalo (2017), Baltimore (2014), Houston (2010-13) and two stints with Denver (1995-2009, 15-16) in a variety of roles.

Last season, Dennison served as the offensive coordinator for the Bills, helping a Buffalo offense that ranked sixth in rushing as both running back LeSean McCoy and guard Richie Incognito received Pro Bowl recognition.

In his return to Denver (2015-16), Dennison oversaw a Broncos offense that committed just three turnovers during the postseason to help secure a championship in Super Bowl 50.

In his one season with Baltimore (2014), quarterback Joe Flacco established career highs in passing yards (3,986) and touchdown passes (27) and posted a combined eight games with a passer rating above 100.0 while being sacked just 19 times during the regular season—29 fewer than the previous year.

During his time with Houston (2010-13), Texans running backs produced an NFL-best 29 individual 100-yard rushing performances, including 24 by running back Arian Foster, who was named an All-Pro selection by The Associated Press three times in his four years under Dennison. During the 2012 season, seven of Houston's 11 starters on offense received Pro Bowl recognition.

His first stint as an NFL offensive coordinator came with the Broncos (2006-08). Their offense ranked seventh in the NFL (350.5 yards per game) as Dennison oversaw one of just two units in the league to rank in the top 10 in both passing and rushing. He previously worked as the team's offensive line coach (2001-05) and special teams coach (1997-2000).

Dennison joined the Denver staff in 1995 after spending the previous three years coaching at the high school level for Suffield (Conn.) Academy. He worked for two years in Denver as an offensive assistant (1995-96) before being promoted to special teams coach the next season.

Undrafted out of Colorado State University, Dennison played nine seasons at linebacker for the Broncos, appearing in 128 games (52 starts) and totaling 514 tackles, 6.5 sacks, four interceptions, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. He participated in three Super Bowls as a player and was the team's recipient of the Ed Block Courage Award in 1989.

At CSU, he earned three varsity letters and was named a second-team Academic All-American as a senior. Dennison earned two degrees in civil engineering from CSU, first his bachelor's in 1979 and later his master's degree in 1982.

A native of Kalispell, Montana, Dennison attended Rocky Mountain High School in Fort Collins, lettering in football, basketball and baseball.

Dennison and his wife, Shannon, have three sons, Joseph, Steven and Trey, and twin daughters, Abrynn and Allie. His son, Joseph, is married to Hayley and the couple has two sons, Brodrick John Dennison and Ezeckiel George Dennison.

David Diaz-Infante returns for his third season on Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff, and his fourth straight year with the club after he spent time as a training camp intern (2015).

Last season, Diaz-Infante helped integrate a new left tackle in Kelvin Beachum while returning four of five starters from a season ago. The line helped pave the way for a career season from running back Bilal Powell (772 yards and five touchdowns rushing) as well as protecting Josh McCown, allowing the quarterback to complete 67.3% of his passes for a 94.5 quarterback rating, both in the top five in franchise history.

In his first full season with the Jets (2016), Diaz-Infante coached an offensive line that saw nine different starters, including multiple starters at four of the five positions as four projected starters finished the year on injured reserve. Despite the turnover, the line helped blocked for an offense that finished in the top half of the league in both rushing yards (12th) and sacks allowed (t-16th).

Prior to his time with the Jets, Diaz-Infante served as an offensive assistant with the Arizona Cardinals for two seasons (2013-14), working on the same coaching staff as Bowles, who was the defensive coordinator at the time.

Before he began his coaching career, Diaz-Infante enjoyed a seven-year career in the NFL in which he played both guard and center with the Chargers, Broncos and Eagles. During his career, he played in 69 games, earning Super Bowl rings with the Broncos in 1998 and 1999. He entered the league in 1987 with the Chargers as an undrafted free agent and played in three games as a rookie. The first of his two stints with the Broncos came in 1995-98 before playing with the Eagles in 1999 and finishing his career with Denver in 2001. He also played in the World League of American Football (WLAF) with the Frankfurt Galaxy (1991-92), the Sacramento Gold Miners in the Canadian Football League (1993-94) and the Las Vegas Outlaws in the XFL (2001).

Following his playing days, Diaz-Infante worked in television as a studio analyst with FSN Rocky Mountain from 2003-04 before joining ESPN in 2004 as a college and high school football analyst. He also served as an analyst for the Broncos radio network from 2005-08.

A native of San Jose, CA, Diaz-Infante attended Bellarmine College Prep (San Jose, CA) where he was the Central Coast Section Conference Lineman of the Year in 1981. He played college football at San Jose State where he was an honorable mention AP All-American, a first-team all-conference selection and a four-year starter while also serving as a team captain. He was inducted into the San Jose State Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Diaz-Infante earned a bachelor of arts in social science. He and his wife, Audra, have a son, Dante Antonio, and a daughter, Alexis Maria.

KARL DORRELL

WIDE RECEIVERS

Karl Dorrell returns for his fourth season as the Jets wide receivers coach, marking his 29th season coaching at the collegiate and professional levels. The only constant in Dorrell's time with the Jets has been change as his group has helped the Jets become the only team to have five different players register 50+ receptions in a single-season since he started in 2015 (Brandon Marshall, Eric Decker, Quincy Enunwa, Robby Anderson and Jermaine Kearse).

Last season, with the offseason departure of both Marshall and Decker and the training camp season-ending injury to Enunwa, Dorrell was without three receivers who each produced a season of at least 50 catches and 850 yards, as the trio combined to register 337 receptions for 4,683 yards from 2015-16. In his second season, Anderson took a step forward and led the team with 941 yards and seven touchdowns, ranking him third and tied for first respectively among second-year receivers. Anderson also produced touchdowns in five consecutive games, tied for the fourth-longest single-season streak in franchise history. Kearse, then a six-year veteran who was added to the roster a week before the start of the regular season, led the team with a career-best 65 receptions. The duo of Anderson and Kearse, despite not playing together until kickoff weekend, became one of just six wide receiver pairings in the conference to each register five touchdowns, while also becoming the first to both have back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for the Jets since Don Maynard and George Sauer at OAK (12/17/67) and at SD (12/24/67) and the first to complete this feat in the NFL since 2014.

In 2016, his second season with the Jets, following an injury to Decker, Dorrell would get increased contributions from Enunwa, who in his second season established career bests in every category and led the team in receiving yards and receiving touchdowns. Anderson, then an undrafted rookie free agent, finished with the sixth most receiving yards among rookie wide receivers in 2016 and finished seventh in franchise history for most receiving yards by a rookie, becoming the first Jets receiver with multiple touchdown receptions of 40+ yards since 2010.

In his first season with the Jets (2015), Dorrell oversaw a record-setting receiving group led by Marshall, who earned Pro Bowl recognition after posting franchise marks with 109 receptions (fourth in the league), 1,502 yards (fourth) and 14 receiving touchdowns (tied for first). Additionally, Decker and Marshall would combine for the most receptions and receiving touchdowns of any wide receiver duo in Jets history while finishing second in team annals in total receiving yards. The pair also logged touchdowns in the same game nine times, besting the NFL record established in 1998.

Before rejoining the NFL coaching ranks in 2015 with the Jets, Dorrell spent 2014 as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt.

In his prior NFL stints, Dorrell helped the Texans reach the playoffs in 2012, when he tutored quarterback Matt Schaub to his second career Pro Bowl. With Dorrell's guidance, Schaub recorded 4,008 passing yards and completed 64.3 percent of his passes, his highest completion percentage since 2009.

Prior to his time with Houston, Dorrell spent four seasons in Miami, three as a wide receivers coach (2008-10) and the last as quarterbacks coach (2011). In 2011, he mentored Dolphins quarterback Matt Moore to a career season when he took over the starting job in Week Five. He went on to set career highs in almost every category, while also ranking fourth among AFC quarterbacks with an 88.7 passer rating.

As the wide receivers coach from 2008-10, Dorrell saw Marshall and Davone Bess combine for the fourth most receptions of any duo in the NFL. Bess had 209 receptions from 2008-10, at the time the most by any Dolphins player in his first three years with the team.

A head coach at UCLA from 2003-07, Dorrell was named the 2005 Pac-10 Conference Co-Coach of the Year. He guided the Bruins to five bowl games and an overall record of 35-27. In 2005, Dorrell led UCLA to a 10-2 record and No. 13 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. That same season, the Bruins defeated two ranked opponents, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 10 California. The 2005 squad was led by





quarterback Drew Olson and running back Maurice Jones-Drew, who helped the Bruins rank No. 5 nationally in scoring offense (39.1) and No. 23 in both passing offense (270.3) and total offense (431.0).

Dorrell's first full-time stint in the NFL came from 2000-02 when he served as the wide receivers coach for the Broncos. While with Denver, he helped Rod Smith eclipse 1,000 yards receiving three times and earn two Pro Bowl selections. In 2000, Ed McCaffrey posted 101 receptions for 1,317 yards and combined with Smith to become only the second wide receiver duo to each catch 100 passes in a single season. Dorrell received his full-time opportunity with the Broncos (2000) after working with the staff during training camp in 1993 and 1999 as part of the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship program.

Dorrell coached wide receivers at Colorado from 1992-93 and Arizona State in 1994 before returning to Colorado to serve as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach of the Buffaloes from 1995-98. While in Colorado, Dorrell helped Charles Johnson and Michael Westbrook become just the fourth pair of receivers on the same team to top 1,000 yards in a season.

Dorrell was an honorable mention All-America receiver at Helix High School in San Diego before helping the Bruins play in three Rose Bowls as a wide receiver during his playing career at UCLA (1982-86). After college, he spent time with the Dallas Cowboys in 1987.

Dorrell graduated with a degree in psychology from UCLA in 1987, and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at UCLA in 1988. A native of San Diego, CA, Dorrell and his wife, Kim, have two children, Chandler and Lauren.

La'Roi Glover returns for his second season as the Jets assistant defensive line coach. Glover, whose 13-year playing career saw him selected to multiple Pro Bowls and register 83.5 sacks, began his post-playing career as director of player programs with the Rams before entering the coaching ranks with the Jets.

In his first season with the Jets, Glover and Defensive Line Coach Robert Nunn helped Steve McLendon establish a career high in tackles (55) for the second consecutive season, and Leonard Williams finished third in the AFC with 25 quarterback hits.

Additionally, late addition Kony Ealy, who joined the roster shortly before the start of the regular season, recorded nine passes defensed, the second-most by a defensive lineman in the league last season, while in-season signing Xavier Cooper saw action in eight games for the club and recorded 16 tackles, a sack and a pass defensed, all career bests.

Prior to joining the Jets, Glover spent seven seasons working as the Director of Player Programs for the Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams. In that role he was responsible for assisting players with their transition into professional football with the development of programs to address off-the-field matters.

Glover spent 13 seasons as a defensive tackle in the league, playing in 193 games, including 191 consecutive to finish his career, for the Oakland Raiders (1996), New Orleans Saints (1997-2001), Dallas Cowboys (2002-05) and St. Louis Rams (2006-08). He amassed 83.5 sacks during his career and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowl teams, while also receiving All-Pro recognition four times. He was a first-team selection for the 2000s All-Decade team. During the 2000 season, Glover led the league with 17.0 sacks, the second most in league history among defensive tackles, and was named NFL Alumni Defensive Lineman of the Year as well as NFC Defensive Player of the Year.

Glover is a member of the San Diego State University Hall of Fame, the Breitbard Hall of Fame (established to honor athletes who have excelled athletically in San Diego or who are native San Diegans who have achieved athletic fame elsewhere), the New Orleans Saints Hall of Fame and the inaugural class of the CIF-San Diego Section Hall of Fame. Glover graduated from San Diego State University with a degree in public administration and later received his MBA at Fontbonne University in 2012.

Glover and his wife, Spring, have three children, a son, La'Roi, Jr., and two daughters, Neomie and Sophia.

Kevin Greene, a Hall of Fame player following a 15-year, 160-sack career, returns for his second season leading the Jets outside linebackers. He returned to coaching last season following a three-year hiatus helping multiple Jets outside linebackers to career seasons.

Last season, Greene saw linebacker Jordan Jenkins improve in every category as the second-year pro increased his single-season bests in sacks, tackles, quarterback hits, tackles for loss and fumble recoveries. Jenkins also earned AFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after a two-sack performance vs. Buffalo (11/02/17). In his first season as a starter, linebacker Josh Martin also saw an uptick in production as he led the team in tackles for loss and finished second in quarterback hits all while maintaining a large role on special teams. Additionally, linebacker David Bass, who joined the Jets in Week Three, registered sacks in each of his first two games with the team en route to a career best.

Prior to joining the Jets, Greene spent five seasons with the Packers as their outside linebackers coach. In those five seasons, Green Bay produced 203.0 sacks, the fourth most in the league, while linebacker Clay Matthews produced 50.0 total sacks, the third most of any player and the most among any outside linebackers. Additionally, nine different outside linebackers produced multi-sack seasons for the Packers under Greene, including five rookies.

As a 3-4 outside linebacker during his playing career, Greene played for four different teams – Los Angeles Rams, Pittsburgh Steelers, Carolina Panthers and San Francisco 49ers – and notched 160.0 career sacks, the third most in league history and the most by a linebacker. A five-time Pro Bowl selection and three-time All-Pro selection, Greene registered 10 double-digit sack seasons and led his team in sacks 11 times and the league twice. He played in six conference championship games and one Super Bowl (XXX) and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2016.

In addition to his 160.0 sacks, Greene finished his career with 26 fumble recoveries, tied for fourth all-time, and five interceptions. He had three returns for touchdowns (two fumbles, one INT) and also posted three safeties.

A former walk-on at Auburn, Greene played two seasons (1983-84) for the Tigers and led the SEC in sacks as a senior with 11. He was selected in both the NFL Draft by the Rams in the fifth round and in the USFL territorial draft by the Birmingham Stallions.

While earning a degree in criminal justice at Auburn, Greene also completed ROTC training and served as a captain in a 16-year career in the Army Reserve. He served his military commitments during the offseas while playing in the NFL.

After his playing career ended, Greene worked in real estate and as a summer NFL coaching intern with five different clubs, including one in 2006 with Miami, where Dom Capers was the Dolphins' defensive coordinator. His most recent coaching internship came in 2008 with the eventual Super Bowl champion Steelers.

Born in Schenectady, NY, Greene and his wife, Tara, have a son, Gavin, and a daughter, Gabrielle.

Jeff Hammerschmidt returns for his third season as the assistant special teams coach. He initially joined Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff with Special Teams Coordinator Brant Boyer in 2016, his first season in the NFL after a 24-year career coaching in the collegiate ranks.

Last season, punter Lachlan Edwards set franchise records with a 46.6 gross punting average and 40.5 net punting average while also placing 33 punts inside the 20-yard line, the second most in franchise history and the third most in the NFL in 2017. Additionally, kicker Chandler Catanzaro connected on the longest field goal in franchise history when he hit a 57-yard field goal at CLV (10/08/17), while also setting a franchise record with a 66.2% touchback rate. Overall, Catanzaro improved from his 75% field goal rate in 2016 as he connected on 25-of-30 attempts (83.3%), including becoming one of just five kickers in the conference with at least 14 makes of 40+ yards last season.

In Hammerschmidt's two seasons with the Jets, the team has committed just 22 penalties on special teams, the fewest of any team in the league. Last season, the kickoff coverage ranked eighth in the league, allowing just 20.0 yards per return.

In Hammerschmidt's first season, kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league last season and the fourth-highest mark in team history. Additionally, Edwards, then a seventh-round rookie, matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Prior to joining the Jets, Hammerschmidt served as a special teams coordinator for his alma mater Arizona (2008-11) before working in the same capacity at Colorado State (2012-15). In his time with the Rams, both the punter and kicker received honorable mention all-conference honors.

Throughout his career, Hammerschmidt has coached every level of the defense (secondary, linebackers and defensive line) while also serving as a defensive coordinator for Southern Utah (1996-97), Saint Mary's (2000-02) and Montana (2003-04). He began his coaching career in 1992 as a graduate assistant at Arizona and has since worked with a handful of current and former NFL players, including Kris Dielman, Adewale Ogunleye, Antwaan Randle El and Brooks Reed.

A four-year letterman, three-year starting safety and first-team All-Pac-10 selection at Arizona, Hammerschmidt was a semifinalist for the 1989 Jim Thorpe Award after beginning his career as an option quarterback. Following his collegiate career, he signed as a free agent with the Los Angeles Rams (1991) and played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of the World League (1992). Hammerschmidt and his wife, Felicity, have two children, Bryn and Bode. He has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Arizona.

Prior to joining the Jets staff, Jackson spent two seasons with the Titans as the team's assistant secondary coach, assisting a pair of young players to standout years. Safety Kevin Byard, a former 2016 third-round selection, was named a first-team All-Pro last year as well as being selected for the Pro Bowl after tying for the league lead with eight interceptions which he returned for 130 yards (second most in the NFL). Additionally, cornerback Adoree' Jackson, the team's first-round selection in 2017, started since Week One and registered 17 passes defensed (according to Radar360), the third most of any rookie.

Before the Titans, Jackson spent time coaching with the Lions (2013) and Redskins (2004-11) before beginning his coaching career with the Bills (2001-03).

Entering the league as a third-round selection in the 1991 NFL Draft, Jackson spent his entire nine-year player career with the Houston Oilers | Tennessee Titans organization, amassing career totals of 14 interceptions and nine sacks, ending his playing career in Super Bowl XXXIV. Before the NFL, he was a four-year starter at Purdue and was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, given to the nation's top defensive back, as a senior.

A native of Houston, Texas, Jackson has a daughter, Dominique, and a son, Stephen.

JIMMIE JOHNSON

TIGHT ENDS

Jimmie Johnson, one of the original hires on Todd Bowles' Jets staff, returns for his fourth season leading the team's tight ends.

Last season, Johnson's group finished in the top half of the league in targets, receptions and 25+ yards catches, becoming one of just three teams in the league to see four different tight ends produce a catch of 20+ yards. Austin Seferian-Jenkins, in his first full season with the Jets, posted career numbers, catching 50 passes for 357 yards, the eighth most receptions in team history for a tight end and the most since Dustin Keller pulled in 65 passes in 2011.

A big part of the run game, Johnson's tight end group has helped block for a Jets rushing offense that has produced 111.9 yards per game on the ground since 2015, the fifth-best average in the AFC. Eric Tomlinson, a key contributor to the rushing attack, has played all 21 of his career games (17 starts) for Johnson after originally joining the club from the Houston Texans practice squad in 2016.

Prior to joining the Jets, Johnson spent eight seasons as the Vikings tight ends coach, utilizing a variety of different players in his time there. During his time in Minnesota, four different tight ends led the group in receptions, including Jermaine Wiggins (2006), Visanthe Shiancoe (2007-11), Kyle Rudolph (2012) and John Carlson (2013). Under Johnson, Shiancoe posted 208 catches for 2,424 yards and 24 touchdowns in five seasons, despite amassing just 35 catches for 253 yards and three touchdowns in the four seasons prior to joining Minnesota. In his final two seasons with Johnson, Rudolph, a former second-round selection, posted 12 touchdowns. Although he missed eight games in those two seasons, Rudolph's 12 touchdowns tied for the fifth-most among tight ends in the NFL. In their time under Johnson, Vikings tight ends also excelled in the red zone, producing 36 touchdowns on just 75 targets, or almost half a touchdown per target, the best in the league.

His group helped pave the way for the NFL's top rushing attack, as the Vikings produced 138.2 yards per game on the ground, the best yards per carry (4.75), the most carries of 10+ yards (505) and the second-most rushing touchdowns (141). Additionally, Minnesota ran out of two-TE sets more than all but one other team and produced the most yards, the highest yards per carry average and the most carries of 10-plus yards in the league.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Johnson was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Texas Southern (2004-05), the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks/wide receivers coach at Shaw and the running backs coach at South Carolina State.

Johnson entered the league as a 12th-round pick by the Redskins and spent 10 seasons as an NFL tight end, appearing in 118 games (33 starts) for Washington, Detroit, Kansas City and Philadelphia. He helped pave the way for 1,000-yard rushers in eight of his 10 seasons as a player, including Earnest Byner, Barry Sanders, Ricky Watters and Duce Staley.

As a senior at Howard University, Johnson was an All-MEAC choice after hauling in 31 receptions for 546 yards and nine TDs. He finished his four-year college career with 73 catches for 1,229 yards and 16 TDs. Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in consumer studies at Howard University and his MBA from George Washington University. He is a native of Augusta, GA, where he attended T.W. Josey High School.

Overall, McCown finished with 2,926 yards passing, 18 touchdowns and a 94.5 passer rating in just 13 games.

Prior to the Jets, Lombardi worked with both San Francisco and New England. With the 49ers, he coached both sides of the ball as an offensive quality control coach (2016) and offensive assistant (2014) and as a defensive assistant (2015) working with the defensive backs. He joined the 49ers in 2013 as an assistant to Head Coach Jim Harbaugh. STUMP MITCHELL RUNNING BACKS

Lyvonia "Stump" Mitchell enters his second season as the team's running backs coach after overseeing a running back group that posted three different 300-yard rushers on the season, one of just three NFL teams to do so. Additionally, the Jets rushing offense was one of just 10 to post at least three games of 175 yards on the ground in 2017.

In his first season with the Jets, Mitchell helped RB Bilal Powell post career bests in both rushing yards (772) and rushing touchdowns (five) while finishing sixth among AFC qualified rushers with a 4.34 yards per carry average. Rookie RB Elijah McGuire posted 492 yards from scrimmage, the third most by a Jets rookie running back since 2000, while also becoming the only rookie running back in franchise history with a two-point conversion. Mitchell also oversaw the transition of Lawrence Thomas, who switch positions from defensive line to fullback. Thomas, who missed all but three games as a rookie in 2016, made the conversion in the third game of the season, appearing in 14 games (four starts).

Prior to joining the Jets, Mitchell spent nine seasons in Seattle (1999-2007), two seasons in Washington (1998-99) and four seasons in Arizona (2013-16), turning a Cardinals rushing attack that ranked 24th or worse each season from 2005-2012, including 32nd four times, to a top 10 rushing offense over his last two seasons.

Under Mitchell, four different backs — Ricky Watters (1999-00), Shaun Alexander (2001-05), Clinton Portis (2008) and David Johnson (2016) — have gained 1,000 yards rushing in a season, while Andre Ellington produced 1,000 scrimmage yards in each of his first two NFL seasons (2013-14). Additionally, Alexander (five times) and Johnson (each of the last two seasons) have produced 10 or more scrimmage touchdowns in a season, including Alexander's then-NFL record 28 in 2005 and Johnson's league-leading 20 in 2016. He has helped produce five Pro Bowl players: Alexander, Johnson and Portis as well as fullbacks Mack Strong and Mike Sellers.

Before he entered the NFL's coaching ranks, Mitchell spent four seasons at Morgan State, first as the team's offensive coordinator (1995) and then three years as head coach. He returned to college football in 2010, serving as the head coach at Southern University for three seasons (2010-12).

Following the conclusion of his NFL playing career, Mitchell began coaching running backs for the San Antonio Rough Riders of the World League of American Football in the spring of 1991. He then moved on to Casa Grande (AZ) High School in 1993 where he served as the head coach for two seasons, leading the team to the state playoffs in his second year.

A former ninth-round selection in the 1981 NFL Draft, Mitchell played his entire nine-year NFL career with the Cardinals, signing with Kansas City in 1990 without appearing in a game. Mitchell, who moved with the team from St. Louis to Phoenix, ranks in the top three in franchise history in rushing yards (second), rushing average (second), kickoff return yards (second) and punt return yards (third). Off the field, Mitchell earned recognition as the Chuck Drulis Award winner for community service in 1982 and as the team's Byron "Whizzer" White Humanitarian Award finalist in 1984 for his work in the community.

A four-year player and three-year starter at running back for The Citadel, Mitchell holds school records for rushing yards in a season and for a career, finishing with the second-most rushing yards in the country as a senior in 1980 when he was named as a third-team All-American, Southern Conference Player of the Year and South Carolina Amateur Athlete of the Year.

Robert Nunn returns for his second season as the team's defensive line coach, his 19th season in the NFL and 31st season coaching football.

In his first season with the Jets, Nunn oversaw a defensive line group that received contributions from both veteran and young players alike. In his second season with the team, Steve McLendon established a career high in tackles (55) for the second consecutive season, while Leonard Williams finished third in the AFC with 25 quarterback hits and his 19 quarterback hits over the season's final 10 weeks led the conference.

A couple of late additions got up to speed quickly for the Jets as Kony Ealy, who joined the roster shortly before the start of the regular season, recorded nine passes defensed, the second-most by a defensive lineman in the league last season and the most by a Jets defensive lineman since 1994. In-season signing Xavier Cooper saw action in eight games for the club and recorded 16 tackles, a sack and a pass defensed, all career bests.

Additionally, Williams, Ealy and Muhammad Wilkerson all registered interceptions in 2017, making the Jets one of three teams with multiple defensive line interceptions.

Prior to the Jets, Nunn worked with the Cleveland Browns (2016), New York Giants (2010-15), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2009), Green Bay Packers (2005-08), Miami Dolphins (2001-02, 04) and Washington Redskins (2003). He has been part of six top 10 defenses for three different teams and 19 different players have produced at least 5.0 sacks in a season. Of those 19, 11 matched or established their single-season career bests while coached by him. Among the players coached by Nunn in the NFL are Hall of Famers Bruce Smith, who broke the NFL career sacks record under him in 2003, and Jason Taylor, who established a single-season best 18.5 sacks in 2002, as well as Jason Pierre-Paul and Justin Tuck, both of whom registered multiple 10+ sack seasons with him, while Osi Umenyiora logged 11.5 in 2010.

Before entering the coaching ranks in the NFL, Nunn spent 12 years coaching at the collegiate level, including eight seasons as the head coach (1992-99) at Georgia Military College in Milledgeville, GA after spending his first season at the school (1991) as the defensive coordinator. Among his other stops were coaching defensive ends at Tennessee, where he coached current Jets defensive coordinator Kacy Rodgers, and one season as the defensive line coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College (1988).

Nunn spent four years as a linebacker at Oklahoma State, serving as team captain during his senior year. He graduated from the school in 1988 with a degree in secondary education.

Nunn and his wife, Karen, have six children: a daughter, Josie, and five sons, Noah, Jacob, Nathan, Johnny and Jason.

Jason Vrable returns as the Jets offensive assistant, his second season as a member of Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff and his sixth season coaching in the NFL.

Prior to his time with the Jets, Vrable spent four seasons with the Bills, the first three as an offensive quality control coach before being promoted to assistant quarterbacks coach. He assumed the role of interim running backs coach following Anthony Lynn's promotion to offensive coordinator in Week Three. Since Week Three, Bills running backs Mike Gillislee (5.71) and LeSean McCoy (5.67) led all qualifying NFL runners in rushing average as the pair also accounted for 23 total touchdowns as part of a Buffalo offense that finished first in the league in rushing yards per game.

Prior to entering the NFL coaching ranks, Vrable spent two seasons at Syracuse, first working as an assistant to the wide receivers coach and then as an assistant to the quarterbacks coach. Following his time with the Orange, Vrable spent two seasons at the University of Charleston as the school's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks/running backs coach, as the school led its conference in total offense and rushing offense.

After his playing career at Marietta, Vrable spent the summer of 2007 as a strength intern at the University of South Florida before returning to Marietta, this time as the school's quarterbacks coach. He spent one season there before joining the Robert Morris staff in the same position.

Vrable set records in all single-season and career passing categories en route to earning multiple Ohio Athletic Conference honors as well as two offensive Most Valuable Player awards at Marietta College. A two-time captain, he was named Marietta's Clyde Lamb Award winner in 2007 recognizing him as the school's male scholar athlete of the year. He was inducted into the Marietta College Athletic Hall of Fame in February of 2018.

Vrable graduated with a master's degree in sports management from Robert Morris University. He and his wife, Jill, have a son, Drake.

Dennard Wilson returns for his second season as the Jets defensive backs coach, after overseeing a Jets defensive backfield in 2017 that allowed a lower opponent's completion percentage and a lower passer rating than the previous season.

In his first season with the team, Wilson helped integrate the Jets first- and second-round picks, safeties Jamal Adams and Marcus Maye. Adams and Maye led all rookie defensive backs in tackles and finished in third and fourth respectively among all rookies (according to NFL.com statistics). Adams finished with 83 tackles, two sacks, five passes defensed, a forced fumble and fumble recovery, while Maye added 76 tackles, three passes defensed, a forced fumble and tied for the team lead with two interceptions.

Additionally, CB Morris Claiborne led the defense with 11 passes defensed, while CB Buster Skrine posted multiple forced fumbles and fumble recoveries, one of just 10 cornerbacks to do so since 2011, while finishing second with 10 passes defensed. Additionally, Skrine finished as one of just three cornerbacks in the league this season with an interception, forced fumble, fumble recovery and a sack.

With the Rams, Wilson held the defensive backs coach position for two seasons, overseeing a passing defense that improved from 23rd in 2015 to ninth overall in 2016. Since 2015, cornerback Trumaine Johnson has picked off eight passes, tied for the fifth most in the league and third most among corners. Before spending two seasons as the defensive backs coach, Wilson worked as the Rams defensive quality control coach after joining the team in 2012.

Wilson entered the NFL coaching ranks with the Rams after four years as a pro scout with the Chicago Bears, evaluating pro players and scouting opponents.

Before the NFL, Wilson coached at both of his former schools, first as a defensive backs coach/passing game coordinator for DeMatha (MD) High School (2004-06) and then as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland (2007-08).

A three-year starter at Maryland, Wilson played four years as a defensive back and was selected as captain for the 2002-04 seasons, earning All-Atlantic Coast Conference honorable mention in 2004. After Maryland, he signed with the Washington Redskins as an undrafted rookie free agent, joining the team as a member of the practice squad before suffering a season-ending injury.

Wilson graduated from the University of Maryland in 2004 with a degree in communications. He is married to his wife, Taihitia, and the couple have a daughter, Riley.
