

## **BILL FOLEY** Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and Governor

**Bill Foley** knew that bringing an NHL franchise to Las Vegas was not going to be an easy task, but his persistence paid off on June 22, 2016. While that day will go down in history as the first day a major professional team entered the market, it would not have happened without the hard work from Foley and the people he surrounded himself with.

In the years leading up to the Board of Governor's announcement of the NHL's 31st franchise, Foley, the Vegas Golden Knights Chairman and CEO, was busy engaging the fan base and aligning himself with prominent people in the community. In early 2014, he entered an agreement with the Maloof family to pursue an NHL franchise in Las Vegas. At the end of 2014, the NHL granted Foley permission to gauge fan interest in Las Vegas.

On February 15, 2015, Foley and the Maloofs launched the "Vegas Wants Hockey" season ticket drive with the goal of 10,000 season tickets sold. They received more than 5,000 ticket deposits on the first day and about a month later, they reached their goal. In June, the NHL officially announced they would accept applications for expansion. Less than a month later Foley had submitted his application. He would spend the next 11 months meeting with NHL

officials and governors on why Las Vegas was a good fit.

After expansion was announced, Foley went to work putting together his team. He named George McPhee the team's first General Manager on July 13, 2016 and the hockey operations staff started to take form. On October 3, 2016, Kerry Bubolz was named the team's first President and the business side of the team started to develop. The official team name, the Vegas Golden Knights, was announced on November 22, 2016, in front of thousands of fans in Toshiba Plaza in front of T-Mobile Arena.

Foley sat in on many meetings leading up to the Expansion Draft and on June 21, alongside McPhee, Foley announced picks at the NHL Awards Show in front of more than 10,000 fans at T-Mobile Arena.

In their inaugural season, the Golden Knights finished with a 51-24-7 overall record, won the Pacific Division and advanced to the Stanley Cup Final. Vegas became the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division.

Foley is the founder and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Fidelity National Financial Corporation (NYSE: FNF), a publicly traded Fortune 500 Company. A provider of title insurance, specialty insurance and claims management services, FNF was selected in 2004 by Forbes as one of the "26 Best Managed Companies in the U.S." and has repeatedly been named to Fortune's list of America's Most Admired Companies, Forbes' list of America's Best Big Companies and selected for Barron's list of Best Companies for Investors.

After receiving his B.S. degree in engineering from the United States Military Academy at West Point, Foley served in the U.S. Air Force, where he attained the rank of captain. He received an M.B.A. degree from Seattle University and earned his J.D. degree in 1974 from the University of Washington School of Law. From 1974 to 1984, Foley practiced law in Phoenix and focused primarily on corporate and real estate law. Following his legal tenure, Foley became affiliated with FNF. Through strategic acquisitions, Foley led FNF to become one of the largest title insurance companies in the nation, as well as to diversify into information services through the 2003 acquisition of ALLTEL Information Services, now Lender Processing Services (NYSE: LPS).

Foley devotes time to many educational and community organizations. In 1997, he was chosen as Orange County, California's Business Person of the Year, honored with the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation's Semper Fidelis award and inducted into the Florida Council of Economic Education's First Coast Business Hall of Fame in 2006.

Foley and his wife, Carol, are active philanthropists for many causes, especially those in support of children's education. Foley has served as a trustee on the boards of the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce and the Cummer Museum of Art & Gardens. He also serves on the board of the Folded Flag Foundation, and their mission is to provide educational scholarships and support grants to the spouses and children of the United States military and government personnel who died as a result of hostile action or in an accident related to U.S. combat operations. Foley's additional professional directorships include Winter Sports, Inc.; Ceridian Corporation; and Fidelity Newport Holdings, LLC.

In addition to his numerous professional and philanthropic commitments, Foley is an accomplished golfer, ranked in 2004 by Golf Digest as one of the top five executive golfers in the world. Foley enjoys his time as a vintner and is the founder and managing partner of Foley Family Wines, headquartered in Sonoma, Calif. Foley also formed and serves as Chairman of Glacier Restaurant Group, LLC, the largest restaurant business headquartered in Montana. He is the developer of Rock Creek Cattle Company, a 40,000-acre working Montana ranch, featuring a high-end golf community with diverse homesteads, a well-appointed lodge for recreation and dining and an exceptional golf course designed by Tom Doak.





## **GEORGE McPHEE**

### President of Hockey Operations, Alternate Governor

On July 13, 2016, George McPhee became the first-ever President of Hockey Operations and General Manager of the Vegas Golden Knights. On September 1, 2019, McPhee retained the President of Hockey Operations when he promoted Kelly McCrimmon to the team's General Manager.

In his current role, McPhee oversees the team's day-to-day hockey operations including development, with an emphasis on scouting, drafting and overseeing the coaching staff. He has created a team-first culture in his short time with the franchise and has hired staff around him who share that philosophy.

During the team's second season, the Golden Knights posted a 43-32-7 record (93 points) and finished third in the Pacific Division. In the opening round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Vegas fell to the San Jose Sharks in seven games.

Under McPhee's guidance, the Golden Knights became the first expansion team to start their inaugural season 3-0. The Golden Knights continued their strong play in October, starting with an 8-1 record, despite losing multiple goaltenders to injury.

The Vegas Golden Knights finished their unprecedented inaugural season with a 51-24-7 record (109 points) and the Pacific Division title, becoming the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division.

For his efforts, McPhee was named the General Manager of the Year during the NHL Awards show on June 20, 2018. It was his first GM Award in his second appearance as a finalist, having finished as a runner-up in 2009-10 with the Washington Capitals.

Prior to the season, McPhee was tasked with putting together a competitive team in the short-term but also building for long-term success. Contributing to both of those goals was a successful Expansion Draft, which saw him select three-time Stanley Cup champion goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury from the Pittsburgh Penguins as well as other players who will immediately compete for playing time.

The Expansion Draft was not the only place where McPhee and his staff were successful. Through the expansion process, the Golden Knights made agreements with other teams and benefited by having three first-round draft picks in the 2017 NHL Entry Draft and 13 overall picks in the draft. The team ended up making 12 selections, the most of any team in the 2017 draft.

McPhee joined the Golden Knights after most serving as a Special Advisor to New York Islanders General Manager Garth Snow in 2015.

Prior to his time with the Islanders, McPhee served as Vice President and General Manager of the Washington Capitals for 17 seasons. Under his guidance, the Capitals grew from a lottery team to a perennial contender with multiple Southeast Division championships and the team captured the Presidents' Trophy in 2009-10.

The Capitals reached the playoffs 10 times during McPhee's tenure in Washington, including six straight seasons from 2007-08 to 2012-13. Under his leadership, the team claimed seven Southeast Division titles (1999-2000, 2000-01, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2012-13) and he oversaw the Capitals first trip to the Stanley Cup Final in 1997-98, McPhee's first season with the franchise.

McPhee also saw success through the draft while with Washington as the team held 15 first-round draft picks from 2004-13, the most of any NHL team. His most notable selection was the No. 1 overall pick in 2004, Alex Ovechkin, the league's only active three-time MVP. Prospects flourished under McPhee's direction as the Capitals affiliate of the American Hockey League, the Hershey Bears, were Calder Cup champions in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Prior to his time in Washington, McPhee spent five seasons as the Vice President and Director of Hockey Operations as well as alternate governor for the Vancouver Canucks, assisting then General Manager Pat Quinn with all hockey-related matters. In his time with the Canucks, the team enjoyed four trips to the playoffs, a division championship and a trip to the 1994 Stanley Cup Final.

McPhee began his playing career in his hometown of Guelph, Ont., with the Ontario Junior Hockey League's Guelph Platers, leading them to the 1978 Centennial Cup, Canada's Tier II championship. Following his stint with the Platers, McPhee attended Bowling Green State University of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, where he became one of college hockey's most decorated players. A four-year letterwinner from 1978-82, he was the recipient of the 1982 Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given to the top player in college hockey. His other accolades included a first-team All-CCHA selection in 1982, second-team All-CCHA honors in 1979 and 1981 and his selection as the CCHA's Rookie of the Year in 1979. Earning a degree in business, he became the first player to be named to the CCHA All-Academic Team in three consecutive seasons.

Upon the completion of his college career, McPhee signed as a free agent with the New York Rangers and started his NHL career during the 1982 Stanley Cup playoffs. Following his seven seasons with the Rangers and New Jersey Devils, McPhee earned his law degree from Rutgers University in 1992.

McPhee and his wife, Leah, have two daughters, Grayson and Adelaide, and one son, Graham, who was drafted by the Edmonton Oilers in the fifth round of the 2016 NHL Entry Draft.





## **KERRY BUBOLZ**

## President, Chief Operating Officer, Alternate Governor

On October 3, 2016, Vegas Golden Knights Chairman and owner Bill Foley announced Kerry Bubolz as the first President and Chief Operating Officer of the Golden Knights. In his role, Bubolz oversees all business aspects of the franchise.

Bubolz is in his third season with the Golden Knights after leading the organization to tremendously successful first two campaigns. The Golden Knights continued to exceed expectations in their second season, averaging 105.5% capacity at T-Mobile Arena while also achieving a top 5 ranking in the NHL in team allocated sponsorship revenue, ticket sales and merchandise sales.

Bubolz was also instrumental in negotiating the franchise's television deal with Root Sports (now AT&T Sportsnet), broadcasting VGK games not only locally in Las Vegas but extending throughout the Western Rockies region through Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Wyoming, Montana and parts of California and Arizona. In only their second year, the Golden Knights ranked 3rd in the NHL's U.S. markets with a 4.2 average household rating for the 18-19 regular season. For the

2019-2020 preseason, the Golden Knights made their television broadcasts even more accessible to fans through partnerships with KTNV, Nevada Sports Network, and KJZZ, allowing the games to be seen in Las Vegas, Reno, and Salt Lake City.

The organization also captured national attention with their best-in-class game presentation putting on a show for both Golden Knights fans, and NHL fans. Players across the league have taken notice of the incredible atmosphere at Golden Knights games, as T-Mobile Arena was voted "Best Atmosphere in the NHL" by the players in a recent NHL Players' Association Poll. Bubolz's steady leadership ultimately led to the organization winning the Sports Business Journal's prestigious Sports Team of the Year Award for the 2017-2018 season, as well as the National Hockey League's "Commissioner Award for Business Excellence" for the inaugural season. The Golden Knights continued to earn recognition in their second season by winning the NHL Business Awards Stanley for best in class social media content.

Bubolz has also instilled a commitment to community outreach and service in the franchise through the organization's various charitable initiatives. The Golden Knights Foundation serves as the primary charitable link between the team and the Las Vegas community focusing on five pillars including, fighting hunger and homelessness in Las Vegas, securing the future of Las Vegas military, first responders and their families, and fostering physical, social and emotional growth of Las Vegas youth. The Golden Knights Foundation has been supported by the 51/49 raffle, which has raised more than \$2,500,000 during the team's first two seasons. Bubolz's commitment to community and growing the sport of hockey in Southern Nevada is evidenced by the team's hockey development programs, including the "Golden Knights Hockey Academy" which reaches over 200,000 children in Clark County middle and elementary schools.

Prior to joining the Golden Knights, Bubolz spent 13 years with the National Basketball Association's Cleveland Cavaliers. In 2013, he was named President, Business Operations where he oversaw ticketing and suite sales, corporate sponsorship revenue, broadcast, marketing, communications and community engagement for the franchise. In Bubolz's time with the Cavaliers, the team won the Eastern Conference Championship three times and won the NBA championship in 2016. The Cavaliers were consistently recognized by the NBA during their annual Sales & Marketing awards ceremonies as a top performing team in all key business metrics.

In addition to overseeing Cavaliers business operations, Bubolz also served as President and Alternate Governor for all franchise property teams owned by the Cavaliers Operating Company, including the Lake Erie Monsters of the American Hockey League. In 2016, the Monsters won the Calder Cup and finished third in league average attendance with 8,596 fans per-game. He was also President and Chief Operating Officer of the Cleveland Lumberjacks of the International Hockey League from 1994 to 2000.

The Tulsa, Oklahoma native also brings an abundance of National Hockey League experience to Las Vegas. He served as vice president of sales for the Carolina Hurricanes and the Dallas Stars prior to joining the Cavaliers.

Bubolz graduated from Oklahoma State University with a Bachelors' Degree in marketing in 1989. He and his wife, Melissa, live in Summerlin and have two daughters, Madison and Emma.





## **KELLY McCRIMMON General Manager**

On September 1, 2019, Kelly McCrimmon took over the General Manager duties for the Vegas Golden Knights. He originally came to Las Vegas as one of George McPhee's first appointments and was instrumental in the development of the front office staff, roster and culture for the organization during the first three years with the team.

McCrimmon joined the organization after serving as Owner, Governor, General Manager and Head Coach of the Western Hockey League's Brandon Wheat Kings and has been with the organization since 1988-89. McCrimmon served as Head Coach from 2004-11, and 2013-16. He has helped the Wheat Kings to five Memorial Cup appearances, once as a player (1979), three times as General Manager (1995, 1996, 2016) and twice as Head Coach and General Manager (2010, 2016).

Under McCrimmon's guidance, the Wheat Kings have captured 10 Eastern Division pennants and six Eastern Conference Championships. He was named WHL Executive of the Year in 1994-95, 2009-10, 2014-15, and received the Canadian Hockey League Executive of the Year award in 2009-10.

Since the 1992-93 campaign, when the Wheat Kings established a CHL record that still stands for the biggest single-season improvement of 62 points, the club has won more games than any other team in the CHL and has made the playoffs 22 of the last 24 seasons.

McCrimmon is the Wheat Kings All-Time winningest coach, having won over 400 games behind Brandon's bench. He purchased one-third ownership of the Wheat Kings from partner Bob Cornell in 1992, and assumed sole ownership in 2000. A member of the WHL's Board of Governors, McCrimmon also served as Chairman of the league's Competition Committee.

The Plenty, Saskatchewan, native played two seasons in Brandon in the late seventies and was a member of the 1979 WHL Championship club before moving on to the University of Michigan from 1980-84, serving as team captain his senior year. He will continue to serve as Owner and Governor of the Wheat Kings.





## MISHA DONSKOV Director of Hockey Operations

**Misha Donskov** was named Director of Hockey Operations for the Vegas Golden Knights on August 8, 2016. In this role, he provides day-to-day leadership to the team's management group and hockey operations department. His responsibilities include overseeing video/technology and analytics, managing the amateur and pro scouting administrative platforms, scouting and player evaluation at the amateur and pro levels, and providing support to the coaching staff. In addition, he advises President of Hockey Operations George McPhee and General Manager Kelly McCrimmon with regards to talent evaluation, player transactions, roster management and the amateur draft.

Donskov joined the Golden Knights after serving as Manager of Hockey Operations/Analytics & Video for Hockey Canada's Men's National Teams. On July 1, 2016, he was appointed Assistant Coach/Hockey Operations for the Men's National Teams. During his time with Hockey Canada, Misha won a gold medal at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey in Toronto, serving as an Assistant Coach on Mike Babcock's staff. In addition, Donskov won gold medals with Canada at the 2016 IIHF World Championship in Russia, the 2015 IIHF World Championship in the Czech Republic, the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship in Toronto and Montreal and with the 2013 Under-18 Team at the Ivan Hlinka Memorial Tournament in the Czech Republic and Slovakia. He won a bronze medal with Canada's National Men's Under-18 Team at the 2014 IIHF U18 World Championship in Finland. Donskov also served on Canada's coaching staff for the Canada-Russia Challenge, CHL Subway Series and Deutschland Cup.

Prior to his work with Hockey Canada, he was an associate coach with the Ontario Hockey League's Ottawa 67's from 2012-14 and spent three seasons with the London Knights. With the Knights, he served as assistant general manager and assistant coach, winning an Ontario Hockey League championship in 2012. In 2011, Donskov won a gold medal with the U.S. Women's National Team in Zurich, Switzerland serving as player development coach and advanced scout. Donskov also spent eight years working with the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets and Atlanta Thrashers organizations within hockey development, community development, fan development, marketing and hockey operations.

Before pursuing a career in hockey, Donskov spent six years with Cardinal Health, a Fortune 500 healthcare services company. He played hockey at the junior, university, and semi-professional level in Canada, United States, Sweden and Norway. ## ANDREW LUGERNER Director of Legal Affairs



Lugerner, a native of Potomac, Maryland, now resides in Las Vegas.






## VAUGHN KARPAN Director, Player Personnel

In addition, he advises the rest of the hockey operations department on potential trades, transactions and signings.

Before joining the Golden Knights, Lowes served as chief amateur scout for the Ottawa Senators for two seasons and had been with the Senators since the 2006 season, where he started as an amateur scout.

Lowes spent 12 years as a head coach in the Western Hockey League (WHL), including nine years with the Brandon Wheat Kings and three years with the Regina Pats. He also advises the rest of the hockey operations department regarding potential draft picks and transactions involving European prospects. Before joining the Golden Knights in August of 2016, he spent 17 years with the Washington Capitals, serving as a European scout since 1999.

Kelly Kisio serves as a professional scout for the Golden Knights. Prior to joining the team, he spent 18 years with the WHL's Calgary Hitmen, holding multiple positions throughout his tenure. The Hitmen won the WHL championship in 1999 and 2010 under Kisio's leadership. Before becoming general manager of the Hitmen, he scouted for the Calgary Flames for three years. Kisio enjoyed a long, successful playing career as well. In his 13 NHL seasons, he played for four teams and served as captain of the Rangers for four seasons, and alternate captain of the Sharks for two seasons. Kisio represented the Sharks in the 1993 NHL All-Star Game, scoring a goal for the Campbell Conference.



Jim McKenzie is a professional scout with the Golden Knights. Before joining the Golden Knights, McKenzie spent three seasons as a professional scout for the Florida Panthers. Prior to that, he served as the head coach of the Muskegon Lumberjacks of the United States Hockey League for parts of two seasons. McKenzie also worked for six years as a player liaison for the National Hockey League Players' Association. A former player himself, McKenzie had a 15-year NHL career playing for nine teams. He played in 880 career NHL games, compiled 1,739 penalty minutes, two Stanley Cup Finals and was a member of the 2003 New Jersey Devils Stanley Cup championship team.

Vince Williams is a Professional Scout for the Golden Knights. Williams joins the Golden Knights after serving as head coach of the ECHL's Orlando Solar Bears for two seasons. Prior to that, he spent seven seasons with the ECHL's Trenton Titans/ Trenton Devils Organization. Williams played eight seasons of professional hockey, and spent time in the ECHL, IHL and AHL. In 461 ECHL games, split between the Columbus Chill, Trenton Titans and Florida Everblades.



**Micky McCrimmon** is a professional scout with the Golden Knights. Prior to joining the Golden Knights, McCrimmon served as the assistant general manager for the Brandon Wheat Kings during the 2016-17 season. From 2002-04 he played for the Manitoba Junior Hockey League's Portage Terriers, from 2004-06 he played for the British Columbia Hockey League's Vernon Vipers and also suited up for the United States Hockey League's Lincoln Stars during the 2005-06 season. During the 2006-07 season, he suited up for the MJHL's Selkirk Steelers and wrapped up his playing career in 2007-08 with the University of Manitoba.





**Bruno Campese** is an Amateur Scout for the Golden Knights. He was most recently the head coach at Okanagen Hockey Academy in Penticton, British Columbia. Prior to this role, Campese served as general manager and head coach for the Prince Albert Raiders of the WHL from 2008-15. He also was the director of hockey operations and head coach for the Penticton Vees of the BCHL in Penticton, BC, from 2005-07. Before that he was an assistant coach for the Calgary Hitmen of the WHL from 2002-04 and general manager and head coach for the Trail Smoke Eaters of the BCHL from 2000-02. Prior to becoming a coach, Campese was a professional hockey player in European Division One from 1986-2000 and a played in the WHL from 1982-84.



Kent Hawley is an amateur scout for the Golden Knights. Hawley joins the Golden Knights after 11 years as an amateur scout for the Edmonton Oilers. Prior to that, he spent four years as a scout for the OHL's Plymouth Whalers. He also spent time as a coach before becoming a scout, serving as head coach of multiple teams in the UHL and CHL. As a player, he was drafted in the second round by the Philadelphia Flyers in 1986. Hawley spent three seasons playing for the OHL's Ottawa 67's. Hawley went on to play nine seasons of professional hockey, including stints with the AHL's Hershey Bears and ECHL's Hampton Roads Admirals. He won the Kelly Cup, the ECHL's top prize, with the Admirals in 1991.





Erin Ginnell is an Amateur Scout for the Golden Knights. Ginnell came to the Golden Knights after being with the Florida Panthers for 14 years, serving as the head amateur scout for the last six years. While with the Panthers, the team won two division titles (2011-12 and 2015-16). Prior to joining the Panthers, he was a scout for the Columbus Blue Jackets and the Colorado Avalanche. The Washington Capitals selected Ginnell in the fourth round of the 1986 draft. He also played in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League and the Western Hockey League. While playing Canadian college hockey, Ginnell won a championship with the Red Deer College Kings. He also played Canadian senior hockey, where he won two Allan Cups with the Powell River Regals.

Raphael Pouliot is an amateur scout for the Golden Knights. Pouliot most recently served as the assistant general manager and head scout for the Rouyn-Noranda Huskies in the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL), helping lead them to the President's Cup during the 2015-16 season. Pouliot has also served as the director of player development and as an Atlantic and Quebec regional scout for Rouyn-Noranda. Pouliot played four seasons in the QMJHL. He also played a season at the University of Moncton.

Keith Hendrickson is an amateur scout for the Golden Knights. Hendrickson previously served in the same capacity for the Buffalo Sabres for six seasons from 2011-17. Prior to that he was a successful high school hockey coach in Minnesota, serving as the head coach of the Virginia-Mountain Iron-Buhl boys coach. He helped lead the Blue Devils to the state tournament in 2005, 2009 and 2010, the first appearances in program history. Hendrickson played collegiately for the Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs from 1975-80 and was an eighth round draft selection by the Montreal Canadiens during the 1977 NHL Entry Draft.



Yan Stastny is an Amateur Free Agent Scout for the Golden Knights. He joined the team after playing hockey professional for 15 years. He appeared in 91 NHL games with the St. Louis Blues and Boston Bruins and recorded 16 points (6G, 10A). Stastny also played in professional leagues in Austria, Czech Republic, Germany, Russia and Sweden. After spending two years at Notre Dame, he was drafted by the Boston Bruins in the eighth round (259th overall) of the 2002 NHL Entry Draft. Stastny is the older brother to current Vegas Golden Knights forward Paul Stastny and son of Peter Stastny, who is in the NHL Hall of Fame.



Peter Ahola was hired on to the Golden Knights team as a European scout on August 30, 2016. Before joining the Golden Knights, Ahola served as a General Manager for four seasons in Finland's Liga (Finnish Elite League) with the Espoo Blues. Ahola also previously served as a European scout for the Toronto Maple Leafs for two seasons. He also played in the NHL for three seasons, suiting up for the Los Angeles Kings, Pittsburgh Penguins, San Jose Sharks and the Calgary Flames.



Alex Godynyuk is a European scout for the Golden Knights. Previously Godynyuk served as the head coach of Sokol Krasnoyarsk of the Russian Supreme Hockey League. Before his time with Sokol Krasnoyarsk, he also spent time as the head coach of the Hockey Federation of Ukraine from 2014-2015 as well as their National Junior U-20 and U-18 teams from 2009-2015. Before his coaching career, Godynyuk played in 223 NHL games over a span of nine years for four teams. After his retirement in 2001, he coached the ECHL's Greensboro Generals for one season.



Anders Johansson is a European scout for the Golden Knights. Previously Johansson worked with the Swedish national team, serving as an assistant coach on numerous teams from 2010-17. From 2003-10, he served as the head coach of Division 2 team Boro/Vetlanda. During the 2003-04 season, Johansson was the head coach of the Rögle BK J20 after serving as an assistant coach for two seasons with Rögle BK. The Vertlanda, Sweden native got his start in coaching serving as an assistant coach for the Great Falls (MT) Americans of the American West Hockey League.



Serhii Hapshenko is a European scout for the Golden Knights. The Chernihiv, Ukraine native began his work hockey as a journalist in 2009 in Ukraine. From 2011-2013, he worked in a hockey analytic position for Sokol Kyiv of the Professional Hockey League, which was an elite Ukrainian hockey league, where he worked with Alex Godynyuk. From 2013-19 he worked in hockey analytics, was the head of the hockey section and served as Deputy Chief Editor for Sportarena.com. Hapshenko holds a Master of Psychology degree from National University of Chernihiv, Ukraine. He and his wife Olha reside in Ukraine.



**Mike Rosati** is the Goaltending Development Coach/scout for the Golden Knights. Rosati joins the team after serving as the goaltending coach of the Barrie Colts in the Ontario Hockey League (OHL). He was drafted by the New York Rangers in the 1988 NHL Entry Draft, won two Italian Hockey Championships and played on the Italian national team during the 1994 and 1998 Winter Olympics. He appeared in one NHL game and recorded 12 saves in a perfect outing for the Washington Capitals in 1998.





## GERARD GALLANT Head Coach

**Gerard Gallant** was named the first head coach of the Vegas Golden Knights on April 13, 2017 and is in his third season as the team's bench boss. Since the start of the team's inaugural season, Vegas has held at least third place in its division for more than three quarters of the Golden Knights time in the League (78%, 294 of 374 days as of April 6). The team has collected 202 standings points in just two seasons and it took them 161 games to collect their 200th point, one contest fewer than the Ottawa Senators (1917-18).

In Year 2, Gallant led the Golden Knights to a 43-32-7 overall record (93 points) and third place in the Pacific Division and a playoff appearance for the second straight season. In the playoffs, the Golden Knights faced the San Jose Sharks for the second straight season, but the team fell in seven games to the Sharks in the First Round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

During the team's inaugural season, Gallant led the Golden Knights to the Stanley Cup Final, broke numerous expansion records during the season and was named the 2018 Jack Adams Award winner after finishing the season with a 51-24-7 record (109 points) and the Pacific Division title.

Vegas became the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division (excluding mergers and all-expansion divisions). With a fifth-place finish overall, Vegas also became the first expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish among the top-five in the league.

Under Gallant's direction, the team became the first expansion team to start a season with a 3-0-0 record after defeating the Dallas Stars and Arizona Coyotes on the road before hosting the Coyotes on October 10, 2017. The team would continue their hot trend, losing only one of its first nine games. The Golden Knights capped off its 8-1-0 start with a 7-0 victory on Nevada Day, marking its first five-game winning streak of the season – at the time matching an inaugural season record achieved by two other clubs (1926-27 Rangers and 1979-80 Oilers).

Over the course of the 2017-18 season, the Golden Knights would shatter records for a franchise in its inaugural NHL season, including longest home point streak (10-0-2 from Dec. 3 – Jan. 23), most home wins (finishing with 29), most road wins (finishing with 22) and most overall points (finishing with 109). On March 26, Vegas became the third expansion team since 1968-69 – and first to start from scratch – to clinch a berth in the Stanley Cup Playoffs (also EDM and HFD in 1979-80). In addition to the Golden Knights, Oilers and Whalers, only four other expansion clubs from any of the four North American professional sports leagues qualified for the playoffs in their inaugural seasons.

Prior to the Golden Knights, Gallant served as head coach of the Florida Panthers for parts of three seasons (2014-16), leading the Panthers to a record of 96-65-25 and an Atlantic Division title during the 2015-16 season.

During his first season behind Florida's bench, Gallant guided the Panthers to a 38-29-15 record and 91 points, a 25-point improvement from the previous season. The Panthers were eliminated from playoff contention after the 80th game of the 2014-15 regular season.

In his second year with the team, the Panthers finished with a franchise-best 103 points and a record of 47-26-9. The team captured its second-ever division title and made their fifth appearance in the NHL playoffs and first since the 2011-12 season. For his efforts, Galant was named a finalist for the Jack Adams Award, which is annually given to the NHL coach who has contributed the most to his team's success.

Prior to joining the Panthers, Gallant, 55, spent two seasons (2012-14) as an assistant coach with the Montreal Canadiens, helping the team advance to the postseason each year, including the 2014 Eastern Conference Finals.

During his two years as an assistant coach, Montreal posted a 75-42-13 mark, including their first 100-point season since 2007-08. Before coaching in Montreal, Gallant spent three seasons (2009-12) as the head coach of the Saint John Sea Dogs of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL). During his three seasons with Saint John, he compiled a 159-34-9 record and led the Sea Dogs



to three first-place finishes, three league final appearances, two QMJHL championships (2011 & 2012) and one Memorial Cup (2011). Gallant was also named the QMJHL and Canadian Hockey League Coach of the Year twice (2010 & 2011).

Gallant served as head coach of Columbus for parts of three seasons (2003-04 & 2005-07), after serving as an assistant with the Blue Jackets (2000-03). He was also an assistant with the New York Islanders (2007-09), the International Hockey League's Fort Wayne Komets (1998-99) and the American Hockey League's Louisville Panthers (1999-2000). Gallant began his coaching career in 1995-96 with the Summerside Capitals of the Maritime Junior Hockey League (MJrHL) leading the team to the Royal Bank Cup in 1997.

A native of Summerside, P.E.I, Gallant was selected by Detroit in the sixth round (107th overall) in the 1981 NHL Draft. He played in 615 NHL games for Detroit (1984-93) and Tampa Bay (1993-95) registering 480 points (211-269-480) and 1,674 penalty minutes. Gallant recorded four 70-plus point seasons, including his most successful year in 1988-89 when he registered a career high 93 points (39-54-93) and was selected as a NHL Second Team All-Star.

He and his wife, Pam, live in Las Vegas. They have two children, Melissa and Jason, and two grandchildren, Caleb and Dylan.

## MIKE KELLY Assistant Coach

**Mike Kelly** is in his third year as an assistant coach for the Vegas Golden Knights. He joined the team after most recently serving under Gerard Gallant with the Florida Panthers organization from 2014-17. In that time Kelly helped guide the Panthers to a record of 120-91-35 and a first-place finish in the NHL Atlantic Division in the 2015-16 season.

Prior to working with the Panthers, Kelly spent four seasons with the Saint John Sea Dogs of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League. There he served as head coach and general manager (2012-14) and director of hockey operations/associate head coach under Gallant (2010-12). He helped lead the Sea Dogs to three first-place finishes, three league final appearances, two QMJHL championships (2011 & 2012) and one Memorial Cup (2011).

Before working in Quebec, Kelly spent three years with the Vancouver Canucks organization (2005-08) as an assistant coach with both the Canucks and their American Hockey League affiliate, the Manitoba Moose. At the major junior level, Kelly has experience in both coaching and management with the Brandon Wheat Kings (Western Hockey League), North Bay Centennials (Ontario Hockey League) and Windsor Spitfires (OHL).

Internationally, Kelly led Team Canada to a gold medal at the 2003 IIHF World Under-18 Championship as head coach. He was also an assistant on Team Canada's coaching staff at the IIHF World Junior Championship in 2000, 2001, and 2002.

Kelly played hockey at the University of New Brunswick from 1981-86. During his time as a collegiate athlete, he recorded 48 goals and 73 assists for 121 points.



## RYAN McGILL Assistant Coach

**Ryan McGill** is in his third season with the Golden Knights and joined the team after most recently serving as the head coach of the Ontario Hockey League's Owen Sound Attack. He led the Attack to an overall record of 49-15-4 for a franchise-best 102 points during the 2016-17 season, which was good for the second-most points in the league. Over his two years with the club, McGill compiled a record of 81-42-10-5 and helped guide the team to its first conference final berth since the Attack won the J. Ross Robertson Cup in 2010-11 and was named both the OHL and Canadian Hockey League's Coach of the Year in 2016-17.

Prior to coaching the Attack, McGill spent time as the head coach of the Western Hockey League's Kootenay Ice. It was his second stint with the Ice, as he was team's head coach from 1998-2002 and led them to a Memorial Cup title in 2002. In 2009, McGill was named an assistant coach for the Calgary Flames after four years as the head coach of the Flames' American Hockey League primary affiliate team in Quad City and Omaha. He was also the head coach of the AHL's Hartford Wolf Pack from 2003-05.

The Sherwood Park, Alberta native played in 151 NHL games between 1991-95 before his career was cut short by injury. McGill scored four goals and recorded 15 assists for 19 points and 391 penalty minutes in those 151 games. He suited up for the Chicago Blackhawks (1991-92), Philadelphia Flyers (1992-95) and the Edmonton Oilers (1994-95).

He was selected by Chicago in the second round (29th overall) of the 1987 NHL Draft. McGill made his NHL debut for the Blackhawks during the 1991-92 season.



## RYAN CRAIG Assistant Coach

Ryan Craig is in his third year as an assistant coach for the Vegas Golden Knights. The Abbotsford, BC native joined the Golden Knights after most recently playing for the Cleveland Monsters of the American Hockey League, an affiliate of the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets. In the 2016-17 season Craig served as captain of the team and skated in 71 games, combining goals (11) and assists (11) for a total of 22 points. He also had a total of 25 penalty minutes this during the 2016-17 season. In the 2015-16 season Craig played for the Lake Erie Monsters, where he skated in 60 games, registering 20 points with 9 goals and 11 assists and totaling 38 penalty minutes. In addition, in the 2015-16 season the Monsters were the AHL Calder Cup champions.

Craig spent a total of 11 seasons in the AHL and was the captain of his team for nine of those years. He skated in 711 AHL games and tallied a total of 360 points on 172 goals and 188 assists and recorded 554 penalty minutes. From 2010-2012 Craig captained the AHL's Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins until signing a one-year AHL contract with the Springfield Falcons, where he was also named captain in his first season with the club.

The British Columbia native also spent time playing with various teams in the NHL. Craig was selected by the Tampa Bay Lightning in the 8th round (255th overall) in the 2002 NHL Entry Draft. Craig debuted in his first NHL game with Tampa Bay in the 2005-06 season. Craig played with Tampa Bay four more seasons, from 2006-2010, before signing with the Pittsburgh Penguins for the 2010-2011 season. In 2013-14 Craig signed with Columbus where he played in 2 regular season games. Over Craig's entire NHL, career he registered 63 total points, combining 32 goals with 31 assists as well as 148 penalty minutes in 198 games.

Craig has earned several awards throughout his years in professional hockey including: the CHL and WHL Humanitarian of the Year in 2002-03, the ECHL Player of the Week in 2003-04 and AHL Calder Cup champion in 2015-16.

He and his wife, Jaydee, have a son, Carson, and two daughters, Kylie and Camryn.



## **DAVID PRIOR** Goaltending Coach/Director of Goaltending

**David Prior** serves as the Director of Goaltending and the NHL Goaltending Coach for the Golden Knights. In this role, he works with the NHL team's goaltenders and is also responsible for the development of all goaltending prospects within the organization.

Before joining the Golden Knights, Prior was the goaltending coach for the Washington Capitals from 1997 to 2013. In his time in Washington, he helped draft and develop NHL goaltenders, such as the 2016 Vezina Trophy winner Braden Holtby, the 2013-14 Vezina Trophy finalist Semyon Varlamov, the Capitals Philipp Grubauer and the Philadelphia Flyers Michal Neuvirth. Before his time in Washington, he had stints as the goaltending coach for the following teams: Dallas Stars, Detroit Red Wings, San Jose Sharks and Winnipeg Jets.

He also worked extensively with Capitals career wins leader Olaf Kolzig, including with the German national team at the 1998 Olympics in Nagano, Japan. Kolzig won the Vezina Trophy under Prior's tutelage in 2000.

Prior previously worked for Golden Knights President of Hockey Operations George McPhee in Washington, and the two grew up at the same time in Guelph, Ontario.



## TOMMY CRUZ Video Coach

**Tommy Cruz** is in his third season as the video coach for the Vegas Golden Knights. He most recently served under Gerard Gallant and with Mike Kelly with the Florida Panthers organization from 2014-17.

Prior to becoming the video coach with the Florida Panthers, Cruz was a goaltender for two years in the Eastern Junior Hockey League for the Philadelphia Revolution (2011-12) and Palm Beach Hawks (2012-13). During the 2011-12 season with the Revolution, Cruz appeared in three games. After a year with the Revolution, he spent time with the Hawks.

Cruz is a Davie, Florida native and currently resides in Las Vegas, Nevada.

## 2019 PLAYOFF NOTES

### GAME 7

The Vegas Golden Knights appeared in their first Game 7 in franchise history, but fell to the San Jose Sharks, 5-4, in overtime. Vegas jumped out to a 3-0 lead but the Sharks scored four goals in the final period. Jonathan Marchessault tied the game with 47 seconds left in the game to force overtime.

### **MARCHING ALONG**

After being held without a point in the first two games of the series against San Jose, Jonathan Marchessault recorded a point in five straight games and also scored a goal in four straight playoff games, which is a career-best during the playoffs. Marchessault finished third on the team with four goals during the 2019 playoffs.

### STARTING FAST...

Max Pacioretty scored 71 seconds into Game 4 vs. the San Jose Sharks as the Golden Knights became the first team in NHL history to score in the opening 90 seconds of three consecutive playoff games, claiming their third straight win over San Jose. Vegas also became the first club ever to score in the opening 90 seconds of four straight playoff periods. In Game 3, the team found the back of the net within the first minute of each period, including Mark Stone's goal 16 seconds into the game, which was the fastest goal to start a playoff game in Golden Knights history. The Golden Knights also scored 21 seconds (Paul Stastny) into the second period and 36 seconds (Stone) into the third, joining the 1981 Bruins as just the second team in NHL history to score an opening-minute goal in each period of a postseason game. In Game 2, Vegas scored 58 seconds (Cody Eakin) into the game and are the 13th team in NHL history and third in the last 30 years to score in the opening minute of consecutive postseason games, joining the 2000 Devils (Game 6 of CSF & Game 1 of CF) and 1991 Bruins (Game 1 & 2 of DSF).

### ...FINISHING STRONG

The Golden Knights became the second team in the last 23 years to score five or more goals in at least three consecutive games within a playoff series. They join the 2010 Washington Capitals as they had five or more goals vs. MTL in the CQF. Vegas defeated San Jose 5-3 in Game 2, 6-3 in Game 3 and 5-0 in Game 4 during the opening round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs.

### **FIVE POINT EFFORTS**

Forwards Mark Stone & Paul Stastny each had five point games in Game 3 against San Jose, becoming the 15th set of teammates in NHL history to each record at least five points in the same playoff game, with only two other sets accomplishing the feat since 1989: Detroit's Todd Bertuzzi (1G, 4A—5PTS) & Johan Franzen (4G, 2A—6PTS) in Game 4 of the 2010 Conference Semifinals, as well as the Los Angeles trio of Wayne Gretzky (1G, 4A—5PTS), Tomas Sandstrom (3G, 2A—5PTS) & Tony Granato (3G, 2A—5PTS) in Game 4 of the 1990 Division Semifinals.

### **STONE ERA**

Mark Stone found the back of the net twice in Game 1 at San Jose, scored a power-play goal in Game 2 and recorded his first career hat trick in Game 3 against the Sharks during the opening round of the 2019 playoffs. He finished the playoffs with six postseason goals and 12 total points, both team-highs. The Winnipeg, MB native had a personal four-game postseason goal streak, going back to his final playoff game with Ottawa vs. Pittsburgh in Game 7 of the 2017 Eastern Conference Final through Game 3 vs. the San Jose Sharks.

## **2019 PLAYOFF NOTES**

### MORE MULTI-GOAL PERFORMANCES IN PLAYOFFS

Mark Stone, who scored two goals during the opening game of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs against the San Jose Sharks, recorded his first career hat trick in Game 3 against the Sharks. Also in Game 3, Paul Stastny had two goals of his own, recording his third multi-goal performance in a postseason game. Their linemate, Max Pacioretty, got in on the multi-goal action, scoring two goals in Game 4 vs. San Jose for his first multi-goal playoff performance. It is the seventh, eighth and ninth times in Golden Knights postseason history an individual player on Vegas has recorded a multi-goal effort.

### FLEURY CLIMBING ALL-TIME RANKINGS

With his 78th career playoff victory in Game 4 of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Marc-Andre Fleury sits in eighth place on the NHL's all-time list, passing Mike Vernon. The Sorel, Quebec native also recorded his 15th career-shutout, moving him into a tie with Clint Benedict & Chris Osgood for fourth on the NHL's all-time playoff shutouts list. Fleury has appeared in 141 career playoff games and recently passed Vernon for the fifth most all-time. He leads all active goaltenders in postseason games played, wins & shutouts.

### MAKING THE POSTSEASON, AGAIN

Vegas is the seventh team in NHL history to make the playoffs in each of its first two seasons, joining the Oilers as the only team to do it in the post-expansion era (i.e. excluding teams who joined the NHL in 1967-68 or earlier). The Oilers went on to extend their streak to 13 consecutive seasons, a run which saw them capture five Stanley Cups within their first 11 campaigns. Though playing under different rules and circumstances, these are the other franchises to make the playoffs in each of their first two NHL seasons, with their consecutive playoff appearances and inaugural season noted in parentheses: Oilers (13; 1979-80), Rangers (9; 1926-27), Blues (6; 1967-68), Canadiens (2; 1917-18), Flyers (2; 1967-68) and Kings (2; 1967-68).

### FAMILIAR FOE IN THE FIRST ROUND

The Vegas Golden Knights met the San Jose Sharks in the First Round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs. Both teams squared-off in the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs, a six-game triumph by Vegas in the Second Round. The Golden Knights became the first team to face the same opponent in each of their first two trips to the Stanley Cup Playoffs since the Wild faced the Ducks in the 2003 Conference Finals and 2007 Conference Quarterfinals.



### GOLDEN KNIGHTS AMONGST THE BEST SINCE TRADE DEADLINE

Vegas recorded 24 points (11-6-2), tied for ninth most in the league since the Trade Deadline. Their marquee acquisition that day was five-time 20-goal scorer Mark Stone, who recorded 11 points (5 G,6 A) in 18 games with the Golden Knights – part of his best NHL season yet in terms of goals and points (73 points - 33 G, 40 A) in 77 GP w/ OTT and VGK.

### SITTING IN A TOP THREE SPOT IN THE PACIFIC

The 2017-18 Pacific Division champion Golden Knights have held at least third place in their division for more than three quarters of their time in the League (78%, 294 of 374 days as of April 6).

### SITTING IN A TOP THREE SPOT IN THE PACIFIC, PART DEUX

Since the introduction of divisions in 1926-27, only two NHL franchises have finished among the top three in their division in each of their first two seasons: the Rangers (American Division: 1st in 1926-27, 2nd in 1927-28) and Blues (West Division: 3rd in 1967-68, 1st in 1968-69).

### **X MARKS THE SPOT**

For the second consecutive season, the Vegas Golden Knights clinched a spot in the Stanley Cup Playoffs after Arizona fell to Colorado, 3-2 (SO) on March 29. Vegas is the seventh team in NHL history to make the playoffs in each of its first two seasons, joining the Oilers as the only team to do it in the post-expansion era (i.e. excluding teams who joined the NHL in 1967-68 or earlier); the Oilers went on to extend their streak to 13 consecutive seasons, a run which saw them capture five Stanley Cups within their first 11 campaigns. The Golden Knights will open the 2019 Playoffs at the San Jose Sharks. It is the second consecutive year that Vegas and San Jose have met in the postseason. Last year, the Golden Knights won the Second Round series against the Sharks in six games.

### HOME COOKING AT T-MOBILE ARENA

Vegas became the first team in NHL history to record a home point streak of at least 11 games in each of their first two NHL campaigns. The Golden Knights finished the season with a 24-12-5 home record (53 points).

### LAYING THE LUMBER

The Vegas Golden Knights rank amongst the heaviest hitters in the NHL this season, averaging 27.66 hits per game. Vegas forward Ryan Reaves was the only player in the NHL to finish with more than 300 hits, recording 305. His linemate William Carrier led the league in hits per game, averaging 5.1 hits per contest after finishing with 277 hits in 54 games.

## 2018-19 NOTES



### **OVER 200 POINTS IN TWO SEASONS**

After earning 109 points in their inaugural campaign of 2017-18, the Vegas Golden Knights collected 93 points this season, giving the team 202 points as a franchise. They join Nashville and Winnipeg as the only Western Conference teams with 200-plus points since the start of last season. The Golden Knights required the fewest games (161 games) to collect 200 standings points, one contest fewer than the Ottawa Senators (1917-18). Vegas' success as a young franchise has been unprecedented in the NHL.

### SHOTS ON SHOTS

As a team, the Vegas Golden Knights finished with 50 shots against the Nashville Predators (Feb. 16). It was the second time this season that Vegas has recorded 50 or more shots in a game as they recorded 53 in a win over Ottawa (Oct. 28, 2018). The first time Vegas had more than 50 shots in a game was in Game 2 of opening round of the 2018 Stanley Cup Playoffs when the Golden Knights had 56 shots in a double overtime win against the Los Angeles Kings (April 13, 2018). As a team during the 2018-19 season, Vegas averaged 34.3 shots per game, which ranked as the second most in the league behind the Carolina Hurricanes. Jonathan Marchessault led all Golden Knights with 278 shots, which ranked 11th in the NHL.

### **50 POINTS BEFORE JANUARY 1**

With the victory over Arizona (Dec. 30), Vegas became the third team in the Western Conference to reach 50 points this season, joining Calgary (23-12-4, 50 points) & Winnipeg (24-12-2, 50 points) atop the Western Conference standings. The Golden Knights, who posted a 26-9-2 (54 points) record by Dec. 31, 2017, became the first franchise in league history to accumulate 50 or more points before Jan. 1 in each of their first two NHL seasons.

### 20+ POINTS IN DECEMBER

The Vegas Golden Knights finished the month of December with a 9-3-3 record as they captured 21 points. In terms of points, it is the second best month in franchise history & the nine victories are tied for the second most in a single month. It's the third time in the young franchise's history that the team has recorded 20 or more points in a single month. Last year, Vegas recorded 20 or more points in December (23 points, 11-1-1 record) and March (20 points, 9-5-2 record).

### **EIGHT IS GREAT**

The Vegas Golden Knights posted a franchise-best eight goals at the Chicago Blackhawks (Nov. 27). The Golden Knights spread out the goals, scoring three in the first and second periods, each, and finishing with two goals in the third. They recorded the 10th game where a team scored at least eight goals this season. Last season, Vegas scored seven goals on two occasions during the regular season (7-0 win over Colorado on Oct. 27 and 7-3 win over Calgary on Feb. 21) and once during the playoffs (7-0 win over San Jose in Game 1 of the second round on April 26).



### FLOWER POWER

Marc-Andre Fleury finished the season with a 35-21-5 record to go with a 2.51 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage. Fleury was named the NHL's First Star of the Week (March 4) after posting a 3-0-0 record to go with a 0.33 goals-against average, .987 save percentage and two shutouts from Feb. 25 - March 3.

### FLOWER CONTINUES TO CLIMB THE ALL-TIME WINS LADDER

Marc-Andre Fleury has climbed from 11th to 8th place on the NHL's all-time regular-season wins list this season, surpassing Glenn Hall, Tony Esposito and Jacques Plante. He finished the regular season with 439 career victories, which is six wins behind Terry Sawchuck.

### 200 MINUTES OF FLOWER

Marc-Andre Fleury recorded back-to-back shutouts against Anaheim & Vancouver (March 1-3), which is the sixth time in his career (including playoffs), & second time this season he has posted shutouts in back-to-back games. The Sorel, QC native did not allow a goal in 200:41 of game play, from 11:13 into the first period of the game against Dallas (Feb. 26) to 11:54 into the second period against Calgary (March 6), which is the longest shutout stretch of his career and he became the 67th goaltender in league history to record at least 200 consecutive minutes without a goal. It was the third time Fleury has gone at least 160 minutes of game action without allowing a goal; the other two instances happened during the 2014-15 season.

### **FIRST NETMINDER TO 30 WINS**

On Feb. 26, Marc-Andre Fleury became the first goaltender to record 30 wins in 2018-19. In doing so, he joined Martin Brodeur (14), Patrick Roy (13), Henrik Lundqvist (11) and Ed Belfour (9) as the only netminders to record nine or more 30-win campaigns.

### **FINISHING IN TOP-FIVE**

Marc-Andre Fleury finished with 35 wins this season, tied for fifth most in the NHL. It is the sixth season of his career ranking in the NHL's top five in wins, tied for the most by any goaltender since Fleury entered the league in 2003-04. *Most Seasons in NHL Top 5 In Wins – Since 2003-04*

### **MAKING 60 APPEARANCES**

Marc-Andre Fleury has appeared in 61 games this season. It is the eighth time in 15 NHL seasons he has made at least 60 appearances. Over the course of those 61 games, Fleury has posted eight shutouts, which is the second most in the NHL this season and the second-highest total of his career (10 in 2014-15).

## 2018-19 NOTES



Marc-Andre Fleury was selected for the 2019 Honda NHL All-Star Weekend in San Jose, California in January. It was his fourth All-Star Game, as he previously appeared in the 2011, 2015 and 2018 games.

### STREAKING FLOWER

From December 9, 2018 through January 8, 2019, Marc-Andre Fleury recorded a personal point streak of 12 games (9-0-3, 2.31 GAA, .921 save percentage). It was his longest personal point streak since a 12-game run from Feb. 21 – March 25, 2012 (11-0-1).

### **MILESTONE FLOWER**

In December, Marc-Andre Fleury captured his 50th win as a Vegas Golden Knight with a 2-1 victory over Colorado (Dec. 27), becoming the third quickest goaltender in NHL history to reach the 50 win mark for a new franchise. It took Fleury 81 games to win 50 games, behind Boston's Tiny Thompson (72 games, 1928-30) & Ottawa's Clint Benedict (77 games, 1917-1921).

### FLOWER FIRST, AGAIN

Prior to the holiday break, Marc-Andre Fleury became the first goaltender to reach 20 victories in 2018-19 with a victory over the NY Islanders (Dec. 20). It is the second time in his career he was the first goaltender to reach the 20-win mark, as he also did so in 2013-14 en route to 39 wins. The only other active goaltender who has been the first to 20 wins on multiple occasions is Jimmy Howard (2010-11 & 2011-12).

### FLOWER CHANNELS INNER CHRYSANTHEMUM

For the month of November, Marc-Andre Fleury was named the NHL's Third Star of the month after leading the NHL with nine wins and four shutouts (13 GP), compiling a record of 9-4-0 with a 2.32 goals-against average and .920 save percentage to backstop the Golden Knights (14-12-1, 29 points) to a 9-6-0 month. Fleury yielded three or fewer goals in 10 of his 13 appearances, highlighted by shutouts Nov. 3 vs. CAR (34 SV), Nov. 14 vs. ANA (29 SV), Nov. 23 vs. CGY (29 SV) and Nov. 24 vs. SJS (33 SV). Fleury also earned the NHL's Second Star of the week after going 3-0 with a 0.65 goals-against average and a .976 save percentage for the week ending Nov. 25. He allowed two goals in three games and pitched back-to-back shutouts on Nov. 23-24 against Calgary and San Jose, respectively. *The chrysanthemum is November's birth flower per the Farmer's Almanac.* 

### 200-FOOT FORWARDS

Vegas was the only team to have two players who recorded at least 20 goals, 55 blocked shots and 70 takeaways this season: Mark Stone and William Karlsson. Stone finished with a career-high 33 goals, a career-high 71 blocked shots and led the league with 122 takeaways, while Karlsson had 24 goals, a career-high 55 blocked shots and 73 takeaways. There is only one other player in the NHL this season who had at least 20 goals, 55 blocked shots and 70 takeaways: Aleksander Barkov, FLA (35 G, 61 BS, 100 TkA). Last season, Karlsson finished with a career-high 43 goals, 45 blocked shots & 78 takeaways and Stone finished with 22 goals, 39 blocked shots & 59 takeaways.



### HITTING THE CENTURY MARK AS A GOLDEN KNIGHT

William Karlsson (67G, 67A—134 points in 164 GP), Jonathan Marchessault (52G, 82A—134 points in 159 GP) and Reilly Smith (41G, 72A—113 points in 141 GP) each have accumulated at least 100 regular-season points in a Golden Knights uniform, with Karlsson the first to do so (Dec. 6, 2018) and Marchessault to do it in the fewest number of games (111 games).

### WILD BILL'S TWO SEASONS IN VEGAS PUT HIM IN RARE AIR

Vegas Golden Knights forward William Karlsson's two seasons in Vegas place him in some excellent company within the last decade as he is one of four players to record 60 goals, 60 assists and have a plus-50 rating.

### TUCH WITH A FRANCHISE-BEST STREAK

Alex Tuch notched a point in nine consecutive games from Dec. 27, 2018 to Jan. 12, 2019, marking the longest point streak recorded by a Golden Knights player (3G, 8A—11 points in 9 GP).

### GAME-WINNING GOALS

Vegas Golden Knights forward Max Pacioretty became the 30th different player in 2018-19 to register consecutive game-winning goals after scoring game winners against Anaheim (Jan. 4) & New Jersey (Jan. 6). One other Golden Knights player has registered the game-winning goal in consecutive team games, former Golden Knight James Neal did so in the first three games in franchise history from Oct. 6-10, 2017. Pacioretty finished with five game-winners this season, which is tied for the second most GWGs on the Golden Knights with William Karlsson. Pacioretty & Karlsson trail Alex Tuch & Jonathan Marchessault, who each had six game-winners this season. Marchessault recorded his sixth game-winning goal of the season against Edmonton (April 1). Going back to last season, he leads the team with 12 game-winners.

### EAKIN TURNS IN CAREER YEAR

After missing the first three games of the season, Vegas Golden Knights forward Cody Eakin recorded 17 points (10G, 7A) and was tied for the most goals on the team at the end of November. He scored a goal in three of his first four games, including his season debut at Washington (Oct. 10). He also scored game-winning goals at Philadelphia (Oct. 13) and against Buffalo (Oct. 16). He recorded points in five straight games from Nov. 6-14 and had a point in 10 games in the month of November. Against Chicago (Nov. 27) he recorded his second multi-goal game of the month, giving him seven total goals during the month of November. It was the most goals he has scored in any month of his career. He recorded five goals in one month with Dallas, doing it twice: March 2016 and February 2015. The Winnipeg, MB native finished the season with a career-high 22 goals and a career-high 41 points. Eakin led the team with a career-best 18.3 shooting percentage after appearing in 78 games.

## 2018-19 NOTES

### STONE AGE

The Vegas Golden Knights acquired forward Mark Stone from the Ottawa Senators prior to the trade deadline on Feb. 25. The Golden Knights posted a record of 11-6-2 and collected 24 points, which are the most points in the Pacific Division. Highlights on the Winnipeg, MB native include: a point in six consecutive games (March 6-18), scored first goal as a Golden Knight at T-Mobile Arena vs. Edmonton (March 17), scored first goal as a Golden Knight at Vancouver (March 9) & finished with two points (1G, 1A), collected first point as a Golden Knight, an assist, at Anaheim (March 1), recorded a career-high of 73 points (33G, 40A) this season, led the NHL in takeaways with 122 and has scored 20 or more goals in five consecutive seasons.

### **STASTNY DISHING**

Vegas Golden Knights forward Paul Stastny recorded an assist in seven consecutive games from Jan. 12 - Feb. 2, a Golden Knights record. It was the second time in his career he has had at least seven straight games with a helper. While playing in Colorado, he recorded a career-long eight consecutive games with an assist from March 11-28, 2008. Stastny finished the season with 29 assists, which ranked fifth on the team, despite only playing in 50 games.

### PATCHIN' IT TOGETHER

Vegas Golden Knights forward Max Pacioretty scored two goals against the Vancouver Canucks (Nov. 29) and recorded a point in seven straight games from Nov. 18-29, which matched his career-best streak. During his streak, Pacioretty tallied 11 points (8G, 3A) and recorded three multi-goal games. He previously had a point in seven consecutive games from Jan. 2-17, 2015, recording 10 points (7G, 3A), and from March 3-14, 2012, recording 12 points (5G, 7A). The New Canaan, CT native finished the season with 40 points (22G, 18A) in 66 games.

### SECOND HALF SURGE FOR SMITH

After returning from the All-Star Break, Reilly Smith has been outstanding, averaging nearly a point per game. He's finished just one point away from matching his first-half total despite playing 18 fewer games. *Reilly Smith. Before/After All-Star Break – 2018-19*

In 43 games (39 starts) with Vegas since the beginning of the 2017-18 season, goaltender Malcolm Subban has posted a 21-14-4 overall record to go with a 2.81 GAA & a .906 save percentage. *June 27, 2017* - The team's inaugural development camp begins with 44 players at the Las Vegas Ice Center.

*August 14-19, 2017* - Golden Knights staff and players embark on a road trip through the team's television distribution area, making stops in Idaho, Montana and Utah before returning to Las Vegas.

August 28, 2017 - Vegas Golden Knights staff members move into the recently completed City National Arena.

*Sept. 7, 2017* - Rookies report for the first-ever Golden Knights Rookie Camp.

*Sept. 12-13, 2017* - The Vegas Golden Knights travel to Los Angles for two rookie games. The team split their two contests against the Kings.

The game marks the end of the team's first-ever homestand, where they finish with a 6-1-0 record. The Golden Knights become the first club in NHL history to win eight of its first nine games in its inaugural NHL season and the team collects its fifth straight victory, which matched the longest winning streak by a team at any point in its first season, joining the 1926-27 Rangers and 1979-80 Oilers.

*Nov.* 22, 2017 - Vegas matches the NHL record for most wins by a team through the first 20 games of its inaugural season with its win over Anaheim, joining the Montreal Canadiens (1917-18) with 13 victories.

*Nov. 24, 2017* - The Vegas Golden Knights defeat the San Jose Sharks 5-4 in overtime, giving Vegas its eighth consecutive victory at T-Mobile Arena, becoming the second team in NHL history to go 8-0-0 at home during any point in their inaugural season, joining the Toronto Arenas (1917-18).

*Nov.* 25, 2017 - The Vegas Golden Knights defeat the Arizona Coyotes and record their second five-game winning streak during the 2017-18 season. The win also gives the Golden Knights their 15th victory on the year and the team established an NHL record for fewest games to earn 15 wins by a team in its inaugural season (22 GP), besting the mark of 25 games set by the New York Rangers (1926-27).

*Dec. 3, 2017* - The Vegas Golden Knights capture their 10th victory at T-Mobile Arena with 3-2 overtime win against the Arizona Coyotes, becoming the first franchise in NHL history to win 10 of its first 12 home games in its inaugural season.

*Dec. 14, 2017* - The Vegas Golden Knights capture their 20th win with a 2-1 victory over the Pittsburgh Penguins, establishing an NHL record for fewest games (31) to reach the 20-win mark by a club in its inaugural season

*Dec.* 27, 2017 - The Vegas Golden Knights extend their point streak to 10 games (9-0-1), including five consecutive wins, after defeating the Anaheim Ducks, establishing an NHL record for the longest point streak by a team in its inaugural season, eclipsing the mark of nine games set by the Panthers in 1993-94 (5-0-4). Also with the win, the Golden Knights establish an NHL record for fewest games (35 GP) to reach 50 points by a team in its inaugural season, besting the mark of 40 contests set by the Rangers in 1926-27 (22-12-6, 50 points).

*Dec. 28, 2017* - The Vegas Golden Knight set an NHL record for fewest games (36 GP) to reach 25 wins by a team in its inaugural season after defeating the Los Angeles Kings 3-2 in overtime, establishes the longest win streak by an NHL team (six) in its inaugural season and extends their point streak to 11 games (10-0-1)

*Dec. 31, 2017* - William Karlsson leads the Vegas Golden Knights by recording the first hat trick in franchise history and the team closes out calendar year with a 6-3 victory over the Toronto Maple Leafs, finishing the month of December with a an 11-1-1 record and a league-best 23 points. The 11 wins by Vegas are the most wins in a calendar month by a team in its inaugural season, besting the New York Rangers, who were 8-1-2 (18 points) in January 1927, the Hartford Whalers, who were 8-5-1 (17 points) in December 1979, and the Golden Knights previous record for wins in a month when Vegas was 8-3-0 (16 points) in October of this year.

Jan. 2, 2018 - The Golden Knights shut out the Nashville Predators 3-0 and extend their winning streak to eight games. Vegas becomes second team in the NHL to have an eight-game winning streak during the 2017-18 year, joining the LA Kings, and becomes the first major North American professional sports franchise to win eight straight games at any point in its inaugural campaign since the NBA's Denver Nuggets in 1976.



*Jan. 7, 2018* - The Golden Knights capture a 2-1 win over the New York Rangers and finish the first half of the season with a 29-10-2.

Jan. 14, 2018 - 10,000 fans attend the Vegas Golden Knights first-ever "Fan Fest" on Fremont Street in Downtown Las Vegas where players signed autographs and took pictures with fans before being introduced on the 3rd Street Stage. The event was originally scheduled in October but after the mass shooting that occurred on October 1, it was rescheduled to January.

*Jan.* 27, 2018 - Goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury stops 14 consecutive shots to win the save streak competition during the NHL All-Star skills competition.

*Jan. 28, 2018 -* Vegas Golden Knights Head Coach Gerard Gallant, forward James Neal and goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury help lead the Pacific Division to victory in the NHL All-Star game.

*Feb. 1, 2018* - The Vegas Golden Knights capture their 34th win of the season with a 3-2 overtime victory over the Winnipeg Jets, establishing an NHL record for most wins by a team in its inaugural season.

*Feb. 21, 2018* - The Golden Knights establish an NHL record for most points by a team in its inaugural season after capturing their 84th point with a victory over the Calgary Flames. The team also improves to 23-5-2 at T-Mobile Arena and pass the 1979-80 Hartford Whalers for the most home wins by a team in its inaugural season.

*March 10, 2018* - With a 2-1 shootout victory over the Buffalo Sabres, the Golden Knights improve to 20-12-3 on the road and set the record for most road wins by a team in its inaugural season in league history, passing the Mighty Ducks of Anaheim (1993-94).

*March 12, 2018* - Vegas Golden Knight's goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury becomes the 13th goalie in NHL history to capture 400th career victory as Vegas defeats the Philadelphia Flyers, 3-2. *March 18, 2018* - Vegas Golden Knight's goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury captures 401st career victory and 48th career shutout while forward William Karlsson records his second career hat trick and becomes the 11th player in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) to record multiple hat tricks while playing for a team in its inaugural season, and just the eighth with a natural hat trick, as Vegas defeats the Calgary Flames, 4-0.

*March 22, 2018* - Vegas became the first team in NHL history to reach the 100-point mark in its inaugural season. The previous benchmark was three seasons, set by the Oilers in 1981-82 and four campaigns for a team that did not merge from the WHA (a mark set by the Islanders in 1975-76).

March 26, 2018 - The Vegas Golden Knights defeated the Colorado Avalanche to become the third expansion team since 1968-69 - and first to start from scratch - to clinch a berth in the Stanley Cup Playoffs. In 1979-80, the Hartford Whalers and Edmonton Oilers each reached the postseason after joining the NHL from the World Hockey Association. In addition to the Golden Knights, Oilers and Whalers, only four other expansion clubs from any of the four North American professional sports leagues qualified for the playoffs. The four other expansion clubs to reach the playoffs - all from the NBA - are the 1966-67 Chicago Bulls, 1976-77 Denver Nuggets, 1976-77 San Antonio Spurs and 2002-03 New Orleans Hornets. The Nuggets and Spurs joined from the defunct American Basketball Association, while the newly-formed Bulls were part of an eight-team playoff bracket in a 10-team league. The Hornets, meanwhile, relocated from Charlotte but are considered an expansion franchise by the NBA.

*March 31, 2018* - Vegas defeats San Jose and becomes the first modern-era expansion team from any of the four North American professional sports leagues to start from scratch and finish first in its division (excluding mergers and all-expansion divisions).

*April 7, 2018* - The Golden Knights finish their inaugural regular season with a record of 51-24-7 and 109 points.

April 11, 2018 - The Golden Knights capture their first playoff victory with a 1-0 win over the Los Angeles Kings.

## **VEGAS TIMELINE**



*April 17, 2018* - The Golden Knights became just the third team from the NHL, NBA and MLB to complete a four-game sweep to win their first-ever playoff series – and the first to do so in their inaugural season. Only three other NHL teams won a playoff series in their inaugural season, all against other clubs also in their debut campaign (Toronto Arenas in 1918; St. Louis Blues and Minnesota North Stars in 1968).

*May 6, 2018* - The Golden Knights capture their second series after defeating the San Jose Sharks in six games. Vegas became just the third franchise in NHL history to win multiple series in its inaugural season. The first postseason in League history saw the Toronto Arenas win the 1918 NHL Final, a two-game total-goals series, by a 10-7 margin against the Montreal Canadiens before defeating the Pacific Coast Hockey Association's Vancouver Millionaires to win the Stanley Cup. In 1968, the St. Louis Blues defeated the Philadelphia Flyers and Minnesota North Stars to emerge from the all-expansion West Division and advance to the Stanley Cup Final.

*May 20, 2018* - The Golden Knights defeated the Winnipeg Jets in five games and became the seventh team in NHL history to reach the Stanley Cup Final after recording three series-clinching wins on the road.

*May 28, 2018* - Down 4-3 early in the third period, the Golden Knights scored three unanswered goals – including the winning and insurance tallies by Tomas Nosek – to defeat the Capitals in Game 1 of the Stanley Cup Final.

*June 7, 2018* - The Golden Knights drop their first postseason series, falling to the Washington Capitals in Game 5 of the 2018 Stanley Cup Final.

*June 13, 2018* - An estimated crowd of 7,500 stand under the canopy covering Fremont Street as the Golden Knights held a "Stick Salute to Vegas and Our Fans" event to thank fans for their support during the Golden Knights inaugural season.

*June 20, 2018* - Four members of the Vegas Golden Knights – defenseman Deryk Engelland, center William Karlsson, head coach Gerard Gallant and general manager George McPhee – received awards in recognition of achieving the greatest season by an expansion team in major pro sports history, both on and off the ice. *June 26, 2018* - The team's second development camp, and first at City National Arena, begins with 42 players.

*July 18, 2018* - Nate Schmidt, Ryan Reaves, Brayden McNabb and James Neal represent the Vegas Golden Knights as the team was up for "Best Moment" at the ESPYs.

*Aug. 6-10, 2018* - Golden Knights staff and players embark on the second annual road trip through the team's television distribution area, making stops in Reno, Nevada; Boise, Idaho; Jackson, Wyoming; and Salt Lake City, Utah before returning to Las Vegas.

*Aug. 16, 2018* - Pierre-Edouard Bellemare and William Karlsson partake in the NHL European Media Tour in Stockholm, Sweden.

Sept. 6, 2018 - Rookies report for Golden Knights Rookie Camp.

Sept. 8-11, 2018 - The Golden Knights host the 2018 Vegas Rookie Faceoff presented by NextGen at City National Arena. The Anaheim Ducks, Arizona Coyotes, Colorado Avalanche, Los Angeles Kings and San Jose Sharks all take part and Vegas was 2-1 in the three-day event, defeating the Avalanche, 7-6, on Sept. 8 and the Kings, 7-2, on Sept. 11. The team's only loss came on Sept. 9 against the Sharks, falling 5-4. Gage Quinney led the Golden Knights with seven points (3G, 4A) in three games.

*Sept. 11, 2018* - The Vegas Golden Knights Inaugural Charity Golf Classic is played at Bear's Best Las Vegas.

*Sept. 13, 2018* - Veterans report for the Golden Knights Training Camp.

*Sept. 30, 2018* - The Golden Knights wrap up the preseason with a 5-2 win over the San Jose Sharks and finish the exhibition schedule with a 6-1-0 record.

*Oct. 1, 2018* - The Golden Knights join the community in remembrance of the 1 October tragedy one year ago by visiting command and dispatch centers, Mandalay Bay and the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority.

*Oct. 2, 2018* - The Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles and Golden Knights release a VGK branded "Vegas Born" license plate.

*Oct. 4, 2018* - The Vegas Golden Knights drop their season opener at T-Mobile Arena, falling to the Philadelphia Flyers, 5-2.



*Oct. 6, 2018* - Vegas captures its first victory of the season, a 2-1 shootout win at the Minnesota Wild.

*Oct. 18, 2018* - The Golden Knights host their annual Season Ticket Member Appreciation Event at Mandalay Bay Resort & Casino.

*Oct. 20, 2018* - Marc-Andre Fleury passes Glenn Hall for sole possession of 10th place on the NHL's all-time wins list with 408 career victories.

*Oct. 28, 2018* - After starting the month with a 1-6-0 record, the Golden Knights win four of five games at T-Mobile Arena, including a 4-3 overtime victory against the Ottawa Senators. Jonathan Marchessault sealed the victory after scoring the 15th penalty-shot goal in overtime in league history, with Vegas becoming the 13th different franchise to have such a tally (NSH and ANA have two each).

*Nov. 3, 2018* - Marc-Andre Fleury makes 34 saves en route to his 50th career shutout as Vegas defeats Carolina, 3-0.

*Nov. 11, 2018* - The Golden Knights play their 100th game as a franchise, but fall at the Boston Bruins, 4-1.

*Nov. 26, 2018* - Marc-Andre Fleury earns the NHL's Second Star of the Week after stopping 81 of the 83 shots he faced, going 3-0-0 with a 0.65 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and two shutouts to lift the Golden Knights (12-12-1, 25 points) into third place in the Pacific Division.

*Nov.* 27, 2018 - The Vegas Golden Knights post a franchise-best eight goals at the Chicago Blackhawks. Vegas spread out the goals, scoring three in the first and second periods, each, and finishing with two goals in the third.

*Dec. 1, 2018* - Marc-Andre Fleury earns the NHL's Third Star of November after leading the NHL with nine wins and four shutouts in November (13 GP), compiling a record of 9-4-0 with a 2.32 goals-against average and .920 save percentage to backstop the Golden Knights (14-12-1, 29 points) to a 9-6-0 month.

*Dec. 6, 2018* - William Karlsson collects an assist and becomes the first Golden Knights player to reach the 100-point mark (112 games).

*Dec.* 14, 2018 - Jonathan Marchessault records an assist to become the fastest player in Golden Knights history to record 100 points (111 games).

*Dec. 20, 2018* - Marc-Andre Fleury passes Tony Esposito for sole possession of ninth place on the NHL's all-time wins list with 424 career victories.

*Dec. 30, 2018* - The Golden Knights (23-15-4) defeat Arizona, 5-1, and become the first franchise in NHL history to accumulate 50 or more points before Jan. 1 in each of their first two seasons. Vegas posted a 26-9-2 (54 points) record by Dec. 31, 2017.

*Jan. 6, 2019* - Max Pacioretty becomes the the 30th different player in 2018-19 to register consecutive game-winning goals. Only one other Golden Knights player has registered the game-winning goal in consecutive team games: James Neal, who did so in the first three games in franchise history from Oct. 6-10, 2017.

Jan. 8, 2019 - The Golden Knights win their season-high seventh straight game and record a point in 10 straight games with a 4-2 win over the Rangers. Marc-Andre Fleury has collected a point in his last 12 starts (9-0-3), the third longest point streak of his career. Vegas also extends its home point streak to 12 games (12-0-2 since Nov. 23), which is tied for the longest in franchise history.

*Jan. 12, 2019* - Alex Tuch extends his point streak to nine games (3G, 8A - 11P), the longest such stretch in franchise history.

*Jan. 17, 2019* - The 2019 Knight To Remember Gala is held at World Market Center Pavilions.

*Jan. 19, 2019* - Jonathan Marchessault scores the third hat trick in team history as Vegas defeats Pittsburgh, 7-3.

*Jan.* 25-26, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury makes fourth career all-star appearance, representing the Golden Knights at the 2019 NHL All-Star Weekend in San Jose, CA.

*Feb. 26, 2019* - Marc-Andre Fleury records 30th win of the season, the ninth time in his career he has had a season with 30 victories.

*Feb.* 28 - *March* 6, 2019 - Marc-Andre Fleury records a career-high shutout streak of 200:41.

*March 4, 2019* - Marc-Andre Fleury is named the NHL's First Star of the Week after going 3-0-0 with a 0.33 goals-against average and a .987 save percentage.

*March 9, 2019* - Marc-Andre Fleury makes 29 saves and moves into sole possession of eighth place all-time, passing Jacques Plante, after collecting his 438th regular-season victory.

March 17, 2019 - The Golden Knights earns their 40th win of the season with a 6-3 victory over Edmonton.

*March 29, 2019* - Vegas clinches a spot in the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, becoming the seventh team in NHL history to make the playoffs in each of its first two seasons, joining Edmonton as the only team to do it in the post-expansion era.

*March 30, 2019* - The Golden Knights fall in overtime at the San Jose Sharks, but collect their 200th point as a franchise, becoming the fastest team in league history to collect their 200th standings point.

*April 4, 2019* - The Golden Knights fall to the Arizona Coyotes, 4-1, in the final home game of the 2018-19 season. Following the game the Golden Knights announce regular season award winners. For the second year in a row, Deryk Engelland receives the Vegas Strong Service Award for his outstanding work in the Las Vegas community. Ryan Reaves earns the Seventh Player Award presented by GEICO as the player who most exceeded expectations during the 2018-19 campaign after setting career-highs in goals, assists, points, game-winning goals and shots on net. Finally, Marc-Andre Fleury and Cody Eakin share the honor of the First Star Award for having the most three stars appearances on home ice this season.

*April 6, 2019* - The Golden Knights finishes their second season with an overall record of 43-32-7 (93 points) following a 5-2 loss at Los Angeles.

*April 17 -* Forward Mark Stone was named a finalist for the 2019 Frank J. Selke Trophy.

April 23, 2019 - Vegas falls 5-4 in overtime to the San Jose Sharks in Game 7 of the opening round of the 2019 Stanley Cup Playoffs, concluding the Golden Knights second season.

*May 1, 2019* - The Golden Knights host inaugural 'Coat The Fortress' event at T-Mobile Arena where fans painted their personalized message to commemorate the 2018-19 season and #KnightUp campaign on the ice surface.

*May 2, 2019* - The team announced that Kelly McCrimmon was promoted to General Manager of the Vegas Golden Knights, effective September 1, 2019, and will report to George McPhee, who will continue to be responsible for all hockey operations decisions and oversee the club's hockey operations team as the Golden Knights President of Hockey Operations.

*June 3* - Members of the Vegas Golden Knights staff joined officials from the City of Henderson at the Henderson Convention Center to celebrate the start of construction on Vegas Golden Knights at Henderson: a new hockey facility in Downtown Henderson.

*June 8, 2019* - Vegas' American Hockey League Affiliat, the Chicago Wolves, fall in Game 5 of the Calder Cup Final to the Charlotte Checkers.

June 25, 2018 - The team's third development camp begins.

*July 29 - August 2 -* The Golden Knights and Vienna Capitals will host a Summer High Performance Camp and Coaching Education Seminar in Vienna, Austria from July 29 to August 2.

*August 4-9* - Members of the Vegas Golden Knights took part in the team's annual Road Trip, which visited Idaho Falls, Idaho; Billings, Montana; Casper, Wyoming; and St. George, Utah.

August 7, 2019 - The team renewed its affiliation agreement with the ECHL's Fort Wayne Komets. The Komets became the official ECHL affiliate of the Vegas Golden Knights in 2018 and are based in Fort Wayne, Indiana.





## **GAME-DAY MEDIA POLICIES**

#### **Media Credentials**

Credentials are issued to media who cover the Golden Knights both seasonally and on a game-by-game basis. The credential is good only for the game(s) printed on the tag and must be displayed to a T-Mobile Arena security personnel to gain entry to restricted areas. Please contact Alyssa Girardi (agirardi@vegasgoldenknights.com) for credential information. Credentials must be requested 48 hour before a contest. Credential requests or changes made less than 48 hours before game time will not be granted. We will respond to all requests as promptly as possible. Please wait for confirmation on your request.

#### Press Gate/Media Will Call

The press gate is located on the west side of T-Mobile Arena on Frank Sinatra Drive. Signs will direct members of the media to the press gate. Members of the Vegas Golden Knights communications staff will check media in and issue single game credentials. Credentials will be available for pickup three hours prior to puck drop through the end of the first period.

#### **Media Parking**

The Vegas Golden Knights can provide complimentary parking on a very limited basis. Media parking at T-Mobile Arena is located on the fifth level of the Aria parking garage. Media members who have their parking confirmed will have their names on a list with a parking attendant. Those requesting parking need to reach out to Sage Sammons (ssammons@vegasgolden-knights.com) at least 48 hours before each contest. Media parking opens three hours before each game.

### **MEDIA INFORMATION**

#### Press Work Area and Press Lounge

The press work area and press lounge are located on the event level of T-Mobile Arena. Once entering the building through the press gate, members of the media will take a right to access the press work area and press lounge. Signs will clearly mark each room. Pregame meals are \$10 and are served buffet style two-and-a-half hours prior to game time. All food must be consumed in the press lounge and may not be taken to the press box. Once entering the arena, there will be signs directing media to the press work room and press lounge. There are reserved seats for daily media and additional work spaces with wireless internet access. Please honor the reserved spaces. News releases, game day notes and statistical packages are available each game day in the workroom area from the morning skate through the game.

#### **Press Box**

The press box is on level five of T-Mobile Arena on the side opposite the team benches. Media can access the designated press elevator by following signage once inside the building. Seats in the press box are on an assigned basis only and members of the media must sit in the seat assigned to them. Please check the seating charts in the press room or press box, or check with the Golden Knights communications staff member for your seat assignment. In order to ensure seating in the press box, it is necessary for all media members to notify the Golden Knights communications staffers of their attendance by noon the day prior to the game. If you do not have an assigned seat, please check with a member of the communications staff. In compliance with T-Mobile Arena regulations, smoking is not allowed in the arena.

#### Wireless Internet

Wireless internet is provided free of charge on all game days in both the press box and the press lounge for members of the working media. If you have difficulty with the wireless connection, please contact a member of the Golden Knights communications staff.

Photo positions at T-Mobile Arena are located at various locations throughout T-Mobile Arena. All photo positions will be assigned prior to the game by the communications department. Daily print and wire services receive priority for prime positions. There is a photo meeting 90 minutes before each game at the photo work room.

#### Game Day/Night

The Golden Knights locker room will be open within five minutes of the end of the game to working media only. Head Coach Gerard Gallant's press conference will follow approximately 15 minutes post-game adjacent to the media work room.

#### **Player and Management Access**

If the media wishes to interview a player who is not present in the dressing room, they should make the request to a Golden Knights media relations representative who will locate the player and, if possible, make him available.

#### **Visitors Dressing Room**

Visiting team rooms are closed to the media for five minutes after the game. Visiting team coaches or visiting team personnel are responsible for opening their dressing room to the media.

#### Interviews

Television networks and stations requesting live pregame interviews with a player must request these prior to or during the morning skate. Live television interviews are available for each game up until 30 minutes before puck drop and may be arranged through the Golden Knights communications staff.

#### **News Releases**

Accredited members of the media who would like to receive e-mailed Golden Knights news releases should contact Alyssa Girardi (agirardi@vegasgoldenknights.com) with their email address. Press releases produced by the Golden Knights include the schedule of games, practices and other Golden Knight events.

#### Transcripts

The Golden Knights communication team will provide game-day transcripts of the head coach media availability and will provide post-game audio from player availability in both locker rooms. Transcripts will be distributed electronically.

#### **Players' Personal Telephone Numbers**

At no time will a player's home or mobile phone number be released to either the media or the public unless the player specifically authorizes such release. Members of the media attempting to reach players must do so through the Golden Knights media relations staff.

#### Autographs

Media attending Golden Knights practices or games are strictly forbidden from requesting autographs. The locker room area is for working media only. Any person in the locker room with a media pass observed asking players for autographs will be asked to leave the premises and will have their credential privileges revoked.

#### **Team Medical Rooms**

Team medical rooms located at T-Mobile Arena and City National Arena are off limits to the media at all times.

#### **Cell Phones**

Per NHL media regulations, no media member is permitted to use a cell phone in the dressing room to place a call or take photographs.

## PRACTICE SESSION MEDIA POLICIES

#### Media access

The media has full access to all team practices at City National Arena, including game-day skates, in accordance with NHL media regulations. The media is allowed to enter the team dressing room five minutes after the first player who has participated in the entire practice leaves the ice. In the event of a team meeting, the media will be allowed access immediately following the conclusion of the meeting. The locker room is closed to the media prior to and during practice. Head Coach Gerard Gallant will be available approximately 20 minutes after the conclusion of practices (in most instances).

#### **Practices at City National Arena**

The media should enter City National Arena through the main entrance of the building on north side of the building. Media with valid press identification can check in with a member of the communications team at the front desk. ## DAVE GOUCHER

### AT&T SportsNet Play-by-Play Announcer

**Dave Goucher** is in his third season as the play-by-play voice for Golden Knights games on AT&T Sports-Net. He was previously the radio play-by-play announcer for the Boston Bruins 2000-17. He has been named New England's top radio play-by-play announcer by the Associated Press three times (2003, 2006 and 2007), was awarded the Associated Press "Best Sportscast" Award in 2006 and was named the Massachusetts Sportscaster of the Year in 2013 and 2014. Goucher also calls games during the season for NBCSN.

While with the Bruins he has called several historic and exciting matchups. He was the voice in the 2010 Winter Classic at Fenway Park featuring the Bruins and Flyers and could be heard throughout the Bruins 2011 Stanley Cup Championship run. This included calls of Game 5 and Game 7 of the Bruins vs. Canadiens matchup, both of which Bruins won in double overtime and overtime, respectively, Game 7 of the Eastern Conference Final, where the Bruins defeated the Lightning to advance to the Cup Final and Game 7 of the 2011 Stanley Cup Final, in which the Bruins defeated the Canucks to take the Cup.

In 2017, Goucher called the Western Conference Final nationally on Westwood One Radio. He also called the Boston Marathon. from 2005-07 and was also the voice of the Wheeling Thunderbirds (1993-95) and then the AHL's Providence Bruins (1995-2000). He was behind the mic when the P-Bruins won the Calder Cup in 1999.

In 2013, he called Game 7 of the Bruins-Leafs matchup, where the Bruins rallied from three goals down in the third period to win the game and series in overtime. Also in 2013, Goucher was the radio play-by-play broadcaster of the Bruins-Penguins series in which the Bruins swept the Penguins to return to the Stanley Cup Final and called all six games of the Stanley Cup Final between the Bruins and the Blackhawks that year. In 2016, he called his second Winter Classic as the Bruins hosted the Montreal Canadiens at Gillette Stadium. Goucher has been a regular contributor to Bruins coverage on Comcast Sportsnet New England, the NHL Network and WCVB-TV in Boston.

He began his broadcasting career at his alma mater, Boston University, calling Terrier hockey games, including the Hockey East Championships and 1993 Frozen Four, before becoming the radio and television play-by-play announcer for the ECHL's Wheeling Thunderbirds. In 2004, he covered the Boston Red Sox winning their first World Series in 86 years and Super Bowl XXXIX.



## SHANE HNIDY AT&T SportsNet Color Analyst

**Shane Hnidy** is in his third season of providing color commentary on the Golden Knights television airwaves. He was previously part of the Winnipeg Jets broadcast team from 2011-17. He was the color commentator alongside Dennis Beyak on TSN Television, as well as a part of the broadcast team on TSN Radio 1290, and handled in-studio pre-game and game recaps for TSN. Hnidy also serves as an analyst on numerous NBCSN broadcasts.

The Neepawa, Manitoba native played in the NHL from 2000-2011, playing for the Ottawa Senators, Nashville Predators, Atlanta Thrashers, Anaheim Ducks, Boston Bruins and Minnesota Wild. He was drafted in the 7th round (173rd overall) in the 1994 NHL Entry Draft by the Buffalo Sabres. As a defenseman, he played in 550 NHL games during his career, registering 16 goals and 55 assists for a total of 71 points with 633 penalty minutes.

Hnidy was a member of Atlanta's and Nashville's inaugural playoff appearances. In addition, he was a member of the Bruins' 2011 Stanley Cup championship team. He officially retired on August 21, 2011.

He joined TSN 1290 in September of 2011 as a radio analyst for the Jets and went on to become the full-time Winnipeg Jets Television color analyst for TSN in 2014. While with TSN, he served as an analyst covering the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship and the Men's World Hockey Championships for the last four years.

Millard brings nearly three decades of experience to the Golden Knights broadcasting team. He began his broadcasting career in radio and worked different markets in the provinces of Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

The Brandon, Manitoba native was one of the first hires ever made by Rogers Media's Sportsnet in 1998 and he worked as an on-air host with Sportsnet for 20 years. In addition to his role as host, Millard covered events such as the 2010 Winter Olympics, multiple Stanley Cup Finals, as well as the 2017 NHL Expansion Draft at T-Mobile Arena.

In December of 2018 Millard started his own hockey podcast, "The Chirp", featuring interviews from prominent figures around the NHL.



## MIKE McKENNA AT&T SportsNet Studio Analyst

**Mike McKenna** is in his first season of providing pregame, intermission and postgame analysis for the Golden Knights. McKenna, a native of St. Louis, was drafted by the Nashville Predators in the sixth round of the 2002 NHL Draft.

The recently retired goaltender had a career that spanned 14 years in professional hockey. After playing four years of college hockey at St. Lawrence University, McKenna made his pro debut with the ECHL's Las Vegas Wranglers during the 2005-06 season and spent two years in Las Vegas. During his career, he appeared on seven different NHL teams and 12 different AHL teams. He appeared in a total of 35 NHL games and sported a goals-against average of 3.60 to go with a .890 save percentage

Since February 2019, McKenna has hosted his own podcast, "6 Degrees with Mike McKenna."



## **STORMY BUONANTONY** AT&T SportsNet Rinkside Reporter

**Stormy Buonantony** is in her first season at the rinkside reporter for the Golden Knights. She is returning to her hometown of Las Vegas to be the rinkside reporter for the Golden Knights after spending the 2017-19 seasons as the in-stadium emcee and broadcast reporter for the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

Her extensive portfolio includes time with ESPN, SEC Network, Raycom Sports and NBC News, in addition to three years spent as a reporter and host for the Mountain West in Colorado. She's received numerous awards for her work including the NATAS Heartland Emmy for Technical Achievement, the Cynopsis Sport Leaderboard Award for Excellence in Social Media, and a NATAS Pacific Southwest Emmy for Outstanding Production in Sports.

**Dan D'Uva** is in his third season of Golden Knights radio play-by-play on flagship Fox Sports 98.9 FM / 1340 AM. He previously was the radio and TV play-by-play voice of the AHL's Syracuse Crunch since 2012. He has called some of the team's most historic games, including runs to the 2013 and 2017 Calder Cup Finals and the Toyota Frozen Dome Classic in 2014. He also contributed to two AHL All-Star Classic broadcasts, on radio in 2015 and on television in 2016.

In addition to his role with the Crunch, he hosted a daily show, "In the Booth with Dan D'Uva" on ESPN Radio Syracuse, handled on-air assignments for Time Warner Sports/Spectrum Sports, and served as a media consultant for the Cape Cod Baseball League's Chatham Anglers. He has also been an adjunct professor at Syracuse University's S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications.

Prior to that, the Ridgewood, New Jersey native was the director of public relations and broadcasting for the ECHL's Trenton Devils. He studied at Syracuse University and Fordham University and participated in student media at each school. He received WFUV's Marty Glickman Award for excellence in play-by-play in 2009.

One of the most versatile members of the Golden Knights broadcasting team, **Gary Lawless** is in his third season as the Vegas Golden Knights Insider. In this role, Lawless authors in-depth breaking news stories, columns, features, event recaps and player/staff profiles on vegasgoldenknights.com and serves as the team's lead on-camera reporter, filing daily video recaps from Golden Knights practices, games, events and press conferences for the team's social channels and website. He also serves as the analyst for all radio broadcasts and is prevalent on the AT&T SportsNet's television broadcasts during the season.

Lawless joined the Golden Knights after an 18-year run in Winnipeg, Manitoba where he held several prominent media positions. He began as a beat writer and columnist for the Winnipeg Free Press covering the Canadian Football League's Winnipeg Blue Bombers and the NHL's Winnipeg Jets. In 2006 he launched the "Hustler and Lawless" Radio Show on TSN 1290 AM, a daily, drive-time sports talk radio show covering a variety of topics throughout the world of sports. He had been the show's co-host since its inception in 2006. Lawless regularly appeared as an analyst on multiple television programs, including TSN That's Hockey, TSN Sportscentre and TSN's broadcasts of Winnipeg Jets home games. He also contributed regular col-

umns and feature stories on TSN's website as their Senior Correspondent.

Over the course of his reporting career, Lawless has covered multiple Super Bowls, Grey Cups, Stanley Cup Finals, IIHF World Ice Hockey Championships, IIHF World Junior Ice Hockey Championships and one Winter Olympics (2014 in Sochi).

He began his career in sports reporting in 1993 as the hockey beat reporter for the Thunder Bay Chronicle-Journal in Thunder Bay, Ontario. He also worked for the CFL's Toronto Argonauts as the club's Public Relations Director where he was part of the 1996 Grey Cup championship winning team.

Lawless is a native of Peterborough, Ontario. He and his wife Jennifer have a daughter, Lauren.




## **GOLDEN KNIGHTS ON RADIO**

In addition to broadcasting games in English, the Vegas Golden Knights have featured Spanish broadcasts on Deportes Las Vegas 1460. The Golden Knights are one of four teams to broadcast any games in Spanish during the 2018-19 season, being joined by the Chicago Blackhawks, Los Angeles Kings and San Jose Sharks, but Vegas is the only organization that has broadcast all home games in Spanish

For the third consecutive year, Jesus Lopez will again handle the play-by-play duties, while Herbert Castro will provide analysis of games this season. Vegas was one of only two teams to broadcast games in Spanish during the 2017-18 season, being joined by Chicago. In total, 20 regular season games and all of the home games during the Stanley Cup Playoffs were heard in Spanish during the Golden Knights inaugural season. During the 2018-19 season, the organization aired all 41 regular season home games in Spanish as well as every game during the opening round of the Stanley Cup playoffs against the San Jose Sharks.

Select Golden Knights games of the Spanish feed at T-Mobile Arena are available on television through the Second Audio Program (SAP) function during home games.





## **T-MOBILE ARENA**



One of the newest additions to the Las Vegas Strip is T-Mobile Arena, the home of the Vegas Golden Knights. The 650,000-square-foot entertainment and sports venue sits on 16 acres and is located between New York-New New York Hotel & Casino and Park MGM Las Vegas.

Construction for T-Mobile Arena started on May 1, 2014 and less than two years later the arena hosted its grand opening on April 6, 2016 with a blowout concert headlined by local legends including The Killers, "Mr. Las Vegas" Wayne Newton and emerging pop artist Shamir.

To capture the excitement of The Strip, T-Mobile Arena's design includes an expansive glass façade with an LED overlay, sweeping, dramatic balconies on every level, an outdoor performance stage and a sleek exterior that is as bold as it is sophisticated. The design creates a visually captivating and iconic focal point in Las Vegas' bustling entertainment market.

As guests enter T-Mobile Arena, they walk through Toshiba Plaza, an open-air public venue that connects The Strip, The Park and T-Mobile Arena. This two acre flexible event space has the ability to host outdoor basketball and volleyball events, public concerts, media events and a variety of other activations including fan festivities prior to Golden Knights games.

Inside the arena, guests can experience unrivaled premium seating options featuring Event Level Suites, Luxury Suites, Opera Boxes and Terrace Tables, as well as Club and Event Level seating programs. There are eight Event Level "Bunker" suites, 44 Luxury Suites and two Party Suites inside T-Mobile Arena. There also are six premium VIP clubs, including two Tower Clubs cantilevered over the upper bowl offering unique views. Guests sitting in these locations will enjoy dedicated VIP entrances and VIP parking adjacent to the arena.

In addition to being home to the Vegas Golden Knights, the venue hosts more than 100 events annually. Past and current events include the Billboard Music Awards, iHeartRadio Music Festival, Latin GRAMMYs, Academy of Country Music (ACM) Awards, Professional Bull Riders (PBR) World Finals, the NHL Awards & Expansion Draft, Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament, concerts by some of the top touring artists in the world and major boxing events including the Floyd Mayweather vs. Conor McGregor and Canelo Alvarez vs. Gennady Golovkin bouts, among many others. T-Mobile Arena also is the exclusive Las Vegas arena destination for Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC).

T-Mobile Arena has been named the No. 1 venue on Billboard Magazine's 2018 Arena Power List and the "Best New Major Concert Venue" by Pollstar Magazine in 2016, among other recognitions since its opening.

## **CITY NATIONAL ARENA**



When the idea of an NHL franchise in Las Vegas became a reality, Chairman and CEO Bill Foley knew that the Vegas Golden Knights would need a state-of-the-art facility that served as a home for the hockey team and the business team.

Thus, the vision for City National Arena was born. Designed to house all the needs of a hockey team and staff, the building was tailored for a new franchise and its excited fanbase. Equipped with two sheets of ice, office space, top-tier training and medical equipment, and an expansive locker room, the rink effectively serves all the needs of the team and business as it laid its roots in Las Vegas.

The fan experience was an important aspect of the building's design as the organization wanted the people of Las Vegas to embrace the Golden Knights. City National Arena serves the needs of the community by housing youth and adult hockey programs as well as multitiered figure skating programs. Between the sheets lies Mackenzie River Pizza, a full-service grill and pub which serves as a common place for fans to gather and watch Golden Knights games on television. The Arsenal, located in the building lobby, is the home to unique team apparel as well as a fully functioning hockey pro shop.

After the inaugural season of Golden Knights hockey, the building transformed to reflect the team's brand identity that developed during that first year. A state-of-the-art video scoreboard was installed on the team's main practice rink and a castle structure was built around it. Black, gray and gold paint was laid upon the walls of the building to create a feel that matched the team's uniform.
