# **KOMET HISTORY**

#### The History of the FORT WAYNE KOMET HOCKEY CLUB Est. 1952

Ernie Berg started it 62 years ago this season. He was the one that began thinking about hockey in Fort Wayne, Indiana. But it was after the city announced plans of building the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum. Berg took a trip to Toledo one night to watch an IHL game. That was all it took. Berg came home full of enthusiasm.



October, 1952, a new game in town. The Komets put on a clinic scrimmage preview game for fans before opening the first season of Komet Hockey.

With the thought of Fort Wayne building a beautiful new big building, Berg couldn't help but envision it filled with people for a hockey game. It was a dream. A dream later to become reality. The dream came true with the dropping of the first puck at the start of the 1952-53 International Hockey League season.

Many have wondered about Komets being spelled with a "K". Berg did it. He wanted to have a name that suggested speed, flash, excitement. And he spelled it with a "K" instead of a "C" after his wife. Her name was Kathryn but she always went by Kay.

Berg became the team's General Manager and put together a talented hockey team. That first team was a real crowd pleaser, if not an artistic success. He got guys who were tough and aggressive. And the Fort Wayne fans liked that.

It wasn't until the sixth game when the franchise picked up its first victory. It came on a Tuesday night before a crowd of 6,381. The "K's" won 6-5 over the Grand Rapids Rockets.

The fans liked the hard-hitting Komets, too. They soon began to fill the coliseum regularly on weekend nights and came close to filling it on week nights. From then on the fans have been supporting their Fort Wayne Komets.

With 62 years of Komet hockey in the history books, there have been many high and low moments. The lowest came in the summer of 1990 when, for a few days, the city did not have a team. Previous ownership moved the club to Albany, New York. A couple of days later the Franke family purchased the Flint IHL franchise and moved it to Fort Wayne, keeping the name "Komets", but changing many facets of the organization.

After maintaining the Komets in the IHL for nine more years, the Franke family moved the team to the United Hockey League prior to the 1999-2000 season. The Komets played eight seasons in the UHL before the league dissolved after 2006-07. Fort Wayne, along with partners in Kalamazoo, Muskegon, Port Huron, Flint and Bloomington (Illinois) formed the new International Hockey League, breathing live into the IHL once again with the 2007-08 season.

After three seasons in the "new" IHL and winning the Turner Cup Championship each year, the Komets moved once again. The Komets became members of the Central Hockey League in 2010 and were part of the CHL for two seasons, capturing the CHL Presidents' Cup in 2012.

In 2012-13, the Komets made their debut in the ECHL renewing old rivalries with Kalamazoo, Toledo, Cincinnati, Elmira, Colorado and Orlando. This season, the Komets will renew their intrastate rivalry with Indianapolis as the new Fuel will be introduced to the ECHL.

62 seasons of Komet Hockey in Fort Wayne have yeilded a dozen regular season championships (9 IHL, 3 UHL) and nine championship titles (7 IHL Turner Cups, 1 UHL Colonial Cup and 1 CHL Presidents' Cup). And now, with the 2014-15 season, the tradition continues in Northeast Indiana with the 63rd anniversary season of Komet Hockey in Fort Wayne.

### KOMET HISTORY -- BIRTH OF KOMET HOCKEY

The residents of Northeast Indiana most likely first learned that pro hockey was coming to Fort wayne in an article that appeared in the Fort Wayne Journal-Gazette Monday, June 9, 1952, and subsequent articles that summer and fall leading up to the inaugural season of Komet Hockey in 1952.

Monday, June 9, 1952, the Journal-Gazette ran the following article on the front page of the Sports section:

# International Hockey Lg. Gives Fort Wayne Berth Franchise Accepted By Local Men

Fort Wayne is now a member of the International Hockey League.

This city was accepted into the circuit and tendered a franchise at the league meeting in Troy, O., on Saturday.

The circuit is now composed of six cities. In addtion to fort Wayne, they are Detroit, Grand Rapids, Toledo, Chatham, Ont. and Troy. O.

Fred Huber, executive secretary said that there is a possiblity of adding two more cities. Indianapolis and Cincinnati were represented at the International Hockey League meeting and are expected to come in. Cincinnati has definately decided to withdraw from the American but Indianapolis' position is uncertain and will be decided by the parent organization, the Detroit Red Wings.

The Amercian League's setup will not be decided until the meeting of the National Hockey League on June 19, when action will be taken on the application of Cleveland to become a member of the main circuit. Cleveland is not expected to be accepted by the National loop, but is expected to remain in the American.

The International Hockey League has voted to increase its budget, thus raising the standard of play in the league. That helped to clinch the decision of Fort Wayne interests to become a member of that circuit. They have had under consderation at the same time the possiblities of entering the American League should that circuit split up and organize a strictly midwestern league.

Hockey here will be promoted by an

organization to be know as Fort Wayne Sports Enterprises, headed by Harold Van Orman, Jr. and Ernie Berg. They have already secured playing dates in the new Memorial Coliseum.

#### KOMET HISTORY -- WHAT'S IN A NAME

The residents of Northeast Indiana most likely first learned that the new pro hockey team coming to Fort Wayne was going to be called "Komets", yes, comets with a "K", in an article that appeared in the Fort Wayne Journal-Gazette September 13, 1952.

It was the final summer before a game called ice hockey was to invade the new Allen County War Memorial Coliseum, spreading its popularity all over northeast Indiana and northwest Ohio.

That summer was also prelude to the opening of the Fort Wayne Pistons' 1952-53 NBA season at the Coliseum which included the 1953 NBA All-Star Game. The Fort Wayne Daisies were playing their eighth season of Girls Professional Baseball at Memorial Park while Cindy's Diner first opened in downtown Fort Wayne at the intersection of Clinton and Jefferson streets. The honorable Harry W. Baals served as mayor and WOWO Radio AM 1190 was belting out hits such as "Cry" by Johnnie Ray, "Wish You Were Here" by Eddie Fisher and "You Belong To Me" by Jo Stafford in its 27th anniversary summer of broadcasting from Fort Wayne.

One Saturday morning during that summer of '52, on September 13, the Journal-Gazette ran the following article:

# Hockey Club To Be Called 'Komets;' Train In Canada

The Fort Wayne Hockey Club, playing its first season of ice hockey in this area, will be known as the Fort Wayne Komets. The name KOMETS was selected by the officials of the local club after a number of names had been suggested by fans throughout the area. So, it will be the Fort Wayne Komets along with the Toledo Mercurys, the Cincinnati Mohawks, the Troy Bruins, the Grand Rapids Rockets and the Milwaukee Clippers, the names of the other entrants in the International Hockey League.

Along with the selection of the name Komets, the team colors were also selected by the Komet management. Maroon and White have been chosen as the Fort Wayne colors, with white jerseys being worn for all home games and the maroon, trimmed in white being worn on all road games. Uniforms and equipment have been on order for some time and elaborate breast emblems have been ordered to emblazen the colorful jerseys that are planned. The Komet office, located in the Hotel Van Orman, is stepping up activities these days and completing the plans for the training camp grind of the team. Alex Wood, manager of the Komets in their fist season, will have a group of approximately 25 aspirants going into training at Woodstock, Ontario on October 8. Following two weeks of training and exhibiton games, the Komet squad will be pared to fifteen and return to Fort wayne to prepare for their opening league game on October 25 at the new Memorial Coliseum.



# **KOMET HISTORY -- FIRST FINALS BERTH**

Former Komet player Norm "Whiz" Waslawski stopped by the Komets' office in August, 2012, and dropped off the photo below. The Komets have enjoyed many locker-room celebrations over the years, and this photo shows that some things never change. Locker-room celebrations are memorable occasions and this one was no exception.

Waslawski, standing behind goaltender Glenn Ramsay, celebrates with a bottle of 7-Up (At least we think it's 7-Up!). The guys were celebrating a 6-4 home victory over Indianapolis on April 8, 1959, and winning the IHL semi-finals best-of-seven series 4-1 against the instate rival Chiefs and advancing to the Finals for the first time in Komet history.



The Komets later fell to the Louisville Rebels in their first appearance in the IHL Finals 4 games to 2.



# KOMET HISTORY -- THE SECOND TURNER CUP Celebrating the 50th anniversary of the 1965 IHL Turner Cup Championship By Chuck Bailey, 2014-15

Tuesday, April 27, 1965 was a mild day in Fort Wayne with the temperature outside reaching 57 degrees before falling to a low of 39 under partly cloudy skies. The Supremes had the number one record in the land



with "Stop! In The Name Of Love", the hills were alive with Julie Andrews and "The Sound of Music" showing nation wide at the movies including The Jefferson in downtown Fort Wayne, Ford introduced the new Mustang to the U.S. with a starting price tag of \$2,368, President Johnson had a press conference in the East Room of the White House on the war in Viet-Nam and TV news-caster Edward R. Murrow died at the age of 57.

Also on the night of April 27, the Montreal Canadiens defeated the Chicago Black Hawks 6-0 to take a 3-2 Stanley Cup series lead in the NHL playoff finals (a game in which former Komet John Ferguson fought Chicago's Eric Nesterenko), and the Fort Wayne Komets defeated the Des Moines Oak Leafs at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum 7-5 to win the IHL's Turner Cup Championship in front of a Tuesday night playoff crowd of 5,011.

After spotting the Oak Leafs with a pair of goals the Komets rallied with goals by Johnny Goodwin and Merv

Dubchak to pull even at 2-2 before Des Moines scored to finish the first period leading Fort Wayne 3-2. The second period was all Fort Wayne as the Komets netted three unanswered tallies by Bill Orban, Chick Balon and Norm Waslawski to take a 5-3 lead into the second intermission. The Oak Leafs scored the first goal of the third period to narrow Fort Wayne's margin to one before LenThornson and Dubchak each found the back of the net in less than a three minute span to give the Komets a commanding 7-4 lead. Des Moines fought back with a goal in the last minute of the game but it wasn't enough as FortWayne won the Turner Cup Finals in six games, 4-2 for their second IHL Turner Cup Trophy after sweeping the Toledo Blades 4 games to 0 in the first round. Dubchak led the Komets in the game with a pair of goals and added an assist while Goodwin also posted three points with two assists and a marker. Thornson bagged the game winning goal, his third game winner in the finals against Des Moines, to give him a team high and career high 12 playoff goals.

Thornson became a Komet legend center and was one

of the Komet stars of the 50's and 60's and a seven-time IHL James Gatschene Memorial Trophy (MVP) winner. Thornson had already won the IHL MVP five times, including the previous four straight seasons and he went on to win it two more times in 1967 and 1968 to finish with an IHL record seven MVP's. The Winnipeg, Manitoba native won the Komets' scoring title a record seven times and to this day continues to be the all-time leader with 807 assists and 1219 points in 763 regular season games.

Everyone remembers the first Fort Wayne Turner Cup Championship won in 1963, but what about that second one? Who better to ask than Thornson? It would be interesting to see what he remembered about Fort Wayne's 1964-65 season as we honor the 50th anniversary of Fort Wayne's second Turner Cup Championship.

The Komets won the 1965 Turner Cup title skating all 10 games of the postseason with only 14 players, a commonality back then. Among the 14 were 10 forwards and only four defensemen. "We had two main lines and an extra man or two," Thornson remembered. "With a limited number of players the players were close. Most were low-key guys. They were professional and knew what they had to do and did it."

When asked about all of the ice time each player got, Thornson said, "The players loved that. They all wanted to be on the ice all of the time." Certain

systems were used then, just as they are today. "We played in what you might call a triangle. We always had a backchecker. We had one guy in, one guy

wide and one guy as a trailer. We played against different people different ways, but to get out of your own end you had to have a system."

"Waslawski should have been in the NHL," Thornson added. "Without a doubt. A guy that never made a mistake. Always did things right." Goodwin was on the wing. "Goodwin was small, but probably the best left winger that ever was here." Eddie Long appeared in 31 regular season games as he was making the transition from player to head coach. Chuck Adamson was the goaltender. "One of the things we've always been known for is we've always had the best goaltenders, period. And we just had good defensemen". On the 1965 championship team there were four defensemen; Lionel Repka, Cal Purinton, Cy Whiteside and Terry Pembroke, who was making his pro debut.



In regards to the power play, the Komets used the speedy forward Bobby Rivard on the point with Lionel Repka while Thornson played center. "We played possession hockey and without question Repka was overall the best defenseman we had."

I asked Thornson what he remembered most about the '65 playoffs and he said, "The thing I remember was I scored 12 goals, a playoff career high, in 10 games! You remember those things. I was playing with Billy Orban (LW) that time, as tough as anybody you ever met. And Teddy (Wright) was on right wing half the time."

The 1964-65 Komets set league records of 344 goals and 576 assists for an IHL team record of 920 points in a 70-game schedule.

Along with Thornson, legends still living in Fort Wayne today include Long, Waslawski, Repka, Adamson and of course, broadcaster Bob Chase, who is still making the call radio-rinkside on WOWO Radio 50 years later. Unfortunately, we lost Reggie Primeau, who played on the teams of the 60's, just last summer.

So, we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Komets' successful run for the 1965 IHL Turner Cup. One of "those things" you like to remember.

# FORT WAYNE KOMETS 2014 GUIDE AND RECORD BOOK

#### KOMET HISTORY -- GEORGE'S CHARLIE RYAN STORY By Chuck Bailey Director of Communications Fort Wayne Komets

George Drysdale, an original Komet, and the first player to be voted captain of the team for the 1952-53 season, experienced many situations, conditions and circumstances as part of that new era of professional ice hockey in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Many Komet legends have so many stories to share with all of us, and George is certainly no exception. Of all the stories he has shared over the years, and there are plenty, one stands out way above all the rest. So, in my search for Komet information and stories for the media guide and record book each year, the following has to be included in the chest of Komet legendary tales and times.

It was a summer day in 2011 when George was at the Komet office, probably after dropping his wife Roe off at the Mall and had some time to kill so he stopped by. As usual, he began telling a few of his stories.

"1952, opening night, Fort Wayne, Indiana," he said. "George Edwards (Komet player, left winger). In those days we all had skate guards because the little ramp going up to the ice surface didn't have the rubber flooring you have now. It was tile. When you get to the ice you flip your guards off. Well, Edwards forgot about his, and of course, as you're introduced, you just jump over that little ledge onto the ice. Edwards pushed off.....he stopped about center ice!"

In the early days of Komet hockey, the team traveled to the road games by car, usually a caravan of three to four cars. There were only 12 players or so on the team back then. George said they called the cars the "Flyin' Coffins". He said "we called them that because we always wondered how we got home after a road game."

George also talked about the first year, when the team had training camp just outside Toronto, Ontario, in a suburb which is right on the lake. As George tells it, beginning another story, "So there were more guys from Ottawa than there were from anywhere in Canada. It was a nice day after practices in the morning and afternoon and we decided we were going to have a baseball game. So we went over to this nice little park next to the hotel and it was Ottawa vs. The World. We had a little cup made up, a large round bowl....with fur around the top....taken from the hotel.

"Now, we had a trainer named Charlie Ryan. Charlie was from England. A very colorful guy. He had just immigrated from England and was getting to know his way around as he settled-in in Chatham. We said Charlie, you ever play baseball? He said 'Oh yeah, all the time'. We said OK, you catch then, Charlie. You be a catcher! Well, whoever it was that threw the first pitch to Charlie, hit him right in the face. Charlie went down but said he was OK and later confessed he had never played baseball in England."

Ottawa won the game and the "Cup" was presented over their evening meal that night by Charlie, the Englishman.

After that 1952 training camp in Canada was completed, George and the rest of the players moved to Fort Wayne to help begin what is known now as the tradition of Komet hockey.

It wasn't until the third Komet season that the colorful Englishman Charlie Ryan came to Fort Wayne. While George helped the team introduce the sport of pro hockey to the fans in Fort Wayne in 1952-53 and 1953-54, Charlie served his first two years as an equipment manager and trainer in Chatham, Canada.

And now George tells the rest of the story of Charlie Ryan. "After his first two seasons at Chatham, I asked Charlie what he was going to do and he said he'd probably continue working with some of the junior clubs in Chatham. Well, during the first couple years, you know, in Fort Wayne we had some young kid, I think he was only 14 or 15. Charlie had some training experience now and when I went home during the summer and worked on my papers (team paperwork) I got a hold of Berg (Ernie Berg, General Manager and one of the owners of the new Komets) and said I had a trainer for us."

So, Berg agreed with his first captain of the Komet hockey club that Charlie would be a good fit and Charlie was hired for the 1954-55 season.

George moved ahead in his story to sometime near the end of the third season. The team continued to travel in caravans to the road games.

"We were going to Toledo and Charlie had bought a brand new 1954 red Buick convertible. Charlie said he chose red because his girlfriend Margarete was a blonde and she would look really great in the summer in that car. Charlie and Margarete stopped over the night before the game at Toledo for a cup of tea. So Roe (George's wife) made him and Margarete a cup of tea and they stayed until about nine o'clock at the apartment. I thought that instead of me driving my car up there, why not have Charlie just pick me up on the way? He said OK and that he would pick me up in the morning and I said OK, Charlie, that's fine.

"The next morning came and I waited and waited and waited. I said geeze, Roe, I think we're leaving around noon. So I called out there to Margarete and she answered the phone and I asked if Charlie was there and she said 'OK, yeah, he left'. And I said oh, he probably stopped down at Main Auto to get some sticks or something.

"She said 'just a minute, there's someone at the door'. All I heard was a scream. The guy came on the phone and said 'Your friend hit a train out on the bypass'. Why he went that way I don't know. They lived out on Leesburg Road and he went up to the truck stop there and the guy at the truck stop said 'I saw him, he had the green light, but he was fooling with the radio' because the car was brand new and Charlie looked up and that's when he hit the train.

"So I went to see him at the funeral home and I said Charlie Ryan? The guy at the funeral home said yeah. So I went back to the desk and said no, I wanted to see Charlie Ryan. He said that's Charlie Ryan. But I said his hair's white! He said yeah, he said that in that split second the fear turned Charlie's hair completely white."

Charlie Ryan's place in Fort Wayne Komet Hockey history was brief. But because of Komet legends such as George Drysdale, his memory and the memories of so many that have been a part of the Komet past will live on into the future.

# **KOMET HISTORY -- 50-GOAL SCORERS**

In the history of the Fort Wayne Komets there have only been 10 players to have reached 50 goals in a single season. Pretty amazing when you consider the Komets are in their 63rd consecutive season in Fort Wayne and have skated a total of 4,634 regular season games after 62 years.

Also, the near extinction of 50-goal scorers is even more evident when you consider that the ECHL has not had a 50-goal scorer over the past five seasons and when Kevin Baker of the Florida Everblades netted his 57 goals in 2008-09 it was the only time 50 goals were scored by an individual in the ECHL in the last 13 years.

The last time a Komet hit 50 goals in a season was 1990-91 when Lonnie Loach found the twine 55 times in 81 games. 22 seasons have come and gone since.

Seven years after the Komet franchise was established in Fort Wayne Len Ronson became the first to hit the 50-goal mark when he netted 62 goals in 68 games during 1959-60.

Only two players have had multiple 50-goal seasons with the Komets. Merv Dubchak reached 50 goals three straight seasons and Barry Scully had 50 or more goals four straight seasons.

Dubchak bagged 52 goals in 70 games in 1964-65 and

followed that with his IHL record 72 goals in 70 games during 1965-66. The winger added another 50-goal year in 1966-67 when he again scored 52 goals in 72 games.

Scully scored 61 markers in 1979-80, 69 in 1980-81, 60 in 1981-82 and 57 in 1982-83.

It's true that teams in professional hockey are not lighting the lamp as much as in the past with so much emphasis on strong defensive skills in the modern hockey world.

But here in Fort Wayne, scoring 50 goals by a Komet player can be done again. It's just a matter of when. And when it happens, it will be something to see and celebrate!

# KOMET HISTORY -- TRIBUTE In memory of Ken Ullyot, Flossie Zimmerman and Reggie Primeau

During the course of this past year, the Komets lost three legends. Three individuals who helped shape the Komet mold and will be forever remembered in the Komets Hall of Fame and the hearts of all who have followed the Komets over the years.

Former Komets executive, owner, general manager and coach Ken Ullyot died at the age of 92 on December 12, 2013. "Ken was a great guy," Komet Majority Owner and CEO Stephen Franke said. "I grew up in his era and he was the foundation of my love for Komet hockey. Ken told me when we bought the franchise to savor the wins and when you wake up the next morning you'll still be excited. Forget about the losses before you go to bed. It has been good advice for 24 years."

Ullyot came to Fort Wayne to coach the Komets in 1958. The legendary icon of Komet Hockey also served the team as general manager and owner at different times until he retired in 1986. Ullyot led the Komets to the 1963 IHL Turner Cup as a coach, the 1965 championship as general manager and the 1973 Turner Cup Title as an owner.

In addition to the three IHL championships, the Komets made seven trips to the finals under Ullyot's direction. In 1997 The Hockey News named Ullyot the IHL's All-Time Greatest General Manager. In addition, the IHL honored it's Western Conference Champion by presenting them with the Ken Ullyot Trophy.

During his tenure as an IHL governor, Ullyot and Komets business manager Colin Lister were credited with keeping the IHL alive through some very lean years. "Kometland is sad today with the passing of 'The Father' of the Komets, Ken Ullyot," Komet general manager David Franke said. Ken may not have been one of the original founders of the franchise, but with his arrival in 1958 he started a lot of what we still see with the organization today. If not for Ken Ullyot this franchise would never be where it is today with the on-ice success and players making their homes in Fort Wayne after retirement. Ken was the best coach the Komets had in their 62-year history. He not only kept the Komets going but also helped save the IHL on many occasions. The Franke family has been proud to keep the tradition going that Ken started back in 1958."

The Komets retired jersey number 58 in honor of Ullyot's first season with Fort Wayne. The Saskatoon, Saskatchewan native was inducted into the Comcast Xfinity Komet Hall of Fame in 1987. "We have lost the father of Komet hockey, who continued to follow his beloved Komets to the end," Komet president Michael Franke said. "It goes without saying that without Ken Ullyot Komet hockey would never have survived to celebrate 62 years. He was a great supporter of ours over the past 24 years and things will never be quite the same."

Ullyot and his wife, Violet, were residents of Fort Wayne for 55 years where they raised their daughter Donna and son Ron. Ron is a former Komet player and coach. Ullyot and his son Ron were one of the very few father-son combinations who had won IHL Turner Cup Championships.

Flossie Zimmerman

We lost Flossie Zimmerman January 21, 2014. She served in the Komets' office as manager and executive secretary for 30 years beginning in 1958.

David Franke commented, "I've known Flossie since I was a little kid and an up-andcoming Komet fan when she was the Komets' ticket manager. The Zimmerman family are great ambassadors for the Komets and all of youth hockey in Fort Wayne."

Flossie was the matriarch of what has been called Fort Wayne's first family of hockey. She and her husband of 64 years, Richard, were both inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 2004. Richard died at age 83 in February, 2010.

"Flossie Zimmerman was part of the backbone of the Fort Wayne Komets," Michael Franke said. "Her dedication to the Komets, Fort Wayne Youth Hockey and McMillen

Park/Glenbrook Square figure skating is unsurpassed and her contributions will never be forgotten."

Shortly after the conclusion of the 2013-14 Komet season, on May 28, 2014 Hall of Fame center Reggie

Primeau passed away at the age of 77. Primeau played eight seasons with the Komets during the 60's and ranks seventh on the Komets' all-time top 10 point leaders list with 542 points including 200 goals and 342 assists in 452 regular season games. Primeau added 22 goals, 31 assists and 53 points in 59 career playoff games with Fort Wayne.

During 1961-62 the Prince Albert, Saskatchewan native eclipsed the 100-point mark with 105 points and followed with two league championships when he helped Fort Wayne win its first two IHL Turner Cups in 1963 and 1965.

Primeau retired from professional hockey in 1969. He later became one of the charter members of the Komets' Hall of Fame and had his number 12 retired. Primeau remained a resident of Fort Wayne where he and his wife, Sonja, raised their four children.

"Luckily I was old enough and fortunate enough to see Reggie play for the Komets," David Franke said. "He was a great Komet and a wonderful family man. Reggie always had a smile on his face and handled life's ups and downs with dignity and class. Reggie Primeau will always be a Komet legend and an inspiration when times are tough."

Two heart-felt articles in the Fort Wayne newspapers resulted from the loss of Reggie Primeau. On May 29, Blake Sebring wrote the following in the News-Sentinel: Reggie Primeau always inspired the Komets on and off the ice and he became a Fort Wayne institution until his retirement in 1969.

Recognizing Primeau's Cree heritage from his mother's side of the family, organist Norm Carroll would sometimes play an Indian "war dance" before Primeau would take a faceoff. One time the Komets got caught in a massive snowstorm and had to hole up in a gas station. Seeing Primeau wrapped up in a blanket near the door, a stunned customer asked whether Primeau was a real cigar store Indian.

No matter how much his teammates teased, Primeau always had a smile on his face. He could also initiate the laughs as well as be the target.

Along with working as a food salesman, Primeau continued to raise his family here and go to games with Sonja. When diabetes forced a kidney transplant in 1998, his former teammates held a raffle to raise money. After diabetes cost Primeau his right leg in October 2000, his teammates would take him in his wheelchair to events or let him ride along in a golf cart. He eventually learned to walk again with a prosthesis but was unable to skate.

Recognized as the Komets' smoothest skater, Primeau always wanted to be the first player out for practice because he loved listening to his skates cracking the fresh ice. After losing his leg, he never thought he'd hear the sound again, but in 2005 he tried a new prosthesis. For the first time in eight years, he was skating again. "At least it looked like I was really skating," Primeau said. "I didn't think I would be able to get my right leg off the ice, but it came." Within 30 minutes, he was making turns and skating figure-eights. He skated for an hour and 20 minutes, and even after going more than 100 times around the rink he didn't want to come off.

"I was really happy," Primeau said. "I didn't do any real fast skating, just so I could get my legs moving. I think it's going to work out OK. I think I'm going to be able to move pretty good."

On May 30, Ben Smith wrote in the Journal Gazette about a time when the boys of winter, the '60s kids, stuck together, even a half-a-century later. How they never quit on each other on the ice, a habit that stayed with them. Ben wrote about the time when he paid a visit to a few of them during a rough time. It was a rough time for them collectively— Reg had just lost part of a leg, Ken Ullyot was suffering from fibromyalgia and Lionel Repka had just lost his son in a tragic bicycling accident.

Ben accurately commented in his article that they were actually in a community within their own adopted community, in essence. One day, sitting in Repka's quiet kitchen, Repka told him a story about the day he buried his boy out at Lindenwood Cemetery, and how at one point in the graveside service, Repka looked up, and there, sitting in his wheelchair on a hill under a tree not far way, was Reg Primeau.

"He'd just gotten out of the hospital," Repka said to Ben with his eyes beginning to glisten before not being able to talk anymore.

So, we salute Ken, Flossie and Reggie. Three important members of that special Komet community. Komet Stars that we will never forget.

# Gary Graham

### Head Coach/Director of Player Personnel, Fort Wayne Komets

Gary Graham rejoined the Komets when he was named Head Coach and Director of Player Personnel on June 4, 2013.



Graham became the 28th person to handle head coaching duties with the Komets since the team was established in Fort Wayne in 1952. Graham replaced Al Sims, who announced his retirement after the 2012-13 season. "Gary is the right coach at the right time for the Komets," Komet president Michael Franke said. "He knows the Komet way of doing business and will be a tremendous asset to the Komet organization."

Graham returned to the Komets after guiding Pensacola to the Ice Flyer's first Southern Professional Hockey League Championship. The Ice Flyer's finished 2012-13 with a 33-18-5 record and 71 points, two points shy of capturing the regular season title. It was the first time Pensacola skated to a regular season winning percentage over .600 (.634) since joining the SPHL in 2009-10.

The 2013 SPHL Presidents' Cup Title was Graham's fourth career league crown. Before his stint with Pensacola, Graham collected three league championships (2009, 2010, 2012) in four seasons as an assistant coach with the Komets.

Last season Graham made his Fort Wayne head coaching debut leading the Komets to the ECHL Eastern Conference Semifinals in their first ever berth in the Kelly Cup Playoffs.

Prior to Graham's first tenure with the Komets, the Fort Wayne native enjoyed success as head coach of the Indiana Jr. Ice Tier 1 team, guiding the Ice to a 38-17-3 record in the Midwest Elite League during 2008-09 before serving as associate coach for the USHL Clark Cup Champion Indiana Ice.

Graham majored in Exercise Science at Ball State University and resides in Fort Wayne with his children Connor and Isabella.

## FORT WAYNE KOMETS 2014 GUIDE AND RECORD BOOK

#### **KOMET HALL OF FAME**



The Komet Hall of Fame was first introduced in 1988. Komet general manager Bob Chase decided it was time to get a Hall of Fame established for the all-time Fort Wayne Komet hockey greats in honor of their dedication and contributions to Komet hockey in Fort Wayne.

The Hall of Fame is divided into three sections. The Executive Builders section (10), the Team Personnel section (22) and the Media section (6) combine for a total of 38 members.

The most recent inductees are Colin Chin, Steve Fletcher, Terry McDougall and Win Rood, inducted into the Class of 2007 in a ceremony at the Komets' home game Nov. 17, 2007. The most recent number retirements are Chuck Adamson (1) and Nick Boucher (33) whose numbers were retired in a ceremony Oct. 26, 1013. Boucher automatically entered the Komet Hall of Fame with his number retirement.

Chuck Adamson, already a member of the Komet Hall of Fame, had his famous Komet number 1 retired to the rafters of the Memorial Coliseum Oct. 26, 2013, along with goaltender Nick Boucher's number 33 in a ceremony prior to the Komets' second home game of the 2013-14 season.

Chuck was celebrated for his many achievements as Komet goaltender including Fort Wayne's first two IHL Turner Cup Championships in 1963 and 1965.

The Sudbury, Ontario native was awarded the 1964-65 IHL James Norris Memorial Trophy as Outstanding Goaltender of the Year. Chuck also holds the Komet record of 176 consecutive games played as a goaltender when he didn't miss a game over a stretch of three seasons from 1962 to 1965, a record surely never to be broken.

## **2** GUY **DUPUIS**



In a memorable ceremony Saturday, Oct. 29, 2011, the Komets' second home game of the new 2011-12 season, the Komets retired Guy Dupuis' number 2 to the rafters of the Memorial Coliseum and placed Guy into the Komet Hall of Fame. Guy completed his pro hockey career at the conclusion of 2010-11 with a record that may never be broken by another Komet. Guy retired as the the player with the most games played, ever, in a Komet uniform. Most regular season games played as a Komet with 945, and most overall including playoffs with 1,040.

Guy also holds the distinction of owner of almost every Komet defenseman record. During his time with the Komets Guy netted 126 goals, 417 assists for 543 points (regular season). When you add his playoff totals, Guy holds the Komets defenseman records for most overall goals (140), most overall assists (454) and most overall points by a defenseman at 594.

Guy takes with him four league championships as a Komet, he is an eight-time recipient of the Komets' Defenseman of the Year Award and three-time league Defenseman of the Year. He earned the plus-minus Komet Award on seven occasions and was two-time winner of the Komets' yearly Community Service Award. Many times an All-Star, Guy will always be a bright star in the history of the Fort Wayne Komets.

# 5 TERRY PEMBROKE



Terry Pembroke scored one of the most memorable goals in Komet history and ranks third in most Komet career games with 784 after skating 12 years in a Komet uniform.

Terry accumulated 273 assists and 339 points during his career as a Komet. The defenseman also ranks sixth all-time with 1,143 penalty minutes. Terry holds the club record with eight IHL All-Star Game appearances. He was a member of the 1965 and 1973 Turner Cup Champion Komet teams.

On February 20, 1965, with about 25 seconds remaining in the first period, Terry took the puck off the face-off deep in the Komet end and quickly turned and fired a wrist shot from the bottom of the face off circle. The puck traveled approximately 176 feet through the air and beside the Memorial Coliseum scoreboard before it hit Toledo goaltender Glenn Ramsay in the leg and glanced into the goal. Terry Pembroke was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

# 6 LIONEL REPKA



Lionel Repka played 11 seasons as a Fort Wayne Komet. Lionel ranks 10th on the Komets' alltime top 10 point leaders list with 492 points in 666 games.

"Choo Choo", as he was nicknamed, was an IHL Turner Cup Champion with the Komets twice, in 1963 and again in 1965. He was named best defenseman in the league during the 1964-65 season. During the 65-66 campaign, Lionel tallied a total of 80 points while playing defense.

Lionel still resides in Fort Wayne and is a frequent visitor to Komet home games, Legend ceremonies and other various off-ice events.

Lionel Repka was inductd into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

## 11 LEN THORNSON



Len Thornson was one of the greatest puckhandlers and scorers ever in the International Hockey League. Lenny played 12 seasons from 1957-58 to 1968-69 with the Komets and appeared in 763 regular season games. The center holds the Komet's all-time point record with 1,219 career points and the Komet record for assists with 807. He also shares the record of most points in a season of 139 with Terry McDougall. During the 1960-61 season, Lenny set the Komet record of the longest 2-point scoring streak of 14 games.

Thornson won seven IHL MVP awards, three IHL scoring titles and was selected to the All-IHL Team eight times. Lenny is regarded in many circles as one of the greatest all-around minor league hockey players of all time. In 1997, The Hockey News named Len Thornson the IHL's Greatest Player of All Time. Len Thornson was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

## 12 REGGIE PRIMEAU



Reggie Primeau played eight seasons with the Komets. The center's numbers include 342 assists in 452 regular season games and he ranks seventh on the Komet's all-time top 10 point leaders list with 542. During the 1961-62 season Reggie eclipsed the 100-point mark for the year with 105 points.

Reggie was an IHL Turner Cup champion with the Komets twice in his career in 1963 and 1965.

Reggie became a permanent resident of Fort Wayne after his retirement from hockey. He was a frequent visitor to Komet home games, Legend ceremonies and various off-ice events until he passed away May 28, 2014.

Reggie Primeau was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

# 16 EDDIE LONG



Eddie Long was nicknamed Mr. Komet and appropriatley so. The rugged right winger spent 14 years playing in a Komet's uniform and was an original member of the Komets' 1952 team.

Eddie skated the most games all-time of any Komet, prior to 2008-09, appearing in 866 from 1952-53 thru 1965-66 including playoffs. Eddie's record of most games as a Komets was eclipsed April 8, 2009, when Guy Dupuis appeared in his 867th game for a new Komet all-time most games record. Eddie continues to hold the record of most career goals scored in a Fort Wayne uniform with 425. Eddie, along with three other players, holds the Komet record for most goals in a game with five. He also scored a record four hat tricks during the 1956-57 season, also a record shared with three other players.

Eddie won the IHL Turner Cup Championship as a player in 1963 and as the Komet's head coach in 1965. He was the first Komet to have his jersey number (16) retired in 1965-66. Eddie was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

## 18 ROBBIE LAIRD



Robbie Laird hustled on the ice for the Komets nine seasons and coached the Fort Wayne club another four seasons. It was Laird's hard-nosed style of play that earned him his fame.

No one could ever acuse Rob Laird of taking a shift off. It was his blue collar work ethic on the ice that made him a Komet legend and earned him a spot in the hall of fame.

Robbie broke the 100-point plateau during the 1978-79 season tallying 107. Robo, as he was nicknamed, ranks fourth on the Komet's all-time penalty minute list with 1,298 minutes in the sin bin and ranks ninth on the Komet's all-time top 10 point leaders list with a career total of 499 points in 520 games played.

Robbie's on-ice work ethic carried over to his coaching style and he ranks fourth on the Komet's career coaching wins list with 194. Robbie Laird was inducted into the Komet Hall of fame in 2002.

## 26 COLIN CHIN



Colin Chin was born in Fort Wayne, Indiana and raised on Komet Hockey. After completing three seasons of play in the NCAA at the University of Illinois-Chicago, the center skated with Baltimore of the American Hockey League in 1985-86 before returning to his roots in Fort Wayne.

Colin appeared in 10 consecutive seasons with the Komets from 1986-87 to 1995-96 and grabbed the IHL Turner Cup Championship in 1993. In 1993-94 "Chinner" became a member of the Komets' elite 100-point Club posting exactly 100 points scoring 36 goals and adding 64 assists in 81 games. He ranks fifth on the Komet's all-time top 10 point leaders list with 636 points during his 660-game career with the Komets. Colin remains known as one of the most popular and prominent captains in the history of the Komet hockey club.

Colin resides in Fort Wayne and is employed by Lincoln Financial. Colin was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 2007.



## ROBBIE **IRONS**

Robbie Irons played between the Komet pipes for 12 seasons encompassing parts of three decades. Robbie collected an IHL Turner Cup Championship with the Komets in 1973.

He was originally the property of the New York Rangers. In the 1968-69 season Robbie was an emergency back-up on the bench for the St. Louis Blues when he replaced Glenn Hall for three minutes without allowing a goal. His three-minute appearance set an NHL record for the fewest career minutes played by an NHL goalie.

Robbie continues to reside in Fort Wayne after retiring in 1981 and works alongside Komet announcer Bob Chase offering color commentary on Komet home radio broadcasts.

Robbie Irons was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

## 33 NICK BOUCHER



Nick Boucher guarded the Komet net for five consecutive seasons from 2007 to 2012 and in that span of five years the goaltender collected four Komet league championships (2008, 2009, 2010, 2012).

Nick led IHL goaltenders in goals-against average for three straight seasons and was awarded IHL Goaltender of the Year for 2008-09. En route to the 2012 CHL Presidents' Cup the Leduc, Alberta native tied Pokey Reddick's Komet record of 12 playoff wins by a goaltendfer.

Nick's number 33 was retired to the rafters of the Memorial Coliseum along with Komet Legend Chuck Adamson's number 1 Oct. 26, 2013 prior to the Komets' secone home game of the 2013-14 season.

His number retirement automatically places Nick into the Komet Hall of Fame.

# 40 BOB CHASE



Bob Chase hails from Negaunee, Michigan, where he was born January 22, 1926. He grew up in Marquette, Michigan and after high school joined the U.S. Navy where he served from 1943-1947. Upon his discharge from the Navy, Bob entered Northern Michigan University at Marquette and graduated in 1952. While in college, Bob started his radio career in Marquette in 1949.

Bob moved to Fort Wayne to begin his radio career with WOWO AM 1190 in 1953 which included broadcasting Komet hockey games starting with the 1953-54 season. Bob never looked back and is enjoying his 61st consecutive season calling Komet hockey radio-rinkside. In 1988, as general manager of the Komets, Bob introduced the Komet Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the Hall himself as the only member of the Class of 2003.

Bob was honored for his 40th season in 1993 as part of a ceremony retiring the number 40 in his honor. Bob and Muriel have four children; Michael, Kurt, Karin and David.

# 58 KEN ULLYOT



Ken Ullyot came to Fort Wayne to coach the Komets in 1958. He also served the team as general manager and owner at different times until he retired in 1986. Ken led the Komets to the 1963 Turner Cup as a coach, the 1965 championship as general manager and the 1973 title as an owner.

From 1958 to 1973 the Komets won three Turner Cups and made seven trips to the finals under his direction. In 1997 The Hockey News named Ken Ullyot the IHL's All-Time Greatest General Manager and the IHL honored it's Western Conference champion by presenting them with the Ken Ullyot trophy.

During his tenure as an IHL governor, Ullyot and Komet business manager Colin Lister were credited with keeping the league alive through some very lean years. The Komets retired jersey number 58 in honor of the year of Ken's first season with the Komets. Ken remained a resident of Fort Wayne after retirement. He passed away Dec. 12, 2013.

Ken Ullyot was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987.

## 59 COLIN LISTER



Colin Lister arrived in Fort Wayne prior to the 1958-59 season after accepting the position of Secretary-Treasurer and Business Manager of the Komets. Newly hired general manager Ken Ullyot decided Colin was the perfect man for the job after Colin had previously served as Ken's business manager in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan.

Colin mastered the art of managing the Komets' business affairs and became a very familiar face to Komet fans in the Coliseum ticket office where he was also the box office manager. Colin later became a stockholder in the Komet hockey club and in the early 80's, after capturing three IHL Turner Cup Championships, Colin became majority owner. Colin sold the team in the summer of 1985.

Through his 26-year Komet career, Colin was directly involved in every aspect of Komet hockey management and it's representation in the community. The Komets retired the jersey number 59 in honor of Colin's inaugural season in Fort Wayne. Colin Lister was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 1987. The Fort Wayne hockey community mourned the loss of Mr. Lister when he passed Dec. 31, 2010.

## 77 STEVE FLETCHER



Steve Fletcher started his career with the Komets in 1982 after completing three years of juniors at Hull. Selected by Calgary in the 1980 NHL Entry Draft, Steve skated nine seasons in the American Hockey League after his initial start with the Komets during 1982-83. His career in the NHL included stints with Montreal and Winnipeg before returning to Fort Wayne in 1990 for six additional seasons. Steve officially ended his playing career appearing in one game with the Komets druing the 2002-03 season.

Steve is a recipient of the Komet's Most Popular Player Award and is the Komets' all-time king enforcer with a total 1,752 penalty minutes. Steve continues to reside in Fort Wayne and is employed by Aunt Millie's Bakery. Steve Fletcher was inducted into the Komet Hall of Fame in 2007.
