DAN DEVOS

CO-OWNER/PRESIDENT & CEO/GOVERNOR

A Grand Rapids native, **Dan DeVos** led the way for the return of professional hockey to West Michigan in 1996. Since then, the Griffins organization has strived to meet a standard of excellence in everything it does, while providing a fan experience focused on family fun and entertainment. That excellence begins on the ice, where the team has won five division titles in either the AHL or the International Hockey League over the last 13 seasons.

DeVos is president and CEO of DP Fox Ventures, LLC, a Grand Rapids-based business development and management firm that employs nearly 1,000 professionals through companies including Fox Insurance Agency, Fox Powersports and Fox Motor Group, a retail automotive group representing 40 brands at 21 locations.

A member of the board of directors of Alticor Inc., the parent company of Amway Corporation, DeVos also serves as president/CEO of Powell Pointe Resort, the developer of Cape Eleuthera, and of Cape Eleuthera Properties, the manager of the Princess Cays facility, on the island of Eleuthera, The Bahamas. Additionally, he is chairman of Georgian International, based in Barrie, Ontario.

DeVos, a member of the West Michigan Sports Commission's board of directors since 2007, is also chairman and part owner of the Orlando Magic, and he serves on both the AHL's executive committee and the NBA's Board of Governors. He was named the IHL's Executive of Year in 1997 and served as the league's chairman of the board during its final two seasons (1999-2001).

In honor of the impact that he, his brothers and their father, Rich, have made on the sports landscape both locally and nationally, the DeVos family was inducted into the Grand Rapids Sports Hall of Fame in the team category in 2011.

DeVos is involved in a variety of local business and civic organizations, including Hope Network and the Grand Valley State University Foundation. He also serves as a trustee for Northwood University, his alma mater.

His wife, Pamela, is president and designer of PAMELLA ROLAND. They have two daughters and one son.

DAVID VAN ANDEL

CO-OWNER/CHAIRMAN

David Van Anandel played a prominent role in bringing professional hockey back to Grand Rapids in 1996. He is co-owner and chairman of the Grand Rapids Griffins.

Van Anandel is chairman/CEO of The Van Anandel Institute for Education and Medical Research. Van Anandel serves as chairman of Twinlab Corp. In this role, he is leading the company to become the world's pre-eminent supplier of natural and organic products. He is also a member of Amway's Board of Directors and serves on its Executive, Governance and Audit committees.

Van Anandel is active in many business and community organizations in Grand Rapids, including the Grand Rapids Right Place Program, the Hope College Board of Directors and the Economic Club of Grand Rapids.

He and his wife, Carol, have four children.

SCOTT GORSLINE **CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER/ ALTERNATE GOVERNOR**

Scott Gorsline is responsible for overseeing the operational aspects of the Griffins and DP Fox Sports & Entertainment.

Gorsline most notably helped negotiate the Griffins' original affiliation agreement with the Detroit Red Wings in 2002 along with its five-year extensions in both 2007 and 2012. He serves as the team's alternate governor to the AHL Board of Governors and has been involved in numerous franchise start-ups during his years with DP Fox, including the Griffins (1995-96), IHL Kansas City Blades (1996), AFL Grand Rapids Rampage (1997-98) and Oklahoma Wranglers (1999-2000), and af2 Wichita Stealth (2000-01). Gorsline also oversees Griff's IceHouse at Belknap Park, the Griffins' practice facility, on behalf of DP Fox.

Gorsline has had operational roles with other DP Fox-affiliated companies, including Powell Pointe at Cape Eleuthera, a high-end resort development in The Bahamas. Gorsline currently serves as COO of PAMELLA ROLAND, a high-end, New York-based design house run by designer/president Pamella DeVos. In addition, he oversees Fox Insurance Agency, along with DP Fox's human resources and IT departments.

Gorsline has been with DP Fox Ventures, LLC, parent company of the Griffins, since 1995. He graduated from Alma College with a bachelor's degree in business administration and history, and received his JD and MBA from the University of Detroit, where he was editor of the *Law Review*.

He and his wife, Mary, are the parents of triplets Grace, Elizabeth and Isabel.

TIM GORTSEMA **SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT OF BUSINESS OPERATIONS**

A member of the Griffins' original 1995 staff, **Tim Gortsema** began his career with DP Fox Sports & Entertainment as vice president of finance and administration. In February 2007, he was promoted to senior vice president of business operations, becoming just the second person to direct the Griffins' front office.

Now in his 17th season with the club, Gortsema oversees all business-related activities for the Griffins, including finance and administration, sales and marketing, public relations, community relations, arena advertising and Griff's IceHouse. Under his watch, the Griffins have achieved attendance increases in five of the last six seasons, finishing sixth out of 30 AHL teams in 2011-12.

Instrumental in the successful management of what has become a multi-million dollar business venture, Gortsema received his bachelor's degree from Hope College in Holland and later earned his MBA from Western Michigan University. Prior to joining DP Fox Sports, he was a manager in the audit department at Deloitte & Touche, LLP.

He and his wife, Suzanne, have two daughters, Danielle and Madelyn, and one son, Justin.

BOB KASER VICE PRESIDENT OF COMMUNITY RELATIONS AND BROADCASTING



Named the Griffins' vice president of community relations and broadcasting in March 2007, **Bob Kaser** begins his 13th season as the team's play-by-play voice and his sixth assisting with the oversight of the Griffins' business operations. While calling every Griffins game on the team's flagship station, Newsradio WOOD 106.9 FM & 1300 AM, he also supervises the team's extensive community relations efforts and directs all major fundraising events for the Griffins Youth Foundation, of which he was named president in June 2006.

Kaser received the AHL's 2009-10 Ellery Award for excellence in radio broadcasting, the latest in a string of honors he's earned behind the Griffins' microphone. Each year from 2001-2004 and more recently in 2006, Griffins hockey on WOOD was awarded a Broadcast Excellence Award from the Michigan Association of Broadcasters. Kaser and color commentator Larry Figurski are also three-time winners (2002, 2005 and 2006) of Michigan AP's award for Best Live Sports/Class II Radio.

Kaser serves as director for both the Griffins Youth Foundation Golf Classic and the Griffins Youth Hockey Camp, as well as co-chair for the Great Skate Winterfest, which he founded in 2002. He has also developed several of the team's innovative community programs, including Growing with the Griffins and Charitable Goals. Under his leadership, the Griffins have raised more than \$3.1 million for local charities over the last 10 seasons, and the franchise won the AHL's 2008-09 Western Conference award for community service.

In his free time, Kaser assists with several other worthy causes in West Michigan, serving as a board member for Cornerstone University's Champions of Character program, as well as a member of the Advancing Excellence committee for East Grand Rapids Schools and the food procurement committee for Kid's Food Basket. An avid baseball fan and former amateur player, he has coached Diamonds travel baseball teams for the last four years and is set to coach next season's 15U team.

A Kalamazoo native who grew up in Flint, Kaser has been involved in hockey since 1979, most notably spending 10 seasons (1990-2000) as director of communications and broadcasting for the IHL's Kansas City Blades. He was twice awarded the Bob Chase Award as IHL Broadcaster of the Year (1993-94 and 1997-98), and his public relations staff earned recognition as the best in the Western Conference on four occasions (1994-95, 1995-96, 1997-98 and 1999-00).

Kaser lives in East Grand Rapids with his wife, Rosalie, and their two sons, Charlie and Sam.

SEAN WRIGHT VICE PRESIDENT OF CORPORATE SALES

Sean Wright began his tenure with DP Fox Sports & Entertainment in 2001 as director of arena advertising sales. Following a promotion in 2008, he now serves as the Griffins' vice president of corporate sales.

Wright oversees arena advertising sales and the Griffins' corporate sales department, having responsibility for maintaining and servicing current clients as well acquiring new business through team sponsorships.

Prior to his time with DP Fox Sports, the Oakland, Calif., native spent two years with Citadel Broadcasting as a radio sales representative. Wright currently serves on the board for Georgetown Little League and on the committee for the West Michigan Charity Sports Banquet, a fundraiser for the Children's Miracle Network.

He and his wife, Sara, have three daughters, Jessica, Kaitlyn and Allison, and one son, Carson.

JEFF BLASHILL HEAD COACH

Jeff Blashill was named by the Detroit Red Wings as the ninth head coach in Griffins history on June 25, 2012.

Blashill, 38, served as an assistant coach for the parent Red Wings in 2011-12, when he helped the team to its 12th consecutive 100-point season and 21st consecutive postseason appearance. Prior to joining the organization, he served as the head coach of the CCHA's Western Michigan Broncos in 2010-11, earning several national coach of the year honors.



Born in Detroit and raised in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Blashill has rapidly ascended hockey's coaching ladder, joining his fourth team in four seasons. He began his head coaching career with the USHL's Indiana Ice in 2008-09, capturing a franchise-record 39 wins and a Clark Cup championship. He compiled a 72-43-5 mark in two seasons as the Ice's head coach and general manager before departing for Western Michigan in 2010.

While in Kalamazoo, Blashill led the Broncos to a 19-13-10 record, doubling the team's win total from the previous season and leading it to its best conference finish (4th) since 1995-96. Additionally, the Broncos played in the CCHA championship game for the first time since 1986 and earned their first NCAA Tournament berth since 1996. Blashill was named a finalist for CCHA Coach of the Year and was named National Coach of the Year by College Hockey News, Inside College Hockey and USCHO.com.

Blashill began his coaching career by spending four seasons (1998-02) as an assistant at Ferris State University, his alma mater. He also spent six seasons (2002-08) with Miami University, helping the CCHA's RedHawks qualify for the NCAA Tournament four times while recruiting three Hobey Baker Finalists, four CCHA All-Rookie Team members, 11 first or second team All-CCHA players and six All-Americans.



Blashill has also been a member of Team USA's coaching staff three times: at the 2009 World Junior 'A' Challenge, the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship and the 2006 U-18 Junior World Cup.

The former goaltender spent four seasons between the pipes for Ferris State, earning the Bulldogs' Rookie of the Year award in 1994-95 and a spot on the CCHA's All-Academic Team for 1996-97. He also garnered the Ferris State University President's Award for three straight years for having the highest grade point average on the Bulldogs.

Blashill and his wife, Erica, live in East Grand Rapids with their three children, Teddy, Josie and Owen.

JIM PAEK ASSISTANT COACH

The longest-tenured coach in franchise history, **Jim Paek** begins his eighth season as the Griffins' assistant coach. He joined the organization on Aug. 11, 2005.

Paek, 45, helped guide Grand Rapids to the AHL's regular season championship in 2005-06 and additional playoff berths in 2006-07 and 2008-09, when the Griffins notched their first-ever playoff upset by eliminating Hamilton in the North Division Semifinals. He even took a turn as the team's bench boss for one game in 2008-09, a 4-0 home victory over Philadelphia on Jan. 10, 2009.

In 2008, Paek earned the right to hoist Lord Stanley's Cup for the third time after coaching the Detroit Red Wings' "black aces" during the parent club's title run. Ironically, that privilege came at the expense of the Pittsburgh Penguins, with whom he won consecutive Stanley Cups as a defenseman in 1991 and 1992. During five seasons in the NHL (1990-95), he tallied 34 points (5-29—34) and 155 penalty minutes in 217 games with Pittsburgh, the Los Angeles Kings and Ottawa Senators.



Born in Seoul, South Korea, and raised in Toronto, Paek became a U.S. citizen on March 16, 2011. As the first Korean to both play in the NHL and have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup, his Penguins jersey is displayed in the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto.

While in Pittsburgh, he was named the team's 1992 rookie of the year and was the co-winner of its 1993 community service award.

Traded to Los Angeles with former Griffin Marty McSorley for Tomas Sandstrom and Shawn McEachern on Feb. 16, 1994, Paek had the distinction of counting both Mario Lemieux and Wayne Gretzky as teammates. During his 16-year playing career, he also learned from some of hockey's most accomplished coaches, including the legendary Scotty Bowman, "Badger" Bob Johnson, and Phoenix Coyotes head coach Dave Tippett.

Paek began his professional career with a three-year stint in Muskegon, Mich., during which he helped the IHL's Lumberjacks win the 1989

Turner Cup. He added a fourth and final cup to his resume in 1999 as a member of the IHL's Houston Aeros.

Upon retiring in 2003, Paek was named head coach of the WHA2's Orlando Seals, guiding the club to a 27-25-5 record in 2003-04 and coaching in the league's all-star game. In 2004, he returned to Cleveland and served as an assistant coach for the St. Edwards High School team that won the Ohio state championship, and co-coach of the Cleveland Panthers bantam minor squad that captured the Eastern Elite Amateur Hockey League title.

Paek and his wife, Kortney, have two children, Megan and Kyler.

Griffins Hockey Mythology

January 23, 1995

West Michigan Hockey, Inc. principals Daniel G. DeVos and David L. Van Andel announce plans to bring a professional ice hockey team to the greater Grand Rapids area.

April 25, 1995

West Michigan Hockey, Inc. and the International Hockey League announce plans to bring an IHL expansion team to the greater Grand Rapids area in time for the 1996-97 hockey season. The team will play its home games in the new downtown arena that is under construction.

November 20, 1995

West Michigan Hockey, Inc. announces that the IHL's Grand Rapids entry will be called the Griffins, after a creature from Greek mythology that displayed the head and wings of an eagle and the body of a lion. The team's new logo, designed by Sean Michael Edwards Design, Inc. of New York, of a Griffin aggressively positioned upon the team wordmark, is also revealed, as are the team's colors of gold, silver, navy, red, and green.

January 26, 1996

Griffins name IHL veteran Bob McNamara as director of hockey operations/general manager.

July 24, 1996

Griffins sign first-ever player in defenseman Todd Nelson, from Prince Albert, Saskatchewan.

July 26, 1996

Grand Rapids signs its first American-born player, defenseman Travis Richards, a Minnesota native who played on the 1994 U.S. Olympic Team.

August 19, 1996

Griffins announce that they have sold 7,000 season tickets, most by any team in IHL history.

October 5, 1996

Griffins open their inaugural campaign on the road at Market Square Arena versus the Indianapolis Ice, and emerge with a 1-0 win on 30 saves by Pokey Reddick and a first-period power-play goal by Michel Picard, the first goal in Griffins' history.

October 11, 1996

Griffins host their first-ever game at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids against the Orlando Solar Bears before a sold-out crowd of 10,834, but fall by a 3-1 score to the defending Eastern Conference playoff champions. Darin Smith scores the first Griffins goal in the new facility, converting in the second period against Allan Bester.

February 18, 1997

Grand Rapids hosts the 1997 IHL All-Star Game before a sold-out throng at Van Andel Arena. Pokey Reddick, Michel Picard and Jeff Nelson represent the Griffins on the Eastern Conference squad, but it's the Western Conference that claims a 6-4 victory.

June 24, 1997

Dan DeVos is unanimously selected as the IHL Executive of the Year.

June 27, 1997

Bob McNamara is honored by his peers as the inaugural IHL General Manager of the Year.

June 10, 1999

Griffins announce a two-year agreement to serve as the primary affiliate of the NHL's Ottawa Senators.

September 12, 1999

The NHL comes to Van Andel Arena for the first time, as the Griffins host the NHL Showcase Game. The St. Louis Blues shutout the expansion Atlanta Thrashers by a 4-0 count before a near-capacity crowd, and the game raises \$40,000 for charity.

April 15, 2000

Griffins claim their first Eastern Conference regular season championship and earn their 50th win thanks to a 5-2 victory at Cincinnati. Michel Picard ties a franchise mark with two shorthanded goals.

May 11, 2000

Guy Charron is awarded the Commissioner's Trophy as the IHL's 1999-2000 Coach of the Year.

May 23, 2000

Griffins win the Eastern Conference championship and earn their first trip to the Turner Cup finals with a 6-1 win over Cincinnati at Van Andel Arena. Grand Rapids wins the final four games of the series.

June 5, 2000

The Griffins' championship dreams come to an end in a 3-1 loss at Van Andel Arena in Game 6 of the Turner Cup Finals, which is witnessed by the second-largest playoff crowd in Grand Rapids history (10,156). After 99 regular season and playoff games, the Griffins complete their magical season with a 61-29-9 record.

September 15, 2000

As a thank you to their fans, the Griffins host the Detroit Red Wings Red & White Game at Van Andel Arena. The White team throttles the Red squad by a 6-1 margin, as NHL stars such as



Steve Yzerman, Sergei Fedorov, Brendan Shanahan and Nicklas Lidstrom play the entire game. \$137,882 is raised for four charities.

October 18, 2000

In their first-ever caravan event, the Griffins hold an evening practice at The Edge ice rink in Holland. Approximately 500 fans attend.

October 24, 2000

Griffins and Ottawa Senators extend their affiliation agreement for a third season, through 2001-02.

December 16, 2000

Griffins wear special holiday jerseys, the first alternate Griffins-logo sweaters ever donned by the team, in a 4-3 loss to Kansas City.

February 5, 2001

Center Kip Miller is assigned to Grand Rapids by the Pittsburgh Penguins, thereafter joining Kelly and Kevin as the third Miller brother to don a Griffins uniform.

February 10, 2001

Griffins sign former NHL defenseman Marty McSorley. He makes his IHL debut that same night in a 3-1 home win over Utah.

April 6, 2001

Griffins claim the IHL's Huber Trophy as regular season champions with a 2-1 win at Utah.

May 3, 2001

In the second-longest game in IHL history, Orlando's Hugo Boisvert scores at 11:12 of the third overtime to lift the Solar Bears to a 4-3 win in Game 1 of the Eastern Conference finals at Van Andel Arena. The game ends at 12:39 a.m., five hours and one minute after it began.

June 4, 2001

Griffins and five other IHL teams – Chicago, Houston, Manitoba, Milwaukee and Utah – are accepted into the American Hockey League as expansion franchises for the 2001-02 season.

September 26, 2001

In the 2001 NHL Showcase Game at Van Andel Arena, nine former Griffins take to the ice in NHL uniforms as the Ottawa Senators, led by goalie Mathieu Chouinard, defeat the Florida Panthers, 3-1.

October 5, 2001

Griffins make their AHL debut in a 3-0 loss to the Utah Grizzlies at Van Andel Arena.

October 30, 2001

DP Fox Sports & Entertainment, operator of the Griffins and Rampage, is presented with the 2001 Best in Community Service - Small Business award at the 13th Annual Better Business Bureau of

Western Michigan's "Best in Business" awards luncheon.

November 13, 2001

6,841 fans, including more than 2,500 high school and elementary students from 39 schools, watch the Griffins defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first non-holiday weekday matinee (noon) in AHL history.

November 14, 2001

Several hundred fans attend a public Griffins practice held in the evening at Ewingleben Ice Arena on the campus of Ferris State University in Big Rapids.

December 7, 2001

During a dramatic 5-4 come-from-behind win over Chicago, the Griffins wear specially designed patriotic jerseys to honor Pearl Harbor and the victims of September 11. The jerseys gross a record \$23,587 during a post-game auction for Big Brothers Big Sisters.

January 24, 2002

Griffins and Detroit Red Wings hold a joint press conference at The B.O.B. in downtown Grand Rapids to announce a five-year affiliation agreement (2002-03 to 2006-07). Red Wings general manager Ken Holland and assistant GM Jim Nill are present for the announcement, made before an overflow crowd of media and sponsors.

February 9, 2002

Defenseman Julien Vauclair becomes the first active Griffins to participate in the Winter Olympics when he suits up for Switzerland in 3-3 tie with France. Vauclair notches one shorthanded goal during the tournament and helps his country to a 2-1-1 record and an 11th place finish.

April 6, 2002

With a 3-2 victory at Chicago, the Griffins win the AHL's inaugural Bud Poile Trophy as 2001-02 West Division champions.

April 11, 2002

Griffins head coach Bruce Cassidy is named the winner of the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award as the AHL's 2001-02 Coach of the Year.

April 17, 2002

Center Jason Spezza, the Ottawa Senators' first selection (second overall) in the 2001 NHL Entry Draft, makes his pro debut with the Griffins in their 2-1 loss in Game 3 of the Western Conference Quarterfinals at Chicago.

June 4, 2002

A throng of 2,500 fans turns out at Welsh Auditorium to see hockey's holy grail, the Stanley Cup, during a four-hour tour stop hosted by the Griffins and the City of Grand Rapids in conjunction with the National Hockey League.



June 25, 2002

Bruce Cassidy, the winningest coach in Griffins history, is named head coach of the NHL's Washington Capitals. He becomes the second-youngest head coach in the NHL and the second straight Griffins bench boss to advance to hockey's highest level.

September 5, 2002

Griffins introduce a subtle color change to their logo, new home, road and third jerseys, plus a dramatic billboard campaign in a media event on the floor of Van Andel Arena.

September 19, 2002

Led by Brett Hull's goal and shootout tally, the Red team downs the White squad 3-2 before a sellout crowd in the 2002 Red & White Game at Van Andel Arena. The event raises \$141,000 for the Griffins Youth Foundation and two other local charities.

October 29, 2002

Former Spartans Danton Cole and Bryan Adams return to East Lansing as the Griffins conduct an open evening practice for fans at Munn Ice Arena at Michigan State University.

December 2, 2002

Grand Rapids' team-record 16-game point streak (11-0-3-2) finally ends with a 5-3 loss at San Antonio, the Griffins' first regulation road loss of the season.

December 8-9, 2002

In a first-of-its-kind event, every Griffins player and coach takes turns skating with fans for one hour each, around the clock, as part of "The Great Skate." Held outdoors at Rosa Parks Circle in downtown Grand Rapids, the event raises \$12,000 for the Griffins Youth Foundation.

March 9, 2003

Thanks to losses by Rochester and Cincinnati, the idle Griffins claim the 2002-03 John Chick Trophy as champions of the Central Division. The title marks their second straight as AHL members and fourth consecutive overall, dating back to the 1999-00 IHL campaign.

April 2, 2003

With a 2-0 win at Utah, the Griffins earn the Western Conference regular season title, set an AHL record with their 26th road win, tie a league standard with their 57th road point, and equal a franchise mark with their ninth shutout overall.

May 2, 2003

Thanks to a 2-0 win at Chicago, Grand Rapids becomes the 11th team in AHL history to sweep the defending Calder Cup champions and advances to a conference final for the third time in four years.

May 19, 2003

Facing elimination and trailing Houston 3-1 in the second period, the Griffins rally for a dramatic 5-4 victory at the Compaq Center in the third double-overtime game in franchise history.

May 21, 2003

Griffins become just the third team in AHL history to win consecutive overtime games when facing elimination, taking a 2-1 win over the Aeros in Game 6 at Van Andel Arena.

May 22, 2003

In the first Game 7 in Griffins history, Houston defeats Grand Rapids by a 2-1 count to advance to the Calder Cup Finals. The Aeros eventually claim the championship in seven games over Hamilton.

June 6, 2003

DP Fox Sports and Entertainment is named one of West Michigan's 101 Best and Brightest Companies to Work For by the Michigan Business and Professional Association, in recognition of its human resource practices and standards of excellence.

September 18, 2003

Goals by Griffins forwards Hugo Boisvert and Nathan Robinson lead the Red Team to a 2-1 victory in the Detroit Red Wings 2003 Red & White Game. The capacity crowd of 10,834 at Van Andel Arena sees Red goalie Dominik Hasek stop all 15 shots he faces in a period and a half of work.

October 20, 2003

The Red Wings assign veteran NHL goaltender Curtis Joseph to Grand Rapids for conditioning during his rehabilitation from off-season ankle surgery.

October 24, 2003

Playing their first games for Grand Rapids, Jiri Hudler notches two goals and an assist, while Curtis Joseph makes 20 saves to lead the Griffins to a 4-1 win over Utah. The Van Andel Arena crowd of 8,031, bolstered by an estimated 2,800 fans who came primarily to see Cujo make his AHL debut, is the largest non-opening night October crowd for the Griffins since 1998.

December 9, 2003

In a day unprecedented in the Griffins' eight seasons, nine different players are involved in a total of 10 transactions. Decimated by injuries, the Detroit Red Wings recall Jiri Hudler, Curtis Joseph, Niklas Kronwall, Joey MacDonald (from ECHL Toledo, where he had been assigned earlier in the day) and Kevin Miller. Detroit assigns Nathan Robinson to Grand Rapids, while the Griffins sign Bujar Amidovski and Jeff Nelson and recall Paul Ballantyne from Toledo. By



day's end, four of Grand Rapids' top five scorers and eight members of the team overall find themselves in Detroit.

January 7, 2004

In their fourth-annual caravan event, the Griffins hold an evening practice for Lakeshore fans at the The Edge ice rink in Holland.

February 8, 2004

Griffins host the AHL All-Star Skills Competition, the first event of the 2004 Pepsi AHL All-Star Classic. PlanetUSA posts an 18-9 victory over the Canadian All-Stars, but Grand Rapids' Nathan Robinson suffers a pulled groin in the Fastest Skater competition.

February 9, 2004

Despite the presence of Jiri Hudler and captain Travis Richards on their roster, PlanetUSA drops a 9-5 decision in the AHL All-Star Game at Van Andel Arena. The event concludes a star-studded weekend in Grand Rapids, which welcomed several of hockey's all-time greats to town, including Scotty Bowman, Willie O'Ree, Grant Fuhr, Billy Smith, Joe Kocur and Adam Graves.

June 7, 2004

With the Tampa Bay Lightning's 2-1 win over the Calgary Flames in Game 7, Dmitry Afanasev and Darren Rumble become the first former Griffins players to win the Stanley Cup.

October 18, 2004

Griffins host their fifth annual caravan event, a public evening practice at the Georgetown Ice Center in Hudsonville, Mich.

April 12, 2005

Niklas Kronwall is named the winner of the Eddie Shore Award as the AHL's outstanding defenseman, becoming the first European-born player to earn the honor.

April 17, 2005

Griffins finish the season at 41-35-2-2 with a 3-2 defeat at Cincinnati, becoming the first team in the AHL's 69-year history to win more than 40 games and be excluded from the playoffs.

May 15, 2005

After scoring six points and helping Sweden to a fourth-place finish at the 2005 IIHF World Championship in Austria, Niklas Kronwall is named by the media to the tournament's all-star team. Others selected to the impressive sextet include future Hall of Famer Jaromir Jagr, four-time NHL All-Star Joe Thornton, and 2003-04 NHL goal-scoring leader Rick Nash.

October 19, 2005

Chris Osgood makes 22 saves in his Griffins debut, helping Grand Rapids take a 6-3 victory at San Antonio.

December 30, 2005

Assigned to the Griffins by the Red Wings for conditioning earlier in the day, Manny Legace makes 20 saves and earns an assist in Grand Rapids' 7-2 win over Hamilton.

February 26, 2006

Niklas Kronwall scores a goal at 13:24 of the second period of the gold medal game, helping team Sweden to a 3-2 victory over Finland in Turin, Italy. The defenseman becomes the first Griffins' alumnus to win an Olympic medal.

March 12, 2006

By scoring his 49th and 50th goals in a 7-3 win at Chicago, Donald MacLean becomes the 46th player in AHL history to reach the half-century mark and sets a team record with a seven-game goal streak.

March 23, 2006

Donald MacLean nets his league-high 53rd goal to capture the title of all-time leading single-season goal scorer in Grand Rapids pro hockey history.

March 31, 2006

Grand Rapids claims both the North Division and Western Conference regular season titles with a 5-4 overtime win at Manitoba, giving the team its record 11th straight win, its record-tying 53rd win of the season, and a best-ever mark of 12-1 for the month.

April 8, 2006

Grand Rapids sets a record with its 54th win and ties a club mark with its 113th point, thanks to a 6-0 win at Syracuse. Donald MacLean's five-point night is highlighted by his franchise-record fifth hat trick of the season, as his total of 56 goals ties for eighth in AHL history.

April 14, 2006

Donald MacLean is named the winner of the Les Cunningham Award as the AHL's Most Valuable Player, becoming the first Griffins to receive the honor. That night, the Griffins capture the Macgregor Kilpatrick Trophy as the AHL's regular season champions with a 4-2 win over San Antonio, increasing their franchise-record totals to 115 points and 55 wins, the third-most in league history.

April 21, 2006

Jiri Hudler's laser from the point at 2:21 of triple overtime ends the second-longest game in Griffins history and gives Grand Rapids a 6-5 win over the Toronto Marlies in Game 1 of the North Division Semifinals at Van Andel Arena.

May 16, 2006

Griffins stage the biggest comeback in their playoff history to beat Manitoba 5-4 in Game 7 at Van Andel Arena, propelling Grand Rapids into the Western Conference Finals. Facing a 4-1



deficit, the Griffins score four goals in the final 20:01, including Bryan Helmer's goal with 0.5 seconds left in the second frame, two third-period tallies by Valtteri Filppula, and Darryl Bootland's dramatic game-winner with 2:06 remaining. Jiri Hudler sets up each of the Griffins' five goals, setting a single-game franchise playoff record for assists and tying the mark for points.

May 24, 2006

The Griffins' record-setting 63-win season comes to an end with a 5-4 loss at Milwaukee, as Grand Rapids falls four games to none in the Western Conference Finals. Trailing 4-1 in the middle period, Darryl Bootland and Valtteri Filppula (two goals) score to tie the game before the second intermission, but the Admirals notch their AHL-record seventh shorthanded goal of the postseason just 21 seconds into the final period to claim the win. Each of the last three games in the series is decided by a single goal.

June 14, 2006

Defenseman Travis Richards, the last player remaining from the Griffins' inaugural 1996-97 squad, officially announces his retirement after 10 seasons with the franchise, during a party held in his honor at GP Sports restaurant in downtown Grand Rapids.

June 19, 2006

Carolina Hurricanes center Kevyn Adams, who appeared in every game for the Griffins during their inaugural 1996-97 season, becomes the third former Griffin in the last two seasons to earn a place for his name on the Stanley Cup.

Nov. 24, 2006

Griffins retire Travis Richards' no. 24 jersey to the rafters before claiming a 6-4 victory over the Chicago Wolves. The first Griffin to receive the honor, Richards is honored during a second intermission ceremony alongside his family, and was presented with a vacation to Disney World.

April 14, 2007

Griffins and Detroit Red Wings announce an agreement in principle to extend their affiliation through the 2011-12 season.

May 1, 2007

Griffins lose their first-ever Game 7 played on the road, ending their season with a 4-1 loss at Manitoba.

February 8, 2008

In his first American Hockey League contest since 1993, Darren McCarty records an assist and earns third-star honors in his Griffins debut, as Grand Rapids scores three power play goals and a shorthanded tally to defeat the Lake Erie Monsters 4-1 in Cleveland.

February 15, 2008

Darren McCarty provides fans with one of the most memorable nights in Griffins history during his home debut by scoring a hat trick and earning the first four-point night of his 16-year career. After scoring 5:53 into the first period, 2:17 into the second and 2:45 into the third to ignite the throng of 10,062 into an ovation lasting nearly five minutes, he caps off his four-point evening with a helper on Grand Rapids' final goal during a 6-3 win over the Lake Erie Monsters.

June 4, 2008

Nine former Griffins - Valtteri Filppula, Darren Helm, Jiri Hudler, Tomas Kopecky, Niklas Kronwall, Brett Lebda, Darren McCarty, Derek Meech and Chris Osgood - hoist the Stanley Cup by virtue of Detroit's six-game triumph over Pittsburgh.

July 23, 2008

Curt Fraser is named the eighth head coach in Griffins history, bringing 18 years' experience as a head coach, assistant coach and player in the National Hockey League to his new role.

Oct. 14, 2008

Aaron Downey and Darren Helm join their former Red Wings teammates for a visit to the White House, where President George W. Bush honors the 2008 Stanley Cup Champions during a ceremony in the East Room.

Dec. 5, 2008

At 46 years of age, Chris Chelios makes his Griffins debut during a conditioning assignment and becomes the oldest player in the 73-year history of the AHL. Over nine thousand fans come out to witness Chelios earn an assist in the Griffins' 3-2 overtime loss to Toronto.

Dec. 20, 2008

Prior to a 2-0 win over the Milwaukee Admirals, the Griffins welcome Grand Rapids resident Bernie Loomans as the 4 millionth fan in team history to pass through the turnstiles. As the lucky fan, Mr. Loomans is presented with a prize pack including a Griffins jersey with the numeral "4" and the nameplate "MILLION" on the back; four lower-bowl tickets to every Griffins home game during the ensuing four million seconds; a gas card to travel four million feet; four million Zimbabwean dollars; four million microliters of Pepsi; four million milligrams of Van Anstel Arena popcorn; forty "100 Grand" candy bars; four days of recognition on the griffinshockey.com splash page; and a four-second standing ovation from Griffins fans during the on-ice ceremony.



Jan. 29, 2009

Aaron Downey becomes the 100th former member of the Griffins to skate in the National Hockey League when he takes a shift during the first period of the Detroit/Dallas game at Joe Louis Arena.

April 26, 2009

The Griffins win a playoff series for the first time ever as the lower seed, knocking off Hamilton 4-2 in the North Division Semifinals.

June 12, 2009

Thanks to Pittsburgh's 2-1 win over the Red Wings in Game 7 at Joe Louis Arena, Penguins defenseman Mark Eaton becomes the 13th former member of the Griffins to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup.

Oct. 1, 2009

Kyle Quincey plays his first game as a member of the Colorado Avalanche, which becomes the 30th and final NHL club for which a former Griffin has played since the team's inception in 1996.

Oct. 21, 2009

Nineteen-year NHL veteran Michael Nylander is assigned to the Griffins by the Washington Capitals for conditioning.

Feb. 3, 2010

2008 Stanley Cup champion Andreas Lilja makes his Griffins debut while on a conditioning stint from the Red Wings.

Feb. 17-18, 2010

Sergei Kolosov (Belarus) and Ole-Kristian Tollefsen (Norway) make their debuts at the 2010 Vancouver Games, becoming two of only four players in franchise history to participate in the Olympics as active Griffins.

March 4, 2010

Brad May, a veteran of 1,041 games in the NHL, plays his first-ever AHL contest, as a member of the Griffins at Peoria.

Feb. 28, 2010

Valtteri Filppula becomes the second Griffins alumnus to win an Olympic medal, thanks to Finland's 5-3 win over Slovakia in the Bronze Medal Game in Vancouver.

June 9, 2010

For the third straight year and the fifth time in the last six seasons, a former Griffins player secures a spot for his name on the Stanley Cup, as Chicago's Tomas Kopecky becomes the first alumnus to win the Cup twice.

June 23, 2010

Former Griffins and current Red Wings goaltender Jimmy Howard, previously named a runner-up for the NHL's Calder Memorial Trophy as outstanding rookie, is named to the NHL's All-Rookie Team.

June 30, 2010

Bob Kaser, the Griffins' vice president of community relations and broadcasting, wins the AHL's James H. Ellery Memorial Award in the radio category, in recognition of his outstanding coverage of the league.

Aug. 27, 2010

Curt Fraser signs a new two-year contract to remain the Griffins' head coach through the 2011-12 season.

Nov. 24, 2010

The Griffins set a franchise record for penalty minutes with 118 in a 3-1 loss at Toronto that featured 218 combined PIM and 16 fighting majors. The previous mark of 104 had been set 13 seasons earlier, on April 11, 1998 versus Quebec.

Nov. 27, 2010

In the AHL's highest scoring contest since March 29, 1996, the Griffins defeat the host Chicago Wolves by a 10-8 score, marking the highest scoring game in franchise history. Grand Rapids ties a team standard for goals scored in a game and sets a mark for goals in one period, scoring seven in the second frame. Tomas Tatar sets franchise records for most points in a game (7) and highest plus/minus (+7) while tying the mark for assists (5).

Jan. 29, 2011

Curt Fraser overtakes Danton Cole for most games coached in Griffins history when he steps behind the bench for regular season game No. 209, a 3-2 victory at Peoria.

Feb. 27, 2011

Logan Pyett becomes the first defenseman in Griffins history to record a hat trick, accomplishing the feat in a 5-2 win at Hamilton. He records all three goals within a span of 11:06 in the second period, becoming just the fifth player in team history to score three goals in one frame.

June 15, 2011

Boston Bruins center Chris Kelly becomes the 14th former Griffin to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup, as the Bruins defeat the host Vancouver Canucks 4-0 in Game 7.

June 22, 2011

After serving 15 seasons as the only general manager in Griffins history, Bob McNamara announces that he will not return for the 2011-12 season.

Sept. 27, 2011

The Red Wings host their first Red & White intrasquad game in Grand Rapids since 2003. A crowd of 10,174 fills Van Andel Arena to watch former Griffins Valtteri Filppula and Jiri Hudler score a pair of goals each to lead Team Red to a 6-4 victory over Team White.



Oct. 18, 2011

Joey MacDonald paces the Griffins to a 3-0 victory over the Hamilton Bulldogs. MacDonald makes 31 saves to become the first goalie in franchise history to reach 100 wins while also breaking a tie with Jimmy Howard for most games played by a Grand Rapids goalie with his 187th career appearance.

Feb. 9, 2012

The Griffins announce that they will face the Toronto Marlies at Comerica Park in Dec. 2012, marking their first-ever outdoor game. Later set for Dec. 30, the game will be part of the Detroit Red Wings' "Hockeytown Winter Festival," a series of NHL alumni, junior, college, high school and youth contests that will lead up to the much-anticipated 2013 NHL Winter Classic between the Red Wings and Toronto Maple Leafs at Michigan Stadium on Jan. 1.

Feb. 18, 2012

The Griffins partner with the Van Andel Institute (VAI) for their first-ever "Purple Game" against the Peoria Rivermen. Nearly everything at Van Andel Arena is in sync with the color associated with cancer survivors, headlined by four-year-old Clayton Kendall, a two-time cancer survivor from Grant, Mich., who drops the ceremonial first puck before the game. Other purple game elements include special purple jerseys, stick tape and skate laces worn by the Griffins; 10,000 purple t-shirts and 2,500 white and purple rally towels given away before the game; purple concession items; purple VAI logos embedded in the arena's ice surface; a "purpled out" Griffins web site, Facebook page and Twitter page; and purple game production elements, including songs, videos and graphics.

March 7, 2012

The Griffins and Red Wings announce a five-year extension of their affiliation agreement, ensuring that the relationship between Michigan's premier hockey teams will continue through at least the 2016-17 season. The new agreement benefits the Griffins in several ways, most notably by transferring all responsibility for player and hockey operations decisions to the Red Wings.

March 17, 2012

Gustav Nyquist tallies two goals and one assist in a 5-3 win over the Hamilton Bulldogs to give him sole possession of the franchise rookie scoring record. Nyquist would be recalled to Detroit for the rest of the season, finishing his record-setting season with 58 points (22-36—58) in just 56 games.

April 6, 2012

The American Hockey League names Chris Minard the Griffins' first-ever winner of the Fred T. Hunt Memorial Award as the player who best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship, determination and dedication to hockey. Minard missed the Griffins' first 36 games of the season while dealing with the continuing after-effects of a concussion suffered during the 2009-10 season. He returned to capture Reebok/AHL Player of the Month honors for February and record three hat tricks during his shortened season.

June 18, 2012

The longest-tenured head coach in Griffins history becomes the third to earn a promotion to the NHL, as the Dallas Stars hire Curt Fraser as an assistant coach. Fraser ends his four-year run in Grand Rapids as the franchise's all-time leader in both regular season games coached (316) and wins (146).

June 19, 2012

East Grand Rapids native Luke Glendening becomes the first player from Greater Grand Rapids to sign with the Griffins, inking an AHL contract for the 2012-13 season.

June 25, 2012

The Red Wings announce that Jeff Blashill will become the ninth head coach in Griffins history and move to Grand Rapids after serving as the assistant coach for Detroit in 2011-12. Born in Detroit and raised in Sault Ste. Marie, Blashill brings a strong connection to the state of Michigan, having made stops at Ferris State and Western Michigan before joining the Red Wings organization.

Griffins Media Information

CREDENTIALS: Members of the media must email requests for single-game credentials to the Griffins public relations office no later than 24 hours prior to game time. The names of individuals covering the game must be specified. Freelancers must provide proof of assignment. Credentials will be left at the media (service) entrance on the southeast side of Van Andel Arena. Pre-game information and notes (via flash drive), between-period statistics, out-of-town scores and final statistics will be made available. Media displaying game credentials will also have access to the Griffins media room, the press box and both home and visiting team dressing rooms.

Credentials will not be issued to family members, non-working media, or anyone not associated with accredited media organizations. Requests for credentials received on game day will not be granted. Season credentials will be granted only to print, television and radio media members who cover the Griffins on a regular basis.

Individuals possessing official National Hockey League or American Hockey League credentials will be granted full access to the arena. Call or email the public relations office to reserve parking and press box seating.

PARKING: Limited reserved parking is available to media in Area 4 (behind the arena, across Oakes Street). To request parking, contact the public relations office by 5 p.m. ET the day before the game.

MEDIA ENTRANCE: The media will call table is located at the southeast service entrance of Van Andel Arena (off Ionia Street). Media, scouts and broadcasters must use this entrance on game nights and should be prepared to present photo identification if requested. Credentials are available from two hours prior to game time until 20 minutes before faceoff. After that time, credentials may be picked up at the public will call windows in the main (Fulton St.) lobby of the arena.

PRESS BOX: The press box at Van Andel Arena is located on the fourth floor above the upper-level suites on the east side of the building. It can be accessed by taking the elevator at the media entrance to level 3, then turning left and walking up the flight of stairs. The press box can seat a maximum of 36 people for Griffins home games, and all seating is assigned. Please call ahead to reserve seating. Media personnel requiring telephone access for filing purposes should notify the Griffins public relations office. Complimentary wireless Internet access is also available.

MEDIA ROOM: The media room at Van Andel Arena is a source of pre-game information and is located on the locker room (west) side of the building on the first floor. A limited number of telephones are available for media use in the media room and the press box.

MEDIA MEAL: Complimentary arena concession vouchers are available to all credentialed media and scouts. They may be obtained from the attendant at the media entrance from two hours prior to game time until 20 minutes before faceoff. After that time, please see the Griffins PR staff in the press box.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers wishing to cover Griffins home games should follow the aforementioned procedure for media, submitting their emailed request no later than 24 hours prior to game time. Photographers may shoot only from areas designated by the public relations office, and on a space-available basis. Freelance photographers must provide proof of assignment. Fans and others without photo credentials may not use cameras that extend over 80 mm, detachable lenses over 80 mm, or flash.

DRESSING ROOMS: Per AHL policy, players and coaches will be made available for interviews within the locker rooms after a 10-minute cooling-off period. The training room and weight room are off-limits to media personnel at all times.

INTERVIEWS: Requests for all Griffins player and coach interviews, pre-game or otherwise, should be made to the Griffins public relations office. Requests for interviews such as live shots on a game night should be made that day during the Griffins' morning skate (usually held at 10 a.m. ET at Van Andel Arena). Please do not enter the Griffins locker room unless accompanied by a Griffins public relations staff member.

PRACTICES: Griffins practices are held at either Van Andel Arena or at Griff's IceHouse at Belknap Park (30 Coldbrook Road NE) and are open to the media. Consult the public relations office for exact dates and times.

I. GREAT SKATE WINTERFEST - JAN. 12-13, 2013


The Great Skate debuted in 2002 as a 24-hour ice skating marathon held at the outdoor Rosa Parks Circle Ice Rink in downtown Grand Rapids, with every Griffins player and coach skating for at least one hour around the clock with fans. In 2009, the event expanded into a two-day, 34-hour Winterfest, with skating, winter sports demonstrations, games and activities as part of a celebration

of winter in our city. The 2013 Winterfest will begin at noon on Saturday, Jan. 12 and conclude with The Great Skate, which will run from 10 p.m. on Jan. 12 until 10 p.m. on Sunday, Jan. 13. II. GROWING WITH THE GRIFFINS

In conjunction with partners such as Helen DeVos Children's Hospital, Belle Tire and Dean Foods, Growing With The Griffins supports Grand Rapids-area youth hockey programs and the Griffins Youth Foundation. III. PUT A LID ON IT

The Griffins, in recognition of the importance of wearing helmets during bicycling and other outdoor activities, eagerly take that message to the streets and kids of West Michigan. Helen DeVos Children's Hospital is the presenting sponsor of Put A Lid On It, whose ultimate goal is to help prevent brain and neurological injuries among pre-K through middle school children. In

In one of the most unique events anywhere involving a professional sports team, the Griffins each season play a friendly but spirited game of sled hockey with and against the Grand Rapids Sled Wings, a talented team of physically challenged children and young adults sponsored by the Griffins Youth Foundation in partnership with Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Hospital. This season's eighth-annual game will again benefit both the Griffins Youth Foundation and the Sled Wings.



VII. TIP-A-GRIFFIN - NOV. 13, 2012

A fan favorite returns for the 2012-13 season, as Griffins players and coaches will visit all four Uccello's locations in West Michigan to serve food and wait tables, with tips and proceeds benefiting the Griffins Youth Foundation. In its six previous editions, Tip-A-Griffin has raised nearly \$60,000 for various local charities.



VIII. REDS, WHITES & BREWS - FEB. 19, 2013

Last season, the Griffins hosted their inaugural Reds, Whites and Brews wine and beer tasting benefit for Easter Seals Michigan at the Goei Center. Griffins players served craft beer and wine samples to over 150 guests, who also enjoyed live music and hors d'oeuvres.

IX. PUPS AND PUCKS FALL WALK-A-THON - OCT. 15, 2012

The Griffins will hold their fifth annual Pups and Pucks Fall Walk-a-Thon at Mackenzie's Animal Sanctuary in Lake Odessa, as Griffins players, coaches and front office staff walk rescued dogs for pledges. Presented by Beene Garter LLP, the event invites all animal lovers to attend – with or without a dog to walk – and enjoy a host of activities that include live music, a BBQ dinner, hay rides and a K-9 costume contest. The event raises approximately \$15,000 annually for Mackenzie's, the Midwest's largest no-kill sanctuary.





X. GRIFF'S READING GOALS

Twice each season, the Griffins reward young readers through the Griff's Reading Goals program. In cooperation with the Kent Intermediate School District and the Ottawa Area Intermediate School District, special bookmarks are distributed to Pre-K through eighth grade students, offering rewards for every hour that they read. Local businesses offer prizes for the first and second hours of reading, while kids who total three hours of reading receive two free tickets to a select Griffins game.



XI. GRIFFINS GIVE BACK

XIV. BETTER HALVES

Introduced in Dec. 2003, players' wives and girlfriends team up to assist the Griffins in their community endeavors. OUR MISSION

Established in 1995, the Griffins Youth Foundation promotes academic excellence, community involvement and healthy lifestyles among the youth of West Michigan, enhancing their lives through hockey and ice-related sports.

The foundation was formed by Dan DeVos, co-owner and president of the Grand Rapids Griffins, and his wife, Pam, a year before the team began play. In conjunction with partners such as the Griffins, the City of Grand Rapids, Davenport University, Grand Valley State University, Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Hospital and Special Olympics, we offer a variety of programming to children throughout our community – many of whom are underprivileged, at-risk, underserved or have special needs – at our “home ice,” Griff’s IceHouse at Belknap Park.

For nearly two decades, we’ve worked to eliminate the high financial and logistical barriers that prevent children from playing hockey and related sports. The benefits gained by our kids and our community have been immeasurable: children involved in our programs are more likely to stay in school and out of trouble, and less likely to use drugs or get pregnant.

Through something as simple as hockey, we all benefit.



OUR KIDS

Nearly 325 kids play in our 1-2-3, 46er, middle/high school and girls hockey programs, and we support another 25 members of the Grand Rapids Sled Wings sled hockey team. With our fall 2012 expansion of the program to include grades 10, 11 and 12, kids now have the opportunity to play from first grade through the conclusion of high school.



Anyone interested in playing in the foundation’s programs is invited to submit a wait list application. Online and PDF versions of the application are available at griffinskids.org from April through August each year.

Our ranks of current and past players are filled with success stories, none larger than Tyler Anderson and Susie Kluting. A longtime member of the Sled Wings, Anderson also played three seasons (2009-12) for the U.S. National Developmental Sled Hockey Team and has his sights set on one day representing our country in the Paralympic Games. Kluting, meanwhile, is in her second season as a

member of the U.S. Women’s Sled Hockey Team.

OUR PROGRAMS

All programs are non-checking. Our season runs November through March.

Olympic Division (1-2-3)

Co-ed hockey instruction and games for first, second and third grade children.

Adams Division (46er)

Co-ed hockey instruction and games for fourth, fifth and sixth grade children.

Middle/High School Hockey

Co-ed hockey instruction and games for students in grades 7-12.

Hockey instruction and games for girls in grades 6-10, featuring an all-female coaching staff.

Sled Hockey

Co-ed hockey instruction and games for physically challenged youth. Sled hockey rules are virtually identical to traditional hockey, except participants are on bladed sleds.

The Grand Rapids Sled Wings, a team of physically challenged children and young adults, are sponsored by the foundation in partnership with Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Hospital. Since becoming the first junior-level sled hockey team in Michigan upon their founding in 2001, the Sled Wings have gained a national reputation through wins in various prestigious tournaments – including the 2012 national championship – and their continuing development of high-caliber players.

Open-Skating Programs

In addition to hockey programming, we offer various ice skating opportunities, including holiday lunch skates and Special Olympics speed skating.

Rosa Parks Circle

We also provide all the skates for Rosa Parks Circle Ice Rink, the downtown outdoor facility that draws over 20,000 visitors per year.





OUR EVENTS

Griffins Youth Foundation Golf Classic (Aug. 26, 2013) - The foundation's primary fundraiser has become one of the largest charitable events in West Michigan, bringing in \$75,000 annually. Held each August at the prestigious Egypt Valley Country Club in Ada, the tournament features Griffins players and coaches along with celebrities from around the hockey world. Past participants have included NHL veteran Mike Knuble and members of both the Detroit Red Wings and the 1980 "Miracle on Ice" U.S. Olympic Team.

Great Skate Winterfest (Jan. 12-13, 2013) - What do Griffins players, sled dogs, figure skaters, snowboarders, ice sculptors, zoo animals, horse-drawn carriages, winter sport athletes, museums, libraries, and local celebrities have in common? They're all part of the annual Great Skate Winterfest at Rosa Parks Circle in downtown Grand Rapids. This celebration of winter in our city begins with a host of winter-inspired events, sports demonstrations and family activities, then concludes with a 24-hour skating marathon. Every Griffins player and coach skates for at least one hour around the clock, joined by hundreds of fans. Donations and proceeds from the event have tripled in recent years, as it has grown into Grand Rapids' premier winter festival.



Griffins/ Sled Wings Game (Feb. 12, 2013) - In one of the more remarkable events you'll find involving a professional sports team, the entire roster of Griffins plays a friendly but spirited game of sled hockey with the Grand Rapids Sled Wings each year at Griff's IceHouse.

Hockey is just the start of what our kids learn. From College Night at local universities for our high schoolers, to educational programs, to community service projects and presentations on nutrition and exercise, their lessons extend well beyond the ice. Van Andel Arena

Located in the heart of Michigan's second-largest city, Van Andel Arena ranked as the second highest-grossing midsize arena worldwide during the 2000-2009 decade, according to *Billboard* magazine.

Completed in 1996, the \$75 million facility seats 10,834 spectators for ice hockey and has a maximum event capacity of more than 12,000, including 44 private suites. Van Andel Arena annually ranks among the top worldwide arenas in attendance, thanks to regular stops by performers such as Lady Gaga, Katy Perry, Kenny Chesney, Keith Urban and Kid Rock.

The rink surface is the standard North American hockey size (200' x 85'), although the dasher boards can be moved to expand the surface to international dimensions (200' x 100'). Thus, the Griffins' home is one of only a handful of arenas on the continent that can switch between the two ice sizes.

The arena's newer amenities include a state-of-the-art LED ribbon that encircles the arena on the façade of the upper deck, as well as the Amway "Section A" expansion of the arena's northwest concourse.

The Griffins' official team store, "The Zone," is located on the building's west side and carries an extensive selection of official team souvenirs and merchandise, including a number of items not available anywhere else. The store also serves as the primary ticket outlet for the Griffins.

Van Andel Arena is connected via skywalk to the Amway Grand Plaza Hotel, the JW Marriott, the Marriott Courtyard Hotel and other downtown Grand Rapids buildings. It also houses the Griffins' administrative and staff offices on its east side.
