LEADING OFF--The Travs go for a split of the six game series.

LOOKING BACK--Nolan Gorman hit three of Springfield's five home runs and the Cardinals dumped the Travs, 9-2...Gorman homered in his first three at-bats before walking and grounding out in his final two trips to the plate... Arkansas starter Devin Sweet gave up all five homers and seven runs total... Stephen Wrenn, David Masters and David Sheaffer each had two hits for Arkansas.

MORGAN MASHING--Josh Morgan extended his hitting streak to six last night after having a career night Friday with his first career two homer game and six RBIs...In the six game hit streak Morgan is slashing .385/.407/.769 with a double, three home runs and nine runs batted in in that time.

OKAY O'KEEFE--Catcher Brian O'Keefe has hits in 10 of his past 11 games...over that time he is 20-42 with four walks and a slash line of .476/.532/.881...he has two doubles, five homers and 13 runs driven in during that time including a four hit, six RBI game Wednesday night...has boosted his batting average to .343, third in the league, and is also fourth in slugging percentage and third in RBIs.

BOMBS AWAY--Through 34 games, including 17 in Dickey-Stephens Park, the Travelers have slugged 39 home runs, 16 at home...they are on pace to hit 138 homers in this year's 120 game season including 56 in their home ballpark...the overall total would be a Travs record for the Dickey-Stephens Park era (2007-present) despite this year's shortened schedule...the most homers by any Travs team in that time is 128 (in 140 games) by the 2008 squad...the current home pace would just top the number put up by that same 2008 team that went deep 55 times at DSP (in 70 games).

GONE, NOT FORGOTTEN--Travs manager Collin Cowgill has been away from the club since Thursday...hitting coach Joe Thurston has served as the acting manager for the weekend...Cowgill is expected back with the club when they return home on Tuesday.

YOU'RE TOO CLOSE--The Travelers victories in this series have made them 3-8 in their past 11 games decided by three runs or less...23 of their 34 games have been decided by three or less but they are just 9-14 in those contests including 1-6 in one-run games.

HITTING THE ROAD--The Travs are in a stretch where they play 24 out of 30 contests on the road through July 4...are 4-7 during this 30 game period... the only home games in that time are June 15-20 vs. Tulsa...Arkansas played 18 of their first 23 at home.

PROSPECTING--Arkansas has two of Seattle's top 30 prospects based on MLB pipeline rankings...INF Joe Rizzo is #28 and INF Jake Scheiner is #29.

SCOUTING SPRINGFIELD--The Cardinals (St. Louis Cardinals) came into this series after dropping four of six to the San Antonio Missions at home last week...managed by Jose Leger...they are second in the league in batting average but last in scoring...their pitching staff ranks dead last in ERA (6.48) and they have given up the most walks (155) and homers (45)... Springfield features two top prospects in INF Nolan Gorman and C Ivan Herrera...Gorman ranks #2 in the Cardinals system and #31 overall by MLB Pipeline while Herrera is #3 and #85...other players on the Springfield roster among the St. Louis top 30 include 1B Luken Baker (#14), OF Alec Burleson (#15), RHP Andre Pallante (#21), INF Brendan Donovan (#26), INF Delvin Perez (#27) and OF Nick Plummer (#30).

Tonight's Starter - 29 Tyler Herb

- Tyler Herb makes his fifth start of the season...has delivered a quality start each time out...fired seven shutout innings at Wichita last Sunday on six hits with a season best eight strikeouts as part of a combined shutout...also went seven innings in his prior start on 5/30 vs. Tulsa (6 H, 2 R, 2 BB, 5 K, HR)...went six scoreless innings (on 75 pitches) for a win on 5/23 at Corpus Christi allowing four hits and a walk with four strikeouts in a combined five-hit shutout
- Herb is pitching in Double-A for the 52nd time (all starts) in his career and 21st time with Arkansas...owns a 16-14 record and 3.43 ERA at this level
- Tyler signed with the Mariners in early May after being set to start the season with the independent Lancaster Barnstormers of the Atlantic League
- Did not pitch in 2020...spent 2019 as part of the Orioles organization...pitched for Double-A Bowie going 4-2 with a 3.95 ERA in 54.2 innings over 10 starts with 45 strikeouts and 20 walks...also pitched for Triple-A Norfolk going 4-8 with a 7.16 ERA in 76.2 innings over 16 games with 63 K, 37 BB and 20 HR
- Limited to 13 starts with Triple-A Sacramento in the Giants system in 2018 by injury...went 2-8 with a 5.35 ERA in 70.2 IP with 59 K and 20 BB
- Opened 2017 in the Travs rotation making 16 starts and going 6-4 with a 3.31 ERA over 98 IP (88 K, 30 BB), earning a Texas League midseason All-Star selection...traded to the Giants organization on July 3 in exchange for cash considerations...finished the year with Richmond (2.76 ERA, 65.1 IP, 48 K, 18 BB)
- In 2016, Herb made 11 starts at Double-A Jackson in 2016 (2-3, 5.04, 55.1 IP, 41 K, 27 BB) and 15 starts at Hi-A Bakersfield (7-3, 3.28, 85 IP, 93 K, 28 BB)
- Pitched at Low-A Clinton in 2015...was 7-8 with a 4.64 ERA in 27 starts...made 20 relief appearances (37.2 IP) at 3 levels in 2014
- 29-year old was drafted by Seattle in 2014 after playing four years at Coastal Carolina...went 22-9 over his career with the Chanticleers
