YESTERDAY: The Captains came from behind for the second straight night and rode a four-run eighth inning to a 4-2 win over West Michigan. Trailing 2-0 entering the eighth, the Captains rallied for four runs on four hits to take the lead. **Daniel Schneemann** put the Captains on the board with an RBI single off right-hander Xavier Javier. **José Tena** tied the score with an RBI double off lefty Jared Tobey. After the Whitecaps intentionally walked **Bryan Lavastida** to load the bases, Naranjo connected with a two-run single off Tobey to put the Captains ahead. **Kevin Kelly** held the Whitecaps scoreless on one hit and struck out three to nail down the save in the ninth. **Nathan Ocker** pitched two scoreless innings in relief for the win. Starter **Xzavion Curry** held the Whitecaps to two runs over six innings in his Classic Park debut, but did not factor in the decision. Javier took the loss for West Michigan after failing to record an out against the three batters he faced in the eighth, allowing three runs on two hits and one walk.

REDEMPTION: The Captains have won two straight games against West Michigan after being swept in a six-game series during their first meeting with the Whitecaps. At LMCU Ballpark in May, Lake County's offense averaged just 2.0 runs per game and slashed .179/.265/.235. **José Tena** was the Captains' lone offensive bright spot during the series, hitting .368 (7-for-19) with three doubles. The Captains' pitching staff posted a 5.07 ERA during the series. The Captains lost three games during the series by just one run.

HOME COOKIN': The home team has won each of the first eight games between the Captains and Whitecaps this season. West Michigan swept a six-game series against the Captains from May 25-30 at LMCU Ballpark. The Captains have won the first two games of this six-game series at Classic Park.

KEEPING IT CLOSE: Five of the first eight games between the Captains and Whitecaps have been decided by two runs or fewer, including four one-run games. The Captains are 2-3 in these close games (1-3 in the one-run games).

RED HOT JUNE: Since returning from a groin injury on June 1, **Quentin Holmes** has gone 10-for-23 (.435) with a home run, a triple, five RBI, three walks and three steals. **Brayan Rocchio** has a .964 OPS in June with three homers and four doubles. **José Tena** is hitting .313 (15-for-48) in June with four doubles, two triples and nine RBI. **Austen Wade** has a .448 on-base percentage, thanks to eight walks in nine games.

BRENNAN BASHING: Captains OF **Will Brennan** is tied for the High-A Central League (HAC) lead in doubles (15). He is also second in hits (39), tied for fourth in extra-base hits (18), fifth in batting average (.310) and 10th in OPS (.875).

ALUMNI UPDATE: 2018 Captains SS **Ernie Clement** became the 101st former Captain to reach the major leagues when he debuted for Cleveland on June 13. Nine former Captains have made their major league debuts this year – OF **Ka'ai Tom** (2016), RHP **Luis Oviedo** (2018-19), LHP **Sam Hentges** (2016), RHP **Louis Head** (2012-13), RHP **Nick Sandlin** (2018), INF **Ivan Castillo** (2014), **Jean Carlos Mejia** (2018) and RHP **Eli Morgan** (2018) and Clement. That ties the record for the most former Captains to debut in a single year, matching 2013 and 2016.

DEFENSIVE FLEXIBILITY: The Captains' have shuffled their infield defenders in 2021. Lake County has used four different first basemen, six different second basemen, six different third basemen and two different shortstops. **Raynel Delgado**, **Brayan Rocchio** and **José Tena** have each played three different infield positions. **Victor Nova** and **Daniel Schneemann** have played two different infield positions and left field.

YOUNGSTERS: The Captains have five of the 10 youngest players in the High-A Central League – 1B **Joe Naranjo** (20), INF **Aaron Bracho** (20), INF **José Tena** (20), INF **Brayan Rocchio** (20) and OF **George Valera** (20). Naranjo, Bracho and Tena are the three youngest players in the league. Naranjo, who turned 20 on Tuesday, is the youngest player in all of High-A. Bracho (born 4/21/00) is the second youngest in all of High-A. The Captains have eight players who are age 21 or younger.

LAST TIME OUT: Allen pitched a career-high 6.1 innings on Thursday at Fort Wayne. Through the first six innings, Allen held the TinCaps to one run on four hits. Allen came back out to pitch the seventh with the Captains leading, 3-1. In the seventh, the lefty surrendered a double, issued a walk and hit a batter to load the bases. He was lifted after recording the first out of the inning on a strikeout. Reliever **Alec Wisely** then allowed all three inherited runners to score on a sacrifice fly, a wild pitch and a double to put the TinCaps in front, 4-3. Allen ultimately did not factor in the decision because TinCaps left fielder Grant Little dropped a fly ball with two outs in the ninth that would have ended the game, but instead allowed **Austen Wade** to score the tying run from first. The Captains lost in 10 innings on a walk-off ground rule double by Justin Lopez.

COLLEGE ACCOLADES: Allen was named a Preseason All-American by several outlets ahead of the shortened 2020 season and was also named the 2020 Conference USA Preseason Pitcher of the Year. Allen racked up five C-USA Pitcher of the Week honors during his career, including in 2020 after pitching a seven-inning, one-hitter with 13 strikeouts against George Mason. Allen was twice honored with All-CUSA nods as a position player. He was named as a utility player on the All-CUSA 2nd Team as a freshman and on the All-CUSA 1st Team as a sophomore. He was named a Freshman All-American by three different outlets in 2018.

TEAM USA: In 2019, Allen became the first FIU Panther ever selected to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

2020 DRAFT: Cleveland selected Allen in the second round (56th overall) of the 2020 draft, which was shortened to five rounds. Allen was Cleveland's third selection in the draft, following SS **Carson Tucker** (1st Round – 23rd overall) and RHP **Tanner Burns** (CBA Round – 36th overall).

TWO-WAY: Allen was a two-way player at Florida International University, playing first base when he wasn't pitching. He was even named to the All-CUSA 2nd Team as a freshman and the All-CUSA 1st Team as a sophomore, both as a utility player. In three seasons at FIU, Allen played 50 games at first base. He batted .297/.362/.410 (.773 OPS) during his career with six home runs, eight doubles and 23 RBI. As a freshman, when Allen played the most as a two-way player, he posted a career-best .390 OBP.

NOT THAT LOGAN ALLEN: Allen shares the same name as Cleveland's big league left-hander **Logan Allen**. The younger Allen said last year, "he reached out to me after the draft, and we talked... It's really funny. Maybe there can be some marketing possibilities one day."

PREVIOUSLY DRAFTED: Originally drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the sixth round of the 2016 draft out of University High School (Orange City, FL).

COLLEGE COACH: Allen has known his college coach, Mervyl Melendez, since he was five years old. Allen played "Pony Baseball" and travel baseball with Melendez's oldest son. Melendez helped coach the boys from a young age. "We consider [Logan] very dear to our family and he's like another son to me." Logan's brother, Hunter, also played college baseball for Melendez at Alabama State from 2014-16 (Hunter is now the assistant softball coach at FIU).

CHANGEUP: Allen's changeup – a circle change grip – is regarded as his best secondary pitch. According to his college coach, Mervyl Melendez, who coached Allen in youth baseball (see "College Coach" note above), the development of that changeup goes back to Allen's youth. Melendez said he did not allow Allen to throw anything but a fastball and a changeup (no curveballs) until Allen was 12 years old. *MLB.com's* scouting report of Allen's changeup notes "his changeup is his bread and butter, a potentially future plus circle change he sells really well with good fade and sink that misses bats and elicits weak contact on the ground."

DELIVERY: Eric Longenhagen of *FanGraphs* notes Allen's athleticism as a two-way player has helped him maintain a "well-balanced, repeatable delivery." Allen's college coach, Mervyl Melendez, who also coached Allen in youth baseball (see "College Coach" note above), says of Allen's delivery "when [Logan] first started pitching at seven, you kind of saw the mechanical aspect of his pitching was a little bit more advanced than anybody else."
