Brayan Rocchio reached on an infield single but then got picked off of first and got in a rundown between first and second base. The ball was thrown into left field allowing Rocchio to get to second base. He scored a batter later on a José Tena single. Fort Wayne struck back in the bottom of the third with an unearned run after Rocchio made a throwing error at third base. In the sixth inning the Captains took the lead back when Will Brennan tripled and scored on a Rocchio sac-fly. They added another run to make the score 3-1 in the seventh on back to back doubles from Brayan Lavastida and Aaron Bracho. In the seventh Captains starter Logan Allen started to tire, exiting the game with the bases loaded and one out. On consecutive pitches the TinCaps tied the game on a sacrifice fly and a wild pitch. Dwanye Williams-Sutton doubled home a third run to give the TinCaps a 4-3 lead. In the top of the ninth the Captains were down to heir final out with a runner on first base. But a pop up to left field was dropped as Grant Little and Reinaldo llarraza converged on the ball for an error allowing Austen Wade to score from first and tie the game 4-4. The Captains failed to score in the tenth inning. In the bottom of the tenth the TinCaps had runners on first and second with two outs. Justin Lopez lofted a soft fly down the left field ine that dropped just fair out of the reach of Rocchio and bounced out of play for an automatic double. That allowed Ethan Skender to score from second base and give the TinCaps a 5-4 walk-off win.

TODAY'S STARTER: Tanner Burns makes his sixth start of the season. He enters with a 3.04 ERA after recording his first professional win and a career high six scoreless innings last Friday against the Dayton Dragons. If he qualified, he would sit fourth n the High-A Central League with 8.6 K/BB

APPLESAUCE: The Captains are 7-2 against the TinCaps with a +24 run differential (45-21). Lake County is slashing 256/.313/.430 (.743 OPS) with 10 home runs during the season series. José Tena leads the offense with a .355/.375/.677 slash ine (1.025 OPS), including three home runs. The Captains' pitching staff has a cumulative 2.09 ERA and has averaged 12.7 K/9 (114 K, 81.2 IP), while holding Fort Wayne to a .177 average.

COMING ALIVE: The Captains ended May by suffering a six-game sweep at West Michigan, in which they averaged just 2.0 runs er game. Since then, the Captains have averaged 5.1 runs per game and have gone 6-3 to open June. Joe Naranjo is 7-for-22 (318) with a team-leading seven walks for a .483 on-base percentage. Brayan Rocchio is 10-for-29 (.345) with two homers and four doubles for a .690 slugging percentage and a 1.065 OPS. Will Brennan is 11-for-36 (.306) with two homers, three doubles and a triple for a .611 slugging percentage and a .953 OPS.

WELCOME BACK: Since returning from a groin strain that kept him out from May 7 through May 31, OF Quentin Holmes has one 5-for-9 (.556) with three walks, two RBI and two runs scored. Holmes has a .667 on-base percentage in his return

BRENNAN BASHING: Captains OF Will Brennan leads the High-A Central League (HAC) league in doubles (12). He is tied for ourth in batting average (.309), and 11th in OPS (.878).

SWING AWAY: The Captains' offense has walked just 122 times this season. That is the second-fewest in the High-A Central eague. The Captains also have two of the nine lowest BB% rates among qualified hitters in the High-A Central League – Brayan Rocchio (4.0% - 1st), José Tena (5.9% -8th).

100: 2018 Captains RHP Eli Morgan became the 100th former Captain to reach the major leagues when he debuted for Cleveland on May 28. Eight former Captains have made their major league debuts this year – OF Ka'ai Tom (2016), RHP Luis Oviedo (2018-19), LHP Sam Hentges (2016), RHP Louis Head (2012-13), RHP Nick Sandlin (2018), INF Ivan Castillo (2014), Jean Carlos Mejia (2018) and Morgan. The record for the most former Captains to debut in a single year is nine (2013 and 2016)

DEFENSIVE FLEXIBILITY: The Captains' have shuffled their infield defenders in 2021. Lake County has used four different first paseman, six different second baseman, six different third basemen and two different shortstops. Raynel Delgado, Brayan Rocchio and José Tena have each played three different infield positions. Victor Nova and Daniel Schneemann have played two different infield positions and left field.

LAST TIME OUT: Burns set a career high with six innings against the Dayton Dragons last Friday. He set down the first eight Dragons to come to the plate including five strikeouts in the stretch. . The Captains offense supported Burns with two runs on a Will Brennan RBI double in the third inning. After standing runners on second base in the third and fourth Burns worked a 1-2-3 fifth to match his career high. In the top of the sixth Burns allowed a bunt double down the first base line to start the inning. After a lineout to third base, a single but runners on the corners with two outs. Burns induced a groundball to second base and the Captains turned an inning ending double play to complete the day for Burns. The Captains got insurance with solo home runs from Brayan Rocchio and Mike Amditis before tacking on four eighth inning runs on six singles. Dayton gave the Captains a scare with four runs in the top of the ninth but Kevin Kelly halted the comeback to give the Captains an 8-4 victory and notch Burns first professional win.

COLLEGE ACCOLADES: After a solid freshman campaign, Burns broke through in 2019 and was named a third team All-American by Perfect Game. Prior to the 2020 season Burns was Named Preseason All-SEC, Preseason All-America by Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, D1 Baseball and Perfect Game. In just four games in 2020 Burns was off to a hot start striking out 12.9 per nine innings and had a 3-1 record with a 2.42 ERA.

TEAM USA: In 2018, Burns was selected to the USA Collegiate National Team. Burns appeared in four games allowing five runs over 7.2 innings. He allowed nine hits, struck out six and walked one. Also on the team were back to back first overall draft picks Adley Rutschman (2019) and Spencer Torkelson (2020).

2020 DRAFT: Cleveland selected Burns in the CBA round (36th overall) of the 2020 draft, which was shortened to five rounds. Burns was Cleveland's second selection in the draft, following SS Carson Tucker (1st Round – 23rd overall).

PREVIOUSLY DRAFTED: Originally drafted by the New York Yankees in the 37th round of the 2017 draft out of Decatur High School (Decatur, AL).

MR. ALABAMA: Burns was named Mr. Alabama his senior season of high school. Along with being one of the top pitchers in the state he hit .467 with 16 homers, 10 doubles, four triples and 46 RBI as a senior in High School.

RECRUITING BATTLE: A highly sought after recruit in Alabama, Burns originally committed to the University of Alabama but decided to weigh other options when Crimson Tide Head Coach Mitch Gaspard resigned in 2016, eventually committing to Auburn. Burns grew up an Alabama fan and only committed to the Tide's arch-rival Auburn due to Head Coach Butch Thompson's experience developing pitchers. He says he took a lot of heat for committing to Auburn from friends he grew up with.

STAR MENTORS: While at Auburn, Burns had a variety of people with great track records to learn from. Auburn Head Coach Butch Thompson has had 16 of his former pitchers make the big leagues including 10 since 2014. He previously worked as the Associate Head Coach and Pitching Coach at Mississippi State. Among the stars coached by Thompson is 2018 number one overall pick Casey Mize. Burns worked closely with Mize at Auburn, and was throwing partners with Mize during his freshman year of 2018. He took over the premier role in the rotation from Mize, operating as the teams Friday night starter in 2019 and 2020. Tim Hudson joined Thompson's staff in 2020 as a volunteer assistant and pitching coach, also getting the chance to mold Burns' game. The former Auburn great and 17 year MLB veteran worked with Burns for a short time in 2020 before the season was shortened but Burns says the two will have a relationship for the rest of his life.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT: Kevin Goldstein of FanGraphs says Burns brings "big stuff out of a small package" with good secondary pitches to go with solid velocity (sits 93-94) on his fastball. Eric Logenhagen, also of FanGraphs, describes Burns as "an org based bet." Logenhagen sees Burns as someone who's future value mostly revolves around Cleveland's recent ability to develop pitchers. "I've always been a little lower on him due to his middling velocity and projectionless frame, but he executes his secondary stuff very consistently" Logenhagen said. Baseball America sites Burns offspeed pitches as potential plus pitches, especially his curveball and slider. Burns earns praise for his dedication, makeup and desire to learn.
