YESTERDAY: The Captains won their third straight game, and sixth of their last seven in a 3-2 victory over the Fort Wayne TinCaps on Wednesday. Xzavion Curry made his Lake County debut on the mound for the Captains and tossed five scoreless innings. He worked out of trouble in the second, third and fifth innings, stranding four TinCaps in scoring position across his five innings. The Captains got on the scoreboard in the top of the second inning when Aaron Bracho launched a solo home run to left field for his fourth long ball of the season. In the fifth Lake County added another run when Quentin Holmes drove home Mike Amditis with an RBI single. In the sixth inning the TinCaps tied the game 2-2 with three soft hits, a walk and a hit by pitch issued by Jared Janczak. Lake County took the lead for good in the seventh inning. With two outs Daniel Schneemann reached on an error and stole second base. That set the table for Holmes who delivered his fourth hit of the game on a sharp single to center-field to score Schneemann and give the Captains a 3-2 lead.

TODAY'S STARTER: Logan Allen makes his sixth start of the season. He leads the league in ERA (1.63), and is third in WHIP (0.90). Allen is also seventh in the league in K/9 (11.4), fourth in BB/9 (1.63), fifth in K% (33.7%), fifth in BB% (4.8%) and fourth in K/BB% (28.8%). The Captains are 4-1 in games Allen has started, with the only loss occurring on a 1-0 walk off balk to the West Michigan Whitecaps.

APPLESAUCE: The Captains are 7-1 against the TinCaps with a +25 run differential (41-16). Lake County is slashing .266/.323/.444 (.767 OPS) with 10 home runs during the season series. José Tena leads the offense with a .370/.393/.741 slash line (1.134 OPS), including three home runs. The Captains' pitching staff has a cumulative 2.00 ERA and has averaged 11.2 K/9 (101 K, 72 IP), while holding Fort Wayne to a .170 average.

COMING ALIVE: The Captains ended May by suffering a six-game sweep at West Michigan, in which they averaged just 2.0 runs per game. Since then, the Captains have averaged 5.1 runs per game and have gone 6-2 to open June. Joe Naranjo is 7-for-22 (.318) with a team-leading seven walks for a .483 on-base percentage. Brayan Rocchio is 9-for-25 (.360) with two homers and four doubles for a .760 slugging percentage and a 1.167 OPS. Will Brennan is 9-for-31 (.333) with two homers, two doubles for a .548

WELCOME BACK: Since returning from a groin strain that kept him out from May 7 through May 31, OF Quentin Holmes has gone 5-for-9 (.556) with three walks, two RBI and two runs scored. Holmes has a .667 on-base percentage in his return

BRENNAN BASHING: Captains OF Will Brennan is tied for the High-A Central League (HAC) league lead in doubles (11). He is fifth in batting average (.305), and 17th in OPS (.853).

SWING AWAY: The Captains' offense has walked just 119 times this season. That is the fewest in the High-A Central League. The Captains also have two of the nine lowest BB% rates among qualified hitters in the High-A Central League - Brayan Rocchio (4.2% - 2nd), José Tena (6.1% -10th).

100: 2018 Captains RHP Eli Morgan became the 100th former Captain to reach the major leagues when he debuted for Cleveland on May 28. Eight former Captains have made their major league debuts this year – OF Ka'ai Tom (2016), RHP Luis Oviedo (2018-19), LHP Sam Hentges (2016), RHP Louis Head (2012-13), RHP Nick Sandlin (2018), INF Ivan Castillo (2014), Jean Carlos Mejia (2018) and Morgan. The record for the most former Captains to debut in a single year is nine (2013 and 2016).

DEFENSIVE FLEXIBILITY: The Captains' have shuffled their infield defenders in 2021. Lake County has used four different first baseman, six different second baseman, six different third basemen and two different shortstops. Raynel Delgado, Brayan Rocchio and José Tena have each played three different infield positions. Victor Nova and Daniel Schneemann have played two different infield positions and left field.

YOUNGSTERS: The Captains have five of the 10 youngest players in the High-A Central League – 1B Joe Naranjo (20), INF Aaron Bracho (20), INF José Tena (20), INF Brayan Rocchio (20) and OF George Valera (20). Naranjo, Bracho and Tena are the three youngest players in the league. Naranjo, who turned 20 on Tuesday, is the youngest player in all of High-A. Bracho (born 4/21/00) is the second youngest in all of High-A. The Captains have eight players who are age 21 or younger.

LAST TIME OUT: Allen equaled his career high with six innings last Wednesday against the Dayton Dragons. Aggressive baserunning helped the Dragons get on the borad in the first inning. After a leadoff single, Jacob Hurtubise took off for second and the pitch got away from Mike Amditis allowing Hurtubise to make it all the way to third base. He came home to score on a Michael Siani single. After three scoreless innings from Allen he was tagged for a two-run homer from Francisco Urbaez in the top of the fifth to give the Dragons a 3-1 lead. The Captains responded with two runs in the fifth to tie the game. After Allen worked a scoreless sixth inning, Will Brennan belted a three-run home run in the bottom of the frame to give the Captains a 6-3 lead and give Allen the win.

COLLEGE ACCOLADES: Allen was named a Preseason All-American by several outlets ahead of the shortened 2020 season and was also named the 2020 Conference USA Preseason Pitcher of the Year. Allen racked up five C-USA Pitcher of the Week honors during his career, including in 2020 after pitching a seven-inning, one-hitter with 13 strikeouts against George Mason. Allen was twice honored with All-CUSA nods as a position player. He was named as a utility player on the All-CUSA 2nd Team as a freshman and on the All-CUSA 1st Team as a sophomore. He was named a Freshman All-American by three different outlets in 2018.

TEAM USA: In 2019, Allen became the first FIU Panther ever selected to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.

2020 DRAFT: Cleveland selected Allen in the second round (56th overall) of the 2020 draft, which was shortened to five rounds. Allen was Cleveland's third selection in the draft, following SS **Carson Tucker** (1st Round – 23rd overall) and RHP **Tanner Burns** (CBA Round – 36th overall).

TWO-WAY: Allen was a two-way player at Florida International University, playing first base when he wasn't pitching. He was even named to the All-CUSA 2nd Team as a freshman and the All-CUSA 1st Team as a sophomore, both as a utility player. In three seasons at FIU, Allen played 50 games at first base. He batted .297/.362/.410 (.773 OPS) during his career with six home runs, eight doubles and 23 RBI. As a freshman, when Allen played the most as a two-way player, he posted a career-best .390 OBP.

NOT THAT LOGAN ALLEN: Allen shares the same name as Cleveland's big league left-hander **Logan Allen**. The younger Allen said last year, "he reached out to me after the draft, and we talked... It's really funny. Maybe there can be some marketing possibilities one day."

PREVIOUSLY DRAFTED: Originally drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the sixth round of the 2016 draft out of University High School (Orange City, FL).

COLLEGE COACH: Allen has known his college coach, Mervyl Melendez, since he was five years old. Allen played "Pony Baseball" and travel baseball with Melendez's oldest son. Melendez helped coach the boys from a young age. "We consider [Logan] very dear to our family and he's like another son to me." Logan's brother, Hunter, also played college baseball for Melendez at Alabama State from 2014-16 (Hunter is now the assistant softball coach at FIU).

CHANGEUP: Allen's changeup – a circle change grip – is regarded as his best secondary pitch. According to his college coach, Mervyl Melendez, who coached Allen in youth baseball (see "College Coach" note above), the development of that changeup goes back to Allen's youth. Melendez said he did not allow Allen to throw anything but a fastball and a changeup (no curveballs) until Allen was 12 years old. *MLB.com*'s scouting report of Allen's changeup notes "his changeup is his bread and butter, a potentially future plus circle change he sells really well with good fade and sink that misses bats and elicits weak contact on the ground."

DELIVERY: Eric Longenhagen of *FanGraphs* notes Allen's athleticism as a two-way player has helped him maintain a "well-balanced, repeatable delivery." Allen's college coach, Mervyl Melendez, who also coached Allen in youth baseball (see "College Coach" note above), says of Allen's delivery "when [Logan] first started pitching at seven, you kind of saw the mechanical aspect of his pitching was a little bit more advanced than anybody else."
