THE 21ST SEASON OF CURVE BASEBALL: The Curve finished with a losing record and missed the playoffs for the first time since 2014. Altoona qualified for the Eastern League postseason in each of the previous four seasons, which matched the longest streak in franchise history. The Curve tied a franchise record with five straight wins to start the season and started the year 6-2 before a six-game losing streak. The club rebounded to finish April at 12-12 and stood 22-20 at the start of a long road trip to New Hampshire, Portland and Trenton. On that trip from May 21-30, the club went 2-7 and eventually fell to a season-low five games under. 500 (24-29) after a loss at home on June 2. The team then surged for five weeks with a 25-10 roll from June 3-July 13, including wins in 7 of 8 entering the All-Star Break for the second-best record in the league over that period and climbed to a season-best 10 games over (49-39). However, Altoona went 21-33 after the break, the second-worst record on the circuit. Four straight wins over Akron in the final home series of the season pushed the club two games over .500 heading into the final series of the season at Harrisburg, but the Curve lost all four contests.

SPLIT WHILE YOU'RE AHEAD: For the first time since joining the Eastern League in 1999, the Curve experienced a splitseason playoff format. The last time the E.L. used the split season for playoff qualification was in 1982 at the end of a fiveyear run from 1978-82. The league also implemented a split-season during the 1934-35, 1958 and 1975 seasons. The First Half ended on June 18 with Harrisburg five games better than the Curve in the Western Division while the Eastern Division ended in a tie between Reading and Trenton. Trenton had the better intra-division record and was awarded the tie-breaker due to zero games against Reading in the half. The same situation occurred in the Western Division Second Half standings when Bowie and Erie finished tied without playing a game from June 19-September 2. Bowie had the better intra-division record to reach the playoffs while Reading ultimately beat out Trenton in the Eastern Division.

YEAR OF THE PITCHER: Eastern League pitchers handcuffed hitters to a .238 league-wide batting average, the lowest since 1971 when the league average was .234. Since the E.L. became a Double-A circuit in 1963, the league average has finished under .240 just six times: 2019 (.238), 1971 (.234), 1968 (.219), 1967 (.228), 1966 (.234) and 1965 (.236). The league's batting champion, Portland's C.J. Chatham, finished with a .297 batting average and is just the second batting champ in E.L. history to finish under .300 (.294, Tony Torchia in 1968). Eight no-hitters were thrown in 2019, including two against the Curve on April 29 at PNG Field by Erie's Casey Mize and August 1 by Brian Keller of Trenton at ARM & HAMMER Park, which was the most hitless efforts in the E.L. since a league-record nine were thrown in 1967. Teams were held to 3.92 runs per game making it the first season below 4.0 runs per game since 1990. Strikeouts also spiked to 8.7 SO/9 IP, the highest ratio in league history going back to the earliest data available in 1965. Despite the increased number of strikeouts by the league as a whole, the Curve's 964 punch outs were the fewest among full-season teams in Minor League Baseball.

RYAN'S REIGN: Indiana, Pa. native **Michael Ryan** returned for a third season and became the winningest manager in Curve history with his 214th victory on August 18 over Bowie. Ryan finished the season with a 221-197 record as Altoona's manager and was the fastest to reach the 200-win milestone in his 365th game on July 12 in Erie. After three seasons guiding the Curve, Ryan's .529 winning percentage finished third-highest in team history. During his seven-year managerial career in the Pirates developmental system, Ryan went 501-466 while leading his teams to the playoff sour times, went 13-6 in playoff games and captured the 2016 Florida State League Championship with A-Adv. Bradenton and 2017 Eastern League Championship with the Curve.

HEROES OF THE ZEROES: Curve pitchers set a team record with 18 shutouts in 2019, which also led the Eastern League. The club tossed back-to-back scoreless games on three occasions and pitched eight shutouts over the last 25 games of the season. The club witnessed individual nine-inning, complete-game shutouts from **Sean Brady** on August 23 at Bowie and **Domingo Robles** August 26 versus Akron that tied and surpassed the previous team record of 16 scoreless games pitched by the 2015 Curve. Brady and Robles' performances are the first multiple nine-inning, individual shutouts to be pitched by the Curve in the same season since Tom Gorzelanny threw two in 2005. **James Marvel** and Robles also threw seven-inning, complete-game shutouts to total four individual shutouts over the course of the season, matching the 2000 season for the most in team history. Robles stands with Gorzelanny (2), Stephen Sparks (2) and Ian Snell (3) as the only pitchers in club history with multiple complete-game shutouts in their Curve careers.

ALL-AROUND OLIVA: Jared Oliva was one of the Eastern League's steadiest performers in 2019. He was honored as an End-of-Season All-Star and the 2019 Altoona Curve Most Valuable Player. After batting .188 through his first 40 games, Oliva surged from June 3 through the end of the season to hit .277 and finished sixth in the league's batting race. From June 3 until the end of the year, Oliva led the E.L. with a .320 (97/303) batting average over 82 games with league-highs in on-base percentage (.387) and hits (97). He also led the league in hitting during the Second Half (.325) and finished with the fourth-highest batting average after the All-Star Break (.301). From a defensive standpoint, Oliva's 114 games in the outfield and 291 total chances were each the most in Minor League Baseball by an outfielder that did not commit an error.

SUMMER CATCH: Curve catchers **Arden Pabst** and **Jason Delay** appeared behind the plate in all 140 games in 2019. Pirates catcher Francisco Cervelli caught seven innings on August 11 during a Major League Rehab Assignment before Delay caught the final two innings of the game at PNG Field. Altoona was one of just four teams in Minor League Baseball to play the entire season with the same catching tandem while A-Adv. Wilmington (Royals), Class A Clinton (Marlins) and Class A Greensboro (Pirates) also had one of their two catchers behind the plate in every game.

GLOVE TRAIN: For the second straight season and third time in the last four years, the Curve led the Eastern League in fielding percentage at .982. The club also led the circuit with 134 double plays, the second-most at the Double-A level.

SHINING STARS: The Curve sent three players to the Eastern League All-Star Game in Richmond on July 10: right-handed pitchers Pedro Vasquez and Beau Sulser joining catcher Jason Delay. Sulser was selected to join the Western Division roster after James Marvel was promoted to Triple-A Indianapolis after he was originally selected as a mid-season all-star.

AWARDS SEASON: The Curve's season awards were announced on August 29 before the team's final home game of the season, Awards were presented to Jared Oliva (Most Valuable Player), Pedro Vasquez (Co-Pitcher of the Year), Beau Sulser (Co-Pitcher of the Year), Matt Eckelman (Fireman of the Year) and Brett Pope (Unsung Hero of the Year).

PROSPECT WATCH: The 2019 Curve roster featured six of MLB.com's Preseason Top 30 Pirates prospects: **Oneil Cruz** (No. 4), **Jared Oliva** (No. 12), **Clay Holmes** (No. 23), **Stephen Alemais** (No. 26), **Cody Bolton** (No. 27) and **Gage Hinsz** (No. 30), and also featured seven of *Baseball America's* Preseason Top 30 Pirates prospects: Cruz (No. 3), Holmes (No. 17), Oliva (No. 19), Bolton (No. 21), Alemais (No. 26), Hinsz (No. 28) and **Dario Agrazal** (No. 29). Hinsz broke camp with the team but spent the entire season on the injured list while Holmes appeared in two games on MLB rehab. This year's Curve team had four of MLB.com's Top 30 prospects at the end of the season rankings, including: Cruz (No. 3), Oliva (No. 11), Bolton (No. 13) and **Blake Cederlind** (No. 28). Cruz started the year ranked by *Baseball America* as their No. 79 overall prospect while MLB.com ranked him at No. 96 overall and boosted him up to No. 58 at the end of the season.

ROAD TO THE SHOW: 13 former Curve players made their MLB debuts during the 2019 season, including nine with the Pirates. The list included: **Connor Joe** (2017 Curve) on March 28 for the Giants, **Jason Martin** (2018 Curve) on April 6 for the Pirates, **Cole Tucker** (2017-18 Curve) on April 20 for the Pirates, **Bryan Reynolds** (2018 Curve) for the Pirates on April 20, **Taylor Hearn** (2018 Curve) for the Rangers on April 25, **Montana DuRapau** (2015-18 Curve) for the Pirates on May 9, **Harold Ramirez** (2016 Curve) for the Marlins on May 11, **Geoff Hartlieb** (2018 Curve) on May 18 for the Pirates, **Josh Smith** (2015-15 Curve) on May 25 for the Indians, **Mitch Keller** (2017 Curve) for the Pirates on May 27, **Dario Agrazal** (2017-19 Curve) for the Pirates on June 15, **Luis Escobar** (2018 Curve) on July 13 for the Pirates and **James Marvel** (2018-19 Curve) for the Pirates on September 8.

ROSTER RUNDOWN: The Curve roster featured 53 players and 103 transactions were made. Nine players spent the entire season on the Double-A roster: Jason Delay, Yeudy Garcia, Angel German, Bralin Jackson, Bligh Madris, Jared Oliva, Arden Pabst, Brett Pope and Jerrick Suiter. 23 players got their first Double-A experience while 25 others were returning Curve players, including Clay Holmes and Francisco Cervelli on MLB Rehab Assignments. Aside from two rehabbers, four players with prior MLB experience spent time with Altoona in 2019: Vicente Campos, Tom Koehler, Gift Ngoepe and Darnell Sweeney. The average age of the club was 24.2 with Oneil Cruz (20) as the youngest and Cervelli (33) the oldest.

EVERYBODY LOVES CURVE BASEBALL: Peoples Natural Gas Field welcomed 308,464 fans over 67 dates in 2019, the highest total attendance since 2008 (346,973). The 2019 season also broke the 300,000-fan barrier for the first time since 2015 (302,761). With an average attendance of 4,604, the Curve saw an uptick at the turnstiles for the third consecutive season. On July 4, 8,806 fans saw the Curve beat the Erie SeaWolves in walk-off fashion and accounted for the ninth-largest regular-season attendance total in the franchise history. Three total dates exceeded 8,000 fans (8,074 on May 8, 8,806 on July 4 and 8,656 on August 11) while two other games had crowds larger than 7,000 (7,013 on August 17 and 7,038 on August 29).

2019 MONTHLY NOTES

APRIL

OPENING DAY ROSTER: Altoona's Opening Day roster included 14 players that spent time with the Curve in 2018 while 17 players had prior Double-A experience. Five players (**Dario Agrazal, Jake Brentz, Yeudy Garcia, Logan Hill and Tate Scioneaux**) were on the roster to start the year for a second consecutive season. Seven members of the club opened the season with the Curve for their first Double-A experience. There are 13 pitchers and 12 position players on the team. 19 of the 25 players were originally drafted or signed by the Pirates.

OPENING DAY NOTES: The Curve started the campaign against Akron for just the third time in Altoona's 21-year history and for the second straight season. With a 5-0 win at Canal Park, the Curve improved to 10-11 in season openers to extend a franchise-record winning streak on Opening Day to three.

OPENING DAY STARTER: Right-hander **James Marvel** was chosen as the Opening Day starter, the second time he had taken the ball in a season opener for his club. His performance on April 4 at Akron set the tone for a the 2019 Pittsburgh Pirates Minor League Pitcher of the Year. Marvel's six one-hit, shutout innings with nine strikeouts and zero walks was the best in franchise history, matching Opening Day team records with the most innings pitched, fewest hits allowed and most strikeouts. He also earned the winning decision, just the fifth Opening Day starter for Altoona to do so.

SWEEP VICTORY: Altoona swept their season-opening series in Akron, winning the four games by a combined score of 17-8. It marked the first four-game sweep in Akron in franchise history.

THE STREAK: The Curve extended their winning streak to five games with a 6-3 victory in Erie to start their second series of the year. The club's 5-0 start tied a franchise record for the most consecutive wins to begin a season, which was accomplished by the 2006 Curve. The five-game winning streak was Altoona's longest of the entire season and ended in a 4-3 defeat in the team's sixth game. They would lose the finale of their first road trip before coming home with a 5-2 record.

HOME SWEET HOME (OPENER): Peoples Natural Gas Field opened with a Curve victory and extended the team's winning streak in home openers to three, all against the Akron RubberDucks. Over the franchise's 21-year history, the Curve are 16-5 in their first home game of the season and have won eight of their last 10 openers dating back to the 2010 season. The Curve and RubberDucks were tied, 1-1, through nine innings and the game lasted 12 frames. The hero was **Bligh Madris**, who sent the first Altoona crowd of the season home with a walk-off single that lifted the Curve to a 3-2 win.

BACK TO EARTH: After a record-tying 5-0 start to the season, the Curve lost eight of their next nine games and six straight contests from April 13-18. The team was outscored 44-21 over that nine-game stretch that also saw the team lose five of their first six home games.

OWEN'S OPEN: Third baseman **Hunter Owen** had one of the strongest April's in franchise history. His seven home runs and 20 RBIs were each the most by a Curve player through the first month of the season since Brad Eldred hammered 10 home runs and knocked in 22 RBIs in April 2005. The rest of the Curve hit a total of five homers compared to Owen's seven, which was second-most in the league. He was also named Eastern League Player of the Week for April 22-28 when he led the league with three homers, seven runs scored and seven extra-base hits while he batted .417 (10/24).

AN A-MIZE-ING DEBUT: The first overall draft pick in the 2018 draft by the Detroit Tigers, Casey Mize, was called up to Double-A Erie and made his debut on April 29 at PNG Field. The right-hander from Springville, Ala. threw a nine-inning no-hitter against the Curve on 98 pitches with seven strikeouts and one walk. Mize hit his first batter of the game before he rolled up a double play three pitches later. He faced the minimum until he walked **Bligh Madris** with two outs in the seventh inning and retired each of his last seven batters. Mize's dominant performance was the first individual, nine-inning no-hitter ever pitched at PNG Field.

WHY WALK WHEN YOU CAN DRIVE: Outfielder Bligh Madris had 91 plate appearances and led the Eastern League with 29 hits over his first 21 games through April 28. He batted .326 over that period and did not draw a single walk. He had the most plate appearances without a walk at the time of his first free pass on April 29 and drew at least one walk in each of his next six games.

APRIL RECAP: The Curve finished 12-12 over the first month of the year, marking the ninth time in team history of a .500 record or better heading into May. Altoona stood in second place in the Western Division standings, 8.5 games behind Harrisburg (21-4 record in April). The offense ranked fourth in the league with a .239 batting average, hit 13 home runs for a sixth-place tie and scored the seventh-most runs (86) over the course of the month. The pitching staff ranked fourth in the league with a 3.13 ERA with a league-high five shutouts. Curve pitchers also struck out the fewest hitters in Minor League Baseball and also issued the fewest walks (54 in 207 innings) across the Minors during the first month.

MAY

NOT SO HOME SWEET HOME: Altoona was not a pleasant place to play for the Curve early in the year. The team went 5-10 and was outscored 72-49 in their first 15 home games and went 1-4 over the first five series. The Bowie Baysox made their first visit to Altoona on May 6-8 and took 2 of 3 by a combined score of 24-10, a series that kick-started Bowie's run to the Eastern League Championship Series. Altoona rebounded to win their last two home series in May and went on to a 34-22 record at home the rest of the season.

DELAY DOING DAMAGE: Catcher **Jason Delay** caught fire near the end of April and rode that momentum through the month of May. From April 23 through May 19, Delay batted .489 (23/47) and hit safely in 11 of 13 games, collected six multi-hit games, socked four home runs and delivered 16 RBIs. Over 16 games in May, he batted .339 (20/59) with four homers and 16 RBIs in 16 games.

LOGAN'S RUN: Outfielder Logan Hill compiled a 16-game on-base streak, the Curve's second-longest of the season, from May 2-19. Over that period, Hill reached base at a .478 percentage, the third-highest rate in the league, while he batted .407 (24/59), the second-best average in the league over that period. Hill also added 15 RBIs in those 16 games.

BIG COMEBACK IN BINGO: On May 15 in Binghamton, the Curve trailed 6-2 for most of the ballgame. However, Logan Hill and Hunter Owen each clubbed solo homers in the sixth inning before RBIs knocks by Mitchell Tolman and Hill put Altoona on top, 7-6, in the seventh. The Curve scored twice on a sacrifice fly from Jerrick Suiter in the ninth to open up a 9-6 lead, which turned out to be crucial after a two-run rally by the Rumble Ponies fell short in the ninth. That victory was the start of wins in 4 of 5 for the Curve and moved to within seven games of first before their longest road trip of the season.

OFF THE RAILS: Altoona's annual journey to New Hampshire and Portland included a stop in Trenton before the return home. The trek was scheduled to be a 10-game road trip from May 21-30 but was trimmed down to nine after rain impacted all three days in Trenton to end the trip. The Curve went 2-7 and lost the first five games on the trip. In Manchester, the Fisher Cats outscored the Curve 14-3 in a three-game sweep. In Portland, the Curve busted their five-game losing streak with a 7-2 win but Portland took the finale on Memorial Day when Tate Matheny hit a walk-off grand slam to lift the Sea Dogs to a 7-3 win. One game was finished in Trenton, a 5-6 loss to open the series, before a rain out forced a double-header on May 30. The game was suspended until July 30 with the Curve leading 6-0, which was the eventual final score.

MAY RECAP: The Curve went 12-16 in May, the first month that Altoona had a losing record since June 2017 and the first losing record in May since 2014. The club was 9.5 games behind first-place Harrisburg in the Western Division and tumbled to five games under .500 for the first time since 2016. Altoona's pitching staff turned in a 4.78 ERA, the highest in the Eastern League and ranked second-worst in the league with a 4.01 ERA at that point in the season. Offensively, the team hit .242, fifth in the E.L., with 17 homers, the fewest in the league. Through two month, the Curve offense had hit the fewest homers (30) and ranked fifth with a .241 average.

2019 MONTHLY NOTES

JUNE

BACK ON TRACK: After a tough month of May, June started with a bang. Altoona trailed, 3-2, at home in the bottom of the ninth inning. Logan Hill led off with a single to right and was lifted for Bralin Jackson to pinch run. Two pitches later, Hunter Owen sent a two-run homer into the left field seats for a walk-off, 4-3 victory. The walk-off blast was Altoona's lone walk-off homer of 2019, the first of Owen's career and his third walk-off hit. It was the first time since Bryan Reynolds' three-run, walk-off homer on July 26, 2018 that Altoona won on a walk-off home run with the team trailing when the game-winner was hit.

THE TURNING POINT: A late-inning comeback on June 3 at Erie propelled the Curve over the next five weeks. The SeaWolves led 4-1 after six innings and 8-3 after seven. Altoona scratched out a run in the eighth to pull the Curve within four. The first three hitters in the top of the ninth reached base and Logan Hill brought in the one on an RBI groundout. Two pitches later and two days removed from his late-inning heroics in Altoona, **Hunter Owen** tied the game on a three-run homer to left-center. Bligh Madris yanked the next pitch over the right field fence to put the Curve ahead, 9-8, in the blink of an eye. **Angel German** pitched a 1-2-3 bottom of the ninth to cap off one of the big-gest comeback wins of the season.

SPLITS-VILLE: For the first time in franchise history, the Curve's record reset to 0-0 after the conclusion of the First Half on June 18. Altoona won 11 of their last 14 games and pulled within 5.5 games of Harrisburg, who won the First Half to snap a five-year playoff drought.

BOUNTY HUNTER: Hunter Owen was one of the most lethal hitters in the league during the First Half before he was promoted to Triple-A Indianapolis on June 20. Upon his call up to Triple-A, Owen led the Eastern League with a .295 batting average, 15 homers, 45 runs, 70 hits, .565 slugging percentage and .934 OPS while he ranked fifth in on-base percentage at .367 and third with 44 RBIs. Owen reached 15 homers in 64 games, just one game shy of **Jordan Luplow**'s historic 63-game pace in 2017. **Josh Bonifay** reached the 15-homer mark in 2005 in just 55 games but he did not debut until April 18 and homered for the 15th time on July 3.

PITCHING THE LIGHTS OUT: Right-handed starting pitchers James Marvel and Pedro Vasquez were two of the Eastern League's best pitchers over each of their five June starts. Marvel paced the league with a 5-0 record and tied a frachise record for the most winning decisions in a month. His name is now next to Wilson Guzman (June 2000), Sam McConnell (June 2000) and A.J. Morris (May 2014) in the Curve Record Book. Marvel also led the league with 38 strikeouts in June and held a 2.21 ERA. As for Vasquez, he paced the cicuit with a 0.87 ERA and 0.74 WHIP while he went 3-0 with 30 strikeouts and just three walks over 31 innings.

REINFORCEMENTS: A pair of Florida State League All-Stars with A-Adv. Bradenton joined the Curve in mid-June and quickly became staples in the lineup. Infielder **Robbie Glendinning** was brought up to stay on June 13 and drove in 18 RBIs in his first 18 games, the fourth-most in the Eastern League. Glendinning totalled 27 RBIs in 49 games from June 14-August 7, ninth-most in the league before he missed the remainder of the season with a sprained ankle. Outfielder **Chris Sharpe** debuted with the Curve on June 21 and ranked among the league leaders through the rest of the season: second in runs scored (44), fifth in home runs (11) and fourth in RBIs (38).

JUNE RECAP: The Curve went 19-9 in June, which only trailed Bowie's 20-7 mark for the best Eastern League record in June. The Curve won 7 of 8 series and reached 19 wins in a single month for the eighth time in club history. Altoona led the league in pitching with a 2.78 ERA and pulled their season-long mark down to 3.57, seventh in the league, after the Curve staff ranked last in the E.L. with a 4.122 ERA entering play on May 16. The Curve bats ranked third in the league in hitting at .255 with the second-most runs scored (111) and hit a season-high 21 homers in June after just 30 were hit over the first two months of the season.

JULY

CHANGING THE NARRATIVE: Altoona clinched the season series over Akron after they took 2 of 3 in a tense, competive series at Canal Park from July 1-3. The Curve finished 6-1 at Canal Park in 2019 for the best record by the Curve in Akron in team history and just the fourth time they compiled a winning record in the ballpark, which held Altoona to a .396 winning percentage from 1999-2018.

INDEPENDENCE DAY: The Curve hosted their third straight game on July 4 at Peoples Natural Gas Field and 8,806 fans saw the Curve beat the Erie SeaWolves, 6-5, on a walk-off double by **Robbie Glendinning** in the 10th inning. Altoona's franchise improved to 9-12 on Independence Day and 7-8 in those games played in front of their home crowd. Glendinning's walk-off was the first in franchise history to occur on the Fourth of July.

COMIN' IN HOT: Altoona was the Eastern Leauge's hottest team entering the All-Star Break. From June 3 until the July 8-10 stoppage of play, went 23-9 thanks to the best team ERA in the league (2.84) over that period. In the standings, the Curve pulled within 2.5 games behind Bowie at the top of the Second Half standings but held the best overall record in the Western Division at 48-38.

THE SCORE IS WHAT MATTERS: The Curve won two games against the Erie SeaWolves on each side of the All-Star Break in which they struck out 35 times. On the final day before the Eastern League All-Star Break on July 7, the Curve were held to two hits, both from **Bligh Madris**, and struck out 17 times by SeaWolves pitchers. Despite tying a team record for the most offensive strikeouts in a nine-inning game, Altoona defeated Erie by a 3-2 score. In the second game back from the All-Star Break at Erie's UPMC Park, the Curve set a new record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game when Tarik Skubal, Nolan Blackwood and Trent Szkutnik fanned 18 Altoona hitters. The only score in the contest was a solo home run by **Logan Hill** in the fourth inning to give the Curve the victory.

TOLMAN AT THE TOP: After a lineup shuffle found **Mitchell Tolman** at the top of Altoona's lineup to start the Second Half, the second baseman was an on-base machine for several weeks. He reached base in 17 straight games, the longest on-base streak by a Curve hitter in 2019, from June 24-July 15. He was getting on base at a .429 clip, the third-highest rate in the Eastern League over that period.

ECK'S GON GIVE IT TO YA: Right-handed closer Matt Eckelman climbed up the career saves list throughout the season, including a couple of milestones in July. He became the second Curve pitcher to reach 30 career saves with Altoona on July 28 versus Richmond. It was his second attempt at No. 30 after he blew his only save of the season the night before on July 27. Eckelman set a franchise record with 26 successful save attempts from August 3, 2018 through July 17, 2019.

AN EARLY FALL: After the All-Star Break, the Curve did win another series for the remainder of July and lost 15 of 21. The skid reached a few games into August as the Curve went 7-18, the worst record in the Eastern League, from July 11-August 3. After the club's loss on August 3 at Reading, the Curve stood below .500 for the first time since June 8.

CRUZ CONTROL: Shortstop **Oneil Cruz** was promoted to Double-A Altoona and joined the Curve on July 30. Altoona picked up a May 30 suspended game that day in Trenton and Cruz made his Double-A debut when he was inserted into the lineup to replace the promoted Hunter Owen. The 6-foot-6, 20-year-old infielder became the tallest position player to ever play for the Curve and the 11th player to debut with Altoona at age 20 or younger. Cruz was ranked by Baseball America and MLB.com as Pittsburgh's No. 3 prospect and was the highest-ranked player to suit up for the Curve in 2019.

JULY RECAP: After a strong 7-2 start, the Curve closed the month of July with a record of 11-16. It became the first losing July for Altoona since 2011 and the third all-time. The team fell to fourth place and 11 games back in the Second Half standings with a 10-game gap between second-place Erie and third-place Harrisburg. Curve pitchers held a 3.91 ERA and ranked eighth with a 3.66 ERA overall. The offense scored the third-fewest runs (101) and also had the third-lowest batting average of .235 in July. For the season, Altoona ranked tied for last in the league in homers through July but ranked fifth in overall batting average at .243.

AUGUST/SEPTEMBER

SHUTOUT FEVER: Altoona pitchers teamed up on eight shutouts in August, which tied or bettered nine full seasons in team history. They did not pitch their first shutout of the month until August 8 and went on to lock up eight of their final 11 victories due to scoreless efforts by the pitching staff.

ROBLES ENDS ON A ROLL: Left-handed starter **Domingo Robles** dominated over his last five starts of the season from August 9-31. In those five starts, he threw two scoreless starts, each of which resulted in shutout victories, and held opponents to one run or less four times. He carried a 1.59 ERA (6 ER/34 IP), third-lowest in the Eastern League over that stretch, struck out 27 and had a 2-1 record. The highlight of his August run was a nine-inning, complete-game shutout on August 26 versus Akron, his second individual shutout of the season that set a new single-season franchise record for team shutouts. Robles was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for the final week of the season (August 26-September 2) after a 0.64 ERA that included his complete-game effort.

ZEROES FOR VIEAUX: Left-hander **Cam Vieaux** held the Eastern League's best ERA after he was brought back to Altoona to close the season. He allowed three runs in his final 26.1 innings for a 1.03 ERA over four starts. All three runs scored on August 24 at Bowie when Carlos Perez hit a three-run homer that broke up a no-hit bid with two outs. Vieaux pitched 20.1 scoreless Double-A innings from May 22-August 24 and 24.1 straight innings without a run allowed between Triple-A Indianapolis and Double-A Altoona from July 31-August 24. Vieaux started Altoona's home opener and the home finale on August 29, where he set a new career-high with 7.1 innings pitched and struck out 10 batters for the second time in 2019. He was able to lower his ERA to 2.23 and stands as the fifth-lowest, single-season ERA in franchise history.

CHANGING THE NARRATIVE, CONTINUED: The Curve closed out the season series with Akron in the same fashion in which it began: a four-game sweep. Altoona finished 14-4 against the RubberDucks, the second-best finish in the season series against the Akron franchise. The Curve went 36-24 against Akron during the 2017-19 seasons.

KING OF THE HILL: Logan Hill finished second on the club with 12 homers, one of three players to reach double figures in the home run department. Half of his homers were during a strong month of August to go with 22 of his 69 RBIs. Hill's 69 RBIs finished second in the league while he ranked seventh with a team-best 27 doubles and 42 extra-base hits. He also ranked seventh with a .760 OPS and eighth with a .428 slugging percentage. He was named Eastern League Player of the Week for August 12-18 by leading the leauge with three homers, nine RBIs, a .958 slugging percentage and 1.438 OPS while hitting .458 (11/24) over six games. Hill entered the season with the most home runs by any Pirates minor leaguer since 2017 and currently ranks tied for third with 49 blasts over the last three seasons, trailing only Mason Martin (60) and Hunter Owen (50).

POPE'S PROGRESS: Brett Pope was the 2019 Altoona Curve Unsung Hero of the Year as one of the most improved players on the team. The 23-year-old played in just 116 career games before he made the Double-A club out of spring training and he batted .169 over his first 30 games. Over his last 70 games after May 25, he raised his batting average to .252 by batting .286 (57/199) with 12 doubles, one triple, two homers and 18 walks for a .356 on-base percentage. After Pope batted .291 through the month of June, he hit a season-best .316 (24/76) with two homers in August and batted .296 (32/108) over his final 36 games since July 22.

JEKYLL AND HYDE: The Curve were really tough to beat at home over the last month of the season but were not the same on the road. Altoona went 12-5 and won 4 of 5 series at PNG Field. On the road, however, the club went 3-15 in August and September.

AUGUST/SEPTEMBER RECAP: Altoona closed the season 15-18 over their last 33 games. The Curve traveled to Harrisburg with a 69-67 record and needed just one win to clinch a .500 record, but they were swept over the final four games of the season by a combined score of 22-8. The Curve did not score a run in the two games in September. Altoona ranked 10th from a pitching standpoint in August and September with a 3.78 ERA. At the plate, the club ranked seventh in the league in hitting at .234.
