Aviators vs. Rainiers: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will host the Tacoma Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, tonight in game five of the six-game series in Triple-A West action at Las Vegas Ballpark (8,834)...Las Vegas is 3-7 on the season-long 12-game homestand (2-4 vs. Reno; 1-3 vs. Tacoma)...the series against the Rainiers will conclude tomorrow evening...following an off day on Wednesday, June 23, the Aviators will embark on a six-game road trip to Salt Lake City, Utah to face the Bees, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels, from Thursday-Tuesday, June 24-29.

Las Vegas defeats Tacoma 14-3 on Father's Day (Sunday, June 20):

The Aviators defeated the Rainiers 14-3 to snap their six-game losing streak in game four of the six-game series before a crowd of 5,726 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 16 hits and seven players recorded multiple-hit games. Second baseman **Nate Mondou** was 3-for-4, walk, solo homer, two runs scored. Third baseman **Vimael Machín** was 2-for-4, HBP, triple, 4 RBI, two runs scored; center fielder **Cody Thomas** was 2-for-5, three-run homer, two runs scored; right fielder **Greg Deichmann** was 2-for-3, three walks, four runs scored; DH **Frank Schwindel** was 2-for-4, SF, 3 RBI; left fielder/third baseman **Jacob Wilson** was 2-for-5, two-run home and shortstop **Pete Kozma** was 2-for-5, double, RBI.

Tacoma offense: The Rainiers recorded 9 hits and stranded six runners on base. Center fielder **Dillon Thomas** was 3-for-4 and second baseman **Jack Reinheimer** was 2-for-4, two doubles, RBI, run scored.

Las Vegas pitching: Right-hander **Daulton Jefferies** recorded the victory with 5.0 solid innings. He allowed 6 hits, 2 runs, issued no walks and struck out 4 on 82 pitches.

Reno defeats Las Vegas 16-4 in series finale (Tuesday, June 15): The Aces defeated Reyes de Plata 16-4 in the finale of the six-game series before a crowd of 5,619 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Tacoma defeats Las Vegas 11-7 in series opener (Thursday, June 17): The Rainiers defeated the Aviators 11-7 in the opener of the six-game series and game seven of the 12-game homestand before a crowd of 6,907 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 15 hits and scored four runs in the third inning to tie the game at 5-5. Third baseman **Jacob Wilson** was 4-for-5, three runs scored, two home runs, 4 RBI. Designated hitter **Austin Allen** was 2-for-4, walk, double and left fielder **Cody Thomas** was 2-for-4, walk, triple, RBI.

Tacoma offense: The Rainiers recorded 12 hits and broke the 5-5 tie with three runs in the fourth inning. Shortstop **Donovan Walton** was 3-for-6, double, RBI, run scored. Tacoma defeats Las Vegas 5-2 for second straight victory in series (Friday, June 18): The Rainiers defeated the Aviators 5-2 in game two of the six-game series and game eight of the 12-game homestand before a crowd of 7,690 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 7 hits and scored solo runs in the third inning on an RBI single by shortstop **Pete Kozma** (1-for-4) and a homer in the seventh by catcher **Austin Allen** (1-for-4). Left fielder **Luis Barrera** was 2-for-3, double, run scored.

Tacoma offense: The Rainiers recorded 10 hits and built a 4-0 lead after 2 1/2 innings. First baseman **José Marmolejos** was 3-for-4, RBI, run scored. Right fielder **Jarred Kelenic** was 2-for-5, RBI and left fielder **Luis Liberato** (1-for-4) hit a two-run homer in the second inning.

Tacoma defeats Las Vegas 5-3 for third straight victory in series (Saturday, June 19): The Rainiers defeated the Aviators 5-3 in game three of the six-game series and game nine of the 12-game homestand before a crowd of 8,357 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas offense: The Aviators recorded 10 hits and scored solo runs in the first, third and seventh innings. Designated hitter **Austin Allen** was 3-for-4 and first baseman **Frank Schwindel** was 2-for-4, 2 RBI, solo homer in the third. Shortstop **Pete Kozma** was 2-for-5, double, run scored and right fielder **Luis Barrera** was 2-for-5.

Tacoma offense: The Rainiers recorded 7 hits and broke the 2-2 tie in the seventh inning on a two-run homer by shortstop **Jack Reinheimer** (2-for-3, walk, double, 3 RBI, two runs scored). Second baseman **Donovan Walton** was 1-for-5 with a two-run single in the third inning.

AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas is 3-7 on the season-long 12-game homestand (2-4 vs. Reno; 1-3 vs. Tacoma)...the Aviators have hit at least one home run in **15** consecutive games (June 4 – present)...the six-game series against the Rainiers, Triple-A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners, will conclude tomorrow evening...Tacoma and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 18 times during the regular season...following an off day on Wednesday, June 23, Las Vegas will embark on a six-game road trip to Salt Lake City, Utah beginning on Thursday, June 24...the series against the Bees, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels, will conclude on Tuesday, June 29...*the 2021 season will feature six-game series against opponents from Thursday-Tuesday and off days on Wednesday...the 2021 season will also feature 120 games (60-home; 60-away).*

38 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE – The Aviators are playing in their 39th Triple-A professional baseball season in the Silver State (formerly the Pacific Coast League, 1903-2020) and currently as a member of Triple-A West...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

TRIPLE-A WEST: Formerly the Pacific Coast League (118 years, 1903-2020)...Triple-A West will consist of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **Western Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **Eastern Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Skeeters.

TRIPLE-A EAST: It will consist of three divisions for a total of 20 teams. **Midwest Division:** Columbus Clippers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. **Northeast Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse

Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **Southeast Division:** Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Gwinnett Stripers, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Norfolk Tides.

2020 SEASON – JUNE 30: Major League Baseball™ (MLB™) informed Minor League Baseball™ (MiLB™) that it will not be providing its affiliated Minor League teams with players for the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic...as a result, the Minor League Baseball season was canceled for the first time in its history...Minor League Baseball, which began as the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues, was founded on Sept. 5, 1901...**the 2021 season marks the 39th “calendar season” of Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball in the Silver State.**

2019 SEASON – The Aviators compiled the second-best record in the 16-team Pacific Coast League at 83-57 (.593)...Round Rock Express had the best record in the PCL at 84-56 (.600)...Las Vegas tied a franchise record for most road wins in a season with 44 (2002 team was 44-28, .611)...Las Vegas clinched its first PCL Playoff berth since the 2014 season (Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets)...Las Vegas lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the League Championship Series...the River Cats captured the PCL and the Triple-A championships...Las Vegas recorded 250 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563)...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,834-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark will provide a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site will be landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of Triple-A West (formerly the Pacific Coast League, PCL), and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Aviation History in Las Vegas (from McCarran Airport) - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

Nellis Air Force Base (in Las Vegas) is "Home of the Fighter Pilot" and home to the United States Air Force Warfare Center - the largest and most demanding advanced air combat training mission in the world. Crews do not come to learn how to fly, but instead how to be the **best combat aviators in the world!**

Las Vegas Ballpark 100% Capacity began on June 10: The Aviators announced on May 24 that Las Vegas Ballpark will operate at 100% capacity beginning with the third homestand of the 2021 season on Thursday, June 10 against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces.

Individual Game Tickets: Aviators individual game tickets for the remainder of the 2021 season (June 10 – September 14) went on sale on **Tuesday, June 1 at noon** pacific through Ticketmaster (www.ticketmaster.com).

Mask Policy: Due to CDC and state/local guidelines, masks will no longer be required for fully vaccinated fans at the ballpark.

Hospitality group areas, including suites, party decks and the pool area in right-center field are available by calling the Aviators administrative offices at **(702) 943-7200**.

Aviators on Radio in 2021: Russ Langer will broadcast all 120 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** and on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer is in his 21st season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-20...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2020, Langer also completed his ninth season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:

The “Aviators Home Radio Booth” was renamed the “**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**” prior to the 2013 season at Cashman Field (and currently at Las Vegas Ballpark) to honor the then-51s Special Assistant to the General Manager...“The Blummer” passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51^s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

Aviators Manager Fran Riordan: *****2019 PCL Manager of the Year***** ...was named the 25th manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 37 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 20 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past six seasons (2015-20).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 21 seasons (**current**) of 1,043-1,003 (.510).

2020: Riordan was involved with the Athletics 60-man player pool alternate site located in San Jose, Calif.

2019: He was named PCL Manager of the Year and led Triple-A Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL (83-57, .593) and the Aviators captured the Pacific Southern Division Championship. Las Vegas returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2014 and lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the conference championship series. The 83-57 record marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

2018: He made his Triple-A debut as manager with the Nashville Sounds of the Pacific Coast League and compiled an overall record of 72-68 (.514) and finished in second place in the American Southern Division to the PCL and Triple-A National Champion, the Memphis Redbirds...Nashville compiled a PCL-best 15-game winning streak from July 29 – August 14.
