Today's Matchup: The **Oklahoma City Blue (8-6)** wraps up the regular season with a matinee game against the **Santa Cruz Warriors [Golden State Warriors affiliate] (10-3)**.

Last Time Out: After falling behind by as many as 18 points in the game, free throws from Antonius Cleveland pulled Oklahoma City within one at 114-113 with 7.8 seconds on the clock before Cassius Winston hit two of his own to push the BayHawks lead back to three and the Blue were unable to convert on the other end.

An Award-Worthy Performance: Thunder Two-Way player Moses Brown was named G League Player of the Week for games played Feb. 15-21. Brown helped Oklahoma City to a 4-0 week, averaging 19.8 points, 15.0 rebounds, 2.3 blocks and 1.3 steals. He turned in a 24-point, 20-rebound performance on Feb. 16 versus the Mad Ants, his first career 20/20 game.

What Can Brown Do For You?: Oklahoma City Thunder two-way player Moses Brown has put in numerous strong performances this G League season, averaging 18.5 points, 13.9 rebounds and 1.77 blocks. He's turned in 10 double-doubles so far and set career highs in points (26 vs. CTN and vs. GBO) and rebounds (21 vs. ERI). His rebounds lead the league. He has an 18.8 offensive rebound percentage, and averages 7.5 second-chance points per game, which rank first and second in the league, respectively, and 14.3 points in the paint, which ranks fourth in the league.

Top Ranking: To start the 2020-21 season, Oklahoma City has players all over the leaderboards. Moses Brown leads the league with 13.9 rebounds per game, Xavier Simpson is averaging 6.3 assists per game, seventh in the league. Ömer Yurtseven is shooting 62.6% from the field, which is ninth in the league. Overall, the team is in the top-five of most statistical categories.

AC's Strong Open: Blue forward Antonius Cleveland scored the first 10 points of the season opener against the Salt Lake City Stars and scored 19 points in the second half. The 19 points are the fourth-most points scored in a half by a player in their debut with the Blue. Rob Edwards scored 18 points in the second half of the same game, which stands as the fifth-most points scored in half by a player in their debut with the Blue.

Next is Now: The Blue opens the 2020-21 season in a whole new world. The season is being held in Orlando, Fla. at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex. Eighteen teams, including 17 NBA G League teams and NBA G League Ignite, will each play 15 games from Feb. 10 – March 6 at Disney. The top eight teams from the 135-game schedule will advance to a single-elimination playoff, which will begin on March 8 and conclude with the NBA G Final presented by YouTube TV on March 11. The season will be held with players, coaches, team and league staff living on the NBA G League's campus, guided by comprehensive leaguelike health and safety protocols, which are based on the core principles of social distancing, mask wearing, hand hygiene and COVID-19 testing.

Standard of Excellence: Over the last four seasons, the Blue stands as one of the G League's best teams, putting together the second-best regular season record in that time (116-76, .604). The Raptors 905 lead the G League with a .627 win percentage in that time. Oklahoma City has advanced to the playoffs in three of the last four seasons, including a trip to the Western Conference Finals in the 2016-17 season.

Assignment of Confidence: To start the season, the Blue roster featured two Thunder assignment players, Ty Jerome and Aleksej Pokuševski, and its two two-way players, Moses Brown and Josh Hall, following the Thunder's longstanding emphasis on utilizing the G League as a hub for development. Brown, Hall and Pokuševski have each seen time in NBA games this season.

Gotta Swat 'Em All: Thunder rookie Aleksej Pokuševski has swatted a block in 13 of his 17 NBA appearances so far this season, good for the second-most among all players age 20 or younger. He currently leads Oklahoma City with 19 swats on the season despite being on G League assignment.

Three-efficient Basketball: In the 19-20 season, Oklahoma City ranked fifth in the league with a 47.8 percent field goal percentage, due in large part to its 36.0 three-point field goal percentage, which ranked 10th overall in the G League. Oklahoma City had four players shooting 40 percent or above from beyond the arc.

Give Me Three: On Feb. 4 vs. the South Bay Lakers, Oklahoma City set an all-time G League record with 32 made threes in the game. Previously the record was 31, held by the Stockton Kings (12/17/19) and the Reno Bighorns (1/31/15). Current Blue player Vincent Edwards contributed five, second most on the team.

Block Party: The Blue finished the 2019-20 season ranked fourth in the league with 5.83 blocks per game. In Oklahoma City's 12/7/19 game versus the Salt Lake City Stars, the Blue recorded 14 blocks, tied for most blocks in any G League game this season.

Balanced Blue: Oklahoma City's 19-20 roster featured a balanced offensive attack, with 10 players averaging double-digit scoring. Thirty-six of the team's games this season have featured five players scoring in double figures. The Blue has had at least five players score in double figures in 236 of 292 regular season games the past six seasons.

Investing in Development: The Oklahoma City Thunder has placed an emphasis on using its development team and investing in the development process. When Oklahoma City purchased its G League affiliate in 2008, it entered the season as one of just three teams to have a single affiliation with a G League club. Ten seasons later, all teams in the G League are in single affiliation with an NBA organization. Since the 2008-09 season, the Thunder has helped lead the way in using the G League as a place to develop and grow talent. The Thunder has also utilized its G League team for developing NBA coaches. The past four coaches of this team have received "call-ups" to the NBA ranks. Mark Daigneault (2014-19) was named Head Coach of the Oklahoma City Thunder on Nov. 11, 2020 after spending the 2019-20 season as an assistant on the Thunder bench. Darko Rajakovic (2012-14) is an assistant coach with the Memphis Grizzlies and began his career with the Thunder while Dale Osbourne (2011-12) is an assistant with the Portland Trail Blazers and Nate Tibbets (2009-11) works as Portland's Associate Head Coach.

Nothin' But a G Thang: Before the 2017-18 season, the NBA's development league took on a new identity as the NBA G League. Along with the new branding, conferences were realigned for the season. Oklahoma City remained in the Western Conference but transitioned to the Midwest Division along with the Sioux Falls Skyforce, Iowa Wolves and Memphis Hustle.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Blue trailed by as many as 35 points in the third frame but outscored the Raptors 33-26 in the fourth quarter and trimmed the deficit to 20 points with just over a minute to play.
- Four Blue players had double-digit games with Jaylen Hoard leading the team with his 12 points, five rebounds and three assists.
- Thunder assignment player Aleksey Pokuševski chipped in seven points and three rebounds while two-way player Moses Brown produced eight points and eight rebounds. Off the bench, Ömer Yurtseven dropped 10 points along with his seven rebounds.

Grant Gibbs enters his second season as head coach of the Oklahoma City Blue after being named to the position on August 2, 2019. He led the Blue to a 20-22 record, before the season was suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Gibbs spent two seasons as an assistant coach for the Blue. In his time on the bench, the team went 62-38 (.620) and advanced to the playoffs in both years.

Gibbs replaced Mark Daigneault as head coach of the Blue, who was elevated to the Thunder bench for the 2019-20 season before eventually being named head coach of the Thunder in November 2020.

Gibbs began his coaching career with the Blue after a three-year international playing career. He played in the Netherlands and Germany after graduating from Creighton with a degree in journalism.

The Iowa native began his collegiate career at Gonzaga then transferred to Creighton after two seasons with the Bulldogs. He played in 100 games and averaged 7.6 points, 5.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds as the Bluejays appeared in the NCAA tournament in each of his seasons with the team.
