Weekly Storylines:

- Fury FC have never lost against Indy at Michael A. Carroll Stadium. Ottawa has won all three matches in Indianapolis outscoring the Eleven 10-4
- Mauro Eustaquio scored his first-ever NASL goal against Indy Eleven on August 8, 2015 in a 4-1 win in Indy
- Sunday's loss against the New York Cosmos marked the first road loss for Ottawa since May 2, 2015 which was also the last time that the club lost two games in a row
- Ottawa's new loan-signing from Fluminense – Uruguayan midfielder Bryan Olivera – will be in the 18-man roster for Saturday's game where he could make his Fury FC debut
- Fury FC captured a 3-0 win over Indy Eleven in a pre-season fixture played in Arizona on March 2
- Indy Eleven have a few familiar faces in their squad that include former Fury FC midfielders Siniša Ubiparipović and Nicki Paterson as well as defender Colin Falvey
- Saturday's match is Indy Eleven's home opener

Scouting Indy: As they enter their third season in the NASL, with a new coach and several new faces in the squad, Indy Eleven will look to finally take that next step into the league's elite. Tim Hankison's side started the 2016 NASL campaign by picking up a point on the road as Indy played to a 0-0 draw against the Rowdies in Tampa.

Head-to-Head: Fury FC and Indy will face each other three times this season. Fury FC always had lot of success against Indy Eleven, as Ottawa won five of the six matches between the two teams in the last two years. Last time the two clubs met was August 8, 2015 and Fury FC collected the three points in that one with a convincing 4-1 victory at the Michael A. Carroll Stadium. MATCH PREVIEW:

Two years removed from their respective debuts as NASL expansion sides back in 2014, Ottawa Fury FC and Indy Eleven meet once again Saturday, now well-established members of the league both looking to take that next step forward.

After both sides finished their inaugural seasons with 27 points following up and down campaigns to find themselves near the bottom of the league tables, Fury separated itself from its expansion cousin last year, riding an incredible fall season to second place on the overall standings, a Fall Season title and a spot in the NASL Championship final. Indy, meanwhile, saw modest improvements over year one, finishing the year in ninth spot overall.

While Saturday's match marks the seventh time Ottawa and Indy will go head-to-head, both squads come into this one with new looks following busy off-seasons. With both teams featuring new coaches in Paul Dalglish and Tim Hankinson, they also have their share of new faces, though a few will be familiar to Ottawa supporters as former Fury players Siniša Ubiparipović, Nicki Paterson and Colin Falvey will be facing their former squad for the first time.

Though Fury FC didn't get the result they wanted in the club's season-opening match last Sunday in New York against the Cosmos, there were plenty of positives to take out of the loss to build on as the team looks to bounce back in Indy this weekend.

"If you look at the statistics from the game, we had as many shots as them, we had more corners, we had more crosses and for a large part of the game we were the better team," said Dalglish. "The difference is when you play a team at the level of the New York Cosmos, they will punish you for your mistakes and that's what they did. For us, to have played one of the best team in the league in our first game of the season, which gave us some things to work on, was hugely important for the long-term."

As Fury FC look for their first points of the season, Dalglish's side will play Saturday's match in a place they have had no shortage of success over two seasons. In fact, Ottawa remains perfect at Michael A. Carroll Stadium, winning all three games in Indianapolis over the last two seasons, outscoring Indy 10-4 in the process. But while Fury FC beat Indy Eleven 3-0 in a pre-season fixture on March 2nd, Marcel De Jong – who played 90 minutes against New York – knows that means next to nothing.

"Pre-season games and league games are always different," said De Jong. "Everybody is trying to put pieces together in pre-season but now that the season started it's another story. We will have to play the same game like we did in Arizona, put them under pressure, play nice football and if we do that it's going to be a positive day for us."

Meanwhile, Indy Eleven started its 2016 NASL campaign by picking up a point on the road in a 0-0 draw against the Tampa Bay Rowdies. The new look Eleven squad featured ten players making their Indy debut, including goalkeeper Jon Busch, who made three saves and claimed his first clean sheet with his new team. In addition to the former Fury FC trio, Indy Eleven also added midfielder Gorka Larrea during the offseason. The Spanish-born footballer played at Levante, Real Sociedad and Montreal Impact before joining Indy and he is expected to be a key component this year.

As players and coaching staff eagerly await this second game of the season, Paul Dalglish is confident that his team will be well prepared entering his side's next challenge.

"It's a bit better to prepare for this game than it was to prepare for New York," said Dalglish. "Having played Indy in pre-season, having seen their first game against Tampa and knowing that they have three players on their roster that were here last year, we are confident heading into this game with a good understanding of what we need to do in order to get a good result."

ABOUT INDY ELEVEN

Indy Eleven was launched by Keystone Group CEO Ersal Ozdemir on January 16, 2013, to play in the North American Soccer League, beginning with the 2014 season. Originally born under the Indy Pro Soccer moniker, the club officially adopted its Indy Eleven identity on April 25, 2013, during a ceremony held at the iconic Soldiers and Sailors Monument - 152 years to the day of the initial enlistment of the 11th Indiana Regiment during the Civil War.

After selling out all 14 home games of its 2014 Inaugural Season, Indy Eleven is currently in its second season of play at Michael A. Carroll Stadium (2015 capacity of 10,524) on the campus of IUPUI in downtown Indianapolis. After leading the NASL in attendance during its inaugural season with nearly 10,500 fans per game, "Indiana's Team" is again pacing the growing league in the stands in 2015. The mission of Indy Eleven - "To win championships with and for the community" - stays true to its aim of fielding a team that will represent Indiana proudly on and off the field.

Ottawa became the 9th club in the modern era of the North American Soccer League on June 20, 2011 when the NASL awarded an expansion franchise to the Ottawa Sports and Entertainment Group (OSEG). On February 26, 2013 it was announced that Ottawa's newest pro sports team would bear the name Ottawa Fury FC - a named already deeply rooted in the Ottawa soccer community. Ottawa Fury FC began play in the NASL in 2014. The club claimed their first piece of silverware in 2015 claiming the NASL Fall Season Championship reaching the NASL Championship Final that same year. Fury FC fell 3-2 to the New York Cosmos in the Final, but set several NASL records during an impressive season for the second-year club. Ottawa Fury FC plays out of TD Place at Lansdowne.
