Weekly Storylines:

- Saint Louis FC shared the points in their first regular season game last weekend, in a 0-0 draw in Louisville
- Saint Louis were 4-7-4 at home last season (regular season) outscoring the opposition 23-20
- In 2016, Saint Louis hired former Toronto FC Head Coach (2010) Preki. The Serbian-born American coach was named the 2014 USL Head Coach of the Year while he was coaching Sacramento FC
- Ottawa will be facing a familiar face Saturday as former Fury FC goalkeeper Devala Gorrick is now with STL

Scouting Saint Louis FC: After missing the playoffs and finishing 14th in the Western Conference last year, Saint Louis FC decided the shake up their roster ahead of the 2017 campaign and hire 2014 USL Head Coach of the Year, Predrag (Preki) Radosavljevic. The club joined the Eastern Conference for the 2017 season and brought in several new faces (19) including Devala Gorrick (GK), Konrad Plewa (D), Octavio Guzman (M), Jose Angulo (F) and Christian Volesky (F).

Head-to-Head: Saturday's match-up marks the first-ever regular season meeting between Ottawa and St. Louis. Fury FC defeated Saint Louis FC 2-1 in preseason action.

MATCH PREVIEW:

After eight weeks of training camp and eight preseason friendlies in which the club boasted a promising record of 5W-1D-2L and outscored the opposition 19-6, the wait is finally over. Fury FC are ready to kick off their first USL season and the will be looking to carry over the confidence earned in preseason. First stop: Saint Louis FC, Saturday evening at the Toyota Stadium.

There were plenty of positives over the past eight weeks. The club established its presence early on in the preseason starting things off with three wins in four games, including a 2-1 win against Saint Louis FC during Fury FC's week-long camp at the IMG Academy.

Newcomers Sito Seoane (5), Tucker Hume (4) and Steevan Dos Santos (3) were impressive during training camp, scoring 12 of Ottawa's 19 goals. Gerardo Bruna, who missed almost the entire 2016 season because of an injury came back with a lot of ambition ahead of 2017. The Argentinian netted four goals in preseason action.

Fury FC capped off their preseason schedule with an impressive performance against the Montreal Impact last Friday in a friendly scrimmage, picking up a convincing 2-0 win. Ottawa will now look to kick off the season with a strong performance in Saint Louis.

Paul Dalglish's side will be squaring off against a familiar face as former Fury FC goalkeeper Devala Gorrick is now with Saint Louis. after spending last season with Colorado and earning an USL All-League Second Team honors while ranking in the league's top five for saves, save percentage, goals-against average and minutes.

What are they saying?

Fury FC GM and Head Coach, Paul Dalglish:

"We're impatient, we've been waiting for this moment for a long time. We're ready to go and we want to come out of the gates flying. The team this year will mirror the type of football that I want to see and I am 100% confident that we will be successful and that we have the ability to achieve great things."

"I've known Preki since he was in Sacramento. He has a very recognizable style of play, so we know what to expect from them. It's a team that builds from the back with loads of possession, so we will be ready."

Fury FC Captain, Lance Rozeboom:

"We're really excited, it's been a long preseason of tough training, but we're excited to play our opener and we feel ready. We'll have to match their intensity in the first half and then stay focused throughout the game and stick to our game plan."

Fury FC defender, Eddie Edward:

"The guys are ready. We are really looking forward to Saturday. We had a really good preseason, with lots of energy displayed at training and in games and we want to keep that going. We have a very good and talented group of guys and we are all really excited for what we can achieve this season."

ABOUT SAINT LOUIS FC:

On May 1, 2014, it was announced that USL was expanding to St. Louis for the 2015 season. St. Louis Scott Gallagher, a well-renowned St. Louis youth club, was announced as the owner and operator of the new Saint Louis FC. Both the youth club and the pro team are based at the St. Louis Soccer Park in Fenton, MO, commonly known as "The Park".

Saint Louis FC adopted a logo that has strong ties to the foundation of the city. The fleur-de-lis that acts as the focal point of the logo is a tribute to the French founders of the city, and 1764 is a reference to the year the city was founded. The five lines behind the fleur-delis represent the five core values of the club: Unity, Humility, Passion, Respect, and Tradition. The fans of St. Louis selected this logo in a public vote shortly after the club was announced. St. Louis features prominently in American soccer history, dating all the way back to the early 1900s. It all began with the founding of the St. Louis Soccer League in 1907. At the time of its inception, the SLSL was the only fully professional league in the country.

About Ottawa Fury FC

Ottawa Fury FC is professional soccer team representing Canada's capital in the 30-team United Soccer League (USL). Established in 2011, Fury FC began play in 2014 in the North American Soccer League. In just their second season, the Fury claimed the Fall Season Championship and reached the Championship Final.
