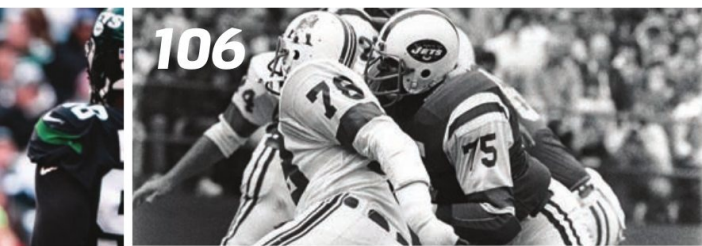

JETS TACKLE A DIFFERENT KIND OF OFFSEASON

Adam Gase: Approach to Virtual Program Will Be 'Very Beneficial for Us'

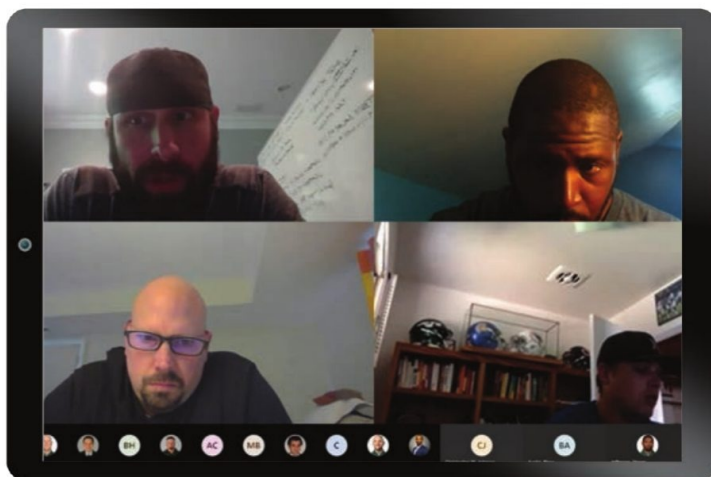
The NFL entered uncharted waters with virtual offseason programs due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but the Jets didn't skip a beat. Instead of field work or being in the weightroom or the classroom at One Jets Drive, head coach Adam Gase and his staff held meetings on Microsoft Teams with the players.

"The best thing about this program is that I can jump in and out of a lot of different meetings," said Gase, who was very hands-on throughout the process. "The video stuff that we're able to do, it's pretty cool how we can share our screen and watch the film with players and be able to diagram and talk through some stuff. It's a unique way that we're doing things, but I think it's going to be very beneficial for us."

Perhaps the biggest challenge of the offseason for the players is staying in shape. Typically, head strength and conditioning coach Justus Galac puts the team through a program at the facility, but this offseason each player is responsible for his workout regimen.

"Everybody has been doing a little bit of a different thing," Gase said. "I do think there are some instructional things that these guys had before they even left that they've been using for a long time. Guys who are on their own also have trainers that they've been using for a long time. I feel good with where we're at with guys working out."

One hurdle of the virtual offseason program is intangible: team chemistry. Spring football is the first time free-agent additions and newly drafted players can meet and interact with their new teammates, developing camaraderie on and off the field.



"We're just preparing how we would normally. Obviously not in person, but we're still going through things as normal and we've got a pretty good setup with how we've been meeting," QB Sam Darnold said. "The interaction with my teammates isn't there, but I've been texting, FaceTiming guys as much as I can, and everything's been good. We're just really trying to stay on task and focus on what we can right now."

Finally, the Jets were able to focus on practicing together again, as captured in the photos of the players working out at the Atlantic Health Training Center prior to the first practice of training camp Aug. 14.

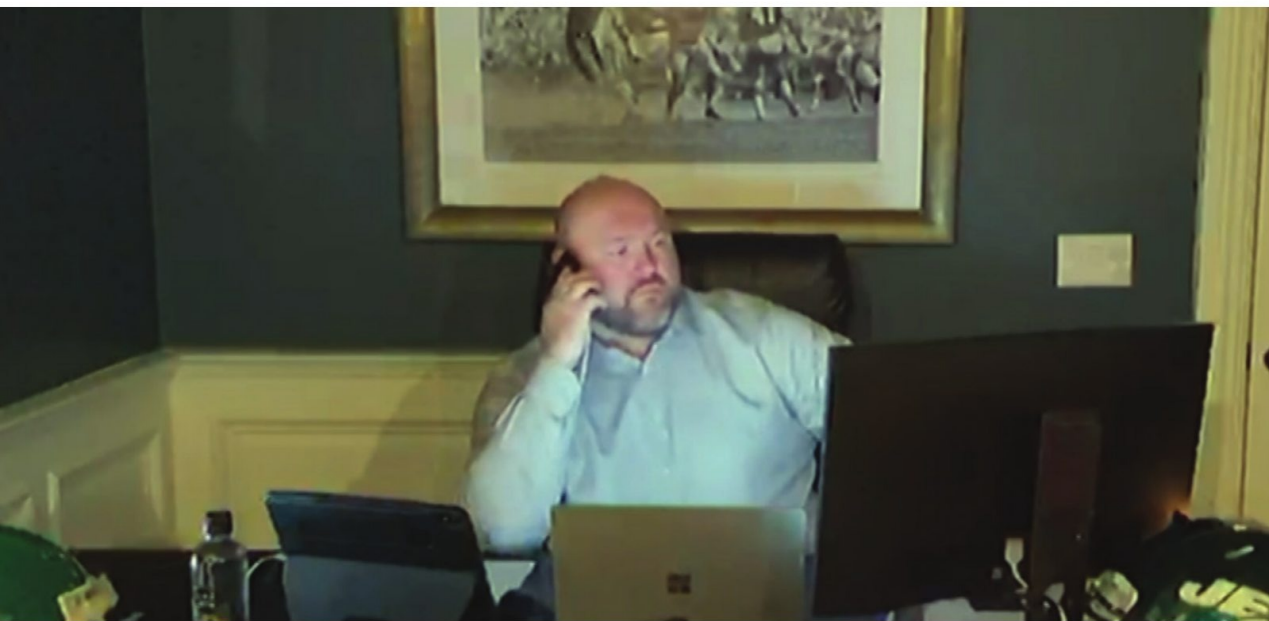

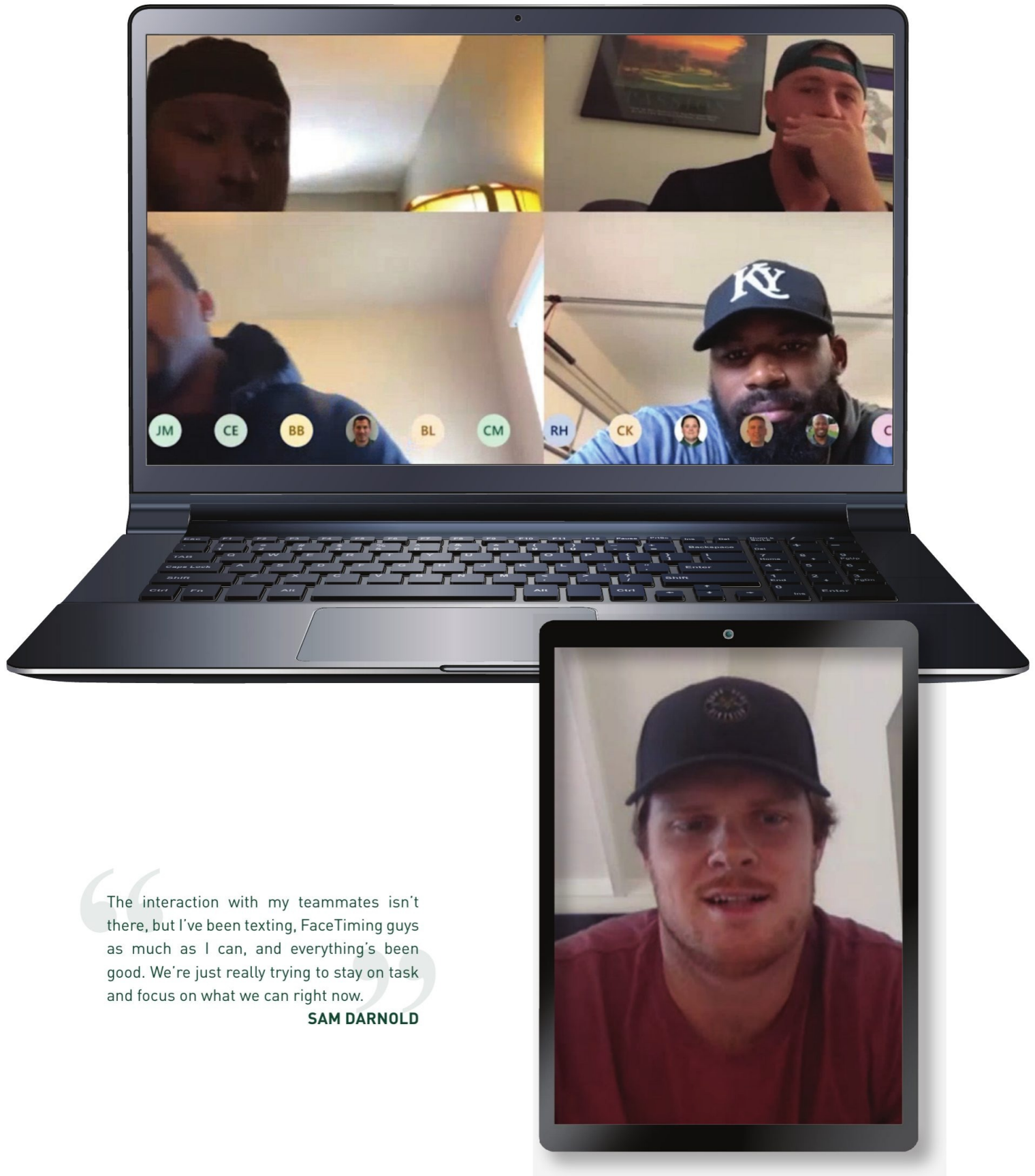

CEO Senses 'Whole New Dynamic' Heading Toward Regular Season

The moment was bittersweet — and cold. After watching the Jets take down the Bills, 13-6, in water-logged Western New York to wrap up a 6-2 back half of the 2019 campaign, Green & White CEO Christopher Johnson was asked by a reporter about his feelings as his team's season had reached its end.

"I feel pretty good right now, but this is not where I want to be," Johnson said. "It's a little wistful, because I think we could have been competing for a playoff spot if a couple of things had gone differently for us."

The Jets finished 7-9 and out of the postseason, but they headed into the offseason with some momentum. After watching first-year head coach Adam Gase lead a rally down the stretch, Johnson was excited for general manager Joe Douglas' first true offseason at the helm.

"Look, am I happy here? No," Johnson said. "But we turned the thing around pretty well and I'm really, really feeling good about this offseason. I feel like we're in a good direction going forward, and I feel good about Joe and Adam working together this offseason. I think they're going to hit the ground running."

Over the ensuing months, Douglas revamped the offensive line, added playmakers on the outside, targeted position flexibility and versatility on both sides of the ball, and emphasized culture at every step. After injuries ravaged the team early on last season, depth has improved heading into the 2020 campaign. The defense has many returnees from last season's No. 7-ranked unit while RB Le'Veon Bell remains one of the NFL's top backs and the organization is high on emerging signal-caller Sam Darnold.

"It's the trust I see," Johnson said of the Jets' structure. "Seeing Adam work with Sam gives me a lot of confidence, seeing him work with Joe. It's a whole new dynamic in this building, it's a really positive dynamic. They have the same vision for this team going forward."

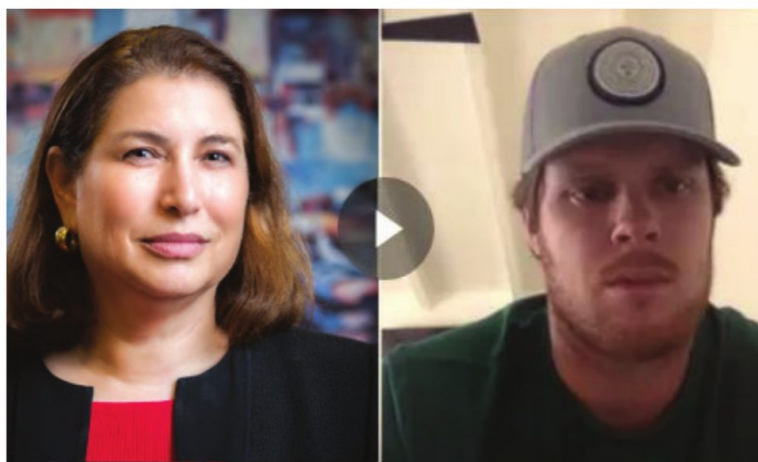

REMEMBERING BETTY WOLD JOHNSON



'First Lady of the Jets,' 99, Supported Education, Healthcare & the Arts

Betty Wold Johnson, the matriarch of the Johnson Family, peacefully passed away on May 5. Ms. Johnson, the mother of both Christopher Johnson, the Jets CEO, and Woody Johnson, the U.S. Ambassador to Great Britain and Northern Ireland, was a renowned philanthropist and long-time contributor to arts, education and healthcare initiatives throughout New Jersey and New York. She was 99.

"I think of her as 'the First Lady of the Jets,' " former Jets QB Chad Pennington said. "I think of Ms. Johnson as nothing but first class with how she treated people, how she carried herself and how she represented herself and her family."

Ms. Johnson used to refer to Jets players as her grandchildren. Football had always been part of her life as she spent some of her formative years in Minnesota following the Golden Gophers with her father, Karl Christian Wold, a doctor. She later married Robert Wood Johnson and had five children with him before his death in 1970.

A benefactor of the New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC), Ms. Johnson was a supporter of many Princeton and New York

arts and science institutions, including McCarter Theatre, The Nature Conservancy in New Jersey, the Liberty Science Center, the Arts Council of Princeton, the Princeton Public Library and the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

In the medical arena, Ms. Johnson also funded the rebuilding of Princeton Hospital and, through Project Renewal, backed aid to the homeless and mobile health services programs for those in need. She was an annual leading supporter of the Jets Kickoff Luncheon, benefiting the Lupus Research Alliance and its goal to treat and ultimately cure lupus.

"She had a personal interest rooting for the Jets, but just her energy, she had a younger person's energy," said former Jets RB Curtis Martin, the team's all-time leading rusher and Pro Football Hall of Famer. "She was just very approachable to everyone who met her. I just loved her as a human being."

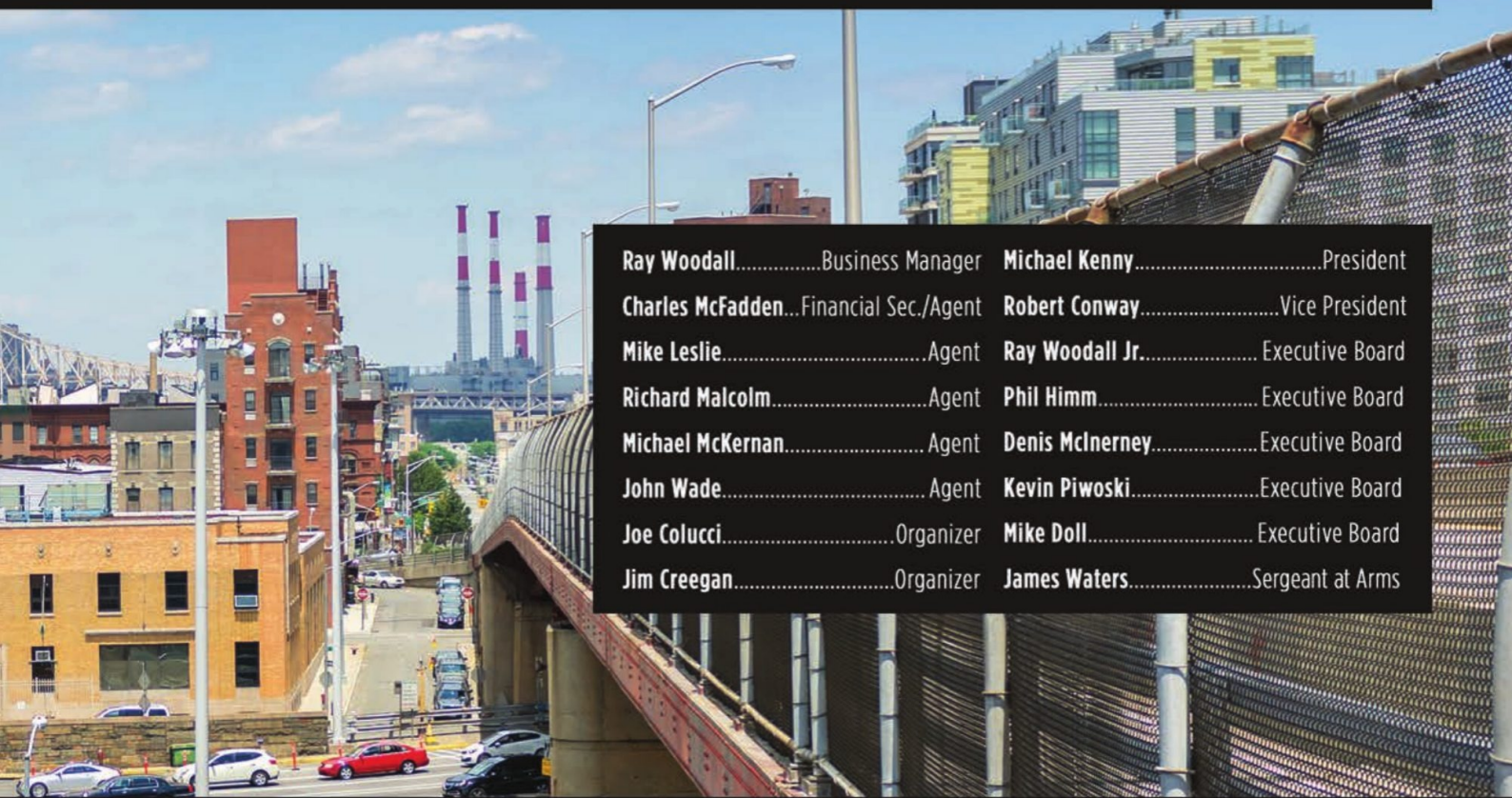

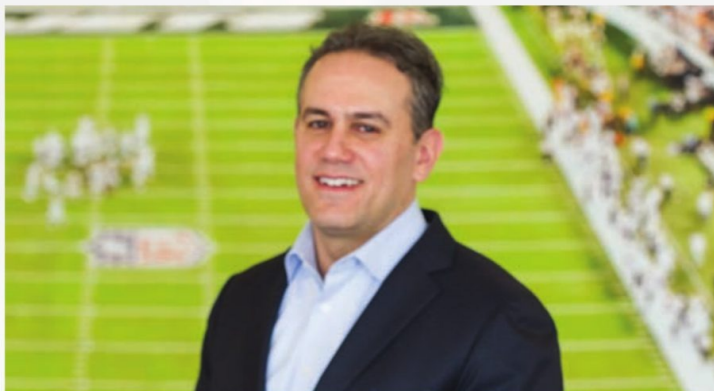
HYMIE ELHAI'S RISE THROUGH THE RANKS

Two-Decade Journey Took Him from Intern to Team Counsel to Jets President

The Jets and Hymie Elhai, the team's president since last September, go way back.

"They have always been a part of my family and a part of my fabric," Elhai says. "I was born in Queens, Forest Hills, obviously a stone's throw away from Shea Stadium. I remember my dad taking me to games, being under the blanket, watching the Jets in the cold weather at Shea."

Elhai never lost touch with his team even as he started his professional journey. In fact, in the last 20 years he embarked on a classic career arc, beginning with the Jets as an intern in 2000, being named manager of legal affairs and business development two years later, and working his way to senior vice president, business affairs & general counsel in 2015.



Then at the start of the 2019 season, chairman and CEO Christopher Johnson and the Jets named him president.

"I think that's the story that resonates when people talk about me, that hard work, dedication and commitment to the organization can be rewarded," Elhai says. "Obviously, the COVID-19 pandemic was not in the script on how you would envision your first year on the job. Has it been everything I'd hoped for? Yes, but probably in a different way than I anticipated."

Some highlights from Elhai's first year were in starting to "reset the culture of the Jets inside and outside the building" and in working closely with general manager Joe Douglas and head coach Adam Gase "to help the football on the field get to a place that is more reflective of the long-term success we want for the organization."

He also is guiding the creation of a Jets committee that will focus on the social justice issues raised this offseason.

"Our public statements have spoken pretty loudly. We want to have an impact in the community and do things to make not only the organization but the public proud and really make a difference," he says. "This is something that's important to the country and at a local level to our fan base and our team. I think this is a good opportunity for us to impact change and it's the right thing to do."

JOE DOUGLAS: GOOD YEAR ONE WITH MORE TO COME

Jets GM Clears Hurdles, Improves Roster Through Free Agency, Draft & Trades

Joe Douglas has had one of the most unusual starts to an NFL general managership in recent years. He was hired by the Jets in June 2019, not January. This offseason he presided over his first free agency period and his first draft as GM while the COVID-19 pandemic raged.

If things can go this evenly moving forward, the Jets should endure minimal midair turbulence with Douglas at the controls.

"The process went about as smooth as it could go under the circumstances," Douglas said about the draft, during which, due to the virus, he posted up in his house to coordinate the Jets' moves. "This was a real team effort from every department — video, IT, coaching, personnel. We were all able to come together, we embraced the technology, the teleconference abilities we had. We weren't afraid to disagree, we were able to hash things out. And I think it really led to us being able to get good players and have a strong draft."

Of course, it will take more than one year on the job to grade Douglas' stewardship. But the draft brought together a number of elements that bode well for the Green & White's future.

In October, he traded DL Leonard Williams to the Giants for two choices, one of which was a third-rounder that was spent on S Ashtyn Davis.

Beginning in March, Douglas began bringing in free agent talent to fortify the offensive line (George Fant, Connor McGovern, Greg Van Roten, Josh Andrews), wide receivers (Breshad Perriman) and cornerbacks (Pierre Desir).

He made three more trades during the draft. The first two, with Seattle and New England, provided three extra picks, which were used to take WR Denzel Mims, QB James Morgan and T Cameron Clark. A late trade with Indianapolis brought in veteran CB Quincy Wilson.

All of these picks added to the selections of T Mekhi Becton (11th overall), edge rusher Jabari Zuniga, RB La'Mical Perine, CB Bryce Hall and P Braden Mann.

Most recently, Douglas executed the July trade headlined by S Jamal Adams going to the Seahawks for two No. 1 picks plus S Bradley McDougald (see Page 70). "It certainly wasn't the plan when I first arrived here," Douglas said of trading Adams. "But when our conversations started with Seattle, the focus became clear that this is a great opportunity for us moving forward."

Coach Sees Fired-Up Darnold, Tight Locker Room Heading into Year 2

After leading the Jets to a 6-2 mark in the back half of his first season as head coach of the Green & White and watching general manager Joe Douglas improve the talent on the roster this spring, Adam Gase had reason to sense an upswing.

"I feel like things are moving in the right direction," Gase said following the 2020 NFL Draft. "It's hard for me to talk about these mythical steps that everybody's talking about. All I know is, we need to find ways to win games and put ourselves in position where we can make the tournament."

Gase was challenged immediately at the start of his Jets tenure. Sam Darnold's early-season battle with mono and C.J. Mosley's groin injury were harbingers of what was to come and the Jets were left for dead at 1-7, but Gase kept the team afloat and they finished strong. Douglas overhauled the offensive line, got Darnold some playmakers on the outside and transformed the cornerback position. A tough defense will transition without All-Pro S Jamal Adams (traded to Seattle) and Mosley (opted out of the season due to COVID-19), and special teams should remain a strength.

"Roster-wise, Joe has done a great job as far as lining this thing up the right way, finding the right type of guys and really the right fit for what we're trying to do," Gase said. "I really think our locker room is going to be a tight locker room."

When Gase joined the Jets in January 2019, he said the No. 1 reason they were the right spot for him was the young quarterback. And he suspects Darnold will be pumped for their second season together.

"I know he watches last year's stuff and it gets him fired up because he knows, 'I can do this better, I know how this is supposed to look,' " the coach said. "His brain's working so much faster when you go into year two of these things because you know all of the little details of what the offense is about."

What is VASCEPA?

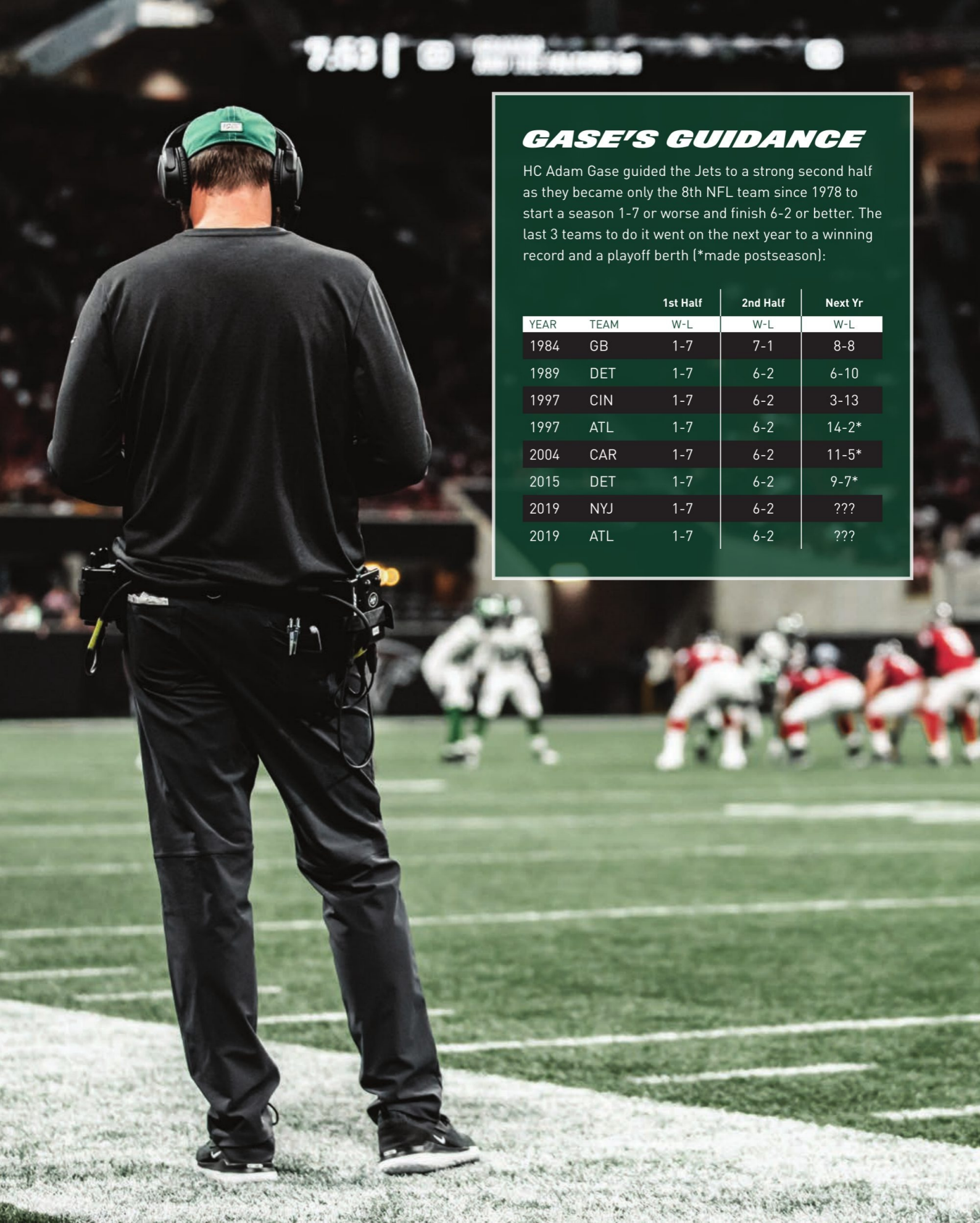

WORKING TOWARD A BIG JUMP

Jets QB Focusing on Accuracy, Becoming Extension of Coaching Staff

Like a grizzled veteran, 23-year-old Jets quarterback Sam Darnold entered an unprecedented summer equal parts optimist and realist.

"I think it's safe to say we have a lot of potential, but there is obviously a lot of work to be put in still and we're going to put in that work," Darnold said during the Jets' virtual offseason program.



General manager Joe Douglas began the offseason with an emphasis on doing everything to help Darnold succeed. And he followed through with an offensive line facelift in addition to revamping the wide receiver corps.

"We definitely have the guys to be able to win football games," Darnold said, "but as we see every year, it's about putting everything together. Right now, we've still got a long way to go."

Last year, Darnold went 7-6 as starter and improved in almost every passing category as he connected on 61.9% of his throws for 3,024 yards with 19 TDs and 13 INTs. He wants to become a more consistent performer and the athletic passer is targeting better accuracy both on the move and in the vertical game.

"I think it's just about getting those reps over and over again and putting myself in uncomfortable positions in the pocket and continuing to work on throws on the run, running and setting up throwing," he said.

Darnold has experienced a year in Adam Gase's offense and the head coach wants his quarterback to become an extension of the coaching staff in 2020. But with new personnel around him and the absence of on-field reps in the spring, Darnold will have the responsibility of getting the Jets firing on all cylinders quickly once the season commences.

"He's probably looking at wins, because he never talks about stats," Gase said. "Everybody else is going to look at ratings and touchdown passes, interceptions and yards and all those things. I think he'll look at it as he should make a big jump."

WR Crowder, RB Bell, TE Griffin Welcome New & Returning Vets to Skill Mix

With their starting signal-caller in place, the Jets changed the pieces around Sam Darnold this offseason. The facelift could include a pair of new starters at receiver as GM Joe Douglas added size and speed to Jamison Crowder and the WR corps in Breshad Perriman and rookie Denzel Mims.

"I think it's safe to say that we have a lot of potential, but there is obviously a lot of work to be put in still and we're going to put in that work," said Darnold. "We definitely have the guys to be able to win football games, but as we see every year, it's about putting everything together. Right now, we've still got a long way to go."

The offense will also receive a boost from TE Chris Herndon, who played one game in 2019 after a promising rookie season in which he had 39 receptions for 502 yards and 4 touchdowns, all of which ranked second on the team.





"We expected Chris to be a big part of the offense last year and he didn't get that opportunity," head coach Adam Gase said. "So we're adding a guy that is a very good player who's finally going to get back into the mix of this thing."

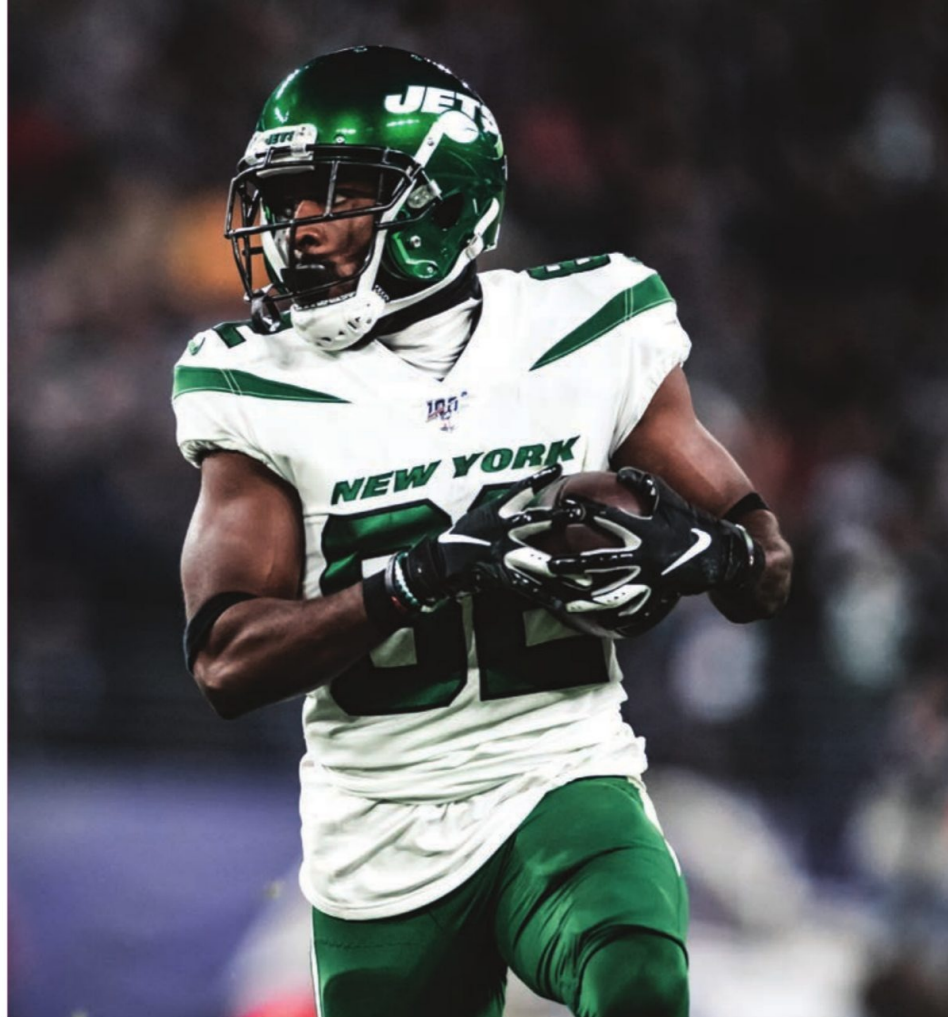
The TEs room also has Ryan Griffin, who had a career-high 5 TDs last year among his 34 catches for 320 yards, plus Daniel Brown and Trevon Wesco. The running back stable features Le'Veon Bell and two new faces behind him in Frank Gore, the NFL's third all-time leading rusher, and rookie La'Mical Perine.

Then in mid-August another wideout weapon was added in Chris Hogan, who's making the Jets his fourth AFC East team in his eight-year, 202-catch NFL career.

"Those two guys can really do some damage together. We have two guys that can play all three downs. They both have outstanding skillsets," Gase said of Bell and Gore. He added that Gore is "a natural leader, he's the kind of guy that guys respect around the NFL. He's done a great job as far as helping younger players that are in the room."

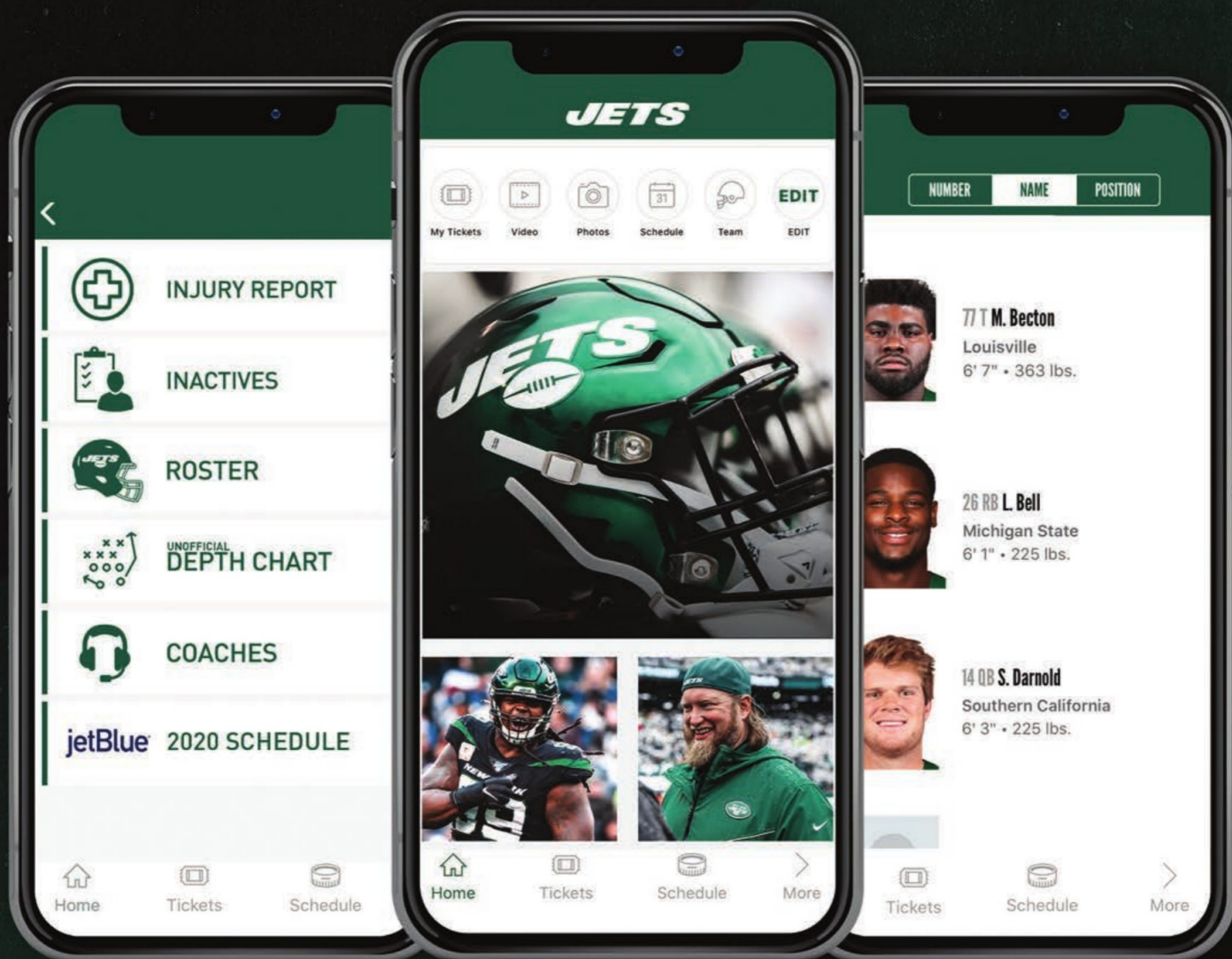

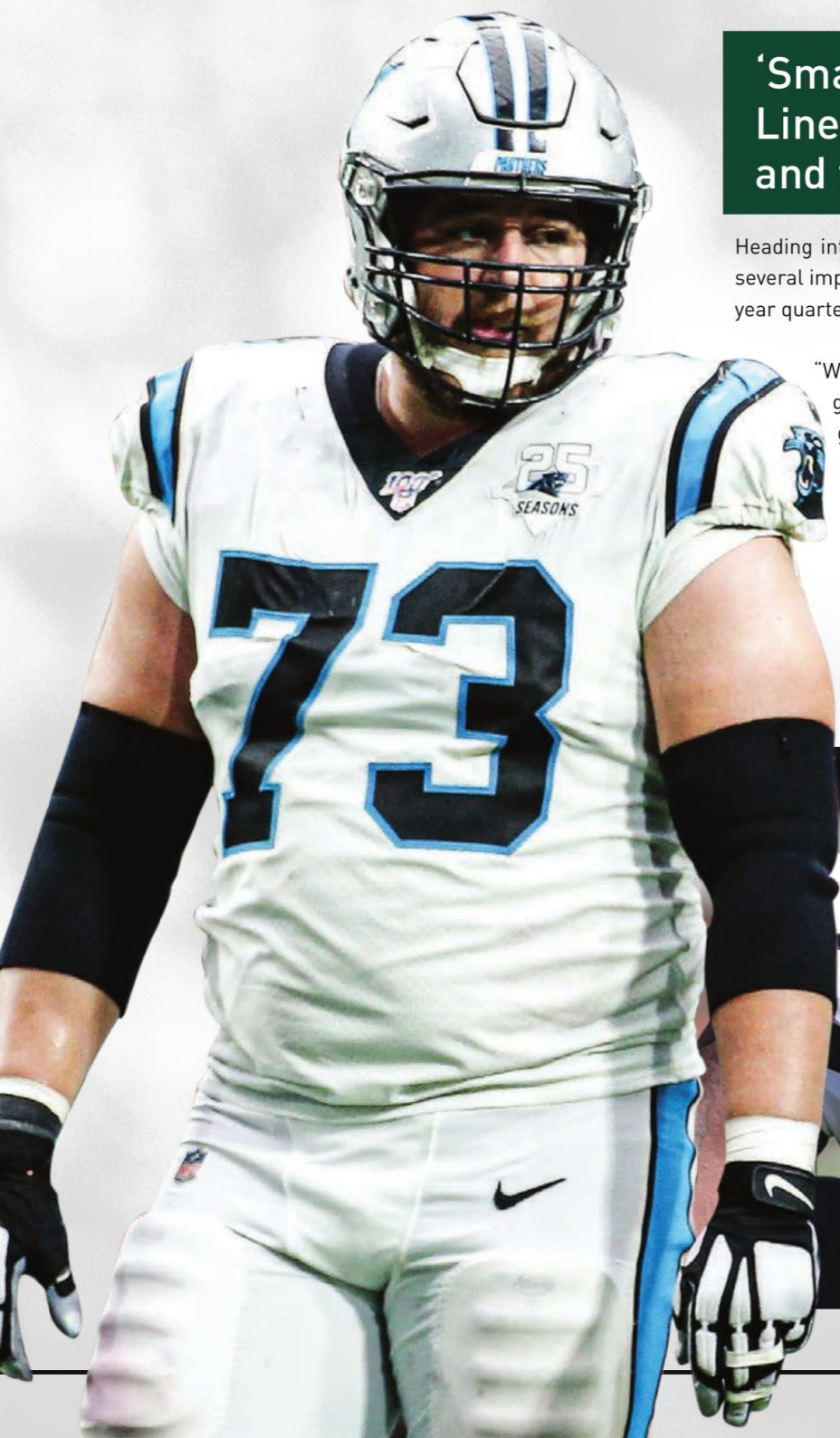
JETS O-LINE UNDERGOES A POWER MAKEOVER

'Smart, Tough, Versatile' Linemen Arrive in Free Agency and the Draft

Heading into this offseason, Jets general manager Joe Douglas had several imperatives. One was to fortify the cast surrounding third-year quarterback Sam Darnold.

"When I first met Sam's parents before the first preseason game" last August, Douglas said, "I promised them I was going to do everything in my power to take care of Sam with protection and playmakers."

Last season, the Jets' offensive line struggled to find its rhythm in helping Darnold, his receivers and RB Le'Veon Bell move the ball. Battling through multiple injuries, they started 11 players. RG Brian Winters, the only returning opening-day starter, was released in early August.





However, once the offseason began, Douglas started to make good on his promise to the Darnolds. His commitment to improving the O-line resulted in signing four free agents — T George Fant, C Connor McGovern, G Greg Van Roten and G Josh Andrews — and re-signing G Alex Lewis.

The GM also plucked one of the top four available tackles in the 2020 NFL Draft in Louisville's Mekhi Becton at No. 11 overall and added Charlotte T Cameron Clark in Round 4.

"Our focus is doing everything we can to help Sam succeed," Douglas said. "The one thing we didn't want was a situation where he was just going to have to be under fire all the time with protection issues. We're going to keep it simple with guys that are smart, tough and versatile. We're going to keep addressing that moving forward and we're going to keep addressing playmakers moving forward."

Playing behind a revamped line heading into 2020, Darnold will have the opportunity to find more success in year three.

C.J. Mosley Opt-Out Shows Why 'Backers 'Will Keep Pushing Themselves'

After C.J. Mosley was limited to just two appearances last season due to a groin injury, the veteran Mike linebacker and the Jets had hoped a return was in the cards. But in August, Mosley, citing family concerns during COVID-19, elected to opt out of the 2020 season. Despite the blow, the Jets have established great depth at the position and they have experience operating without one of the game's top inside 'backers.



"If you're a good football player, we'll find a way to get them on the team," said inside linebackers coach/assistant head coach Frank Bush prior to Mosley's decision. "Every guy in the room is going to make every guy that much better. When you look at what happened last year, every man starts to understand that they're just one snap away from being a part of this thing, so they won't take anything for granted. They'll keep pushing themselves."

Avery Williamson is pushing to get back in the lineup after missing the entire 2019 season with a torn ACL. In 2018, Williamson recorded 116 tackles, 6 pass defenses, 3 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and 1 recovery.

"He flies around and he hits people. He's constantly going," Bush said of Williamson. "You have to like that part about him. He's a smart kid, he makes good decisions on the football field, but the effort chasing down guys, that's his calling card."

Williamson started training camp on the Active/PUP list, though, and heavy competition was expected at both the Mike and Will spots with Williamson, James Burgess, Neville Hewitt, Blake Cashman and former Raven Patrick Onwuasor (32 starts, 234 tackles, 9.5 sacks, 5 FF) all in the mix.

"We're hoping he can infuse some of that winning into our room. He's the only guy that hasn't heard the system like the other guys have heard it, but he's been outstanding in the sense that he doesn't miss any meetings and he asks great questions," Bush said of Onwuasor. "He's done a great job this spring of being innovative with the information. He needs reps, that's the number one thing for him, but I'm excited about what he's given us so far."

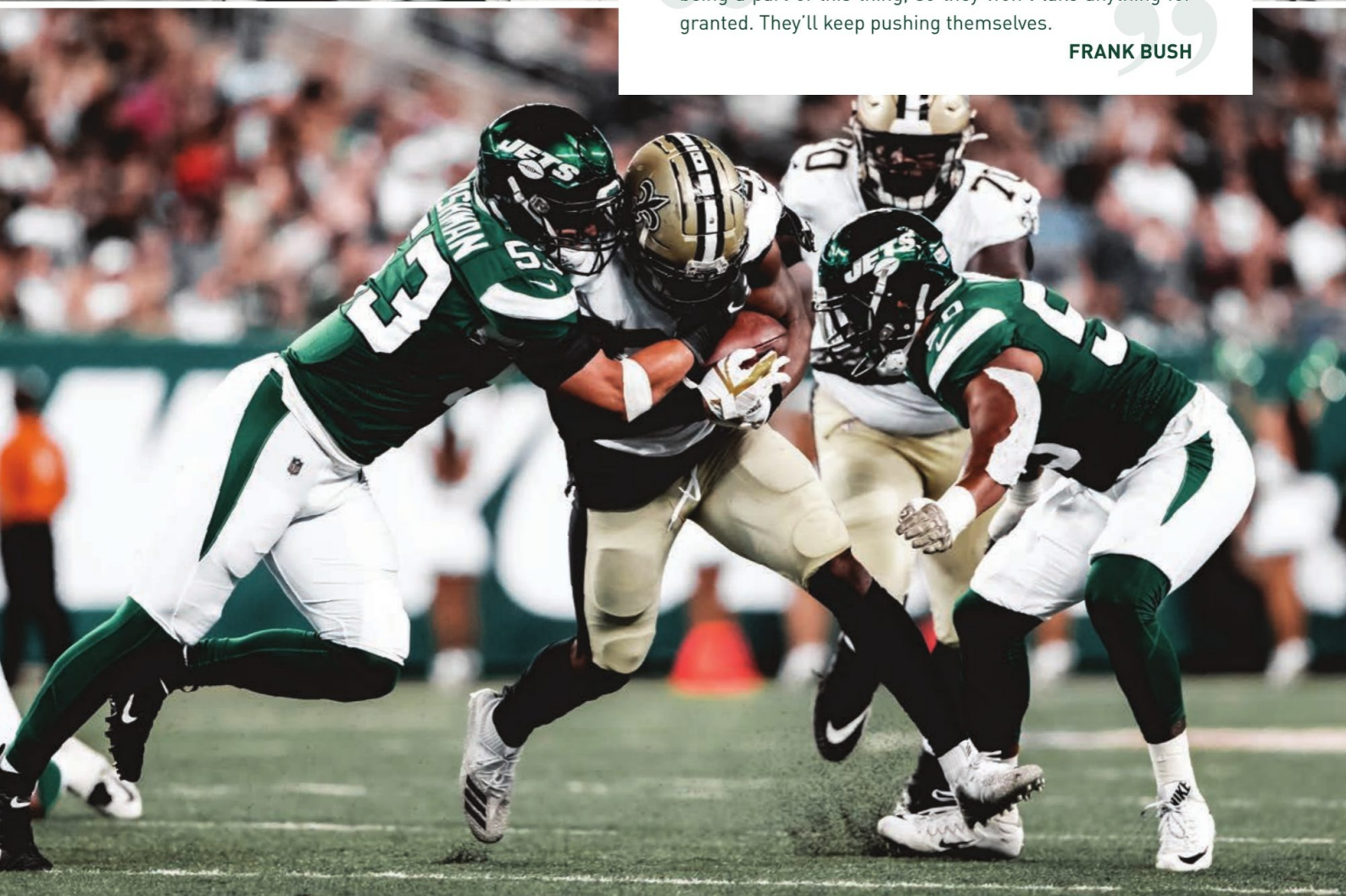

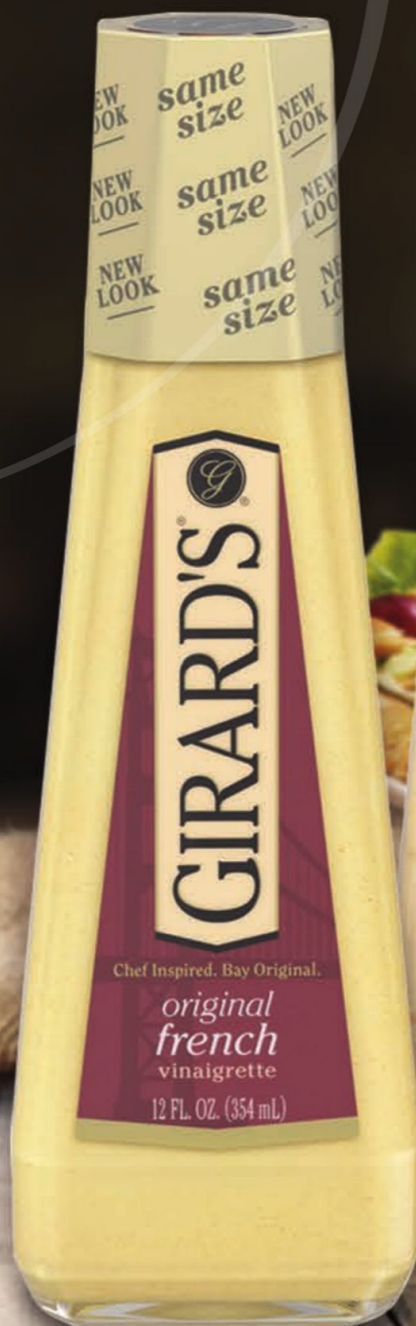

Focusing on the line, nine players saw action in 2019. Six of them — rookies Quinnen Williams and Kyle Phillips, followed by vets Steve McLendon, Anderson, Folorunso Fatukasi and Leonard Williams (traded in October to the Giants) — were in for at least 350 defensive snaps. Eight of the nine had at least one tackle for loss on a rush or reception, and eight had at least one-half sack.

That spread-the-wealth contribution from a still young pack of stout linemen bodes well for this unit in 2020. So says the group's grand old man, McLendon, now 34 years old and entering his 11th pro season and his fifth in green and white.

"I've been talking to a lot of the guys and we've been communicating this whole offseason," McLendon said from his newly opened gym in Georgia. "We've been doing workouts, truck pulls and stuff like that just to push each other. This is something that's different from the past offseason. We continue to push each other when we're not together, so I can imagine what it will be like when we are together."

NEW CONSTRUCTION IN THE SECONDARY

Safety Realigns After Jamal Adams Trade in July; Corner Overhauled Early

The Jets' secondary underwent an ambitious offseason makeover. Cornerback was redesigned early in the offseason schedule, while the safety position was retooled in late July with the blockbuster trade of Jamal Adams to Seattle.

Players and fans will be talking about the Adams deal for years to come, since it's one of the biggest trades in franchise history. Much more was included in the swap — the Jets received the Seahawks' first-round picks in 2021 and 2022, their third-rounder in '21, and S Bradley McDougald, while the Jets also sent Seattle a fourth-rounder in '22.

"We were ready for anything in terms of how this could ultimately play out," general manager Joe Douglas said of the Adams contract situation, "and we were prepared for Jamal to come in and have a discussion with him and try to work out a resolution. But obviously we received an offer that was just too difficult to pass up, and we decided to move forward with that decision."

Adams' starting spot alongside fourth-year veteran Marcus Maye is now open, with McDougald, whom Douglas called a "consistent performer" with 10 interceptions in 75 NFL starts, one of the favorites.

Earlier on the calendar, the Jets added to their cornerbacks room via free agency, trade and the draft. After re-signing nickel Brian Poole, they quickly pounced on Pierre Desir, who was released by Indianapolis after starting 23 games and recording 4 interceptions and 19 pass defenses for the Colts the past two seasons.

"I was dealing with a hamstring injury and missed a couple of games, so that kind of put me down a little bit throughout the year," Desir said. "But this is a business. You're only as good as your last performance. And I think I showed that I could still compete at a high level. I think my ceiling's very high. I'm going to just continue to grow as a player and live out this dream of playing in the NFL."

Douglas then drafted S Ashtyn Davis in the third round and CB Bryce Hall in the fifth before trading a sixth-round pick to Indy for former second-round CB Quincy Wilson, Desir's former teammate and Maye's and Poole's college teammate at Florida.

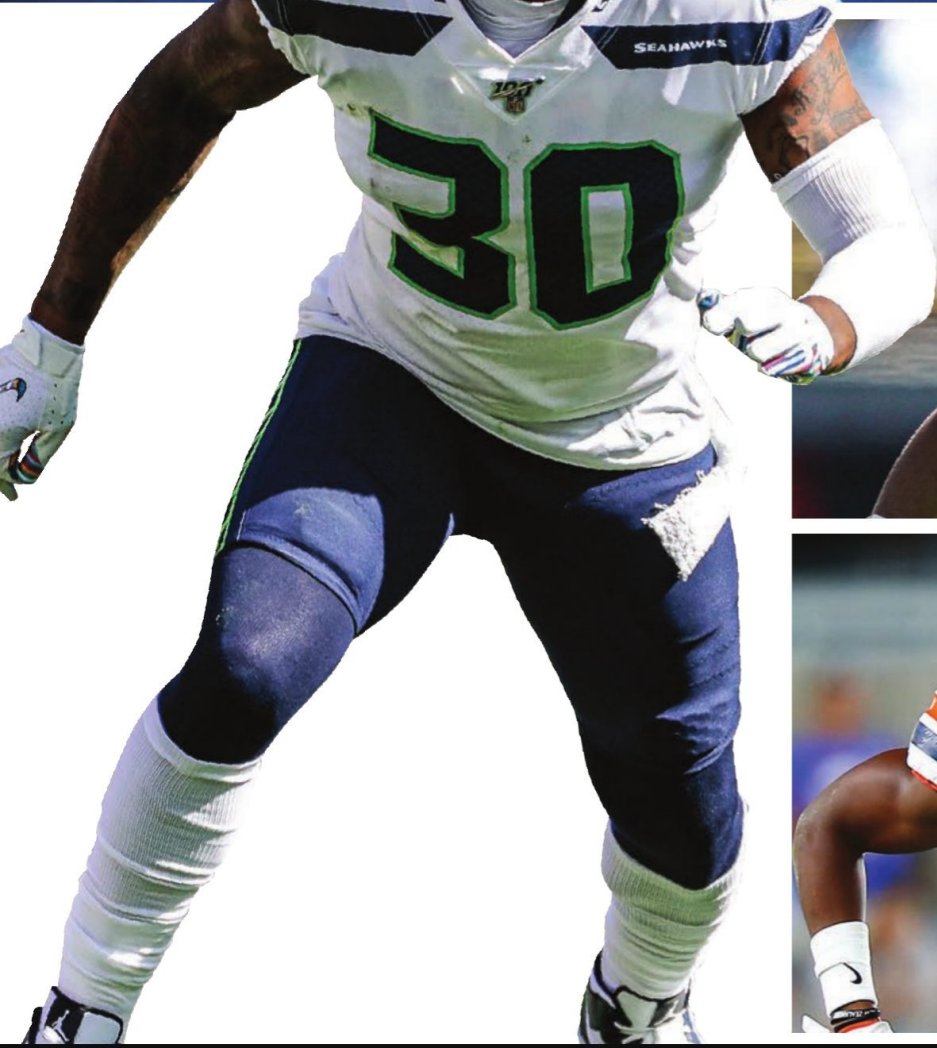

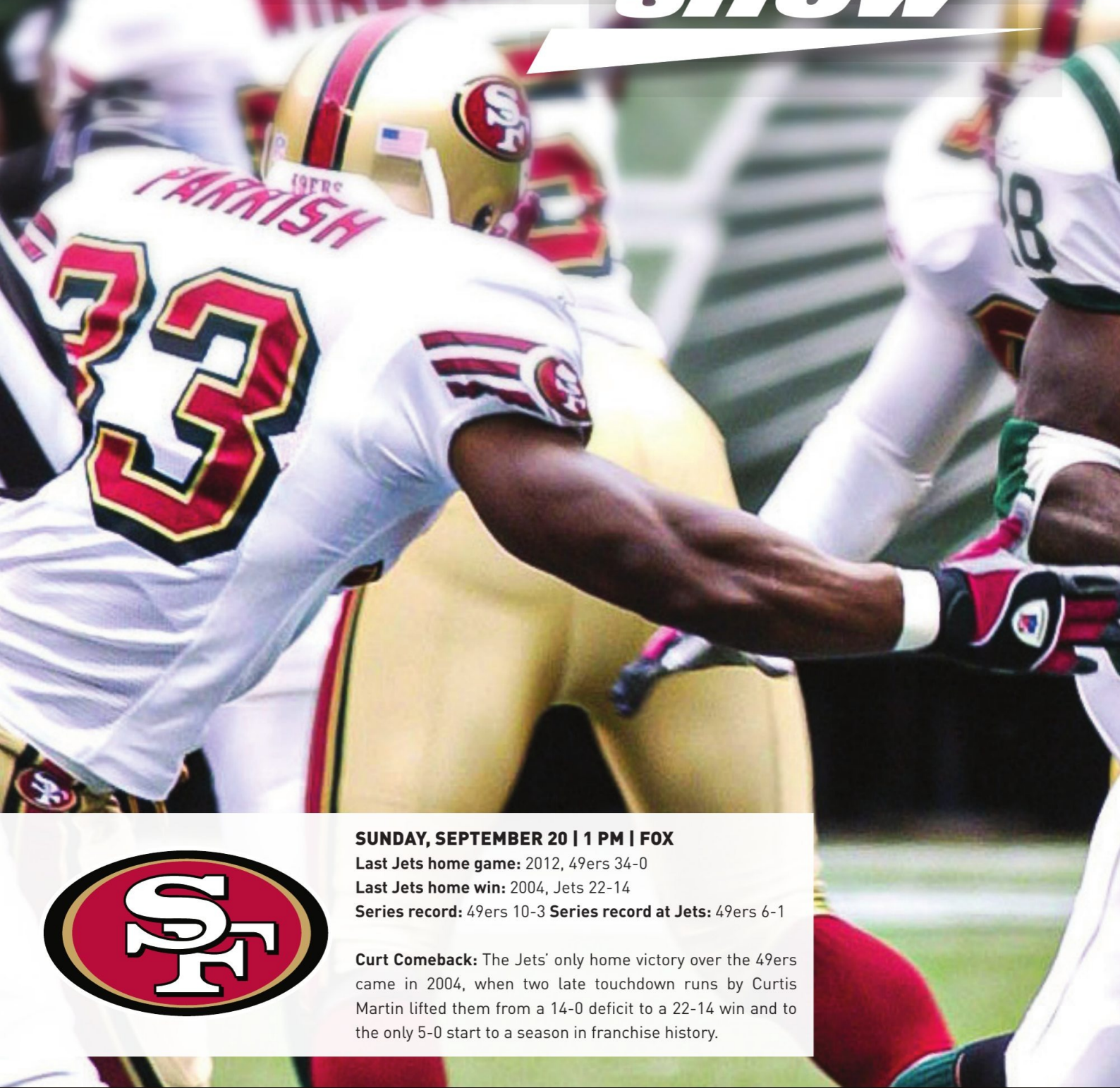

Jets Open at Home vs. the 49ers, Play the Las Vegas Raiders for the First Time

When the NFL's "Double West" schedule rotation comes up for AFC East teams once every dozen seasons, that means not only a lot of long trips but also games against infrequent and often exotic teams from the Rockies and beyond visiting MetLife Stadium.

It all starts with the defending NFC champion San Francisco 49ers coming to town Sept. 20. It's the 49ers' first visit to MetLife to play the Jets in eight years and only their second time as the opponent in the Jets' home opener (the first was 1991). And the Jets are set for their first encounter with QB Jimmy Garoppolo (except for one brief relief stint for Tom Brady with New England in 2016).

Also coming in Dec. 6 are the Raiders. Haven't they been to the Meadowlands a lot before? Absolutely. Have they ever been in to play the Jets as the Las Vegas Raiders? Nope, this is the first time.

Two more Western Division teams that the Jets have enjoyed playing in the Eastern Time Zone are also set to visit for back-to-back home games: GM John Elway's Denver Broncos on Thursday night, Oct. 1 (their last meeting at MetLife, in 2018, was a milestone win for then-rookie QB Sam Darnold) and HC Kliff Kingsbury's Arizona Cardinals on Oct. 11 (the Jets have won four of five home games over the Cards).

The AFC East of course will fill out the Jets' home dance card — resurgent Buffalo on Oct. 25, post-Tom Brady New England on MNF, Nov. 9, and Miami on Nov. 29. And the regular-season home finale comes against Cleveland and QB Baker Mayfield on Dec. 27, marking the sixth straight year the Jets and Browns have hooked up for an interdivisional clash.

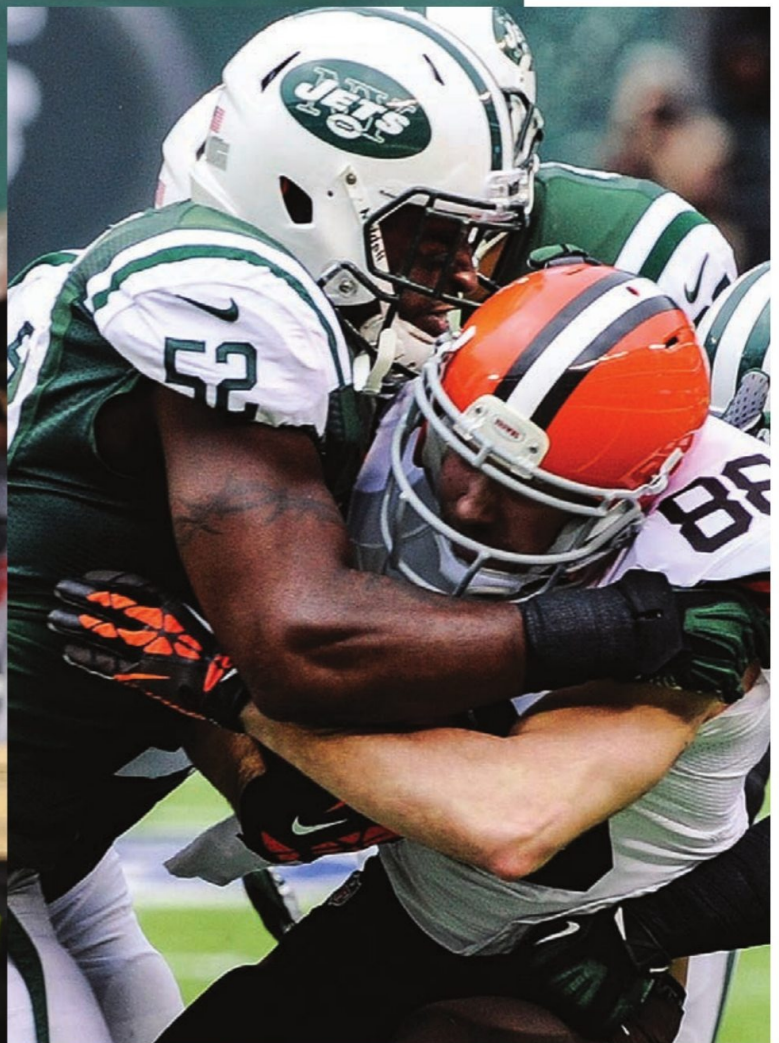

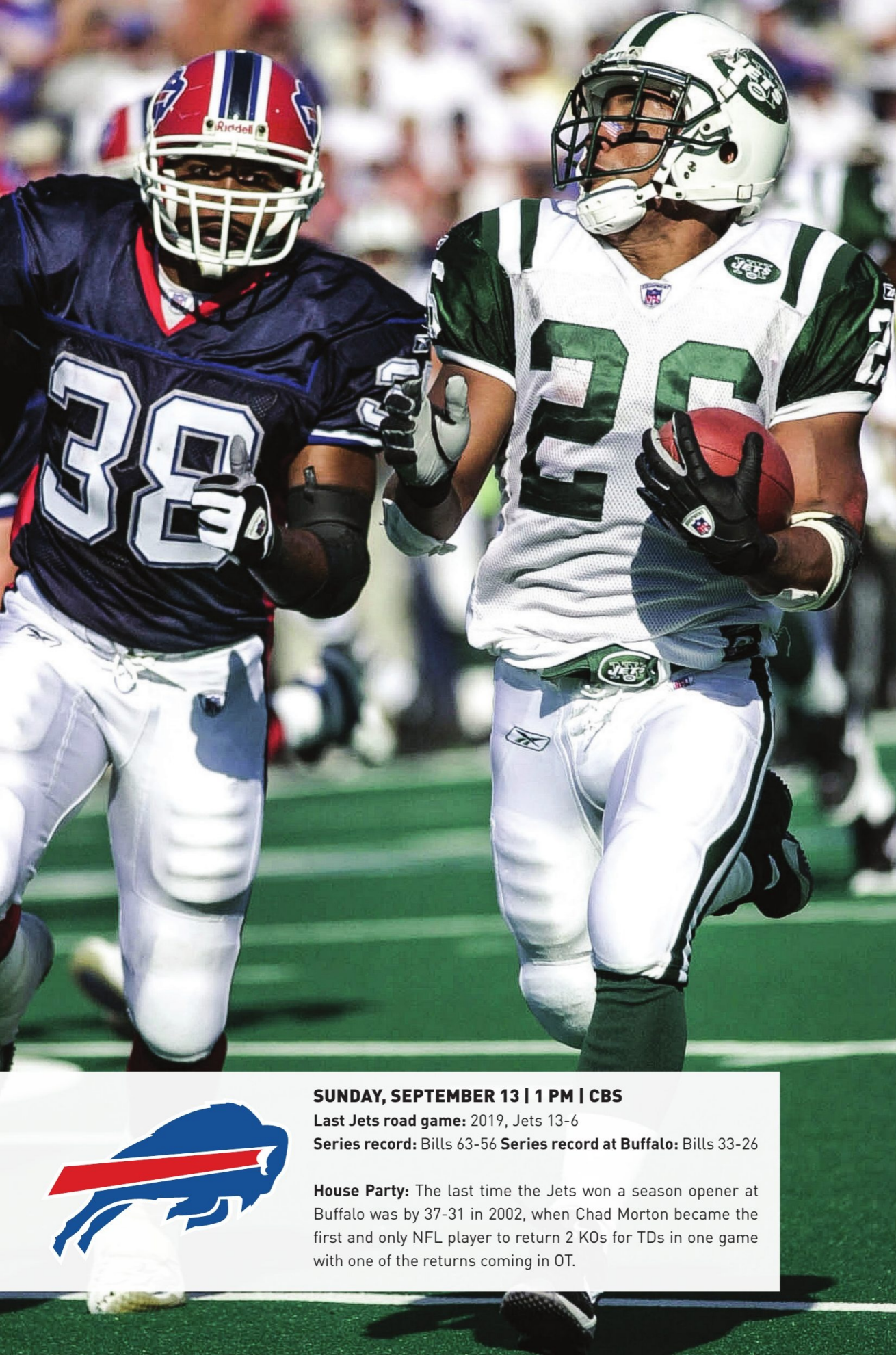

ROAD TEST LIKE FEW OTHERS

Jets' Longest Away Sked Since '08 Features 3 Trips to West Coast, 1 to KC

The road will present a challenging journey for the Jets this season. After all, the round-trip air distance calculates to around 21,100 miles for the eight away games, the second-longest road itinerary in franchise history behind only the endless 2008 trek.

And three of the schedule's four "quarters" will present their own special roadblocks for the Green & White to navigate past if they want to have a successful 2020.

In the first four games, the Jets travel to Buffalo for their season opener against their friendly foes from the AFC East who have reached the playoffs two of the previous three years. At least this is a familiar routine for the Jets, who've gone 6-4 in 10 previous season openers in Orchard Park, NY. Then in Game 3 it's off to Indianapolis to play the frisky Colts and their new/old signal-caller, Philip Rivers.

The second quarter features the Jets' first Los Angeles trip since 1993 and their first of two games scheduled for brand new SoFi Stadium, to take on the Chargers in Week 6. Two weeks later the Jets play new face of the NFL Patrick Mahomes for the first time when they visit the Chiefs at hallowed and loud Arrowhead Stadium.

After a third quarter with only one trip, and that one to the familiar confines of South Florida to play the Dolphins, a stern fourth-quarter test will present itself: back-to-back West Coast games at Seattle and the Los Angeles Rams, back in SoFi, in Weeks 14 and 15.

Then after the final home game against the Browns, the Jets will venture to Foxboro, MA, for their third season finale in the last four years. The Patriots may not have Tom Brady at QB anymore but they will be tough as always as the Jets attempt to survive a close shave at Gillette Stadium and make a hoped-for dapper entrance into the 2020 AFC playoff dance.

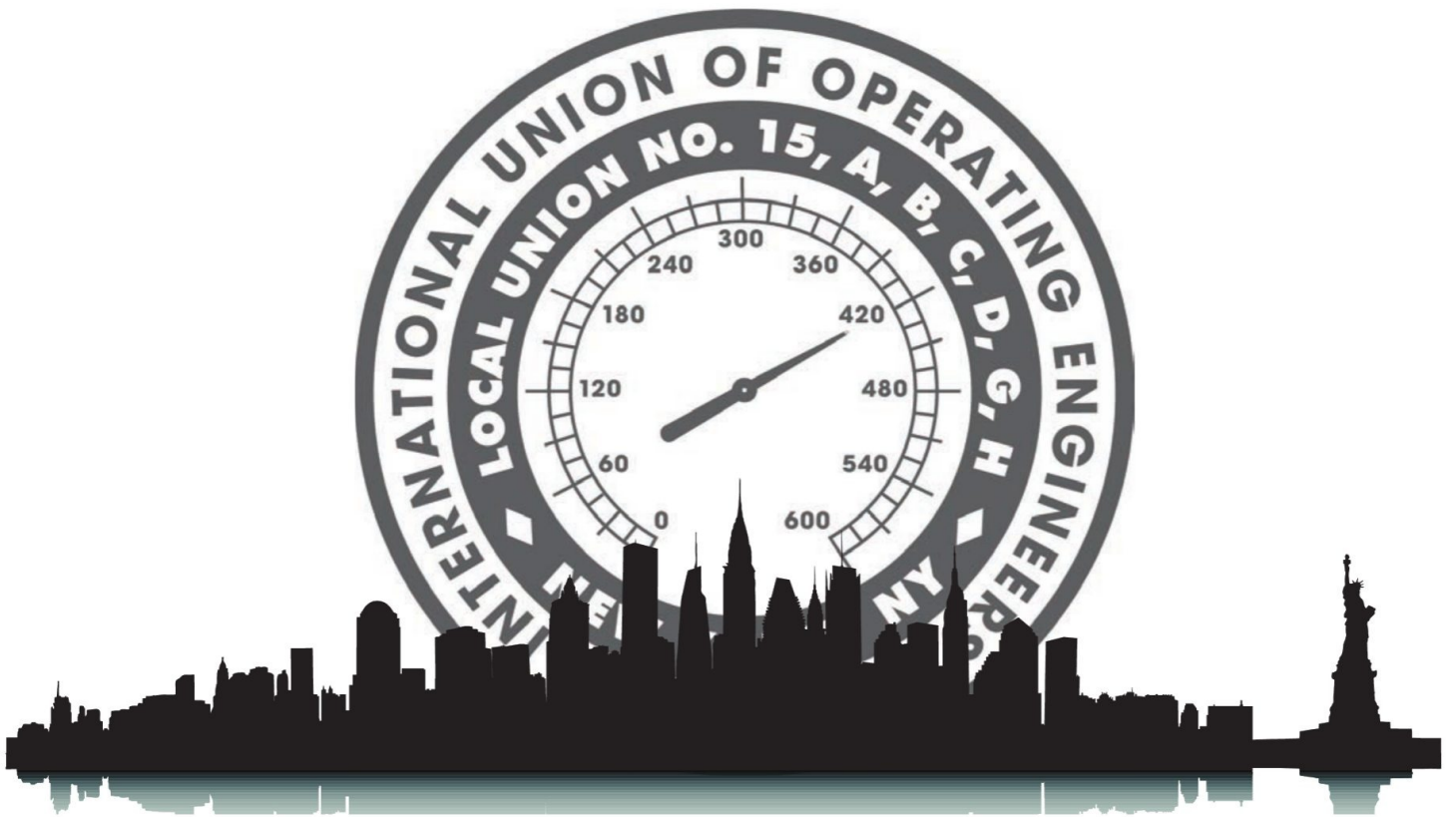

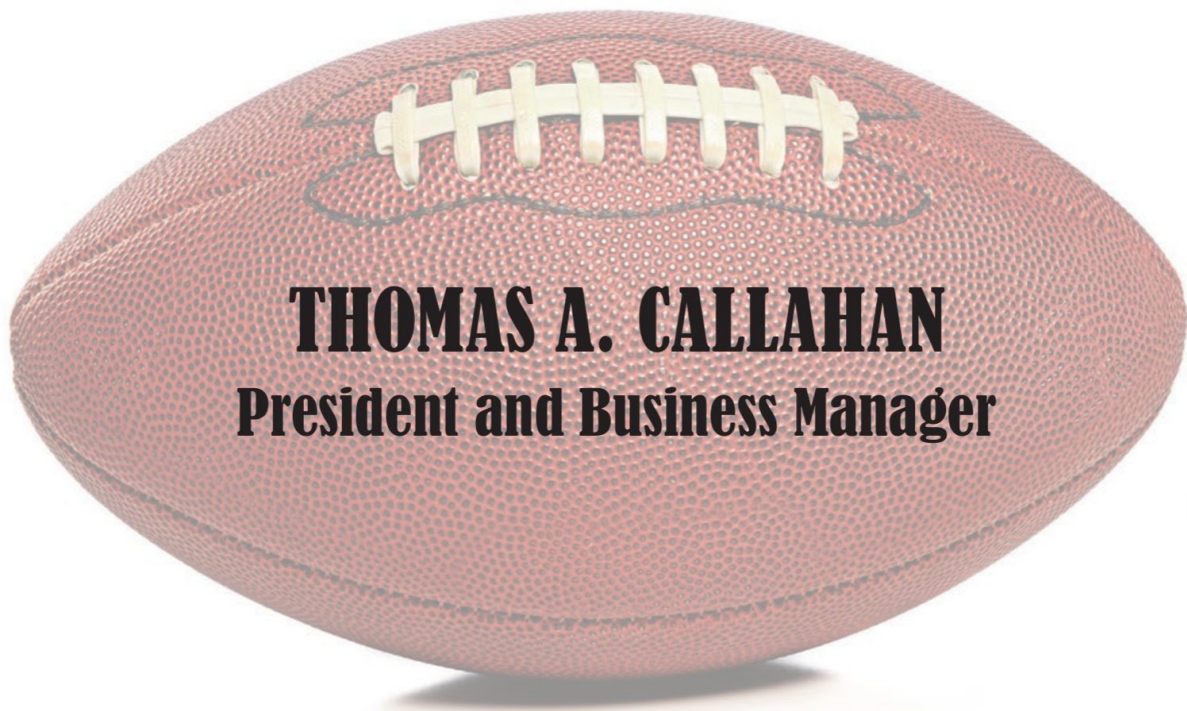

WINSTON HILL'S HALL OF FAME ENTRY IS A FAMILY AFFAIR

Jets Tackle Named to HOF in January, Will Be Enshrined in August 2021

The late Winston Hill was and is a favorite of his immediate family.

"My dad was so beloved," said his daughter, Heather. "He's always been our MVP."

And Hill's extended Jets family has always felt the same.

"Winston and I were the captains of the team back then," center John Schmitt said, "and he was the spiritual leader as well as an All-Pro offensive tackle, a hell of a tackle. He was fantastic, a great teammate and a great guy."

But when Hill's selection for the Pro Football Hall of Fame was revealed in January, his legion of admirers grew exponentially. "Winnie" will be enshrined among the game's all-time greats in Canton, OH, as part of the once-in-a-lifetime Centennial Celebration, which, due to COVID-19, has been rescheduled for August 2021.

Hill's families were concerned that his HOF candidacy might go by the boards. After he retired in 1976, his achievements and honors were well-known — his franchise-record eight all-star berths, his franchise mark for offensive linemen of 195 consecutive games played and 174 straight starts, his No. 75 jersey being retired in 2009,



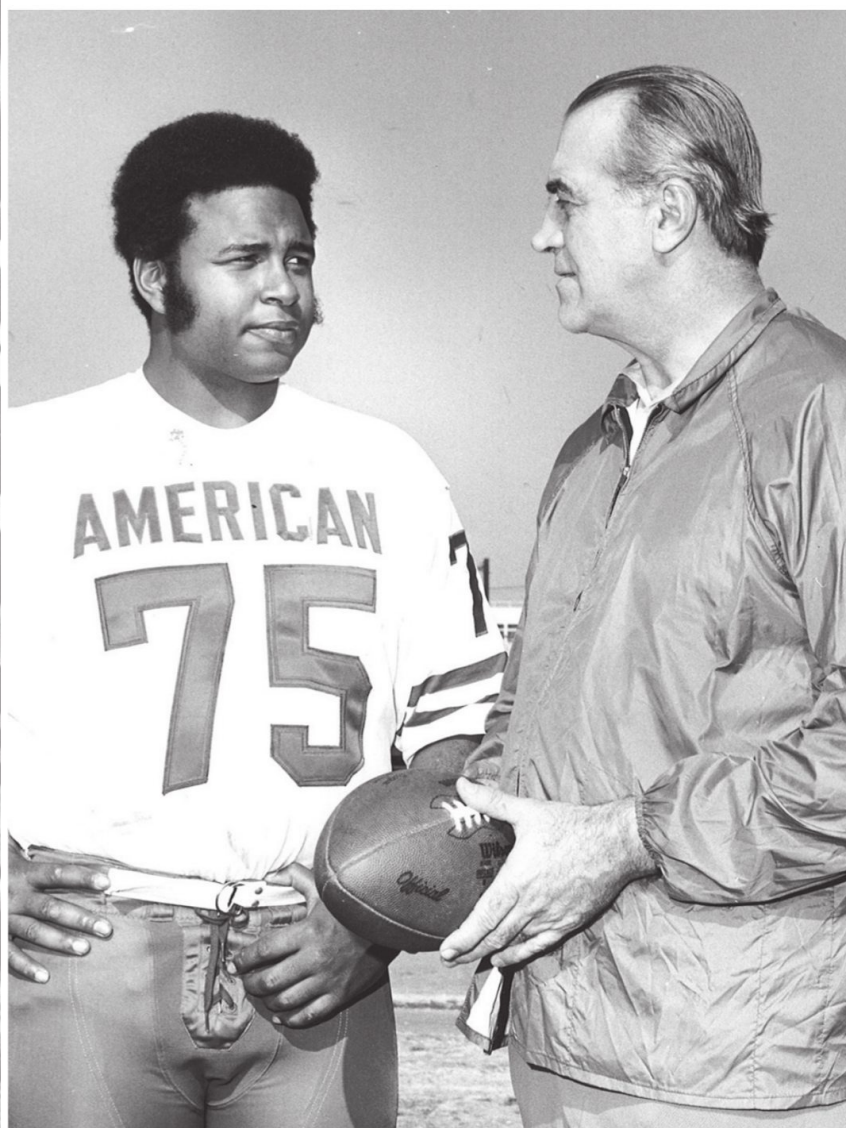


his presence in the Jets' 2010 Ring of Honor inaugural class and on the Jets' All-Time Team revealed last September. And of course there was his Super Bowl III ring.

But he was never a Hall of Fame Modern-Era or Senior Candidate finalist. When he died in 2016, there was a fear he would never enter Canton. However, the NFL's Centennial Celebration, a part of which was the plan for the HOF to select 10 Seniors as members of an expanded Centennial Class of 2020, led to him becoming memorable once more.

"Winston Hill entering the Hall of Fame is one of the greatest days in the history of the New York Jets," said Frank Ramos, the Jets' longtime public relations director. "He was the most honored Jet of all time, but he was an even better husband, father, friend and person. He's been deserving of this honor for so many years and it's a shame that he didn't live to enjoy it, but his family and the Jets family and the Jets fans will cherish this day."

2020 DRAFT CLASS: GOOD QUANTITY, HIGH QUALITY

Mekhi Becton, the Huge, Fast, Nasty Tackle from Louisville, Leads the Way

General manager Joe Douglas stayed true to his word in his first NFL Draft by protecting Sam Darnold with offensive linemen and playmakers while continuing to create the fabric for “the best culture in sports.”

“I think we were able to acquire high-quality players that are high-quality people as well,” Douglas said. “Time will tell how this draft class stacks up, but we feel good now. We feel like our process was true. I feel like everyone was able to check their ego at the door and really have tough conversations. At the end of the day, we were able to find the right players to help the New York Jets. It doesn’t matter who is right, all that matters is that we are right.”

Douglas selected Louisville T Mekhi Becton No. 11 overall with his first pick, marking the first time the Jets drafted a tackle in the first round since D’Brickashaw Ferguson in 2006. Becton (6’7”, 363) is a dancing bear as he ran a 5.1-second 40-yard dash at the NFL Scouting Combine in February. He’s light on his feet in pass protection and plays with a mean streak in the run game.

“I’m clearly the most dominant guy on the field,” Becton said. “I bring a strong edge. I always play with a chip on my shoulder. I promise you this chip is going to stay on my shoulder. It’s not going anywhere. I’m going to keep playing like I never got drafted.”

The Jets rounded out their draft class with eight more players — Baylor WR Denzel Mims, California S Ashtyn Davis, Florida edge rusher Jabari Zuniga, Florida RB La’Mical Perine, Florida International QB James Morgan, Charlotte T Cameron Clark, Virginia CB Bryce Hall and Texas A&M P Braden Mann. 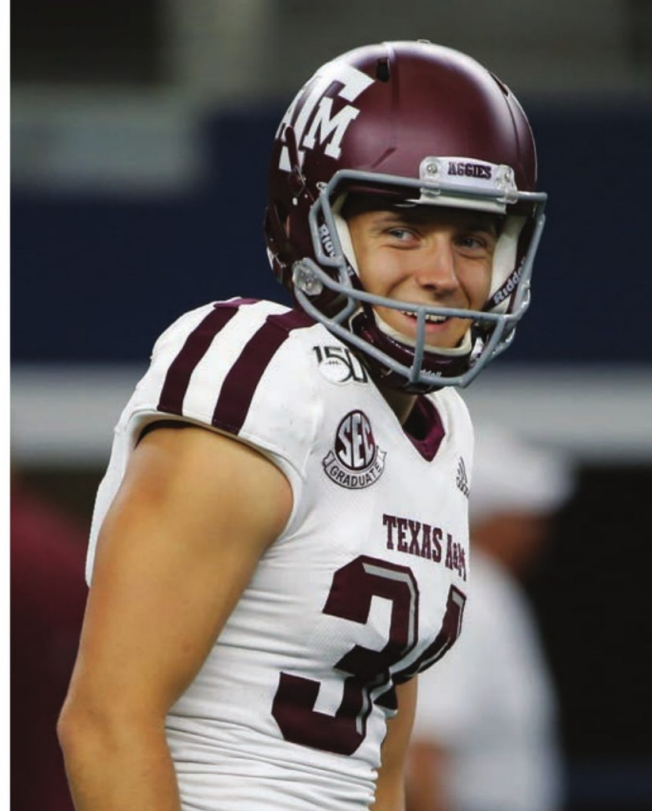

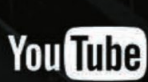

Donations Totaling \$3 Million Help NY/NJ Groups Aid Those Impacted by Virus

The Johnsons and the entire Jets family have made continued efforts throughout the years to donate to local communities and organizations that provide multiple support systems and avenues of relief for people. Jen and Adam Gase, through the Gase Family Foundation in conjunction with the Jets Foundation, purchased 1,000 meals from local restaurants to feed nurses and doctors at Atlantic Health System's Morristown Medical Center.

Additionally, over 400 gift cards for \$100 have been provided to the Morristown Neighborhood House and Pride Academy Charter School to distribute to high-risk families. This year more than ever, these efforts were maximized to help many families in need around the New York and New Jersey areas.

The Jets, along with facing unprecedented social and health challenges this offseason, also continued to fulfill their year-round commitments to such causes as growing youth football and fighting against bullying through new and creative experiences.

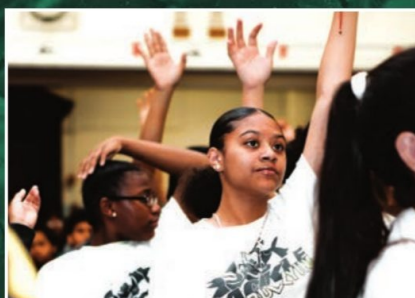

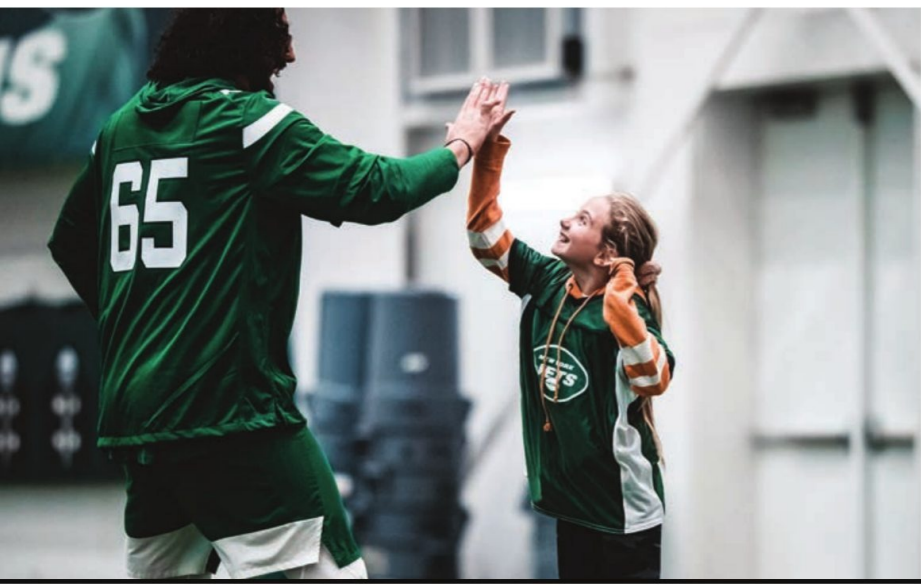

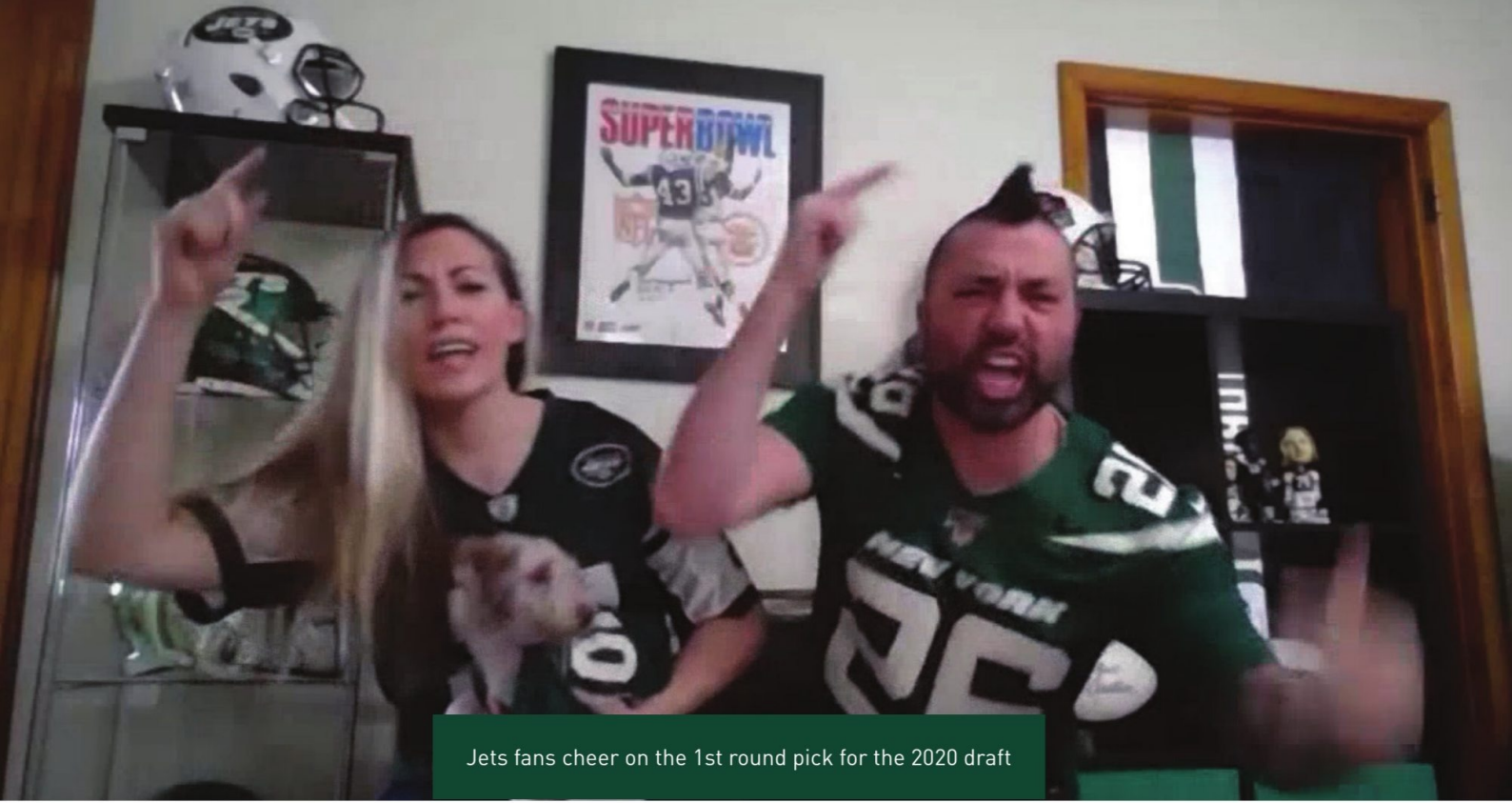
most accurate prediction of first-round picks winning a VIP suite for a future Jets home game. The Green & White hosted a trivia night for season ticket holders and made plans for an encore.

Dan Szpakowski enters his fifth year with the Jets and his ninth in the NFL of providing poignant and impactful images of the New York Jets with inventive methods and superb techniques.

His work can be seen illustrating stories on newyorkjets.com, on the videoboards and video pylons at MetLife Stadium on gamedays, accompanying tweets and stories on the Jets' social media platforms, and of course in the team's annual Yearbook. This offseason has been like no other due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but Szpakowski

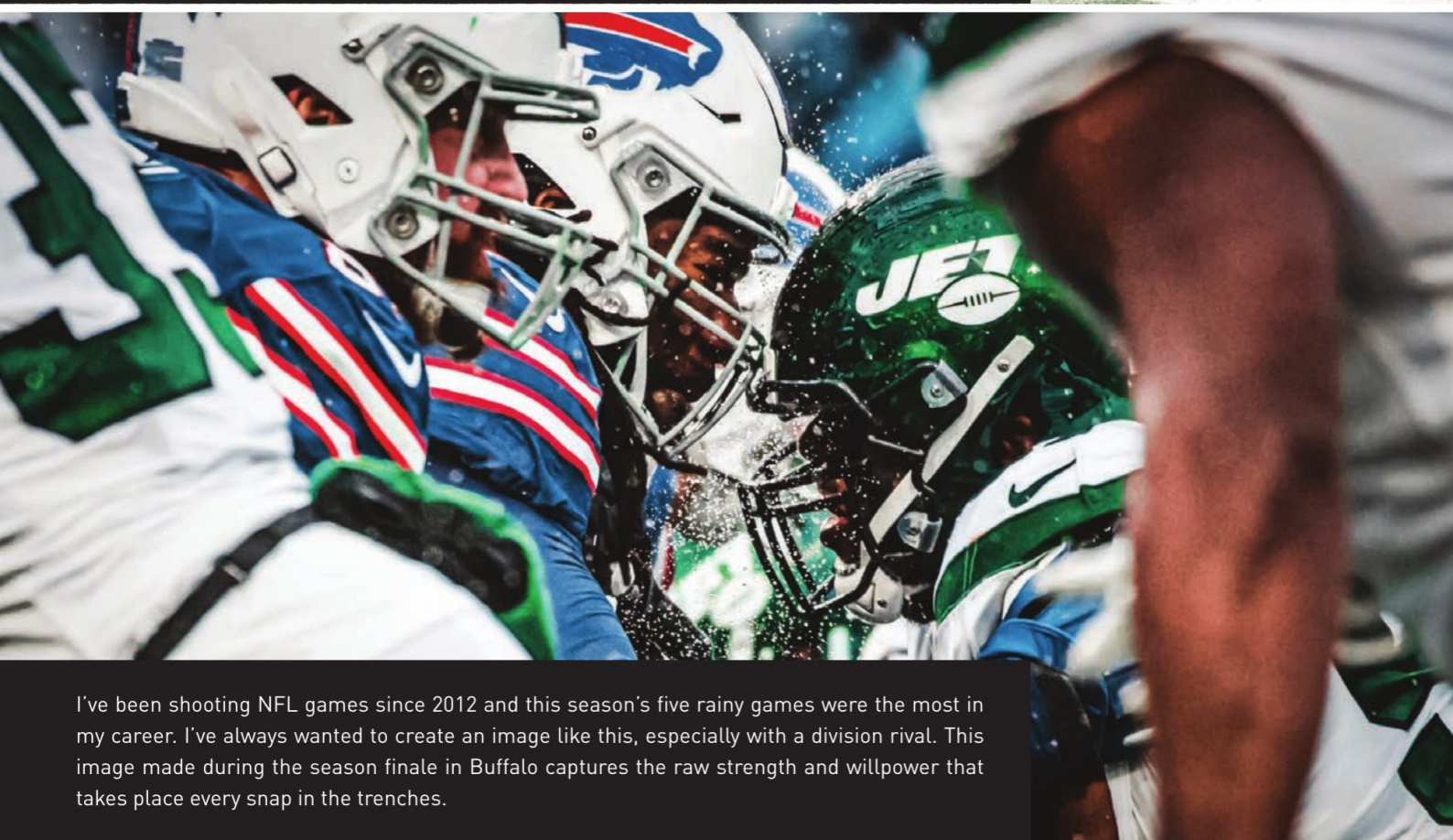
persevered and continued to provide the telling images that will tell the story of the Jets' unfolding 2020 season.

One of the features Szpakowski likes to hang on his "gallery wall" at the end of each season is his "Top Photos of the Year." With very little in the way of great sports photos in the first half of this year, we're presenting Dan's "Top Ten" photos from the 2019 season that he has recommended for Jets fans' enjoyment, plus his comments on some of the thinking that went into each image.

Dan Szpakowski is the lead photographer and photo editor for the 2020 New York Jets Yearbook.



Le'Veon Bell was the center of attention in his heavily anticipated return to football after sitting out the 2018 season. Bell and the Jets hosted their division rivals, the Buffalo Bills, in Week 1 at MetLife Stadium. I love this angle of Bell's first touchdown in green and white because the crowd's reaction is palpable.



I've been shooting NFL games since 2012 and this season's five rainy games were the most in my career. I've always wanted to create an image like this, especially with a division rival. This image made during the season finale in Buffalo captures the raw strength and willpower that takes place every snap in the trenches.



Vyncint Smith didn't budge when I crept within 12 inches of his face to shoot this portrait. I love how raw Smith's emotion is. There's no significant context to it nor was it a big moment in the game. It's just a tight portrait of a veteran free agent trying to earn his keep in the NFL.



It's not common to have one of your favorite photos from preseason pregame warmup. But with the unusual kickoff times for preseason games, the sunlight pushing through the stadium in Atlanta makes it tough to pass up. The point-of-view perspective invites a closer look to try to figure out when and where this image was taken.



The Jets had just lost their second straight game to open the season against the Browns. They played this prime-time contest without QB Sam Darnold, diagnosed with mono days before, and LB C.J. Mosley, one of the team's prized offseason acquisitions, who sustained a groin injury against the Bills. Here Mosley is walking off the field with RB Le'Veon Bell, a former AFC North rival turned teammate in New York. Mosley's leadership was on display despite not being able to suit up.



There is so much emotion to capture as players walk out of the locker room before kickoff. In this instance, I decided to highlight the colors and surroundings instead of a facial expression. I really like this image of Sam Darnold leaving the locker room to take the field against the Cowboys in his return from his bout with mono. The clean all-white uniforms contrast so well with the heavy green ambient light.

Football is the ultimate team game and I'm constantly looking for ways to convey that in a single image. I think this photo of the pregame prayer in Week 5 in Philadelphia exemplifies that.





This is the image I've wanted at MetLife Stadium since I started shooting there over seven years ago. I laid on my stomach for the low angle of the snap and hoped someone would get to the quarterback with the MetLife logo symmetrically placed over the top of the image. Thank you, Jordan Jenkins, for helping me out with this one.



The Jets debuted their Stealth Black uniforms in Week 2 on Monday Night Football against the Browns and I wanted to find a unique way to create an image. I used a star filter on the front of my lens in capturing Marcus Maye crouched in the defensive backs huddle on the field right before kickoff. I really like the way this photo turned out with the stars aligned with his eyes.

Williams' trademark energy, passion and aggressiveness in his first year at the Green & White defensive helm helped the Jets improve their NFL rankings to 2nd in rushing defense and yards allowed/carry, 7th in total defense and 5th in yards allowed/play, and sent S Jamal Adams to Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors. In his most recent post before the Jets, Williams was Cleveland's DC in 2017-18, then assumed the title of interim head coach and guided a team that had gone 3-36-1 in the previous 2½ seasons to a 5-3 finish.

Loggains coordinated a Jets offense that battled year-long injury issues yet showed second-half improvement in QB Sam Darnold's play and in better red zone productivity. In 2018, with Loggains serving as OC on Adam Gase's Miami staff, the Dolphins ranked 9th in the NFL with 4.68 yards/rush and 2nd with 14 TD passes of 20-plus yards. Loggains has served as either coordinator or quarterbacks coach in the league since 2010, with Tennessee, Cleveland and Chicago before his AFC East stops with Miami and the Jets.

A season after being ranked No. 1 in the NFL by several platforms, Boyer's specialists were again in the top 10 and featured Braxton Berrios, who led the league in punt return average much of the season, top tackler Frankie Luvu, and Arthur Maulet and B.J. Bello, each of whom scored a ST touchdown. Boyer came to the Jets from Indianapolis, where he had been the Colts' assistant special teams coach from 2012-15. He began in the NFL coaching ranks as a training camp intern with the Browns in '09 and the Giants in '10.
