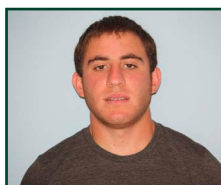

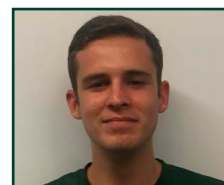

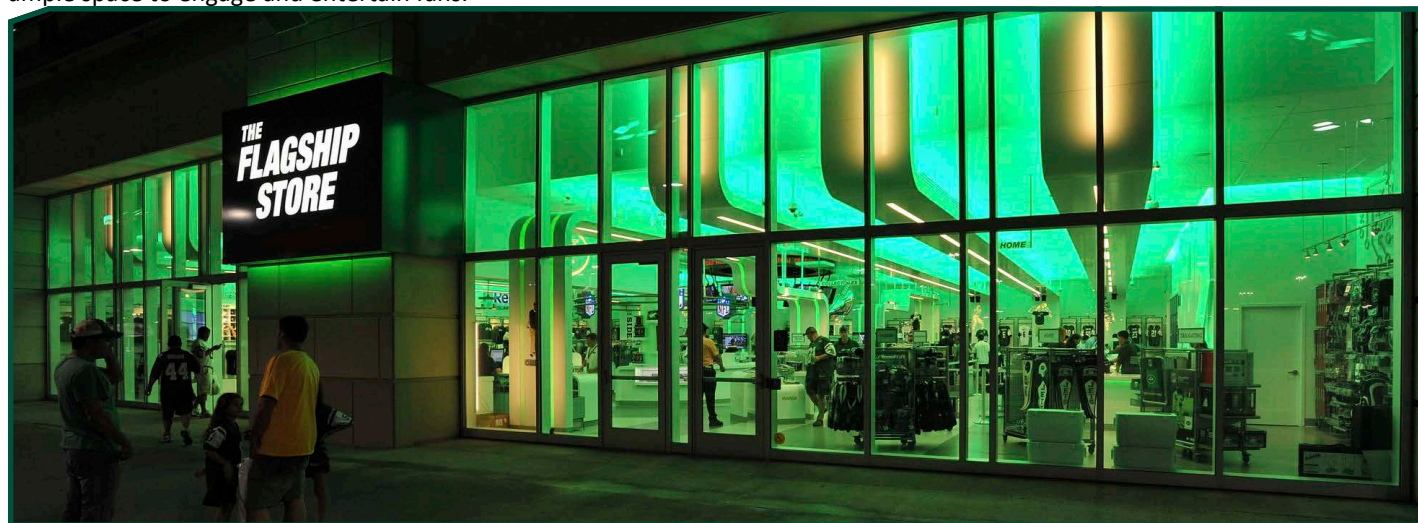

On August 23, 2011, the home of the New York Jets became MetLife Stadium. The insurance company was the first of the four cornerstone partners in the new stadium, which opened in the spring of 2010. MetLife Stadium is one of the highest-profile stadiums in the country with more than 2 million fans attending events every year. On February 2, 2014, MetLife Stadium hosted Super Bowl XLVIII.

From the lighting and LED signage to the massive video boards to the plaza and tailgating options, the stadium bleeds green on Jets gamedays. Travelling to the home of the Jets is quick and easy with three times the number of roadways and a rail stop just outside the stadium.

Once at MetLife Stadium, fans have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game. The ESPN New York - 98.7FM pregame radio show broadcasts live from the west plaza area. Fans can enjoy activities for kids and a vast array of food and beverage. Also, fans can find the latest gear at the team's 10,000 square foot flagship plaza store. MetLife and the cornerstone partners – Bud Light, Pepsi, EMC/SAP and Verizon – are integrated into the game experience with ample space to engage and entertain fans.



Inside there is more food variety and concessions stands all adding up to a “Home Food Advantage” for fans. The intimate seating bowl, uncompromised sight lines, cutting-edge video boards, LED signage and state-of-the-art sound system all enhance the game-watching experience.

One of the biggest upgrades in MetLife Stadium is the availability of club seats. There are four clubs – Chase, Coaches, Metlife 50 and Toyota – that offer access to VIP reserved parking, a private club entrance as well as a host of other amenities and benefits.

- MetLife Stadium has played host to the Top Grossing tours of 2010 – 2015: Bon Jovi, U2, Bruce Springsteen and The E Street Band, Bon Jovi, One Direction, and Taylor Swift respectively.

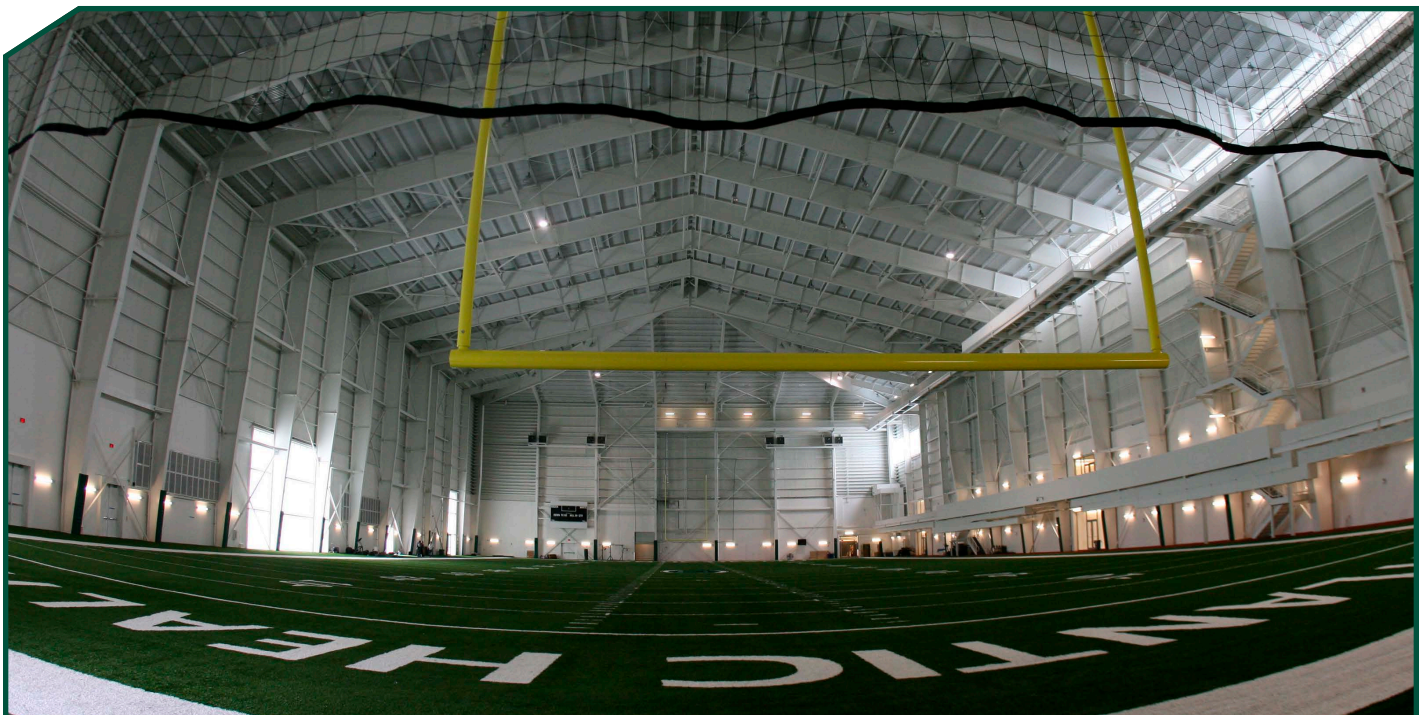

The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center in Florham Park, N.J. is the headquarters of the New York Jets. The team moved into the facility with a formal ribbon-cutting ceremony on September 2, 2008. Located at One Jets Drive, this 224,000 square-foot complex is surrounded by nearly 100 acres of open space and provides players, coaches and staff of the Jets with a state-of-the-art learning, practice and working environment. The facility is a short drive to MetLife Stadium, Newark Liberty International Airport and Morristown Medical Center.

Woody Johnson hired world-renowned architecture firm, Skidmore Owings + Merrill and outlined three key objectives in the design of the training facility. First, as the first true corporate headquarters for the team, the new training center needed to represent the beginning of a new era for the Jets. Previously, the Jets business and football operations were located in separate multi-tenant buildings more than 30 miles apart. The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center is a modern, glass and steel building that seamlessly combines the operations of football and business departments. Serving as the home base for the entire Jets organization, it is equipped with open-concept workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment. The training center was a major contributing factor in the team being named one of Inc. Magazine's Top Small Company Workplaces in 2010. An outdoor terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, provides a business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners.







## ATLANTIC HEALTH JETS TRAINING CENTER HIGHLIGHTS

- 224,000 square-foot facility on a 27-acre campus
- Five full-length fields
- Permanent scoreboards for each field
- More than 75 miles of data cabling
- 5,500 square-foot locker room
- 11,00 square-foot weight room
- 10 state-of-the-art classrooms

- The Players Gallery, consisting of a life-size photo of cheering Jets fans, spans the building's main corridor

Second, the training and medical facilities had to be state-of-the-art, combining the latest advances in rehabilitation pools, high-performance equipment and nutrition. The complex has five full-size football fields; three natural grass, one Sportex synthetic turf field outdoors, and another in the Field House, each with a permanent scoreboard. The goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be repositioned 90 degrees in order to minimize wear on the grass. Inside the complex, the first floor is dedicated to one-hundred yards of football along the "Players Gallery", consisting of a life-size super-panoramic photo of cheering Jets fans that serves as a daily reminder of the tremendous support the Jets receive from our faithful fans. In addition, the first level features a 5,500-square-foot locker room, an 11,000-square-foot weight room, and a 10,000 square foot cafeteria.

Third, the training center needed to be a "graduate school for football." Players and coaches actually spend more time in the classrooms than on the football fields themselves. To that end, there is more than 25,000 square feet of space dedicated to classrooms and instruction space – including 10 classrooms. The classroom atrium is located just steps from the practice fields, with direct access to both the indoor and outdoor fields.

2016 will be the third year, and second since 2011, the Jets will host training camp at Atlantic Health Jets Training Center. The site, since 2009, has hosted mini-camps and organized team activities that were open to fans. The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center is evidence of the team's commitment to excellence, providing the organization with a competitive advantage and a new community to call home.

In 2016, the New York Jets and USA Football announced a new league within NFL FLAG powered by USA Football with the New York City Police Athletic League (PAL). Through a \$40,000 donation from the Jets Foundation, 1,200 New York City youth will have the opportunity to play flag football at no cost. All participants will be given a free Jets NFL FLAG jersey and top teams in each division will have their entry fee to the New York City area's 2016 Regional NFL Flag tournament covered by the Jets.

### SNY Play Ball: Football Week



The New York Jets have teamed up with our television partner, SNY, to offer support for youth football leagues in our community through SNY Play Ball: Football Week. SNY Play Ball offers leagues the opportunity to receive new footballs, tickets to a Jets preseason game, attend an exclusive youth football clinic, and volunteer with league projects in our local community. In addition, one eligible organization will receive a \$5,000 grant to be put toward new equipment for the upcoming season. The program will culminate in "Play Ball Week," where SNY will honor and highlight individuals and selected organizations daily on the television network and website. ### Jets Heads Up! – Public Schools Athletic League



In 2001, the New York Jets formed a community partnership with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. The Jets and the PSAL expanded this partnership in 2005 and titled it Heads Up!

Through an annual matching grant from the NFL's Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets now donate \$150,000 to the PSAL's football programs. This grant has helped to create 15 new and developmental foot-

ball teams. The funding also assisted in the creation of the first-ever PSAL female Varsity Flag Football League, the reconditioning of every student-athletes' helmet, two New York Jets PSAL \$5,000 college scholarships, and the expansion of C.H.A.M.P.S. Middle School Flag Football League to more than 200 programs throughout the New York City public school system. The Jets also annually fund the cost for PSAL coaches to become USA Football Heads Up certified. Beyond these grants, the Jets support the PSAL in a variety of other ways including honoring the PSAL football champions at a home game during the NFL season.

### High School Coach of the Week



The Jets have been a proud participant in the NFL High School Coach of the Week program since 1996. The Jets present the award weekly to a coach in the local tri-state area who best serves the interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to their community, school and student-athletes. Each winner is awarded a \$1,000 grant for their high school's football program. In addition to the Coach of the Week awards, a Coach of the Year will be selected at the end of the



high school season and awarded a \$2,000 grant.

### JETS PLAY 60 EQUIPPED BY MODEL'S



The New York Jets have taken a stance in the fight against childhood obesity through fitness and nutrition programs under the Jets PLAY 60 platform



equipped by Modell's, which encourages children to get 60 minutes of activity every day. Our partnership brings together the Jets passion for helping children live healthy lives and Modell's vision to make sports accessible to everyone, as well as their commitment to programs that support families, youth, education, and physical activity. The Jets are proud to partner with Modell's to enhance our PLAY 60 initiative by bringing their product to our valued community partners in order to help the children we work with reach their full potential.

## Jets PLAY 60 Equipped by Modell's School Program

The Jets PLAY 60 equipped by Modell's School Program has annually partner with 10 local New Jersey schools to challenge students to get 60 minutes of activity every day over a four-week period. Each student participating in the PLAY 60 equipped by Modell's School Program will receive a Jets and Modell's branded game planner to track their minutes. Each planner will also include a Modell's coupon. The top male and female performing students in school will receive two tickets to the Jets PLAY 60 Game equipped by Modell's on October 2nd against the Seattle Seahawks and be recognized on field for their achievement. The campaign asks schools to challenge their students to get 60 minutes of physical activity every day and invites schools to submit their most creative cafeteria meal menus to determine which New Jersey schools each year that go above and beyond state and federal guidelines. The Jets and ADANE provide grants to the winning schools, which can be used for cafeteria infrastructure improvements and physical education equipment.

One "Grand Champion" winning school is awarded a \$15,000 grant and a visit from the program's spokesperson, Jets kicker, Nick Folk. Three schools are awarded "Division Champion" grants of \$5,000 and a Jets player visit. In addition, we award a "Regular Season Champion" in the fall that will receive a "surprise" visit at their school by Nick Folk delivering tickets for eight (8) student and staff representatives to attend and be recognized at the Jets football game at MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford.

## Fuel Up to PLAY 60 Hometown Grants



Through the Fuel Up to PLAY 60 program, the New York Jets and American Dairy Association Northeast are offering a \$5,000 Hometown Grants to an eligible school in Nassau County and Suffolk County that best showcase how their students stay active for 60 minutes per day, as well as provide increased access to school breakfast and ensure their students are fueled to learn. Grants will be awarded to one school in each county to help facilitate sustainable physical activity and eating improvements. Schools not already enrolled in the Fuel Up to PLAY 60 program can enroll at [www.fueluptoplay60.com](http://www.fueluptoplay60.com) and complete the online grant application. Fuel Up to Play 60 is an in-school nutrition and physical activity program launched by National Dairy Council and National Football League, with additional support from the US Department of Agriculture. The program encourages youth to consume nutrient-rich foods and achieve at least 60 minutes of physical activity every day. Proper nutrition and consistent physical activity are both necessities for maintaining a healthy child.

## American Heart Association Jets PLAY 60 Challenge Equipped by Modell's

The American Heart Association and the National Football League have teamed up to create the PLAY 60 Challenge, a program that inspires kids to get the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity a day.

The PLAY 60 Challenge is an in-school curriculum created by the National Football League and the American Heart Association that has been implemented locally between the Jets, Modell's, and several schools in Morris County, New Jersey, the home of the Jets training facility. Childhood obesity





rates are at an all-time high: today, nearly one in three kids and teens in the United States are obese or overweight. Physical activity produces overall physical, psychological and social benefits, while research suggests that inactive children are likely to become inactive adults. This program helps schools become environments that encourage physically active lifestyles year-round. ## Hometown Huddle

In 2015 the New York Jets donated \$45,000 to build a PLAY 60 Fitness Zone at Dover Middle School. Since 1999, Hometown Huddle has helped to help make a difference in local NFL communities.



## PLAY 60 Challenge at Generation Jets Academy



The primary goal of Generation Jets Academy is to provide elementary school students with enjoyable learning experiences that enhance their literacy and math skills, creativity, community awareness and self-esteem. This education initiative provides students with personalized attention from caring and creative teach-

ers and a 50 percent increase in learning time each day. Generation Jets Academy is operated by the Gary Klinsky Children's Centers of the Brooklyn Community Services.

Throughout the year, the Jets implement the PLAY 60 Challenge at Generation Jets Academy. Students attend field trips to enrich their lives as incentives for participation in the program. Generation Jets Academy is located at the Ethan Allen School (P.S. 306) in East New York, Brooklyn.

## CHARITABLE PARTNERSHIPS

### Atlantic Health Jets Women's Organization



In 2008, the Jets Women's Organization and Atlantic Health partnered to form the Atlantic Health Jets Women's Organization (AHJWO). Through this partnership, the AHJWO can accomplish its mission of working together to build goodwill in the tri-state community through active volunteer participation. The Jets Community Relations Department oversees the organization with the assistance of Dana Glat, wife of the Jets team president, Taneka Bowles, wife of the Jets head coach, and Betty Maccagnan, wife of the Jets general manager.

The AHJWO serves as a unique and positive outlet in the community on behalf of the New York Jets and seeks to team up with select charities to assist in maximizing the impact of their events. The work of the AHJWO would not be possible without the partnership with Atlantic Health.

### United Way

## Marty Lyons Award



2013 Ring of Honor inductee, Marty Lyons, a former All-American defensive tackle from the University of Alabama, played the entirety of his 12-year NFL career with the New York Jets as a member of the feared "Sack Exchange." In 1984 Marty Lyons was named the National Football League's Man of the Year and in 1990 the New York Jets renamed their Outstanding Community Service Award the Marty Lyons Award because of Lyons' commitment to the

community. Early in his career, Lyons befriended and became a surrogate father to a 3-year-old boy suffering from an advanced illness. Three years later, in the spring of 1982, the youngster's death coincided with the sudden death of Lyons' father and the birth of his first child, a healthy son. These experiences profoundly affected Lyons' outlook on life, fame and philanthropy. With the encouragement and the assistance of his family and friends, he established a foundation dedicated to granting wishes of seriously ill children. Incorporated in 1982, the Marty Lyons Foundation helps to lift children's spirits and lets the magic of hope lead their thoughts and dreams for the future. More than 7,100 wishes have been granted to children suffering from life threatening or terminal illnesses since the foundation's inception. The Marty Lyons Award is presented each year to a New York Jets player that gives from the heart through charity and community involvement (as voted by Jets staff).

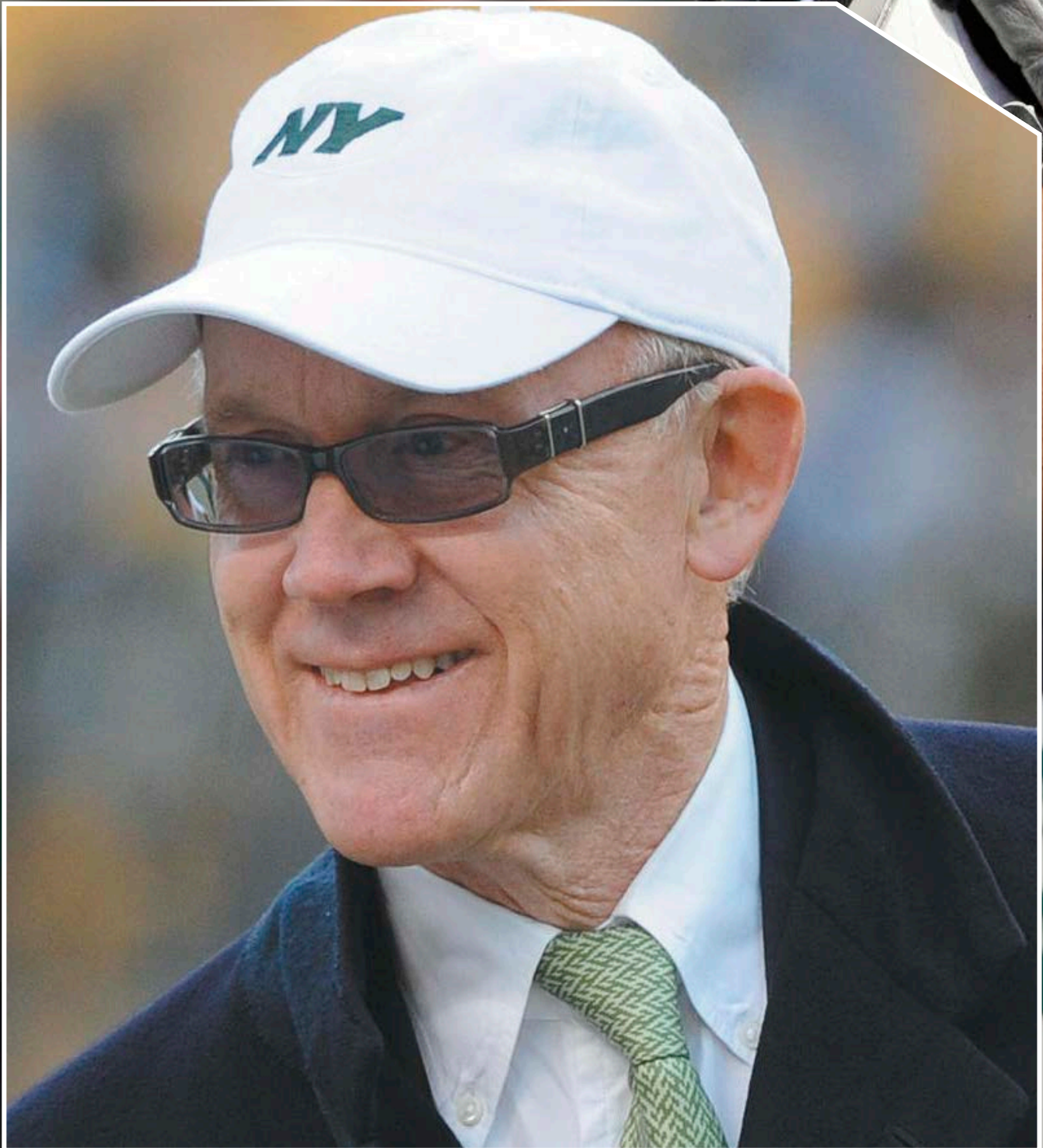

# WOODY JOHNSON

Woody Johnson, a fourth-generation member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family's proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, civic leader and compassionate philanthropist. As an owner of the New York Jets, Johnson continues his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new home field. His improvements to the franchise include: building a competitive team each season, a world-class training complex, and a 21st-century sports stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets posted nine winning seasons, appeared in 12 postseason games, played two AFC championship games, and captured an AFC East title.

Johnson's philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in enriching the greater community. In this spirit, the New York Jets Foundation funds programs such as PLAY 60 Eat Right Move More to help teach children the importance of good health habits, enhance educational experiences, and support the region's disabled and disadvantaged residents.

Johnson serves as a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation's largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and advancing healthcare. The Foundation aims to prompt new public policy, inspire action from the private sector, and improve the delivery of the best health care to the most people.

Johnson's healthcare initiatives also include support for lupus research. In 1999, Johnson founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (ALR), an organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. The ALR-funded International SLE Genetics Initiative recently uncovered several of the genes associated with lupus. ALR-funded research laid the foundation for development of 30% of all lupus drugs currently in the clinical-trial pipeline.

In Washington, D.C., Johnson has been a strong advocate for increased government spending for medical research. He helped initiate the campaign "The Only Remedy Is a Cure," transforming the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF) from a small, non-profit group into the largest private medical entity focused on finding a cure for diabetes.

Johnson is active in local philanthropy and civic affairs, serving as a board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center. He also lends his time and talents to the Council on Foreign Relations, and the Peregrine Fund, and is an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society.

to raise awareness about the devastating impact of bullying in area schools. Additionally, the year-round fan engagement calendar implemented during Glat's tenure continues to see great fan participation and partner involvement at events like the Town Hall, Movie Night, Jets House, and the Jets Cruise.

Prior to joining the Jets, Glat was the National Football League's Senior Vice President of Corporate Development. Glat headed a department responsible for League strategic initiatives, new business development, Club business development, and stadium development. Glat's Club business development activities entailed initiating and overseeing the League efforts to help grow revenues for all 32 NFL Clubs. His stadium development activities included advancing numerous successful new stadium projects and the League's G-3 and G-4 stadium financing programs. Also, he conceptualized and secured approval for the launch of the NFL venture capital fund. Glat worked at the NFL from 1997-2012.

Glat received a J.D. from Harvard Law School after graduating with a degree in Economics from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania.





# MIKE MACCAGNAN

GENERAL MANAGER



EXPERIENCE: NFL: 19th • JETS: 2nd

Mike Maccagnan was named General Manager of the New York Jets by team Chairman & CEO Woody Johnson on January 13, 2015.

In his first season as a General Manager, Maccagnan was named NFL Executive of the Year by the *Pro Football Writers Association* after he acquired seven players that earned starting roles and helped the team win 10 games - six more than the previous season. Two (Brandon Marshall & Darrell Revis) of the seven new starters earned Pro Bowl recognition in 2015. Marshall, who was acquired for a 2015 fifth-round draft pick, earned team MVP honors and established new club records for receptions (109) and receiving yards (1,434) while he tied the Jets record for most receiving touchdowns (14). Revis, who signed as an unrestricted free agent, led the club with nine takeaways (five interceptions and four fumble recoveries). Revis' nine takeaways tied for the second most in the NFL.

During the 2015 offseason, Maccagnan also traded for quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick, who established a new Jets record for passing touchdowns in a single season (31) and led the team to 10 wins, the most by a Jets starting quarterback since 2010 when Mark Sanchez led the club to 11. Fitzpatrick earned two team awards, the Kyle Clifton "Good Guy" Award given by the Jets staff to acknowledge his exceptionally consistent willingness, cooperation and professionalism in daily interaction with various departments within the organization, and the Ed Block Courage Award, an honor voted on by his teammates, recognizing his perseverance and dedication in recovering from a broken leg suffered in Week 15 of 2014 while playing with Houston.

Prior to his arrival in Florham Park, Maccagnan spent more than 20 years in scouting, including the last four as the director of college scouting for the Houston Texans. After a thorough interview process in January of 2015, Johnson had the following to say about hiring Maccagnan, "We interviewed a number of im-

pressive, qualified candidates, but Mike Maccagnan clearly stood out. Mike's attention to detail, strong personnel background and collaborative approach to evaluating players made it clear that he is the right choice to be the next General Manager of the New York Jets. We are proud to welcome Mike to the organization and I am confident that he will help us build a winning team."

Maccagnan joined Houston in 2000 shortly after the expansion franchise was awarded. One of Charley Casserly's original hires as Texans general manager, he spent his first 10 seasons with the club as the coordinator of college scouting before twice being promoted by current general manager Rick Smith, first to assistant director of college scouting in 2010 and



then to the director of college scouting the following season.

He had a hand in every draft in Texans franchise history, selecting or signing an undrafted rookie free agent Pro Bowler at every position group with the exception of quarterback and specialist. RB Arian Foster (undrafted rookie free agent), WRs Andre Johnson (first-round pick) and Jacoby Jones (third-round pick), TE Owen Daniels (fourth-round pick), LT Duane Brown (first-round pick), DE J.J. Watt (first-round pick), DE Mario Williams (first-round pick), DE Jason Babin (first-round pick), LBs Brian Cushing (first-round pick) and DeMeco Ryans (second-round pick), CB Tramon Williams (undrafted rookie free agent) and S Glover Quin (fourth-round pick) were added to the roster and went on to make at least one Pro Bowl appearance in their careers.

Despite selecting just two offensive linemen before the third round since 2008, Maccagnan helped add talent to a position group that cracked the top 10 in fewest sacks allowed (eighth), rushing yards (eighth) and fewest turnovers (10th). In 2014, 65 percent of the Texans offensive line starters joined the team as a result of the draft or as an undrafted rookie free agent.

Maccagnan began his career in the NFL as a training camp intern with the Washington Redskins (1990) and later re-joined the team in 1994 as a college scout before spending the next five seasons as a pro scout.

Prior to returning to Washington, Maccagnan served as a league scout for the World Football League at it's office in Dallas, joining the London Monarchs the following year for the team's championship run. He also spent time in the Canadian Football League, first with the Ottawa Rough Riders and later with the Saskatchewan Roughriders.

Married to wife, Betty, Maccagnan is a native of Hightstown, NJ, and holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Trinity College.

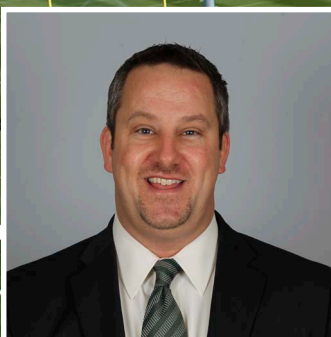

# JESSICA MANDLER

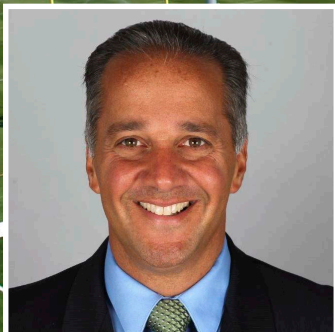

# MATT BAZIRGAN

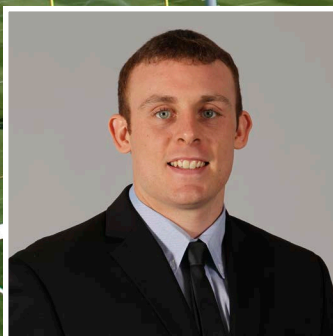
DIRECTOR, PRO SCOUTING

# TODD BOWLES

HEAD COACH

HOMETOWN: Elizabeth, NJ

## CAREER

Todd Bowles, the 16th full-time head coach in franchise history, returns for his second season after leading the team to a 10-6 record in 2015, a six-win improvement from the previous season.

Taking over a four-win team, the coaching moves did not stop with Bowles last season. His first season saw changes at both offensive and defensive coordinator, as Offensive Coordinator Chan Gailey and Defensive Coordinator Kacy Rodgers were brought in to implement new systems. Despite these changes to both scheme and personnel, the Jets finished 10th in the league in total offense and fourth in total defense, one of just five teams in the league with a top 10 finish on both sides of the ball.

For Bowles, the key to having a successful team comes from executing in four key areas: running the ball, third down, red zone and turnovers. Last season, the Jets ranked in the top-third of the NFL in three of the four major offensive categories and in the top three in all four major defensive categories, improving the team's rank from 2014 in seven of the eight. The Jets also established a new franchise record mark for the fewest rushing yards allowed per game in a single season.

Bowles began his head coaching tenure by winning four of his first five games before dropping four of five to even the season record at 5-5. With the season at a crossroads, Bowles guided the club to five straight wins, ultimately finishing short of the postseason after dropping the season finale.

"He'll tell you exactly where you stand, where you have to get better," said Woody Johnson, CEO and Chairman, following the conclusion of the 2016 season. "I think players appreciate that. Sometimes it's not pleasant, but you'd rather hear it. He went over some of these rough patches during the year and I think from a leadership standpoint, the team hung together. You could see that and it evolved. Toward the end of the year I could see the team becoming stronger."

Prior to rejoining the Jets, Bowles served as the defensive coordinator for the Cardinals (2013-14), earning Assistant Coach of the Year recognition in 2014 from both the Pro Football Writers of America and The Associated Press, the first ever recipient of the AP award. During his time with Arizona, the Cardinals defense ranked in the top five in the league in

several statistical categories, including third in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed (14), fifth in points per game allowed (19.5) and fifth in rushing yards per game allowed (96.6). Also, Bowles' defenses demonstrated a knack for causing turnovers and returning them for scores. During his tenure, the Cardinals ranked first in defensive touchdowns (nine) and fifth in interceptions (38).

In 2014, despite key losses to injury, Arizona's defense remained among the league's best and helped the Cardinals tie their highest win total in franchise history with 11. The defense ranked fifth in the NFL in points per game allowed (18.7), tied for fifth in fewest touchdowns surrendered (32), tied for third in interceptions returned for touchdowns (three) and tied for fifth in turnover margin (+8).

During Bowles' first season as Arizona's defensive coordinator in 2013, his defense immediately developed into one of the most stout units in the NFL. The Cardinals finished the 2013 campaign with 10 wins, led by the league's sixth-ranked overall defense with 317.4 yards per game allowed. Arizona finished with the NFL's No. 1 rushing defense for the first time in franchise history, surrendering 84.4 yards per game, improving from 28th in the league in 2012. Additionally, the Cardinals defense ranked seventh in points allowed per game (20.3), sixth with 30 takeaways and fifth with 20 interceptions. The team's 47.0 sacks in 2013 were good for the third highest in a season in team history.

Under Bowles' tutelage, three different Cardinals defensive players were named to the Pro Bowl. Most notably, cornerback Patrick Peterson made the Pro Bowl both seasons and was recognized as a first-team Associated Press All-Pro in 2013. Defensive end Calais Campbell was named to his first Pro Bowl in 2014 and earned second-team All-Pro honors. In 2013, linebacker Karlos Dansby earned second-team All-Pro honors and linebacker John Abraham was a Pro Bowler after accumulating a team-leading 11.5 sacks, the most by a linebacker in a single season in team history.

Prior to joining the Cardinals, Bowles coached in Philadelphia (2012), Miami (2008-11), Dallas (2005-07) and Cleveland (2001-04) after his start with the Jets (2000).

With the Eagles, he began the season coaching the team's de-

fensive backs for the first six games before being appointed interim defensive coordinator for the final 10 contests. The Eagles finished ninth in the NFL in pass defense (216.9 ypg.) that season.

Before his time with the Eagles, he spent four seasons with the Dolphins, serving as the team's assistant head coach/secondary. In 2011, he was named interim head coach for the final three games, leading the club to a 2-1 record. In his time with the Dolphins, opposing quarterbacks completed just 58.1% of their passes, the seventh-lowest total in the league, while safety Jeremiah Bell (2009) made his only Pro Bowl appearance in that span.

Prior to his time with Miami, he reunited with Head Coach Bill Parcells (who as the director of football operations for the Jets in 2000 hired Bowles to his first coaching job in the NFL) as the secondary coach for the Cowboys from 2005-07. During that span, the Dallas defense totaled 52 interceptions, tied for third-most in the NFC, and ranked fifth in the NFC by holding opposing offenses to 310.4 total yards per game. He coached three defensive backs to a total of five Pro Bowls in Dallas, including three appearances by safety Roy Williams and the first career trips for safety Ken Hamlin and cornerback Terence Newman.

From 2001-04, Bowles was a defensive assistant for Cleveland, serving as the secondary coach (2004) and defensive nickel package coach (2001-03). In 2004, the Browns ranked fifth in the NFL in passing yards allowed with 181.3 yards per game. His first year with Cleveland in 2001, the Browns defense set a franchise record with 33 interceptions, including 28 picks by the secondary.

Bowles got his start in the NFL coaching ranks in 2000 as the Jets defensive backs coach and mentored a secondary that was ranked sixth in the NFL in pass defense, allowing 183.3 yards per game.

Before beginning his NFL coaching career, Bowles was recruited by his former Redskins teammate, quarterback Doug Williams, despite never having coached at any level, to serve as the defensive coordinator/secondary coach at Morehouse College in 1997 and then as the defensive coordinator/secondary coach at Grambling State from 1998-99.

After his retirement as a player, Bowles spent two seasons (1995-96) with the Green Bay Packers player personnel department under General Manager Ron Wolf, working alongside five current NFL general managers, John Dorsey, Scot McCloughan, Reggie McKenzie, John Schneider and Ted Thompson.

Despite going undrafted in the 1986 NFL Draft, Bowles, the four-year letterman and team captain out of Temple (1982-85), played in 117 regular-season games at cornerback and safety and registered 15 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries in his eight-year career playing for the Washington Redskins (1986-90, 1992-93) and the San Francisco 49ers (1991). He was a starter on the 1987 Redskins championship team that defeated the Denver Broncos, 42-10, in Super Bowl XXII.

The New Jersey native, who grew up 22 miles from the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, and his wife, Taneka, have three sons, Todd, Jr., Troy and Tyson.

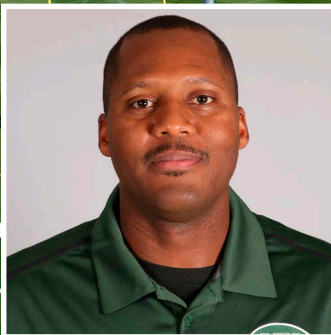

# MIKE CALDWELL

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH / INSIDE LINEBACKERS

## CAREER

Mike Caldwell returns for his second season as the team's assistant head coach/linebackers coach. In his first season, Caldwell was part of a defense that set a franchise record with just 83.4 rushing yards per game allowed, as two of his linebackers, **DAVID HARRIS** and Demario Davis, finished first and second on the team in total tackles with 128 and 118, respectively.

Prior to joining the Jets, Caldwell oversaw a Cardinals linebacker group that contributed to a defense (coordinated by Todd Bowles) that ranked fifth in points allowed per game in 2015 (18.7) despite the key losses of inside linebackers Karlos Dansby (free agency) and Daryl Washington (injury).

In 2013, Arizona's defense finished as the NFL's sixth-ranked overall unit and featured the league's top-ranked run defense (84.4 yards per game) after allowing the fewest rushing yards in team history for a 16-game season (1,351). The Cardinals also had 47 sacks, the third-highest total in franchise history, and 30 takeaways, including 20 interceptions which tied for the fifth-best total in the NFL.

After serving as a training camp coaching intern with the Eagles in 2007, Caldwell began his coaching career as a defensive quality control coach with Philadelphia in 2008. He was promoted to assistant linebackers coach in 2010 and elevated to linebackers coach in 2011. During his first season overseeing the linebackers, Caldwell helped develop several young players into key roles, including Jamar Chaney, who intercepted three passes to go along with a team-leading 104 tackles. He also integrated two rookies into the rotation – sixth-round pick Brian Rolle, who started 13 games, and fourth-rounder Casey Matthews. In 2012, Caldwell oversaw standout linebacker DeMeco Ryans, who led the team with 113 tackles, including 15 tackles for loss.

During his 11-year playing career at linebacker, Caldwell was a special teams standout with Cleveland (1993-95), Baltimore (1996), Arizona (1997), Philadelphia (1998-2001), Chicago (2002) and Carolina (2003), having played in 159 career regular-season games, posting 14.5 sacks and eight INTs and receiving Special Teams MVP honors from his Eagles teammates in 1998.

Caldwell earned his degree from Middle Tennessee State in business administration. He and his wife, Sue, have two daughters, Sydnei and Saniah, and a son, Simeon. His niece, Nikki, is the head women's basketball coach at LSU.

# BRANT BOYER

SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR

## CAREER

Brant Boyer was named the special teams coordinator for Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff on February 2, 2016 after serving as an assistant special teams coach with the Colts for the last four seasons. Boyer reunites with Bowles, who served as the defensive nickel package coach with the Browns during his final three seasons in the NFL.

During his tenure in Indianapolis (2012-15), Boyer aided a Colts special teams unit that ranked in the top 10 league-wide during that span in net punting average (third), kickoff return average (fourth), kickoff touchbacks (fourth) and field goal percentage (seventh), despite using three different players as primary punt returners and four different kick returners in his four seasons.

In 2014, both punter Pat McAfee and kicker Adam Vinatieri received Associated Press First-Team NFL All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors under Boyer as McAfee converted a career-high three onside kicks and set single-season franchise records for punts pinned inside the 20-yard line (30), net punting average (42.8) and kickoff touchbacks (70), while Vinatieri made 30-of-31 field goals, including 35 consecutive attempts, the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

In 2013, Boyer coached Matt Overton to his first career Pro Bowl selection, one year after discovering the long snapper at a specialists combine in Arizona and bringing him to Indianapolis for a workout prior to his signing in April of 2012.

Prior to joining the Colts, Boyer was twice a training camp intern, first for the Cleveland Browns (2009) and later for the New York Giants (2010).

Before entering the coaching ranks, Boyer played linebacker and was a stand-out on special teams for the Miami Dolphins (1994), Jacksonville Jaguars (1995-2000) and Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He served as a special teams captain for both the Jaguars and Browns and led the unit in tackles in 2002 and 2003. Boyer was a two-time member of USA Today's All-Joe Team, once as a linebacker and once as a special teams player. In 2002, his teammates selected him for the Cleveland Browns Unsung Hero Award.

Boyer played in 129 career games and totaled 250 tackles, 13.0 sacks, six interceptions, one forced fumble and 15 passes defended. He originally entered the league as a sixth-round selection of the Miami Dolphins in the 1994 NFL Draft.

Before entering the NFL, Boyer, an inside linebacker and team captain at the University of Arizona, led the team in tackles during his senior season, helping the Wildcats to their first 10-win season in 90 years and a victory in the 1993 Fiesta Bowl, earning a place in the school's Ring of Honor.

Boyer and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Brayton and Braddock.

# CHAN GAILEY

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

## CAREER

Chan Gailey returns for his second season as the Jets offensive coordinator after a record-setting 2015 campaign saw the franchise set new marks for total offense (5,925), passing offense (4,057) and pass completions (362), while wide receiver **BRANDON MARSHALL** and quarterback **RYAN FITZPATRICK** established individual all-time team bests. Under Gailey's direction, the Jets improved their league ranks from a bottom-third offense in 2014 to a top-third offense in 2015.

Gailey, who is entering his 39th year of coaching, has spent 13 of his previous 19 NFL seasons as either a head coach or offensive coordinator and boasts a resume that includes four Super Bowl appearances, including three with the Broncos (XXI, XXII, XXIV) and one with the Pittsburgh Steelers (XXX). Prior to his time with the Jets, Gailey served as the Bills head coach from 2010-12. In his final year with Buffalo, Gailey oversaw an offense that ranked sixth in the NFL in rushing (138.6 ypg) and fourth in yards per attempt (5.02). Under Gailey's guidance, running back C.J. Spiller set career bests in rushing yards (1,244), good for eighth-best in the NFL, total touchdowns (eight), carries (207), receptions (43) and receiving yards (459), en route to playing in his first Pro Bowl. Additionally, defensive tackle Kyle Williams and safety Jairus Byrd were named to the Pro Bowl following the 2012 season.

Prior to Buffalo, Gailey served as the Chiefs offensive coordinator in 2008. For just the third time in franchise history, Kansas City finished the season with a pair of 1,000-yard receivers – Pro Bowl tight end Tony Gonzalez (1,058) and wide receiver Dwayne Bowe (1,022).

Gailey became the head coach of Georgia Tech in 2002 and remained with the Yellow Jackets until 2007. He was the first head coach in school history to lead the team to bowl game appearances in his first six seasons and compiled a 44-33 record. Over the course of his six seasons, 46 players were either drafted into the NFL or were signed by an NFL team as undrafted free agents, headlined by the No. 2 selection in the 2007 NFL Draft, wide receiver Calvin Johnson, who also won the Biletnikoff Award and was named ACC Player of the Year.

As the offensive coordinator for Miami from 2000-01, the Dolphins made two playoff appearances, posting back-to-back 11-win seasons. Miami averaged 118.4 rushing yards per game in 2000, at the time the team's highest rushing total since 1984.

Gailey's first NFL head coaching job came in 1998 when he was named head coach of the Dallas Cowboys. During his tenure in Dallas, he led the

franchise to consecutive postseason trips with the help of an offense that scored 37 rushing touchdowns, the fourth-highest total in the league during that span.

Before joining the Cowboys coaching staff, Gailey was with the Steelers for four seasons, first as the wide receivers coach (1994-95) before being promoted to offensive coordinator (1996-97). During those four years, Pittsburgh won the AFC Central four times, appeared in three AFC Championship Games and one Super Bowl. As offensive coordinator, Gailey was credited with implementing the "Slash" offense that featured dual-threat quarterback Kordell Stewart. In 1997, the Steelers led the NFL with 154.9 rushing yards per game, ranked sixth in total offense (34.6 ypg) and seventh in scoring (23.3 ppg).

In Gailey's offense, running back Jerome Bettis recorded his two most productive seasons as a pro, rushing for 1,431 yards in 1996, which ranked third in the NFL, and following that up with a career-best 1,665 rushing yards in 1997, again third-best in the league. Bettis was named to the Pro Bowl in both seasons and scored a total of 20 touchdowns.

In between his first two jobs coaching in the NFL, Gailey had a one-year stint as the head coach of Samford University (1993) and was the head coach of the Birmingham Fire (WIAF) from 1991-92.

Gailey began his NFL coaching career as an assistant in Denver for six seasons (1985-90) under head coach Dan Reeves, helping the Broncos advance to three Super Bowls. Gailey coached Hall of Fame quarterback John Elway in 1988 as the Broncos quarterbacks/receivers coach and from 1989-90 as the offensive coordinator/receivers coach. Also, he was the Broncos special teams/defensive assistant in 1985 and the special teams/tight ends coach from 1986-87.

Before coaching in the NFL, Gailey was the head coach at Troy State (1983-84), where in 1984 he led the Trojans to a 12-1 record and an NCAA Division II National Championship. Previously, he was on the coaching staff at Air Force, initially as a defensive assistant from 1979-80 and then as the defensive coordinator from 1981-82.

Gailey began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Florida from 1974-75, before coaching the secondary at Troy State (1976-78). He was a three-year letter winner for the Gators and a former all-state quarterback at Americus (GA) High School.

A native of Americus, GA, he and his wife, Laurie, have two sons, Tate and Andrew, and five grandsons.



## QUARTERBACK SUCCESS

In five of his last six seasons as an NFL head coach or offensive coordinator, Gailey's quarterbacks have finished among the top 10 at their position in rushing. Additionally, four of the five quarterbacks to start 13 or more games for him since 2000 have reached the 3,000-yard passing mark.

- **Kordell Stewart** – Helped Stewart, in his first year as a starting quarterback (1997), lead an 11-5 PIT team by throwing for a career-high 21 touchdowns and rushing for a career-high 11 touchdowns.
- **Jay Fiedler** – Guided Fiedler to career highs in yards (3,290), passing touchdowns (20) and rushing touchdowns (four) in 2001.
- **Ryan Fitzpatrick** – In 2015, recorded a Jets team and personal single-season best 31 touchdown passes, while also finishing with the second-most passing yards in franchise history (3,905).

In his three years in Buffalo under Gailey, Fitzpatrick threw for at least 3,000 yards and 23 touchdowns in every season.

## NOTABLE PLAYER SUCCESS

- **RB Jerome Bettis** (PIT 1996-97) – Bettis, the NFL's sixth all-time leading rusher, logged his two best rushing seasons, topping 1,400 yards both seasons, after joining PIT in 1996. Under Gailey as an offensive coordinator, he posted 3,096 yards and 18 touchdowns in two seasons, including 1,665 yards in 1997, which ranked third in the league behind Barry Sanders and Terrell Davis.
- **WR Yancey Thigpen** (PIT 1994-97) – Recorded the only two 1,000-yard seasons of his career, twice topping 1,300 yards, in his four years with Gailey. Prior to Gailey's arrival, had logged 10 total receptions in his three NFL seasons, but in four seasons with Gailey, posted 212 receptions for 3,495 yards and 18 touchdowns, including 1,398 yards in 1997, the third-highest total in the league, and a career-best seven touchdowns.
- **WR Raghieb Ismail** (DAL 1999) – The most successful season of his nine-year NFL career came in his first season under Gailey as he tallied 1,097 receiving yards and 80 receptions, while only Randy Moss recorded more receptions of 50+ yards than his four.
- **RB Lamar Smith** (MIA 2000-01) – In his only two seasons with Gailey, he registered his two best seasons, rushing for 1,139 and 968 yards. He did not eclipse 750 yards on the ground in any of his eight other NFL seasons.
- **TE Tony Gonzalez** (KC 2008) – In his lone season under Gailey, recorded 96 receptions, 1,058 yards and 10 touchdowns, all totals which rank amongst the top three of his career.
- **WR Stevie Johnson** (BUF 2010-12) – Upon Gailey's arrival in 2010, recorded career numbers with 82 receptions for 1,073 yards and 10 touchdowns and the next two seasons (2011 & 2012) he added similar numbers, ranking in the top three of his career thus far. His three totals under Gailey were amongst the best in the league as he ranked 10th in receptions (237), 11th in receiving yards (3,123) and tied for 12th in touchdown receptions (23).
- **RB C.J. Spiller** (BUF 2012) – Emerged in his third season with Gailey as he registered career highs with 207 carries for 1,244 yards rushing (6.0 avg.) and 43 receptions for 459 yards. His 1,703 total yards were the fifth-highest total among running backs, despite having over 50 fewer touches from the four players in front of him.
- **WR Brandon Marshall** (Jets 2015) – Established franchise highs in receptions (109) and receiving yards (1,502), and tied a franchise-high with 14 receiving touchdowns in his first season with the Jets. Marshall also recorded his NFL-record sixth 100-reception season.





# KACY RODGERS

## DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

### CAREER

Kacy Rodgers returns for his second season as the Jets defensive coordinator after enjoying a wildly successful 2015 campaign in which the defense saw improvements in all areas, including allowing a franchise-low 83.4 rushing yards per game. Under Rodgers' direction, the Jets finished with the top-ranked red zone defense and improved to third in the league in third-down conversions (33.2 percent).

Against running backs in 2015, Rodgers led a defense that limited ball carriers to just 3.35 yards per carry, while holding a team's leading running back to under 65 yards in 12-of-16 weeks. In addition, the team's rushing defense allowed a franchise-low four rushing touchdowns, besting the previous low of five set in 1982. Against the pass, Rodgers was equally impressive, holding opposing quarterbacks to the lowest completion percentage in the NFL (57.1 percent) and the sixth-lowest passer rating (79.0). The secondary also accounted for all 18 of the team's interceptions after the defensive unit registered an NFL-low 13 takeaways in 2014. In Rodgers' first year, that total increased to 30, which tied for the third-most in the league and the most since the team recorded 31 in 2011.

As a whole, the Jets defense under Rodgers ranked in the top 10 in five major defensive categories, including points (No. 9), total defense (No. 4), rushing defense (No. 2), third downs (No. 3) and red zone (No. 1).

Prior to joining the Jets, Rodgers spent seven seasons coaching the defensive line in Miami. During his tenure, the Dolphins defense totaled 287 sacks, third-most in the league during that span, and ranked in the top 10 in opponents' rushing average (4.02 yards per carry) and rushing touchdowns allowed (80). In 2014, Miami's defensive line produced 30.5 of the team's 39 sacks, the third consecutive season that it accounted for over 70% of the team's total.

Under his direction, defensive tackle Paul Soliai (2012), defensive tackle Randy Starks (2010, '12) and defensive end Cameron Wake (2011, 13-15) all made their first Pro Bowl appearances. Additionally, 2012 third-round selection defensive end Olivier Vernon joined Wake to post 38.0 sacks from 2013-14, the third-highest total a pair of defensive linemen produced, behind only Mario Williams and Kyle Williams (BUF), and Robert Quinn and Chris Long (SL).

During his time with the Cowboys, Rodgers coached both the defensive tackles (2003-04) and the defensive line (2005-07). Over his tenure, the defense finished in the NFL's top 10 against the rush all but one year. In 2007 it finished sixth against the rush, allowing just 94.6 yards per game.

Prior to his career in the NFL, Rodgers spent time coaching at several colleges, including Tennessee-Martin (1994-97), Louisiana-Monroe (1998), Middle Tennessee State (1999-01) and Arkansas (2002). He spent his time coaching the defensive lines at every stop, as well as becoming the assistant head coach during his time at Tennessee-Martin and Middle Tennessee State.

Rodgers signed as an undrafted free agent with the Steelers in 1992, spending training camp with the team, and signed with the Shreveport Pirates (CFL) in 1994 before retiring.

He attended the University of Tennessee (1988-91) and lettered four times while contributing to a pair of SEC championships (1990-91).

## CAREER

Robby Brown returns for his second NFL season and second with the Jets as the team's quality control – offense coach. Prior to joining the Jets, Brown coached in the collegiate ranks for 10 seasons, working at South Alabama, Northwestern State, Valdosta State, Henderson State, Southwest Baptist and Troy.

As offensive coordinator for Valdosta State in 2012, Brown helped the team capture the NCAA Division II National Championship, while averaging 469 yards and scoring 40 points per game.

Before beginning his coaching career, he spent one season as a quarterback at Georgia Military College, later transferring to Georgia Tech, where he played two seasons. A backup quarterback, he finished the final series of Georgia Tech's wins in both the 2003 Humanitarian Bowl and the 2004 Champs Sports Bowl.

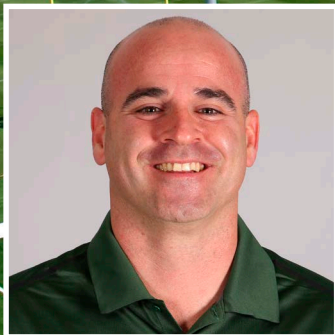

## CAREER

Mark Collins returns for his second season as the Jets outside linebackers coach after a first season that saw four different outside linebacker register sacks, led by rookie third-round selection **LORENZO MAULDIN** (4.0). **MAULDIN** registered all of his sacks after Week 8, finishing with the most by a Jets rookie since 2012. Additionally, veteran Calvin Pace added 3.0 sacks, his eighth-consecutive season logging at least 3.0 for the Jets.

Prior to working with the outside linebackers in his final season (2014) with the Falcons, Collins served as a defensive assistant and worked with the defensive line for four seasons (2010-13). In his time with Atlanta, the defense produced 140 takeaways, the seventh most in the league for a team that notched at least 46 wins and ninth overall. During his time coaching the defensive line, the run defense recorded a tackle for loss once every 10.2 rushing attempts, the eighth best ratio in the league.

Before to his arrival in the NFL, Collins was an assistant coach at the collegiate level for 11 seasons, with stops at Louisiana-Monroe, Georgia, Georgia Southern, Elon and Michigan after getting his start in coaching at his alma mater, East Tennessee State. His one year at Georgia produced a No. 2 ranking in the final Associated Press poll, while his two seasons at Michigan saw back-to-back Rose Bowl appearances.

A four-year starter at outside linebacker at East Tennessee State, Collins was named team captain in 1997 while also receiving the school's John Robert Bell Award. He earned a degree in finance from East Tennessee State and was twice named a National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame Scholar.

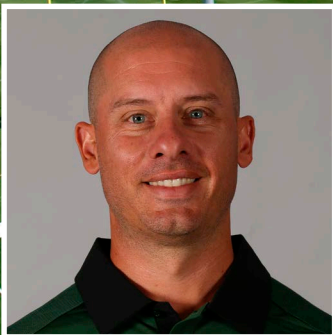

# JOE DANNA

### CAREER

Joe Danna returns for his second season as the Jets defensive backs coach after he oversaw a secondary that tripled its interception total from the previous season. The defensive backs produced all 18 of the team's interceptions last season (fifth most in the NFL), tripling their 2014 total of six (ranking tied for 30th). Additionally, the secondary held opposing quarterbacks to the lowest completion percentage in the league (ranked 21st in 2014) and the sixth lowest quarterback ranking (ranked 30th in 2014).

Under his direction, cornerback DARRELLE REVIS, who returned to the club in 2015, registered nine takeaways (five interceptions and four fumble recoveries), the most of any cornerback in the league and his most interceptions since 2009. Second-year former undrafted cornerback MARCUS WILLIAMS led the team in interceptions, picking off six passes despite playing in less than 27 percent of the defensive snaps, while 2014 first-round pick safety CALVIN PRYOR registered career highs in tackles (71) and passes defended (six). He recorded his first three takeaways of his career (two interceptions and one forced fumble) in his first season under Danna.

In his final season with the Falcons (2014), Danna worked with a pair of second-year starting corners, with first-round pick Desmond Trufant making starts in all 16 games and second-round choice Robert Alford starting all 10 games he played, with each picking off three passes. In his first season with the Falcons, starting safeties Thomas DeCoud and William Moore each earned their first Pro Bowl selections. DeCoud finished with a team-high six interceptions, while Moore posted four interceptions.

Prior to arriving in Atlanta, Danna spent two seasons as the assistant defensive backs coach in Miami (2010-11), helping coach a secondary that held opposing quarterbacks to the eighth-lowest completion percentage in that span. Before the Dolphins, Danna served as a defensive assistant during his first stint with the Falcons (2008-09).

Danna began his coaching start at his alma mater, Central Michigan, where he was a four-year letter-winning wide receiver (1995-98), first as a student assistant (1999) and then as a graduate assistant (2000). Following a season as graduate assistant at the University of Georgia (2001), Danna returned to CMU where he served as wide receivers coach (2002, 2005) and safeties coach (2003-04). He spent the next two seasons as the defensive backs coach at Georgia Southern (2006) and James Madison (2007).

The Midland, MI, native and his wife, Nicole, have two sons, Luke and Zack, and a daughter, Lindsey. He earned his bachelor's degree in elementary education and social studies with a language arts minor from Central Michigan.

## CAREER

David Diaz-Infante was named offensive line assistant for Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff on February 9, 2016, returning to the Jets after spending the previous season with the club as a training camp intern. Prior to his time with the Jets, Diaz-Infante served as an offensive assistant with the Arizona Cardinals for two seasons (2013-14), working on the same coaching staff as Bowles, who was the defensive coordinator at the time.

Before he began his coaching career, Diaz-Infante enjoyed a seven-year career in the NFL in which he played both guard and center with the Chargers, Broncos and Eagles. During his career, he played in 69 games (nine starts), earning Super Bowl rings with the Broncos in 1998 and 1999. He entered the league in 1987 with the Chargers as an undrafted free agent and played in three games as a rookie. The first of his two stints with the Broncos came in 1995-98 before playing with the Eagles in 1999 and finishing his career with Denver in 2001. He also played in the World League of American Football (WLAF) with the Frankfurt Galaxy (1991-92), the Sacramento Gold Miners in the Canadian Football League (1993-94) and the Las Vegas Outlaws in the XFL (2001).

Following his playing days, Diaz-Infante worked in television as a studio analyst with FSN Rocky Mountain from 2003-04 before joining ESPN in 2004 as a college and high school football analyst. He also served as an analyst for the Broncos radio network from 2005-08.

A native of San Jose, CA, Diaz-Infante attended Bellarmine Prep (San Jose, CA) where he was the conference lineman of the year in 1981. He played college football at San Jose State where he was an honorable mention AP All-American, a first-team all-conference selection and a four-year letterman while also serving as a team captain. He was inducted into the San Jose State Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Diaz-Infante earned a bachelor of arts in social science. He and his wife, Audra, have a son, Dante Antonio, and a daughter, Alexis Maria.

# KARL DORRELL

## CAREER

Karl Dorrell returns for his second season as the Jets wide receivers coach, marking his 27th season coaching at the collegiate and professional levels. In his first season with the Jets, Dorrell oversaw a record-setting receiving group led by **BRANDON MARSHALL**, whom he helped earn Pro Bowl recognition after posting franchise marks with 109 receptions (fourth in the league), 1,502 yards (fourth) and 14 receiving touchdowns (tied for first).

Additionally, **ERIC DECKER** saw an increase in his production, surpassing all of his 2014 season numbers in his second campaign with the Jets as the receiver logged 80 receptions for 1,027 yards and 12 touchdowns. The **DECKER/MARSHALL** combo combined for the most receptions and receiving touchdowns of any wide receiver duo in Jets history while finishing second in team annals in total receiving yards. The pair also logged touchdowns in the same game nine times, besting the NFL record established in 1998.

Before rejoining the NFL coaching ranks in 2015 with the Jets, Dorrell spent 2014 as the offensive coordinator quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt.

In his prior NFL stints, Dorrell helped the Texans reach the playoffs in 2012, when he tutored quarterback Matt Schaub to his second career Pro Bowl. With Dorrell's guidance, Schaub recorded 4,008 passing yards and completed 64.3 percent of his passes, his highest completion percentage since 2009.

Prior to his time with Houston, Dorrell spent four seasons in Miami, three as a wide receivers coach (2008-10) and the last as quarterbacks coach (2011). In 2011, he mentored Dolphins quarterback Matt Moore to a career season when he took over the starting job in Week 5. He went on set career highs in almost every category, while also ranking fourth among AFC quarterbacks with an 88.7 passer rating.

As the wide receivers coach from 2008-10, Dorrell saw **MARSHALL** and Davone Bess combine for the fourth-most receptions of any duo in the NFL. Bess had 209 receptions from 2008-10, the most by any Dolphins player in his first three years with the team.

A head coach at UCLA from 2003-07, Dorrell was named the 2005 Pac-10 Conference Co-Coach of the Year. He guided the Bruins to five bowl games and an overall record of 35-27. In 2005, Dorrell led UCLA to a 10-2 record and No. 13 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. That same season, the Bruins defeated two ranked opponents, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 10 California. The 2005 squad was led by quarterback Drew Olson and running back Maurice Jones-Drew, who helped the Bruins rank No. 5 nationally in scoring offense (39.1) and No. 23 in both passing offense (270.3) and total offense (431.0).

Dorrell's first full-time stint in the NFL came from 2000-02 when he served as the wide receivers coach for the Broncos. While with Denver, he helped Rod Smith eclipse 1,000 yards receiving three times and earn two Pro Bowl selections. In 2000, Ed McCaffrey posted 101 receptions for 1,317 yards and combined with Smith to become only the second wide receiver duo to each catch 100 passes in a single season.

Dorrell received his full-time opportunity with the Broncos after working with the staff during training camp in 1993 and 1999 as part of the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship program.

Dorrell coached wide receivers at Colorado from 1992-93 and Arizona State in 1994 before returning to Colorado to serve as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach of the Buffaloes from 1995-98. While in Colorado, Dorrell helped Charles Johnson and Michael Westbrook become just the fourth pair of receivers on the same team to top 1,000 yards in a season.

Dorrell was an honorable mention All-America receiver at Helix High School in San Diego before helping the Bruins play in three Rose Bowls as a wide receiver during his playing career at UCLA (1982-86). After college, he spent time with the Dallas Cowboys in 1987.

Dorrell graduated with a degree in psychology from UCLA in 1987, and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at UCLA in 1988. A native of San Diego, CA, Dorrell and wife, Kim, have two children, Chandler and Lauren.

## CAREER

Jeff Hammerschmidt was named an assistant special teams coach for Head Coach Todd Bowles' staff on February 5, 2016, his first position in the NFL after spending 24 seasons coaching in the collegiate ranks.

Prior to joining the Jets, Hammerschmidt served as a special teams coordinator for his alma mater Arizona (2008-11) before working in the same capacity at Colorado State (2012-15). In his time with the Rams, both the punter and kicker received honorable mention all-conference honors.

Throughout his career, Hammerschmidt has coached every level of the defense (secondary, linebackers and defensive line) while also serving as a defensive coordinator for Southern Utah (1996-97), Saint Mary's (2000-02) and Montana (2003-04). Following his collegiate career, he signed as a free agent with the Los Angeles Rams (1991) and played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of the World League (1992). # JIMMIE JOHNSON

## CAREER

Jimmie Johnson returns for his second season as the Jets tight ends coach after returning last season to the NFL after a one-year absence. In his first season with the Jets, Johnson battled key injuries at his position, losing both **JACE AMARO** and **ZACH SUDFELD** before the start of the season. Under Johnson, the tight ends helped block for a rushing attack that ranked 10th in the league, helping Chris Ivory earn Pro Bowl honors after gaining an AFC-leading 1,070 yards rushing, the first 1,000-yard season of his career, and also set career bests in rushing touchdowns (seven), total touchdowns (eight), receptions (30) and receiving yards (217).

Prior to joining the Jets, Johnson spent eight seasons as the Vikings tight ends coach, utilizing a variety of different players in his time there. Four different tight ends led the group in receptions, including Jermaine Wiggins (2006), Visanthe Shiancoe (2007-11), Kyle Rudolph (2012) and John Carlson (2013). Under Johnson, Shiancoe posted 208 catches for 2,424 yards and 24 touchdowns in five seasons, despite amassing just 35 catches for 253 yards and three touchdowns in the four seasons prior to joining Minnesota. In his final two seasons with Johnson, Rudolph, a former second-round selection, posted 12 touchdowns. Although he missed eight games in those two seasons, Rudolph's 12 touchdowns tied for the fifth-most among tight ends in the NFL. In their time under Johnson, Vikings tight also excelled in the red zone, producing 36 touchdowns on just 75 targets, or almost half a touchdown per target, the best in the league.

His group helped pave the way for the NFL's top rushing attack, as the Vikings produced 138.2 yards per game on the ground, the best yards per carry (4.75), the most carries of 10+ yards (505) and the second-most rushing touchdowns (141). Additionally, Minnesota ran out of two-TE sets more than all but one other team and produced the most yards, the highest yards per carry average and the most carries of 10-plus yards in the league.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Johnson was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Texas Southern (2004-05), the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks/wide receivers coach at Shaw and the running backs coach at South Carolina State.

Johnson entered the league as a 12th-round pick by the Redskins and spent 10 seasons as an NFL tight end, appearing in 118 games (33 starts) for Washington, Detroit, Kansas City and Philadelphia. He helped pave the way for 1,000-yard rushers in eight of his 10 seasons as a player, including Earnest Byner, Barry Sanders, Ricky Watters and Duce Staley.

As a senior at Howard, Johnson was an All-MEAC choice after hauling in 31 receptions for 546 yards and nine TDs. He finished his four-year college career with 73 catches for 1,229 yards and 16 TDs.

Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in consumer studies at Howard University and his MBA from George Washington University. He is a native of Augusta, GA, where he attended T.W. Josey High School.

# PEPPER JOHNSON

## CAREER

Pepper Johnson returns for his second season as the Jets defensive line coach after his first year saw a defensive line establish a new franchise mark with just 83.4 rushing yards allowed per game. Additionally, the team's rushing defense allowed a franchise low four rushing touchdowns, besting the previous low of five set in the 1982 season when the year was shortened to just nine games. Against running backs in 2015, the Jets defense limited ball carriers to just 3.35 yards per carry, holding a team's leading back to under 65 yards in 12-of-16 weeks. Eight times in 2015, an opponent's leading running back failed to average 3.00 yards per carry against the Jets.

Under Johnson, **MUHAMMAD WILKERSON** earned the first Pro Bowl recognition of his career as the fifth-year pro recorded a career-high 12.5 sacks. Additionally, 2015 first-round selection **LEONARD WILLIAMS** was named to the All-Rookie Team by the Pro Football Writers of America.

Prior to joining the Jets, Johnson served the Bills in the same capacity, overseeing a Buffalo defensive line that led the NFL in sacks, accounting for 50 of the team's 54. Under his direction, three of the four defensive line starters posted double-digit sacks (Mario Williams, Marcell Dareus & Jerry Hughes), while Kyle Williams joined Mario Williams and Dareus as Pro Bowl selections. Mario Williams posted a career-best 14.5 sacks under him.

Before the Bills, Johnson spent 14 seasons as a member of the Patriots staff serving in various capacities. He entered the NFL coaching ranks in 2000 as an assistant linebackers coach, serving as an inside linebackers coach (2001-03), defensive line coach (2004-11) and linebackers coach (2012-13) during his stint in New England. In his time with the Patriots, the club

was tied for the second-most takeaways forced (440), while his run as defensive line coach saw the team hold opposing rushers to just 104.1 yards per game, sixth-best in that span. Johnson, who has won five Super Bowls as either a coach or player, was a member of three Super Bowl-winning coaching staffs in New England (2001, 2003-04).

Under his direction, 11 different defensive linemen have registered at least 5.0 sacks, including both **WILKERSON** (12.5) and **SHELDON RICHARDSON** (5.0) in his first season with the Jets.

A two-time Pro Bowl performer who won Super Bowl titles as a member of the New York Giants in 1986 and 1990, Johnson started 158 of 193 regular-season games for four different teams during his 13-year NFL career from 1986-98, including starting all 24 games he played over his final two NFL seasons with the Jets. Johnson was also a two-time captain during his time in New York. For his career, he totaled over 1,200 tackles, leading his team six different times, and posted 25.5 sacks, 12 forced fumbles, eight recoveries, and 14 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns.

A two-time co-captain and defensive MVP at Ohio State, Johnson was drafted by the New York Giants in the second round of the 1986 NFL Draft after an All-American campaign as a senior for the Buckeyes in 1985. He was named to Michigan's all-decade team for the 1980s and to Ohio State's all-century team. He was later inducted into the Buckeyes' Hall of Fame in 2001.

Nicknamed "Pepper" by an aunt who observed his ritual of sprinkling pepper on his breakfast cereal as a youngster, Johnson has a son, Dionte, a daughter, Aanjeya, and a grandson, Dionte, Jr.

## CAREER

Steve Marshall returns for his second season as the Jets offensive line coach, his 36th season coaching football and ninth in the NFL. In his first season with the Jets, the offensive line helped **RYAN FITZPATRICK** set a franchise record for most passing touchdowns (31), while his 3,905 yards passing were the second most in the franchise's history, trailing only Joe Namath's 4,007 in 1967.

Including his first season with the Jets, Marshall's offensive lines have ranked in the top 10 in the league in sacks allowed in each of his last four seasons. In 2015, Fitzpatrick was sacked just 19 times (fifth fewest), or on just 3.3% of his dropbacks, the best percentage in the NFL. In total, the Jets offensive line allowed the second-fewest sacks in the league (22) and the fewest since the franchise allowed 19 in 2001.

Additionally, behind Marshall's line, Chris Ivory earned Pro Bowl honors after gaining an AFC-leading 1,070 yards rushing, the first 1,000-yard season of his career and also set career bests in rushing touchdowns (seven), total touchdowns (eight), receptions (30) and receiving yards (217).

Prior to the Jets, Marshall's lines helped two quarterbacks, Derek Anderson (Browns, 2007) and Aaron Rodgers (Packers, 2014) earn Pro Bowl appearances. In Cleveland, he helped rookie first-round draft choice Joe Thomas earn Pro Bowl honors in his first two seasons, adding All-Pro recognition in his second, while his lines paved the way for RB Jamal Lewis to gain over 1,000 yards each year.

In his first NFL position, Marshall served as the assistant offensive line coach for two seasons at Houston, including the team's inaugural season in 2002. He was then promoted to offensive line coach in 2004, coaching a line that blocked for an 1,100-yard rusher (Domanick Williams) and an 1,100-yard receiver (Andre Johnson).

In his collegiate stops, he has helped tutor 19 future NFL players, including draft choices David Bakhtiari, Mitchell Schwartz and Andre Gurode. Marshall has coached collegiately at New Mexico State (2014), Colorado (2011-12 & 2000-01), California (2009-10), North Carolina (1998-99), Texas A&M (1997), UCLA (1996), Tennessee (1993-95 & 1980-81), Virginia Tech (1987-92), Murray State (1985-86), Louisville (1984), Marshall (1982-83) and Plymouth State (1979).

Marshall was a two-time letterman at both tight end and guard for Louisville. As a junior in 1977, he was a member of a Cardinals team that played in the Independence Bowl, earning a bachelor's degree in both history and physical education. He is married to wife, Karin.

## CAREER

Daylon McCutcheon returns for his second season as the Jets assistant defensive backs coach after making his NFL coaching debut in 2015. In his first full season with the Jets, he assisted Defensive Backs Coach Joe Danna on a secondary that tripled its interception total from the previous season. The defensive backs produced all 18 of the team's interceptions last season (fifth most in the NFL), increasing their 2014 total of six (ranking tied for 30th). Additionally, the secondary held opposing quarterbacks to the lowest completion percentage in the league (57.1 percent) and the sixth lowest quarterback ranking (79.0).

McCutcheon returned to the Jets after spending the 2013 training camp as a minority coaching intern, working with the defense. Prior to returning to the Jets, he assisted the Cardinals in the same capacity during the 2014 training camp, working with Todd Bowles, Mike Caldwell and the Arizona defense.

## CAREER

Kevin Patullo returns for his second season as the Jets quarterbacks coach after reuniting with Offensive Coordinator Chan Gailey last season and helping Ryan Fitzpatrick post a franchise-record 31 touchdown passes for an offense that established a new franchise mark for total yards (5,896) – including 400-plus yard performances in four of the final six games – and net passing yards (4,057), while ranking 11th in points per game (24.2), the most by a Jets team since 2008.

Prior to joining the Jets, Patullo assisted offenses in Tennessee, Buffalo and Kansas City in various capacities.

In his lone season with the Titans, Patullo served as the assistant wide receivers coach, leading a receiving group that saw Nate Washington average 16.2 yards per catch in 2014, the seventh-best in the league, and second-year wide receiver Justin Hunter average 17.8 yards per catch, an average that would have ranked as the third-highest had an injury not left him with too few catches to qualify. Under Patullo, leading wide receiver Kendall Wright posted his best season in terms of yards per catch (12.5) and touchdowns scored (six), despite missing two games.

Before Tennessee, Patullo spent three seasons in Buffalo (2010-12), adding the title of assistant wide receivers coach in 2012. Supporting the wide receivers all three years, Patullo aided in the three best seasons of wide receiver Stevie Johnson's career, as he topped 75 receptions, 1,000 yards and six touchdowns in each season.

Patullo entered the NFL coaching ranks in 2007, spending two seasons as a quality control coach for the Chiefs. Prior to Kansas City, he served on collegiate coaching staffs at Arizona (2004-06) and his alma mater, South Florida (2003-04).

A three-year letterman at South Florida who played both quarterback and wide receiver, Patullo was the recipient of the team's Golden Bull Award in 1999 as the program's outstanding scout team player. During his time at USF, the football team transitioned from I-AA to I-A, joining Conference USA the season following his graduation. He was also a four-year academic all-conference selection who received his bachelor's in business marketing from USF and his master's in information research science from the University of Arizona.

A native of Hillsborough, NJ, Patullo and his wife, Nichole, have a daughter, Lauren, and son, Logan.

## CAREER

Marcel Shipp returns for his second season guiding the Jets running backs after returning to the NFL in 2015 at the conclusion of a seven-year playing career that ended in 2007.

In his first year with the Jets, Shipp coached running back Chris Ivory to the first 1,000-yard rushing season of his career as the back led the AFC with 1,070 yards on the ground while also registering career high with eight touchdowns, 30 receptions and 217 receiving yards. Additionally, running back BILAL POWELL also enjoyed a career season, establishing single-season bests with 47 receptions for 388 yards and two receiving touchdowns, including averaging 49.8 yards receiving per game from Weeks 11-16, the best in the league over that span.

Before the Jets, Shipp served as the running backs coach (2014) for his alma mater, the University of Massachusetts, and spent time with the Arizona Cardinals in training camp as a coaching intern (2013). Following the final seasons of his playing career with Las Vegas of the UFL, he joined the Locomotives coaching staff for the league's last season.

In three seasons with Las Vegas Locomotives, he posted 234 carries for 734 yards and nine touchdowns, helping the team advance to the championship game in all three seasons, winning the first two.

The former undrafted free agent spent seven seasons with the Arizona Cardinals, appearing in 88 games (28 starts) and posting 605 carries for 2,197 yards and 113 receptions for 937 yards, scoring 14 total touchdowns.

A two-time first team All-America selection for UMass (1998-99), Shipp rushed for 200 or more yards in a single game seven times in his career, including a 244-yard, three-touchdown performance in the 1998 Division 1-AA national championship game. He finished his career as the all-time leading rusher in the history of the Atlantic 10 Conference with 6,250 yards and set school records for carries (1,215), rushing yards per game (130.2), rushing touchdowns (58), all-purpose yards (7,759), all-purpose plays (1,365), all-purpose yards per game (161.1), points scored (378) and touchdowns scored (63).

Before UMass, Shipp attended Passaic Tech in Wayne, NJ, and was a New Jersey Super 100 pick as one of the state's top 100 high school seniors, and a first-team all-state selection and participant in the New Jersey North-South All Star Game.

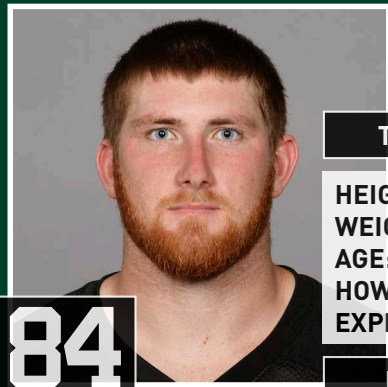

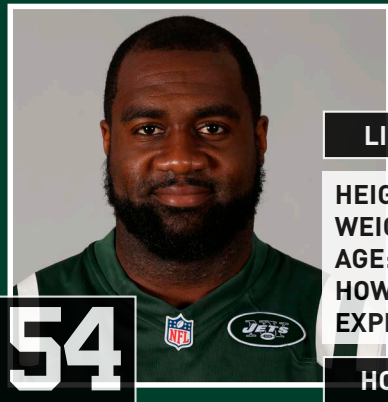

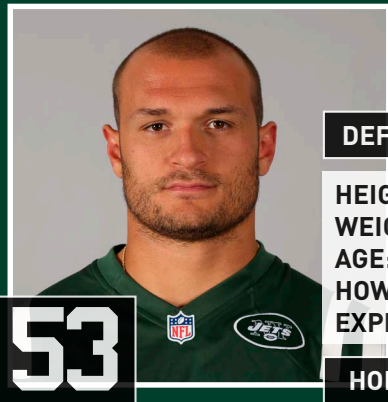

- Seventh-year wide receiver who entered the league as a third-round draft selection (2010) with DEN before joining the Jets as an unrestricted free agent (2014).
- Has appeared in 92 games (72 starts), posting totals of 376 receptions, 5,059 yards and 50 touchdowns.

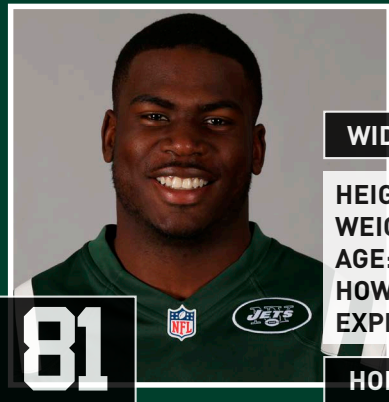

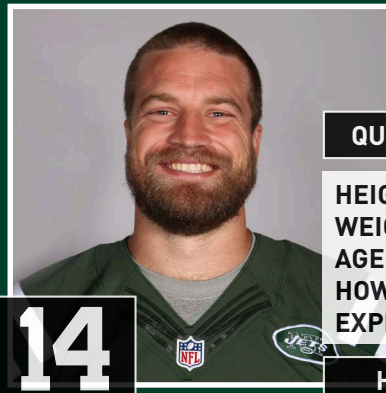

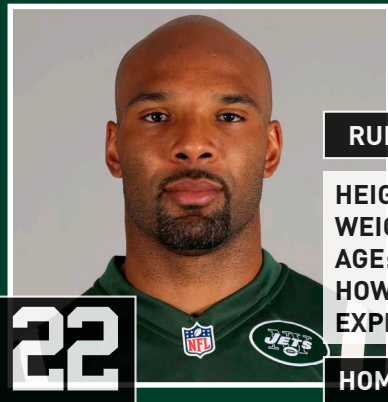

- Last season, voted by his teammates as the Curtis Martin Team Most Valuable Player Award winner after recording franchise records with 109 receptions, 1,502 yards receiving and 14 touchdowns, ranking in the top five in the NFL in all three categories, including tying for the league-lead in touchdown catches.
- Along with WR **Eric Decker**, established a new NFL record in 2015 for most games in which both players scored a touchdown (nine), while also setting a new club record for most combined touchdowns in a single season between two receivers (26).

## SEASON-BY-SEASON REVIEW

**JETS (2015)** Named by his teammates at the Curtis Martin Team Most Valuable Player and selected to his sixth Pro Bowl as he recorded franchise-record-setting numbers in receptions (109) and receiving yards (1,502), while matching the team's all-time mark in receiving touchdowns (14), a new career high and the fourth time he has logged double-digit touchdowns in a season...Among all NFL wide receivers that season, ranked in the top five in all three categories, including tying for the league-lead in touchdown catches...Became the 45th player in NFL history to surpass 10,000 receiving yards in Week 3 vs. PHI (9/27), before eclipsing the 11,000-yard barrier in Week 15 at DAL (12/19), becoming just the fourth active player to do so since entering the league in 2006...Became the 15th player in NFL history to record 50 receptions or more in at least nine of this first 10 seasons...Joined WR Don Maynard (1968) and WR George Sauer (1966) as the only Jets players to have four consecutive 100-yard receiving games with his performances in Weeks 2 through 6, finishing the season with a career high in 100-yard receiving games (10), breaking the Jets record for most in a season, a mark previously held by Maynard (1967)...Combined with WR **Eric Decker** to set a new Jets record for touchdown receptions among the team's top wide receivers in a single season (26), as the pair also lead all NFL wide receiver duos in receptions (189), finishing second in combined yards (2,529)...The Decker/Marshall combo each scored a touchdown in the same game nine times, besting the NFL mark of seven set in 1998 by MIN WRs Cris Carter and Randy Moss, and helping the Jets to a 7-2 record when they both found the end zone...His 109 receptions mark his sixth season with 100+ receptions, most in NFL history, while his 1,502 yards are tied him for active lead for 1,000 yard receiving seasons with the NFL record of eight...Became the first player in NFL history to record 1,000-yard seasons with four different teams. **SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: (1/3 at BUF)**...Finished with eight receptions for 126 yards and a touchdown, his Jets franchise record 10th 100-yard performance this season. **(12/27 vs. NE)**...Finished the game with eight receptions for 115 yards and two touchdowns, the second game that season he's caught two touchdowns, while improving his season total to 13, surpassing his previous high of 12 (2013). **(12/13 vs. TEN)**...Caught a 69-yard touchdown, the third longest of his career and longest since 2009...Finished with 125 yards receiving, his third-consecutive 100-yard effort and eighth of the season breaking, his previous career high for 100-yard games in a season (2012). **(12/6 at NYG)**...Named AFC Offensive Player of the Week, the first Jets WR to earn the honor since 1990...Caught the game-tying touchdown with 27 seconds left in the fourth

He began covering the Jets in 1996 as a reporter for WFAN, and from 1997-2001 hosted pregame and postgame shows for the Jets radio network.

Over the last decade, Wischusen has proven to be one of the most versatile television and radio voices in the country. When not with the Jets, he serves as a play-by-play announcer for ESPN, calling college football, college basketball and major championship golf. In the studio, Wischusen is a part time host of NFL Live and NFL Insiders. In the past for ESPN, his play by play duties have included arena football, boxing, college baseball, college softball and WNBA basketball.

In the New York market, Wischusen worked for MSG Network in a variety of rolls, calling New York Rangers hockey, New York Knicks and New York Liberty basketball and anchoring FSNY's New York Sports Report and MSG Network's SportsDesk. Wischusen's credits also include sideline reporting for NBC on Notre Dame football and NBA basketball telecasts and play-by-play for Westwood One radio and Comcast Network television. Raised in Westfield, NJ and a 1993 graduate of Boston College, Wischusen began his professional career at WQAM in Miami. In 1996, he moved to New York and joined WFAN, where he started hosting talk shows and anchoring while also covering the Jets. Wischusen currently resides in New Jersey with his wife Julie and their five children: Katrina, Charlie, Jimmy and twins, Ben and Cory.



# MARTY LYONS

NEW YORK JETS RADIO NETWORK ANALYST

Marty Lyons is in his 15th season as the Jets radio analyst. Lyons was originally a first-round draft selection of the Jets in 1979 out of the University of Alabama after playing for Paul "Bear" Bryant. On October 13, 2013, Lyons took his place as one of the all-time great members of the New York Jets organization as he was inducted into the team's Ring of Honor.

A founding member of the "New York Sack Exchange," Lyons, together with teammates Mark Gastineau, Joe Klecko and Abdul Salaam, helped lead the 1981 Jets to a franchise-record 66 sacks, and the team's first playoff appearance since 1969. He finished his NFL career with 43 sacks over 11 seasons for the Jets (1979-89), playing in 147 games – a team-record for a defensive lineman at the time of his retirement. Also a dominant college player, Lyons was enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame following his first appearance on the ballot.

While a formidable force on the field, Lyons has made significant contributions off the field as well with his extensive charitable work. For his commitment to the community, he was named NFL Man of the Year in 1984. Lyons is the founder and chairman of the Marty Lyons Foundation, which grants wishes to children diagnosed with terminal or chronic life-threatening illnesses. It has made more than 7,100 wishes come true in the past 33 years.

As a tribute to his longstanding charitable commitment, the Jets annually present the Marty Lyons Award to the player who gives the most back to his community as selected by the Jets staff. Lyons was the first recipient of this award in 1990.

He and his wife, Christine, currently reside in Smithtown, N.Y. Marty has four children, Rocky, Jesse, Megan and Luke, and two grandchildren, Liv and Martin Anthony Lyons III "Rush".





# CLEMSON SMITH MUÑIZ

NEW YORK JETS RADIO NETWORK SPANISH PLAY-BY-PLAY

Clemson Smith Muñiz, in his 17th season as the voice of “los Jets en español,” is the longest-tenured Jets radio voice and a New York City broadcast pioneer. He called the first Jets game in Spanish in 1999 before taking over the play-by-play role permanently the following year.

He also was the first play-by-play announcer for “los Knicks en español” (1994-2014), “St. John’s en español” (1994-97) and “Army en español” (2005-2012). In 2009, he became the first Spanish-language play-by-play announcer for the new MLB Network, broadcasting “Showcase,” the game of the week, on SAP. And in 2015, he began calling boxing in Spanish for HBO Latino and HBO Sports (SAP). In addition, Smith Muñiz was one of the lead announcers for Monday Night Football on Spanish-language national radio, including two Super Bowls for Univisión Radio, from 2002 through 2011.

Smith Muñiz is president of Smith Muñiz Productions; a Spanish-language sports broadcast and production company that helps teams, leagues, networks and publishers reach the growing Hispanic market. Beside the Jets, SMP adapts scripts to Spanish for HBO (Real Sports, Hard Knocks and The Fight Game) and works with Major League Baseball on assorted projects.

Smith Muñiz grew up in Río Piedras, Puerto Rico. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, he played wide receiver and tight end while lettering four times in Sprint football. Still active at his alma mater, Smith Muñiz is past president of Penn’s Association of Latino Alumni. In the off-season, he is an avid cyclist and amateur wildlife photographer who is preparing for his seventh trip to Africa and will attempt to summit Mt. Kilimanjaro in February 2017. He lives in Beacon, N.Y.



# GREG BUTTLE

NEW YORK JETS RADIO NETWORK PRE-GAME HOST

Buttle is in his 15th season as the co-host of “Jets Gameday” and “Countdown to Kickoff” (pregame) and “The 5th Quarter” (postgame) on the Jets broadcasts on 98.7 ESPN Radio. One of the best linebackers in Jets history, Buttle finished his nine-year career with 15 interceptions and 976 tackles. Originally selected by the Jets in the third round from Penn State, the Linwood, NJ, native went on to make virtually every all-rookie team, as he led the Jets in tackles in 1976. As a rookie he uttered the memorable line, “They pay me to practice! On Sundays I play for free.”

Buttle, who was named first-team All-Pro by Sports Illustrated after the 1979 season, scored three touchdowns in his career, including two versus the Patriots. One came on a 23-yard fumble return during his rookie season and the other on a 44-yard

interception return in 1977. The third came on a fumble return against the Colts in 1984. He also holds the Jets playoff record for interceptions with three.

Off the field, Buttle is involved with his own businesses. His newest venture, PathSight Predictive Science, combines data, behavioral and neuroscience to cluster any population according to one’s biological instincts which delivers intimacy at scale. He also owns long-term valet parking lots ([www.airparkparking.com](http://www.airparkparking.com)) located in close proximity to NY area airports -- LGA, JFK and Newark. He and his wife, Rita, reside on Long Island and have two daughters, Christina and Allegra, and a son, Gregory.



# DON LA GRECA

Don La Greca is in his 15th season as the co-host of “Jets Gameday” and “Countdown to Kickoff” (pregame) and “The 5th Quarter” (postgame) on the Jets broadcasts on 98.7 ESPN New York. La Greca and Greg Buttle also host “The New York Sports Reporters” on 98.7.

A veteran of the sports radio industry for the past decade, La Greca is a key component of 98.7 ESPN New York. He got started in sports radio at Sports Phone, where he updated scores while covering New York sports. La Greca has been a sports anchor at 1010 WINS, a talk show host at eYada.com and an update anchor at WFAN, where he covered the Jets in 2000 before joining 1050 ESPN Radio from its start.

La Greca was the very first voice of 98.7, formerly known as

1050 ESPN Radio, on Sept. 3, 2001. He is co-host of 98.7’s “The Michael Kay Show,” airing weekdays from 3-7 p.m. La Greca has been part of the Kay show since 2002, as the primary fill-in host for Michael. He also co-hosts the “Mike Lupica Show” on 98.7 from 12-1 p.m.

After many seasons of hosting the official New York Rangers pregame and postgame shows on 98.7, La Greca was added to the their radio broadcast team for the 2008-09 season as the fill-in play-by-play announcer for lead voice Kenny Albert. His passion for hockey and expertise on the sport also make him the ideal host of “NHL Live” on the NHL Network. La Greca graduated from Ramapo College in Mahwah, NJ. He resides in Somerset, NJ, with his wife, Nancy.
