In 2010, New Meadowlands Stadium became the home of the New York Jets. The venue was renamed MetLife Stadium on August 23, 2011, when MetLife acquired the naming rights. MetLife Stadium is one of the highest-profile stadiums in the country, and was honored as the 2017 "Venue of the Year" by The StadiumBusiness Awards. In 2016, the Stadium had its busiest year since opening, drawing nearly 3 million fans to a record 61 major events and 210 smaller private events.

MetLife Stadium bleeds green on Jets game days. Fans have many options for entertainment and tailgating before the game. They can catch the ESPN New York - 98.7FM pregame radio show broadcast live from the west plaza, head to the Kids Zone for family-fun activities and enjoy a vast array of food and beverages on the Stadium's multiple concourses. Fans can also find the latest gear at the team's 10,000 square-foot flagship plaza store. The intimate seating bowl, uncompromised sight lines, cutting-edge video boards, LED signage and state-of-the-art sound system all enhance the game-watching experience.

MetLife and the cornerstone partners – Bud Light, Pepsi, Dell EMC/SAP and Verizon – are also integrated into the game experience with ample space to engage and entertain fans.

One of the biggest upgrades in MetLife Stadium is the availability of club seats. There are four clubs –Coaches, Metlife 50, Toyota, and Touchdown – that offer access to VIP reserved parking, a private club entrance as well as a host of other amenities and benefits.

ATLANTIC HEALTH JETS TRAINING CENTER



The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, located at One Jets Drive in Florham Park, N.J. has been the headquarters of the Jets since its official ribbon cutting on September 2, 2008. Designed by Skidmore Owings + Merrill, the 224,000 square-foot complex sits on nearly 100 acres of open space and provides players, coaches and staff with a best-in-class facility to learn, practice and work. Located within 30 minutes of both MetLife Stadium and Newark Liberty International Airport, the facility is also just a short distance to a number of New Jersey towns, giving all Jets employees a number of options for suburban, urban or rural lifestyles.

A UNITED ORGANIZATION

Prior to the opening of the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the team's operations were split between two locations, first, located on the campus of Hofstra University, Weeb Ewbank Hall housed the players, coaches and football support staff, while the business operations were located in New York City.

In the creation of the new facility, Chairman & CEO Woody Johnson looked to unite all elements of the franchise under one roof. In the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, the organization now has a building that seamlessly combines the operations of both the football and business departments. Equipped with open-concept workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment, the training center was a major contributing factor in the team being named one of Inc. Magazine's Top Small Company Workplaces in 2010. An outdoor terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, provides a business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners.

FOOTBALL FACILITIES

Featuring state-of-the-art training and medical facilities that combine the latest advances in rehabilitation pools, high-performance equipment and nutrition, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center also features five full-size football fields; three natural grass, one Sportexe synthetic turf field outdoors, and another in the Field House, each with a permanent scoreboard. Additionally, the goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be repositioned 90 degrees to help minimize some of the wear throughout the season. With a first floor that is all football, the facility houses a 5,500-square-foot locker room, an 11,000-square-foot weight room and a 10,000-square-foot cafeteria.

As a "graduate school for football" - an element that was important in the design of the building - the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center has more than 25,000 square feet of space dedicated to classrooms and instruction space, including 10 classrooms. The classrooms also provide direct access to both the indoor and outdoor practice field, allowing for seamless transition between classroom and practice.

TRAINING CAMP

For the third consecutive year, the New York Jets will host training camp at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, in addition to all team mini-camps and organized team activities. Over the first two seasons, the facility hosted 13 open practices, and welcomed over 21,000 Jets fans.

During all open practices, fans were able to take advantage of bleachers for enhanced viewing, a shuttle service to and from the parking lot, water stations close to the field, cooling zones, a food court and a fan zone fully equipped with family-friendly activities. Additionally, all fans could enjoy Training Camp staples including Jets Fest, featuring skills challenges, music, inflatable rides, virtual reality and the Jets Shop tent, while members of the Gen Jets Kids Club, had a kids-only player autograph area.

This year, the AHJTC will feature six open practices as well as play host to a variety of youth camps and football teams.

The Jets Tackle Bullying program presented by Municipal Credit Union (MCU) is a collaboration with STOMP Out Bullying to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators, and preventing bullying for kids and teens. With support from MCU, the Jets have made available a Jets branded STOMP Out Bullying **Educator's Prevention Toolkit** at no cost to schools in the tri-state area. This toolkit enables educators to create meaningful dialogue, educate students through proven Social Emotional Learning methods, adopt character building in schools and involve both students and faculty in working together to change school climate. In addition, the Jets and MCU are funding a digital training tool reaching every school throughout the New York City Department of Education.



Schools that sign up for the toolkit or complete the digital training course are invited to our annual **Educator's Symposium** designed to provide teachers and administrators resources to improve the culture at their schools. Schools that attend the symposium are then given additional opportunities to engage with the Jets through our Upstander of the Week and School Recognition programs.

The **Upstander of the Week Program** highlights one student per week during the season across our social media platforms and on the video boards during home games. "When you see someone being bullied and/or cyberbullied and you help them, you stop being a bystander and become an Upstander!" Our **School Recognition Program** focuses on schools who demonstrate and can articulate how their school combats bullying. Selected schools receive a fun filled assembly featuring a Jets player.

YOUTH FOOTBALL

The New York Jets are committed to growing the game of football through a comprehensive outreach program designed to provide opportunities for underserved communities to play football. In addition, we fund training and equipment to ensure safety for all participants.



FLAG FOOTBALL

The Jets fund and create thousands of Flag Football opportunities for children ages 5-18 to enjoy America's favorite sport. Players benefit by being physically active through non-contact, continuous action while learning the fundamentals of football, lessons in teamwork and sportsmanship.

In 2016, the New York Jets and USA Football announced a new NFL FLAG powered by USA Football league with the **New York City Police Athletic League (PAL)**. Through a \$40,000 donation from the Jets Foundation, 1,200 New York City youth have the opportunity to play flag football at no cost. All participants are given a free Jets NFL FLAG jersey and top teams in each division have their entry fees to the New York City area's Regional NFL Flag tournament covered by the Jets.

Each year the Jets provide \$50,000 to support the **Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) Girls Varsity Flag Football League**. Created in 2011 by the PSAL and Jets, the league has nearly doubled from 31 to now almost 60 schools participating. USA Football was also instrumental in helping to get the league off the ground with flag belts and footballs for each program.

Since 2007, the Jets have provided annual funding for the expansion of **CHAMPS Middle School Flag Football League** to more than 3,700 students at 111 programs throughout the New York City public school system. The CHAMPS Middle School Sports and Fitness League is an initiative of the New York City Department of Education that promotes student physical activity during the critical years of middle school. The name CHAMPS derives from the initials of the five characteristics that describe our participants: Cooperative, Healthy, Active, Motivated and Positive Students. SNY PLAY BALL: FOOTBALL WEEK

The New York Jets have teamed up with our television partner, SNY, to offer support for youth football leagues in our community through SNY Play Ball: Football Week. SNY Play Ball offers leagues the opportunity to receive new footballs, tickets to a Jets preseason game, attend an exclusive youth football clinic and volunteer with league projects in our local community. In addition, one eligible organization will receive a \$5,000 grant to be put towards new equipment for the upcoming season. The program will culminate in "Play Ball Week," where SNY will honor and highlight individuals and selected organizations daily on the television network and website. PUBLIC SCHOOLS ATHLETIC LEAGUE

In 2001, the New York Jets formed a community partnership with the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL) to provide support to New York City public school football programs. Through an annual matching grant from the NFL's Youth Football Fund, the New York Jets now donate \$100,000 to the PSAL's football programs. This grant has helped to create 15 new and developmental football teams. The funding also assisted in the reconditioning of every student-athletes' helmet and the cost for PSAL coaches to become USA Football Heads Up certified. Beyond these grants, the Jets support the PSAL in a variety of other ways including honoring the PSAL football champions at a home game during the NFL season.



HIGH SCHOOL COACH OF THE WEEK

presented by

For 10 weeks during the football season the Jets and Gatorade present the High School Coach of the Week award to a coach in the tri-state area who serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to his community, his school and his student-athletes. Gatorade and the Jets award each winner with a \$2,000 check for their high school's football program. In addition to the weekly award, a Coach of the Year is selected at the end of the high school season. The Coach of the Year winner is awarded \$4,000 and receives a Gatorade cooler cart from the Jets and Gatorade.



REGIONAL 7on7 TOURNAMENT

In 2017, the Jets and USA Football hosted a 20-team regional 7on7 tournament. Schools participated free of charge, as all entry fees were waived through funding from the Jets foundation. Featuring pool and bracket play, schools participating in the two-day tournament competed to qualify for USA Football's 7on7 National Championship Series in July. To that end, the New York Jets Foundation funds programs that look to positively influence the lives of young men and women in the tri-state area by promoting fitness, supporting youth football and preventing bullying, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the charities supported by the Foundation is the club's trail-blazing anti-bullying program, Jets Tackle Bullying. The program aims to tackle all forms of bullying by raising awareness, providing tools for educators, and preventing bullying for kids and teens.

A dedicated proponent of autism research and awareness, **Johnson** works closely with the Johnson Center for Child Health & Development. The Center, named for **Johnson's** mother, Betty, aims to advance the understanding of childhood development through clinical care, research, and education as well as raise awareness on autism spectrum disorder and identify medical research to unlock better treatments for children and young adults affected by this condition.

In addition to his work with The Johnson Center, **Johnson** is also active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction as well as encouraging public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies. On a national level, **Johnson** donated \$1M on behalf of the Jets to the American Red Cross in the wake of the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey.

Neil Glat is entering his sixth season with the Jets after being named President in April 2012. Glat reports directly to Jets Chairman/CEO, Christopher Johnson, and oversees all elements of team business operations.

Since joining the Jets, Glat and his senior staff have focused on improving the fan experience and deepening the team's relationship with its passionate fan base, while also striving to be best-in-class in all areas of the sports business. To that end, Glat has looked to elevate the organization's off-field activities through strong and positive relationships with business partners and community leaders. These efforts have led to many new and innovative initiatives, such as the technology-driven Jets Rewards program (including digital ticketing and Jets Cash) which has resulted in faster stadium entry, enhanced fan offerings, and an improved game day experience at MetLife Stadium. Other initiatives have included award-winning virtual reality offerings, a state-of-the-art mobile app, and the launch of Jets 360; Jets 360 is a comprehensive content platform that gives fans greater access to the team through enhanced storytelling, graphics, and video quality across all digital and social platforms, through the team's television channels, as well as SNY and WCBS.

During Glat's tenure, the team implemented a year-round fan engagement calendar that results in great fan participation and partner involvement at events like Jets House, Draft parties, Taste of the Jets, Town Hall, and Movie Night. Glat has fostered programs that strengthen the team's connections to Jets alumni, including Legends Community Weekend and Legends Homecoming, and business partners through the Jets Partner Alliance.

Glat has led a community-based initiative, including a heralded partnership with STOMP Out Bullying, designed to raise awareness about the devastating impact of bullying in local schools. In 2016, the team hosted educators at the inaugural Jets Tackling Bullying Symposium, highlighting the latest trends and best practices in anti-bullying.

Prior to joining the Jets, Glat was the National Football League's Senior Vice President of Corporate Development. Glat headed a department responsible for League strategic initiatives, Club business development, stadium development, and new business opportunities. 

Entering his third season as general manager, **Mike Maccagnan** has re-shaped a roster he inherited in 2015 with a keen emphasis on building through the draft while focusing on the long-term objective of constructing a team that consistently competes for the playoffs.

“Our goal is to be a team that competes for the playoffs on a consistent basis,” said **Maccagnan**. “Our plan is to build the nucleus of this team through the draft. This core group of young players will be our foundation and, ideally, we want to have a good group of veterans. Some of these veterans can be players that have been with us for their entire career. Some of these players will be veterans that we’ve added through free agency. We’re all on the same page and success can’t happen fast enough for any of us, but we also recognize that it will take time to do it right. Every decision we make will be based on what’s best for the team in the short term and the long term.”

In his three drafts with the Jets, **Maccagnan** has selected 22 players - at least one at every position group - including defensive lineman **Leonard Williams** as well as young starters in right tackle **Brandon Shell**, punter **Lachlan Edwards**, linebackers **Darron Lee** and **Jordan Jenkins** as well as rookie safeties **Jamal Adams** and **Marcus Maye**. Undrafted free agent wide receiver **Robby Anderson** has also blossomed into a starter and cornerback **Juston Burris** has earned significant action on defense.

Williams was a consensus all-rookie selection in 2015 and earned selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016. **Lee** was named an all-rookie selection by NFL.com in 2016 after ranking fourth on the team in tackles with only nine starts. **Anderson** topped all NFL rookies with 20 or more receptions in yards per catch in 2016 and ranked sixth among all rookies in receptions and receiving yards.

Maccagnan has shown the ability to maneuver throughout the Draft, trading nine times in his three drafts, completing transactions to move up and move down as well as in and out of rounds. During the 2017 Draft, he executed five trades, increasing the team’s total draft choices from six entering the Draft to nine at its conclusion, while also adding a selection in the 2018 Draft. Maccagnan also added players on the current roster via waiver claims (tight end **Austin Seferian-Jenkins** and defensive lineman **Kony Ealy**) and trades (acquiring wide receiver **Jermaine Kearse** and re-acquiring linebacker **Demario Davis**).

In his first season as a general manager (2015), **Maccagnan** was named NFL Executive of the Year by the Pro Football Writers Association after he acquired seven new starters, all of which played a role in helping the team win 10 games - six more than the previous season. Two (Brandon Marshall & Darrell Revis) of the new seven starters earned Pro Bowl recognition in 2015. Marshall, who was acquired for a 2015 fifth-round draft pick, earned team MVP honors and established new club records for receptions (109) and receiving yards (1,434) while he tied the Jets record for most receiving touchdowns (14). Revis, who signed as an unrestricted free agent, led the club with nine takeaways (five interceptions and four fumble recoveries). Revis’ nine takeaways were tied for the second most in the NFL.

Last season (2016), the Jets used an NFL-record tying 75 players (including 49 different starters) en route to a 5-11 finish. Despite the disappointing finish, many of the young players earned a chance to play.

“When you look back on our season, obviously we’re not happy with the record and how everything worked out,” **Maccagnan** said at the Combine. “But that allowed for some of the young players to actually play and there are some positives in there ... There’s players that we drafted high. There’s some players that we drafted late. There’s some players that we brought on as college free agents and that have done well ... There are some young pieces in there that we feel good about.”

Prior to his arrival in Florham Park, **Maccagnan** spent more than 20 years in scouting, including the last four as the director of college scouting for the Houston Texans, originally joining the team in 2000 shortly after the expansion franchise was awarded. One of Charley Casserly’s original hires as Texans general manager, he spent his first 10 seasons with the club as the coordinator of college scouting before twice being promoted by current general manager Rick Smith, first to assistant director of college scouting in 2010 and then to the director of college scouting the following season.

Prior to his departure, he had a hand in every draft in Texans franchise history, selecting or signing an undrafted rookie free agent Pro Bowler at every position group with the exception of quarterback and specialist. RB Arian Foster (undrafted rookie free agent), WRs Andre Johnson (first-round pick) and Jacoby Jones (third-round pick), TE

Owen Daniels (fourth-round pick), LT Duane Brown (first-round pick), DE J.J. Watt (first-round pick), DE Mario Williams (first-round pick), DE Jason Babin (first-round pick), LBs Brian Cushing (first-round pick) and DeMeco Ryans (second-round pick), CB Tramon Williams (undrafted rookie free agent) and S Glover Quin (fourth-round pick) were added to the roster and went on to make at least one Pro Bowl appearance in their careers.

Despite selecting just two offensive linemen before the third round since 2008, **Maccagnan** helped add talent to a position group that cracked the top 10 in fewest sacks allowed (eighth), rushing yards (eighth) and fewest turnovers (10th). In 2014, 65 percent of the Texans offensive line starters joined the team as a result of the draft or as an undrafted rookie free agent.

Maccagnan began his career in the NFL as a training camp intern with the Washington Redskins (1990) and later re-joined the team in 1994 as a college scout before spending the next five seasons as a pro scout.

Prior to returning to Washington, **Maccagnan** served as a league scout for the World Football League at it's office in Dallas, joining the London Monarchs the following year for the team's championship run. He also spent time in the Canadian Football League, first with the Ottawa Rough Riders and later with the Saskatchewan Roughriders.

Married to wife, Betty, **Maccagnan** is a native of Hightstown, NJ, and holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Trinity College.

BRIAN HEIMERDINGER

VICE PRESIDENT, PLAYER PERSONNEL

Brian Heimerdinger is in his third year with the Jets and first as vice president of player personnel. In his current role, Heimerdinger oversees both the college and pro personnel departments while assisting with player contract negotiations. Heimerdinger joined the Jets after spending three seasons as a scout and player personnel analyst for the St. Louis Rams. 

Todd Bowles returns for his third season as head coach of the New York Jets, the franchise where he began his NFL coaching career in 2000. The 2017 offseason saw the Jets infuse their roster with younger players at a number of positions, but Bowles' expectations have not wavered.

"Our goal is to win regardless of whether we have younger guys or older guys," said Bowles. "Progress for me is being a lot better than last year and getting to the playoffs and getting to the Super Bowl. That's the ultimate progress. There is progress and steps between that – obviously we want to win a lot more games than last year and we want to go to the playoffs, and that's what we're coaching and striving to do (is) to go to the playoffs, so that's my goal.

"We lost a lot of guys that had a lot of production, but that doesn't mean the other guys cannot play," said Bowles of the team's young roster. "They just haven't made household names for themselves yet, but I'm excited about the season, I'm excited about the young guys we have coming in and we're going to be competitive and I know those guys are going to play well."

Bowles also made alterations to the coaching staff. Following the retirement of offensive coordinator Chan Gailey, Bowles tapped John Morton to lead the offense in 2017. Morton, a longtime NFL assistant, joins returning coordinators Kacy Rodgers on defense and Brant Boyer on special teams. Moreover, Bowles re-shaped his staff with five new position coaches: Jeremy Bates (quarterbacks), Kevin Greene (outside linebackers), Stump Mitchell (running backs), Robert Nunn (defensive line) and Dennard Wilson (defensive backs).

"I was looking for different types of coaches that could teach their guys a different way," said Bowles. "I knew the kind of guys I was looking for and all these guys fit the bill. They all teach differently but I wanted to find a good mix between them."

En route to earning a 5-11 record in 2016, the Jets tied an NFL record by using 75 players, including 49 different starters, 25 of whom were in their first or second seasons. Additionally, of the 29 players that appeared on the practice squad for the Jets in 2016, 13 were promoted to the active roster, including every player that spent at least seven weeks on the practice squad.

Bowles led the Jets to a 10-6 mark in 2015, beginning his head coaching tenure by winning four of his first five games before dropping four of five to even the season record at 5-5. With the season at a crossroads, Bowles guided the club to five straight wins. The six-game turnaround from the previous season matched the second-best win improvement in the first season by a new Jets head coach. The team also finished 10th in the league in total offense and fourth in total defense, one of just five teams in the league with a top 10 finish on both sides of the ball.

For Bowles, the key to having a successful team is tied to executing in four key areas: running the ball, third down, red zone and turnovers. Over his first two seasons, the Jets defensive unit ranked in the top five in rushing yards per game, third-down conversion rate and red zone touchdown percentage.

In 2015, the Jets ranked in the top third of the NFL in three of the four major offensive categories and in the top three in all four major defensive categories, improving the team's rank from 2014 in seven of the eight areas. The Jets also established a new franchise record mark for the fewest rushing yards allowed per game in a single season.

Prior to rejoining the Jets, Bowles served as the defensive coordinator for the Cardinals (2013-14), earning Assistant Coach of the Year recognition in 2014 from both the Pro Football Writers of America and The Associated Press, the first ever recipient of the AP award. During his time with Arizona, the Cardinals defense ranked in the top five in the league in several statistical categories, including third in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed (14), fifth in points per game allowed (19.5) and fifth in rushing yards per game allowed (96.6). Also, Bowles' defenses demonstrated a knack for causing turnovers and returning them for scores. During his tenure, the Cardinals ranked first in defensive touchdowns (nine) and fifth in interceptions (38).

In 2014, despite key losses to injury, Arizona's defense remained among the league's best and helped the Cardinals tie their highest win total in franchise history with 11. The defense ranked fifth in the NFL in points per game allowed (18.7), tied for fifth in fewest touchdowns surrendered (32), tied for third in interceptions returned for touchdowns (three) and tied for fifth in turnover margin (+8).

COACHING STAFF

During Bowles' first season as Arizona's defensive coordinator in 2013, his defense immediately developed into one of the most stout units in the NFL. The Cardinals finished the 2013 campaign with 10 wins, led by the league's sixth-ranked overall defense with 317.4 yards per game allowed. Arizona finished with the NFL's No. 1 rushing defense for the first time in franchise history, surrendering just 84.4 yards per game, improving from 28th in the league in 2012. Additionally, the Cardinals defense ranked seventh in points allowed per game (20.3), sixth with 30 takeaways and fifth with 20 interceptions. The team's 47.0 sacks in 2013 were good for the third highest in a season in team history.

Under Bowles' tutelage, three different Cardinals defensive players were named to the Pro Bowl. Most notably, cornerback Patrick Peterson made the Pro Bowl both seasons and was recognized as a first-team Associated Press All-Pro in 2013. Defensive end Calais Campbell was named to his first Pro Bowl in 2014 and earned second-team All-Pro honors. In 2013, linebacker Karlos Dansby earned second-team All-Pro honors and linebacker John Abraham was a Pro Bowler after accumulating a team-leading 11.5 sacks, the most by a linebacker in a single season in team history.

Prior to joining the Cardinals, Bowles coached in Philadelphia (2012), Miami (2008-11), Dallas (2005-07) and Cleveland (2001-04) after his start with the Jets (2000).

With the Eagles, he began the season coaching the team's defensive backs for the first six games before being appointed interim defensive coordinator for the final 10 contests. The Eagles finished ninth in the NFL in pass defense (216.9 ypg) that season.

Before his time with the Eagles, he spent four seasons with the Dolphins, serving as the team's assistant head coach/secondary. In 2011, Bowles was named interim head coach for the final three games, leading the club to a 2-1 record. In his time with the Dolphins, opposing quarterbacks completed just 58.1% of their passes, the seventh lowest total in the league, while safety Jeremiah Bell (2009) made his only Pro Bowl appearance in that span.

Prior to his time with Miami, he reunited with Head Coach Bill Parcells (who, as the director of football operations for the Jets in 2000 hired Bowles to his first coaching job in the NFL) as the secondary coach for the Cowboys from 2005-07. During that span, the Dallas defense totaled 52 interceptions, tied for third most in the NFC, and ranked fifth in the NFC by holding opposing offenses to 310.4 total yards per game. He coached three defensive backs to a total of five Pro Bowls in Dallas, including three appearances by safety Roy Williams and the first career trips for safety Ken Hamlin and cornerback Terence Newman.

From 2001-04, Bowles was a defensive assistant for Cleveland, serving as the secondary coach (2004) and defensive nickel package coach (2001-03). In 2004, the Browns ranked fifth in the NFL in passing yards allowed with 181.3 yards per game. His first year with Cleveland (2001), the Browns defense set a franchise record with 33 interceptions, including 28 picks by the secondary.

Bowles got his start in the NFL coaching ranks in 2000 as the Jets defensive backs coach and mentored a secondary that was ranked sixth in the NFL in pass defense, allowing 183.3 yards per game.

Before beginning his NFL coaching career, Bowles was recruited by his former Redskins teammate, quarterback Doug Williams, despite never having coached at any level, to serve as the defensive coordinator/secondary coach at Morehouse College in 1997 and then as the defensive coordinator/secondary coach at Grambling State from 1998-99.

After his retirement as a player, Bowles spent two seasons (1995-96) with the Green Bay Packers player personnel department under General Manager Ron Wolf, working alongside five current NFL general managers, John Dorsey, Scot McCloughan, Reggie McKenzie, John Schneider and Ted Thompson.

Despite going undrafted in the 1986 NFL Draft, Bowles, the four-year letterman and team captain out of Temple (1982-85), played in 117 regular-season games at cornerback and safety and registered 15 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries in his eight-year career playing for the Washington Redskins (1986-90, 1992-93) and the San Francisco 49ers (1991). Bowles was a starter on the 1987 Redskins championship team that defeated the Denver Broncos, 42-10, in Super Bowl XXII.

The New Jersey native, Bowles grew up 22 miles from the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center. He and his wife, Taneka, have three sons, Todd Jr., Troy and Tyson.

In 2016, the city of Elizabeth, NJ renamed Waterfront Field to The Todd Bowles Waterfront Sports Complex.



Mike Caldwell returns for his third season as the team's assistant head coach/linebackers coach after joining Head Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff from the outset in 2015.

Last season (2016), **Caldwell** guided a group that saw **David Harris** lead the team in total tackles (113) for the ninth time in 10 seasons. Additionally, 2016 first-round draft choice **Darron Lee** posted 40 of his 76 tackles as a starter over the season's final six games. His charges were part of a defense that allowed just 3.69 yards per carry to opposing ball carriers, the fourth lowest average in the league, as the Jets were one of just five teams to surrender 91 or fewer rushing yards in a game 10 times, despite facing six of the top 10 running backs in rushing yards.

Because of injury, including seeing **Harris'** streak of 121-consecutive starts snapped, **Caldwell** saw five different players — **Harris, Lee, Erin Henderson, Julian Stanford** and **Bruce Carter** — start at inside linebacker last season. Four of those players produced at least one double-digit tackle performance for the Jets in 2016.

In his first season with the Jets (2015), **Caldwell's** unit was part of a defense that helped to set a franchise record with just 83.4 rushing yards per game allowed, as two of his linebackers, **Harris** and Demario Davis, finished first and second on the team in total tackles with 128 and 118, respectively.

Prior to joining the Jets, **Caldwell** oversaw a Cardinals linebacker group that contributed to a defense (coordinated by **Bowles**) that ranked fifth in points allowed per game in 2015 (18.7) despite the key losses of inside linebackers Karlos Dansby (free agency) and Daryl Washington (injury).

In 2013, Arizona's defense finished as the NFL's sixth-ranked overall unit and featured the league's top-ranked run defense (84.4 yards per game) after allowing the fewest rushing yards in team history for a 16-game season (1,351). The Cardinals also had 47 sacks, the third highest total in franchise history, and 30 takeaways, including 20 interceptions which tied for the fifth best total in the NFL.

After serving as a training camp coaching intern with the Eagles in 2007, **Caldwell** began his coaching career as a defensive quality control coach with Philadelphia in 2008. He was promoted to assistant linebackers coach in 2010 and elevated to linebackers coach in 2011. During his first season overseeing the linebackers, **Caldwell** helped develop several young players into key roles, including Jamar Chaney, who intercepted three passes to go along with a team-leading 104 tackles. He also integrated two rookies into the rotation – sixth-round pick Brian Rolle, who started 13 games, and fourth-rounder Casey Matthews. In 2012, **Caldwell** oversaw standout linebacker DeMeco Ryans, who led the team with 113 tackles, including 15 tackles for loss.

During his 11-year playing career at linebacker, **Caldwell** was a special teams standout with Cleveland (1993-95), Baltimore (1996), Arizona (1997), Philadelphia (1998-2001), Chicago (2002) and Carolina (2003), having played in 159 career regular-season games, posting 14.5 sacks and eight INTs and receiving Special Teams MVP honors from his Eagles teammates in 1998.

Caldwell earned his degree from Middle Tennessee State in business administration. He and his wife, Sue, have two daughters, Sydnei and Saniah, and a son, Simeon. His niece, Nikki, is the head women's basketball coach at LSU.





Brant Boyer returns for his second season as the special teams coordinator after initially joining Head Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff in 2016.

In his first season, kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league last season and the fourth highest mark in team history. Additionally, seventh-round rookie punter **Lachlan Edwards** matched a team rookie record with 75 punts.

Boyer joined the Jets after a four-year tenure in Indianapolis (2012-15), where he aided a Colts special teams unit that ranked in the top 10 league-wide during that span in net punting average (third), kick-off return average (fourth), kickoff touchbacks (fourth) and field goal percentage (seventh), despite using three different players as primary punt returners and four different kick returners in his four seasons.

During the 2015 season, the Indianapolis special teams unit established an NFL record with just 156 kickoff return yards allowed for the season, besting the previous mark of 254 set by Denver in 1992.

In 2014, both punter Pat McAfee and kicker Adam Vinatieri received Associated Press First-Team NFL All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors under **Boyer** as McAfee converted a career-high three inside kicks and set single-season franchise records for punts pinned inside the 20-yard line (30), net punting average (42.8) and kickoff touchbacks (70), while Vinatieri made 30-of-31 field goals, including 35 consecutive attempts, the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

In 2013, **Boyer** coached Matt Overton to his first career Pro Bowl selection, one year after discovering the long snapper at a specialists combine in Arizona and bringing him to Indianapolis for a workout prior to his signing in April of 2012.

Prior to joining the Colts, **Boyer** was twice a training camp intern, first for the Cleveland Browns (2009) and later for the New York Giants (2010).

Before entering the coaching ranks, **Boyer** played linebacker and was a standout on special teams for the Miami Dolphins (1994), Jacksonville Jaguars (1995-2000) and Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He served as a special teams captain for both the Jaguars and Browns and led the unit in tackles in 2002 and 2003. **Boyer** was a two-time member of USA Today's All-Joe Team, once as a linebacker and once as a special teams player. In 2002, his teammates selected him for the Cleveland Browns Unsung Hero Award.

Boyer played in 129 career games and totaled 250 tackles, 13.0 sacks, six interceptions, one forced fumble and 15 passes defended. He originally entered the league as a sixth-round selection of the Miami Dolphins in the 1994 NFL Draft.

Before entering the NFL, **Boyer**, was an inside linebacker and team captain at the University of Arizona who led the team in tackles during his senior season, helping the Wildcats to their first 10-win season in 90 years and a victory in the 1993 Fiesta Bowl, earning a place in the school's Ring of Honor.





John Morton was named as the Jets offensive coordinator on January 31st, joining Head Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff after 15 seasons in the NFL, the last two with the New Orleans Saints as the team's wide receivers coach.

Among the head coaches that **Morton** has coached under: Jon Gruden (OAK, 1998-01), Bill Callahan (2002-03), Norv Turner (2004), Jim Harbaugh (University of San Diego, 2005 and SF, 2011-14), Sean Payton (NO, 2006, 15-16) and Pete Carroll (Southern California, 2007-09). Those six coaches have produced 465 career wins and six Super Bowl appearances.

Over the last two seasons, Saints wide receivers led the NFL with 507 receptions and 6,682 yards. Of that total, all but 49 receptions and 444 yards came from wide receivers with three or fewer years of experience. Under **Morton**, wide receivers Brandin Cooks and Michael Thomas each produced 1,100-yard seasons, while Cooks, Thomas, Willie Snead IV and Brandon Coleman all produced multiple touchdowns in each of their seasons under **Morton** despite all having three-or-fewer years of NFL experience.

Before his return to New Orleans, **Morton** worked in San Francisco coaching wide receivers (2011-14). During that span, both wide receivers Anquan Boldin (2013-14) and Michael Crabtree (2012) produced 1,000-yard seasons. In addition to Boldin and Crabtree, three other players produced multiple touchdown seasons under him. In his first stint with New Orleans (2006), **Morton** served as an offensive assistant for a Saints team that advanced to the NFC Championship Game.

Morton's first coaching job came in 1997 when he joined the Raiders in the team's personnel department. After one season there, he moved to Oakland's coaching staff where he worked in a variety of positions including offensive assistant/wide receivers (1998-99), offensive quality control/wide receivers (2000-01), senior offensive assistant (2002-03) and finally as the team's tight ends coach (2004). During his time in Oakland, **Morton** worked with Hall of Fame receivers Jerry Rice and Tim Brown, both of whom enjoyed multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons during their time with Morton.

In between NFL stints, **Morton** worked at the collegiate level, first as the passing game/wide receivers coach at the University of San Diego (2005) under Jim Harbaugh, where quarterback Josh Johnson established current school records in both completions and completion percentage. Later, **Morton** would spend four seasons at the University of Southern California (2007-10) under Carroll. For the first two seasons at USC, **Morton** worked as the passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach before spending the final two as the school's offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach.

After spending two years at Grand Rapids (MI) Community College (1989-90) as a wide receiver, **Morton** played two years for Western Michigan (1991-92), finishing eighth in receiving yards and 10th in receptions and earning All-Mid-American Conference honors as a senior. **Morton** entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent with Oakland (1993), spending parts of two seasons with the Raiders as a member of their practice squad. He also spent time with Green Bay in 1993 and

was in training camp with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 1995. **Morton** returned to training camp with the Raiders again in 1996. He played for the CFL's Toronto Argonauts in 1995 and 1996, and later with the World League's Frankfurt Galaxy in the spring of 1997.

Morton received his bachelor's degree in general studies from Western Michigan in 1997 and an associate's degree from Grand Rapids (MI) Community College in 1990. He and wife, Shannon, have two daughters, Tierney Rose and Sage Marie.





KACY RODGERS

Kacy Rodgers returns for his third season as the Jets defensive coordinator after helming a defense that saw 32 different players and 24 different starters play in 2016.

Last season, the passing defense improved over the final eight weeks from the league's last-ranked passing defense, allowing 302.1 yards per contest, to the league's second-ranked passing defense, allowing just 207.5 yards per game. Additionally, the rushing defense allowed just 3.69 yards per carry, the fourth lowest average in the league, continuing the group's success against the run. Over his two seasons as defensive coordinator, **Rodgers'** group has held opposing runners to just 91.1 yards per game, the third fewest in the league during that span. Opposing ball carriers have gained just 3.64 yards per carry, the second best in the league.

In his first season as defensive coordinator (2015), **Rodgers'** unit registered 30 takeaways, increasing the team's total by 17 from the previous season, tying for the third most in the league and the most since the team recorded 31 in 2011. As a whole, the defense ranked in the top 10 in five major defensive categories, including points (No. 9), total defense (No. 4), rushing defense (No. 2), third downs (No. 3) and red zone (No. 1).

Prior to joining the Jets, **Rodgers** spent seven seasons coaching the defensive line in Miami. During his tenure, the Dolphins defense totaled 287 sacks, third most in the league during that span, and ranked in the top 10 in opponents' rushing average (4.02 yards per carry) and rushing touchdowns allowed (80). In 2014, Miami's defensive line produced 30.5 of the team's 39 sacks, the third consecutive season that it accounted for over 70% of the team's total.

Under **Rodgers'** direction, defensive tackle Paul Soliai (2012), defensive tackle Randy Starks (2010, '12) and defensive end Cameron Wake (2011, 13-15) all made their first Pro Bowl appearances. Additionally, 2012 third-round selection defensive end Olivier Vernon paired with Wake to produce 38.0 sacks from 2013-14, the third highest total by a pair of defensive linemen, behind only Mario Williams and Kyle Williams (BUF), and Robert Quinn and Chris Long (SL).

During his time with the Cowboys, **Rodgers** coached both the defensive tackles (2003-04) and the defensive line (2005-07). Over his tenure, the defense finished in the NFL's top 10 against the rush all but one year. In 2007 it finished sixth against the rush, allowing just 94.6 yards per game.

Prior to his career in the NFL, **Rodgers** spent time coaching at several colleges, including Tennessee-Martin (1994-97), Louisiana-Monroe (1998), Middle Tennessee State (1999-01) and Arkansas (2002). He spent his time coaching the defensive lines at every stop, before becoming the assistant head coach at Tennessee-Martin and Middle Tennessee State.

Rodgers signed as an undrafted free agent with the Steelers in 1992, spending training camp with the team, and signed with the Shreveport Pirates (CFL) in 1994 before retiring.

He attended the University of Tennessee (1988-91) and lettered four times while contributing to a pair of SEC Championships (1990-91).

Rodgers' son, Kacy II, plays defensive back for the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the CFL.







Jeremy Bates was named quarterbacks coach on February 8th, 2017, marking his return to the Jets, whom he coached for in 2005. For **Bates**, the position marks his first in the NFL since 2012 when he coached quarterbacks with the Chicago Bears.

Prior to his time in Chicago, **Bates** spent one season as the offensive coordinator for the Seahawks, overseeing a Seattle offense that averaged 31.5 points in the postseason.

Between NFL positions, **Bates** spent one season at the University of Southern California where he worked with Jets Offensive Coordinator **John Morton** (then the USC offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach) as the school's assistant head coach/quarterbacks coach.

Prior to USC, **Bates** spent three seasons with Denver, first as an offensive assistant (2006), then as the wide receivers/quarterbacks coach (2007) and finally as the quarterbacks coach (2009). The Broncos finished top 10 in both total yards and passing yards in that span.

In his first stint with the Jets (2005), **Bates** worked with a quarterback position that saw five quarterbacks play and three start as injuries took their toll on the position.

In his first coaching position, **Bates** was an offensive quality control coach (2002-03) and later became the assistant quarterbacks coach (2004) with Tampa Bay as the Buccaneers won Super Bowl XXXVII after the 2002 season.

Bates, a college quarterback at both Rice (1996-99) and Tennessee (1995), received his degree from Rice in 1999. He is the son of Jim Bates, who spent 17 years coaching in the NFL as part of a coaching career that spanned five decades.







David Diaz-Infante returns for his second season on Head Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff, and his third straight year with the club after he spent time as a training camp intern (2015).

Last season, his first full one with the Jets, **Diaz-Infante** coached an offensive line that saw nine different starters, including multiple starters at four of the five positions as four projected starters finished the year on injured reserve. Despite the turnover, the line helped blocked for an offense that finished in the top half of the league in both rushing yards (12th) and sacks allowed (t-16th).

Prior to his time with the Jets, **Diaz-Infante** served as an offensive assistant with the Arizona Cardinals for two seasons (2013-14), working on the same coaching staff as Bowles, who was the defensive coordinator at the time.

He also played in the World League of American Football (WLAF) with the Frankfurt Galaxy (1991-92), the Sacramento Gold Miners in the Canadian Football League (1993-94) and the Las Vegas Outlaws in the XFL (2001).

Following his playing days, **Diaz-Infante** worked in television as a studio analyst with FSN Rocky Mountain from 2003-04 before joining ESPN in 2004 as a college and high school football analyst. He also served as an analyst for the Broncos radio network from 2005-08.

A native of San Jose, CA, **Diaz-Infante** attended Bellarmine College Prep (San Jose, CA) where he was the Central Coast Section Conference Lineman of the Year in 1981. He played college football at San Jose State where he was an honorable mention AP All-American, a first-team all-conference selection and a four-year starter while also serving as a team captain. He was inducted into the San Jose State Sports Hall of Fame in 2006.

Diaz-Infante earned a bachelor of arts in social science. He and his wife, Audra, have a son, Dante Antonio, and a daughter, Alexis Maria.





Karl Dorrell returns for his third season as the Jets wide receivers coach, marking his 28th season coaching at the collegiate and professional levels.

Last season (2016), following an injury to Eric Decker, **Dorrell** would get increased contributions from second-year wide receiver **Quincy Enunwa**, who established career bests in every category and led the team in receiving yards and receiving touchdowns. Undrafted rookie wide receiver **Robby Anderson** finished with the sixth most receiving yards among rookie wide receivers in 2016 and finished seventh in franchise history for most receiving yards by a rookie, becoming the first Jets receiver with multiple touchdown receptions of 40+ yards since 2010.

In his first season with the Jets (2015), **Dorrell** oversaw a record-setting receiving group led by Brandon Marshall, who earned Pro Bowl recognition after posting franchise marks with 109 receptions (fourth in the league), 1,502 yards (fourth) and 14 receiving touchdowns (tied for first). Additionally, Decker and Marshall would combine for the most receptions and receiving touchdowns of any wide receiver duo in Jets history while finishing second in team annals in total receiving yards. The pair also logged touchdowns in the same game nine times, besting the NFL record established in 1998.

Before rejoining the NFL coaching ranks in 2015 with the Jets, **Dorrell** spent 2014 as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Vanderbilt.

In his prior NFL stints, **Dorrell** helped the Texans reach the playoffs in 2012, when he tutored quarterback Matt Schaub to his second career Pro Bowl. With **Dorrell's** guidance, Schaub recorded 4,008 passing yards and completed 64.3 percent of his passes, his highest completion percentage since 2009.

Prior to his time with Houston, **Dorrell** spent four seasons in Miami, three as a wide receivers coach (2008-10) and the last as quarterbacks coach (2011). In 2011, he mentored Dolphins quarterback Matt Moore to a career season when he took over the starting job in Week Five. He went on to set career highs in almost every category, while also ranking fourth among AFC quarterbacks with an 88.7 passer rating.

As the wide receivers coach from 2008-10, **Dorrell** saw Marshall and Davone Bess combine for the fourth most receptions of any duo in the NFL. Bess had 209 receptions from 2008-10, at the time the most by any Dolphins player in his first three years with the team.

A head coach at UCLA from 2003-07, **Dorrell** was named the 2005 Pac-10 Conference Co-Coach of the Year. He guided the Bruins to five bowl games and an overall record of 35-27. In 2005, **Dorrell** led UCLA to a 10-2 record and No. 13 national ranking in the USA Today Coaches' Poll. That same season, the Bruins defeated two ranked opponents, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 10 California. The 2005 squad was led by quarterback Drew Olson and running back Maurice Jones-Drew, who helped the Bruins rank No. 5 nationally in scoring offense (39.1) and No. 23 in both passing offense (270.3) and total offense (431.0).

Dorrell's first full-time stint in the NFL came from 2000-02 when he served as the wide receivers coach for the Broncos. While with Denver, he helped Rod Smith eclipse 1,000 yards receiving three times and earn two Pro Bowl selections. In 2000, Ed McCaffrey posted 101 receptions for 1,317 yards and combined with Smith to become only the second wide receiver duo to each catch 100 passes in a single season.

Dorrell received his full-time opportunity with the Broncos (2000) after working with the staff during training camp in 1993 and 1999 as part of the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship program.

Dorrell coached wide receivers at Colorado from 1992-93 and Arizona State in 1994 before returning to Colorado to serve as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach of the Buffaloes from 1995-98. While in Colorado, **Dorrell** helped Charles Johnson and Michael Westbrook become just the fourth pair of receivers on the same team to top 1,000 yards in a season.

Dorrell was an honorable mention All-America receiver at Helix High School in San Diego before helping the Bruins play in three Rose Bowls as a wide receiver during his playing career at UCLA (1982-86). After college, he spent time with the Dallas Cowboys in 1987.

Dorrell graduated with a degree in psychology from UCLA in 1987, and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at UCLA in 1988. A native of San Diego, CA, **Dorrell** and wife, Kim, have two children, Chandler and Lauren.





A 2007 graduate of Rutgers, **Giacobbe** and his wife, Melissa, have one son, Antonio.





La'Roi Glover was named assistant defensive line coach on February 28, 2017. He joins Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff as a first-time coach after seven years of experience working in the NFL and a 13-year playing career that saw him selected for multiple Pro Bowls.

Prior to joining the Jets, **Glover** spent seven seasons working as the Director of Player Programs for the Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams. In that role he was responsible for assisting players with their transition into professional football as the development of programs to address off-the-field matters.

Glover spent 13 seasons as a defensive tackle in the league, playing in 193 games, including 191 consecutive to finish his career, for the Oakland Raiders (1996), New Orleans Saints (1997-2001), Dallas Cowboys (2002-05) and the St. Louis Rams (2006-08). He amassed 83.5 sacks during his career and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowl teams, while also receiving All-Pro recognition four times. He was a first-team selection for the 2000s All-Decade team. During the 2000 season, **Glover** led the league with 17.0 sacks, the second most in league history among defensive tackles, and was named NFL Alumni Defensive Lineman of the Year as well as NFC Defensive Player of the Year.

Glover is a member of the San Diego State University Hall of Fame, the Breitbard Hall of Fame (established to honor athletes who have excelled athletically in San Diego, or who are native San Diegans who have achieved athletic fame elsewhere), the New Orleans Saints Hall of Fame and the inaugural class of the CIF-San Diego Section Hall of Fame. **Glover** graduated from San Diego State University with a degree in public administration and later received his MBA at Fontbonne University in 2012.

Glover and his wife, Spring, have three children, a son, La'Roi, Jr., and two daughters, Neomie and Sophia.





Kevin Greene joined the New York Jets staff as the team's outside linebackers coach on January 28th, 2017, his second coaching position in the NFL following a 15-season, Hall-of-Fame playing career.

Prior to joining the Jets, **Greene** spent five seasons with the Packers as their outside linebackers coach. In those five seasons, Green Bay produced 203.0 sacks, the fourth most in the league, while linebacker Clay Matthews produced 50.0 total sacks, the third most of any player and the most among any outside linebackers. Additionally, nine different outside linebackers produced multi-sack seasons for the Packers under **Greene**, including five rookies.

As a 3-4 outside linebacker during his playing career, **Greene** played for four different teams – Los Angeles Rams, Pittsburgh Steelers, Carolina Panthers and San Francisco 49ers – and notched 160.0 career sacks, the third most in league history and the most by a linebacker. A five-time Pro Bowl selection and three-time All-Pro selection, **Greene** registered 10 double-digit sack seasons and led his team in sacks 11 times and the league twice. He played in six conference championship games and one Super Bowl (XXX) and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2016.

In addition to his 160.0 sacks, **Greene** finished his career with 26 fumble recoveries, tied for fourth all-time, and five interceptions. He had three returns for touchdowns (two fumbles, one INT) and also posted three safeties.

A former walk-on at Auburn, **Greene** played two seasons (1983-84) for the Tigers and led the SEC in sacks as a senior with 11. He was selected in both the NFL Draft by the Rams in the fifth round and in the USFL territorial draft by the Birmingham Stallions.

While earning a degree in criminal justice at Auburn, **Greene** also completed ROTC training and served as a captain in a 16-year career in the Army Reserve. He served his military commitments during the offseasons while playing in the NFL.

After his playing career ended, **Greene** worked in real estate and as a summer NFL coaching intern with five different clubs, including one in 2006 with Miami, where Dom Capers was the Dolphins' defensive coordinator. His most recent coaching internship came in 2008 with the eventual Super Bowl champion Steelers.

Born in Schenectady, NY, **Greene** and his wife, Tara, have a son, Gavin, and a daughter, Gabrielle.

Jeff Hammerschmidt returns for his second season as the assistant special teams coach. He initially joined Head Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff with Special Teams Coordinator **Brant Boyer** in 2016, his first season in the NFL after a 24-year career coaching in the collegiate ranks.

In **Hammerschmidt's** first season, kicker Nick Folk connected on 87.1% of his field goal attempts, tied for the sixth best in the league last season and the fourth-highest mark in team history. Additionally, seventh-round rookie punter **Lachlan Edwards** matched a team-rookie record with 75 punts.

Prior to joining the Jets, **Hammerschmidt** served as a special teams coordinator for his alma mater Arizona (2008-11) before working in the same capacity at Colorado State (2012-15). In his time with the Rams, both the punter and kicker received honorable mention all-conference honors.

Throughout his career, **Hammerschmidt** has coached every level of the defense (secondary, linebackers and defensive line) while also serving as a defensive coordinator for Southern Utah (1996-97), Saint Mary's (2000-02) and Montana (2003-04). He began his coaching career in 1992 as a graduate assistant at Arizona and has since worked with a handful of current and former NFL players, including Kris Dielman, Adewale Ogunleye, Antwaan Randle El and Brooks Reed.

A four-year letterman, three-year starting safety and first-team All-Pac-10 selection at Arizona, **Hammerschmidt** was a semifinalist for the 1989 Jim Thorpe Award after beginning his career as an option quarterback. Following his collegiate career, he signed as a free agent with the Los Angeles Rams (1991) and played for the Frankfurt Galaxy of the World League (1992). **Hammerschmidt** and his wife, Felicity, have two children, Bryn and Bode. He has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Arizona.





Jimmie Johnson returns for his third season as the Jets tight ends coach, originally joining Head Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff in 2015. In two seasons under **Johnson**, the tight ends have helped block for a rushing attack that has produced 114.7 yards per game, the eighth best average in the league.

Last season (2016), in-season waiver claim **Austin Seferian-Jenkins** posted eight of his 10 catches with the Jets over his final five contests. In his first season with the Jets (2015), **Johnson** battled key injuries at his position, losing his top two returning tight ends before the start of the season.

Prior to joining the Jets, **Johnson** spent eight seasons as the Vikings tight ends coach, utilizing a variety of different players in his time there. During his time in Minnesota, four different tight ends led the group in receptions, including Jermaine Wiggins (2006), Visanthe Shiancoe (2007-11), Kyle Rudolph (2012) and John Carlson (2013). Under **Johnson**, Shiancoe posted 208 catches for 2,424 yards and 24 touchdowns in five seasons, despite amassing just 35 catches for 253 yards and three touchdowns in the four seasons prior to joining Minnesota. In his final two seasons with **Johnson**, Rudolph, a former second-round selection, posted 12 touchdowns. Although he missed eight games in those two seasons, Rudolph's 12 touchdowns tied for the fifth-most among tight ends in the NFL. In their time under **Johnson**, Vikings tight also excelled in the red zone, producing 36 touchdowns on just 75 targets, or almost half a touchdown per target, the best in the league.

His group helped pave the way for the NFL's top rushing attack, as the Vikings produced 138.2 yards per game on the ground, the best yards per carry (4.75), the most carries of 10+ yards (505) and the second-most rushing touchdowns (141). Additionally, Minnesota ran out of two-TE sets more than all but one other team and produced the most yards, the highest yards per carry average and the most carries of 10-plus yards in the league.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, **Johnson** was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Texas Southern (2004-05), the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks/wide receivers coach at Shaw and the running backs coach at South Carolina State.

Johnson entered the league as a 12th-round pick by the Redskins and spent 10 seasons as an NFL tight end, appearing in 118 games (33 starts) for Washington, Detroit, Kansas City and Philadelphia. He helped pave the way for 1,000-yard rushers in eight of his 10 seasons as a player, including Earnest Byner, Barry Sanders, Ricky Watters and Duce Staley.

As a senior at Howard, **Johnson** was an All-MEAC choice after hauling in 31 receptions for 546 yards and nine TDs. He finished his four-year college career with 73 catches for 1,229 yards and 16 TDs.

Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in consumer studies at Howard University and his MBA from George Washington University. He is a native of Augusta, GA, where he attended T.W. Josey High School.



Steve Marshall returns for his third season as the Jets offensive line coach, his 37th season coaching football and 10th in the NFL.

Last season, **Marshall** coached an offensive line that saw nine different starters, including multiple starters at four of the five positions as four projected starters finished the year on injured reserve. Despite the turnover, the line helped blocked for an offense that finished in the top half of the league in both rushing yards (12th) and sacks allowed (t-16th).

In his first season (2015), quarterback Ryan Fitzpatrick and running back Chris Ivory both established career best seasons as Fitzpatrick set a franchise record for most passing touchdowns (31) and Ivory earned Pro Bowl honors after gaining an AFC-leading 1,070 yards rushing.

Including his first season with the Jets (2015), **Marshall's** offensive lines have ranked in the top 10 in the league in sacks allowed in four of the last five seasons.

Prior to the Jets, **Marshall's** lines helped two quarterbacks, Derek Anderson (Browns, 2007) and Aaron Rodgers (Packers, 2014) earn Pro Bowl appearances. In Cleveland, he helped rookie first-round draft choice offensive tackle Joe Thomas earn Pro Bowl honors in his first two seasons, adding All-Pro recognition in his second, while his lines paved the way for running back Jamal Lewis to gain over 1,000 yards each year.

In his first NFL position, **Marshall** served as the assistant offensive line coach for two seasons at Houston, including the team's inaugural season in 2002. He was then promoted to offensive line coach in 2004, coaching a line that blocked for an 1,100-yard rusher (Domanick Williams) and an 1,100-yard receiver (Andre Johnson).

In his collegiate stops, he has helped tutor 19 future NFL players, including draft choices David Bakhtiari, Mitchell Schwartz and Andre Gurode. **Marshall** has coached collegiately at New Mexico State (2014), Colorado (2011-12 & 2000-01), California (2009-10), North Carolina (1998-99), Texas A&M (1997), UCLA (1996), Tennessee (1993-95 & 1980-81), Virginia Tech (1987-92), Murray State (1985-86), Louisville (1984), Marshall (1982-83) and Plymouth State (1979).

Marshall was a two-time letterman at both tight end and guard for Louisville. As a junior in 1977, he was a member of a Cardinals team that played in the Independence Bowl, earning a bachelor's degree in both history and physical education. He is married to wife, Karin.



Daylon McCutcheon returns for his third season as the Jets assistant defensive backs coach after making his NFL coaching debut in 2015.

Since 2015, the secondary has ranked in the top 10 in both passing defense and completion percentage allowed. Last season the Jets improved from the league's lowest-ranked passing defense, allowing 302.1 yards per contest over the first eight weeks, to the league's second-ranked passing defense, allowing just 207.5 yards per game.

Additionally, the secondary saw increased contributions from first- and second-year players, including 2016 fourth-round selection, cornerback **Juston Burris**, who appeared in all 16 games, starting one and collecting a pick, and roster cutdown waiver claim, cornerback **Darryl Roberts**, who made two starts and tied for the team lead in passes defended with eight.

In his first full season with the Jets (2015), the defensive backs produced all 18 of the team's interceptions (fifth most in the NFL), and held opposing quarterbacks to the lowest completion percentage in the league (57.1 percent) and the sixth lowest quarterback ranking (79.0).

McCutcheon returned to the Jets after spending the 2013 training camp as a minority coaching intern, working with the defense. Prior to returning to the Jets, he assisted the Cardinals in the same capacity during the 2014 training camp, working with **Todd Bowles**, **Mike Caldwell** and the Arizona defense.

Following his playing career, **McCutcheon** returned to his alma mater, Bishop Amat High School, to serve as the team's defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach.

A former third-round selection in the 1999 draft, he started 96-of-103 career games, posting 396 tackles, 12 interceptions, 7.0 sacks and 53 passes defended. During his time in the Browns secondary (1999-06), the team tied for fifth in the league with 133 interceptions.

A four-year player at USC, **McCutcheon** started 42-of-48 games, amassing 187 tackles, 10 interceptions and 46 passes defended. He earned All-American recognition as a senior in addition to All-Pac 10 first-team honors and was a semifinalist for the Thorpe Award.

McCutcheon and wife, Shawna, have three children, son, Dyson, and twin daughters, Shyanne and Maliyah. His father, Lawrence McCutcheon, was a Pro Bowl running back for the Los Angeles Rams who helped the club advance to Super Bowl XIV.







Lyonia “Stump” Mitchell joined Head Coach **Todd Bowles’** staff as the team’s running backs coach on February 1st, 2017, his 16th season coaching running backs in the NFL.

Prior to joining the Jets, **Mitchell** spent nine seasons in Seattle (1999-2007), two seasons in Washington (1998-99) and the last four seasons in Arizona (2013-16), turning a Cardinals rushing attack that ranked 24th or worse each season from 2005-2012, including 32nd four times, to a top 10 rushing offense over the last two seasons.

Under **Mitchell**, four different backs — Ricky Watters (1999-00), Shaun Alexander (2001-05), Clinton Portis (2008) and David Johnson (2016) — have gained 1,000 yards rushing in a season, while Andre Ellington produced 1,000 scrimmage yards in each of his first two NFL seasons (2013-14). Additionally, Alexander (five times) and Johnson (each of the last two seasons) have produced 10 or more scrimmage touchdowns in a season, including Alexander’s then-NFL record 28 in 2005 and Johnson’s league-leading 20 last season. He has helped produce five Pro Bowl players: Alexander, Johnson, Portis as well as fullbacks Mack Strong and Mike Sellers.

Before he entered the NFL’s coaching ranks, **Mitchell** spent four seasons at Morgan State, first as the team’s offensive coordinator (1995) and then three years as head coach. He returned to college football in 2010, serving as the head coach at Southern University for three seasons (2010-12).

Following the conclusion of his NFL playing career, **Mitchell** began coaching running backs for the San Antonio Rough Riders of the World League of American Football in the spring of 1991. He then moved on to Casa Grande (AZ) High School in 1993 where he served as the head coach for two seasons, leading the team to the state playoffs in his second year.

A former ninth-round selection in the 1981 NFL Draft, **Mitchell** played his entire nine-year NFL career with the Cardinals, signing with Kansas City in 1990 without appearing in a game. **Mitchell**, who moved with the team from St. Louis to Phoenix, ranks in the top three in franchise history in rushing yards (second), rushing average (second), kickoff return yards (second) and punt return yards (third). Off the field, **Mitchell** earned recognition as the Cardinals Chuck Drulis Award winner for community service in 1982 and as the team’s Byron “Whizzer” White Humanitarian Award finalist in 1984 for his work in the community.

A four-year player and three-year starter at running back for The Citadel, **Mitchell** holds school records for rushing yards in a season and for a career, finishing with the second-most rushing yards in the country as a senior in 1980 when he was named as a third-team All American, Southern Conference Player of the Year and South Carolina Amateur Athlete of the Year.





Robert Nunn was named the defensive line coach on **Todd Bowles'** staff on January 31st, 2017. **Nunn** joins the Jets for his 18th season as a coach in the league and his 30th season coaching football.

Prior to the Jets, **Nunn** worked with the Cleveland Browns (2016), New York Giants (2010-15), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2009), Green Bay Packers (2005-08), Miami Dolphins (2001-02, 04) and Washington Redskins (2003). He has been part of six top 10 defenses for three different teams and 19 different players have produced at least 5.0 sacks in a season. Of those 19, 11 matched or established their single-season career bests while coached by him. Among the players coached by **Nunn** in the NFL are Hall of Famers Bruce Smith, who broke the NFL career sacks record under him in 2003, and Jason Taylor, who established a single-season best 18.5 sacks in 2002, as well as Jason Pierre-Paul and Justin Tuck, both of whom registered multiple 10+ sack seasons with him.

Before entering the coaching ranks in the NFL, **Nunn** spent 12 years coaching at the collegiate level, including eight seasons as the head coach (1992-99) at Georgia Military College in Milledgeville, GA after spending his first season at the school (1991) as the defensive coordinator. Among his other stops were coaching defensive ends at Tennessee, where he coached current Jets defensive coordinator **Kacy Rodgers**, and one season as the defensive line coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College (1988).

Nunn spent four years as a linebacker at Oklahoma State, serving as team captain during his senior year. He graduated from the school in 1988 with a degree in secondary education.

Nunn and his wife, Karen, have five children: a daughter, Josie, and four sons, Noah, Jacob, Nathan and Johnny.





Jason Vrable was named to Coach **Todd Bowles'** staff as an offensive assistant on February 7th, 2017. Vrable joins the Jets after spending the previous four seasons with the Buffalo Bills.

In Buffalo, **Vrable** spent the first three seasons as offensive quality control coach before being promoted to assistant quarterbacks coach. He assumed the role of interim running backs coach following Anthony Lynn's promotion to offensive coordinator in Week Three. Since Week Three, Bills running backs Mike Gillislee (5.71) and LeSean McCoy (5.67) led all qualifying NFL runners in rushing average as the pair also accounted for 23 total touchdowns as part of a Buffalo offense that finished first in the league in rushing yards per game.

Prior to entering the NFL coaching ranks, **Vrable** spent two seasons at Syracuse, first working as an assistant to the wide receivers coach and then as an assistant to the quarterbacks coach. Following his time with the Orange, **Vrable** spent two seasons at the University of Charleston as the school's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, as the school led its conference in total offense and rushing offense.

After his playing career at Marietta, **Vrable** spent the summer of 2007 as a strength intern at the University of South Florida before returning to Marietta, this time as the school's quarterbacks coach. He spent one season there before joining the Robert Morris staff in the same position.

Vrable set records in all single-season and career passing categories en route to earning multiple Ohio Athletic Conference honors at Marietta College. He was named Marietta's Clyde Lamb Award winner in 2007 recognizing him as the school's male scholar athlete of the year.

Vrable graduated with a master's degree in sports management from Robert Morris University. He and his wife, Jill, have a son, Drake.





Dennard Wilson joined the Jets staff as the team's defensive backs coach on January 18th, 2017 after five seasons with the Rams, both in St. Louis and Los Angeles.

With the Rams, **Wilson** held the defensive backs coach position for the last two seasons, overseeing a passing defense that improved from 23rd in 2015 to ninth overall in 2016. Since 2015, cornerback Trumaine Johnson has picked off eight passes, tied for the fifth most in the league and third most among corners. Before spending the last two seasons as the defensive backs coach, **Wilson** worked as the Rams defensive quality control coach after joining the team in 2012.

Wilson entered the NFL coaching ranks with the Rams after four years as a pro scout with the Chicago Bears, evaluating pro players and scouting opponents.







- 10th-year running back who spent first eight seasons with CHI before joining the Jets as an unrestricted free agent (2016)...A two-time Pro Bowler (2011 and 2013), he has rushed for over a 1,000 yards five times in his career with three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons (2012-14)...Ranks first in the NFL in total scrimmage yards with 13,794 since entering the league in 2008 and second among active running backs in receptions (517)...Has missed only 10 games in 10 seasons...Has a career rushing total of 9,415 yards and 4,379 yards receiving with 72 touchdowns combined in 134 games (133 starts).
