THE RECORD...completed the 2018 season 89-73 (.549), finishing 3rd in the American League West (14.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...finished 8.0 games back of the American League Wild Card...went 45-36 (.556) at home and 44-37 (.543) on the road...were 58-39 (.598) prior to the All-Star break and 31-34 (.477) following the break...posted a 25-20-8 record in series, including 7 sweeps...went 9-10 in rubber games to decide the outcome of a 3-game series...were 64-46 (.582) in night games and 25-27 (.481) during the day...when scoring first went 59-30 (.663)...were 65-4 (.942) when leading after 7 innings and 77-0 (1.000) when leading after 8 innings...recorded 39 come-from-behind wins and suffered a loss in 32 games after holding a lead...season-high winning streak was 8 games, June 25-July 3...had 2 season-high 5-game losing streaks, June 17-22 and July 31-August 4.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS...the Mariners went 56-32 (.636) in their first 88 games through July 5...at that point, they had the 4th-best record in the Major Leagues and had matched their season-high at 24 games over .500 (also: 55-31)...from July 6 through the end of the regular season, the Mariners went 33-41 (.446), the 12th-worst record in baseball over that span.

THE HITTING...the Mariners hit .254 (1402x5513) with 256 doubles, 32 triples, 176 home runs, 644 RBI, 430 walks, 79 stolen bases, a .314 on-base percentage and a .408 slugging percentage (.722 OPS)...averaged 4.18 runs-per-game (677 R, 162 G)...ranked 5th in the American League/8th in the Majors in batting...led the Majors with a .265 (760x2869) average on the road, compared to .243 (642x2644) at home, which ranked 21st in the Majors...ranked 8th-best in the Majors with 4.67 runs-per-game (378 R, 81 G) on the road, compared to 3.69 runs-per-game (299 R, 81 G) at home, which ranked 28th in the Majors.

THE PITCHING...the Mariners went 89-73 with 60 saves and a 4.13 ERA (664 ER, 1,448.2 IP)...combined for 12 shutouts...recorded 1,328 strikeouts, averaging 8.25 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings (1,328 K, 1,448.2 IP)...issued 400 walks and allowed 195 home runs...held opponents to a .252 (1396x5545) average against while recording a 1.24 WHIP (400 BB, 1396 H, 1,448.2 IP)...led the Major Leagues in fewest walks allowed, ranking ahead of Cleveland (407) and Los Angeles-NL (422)...Mariners starters went 54-49 with a 4.35 ERA (431 ER, 891.1 IP) with 772 strikeouts and 226 walks; recorded 3 complete games...Mariners relievers went 35-24 with 60 saves, 109 holds and a 3.76 ERA (233 ER, 557.1 IP) with 556 strikeouts and 174 walks.

THE FIELDING...the Mariners combined for a .985 fielding percentage, successfully converting 5,832-of-5,920 total chances (4,346 putouts, 1,486 assists, 88 errors)...tallied 152 double plays...committed 88 errors...ranked 4th in the American League in total chances, behind Oakland (6,080), Texas (5,971) and Baltimore (5,934)...**Guillermo Heredia** was 1 of 5 qualifying outfielders in the Major Leagues to compile a 1.000 fielding percentage (also: Mark Canha-OAK, Jon Jay-KC/ARI, Josh Reddick-HOU and Mike Trout-LAA)...Heredia successfully converted 222 total chances (219 PO, 3 A)...joins Franklin Gutierrez (2010) as the only Mariners outfielders in club history with a 1.000 fielding percentage in a season...**Mitch Haniger** tied for the Major League lead in outfield assists with 12 (also Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN)...**Mike Zunino** ranked 3rd in the AL/5th in the Majors among qualifying catchers with a .998 fielding percentage (925 TC, 880 PO, 43 A, 2 E)...ranks 3rd among catchers in single-season club history, behind Dan Wilson in 2001 (.999) and 2003 (.998).

WINNING WAYS...since 2016, the Mariners have the 5th-most wins in the American League...over the last 3 seasons, Seattle has compiled a record of 253-233 (.521), trailing only Boston (294-192/.605), Houston (288-198/.593), Cleveland (287-198/.592) and New York-AL (275-211/.566)...Seattle is 1 of 5 American League clubs with a cumulative winning record since 2016.

THAT'S A LOT OF WINS...the Mariners went 89-73 in 2018, marking their 2nd season with at least 85 wins since 2016...the Mariners are 1 of 5 American League teams with multiple 85-win seasons over the last 3 seasons...they join Boston (3), Cleveland (3), Houston (2) and New York-AL (2).

FOR STARTERS...three Mariners pitchers recorded at least 10 wins in 2018: **Marco Gonzales** (13), **James Paxton** (11) and **Mike Leake** (10)...marks the 20th time in club history that at least 3 pitchers had 10 wins apiece and the first time since 2014 (**Roenis Elías, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, Chris Young**)...the Mariners were 1 of 10 clubs this season with 3-or-more pitchers with 10 wins each, joining Arizona, Boston, Chicago-NL, Cleveland, Colorado, Houston, New York-AL, New York-NL and Philadelphia.

FOUR SCORE...the Mariners went 65-19 (.774) when scoring at least 4 runs in 2018...their .768 winning percentage was 9th-best in the Majors when scoring 4-plus runs...the Mariners were held to 3-or-fewer runs in 78 games, going 24-54 (.308)...their .308 winning percentage when scoring 3-or-fewer runs was 3rd-best in the Majors, behind Oakland (.344/21-40) and Colorado (.323/21-44)...Seattle's 78 games with 3-or-fewer runs were tied for 8th-most in the Majors (also: Kansas City).

PLAYING IT CLOSE...of the Mariners 162 games, 82 were decided by 2-or-fewer runs with the club going 54-28 (.659) in those contests...the Mariners led the Majors in wins decided by 2-or-fewer runs, while ranking 3rd in winning percentage and 4th in games played...Seattle's 54 wins in games decided by 2-or-fewer runs were a single-season club record (previous: 51, 2009).

ONE IS THE LONELIEST NUMBER...the Mariners went 36-21 (.632) in one-run games, leading the Major Leagues in one-run wins while ranking 7th in winning percentage in one-run games...trailing only Oakland (.689/31-14), Atlanta (.657/23-12), Boston (.641/25-14), Milwaukee (.635/33-19), Colorado (.634/26-15) and Los Angeles-AL (.634/26-15) in winning percentage in one-run games...the Mariners 36 one-run wins were a single-season club record (previous: 35, 2009)...the Mariners .632 winning percentage in one-run games was 4th-best in club history, trailing Seattle's clubs of 2001 (.684/26-12), 2009 (.636/35-20) and 2017 (.634/26-15)...since 2015, the Mariners are 120-95 (.558) in one-run games, leading all clubs in one-run wins and games played while ranking 2nd in winning percentage.

GET THE BALL TO EDDIE...when leading after 8 innings, the Mariners were 77-0 (1.000) in 2018, the only team in the Majors with a perfect record when leading at the end of 8...according to *STATS LLC*, the Mariners are the 25th team in the Major Leagues since 1912 with 77-or-more wins and 0 losses in a season when leading after 8 innings, the first club to do so since the 2017 Los Angeles Dodgers (90-0) and the first AL club to accomplish this feat since the 2015 New York Yankees (81-0)...since 2002, 8 American League clubs, including the 2018 Mariners, have gone 77-0 or better when leading after 8...from 1912-2001, it was done by only 5 AL teams.

WORKHORSES...five Mariners pitchers made at least 25 starts in 2018...**Mike Leake** led the club with 31 starts, followed by **Marco Gonzales** (29), **Félix Hernández** (28), **James Paxton** (28) and **Wade LeBlanc** (27)...the Mariners were the only team in the Majors this season with 5 pitchers with at least 25 starts each... Seattle became the first American League club to have 5 pitchers make at least 25 starts apiece since 2016 when both Cleveland and Toronto accomplished this feat...marked only the 4th time in club history to have 5 pitchers make 25-plus starts apiece, joining the Mariners clubs of 1991 (Rich DeLucia, Erik Hanson, Brian Holman, Randy Johnson, Bill Krueger), 2003 (Ryan Franklin, Freddy García, Gil Meche, Jamie Moyer, Joel Piñeiro) and 2006 (**Félix Hernández**, Gil Meche, Jamie Moyer, Joel Piñeiro, Jarrod Washburn).

INNINGS EATERS...five Mariners pitchers worked at least 150.0 innings in 2018...**Mike Leake** led the club with 185.2 innings, followed by **Marco Gonzales** (166.2), **Wade LeBlanc** (162.0), **James Paxton** (160.1) and **Félix Hernández** (155.2)...the Mariners were the only club in the Major Leagues this season to have 5 pitchers work at least 150.0 innings...marked only the 5th time in club history to accomplish this feat as the 2018 squad joined the Mariners clubs of 1991 (Rich DeLucia, Erik Hanson, Brian Holman, Randy Johnson, Bill Krueger), 1993 (Chris Bosio, Dave Fleming, Erik Hanson, Randy Johnson, Tim Leary), 2003 (Ryan Franklin, Freddy García, Gil Meche, Jamie Moyer, Joel Piñeiro) and 2006 (**Félix Hernández**, Gil Meche, Jamie Moyer, Joel Piñeiro, Jarrod Washburn).

TURN TWO...the Mariners turned 152 double plays in 2018, 4th-most in the American League and tied for 7th-most in the Majors (also: Arizona)...two Mariners ranked among the top-3 American League pitchers for most opponents grounded into double plays: **Mike Leake** led the AL with 24 GIDP, while **Marco Gonzales** tied for 2nd-most with 23 (also: Kyle Gibson-MIN)...**Kyle Seager** led all 3rd basemen with 49 double plays, ranking ahead of Nolan Arenado-COL (44) and Matt Chapman-OAK (37)...the Mariners turned a club record 6 double plays on Aug. 21 vs. Houston (previous: 5, 2x, last: 9/3/81 at BOS).

WALK IT OFF...the Mariners recorded 8 walk-off wins in 2018: May 5 vs. Los Angeles-AL (**Ryon Healy**, RBI-double), May 15 vs. Texas (**Guillermo Heredia**, RBI-single), May 20 vs. Detroit (**Jean Segura**, RBI-single), May 26 vs. Minnesota (**Mike Zunino**, HR), June 1 vs. Tampa Bay (**Mitch Haniger**, HR), June 13 vs. Los Angeles-AL (**Mitch Haniger**, 2-run HR), Aug. 18 vs. Los Angeles-NL (balk) and Sept. 25 vs. Oakland (**Chris Herrmann**, pinch-hit, 2-run HR)...five of the Mariners 8 walk-off wins came in a span of 16 home games, from May 5- June 1...the Mariners 8 walk-off wins were tied for 4th-most in the American League/8th-most in the Major Leagues (also: Chicago-NL, Colorado, New York-AL and New York-NL).

EXTRA, EXTRA!...the Mariners went 14-1 (.933) in extra-inning games this season, leading the Majors in extra-inning wins and winning percentage while ranking tied for 10th in the Majors in extra-inning games played (also: Los Angeles-NL and Miami)...according to Baseball-Reference, there have been 1,168 seasons since 1908 in which a team played at least 15 extra-inning games; of those 1,168 seasons, the Mariners .933 winning percentage is 2nd-best, trailing only the 1949 Cleveland Indians (.947/18-1)...the Mariners won each of their first 8 extra-inning games in 2018...joined the 1995 Cleveland Indians (13-0) and the 2002 San Francisco Giants (8-0) as the only clubs since 1995 to begin the season with an 8-game winning streak in extra-inning games...suffered their first extra-inning loss on July 27 at Los Angeles-AL.

IN THE BLACK...the 2018 season was only the 3rd time in club history that the Mariners never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times in 2018 (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.

ALL HANDS ON DECK...the Mariners used a total of 53 different players in 2018, 3rd-most in single-season club history, trailing only the 61 players used in 2017 and the 54 used in 2016...Seattle used 32 different pitchers (including 2 position players: **Andrew Romine** and Taylor Motter) this season, tied for 2nd-most in club history (also: 2016), behind only the 2017 club (40).

MOVING ON UP...the Mariners were the 5th-most improved team in the Majors in 2018, winning 11 more games this season compared to 2017...Seattle trailed 4 clubs in biggest difference in wins from 2017 to 2018: Oakland (22), Atlanta (28), Boston (15) and Philadelphia (14).

MANAGERIAL MILESTONES...**Scott Servais** recorded his 250th career managerial win on Sept. 25 vs. Oakland...in 3 seasons with the Mariners, Servais has 253 career victories, 2nd-most in club history to Lou Piniella (840)...Servais became the 5th manager in club history with at least 200 wins when he recorded his 200th managerial victory on June 2 vs. Tampa Bay; he joins Piniella, Jim Lefebvre (233), Darrell Johnson (226) and Eric Wedge (213)...since 2016, Servais ranks 6th among all managers in wins, trailing only Joe Maddon-CHC (290), AJ Hinch-HOU (288), Terry Francona-CLE (287), Dave Roberts-LAD (287) and Craig Counsell-MIL (255).

Mitch Haniger made 156 outfield starts in 2018, tops in the AL and 2nd-most in the Majors (Nick Markakis-ATL, 160)... Haniger is the 1st Mariners outfielder to make at least 156 starts since **Ichiro Suzuki** in 2010.

208

James Paxton ranked 8th in the AL with 208 strikeouts...became the 6th pitcher in club history with at least 200 strikeouts (last: **Félix Hernández**, 2014, 248 K).

1,328

Mariners pitchers established a single-season club record for strikeouts with 1,328 (previous: 1,318, 2016).

2,300,177

The Mariners drew 2,300,177 fans to Safeco Field in 2018, eclipsing the two-million mark for 5th straight season... marks the highest home attendance total since 2008 (2,332,530).

CALL IT A COMEBACK...of the Mariners 89 wins, 39 came in comeback fashion...Seattle's 39 comeback wins ranked 6th-most in the American League/9th-most in the Major Leagues, trailing the Cubs (48), Red Sox (47), Rockies (46), Twins (44), Athletics (42), Blue Jays (42), Brewers (42) and Astros (41)...the Mariners scored the game-winning run in the 7th inning or later in 25 of their 39 comeback wins, including 8 times in extra innings.

GETTING SERIES...the Mariners compiled a series record of 25-20-8 in 2018, including 7 sweeps and 4 times being swept...Seattle's series record ranked 7th in the American League/11th in the Majors...in 26 series at Safeco Field, the Mariners went 12-10-4, including 4 sweeps and 1 time being swept...in 27 series on the road, the Mariners were 13-10-4, including 3 sweeps and 3 times being swept...the Mariners won or tied 24 of their first 29 series, going 18-5-6 in series from the beginning of the season through July 5...from July 6 - Aug. 29, the Mariners were 2-10-1 in series...over their last 11 series, the Mariners were 5-5-1, including winning 3 of the last 5...the Mariners went 8-1-3 in their first 12 road series, spanning April 3 - June 10.

NO FREE PASSES...the Mariners issued the fewest walks in the Major Leagues in 2018...Seattle pitchers walked 400, ranking ahead of Cleveland (407), Los Angeles-NL (418), Houston (435) and Oakland (474)... Seattle's 400 walks allowed are fewest in club history in a full season (the 1981 Mariners issued 360 walks in 110 games), ranking ahead of the clubs of 2011 (436), 2002 (441) and 2012 (449)...among Mariners pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched in single-season club history, 4-of-the-top-11 marks for fewest walks allowed came in 2018: **Marco Gonzales** finished T3rd with 32 (also: Doug Fister, 2010, and Carlos Silva, 2008), while **Mike Leake** was 6th with 34, **Wade LeBlanc** was T7th with 40 (also: Taijuan Walker, 2015) and **James Paxton** was T9th with 42 (also: Jamie Moyer, 1998, and Hisashi Iwakuma, 2013).

BEST VS. THE WEST...the Mariners had a winning record vs. each of their divisional opponents in 2018...the Mariners went 10-9 vs. Houston, 11-8 vs. Los Angeles-AL, 10-9 vs. Oakland and 10-9 vs. Texas (41-35 overall vs. the AL West)...marks the first time the Mariners have had a winning record vs. each of their divisional foes since Houston joined the AL West in 2013...is the first time Seattle has had a winning record vs. each team in their division since 2003 (11-8 vs. LAA, 12-7 vs. OAK, 10-10 vs. TEX).

PITCHING IN...two Mariners position players made pitching appearances this season: **Andrew Romine** and **Taylor Motter**...Romine was 1 of 4 primary position player to make 3 pitching appearances in 2018 (also: Erik Kratz-MIL, Matt Davidson-CWS and Hernán Pérez-MIL)...Romine's 3 pitching appearances are the most in club history by a primary position player, surpassing Jesús Sucre (2)...he appeared as a pitcher on July 12 at the Angels, Aug. 17 vs. the Dodgers and Aug. 19 vs. the Dodgers and has 7 career pitching appearances...Motter worked the 8th inning on April 9 at the Royals and has 2 career pitching appearances.

ALL-STAR POWER...the Mariners had 4 All-Star selections in 2018: **Nelson Cruz**, **Edwin Díaz**, **Mitch Haniger** and **Jean Segura**...the Mariners 4 All-Stars were their most since 2014 (**Robinson Canó**, **Félix Hernández**, Fernando Rodney and **Kyle Seager**) and marked only the 2nd time to have at least 4 All-Stars since the club had 5 in 2003 (Bret Boone, Edgar Martínez, Jamie Moyer, Shigetoshi Hasegawa and **Ichiro Suzuki**)...here are some notes on the Mariners in the 2018 All-Star Game:

- **Segura** (2x2, 2 R, HR, 3 RBI) became the 7th player in All-Star Game history to match that stat line, joining Andruw Jones (2003), Willie McCovey (1969), Ted Kluszewski (1954), Al Rosen (1954), Ted Williams (1946) and Arky Vaughan (1941)...became the 6th Mariners player to homer in the All-Star Game (also: Ken Griffey Jr., Edgar Martínez, Alex Rodríguez, **Ichiro Suzuki** and **Robinson Canó**)...his 3 RBI are the most by a Mariners player in a single Midsummer Classic...Segura was elected by the fans to the 32nd and final roster spot on the AL All-Star Team through the Final Vote; he was Seattle's first Final Vote candidate since the program's inception in 2002...it was Segura's 2nd career All-Star selection.
- **Díaz** (W,1.0,1,2,2,1,2,HR) became the 2nd Mariner to be the winning pitcher at the All-Star Game, joining Freddy García (2001 at Safeco Field)...it was Díaz's 1st career All-Star appearance.
- **Cruz** drew a walk in his only plate appearance at the Midsummer Classic...it was Cruz's 6th career All-Star selection and his 5th in the last 6 seasons (also: 2009, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017).
- **Haniger** was 0-for-2 as a defensive replacement...it was his 1st career trip to the Midsummer Classic.

ONE IS ALL IT TAKES...the Mariners went 5-0 in 1-0 games in 2018, the 2nd-most 1-0 wins in a season in club history; the 2012 Mariners won 6-3 in 1-0 games...Seattle's 5 wins in 1-0 games led the Majors in 2018, ranking ahead of Chicago-NL (4), Pittsburgh (4), San Francisco (4) and Tampa Bay (4)...**Edwin Díaz** went 5-for-5 in save opportunities in the Mariners 1-0 wins...in those 5 saves, Díaz threw five 1-2-3 9th innings, striking out 14 of the 15 batters he's faced...his 5 saves in 1-0 wins are tied with 4 others for the most in single-season history since the save became an official stat in 1969 (also: Troy Percival-LAA, 2002, Heath Bell-SD, 2010, Carlos Marmol-CHC, 2010, and Trevor Rosenthal-STL, 2014).

SHUT IT DOWN...Mariners pitchers combined for 12 shutouts in 2018, tied for 5th-most in the American League/10th-most in the Major Leagues (also: Houston, Miami and Philadelphia)...**James Paxton** was the only Mariner to throw an individual shutout (no-hitter) and was 1 of 19 pitchers with a shutout in 2018...**Marco Gonzales** started 4 of the Mariners team shutouts, tops on the club and tied for 3rd-most in the American League (also: 7 other pitchers), behind only Corey Kluber-CLE (5) and David Price-BOS (5).

GET IN THERE, ROOK...two players made their Major League debuts with Seattle during the 2018 season: **John Andreoli** (May 23 at OAK) and **Matt Festa** (July 14 at COL)...eight rookies saw action on the field with the Mariners in 2018: Andreoli, Festa, **David Freitas**, Mike Marjama, **Nick Rumbelow**, **Zach Vincej**, **Daniel Vogelbach** and **Rob Whalen**.

YOU COMPLETE ME...Mariners pitchers tallied for 3 complete games, tied for 2nd-most in the Majors (also: Houston, New York-NL and Pittsburgh), trailing only Cleveland (5)...**James Paxton** led the club with 2 complete games, followed by **Marco Gonzales** (1)...Paxton was 1 of 8 pitchers with 2 complete games in 2018, joining José Berríos-MIN, Carlos Carrasco-CLE, Mike Foltyniewicz-ATL, Corey Kluber-CLE, Max Scherzer-WAS, Noah Syndergaard-NYM and Jameson Taillon-PIT...Paxton became the first Mariner with multiple complete games in a season since **Félix Hernández** in 2015 (2).

HAMMERIN' HANIGER...**Mitch Haniger** finished his first full Major League season batting .285 (170x596) with 90 runs, 38 doubles, 4 triples, 26 home runs, 93 RBI, 10 HBP, 70 walks, a .366 on-base percentage and a .493 slugging percentage (.859 OPS) in 157 games in 2018...Haniger ranked among the top-20 American League leaders in batting (19th), runs (T14th), hits (T8th), doubles (13th), RBI (10th), walks (T13th), on-base percentage (11th), slugging percentage (16th), OPS (10th) and extra-base hits (T12th, 68)...he recorded 12 outfield assists, tied for the Major League lead (also: Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN)...ranked 6th in the Majors with 15 game-winning RBI...became the 13th player (done 29x) in club history with at least 90 runs and 90 RBI in a season (last: **Nelson Cruz**, 2017)...became 1 of 7 Mariners outfielders in club history with at least 25 home runs and 90 RBI in a season and, at 27 years of age, is the youngest since Ken Griffey Jr.'s MVP campaign of 1997 (also 27)...Haniger was named to his 1st All-Star Game in 2018.

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** led the Major Leagues with 57 saves...his 57 saves are tied with Bobby Thigpen-CWS (1990) for 2nd-most in single-season history...is the 14th pitcher in Major League history (done 17x) with at least 50 saves in a season and the youngest ever to reach that milestone...is the 2nd pitcher ever with at least 50 saves and 100 strikeouts in a season (also: Eric Gagne-LAD, 2002 and 2003)...ranked 2nd among all relievers with 124 strikeouts...was 27-for-30 (90.0%) in one-run save opportunities, establishing a single-season Major League record for saves when entering with a one-run lead...is 1 of 18 relievers in Major League history (done 20x) with at least 100 more strikeouts than walks...earned his 1st All-Star Game selection...was named AL Reliever of the Month 4 times (April, June, July, August).

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES...of the 53 players who appeared in a game with the Mariners in 2018, 14 were not in the organization when the club opened Spring Training camp: **Alex Colomé**, **Ross Detwiler**, **Zach Duke**, **Roenis Elías**, **Erik Goeddel**, **Justin Grimm**, **Chris Herrmann**, **Wade LeBlanc**, **Cameron Maybin**, **Kristopher Negrón**, **Denard Span**, **Ichiro Suzuki**, **Sam Tuivailala**, **Adam Warren**...5 of the 53 players were no longer in the Mariners organization at the end of the regular season: John Andreoli, Erik Goeddel, Mike Marjama, Ariel Miranda and Taylor Motter.

THAT'S A NO-NO...**James Paxton** pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in his on May 8 at Toronto...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout...here are some notes on Paxton's no-no:

- Became the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.
- Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with Texas (STATS LLC).
- Marks the Mariners 4th no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for tops in the Majors during that span.
- Marks the 1st no-hitter in club history to occur on the road.
- Marks the 1st no-hitter at Rogers Centre since 2011 (Justin Verlander-DET, 5/7/11 vs. Blue Jays).
- Was 1 of 3 no-hitters in the Majors in 2018 (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS; four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).
- Became the 12th pitcher since 1988—the first year in which pitch counts were tracked—to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a no-hitter (last: Edinson Vólquez-MIA, 6/3/17 vs. ARI).

PAXTON'S PUNCHOUTS...**James Paxton** finished 9th in the American League with 208 strikeouts...became the 6th Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season, the first since **Félix Hernández** in 2014 (248 K) and the first Seattle southpaw since Randy Johnson in 1998 (213 K)...Paxton's 2018 campaign marked the 20th season or at least 200 strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher in club history: Johnson (7), Hernández (6), Mark Langston (4), Floyd Bannister (1) and Erik Hanson (1).

NORTH OF THE BORDER...**James Paxton** became the 7th Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history with at least 200 strikeouts in a single season, the first since Ryan Dempster-CHC in 2010 (208) and only the second Canadian left-hander ever, along with Erik Bedard-BAL in 2007 (221 K)...Paxton's 2018 season marked the 13th season of at least 200 strikeouts by a Canadian-born pitcher: Ferguson Jenkins (6), Dempster (2), Bedard (1), Bob Emslie (1), Russ Ford (1) and Kirk McCaskill (1).

MR. 300...**Jean Segura** ranked 7th in the American League with a .304 (178x586) batting average...after hitting .300 (157x524) in his first year with Seattle in 2017, becomes the 8th Mariners player in club history to hit at least .300 in back-to-back seasons... the last Mariners player to accomplish this feat was Ichiro Suzuki, who hit .300-or-better in 10 consecutive seasons from 2001-10...the other Mariners to hit .300 in consecutive seasons are Edgar Martinez (1995-2001 and 1990-92), Ken Griffey Jr. (1990-94 and 1996-97), Alex Rodriguez (1996-98), Bruce Bochte (1979-80), Phil Bradley (1985-86) and John Olerud (2001-02).

HOLD UP...Mariners relievers finished 3rd in the Major Leagues in 2018 with 109 holds, trailing Tampa Bay (115) and Arizona (112) while ranking ahead of Boston (107), Colorado (105) and Houston (105)...the Mariners 109 holds were a single-season club record, surpassing the 100 holds by the 2015 club...despite not recording his first hold until May 28, **Alex Colomé** ranked 3rd in the American League/7th in the Majors with 30 holds; trailed only José Alvarado-TB (32) and Chaz Roe-TB (32) for the AL lead...**Colomé** became only the 2nd pitcher in club history with at least 30 holds in a season, joining Arthur Rhodes, who set the club record with 32 holds in 2001.

GOODBYE BASEBALL...seven Mariners reached double-digits in home runs in 2018: **Nelson Cruz** (37), **Mitch Haniger** (26), **Ryon Healy** (24), **Kyle Seager** (22), **Mike Zunino** (20), **Robinson Canó** (10) and **Jean Segura** (10)...the 2018 season was 1 of 14 in club history in which the Mariners had at least 7 players with 10-or-more home runs apiece and the 4th season in a row; Canó, Cruz, **Ben Gamel**, Haniger, Seager, Segura, Danny Valencia and Zunino each tallied at least 10 home runs in 2017.

IN THE BIG INNING

On Aug. 9 at Houston, the Mariners started the game with 4 consecutive hits: **Mitch Haniger's** home run, followed by **Denard Span's** triple, **Jean Segura's** double and **Nelson Cruz's** single...the Mariners became the first team in the live ball era to have its first 4 batters hit for the cycle in reverse order...Haniger, Span and Segura combined to become just the 6th trio of 1-2-3 hitters to record at least 3 hits and 1 home run in a game during the live ball era; the Astros were the last team to accomplish this feat on July 4, 2017 at Atlanta.

LEADING THE WAY...Mariners leadoff batters combined to hit .309 (216x700), the 2nd-best mark by a club's leadoff hitters in 2018...they trailed only Boston (.332/221x665) while ranking ahead of Kansas City (.308/208x675), Chicago-NL (.302/212x701) and Washington (.282/192x680)...five Mariners made starts batting leadoff in 2018: **Dee Gordon** (99), **Mitch Haniger** (45), **Jean Segura** (14), **Guillermo Heredia** (3) and **Denard Span** (1)...Haniger hit .330 (62x188) while batting leadoff with 19 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 21 RBI, a .388 on-base percentage and a .580 slugging percentage (.967 OPS)...among qualifying leadoff batters in 2018, Haniger ranked 3rd in batting, 3rd in slugging, 3rd in OPS and 5th in on-base percentage... Haniger became the 4th qualifying leadoff hitter in club history to bat at least .330 in the leadoff role and the first since **Ichiro Suzuki** hit .352 as a leadoff batter in 2009.

THE LEFTY FROM LADNER...**James Paxton** earned co-American League Player of the Week for May 7-13 after throwing a no-hitter on May 8 at Toronto...overall, he went 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (3 ER, 15.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts and 3 walks in 2 starts...marked Paxton's 3rd career player of the week honors (also: April 10-16, 2017 and July 24-30, 2017), as he joined Randy Johnson as the only pitchers in club history to earn 3 Player of the Week honors...Paxton shared the weekly honor with Cleveland Indians shortstop Francisco Lindor.

DOMINANT DÍAZ...**Edwin Díaz** was named American League Reliever of the Month 4 times in 2018, including 3 consecutive months: April, June, July and August...became the first non-rookie to win 4 monthly awards in a single season since Pedro Martínez earned 4 AL Pitcher of the Month honors in 1999...joins Edgar Martínez (5-time AL Player of the Month) and **Ichiro Suzuki** (4-time AL Rookie of the Month and 1-time AL Player of the Month) as the only Mariners to earn 5 career monthly awards of any kind.

CLIMBING THE LADDER...**Félix Hernández** entered the 2018 season with 2,342 career strikeouts...with 125 strikeouts during the 2018 campaign, he brought his career total to 2,467 strikeouts, 37th-most in Major League history...recorded his 2,465th career strikeout on Sept. 26 vs. Oakland, surpassing Mark Langston for the 37th-most career strikeouts all-time...since the beginning of the season, climbed from 48th on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard to 37th, surpassing Hall of Famer Robin Roberts, Charlie Hough, Hall of Famer Sandy Koufax, Kevin Brown, Hall of Famer Dennis Eckersley, Luis Tiant, Jamie Moyer, Andy Pettitte, Sam McDowell, Jim Kaat and Langston.

KING OF OPENING DAY...**Félix Hernández** made his 11th career Opening Day start – his 10th consecutive – on March 29 vs. Cleveland (also: 2007 vs. OAK, 2009 at MIN, 2010 at OAK, 2011 at OAK, 2012 at OAK-Tokyo, 2013 at OAK, 2014 at LAA, 2015 vs. LAA, 2016 at TEX and 2017 at HOU)...became the 7th pitcher in Major League history to make at least 10 consecutive Opening Day starts (also: Steve Carlton, Roy Halladay, Walter Johnson, Jack Morris, Robin Roberts and Tom Seaver)... earned his 7th career Opening Day win, tied for 4th-most all-time (also: Randy Johnson, Jimmy Key and Tom Seaver), trailing Walter Johnson (9), Pete Alexander (8) and Jack Morris (8)...lowered his career Opening Day ERA to 1.52 (13 ER, 76.2 IP), 2nd-lowest all-time among pitchers with at least 70.0 innings pitched on Opening Day (Walter Johnson, 1.31/18 ER, 124.0 IP)... marked his 6th career Opening Day start allowing 1 or fewer runs, tied for 2nd-most all-time (also: Juan Marichal and Tom Seaver), trailing only Walter Johnson (8)...his streak of 10 consecutive Opening Day starts is the longest active streak in the Majors...extended his club record for most career Opening Day nods (previous: Randy Johnson, 6).

CRUZ CONTROL...**Nelson Cruz** was named American League Player of the Week for June 18-24...Cruz hit .500 (12x24) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 8 RBI, 2 walks, a .538 on-base percentage and a 1.042 slugging percentage (1.580 OPS) in 6 games during the week...he hit safely in each of the 6 games and reached base via hit or walk 14 times during that span...it marked Cruz's 5th career Player of the Week honor, having won the awards twice with the Mariners (also: April 19, 2015), twice with Baltimore (June 2 and Sept. 8, 2014) and once with Texas (May 24, 2010).

GOOD STRETCH...from May 18 – July 3, the Mariners went 31-12 (.721), the top record in the Majors over this span...Seattle ranked ahead of Los Angeles-NL (29-13/.690), Houston (28-14/.667), Boston (28-15/.651) and New York-AL (27-15/.643) during this stretch...30 of the club's 43 games over this span were decided by 2-or-fewer runs, with the Mariners going 24-6 in those contests...in these 43 games, Mariners starters were 22-7 with a 3.30 ERA (99 ER, 270.0 IP) with 228 strikeouts and 58 walks, leading all starting rotations in innings pitched, while ranking 2nd in wins and 3rd in ERA...from May 18 – July 3, the Mariners hit .260 (378x1456), 7th-best in the Majors...**Edwin Díaz** went 19-for-20 (95.0%) in save opportunities over this stretch.

TROUBLE IN THE FIRST...Mariners starting pitchers combined for a 5.61 ERA (101 ER, 162.0 IP) in the 1st inning in 2018, 4th-highest in the Major Leagues...only Colorado (7.23/131 ER, 163.0 IP), Baltimore (6.44/116 ER, 162.0 IP) and Chicago-AL (6.17/111 ER, 162.0 IP) had a higher team ERA in the 1st inning... of the 5 Mariners pitchers to make at least 25 starts this season, 4 had a 1st-inning ERA of at least 4.00: **Félix Hernández** (8.16/26 ER, 28.2 IP), **James Paxton** (5.00/15 ER, 27.0 IP), **Wade LeBlanc** (4.67/14 ER, 27.0 IP) and **Mike Leake** (4.65/16 ER, 31.0 IP).

NIGHT AND DAY...the Mariners had the 7th-best winning percentage in night games in 2018, going 64-46 (.582)...they trailed only Milwaukee (68-35/.660), Boston (72-44/.621), New York-AL (68-42/.618), Houston (67-42/.615), Colorado (66-45/.595) and Oakland (60-42/.588)...in day games, the Mariners were 25-27 (.481), tied with Colorado for the 13th-worst record in baseball...the Mariners had a 3.96 ERA (435 ER, 988.2 IP) in night games, compared to a 4.48 (229 ER, 460.0 IP) mark in day games...the Mariners averaged 4.35 runs-per-game (478 R, 110 G) at night but only 3.83 runs-per-game (199 R, 52 G) during the day.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME...the Mariners ranked 11th in the Majors with an ERA of 3.70 (306 ER, 745.0 IP) at Safeco Field, but ranked 20th in baseball with an ERA of 4.58 (358 ER, 703.2 IP) on the road... **James Paxton** ranked 13th in the American League with a home ERA of 3.35 (32 ER, 86.0 IP).

7TH HEAVEN...**Mike Leake** (31 GS, 34 BB) recorded his 7th straight season of at least 30 starts and 50-or-fewer walks, joining Greg Maddux (13, 1996-2008) as the only pitchers in the live ball era with at least 7 such seasons in a row.

2018 TEAM HIGHLIGHTS



TRUE TO THE BLUE...the Mariners drew 2,300,177 fans to Safeco Field in 2018, eclipsing the two-million mark for 5th straight season...marks the highest home attendance total since 2008 (2,332,530)...there were 5 sold out games at Safeco Field in 2018: March 29 vs. Cleveland, June 17 vs. Boston, July 25 vs. San Francisco, Aug. 17 vs. Los Angeles-NL and Aug. 19 vs. Los Angeles-NL...5 sellouts are the most since 2007...the Mariners drew at least 40,000 fans to Safeco Field for 14 games in 2018, most since 2007 (21).

WINS AND LOSSES...in 89 wins, the Mariners posted a 2.50 ERA (230 ER, 829.0 IP), compared to a 6.30 ERA (434 ER, 619.2 IP) in the club's 73 losses...the difference of 3.80 more runs allowed in losses than wins was the 8th-largest difference in the Majors in 2018, behind Colorado (4.60), Miami (4.50), Philadelphia (4.23), Chicago-AL (3.97), New York-AL (3.91), Kansas City (3.84) and Minnesota (3.82).

AT HOME ON THE ROAD...the Mariners led the Major Leagues with a .265 (760x2869) batting average on the road in 2018...they ranked ahead of Oakland (.262/755x2879), Houston (.262/741x2833), Atlanta (.258/742x2874) and Los Angeles-NL (.258/745x2890)...among Major League leaders in batting on the road, **Jean Segura** ranked 9th (.325/96x295) and **Mitch Haniger** was 19th (.307/96x313).

DOUBLE DOUBLE...two Mariners tallied at least 35 doubles in 2018: **Mitch Haniger** (38) and **Kyle Seager** (36)...the Mariners were 1 of 6 clubs in the Majors with at least 2 players with 35+ doubles apiece, joining Boston (4), Oakland (4), Atlanta (3), Cleveland (3) and Colorado (2)...the 2018 season marked 1 of 14 in club history in which the Mariners had 2-or-more players with 35+ doubles each and the first since 2008 when Yuniesky Betancourt, Raúl Ibañez and José López each accomplished this feat.

SAVE IT...since 2016, the Mariners have totaled 148 saves, tops in the American League and only 1 shy of Milwaukee (149) for the Major League lead...over the last 3 seasons, **Edwin Díaz** leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the Majors with 109 saves, trailing Kenley Jansen (126) while ranking ahead of Craig Kimbrel (108) and Wade Davis (102)...Díaz is 1 of 13 pitchers to record a save for the Mariners over the last 3 seasons; he is joined by Steve Cishek (26), **Nick Vincent** (3), Andrew Albers (1), **Shawn Armstrong** (1), **Alex Colomé** (1), Yovani Gallardo (1), Nathan Karns (1), **Wade LeBlanc** (1), **Juan Nicasio** (1), Marc Rzepczynski (1), Tom Wilhelmson (1) and Tony Zych (1).

FROM THE START...from May 8 – July 5, Mariners starting pitchers went 26-9 with a 3.24 ERA (123 ER, 342.0 IP) with 282 strikeouts and 70 walks in 55 starts...over this span, Mariners starters held opposing batters to a .235 (302x1283) average against while posting a 1.09 WHIP (70 BB, 302 H, 342.0 IP)...31 of their 55 outings during this stretch were quality starts...Seattle starters tallied 3 complete games over this stretch; no other club had more than 1 complete game during this time...among Major League starting staffs over this span, the Mariners ranked 1st in ERA, 1st in innings pitched, 1st in win percentage, 1st in WHIP, 2nd in wins, T2nd for fewest walks allowed, 3rd in strikeout-to-walk ratio, 7th in opponents' average against and 9th in strikeouts...over this 55-game span, the Mariners were 37-18, the 2nd-best record in the Majors (Houston, .692/36-16).

WHAT A RELIEF...Mariners relievers combined for 35 wins this season, most by a relief corps in single-season club history (previous: 33, 2001 and 2002)...Seattle's 35 wins by relievers were tied for 4th-most in the American League/6th-most in the Majors (also: Los Angeles-NL, Minnesota and New York-AL)...**Chasen Bradford** and **Alex Colomé** each recorded 5 wins in 2018, tops among Mariners relievers; they were followed by **James Pazos** (4), **Nick Vincent** (4), **Dan Altavilla** (3), **Adam Warren** (3), **Ryan Cook** (2), **Zach Duke** (2), **Roenis Elías** (2), Erik Goeddel (2), **Casey Lawrence** (1), **Juan Nicasio** (1) and **Sam Tuivailala** (1).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY...the Mariners posted their worst record in Interleague Play in the 22-year history of the American League facing the National League during the regular season...Seattle was 6-14 (.300) in Interleague Play in 2018, tying Chicago-AL, Detroit and Kansas City for the worst IL record in 2018...Mariners pitchers combined for a 5.04 ERA (98 ER, 175.0 IP) in Interleague Play in 2018, 4th-highest in the Majors ahead of only the White Sox (5.49/107 ER, 175.1 IP), the Tigers (5.39/105 ER, 175.1 IP) and the Twins (5.32/103 ER, 174.1 IP)...Seattle averaged 3.00 runs-per-game (60 R, 20 G) vs. the National League, 3rd-fewest of any club during Interleague Play, ranking ahead of only the Royals (2.70/54 R, 20 G) and the Padres (2.95/59 R, 20 G)...the Mariners faced Arizona (2-1), Colorado (1-5), Los Angeles-NL (1-2), San Diego (0-4) and San Francisco (2-2) during Interleague Play in 2018.

SIMPLY SEAGER...**Kyle Seager** recorded his 1,000th career hit on April 7 at Minnesota...became the 9th Mariners player in franchise history with at least 1,000 career hits with the club, joining **Ichiro Suzuki** (2,542), **Edgar Martinez** (2,247), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (1,843), **Jay Buhner** (1,255), **Alvin Davis** (1,163), **Raúl Ibañez** (1,077), **Dan Wilson** (1,071) and **Harold Reynolds** (1,063)...Seager finished the 2018 season with 1,124 career hits, 6th-most in club history.

THE CANÓ SHOW...**Robinson Canó** entered the 2018 season with 512 career doubles...after totaling 22 doubles during the 2018 campaign, he brought his career total to 534 doubles, tied with Hall of Famer Lou Gehrig for 40th-most in Major League history...since the beginning of the season, Canó climbed from 54th on the all-time doubles leaderboard to 40th, surpassing **Edgar Martinez**, Hall of Famer **Joe Cronin**, **Scott Rolen**, Hall of Famer **Ed Delahanty**, **Johnny Damon**, **Garret Anderson**, Hall of Famer **Willie Mays**, Hall of Famer **Ken Griffey Jr.**, Hall of Famer **Ted Williams**, **Dave Parker**, Hall of Famer **Frank Robinson**, Hall of Famer **Cap Anson** and **Al Oliver**.

CONTRACT EXTENSIONS...Mariners General Manager **Jerry Dipoto** received a multi-year contract extension on July 6...the 2018 season marked Dipoto's 3rd full season with the Mariners after being hired on Sept. 28, 2015...Mariners Manager **Scott Servais** received a multi-year contract extension on July 20...after being named the 20th manager (17th full-time) in club history on Oct. 23, 2015, Servais has compiled a record of 253-233 (.521) in 3 seasons with the Mariners.

OPENING DAY TIDBITS...**Ichiro Suzuki** was the oldest player on the Mariners 2018 Opening Day roster at 44 years, 158 days, while **Edwin Díaz** was the youngest at 24 years, 7 days...**Marco Gonzales**, **Casey Lawrence**, **Mike Marjama** and **Daniel Vogelbach** each appeared on their first Opening Day rosters...it was the 17th Opening Day for Suzuki and the 13th for **Félix Hernández** and **Robinson Canó**...four Mariners began 2018 with at least 10 years of Major League service time, led by Suzuki (17,000), Canó (12,153), Hernández (12,060) and **Nelson Cruz** (10,082)...the Mariners Opening Day roster was represented by 7 different countries or territories: Canada (**James Paxton**), Cuba (**Guillermo Heredia**), Dominican Republic (Canó, Cruz, **Juan Nicasio** and **Jean Segura**), Japan (Suzuki), Puerto Rico (Díaz), United States (16 players) and Venezuela (Hernández).

UNDER REVIEW...in the 5th year of Major League Baseball's expanded instant replay, the Mariners challenged 37 plays, with 13 being overturned...the 35.1% overturn rate ranked 29th in the Major Leagues...three clubs had a success rate of at least 70%: Kansas City (78.6/33x42), San Francisco (72.7/24x33) and New York-AL (70.3/26x37)...in 2018, there were 1,400 reviews after 1,338 in 2015, 1,502 reviews in 2016 and 1,395 in 2017...666 calls were overturned in 2018 (47.6%)...the average time of review in 2018 was 1:23; it was 1:51 in 2015, 1:36 in 2016 and 1:28 in 2017.

DRAFT RECAP...the club selected 40 players in the 2018 MLB's First-Year Player Draft, highlighted by their first pick, right-handed pitcher **Logan Gilbert** (Stetson), who was the 14th overall selection in the draft...the Mariners selected 21 pitchers – including 6 left-handers – 3 catchers, 11 infielders (6 2B, 4 SS, 1 3B) and 5 outfielders...Seattle selected 33 college players and 7 high school players.

ALL-STAR FUTURES GAME...the Mariners had one player selected for the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game that took place on July 15 at Nationals Park...OF **Kyle Lewis** (Snellville, GA) represented the U.S. Team...Lewis went 0-for-1 with 1 run and 1 walk.

ALL IN THE FAMILY...the Mariners recently agreed to extensions of the player development contract with 3 of their minor league affiliates as well as having agreed to a player development contract with a new affiliate...the Mariners have extended their partnerships with AAA Tacoma (through 2022), AA Arkansas (through 2020) and short-A Everett (through 2022)...the Mariners announced a new player development contract with class-A West Virginia of the South Atlantic League through 2020.

MINOR LEAGUE AWARDS...the Mariners announced the organization's Minor League Awards for the 2018 season: 1B/DH **Joey Culetta** (AA Arkansas) received the Ken Griffey Jr. Minor League Hitter of the Year, RH **Matt Festa** (Seattle/AA Arkansas) received the Jamie Moyer Minor League Pitcher of the Year, C/INF/DH **Dean Nevarez** (Rookie AZL Mariners) received the Edgar Martinez PTPA Award, RHP **Jack Anderson** (High-A Modesto) received the "60 ft., 6 in. Club" Award, 1B **Evan White** (High-A Modesto/AAA Tacoma) received the Alvin Davis "Mr. Mariner" Award, OF **Braden Bishop** (AA Arkansas) received the Dan Wilson Minor League Community Service Award and manager **Jose Umbria** (A Clinton) received the Dave Henderson Minor League Staff Member of the Year Award.

- **All-Star** - Named to his 1st career All-Star Game...went 0-for-2 as a defensive replacement at the Midsummer Classic in Washington, D.C.
- **Leader** - Ranked among the top-20 American League leaders in batting (19th), runs (T14th), hits (T8th), doubles (13th), RBI (10th), walks (T13th), on-base percentage (11th), slugging percentage (16th), OPS (10th) and extra-base hits (T12th, 68).
- **Good Company** - Became 1 of 7 Mariners outfielders in club history (done 16x) with at least 25 home runs and 90 RBI in a season...is the first Mariners outfielder to do so since Raúl Ibañez in 2006 and, at 27 years of age, is the youngest since Ken Griffey Jr.'s MVP campaign of 1997.

- **Gamer** - Ranked 5th in the American League with 1376.2 innings played...trailed only Marcus Semien-OAK (1423.2), Alex Bregman-HOU (1404.0), Matt Olson-OAK (1403.1) and Francisco Lindor-CLE (1386.1).
- **Living On Base** - Had 9 games in which he reached base at least 4 times, tied for 5th-most in the American League (also: José Ramírez-CLE and Shin-Soo Choo-TEX)...trailed Mookie Betts-BOS (20), Mike Trout-LAA (17), Jose Altuve-HOU (12) and Francisco Lindor-CLE (11).

- Rare Company** – Is only the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 50 saves and 100 strikeouts in a season...joins Eric Gagne, who accomplished this feat in back-to-back years for the Dodgers, including in 2003 when he won the National League Cy Young Award.

- **Closing Time** – Compiled one of the most dominant seasons by a closer in Major League history...among the 17 seasons in which a pitcher recorded at least 50 saves, ranks 1st in strikeouts-per-9.0-innings, 2nd in strikeouts, 2nd in opponents' average against, 2nd in WHIP, 2nd in opponents' on-base percentage, 3rd in opponents' slugging percentage, 6th in save percentage and 7th in ERA.
- **Save It** – Successfully converted 28 consecutive save opportunities, spanning June 2 - Aug. 15...marks the longest streak in the Majors this season and the 2nd-longest streak in club history (J.J. Putz, 31, 9/30/06 – 7/20/07)...during this stretch, Díaz earned 12 one-run saves.

- **Lock It Down** – Went 5-for-5 in save opportunities when the Mariners lead 1-0...in those 5 saves, threw five 1-2-3 9th innings, striking out 14 of the 15 batters he faced...his 5 saves in 1-0 wins are tied with 4 others for the most in single-season history since the save became an official stat in 1969 (also: Troy Percival-LAA, 2002, Heath Bell-SD, 2010, Carlos Marmol-CHC, 2010, and Trevor Rosenthal-STL, 2014).

- **The Totals** – Went 11-6 with a 3.76 ERA (67 ER, 160.1 IP) with 208 strikeouts and 42 walks in 28 starts with the Mariners.
- **Leaderboard** – Ranked 9th in the AL in strikeouts...among AL pitchers with at least 160.0 innings pitched, was 3rd in K/9.0 IP (11.68/208 K, 160.1 IP), 4th in K/BB ratio (4.95/208 K, 42 BB), 7th in WHIP (1.10/42 BB, 134 H, 160.1 IP) and 9th in opponents' average against (.224/134x598).
- **Pax's Punchouts** – Finished 9th in the American League with 208 strikeouts...became the 6th Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season, the first since **Félix Hernández** in 2014 (248 K) and the first Seattle southpaw since Randy Johnson in 1998 (213 K)...Paxton's 2018 campaign marked the 20th season or at least 200 strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher in club history: Johnson (7), Hernández (6), Mark Langston (4), Floyd Bannister (1) and Erik Hanson (1).
- **North of the Border** – Became the 7th Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history with at least 200 strikeouts in a single season, the first since Ryan Dempster-CHC in 2010 (208) and only the second Canadian left-hander ever (Erik Bedard-BAL, 2007, 221)...marked the 13th season of at least 200 strikeouts by a Canadian-born pitcher: Ferguson Jenkins (6), Dempster (2), Bedard (1), Bob Emslie (1), Russ Ford (1) and Kirk McCaskill (1).
- **No-No** – Tossed the 6th no-hitter in club history – the 5th by an individual pitcher – on May 8 at Toronto...allowed only 3 baserunners – all via walks – while striking out 7 over 9.0 scoreless innings in the Mariners 5-0 win...joined Randy Johnson (6/2/90 vs. DET), Chris Bosio (4/22/93 vs. BOS), **Félix Hernández** (8/15/12 vs. TB – Perfect Game) and Hisashi Iwakuma (8/12/15 vs. BAL) as the only Mariners pitchers to record individual no-hitters.
- **Canada's Son** – With his no-hitter on May 8 at Toronto, became the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history to throw a no-hitter...joined Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945 against the St. Louis Browns...marked the 6th no-hitter in Major League history to take place in Canada (last: Justin Verlander-DET, 5/7/11 at TOR).
- **Back-To-Back** – In back-to-back starts, recorded 16 strikeouts (5/2 vs. OAK) and threw a no-hitter (5/8 at TOR)...became the first American League pitcher to accomplish both feats in the same season since Nolan Ryan-TEX achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto (STATS LLC).
- **Efficient No-Hitter** – Threw just 99 pitches in his no-hitter, May 8 at Toronto, becoming the 12th pitcher since 1988 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a no-hitter...1988 is the first year in which complete pitch counts were tracked.
- **Attacking the Zone** – Among Mariners pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched in single-season club history, ranks T9th for fewest walks with 42 (also: Jamie Moyer, 1998, and Hisashi Iwakuma, 2013).
- **You Complete Me** – Was 1 of 8 pitchers in the Major Leagues with multiple complete games, joining José Berríos-MIN, Carlos Carrasco-CLE, Mike Foltyniewicz-ATL, Corey Kluber-CLE, Max Scherzer-WAS, Noah Syndergaard-NYM and Jameson Taillon-PIT...tossed his first career complete game in his no-hitter on May 8 at Toronto...followed that up two starts later with a complete game on May 19 vs. Detroit.
- **Honors** – Named co-American League Player of the Week for May 7-13...went 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (3 ER, 15.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts and 3 walks in 2 starts at Toronto (May 8) and at Detroit (May 13) during the week, including a no-hitter on May 8 vs. the Blue Jays...marked the 3rd such honor in his career (also: April 10-16, 2017 and July 24-30, 2017), joining Randy Johnson as the only pitchers in club history with 3 Player of the Week honors.

TEAM NOTES...the Mariners went 16-11 (.593) in March/April...it equaled their 4th-most wins prior to May 1 in club history (also: 1996, 16-10, and 1997, 16-11); trailing only the Mariners clubs from 2001 (20-5), 2002 (18-8) and 2003 (17-10)...Seattle's .593 winning percentage tied the 1997 Mariners squad for 5th-best in March/April in club history (min. 5 G), trailing the clubs from 2001 (.800/20-5), 2002 (.692/18-8), 2003 (.630/17-10) and 1996 (.615/16-10).

ODDS AND ENDS

- **Leaders** - 3 Mariners led outright or tied for the American League lead after April in major statistical categories: **Edwin Díaz** led the AL with 11 saves...**Dee Gordon** led the AL with 10 stolen bases...**Mitch Haniger** tied for the AL lead with 10 home runs (also: Didi Gregorius-NYY, Mike Trout-LAA).
- **Off to the Races** - the Mariners were one of three teams in the American League with a pair of players with at least 5 stolen bases each...**Dee Gordon** led the American League with 10 stolen bases while **Jean Segura** ranked T3rd with 5 steals.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners won or tied 8 of their first 9 series, posting a series record of 6-1-2.
- **Home Runs** - Seattle hit 36 home runs, 4th-most in club history and most since 1999 (44 HR).

FOR OPENERS...**Félix Hernández** tossed 5.1 scoreless innings in the Mariners 2-1 Opening Day win vs. Cleveland on March 29, allowing just 2 hits and 2 walks while striking out 4...improved to 7-2 with a 1.52 ERA (13 ER, 76.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts in 11 career Opening Day starts...marked 6th career Opening Day start allowing 1 or fewer runs, T2nd-most all-time (also: Juan Marichal and Tom Seaver); trails Walter Johnson (8)...lowered career Opening Day ERA to 1.52 (13 ER, 76.2 IP), 2nd-lowest all-time among pitchers with at least 70.0 innings pitched on Opening Day (Walter Johnson, 1.31/18 ER, 124.0 IP)...now ranks 4th all-time in the Majors with 78 strikeouts on Opening Day (most: Randy Johnson, 107)...became 7th pitcher in Major League history to record 10 consecutive Opening Day starts, the longest active streak in the Majors...is one of 14 pitchers in Major League history to make 11 Opening Day starts (most: Tom Seaver, 16).

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH, EDWIN...in 14 appearances in March/April, **Edwin Díaz** converted 11-of-11 save opportunities while posting a 0.63 ERA (1 ER, 14.1 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 7 walks...Díaz is one of nine pitchers (done 10x) in Major League history to record at least 11 saves and 27 strikeouts in any calendar month...he is the first to do so since Aroldis Chapman had 13 saves to go along with 31 strikeouts in July 2012 for Cincinnati...Díaz is the second Mariner to accomplish this feat, joining Norm Charlton, who had 11 saves and 29 strikeouts in September 1995.

HIGH FIVE...with 2 strikeouts on April 25 against the White Sox, **Edwin Díaz** reached the 200-strikeout plateau, becoming the 5th-fastest pitcher by innings pitched in Major League history to record 200 career strikeouts...Díaz reached the milestone in 130.0 career innings pitched, trailing only Craig Kimbrel (117.2 IP), Kenley Jansen (119.2 IP), Aroldis Chapman (123.1 IP) and Dellin Betances (129.0 IP)...**STATS**.

CLIMBING THE RANKS...**Ichiro Suzuki** recorded his 3,801st and 3,082nd career hits in the Major Leagues on March 31 vs. CLE, surpassing Hall of Famer Cap Anson (3,081) for the 21st-most hits all-time (*Elias Sports Bureau*)...of the 20 players who rank ahead of Ichiro in career hits, 17 are Hall of Famers, with the exception of Pete Rose, Derek Jeter (not yet eligible) and Alex Rodriguez (not yet eligible).

BATTING 1000...**Kyle Seager** recorded his 1,000th career hit on April 7 at Minnesota with a single to right field in the 8th inning...he was the 9th player in club history to reach that milestone.

MITCH HANIGER IS GOOD...in 27 games in March/April, **Mitch Haniger** hit .309 (30x97) with 17 runs, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 27 RBI, 12 walks, a .384 on-base percentage and a .701 slugging percentage (1.085 OPS)...among American League leaders for March/April, ranked T1st in home runs, T2nd in RBI, 4th in slugging, 3rd in extra-base hits and total bases (68) and 5th in OPS...recorded 5 game-winning RBI in March/April, tied for the most in the AL with Alex Bregman-HOU and Jed Lowrie-OAK...reached base safely via a hit or walk in 22 of 27 games, including 18 games with a hit...had 9 multi-RBI games in March/April, most in the Major Leagues, ahead of Khris Davis-OAK (8) and Gary Sánchez-NYY (8).

LATE AND GREAT...in the 7th inning and later in March/April, **Mitch Haniger** batted .406 (13x32) with 12 runs, 1 double, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 14 RBI, 4 walks, a .472 on-base percentage and a 1.250 slugging mark (1.722 OPS)...among all players in the 7th and later, ranked 1st in runs, home runs, slugging, OPS and extra-base hits, T1st in RBI, 8th in batting and T8th in hits...the Mariners led the Majors in home runs (17) and slugging (.498) in the 7th inning and later, while ranking 4th in batting (.264/79x299) and T10th in runs (45).

YES IN DEE, DEE...**Dee Gordon** appeared in each of the Mariners first 27 games this season, making 26 starts...the Mariners were 15-5 in games in which he recorded at least 1 hit, compared to a record of 1-6 when he went hitless.

IN THE SWING OF THINGS...3 Mariners hit at least .300 to start the season: **Robinson Canó** (.313/30x96), **Dee Gordon** (.309/34x110) and **Mitch Haniger** (.309/30x97)...Seattle was one of two AL teams with a trio of players batting at least .300 (also: Boston, Mookie Betts, .344, J.D. Martinez, .337, and Hanley Ramirez, .330).

A PITCHER'S BETTER BEST FRIEND...the Mariners turned the 12th triple play in club history on April 19 vs. Houston at Safeco Field...with Carlos Correa on 1st base and Jose Altuve at 2nd in the 4th inning, Evan Gattis hit a groundball to **Kyle Seager**, who stepped on 3rd base for the force out on Correa and fired to **Robinson Canó** for the force on Altuve; Gattis vacated 1st base and was tagged out by **Daniel Vogelbach** to complete the 5-4-3 triple play...marked the first triple play turned by the Mariners since July 26, 2015 vs. Toronto (3-6-2-2).

- **Walk it Off** - The Mariners recorded 4 walk-off wins in the month of May; went 5-0 in extra innings.
- **Save It** - **Edwin Díaz** tallied 8 saves in the month of May, T4th most in the AL...led the American League with 19 saves at the end of May.
- **Take Five** - **Seattle posted a 5-game winning streak May 18-23, its longest of the season.**
- **Every Other** - **The Mariners alternated W-L-W-L over the course of 13 games from May 1 to 14...went 11-5 from May 15 to 31.**
- **Hottest Team in Baseball** - Over the last two weeks of May, the Mariners were one of the hottest teams in the Major Leagues...from May 14 to 31, Seattle went 12-5 (.706), tied with Milwaukee (12-4/.750) and Tampa Bay (12-5/.706) for the most wins in the Majors during that span...trailed only Milwaukee (.750) for the top winning percentage in the Majors since May 14.

ONE MORE RUN THAN THEM...The Mariners were 16-9 (.640) in one-run games through the end of May... their 16 one-run wins led the Majors... played 6 consecutive one-run games from May 20 - 26 and went 5-1 in those 6 one-run games... the 6-game streak tied the record for most consecutive one-run games in club history (also: July 1-6, 1991).

WHAT A RELIEF...from May 10 to 29, Mariners relievers combined for the lowest bullpen ERA in the Major Leagues...during that span, Seattle's bullpen posted a 1.58 ERA (9 ER, 51.1 IP), which ranked ahead of Milwaukee (2.11/16 ER, 68.1 IP) and Houston (2.20/11 ER/45.0 IP)...from May 18 to 29, Mariners relievers combined to allow only 1 run over 27.1 innings in relief (0.33 ERA)...during this stretch, Mariners relievers limited opponents to a .138 (12x87) average, while walking 2 and striking out 32...**Edwin Díaz** (7.0), **Juan Nicasio** (5.0), **Dan Altavilla** (4.1) and **Chasen Bradford** (3.0) each recorded scoreless innings streaks of at least 3.0 innings.

COMEBACK KIDS...the Mariners recorded 16 comeback wins through May...their 16 comeback wins were 2nd-most in the AL (Boston, 17)...ranked ahead of Houston (13) and New York-AL (13) for comeback wins...in their 16 comeback wins, the Mariners took the lead in the 7th inning and later on 10 occasions.

BORN TO RUN...the Mariners tallied a Major League leading 22 stolen bases in the month of May, finishing the month ranked T2nd in the AL with 39 stolen bases on the season, trailing only Chicago-AL (47 steals)...**Jean Segura** (7) ranked T3rd, **Dee Gordon** (6) ranked T6th and **Ben Gamel** (3) ranked T17th among American League stolen base leaders in the month of May.

WHAT A MONTH...in 6 starts in the month of May, **James Paxton** went 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (8 ER, 43.0 IP) with 51 strikeouts and 9 walks while limiting opponents to a .144 (21x146) average against...among American League leaders for the month of May, Paxton ranked 1st in innings pitched and opponents average against, 2nd in strikeouts and WHIP (0.70/9 BB, 21 H, 43.0 IP), 3rd in ERA and T5th in wins...he was the only AL pitcher with 2 complete games in May.

- **No-Hitter**...**James Paxton** threw the 6th no-hitter in team history (5th individual) on May 8 at Toronto... became 1st Mariners pitcher to throw a no-hitter on the road and 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter...marked the Mariners 4th no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for most during that span...marked 1st complete game and shutout of Paxton's career.
- **KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK**...**James Paxton** tallied a career-high 16 strikeouts on May 2 vs OAK, becoming the first Mariners pitcher to record 16 strikeouts in a single game since Randy Johnson tallied 19 strikeouts on Aug. 8, 1997 vs Chicago-AL...Paxton's outing was one of three in Mariners history of at least 7.0 scoreless innings and at least 16 strikeouts; the others both belong to Randy Johnson (8/8/97 vs CWS and 7/15/95 vs TOR)...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most recorded in a single game by any pitcher in the Majors this season (Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/5 at ARI).

MIGHTY MARCO...**Marco Gonzales** went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA (10 ER, 30.1 IP) through the month of May with 10 walks and 22 strikeouts...ended the month with an active streak of 19.1 IP without allowing an earned run (snapped 6/2 at 24.1 consecutive innings)...tossed 6.0 or more innings in 4 of his 5 starts in May, including a career-high 7.0 IP on May 23 at Oakland.

JEAN, JEAN THE MAY MACHINE... Jean Segura posted a .382 batting average (42x110) through the month of May with 20 runs scored, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 16 RBI, 7 stolen bases and a .385 on-base percentage...led the team with 15 multi-hit games in May, posting 3+ hits in 7 games over that span.

BIG BEN...after batting .121 (4x33) in April, **Ben Gamel** batted .343 (23x67) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 8 walks in the month of May, raising his batting average from .121 to .279...reached base safety in 12 consecutive starts to end the month, batting .395 (17x43) with 3 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, and 5 walks during that span (5/14 - 5/29).

TEAM NOTES...the Mariners were 53-31 (.631) at the end of June, their T3rd-best record in the first 83 games of a season in club history... they trailed the Mariners clubs of 2001 (61-23/.726) and 2003 (54-30/.643) while tying 2002 (53-31/.631)... the Mariners won a season-high 8 straight games, June 25 – July 3.

ODDS AND ENDS

- **Comeback Kids** - Seattle's 24 comeback wins led the Majors at the end of June, ranking ahead of Boston (23), Chicago-NL (23), New York-AL (23) and Philadelphia (23)...in the Mariners 24 comeback wins, they took the lead in the 7th inning or later on 16 occasions.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners won or tied 23 of their first 28 series, posting a series record of 17-5-6.

WHAT A MONTH...the Mariners finished the month of June going 19-9...the 19 wins were a team high in a single month this season...marked the 18th time in club history to finish June with at least a .500 record or better...the 19 wins in June were T2nd-most in club history (also: 2000), trailing only 20 wins in 1997 (20-7/.741).

AMONG THE BEST...from May 8 to June 30, the Mariners had a .667 (34-17) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trailed only Houston (.688/33-15), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.630/29-17), Boston (.620/31-19) and Milwaukee (.596/28-19)...the Mariners 34 wins were the most in the Majors from May 8 to June 30, ranking ahead the Astros (33-15)...the Mariners joined the Astros, Yankees and Red Sox as the only American League clubs with a .600 winning percentage since May 8.

CLOSE CALLS...the Mariners played 50 games decided by 2 or fewer runs through the end of June, tops in the Majors at that point...were 36-14 (.720) in those games...5 of the team's last 6 games in June were decided by 2 or fewer runs, with the Mariners going 5-0...from June 14 to 30, 10 of the club's last 16 games were decided by 2 or fewer runs with the Mariners going 7-3 in those 10 games...the Mariners 25 1-run wins were T2nd (Pittsburgh, 1938) for the most through a club's first 84 games of a season, trailing only the 1979 Astros (*Baseball-Reference*).

ELECTRIC EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 31 saves at the end of June...his 31 saves set a club record for saves prior to the All-Star Break (previous: Kazuhiro Sasaki, 29, 2001)...the Mariners were 39-0 when Díaz entered the game with a lead, including 21-0 when he entered with a 1-run lead... he became the 13th pitcher in Major League history (done 16x) to record at least 30 saves prior to the All-Star Break (last: Jeury's Familia-NYM, 31, 2016).

WINNING WAYS...the Mariners had a quartet of pitchers with at least 7 wins at the end of June...**Marco Gonzales**, **Félix Hernández** and **Mike Leake** led the club with 8 wins, followed by **James Paxton** (7)...the Mariners were one of three clubs in the Majors with four pitchers with at least 7 wins apiece, joining Boston (Rick Porcello, David Price, Eduardo Rodriguez and Chris Sale) and Houston (Gerrit Cole, Lance McCullers Jr., Charlie Morton and Justin Verlander).

CRUZ CONTROL...**Nelson Cruz** was named the AL Player of the Week for June 18-24, after batting .500 (12x24) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 8 RBI, 2 walks, a .538 OBP and a 1.042 slugging mark (1.580 OPS) in 6 games during the week...Cruz hit safely in 25 of his last 34 games to close out the month (5/24-6/30), batting .333 (42x126) with 23 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 33 RBI, 3 HBP, 14 walks, a .410 on-base percentage and a .714 slugging percentage (1.124 OPS)...Cruz led the Major Leagues in home runs from May 24 to June 30, while also ranking 3rd in RBI, 4th in OPS, T9th in hits and T13th in on-base percentage.

GOODBYE BASEBALL...the Mariners 101 home runs through the end of June were T7th-most in club history (also: 2000) and trailed only 1999 (134), 1998 (129), 1997 (125), 1996 (123), 2016 (114) and 1994 (110)...the Mariners were the only club in the Major Leagues with 4 players with at least 15 home runs apiece at that point in the season...Nelson Cruz led the club with 21 home runs, followed by Mitch Haniger (17), Ryon Healy (16) and Kyle Seager (15)...there were 4 clubs with 3 players with 15-or-more home runs each: Cleveland, Colorado, New York and Texas

HOMER HAPPY...dating back to June 5 the Mariners recorded 38 home runs in 25 games, including homering in 6 straight games...the team's 38 home runs during that stretch were 2nd-most in the Majors and trailed only Los Angeles-NL (46)...57 of the Mariners 117 runs scored (48.7%) during this 25-game stretch came via the home run (22 solo HR, 13 2-R HR, 3 3-R HR)...the Mariners had 7 players record at least 1 home run from June 5 to June 30, including 11 home runs by Nelson Cruz, 7 home runs by Ryon Healy and 6 home runs by Kyle Seager.

EXTRA, EXTRA!...the Mariners were 8-0 in extra-inning games to this point in the season, the only undefeated club in the Majors...dating back to July 16, 2017, the Mariners had won 14 consecutive extra-inning games, the longest such streak since the Orioles won 17 straight extra-inning contests, April 16, 2012 – April 18, 2013 (*ESPN Stats & Info*).

MULTI-HIT MADDNESS...at the end of June, **Jean Segura** led the Majors with 35 multi-hit games, ahead of Atlanta's Nick Markakis...Segura also led the Major Leagues with 15 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12).

AL WEST RACE...the Mariners were in 1st place in the AL West for 12 days in June (3 days tied for 1st)...for the rest of June, Seattle trailed Houston, going as far back as 4.5 games and ending the month just 1.5 games back.

TEAM NOTES...the Mariners were 63-44 (.617) at the end of July, their 4th-best record in the first 107 games of a season in club history...they trailed the Mariners clubs of 2001 (77-30/.720), 2003 (65-42/.607) and 2002 (65-42/.607)...the Mariners won a season-high 8 straight games from June 25 to July 3.

ODDS AND ENDS

- **Whiff** - Through the end of July, **Edwin Díaz** had struck out his first batter faced 24 times, tied with Adam Ottavino-COL for most in the Majors...Díaz struck out his first batter in 45.3% (24x53) of his appearances through the end of the month.
- **As Easy as 1-2-3** - **Edwin Díaz** retired the Astros in order in the 9th inning on July 30 for his 40th save of the season...in 24 of his 40 saves through the end of July, he faced the minimum 3 batters in an outing of exactly 1.0 inning, the most such saves in the Majors at the time.
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 41-17 (.707) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 27-14 (.659) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 14-3 (.824) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Bullpen Bullies** - **Edwin Díaz** did not allow an earned run over 16.2 innings spanning 16 appearances (6/25-8/9), while **Alex Colomé** did not allow a run in the month of July, as part of a 20.0 scoreless innings streak, June 30- Aug. 15, the longest scoreless streak among Mariners pitchers in 2018.
- **New Faces** - Left-handed pitcher **Zach Duke** and right-handed pitcher **Sam Tuivailala** made their Mariners debuts vs. Houston on July 31.

THE EDWIN DÍAZ FILE... **Edwin Díaz** recorded his Major League-leading 40th save of the season on July 30...he became the 4th pitcher in single-season club history to notch at least 40 saves, joining Fernando Rodney (48, 2014), Kazuhiro Sasaki (45, 2001) and J.J. Putz (40, 2007)...with 36 saves and 79 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break, Díaz became the 2nd pitcher in Major League history to record at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts before the All-Star break, joining Eric Gagne-LAD (31 SV, 76 K).

MANAGERIAL MILESTONE...with a win over the Astros on July 30, manager **Scott Servais** surpassed Darrell Johnson (226) for 3rd-most managerial wins in club history...it marked Servais' 227th managerial win.

LEFTIES ON PARADE...Mariners left-handed starting pitchers combined to go 27-10 with a 3.44 ERA (139 ER, 363.1 IP) in 60 starts through the end of July...**James Paxton** (9-4, 3.49) and **Marco Gonzales** (12-5, 3.37) led Mariners southpaws with 21 starts apiece, followed by **Wade LeBlanc** (6-1, 3.51 in 16 GS), **Roenis Elías** (0-0, 4.91 in 1 GS) and **Ariel Miranda** (0-0, 1.80 in 1 GS)...Seattle southpaws combined for 31 quality starts to this point in the season, 2nd-most among any club's left-handers behind only Boston (38); Paxton led Mariners lefties with 13 quality starts, followed by Gonzales (12) and LeBlanc (6).

WHAT A RELIEF...the Mariners led the Major Leagues in saves (42) and holds (78) at the end of July...**Edwin Díaz** led the Majors with 40 saves, while **Juan Nicasio** was T9th in MLB with 19 holds, and **Alex Colomé** was T11th with 18 holds.

HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners finished the month of July with the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...Seattle was 35-20 (.636) at Safeco Field...only Boston (.717/38-15), New York-AL (.717/38-15) and Philadelphia (.654/34-18) had a higher winning percentage at their home ballparks...from May 18 to July 31, the Mariners were 26-10 (.722) at Safeco Field, the 2nd-best home winning percentage in the Majors in that span (Boston, .735/25-9).

HAIL TO THE KING...on July 21, **Félix Hernández** recorded his 1,300th career strikeout at Safeco Field vs. the White Sox...since 1970, only 3 pitchers have recorded more strikeouts at a single ballpark (Steve Carlton - 1,615, Veterans Stadium; Nolan Ryan - 1,446, Angel Stadium; Roger Clemens- 1,398, Fenway Park).

WINNING WADE...**Wade LeBlanc** made 21 career starts (6/24/16-7/8/18) with the Mariners before suffering his first loss on July 8...only 1 American League pitcher in the live-ball era had a longer such streak to begin a tenure with a single club (Whitey Ford-NYY, 22, 7/6/50-6/12/53)...among all pitchers in the live-ball era, LeBlanc's streak trailed only Ford and Kirk Rueter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94)(STATS).

MAKING A MARCO...in 4 starts in the month of July, **Marco Gonzales** went 4-0 with a 1.78 ERA (5 ER, 25.1 IP) and 24 strikeouts...all 4 outings were quality starts, including a 7.0-inning scoreless start on July 11 at Los Angeles-AL...won a career-high 5-straight starts, June 29—July 29.

THE FLASH...**Dee Gordon** recorded the 300th stolen base of his career vs. the Angels on July 3...he became 1 of 5 active players with 300+ career steals (also: Jose Reyes, 517, Ichiro Suzuki, 509, Rajai Davis, 415, and Jacoby Ellsbury, 343).

HEADING INTO THE BREAK...the Mariners were 58-39 going into the All-Star break...marked the 15th time in franchise history and the 3rd time in the last 5 seasons (also: 2016 & 2014) to go into the All-Star Break with a .500 or better record...the Mariners .598 (58-39) winning percentage was the 4th-highest in club history at the All-Star Break, trailing only the 2001 Mariners (72/63-24), the 2002 Mariners (.625/55x33) and 2003 Mariners (.624/58-35), while ranking ahead of the 2000 club (51-35/.593).

TRADE WINDS...from Opening Day to the non-waiver trade deadline on July 31, the Mariners made 6 trades involving the 40-man roster, including 4 trades in the last 5 days before the deadline...in those 6 deals, the Mariners acquired 5 pitchers and 2 position players: LHP **Roenis Elías** (4/23 from BOS), RHP **Alex Colomé** (5/25 from TB), OF **Denard Span** (5/25 from TB), RHP **Sam Tuivailala** (7/27 from STL), LHP **Zach Duke** (7/30 from MIN), RHP **Adam Warren** (7/30 from NYY) and OF **Cameron Maybin** (7/31 from MIA).

ODDS AND ENDS

- **10 in a Row** - **Edwin Díaz** earned the save in each of the Mariners 10 wins from July 25-Aug. 15, equaling the club record for most saves in consecutive team wins...equals the mark shared by Tom Wilhelmson (8/28-9/22/12) and Danny Farquhar (8/3-29/13)...Díaz also earned the save in 7 straight team wins earlier this season (6/30-7/20).
- **Climbing the Ranks** - **Robinson Canó** collected 4 doubles in the month of August to bring his career total to 526, tied for 44th-most on the all-time doubles list (also: Dave Parker).
- **Double Double** - **Kyle Seager** recorded his 30th double of the season on Aug. 25 at Arizona...marks his 6th season with at least 30 doubles in his career...he trails only Edgar Martinez (9) for most seasons in club history with at least 30 doubles.
- **Jean, Jean the Hit Collector** - **Jean Segura** recorded his 1,000th career hit on Aug. 29 at San Diego.
- **Turning Two** - The Mariners turned a club record 6 double plays on Aug. 21 vs. Houston (previous: 5, 2x, last: 9/3/81 at BOS).
- **Welcome to the Club** - Outfielder **Cameron Maybin**, right-handed pitcher **Adam Warren** and infielder **Zach Vincej** made their Mariners debuts on Aug. 1 vs. Houston...left-handed pitcher **Ross Detwiler** made his Mariners debut on Aug. 21 vs. Houston...infielder/outfielder **Kristopher Negrón** was acquired from Arizona in exchange for cash considerations on Aug. 30.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH...**Mitch Haniger** hit safely in 24 of 28 games in August, including 12 multi-hit games...over that span, he batted .345 (41x119) with 19 runs, 12 doubles, 5 home runs, 15 RBI, 1 HBP, 9 walks, a .392 on-base percentage and a .571 slugging percentage (.964 OPS)...among American League leaders in the month of August, Haniger ranked 5th in average, trailing only Mallex Smith-TB (.389/28x72), J.D. Martinez-BOS (.373/38x102), Whit Merrifield-KC (.358/39x109) and Mookie Betts-BOS (.353/36x102)...led the AL during August in hits (41), while also ranking T1st in doubles (12), 4th in total bases (67), T4th in extra-base hits (17) and 11th in on-base percentage (.393).

THE BIG FIVE-OH...on Aug. 25, **Edwin Díaz** collected his 50th save of the season in the Mariners 4-3 win at Arizona...he became the 14th pitcher in Major League history (done 17x) to record at least 50 saves in a single season.

STEAL AWAY...at the end of August, **Dee Gordon** led the American League with 30 stolen bases...Gordon has recorded 5 consecutive seasons with 30+ stolen bases...he is tied with Billy Hamilton (5, 2014-18) for the longest active run of consecutive seasons with 30+ stolen bases.

SIMPLY SEAGER...on Aug. 18, **Kyle Seager** recorded his 1,100th career hit, a first-inning, 3-run home run...he became the 6th player in club history to reach 1,100 hits with the Mariners, joining Ichiro Suzuki (2,542), Edgar Martinez (2,247), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,843), Jay Buhner (1,255) and Alvin Davis (1,163)...it was his 20th home run of the season, marking his 7th consecutive season with 20+ home runs...his 7 seasons with 20+ home runs are the 4th-most in club history, trailing Ken Griffey Jr. (9), Edgar Martinez (8) and Jay Buhner (8).

GOOD COMPANY...with his 400th career Mariners start on Aug. 28, **Félix Hernández** became one of just 18 pitchers in the live-ball era to maintain an ERA below 3.50 through their first 400 starts with a single club.

FAST EDDIE...**Edwin Díaz** recorded his 100th career save on Aug. 20 vs. Houston...at 24 years, 151 days, he is the 2nd-fastest pitcher (by age) to reach 100 saves since the save became an official stat in 1969...Roberto Osuna (23 years, 62 days, 4/10/18 at BAL w/TOR) is the youngest pitcher to reach 100 career saves...Francisco Rodriguez (24 years, 246 days, 9/10/06 vs. TOR w/LAA) and Craig Kimbrel (24 years, 346 days, 5/9/13 at SF w/ATL) are currently the only other pitchers to reach 100 career saves before turning 25...STATS LLC.

MAKING IT COUNT...**Dee Gordon** hit a game-winning 2-run home run in the 12th inning of the Mariners 2-0 win at Oakland on Aug. 15, just his 2nd home run of the season...marked his 5th straight go-ahead home run, including 3 consecutive home runs that had given his team the lead in the 7th inning and later.

NOW WARMING...**Félix Hernández** made his first career relief appearance on Aug. 14 at Oakland...he entered in relief of James Paxton and allowed 2 runs over 5.2 innings pitched, the longest relief outing by a Mariners reliever to that point in the season...only Mike Mussina made more career starts (498) before his first relief appearance...marked Félix's sole bullpen appearance of the season.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF...in 15 games in August after returning from the restricted list on Aug. 14, **Robinson Canó** batted .277 (18x65) with 6 runs, 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 7 RBI and 4 walks, trailing only Mitch Haniger (.288/19x66) for the club lead over that span (8/14-8/31).

NO RUNS FOR YOU...**Alex Colomé** recorded 20.0 consecutive scoreless innings (6/30-8/15), the longest scoreless streak among Mariners pitchers in 2018...ranked 6th-longest in club history, trailing Shigetoshi Hasegawa (28.2 IP), Tom Wilhelmson (24.0 IP), Edwin Núñez (24.0 IP), Charlie Furbush (22.2 IP) and J.J. Putz (22.0 IP)...went 1-0 with 13 holds while limiting opponents to a .192 (14x73) average against with 19 strikeouts and 6 walks in 19 appearances during the streak.

HE'S FLEXIBLE...**Andrew Romine** made 3 pitching appearances in August, becoming 1 of 4 primary position players to make 3 pitching appearances in 2018...marked the most pitching appearances by a primary position player in club history, surpassing Jesús Sucre (2).

TEAM NOTES...the Mariners were 89-73 (.549) at the end of September, their 6th-best record through 162 games in club history...they trailed the Mariners clubs of 2001 (116-46/.716), 2003 (93-69/.574), 2002 (93-69/.574), 2000 (91-71/.562) and 1997 (90-72/.556).

ODDS AND ENDS

- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners finished the season as the only Major League club with a 1.000 winning percentage (77-0) when leading after 8 innings this season.
- **Always On** - **Edwin Díaz** made his 40th appearance at Safeco Field this season on Sept. 25...became the 4th pitcher in club history (done 5x) with at least 40 appearances at home in a single season, joining David Aardsma (42, 2009), J.J. Putz (42, 2007; and 41, 2006) and Sean Green (40, 2008).
- **Hold Up** - **Alex Colomé** recorded his 30th hold on Sept. 29, becoming the 2nd pitcher in club history with at least 30 holds in a season...trails Arthur Rhodes by 2 (32, 2001) for the single-season club record for holds...led the Majors in holds since being acquired by the Mariners on May 25.
- **Shut It Down** - **Matt Festa** (1.0 IP), **Casey Lawrence** (3.0 IP), **Adam Warren** (1.0 IP), **Shawn Armstrong** (1.0 IP), **Zach Duke** (1.0 IP), **Justin Grimm** (1.0 IP) and **Roenis Elías** (1.0 IP) combined for a shutout on Sept. 19 at Houston...the 7 pitchers used by the Mariners were the most ever in a shutout in club history.

BEST VS. THE WEST...the Mariners clinched a winning record vs. each of their divisional opponents this season after taking 3 of 4 games in final series of the season vs. the Rangers...19 of their 27 games in September were played against AL West opponents (11-8)...overall, the Mariners went 10-9 vs. Houston, 11-8 vs. Los Angeles-AL, 10-9 vs. Oakland and 10-9 vs. Texas (41-35 overall vs. the AL West)...marked the first time since Houston joined the AL West in 2013 that the Mariners have had a winning record vs. each of their divisional foes...the last time Seattle had a winning record vs. each team in its division was 2003 (11-8 vs. LAA, 12-7 vs. OAK, 10-10 vs. TEX).

DIABOLICAL DÍAZ...**Edwin Díaz** recorded his 300th career strikeout with a punchout of Willie Calhoun in the 9th inning on Sept. 29 vs. Texas...Díaz reached the milestone in 190.2 innings pitched, 4th-fastest by innings pitched in Major League history...only 3 pitchers have reached 300 career strikeouts in fewer innings: Craig Kimbrel (171.2, 2013), Aroldis Chapman (187.2, 2013) and Dellin Betances (190.1, 2016)...STATS LLC.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING...**Mitch Haniger** recorded a career-high 17-game hitting streak (8/18-9/8), batting .305 (22x72) with 13 runs scored, 4 doubles, 5 home runs, 7 RBI, 2 HBP and 9 walks...his 17-game hitting streak was the longest by a Mariners player this season.

RING 'EM UP...**James Paxton** tallied 9 strikeouts vs. the Rangers on Sept. 29, bringing his season total to 208 strikeouts...he became the 6th pitcher in Mariners history to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season and the first since **Félix Hernández** in 2014 (248 K)...became the 4th left-hander in club history to tally 200 strikeouts in a season, joining Randy Johnson, Mark Langston and Floyd Bannister (last: Randy Johnson, 1998, 213 K)...finished the 2018 season with 208 strikeouts, which ranks 18th-most in club history.

FOR THE RECORD BOOKS...**James Paxton** made his 100th career start on Sept. 7 vs. New York-AL...his 603 career strikeouts through his first 100 career starts are the most strikeouts as a Mariner in a pitcher's first 100 career games...ranks ahead of **Félix Hernández** (575), Mark Langston (555), Erik Hanson (534) and Randy Johnson (531 K in 89 games with Seattle; 51 K in 11 games with Montreal prior to joining Seattle).

SCORELESS IN SEATTLE...**Wade LeBlanc** did not allow a run over 19.0 innings pitched from Aug. 25 to Sept. 12, the longest scoreless innings streak among Mariners starters this season.

FINISHING STRONG...**Marco Gonzales** was 1-0 with a 1.71 ERA (4 ER, 21.0 IP) in 4 starts in September, including 2 scoreless outings (9/22 at TEX & 9/27 vs. TEX)...during this 4-game stretch, he limited opponents to a .176 (13x74) average, while walking 4 and striking out 17.

SEPTEMBER SONG...in the month of September, **Mitch Haniger** batted .310 (31x100) with 19 runs, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 3 home runs and 9 RBI in 25 games...in 27 games in the month of September last season, Haniger hit .365 (42x115) with 17 runs, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs and 14 RBI...over the last two Septembers, Haniger has hit .340 (73x215), the 6th-highest average in the Majors (min. 100 PA)...he trails only J.D. Martinez (.364/64x176), Nicholas Castellanos (.360/77x214), Kurt Alex Presley (.351/34x97), Alcides Escobar (.341/56x164) and Jeff McNeil (.340/36x106).

DOMINICAN DANDY...**Nelson Cruz** collected the 1,000th RBI of his career on Sept. 12 with a solo home run in the 5th inning, his 35th home run of the season...Cruz is the 11th active player to record at least 1,000 career RBI, the 6th player to record his 1,000th RBI in a Mariners uniform and the 14th player born in the Dominican Republic to reach 1,000 career RBI.

THE CANÓ SHOW...in the month of September, **Robinson Canó** hit .343 (35x102) with 14 runs, 8 doubles, 4 home runs, 20 RBI and 7 walks...he led the club in average, hits, RBI, on-base (.391), slugging (.539) and total bases (55), while his 4 home runs were tied with **Nelson Cruz** for most on the team in September.

INSTANT RELIEF...Mariners relievers combined for a 3.13 ERA (38 ER, 109.1 IP) in the month of September, the 5th-best mark in the Major Leagues, trailing only Milwaukee (2.03/26 ER, 115.0 IP), Los Angeles-NL (2.75/27 ER, 88.1 IP), Colorado (2.98/31 ER, 93.2 IP) and Houston (3.05/38 ER, 100.1 IP)...the Mariners bullpen's 115 strikeouts ranked 9th in the Majors and it issued just 31 walks, the 3rd-fewest in the ML, trailing just Los Angeles-NL (23) and Milwaukee (29).

ALL HANDS ON DECK...on Sept. 25, the Mariners used 26 players, including 10 pitchers, in their 11-inning, walk-off win vs. Oakland...marked the 2nd time in club history to use at least 10 pitchers in a game (11, Sept. 25, 1992 at TEX, 16 innings).

TEAM NOTES...the Mariners posted their worst record in Interleague Play in the 22-year history of the American League facing the National League during the regular season...Seattle was 6-14 (.300) in Interleague Play in 2018, tying Chicago-AL, Detroit and Kansas City for the worst IL record in 2018...posted a series record of 1-5-2 and were swept 3 times (7/6-8 at COL, 8/28-29 at SD & 9/11-12 vs. SD)...registered a 3-7 record in National League parks and went 3-7 at Safeco Field...played Arizona (2-1), Colorado (1-5), Los Angeles (1-2), San Diego (0-4) and San Francisco (2-2)...were outscored by NL opponents, 60-109...the Mariners are 209-195 (.517) all-time vs. the National League, the 9th-best winning percentage in Interleague play since its inception in 1997...have posted 14 seasons with a .500-or-better winning percentage vs. the NL since 2000.

ODDS AND ENDS

- **Boomstick** - Dating back to 2014, Nelson Cruz has hit 29 home runs in Interleague play, the most in the Majors.
- **Save It** - **Edwin Díaz**'s 5 saves during Interleague play were T5th-most in the Majors (also: Seranthony Dominguez-PHI, Kenley Jansen-LAD, Blake Treinen-OAK & Felipe Vázquez-PIT)...trailed only Sean Doolittle-WAS (7), Aroldis Chapman-NYY (6), Wade Davis-COL (6) and Craig Kimbrel-BOS (6).

NO FREE PASSES...Mariners pitchers issued just 45 walks in Interleague play, the fewest in the Major Leagues, and recorded an ML-best 5 games without issuing a walk...Mariners starters issued 2-or-fewer walks in 18 of 20 Interleague games, tied with Tampa Bay for the best mark in the Majors.

NATIONAL TREASURE...**Félix Hernández** closed out his 2018 Interleague slate with a strong outing at San Diego on Aug. 28, allowing 2 runs over 7.0 innings...marked his 25th career Interleague start of at least 7.0 innings pitched while allowing 2-or-fewer earned runs, 4th-most all-time among Major League starters...overall Félix is 23-12 with a 3.14 ERA (109 ER, 312.0 IP) in 45 career Interleague starts (29 quality starts, 2 CG, 1 ShO)...he is one of 12 pitchers all-time to win at least 23 games in Interleague play...his 3.14 career ERA in Interleague games ranks 10th all-time.

INTERLEAGUE PITCHING...the Mariners boast the 2nd-best ERA in Interleague history, trailing only the New York Yankees (3.79/1520 ER, 3611.2 IP)...Seattle's pitchers have compiled a 3.83 ERA (1571 ER, 3638.0 IP) in 404 games since the start of Interleague play in 1997...New York-AL and Seattle rank ahead of Boston (3.86), Los Angeles-AL (3.89), Oakland (3.91), Cleveland (3.98) and Los Angeles-NL (3.98)...no other MLB team has an ERA under 4.00...the Mariners have 38 shutouts during Interleague play, which is the most by any team, ranking ahead of the Mets (31), Yankees (31), Braves (30), Marlins (30), Blue Jays (30) and Red Sox (29).

HEY, BATTER BATTER...**Jean Segura** led the club with a .333 (19x57) average and a .391 on-base percentage in Interleague play, including a .368 (14x38) average and .455 on-base percentage on the road...**Kyle Seager** led the club in RBI (12), doubles (5) and extra-base hits (7), while **Mitch Haniger** (.288/21x73) and **Denard Span** (.286/14x49) each weighed in with 7 RBI apiece.

WEIRD BASEBALL...the Mariners won 2 Interleague games in extra innings, including a 10-inning walk-off win vs. Los Angeles on Aug. 18 on a bases-loaded balk...dating back to 1974, it marked the 16th time in Major League history a team has won on a walk-off balk (last: SD vs. SF on 7/16/16)...also marked the 2nd time in club history to win on a walkoff balk (also: 4/19/04 vs. OAK).

PROVIDING HIS OWN RUN SUPPORT...in the 4th inning of his spot start on July 13 at Colorado, **Christian Bergman** recorded an RBI-single, becoming the 15th Mariners pitcher in club history (done 18x) to record an RBI in a game...Bergman was the first to do so since Andrew Albers on Aug. 21, 2017 at Atlanta...marked the first RBI of Bergman's career and his first hit since April 26, 2016 vs. Pittsburgh with Colorado.

VEDDER CUP UPDATE...the Mariners went 0-4 against the Padres, marking the first time either the Mariners or Padres have swept the season series in 21 seasons with a matchup since Interleague play began in 1997.

THE RANKINGS...Mariners pitchers combined for a 5.04 ERA (98 ER, 175.0 IP) in Interleague Play in 2018, 4th-highest in the Majors ahead of only the White Sox (5.49/107 ER, 175.1 IP), the Tigers (5.39/105 ER, 175.1 IP) and the Twins (5.32/103 ER, 174.1 IP)...Seattle averaged 3.00 runs-per-game (60 R, 20 G) vs. the National League, 3rd-fewest of any club during Interleague Play, ranking ahead of only the Royals (2.70/54 R, 20 G) and the Padres (2.95/59 R, 20 G).

GAME ON...for the 6th consecutive season, the Mariners played 20 games in Interleague play, equaling the club record...played 18 Interleague games from 1999 to 2012...played 16 IL games in 1997-98.

CACTUS LEAGUE...the Mariners completed Cactus League play with a 16-14-2 record (.531)... were 10-2-1 over the last 13 games of the spring...ended the spring with six straight games without a loss (5 wins, 1 tie)...posted a spring-high 5-game winning streak, March 14-17, including sweeping a split-squad doubleheader...posted a 7-9 record in home games and 9-5-2 when the road team...had a 9-9-2 mark in day games, compared to a 7-5 record in night games.

THE HITTERS...the Mariners hit .277 (301x1088) with 164 runs, 64 doubles, 10 triples, 37 home runs, 151 RBI, a .345 on-base percentage and a .456 slugging percentage in 32 games this spring... among Major League leaders in Spring Training play, Mariners batters ranked 6th in on-base percentage (.345), T6th in stolen bases (30), 7th in batting (.277), T9th in triples (10), 10th in slugging (.456) and OPS (.801), and T10th in walks (108).

THE PITCHERS...the Mariners pitching staff compiled a record of 16-14 with 12 saves and a 4.60 ERA (145 ER, 283.2 IP) while allowing 300 hits and recording 90 walks and 278 strikeouts in 32 games this spring...ranked 3rd in saves (12), 6th in fewest walks allowed (90), 10th in strikeouts (278).

FINISHING STRONG...the Mariners went 10-2-1 over their last 13 games, dating back to March 14...during this span, Seattle averaged 6.0 runs per game (78 R, 13 G)...Mariners hitters batted .296 (131x443) with 33 doubles, 4 triples, 20 home runs and 72 RBI over the club's last 13 games... Mariners pitching posted a 3.96 ERA (51 ER, 116.0 IP) while recording 115 strikeouts and 37 walks.

TRIPLE SLASH CROWN...**Daniel Vogelbach** led all of Spring Training in batting, on-base percentage, slugging and OPS, extra-base hits and total bases...Vogelbach also ranked T1st in home runs, T3rd in walks, T4th in hits, T5th in doubles and T10th in runs...he reached base safely in 19 of his 21 games with an at-bat this spring, batting .407 (22x54) with 13 runs, 7 doubles, 7 home runs, 15 RBI, 13 walks, a .529 on-base percentage and an .926 slugging percentage (1.455 OPS)... Vogelbach's 1.455 OPS (.529 OBP, .926 SLG) ranked 3rd-best among all qualifiers over the last 10 Spring Training seasons...during that time span, he trails only Greg Bird in 2017 with the Yankees (1.654) and Nolan Arenado in 2016 with Colorado (1.596).

MAKING HIS MARCO...in 7 starts this spring, **Marco Gonzales** recorded a 2.08 ERA (6 ER, 26.0 IP), the seventh best mark in the Majors (4th among AL pitchers) this spring... he trailed Clayton Kershaw-LAD (0.00/0 ER, 21.1 IP), Lance McCullers Jr.-HOU (1.29/3 ER, 21.0 IP), Noah Syndergaard-NYM (1.35/3 ER, 20.0 IP), Julio Teheran-ATL (1.40/4 ER, 25.2 IP), José Berríos (1.42 ERA/3 ER, 19.0 IP) and Justin Verlander-HOU (1.64/4 ER, 22.0 IP)...Gonzales allowed 22 hits and 9 walks, while striking out a club-leading 21 batters...earned his first win of the spring on 3/17 vs. LAA, allowing only 1 hit over 5.2 innings pitched (5.2,1,0,0,1,3)...in the 2017 season, went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) in 11 games (8 starts).

JEAN, JEAN, THE HITTING MACHINE...**Jean Segura** hit safely in 6 of his last 8 games of the spring (3/11-3/27), batting .545 (12x22) with 3 runs, 1 double, 1 triple, 4 RBI and 3 walks during that span...over his last 7 games, Segura made 25 trips to the plate and reached base via a hit or walk 15 times...overall, this spring, he batted .405 (17x42) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks, a .469 on-base percentage and a .643 slugging mark (1.112 OPS) in 16 games.

WELCOME BACK, ICHIRO...the Mariners announced on March 7 that they had agreed to terms with free agent outfielder **Ichiro Suzuki**...Ichiro is the active Major League hits leader, ranking 22nd all-time in MLB history with 3,080 hits...after amassing 1,278 hits during a 9-year career (1992-2000) with the Orix Blue Wave of Japan's Pacific League, Ichiro has totaled 4,358 between MLB and Japan...on Aug. 7, 2016, he recorded his 3,000th career hit in the Major Leagues – a triple – becoming one of 31 players to reach that milestone...he is one of seven players to collect a least 3,000 hits and 500 stolen bases in the Major Leagues (also: Lou Brock, Ty Cobb, Eddie Collins, Rickey Henderson, Paul Molitor and Honus Wagner)...Ichiro has appeared in 17 Major League seasons with Seattle (2001-12), New York-AL (2012-14) and Miami (2015-17).

CACTUS LEAGUE TIDBITS...

- **BULLPEN BRIEFS** – **Dan Altavilla** led Mariners relievers with 14 strikeouts across 11 appearances... his 1.69 ERA (2 ER, 10.2 IP) ranked 2nd among Mariners relievers with at least 9.0 IP (**Shawn Armstrong** 0.96 ERA/1 ER, 9.1 IP)...Altavilla struck out the side in the ninth inning to earn his only save of the spring on Feb. 23 at San Diego...**Edwin Díaz** tossed an immaculate inning (struck out all 3 BF on 9 pitches) in the seventh inning against the Athletics on March 15...from March 4 to March 18, Díaz retired 15 straight batters faced over 5 appearances with 6 strikeouts...Díaz went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (3 ER, 9.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts in 10 Cactus League appearances.
- **GOING NATIONAL** – Seattle went 9-6-1 against the National League this spring...posted a 5-game winning streak vs. National League opponents, March 14-27.
