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2019 NHL DRAFT DETAILS

The 2019 NHL Draft will be held in Vancouver, British Columbia, marking the third time the Canucks and the city of Vancouver are hosting the annual event. Vancouver previously hosted in 1990 at BC Place Stadium and in 2006 at General Motors Place, which is now Rogers Arena.

The first round will be held on Friday, June 21, beginning at 6 p.m. MT and continues with rounds two through seven on Saturday, June 22, starting at 11 a.m. MT. The first round of the draft will be broadcast live on NBCSN, and the second through seventh rounds can be seen on NHL Network.

The 15 teams that didn't qualify for the Stanley Cup Playoffs -- or clubs that acquired the first-round picks of non-playoff clubs -- were entered into the NHL Draft Lottery, which took place on April 9 and determined the first 15 picks of the draft. The remaining 16 selections were determined by the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

The Avalanche holds two selections in the first round for the seventh time in franchise history and the third time since the club relocated to Denver. Colorado last made multiple first-round picks in 2011 when it drafted current captain Gabriel Landeskog with the second overall pick and defenseman Duncan Siemens at 11th overall.

A LOOK BACK: THE NO. 4 PICK

The Avalanche will make a selection with the fourth overall pick in the NHL Draft for the third time in franchise history and the second time since relocating to Denver. Quebec selected forward Todd Warriner with the fourth overall pick in the 1992 draft, and the Avalanche chose defenseman Cale Makar at fourth overall in 2017.

A LOOK BACK: THE NO. 16 PICK

The Avalanche has the 16th overall pick in the NHL Draft for the second time in franchise history and the second time in as many years, as Colorado selected forward Martin Kaut in the same spot at last year's NHL Draft in Dallas. The Avs have one player on its current roster who was chosen with the 16th overall pick: defenseman Nikita Zadorov, who was selected by the Buffalo Sabres in 2013.

NOTABLE

The Avalanche has 28 drafted players on its active roster with 18 that were selected in the first and second rounds.

There are eight Avalanche draft picks on Colorado's current roster, including five players who were selected by the organization in the first round.

Overall, Colorado's roster features 11 players who were chosen in the first round of the NHL Draft – six forwards, four defensemen and one goaltender.

The Avs' current roster features four top-five selections – forwards Nathan MacKinnon and Gabriel Landeskog and defensemen Erik Johnson and Cale Makar – and eight players who were selected in the top 10.

Right wing Mikko Rantanen, who Colorado selected with the 10th overall pick in 2015, was the first Finnish player to be taken in the first round in franchise history.

Center Nathan MacKinnon is the Avalanche's only first overall pick since relocating to Denver in 1995.

Four of Colorado's first-round selections have been selected to represent the Avs in the NHL All-Star Game (Johnson (2014-15, injured - DNP); Nathan MacKinnon, 2016-2019; Gabriel Landeskog, 2018-19; Mikko Rantanen, 2018-19).

Two of the Avs' first-round picks have won the Calder Memorial Trophy as the league's top rookie (Landeskog in 2012, MacKinnon in 2014).

AVS IN THE FIRST ROUND

The Avalanche has made 41 first-round picks in franchise history, including 23 since relocating to Denver in 1995. This will mark the seventh time in franchise history (third since moving to Denver) that Colorado has had multiple selections in the first round. The last time the Avs had more than one first-round pick was in 2011 when they selected Gabriel Landeskog (second overall) and Duncan Siemens (11th overall).

NOTABLE

Since moving to Denver, the Avalanche has held a top-10 pick six times, all in the last 10 years. The Avs have drafted in the top five four times (2009, 2011, 2013, 2017).

The franchise has never had selections in the Nos. 6, 7, 8, 24, 27, 29, 30 or 31st spots of the opening round but has had the first-overall pick four times (1989, 1990, 1991, 2013) and chosen three times each at Nos. 10, 14, 15 and 25.

There are seven years in which the organization did not have a first-round selection: 1980, 1983, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012.

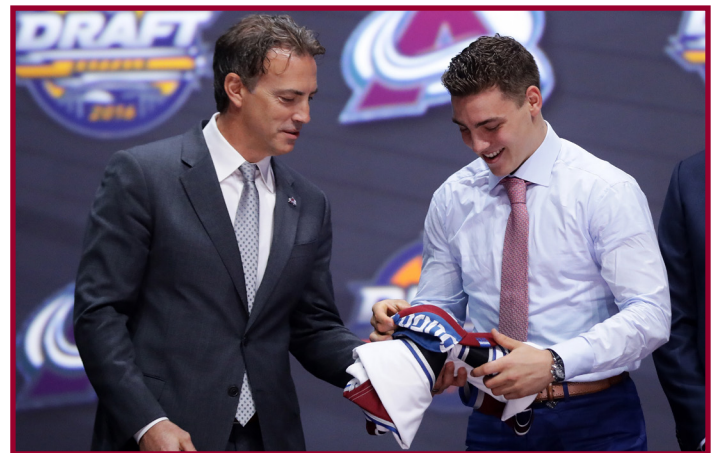

NOTABLE

The Avalanche selected three players from Russian leagues in the 2018 NHL Draft, matching the franchise record for most players from leagues in Russia in a single draft. Colorado also took three players from Russian leagues in 1989.

Colorado has now selected players from the Czech professional leagues in consecutive years (Martin Kaut in 2018 and Petr Kvaca in 2017), breaking a 17-year drought. The Avalanche had previously not drafted a player from a Czech league since 2000.

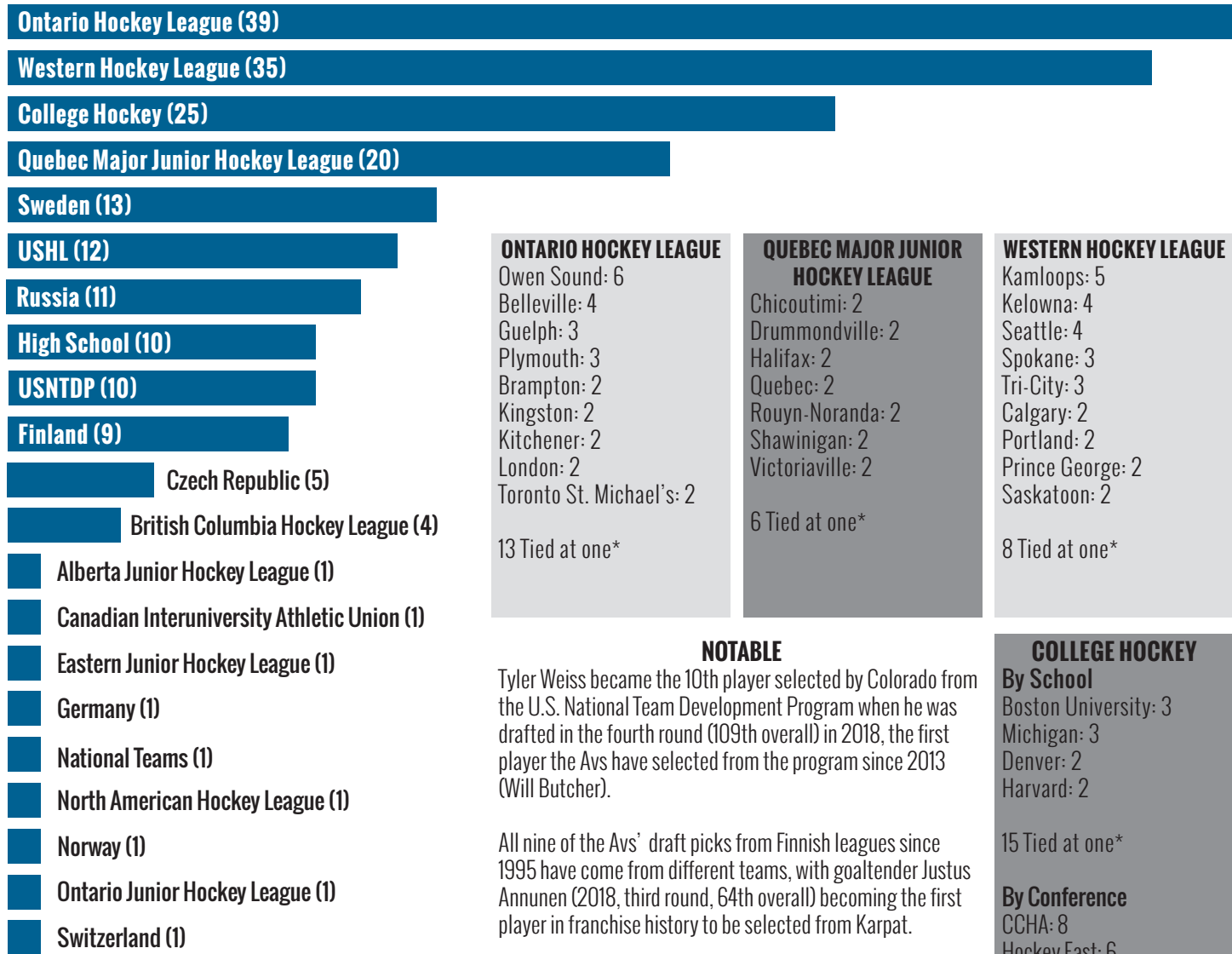
Kaut is the second player in franchise history to be selected from Pardubice from Czech's top professional league, joining Milan Hejduk, who was drafted by the Quebec Nordiques in 1994.

The highest slot with which the franchise has taken a college player is No. 22 overall, as the Nordiques selected center Ryan Hughes in the second round of the 1990 NHL Draft.

Three of Kitchener's OHL-leading seven picks in franchise history have been in the first round: David Shaw, D, No. 13 overall in 1982; David Latta, LW, No. 15 overall in 1985; Gabriel Landeskog, LW, No. 2 overall in 2011.

The organization's eight selections from the QMJHL's Quebec Remparts are the most from a single team in any league.

NOTABLE
Tyler Weiss became the 10th player selected by Colorado from the U.S. National Team Development Program when he was drafted in the fourth round (109th overall) in 2018, the first player the Avs have selected from the program since 2013 (Will Butcher).

All nine of the Avs' draft picks from Finnish leagues since 1995 have come from different teams, with goaltender Justus Annunen (2018, third round, 64th overall) becoming the first player in franchise history to be selected from Karpas.

Taken with the fourth overall pick in the 2017 NHL Draft, Cale Makar became the club's first-ever selection from the Alberta Junior Hockey League and is the highest-ever draft pick from the league in NHL history.

Selected in the second round (No. 44 overall) in the 2005 NHL Draft, center Paul Stastny (University of Denver) is the highest-drafted collegiate player in Avalanche history.

Tyson Jost (Penticton), who the Avalanche drafted with the 10th overall pick in 2016, was the fourth player the organization has selected from the British Columbia Hockey League and the first to be chosen in the first round. The other three were all from the Coquitlam Express.

The Avalanche's six selections from the Ontario Hockey League's Owen Sound Attack is the most from a single team in any league.

Mikko Rantanen was drafted with the 10th overall selection in 2015, the highest pick the organization has used on a right wing since moving to Denver.

NOTABLE

Selected with the fourth overall pick in 2017, Cale Makar became the highest-drafted defenseman since the Avalanche moved to Denver and second highest in franchise history behind Curtis Leschyshyn, who was chosen third overall in 1988.

Goaltender Jocelyn Thibault, who was taken with the 10th overall pick in the 1993 NHL Draft, is the highest-drafted goaltender in franchise history. Marc Denis (25th overall in 1995), is the only goalie that's been drafted in the first round since the franchise relocated.

The Avalanche selected two goaltenders at the 2018 NHL Draft, the first time the club has chosen more than one goaltender at a single draft since 2010 (Calvin Pickard, Sami Aittokallio).

The Quebec Nordiques used three draft picks on goaltenders in both 1989 and 1992, the highest number of selections the franchise has used on the position in a single NHL Draft.

The No. 2 overall pick is the highest position the franchise has used on a left wing, selecting Gabriel Landeskog in that slot in 2011.

Eric Lindros (1991) and Nathan MacKinnon (2013) are the only two centers the organization has selected with the first overall pick in the NHL Draft. The franchise has also twice used the No. 1 overall pick on right wings, selecting Mats Sundin in 1989 and Owen Nolan in 1990.
