2020 NHL DRAFT DETAILS

The 2020 NHL Draft will be held virtually over two days, beginning with the first round on Tuesday Oct. 6 at 5 p.m. MT. The event will continue with rounds two through seven on Wednesday, Oct. 7 beginning at 9:30 a.m. MT.

Coverage of the first round can be seen live on NBCSN, Sportsnet and TVA while Wednesday's events will be broadcast by NHL Network and Sportsnet.

Draft Order Procedure for 2020 NHL Draft

In the first round, picks 1-15 were determined by Phases 1 and 2 of 2020 NHL Draft Lottery. Selections 16-27 consist of teams eliminated in Rounds 1 and 2 of 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs, in inverse order of 2019-20 regular season points percentage. Picks 28 and 29 are teams eliminated in 2020 Conference Finals, in inverse order of 2019-20 regular season points percentage. Pick 30 is the team eliminated in 2020 Stanley Cup Final, while pick 31 went to the 2020 Stanley Cup champion.

For rounds two through seven, picks 1-7 were slated for the teams who did not participate in the Return To Play, in inverse order of 2019-20 regular season points percentage. Picks 8-15 went to teams eliminated in the 2020 Stanley Cup Qualifiers, in inverse order of 2019-20 regular season points percentage. Selections 16-27 are teams eliminated in Rounds 1 and 2 of the 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs, in inverse order of 2019-20 regular season points percentage. Similar to the first round, picks 28 and 29 went to teams eliminated in 2020 Conference Finals, in inverse order of 2019-20 regular season points percentage, pick 30 to the team eliminated in 2020 Stanley Cup Final and pick 31 to the 2020 Stanley Cup champion.

A LOOK BACK: THE NO. 25 PICK

The Avalanche hold the 25th overall pick in the NHL Draft for the fourth time in franchise history, all of which have been since the team relocated to Denver. Colorado had the 25th overall selection in consecutive years, selecting goaltender Marc Denis in 1995 and defenseman Peter Ratchuk in 1996. The Avs picked left wing Mikhail Kuleshov at No. 25 overall in 1999.

NOTABLE

Of the 31 players on Colorado's roster, 18 were drafted in the first two rounds. The Avs' roster features 14 first-round selections --- nine forwards and five defensemen.

There are eight Avalanche draft picks on Colorado's current roster, including six players who were selected by the organization in the first round.

Right wing Mikko Rantanen, who Colorado selected with the 10th overall pick in 2015, was the first Finnish player to be taken in the first round in franchise history.

Center Nathan MacKinnon is the Avalanche's only first overall pick since relocating to Denver in 1995.

Four players on Colorado's roster have been selected to represent the Avs in the NHL All-Star Game (Johnson (2014-15, injured - DNP); Nathan MacKinnon, 2016-2020; Gabriel Landeskog, 2018-19; Mikko Rantanen, 2018-19).

Three of the Avs' first-round picks have won the Calder Memorial Trophy as the league's top rookie (Landeskog in 2012, MacKinnon in 2014, Makar in 2020).

Nine of the 14 players on Colorado's roster that were drafted in the first round are top-10 selections, including six that were drafted by the Avalanche.

Three players acquired by Colorado during the 2019 offseason are first-round selections: Nazem Kadri, Valeri Nichushkin and Andre Burakovsky.



Cale Makar, Colorado's first selection (fourth overall) in the 2017 NHL Draft, won the 2020 Calder Memorial Trophy as the league's rookie of the year.

AVS IN THE FIRST ROUND

The Avalanche has made 43 first-round picks in franchise history, including 25 since relocating to Denver in 1995. With the 25th selection in this year's event, Colorado holds its latest first-round selection since 2002, when it's first pick of the draft came at No. 28 (Jonas Johansson).

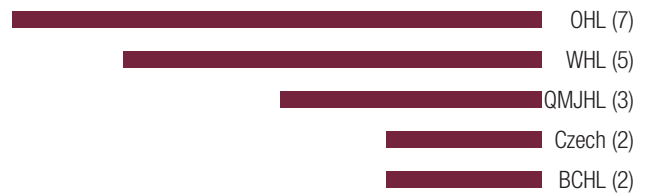

NOTABLE

The Avalanche has held four top-10 selections over the last five NHL Entry Drafts (2015, 2016, 2017 and 2019). The last time Colorado had a first-round pick outside the top 20 was 2014.

Since moving to Denver, the Avs have had five top-five selections (2009, 2011, 2013, 2017, 2019).

The franchise has had the first-overall pick four times (1989, 1990, 1991, 2013) and chosen three times each at Nos. 10, 14, 15 and 25.

There are seven years in which the organization did not have a first-round selection: 1980, 1983, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012.

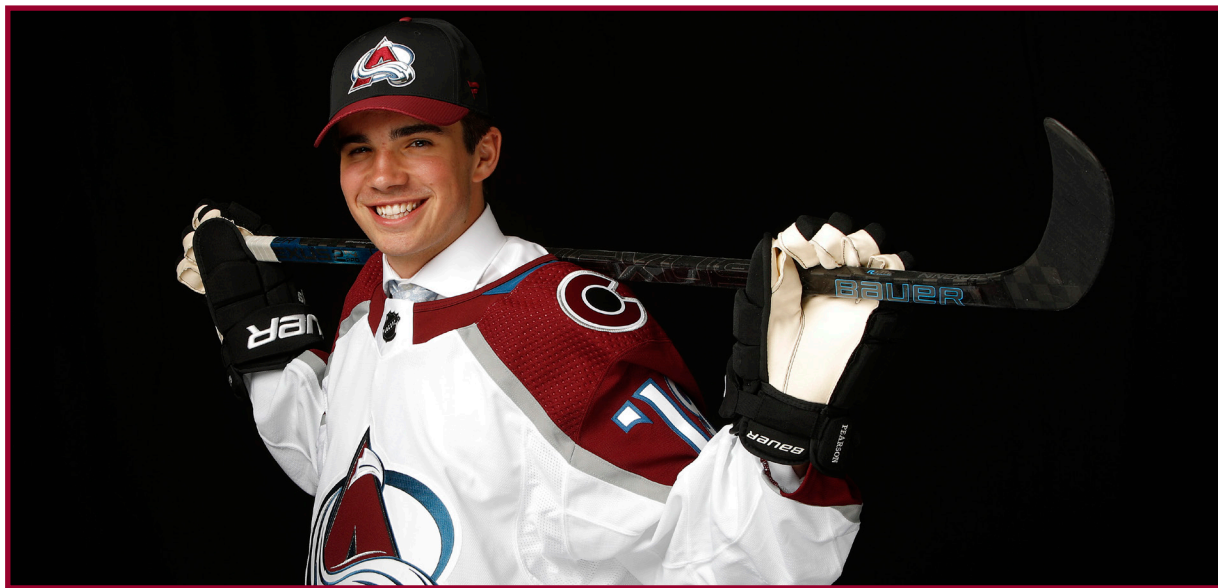

NOTABLE

At the 2019 NHL Draft, the Avalanche selected four players from the Western Hockey League, matching the franchise record for most players drafted out of the WHL (also 2005 and 1992).

Colorado selected players from the Czech professional leagues in consecutive years in 2017 and 2018 (Petr Kvaca and Martin Kaut, respectively), breaking a 17-year drought. The Avalanche had previously not drafted a player from a Czech league since 2000. Kaut was the second player in franchise history to be selected from Pardubice in Czech's top professional league, joining Milan Hejduk, who was drafted by the Quebec Nordiques in 1994.

The highest slot with which the franchise has taken a college player is No. 22 overall, as the Nordiques selected center Ryan Hughes in the second round of the 1990 NHL Draft.

Three of Kitchener's OHL-leading seven picks in franchise history have been in the first round: David Shaw, D, No. 13 overall in 1982; David Latta, LW, No. 15 overall in 1985; Gabriel Landeskog, LW, No. 2 overall in 2011.

The organization's eight selections from the QMJHL's Quebec Remparts are the most from a single team in any league.

NOTABLE

Selected with the fourth overall pick in the 2019 NHL Draft, defenseman Bowen Byram is the highest selection the Avalanche has made from the Western Hockey League since Curtis Leschyshyn in 1988 (third overall).

Alex Newhook (Victoria) is the fifth player the franchise has selected from the British Columbia Hockey League and second in four years, as Colorado drafted Tyson Jost (Penticton) with the 10th overall pick at the 2016 NHL Draft.

All nine of the Avs' draft picks from Finnish leagues since 1995 have come from different teams, with goaltender Justus Annunen (2018, third round, 64th overall) becoming the first player in franchise history to be selected from Karpas.

Taken with the fourth overall pick in the 2017 NHL Draft, Cale Makar became the club's first-ever selection from the Alberta Junior Hockey League and is the highest-ever draft pick from the AJHL in NHL history.

Trent Miner (Vancouver) is the seventh goaltender the Avs have drafted from the WHL and the first since picking Calvin Pickard (Seattle) in the second round (49th overall) in 2010.

Selected in the second round (No. 44 overall) in the 2005 NHL Draft, center Paul Stastny (University of Denver) is the highest-drafted collegiate player in Avalanche history.

The Avalanche's six selections from the Ontario Hockey League's Owen Sound Attack is the most from a single team in any league.

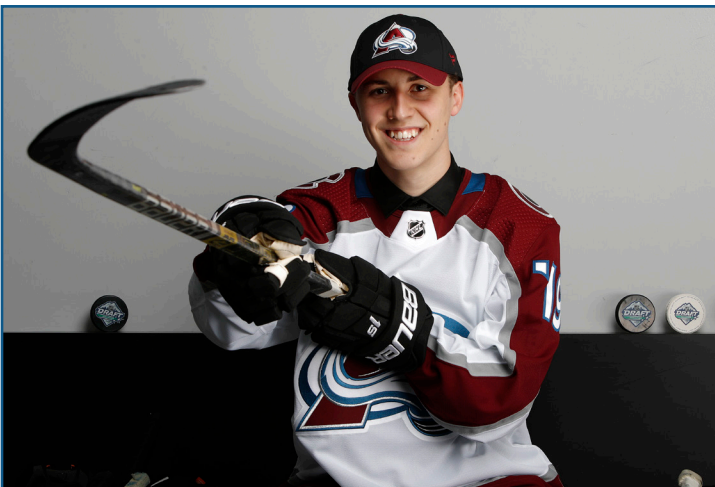

Alex Beaucage (third round, 78th overall) was one of three right wings selected by the Avalanche at the 2019 NHL Draft.

NOTABLE

The Avalanche has had two top-five selections in the last three years, using the No. 4 pick in both 2017 (Cale Makar) and 2019 (Bowen Byram) on defensemen, the second-highest slot used on a blueliner in franchise history behind Curtis Leschyshyn, who was chosen third overall in 1988.

Colorado drafted three right wings in the 2019 NHL Draft, its most selections of the position since 2004 (also three).

Selected with the 10th overall pick in 2015, Mikko Rantanen is the highest pick the Avalanche has used on a right wing since moving to Denver.

Goaltender Jocelyn Thibault, who was taken with the 10th overall pick in the 1993 NHL Draft, is the highest-drafted goaltender in franchise history. Marc Denis (25th overall in 1995), is the only goalie that's been drafted in the first round since the franchise relocated.

The No. 2 overall pick is the highest position the franchise has used on a left wing, selecting Gabriel Landeskog in that slot in 2011.

Eric Lindros (1991) and Nathan MacKinnon (2013) are the only two centers the organization has selected with the first overall pick in the NHL Draft. The franchise has also twice used the No. 1 overall pick on right wings, selecting Mats Sundin in 1989 and Owen Nolan in 1990.

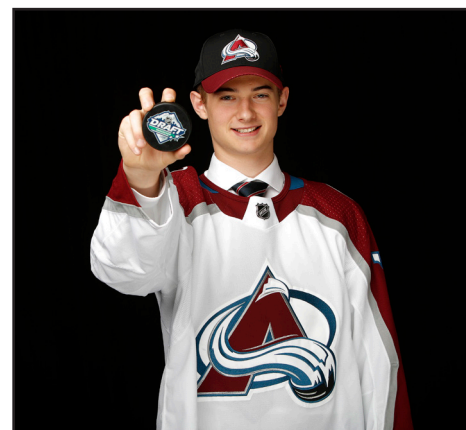
