Augusta GreenJackets (19-23) at Charleston RiverDogs (27-14)

Tonight's Game: The Charleston RiverDogs (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) return home to host the Augusta GreenJackets (affiliate of the Atlanta Braves) for six games at The Joe. This series is the second meeting of the season between the clubs. They split a six-game series in Augusta during the first week of June. **RiverDogs-GreenJackets Season Series in 2021:** Overall: RiverDogs 4, GreenJackets 3. **At The Joe:** RiverDogs 1, GreenJackets 0.

Last Time Out: The RiverDogs came from behind to beat Augusta 7-5 in the opening game of the series on Tuesday night. Augusta quickly scored three runs against Cole Wilcox in the top of the first inning to grab the early advantage. The RiverDogs got one back in the bottom of the opening inning on an RBI single from Brett Wisely. The GreenJackets pushed the lead back to three in the top of the third only to watch the RiverDogs cut the deficit to one run in the bottom of the same inning. Curtis Mead's two-run single in the fourth inning gave the RiverDogs their first lead of the night at 5-4. However, that lead was short-lived as Cade Bunnell launched a solo home run to tie the game in the first at bat of the fifth inning. From that point forward, the RiverDogs bullpen took over and held the GreenJackets scoreless the rest of the way. Meanwhile the offense took advantage of four walks, a passed ball and a wild pitch in the bottom of the sixth to score a pair of runs that proved to be the difference.

Finding His Groove: Tonight's starter Seth Johnson began the season as a member of the starting rotation, but was moved to the bullpen after just two starts. Since that move, Johnson has been a dominant presence on the mound and rejoined the rotation. He has surrendered just one earned run over the last 22.2 innings and has allowed just four hits in the last 14.1 innings. Johnson, a Competitive Balance Round A selection, is the highest ever draft pick out of Campbell University.

That's Gross: Reliever Andrew Gross allowed three runs in his first appearance of the 2021 season back in May. In his 11 appearances since, he has not allowed another run. After tossing 3.0 perfect innings on Tuesday night, Gross has put together 24.0 consecutive scoreless innings, lowering his earned run average to 1.03. That scoreless innings streak is the longest active streak in MiLB and the second-longest of the season. Ken Waldichuk of Hudson Valley worked 30.2 innings without allowing a run earlier in the season.

Toilet Paper Night: On Saturday night, the RiverDogs are inviting fans to stick around the ballpark after the game to "TP" The Joe. The team wants fans to wipe away the memories of last year's toilet paper shortage by treating our "yard" like you would a high school friend's during Homecoming week. As the game reaches its' conclusion, staff members will distribute thousands of rolls of toilet paper to fans. Once the teams clear the field, have at it! The best part is, fans won't be required to stick around for the cleanup.

G'Days Mate: Australian Curtis Mead was named the Low-A East Player of the Week last week for his performance in the series against Myrtle Beach. He has been a problem for opposing pitching staffs all season. After a quiet opening week, the third baseman has registered a hit in 27 of the last 30 games he has played in. Mead is batting .365 over that same span. He leads the league in hits and doubles, is tied for second in extra-base hits, third in total bases and eighth in batting average.

A Whole Lot of Nothing: The RiverDogs 4-0 win over Myrtle Beach on Friday night was their eighth shutout win of the season. The RiverDogs lead Minor League Baseball in that category. Hudson Valley and Durham each have blanked the opponent seven times. In the Low-A East, no other team has more than four shutouts. The RiverDogs currently have a team ERA of 3.03, the second-lowest mark in all of Major and Minor League baseball combined.

Prized Pups: The RiverDogs roster contains seven members of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Rays prospects. The highest ranked of that group is starting pitcher Cole Wilcox who came in at #9. Outfielder/catcher Heriberto Hernandez is the most highly regarded position player at #13. The rest of the list is filled out by starting pitchers Seth Johnson (#15) and Taj Bradley (#21), shortstops Osleivis Basabe (#24) and Alika Williams (#25) and outfielder Nick Schnell (#30).

RIVERDOGS FIELD STAFF

Manager: Blake Butera

Butera is in his first season as the manager of the RiverDogs after two seasons at the helm in Hudson Valley with the Rays former short-season affiliate. He led the Renegades to a postseason berth in both seasons, including a league-most 45 wins in 2018 and a share of the league's best record in 2019. Butera coached with the Leones del Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the cancellation of the 2020 minor league season. At the time he received the managerial job in Hudson Valley, Butera was the youngest manager (25) in all of Minor League Baseball. The native of Metairie, Louisiana was drafted by the Rays in the 35th round of the 2015 Amateur Draft out of Boston College and appeared in 80 minor league games over two seasons. At Boston College, he was voted team captain his senior year and finished his career as the Eagles' all-time leader in walks (112) and at-bats (774). His father, Barry, reached Triple-A with the Red Sox and his brother, Barry, spent two seasons in the Astros minor league system after being selected out of Boston College in the 2009 Amateur Draft.

Pitching Coach: R.C. Lichtenstein

Lichtenstein begins his first year as the pitching coach for the RiverDogs and his 17th year in the Rays organization. Lichtenstein has served as pitching coach at several stops in the Rays farm system including Southwest Michigan (2005-06), Vero Beach (2007-08), Bowling Green (2009-11) and Double-A Montgomery (2012-19). Throughout his career in baseball, the 52-year old has also coached in the Milwaukee Brewers organization and managed two independent squads.

Hitting Coach: Wuarnner Rincones

Rincones enters his first season with the RiverDogs after spending the 2019 season in the same role with the Princeton Rays. In total, he has spent six years as Princeton's hitting coach and four seasons with the GCL Rays. In his playing days, Rincones, spent two years (1994-95) in the farm system of the Chicago White Sox, compiling a .278 batting average over 129 career games.

Coach: Sean Smedley

Smedley enters his first season on the RiverDogs staff after serving as an assistant for the Short-Season Hudson Valley Renegades in 2017 and 2018. He received his first opportunity post-playing career with the Rays as the video coordinator of the Princeton Rays in 2016 before transitioning to the coaching staff in 2017. He was slated to be the manager at Princeton before the 2020 season was canceled. As a player, Smedley was signed by Tampa Bay as an undrafted free agent in 2013 out of Texas A&M International. He played parts of three seasons in the Rays minor league system, reaching Low-A Bowling Green in 2014-15.

Athletic Trainer: Tsutomu Kamiya

Kamiya enters his first season as the athletic trainer for the RiverDogs after holding the same role for two seasons with the short-season Hudson Valley Renegades. Kamiya was slated to rejoin Hudson Valley in 2020 before the season was canceled.

Strength Coach: James McCallie

McCallie enters his first season as the strength and conditioning coach for Charleston and his eighth with the Rays organization. He spent 2017-19 in the same role with the Low-A Bowling Green Hot Rods. McCallie has also served as strength and conditioning coach for the GCL Rays and Port Charlotte. He graduated from the University of Alabama at Birmingham with a B.S. in Exercise Science. He holds his CSCS and RSCC through the National Strength and Conditioning Association as well as his USAW Level 1 through USA Weightlifting.
