



DIRECTIONS

From Indiana Toll Road (1-90)

Westbound: Take I-90 to Exit 17 (US-12/US-20/Dunes Highway). Continue West on Dunes Highway. Stadium will be on left. Eastbound: Take I-90 to exit at Broadway Ave. Turn right on Broadway Ave. Drive two stoplights to 5th Ave. Take left on 5th Ave. Stadium will be on left.

From I-65

Take I-65 North to end of highway at U.S. 12/20 [Dunes Highway]. Turn left on U.S. 12/20 heading west for 1.5 miles (three stoplights). Stadium is on left side.

From I-80/94

Take I-80/94 to I-65 North, all the way to end of highway at U.S. 12/20 [Dunes Highway]. Turn left on U.S. 12/20 heading west for 1.5 miles (three stoplights). Stadium is on left side.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Train (Chicago - South Bend)

The South Shore Line runs daily from downtown Chicago to South Bend, Ind., with a convenient stop just outside U. S. Steel Yard. Just take any South Shore Line Train to the Gary Metro Center spot, and walk one block east on 4th Avenue to the front gate!

Bus

The Gary Public Transportation Corporation has buses running throughout Northwest Indiana, including stops in Merrillville and Crown Point. Convenient stops are available just outside U. S. Steel Yard.

PARKING

Parking at U. S. Steel Yard is FREE year-round and available within comfortable walking distance of the front gate! The RailCats main general admission lot is located next to the Diamond Club just to the east of U. S. Steel Yard. The lot can be accessed from either direction by turning onto Virginia Street off 4th and 5th Avenues. Parking is also available to the east and west of the stadium off 4th and 5th Avenues and just south of the ballpark. The RailCats V.I.P lot for Season Ticket holders is located on Stadium Plaza Drive adjacent to U. S. Steel Yard and is only accessible with a V.I.P. Parking Pass.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

Jared Shlensky and Austin Anderson bring you all 100 RailCats games this season on WEFM (95.9 FM) and online at railcatsbaseball.com.

Coverage for each game will begin 30 minutes prior to first pitch (e.g., 6:50 p.m. pregame for a 7:10 p.m. first pitch). The pregame show will feature interviews with players and coaches as well as a quick preview of the scheduled game.

The postgame show will begin 2-3 minutes after the final out is recorded and will feature a live on-field interview with the player of the game after every home win. The postgame show will also feature audio highlights for every home game, a scoreboard update (American Association & MLB) and a quick preview of the next game.

The RailCats will also have a weekly podcast that can be heard on SoundCloud. The RailCats podcast will feature interviews with players, coaches and front office staff members, announcements on upcoming games and promotions and a more in-depth look of the team.

2016 IN REVIEW

Four RailCats have contracts purchased by MLB Affiliates

Left-handed pitcher Alex Gunn, right-handed pitcher Christian Herstine, catcher Jose Gonzalez and infielder Jose Sermo all had their contracts purchased by Major League Affiliates by the end of the 2016 season.

Gunn had his contract purchased by the Arizona Diamondbacks on July 7, 2016, after going 2-0 with one save and a 3.37 ERA in 12 games (six starts) for the RailCats. After moving to the starting rotation on June 7, the southpaw allowed just eight runs in his six starts (2.20 ERA). The RailCats originally acquired Gunn on August 17, 2015, as part of a three-player trade with Laredo, however, Gunn did not pitch for Gary in 2015.

Herstine had his contract purchased by the New York Yankees on July 7, 2016, after spending just 15 days with the RailCats. Herstine went 1-0 with 10 strikeouts and a 1.04 ERA in five relief appearances (8.2 innings). Herstine made his professional debut with the RailCats on June 22, striking out two batters in two scoreless innings of relief.

Gonzalez had his contract purchased by the Minnesota Twins on February 3, 2017. Gonzalez was one of two All-Stars for the RailCats and was named the American Association Defensive Catcher of the Year in 2016.

Sermo had his contract purchased by the Boston Red Sox on June 20, 2016. A native of Bayamon, P.R., Sermo hit a team-best .311 and was tied for the team lead with five home runs in 29 games before signing with Boston. Sermo was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 35th round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of Bethany (Kan.) College.

RailCats miss postseason for third straight season in 2016

Despite missing the American Association playoffs for the third consecutive season in 2016, The Gary SouthShore RailCats (52-48) improved by seven games from the 2015 season.

Following a 45-55 campaign 2015 season, manager Greg Tagert opened the 2016 season with 14 players from the 2015 season, most notably pitchers Eric Eadignton and Charle Rosario, and infielder Jose Sermo.

After getting swept by St. Paul in a four-game series to begin the year, the RailCats managed to finish just one game under .500 during the month of May. Gary went 4-2 at home in the month, including a sweep over Joplin in its home opening series, however, the RailCats won just two of its six games away from U.S. Steel Yard in May.

The bats were strong in May, especially Sermo, but Gary struggled as a pitching staff. Sermo batted .354 in May and led the team with eight extra-base hits, two home runs, 15 RBI, 31 total bases, a .466 OBP, .646 slugging percentage and a 1.111 OPS. The RailCats finished the month with an ERA over five and opponents batted just under .300 against Gary.

Gary improved its record to 22-17 at the end of June after finishing the month 16-10, including wins in nine of its last 11 to close out the month. While the bats cooled down in June, the pitching staff improved significantly, finishing with a 2.81 ERA for the month. Rosario won a team-high four games in June and struck out a team-best 32 while tossing a pair of complete game shutouts. Karl Triana was also outstanding in June, allowing just 10 earned runs over 40 innings while throwing a complete game shutout of his own.

However, the RailCats couldn't carry their winning ways into July, as the team finished the month .500 at 15-15. Anthony Cheky Jr. was hot at the plate in July, hitting a team-high .350 with three triples and six stolen bases. Moises Melendez went a perfect 3-0 with a save in 10 relief outings in the month. Melendez also struck out 16 batters in 20.2 innings and held opposing hitters to a .253 average.

Gary squandered its Central Division lead after dropping a season-high six straight games to begin the month of August. The Rail-Cats closed out the last month of the year 15-16, finishing two games behind Sioux City for the Central Division Title. Frank Martinez closed out the last month of the year with a team-high .364 average, three home runs, five doubles, nine extra-base hits and a .952 OPS. Jorge De Leon finished with eight saves in the last month of the season and Rosario went 4-1 with another complete game in his last seven starts of the year.

Rosario and Gonzalez named American Association All-Stars

Right-hander pitcher Charle Rosario and catcher Jose Gonzalez represented the North Team in the 2016 American Association All-Star Game.

Gonzalez was third in the league in runners caught stealing percentage (27.5%) and was second on the team in slugging percentage (.420) at the All-Star Break last year. Overall on the year, Gonzalez batted .232 with four home runs and 21 RBIs. Gonzalez was also named the American Association Defensive Catcher of the Year, gunning down 24 of 47 attempted base stealers (34%).

Rosario went 5-3 with a 2.99 ERA in a league-high 14 starts in the first half of the season. The right-hander also tied for the first half league lead in shutouts (2) and was tied for the second in the league in complete games (2). Overall on the season, Rosario went 11-4 with a 3.13 ERA in a league-high 24 starts. Rosario's 11 wins, four complete games, 155.1 innings pitched, and 120 strikeouts were also



Field Manager, Greg Tagert

Greg Tagert returns to the Gary SouthShore Railcats in 2017 for his 13th season (23rd overall) as the team's manager. Tagert has won three league championships (2005, 2007, 2013) and has finished with a .500 or better record in every season except one since being named the team's manager in 2005.

Tagert was named the 2016 American Association Manager of the Year after guiding the RailCats to a 52-48 record, a seven game improvement from the 2015 season. Tagert also had four players have their contracts purchased by Major League Affiliates in 2016.

The two-time Northern League Manager of the Year has led Gary to the playoffs seven times (six straight from 2005-2010), two Central Division Titles and has helped advance 27 former RailCats to affiliated baseball, including 2006 outfielder Nathan Haynes, who played in the MLB for the Los Angeles Angels and Tampa Bay Rays from 2007-2008.

Tagert has developed three Northern League Pitchers of the Year, a Northern League Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, five Baseball America All-Independent League selections, eight full-season Northern League All-Stars and two full-season American Association All-Stars.

Pitching Coach, Alain Quijano

Alain Quijano returns to the Gary SouthShore RailCats in 2017 for his third straight season as the team's pitching coach.
