

OTTERS UNVEIL NEW LOGO BRANDING IN 2021



The Evansville Otters unveiled a collection of newly designed logos on March 16, 2021, giving the baseball team a fresh, rebranded look heading into the 2021 Frontier League championship season.

The Otters franchise announced its logo rebranding in March at the Old National Bank building along Riverside Dr. in Downtown Evansville.

"This is an exciting time for the Otters franchise, coming off our 25th anniversary in 2019, Bosse Field's renovations in 2020, and now, new branding heading into the Otters' return to the field in 2021," Otters president John Stanley stated. "Now seemed like the perfect time to refresh some things."

The new primary logo features updated, brighter color variations of the Otters' traditional red and blue scheme, while also adding a light, watery blue and a warm, white hide.

The main logo also introduced a new typography, showcasing an emphasis on "Evansville" in the visual to signify the dedication to community and local team pride. Plus, the wordmarks present a contemporary, custom script that pays homage to baseball's classic typeface.

The otter mascot in the team logo also received an updated look, displaying a serious game face, but with soft curves and a two-dimensional style to make him friendly and fun – in the true spirit of an otter.

"The biggest differences with our new logo are that it is brighter and has

more contrast, the lines are not as harsh and are smoother, and of course, our new Otter," Otters director of communications Preston Leinenbach said. "We feel our fans will connect more with this otter mascot logo. Plus, the Evansville script represents our goal to illustrate that the Otters are Evansville's professional baseball team."

The Otters also revealed new secondary wordmarks, "E" insignias, and an alternate sub logo.

The Otters stated the franchise set out to develop a new brand that would respectfully honor Evansville's baseball history. The club also wanted to communicate the values that are important to the organization: providing affordable, safe fun for every demographic, representing the city of Evansville, and reflecting the organization's priority of the community.

"Evansville has over 100 years' worth of baseball history, and we believe this new logo celebrates that history, while also reflecting that the Otters are Evansville's team," Otters general manager Travis Painter said.

"2021 is going to be a big, exciting season for the Otters, in addition to starting a new era for the Frontier League with 16 teams," Stanley said. "We cannot wait to see everyone at the ballpark this summer!"



OTTERS MOURNING THE PASSING OF FORMER PLAYER JEFF GOLDBACH



The Evansville Otters are mourning the passing of former player and tristate native Jeff Goldbach, who passed away in March at the age of 41.

Goldbach played for the Otters from 2005-06, leading the way for Evansville toward the 2006 Frontier League Championship.

Goldbach was a versatile player who split time as a first baseman, catcher, outfielder, and designated hitter. Overall, with the Evansville Otters, Goldbach batted .319, and known for his power, finished his Otters career with 36 home runs. Goldbach also totaled 133 RBIs, 100 runs, and 72 extra-base hits in his two seasons with Evansville.

Goldbach is fifth on the Otters' all-time home run list with 36. He is top-ten all-time in RBIs with 133 and first all-time with a .576 slugging percentage.

Goldbach's 19 home runs in 2005 sits fourth in the Otters' single-season record books, and his .339 average that season is good for third. He also had the fourth-most hits in single-season history with 108. In 2005, he slugged .674.

The Princeton, Ind. native was a standout player at Princeton Community High School.

Goldbach was drafted out of high school by the Chicago Cubs organization in the 2nd round of the 1998 MLB June Amateur Draft.


The power hitter reached as high as Double-A with the West Tennessee Di-

amond Jaxx of the Southern League in 2001 with the Cubs organization. He then later returned to the Double-A level in 2003 with the Frisco RoughRiders of the Texas League with the Texas Rangers organization.

Goldbach spent time with the Fargo-Moorhead Redhawks and the Joliet Jackhammers of the defunct Northern League before coming to the Evansville Otters.

The late Greg Jelks was Goldbach's manager with the Otters in 2005-06.

The Otters family expresses their condolences to the entire Goldbach family.

ADVANCE TICKET SALES

Advance tickets may be purchased in person at the Otters office Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday/Sunday (provided the Otters play at home). Tickets may also be purchased online at evansvilleotters.com or by phone using Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover.\

ATM

The Otters have a Heritage Federal Credit Union ATM located inside the tunnel of the main entrance.

AUTOGRAPHS

Players will be available immediately after the game to sign autographs near the home dugout on the first base side of the concourse.

BFFR

Beer is available on the concourse, in the picnic vending areas, and from waiting vendors. Indiana law prohibits the sale of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by minors. The Evans-ville Otters reserve the right to refuse service to any individual without notice. Please drink responsibly.

BROKEN WINDSHIELDS

Fans are welcome to park in the Bosse Field parking lot at no cost or on the adjacent streets (as allowed by law). However, fans who park in an area where baseballs may inflict damage to their automobile do so at their own risk. The Evansville Otters are not liable for any damage to automobiles while parked in the Bosse Field parking lot or on the street.

CREDIT CARDS

The Evansville Otters accept American Express, Discover, VISA, and MasterCard at the ticket office, gift shop, and all concession stands.

FIRST AID & SAFETY

The first aid station is located in the main office at the Main Gate. Representatives of the Vanderburgh County Sheriff's Department are on duty patrolling the stadium during the game to assist fans.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE CARRY-INS

Frontier League rules prohibits fans from bringing any cooler, cans, bottles, food, or beverages into Bosse Field.

FOUL BALL

Fans are welcome to keep any ball that is hit or thrown into the stands during the game. However, any ball or bat entering the stands can be dangerous, and fans should be alert at all time.

GATES OPEN

Gates open 65 minutes before game time.

GIFT CERTIFICATES

Gift certificates are available in the Otters Front Office.

GIFT SHOP

The gift shop is located across from the office at the Main Gate. Official Otters hats, Bosse Field shirts, and other souvenirs are available only at the Otters gift shop at Bosse Field. The gift shop is open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on non-game days and from 9 a.m. through the end of the game on game days.

LOST AND FOUND

All found items are to be taken to the Otters Front Office at the Main Gate. Call (812) 435-8686 to see if your lost item has been found.

PRESS BOX

Fans are not permitted to enter the press box. Special announcements such as birthdays and anniversaries may be purchased by the end of the 2nd inning at the Front Office.

RAIN CHECKS

If you have tickets from a rain out date, those tickets are now rain checks which may be exchanged for any remaining regular season game this season, based on availability. Tickets may be exchanged in the Front Office. No rain checks will be offered if five innings have been completed or if the Otters are ahead after 4 1/2 innings of play. No refunds will be given.

RESTROOMS

Restrooms are located under the stands near the first base and third base concession stands.

SMOKING

Pursuant to city ordinance, smoking is not permitted in the stadium. You can find a smoking area outside the gates on the first and third base side of the concourse.







OTTERS RELIEVER OPP SIGNED BY METS



The Evansville Otters have announced that former Otters pitcher Cam Opp has signed with the New York Mets Organization.

Cam Opp, from Enterprise, Ala., signed and joined the Otters in July 2019 for his first professional stint in baseball.

The left-hander went 4-2 with a 2.70 ERA, recording two saves, and striking out 35 in 26.2 innings pitched and 21 appearances for the Otters.

"I am looking forward to competing at the next level and pushing myself further than I have before," Opp said.

"Cam has above-average velocity from the left side with a sharp cutter, slider combination," Otters manager Andy McCauley said. "He also threw a curveball that was tough to time up with his other pitches."

Opp had 16 appearances not allowing an earned run and had 12 outings recording multiple strikeouts out of the bullpen.

"Cam made a huge impact as a rookie stepping into the setup role, and with the number of pitchers that got picked up last year, we needed younger guys to step up," McCauley said.

"With the new three-batter minimum rule, left-handed pitchers like Cam will be in more demand, and especially because he was dominant against left-handed and right-handed hitters."

Opp came to the Otters following his senior season at the U.S Military Academy at West Point, pitching for the Army Black Knights. In 2019 for the Black Knights, Opp was 5-1 in 24 appearances with a 3.65 ERA. He recorded 51 strikeouts in 44.1 innings pitched.

"I've never had a player from the U.S military academies, U.S.M.A. or U.S.N.A., but hopefully with new regulations we will be able to give these exceptional student-athlete patriots an opportunity to compete past their eligibility," McCauley said.

Following the 2019 Frontier League season, Opp rejoined the Army to resume his military

training.

"The last competitive pitch I threw was in an Otters jersey, and like most baseball players, 2020 was a year away from the field for the most part due to COVID-19," Opp said.

Opp mentioned he was able to piece together a baseball offseason to stay ready and in game shape. He was supported by the Army and the World Class Athlete Program, moving through Texas, Colorado, and most recently North Carolina, which has provided facilities and an environment where he can work to get better each day.

"It was honestly a pleasure to have Cam, as his work ethic, discipline, respect for staff and teammates, and appreciation of the opportunity were exemplary," McCauley said.

"We wish Cam the best of luck with the Mets organization."

"Throughout 2020, the 2019 season with Evansville came to mind often," Opp said. "I will always remember that team, and I look forward to keeping a lot of the relationships I made with the staff and players throughout the organization."

Opp is the seventh Otters player from the 2019 season to be signed to an affiliated organization and sixth pitcher from the 2019 pitching staff. He is the third player from the 2019 roster to sign with the Mets.

"It goes without saying that Mr. Bussing's commitment has allowed me to acquire and retain the best coaching staff in all of minor league baseball," McCauley said. "All three assistants – Boots (Day), Bobby (Segal), and now Max (Peterson) - have won the prestigious Darren Bush Frontier League Coach of the Year award, and all three were well deserved."

McCauley also said having the history and proven ability of his coaching staff to get players signed into affiliated baseball helps recruit new players to Evansville.

The Otters have sent 81 players to affiliated organizations out of Evansville.

BILL BUSSING'S ALL-OTTERS TEAM



OttersTV and Zane Clodfelter caught up with Bill Bussing from the Evansville Otters ownership group to unveil Bussing's All-Otters Team.

Bussing's All-Otters Team selections consisted of Otters' players from 2001, when his family took ownership of the Otters franchise, to the present. Selections were made position-by-position.

Starting in the outfield, Bussing made the following selections:

- Jeff Gardner (2016-18), in right field, batted .266 with 38 home runs, 170 RBIs, and recorded a .823 OPS in his Otters' career. 23 of Gardner's 38 home runs came in 2017, which tied the franchise's single-season record.
- Chris Sweeney (2014-17), in centerfield, had a .256 batting average with an Otters' career record of 51 home runs. He also accumulated 158 RBIs and an .800 OPS with the Otters.
- John Schultz (2013-17), in left field, has a career batting average of .294 with the Otters and a career record of 207 RBIs. Schultz has posted an .839 OPS with 42 home runs with the Otters. Schultz is also the franchise's all-time hits leader with 458.

All three outfielders were starters during the 2016 Frontier League Championship Series, where the Otters earned the second league championship in franchise history.

Bussing selected Nik Balog (2014-16) as the first baseman on his All-Otters Team. Balog batted .278 with 20 home runs and 124 RBIs, while earning a .723 OPS in his time with the Otters. Balog was also a fine defensive first baseman.

Bussing made the following selections as his double play combo in the middle infield:

- Josh Allen (2014-17), at second base, finished his Otters' career with a .306 batting average, 38 home runs, 171 RBIs, and a .905 OPS. Allen was the Frontier League's Most Valuable Player in 2016 when the Otters' won a league championship. Allen also had several walk-off, game-winning hits in his career with the Otters.
- Brian McKenna (2004-06), at shortstop, had a .265 batting average, 15 home runs, 92 RBIs, and a .710 OPS in his Otters' career. McKenna was a member of the Otters' 2006 Frontier League

championship team, the first in franchise history.

The third base position was a tough selection for Bussing, as the Otters have had two league MVPs at that position in Shayne Houck and Ryan Long.

Bussing selected Houck (2014-15) as the third baseman on his All-Otters Team. Houck finished with a batting average above .300 at .303 in his Otters' career, while also racking up 32 home runs, 103 RBIs, and a .917 OPS during his time in Evansville. Houck also led Evansville in 2014 back to the postseason for the first time since 2006.

At catcher, Bussing selected Princeton and Gibson County native Jeff Goldbach (2005-06). Goldbach recorded a .319 batting average, 36 home runs, 133 RBIs, and a .952 OPS in his career with the Otters. Goldbach led Evansville to the 2006 league championship with his performance that season.

After much consideration, Bussing selected Tyler Vail (2015-16, 2018-present) as the starting pitcher on his All-Otters Team. Vail has made 60 starts so far in his Otters' career, earning 23 wins in 364.1 innings pitched with 331 strikeouts. All four statistical totals are career records in the Otters' record books. Vail is coming off his best year in an Evansville uniform in 2019.

The former Otters' closer Eric Massingham (2011-14) was Bussing's selection as a relief pitcher. Massingham is the Frontier League's and Otters' all-time saves leader with 70 saves. He posted a 1.78 ERA with 137 strikeouts in 106 appearances in his years with Evansville.

With a designated hitter position in the Frontier League, Bussing selected Greg Alexander (2009-11) as the DH on his All-Otters Team. Alexander batted .274 with 24 home runs, 148 RBIs, and a .768 OPS in his career with the Otters. Alexander was known for his professionalism during losing seasons with the Otters and his ability to hit in the clutch. Alexander was a member of the 2011 club when current field manager Andy McCauley was in his first full year guiding the franchise.

2020 SEASON RECAP

FRONTIER LEAGUE CANCELS 2020 CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON DUE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC

In a year unlike any other, 2020 forced the Frontier League to act in a way it had never done before in the League's 28 seasons. After holding out hope and postponement, the Frontier League canceled the 2020 championship season due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

The Frontier League was heading into the 2020 season with a lot momentum following a merger with the former independent Can-Am League during the offseason to expand Frontier League's team membership to 14 organizations. The new geographical map of the League stretched from the Mississippi River in Illinois to the Atlantic Ocean near New York and New Jersey and running from the Ohio River along Indiana and Kentucky to the St. Lawrence Seaway in Canada.

The Frontier League's expansion allowed for new opportunities across the different markets and new competition, while making the Frontier League the largest and longest running of the modern independent professional baseball leagues in North America.

However, on March 11, the sports world started its shutdown as the uncertainty surrounding the unprecedented pandemic took over. The NBA season, MLB Spring Training, NHL season, college athletics, and more came to a halt. Even though the hope at the time was to resume sports and start the Frontier League season on time in May, that was not the case.


The entire webs and flows of society also stopped due to shutdowns as well as self-quarantining and isolation. The government at all levels and health departments issued guidelines and mandates to follow to reduce the impact of the Coronavirus and slow its spread. Sanitation, social distancing, and wearing masks became the norm in 2020, but the risks involved were too great to conduct a Frontier League season.

League officials and owners reviewed numerous alternatives to play in 2020, but in the long run, unresolved regulatory and health issues made playing unfeasible. The seven states where franchises are located (and the country of Canada) chose vastly different ways of handling the pandemic, and that dilemma impacted the league's ability to play as a single unit. The health of the players, fans, employees, vendors, and others upon whom the League relies on to create an entertaining season is always of the utmost importance, and the risk for crowds was a primary factor.

The Evansville Otters were also excited about the organization's momentum heading into a 2020 season, as historic Bosse Field underwent major renovations and upgrades during the offseason. The 105-year-old ballpark received a new brick wall backstop and along the first base line, new LED field lights to brighten the playing area, a larger LED video-board to replace the scoreboard and smaller videoboard, a new heating and air system across the interior rooms of the ballpark, improved LED lighting and ceiling fans in the grandstand, LED lighting along the outer concourse, an extended protective netting for safety further down the first and third base lines, and had some touch-up work done to the outer brick facade. All of those upgrades followed up a newly installed sound system the year before. The improvements allow the Otters to host a variety of events at Bosse Field, besides baseball, for people to enjoy themselves with the unique backdrop of Bosse Field.

On the field, there was a lot of excitement and anticipation for the

Evansville Otters' 2020, as the franchise was coming off its fourth consecutive postseason appearance in 2019.



Many players from the 2019 roster had signed to come back to the Otters in 2020, including the Otters' all-time strikeouts and wins leader on the mound Tyler Vail. Also re-signing for 2020 was Tyler Beardsley, Drew Beyer, Anthony Arias, Abraham Almonte, Trace Norkus, and Brandon Wilkes from the pitching staff. Tanner Cable, an Otters' pitcher in 2018, was also signed to the team for 2020. In the field, the Otters signed outfielders Elijah MacNamee and Keith Grieshaber to re-join the club, while also having infielders David Cronin, Tanner Wetrich, and Jacob Adams slated to come back in 2020. Catcher Dakota Phillips had also signed to return in 2020.

The biggest player news from the offseason heading into 2020 was the news of outfielder John Schultz announcing he was coming out of retirement to re-join the Otters, as the Frontier League had changed its rules and increased the playing age of some roster players. Schultz is a three-time Frontier League All-Star, led the Otters to the 2016 league championship, and had his number four jersey retired at the end of 2017. Schultz holds career franchise records in games played (420), RBIs (207), at-bats (1,560), hits (458), runs (280), doubles (90), total bases (710), and walks (219).

With the Frontier League's 2020 season canceled, some Otters found other opportunities to compete in 2020. Dakota Phillips played in Sugar Land, Texas, former Otters like Josh Allen and Ryan Long played in the American Association, and former Otters' closer Taylor Wright continued his stint with the Somerset Patriots of the Atlantic League. Many other former Otters and some of the new 2020 Otters' signees found playing opportunities elsewhere.

Even though the 2020 Frontier League championship season was canceled, a lot of excitement went into a hopeful 2021 season, including the granted membership to Ottawa as the 15th team in the League and the announced partnership between the League and MLB. Following the disappointment in 2020, the Otters looked forward to 2021 with a lot of plans for the enjoyment of the fans.


