History of the Slammers

- > December 9, 2010: Steel City Baseball LLC officially purchases certain and specific assets of the previous professional baseball team that played in Silver Cross Field. The new team's General Manager John Dittrich announces that they will be taking ideas from the public for the new team's yet to be determined name.
- > December 13, 2010: It's announced that the new team will compete in the Frontier League and will open their season on May 19, 2011.
- > January 12, 2011: The organization announces that the new team's name is the "Slammers."
- > January 24, 2011: Bart Zeller is named the first manager in Slammers' history.
- > February 10, 2011: The Slammers sign their first player: outfielder Josh Flores.
- > February 16, 2011: Former Cub Carmen Pignatiello is named the Slammers' first pitching coach.
- February 21, 2011: The Slammers announce they will unveil their logo at "The Grand Slammer: Identity Released" on March 10 at the Rialto Square Theatre. As the days go on, the Slammers reveal a plethora of special guests who will be on hand at the event.
- > February 28, 2011: Former professional baseball player and Northwestern alum. Dan Grunhard is named the Slammers' first hitting coach.
- > March 2, 2011: The Slammers announce that "The Grand Slammer" is sold out.
- > March 4, 2011: Chicago radio personality Chet Coppock is selected as the emcee for the Grand Slammer.
- March 8, 2011: It's a big day for "The Grand Slammer" as the team announces that both Jim Cornelison and American Idol's Chris Medina will perform.
- March 10, 2011: The Grand Slammer is a big hit as a sold out Rialto Square Theatre witnesses the team team's logo and uniform unveiling as part of a show for the ages. Many baseball legends including Maury Wills, "Sudden" Sam McDowell, Bill Madlock and others are on hand and sign autographs for fans at the red carpet event.
- > March 17, 2011: Slammers sign former major leaguer Billy Petrick to the squad.
- > March 26, 2011: A jobs fair is held at Silver Cross Field to find day of game staff for the Slammers' inaugural season.
- > April 4, 2011: Mark Vasko named the first "voice of the Slammers" as the organization announces they will be airing every game on 1340 WJOL. Slammers' President Bill Waliewski announced as Vasko's number two man in the booth. Media Relations Coordinator Aaron Morse will serve as pre and post-game host and fill-in playby-play announcer.

- > April 9, 2011: Open tryouts are held at Silver Cross Field for aspiring PA announcers, national anthem singers, and mascots.
- > April 14, 2011: Slammers announce that Maury Wills will serve as a special instructor in training camp.
- > April 17, 2011: An egg-citing day is highlighted by the Slammers' Easter egg hunt at Silver Cross Field and participation in the city's Easter parade.
- > April 26, 2011: Slammers release their Exhibition Schedule, which features five games before Opening Night.
- > April 27, 2011: The team's first TV commercial is unveiled. The commercial begins with a black and white shot of a prison. As the image shakes, it cuts to a shadowy figure walking through the prison. Atmospheric music plays underneath as the stick he's holding clangs against the prison bars. At the end the music gets louder as the camera tilts up to reveal the "prison guard" is actually a Slammers baseball player in full uniform pounding a bat into his hand as he stares at the camera. It ends with a full screen telling fans about Opening Weekend, which runs May 19-21.
- > April 29, 2011: Zach Rodeghero, one of the first players signed by the Slammers, announces his retirement to take an IT job in the "real world."
- > April 30, 2011: Slammers hold open tryouts at Silver Cross Field. Joliet native Trevor Vermillion earns an invite to Spring Training.
- > May 2, 2011: ATI is announced as the Slammers' presenting sponsor.
- > May 3, 2011: Slammers release their promotional schedule on the eve of individual tickets going on sale.
- May 4, 2011: At 12:01 a.m., individual tickets go on sale at www.jolietslammers.com. The Box Office opens at 10:00 a.m.
- > May 5, 2011: The Slammers open their Spring Training at Silver Cross Field.

Team president Bill Waliewski comes to the Slammers following a 23 year career in commercial real estate. His commercial real estate experience was spread over many disciplines of the business including brokerage, asset management and property management. Most recently, he was Senior

Vice President of Morgan Realty Partners, a

position he held for the last 9 years of his $12 \frac{1}{2}$ year tenure with the company. In this capacity, he was responsible for a portfolio of over 175 tenants totaling over 2 million square feet.

Bill is a graduate of Hinsdale Central High School and Texas Lutheran. In 1983, he was recognized by the Chicago Sun-Times as one of the Top 100 high school prospects in the Chicago area. Following his college baseball career, Bill played 10 years for Al Oremus's nationally recognized Prairie Gravel amateur semi-pro team, which won a AABC World Series championship in 1996 (after two second place finishes in 1993 and 1995). In 1997, his last season with Prairie, the team finished third in the National Baseball Congress World Series.

John Dittrich enters his 38th year in professional baseball. His experience ranges all levels of baseball, including three years in the office of the President of the minor leagues and four years in the front office of a major league ballclub (Texas Rangers). He has also spent 15 years as a

leader in the development and launch of highly

successful venues and independent professional baseball franchises around the country (Fargo, Schaumburg, Rockford & Fort Worth). John currently resides in Lombard with his wife of 41 years, Lois. Together they have three children – Rob, Jennifer, and James.



Ron Biga

Ron is an "inner city" product of Chicago's Pilsen neighborhood where he was born and raised. He has resided in Joliet for 10 years. Paul's resume also includes time as a Project Manager for Chicago based Safety Service Systems, Inc., providing event operational planning and support services for client events such as Harley Davidson's 105th Anniversary Celebration, EA Sports Maui Invitational Basketball Tournament and the Obama for America Election Night Rally. Paul received his Business Management degree from Northern Illinois University in 1978 and a Master's Degree in Sports Management from The Ohio State University in 1981. History of Silver Cross Field



Since it first opened in 2002, Silver Cross Field has been a key component of Joliet's downtown. With a total capacity of over 7,000, this state of the art stadium provides fans and sponsors with the most bang for their buck in independent baseball. 2011 marks the 10-year anniversary of the stadium. Silver Cross Field is an intimate facility where fans can sit back and relax. Among other amenities, Silver Cross Field boasts 14 luxury suites, space for private parties, a LED video board, the Miller Lite Party Deck, the Joliet Area Sports Hall of Fame, three sizeable picnic areas, and a fun playground for children.

When the Slammers aren't playing, Silver Cross Field is available for concerts and other events. The facility is also home to the University of St. Francis baseball team, the IHSA Class 1A, 2A, 3A and 4A State Baseball Tournaments, the prestigious WJOL High School Baseball Tournament, and the Miracle League of Joliet. Plans call for the installation of artificial turf in the fall of 2011. This will make Silver Cross Field a more versatile facility as it will be able to host a variety of sporting and special events no matter the weather.

Over the years, Silver Cross Field has been the site of two nationally televised commercials, with the latest featuring former Chicago Cubs Manager, Lou Piniella. The stadium is celebrating its 10th anniversary this year and was once named the #2 ballpark in independent, professional baseball, by Baseball America. Ballplayers come and go, but Silver Cross Field is, and will continue to be, Joliet's superstar.

The Coaching Staff



Bart Zeller

Slammers field manager Bart Zeller is a native of Chicago Heights, IL and attended Rich Township High School. He was a 3sport standout at Rich, making All Conference in football and baseball.

After attending the University of Arizona for his freshman year, playing both basketball and

baseball, Zeller transferred to Eastern Illinois University to play football and baseball, earning All-Conference status in both sports. At EIU, he was name NAIA All-American (3rd team) in baseball and signed with the St. Louis Cardinals following graduation. He holds both a B.S. and M.S. in Education from Eastern Illinois.

He played at all levels of professional baseball in the Cardinals' system, making the major league roster in 1970. Zeller spent the 1970 season with the Major League Club as both a player and a coach. After signing with the Milwaukee Brewers in 1971, he was traded to the New York Yankees and retired as an active player after the 1971 season. In addition to being the everyday catcher, Bart also filled the role of player coach for Cardinal farm clubs in Lewiston, ID (class A) and Little Rock, AR (class AA).

Zeller was the bench and hitting coach in Sioux Falls of the Northern League (2005) and American Association (2006). He then moved to Southern Illinois in the Frontier League, as their hitting coach and bench coach. He served as pitching coach in 2010. In 2009, his hitters led the FL with a .284 average and in 2007 the team's .282 mark was second in the league. In 2010, Zeller's pitching staff posted a league-best 3.50 ERA as the Miners posted the best won-lost record in the FL.

Bart and Barbara Zeller currently reside in Scottsdale, AZ. They have four children, Kathryn, Karen, Bart and Mike and five grandchildren.

Carmen Pignatiello

Carmen Pignatiello, or "Piggy" as many fans know him, has a story that mirrors that of the men he will be instructing. He spent seven years in the minor league system before making the Chicago Cubs' roster in 2007. In his debut appearance with the Cubs, the lefthander threw a scoreless 9th inning against the Cincinnati Reds and continued with the team through their 2007 playoff run. He is confident his own journey can help him inspire and shape the young talent of the Joliet Slammers.

In addition to being able to relate to the players, Pignatiello is also familiar with the Joliet area. He is a graduate of Providence Catholic High School and has lived in Mokena and Frankfort. He and his wife and son currently reside in Aurora.



Dan Grunhard

South Side native Dan Grunhard will serve as the Slammers' first hitting coach. The St. Laurence High School graduate brings his seven years of minor league experience to Silver Cross Field in 2011.

Grunhard, who was Joe Girardi's roommate at Northwestern University, was named All Big Ten in 1985 and Academic All

Big Ten in 1984 and 1985. He set the university's second highest career batting average. He also had the second highest single season average in school history at .451. After being drafted by the California Angels in 1985, Grunhard played seven seasons with the Angels and Oakland A's, spending three full seasons in Triple-A.

"Dan is a great addition to the staff," Slammers Manager Bart Zeller said. "He rounds out our coaching staff with his extensive experience in affiliated baseball."

Dan has been married to Tonnie Grunhard for 15 years and has two daughters, Savannah, 14, and Scarlett, 12. He resides in Covington, Georgia.



Corey O'Brien, Trainer

Serving as the athletic trainer for the Slammers this season is Corey O'Brien. Raised just south of Saint Paul, Minnesota, Corey graduated from Eagan High School. He received his BS in Athletic Training from the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. Corey then

went on to earn his Master's Degree in Education in Health, Physical Education, and Recreation at Delta State University in Cleveland, Mississippi. Corey has been a certified athletic trainer since 2010. His other experience includes serving as an intern athletic trainer for the Rochester Honkers of the Northwoods League in 2008. Corey also served as an intern athletic trainer for the Minnesota Twins in 2009. While at Delta State University, he served as the athletic trainer for the Statesmen D-II baseball team from 2009 to 2011. Coury spent the 2009 season in the Atlanta Braves' minor-league system after being signed as a non-drafted free agent. Previously, he had played collegiate baseball at Northwestern Oklahoma State University, Massasoit Community College and UMass. He missed two seasons due to injuries. But he battled his way back to emerge as a star, first at Massasoit CC, then at Northwestern Oklahoma, where he played well enough to sign a professional contract in affiliated ball.

In 2009 at Northwestern Oklahoma, he hit .428 with 63 RBI, an .855 slugging percentage, and 18 home runs, fourth-highest all-time in a single season at the school. The 24-year-old went to Durfee High School in Fall River, where he was named a Big Three Conference all-star his senior season.

Deain re-wrote the Northern Illinois record books during his time with the Huskies. A graduate of Prairie Ridge High School, Deain made 128 appearances during his time in DeKalb. That was the most appearances in the

history of the Mid-American Conference. He finished with 23 career saves, good for second in program history and eighth all-time in the MAC. During his senior season Deain saved 12 games, 11th most in the country. His 17 career wins ranks fourth in the history of the Huskies. Meanwhile, Deain's 156 career K's are ninth most ever at NIU. His stellar collegiate stats were rewarded when he signed a professional contract with the Baltimore Orioles. He spent 2010 in the O's organization, compiling an impressive 3.29 ERA in 38 1/3rd innings for three different teams within the system.



Despite not getting on the hill until conference play started, he set a school freshman record for saves with 11. Jarvis struck out 22 batters and walked eight in 30 innings. Jarvis' sophomore year was off to a great start when he decided to go pitch for the Lincoln Saltdogs of the American Association. After not starting a game in college, he made seven starts with the Saltdogs. Overall, Jarvis made 23 appearances, netting a 2.98 ERA in 60 innings. Jarvis was drafted that June by the Giants in the 23rd round. He split time between rookie ball and low-A that year before spending all of 2009 with the AZL Giants. Last season was a good one for Jarvis as he posted a 3.07 ERA for the Augusta Greenjackets of the South Atlantic League.

History of the Frontier League



The Joliet Slammers may be a brand new organization, but they are joining the longest continuously operating independent baseball league in the country. Beginning in 1993, the Frontier League has been the launching pad for a number of future major league baseball players. Fans will see a young, exciting brand of baseball thanks to the league's unique age limit. All players (with one exception) must be under the age of 28 and at least 11 players on each roster must have either one or no years of professional experience. One player on each team may be given "veteran" status if they are 28 or 29 years old but have been on a Frontier League roster for at least 100 games over the previous two seasons.

"Because of the age limit, the players are more willing to take instruction and they play harder as a whole," Slammers VP of Baseball Operations Ron Biga said. "They all believe they have a chance of being picked up by affiliated baseball and it shines through in the way they approach the game."

The league's stability is another big factor in the respect it holds throughout the country. Bill Lee has been the commissioner since 1994, the league's second year of existence.

"I truly believe the league's longevity and successes it has had is due to the hard work, sacrifice and love that many owners, players, staffs and fans have put into it over the last 18 seasons," Lee said. "For any league to be successful, everyone involved has to place the importance of the league equally with the importance of their team. We are fortunate to have had that."

In 2011 the league features six teams from Illinois and one each from Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky, Missouri, Pennsylvania, and Indiana. The Slammers will compete for the East Division title. The defending Frontier League champion is the River City Rascals who defeated the Traverse City Beach Bums in the 2010 Frontier League Championship series.
