

History of the Slammers: Origins to the Championship

- > December 9, 2010: Steel City Baseball LLC officially purchases certain and specific assets of the previous professional baseball team that played in Silver Cross Field. The new team's General Manager John Dittrich announces they will be taking ideas from the public for the new team's yet to be determined name.
- > **December 13, 2010**: It's announced that the new team will compete in the Frontier League and will open their season on May 19, 2011.
- > January 12, 2011: The organization announces that the new team's name is the "Slammers."
- > January 24, 2011: Bart Zeller is named the first manager in Slammers' history.
- February 10, 2011: The Slammers sign their first player: outfielder Josh Flores.
- > **February 16, 2011:** Former Cub Carmen Pignatiello is named the Slammers' first pitching coach.
- > February 21, 2011: The Slammers announce they will unveil their logo at "The Grand Slammer: Identity Released" on March 10 at the Rialto Square Theatre. As the days go on, the Slammers reveal a plethora of special guests who will be on hand at the event.
- > March 10, 2011: The Grand Slammer is a big hit as a sold out Rialto Square Theatre witnesses the team team's logo and uniform unveiling as part of a show for the ages. Many baseball legends including Maury Wills, "Sudden" Sam McDowell, Bill Madlock and others are on hand and sign autographs for fans at the red carpet event.
- > May 19, 2011: OPENING NIGHT! Slammers win 7-0 as former Chicago Cubs pitcher Billy Petrick goes eight strong innings, retiring the last 19 batters he faces. Devin Shepherd records the first hit in Slammers' history and scores the first run as well.
- > June 21, 2011: Reliever Aaron Dott's contract is purchased by the New York Yankees
- > July 4, 2011: Four Slammers get named to the 2011 Frontier League All-Star Game. Erik Lis and Josh Flores are named starters while Ryan Quigley and Bobby Leeper make the team as well.
- > July 13, 2011: Erik Lis earns Frontier League All-Star Game MVP honors as he went 2-3 with a run scored, a triple, and two RBI in the East's 4-2 victory over the West.
- > July 27, 2011: Andrew Moss throws the first no-hitter in team history as the Slammers defeat the Lake Erie Crushers by a final score of 10-1 in Avon, Ohio. It was the second no-hitter thrown in Ohio that day as Ervin Santana tossed one for the Angels against the Indians.

- > August 19, 2011: Ballpark Digest names the Slammers' logo the 2011 Logo of the Year in professional baseball.
- August 28, 2011: The Slammers defeat the Washington Wild Things by a score of 4-2 to clinch a spot in the Frontier League playoffs.
- > August 31, 2011: The Slammers clinch the Frontier League East Division title.
- > **September 7, 2011:** Joliet wins their first playoff game in franchise history by a final score of 5-2 over the Lake Erie Crushers.
- > September 10, 2011: The Slammers finish their three-game sweep of the Crushers to advance to the Frontier League Championship series.
- September 17, 2011: Brandon Peters hits the first walk-off home run in franchise history as the Slammers stun the Rascals by a final score of 4-3 in game three of the Frontier League Championship Series.
- September 18, 2011: Joliet wins game four by a final score of 6-5 to clinch the Frontier League title over the River City Rascals. Brad Netzel is named Championship Series MVP.






History of Silver Cross Field



Since it first opened in 2002, Silver Cross Field has been a key component of Joliet's downtown. With a total capacity of over 6,000, this state of the art stadium provides fans and sponsors with the most bang for their buck in independent baseball. Silver Cross Field is an intimate facility where fans can sit back and relax. Among other amenities, Silver Cross Field boasts 14 luxury suites, space for private parties, a LED video board, the Miller Lite Party Deck, the Joliet Area Sports Hall of Fame, three sizeable picnic areas and a fun playground for children. When the Slammers aren't playing, Silver Cross Field is available for concerts and other events. The facility is also home to the University of St. Francis baseball team, the IHSA Class 1A, 2A, 3A and 4A State Baseball Tournaments, the prestigious WJOL High School Baseball Tournament and the Miracle League of Joliet. Over the years, Silver Cross Field has been the site of two nationally televised commercials, with the latest featuring former Chicago Cubs Manager, Lou Piniella. The stadium celebrated its 10th anniversary last season and was once named the #2 ballpark in independent professional baseball by Baseball America. Ballplayers come and go, but Silver Cross Field is, and will continue to be, Joliet's superstar.

Slammers defeat Rascals three games to one



BIG FIRST INNING CARRIES RASCALS TO GAME ONE VICTORY

River City scores six runs in the first off Renshaw

(O'Fallon, MO) – Jake Renshaw did not have a start all year that lasted fewer than five innings.

The first game of the Frontier League Championship Series changed all that as he only lasted one frame in an 8-5 loss to the River City Rascals Thursday night.

Renshaw retired the first batter he faced but proceeded to walk the next two hitters. A ground-out from Frontier League MVP Stephen Holdren made it so Renshaw was one out away from getting out of the jam. He fell behind Jason Patton 3-0 and elected to put him on to load the bases. That brought Joash Brodin to the plate. Renshaw got two strikes on Brodin and threw a pitch low and out of the zone. Brodin was able to loop it to shallow right-center for a two-RBI single and the flood gates opened. Jareck West was hit by a pitch and Bobby Burk cleared the bases with a devastating full-count double to left-center as River City went up 5-0. A Mat Serna RBI single completed the scoring for the inning.

The first inning was it for Renshaw as the Slammers brought in Brian Fowler in the second.

Joliet tried to rally against River City starter Zack Sterner in the fourth. Brad Netzel singled and Hector Pellot doubled to start the frame. One out later Kyle Maunus smacked a sacrifice fly to make the score 6-1.

But River City responded right away in the bottom of the fourth against Fowler. Matt Serna hit a grounder back to the mound that Fowler was

able to knock down. But his underhand flip to first was high and Serna was safe on the error. He would steal second and come around to score on a Danny Sawyer RBI single.

With two outs in the fifth the Slammers climbed back to within four as Ben Hewett was hit by a pitch and Josh Flores drove one over the right-center field fence to make the score 7-3.

The Rascals scored another run off Fowler in the bottom half of the frame. Holdren singled and one out later Brodin singled as well. Then with two away Burk drove in his fourth run of the night with a single to center as the Rascals went up 8-3.

Joliet nearly came back in dramatic fashion in the ninth. Pellot singled to start the frame and one out later Kyle Maunus was hit a by a pitch. Then Kris Kasarjian hit a line shot to left that was dropped by Joash Brodin. That was the final pitch of the night for Sterner who threw 118 on the night. Brandon Cunniff entered the game and struck out Sean Estand but the ball got away and another run scored to bring the score to 8-5. Cunniff would strike out Brandon Peters and pinch hitter Trey Manz to end the game.

SLAMMERS EVEN CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES IN TRADITIONAL FASHION

Joliet falls behind early, comes back using the long ball, and bullpen closes the door

(O'Fallon, MO) — Normalcy returned to Joliet Slammers baseball Friday night in game two of the best-of-five Frontier League Championship Series.

Joliet fell behind 1-0 but back-to-back home runs from Brad Netzel and Hector Pellot combined with outstanding pitching gave the Slammers a 3-1 victory to even the series at one game apiece.

River City grabbed the lead off Tommy Mendoza in the second inning. With one out Joash Brodin smacked a double. Then with two away Bobby Burk hit a sharp grounder to third that deflected off Estand right to Brad Netzel. Brodin tried to score on the play. Netzel made a good throw home but the ball deflected off Trey Manz's glove and Brodin scored to put River City up 1-0. Burk advanced to second on the play and Mendoza promptly picked him off to end the inning.

The former Angels farmhand settled down after that as he went five innings, scattering five hits, giving up the lone run, walking one and striking out two as he picked up his second win of the playoffs.

It was Joliet's power that helped give him that victory. Frontier League Starting Pitcher of the Year Josh Lowey was cruising until the fourth inning. That's when Netzel crushed a pitch over the left-center field wall and Pellot followed with an even more mammoth shot to put Joliet up 2-1.

They didn't look back as Chuck Lukanen, Billy Petrick, Brian Smith,

and Ryan Quigley combined to throw four scoreless innings out of the bullpen.

The Slammers got some insurance in the seventh. Reid Chenworth got things started with a sharp single to right. Sean Estand executed a perfect hit-and-run and the Slammers had runners at the corners with nobody out. Trey Manz hit a slow chopper to first that Logan Parker could not quite handle and everyone was safe. Manz was credited with a RBI single as Joliet went up 3-1. The inning was slowed down by a spectacular diving catch by Lowey on a Brandon Peters bunt attempt. Manz was doubled off at first on the play and the Slammers did not score another run.

However the two-run lead was more than enough for the bullpen as River City managed only one hit, against the Slammers' quartet of relievers.

Quigley picked up his fourth postseason save as Joliet pulled off the split at T.R. Hughes Ballpark.

PETERS PROPELS SLAMMERS TO THE BRINK OF A CHAMPIONSHIP

Joliet rallies to win in dramatic fashion over River City

(Joliet, IL) — Brandon Peters entered Saturday's Frontier League Championship Series game as a defensive replacement.

He ended the game as the hero.

Peters hit a walk-off home run on the first pitch he saw in his first at bat of the game as the Joliet Slammers stunned the River City Rascals by a final score of 4-3 to take a two games to one Frontier League Championship Series lead.

"It was definitely the biggest hit of my career," Peters said shortly after celebrating at home plate with his teammates.

With the win, the Slammers are one victory away from winning the Frontier Cup in their first season of existence.

For the third straight game in the series, River City took the early lead. Starter Jeremy Tietze walked Chris McClendon to start the game. He stole second and advanced to third when Trey Manz's throw went into center. One out later Logan Parker delivered a sacrifice fly and it was 1-0 River City.

The Slammers took advantage of a lead-off base-on-balls of their own in the third. Manz drew the free pass and stole second. With two outs, Hector Pellot drew a walk and Erik Lis singled in Manz to tie the game.

Manz got things going again for Joliet in the fifth as he singled to start the frame. One out later Brad Netzel bunted him to second. Pellot came through with a single and Manz scored to give Joliet a 2-1 lead.

Tietze retired eight in a row from the third inning through the fifth. But McClendon singled to start the sixth. One out later the Slammers brought in Chuck Lukanen to face the lefty heavy middle of the order. Logan Parker and Stephen Holdren both drew walks to load the bases. Lukanen got Jason Patton to hit into a fielder's choice but McClendon scored to tie the game. Chris Pack entered the game and struck out Joash Brodin to end the inning.

But Pack's control left him in the seventh. He walked Jareck West to start the inning. West stole second and two outs later the Slammers intentionally walked McClendon. Pinch hitter Eric Williams drew a walk to load the bases and Logan Parker picked up his second RBI of the night with a bases loaded walk. Billy Petrick entered for Pack and got Holdren to ground out to finally end the inning.

The Slammers responded in dramatic fashion in the eighth. With one away Brad Netzel singled and advanced to second on a passed ball. Then with two down, Erik Lis worked the count full against reliever Zach Robertson. He hit a seeing-eye single up the middle to score Netzel and tie the game at three.

Brian Smith tossed a scoreless top of the ninth and Peters got a first pitch fastball from River City closer Derrick Miramontes. He knew exactly what to do with it as he pulled it deep into the night sky for the dramatic conclusion.

SLAMMERS BRING A FRONTIER LEAGUE TITLE TO THE CITY OF CHAMPIONS

(Joliet, IL) – The clinching game of the Frontier League Championship Series seemed like it never wanted to end.

Joliet and River City sat through a rain delay to start the game and a rain delay that lasted over two hours after the third inning.

In the end it was the Joliet Slammers who emerged as the 2011 Frontier League champions as they knocked off the River City Rascals by a final score of 6-5 Sunday night. Brad Netzel was named series MVP as he hit .300 in the series and drove in three of the biggest runs, including two Sunday night.

For the fourth straight game in the best-of-five series, River City struck first. "Captain" Jake Renshaw endured the lengthy rain delay after the third inning and pitched a scoreless fourth as well.

But the Rascals put a three spot on the board in the fifth. Danny Sawyer was hit by a pitch to start the frame. A wild pitch moved him to second and one out later Doug Sanders singled him to third. With two down, Chris McClendon doubled in both runners to put River City up 2-0. Logan Parker doubled in McClendon to make the score 3-0.

Just like they'd done all year, the comeback kids struck back immediately. In the bottom of the fifth Sean Estand and Trey Manz hit back-to-back singles. After failing to bunt the runners over, David Fox shrugged it off and singled in Estand to make the score 3-1. Josh Flores bunted his way to first and Netzel delivered a clutch two-RBI single against reliever Dustin Umberger to tie the game.

The Rascals chased Renshaw from the game in the sixth as Joash Brodin singled and Jareck West tripled him home. Renshaw finished the game going five plus innings, giving up four runs on eight hits and striking out three. Billy Petrick entered the game and got three huge outs to leave West stranded at third.

Trailing by one entering the seventh, the Slammers worked their magic again. With one out, Josh Flores bunted his way to first again. Then with two away Hector Pellot kept the inning alive with a single of his own. The Rascals brought Zach Robertson into the game and he was greeted by an Erik Lis double that tied the game. It would have given the Slammers the lead but Pellot slipped rounding third. It didn't matter though as Pellot scored on a wild pitch to give Joliet the lead. Kyle Maunus singled in Lis for a big insurance run. Maunus was thrown out at second on the play but the damage was done.

History/Info of the Frontier League



The Joliet Slammers are members of the longest continuously operating independent baseball league in the country. Beginning in 1993, the Frontier League has been the launching pad for a number of future major league baseball players. Fans will see a young, exciting brand of baseball thanks to the league's unique age limit. All players (with one exception) must be under the age of 28 and at least 11 players on each roster must have either one or no years of professional experience. One player on each team may be given "veteran" status if they are 28 or 29 years old but have been on a Frontier League roster for at least 100 games over the previous two seasons.

"Because of the age limit, the players are more willing to take instruction and they play harder as a whole," Slammers VP of Baseball Operations Ron Biga said. "They all believe they have a chance of being picked up by affiliated baseball and it shines through in the way they approach the game."

The league's stability is another big factor in the respect it holds throughout the country. Bill Lee has been the commissioner since 1994, the league's second year of existence.

"I truly believe the league's longevity and successes it has had is due to the hard work, sacrifice and love that many owners, players, staffs and fans have put into it over the last 19 seasons," Lee said. "For any league to be successful, everyone involved has to place the importance of the league equally with the importance of their team. We are fortunate to have had that."

In 2012 the league features seven teams from Illinois and one each from Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky, Missouri, Pennsylvania, Indiana and Canada. The Slammers will compete for the West Division title this season after winning the East Division title in 2011. Joliet is also the defending league champion as they defeated the River City Rascals in the 2011 Frontier League Championship series.

"Players like Ryan who work hard, are good citizens and put up good numbers deserve the chance in affiliated baseball," Slammers manager Bart Zeller said. "He was a leader on our pitching staff and we are very proud of this accomplishment."

Quigley, 27, was named the Slammers' closer right away in 2011 and he took full advantage of the opportunity as he saved a league record 28 games in the regular season and five more in the playoffs. 

For local traffic from the east, take Riverside west to Interstate Blvd.

From the North: Take I-90/I-39 Northwest Tollway east/south to the Riverside interchange. Turn left at the off-ramp. Continue east about 1/2 mile and turn left at Interstate Blvd. Continue approximately 1/2 mile north to stadium parking lot at end of street.

Skipping the Tollway: If you are coming from the Chicago suburbs, you may take US-20 into Rockford or exit the Jane Adams Tollway at the Belvidere interchange, located immediately before a \$1.60 toll. Take a right at the exit (Belvidere-Genoa Rd.) and continue north as the road becomes Business Route 20. Continue on BR-20 approximately eight miles, through the outskirts of Belvidere, to Shaw Road and take a right. Continue north on Shaw approximately three miles until road ends at Riverside. Turn left at Riverside and continue west two miles. Turn right at Riverside Blvd.
