Last time out...

Sunday was not Matt Dillon's day. The Slammers' rookie starter did not escape the first inning as the right-hander was eventually charged for seven runs on four hits with three walks in a Southern Illinois 11-2 victory on Sunday at Silver Cross Field. The Slammers with the loss fall to 24-30 and the Miners improve to 30-24, however Joliet still won the series two games to one. Jonathan Gonzalez relieved Dillon in the first and he would allow the eighth run to touch home in the inning. Gonzalez lasted three and two third innings, allowing four runs on two hits with a couple of walks. One bright spot for Joliet was the All-Star Marquis Riley who went three for four on the day with one run scored. Chris DeBoo out of the bullpen also tossed a couple of good innings of relief despite allowing two runs in four innings on five hits.

News and Notes...

For Starters...

Corey Kimes is coming off a no-decision against the Rockford Aviators on July 13 as he went five and a third innings and gave up four runs (three earned) on seven hits. The Slammers eventually fell 7-6 in the contest. The 23-year old Kimes, a former star for the University of Illinois Fighting Illini, brings an undefeated record in affiliated ball to Joliet. The Ottawa, IL native went 5-0 in 2012 between the Elizabethton Twins of the Appalachian League and the Beloit Snappers of the Midwest League. In two seasons of affiliated baseball, Kimes has posted an impressive 3.25 ERA in 22 appearances including six starts. He was an 18th round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2011 MLB draft.

Monday means baseball...

Game number 55 of the season is the first Monday game of the campaign for Joliet. Historically the Slammers are 7-6 in Monday games.

Against the Corn...

The Slammers are 2-1 this season against the CornBelters. Normal is the only remaining team not to have visited Silver Cross Field in 2013. Historically Joliet is 11-4 against Normal.

For the first time this season the Slammers have won three consecutive series. They have won five out of their last six series overall.

Save me...

Justin Erasmus is once again tied for first in the Frontier League with 13 saves after his save Saturday night. He has not blown a save and has an ERA of 0.41.

Low and low...

This series is a touch match-up for Joliet as the Slammers have the lowest team batting average in the Frontier League at .229 and the CornBelters have the lowest team ERA in the league at 2.90. *In the clutch...*

All-Star Marquis Riley is the man you want up with runners in scoring position as he has a .341 average in that situation, highest on the team. Riley also has 17 multi-hit games this season, most on the team and leads the squad with an overall batting average of .314

Holding on..

The Slammers have posted an impressive 18-2 record when leading after six innings this season. However they are 6-28 when tied or trailing after six.

They gone!!

Slammers' pitching has struck out 412 batters so far this season; third most in the Frontier League. They have matched their franchise record for K's in one game (14) five times this season. *Transaction Wire...*

Joliet acquired RHP Ryan Hartman from the Gateway Grizzlies for a player to be named later yesterday. They placed RHP Matt Dillon and OF Seth Schwindenhammer on the 14-Day DL today.

INFO: Nick Akins brings four years of experience in the LA Dodgers organization to the Slammers. He was a 19th round draft pick of the Dodgers in 2009 out of Vanguard University of Southern California. Akins posted a batting average of .300 in his first season of affiliated baseball. Then he followed that up by clobbering 21 home runs and hitting .341 combined between the Pioneer and Arizona Leagues in 2010. In 2011 Akins made the move to full-season Single-A in the Midwest League, where he launched 12 home runs. Last season he split time between the Midwest League and the High Single-A California League, hitting a combined 10 long balls. Akins has hit 56 professional home runs over five seasons with a career .271 batting average.

INFO: In 2011, Hewett was a key component of the Slammers' championship run. He stands at only 5'8", but the rookie's heart and hard work that season made him a favorite among

the team's fans. Some of the Slammers' most passionate followers started a fan club called "The Hew Crew" in his honor. Hewett hit .261 during his rookie year with Joliet and had more walks (16) than strikeouts (13). The Slammers went 31-19 with Hewett behind the plate, and he allowed only one passed ball all year. Hewett threw out a team-high 15 base runners. The switch hitter out of Rollins College returned to the Slammers in 2012 and hit .253 with 13 walks and 10 strike outs in 26 games before being traded to the River City Rascals. With River City, Hewett saw his average rise to .288, and he hit his first professional home run when he returned to Silver Cross Field to face Joliet. Overall, he caught 20 runners stealing in 2012 while only allowing three passed balls. Hewett is a career .266 hitter at the professional level and has shown a good eye at the plate, walking 39 times while only striking out 26 times in his career.

The Slammers acquired him in 2011 in the dispersal draft for the Oakland County Cruisers.
