A Wayne, N.J. native, Chrusciel earned degrees in broadcast journalism and radio/television/film from Rowan University in Glassboro, N.J. before completing his masters in sport management at the University of Massachusetts. In addition to his time with the Jackals, Chrusciel has previously worked in broadcasting and multi-media in the athletic department at Army (the United States Military Academy), the video services department with the Philadelphia Phillies, and the public relations and broadcasting department of the ECHL's Trenton Devils.



Matt Sutor joins the Jackals as the team's Broadcasting and Media Assistant for the 2011 season. Sutor, 21, will be a senior this fall at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. At Marist, he is studying communication with a dual concentration in sports communication and journalism. At Marist, Matt has worked extensively with the radio station, WMAR, serving as a sports talk show host, reporter, and play-by-play and color commentator for Red Foxes soccer, basketball, softball, and baseball games. In addition, he works with the campus television station as a play-by-play and color commentator for basketball games, as well as a panelist for the talk show "Red Fox Rumble." A native of Clinton, N.J., Matt supports the New York Yankees, Giants, Rangers, Knicks, and NY/NJ Red Bulls in his free time.

In the summer of 1996 a unique public/private venture was formed. The objective: construct a baseball stadium and ice arena, which would benefit both Montclair State University and the surrounding communities. The answer: a partnership utilizing university property, with funding of all construction costs by Floyd Hall Enterprises. Upon completion, FHE founder and chairman Floyd Hall donated both facilities to the university and FHE was granted a long-term lease to operate both the stadium and the arena. The ice skating arena opened in March of 1998 with two NHL size rinks, an off-ice training area, meeting rooms, concession stand, pro shop, and facilities for birthday parties.

Yogi Berra Stadium opened in June of 1998 and serves as the home to the New Jersey Jackals professional baseball team in the Can-Am League and to the Montclair State University Red Hawks. The stadium, which is flanked by the Yogi Berra Museum and Learning Center on its first-base side, has quickly earned the reputation as the home of champions as the Jackals have won four championships in 13 years and the Red Hawks won the Division III NCAA Championship title in 2000.



In addition, Yogi Berra Stadium hosted the 2000 Northern League All-Star Game and was home to the New Jersey Pride of Major League Lacrosse during their inaugural season in 2001. Numerous special event have also been held at the venue, including WDHA's Rock the Park concerts and a Willie Nelson/Bob Dylan concert. Yogi Berra Stadium has played host to the ABC/WPLJ Charity Game since 2004. All dimensions on the field end in the number 8 to honor Yogi Berra, who wore #8 for the New York Yankees.





2010 marked a banner year for the New Jersey Jackals organization. Craig Breslow, who has been pitching in the majors since 2005, was joined by John Lindsey and Raul Valdes, who each made their major league debuts last summer. Since 2006, 22 Jackals have been sold to major league organizations, including six since the end of the 2009 season. At the conclusion of 2010, the Jackals boasted three alumni in the major leagues – more than any other independent organization.

ALUMNI NEWS AND NOTES

While Breslow is the only former Jackal to begin 2011 in the majors, several former Jackals are making their marks in affiliated baseball as the season gets underway.

Craig Breslow, currently in his third year working out of the Oakland A's bullpen, enters his sixth season overall at the major league level. In 2010, Breslow appeared in over 70 big league contests for the second straight season, posting a 4-4 record and a 3.01 ERA in 75 outings for the Oakland Athletics. In five professional seasons, the workhorse left-handed specialist owns a 2.87 ERA over 228 games.

After earning his first trip to the majors last September, **John Lindsey** returns to the Los Angeles Dodgers Triple-A affiliate, the Albuquerque Isotopes, in 2011. Last season with Albuquerque, Lindsey won the Pacific Coast League batting title when he hit .353 with 25 home runs and 97 RBIs. The Hattiesburg, Miss., native spent parts of the 2005 and 2006 seasons with New Jersey, where he batted .315 with 19 home runs in 125 games.

Raul Valdes, a Cuban defector, begins the 2011 season in the Triple-A Memphis Redbirds starting rotation after signing with the St. Louis Cardinals during the offseason. With the New York Mets in 2010, Valdes appeared in 38 games out of the bullpen, going 3-3 with a 4.91 ERA. Valdes was also lights out with Triple-A Buffalo in 2010, posting a 3.00 ERA with a 4-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio while working primarily as a starter. Valdes also appeared in seven major league spring training games for the Cardinals.

Outfielder **Timo Perez**, a Detroit Tigers' farmhand, enters 2011 with the Triple-A Toledo Mud Hens. Perez, an eight-year major league veteran, joined the Jackals late in the 2009 season and hit .337 in 21 games.

Stuart Pomeranz, a 6-foot-7 right-hander, begins 2011 in the Dodgers system with the Double-A Chattanooga Lookouts. After posting an ERA of 6.50 as a starter with the Jackals in 2009, the former second round draft pick of the Cardinals resurrected his career last season at Double-A Tulsa by moving to the bullpen and striking out 53 batters in 49 innings to compliment a 3.67 ERA. Pomeranz also appeared in three major league spring training games with the Dodgers this season, compiling a 3.86 ERA.

A member of the 2010 Jackals, **Shawn Riggans** begins 2011 with the Double-A Huntsville Stars after signing with the Milwaukee Brewers over the winter. Riggans, who played 64 major league games over four seasons with Tampa Bay (2006-2009), batted .328 with 26 RBIs in 34 games with New Jersey last year.

First baseman **Chris Garcia**, who joined the Jackals late in the 2009 season, takes the field with the Single-A Rome Braves to start the season. Garcia spent the past two seasons in the independent ranks with the Jackals and Shreveport-Bossier Captains of the American Association.

FROM THE JACKALS TO THE MAJORS

CRAIG BRESLOW

For the second straight season, Breslow appeared in over 70 big league contests in 2010, posting a 4-4 record and a 3.01 ERA in 75 outings for the Oakland Athletics. In five professional seasons, the workhorse left-handed specialist owns a 2.87 ERA over 228 games. Now 30, Breslow, whom the Wall Street Journal dubbed the "Smartest Man in Baseball" in 2009, capped the 2010 season by being named The Sporting News' "Smartest Athlete". The Connecticut native graduated from Yale University in 2002 with a 3.5 grade-point average while majoring in molecular biophysics and biochemistry. Breslow spent part of 2004 with New Jersey, going 3-1 with a 4.10 ERA in 19 games for the Northeast League Champion Jackals before eventually playing in the Major Leagues for the San Diego Padres, Boston Red Sox, Minnesota Twins, Cleveland Indians, and Oakland A's.

JOHN LINDSEY

Lindsey, a 33-year-old first baseman, made national headlines when he was called up to the major leagues for the first time in his career during his 16th professional season on September 6, 2010. At the time, he was the longest-tenured active minor league player without major league experience. Lindsey, who was a 13th round pick by the Rockies out of high school in the 1995 draft, won the Triple-A Pacific Coast League batting title when he hit .353 with 25 home runs and 97 RBIs for the Albuquerque Isotopes. With the Dodgers, Lindsey appeared in 11 games and went 1-for-12 at the plate. He recorded his first major league at-bat on September 9 at Houston when he flew out to deep center field before lacing a single three days later against the Astros to notch his first major league hit. Unfortunately, Lindsey's season was cut a few days short when he fractured his left hand after getting hit by a 92-mile-per-hour fastball from Diamondbacks pitcher Daniel Hudson on September 25 at Arizona. Over the past four seasons – all at the Triple-A level – Lindsey has belted 89 homers. Lindsey also slugged a two-run home run during a Dodgers spring training game in March 2010. During his two-year tenure with New Jersey (2005-06), the Hattiesburg, Miss. native batted .315 with 19 home runs in 125 games.

RAUL VALDES

Valdes, a Cuban defector, produced another feel-good story, earning his first trip to the majors on April 22, 2010 when he was promoted from Triple-A Buffalo to the New York Mets at age 32. Valdes, who tried to defect and failed five times before finally succeeding in 2003, tossed three shutout innings against Philadelphia on May 25 to notch his first career save. In total, Valdes appeared in 38 games out of the Mets bullpen in 2010, going 3-3 with a 4.91 ERA. Valdes was also lights out with Buffalo, posting a 3.00 ERA with a 4-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio while working primarily as a starter. With New Jersey in 2006, Valdes went 7-3 with a 2.81 ERA in 17 games (12 starts) before rising through the Mets' minor league system.

CAN-AM LEAGUE HISTORY

The history of the Can-Am League dates back to 1936 when Brockville, Ogdensburg, Oswego, Ottawa, Perth and Watertown/Massena were part of the Class C league. The association continued until the 1942 season, but due to World War II the league folded only to resurrect at the start of the 1946 season featuring teams from the cities of Amsterdam, Gloversville-Johnstown, Oneonta, Pittsfield, Rome, Quebec, Schenectady and Trois Rivières. The second installment of the Can-Am League ended its run after the 1951 season.

On October 6, 2004, the Canadian-American Association of Professional Baseball, or Can-Am League for short, was reborn with the Bangor Lumberjacks, Brockton Rox, Elmira Pioneers, New Haven County Cutters, New Jersey Jackals, North Shore Spirit, Worcester Tornadoes, and Les Capitaes de Quebec as the charter members. In 2006, Elmira and the 2005 road team, Grays, were replaced with the newcomers Sussex Skyhawks and the Nashua Pride. The following year the league expanded to ten teams with the additions of the Atlantic City Surf and the rebirth of the road team Grays. Following the 2007 season, the New Haven County Cutters and North Shore Spirit decided not to operate. Ottawa, a member of the Can-Am from 1936-39, replaced the Grays, giving the league eight teams. In 2010, Pittsfield, a member of the Can-Am from 1941-42 and 1946-51, replaced the New Hampshire club.

For the 2011 season, the Newark Bears join the circuit after spending the past 13 seasons in the Atlantic League while the league also welcomes the expansion Rockland (NY) Boulders. The Sussex (NJ) Skyhawks will not operate in 2011. Their place will be taken by the New York Federals, a road team that will be run by the New York State League with players from that league and other selected professional players.

CAN-AM LEAGUE ROSTER RULES

The roster limit for a Can-Am League club is 22 players. An additional two players may be on the disabled list during the regular season. Of those 22 players, a maximum of four may be veterans and minimum of five must be rookies. The remaining players will be designated limited service players and of those LS players only six (6) may be LS-4. During the pre-season, a maximum of 27 players may be under contract at any one time without regard to classification. The 22 active player roster must be met three days before the start of the regular season.

DEFINITIONS

Year of Service: A year of service for Can-Am League players is 75 official at bats or more in a National Association or independent league or leagues, or 30 innings or more pitched in a National Association or independent league or leagues, in any season prior to the present calendar year. For independent and short season/rookie league service, the first two years of service equals one National Association year. For foreign players, the classification and salary level will be determined by the league office.

Rookie: A player with less than one year of service.

LS-1: A player with less than two years of service.

LS-2: A player with less than three years of service.

LS-3: A player with less than four years of service.

LS-4: A player with less than five years of service. One of the six LS-4 players may be LS-5.

LS-5: A player with less than 6 years of service.

Veteran: A player with six or more years of service. If a player has six or more years of service but has not reached the age of 26 by September 1 of that season, he will be considered an LS-4. If he has not reached the age of 24 by September 1 of that season, he will be considered an LS-3.

Eric Gagne, the 2003 National League Cy Young Award Winner with the Los Angeles Dodgers, started 17 games for the Quebec Capitales in 2009.

FIELD MANAGER - NINTH SEASON

Joe Calfapietra, the longest-tenured manager in the Can-Am League, returns to the Jackals' dugout for his ninth season as the team's field manager in 2011. It will mark his 12th year as a professional manager.

Calfapietra earned his 500th career managerial victory in dramatic fashion on August 26, 2010 when New Jersey defeated Quebec 1-0 on a Carlos Sosa walk-off double in the bottom of the ninth inning, which preserved an Isaac Pavlik complete-game shutout.

In 2009, Calfapietra was named the Can-Am League Manager of the Year after guiding the Jackals to the league's first-half title and a playoff appearance. He also garnered Manager of the Year honors in 2004 when he led the Jackals to a Northeast League championship.

Calfapietra, 40, began his coaching career with the Northern League's Duluth-Superior Dukes in 1994 before spending the 1995 and 1996 seasons with the Aberdeen Pheasants of the Prairie League. In 1997, Calfapietra joined manager Ed Ott's coaching staff with the Allentown Ambassadors as Director of Baseball Operations.

Calfapietra was named the Ambassadors manager in 2000 at the age of 29, making him the youngest manager in Northern League history. After posting an 85-90 managerial record in two seasons with the Ambassadors, Calfapietra left Allentown after five years to guide the expansion Gary SouthShore RailCats in their inaugural season in 2002. Calfapietra led Gary, which played its entire schedule on the road while waiting for its ballpark to be constructed, to a 35-55 team record and was named the Northern League Manager of the Year. Calfapietra joined the Jackals in 2003 and earned his second Manager of the Year award in 2004 when he led New Jersey past the North Shore Spirit for the Northeast League title.

The Royersford, PA native played at Eastern College in Saint Davids, PA, where he was a two-time Division III All-American selection at first base. When he was not drafted out of college, Calfapietra turned to coaching and earned his Master's Degree in Education. He has spent time collegiately as an assistant coach at Eastern College, a volunteer assistant at St. Joseph's University, and as the hitting coach and recruiting coordinator at Villanova University.

COACH - FOURTH SEASON

Returns to the Jackals coaching staff after managing the Sussex Skyhawks in 2010... Spent three seasons as a coach with the Jackals (2007-09)... Was previously the manager of the Allentown Ambassadors for 4 1/2 seasons (1997-99 and 2002-03), earning Northeast League Manager of the Year honors in 1998 and 1999... Was drafted by Pittsburgh in the 23rd round in 1970 and spent eight seasons in the major leagues as a catcher and outfielder.. Helped the Pirates defeat the Orioles in the 1979 World Series, scoring the winning run in Game 2... Was traded to the California Angels prior to the 1981 season, but was limited to 75 games due to a rotator cuff injury... Was Barry Bonds first minor league manager with Single-A Prince William in 1985... Spent seven seasons coaching at the major league level, serving as the Astros first base coach and bench coach under Art Howe from 1989-93 and the Tigers bullpen coach from 2001-02 under Phil Garner... Born 7/11/51 in Muncy, PA (59 years old on opening day).

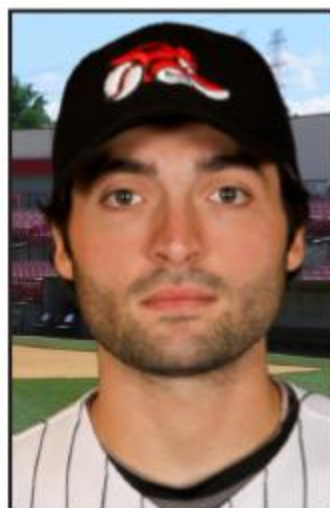

But Skyhawks pitching coach Brooks Carey worked at getting Fox to stop opening up so early in his delivery (which caused him to leave the ball up) and to stop falling off to first base on his follow-through. Once he got his delivery closed up and started striding towards home plate, Fox didn't allow an earned run in his final nine innings of work (while striking out nine) and he had a 1.90 ERA with 29 strikeouts in 24 innings over the final two months of the season."

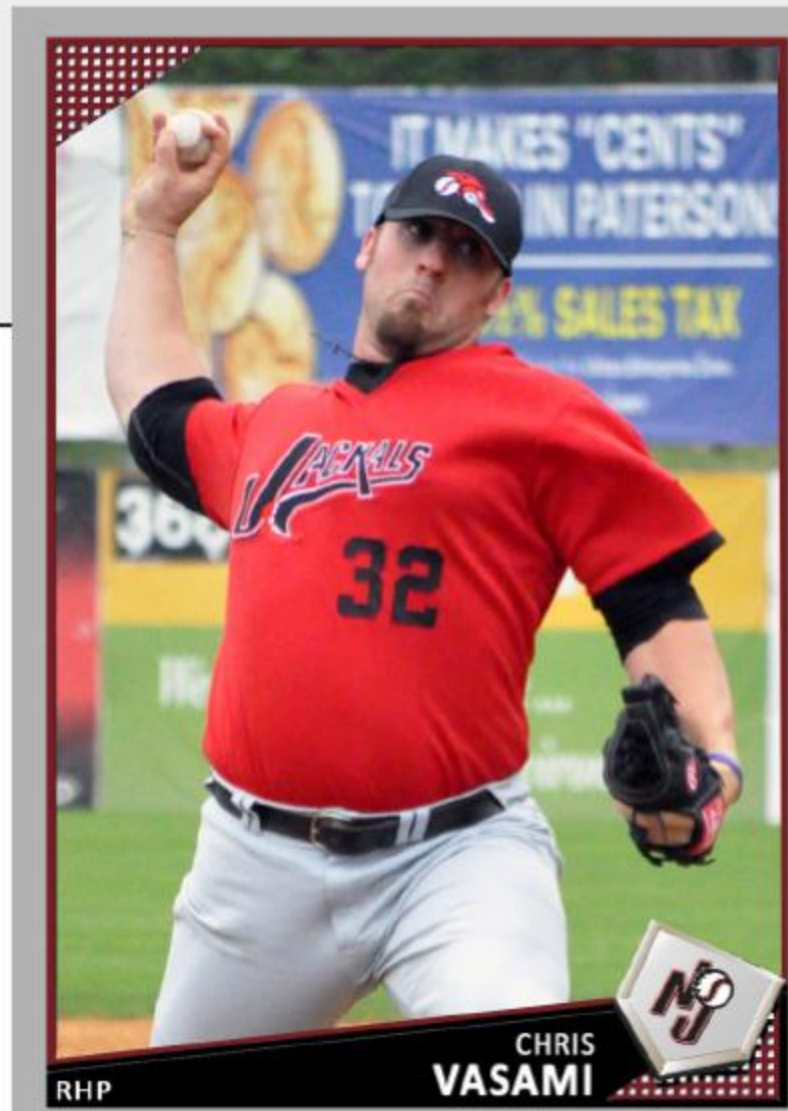

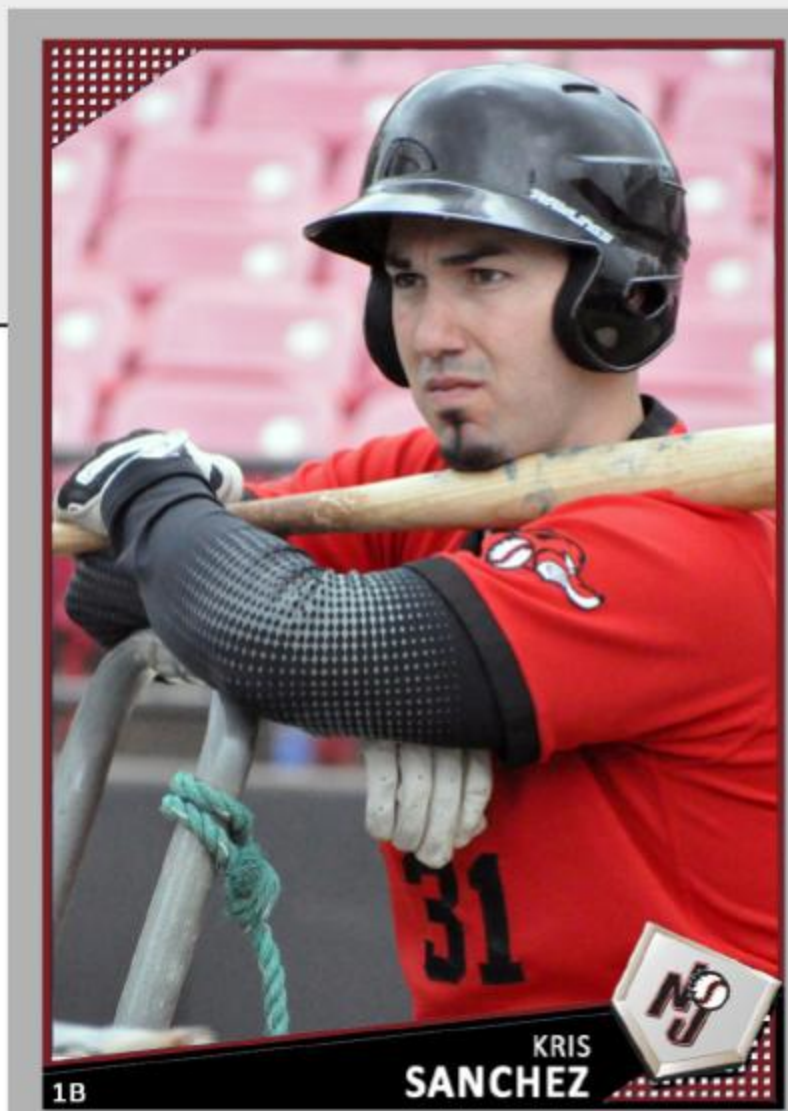

JACKALS 2010 FACTS AND FIGURES

- The Jackals (42-50) waited until the final day of the regular season (Monday, September 6) to clinch the fourth and final Can-Am League playoff spot with a 9-3 win in Quebec City, taking three of four from the Capitales to conclude the season. The Jackals remained in Quebec to open up the playoffs, but were swept by the Capitales in three games.
- Jackals skipper **Joe Calfapietra** earned his 500th career managerial victory in dramatic fashion on August 27 at Yogi Berra Stadium when New Jersey defeated Quebec 1-0 on a Carlos Sosa walk-off double in the bottom of the ninth, which preserved Isaac Pavlik's second complete-game shutout of the season.
- In 92 games, the Jackals utilized 43 players (nine more than their total from 2009). Eight different players combined to spend a total of 200 games on the disabled or inactive lists due to injury. That list doesn't include Matt Stiffler (hamstring) and Dean Forthun (broken ankle), who were released after their respective injuries. Shawn Riggans, who was deactivated due to injury three times over the course of the season, served a pair of stints on the DL and was placed on the IL on July 28 with a re-aggravated oblique strain.
- On Saturday, June 19 against Quebec at Yogi Berra Stadium, the Jackals tied a Can-Am League single-game record when they turned five double plays. New Jersey recorded nine twin-killings in the three-game set.
- **Mike Pontius** appeared in a Jackals franchise record 42 games during the 2010 season. The previous high was 41, set by Justin Garza in 2007 and Seth Overbey in 2009.
- **Jabe Bergeron** finished 2010 tied for second in the Can-Am League with 19 home runs after being released by the Brockton Rox during spring training (Brockton's Melvin Falu led the league with 20). Bergeron also eclipsed his previous career high of 13 blasts, set in 2008 with the Ottawa Rapidz. Bergeron's .552 slugging percentage topped the league.
- **Abraham Nunez** led the league with 68 walks – 20 more than anybody else in the association. Nunez, who struck out just 35 times in 85 games, ranked second in the league in on-base percentage (.428)

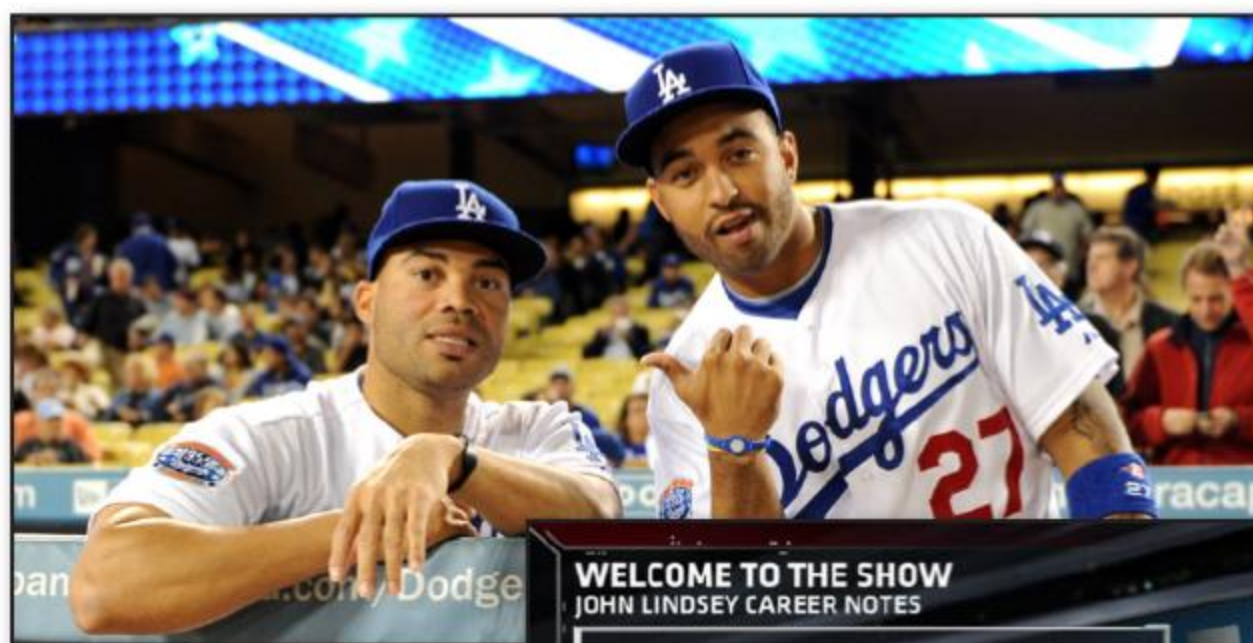

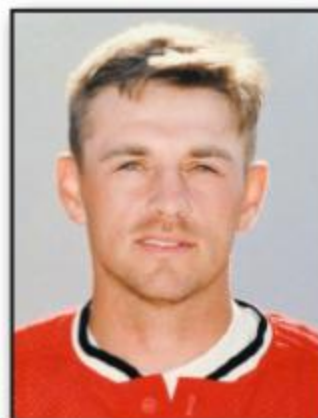

Floyd Hall Enterprises is granted a franchise in the Northeast League

1998

"Jackals" is selected as nickname of new Northeast League team owned by FHE

May 30, 1998

The Jackals play their first games as New Jersey sweeps a doubleheader in Waterbury, beating the Spirit 4-1 and 8-1.

June 5, 1998

The Jackals christen the just-built Yogi Berra Stadium and defeat the Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs, 2-1, in 13 innings. Outfielder Gary Golum hits a game-winning home run for the dramatic conclusion.

July 9, 1998

The Jackals clinch the first-half championship in the south division of the Northeast League with a 4-3 win over Waterbury. New Jersey finishes the first half with a 30-12 record and a guaranteed spot in the playoffs.

July 18, 1998

Shortstop Saul Bustos erupts for a Northeast League record three home runs in a 15-5 win over the Adirondack Lumberjacks in Glens Falls, NY.

August 5, 1998

The Jackals gain national notoriety by signing Pete Rose Jr., the son of baseball's all-time hit king. "Junior" bats .424 in the final 12 games of the season.

July-August 1998

Right-hander Kevin Pincavitch allows one earned run in his final 58 innings pitched of the season.

September 2, 1998

Right-hander John DeSilva is named Northeast League Pitcher-of-the-Year.

September 3, 1998

The Jackals play their first-ever postseason game, defeating Allentown, 11-3, at Yogi Berra Stadium. The Jackals will go on to sweep the Ambassadors in the first round of the playoffs.

September 5, 1998

The Jackals rally for six runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat the Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs, 7-6, in game one of the Northeast League Finals at Yogi Berra Stadium. One day later, New Jersey completes the sweep and wins the Northeast League championship, downing Albany, 4-3.

Winter 1998/99

The Northeast League merges with the Northern League. The Jackals will now play in the Northern League East.

June 18, 1999

Former major league second baseman Mark Lemke makes his professional pitching debut for the Jackals, allowing one run in one inning of relief. Lemke will knuckleball his way to a 5-1 record and 6.68 ERA during the 1999 season.

July 16, 1999

Carmine Cappuccio begins what will turn out to be a 39-game hitting streak, the longest in Northern League history. He will bat .414 with 10 home runs and 51 RBIs during those 39 games.

September 5, 1999

For the second straight season, the Jackals sweep the Allentown Ambassadors in the first round of the playoffs.

September 12, 1999

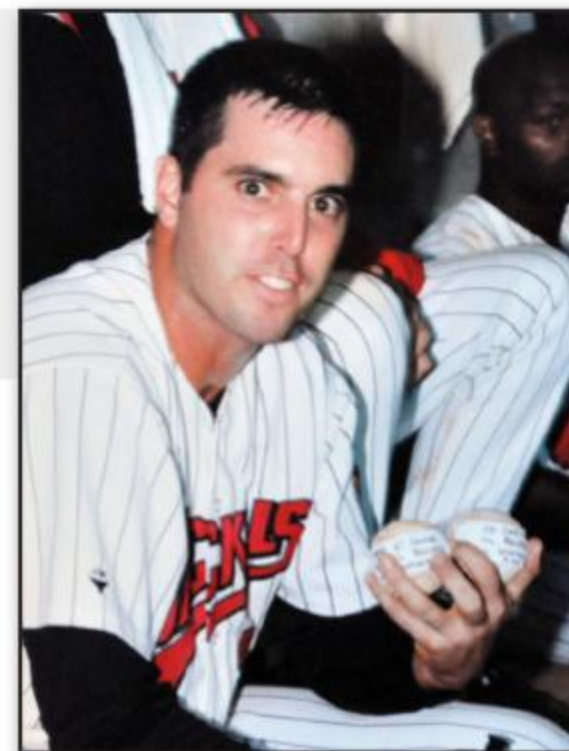
The Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs defeat the Jackals, 6-2, in game four of their playoff series and eliminate New Jersey from the second round of the playoffs, three games to one.

October 1999

Outfielder Carmine Cappuccio is selected as the Northern League East Player of the Year and as Baseball America's Independent Player of the Year. He batted .349 with 17 home runs and 75 RBIs for the season.

June 7, 2000

For the first time in franchise history, the Jackals are swept in a doubleheader, dropping 6-3 and 2-1 decisions at home to the Adirondack Lumberjacks. Incredibly, it also marks the first time in franchise history that the Jackals have a sub-.500 record during the regular season (5-7). New Jersey will finish the season 31-53 and will miss the playoffs for the first time in their three-year history.

Yogi Berra Stadium plays host to the 2000 Northern League All-Star Game. The East team, managed by New Jersey's Kash Beauchamp, defeats the Central stars, 10-5.

October 2000

Kash Beauchamp resigns as Jackals manager. His three-year record stands at five games over .500. The Jackals later name George Tsamis, the former skipper of the Waterbury Spirit, as their new field manager.

June 25, 2001

The Jackals mourn the loss of John Leroy, who passes away from an aneurysm at age 26. Leroy, who was a member of the Sioux City Explorers at the time of his death, pitched for New Jersey in 2000.

June 29, 2001

Outfielder Aaron Fera smashes two homers and drives in six runs in a win at Adirondack. He will have two more two-homer games during the season and, even though he is signed by the St. Louis Cardinals organization on August 1, Fera establishes a new franchise record by hitting 18 home runs in 2001.

July 31, 2001

Jackals' third baseman Ryan Kane clouts a home run and a double in the Northern League All-Star Game played in Winnipeg. Kane is selected as the game's MVP.

September 7, 2001

The Jackals complete their first-round sweep over the Diamond Dogs with a 7-4 victory at Yogi Berra Stadium on hometown hero David Kennedy's three-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning.

September 22, 2001

The Jackals finish off the Elmira Pioneers in the fifth and final game of their playoff series, 8-5. Mike Bertotti comes out of the bullpen to strike out 11 batters over the final seven innings in relief of Joel Bennett, who leaves with a sore shoulder.

September 24, 2001

New Jersey scores four runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to beat the Winnipeg Goldeyes, 7-3, in game one of the Northern League finals in Little Falls.

September 28, 2001

The Jackals win their first Northern League championship, beating the Goldeyes, 8-5, in game four in Winnipeg. New Jersey scores four runs in the top of the ninth inning to secure the win. Outfielder Trey Beamon is named post-season MVP after batting .585 with three home runs and 12 RBIs in 12 games. New Jersey goes 9-3 in the postseason.

June 8, 2002

Joel Bennett fires a complete-game, four-hitter as the Jackals beat the Berkshire Black Bears, 6-1. Bennett will not lose another start until August 17, a span of 12 starts. The former major league right-hander will set a Jackals' record by winning 14 games during the season.



June 16, 2002

New Jersey defeats the Elmira Pioneers, 14-0, to begin a then-franchise-record 13-game winning streak. The Jackals will win the first half South Division title and guarantee themselves a spot in the playoffs with a 30-15 record.

June 23, 2002

Joel Bennett sets a team record by striking out 16 batters in a 14-1 victory over the Allentown Ambassadors.

July 14, 2002

The Jackals defeat Quebec, 7-4, and begin a stretch where they will win 19 of 20 games. New Jersey will win the second half South Division title with a 32-12 mark and will post an overall record of 62-27, the best in franchise history.

August 12-15, 2002

The Jackals sweep a four-game series in Allentown, winning by an aggregate score of 66-22. Shortstop Chas Terni ties a league record by smacking three home runs in the first game and then ties the league record with three doubles two nights later. In the third game, the Jackals erupt for a franchise-record 28 hits with outfielder Billy Brown tying the league mark with six hits in one game. On the 15th, outfielder Travis Bailey drives in six runs, tying the team record as the Jackals score 25 runs in the contest.

August 28, 2002

Jeremy Callier throws the first no-hitter in franchise history, 2-0, over the Berkshire Black Bears. He allows only two base runners in the game, one on a walk and the other on an error. Despite Callier's efforts, the game goes scoreless into the bottom of the ninth inning before the Jackals win the contest on Ryan Kane's two-run home run to complete the walk-off no-hitter.

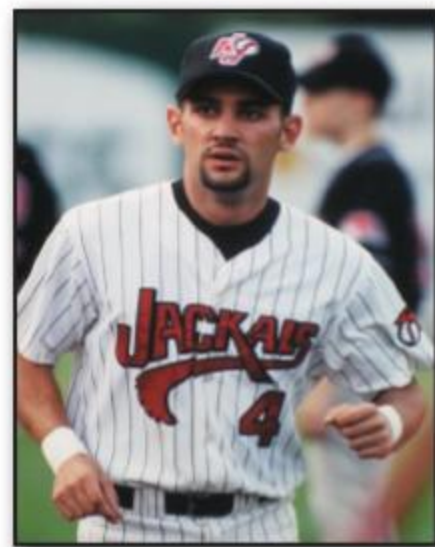

September 4, 2002

Joel Bennett strikes out 12 and allows only three hits over eight innings as New Jersey wins its playoff opener, 3-0, over the Elmira Pioneers at Yogi Berra Stadium.

September 8, 2002

The Jackals win the fifth and deciding game of their first-round series, winning in Elmira, 6-0. Joel Bennett throws blanks again, allowing six hits and no runs over eight innings.



September 9, 2002

Craig Conway smashes a grand slam and drives in five runs as New Jersey takes the first game of its second-round playoff series against the Adirondack Lumberjacks, 13-1, at Yogi Berra Stadium.

September 14, 2002

With the series against Adirondack tied at two games apiece, trailing 2-1 and down to their last strike of the season, the Jackals rally to score three runs in the ninth inning to beat the Lumberjacks in Glens Falls, NY, 4-2, and win the series. Dave Callahan strokes a bases-clearing double with two outs and a 3-2 count to win the series for New Jersey.

September 21, 2002

In game four of the Northern League championship series, Mikaela Dworken smacks a home run and Aaron Myers allows two runs over 6.2 innings as, for the second straight year, the Jackals beat the Gold-eyes to win the league title.

November 2002

After George Tsamis steps down as manager to pursue the same position with the St. Paul Saints, the Jackals hire Joe Calfapietra as the third manager in franchise history. In addition, it is announced that the Northern League East has split with the Northern League Central and will once again play as the Northeast League in 2003.

May 17, 2003

The Jackals take on the Russian National Team in an exhibition double-header at Yogi Berra Stadium. New Jersey is victorious by scores of 3-0 and 5-4.

July 2003

The Jackals send four players to the Northeast League All-Star Game in Quebec – Outfielders Travis Bailey and Darren Blakely, and pitchers Ben Grezlovski and Jackson Crowther.

September 4, 2003

A day after Mother Nature forces the cancellation of their first-round Northeast League playoff game, the Jackals bring in a helicopter flown by Andrew MacQueen of Fairfield, who is stationed at Essex County Airport and works for Helicopter Services and Instruction, to circle the infield and outfield for an hour in preparation for game one against

the Brockton Rox.

January 23, 2004

The Jackals sign Garden State native Zach Smithlin, who would spend six seasons patrolling the New Jersey outfield. Smithlin would end his Jackals career as the team's all-time leader in games played, hits, runs scored and stolen bases.

July 15, 2004

After picking up four wins in a 24-hour span thanks to back-to-back doubleheader sweeps against the Elmira Pioneers the previous two days, the Jackals defeat the New Haven County Cutters, 6-2, in a one-game playoff at Yale Field in New Haven, CT to clinch the Northeast League first-half title and an automatic playoff berth. The four-game stretch against Elmira included a string of 30 consecutive innings where the Jackals led the Pioneers. The Jackals also won eight of their final 10 games in the first half.

August 6, 2004

Shortstop Chris Rowan clubs his 29th home run in a Jackals uniform, breaking Travis Bailey's team record for career blasts. Rowan would connect on a franchise-record 23 homers during the 2004 season.

September 2004

In the Northeast League Championship Series, the Jackals drop the first two games of the series against the North Shore Spirit at Yogi Berra Stadium. In game three at Fraser Field in Lynn, MA, North Shore builds a 3-0 lead before New Jersey battles back to force extra innings, enabling catcher Jay LaFlair to knock in the game-winning run in the 13th. Trailing 2-1 heading to the ninth in game four, the Jackals even the score on a fielder's choice off the bat of Wady Almonte before a two-run, 11th-inning single by Scott Goodman gives New Jersey the lead and Aaron Myers finishes off the Spirit with his second inning of perfect relief. In the decisive fifth game, the Jackals jump out to an early advantage and Joel Bennett and Myers pitch New Jersey to an improbable Northeast League title.

July 12, 2005

As New Jersey batters the Brockton Rox 16-2 at Yogi Berra Stadium, Joe Calfapietra records his 130th franchise victory, becoming the winningest manager in team history. Calfapietra reaches the milestone in 24 fewer games than the previous record holder, Kash Beauchamp.

July 23, 2005

Craig Breslow, a member of the Jackals bullpen in 2004, makes his major league debut for the San Diego Padres. Breslow is the first former Jackal to reach the major leagues.

July 28, 2005

Jackals' first baseman John Lindsey's contract is sold to the Florida Marlins. Lindsey, who later returned to the Jackals before making his major league debut with the Dodgers in 2010, was batting .321 with nine home runs and 62 RBIs for New Jersey.

July 29, 2005

Aaron Myers hurls eight innings of two-hit, shutout baseball as the Jackals defeat the Grays, 12-0.

June 22, 2006

With the bases loaded in a 7-7 contest, pinch hitter John Lindsey laces a walk-off single to center field to carry the Jackals past the New Haven County Cutters, 8-7.

June 24, 2006

With rain in the forecast, Joe Calfapietra elects to start reliever Adam Nikolic against the Brockton Rox. Nikolic strikes out three batters in two scoreless frames before regularly-scheduled starter Aaron Myers enters and allows just two hits in seven shutout innings.

July 1, 2006

The Jackals dominate a doubleheader against Sussex, defeating the Skyhawks 13-0 and 10-0. Game one is a continuation of the previous night's contest – the first-ever meeting between New Jersey and Sussex – which was suspended in the third inning.



August 6, 2006

Aaron "Bulldog" Myers tosses the second no-hitter in franchise history as the Jackals defeat the Worcester Tornadoes, 3-0.

November 14, 2006

Ed Ott joins the Jackals coaching staff. The move reunites Ott and Jackals' manager Joe Calfapietra, who served as a coach for the Allentown Ambassadors for three years when Ott was Allentown's manager.

May 27, 2007

Joe Calfapietra earns his 200th managerial win in a Jackals uniform as New Jersey defeats the Sussex Skyhawks, 9-8. Sussex rookie Ryan Lobban, who would later pitch for New Jersey, takes the loss.

July 9, 2007

The Jackals clinch the Can-Am League first-half title with an 8-0 win over the Worcester Tornadoes in Little Falls.

July 29, 2007

The Jackals sell a pair of pitchers to affiliated organizations as southpaw Rusty Tucker's contract is purchased by the Milwaukee Brewers and submariner Hunter Davis joins the Tampa Bay Rays organization.

August 28, 2007

Sandy Madera's grand slam caps a seven-run ninth inning as the Jackals rally past the North Shore Spirit, 9-6, at Fraser Field in Lynn, MA. A day later, North Shore activates manager Vic Davilla, whose walk-off homer helps the Spirit down New Jersey, 7-5.

September 3, 2007

The Jackals drop their sixth straight game, 10-6 at New Haven County, to stumble into the postseason.

September 8, 2007

In game four of their first-round playoff series, the Nashua Pride smash five home runs at Yogi Berra Stadium to force a fifth game. New Jersey's season comes to an end the next night thanks to a 4-0 loss to Nashua.

March 11, 2008

Joel Bennett announces his retirement after a 17-year professional career that included a pair of major-league stops. In seven dominant seasons with New Jersey, Bennett went 59-19 with a 2.83 ERA.

June 20, 2008

The Jackals announce the signing of long-time nemesis Vic Davilla. Davilla, who had spent 11 seasons competing against the Jackals with the Adirondack Lumberjacks, Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs, Allentown Ambassadors, and North Shore Spirit, would hit .279 in 15 games with the Jackals before finishing the season with the Brockton Rox.

June 24, 2008

First baseman Juan Tejada homers in three consecutive at-bats as the Jackals sweep a doubleheader at Worcester. Tejada lifts a sixth-inning home run in game one before leaving Hanover Insurance Park twice in the 10-8 nightcap victory.



June 27, 2008

In the longest game in Can-Am League history, the Jackals defeat the Tornadoes, 5-4, in a 20-inning marathon in Worcester that takes six hours, six minutes to complete. In the 20th, New Jersey second baseman Marcus Sanders connects for his first home run of the year to propel the Jackals to a one-run lead at 5-4. In the bottom of the inning, Tom Atlee retires the side in order to notch his first save of the season. Sanders is the star at the plate for New Jersey, going 5-10 with 3 RBIs despite not picking up his first hit until his fourth at bat in the seventh inning. In the win, the Jackals set a franchise record as New Jersey pitchers strike out 21 Worcester batters with Ted Serro and Brandon Martin combining for seven innings of shutout relief.

June 28, 2008

In his seventh professional season, right-hander Tom Atlee earns the win in his first career start as the Jackals down the Nashua Pride, 6-2, at Yogi Berra Stadium.

June 30, 2008

The Jackals score a Can-Am League record 21 runs on a league record-tying 28 hits as they defeat the first-place Worcester Tornadoes 21-10 at Yogi Berra Stadium. In the contest, New Jersey also ties a league record with an 11-run bottom of the fourth inning in which they bang out a league-record 12 hits. Additionally, the Jackals tie their team record with 28 hits.

July 3, 2008

In front of a Can-Am League-record 8,016 fans at Bernie Robbins Stadium, the Jackals slug their way to a 16-14 victory over the Atlantic City Surf.

July 31, 2008

The Jackals suffer their franchise-record ninth straight loss, 4-2, at Quebec.

August 16, 2008

Zach Smithlin's inside-the-park home run helps New Jersey down Atlantic City, 8-0, in front of over 3,800 fans at Yogi Berra Stadium. The round-tripper is just the second of Smithlin's career and his first since 2005.

August 22, 2008

In a ceremony prior to their game against the Brockton Rox, the Jackals retire Joel Bennett's number 28.

May 29, 2009

The Jackals emerge victorious on opening day for the eighth straight season as they down the American Defenders of New Hampshire, 10-0, at Historic Holman Stadium in Nashua, NH.

June 6, 2009

Zach Smithlin breaks an 0-for-12 hitless streak as he collects his 500th career hit in an 8-2 loss vs. Brockton.



June 16, 2009

Continuing a trend of solid early-season pitching, closer Rusty Tucker becomes the third straight Jackals' hurler to earn Can-Am League Pitcher of the Week honors. Starters Isaac Pavlik and Ted Serro had previously taken home league honors.

June 23, 2009

Southpaw A.J. Wideman comes within four outs of a perfect game and the New

Jersey Jackals set a league record by winning their 12th consecutive game, defeating Les Capitales de Quebec, 6-0, at Stade Municipal. The win eclipses the previous Can-Am League mark of 11 straight, set by the North Shore Spirit in 2006. A Patrick Deschenes eighth-inning single is the only ball leave the infield against Wideman, who hurls eight shutout innings.

June 25, 2009

The Jackals extend their Can-Am League-record winning streak to 14 games with a 9-7 victory over the Worcester Tornadoes in game one of a doubleheader at Yogi Berra Stadium. However, a 3-1 Worcester win in the nightcap snaps the streak, which began on June 11.

June 28, 2009

Rookie catcher Chris Chiarappa's walk-off, two-run single in the bottom of the ninth inning helps New Jersey overcome a five-run final-frame deficit en route to an 8-7 win over the Worcester Tornadoes.

July 16, 2009

The Jackals clinch the Can-Am League First-Half Championship and a spot in the playoffs, pounding out 16 hits on their way to an 11-1 victory at Worcester.

July 26, 2009

In game one of a doubleheader, Quebec right-hander and former National League Cy Young Award winner Eric Gagne takes a no-hitter into the seventh inning at Yogi Berra Stadium. Gagne allows back-to-back singles to begin the frame before inducing a game-ending triple play on a grounder to third base off the bat of Juan Tejada.



August 1, 2009

A.J. Wideman takes home Can-Am League Pitcher of the Month honors for the second straight month after compiling a 4-0 record with a microscopic 1.06 ERA in July.

September 4, 2009

A league-high five Jackals are named to the Can-Am League Postseason All-Star Team. First baseman Myron Leslie, shortstop Mike DeJesus, outfielder Jerod Edmondson, left-hander A.J. Wideman, and relief pitcher Rusty Tucker each earn league laurels. Joe Calfapietra is later named league Manager of the Year.

April 11, 2010

Southpaw Raul Valdes earns his first call to the major leagues at age 32 when the New York Mets promote him from Triple-A Buffalo. Valdes, a Cuban defector, went 7-3 with a 2.81 ERA in 17 games (12 starts) for the Jackals in 2006.

May 31, 2010

Former Tampa Bay Rays catcher Shawn Riggans is named Can-Am League Player of the Week after going 8-for-15 with two home runs in New Jersey's season-opening series at Sussex.

June 2, 2010

Left-handed outfielder Kevin Clark homers in his first two at-bats against Pittsfield southpaw Dave Qualben as the Jackals defeat the Colonials, 4-2, in the first game of a doubleheader at Wahconah Park. Pittsfield wins the nightcap, 2-1.

June 15, 2010

A.J. Wideman fans a career-high 10 Worcester batters without allowing a walk in a 7-4 New Jersey victory at Hanover Insurance Park.

June 18, 2010

After Jackals starter Ryan Lobban tosses seven shutout innings, New Jersey's bullpen hits a batter and doles out six walks as the Quebec Capitales plate six runs on just one hit (an infield single) in the top of the eighth inning to hand the Jackals a heartbreaking 6-5 Jackals loss at Yogi Berra Stadium.

June 21, 2010

On a New York Mets off-day, former Jackals' reliever Raul Valdes returns to Yogi Berra Stadium to throw out the first pitch prior to New Jersey's game against the Worcester Tornadoes.

July 2-3, 2010

The Boston Red Sox purchase second baseman Argenis Reyes from the Jackals and assign him to Triple-A Pawtucket. A day later, the Pittsburgh Pirates pluck catcher Jordan Newton from New Jersey and send him to Advanced-A Bradenton.

July 22, 2010

Skyhawks starter Mike Vicaro takes a no-hitter into the eighth inning, but New Jersey southpaw Isaac Pavlik's complete-game shutout carries the Jackals to a 2-0 win over Sussex at Skylands Park. Pavlik took his no-hit bid into the bottom of the fifth.

August 26, 2010

Jackals skipper Joe Calfapietra notches his 500th career managerial win with help from Isaac Pavlik and Carlos Sosa. Pavlik fires his second complete-game shutout of the season and Sosa's walk-off double in the bottom of the ninth inning makes it stand as New Jersey defeats the first-place Quebec Capitales, 1-0, at Yogi Berra Stadium.

September 6, 2010

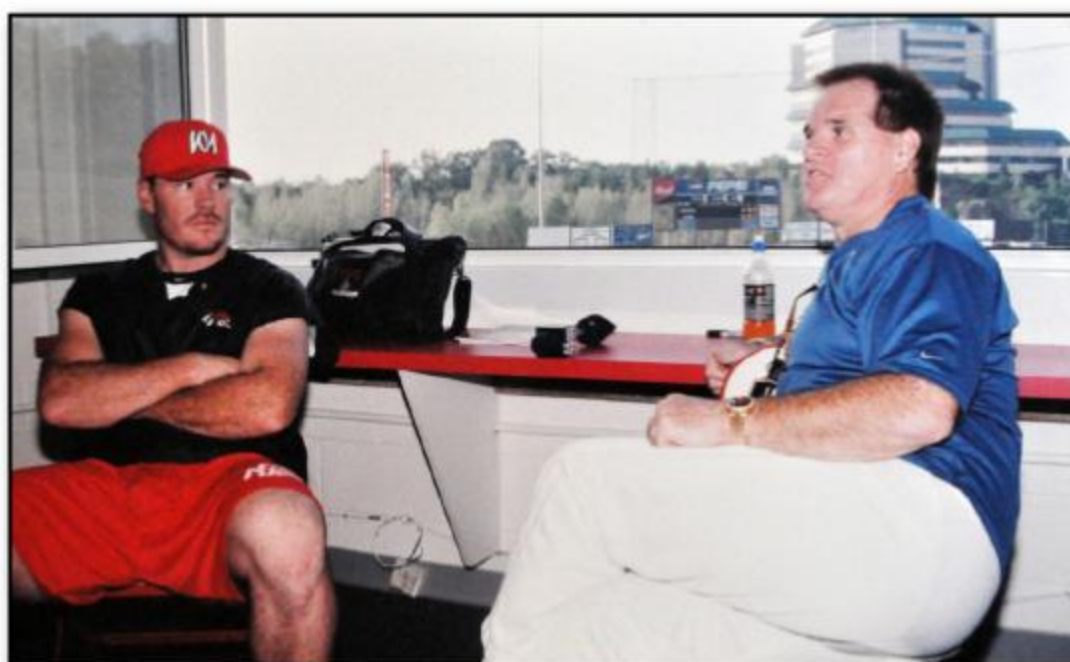
On the final day of the regular season, the Jackals erupt for six runs in the sixth inning to defeat the Capitales, 9-3, on a rainy night in Quebec City and clinch the fourth and final Can-Am League playoff spot. That same day, former Jackal John Lindsey, a 33-year-old first baseman, makes national headlines when he is called up to the major leagues for the first time in his career during his 16th professional season. At the time, Lindsey is the longest-tenured active minor league player without major league experience.

October 24, 2010

Despite being swept by Quebec in the playoffs, the New Jersey Jackals are named the Can-Am League Organization of the Year.

The New Jersey Jackals have retired two numbers over the franchise's first 13 seasons: **YOGI BERRA** — the legendary New York Yankees catcher and Montclair native for whom the Jackals stadium is named — and pitcher **JOEL BENNETT**, who spent seven dominant seasons on the mound in Little Falls. **ZACH SMITHLIN**, who spent six seasons roaming the Jackals' outfield, will join Berra and Bennett when his number 4 is retired during the 2011 season.

#4 ZACH SMITHLIN



For six seasons, Zach Smithlin patrolled the Yogi Berra Stadium outfield brilliantly and was a terror on the basepaths. On July 30, the New Jersey Jackals will honor Smithlin by retiring his number 4.

Smithlin, who spent more time with the Jackals than any position player in organization history, dominates the New Jersey record book. His 503 career hits in a Jackals uniform are 204 more than any other Jackal. Smithlin also holds the Jackals' career records for games played (472), runs scored (287), and stolen bases (154).

A New Jersey native who was born in Paterson and raised in Fair Lawn, Smithlin spent his entire professional career in the Garden State. After a successful run at Penn State, Smithlin signed with the St. Louis Cardinals as a nondrafted free agent in 2003 and spent his rookie campaign with the New Jersey Cardinals, playing 44 games at the Cardinals' New York-Penn League outpost at Skylands Park before signing with the Jackals in 2004. Following the 2004 season in which he helped lead New Jersey to a Northeast League title, Smithlin's contract was purchased by the San Diego Padres, but he was not re-assigned after spring training. Upon returning to the Jackals, Smithlin turned in a career year in 2005,



batting .358 while leading the Can-Am League with 135 hits and 40 thefts and representing the Jackals at the All-Star Game in Brockton. Three years later, Smithlin once again led the circuit when he swiped 33 bags in 2008. An outfielder by trade, Smithlin shifted to the infield for 28 games during the 2007 season when he filled in at second base for the Jackals.

The switch hitter finished his career in 2010 when he saw brief action in the Atlantic League with the Somerset Patriots and Newark Bears. In eight professional seasons with four teams, the fleet-footed Smithlin batted .286 and was successful in over 82% of his steal attempts (159-for-193) while walking more than he struck out.

#28 JOEL BENNETT

Joel Bennett, the legendary Jackals pitcher, announced his retirement following the 2007 season at the age of 38 after 17 seasons and over 1,800 professional innings. As a fitting tribute, the Jackals retired his jersey on August 22, 2008.

Drafted in the 21st round of the 1991 draft by the Boston Red Sox out of East Stroudsburg University, Bennett spent the final seven seasons of his career with the Jackals organization. Although he's best known as the ace of the New Jersey staff, Joel was much more than that. The heart and soul of three championship teams, Bennett began his Jackals career in 2001. He went 10-5 with a 2.57 ERA in his first season, but his impact extends far beyond his dominance on the mound.



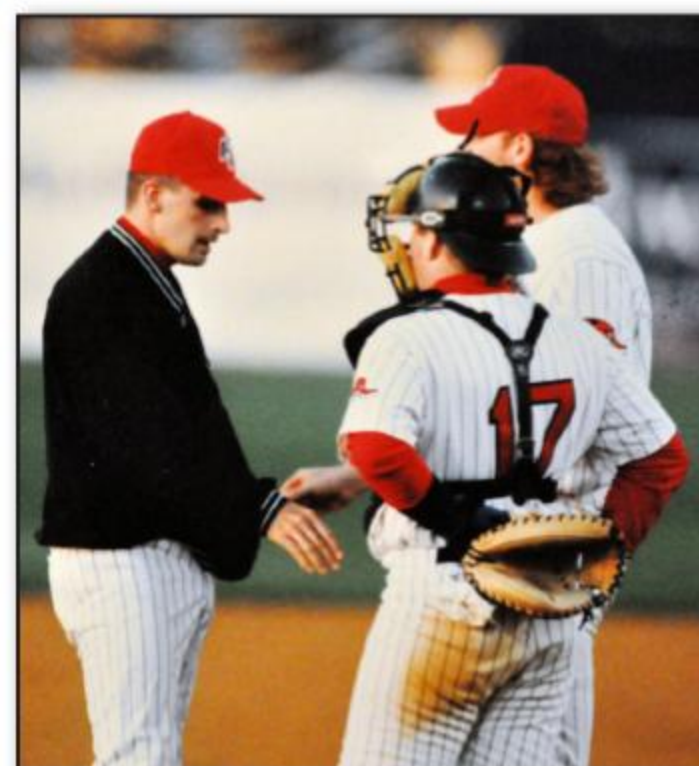
In the midst of the playoffs that year, September 11th struck. When the Northern League decided to continue playing in the wake of the attacks, Bennett was the inspirational leader. The Jackals went on to win their second championship over the Winnipeg Gold-eyes.

Bennett, who pitched seven games in the majors for the Phillies and Orioles in 1998 and 1999, went 14-2 with a 2.93 ERA for New Jersey in 2002. In each of the next five seasons, Joel, who spent baseball offseasons as a physical education teacher near his home in Binghamton, New York, was a late addition to the Jackals. Following the completion of the school year, Bennett would return to the team each June. In 2003, Bennett collected just one loss in 12 starts, compiling an 8-1 record with a miniscule 1.93 ERA.

Rumors of his retirement circulated before the 2004 season, but Bennett once again returned and led the Jackals to the Northeast League title over the North Shore Spirit. Three seasons later, Bennett's place in Jackals lore had been further solidified.

"A person like Joel comes around once or twice in a lifetime. His skill and ability on the field is matched by his care and devotion to his family, team and community," field manager Joe Calfapietra commented.

Bennett concluded his Jackals career with a 59-19 record and 632 strikeouts in 660 innings pitched.



Bennett holds almost every Jackals pitching record, including most wins in a season (14 in 2002), career wins, and strikeouts. On June 23rd, 2002, Bennett set the Jackals single game strikeout record when he fanned 16 Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs.

Joel Bennett's baseball career has taken him seemingly everywhere; From his 1993 season at Single-A Lynchburg where his 241 strikeouts were the third most in all the minors – to his major league debut in 1998 – to the storybook ending of the Jackals 2004 championship season - Bennett found a home each summer at Yogi Berra Stadium. Whether it was atop the mound, in the dugout, in the bullpen, besides manager Joe Calfapietra as his pitching coach, leading the pregame prayer, or signing autographs for enthusiastic young fans, Joel Bennett will always have a place in the Jackals family.
