Mike Tomlin Bio

Mike Tomlin was named the 16th head coach in Pittsburgh Steelers history on January 22, 2007. Hired at the age of 34, Tomlin became only the third head coach hired by the Steelers since 1969.

Through seven seasons, Tomlin has accomplished many things that have never been done in the team's storied history. His 71-41 record (.634) is tied for the best start in franchise history, and he became the youngest head coach in NFL history to both coach in and win a Super Bowl when he led the Steelers to a 27-23 victory over the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII. By winning the Super Bowl in only his second season as a head coach, he also became the fastest to win a Super Bowl title in Steelers history.

In Tomlin's seven years as head coach, he has guided the Steelers' defense to the NFL's top ranking in total defense four times, including most recently in 2012. He has also sent a total of 40 selections to the league's annual Pro Bowl, including two following the 2013 season. Additionally, Tomlin was appointed by Commissioner Roger Goodell to the NFL's Competition Committee in March, 2013.

Tomlin has reached the playoffs four times in his seven seasons, including two trips to the Super Bowl (XLIII and XLV).

Tomlin is one of only seven coaches in league history to win a Super Bowl within his first two seasons as an NFL head coach. Tomlin is the only head coach in Steelers history to lead the team to two Super Bowls in his first four seasons at the helm, including an appearance against the Green Bay Packers in Super Bowl XLV. He is one of only two Steelers head coaches to win three division titles in his first four seasons.

Tomlin is very active in the community and was recognized, along with his wife Kiya, in February, 2013, by the Chuck Cooper Foundation with the Career Achievement in Leadership Diversity and Community Service Award. He has also been a spokesman for the Steelers' and UPMC Sports Medicine's "Don't Hit the Head, Don't Use the Head" program, which is in conjunction with USA Football's Head's Up program that promotes safety in all levels of football. Tomlin is also a member of the All-Pro Dad Team and serves as an honorary chair for the annual Extra Mile golf outing, which provides support for parochial elementary schools educating children of inner-city families.

Arguably one of his best coaching performances may possibly have come in the second half of the 2013 season. Despite an 0-4 and 2-6 start to the season, the Steelers finished the regular season surging to a 6-2 second-half record, falling just short of the playoffs. However, he rallied the team despite numerous injuries on both sides of the ball, to stick together and finished second in the AFC North.

The 2013 campaign also saw quarterback Ben Roethlisberger, wide receiver and team MVP Antonio Brown and running back Le'Veon Bell break numerous regular-season records for the Steelers. Brown and safety Troy Polamalu were each selected to the Pro Bowl following the season.

In 2012, Tomlin led the Steelers to a 27-10 victory over the New York Jets in the home opener, becoming the first coach in team history to win his first six home openers. The Steelers finished the season with the top-ranked overall defense (275.8 ypg) and finished first in passing defense (185.2 ypg).

In 2011, Tomlin led the Steelers to a 12-4 record, marking the second straight season the team posted 12 wins, which was only the second time in team history it has been achieved. The Steelers finished the season with the top-ranked total defense (271.8 ypg) and scoring defense (14.2 ppg). Pittsburgh posted a 7-1 record at home in 2011, for the second time in Tomlin's career (2007). He also had five players (Roethlisberger, Mike Wallace, Maurkice Pouncey, Polamalu and Brown) selected to the Pro Bowl following the season.

Tomlin's seven road wins during the 2010 regular season tied a Steelers record previously set in 1978 and 2004. The Steelers finished second in total defense under Tomlin's guidance in 2010, allowing only 276.8 yards per game. Pittsburgh led the NFL and set a team record in rushing defense, yielding only 62.8 yards per game (1,004 yards), the third-best total in NFL history dating back to 1970. The Steelers also established an NFL record in 2010 by not allowing an opponent to rush for more than 75 yards in any of their first eight games during the regular season.

In all, the Steelers' defense led the NFL in 2010 in rushing yards allowed, points allowed (232), touchdowns (22), quarterback sacks (48), rushing average (3.0), yards per play (4.5) and yards allowed on first down (4.08). It finished second in the league in passing average (6.31), turnover advantage (+14) and red-zone efficiency (40.0, tied).

Under Tomlin, the Steelers broke new ground on offense in 2009. Pittsburgh's offense ranked seventh in the NFL (ninth passing, 19th rushing) but became the first unit in team history to boast a 4,000-yard passer (Roethlisberger), two 1,000-yard receivers (Hines Ward, Santonio Holmes) and a 1,000-yard rusher (Rashard Mendenhall) in the same season. Pittsburgh's defense ranked fifth in the NFL (third vs. run, 16th vs. pass) while leading the AFC and finishing one shy of the NFL lead with 47 quarterback sacks.

The Steelers continued to be dominant at Heinz Field under Tomlin in 2009. Pittsburgh finished with a 6-2 home record after finishing 7-1 (2007) and 6-2 (2008) at home during Tomlin's first two seasons.

Tomlin finished the 2008 season with a 12-4 record and his second consecutive AFC North Division title, becoming the only Steelers head coach to win division crowns in each of his first two seasons. He also set a record with 22 regular-season wins in his first two years at the helm and is the only Steelers head coach to win at least 10 games in each of his first two seasons. Tomlin's .688 winning percentage (22-10) after two years is the best in Steelers history.

The Steelers' defense was dominant under Tomlin's guidance in 2008, leading the NFL in total defense (237.2), pass defense (156.9), points per game (13.9), total yards per play (3.9), rushing yards per attempt (3.3), passing yards per attempt (4.7) and third-down efficiency (31.4), while finishing second in rushing defense (80.3).

Tomlin led the Steelers to a 10-6 record in 2007 and became just the second coach in team history to post a winning record, win a division title and earn a playoff berth in his inaugural season. Tomlin began his head coaching career by becoming only the second Steelers head coach to win his first three games. During 2007, the Steelers became just the fifth team in NFL history to win their first four home games by at least 20 points.

Tomlin guided the Steelers to the NFL's top-ranked defense in 2007, yielding only 266.4 yards per game. The Steelers' defense ranked third in the NFL against both the run (89.9 avg.) and the pass (176.5 avg.), and also finished third in the league in total yards allowed per play (4.6). Pittsburgh's defense led the NFL in passing yards per play (5.7) and first downs allowed per game (15.6), and finished second in the league in points allowed per game (16.8).

The Steelers' offense finished third in the NFL in rushing (135.5 avg.) during Tomlin's first season, sparked by Willie Parker, who led the league in rushing before injuring his leg in Week 16. Roethlisberger enjoyed a record-setting season during Tomlin's first year, establishing new team records for touchdown passes (32) and passer rating (104.1) while earning his first career Pro Bowl appearance.

Tomlin was the NFL's second-youngest head coach in 2007, and he became only the second Steelers' coach in team history to win at least 10 games during his first year at the helm. The Steelers posted a 7-1 record at home in 2007 and were 5-1 in the AFC North (3-0 at home).

Tomlin spent the 2006 season as the Minnesota Vikings' defensive coordinator. That season, the Vikings ranked eighth in the NFL in total defense and first against the run while not allowing a 100-yard rusher the entire season.

Tomlin was the defensive backs coach with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 2001-05. In 2002, Tomlin guided one of the most productive defensive backfields in the NFL, culminating with its performance in Super Bowl XXXVII. The secondary recorded four of the team's five interceptions, returning two for touchdowns, to help Tampa Bay capture the franchise's first Super Bowl title.

Before joining Tampa Bay's staff, Tomlin served two seasons as the defensive backs coach at the University of Cincinnati (1999-00). He took over a secondary that ranked 111th in the nation in pass defense in 1998 and helped them improve to 61st overall in his first season. Under Tomlin's direction in 2000, the Bearcats ranked eighth in the nation in interceptions as well as fourth nationally in total turnovers.

Prior to joining the Cincinnati staff, Tomlin had a short stint on the coaching staff at Tennessee-Martin and then spent two seasons at Arkansas State, coaching wide receivers in 1997 before switching to defensive backs in 1998. Tomlin spent the 1996 season as a graduate assistant at the University of Memphis, where he worked with the Tiger defensive backs and special teams units. He began his coaching career in 1995 as wide receivers coach at Virginia Military Institute.

Tomlin was a three-year starter at wide receiver at William & Mary (1990-94) and finished his career with 101 receptions for 2,054 yards and 20 touchdown catches. A first-team All-Yankee Conference selection in 1994, he established a school record with a 20.2 yards-per-catch average.

Coach Tomlin: Good afternoon. I'll start, as always, quickly with a review of yesterday's performance and then kind of get into some of the season review things. I was pleased with yesterday's performance. I thought it was a definitive victory. But probably one of the most pleasing things was that it wasn't one of our more clean efforts, but we were still able to win the game definitively. I think that speaks to the miles that we covered and how we've evolved as a football team, that we weren't capable of playing our best ball but were able to win the game in definitive fashion. What I mean by some of the things we didn't do well in the game but have done in recent weeks, we turned the ball over in the game. We hadn't done that. We didn't get off the field quickly enough in some instances on defense, but actually we did really stand up in the field goal fringe area, obviously with some of those fourth-down stops throughout the game. We dropped a very catchable interception. We had seized some of those moments in recent weeks. We didn't have a lot of splash in the kicking game. That has aided us quite a bit in recent weeks. So to come up short in some of those areas and still win the game in definitive fashion, I thought it just spoke to the overall growth of the group. We are glad to get the win. Obviously, it was a necessary one to keep us in play. And to finish off the regular season in the manner in which needed to be done, appropriately speaking, against an AFC North opponent, in our home stadium and in front of our fans. I appreciate the efforts of the guys in that regard. On the injury front, we had a few minor injuries in the game. Jerricho Cotchery hurt his ribs. He will be evaluated today. Steve McLendon re-aggravated his high ankle sprain. He will be evaluated today. A few guys that went into the game with bumps and bruises that weren't able to finish, Emmanuel Sanders being one of them. Obviously, we couldn't get Jason Worilds to a level of comfort prior to the game to be able to play effectively. We will continue to deal with those things. I'll try to keep you guys up to date with a myriad of injury things. Obviously, as we push into the offseason, we have to be on our details of getting the ones injured well, and well quickly. All the surgeries that needed to transpire to this point have transpired minus Curtis Brown. If you remember, he had an ACL tear and an MCL injury. The MCL had to heal before the surgery. It has. I think his ACL surgery is scheduled for this Friday. Other than him, all of the other surgeries that needed to transpire have transpired. Obviously, there may be some things that come up at the end of the year, exit physicals and so forth. We aren't going to rush through any of that. We are going to do what is appropriate in regards to closing this out from a health standpoint to put ourselves in the very best position to be as healthy as we can as we push forward into 2014. In review of the season, and looking back at the season, I like to consider myself an accountability guy and responsibility guy. I know that our team does the same. Our record speaks for itself. We fell short this year of getting ourselves in the tournament to chase the ultimate prize, which obviously every year is our intention. We didn't do enough. We didn't do enough, particularly early this year. I think that's been well documented. I'm really proud of the guys, the way they improved, number-one, and the way they stuck together in the midst of adversity. Obviously, it could have gone several ways. You've been around enough football that you know that people tend to seek comfort or get selfish when things were going the way things were going for us earlier in the season. I give a lot of credit to the character of the people that work, players, assistant coaches and even all throughout the organization. Everyone kept a positive, upbeat and can-do attitude in regards to our then present circumstance. We were able to maintain some sort of relevance and improve and put ourselves in a position that we were in yesterday. Obviously, I am sure there is a lot of reaction to what unfolded yesterday evening and last night in regards to our efforts. For me, we made that bed, like I said yesterday after the game. It's my intention to lay in it in a proper manner, professionally speaking, with honor and the right approach. We stepped into 16 stadiums this year with an opportunity to state our case, and we didn't state a strong enough case, so I am not going to lose a lot of sleep over something that went on in a stadium that we weren't even in. We had plenty of opportunities to state our case. What transpired yesterday was unfortunate for our hopes moving forward, but we have to find a way to accept that and move forward, and I am sure

that we will. I'll get an opportunity to meet with the guys today at 2 p.m. and start that process. I think there is also something that needs to be said in regards to this season that I believe in. I believe we have the very best fans in the world. And I would like to thank them for sticking with us throughout what was a trying journey this year. There were many moments during the course of the year where it became very evident to me how special Steelers Nation is. I think about the following we had in London. We went to London as an 0-3 team, and I think about the type of following we had in London, even along the walkway in the bus area after the game when we fell to 0-4. I think about the support we had in New York, coming out of the bye week and going to play the Jets in a road city. I think about the way our fans rallied and supported us here down the stretch with a stretch of home games that were significant in our efforts to stay alive. I don't take it for granted. It doesn't get old. But at the same time, I do want to acknowledge it and thank the fans for riding with us. As we move forward, from a business standpoint and looking ahead to 2014, obviously the necessary business that has to take place, staff things and player things, I'm really just kind of at the very beginning of that. I don't have any strong statements or anything in that regard. I'll do the best I can to answer any questions that you have, but obviously, I am not going to speak inappropriately or too soon in regards to some of the natural business that needs to transpire in all cities in the NFL over the course of the next days and weeks. Those things are reality here. Change is a part of football. Free agency is a part of football. But I won't get into any of that in great detail.

Re: Process for evaluating players and staff:

It's a long and drawn out process for me, something that there is a tendency to try to rush to it and through it. I don't. I take my time. I'll visit with players. I'll set aside blocks of time to do so. I'll evaluate their performance. I'll hear what they have to say in regards to the overall group of the team if you will. I'll do that over the course of the next days or maybe even weeks. I'll have an opportunity to evaluate the staff. Obviously, I'll sit down and map out a plan for moving forward with the Rooney's and Kevin [Colbert] in regards to salary cap, player personnel, looming free agency, draft preparation, etcetera. All of it is normal business for us, but I don't want to rush it. I don't want to make hasty decisions. Obviously, I don't want to make emotional decisions and obviously we've been on an emotional journey. We'll be very deliberate about how we proceed.

Will both coordinators be back next season?

Again like I said, I'm not going to address any of that. Any personnel issues, any staffing issues, is inappropriate. I haven't met with the team and I haven't met with the staff. I will at some point. Obviously, I acknowledge that change is a part of football in staff and in players. But other than that, I'm not getting into that today.

8-8 is 8-8, but do you have a different feel about the way the end of this season was versus the way you left last season?

There are a lot of reasons to be optimistic about what transpired when you look at it over the course of the season. It just speaks to the men that we work with. I learned a lot about them and sometimes you learn a lot about yourself and the people that you work with in the midst of adversity. We had enough adversity, obviously. Starting 0-4 and being 2-6 at the turn, it's encouraging to know the type of men that you work with that are capable of getting singularly focused and tuning out the noise and staying together and continuing to work and improve in the midst of negativity. All of those things are encouraging. But at the same time, as I look back at the body of work, and that's what the beginning of this process is, you've got to acknowledge we are what we are and that's an 8-8 football team on the outside looking in at the tournament. But there is a lot of reason for optimism, a great deal of pride in this group of men that I work with. I just really want to honor their efforts and honor the support and love that we get from our fans.

Was this the most difficult coaching season that you've had?

They're all difficult. I really don't look at it in that way. My job is to provide the team what it needs to be what they're capable of being and that's how I walk in this building every day. Regardless of circumstance, I've got to deliver for them. The circumstances might have been a little different than they were in some years or during the course of it, and we created some of that adversity obviously. But I don't look at it in terms of what I have to do. I just simply do what I have to do in an effort to provide an environment that's conducive to winning and winning consistently and chasing the Lombardi trophy.

How can your team get better in terms of taking care of business against teams that are equally talented or perhaps less talented than you are?

I really don't get into all of that. I'm trying to beat everyone. Where people stand today might be different than where they stood when we played them. I think that's an element of it. I think when we played Detroit they were a division leader, etcetera, etcetera. Teams evolve over the course of the season. You want to be a team that's on the upswing obviously as the season draws to a close so that if you're good enough to get in the tournament, you can have what's necessary to pursue and win the Lombardi trophy. We've got to win every football game. We didn't. We've got to be better. I haven't had a chance to evaluate it from that perspective, but obviously I look forward to doing so.

Re: Handling adversity like injuries differently as a coaching staff:

Obviously, we need to insulate ourselves a little bit better than we did from an injury standpoint. Obviously, I could adjust a little bit better schematically as new positives and new negatives arise as injuries set in and so forth. It's my job to make sure that this group works towards their strengths and works to minimize weaknesses. Obviously, those things change significantly when you have the types of injuries that we had. The ability to adjust, to have a plan and be light on your feet is part of football. To grow over the course of a season, for young players in particular, is a part of football. Those things happened, not quickly enough obviously to get us in the tournament and have an opportunity to move forward. I'll be looking at all of those things and then some moving forward. You can call it assessing blame. For me, it's just looking at it with realistic eyes in an effort to be better the next time and that's what I'll do. Like I said earlier, I'm a believer in accountability and responsibility, and from that standpoint I accept responsibility for what transpires within our organization.

Did Kelvin Beachum show you enough at left tackle that going into next season that could be his position to lose?

He did a very good job of representing what he's capable of, but I'll expect him to continue to improve. I will not allow him to have an opportunity to exhale or seek comfort in regards to that. He's got a big offseason and training camp ahead of him, but he's in pretty decent position from that regard.

The focus and commitment and the staying with it you were talking about, was that something that emerged from this team or was that something that was brought out by a group of leaders or the staff? Where did it come from?

I think it's all of the above. When it's time to circle the wagons, you don't care where great ideas come from and perspective and personalities and I saw it from a myriad of places or a great number of people over the course of the journey. Sometimes it's just as simple as being an energy-bringer as opposed to an energy-drainer. We've got a lot of guys that fall into that category, but like I said it is special

When you're evaluating personnel, how much are leadership characteristics involved in a decision like that, even if a player may not be what he was three years ago?

It's an element, but it's not an element that's exclusive to every particular individual or decision that needs to be made. Largely speaking as you go through this thing, you make necessary decisions and you better have enough guys with experience and natural leadership capabilities and personalities and so forth. Obviously, that will be a part of discussions as we decide what needs to be done from a personnel standpoint, not only in free agency and team development, but also in the draft.

Would you describe your offense as being ahead of your defense right now and maybe even going into 2014?

No, I wouldn't say that. I don't think statistics support that. I think we're 13th in the league in defense or whatever and 20th or so in offense. There are many ways to cut it, obviously. We're an 8-8 football team and that's the bottom line from my perspective. However you cut the mustard, it is what it is. We've got three phases that we look to be as strong as we potentially can be in it in an effort to increase our chances of winning. We've got some work to do in all three phases, obviously.

Are any of your injured reserve guys not on course to be ready for the offseason or camp?

I have no idea. I haven't even begun to ask some of those questions yet. I'm sure I'm going to be getting into those things in the upcoming days.

Re: Using a timeout on the punt at the end of the first half yesterday:

They held their punt team and then when they ran their punt team out on the field, we were in the process of exchanging defense to punt return. At one instance, I thought we had 12 guys on the field. With the new participation rule, you don't have to snap the ball to get penalized for 12 defenders on the field. So I didn't want them to potentially penalize us for 12 people on the field. I called a timeout to preserve that so if we did have 12 on the field that we wouldn't be penalized prior to the ball being snapped. I knew that the play clock was running down, but I wasn't interested in getting into that. I didn't want to have a participation issue. We had some last minute adjustments from a personnel standpoint with Jason Worilds and others being out. That's why I utilized the timeout.

So the timeout was for personnel, not to save time on the clock?

It was for personnel, certainly.

Is there a plan in place for Keith Butler to succeed Dick LeBeau? Is he the coordinator in waiting?

Again, there is no plan in place specifically and I won't be talking about any personnel or staffing issues in great detail today.

Did your coaching philosophy on the no-huddle change as the season evolved?

No, it changes as circumstances evolve. I think week-to-week you ask yourself questions relative to that and I've kind of outlined it in great detail in here over the course of many weeks throughout the course of the season. There is a myriad of decisions that need to transpire as you weigh the options of no-huddle or how much or what personnel group to run it out of or multiple personnel groups to run it out of. Those are discussions that we have as a staff week-in and week-out.

Is this the greatest input Ben Roethlisberger has had into the offense, both in meeting rooms and on the field since you've been here?

No, it's probably consistent with what's transpired in recent years with him. As we get down to the course of the season and we find rhythm or continuity in terms of the people that we're utilizing and how we're playing. He's been a part of the process. He did a great job of it this year, obviously, and not only in terms of his input but his leadership. We've got a bunch of young guys. I really thought he answered the bell for us in a big way in that regard and others. But just specifically in regards to input, he's been involved in input for a number of years here, as all veteran signal callers should be.

As far as the no-huddle and the opponent, do you not look how much success you've had with it in the past games?

No, it's not opponent only. It's circumstances and I think I was pretty clear in discussing that. Most of the time when I outline the variables that are significant in terms of determining how much or if we do utilize it, I talk about us and our people and so forth.

Is there an area or two from the season that you're pleased with the improvement you saw? And conversely, is there an area or two where you weren't pleased with the progress you made?

I really haven't had enough time probably to take a step back and give you a fair assessment of it from that standpoint. Obviously, there are plenty of things to be proud of, there are plenty of things that need to improve. I think the overwhelming feeling that I have as I sit here right now is just a great deal of pride in the group and their willingness to stick together and their ability to maintain focus and improve over the course of the season. I think that's probably the theme that I'll remember regarding this group more than anything else. But there are a myriad of things and specific things that I'm sure that we got better at that need acknowledgment and things that we fell short.

Did you watch the San Diego-Kansas City game with the guys? Did a bunch of the guys watch the late game together?

I don't know what they did. I went home.

Re: Challenge flexibility moving forward based on what has transpired the last few weeks:

Obviously, there is a lot of work that needs to be done from an officiating standpoint. I think it has been played out and well documented over the last several weeks, not only in the stadiums we have played in but others. I look forward to being part of the process of helping it improve. I think that's the mentality that we all should have. We are all blessed to be a part of the NFL. I take a great deal of pride in that. I always want to be somebody that is part of the solution as opposed to someone that is complaining and moaning about the problem. I intend to roll my sleeves up and offer any insight that I can in terms of making this the very best it can be moving forward. Like I said when I opened this thing, I am not looking to assess blame on anybody else about our current position other than ourselves.

Re: Reaction to the San Diego game:

What do you think?

I don't know.

Come on. You're a smart guy.

When you saw Kansas City line up for the field goal, could you see on the television that San Diego was committing a penalty?

Yes.

Do you think having full-time referees could help?

I think that and other things are up for discussion but I'm not going to get into that, just like I am not going to talk about personnel and staffing. It's inappropriate for this setting. Having an opportunity to be a part of the competition committee and the number of meetings we have scheduled moving into the offseason in an effort to ensure that football is the very best product we can provide for the fans, I look forward to being a part of that.

Did LaMarr Woodley need surgery for his injury?

It's a rehabilitation thing. There are no procedures scheduled at this juncture.

When you saw they missed the penalty call on the field goal, did you say anything or yell at the television like a lot of people would?

I'll leave that between myself, my sons and our basement.

Have you received any calls from the league about the officiating from yesterday's Chiefs-Chargers game?

I have received calls, texts and emails. Those guys do a great job of communicating during difficult times. I appreciate that. But it doesn't change what transpired.

Re: Evaluating yourself this offseason:

I'll evaluate everything that I do and how we go about it in an effort to be better. Obviously, I will leave the evaluation of my performance where it should be, to the Rooneys.

Re: Ike Taylor possibly playing safety:

That hasn't been discussed formerly in any form or fashion. Ike and I talk about that from time to time because a lot of guys that have played his position have extended their careers in that manner, particularly guys that have the type of size that he has. Nothing has been discussed formerly in any form or fashion, and I don't think anything needs to be read into that at all.

Re: The fake punt call in overtime during the Chiefs-Chargers game and should there have been a review:

I haven't kept up with the press releases and stuff coming out of New York in regards to some of those things. I will let those guys comment on it. I think that's appropriate. I will follow up if given an opportunity. But I am not going to say anything before they do.

Re: Rationale behind instituting the new rule on field goals and extra points:

It was for player safety. There were guys coming in twos through the gap and some of the ugly things that were transpiring with people toppling over people and things of that nature. I think that was the original intention of the rule.

What officials are responsible for making that call?

There were two guys positioned behind that group, but again, I'll let those guys make comments in regards to what mechanically was done correct or incorrect in that time period. I think it's just best that I wrap a bow around the season and move on from there.

2013 Season-in-Review Notes

TEAM NOTES

Nice Finish: After a slow start to the season, Pittsburgh finished 6-2 in the final eight games, including winning three straight to close out the season for the first time since 2009. It was the fourth time (2008, '10, '11) that the Steelers went 6-2 in the final eight games of the regular season under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**.

Air Attack: The Steelers offense had a lot of success in 2013 through the air. Below are some highlights:

- **QB Ben Roethlisberger** recorded the most completions (375) and attempts (584) in a single regular season in franchise history.
- Roethlisberger totaled the second-most passing yards (4,261) and tied Terry Bradshaw (1978) for the second-most passing touchdowns (28) by a Steelers' player in a single regular season (Roethlisberger, 32 in 2007).
- **WR Antonio Brown** recorded the most receiving yards (1,499) in a single season for a Steeler, and his 110 receptions were the second most in the regular season in franchise history (Hines Ward, 112 in 2002).
- Pittsburgh recorded 4,017 net passing yards, the third-most in a single regular season (4,148 in 2009, 4,054 in 2011).
- With 4,306 gross passing yards this season, the team finished with the third-most in Steelers' history (4,496 in 2009, 4,333 in 2011).
- Dating back to 1940, set a franchise record by recording over 350 net passing yards in four games (379, 357, 371, 358).
- 28 passing touchdowns tied (2009, 1978) for the second most during the regular season in franchise history (34 in 2007).
- 32 pass plays of 25+ yards was the fourth-most for a Steelers team (39 in 2009, 34 in 1995, 33 in 2010), dating back to 1994.
- Completed 377 passes, a new team record for the regular season.
- Registered a completion percentage of 64.3, the second highest in franchise history (65.5 in 2009).
- Passer rating of 92.3 is the fifth-highest by Pittsburgh in the regular season.
- 207 passing first downs is the third most by the Steelers (221 in 2011, 210 in 2009).
- Pittsburgh scored at least 20 points in each of the last nine games (31, 23, 37, 27, 20, 28, 30, 38, 20). It is the first time it has scored at least 20 points in at least nine consecutive regular season games since 2002 (9).

Award Winners: The 2013 season saw many Steelers' players get awarded for their individual performances. Pittsburgh is sending multiple players to the Pro Bowl for the 13th straight season and for the 22nd time in the last 25 seasons. A Steelers player earned a player of the week or month honor four times during the 2013 season. Below is a breakdown of the various honors earned by Steelers' players in 2013.

QB Ben Roethlisberger

- Named AFC Player of the Month for November (Oct. 31-Nov. 25) after registering a passer rating of 100.5 and leading the Steelers to a 3-1 record. Also threw for 1,188 yards, 11 touchdowns and just three interceptions.

- Earned AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance in a Week 11 victory over Detroit. Roethlisberger completed 29-of-45 pass attempts for 367 yards with four touchdowns and zero interceptions for a season-high passer rating of 119.4. He also led a 16-play, 97-yard touchdown drive in the fourth quarter to take a 30-27 lead. It marked the ninth time Roethlisberger has been named AFC Offensive Player of the Week, and first time since in 2011 (Weeks 5 and 8).

WR Antonio Brown

- Named second-team All-Pro by the Associated Press.
- Selected to the Pro Bowl as a both a wide receiver and punt returner, joining Philadelphia's DeSean Jackson (2010 Pro Bowl) as the only players to be named to the Pro Bowl team at two different positions in the same season. It marks his second selection to the Pro Bowl after previously earning a trip to Hawaii after the 2011 season as a punt returner.
- Voted by his teammates as the Steelers' 2013 Most Valuable Player. It was the second time in Brown's four-year career that he has received the honor. He became the 11th player in team history to be named Steelers' Most Valuable Player on multiple occasions.

S Troy Polamalu

- Earned his eighth Pro Bowl selection after recording 85 tackles, two sacks, two interceptions, a career-high five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one defensive touchdown. Also named to the Pro Bowl following the 2004-08 and 2010-11 seasons.
- Named AFC Defensive Player of Week 12 after he registered four tackles, one sack, a single-game career high two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one pass defensed in the Steelers 27-11 victory at Cleveland. It was the seventh time he has been named AFC Defensive Player of the Week and the first time since Week 17 of 2011.

K Shaun Suisham

- Named the AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his clutch performance in a win over the Baltimore Ravens in Week 7. Suisham was a perfect 4-for-4 (34, 28, 38, 42) on field goals, including a game-winning 42-yarder as time expired. It was the fourth time Suisham was selected as Special Teams Player of the Week in his career.

Late Season Success: Under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**, the Steelers are 25-14 during the regular season and postseason in December/January. The Steelers were 3-1 this season with wins coming at Heinz Field and at Lambeau Field. The 25 wins are tied for the sixth-most in the NFL (2007-present).

Pittsburgh won their Week 17 matchup versus Cleveland 20-7, making them 12-2 in Week 17 games since 2000, which is tied for the best record in the NFL over that span (Green Bay).

Heinz Field Advantage: Pittsburgh closed out the regular season at Heinz Field by winning five of its last six home games.

The Steelers own the best home record in the NFL with a 244-95-1 record (.719) since 1970. Pittsburgh is 75-28-1 (.726) at home since Heinz Field opened in 2001, which is the third-best winning percentage in the NFL during that time span. Only six opponents have registered multiple regular-season victories at Heinz Field. Below are the top five home records since 2001:

In the first seven seasons under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**, the Steelers are 41-15 at home during the regular season, which is the fourth-best home record in the NFL during that time. Under Tomlin, Pittsburgh has won at least five games at home each season, including a 5-3 record in 2013. The last time Pittsburgh did not win at least five home games in a season was 2003. Since 2004, Pittsburgh and New England are the only teams in the league to register at least five wins at home during each regular season.

Pittsburgh finished the 2004 regular season with an undefeated (8-0) home record for only the third time in team history and for the first time in 25 years.

The Steelers finished the 1979 regular season with an undefeated home record (8-0) and eventually won Super Bowl XIV. The Steelers were also undefeated at home (7-0) in 1972.

Defense Feels At Home: Pittsburgh's defense gave up 20 points or less in five of eight home games this season, including only seven in a Week 17 victory over Cleveland and 10 in a Week 10 victory over Buffalo. In each of those games the Steelers did not allow a touchdown until the final two possessions of the game.

Pittsburgh gave up 27 points to Detroit in the first half of a Week 11 victory but held them scoreless in the second half and forced three turnovers. The Steelers yielded 40 points in Week 3 against Chicago in part due to five turnovers, including two the Bears brought back for touchdowns. Pittsburgh allowed 34 to Miami but provided an interception returned for a touchdown by **S Troy Polamalu**.

Pittsburgh's 18.1 points per game allowed at home are the fewest in the AFC since the start of 2012.

Since **Dick LeBeau** has been defensive coordinator (2004-present), the Steelers have allowed an average of 16.0 points per game at Heinz Field, which is the second-lowest in the NFL over that time span for points given up at home during the regular season (Baltimore, 15.8).

Controlling The NFC: The Steelers have won 31 of their past 44 regular-season games versus teams in the NFC, dating back to 2003, including an 8-4 record since the start of the 2011 season. Pittsburgh's eight wins are the fourth-most by an AFC team against the NFC (nine wins by KC, DEN and CIN).

In 2013 Pittsburgh played the NFC North. The Steelers fell to Chicago and Minnesota before closing out their NFC slate with a win at home against Detroit and at NFC North Champion Green Bay. Under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**, Pittsburgh is 20-10 against NFC teams (including the postseason).

The Steelers are 104-63-1 all-time against the NFC in the regular and postseason, including 60-20-1 at home. Since 2009, Pittsburgh is 9-1 against the NFC at Heinz Field.

The Steelers are 6-2 versus the NFC in the Super Bowl.

Facing The Champs: Pittsburgh split the season series against Baltimore in 2013, which makes the Steelers 5-7 when facing the defending Super Bowl champion, including the postseason, since 2000.

The Steelers' have won two of their last three games over defending Super Bowl champions (24-20 at the New York Giants in 2012, 19-16 win at home versus Baltimore and a 20-22 loss at Baltimore).

The other three wins since 2000 were a pair of victories over Baltimore during the 2001 season after the Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV and a win over the Patriots in 2004, the season after New England won Super Bowl XXXVIII.

In Control In Cleveland: Dating back to 1999, Pittsburgh has won 12 of 15 games in what is now called FirstEnergy Stadium, including a 27-11 victory in Week 12 in 2013. The Steelers 12 wins in Cleveland since 1999 lead all NFL teams. Pittsburgh's .800 winning percentage on the road against the Browns ranks first in the NFL among teams who have played at least six games there.

In the 15 games played in Cleveland since 1999, Pittsburgh has outscored the Browns 348-166. Of the 15 games, the Steelers held Cleveland to single digits seven times, including two shutouts. The most points the Browns have scored at home against Pittsburgh since 1999 was 23 (2000).

Under Head Coach **Mike Tomlin**, the Steelers are 5-2 at Cleveland, which ties with Baltimore (5-2) for the most regular-season wins at Cleveland during that time span. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** is 8-1 as a starter on the road against the Browns.

So Close: The Pittsburgh Steelers and Baltimore Ravens have played some of the most memorable games in the NFL over the years and the 2013 season was no different, with both games being decided by a total of five points.

Out of the 39 times the two teams have met, including the postseason, 25 have been decided by single digits and 16 of those have been by three points or less. Nine of the last 11 matchups have been determined by three points, including each of the last five games with Pittsburgh winning two to Baltimore's three.

LOOKING AHEAD...

The Steelers will have the 15th overall pick in the first round of the 2014 NFL Draft, which will be held May 8-10.

Thanksgiving Matchup: In 2013, the Pittsburgh Steelers and Baltimore Ravens faced off on Thanksgiving for the first time, with the Ravens' winning at home, 22-20.

It was the seventh time the Steelers played on Thanksgiving (1-6) and the first time since a 19-16 overtime loss at Detroit in 1998. The Steelers only win on Thanksgiving came at the Chicago Cardinals in 1950 (28-17). This year marked the first time Pittsburgh faced an AFC team on Thanksgiving.

Dating back to 2008, Pittsburgh was the first team to play an away game on a Thursday after playing on the road the previous week.

Fighting Through: The Steelers offensive line had to deal with a number of obstacles during the 2013 season. The line started three centers as Pro Bowler **Maurkice Pouncey** was lost for the season in the first game of the year and his replacement **Fernando Velasco** suffered a season ending injury at Baltimore on November 28. The Steelers started seven different line combinations in 2013, including three in the final seven games.

Despite dealing with injuries that forced multiple guys to play multiple positions, the line has had some strong performances:

- In the final seven games, the offensive line only allowed one sack or less six times. Pittsburgh attempted 246 passes in those seven games while giving up a total of seven sacks.
- In a four-game span (Week 11-14), the offensive line surrendered just four sacks, which was the lowest total in a four-game span during the regular season for a Steelers' offensive line since 2005 (10/23 – 11/13).
- The Steelers did not allow a sack in back-to-back games, at Cleveland and at Baltimore.
- The line cleared the way for Pittsburgh to record over 100 rushing yards in six games during the 2013 season (141 vs. Bal / 108 at NE / 136 vs. Buf / 106 vs. Cin / 151 at GB / 120 vs. Cle). The Steelers were 5-1 in those contests.
- In a Week 16 victory at Green Bay, they helped **RB Le'Veon Bell** become the eighth Steelers' rookie (dating back to 1960) to rush for at least 100 yards (124 yards on 26 carries and one TD).

A Good 10-Plus Years: Pittsburgh is one of five teams to win at least 100 regular-season games since the start of the 2003 season. They are also second in Super Bowl appearances over that time span and tied for the lead with two Super Bowl victories.

Tomlin's 71 wins after his first seven seasons are tied for the most wins in team history for any coach after his first seven seasons. His two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first seven seasons. Tomlin's four postseason berths and three division titles are tied for second for the most in a coach's first seven seasons.

Tomlin's 29 regular-season wins against division opponents are tied for the fourth-most in the NFL and the most of any AFC North team since 2007 (Baltimore: 25-17 / Cincinnati: 20-22 / Cleveland: 10-32).

Tomlin has won at least four games against division opponents in five of his first seven seasons. Tomlin owns an impressive 16-5 record against divisional foes at Heinz Field.

High Honor Roll: Defensive coordinator **Dick LeBeau** was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August of 2010. He has registered 28 300+ yard passing games in his career during the regular season, including throwing for 406 yards against Chicago in Week 3, and 383 yards versus Minnesota in Week 4 of 2013. It was the first time in his career he threw for at least 375 yards in back-to-back games. Also in 2013, Roethlisberger threw for 400 yards at New England in Week 9, for 367 yards in a victory over Detroit in Week 11 and for 349 yards against Miami in Week 14.

He registered the fourth-most games with at least 375 passing yards (3) in the NFL during the 2013 regular season (Peyton Manning, 6 / Drew Brees, 5 / Philip Rivers, 4).

The 406 yards in Week 3 of 2013 were the fourth-most passing yards of his career and the sixth-most in franchise history. It was the eighth time a quarterback has thrown for at least 400 yards against the Bears and only the second time dating back to 2001 (Brian Griese, 407 yards, 9/21/08).

Finding The End Zone: Over the final seven games of the 2013 regular season, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** registered 15 touchdown passes and four interceptions while throwing for 1,727 yards. With 219 career touchdown passes during the regular season Roethlisberger passed QB Terry Bradshaw (212) for the most in franchise history. He needs four more passing touchdowns (239) to pass Bradshaw (242) for the most by a Steelers' player during the regular and postseason.

He threw 28 touchdowns during the 2013 regular season, which was the second-most of his career during one regular season (32 in 2007) and tied for the second-most in franchise history (Terry Bradshaw, 28, 1978).

The 2013 season was the second time in his career that he recorded at least one passing touchdown in each game he played during the regular season (13 games played in 2012). This season marked the first time in his career in which he has thrown at least one touchdown pass in each of the team's 16 regular-season games.

Roethlisberger totaled at least three touchdown passes in 27 games during his career, including three times in 2013 (4 at NE and vs. DET / 3 vs. MIA) and four times in 2012 (4 at Oak / 3 vs.

Was / 3 vs. SD / 3 vs. Cle), which marked the second-most times he has thrown for at least three touchdowns in a game in one season (5 in 2007 and 2009).

Roethlisberger had won 12 straight games against divisional foes as the starter prior to a Week 3 setback at Cincinnati in 2009, which was the longest streak in the NFL since Peyton Manning won 12 straight from 2004-06.

Home Cooking: QB Ben Roethlisberger owns a 54-18 (.750) mark in the regular season in his career at Heinz Field, including winning his first eight starts as a rookie in 2004. Roethlisberger is 16-6 at home since the start of the 2011 regular season. Dating back to 2011, Roethlisberger is one of five active quarterbacks to have a passer rating of at least 97.0 at home during the regular season (99.3).

In his regular-season career at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger has completed 63.2 percent of his passes for 17,182 yards with 114 passing touchdowns and 56 interceptions for a passer rating of 95.1. He has thrown for more than 300 yards 14 times and has 33 multi-touchdown games at home (25-8 record in such games), including throwing for 406 yards in Week 3 versus Chicago, for 367 yards in a Week 11 victory over Detroit and for 349 yards in Week 14 versus Miami. He is one of six active quarterbacks to throw at least 110 touchdowns at home during the regular season.

Roethlisberger has twice posted a perfect passer rating at home, including most recently in Week 9 of 2007 against Baltimore. He also had a perfect passer rating (158.3) against Tennessee in the 2005 season opener and has posted a passer rating of at least 125.0 eight times.

The Steelers have scored at least 20 points in 57 of the 72 games at home with Roethlisberger as the starter, including six times during the 2013 season.

Facing The NFC: With a career record of 95-47 as a starter, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted gaudy numbers no matter the opposition.

Throughout his career, Roethlisberger has feasted on competition from the NFC:

- 26-10 in 36 career regular-season games against NFC opponents. Roethlisberger won his first seven starts against NFC teams.
- Completed 655-of-1,048 passes (62.5 pct.) for 8,550 yards with 54 touchdowns, 26 interceptions and a passer rating of 95.0.
- In four games against NFC teams in 2013 Roethlisberger threw for 1,323 yards, nine touchdowns, four interceptions, a completion percentage of 64.8 and a passer rating of 97.6.

Roethlisberger's statistics against the NFC are equally impressive in games at Heinz Field. In 18 career games against NFC opponents at home, Roethlisberger has a 16-2 mark while completing 318-of-522 passes (60.9 pct.) for 4,354 yards with 28 touchdowns and 10 interceptions for a passer rating of 97.5.

Man Of The Year: Steelers quarterback **Ben Roethlisberger** was named the Steelers 2013 Walter Payton Man of the Year. He is one of 32 NFL team's Man of the Year award winners and

qualifies for the league's national 2013 Walter Payton Man of the Year.

The award recognizes a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence. The overall winner will be announced during Super Bowl XLVIII in New York/New Jersey.

Below are some of his community efforts:

- The Ben Roethlisberger Foundation, started in 2006, makes grants to local police and fire departments with an emphasis on K-9 units and service dogs.
- Donated \$30,000 to Make-A-Wish of Greater Pennsylvania to help grant more wishes.
- Participated, along with his wife, in the annual Salvation Army Project Bundle Up shopping night, helping underprivileged children choose warm winter outerwear.
- Attends many of his teammate's charity events.
- Provides a holiday dinner annually for those in need.
- Was honored with the Boys & Girls Club of Western Pennsylvania "National Champion of Youth Award" for his continued commitment to the community, particularly his work with children.
- Hosts an annual football camp, with many Boys & Girls Club members attending for free thanks to his generosity.

Starting In Style: In his career, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** owns an 95-47 (.669) record as a starting quarterback in the regular season. That mark is the third-best regular season record in the NFL among all active quarterbacks (min. 50 starts).

Feeling At Home in Ohio: **QB Ben Roethlisberger** is from Cory Rawson, Ohio, and played collegietely at Miami (Ohio) so it is no wonder he feels at home while playing at Cincinnati or Cleveland. Including the postseason, Roethlisberger is a combined 17-3 playing at Paul Brown Stadium (9-2) and FirstEnergy Stadium (8-1). His only losses at either Cleveland or Cincinnati came by 10 points or less.

Brown Steps Up: WR Antonio Brown emerged as one of the top receivers in the NFL during his fourth season. The 2013 regular season saw Brown record the second-most receptions in franchise history (110) and the most receiving yards (1,499) for a Steelers' player a single regular season. He was also selected as Team MVP by his teammates for the second time in his career (2011).

Below are some more highlights from his 2013 season that saw him earn his second Pro Bowl selection (punt returner, 2011), this time as both a wide receiver and punt returner:

- Became the first player in NFL history to register at least five receptions and 50 receiving yards in all 16 games of a regular season. The streak of 16 regular-season games with at least five receptions and 50 receiving yards is the second longest streak in the NFL, dating back to 1960.

Answering the Bell: Rookie RB Le'Veon Bell had to battle through injuries during the preseason and early part of the regular season, missing the first three games. Since he returned to the field in Week 4, the rookie contributed and evolved in the final 13 games. Below are some highlights from his 2013 rookie season:

Miller Time: TE Heath Miller has been a consistent performer for the Steelers throughout his career. After suffering a knee injury in Week 16 of 2012, Miller returned to the field for the first time in Week 3 versus Chicago and played in every game since. Below are some highlights from the 2013 season:

- 58 receptions on the season, marked the fourth time he has registered at least 50 receptions in the last five regular seasons (76 in 2009 / 71 in 2012 / 51 in 2011).
- Tied a career-best with eight receptions in a victory over Detroit in Week 11 and in a two-point loss at Baltimore in Week 13. He has now recorded eight receptions six times in his career during the regular season.

- Registered six receptions in both Games 4-5, marking the second time in his career that he has recorded at least six receptions in back-to-back games (10/11/12-10/21/12).
- Recorded eight receptions of at least 20 yards (21, 21, 22, 22, 28, 31, 31).
- Registered at least one reception in all 14 games he played in during the 2013 season and every game in which he has played in, regular and postseason, dating back to 11/3/08 vs. Washington, a streak of 88 games.

Despite only playing in 15 games in 2012, Miller was named Steelers MVP and selected to his second career Pro Bowl. Miller's 71 receptions led the team and ranked second in the AFC among tight ends.

In 2012, Miller set career highs with 816 receiving yards and eight touchdown receptions. Miller's 816 receiving yards led all AFC tight ends and his eight touchdowns were second-most in the AFC amongst tight ends.

Miller Climbs The Ranks: TE Heath Miller has 40 career receiving touchdowns, passing Elbie Nickel (37) for the most by a Pittsburgh tight end and ranking fifth in team history. The Steelers are 27-9 when Miller finds the end zone.

Miller (466) passed Nickel (329) for the franchise lead in receptions by a tight end in 2011. Against Baltimore in Week 13 of 2013 he passed Nickel (5,131) for the fifth-most receiving yards in franchise history (5,273) and the most by a Steelers' tight end.

Miller has registered at least one reception in 141-of-149 career games played, including the postseason.

Since 2008, Miller has surpassed 40 receptions each season, including a career-best 76-reception performance in 2009 and 58 in 2013. During the first nine years of his career, Miller averaged over 10 yards per catch each season, including 10.2 in 2013.

Calm and Cool Catchery: The veteran leader of the Steelers wide receivers is **WR Jericho Cotchery**. He has eclipsed 400 receptions and 5,000 yards in his 10-year NFL career. Besides providing leadership, he also contributes on the field. Below are some highlights from this season:

- Led the team with a career-high 10 receiving touchdowns in 2013. His previous career high was six in 2006.
- His 10 receiving touchdowns in 2013 tied for the ninth-most by a Steelers receiver during the regular season. The most touchdown receptions by a Steeler during the regular season is 12 (Hines Ward, 2002 / Louis Lipps, 1985 / Buddy Dial, 1961).
- Finished the 2013 season by recording eight touchdowns in the last nine games.
- Ranked fourth in the NFL in first-down percentage (78.3) in 2013, among receivers with an average of at least two receptions a game.
- Third among Steelers' wide receivers with 46 receptions for 602 yards. It was the first time he has surpassed 500 receiving yards in a single season since 2009 (821).
- Recorded a team-high 103 yards on five receptions with one touchdown versus Minnesota in Week 4. It was the ninth 100+ yard receiving game of his career during the regular season and the first since 9/27/09 (8 rec. for 108 yards and one touchdown vs. Ten).
- Finished with a team-high seven receptions for 96 yards and a career-high three receiving touchdowns at New England in Week 9. Became the first Steelers' receiver since Hines Ward (10/22/06 at ATL) to register three receiving touchdowns in the same game. It was the second multi-touchdown game of his career (two receiving touchdowns vs. Arizona on 9/28/08).
- Registered one touchdown reception in a Week 10 victory over Buffalo, becoming the first Steelers' receiver since

Hines Ward in 2006 (4 rec. TDs, 10/15-10/22) to record four receiving touchdowns in a two-game span during the regular season.

- Recorded a 20-yard touchdown reception late in the fourth quarter to seal the victory over Detroit in Week 11.
- Hauled in the potential game tying touchdown late in the fourth quarter at Baltimore on Thanksgiving, but the two-point conversion was unsuccessful.

Sanders Steps In: Following the 2012 season the Steelers managed to hold onto **WR Emmanuel Sanders**, who was one of the only restricted free agents in the NFL to receive an offer sheet this past off season (New England). Sanders played in all 16 games for the Steelers in 2013, starting a career-best 10 games. Below are some highlights from the 2013 season.

- Twice tied his career high with seven receptions (7 for 57 yards in Week 1 vs. TEN and 7 for 88 and one touchdown in Week 8 at OAK).
- Recorded at least one reception in all 16 games.
- Finished second on the team with career-highs of 67 receptions and 740 receiving yards. His previous highs were 44 receptions and 626 receiving yards in 16 games in 2012.
- With six touchdown receptions in 2013, surpassed his previous career high of two that he set in 2010 and 2011.
- Registered three receptions of 40+ yards (42 yards at NE, 43 yards at CIN and 55 yards at NYJ).
- In Week 2 he recorded a team-best 78 yards receiving on five receptions, including a career-long reception of 43 yards that set up the Steelers at the Cincinnati one-yard line.
- Provided one of the highlights of the Week 4 game against Minnesota, a 36-yard reception to the Vikings 21-yard line on a drive that resulted in a touchdown.
- In a Week 6 victory over the New York Jets he registered the longest reception of his career, a 55-yard touchdown.
- At Oakland in Week 8 he ran in a two-point conversion to cut the Raiders lead to three late in the fourth quarter.
- He led the team with a career-high 98 yards on six receptions in Week 9 at New England.
- Registered a touchdown reception in three consecutive games for the first time in his career: at CLE, at BAL and vs. MIA.

Sanders also contributed on special teams during the 2013 season. In Week 7 against Baltimore he returned a kickoff 44 yards to the Pittsburgh 37-yard line, setting up a drive that resulted in a game-winning field goal. In a Week 16 victory at Green Bay, he recorded a 54-yard kickoff return to the GB 45-yard line with under two minutes left in the first half, setting up a drive that resulted in a field goal.

INDIVIDUAL DEFENSIVE NOTES

Heyward Emerges: DE Cameron Heyward emerged in his third season as both a force against the run and the pass. After not starting the first 34 regular-season games of his career, Heyward started 13 of the last 14 contests of the 2013 season. Below are highlights from 2013:

- Set career highs with 63 tackles, 45 solo tackles, five sacks and 31 quarterback pressures.
- His 31 quarterback pressures led the Steelers.
- Recorded five sacks in the final nine games.
- Led the team with a career-high 12 tackles (8 solo) against Miami in Week 14.
- Recorded a sack and led the team with three quarterback pressures in a Week 17 victory over Cleveland.
- Tied for the team lead with three quarterback pressures in a Week 15 victory over the Bengals.

- Registered the first fumble recovery of his career and returned it eight yards to the Cleveland 44-yard line in a Week 12 victory.
- Recorded career-highs with nine tackles and seven solo tackles at Oakland in Week 8.
- Produced a sack in back-to-back games (at NE and vs. BUF) for the first time in his career.
- Led the team with a career-high six quarterback pressures in a win at the New York Jets in Week 6.

It's Worlds' World: In his first three seasons **LB Jason Worlds** was limited in his defensive opportunities due to the players he backed up, Pro Bowl linebackers James Harrison and **LaMarr Woodley**. When Worlds got his opportunity to play extensively on defense in 2013, he took advantage of it.

- Started 11-of-15 games in 2013, passing his career-best of seven from 2011.
- Despite missing the last game-and-a-half due to injury, recorded a team-high eight sacks, passing his career high of five set in 2012.
- Finished second on the team with 29 quarterback pressures.
- Led the team with a career-high six quarterback pressures in a victory at Cleveland. His previous high was four quarterback pressures on 10/24/10 at Miami.
- Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, registered 13 sacks in 31 games played, while only starting 14 games.
- In 21 career starts he has 11 sacks, including seven of his eight sacks in 2013 coming in the 11 games he started.
- Four times during his career, Week 13 at Baltimore and Week 9 at New England during the 2013 season, Week 12 at Cleveland in 2012 and Week 14 versus the Browns in 2011, Worlds has registered two sacks in one game.
- Finished tied for the team lead with nine tackles (eight solo) at Baltimore in Week 13.
- Led the linebackers with eight tackles (seven solo) against Miami in Week 14.
- Tied for the team lead with three quarterback hurries in a victory over Cincinnati in Week 15.

Troy Being Troy: S Troy Polamalu has made a career of making plays on defense. He has done it so well that he has been selected Defensive Player of the Year once and All-Pro six times by the Associated Press (four first-team and two second-team selections), as well as chosen to eight Pro Bowls, including being selected for his performance in 2013. After injuries kept him to only seven games played in 2012, Polamalu played in every game during the 2013 season and made an impact.

- Two sacks tied for the second-most he has registered in one regular season (3.0 in 2005 and 2.0 in 2003).
- Set a single season career-high with five forced fumbles in 2013.
- Registered at least one sack, one interception, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in the same regular season for the third time in his career.

- Recorded one sack, a fumble recovery and a career-high two forced fumbles in a victory at Cleveland in Week 12.
- Led the defense with 10 tackles (eight solo) and one forced fumble at New England in Week 9. It was his 15th game with at least 10 tackles and first since 2011.
- Registered a sack and interception in Week 8 at Oakland.
- Blocked a PAT versus the Bears in Week 3.

Gotta Be Da Beard: DE Brett Keisel was a team captain and veteran leader on defense in 2013. He also provided steady play on the defensive line each time he stepped on the field.

- Despite missing four games due to injury, ranked third on the team in quarterback pressures (26) in 2013.
- Finished the season third on the Steelers' defensive line with 38 tackles (26 solo).
- In Week 2, he recorded a team-high five quarterback pressures.
- Against the Bears in Week 3, Keisel sacked QB Jay Cutler for a loss of two yards.
- Recorded seven tackles, one sack and registered the sixth fumble recovery of his career in Week 8 at Oakland, which set the offense up at the Raiders 11-yard line in the fourth quarter.
- Registered a team-high five quarterback pressures and led the defensive line with four tackles at New England in Week 9.
- Made some key plays late in the game in a victory at Green Bay in Week 15. On the Packers second to last drive, sacked QB Matt Flynn on first down for a three-yard loss on first-and-10 and then on third-and-8 recovered a Flynn fumble at the GB 17-yard line that was forced by **S Troy Polamalu**. The ensuing drive resulted in a touchdown to give the Steelers' a 38-31 lead with 1:28 to go.
- Finished off the season with a forced a fumble on a sack of QB Jason Campbell that was recovered by **LB Chris Carter** at the Pittsburgh 23-yard line in a victory over the Browns.

Timmons Time: On a defense that has struggled to stay healthy over the last few seasons, **LB Lawrence Timmons** has been a player the Steelers can count on being in the lineup each week. Timmons, who has missed only two games his entire career, started his team-leading 53rd consecutive regular-season game in Week 17 versus Cleveland. Since the start of the 2010 season,

Timmons has started (63) and played in (64) the most games out of any Steelers' linebacker, while also leading the group in tackles over that time. Timmons finished the 2013 season with the team lead in tackles (155, 105 solo).

Timmons not only played in every game in 2013, he also made an impact.

- Registered over 100 tackles (career-high 155) for the third time in the last four seasons (149 in 2010 and 134 in 2012).
- Recorded at least one sack (3.0), interception (2), forced fumble (1) and fumble recovery (1) in the same regular season for the fourth time in his career (2008, '10, '12)
- He recorded at least 10 tackles eight times in 2013: Tennessee (11, six solo), Chicago (10, seven solo), the New York Jets (10, six solo), Baltimore (20, 17 solo), Oakland (12, five solo), Cincinnati (10, five solo), Green Bay (10, eight solo) and Cleveland (12, nine solo). Timmons has registered double digit tackles in 25 games during his career, including 12 times since the start of the 2012 season.
- His tackles (20) and solo tackles (17) in a victory over Baltimore in Week 7 were both career highs.
- In Week 2 he tied for the team lead with seven solo tackles.
- In Week 8, forced a fumble that was recovered by **DE Brett Keisel**, at the Oakland 11-yard line early in the fourth quarter. It was the 10th forced fumble of his career. The ensuing drive resulted in a touchdown to cut the lead to 21-10.
- In a Week 10 victory over the Bills he sacked QB E.J. Manuel for a loss of four yards on third-and-four, forcing a punt on the first drive of the third quarter.
- Recovered a fumble that **S Will Allen** caused and returned it 29 yards to the Detroit 32-yard line in a Week 11 victory.
- Registered a team-high seven tackles (five solo) in a road victory over Cleveland.
- Tied for the team lead with nine tackles at Baltimore in Week 13.
- Totaled at least six tackles in every game of the 2013 season.
- Registered one sack in each of the final two games of the season (at GB, vs. CLE).

In 2012, Timmons became the first player since Joey Porter in 2002 to lead the team or tie for the team lead in tackles, sacks and interceptions.

INDIVIDUAL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

Oh So Suisham: **K Shaun Suisham** had a career season in 2013. He started off by registering a safety on his first kickoff when Titans RB Darius Reynaud fielded the ball just outside the goal line and then took a knee in the end zone. Suisham made all 15 field goals to start the season before missing two at Oakland in Week 8. Dating back to the 2012 season Suisham recorded a streak of 16 consecutive makes, tying for the longest streak of his career when you include the postseason (16, 1/1/12 – 10/11/12). Since missing the two field goals at Oakland, he made 15 straight to finish 2013.

Suisham finished the 2013 season 30-of-32 on field goals. The 30 field goals set a career-high for field goals made in a single regular season (29 in 2007). He also tied Kris Brown (30 in 2001) for the third-most field goals made in franchise history during a single regular season (Norm Johnson, 34 in 1995 and Gary Anderson, 33 in 1985).

His field goal percentage of 93.8 is a new franchise regular season best (min. 15 att.), surpassing the 93.3 he recorded in 2010 (14-15) and Gary Anderson registered in 1993 (28-30).

He made eight from beyond 40 yards in 2013. Including the postseason, he has made 21 straight field goals between 40-49 yards, which is a personal best. His last miss from that range was on 1/1/12 at Cleveland.

Suisham clinched a Week 7 victory for the Steelers over Baltimore with a 42-yard field goal as time expired. Suisham has eight career game-winning field goals, including six as a Steeler.

Since the start of the 2012 regular season, Suisham has made 58-63 field goals (92.1).

Suisham has a current streak of 126 consecutive PATs made as a Steeler. Since October 4, 2009, Suisham has made 146 straight PATs, which is the longest streak of his career.

All Around Ability: **WR Antonio Brown** doesn't just contribute as one of Pittsburgh's main offensive targets. He also makes plays on special teams, earning his second selection to the Pro Bowl a punt returner (2011, '13). Brown has returned two punts and one kickoff for a touchdown in his career. He ranked second in the AFC in punt return average in 2013 (12.8). Below are some highlights from what Brown did as the team's punt returner during the 2013 season:

- Recorded the longest punt return of his career, a 67-yard touchdown in a victory over Cincinnati in Week 15.
- He has 16 punt returns of 20 or more yards in his career. Below are all of his punt returns of at least 40 yards:

- Contributed to a Week 10 victory over Buffalo by returning a punt 24 yards to the Pittsburgh 42-yard line and then returning a punt 50 yards to the Bills 11-yard line. Both returns set up drives that resulted in a total of 10 points.
- In Week 9 at New England, Brown returned a punt 24 yards to the NE 46-yard line early in the third quarter, setting up a drive that resulted in a touchdown.
- Recorded a 44-yard punt return to the Oakland 31-yard line in the fourth quarter of Week 8. It was the second longest punt return of his career.
- Against Baltimore in Week 7, he returned a punt 18 yards to the Pittsburgh 40-yard line, setting up a drive that resulted in a Steelers' touchdown.
- In Week 2 at Cincinnati he returned a punt 40 yards to the Cincinnati 34-yard line, setting up an eventual field goal that gave the Steelers a 3-0 lead.
- With 1,087 yards on punt returns in his career, he already has the fifth-most punt return yards by a Steeler during the regular season.

PITTSBURGH – The Steelers lost their 2013 preseason opener to the New York Giants.

The Giants forced the Steelers to punt on their first possession of the game. After a penalty forced Pittsburgh to punt again, **Drew Butler's** second punt attempt was blocked by DE Damontre Moore, and the Giants took over at the Steelers' five-yard line. The Steelers defense though did not allow a single yard and forced the Giants to settle for a field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Pittsburgh responded on its ensuing drive by controlling the football for more than six minutes. On the drive, **RB LaRod Stephens-Howling** totaled 36 rushing yards and picked up two key first downs. **K Shaun Suisham** ended the drive with a 34-yard field goal to tie the game 3-3.

New York took a 10-3 lead on their next possession when QB Eli Manning found WR Victor Cruz for a 57-yard touchdown. Early in the second quarter, rookie **LB Jarvis Jones** recovered a fumble at the Giants 44-yard line. On the ensuing drive, the Steelers cut the lead 10-6 with another Suisham field goal, this time from 41 yards out. And as the clock expired at halftime, Brown connected on a 30-yard field goal to give the Giants a 13-6 lead going into the break.

Early in the third quarter, **QB Landry Jones** and **RB Baron Batch** collided, which resulted in a fumble. Jones recovered the football but was tackled in the end zone for a safety and the Giants took a 15-6 lead.

The Steelers defense came up big early in the fourth quarter when the Giants fumbled the football on their own 16-yard line. The ball was recovered in the end zone by **LB Adrian Robinson** to cut the Giants' lead 15-13. But Brown added a 47-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter to seal the win for the Giants.

On the Steelers second drive of the game, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** was picked off by LB Ryan Kerrigan, and he returned it 22 yards for a touchdown to give the Redskins a 7-0 lead. Early in the second quarter, the Steelers cut the lead to 7-3 on **K Shaun Suisham's** 28-yard field goal.

Midway through the second quarter, Kerrigan sacked and stripped **QB Bruce Gradkowski** and Washington recovered the football on Pittsburgh's 16-yard line. On the very next play, rookie **LB Jarvis Jones** stripped QB Rex Grossman and **CB Ike Taylor** recovered the fumble. On the Steelers ensuing drive, **RB Jonathan Dwyer** fumbled and the Redskins took over near midfield.

On Washington's next drive, Grossman found WR Leonard Hankerson for a 10-yard touchdown to extend the Redskins lead to 14-3. Pittsburgh went up 10-0 on its next drive when Roethlisberger connected with **RB Jonathan Dwyer** for a 13-yard touchdown. Roethlisberger finished with a game-high 166 passing yards.

Midway through the second quarter, Suisham's 52-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Kansas City. On the Chiefs' ensuing drive, K Ryan Succop made a 19-yard field goal to cut the lead 10-3. The game marked the first time the Steelers played an overtime preseason contest since 1986.

Carolina scored a touchdown on its opening possession as QB Derek Anderson led the team on a six-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 35-yard touchdown pass to WR Ted Ginn, Jr. Pittsburgh tied the game on its ensuing drive, going 80 yards on eight plays. The drive was capped off by **QB Landry Jones'** 13-yard touchdown pass to **TE David Paulson**.

Tennessee 16, Pittsburgh 9

PITTSBURGH – The Steelers lost their 2013 home opener to the Tennessee Titans, 16-9. It marked the Steelers first home-opening loss since the 2002 season.

On the opening kickoff, Titans RB Darius Reynaud fielded the ball just outside the goal line, and then took a knee into the end zone for a safety. It marked the first time that there was a safety on the opening kickoff since September 18, 1988 (New York Giants vs. Dallas Cowboys).

Midway through the second quarter, **QB Ben Roethlisberger's** pass to **WR Emmanuel Sanders** was picked off by CB Alterraun Verner. Tennessee then went 49 yards on 12 plays on a drive that took up almost seven minutes of clock time. RB Jackie Battle scored on a three-yard run to cap off the drive to give the Titans a 7-2 lead.

Late in the third quarter, K Rob Bironas connected on a 26-yard field goal to give the Titans a 10-2 lead. Bironas made a 44-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter to extend Tennessee's lead, 13-2. And with less than four minutes remaining in the game, Bironas connected on a 27-yard field goal to give the Titans a 16-2 lead.

Late in the game, Roethlisberger led the team on a nine-play, 75-yard drive that was capped off with a four-yard touchdown pass to **WR Jerricho Cotchery**. On the drive, Roethlisberger surpassed 30,000 passing yards to become just the 35th quarterback in NFL history to throw for at least 30,000 yards.

Despite the loss, the Steelers' defense held its opponent to less than 17 points for the ninth-consecutive home opener. Dating back to last season, this marked the seventh game in a row where the Steelers' defense did not allow a single touchdown in the first quarter of a game.

Pittsburgh scored on their second drive of the game, thanks in large part to **WR Antonio Brown's** 40-yard punt return, which set the Steelers up in Bengals' territory. **K Shaun Suisham** connected on a 44-yard field goal to give Pittsburgh a 3-0 lead.

Midway through the first quarter, the Steelers marched into Bengals' territory. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **TE David Paulson** for a 34-yard completion but Paulson fumbled the football before he was down. Cincinnati then took over and QB Andy Dalton led the team on a five-play, 87-yard drive that was capped off by **RB Giovani Bernard's** seven-yard touchdown run.

Early in the second quarter, Cincinnati extended their lead, 10-3, on K Mike Nugent's 41-yard field goal. PITTSBURGH – The Steelers could not overcome a 21-point first-half deficit and lost to the Chicago Bears, 40-23, at Heinz Field.

Chicago raced out to a 17-0 lead by the end of the first quarter. K Robbie Gould connected on a 47-yarder on the Bears' opening drive of the game. On the Steelers' first possession, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** was sacked and stripped by LB D.J. Williams and the Bears took over at the Steelers' 17-yard line. MetLife Stadium (76,957)

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. – The Steelers beat the New York Jets, 19-6, at MetLife Stadium for the franchise's 600th win. The Steelers became just the fourth team in NFL history, and first AFC team to accomplish that milestone.

K Nick Folk gave the Jets a 3-0 lead late in the first quarter when he connected on a 25-yard field goal. Pittsburgh though would score on its next three possessions with help from **K Shaun Suisham**. Suisham nailed a 46-yarder, a 33-yarder and then a 48-yarder with less than a minute remaining in the half to give the Steelers a 9-3 lead. Folk responded with his 39-yarder with two seconds left in the second quarter. The Steelers went into halftime with a 9-6 lead.

On Pittsburgh's first drive of the second half, the team faced a third-and-one on at its 45-yard line. **QB Ben Roethlisberger's** play action fake froze the Jets' defense, and **WR Emmanuel Sanders** was wide open in the middle of the field. Sanders hauled in a 55-yard touchdown, his longest career reception, and the Steelers extended their lead to 16-6.

New York drove to the Steelers' 23-yard line on their ensuing possession, but **QB Geno Smith's** throw was intercepted by **S Ryan Clark**. It marked Clark's 14th career interception. Suisham connected on his fourth field goal of the game, this one from 32 yards out to give the Steelers the decisive 19-6 win. The Jets drove into Steelers' territory late in the game, but Smith was intercepted near the goal line by **LB Lawrence Timmons**.

The Steelers' defense recorded season highs in sacks (3) and takeaways (2). The defense also held the Jets to 3-of-11 (27%) on third-down conversions.

PITTSBURGH – K Shaun Suisham connected on a 42-yard field goal as time expired to give the Steelers a 19-16 victory over division rival, the Baltimore Ravens.

Pittsburgh scored first midway through the first quarter. **QB Ben Roethlisberger** led the team on a 10-play, 60-yard drive that was capped off by a three-yard shovel pass to **TE Heath Miller**. The touchdown was the 40th in Miller's career, as he became just the fifth player in team history to record at least 40 receiving touchdowns.

Baltimore's K Justin Tucker made a 46-yard field goal near the end of the first quarter to cut the lead, 7-3. Suisham connected on his first field goal of the game, a 34-yarder, early in the second quarter to increase Pittsburgh's lead, 10-3. Right before halftime, Tucker connected from 38 yards out, and the Steelers went into halftime with a 10-6 lead.

The only points in the third quarter came from Suisham, as he made a 28-yard field goal late in the period to increase the Steelers lead, 13-6. Both teams exchanged field goals, as Tucker made a 32-yarder early in the fourth quarter and then Suisham followed it up with a 38-yarder.

With Pittsburgh leading 16-9, the Ravens started at their own 27-yard line. QB Joe Flacco led the team on a 16-play, 73-yard drive that took up eight minutes of clock time. Flacco found TE Dallas Clark for a one-yard score to tie the game, 16-16.

But Roethlisberger had more than enough time to lead his team down the field. Roethlisberger led the group 39 yards to set up Suisham's game-winning kick. It marked the 28th time during the regular season that Roethlisberger led the team to victory when facing a fourth-quarter deficit or tie.

OAKLAND – The Steelers could not erase an 18-point first-half deficit and lost to the Oakland Raiders, 21-18, at the O.co Coliseum.

On the Raiders first play of the game, QB Terrelle Pryor faked a handoff to RB Darren McFadden, and then ran 93 yards for a touchdown to give Oakland an early 7-0 lead. **P Zoltan Mesko's** attempt was blocked midway through the first quarter, which set Oakland up at the Steelers' 26-yard line. Five plays later, McFadden scored on a seven-yard run to give the Raiders a 14-0 lead.

Late in the first quarter, **S Troy Polamalu** picked off Pryor and returned it to the Raiders' 48-yard line. **K Shaun Suisham** capped off the ensuing drive with a 47-yard field goal to cut the lead, 14-3. The Raiders scored their final points of the game after the two-minute warning when McFadden scored on a four-yard run to give the Raiders a 21-3 lead at halftime.

Neither team scored in the third quarter. Early in the fourth quarter, **DE Brett Keisel** recovered an Oakland fumble that was forced by **LB Lawrence Timmons**, and three plays later **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **WR Emmanuel Sanders** for a nine-yard touchdown to cut the lead, 21-10.

With 1:27 left in the game, **RB Le'Veon Bell** scored on a two-yard run, and Sanders scored on a two-point conversion to cut the lead, 21-18. The Steelers attempted an onside kick but it was recovered by the Raiders.

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. – The Steelers fell to the New England Patriots, 55-31, at Gillette Stadium.

New England scored the first 14 points of the contest, both touchdowns coming on passes. Late in the first quarter, QB Tom Brady found WR Danny Amendola for a 34-yard score, and early in the second quarter, he found TE Rob Gronkowski for a 19-yard touchdown.

K Shaun Suisham's 30-yard field goal midway through the second quarter gave the Steelers their first three points of the game. Late in the second quarter, K Stephen Gostkowski's 20-yard field goal extended the Patriots' lead, 17-3.

Right after the two-minute warning, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** found **WR Antonio Brown** for a 27-yard touchdown pass to pull within a touchdown, 17-10. But New England marched 77 yards on nine plays on their ensuing drive to extend their lead to 24-10 at halftime.

Gostkowski made a 32-yard field goal, Brady and WR Aaron Dobson connected on a 17-yard touchdown and RB Stevan Ridley scored on a five-yard run to extend the lead, 41-24. Roethlisberger and Cotchery connected again for a six-yard score to cut the lead, 41-31, but it would be the closest the Steelers would get.

Brady and Dobson connected for an 81-yard touchdown pass, and RB LaGarrette Blount scored on a five-yard run to give New England the 55-31 victory.

CLEVELAND – The Steelers' defense forced a season-high four turnovers and **QB Ben Roethlisberger** threw for 217 yards and two touchdowns to beat the Browns, 27-11, at FirstEnergy Stadium.

Pittsburgh took its opening possession 45 yards on nine plays, which ended in a field goal. **K Shaun Suisham** nailed a 47-yard field goal to give the Steelers a 3-0 lead. Cleveland responded on its ensuing drive, going 34 yards on seven plays. K Billy Cundiff connected on a 49-yard field goal to tie the game, 3-3. But it would be the last points the Browns would score until late in the fourth quarter.

PITTSBURGH – Pittsburgh ended its 2013 campaign with three straight wins, including a 20-7 victory over the Cleveland Browns in the season finale at Heinz Field. With the win, the Steelers recorded at least eight victories for the 10th straight regular season.

On the Steelers' first drive, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **WR Jericho Cotchery** connected on two straight plays. First, Roethlisberger and Cotchery converted a third-and-10 with a 12-yard pass, and on the very next play, Roethlisberger threw a nine-yard touchdown pass to Cotchery. It marked Cotchery's team-leading 10th receiving touchdown of the season.

Late in the second quarter, **RB Le'Veon Bell** scored on a five-yard run to give the Steelers a 14-0 advantage. Bell finished the game with 96 yards from scrimmage to give him 1,259 on the season, passing Franco Harris (1,235) for the most yards from scrimmage by a rookie in a single-season in team history.

K Shaun Suisham made a 30-yard field goal in the third quarter and a 32-yarder in the fourth quarter to give Pittsburgh a 20-0 lead. Suisham finished the season 30-of-32 on field goals, which are the third-most made field goals in a single-season in franchise history. His FG percentage of 93.8 was a franchise best (min. 15 att.) in the regular season.

Cleveland RB Fozzy Whittaker scored on a 35-yard touchdown pass from QB Jason Campbell late in the contest to prevent the Pittsburgh shutout.

WR Antonio Brown finished with game-highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (87). Brown became the first player in NFL history to record at least five receptions and 50 receiving yards in all 16 regular-season contests.
